BJD-BJP 'understanding' ends

FOR THE FIRST TIME SINCE THE 2019 GENERAL ELECTIONS, BJP LEADERS RAISED THEIR VOICE AGAINST THE CENTRE'S NEGLECT TOWARDS THE STATE

Bhubaneswar, Dec 20: Nineteen months after the 2019 general elections, Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik and senior leaders Biju Janata Dal (BJD) seem to have decided raise their voice against the Modi government at the Centre for the first time.

This was apparent when all BJD leaders openly criticised the Centre at the party's executive body meeting here Sunday.

Earlier, the BJD had been cribbing about the financial neglect of the Centre towards the state, but since the last elections, the party had completely fallen silent against the Modi government. People perceived such cryptic silence of the BJD against the Centre was fallout of a secret understanding between the two parties.

Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik first broke his silence at the executive body meeting of the Biju Yuba Janata Dal recently.

Lanching a scathing attack on the BJP, Patnaik said that the leaders of the national party in the state

are dumb, as they have been sidelining the interests of the state. Their only aim is to keep the central leaders in good humour so as to grab ministries and positions, he said, adding, they have failed in raising their voice in the state's interests.

Such change in the Chief Minister's stand against the Centre signalled that the party will go to the people against the Centre.

Speaking at the executive committee meeting, senior BJD leader Prasanna Acharya said that some parties have pointed their fingers at the BJD's relevance at the present time. "Many have raised questions about the future of the BJD, but the party will gain confidence of the people in future too and will form the government," he asserted.

Puri MP Pinaki Mishra pointed out that a big survey agency has placed Odisha at the fifth slot for Covid-19 management, while Uttar Pradesh and Himachal Pradesh have failed to fare well in pandemic management.

"People know which party is ruling these states. The Centre is ne-

glecting the implementation of the Swaminathan Committee report, special category state status and special package," the Puri MP alleged.

BJD leader Pramila Mallick said that Odisha Chief Minister is number one in the Covid management.

"When people of Odisha were left jobless in other states due to lockdown and were stranded, the Chief Minister made arrangements to bring them back," she added.

She said that the grassroots workers should work to apprise people about the Central neglect towards the state. Opposition parties will not be allowed to win a single seat in civic body polls, she added.

Senior BJD leader Kishore Mohanty said that the treasury of Odisha was empty when the regional party came to power for the first time in 2000. But, the state had a surplus Budget under the BJD rule in 2008, he added.

Speaking at the meet, Kalikesh Singh Deo said that a political party is collecting members through missed calls but BJD does not follow that method.

Police register case against Anubhav

Cuttack, Dec 20: The Purighat police Sunday registered a case against Odia film actor and MP Anubhav Mohanty and two of his aides on a fresh complaint filed by Mohanty's actress wife Varsha Priyadarshini.

The police also quizzed Mohanty and his two aides in connection with the complaint filed by Varsha, sources said.

In her complaint, Varsha Saturday claimed that Mohanty and his two aides had locked her room. As a result, she had to wait outside for some time.

Varsha had also lodged a complaint with police Friday and claimed that a conspiracy is being made to tarnish her image. In a related development, Mohanty Sunday wrote to Director General of Police (DGP), Abhay, and sought protection for him and his family. In his letter to the DGP, Mohanty alleged that some people are conspiring against him and his family. He reportedly mentioned the names of the conspirators, sources said.

Mohanty also urged police to examine the authenticity of an audio clip of Varsha's conversation with her two sisters. The audio clip went viral on social media a few days ago.

It is worth mentioning here that Mohanty and Varsha have been engaged in a marital dispute for last several months. Varsha had filed a case in the Cuttack SDJM court seeking maintenance from Mohanty.

Nepal Parliament dissolved, general elections next year

Kathmandu, Dec 20: Nepal's embattled Prime Minister KP Sharma Oli Sunday sprang a surprise on his rivals and got the President to dissolve Parliament, a controversial move amidst a prolonged tussle for power between him and former premier Pushpa Kamal Dahal "Prachanda".

President Bidya Devi Bhandari dissolved Parliament's House of Representatives at Oli's recommendation and announced mid-term general election in April-May, a decision criticised by the Opposition as unconstitutional.

Earlier, an emergency meeting of the Cabinet chaired by Oli decided to recommend the President for the dissolution of Parliament, a senior Standing Committee member of the ruling Nepal Communist Party (NCP) told PTL.

The first phase of the mid-term election will be held April 30 and May 10 for the second phase, according to a notice issued by the Rashtrapati Bhawan.

The 275-member House of Representatives, which is the lower house of Parliament, was elected in 2017 for a five-year term. The upper house is the National Assembly.

The move comes as the intra-party feud reached climax in the ruling NCP which has been witnessing months long tussle between two factions, one led by 68-year-old Oli and Party's chairman and another led by 66-year-old "Prachanda", also the executive chair of the party and former premier.

Spokesperson of the ruling NCP Narayanakaji Shrestha has termed Oli's move as "undemocratic, anti-constitutional and autocratic".

He said that the ruling party will hold its Standing Committee meeting to discuss the matter.

Pari murder case: One arrested

Bhubaneswar: The Special Investigation Team (SIT) investigating the Pari murder case in Nayagarh arrested one person in connection with crime, Sunday. The accused will be produced before the POCSO Court tomorrow. According to official sources, the accused is a resident of Jadupur village under Nayagarh Sadar police limits. A case has been registered under Sections 364, 302, 376 (AB), 376 (A) and 201 of IPC read with Section 6 of POCSO Act. However, the investigation team did not provide the details of the person arrested in connection with the minor girl murder case. Official sources said lie detection test of the concerned person had been carried out.

Cold wave to sweep several districts

Bhubaneswar: Severe cold wave condition is likely to prevail at one or two places over the districts of Mayurbhanj, Angul, Jharsuguda, Bargarh and Sundargarh during next 24 hours. Weather office sources said cold wave condition is also likely to prevail at one or two places over the districts of Koraput, Kandhamal, Balasore, Cuttack, Keonjhar, Boudh, Sonepur, Kalahandi, Nuapada, Dhenkanal, Deogarh during next 24 hours. Under its impact, an increased likelihood of various illnesses like running/stuffy nose or nosebleed, which usually set in or get aggravated due to prolonged exposure to cold. Livestock may be affected due to prolonged exposure to cold. Experts advised people to stay indoors during night and avoid movement in night.

'Progeny, termination; fundamental rights'

Cuttack, Dec 20: While allowing a rape victim to terminate her pregnancy after 20 weeks of conception, the Orissa High Court recently ruled that right to progeny and termination are both fundamental rights enshrined under Article 21 of the Constitution of India.

The high court cited the instance of Meera Santosh Pal v. Union of India, (2017) 3 SCC 462, wherein the Supreme Court had held that women's right to make reproductive choice is also an aspect of personal liberty as understood under Article 21 of the Constitution.

In this case, the victim was 21 weeks pregnant and according to the existing Medical Termination of Pregnancy Act (MTP Act), medical

termination of pregnancy more than 20 weeks old is not permitted.

However, a Division Bench of Justices SK Mishra and Savitri Ratho mentioned about the Medical Termination of Pregnancy (Amendment) Bill, 2020, currently pending before the Rajya Sabha, which permits termination of pregnancies up to 24 weeks.

While the Bench recognised that the Bill is yet to be passed and cannot be considered as a law, it proceeded to observe,

"It is reflected that due to passage of time and advancement of medical technology for safe abortion there is a scope for increasing the outer limit for terminating pregnancy especially for vulnerable women and pregnancy with substantial fetal abnormalities detected late in pregnancy."

Mahanadi port project gains steam

Bhubaneswar, Dec 20: Ahead of signing of the MoU with the Centre for setting up of ₹4,000 crore riverine port project in Mahanadi, a high-level delegation Sunday visited the proposed site in Kendrapara district, officials said.

The delegation comprising Chief Secretary AK Tripathy, Secretary VK Pandian, Paradip Port Trust (PPT) chairman Rinkesh Roy and others travelled to the proposed site on a vessel.

Local MLA of Mahakalapada Atanu S Nayak was present at the proposed port site. He had a discussion with officials about the project while Kendrapara district collector Samarth Verma appraised the delegation about the importance of the identified site.

The Ministry of Port, Shipping and Waterways has already agreed to the Odisha government's proposal for the riverine port to be developed by Paradip Port Trust at an investment of ₹4,000 crore. The project is estimated to generate employment for 6,000 people. The proposed port will come up at Akhadasali village under Mahakalapada block in Kendrapara district, 13 km from the river mouth at Paradip.

This all-weather and multi-user port on river Mahanadi will be set up in public-private-partnership

(PPP) mode with a capacity of 54 MTPA at an investment of ₹4,000 crore. In the first phase, the port will have the capacity to handle 22 MTPA cargos at an investment of ₹2,562 crore, an official said.

While the Paradip Port Trust will develop supporting project infrastructures like rail and road connectivity and dredging requirements of the facility, the state government has already identified 300 hectares of land for the project.

The state government will also provide the necessary support to PPT in respect of any additional land required for the project, the official said, adding that Odisha in 2018 had decided to go ahead with Mahanadi Riverine Port.

However, the project couldn't progress due to lack of interest by potential bidders. Paradip Port Trust then evinced interest in the project and consequently, the MoU is proposed to be signed with the state government.

On commissioning of the project, the port will provide direct and indirect employment opportunities to more than 4,000 persons in the first phase and about another 1,700 in the 2nd phase.

The riverine port, along with the state-aided Haridaspur Paradip Railway line, will go a long way in boosting the economy of the Kendrapara district, he said.

NPA: NDA's score thrice worse than UPA

Mumbai, Dec 20: In a dubious distinction of sorts, the Bharatiya Janata Party-led NDA rule achieved the highest loans write-off between 2015 and 2019, which is more than three times compared to the figures of bad loans written off during the previous Congress-led UPA regime from 2004-2014, as per an RTI revelation.

During the UPA's 10-year rule, around ₹2,20,328 crore was written off by various banks, and this figure shot up to ₹7,94,354 crore during the NDA regime from 2015-2019.

The data was provided under an RTI query by Pune-based businessman Prafull Sarda, giving some shocking insights into the state of



affairs of not only public sector banks, but also those in the private sector and foreign banks.

The RTI reply figures around two-dozen public sector banks, some three-dozen in private sector, nine Scheduled Commercial Banks, and a whopping four-dozen foreign banks, and includes several in each category which have not written off any loans.

Of the loan write-offs in the

Congress' decade (2004-2014), the PSBs accounted for approximately ₹1,58,994 crore, while the amounts written off by the private banks was ₹41,391 crore and for foreign banks it was ₹19,945 crore, with no write-offs by Scheduled Banks.

Later, in the NDA regime (2015-2019), the figures provided show a phenomenal increase with the PSBs accounting for a stupendous ₹6,24,370 crore loan write-off, with the private

banks writing off ₹1,51,989 crore and the foreign banks shared the remaining 17,995 crore, (Total - ₹7,94,354 crore), besides an additional write-off by Scheduled Banks totalling ₹1,295 crore (Total - ₹7,95,649 crore).

"The official data is not only revealing but very distressing. During the 10 years of UPA government (2004-2014), the total loans written off was ₹2,20,330 crore, but during less than five years of the NDA (2015-2019), the figures zoomed up by almost 350 per cent to ₹7,94,354 crore," Sarda told this news agency.

The surprising aspect is the huge increase in the write-offs by foreign banks - from 2004-2014, it was ₹19,945 crore in the UPA's 10-year tenure (₹ 1,995 crore each year on an average), but shot up to ₹17,995 in the NDA's four years between 2015-2019 (₹4,499 crore annual average).

BANK LOAN WRITE-OFF

Several global giants like HSBC, Barclays, CitiBank and Standard Chartered Bank apparently gained due to the write-offs, among many others, in the past 15 years of the UPA-NDA govts


Shama learns pole dance to stay fit

Deepa's film rejected for Oscar nomination



Toronto: Indo-Canadian filmmaker Deepa Mehta's *Funny Boy* has been rejected for Oscar nomination in the best International Feature Film category at the 93rd Academy Awards.

The filmmaker has co-written and co-directed the film that tells the story of a young Tamil boy growing up in Sri Lanka during the ethnic conflict of the 1970s and 1980s.

To be a contender for Oscar in the International Feature Film category, the film must be produced outside the US, with more than 50 per cent dialogue in a foreign language. But according to the

Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences, Mehta's one hour and 49 minutes long film has only 12 minutes and 27 seconds of Tamil or Sinhala dialogue.

In reaction, Mehta said: "Every step of the way of the *Funny Boy* journey, has been an important one for myself and the *Funny Boy* team. The message of the book has always been one of resilience and courage. It seems as if the afterlife of the film follows a similar arc. Each time we reached an impasse, we pushed on leading us to something even better than we could have imagined." IANS

Unpaused: Hampered by uneven storytelling

FILM REVIEW
When you have multiple directors calling the shots on multiple sets of actors in standalone stories, it is hard to find cohesion of quality. *Unpaused*, with five stories that attempt to define the mood of urban India during lockdown, suffers from that problem. The film starts off on a high note, hits a slump, and somehow manages to recover.

Raj and DK's *Glitch* is quietly scary in the way it imagines an India in the future that has lost its battle to coronavirus. Covid-19 is a first generation menace that is

in the past now, and science is struggling to fathom Covid-30 in the narrative, as a lonely and nervous 'hyppo' (Gulshan Devaiah) goes on a virtual date with a spirited Covid warrior (Sayami Kher). The urge of companionship draws him to the girl, and he would personally love to meet her. But there is always the fear of infection.

The second story, Nikkhil Advani's *The Apartment*, is about a couple (Richa Chadha and Sumeet Vyas), whose lives are irreparably damaged when he is charged with multiple MeToo allegations. There is no specific

reason why this story should have been set during lockdown. Tannishtha Chatterjee directs *Rat-a-Tat*, about a young girl (Rinku Rajguru) and her grumpy elderly neighbour (Lillete Dubey). Unfolding at a languid pace, the film captures the essence of human relationship making interesting use of music.

Avinash Arun Dhaware's *Vishaanu* casts Abhishek Banerjee and Geetika Vidya Ohlyan as a migrant couple in Mumbai who, along with their boy, find luxurious haven in a sample flat of half-constructed high-rise amid lockdown. The film uses TikTok in a quirky

way to carry the story forward - in the time of the Wuhan-origin virus, it is ironic that the banned Chinese app should play havoc in

the lives of the protagonists.

Nitya Mehra directs the final story, *Chand Mubarak*, which traces an unlikely bond between a posh aging loner named Uma (Ratna Pathak Shah) and an autorickshaw driver Rafique (Sharul Bharadwaj), in whom she sees her late brother. The idea lacks originality but Mehra makes up for that drawback by getting the emotional core of the tale right. *Unpaused* thrives on some fine acting - Ratna Pathak Shah, Sharul Bharadwaj, Abhishek Banerjee, Lillete Dubey and Gulshan Devaiah are particularly outstanding. ORANGE WARNING HAS BEEN ISSUED FOR FIVE DISTRICTS CAUTIONING SEVERE COLD WAVE

Bhubaneswar, Dec 20: The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has now predicted cold to severe cold wave conditions in different parts of the state and issued warnings accordingly.

The IMD has predicted colder days Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. The department said that cold to severe cold wave conditions are likely to prevail over Mayurbhanj, Angul, Jharsuguda, Sundargarh and Bargarh districts Monday. Orange warning (be prepared) has been issued by the department for these five districts.

On the other hand, isolated cold waves are likely to prevail in districts like Koraput, Kandhamal, Balasore, Keonjhar, Boudh, Sonepur, Kalahandi, Nuapada, Dhenkanal, Cuttack and Deogarh. The IMD said Mayurbhanj, Angul, Jharsuguda, Sundargarh and Bargarh districts are likely to see cold to severe cold waves while some other districts may see isolated cold waves, Tuesday. The weatherman also claimed that the cold waves are likely to continue till Wednesday.

The office of the Special Relief Commissioner (SRC) has issued warning to the Collectors and Municipal Corporations to remain alert and take steps accordingly.

"All the Collectors are required to ensure that immediate arrangement is made for opening of school buildings, community buildings and other available buildings for use as shelter during night by homeless and needy people. A report indicating the number of such buildings

Puri, Dec 20: Lord Jagannath and his siblings Lord Balabhadra and Devi Subhadra were draped in winter clothes as part of Ghodalagi ritual at Srimandir here Sunday.

Darjee (tailor) servitors of Srimandir had earlier handed over newly-stitched traditional shawls (colloquially known as Ghoda Bastra) for the deities to the Three Jagannath Temple Administration (SJTA), sources said.

Srimandir sources said the deities were draped in the winter clothes at 11.15 am after the completion of some routine rituals.

As per Srimandir tradition, the deities are draped in traditional shawls to save them from the cold.

Traditionally, tailor servitors of the shrine make new shawls for the deities every year. Tailors use Geetgovidin Pata and other silk fabrics to stitch up shawls for the deities. The tailors prepare shawls and other winter clothes for the presiding deities and subsidiary deities like Madanmohan, Garuda, Patitapaban, Nrusingha and Surya, Srimandir sources said.

The deities are draped in seven shawls of different colours in a week. Traditionally, the servitors drape the deities in red colour shawls Sunday, white-black mixed shawls Monday and multicolour winter clothes Tuesday. The deities are draped in blue, yellow, white and black shawls from Wednesday to Saturday.

Dismal show by govt in scholarship schemes: AG

The Higher Education department has failed to achieve the target set for e-Medhabruti scheme for the last financial year

Bhubaneswar, Dec 20: The Kalinga Sikhya Sathi Yojana and e-Medhabruti schemes, aimed at providing financial assistance to meritorious students of underprivileged sections for pursuing higher education, have failed to achieve the targets set for 2019-20. This was revealed in an audit report of the Accountant General (AG).

The Kalinga Sikhya Sathi Yojana was launched to provide education loans at 1 per cent rate of interest to students for pursuing higher studies. Students of underprivileged sections are being provided ₹20,000 annually for pursuing both graduate and post-graduate courses.

The audit by AG found that the government has failed to meet the target set for the scheme for 2019-20. According to the report, the government was able to provide benefits of the scholarship scheme to 29 students only against the target of 500 students for the year 2019-20, a dismal 5.8 per cent achievement of the set target.

Similarly, the Higher Education department has failed to achieve the

target set for e-Medhabruti scheme for the last financial year. E-Medhabruti is provided to students whose parental income doesn't exceed ₹6 lakh per annum. The scholarship is provided to Plus III (senior merit), PG merit and technical/professional courses at the rate of ₹5,000, ₹10,000 and ₹10,000 respectively. According to sources, the government had set a target of covering 10,000 technical and professional students under e-Medhabruti scheme on merit basis. However, the achievement was only 1,783, a shortfall of 82.17 per cent of the target.

"The achievement of physical and financial target under technical and professional category was dismal and the shortfall was 82.17 per cent defeating the very purpose of the scheme thereby depriving the meritorious students to meet a part of their education expenses while pursuing their higher studies," the auditor noted.

It has asked the Higher Education department to remove the bottlenecks and deficiencies in achieving the target for the larger benefit of the needy students.

Swindlers hack woman's savings bank account

Bhubaneswar, Dec 20: Cyber crooks have reportedly withdrawn over ₹1.5 lakh from the savings account of a housewife here by hacking her bank account. The victim has lodged a complaint with Nayapalli police in this regard.

According to sources, the woman has a savings account with the SBI's branch at Priyadarshini Market under Nayapalli police here. The victim was shocked to find that around ₹1, 52,190 has been withdrawn from her account without her notice. Upon checking, she came to know that as many as 39 internet banking transactions have

been done by 'Times of Money Limited' and 'INB Coda Payments India Priva' using her bank account between November 28 and 30, 2020. Interestingly, all these 39 transactions have been done at midnight.

Recently, Commissioner of Police Sudhanshu Sarangi had said during a presser that the cyber criminals usually commit the crime during night.

The victim also claimed that she had not received any OTP messages, mails or SMSes regarding the withdrawals.

Police have started investigations into the matter after registering a case in this regard.

Environmentalists slam abuse of forest rights

Bhubaneswar, Dec 20: Eminent environmentalist and founder of Center for Ecological Sciences, Dhananjaya Gadgil, Sunday, said that the authorities are abusing people's rights on forests to promote commercial entities that profit from the destruction of biodiversity.

Gadgil was addressing the 11th edition of three-day Odisha Environment Congress-2020 that began here Sunday. The main theme of this year's session is 'Environment and Biodiversity'. On the inaugural day of the event, chief guest Gadgil spoke about several important environmental issues.

Gadgil was the former member of Scientific Advisory Council to the Prime Minister of India and the Head of Western Ghats Ecology Expert Panel (WGEEP) of 2010, popularly known as the Gadgil Commission.

The expert said that corruption at bureaucratic level over environment issues is very big and that includes state of Odisha too. He said that his reports and suggestions, as chairman of The Western Ghats

Ecology Expert Panel were never taken seriously and were labelled as favourable to environment and environmentalists and not to development.

"The authorities are abusing people's rights to promote commercial entities that profit from the destruction of biodiversity. Such attitude is dissuading people from conserving biodiversity. In Odisha, the Niyamgiri hills, with its forests and springs sacred to Kondhs, is a striking example of such un-

reasonable practice," Gadgil said.

"Those in power should now realise the critical role the environment plays in the well-being of the masses. If the path of environment development chosen by us is not to lead further and further into the impoverishment of the masses of our population, we must be careful of the way we treat the resources of our environment," he added.

He said that village committees

should be involved in preserving natural heritage of Indian forests.

He also said, "We must not cut the wild food plants and trees in the sanctuaries as they are widely used by local tribes and animals. These plants and trees play a crucial role in providing food security."

On the occasion, Orissa Environment Congress secretary Sudarshan Das said, "Biodiversity can be defined as the variety and variability of life

on earth. Starting from pristine forest covers to the stunning coral reefs of deep oceans, from the mangrove dominated marshlands to the glittery sand dunes of the desert, each environment acts as a host to the numerous indigenous species of flora and fauna that live there."

"A healthy environment ensures the sustainability of different ecosystems. A degrading environment is responsible for the loss of biodiversity," he added.

Bhubaneswar, Dec 20: State's Covid-19 caseload Sunday mounted to 3,26,233 after 372 more people tested positive for the infection, while four fresh deaths raised the toll to 1,836, a senior Health and Family Welfare (H&FW) department official said.

Of the 372 cases, 214 were reported from various quarantine centres, and the rest detected during contact tracing, the official said.

Angul district recorded the highest number of new cases at 50, followed by Sundargarh at 47 and Khurda at 38. Three districts—Bhadrak, Kandhamal and Subarnapur— did not report any new case since Saturday.

Four fresh fatalities were recorded in Khurda, Mayurbhanj, Sambalpur and Sundargarh districts.

As many as 53 Covid-19 patients have died due to comorbidities. The positivity rate in the coastal state stands at 4.94 per cent. Over 66 lakh samples have been examined so far including 34,334 Saturday.

Meanwhile, another 338 Covid patients recovered in Odisha, taking the total recoveries in the coastal state to 3,21,647, the H&FW department tweeted. The recovered cases include 49 from Khurda, 36 from Sundargarh, 21 from Bhadrak,



Jeypore, Dec 20: Even though the border dispute between Odisha and Andhra Pradesh continues at several places in Koraput, the neighbouring state Saturday afternoon laid a blacktop road at Sunabeda village under Sambai panchayat under Pottangi block in the district. This has triggered a fresh controversy in the bordering villages. On being informed by local villagers about the fresh development, Pottangi additional tehsildar took stock of the road laying work. Notably, in a welcome development last December 3, authorities from bordering districts of the two

states held talks at a border post to resolve the prolonged issue. A team of Koraput district administration represented Odisha, while another team of Visakhapatnam district administration represented Andhra Pradesh in the meeting. GPS mapping of the border is being carried out in lines with the Madras Presidency map and a joint survey for this has also started. The officials of the two states had then agreed not to undertake any developmental activity until the boundaries are demarcated. The Andhra Pradesh government, however, has violated the agreement by laying the road.

Irrigation project lying unused

Kesinga, Dec 20: Like most other parts of Odisha, agriculture is the primary occupation of residents of Laitara Gram panchayat in Kesinga block of Kalahandi district. But this sector has been hit hard as the already constructed irrigation project near Ret River is unable to irrigate the farmlands of the panchayat. Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik had inaugurated the project December 15, 2015. The water resources department had spent Rs 8.98 crore to construct it. The project aimed at irrigating 500 hectares of farmland in Laitara, Jaloka and Karalabadi villages

though 29 outlets. The department had set up three pump sets to provide water through an 8.464 km long pipeline as well. But the farmers alleged that given the low-level positioning of water outlets, the project barely manages to irrigate their farmlands. While during rainy season very less amount of water passes through the outlets, it all becomes dry during the Rabi season. When contacted, departmental SDO Manas Kumar Pradhan said that they have requested the state government to reconstruct the check dams, pipelines and outlets in proper position so that the farmers can draw benefits from the project.

Notice served on 3 firms for mineral stock irregularities

Joda, Dec 20: Some mining firms have allegedly committed irregularities in mineral stocks and tampered with grades of iron ore in Joda mining circle in Keonjhar district. The office of the Joda joint director of mining has issued notices to three firms, a report said. According to the report, Kashiv International Private Limited at Jaribhal, Tarini Minerals at Deojhar and Murgabeda iron ore and mines were issued notices Friday. These three mining companies had tampered with the grades of iron ore in official records. The mines department came to know their irregularities and suspended their mining activities for the time being. Some leaseholders at times transport high grade minerals instead of the minerals in their stocks. They usually show low quality minerals in records, but sell high grade minerals.



Due to such illegalities, the state government has to lose crores of rupees as revenue. It may be noted here that the mines department had examined the stock of minerals on the premises of a major mining company in October in Joda. Then, the department came to know about the irregularities. That mine was served closure notice while two mining officers of Joda mining circle had been suspended for dereliction of duty. Joint director of mines at the Bhubaneswar office Umesh Chandra Jena said that notices were issued to three mines as there were irregularities in their stocks. He added that the stand of the government is very clear so far as tax evasion and illegal mining are concerned. Such cases will be dealt with sternly and stringent action will be taken against the erring mines if necessary, he added.

Maoists, security forces exchange fire; arms seized

Phulbani, Dec 20: A militiaman was detained while firearms and other articles were seized during an exchange of fire between the Maoists and security forces December 17 evening near Bireni village under Gochhapada police limits in Kandhamal district, police said Sunday. The militiaman was detained during the exchange of fire while the ultras taking advantage of the dense forest managed to escape. He has been taken for interrogation to examine his involvement in violence and insurgency activities in the region. Two country-made guns, a radio set, medicines, clothes, ration and other articles were seized from the place after the ultras escaped. Preliminary inquiries revealed

Acting on tip-off, the BSF jawans launched a combing operation from Pipalpadar to Nakamamudi in Swabhimana area and unearthed the powerful landmine. Later, a bomb disposal squad reached the spot and defused the landmine averting a possible mishap. The jawans suspected that the Maoists were targeting the security forces for which they had planted the powerful landmine. October 20, BSF jawans and the police had seized materials include 18 pieces of slurry and emulsion explosives, 500 pieces of gelatin, three camera flashes and other materials from this area. They had also seized explosives including tiffin bombs.

Elephant kills one Fake engine oil factory busted

Jhumpura/Joda, Dec 20: After a brief hiatus, an elephant separated from its herd has been causing mayhem in Bamebari section under Champua range in Keonjhar district. The animal claimed the life of a person Saturday evening. The deceased was identified as Srikant Nayak (40) of Kajjoda village. Srikant was out to answer the call of nature near a forest when the elephant trampled him to death. On being informed, Bamebari forester Jatindra Sahu visited the spot while the body was sent to Keonjhar for post-mortem. The forest department says that the



next of kin of the deceased will be provided Rs 4 lakh as government assistance. Three elephants have been unleashing a reign of terror in Champua, Keonjhar and Bhuyan Juanga Pidhi ranges. A forest official said that as these elephants have been moving separately, it is difficult to keep track of them. In the last few days, elephants have killed three people in the area. They have damaged several houses and crops in acres of land. The animals have taken away the sleep of the farmers with crops in large tracts of farmland being eaten and destroyed everyday. Locals alleged that the forest officials have failed to drive away the animals. Berhampur, Dec 20: Acting on tip-off, Town police busted a fake engine oil factory at Niladri Vihar here and arrested its proprietor, Sunday. The accused was identified as Md. Izaz, 31. Around 20 cartons of engine oil, raw materials, a machine worth Rs 3 lakh and a car were seized during the raid. The disclosure is indicative of the extent of spread of fake industrial units in the state manufacturing spurious and adulterated products. It comes close on the heels of similar raids carried out on adulterated soya chunk, ghee, sauce manufacturing units in Cuttack. A case was registered in this connection and further investigations are on. Police said Izaz used to procure plain oil and labels of various prominent brands like Castrol and Servo from Kolkata to manufacture spurious engine oils in the factory. The manufactured oil was later sold in markets of Gajapati and Rayagada.

To roll back or not to roll back! This is the question that could be occupying uppermost mind space of the Union government now. It concerns the three new controversial farming related laws. The Modi government needs to address this imbroglio without any further delay. Time is running out. Unlike the Supreme Court which can afford to bide time to take a decision, a democratically elected government does not enjoy that luxury. The farmers' agitation against the legislations has engulfed the executive, the judiciary, the Opposition and the corporate world while getting international traction. The big private houses that incurred the wrath of the farmers having been perceived to be the main beneficiaries of the new laws, have become unnerved. One of them has launched a media propaganda blitzkrieg through advertisements to counter the farmers' charge against it. Another has begun an almost internecine war in the corporate world accusing its rivals of colluding with the agitating farmers who have given a call to boycott its telecom services, as it is also an agriculture market leader. This has started to hit the company's telephony business with over 400 million subscribers. The rivals, of course, denied the charge and claimed they have been in the telecom business for the past 25 years and captured the market through hard work.

Nobel Laureate Abhijit Vinayak Banerjee has recently said that the farmers' agitation has been spurred on not so much for the content of the new laws but because of massive lack of trust in the government. He further says this time of the pandemic is not good to have a conversation about the farm laws and that the government should immediately announce a temporary rollback and discuss the legislations at length in the Parliament later on. Although Banerjee's opinion may be valid, no one will be deceived that Parliamentary debates in India must not have the last say to pave the way for resolution of such conflicts. Banerjee's suggestion could sound like a sweet melody to this government which has become extremely deft at misusing the discuss-debate-decide mode of Parliament. It is we, the people, the lowest in the economic rung, who have given an overwhelming majority to the BJP in the last general election. With such a huge number of MPs on its side, any discussion on the floor of the House becomes redundant once the matter, at the finale, goes for voting. If the Bills come up for voting once again, the Ayes Have It. Ayes Have It' will ring loud and clear from the Speaker's Chair. Once that is done, the farmers would never understand what hit them. Most uneducated democrats would then stand aside and feel proud that the test of fire was duly undertaken and the law was passed properly. That lie would be a true deception. Apart from the farce being played out on India's democracy currently, Banerjee does not seem to realize that it is not just 'massive mistrust in the government' that is encouraging the farmers to protest but also that the three laws are going to be very harmful for India's agriculture sector in the days to come. Banerjee, in an unspoken fashion, has not opposed the laws per se but finds superficial fault because of the timing of implementation.

Till now the government is in no mood to budge from its stand that the laws will be a "game-changer." After maintaining silence for some time and letting his Cabinet colleagues defend the legislations, Prime Minister Modi has now begun to bat for the farm laws with an appeal to the Opposition to support the measures and not to "mislead" the farmers. This is usual political rhetoric and slugfest between the ruling party and the Opposition to upstage one another to consolidate respective vote-banks. Now, it is for the Opposition to withdraw and not try to usurp this people's movement for its own benefit. Trying to do so would only help the government.

Not long ago, the country was witness to a similar turmoil when farmers closed ranks and took on state power which, like the Modi government, tried its best to sell the idea to the farmers that its initiative was in their interests only. Nearly a decade ago, the CPM government in Bengal began a major industrialisation overdrive by forcibly taking away farmland. Like the BJP, it was also a regimented party enjoying overwhelming majority in the state Assembly and it tried to steamroll farmers' agitation spearheaded by the Trinamool Congress. The then Chief Minister Buddhadeb Bhattacharjee had boasted with the infamous remark, "we are 235, they are 35," referring to the respective tallies of the Left Front and the Trinamool in the Assembly. A minister of the Modi government parroted a similar argument in a slightly different language bragging that the government has comfortable majority in the Parliament and a "ragtag" farmers' group doesn't have the power to stop the government from having its way.

It was the arrogance and desperation to placate the corporate lobby that propelled the Marxist government to try and bulldoze farmers' protest with the power of brute legislative majority and well-oiled party machinery. What happened thereafter is history. The Marxists got voted out by the people in 2011. Since then they have been suffering the ignominy of being an also-ran outfit in successive elections that they have contested.

What the BJP government at the Centre has now embarked upon is being viewed as far more alarming for the farmers and the country's food security. The ruling party first tried to denigrate the agitation by portraying it as a Khalistani-inspired movement, the work of anti-nationals, turban naxals and vested interests. Meanwhile, the Supreme Court too has spoken, defending the farmers' right to protest peacefully while it has also sought the government's opinion on how, in future, such protests should be held against the government. The government is still adamant and unwilling to concede to the farmers' demand to withdraw the legislations completely. That, the BJP leadership feels, could mean a major blow to its standing in the people's eye and the interests of its friends in the corporate world. It's time it learns a lesson from the fate of the Marxist government in Bengal rubbing the farmers the wrong way.


Waygoose

The end of summer came early in old-time printing shops. By the third week in August candles were needed to light the final hours of the long working day. To mark this shift to winter working, it was usual for the master printer to give his journeymen a feast around St Bartholomew's Day (24 August). This was the waygoose or way-goose. Its earliest recorded use is this: The Master Printer gives them a Way-goose; that is, he makes them a good Feast, and not only entertains them at his own House, but besides, gives them Money to spend at the Ale-house or Tavern at Night. ... These Way-goose, are always kept about Bartholomew-tide. And till the Master-Printer have given this Way-goose, the Journey-men do not use to Work by Candle Light (Mechanic Exercises, by Joseph Moxon, 1683). A rather splendid ditty the following century retold the story behind the practice in rhyming couplets: The season comes to light the tapers up, To gild the night, and drink the festive cup; Now darkness treads upon the heels of day, And earlier now dispatches him away. ... We sacrific'd the goose, and mirth pursu'd; As that delicious bird about this time, Call'd for the knife, and was in season prime. ... The masters hence their journeymen invite, To dine abroad, or spend the merry night (Lloyd's Evening Post, 1750, quoted in Notes and Queries, 4 August 1866). The name is baffling. In 1731, lexicographer Nathaniel Bailey argued, in the fifth edition of his Universal Etymological English Dictionary, that it came from wayz, meaning stubble, respelling the word waygoose to make the derivation clearer. Though it continued to be spelled as way-goose by almost everybody except Bailey, nineteenth-century etymologists stuck the "z" in to make it fit Bailey's story.

INEQUALITIES IN EQUALITY

FOCUS HUMANITY

The West and Islam are at loggerheads with each other. This is unfortunate because both are fundamentally egalitarian ideologies. The French Revolution of 1789 was anchored on the slogan "Liberty, Equality, Fraternity." Yet, the French people enslaved large parts of North Africa in the nineteenth century—after the French Revolution— and perpetuated a number of atrocities on those people. They applied "Liberty Equality Fraternity" to the French people and not to the African people. Similarly, Abraham Lincoln abolished slavery in the United States. Yet, the US today has been aggressively promoting the interests of its multinational corporations leading to wealth for the West and poverty for the East. It introduced the Patents Acts in the World Trade Organization. Previously India was free to copy and make a product invented by an American MNC as long as the Indian copier did not use the same process to make the product as used by the American inventor: Before the introduction of the Patents Act in the WTO, an Indian pharma could make the Pfizer vaccine for Covid-19 as long as it used a different process than used by Pfizer to make the vaccine. To give another example, it is reported that the cost of production of Windows software by Microsoft is only one US dollar whereas Microsoft is selling it at about ten dollars per piece. Indian software companies cannot copy the Windows software due the Patents Act. This kind of profiteering is leading to poverty in developing countries and richness in Western countries.

THE WEST HAS ESTABLISHED DEMOCRACY AND EQUALITY WITHIN ITS OWN COUNTRIES BUT ESPOUSED INEQUALITY AND EXPLOITATION VIS-À-VIS DEVELOPING COUNTRIES

We find the same anomaly in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights adopted by the United Nations in 1948 at the behest of the developed countries. Article 31 says "Everyone has the right to freedom of movement and residence within the borders of each state." Question is this: Why should the freedom of movement be restricted within "each state" when the rights enshrined in the Declaration are "universal?" Why the Declaration does not implement "Equality" and "Fraternity" between all hu-

manity? Similarly, Article 21 (2) says "Everyone has the right of equal access to public service in his country." Question is this: Why access to services only in "his country" if we are a common humanity? Why should public services of humanity not be shared across all peoples? In this way, the West has established democracy and equality within its own countries but espoused inequality and exploitation vis-à-vis the developing countries.

Indeed, there are exceptions to this rule. Winston Churchill had gone to the US to meet President Roosevelt during the Second World War seeking American assistance. Roosevelt had put the condition that England would have to give freedom to her colonies as a quid pro quo for American support. That was a great contribution of the US to the welfare of the people of the world. The US had also granted food aid under PL-480 law when India was facing a severe drought in the sixties. However, these exceptions do not obviate the larger exploitative tendency of the West.

The situation gets flipped in Islam. Equality between countries is accepted. Ayat 17:60 of the Quran says, "And [remember, O Muhammad], when we told you, Indeed, your Lord has encompassed the people." This Ayat applies to whole humanity. There is no division between the people that have been "encompassed."

The Lord encompasses the Arabic, American, European, Pagan, Atheists, and all other peoples. The basic tenor of the Quran is global. The Quran brings Allah's message to the whole humanity; not to a section of it. In my reading, Allah does not even tolerate any distinction even between believers and non-believers in the Prophet. A person may believe in Allah and in another Prophet, not Prophet Muhammad. The Quran accepts the Jews and Christians as people of the book even though they do not honour Prophet Muhammad. Unfortunately, Islam has transformed itself into an exploitative society despite this universalism.

Furthermore, Prophet Muhammad lived a very simple life. The first two Imams—Abu Bakr and Umar—also lived simple lives. However, the third Imam Othman transformed the situation entirely. Leslie Hazleton, author of "After the Prophet", says that Othman "built palaces in Medina with enclosed gardens, marble columns, and imported food and chefs. He began to give away vast private state to his relatives some with thousands of horses and as many slaves." In this way, the egalitarian ideology of the Quran was transformed into a deep social inequality within the Islamic countries and this continues to this day. The palaces of Saudi Arabia smack of unparalleled luxury while even

Muslim people of Nigeria are starving. In Pakistan two million people are living today as bonded labour—this within an Islamic country. A number of reports tell of "slave wives" being "wed" by Saudi Royals. So, Islam with an egalitarian ideology has been transformed into an internally unequal and exploitative society. It must be noted and honoured though that Islam has not made military war against other countries like France or economic wars against other countries like the US.

Here again we have exceptions to the rule. Iraq made war against Kuwait. The Rohingyas are considered to have made war against the State of Myanmar. A number of Islamic organizations are openly advocating Jihad against other countries. A difference from France and US, however, is that these wars are being made for religious objectives, not for economic exploitation. We have in front of us a strange spectacle. Two ideologies that are both egalitarian as well as universal, have both espoused inequality in different ways. The West has tried to secure equality within the countries but exploited other people. Islam, on the other hand, has tried to secure equality between countries but exploited its own people. The way forward is for both the West and Islam to reform themselves. Only then we will have peace and welfare as declared by the French Revolution and the Quran.

As an endnote, we in India must remind ourselves that we basically suffer from the same ills as Islam. The caste system still prevails in large parts of the country although we have expunged it from our Constitution. Economic inequality between the rich and the poor has been increasing at a regular pace since the Independence. It has increased exponentially under the present NDA government that is ideologically driven by Hindu texts. Thus, like Muslims, Hindus must also reform themselves to espouse internal equality

Managing well in the WFH era

Many managers are treating this year's pandemic-induced shift to work from home as though it were standard telecommuting. But it's not, and operating under the assumption that it is can ultimately harm employees' morale. While office workers are typically faring better than essential workers during the pandemic, the abrupt shift to remote work was jarring, and its effects should not be overlooked.

Leadership experts and cognitive scientists can attest that resistance to change is less about the change itself and more about losing control and fear of uncertainty. Humans—and other animals, for that matter—respond defensively when the power to make decisions about their own lives is removed. And in a recent study on COVID-19 and mental health, researchers found that adults surveyed in the US and five European countries who believe that other people or random chance mostly dictates what happens to them also report greater symptoms of depression.

There's a big difference between choosing to telecommute and suddenly being forced to work from home. While eliminating the daily commute has been nice, the average

office worker simply wasn't mentally or financially prepared to turn their home into a makeshift WeWork location while also taking on previously outsourced teaching, childcare, and eldercare duties. Many families do not live in homes that can easily accommodate telecommuting, and some employees' domestic arrangements are not conducive to success. Managers can take several steps to ease these burdens for their employees.

Set reasonable expectations: Many employees are bearing new burdens and facing pressure from multiple sources. Managers can avoid overwhelming them by eliminating unnecessary reports and redundant procedures, and by being as transparent as possible about deadlines. For example, if an important client meeting is postponed, managers should inform everyone who is preparing materials for it immediately, so they can reprioritize the day's tasks. Likewise, managers shouldn't expect immediate replies to emails—a constant sense of urgency contributes to employee burnout. Sending emails outside of working hours should be avoided, or staff shouldn't be expected to answer after-hours messages immediately. Don't force employees to be 'on'

all the time: Zoom fatigue is sky high, and employees may have to manage quiet space so that all household members can participate in their respective work calls and video meetings. Women usually get the short end of the stick, with one author dubbing them "reluctant nomads" in the "battle for space." For example, an employee might find herself perched on the edge of the bathtub, precariously balancing a computer on her knees, so that her partner and children can conduct their business or school work from the living room, bedroom, and kitchen. And women tend to face unfair criticism and pressure over their appearance on Zoom. Managers should ask whether any meetings could be eliminated, shortened, or conducted without video.

Find more opportunities to celebrate accomplishments: While it's always a good idea to strike a balance between criticism and praise, employees now face a constant flood of terrible news related to the pandemic, and are likely starved for wins. Managers should look for small successes that can be publicly recognized to boost morale, and thank employees for their hard work when they see a job well done. It costs nothing to show appreciation,

and a little positive feedback could be exactly what someone needed to hear on a particularly rough day.

Capitalize on accessible resources: Managers should look for ways to create more win-win scenarios while leveraging the assets they already have. At Barnard College we are paying our students to tutor the children of our faculty and staff. Our undergraduates gain part-time work at a time when internships and entry-level jobs are scarce, and our full-time employees can outsource one task among their many responsibilities. Managers who are unclear about where employees need some help could ask them in an anonymous survey about the biggest challenges they face and allocate resources accordingly.

Adjusting to sudden change requires effort on everyone's part. Managers owe it to their employees to stop treating work from home like a luxury. The office wasn't invited into the home. It turned up like an unexpected guest—and it shows few signs of leaving soon.

'Metro car land not ego issue'

Mumbai, Dec 20: Maharashtra Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray Sunday said he is open for a resolution of the Kanjurmarg Metro car shed land row in Mumbai through dialogue with the Centre and asserted it is not an "ego issue" for him.

Addressing people of Maharashtra through a live web cast, Thackeray also said that wearing masks will be mandatory for the next six months in the state in view of COVID-19, and asked people to be careful during the New Year celebrations.

Speaking on the Kanjurmarg car shed land dispute, he lamented that the central government moved court against the state over the issue. He also invited the opposition BJP in the state to sit across the table and resolve issues in public interest.

"Derailing each other's projects would serve no purpose...The Kanjurmarg car shed land dispute is not in the interest of citizens. I am ready to give credit to the opposition for the project...This is not an ego issue for me, as being described," he said.

"We have all documents to prove that the land belongs to the state government. If there is a controversy over the ownership of land, the



issue can be resolved through dialogue," Thackeray said.

Should the land be allowed to go because of ownership issues and should it be given to builders? he asked.

Referring to the criticism from BJP leaders, he said, "The issue on Kanjurmarg land is not about my ego and it shouldn't be about yours too."

The Bombay High Court on Wednesday stayed the order passed by Mumbai suburban district collector allotting 102 acres of salt pan land in Kanjurmarg area here for the construction of an integrated metro car shed.

It also restrained the authorities from carrying out any construction work at the said land.

The previous BJP-led state government had decided to construct the car shed for Metro line 3 (Colaba-Bandra-SEEPZ) at Aarey Colony, despite opposition from environmentalists and activists to the vast tree-cutting for the project.

The present MVA government - comprising the Shiv Sena, NCP and Congress -- recently took a decision to shift the car shed from the Aarey Colony to Kanjurmarg.

Thackeray said Aarey car shed spread over 30 hectares was just for Metro line 3, while the 40-hectare

Kanjurmarg land would be used for the car shed for Metro lines 3, 4 ((WadalaGhatkopar-MulundTeen Hath NakaKasarvadavali) and 6 (Lokhandwala-Jogeshwari-Kanjurmarg).

It will also be a junction for Metro line 14, which will go up to Ambarnath and Badlapur (in neighbouring Thane), Thackeray said justifying the choice of land at Kanjurmarg for the Metro car shed.

"The Aarey site for Metro Line 3 car shed was scrapped as more land would have been required in future at the cost of forest," he said, adding the Kanjurmarg site will serve for 50 to 100 years.

Bengaluru, Dec 20: Former Chief Minister Siddaramaiah on Sunday accused the BJP government in Karnataka of being 'hand-in-glove' with private educational institutions which were allegedly overcharging students.

In a series of tweets, the Congress leader slammed Chief Minister B S Yediyurappa and Primary and Secondary Education Minister S Suresh Kumar for allegedly not having control over private educational institutions.

He alleged that schools were forcing parents to pay full school fees and threatening to stop online classes if they did not comply with it and said the government was silent on the issue.

"Schools are charging even extra curricular fees on top of teaching fees. This is an additional burden on parents. The @BJP4Karnataka is hand in gloves with the institutions," Siddaramaiah, who is Leader of Opposition in the state Assembly tweeted.

He sought the intervention of the Chief Minister and the Primary and Secondary Education Minister to resolve the issue at the earliest.

Meanwhile, a group of parents staged a demonstration here, holding placards and banners and raised slogans against private educational

institutions for overcharging. The mother of a student at the protest venue, said this month she was not able to pay fees because her husband, the sole earning mem-

ber, had lost his job as a fallout of COVID-19 lockdown and alleged the management did not allow her son to appear for the half-yearly exams.

Karnataka government on Saturday decided to reopen schools and Pre-University Colleges in the state for class 10 and second year PUC (class 12) students from January 1.

It also decided to start the VidyaGama programme, which enables continued schooling for students from classes six to nine, from that date.

The decisions were taken at a meeting chaired by Chief Minister BS Yediyurappa on reopening schools and PU colleges in the state.

Wistron apologises to workers in Karna

Bengaluru, Dec 20: Nearly a week after violence erupted at a Karnataka factory owned by Taiwan-based Wistron Pvt Ltd that manufactures Apple iPhones, the firm today removed its top executive who oversaw India operations.

"Safety and wellbeing of our team members is always our top priority," Wistron said, admitting that "some workers were not paid correctly, or on time". In a statement, Apple said the supplier has been put on probation and it "will not receive any new business before completing corrective actions".

Last Saturday, several thousand contract workers at the factory near Bengaluru - angered over alleged non-payment of wages - destroyed property and factory gear; the Apple supplier had put the damages at \$7.12 million. Earlier this week, the centre asked the state to look into wage and labour-related disputes, and ensure that investor sentiment is not affected as a result of the violence.

Today, the Taiwan firm said in a statement, "We are removing the Vice President who oversees our business in India. We are also en-

hancing our processes and restructuring our teams to ensure these issues cannot happen again."

"Safety and wellbeing of our team members is always our top priority and core value at Wistron. Since unfortunate events at our Narasapura facility we've found that some workers were not paid correctly, or on time. We deeply regret and apologize to all of our workers," news agency ANI quoted the firm as saying.

"Our top priority is to ensure all workers are fully compensated immediately and we're working hard to achieve that. We've established an employee assistance program for workers at the facility. We're working diligently on corrective actions to ensure it doesn't happen again," it further said. Wistron is one of Apple's top global suppliers.

In a statement, the tech giant today said it is placing the firm on probation. "Our preliminary findings indicate violations of our Supplier Code of Conduct by failing to implement proper working hour management processes.

This led to payment delays for some workers in October and November," the statement read.

Anti-cattle slaughter Bill will hit farmers, tanners

THE BILL WILL HAVE ADVERSE ECONOMIC IMPLICATIONS ON DAIRY FARMERS WHO ARE ALREADY FACING AGRARIAN DISTRESS

Bangalore, Dec 20: Earlier this month, the BJP government in Karnataka passed the controversial Karnataka Prevention of Slaughter and Preservation of Cattle Bill, 2020.

The bill, which replaces the less-stringent 1964 cow protection legislation that prohibited slaughter of cows in the state, bans the slaughter of cattle, whose definition it has expanded to include "cow, calf of a cow and bull, bullock and he or she buffalo".

The bill, when implemented, will mean a blanket ban on beef in the southern state. The anti-cow slaughter legislation, which was passed amid loud protests by the Opposition, does not only have harsh provisions — 3-7 years of jail or/and steep fines up to ₹5 lakh, and sweeping powers to the police — it is also



set to have far-reaching adverse economic implications on dairy farmers who are already facing agrarian distress. Industries like leather and hotels are also going to take a huge hit.

Butchers in Shivajinagar beef market in central Bengaluru, which is one of the largest beef markets

in the city, are worried. The market supplies meat across the city, from smaller hotels to star hotels, besides getting hundreds of customers who buy fresh meat every day.

Behind the beef market is a small lane that leads to the office of Beef Merchants' Association of Karnataka, where Khasim Ajjaz

Quraishi, the president of the association, is in a meeting with the members. The bill, if implemented, Quraishi said, will impact the livelihood of more than 40 lakh people in the state who are dependent on beef and related trade.

Quraishi believes this is a politically motivated bill. "The government says they will protect cows, but see the condition of cow shelters. Cows are suffering and dying there." The 2020 Bill is a harsher version of a law passed by the BJP in 2010 with BS Yediyurappa as chief minister. It aimed at banning all forms of cattle slaughter by recommending stringent penalties for violators.

The bill was shelved in 2013 by the Siddaramaiah-led Congress government when it failed to get the Governor's assent. The Congress had then reverted to the Karnataka Prevention of Cow Slaughter and Preservation of Animals Act, 1964,

which banned killing of any cow or calf of she-buffalo. It, however, had certain relaxations — like it allowed slaughter of bullock, buffalo-male or female if it was certified by a competent authority to be above the age of 12 years, incapacitated for breeding or deemed sick.

Rushtum Shafiyya, secretary, Beef Merchants' Association of Karnataka, said, "We follow the 1964 Act and have never indulged in slaughtering cows. Bullocks and buffalos aged above 12 years are slaughtered in the presence of veterinarians deputed by the Animal Husband Department or BBMP local civic body."

Quraishi also highlighted that beef is consumed by a large number of people from low-income groups for its nutritional value, especially protein. "Beef is poor people's meat since they cannot afford mutton and chicken," he said.

Minister hints at free vaccine

Bangalore, Dec 20: Karnataka is likely to join the list of a few Indian states that have announced that the coronavirus vaccine will be distributed free of cost in the state.

Hinting at the same, Health and Medical Education Minister K Sudhakar said, "Either the Government of India or the Government of Karnataka or both together will ensure that the (costs of the Covid-19) vaccine to be rolled out will be taken care of in the interest of the people. Money is not an issue."

He was responding to queries raised by reporters in Bengaluru citing neighbouring state Kerala's recent promise of free Covid-19 vaccination for all in the state. Sudhakar also claimed that the state government has been taking proactive measures to ensure the pandemic is handled well.

"Right from Day 1, we have been offering free tests and treatment to



many. We have tested over 1.2 crore people in the state for coronavirus free of cost. The government is proactive and committed to handling this pandemic," he said.

Meanwhile, the minister also reiterated that people should avoid New Year celebrations where they gather in huge numbers to avoid a further uptick in the rate of new Covid-19 cases in the state.

"Thousands congregate in congested places usually for New Year celebrations, especially in areas of Bengaluru and other urban areas, in a claustrophobic atmosphere. This should be avoided and the government has taken all measures to discourage such events this time," he said.

UNCERTAINTY OVER BOARD EXAMS

SCHOOLS CONDUCT PRE-BOARDS ONLINE

New Delhi, Dec 20: With no clarity yet on dates of board examinations next year, several schools are already conducting pre-board exams in online mode to ensure that students are fully prepared in time.

While the Ministry of Education (MoE) is yet to take a call on the dates of board exams for class 10 and 12, it has already clarified that the exams will be in pen and paper mode only.

Schools in Delhi are restricting to online exams while those in Gurgaon, Ghaziabad and Noida are also planning exams in blended mode as per easing of restrictions by respective state governments. "The CBSE conducted the NEET and JEE exams in 2020 during the pandemic in offline mode. This strongly indicates that students of grade 10 and 12 should prepare themselves for an offline examination. We managed to conduct pre-board exams in online mode, keeping in consideration safety



and security of staff and students.

"However, that amount of practice is not enough for pupils, we are exploring adopting offline mode of conducting exams as per the CBSE guidelines," said Priyanka Barara, Principal, MRG School, Rohini. According to Pallavi Upadhyaya, Principal, DPS-RNE Ghaziabad, the school has conducted online exams for pre-boards but is also planning to hold physical exams in January.

"Amidst the pandemic, we have been able to complete the academic syllabi for board classes and have con-

ducted the first pre-board examination virtually as per the CBSE guidelines issued according to the paper pattern. "We have conducted virtual sessions with students and parents and have ensured a fair exam. Our system has been designed to keep the exam fair for the invigilator and students," she said.

Upadhyaya said the question papers in PDF format are shared on MS platform and the students are given 3.5 hours to attempt the paper. "After attempting the paper, the students are directed to scan and email the answer sheets to the re-

spective teachers. However, the school certainly is planning to conduct the second pre-boards physically at school in January," she said.

Rashmi Biswal, principal, DAV Public School, Pushpanjali Vihar, said, "Most board exams are of 80 marks so we want to give students the practice of writing the whole exam and to make the experience simpler for them we have decided to divide each paper into two parts, so students can write and submit both parts in one day with an interval in between, or on two separate days."

"We were able to successfully conduct our first set of pre-board exams in online mode around the beginning of December. The upcoming pre-board exams are planned in offline mode along with practical tests. We will be ensuring full safety guidelines related to distancing and hygiene, and would expect the same cooperation from students and teachers as well," said Sangeeta Hajela, Principal, Delhi Public School Indrapuram.

Gandhinagar, Dec 20: The Border Security Force (BSF) has apprehended a Pakistani fisherman for intruding into Indian territory while taking advantage of rough seas and restricted visibility in Gujarat, the central paramilitary force said Sunday.

The fisherman has been identified as Khalid Hussain, 35, a resident of Shahbandar in Sindh province of Pakistan. The BSF troops of 108 Battalion caught the fisherman at 5.50 p.m. on Saturday while patrolling in general area Sir Creek - a 96-km tidal estuary in the uninhabited marshlands of the Indus River Delta on the border between India and Pakistan. In a statement, the BSF said its patrolling team observed the "Pakistan fishing boat which had intruded into Indian territory, taking advantage of rough sea state and restricted visibility".

IMA moves SC over 'mixopathy'

New Delhi, Dec 20: The Indian Medical Association (IMA) has moved the Supreme Court against a Central Council of Indian Medicine (CCIM) order to authorise postgraduate practitioners in specified streams of Ayurveda system of medicine to be trained to perform general surgical procedures.

"The petition was filed Saturday to urge the court to set aside or quash the amendment to regulations to the Postgraduate Ayurveda Surgery by CCIM and declare that the council does not have the powers to include modern medicine in syllabus," IMA President Dr Rajan Sharma said.

The central government had allowed PG students of Ayurveda to perform various kinds of general surgery and medical procedures, including orthopaedic, ophthalmology, ENT and dental, by notifying an amendment in a gazette notification the CCIM issued in November.

The latest amendment allows PG Ayurveda students to receive for-



mal training for such procedures. The training modules for surgical procedures will be added to the curriculum of Ayurvedic studies.

The CCIM amended the Indian Medicine Central Council (Postgraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016, to include the aforementioned regulation to allow the PG students of Ayurveda system to practice general surgery.

The move has drawn a lot of criticism from doctors of modern medicine, leading to a series of protests by IMA members across the country this month. Lakhs of doctors, including those employed in government hospitals, wore black armbands at work and hit the streets

in small groups to agitate against the CCIM's notification. The IMA has been openly opposing such policy moves by the Centre, especially the plan to mix modern medicine with the traditional systems of Ayurveda, Yoga and Naturopathy, Unani, Siddha, and Homoeopathy (AYUSH) in coming years. Sharma had earlier said that an integrative system of medicine would create a "khichdi medical system" and produce hybrid doctors.

The apex body of private practitioners of modern medicine had also condemned the Centre's ambitious 'one nation one system' policy in medical education and called it a cocktail of disaster.

Man flees after marrying two women in five days

Khandwa, Dec 20: A 26-year-old software engineer allegedly married two women in five days in Madhya Pradesh and then fled, police said Sunday.

Based on a cheating complaint filed by a woman's family here on Saturday, the police are conducting a probe into the matter. Khandwa's Kotwali police station inspector B L Mandloi said.

The accused, resident of Musakhedi area in Indore, allegedly married a woman in Khandwa December 2 and another woman at Mhow in Indore on December 7, the official said quoting the complaint.

According to the complaint, one of the Khandwa victim's relative who had gone to a wedding dinner in Mhow tehsil of Indore sent photographs to her family through mobile phone on December 7 of the accused's second marriage in five days, the

police officer said. Subsequently, the Khandwa woman's family lodged a police complaint here, seeking registration of an FIR against the accused. The complaint also stated that the accused, after marrying the woman here, took her to his place in Indore. After a few days, he told her that he had to go to Bhopal for some unavoidable work, but, he went to Mhow to marry another woman, the official said.

On December 2, the accused had come for the wedding here with his parents, brothers, sister and other relatives, he said. When the Khandwa victim's family spoke to the woman with whom the accused tied the knot in Indore, she told them that her marriage was arranged and not a forced one, as per the complaint. After December 7, the accused did not return home and switched off his mobile phone, Mandloi said. Search was underway for the absconding accused, he added.

INDIA, VIETNAM EXPECTED TO INK PACTS TODAY

New Delhi, Dec 20: India and Vietnam are likely to seal a number of agreements and make certain announcements to further expand overall ties including in areas of defence, energy and healthcare at a virtual summit between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his Vietnamese counterpart Nguyen Xuan Phuc Monday, official sources said.

The evolving situation in the Indo-Pacific is expected to figure prominently in the talks as both countries have shared interest in a free, open, peaceful, prosperous and a rules-based regional order, they said.

In the summit, the two sides are also likely to issue a joint vision for future development of 'India-Vietnam Comprehensive Strategic Partnership' with an aim to chart a new course of enhanced cooperation in a range of areas, they said.



KCR back to old games

After a virtual drubbing at the Hyderabad Municipal Corporation polls, Telangana Chief Minister K Chandrashekar Rao is back at his old games. He is trying to tell the BJP that he was never against the party and that his real fight is with the Congress. KCR had managed to convince the Congress high command way back in 2014

that he would merge his Telangana Rashtriya Samiti if his demand for the creation of the Telangana state, by bifurcating Andhra Pradesh, was fulfilled. Just ahead of the 2014 general elections, the United Progressive Alliance government agreed to divide Andhra Pradesh. But what he actually did? KCR went on to finish off the Congress in Telangana by refusing to merge.

Instead, he took the credit of creating a separate state and in the process virtually destroyed the Congress in the state. Now he is doing the same with the Prime Minister and the BJP. The unexpected performance of the BJP in corporation polls seems to have brought KCR on his knees now. He came to Delhi last week for a three-day visit and went about meeting top BJP ministers. He was photographed presenting a shawl to the home minister, Amit Shah. Incidentally, Shah is the same

person who had launched a bitter attack on KCR seeking to make the BJP the main challenger to the ruling TRS.

Yechury new Oppn coordinator

CPM general secretary Sitaram Yechury seems to be emerging as the new coordinator of the Opposition parties against the BJP. Though certain media reports said Rahul Gandhi was the chief architect of the Opposition leaders calling on the President together. It now surfaces that it was not Rahul Gandhi but Sitaram Yechury who coordinated these efforts and took the first initiative. Normally, veteran socialist Sharad Yadav used to coordinate such efforts. But he has been hospitalised for two months due to Covid and related health issues. The death of Ahmed Patel

was another body blow to the Opposition who had a following cutting across party lines. The Congress has not chosen to appoint anybody for the role played by Patel. It was at this juncture that Sitaram Yechury donned the mantle.

Modi's solo show

Prime Minister Modi is creating a history and wants to leave behind a historic mark. After he singularly stole the show at Ayodhya by laying the foundation stone of a massive Ram temple this year, he went on to build a new Parliament House building complex. In Ayodhya, he took the plea that it was the Ram Janmabhoomi Nyas which invited him to lay the foundation stone. It was also explained that if L K Advani, Murli Manohar Joshi and other seniors were not invited to

the event, the question better be addressed to the Nyas. Eyebrows were raised in the absence of the President, Ramnath Kovind also. But it was explained by the Lok Sabha Secretariat that the President had been overlooked by the members of the Gandhi family on two previous occasions. First when the foundation stone-laying ceremony Parliament Annex building was laid by the then Prime Minister Indira Gandhi. The President was not present when she laid the foundation stone. The President was not present when late Rajiv Gandhi laid the foundation stone of the Parliament's library building. While the Speaker of the Lok Sabha, Om Birla was present and Deputy chairman of the Rajya Sabha was also witness to the ceremony, they were not part of the foundation stone pooja. Why M Venkaiah Naidu did not show up for the

prayer meeting continues to baffle the political class.

The Sikh factor

Farmers to observe hunger strike today

New Delhi, Dec 20: Intensifying their agitation against the Centre's new agri laws, farmers Sunday announced that they will observe a day-long relay hunger strike on Monday at all sites of protest here and halt toll collection on highways in Haryana from December 25 to 27.

Thousands of farmers, mainly from Punjab and Haryana, are protesting against the laws for the last over four weeks at various border points of Delhi and demanding that the legislations be repealed.

"Farmers will begin a day-long relay hunger strike Monday at all sites of protest against the new agri laws. It will be started by a team of 11 members at protests sites here, including the Singhu border," Swaraj India Chief Yogendra Yadav said and added that "we appeal to everyone at all protest sites across the nation to participate in the same".

"Protesters are being threatened by the Haryana government. This is against the direction of the Supreme Court. I urge them to stop harassing farmers from tomorrow," he said at a press conference at the Delhi-Haryana Singhu border.

The Supreme Court on Thursday had said that the farmers agitation should be allowed to continue "without impediment" and this court will not "interfere" with it as the right to protest is a fundamental right. It had also put a sole caveat that there should not be any breach of peace either by farmers or police. While announcing the

next move by protesting farmers after their hunger strike, farmer leader Jagjeet Singh Dalewala said farmers will halt toll collection on highways in Haryana from December 25 to 27.

"From December 25 to 27 all toll booths in Haryana will not be allowed by us to collect toll, we will halt them from doing so. On December 27, our prime minister will say his Mann ki baat' and we want to appeal to people to beat 'thalis' during his address," the Bharatiya Kisan Union (BKU) leader said at the press conference.

The 'Mann Ki Baat' is Prime Minister Narendra Modi's monthly radio address to the nation. Farmer leader and senior BKU member Rakesh Tikait, who was also part of the press conference, said that farmers protesting the new agri laws will celebrate Kisan Diwas on December 23 and "we request people to not cook lunch for a day".

Earlier in the day, the protesting agriculturists paid tributes to farmers who died during the agitation and also lit candles in their memory. The All India Kisan Sangharsh Coordination Committee (AIKSSC) also wrote to various traders' unions requesting their support to the on-going farmers' agitation.

Farmers are protesting against the Farmers (Empowerment and Protection) Agreement of Price Assurance and Farm Services Act, 2020, the Farmers Produce Trade and Commerce (Promotion and Facilitation) Act, 2020, and the Essential Commodities (Amendment) Act, 2020.

Revamp forest department in Delhi: NGT

New Delhi, Dec 20: The National Green Tribunal (NGT) has directed the authorities concerned to revamp the forest department in Delhi appropriately for the protection of environment and a meaningful enforcement of the rule of law.

A bench headed by NGT Chairperson Justice Adarsh Kumar Goel took note of a report filed by the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, Department of Forests on the issue of filling of posts. According to the report, the sanctioned posts were taken out of the purview of the Delhi Subordinate Services Selection Board (DSSSB) and the Department of Forest and Wildlife, Government of NCT of Delhi undertook the process of recruitment of a total of 226 vacant sanctioned posts of four forest rangers, 211 forest guards and 11 wildlife guards.

North India reels under cold wave

New Delhi, Dec 20: Cold wave conditions continued across north India on Sunday, with most places in Jammu and Kashmir and Himachal Pradesh experiencing sub-zero temperatures and Delhi recording the season's lowest temperature so far.

The national capital recorded the coldest morning of the season so far at 3.4 degrees Celsius, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) said.

On Saturday the minimum temperature at the Safdarjung Observatory, which provides representative data for the city, had settled at 3.9 degrees Celsius. "The observatory recorded a minimum of 3.4 degrees Celsius, five notches below normal, on Sunday morning. The maximum temperature is likely to settle around 22 degrees Celsius," an IMD official said. The

mercury dipped to 3.3 degrees Celsius at Lodhi Road as icy winds from the snow-laden Western Himalayas barreled through the city, the IMD said. There was some improvement in the minimum temperatures across Kashmir on Sunday but the valley continued to experience sub-zero nights, even as the 40-day harshest winter period -- "Chillai-Kalan" -- starts from Monday, MeT officials said. The night temperature rose slightly across the

valley owing to a cloud cover; but the minimum still settled below the freezing point, they added. Srinagar, the summer capital of Jammu and Kashmir, recorded a low of minus 6.2 degrees Celsius, slightly up from the previous night's minus 6.6 degrees Celsius, the officials said. Icy winds swept through the hills of Himachal Pradesh as several places recorded sub-zero temperatures, the meteorological department said. The tribal district of Lahaul-Spiti's

administrative centre, Keylong, continued to be the coldest place in the state at minus 11 degrees Celsius, Met centre, Shimla Director Manmohan Singh said.

Keylong, Kalpa, Manali and Mandi shivered at sub-zero temperatures in the last 24 hours. The cold wave conditions sweeping Punjab and Haryana for the last few days continued unabated, with Adampur recording a minimum temperature of zero degree Celsius, the IMD said.

While Adampur was the coldest place in Punjab, Amritsar too reeled under an intense chill, recording a low of one degree Celsius. In Haryana, Karnaul was the coldest place, recording a low of 2.4 degrees Celsius.

Cold wave conditions prevailed in Rajasthan too, with the state's only hill station, Mount Abu, recording a low of minus 1.5 degrees Celsius, the IMD said.

Nirav's brother charged in \$2.6mn fraud in New York

New Delhi/ New York, Dec 20: Nehal Modi, the brother of fugitive jewellery merchant Nirav Modi, has been charged by a New York prosecutor in an alleged \$2.6 million fraud carried out through a multi-layered scheme to cheat one of the world's biggest diamond companies.

Announcing the charges against Nehal Modi on Friday, the prosecutor, Cy Vance, said, "While diamonds may be forever, this flawed scheme was not, and now Mr Modi will face the clarity of a New York Supreme Court indictment."

Modi was charged in the state supreme court with "grand larceny in the first degree" for allegedly "fraudulently obtaining over \$2.6 million worth of diamonds from a diamond wholesale company located in Manhattan," said Vance, who is the prosecutor for the city's Manhattan district.

The crime of grand larceny in the first degree under New York State



laws is theft involving more than \$1 million and it carries a maximum penalty of 25 years in prison.

According to the New York Post, Modi told the court he was not guilty of the charge and was released without bail.

In a short video on the Post site, Modi is seen walking with a man who may be his lawyer in what appears to be the corridor of a court building in Manhattan, said Vance, who is the prosecutor for the city's Manhattan district.

Asked about the case, he replied, "There's nothing about the case." Asked about the Interpol notice, the man accompanying him, said, "We are not discussing anything

about the case, I told you that." Nehal Modi is wanted in India in connection with an alleged Rs 13,500 crore (about \$1.9 billion) fraud involving the Punjab National Bank, and at the request of India the Interpol has issued a Red Notice, which is a request to law enforcement worldwide to arrest him pending extradition.

Under the judicial procedure in New York, the prosecutors first presented the case to a grand jury -- a panel of citizens -- to determine if there was a prima facie case to proceed with prosecution. The grand jury indicted him -- a finding that there were enough grounds to charge him.

The alleged crime goes back to 2015 when Nehal Modi asked a company identified as LLD Diamonds USA to obtain over \$2.6 million worth of diamonds with "false representations", some of which he pawned for loans and sold the rest as steeply discounted prices, the prosecution said in a statement.

CBSE board exams' schedule on Dec 22

New Delhi, Dec 20: The schedule of Central Board of Secondary Education exams for Classes 10 and 12 proposed to be held next year through the paper-pen mode is likely to be announced Tuesday, official sources said.

Union Education Minister Ramesh Pokhriyal Nishank is expected to make the important announcement regarding the examination dates. As part of the central government initiative to conduct examinations on time amid the pandemic, the Minister has planned a three-way dialogue with the students, parents and teachers across the country. CBSE officials have clarified that there is no proposal to hold the board exams online.

Authorities have been holding discussions this year with students, parents and teachers regarding the board exams even as schools and colleges across the country are in the process of resuming normal classroom teachings for various classes in December 2020 and January 2021.

Govt plans to measure depth of Himalayan glaciers



New Delhi, Dec 20: As global warming affects the Himalayas, the Ministry of Earth Sciences is planning to measure the depth of glaciers in the region to assess their volume and gauge the water available in them, officials said Sunday.

The project will start next summer, sometime in June-July, said, M Rajeevan, the ministry's secretary Ravichandran, the Director of the National Centre for Polar and Ocean Research (NCPOR), which will execute the project, said the country's remote and high-altitude research centre, Himansh, is also studying the Himalayan climate.

The centre was established in 2016. "The plan is to first study seven glaciers in the Chandra river basin," he said.

The Chandra river is a major tributary of the Chenab river which itself is a tributary of the Indus. The Himalayan glaciers are



a major source of water for rivers originating from there. The Himalayan rivers are also a life-line for the Indo-Gangetic plains, home to several million people.

The NCPOR director said while the area of the glaciers is already known with the help of satellites, what needs to be known is the volume. "The purpose of studying the depth of the glaciers is to understand the volume. This will also help us understand the availability of water and whether the glaciers are increasing or shrinking," Ravichandran added.

72% of nCoV-related cyberattacks coming via fake emails

HACKERS ARE USING MULTIPLE TACTICS TO DISGUISE MALICIOUS LINKS AND AVOID DETECTION BY URL PROTECTION SOLUTIONS

New Delhi, Dec 20: As cyberattacks grow in magnitude globally including in India, cyber criminals now prefer to use Covid-19 in scamming attacks that focus on fake cures and donations, compromising email accounts in Indian organisations.

In fact, 72 per cent of Covid-19-related attacks today are scamming or spear-phishing which is the fraudulent practice of sending emails ostensibly from a known or trusted sender in order to induce targeted individuals to reveal confidential information.

In comparison, 36 per cent of overall attacks were found coming from scammers. "Nearly 13 per cent of all spear-phishing attacks come from internally compromised accounts, so organisations need to invest in protecting their internal email traffic as much as they do in protecting from external senders," according to the report from cloud-enabled security solutions provider Barracuda Networks.

Business email compromise (BEC) attacks are increasing as cybercriminals see how lucrative this type of attack can be. Attackers' exploitation of fears around the COVID-19 pandemic shows how



quickly they can adapt to current events. "A massive 71 per cent of spear-phishing attacks include ma-

licious URLs, but only 30 per cent of BEC attacks included a link," the findings showed.

"Hackers using BEC want to establish trust with their victims and expect a reply to their email, and the lack of a URL makes it harder to detect the attack". According to Murali Urs, Country Manager (India), Barracuda Networks, cybercriminals adapt very quickly when they find a new tactic or current event that they can exploit.

"Their response to the Covid-19 pandemic proved it too well. The organisations in India today are facing increasing threats from highly-targeted phishing attacks," he said. Hackers are using multiple tactics to disguise malicious links and

avoid detection by URL protection solutions. The report took an in-depth look at new tricks being used to successfully execute attacks -- spear phishing, business email compromise, pandemic-related scams, and other types.

"Business email compromise (BEC) makes up 12 per cent of the spear-phishing attacks analysed, an increase from 7 per cent in 2019," the report said. "The organisation must invest in technology to block attacks and provide training to help people act as a last line of defense and avoid falling victim to scammers' latest tricks," said Urs.



Islamabad: Pakistan Sunday summoned a senior Indian diplomat to register its protest over the alleged ceasefire violations by the Indian forces along the Line of Control (LoC). The Foreign Office alleged that a civilian sustained injuries due to the firing in the Rakchikri Sector Saturday. The Indian side was called upon to respect the 2003 Ceasefire Understanding, investigate this and other such incidents of ceasefire violations and maintain peace along the LoC and the Working Boundary.

Bomb blast kills 9

Kabul: A car bomb blast that rocked Afghanistan's capital Sunday morning killed at least nine people, according to the Afghan Interior Ministry. Interior Minister Masoud Andarabi told reporters at the site of the attack that the attack wounded around 20 others, including a member of parliament, Khan Mohammad Wardak. Andarabi said the lawmaker was in "good condition." The interior minister added that the casualty toll could rise further. The attack happened while the lawmaker's convey was passing through an intersection in Kabul's Khoshal Khan neighborhood.

London, Dec 20: A surge in the infection rate caused by a new variant of coronavirus has led to millions entering a stringent new stay-at-home lockdown in the UK from Sunday, with non-essential shops and businesses now closed.

UK Prime Minister Boris Johnson announced the new rules at a briefing from 10 Downing Street Saturday evening, which means a planned five-day "Christmas bubble" of relaxed rules has been cancelled in favour of a new Tier 4 level to the current three-tier lockdown system to try and control the surge in infections being caused by the new mutation of the deadly virus.

UK PM Boris Johnson announced the new rules at a briefing from 10 Downing Street, which means a planned five-day "Christmas bubble" of relaxed rules has been cancelled

"It seems that the spread is now being driven by the new variant of the virus," Johnson said. "We have alerted the World Health Organisation and are continuing to analyse the available data to improve our understand-

ing," said Professor Chris Whitty, the Chief Medical Officer for England.

"There is no current evidence to suggest the new strain causes a higher mortality rate or that it affects vaccines and treatments although urgent work is underway to confirm this," he said.

The state-funded National Health Service (NHS) is set to vaccinate people against the coronavirus on Christmas Day as part of a drive to accelerate the number of inoculations nationally, according to 'The Sunday Times'. More than 100,000 Pfizer jabs have been booked at general practitioner (GP) surgeries and hospital hubs across the country for the coming week.

Under the new Tier 4, people would be banned from mixing with anyone outside of their household, including on Christmas Day, and for the other tiers, Christmas rules allowing up to three households will now be limited to Christmas Day of December 25 only, rather than five days. The changes will last for two weeks with the first review now due December 30.

The new restrictions - similar to the second national lockdown which ended in November - applies to all areas in the South East which were in tier three, covering Kent, Buckinghamshire, Berkshire, Surrey (excluding Waverley), Gosport, Havant, Portsmouth, Rother and Hastings.

Pak govt cancels fake licences of 50 pilots

Islamabad, Dec 20: The Pakistan government has cancelled the licences of 50 pilots for flying with fake credentials and authorities will probe how they obtained the certificates through unfair means, the country's Civil Aviation Authority has informed a top court here.

The issue of fake licences surfaced in the wake of the tragic crash of a Pakistan International Airlines plane in Karachi May 22, killing 97 people, when Minister of Aviation Ghulam Sarwar Khan told the media that 260 of the country's 860 active pilots had either fake licences or had cheated in their exams. Their names were made public to avoid any negative impression about other pilots, including those working outside Pakistan.

Dawn newspaper reported that authorities told the Islamabad high court that under the requirements of the International Civil Aviation Organisation, they have reviewed licences of 860 commercial pilots and cancelled 50 of them.

As end approaches, Trump gets doses of flattery, finality

New York, Dec 20: President Donald Trump's administration is ending how it began, with over-the-top declarations of praise for the chief executive.

But now the flattery is mixed with a sense of finality as key people in the president's orbit are beginning to turn the page and acknowledge his defeat.

Trump himself keeps to the Oval Office, still fighting the Election Day results and offering scant acknowledgement of the death and suffering Americans are bearing in the darkest hours of the COVID-19 pandemic.

In a week when the Electoral College made official President-elect Joe Biden's victory, Trump remained out of sight, staying late in the Oval Office and working the phones and television remote in his private dining area just steps from the Resolute Desk.

While he made not one public appearance, some of those who have been his most influential allies and loyal defenders gave up the fight, letting the president down as gently as possible.

Attorney General William Barr offered his resignation last Monday



In a week when the Electoral College made official President-elect Joe Biden's victory, Trump remained out of sight, staying late in the Oval Office

after weeks of tension with Trump brought about an early exit from his post.

Long seen as one of Trump's most supportive Cabinet members, Barr in recent weeks and months had drawn Trump's wrath for not supporting the president's baseless claims of election fraud or for not publicly pursuing an investigation into Biden's son Hunter.

But when Barr stepped aside, he did so with flowery language reminiscent of the compliments that were tossed as verbal bouquets at Trump during early Cabinet meetings.

"Your record is all the more historic because you accomplished it in the face of relentless, implacable resistance," Barr wrote in his resignation letter. Trump promptly tweeted it out, adding his own words of praise for the attorney general.

In the six weeks since his defeat by Biden, Trump has been increasingly disengaged from his job.

The virus has killed more than 300,000 Americans and is now claiming more than 3,000 lives a day, but the president has offered barely a word about the deaths or the development of the vaccine that could bring an end to the pandemic.

South Korea registers highest daily Covid-19 cases

Seoul, Dec 20: South Korea Sunday reported 1,097 new coronavirus cases, the highest-ever single-day spike after staying above 1,000 for five straight days, raising the overall infection tally to 49,665.

The daily number of infections hovered above 100 for 43 days since November 8 due to small cluster infections in Seoul and its surrounding Gyeonggi province, as well as imported cases, reports Xinhua news agency.

For the past week, the daily average number of infections was 966.

The cluster infections were linked to religious facilities, nursing homes and workplaces, as well as gatherings among families and acquaintances.



Of the new cases, 470 were Seoul residents and 244 were people residing in Gyeonggi province.

Twenty-five were imported from overseas, lifting the combined figure to 5,082. Fifteen more deaths were confirmed, increasing the death toll at 674. The total fatality rate stood at 1.36%.

A total of 388 more patients were discharged from quarantine after making full recovery, pulling up the combined number to 34,722.

The total recovery rate was 69.91 per cent. Since January 3, the country has tested more than 3.68 million people, among whom 3,493,954 tested negative for the virus and 139,475 are being checked.

China appoints new military commander amid Ladakh standoff

Beijing, Dec 20: Chinese President Xi Jinping has appointed a new General as the Commander of the People's Liberation Army's Western Theatre Command which oversees the China-India border, amidst the military standoff in eastern Ladakh.

President Xi, who heads the Central Military Commission (CMC), the overall high-command of the two million-strong People's Liberation Army (PLA), appointed Gen. Zhang Xudong as the Commander of the Western Theatre Command, according to the Chinese media.

Xi has promoted four senior Chinese military and armed police officers. Among them was Gen.



Zhang, Commander of the Western Theatre Command of the PLA, state-run Xinhua news agency reported Friday.

The other officers who were promoted include Guo Puxiao, Political Commissar of the Logistic Support Department of the CMC; Li Wei, Political Commissar of the PLA Strategic Support Force and Wang Chunning, Commander.

The new appointments at the top of the PLA Western Command comes in the midst of the standoff between the Chinese and Indian military in eastern Ladakh since May.

Not much is known about Gen. Zhang, especially his association with Western Theatre Command, as he reportedly served mostly in other theatre commands of the PLA.

He succeeds 65-year-old Gen. Zhao Zongqi who headed the Western Theatre Command during the 2017 Doklam standoff where the Indian Army stood up against the PLA's plan of laying a road close to the Indian border in an area claimed by Bhutan.

Sydney isolated from rest of Australia as outbreak grows

Sydney, Dec 20: Sydney was isolated from the rest of Australia Sunday after all of the country's states and territories imposed travel restrictions on its residents as a coronavirus cluster in the city grew to around 70.

The Australian Capital Territory (ACT) sent a stern 'do not come to us' message to Sydney; the country's most populous city of more than five million people, warning its residents they would be quarantined for 14 days if they arrived.

"If you are not an ACT resident and have been in greater Sydney...our message is simple: do not travel to the ACT," the ACT health department said. The states of Victoria and Queensland, and the Northern Territory, banned people arriving from Sydney as of Monday.

Queensland police will reintroduce road checkpoints at the New South Wales state border to help enforce the new declaration of greater Sydney as a COVID-19 hotspot.

South Australia state imposed a 14-day quarantine for Sydney arrivals on Sunday and banned travellers from affected suburbs. The island state of Tasmania took similar steps Saturday. Western Australia state imposed a hard border closure.

Pearl murder accused claims he is 'scapegoat': Pak lawyer

Islamabad, Dec 20: A lawyer representing the parents of slain US journalist Daniel Pearl has produced a handwritten letter in Pakistan's Supreme Court in which the key accused in the case claimed that he was a "scapegoat" arrested under "US pressure" and the real mastermind was a Karachi-based terrorist.

Pearl, the 38-year-old South Asia bureau chief for The Wall Street Journal, was abducted and beheaded while he was in Pakistan investigating a story in 2002 on the links between the country's powerful spy agency ISI and al-Qaeda. British-born al-Qaeda leader

Ahmed Omar Saeed Sheikh and his three aides were convicted and sentenced in the abduction and murder case of Pearl. In April, they were exonerated by the Sindh High Court and an appeal against their acquittal is being heard in the Supreme Court.

According to an Express Tribune report Sunday, Faisal Siddiqui, counsel for Pearl's parents, has produced the handwritten letter in the Supreme Court in which Sheikh claimed that the real culprit was a militant, Attaur Rehman, from Karachi.

Siddiqui told the apex court that the letter was submitted to the Sindh High Court July 19, 2019. In the letter, Sheikh claimed that

he was "a scapegoat" arrested on the "US pressure" and that the real culprit was Rehman.

The letter was produced during a hearing of the appeals against the acquittal of the four accused in the Pearl murder case. A three-judge special bench led by Justice Mushir Alam heard the appeals of the Sindh government and Pearl's parents, Ruth and Judie Pearl, against the high court ruling.

Siddiqui contended that the bench must consider it. However, the apex court will decide on it on the next date of hearing on January 4, the report said.

Sheikh further said in his letter that he had been in prison under the death sentence since 2002, charged



and convicted for the abduction and murder of Pearl. However, it was on public record that neither did he abduct Pearl nor did he murder him and it had been acknowledged by the US government and by



Pakistan's former president Pervez Musharraf in his book.

Sheikh said his role in this case was a relatively minor one, which did not warrant the death sentence, adding that he had already served

in prison - most of which has been in illegal solitary confinement.

According to the letter, the pressure on the Pakistan government at the time (in 2002) by the US was so intense that Sheikh was used as a "scapegoat" to lessen that pressure.

"Therefore, evidence was fabricated against me to convict me of the abduction and murder of Daniel Pearl," Sheikh claimed.

"Later, when the person (Rehman alias Naem Bukhari) who actually abducted Daniel was arrested, he was not charged with the case because to do so would have exposed the lies and perjured evidence that the Musharraf government used to convict me," he added.



Need multiple bad banks to address NPA issue: CII to Govt

In its pre-budget memorandum submitted to the government, the industry body has recommended the government to consider enabling FPIs and AIFs to purchase NPAs

New Delhi, Dec 20: The Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) has urged the government to consider creation of multiple bad banks to address the adverse impact of non-performing assets accumulated by public sector banks in the recent past, and which have got further accentuated during the pandemic.

In its pre-budget memorandum submitted to the government, the industry body has recommended the government to consider enabling Foreign Portfolio Investors (FPIs) and Alternative Investment Funds (AIFs) to purchase NPAs. CII President Uday Kotak said: "In the aftermath of Covid, it is important to find a resolution mechanism through a market determined price discovery. With huge liquidity, both globally and domestically multiple bad banks can address this issue in a transparent manner and get the credit cycle back in action."

As per the industry body, a robust market-based mechanism will encourage public sector banks to sell their bad loans, without fear of questions being raised later. With cleaner balance sheets, PSBs should be able to raise capital from the market, obviating the need for re-



capitalisation by government, a bill which the government can ill-afford to foot at this point of time, it said. The government has put in ₹80,000 crore in bank re-capitalisation in FY18, ₹1.08 lakh crore in FY19 and ₹70,000 crore in FY20. In September this year, the parliament approved another ₹20,000 crore of capital infusion into PSBs.

So far, the NPAs have largely been sold to Asset Reconstruction Companies (ARCs). Due to the limited capital that ARCs have, many sales are made not on cash basis but on security receipts (SR). SR is an instrument wherein the payment is made only upon recovery which means that the sale price is not a 'true sale'.

A CII statement on Sunday said that based on recent RBI data on outstanding SRs, industry estimates

that the net recovery rate of ARCs is low and may be in the range of only around 10-12 per cent. The outstanding SRs are ₹1.46 lakh crore. This represents the "non-cash" consideration received by banks against sale of loans, it noted.

The low recovery rates and the sale on the basis of SRs is not a very attractive proposition for banks. The best way to achieve true price discovery and better realizations is to open the buy side and enable a clear path for capital to flow for purchase of NPAs, as per the CII.

The buy side could be opened by allowing FPIs and AIFs to purchase NPAs, it said.

The RBI has already contemplated this in a consultative paper wherein, it has proposed that regulated entities may be permitted to purchase NPAs.

Our investment plans in India on track: Saudi

New Delhi, Dec 20: Saudi Arabia, the world's largest oil exporter, Sunday said its investment plans in India are on track, noting that the Indian economy has the strength to recover from the adverse impact of the coronavirus crisis.

In February last year, Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman announced that Saudi Arabia would invest over \$100 billion in India in petrochemicals, refining, infrastructure, mining and manufacturing, agriculture and several other sectors.

"Our plans to invest in India are on track and we are in discussion to prioritise investment opportunities in several sectors in both countries," Saudi Ambassador Dr Saud bin Mohammed Al Sati said.

Stating that Saudi Arabia values India as a strategic partner and a close friend, Al Sati identified ongoing cooperation in areas of training, knowledge sharing and combating terrorism as key elements of the partnership in defence and security sphere.

Al Sati complimented India's measures to revive its economy in view of the impact of the pandemic and said the economic re-



covery of both countries will help elevate other economies in the region as well.

"The economic relief package provided by India for its most prominent sectors is commendable. As the fifth-largest global economy and the largest economy in South Asia, the Indian economy has the impetus to recover from the impact of the ongoing pandemic," he said.

Without commenting on Army Chief Gen MM Naravane's visit to Saudi Arabia last week, the Ambassador said the setting up of the Strategic Partnership Council by the two countries opened new avenues of cooperation in several sectors including defence and security and counter-terrorism.

New Delhi, Dec 20: State-owned Oil and Natural Gas Corporation (ONGC) Sunday opened India's eighth hydrocarbon producing basin when it started oil flow from a well in the Bengal basin.

Oil production commenced from the well Asokenagar-1 in 24 Pargana district, the company said in a statement.

"The well Asokenagar-1 was completed as an oil producer under early monetisation plan issued by the Government of India," it said.

With this ONGC has discovered and put to production seven out of the eight hydrocarbon producing basins of India, covering 83 per cent of established oil and gas reserves.

ONGC is India's largest oil and gas producer contributing 72 per cent of the country's hydrocarbon production.



The Bengal basin is spread across nearly 1.22 lakh square kilometres, with nearly two-third of it falling under the waters of the Bay of Bengal. Till now, ONGC has invested ₹3,361 crore to explore hydrocarbon in the Bengal basin, the statement said adding ₹425 crore will be spent on exploration activities in the basin in the coming two years.

Net enrolments rises 56%: EPFO

New Delhi: Net new enrolments with retirement fund body EPFO rose by 56% to 11.55 lakh in October compared to 7.39 lakh in the same month last year, according to its latest payroll data, providing a perspective on formal sector employment amid the coronavirus pandemic. The net payroll additions, however, have registered a slight dip in October compared to 14.19 lakh in September this year, according to a statement by the Labour Ministry.

Kishore becomes IL&FS exec dir

Mumbai: Infrastructure Leasing and Financial Services (IL&FS) Sunday said the Ministry of Corporate Affairs has approved the appointment of Nand Kishore as the group's executive director. Till now, Kishore was serving on the IL&FS board as non-executive director, the company said in a release. "Based on the recommendation of the Nomination and Remuneration Committee, the IL&FS board in its meeting held December 19, 2020," the release said.

BoB completes integration

Mumbai: State-run Bank of Baroda (BoB) Sunday said it has completed integration of 3,898 branches of erstwhile Vijaya Bank and Dena Bank with itself. In a first three-way amalgamation, Vijaya Bank and Dena Bank were merged with Bank of Baroda from April 1, 2019. The bank has completed the integration of 1,770 erstwhile Dena Bank branches in December 2020, and had earlier completed the integration of 2,128 erstwhile Vijaya Bank branches in September 2020, the lender said in a release.

Oriflame records 25% growth

New Delhi: Direct selling beauty brand Oriflame has witnessed around 25% increase in number of sales partners in India during COVID-impacted 2020, a top company official said. The company recorded higher growth in sales in the third and fourth quarter, and expects to cover up the loss of business in the second quarter due to imposition of lockdown in the country, Oriflame VP and Head of South Asia and MD of India Frederic Widell said.

5G connected cars to take 40% of Chinese market by 2025

New Delhi, Dec 20: 5G connected car sales volume in China will reach 7.1 million units in 2025, accounting for 40% of the country's total connected car sales volume, according to latest research.

The sales volume of 4G connected cars are expected to reach 7.8 million units in 2020 to account for 95% of the country's total connected car sales volume, according to Counterpoint Research's Smart Automotive service.

However, with 5G seeing a fast rollout in China and the automotive industry expected to grow faster starting 2021, the share of 5G connected car sales volume will show rapid growth.



"Despite the impact of COVID-19, China's connected car sales volume are expected to reach 8.2 million units in 2020, a slight increase of 0.8% Yo-Y from the 8.1 million units shipped in 2019," said Senior Analyst Aman Madhok.

In terms of the global share, China is expected to grab 26.8 per cent of the sales volume in 2020, becoming the second-largest con-

nected car market.

With a projected share of 30%, the US will continue to lead the market while Europe will take the third spot, but with almost the same volume as China.

The three state-owned telecom operators in China - China Mobile, China Unicom, and China Telecom - are expected to invest around \$184 billion in 5G networks by 2025.

Luxury brands Mercedes Benz, BMW, and Audi have been offering 4G connectivity in most cars since Q1 2019. After Huawei released the world's first 5G telematics module (MH5000) in April 2019, Audi quickly deployed it in its passenger cars and showcased it at the Beijing-Chongli Expressway demonstration in 2019-end.

Guwahati, Dec 20: Due to its close proximity with five countries, unique culture and traditions besides picturesque beauty of its mountains and lush green landscapes, northeast India could be an ideal tourist destination post-Covid, experts and administrators said on the final day of the North East Festival (NEF) here Sunday.

The two-day 8th edition of NEF concluded after setting the NE growth agenda as its priority with businessmen, administrators and experts expressing their strong confidence on the travel and tourism industry's revival in post Covid situation, by showcasing potentials of the region.

Assam Tourism Secretary Ravze Hussain said that Covid-19 can be a blessing in disguise.

"All northeastern states can be a great tourism destination. Focus should be on tea tourism where old bungalows can get converted to boutique hotels. Experiencing the life of a tea planter here can be a tourist attraction. Chopper service availability from Guwahati to Kaziranga, Majuli etc will also help the tourism industry here," he said.

Assam Tourism Department Director Deba Kumar Mishra said that focus on local tourism, more from domestic tourists, creatively planned projects for establishments of good tourism would attract and

appeal more people. Mishra said: "Northeast region shares borders of different countries and it is an incredible boon. Assam has 'Chicken-Neck' with West Bengal and five international frontiers along the eight northeastern states are best for tourism.

Stress on eco-cultural tourism, flourishing more local commodities, local lifestyle and food could boost the tourism industry."

"One more major focus is in 'Medical Tourism'. Need to wel-



come high level and leading tours from Mumbai, Telangana, Delhi and other big states. We are blessed with resources, we have to think with regional perspective," the Director added.

Budget airliner Spicejet's Chief Operating Officer (Sea Plane department) Santanu Kalita claimed

that seaplanes can bring revolution in the tourism sector.

"Northeast is a God gifted and most beautiful natural land in India. We will see and reflect on the fly plan scheme, Guwahati to Kaziranga to Dima Hasao. We have sufficient eight months to set the fly plan scheme which will result in concern

more in the act of flourishing of tourism," Kalita said

North Eastern Council Adviser R. Lalrodingi, in his address in the valedictory session, said that the local people must get benefits from tourism. Stressing on the creation of community based tourism, he said: "We must think straight and properly organise it. Good marketing is essential.

One main factor to be highlighted is within the northeast area must have an operational area for more organised and systematic tourism. Let people learn more about their own region to speak more about their own region to prepare a good atmosphere for tourists."

In the concluding session, NEF's chief organiser Shyamkanu Mahanta said: "We need support at the initial stage in the tourism sector."


