SC ruling on farm laws today

SC PULLS UP CENTRE, SAYS EXTREMELY DISAPPOINTED WITH NEGOTIATION PROCESS BETWEEN GOVT & FARMERS

New Delhi, Jan 11: The Supreme Court Monday pulled up the Centre for its handling of the farmers protest against the new farm laws, saying it is "extremely disappointed" with the way negotiations between them were going and it will constitute a committee headed by a former Chief Justice of India to resolve the impasse. The court said, it will pronounce orders Tuesday on various issues related to the new farm laws.

Indicating amply that it may go to the extent of staying the implementation of the contentious farm laws, the apex court refused to grant extra time to

the Centre to explore the possibility of amicable solution saying it has already granted the government a "long rope". "We have given you long rope, Mr Attorney General, please don't lecture us on patience," a bench headed by Chief Justice S A Bobde said.

Solicitor General Tushar Mehta told the bench, also comprising Justices AS Bopanna and V Ramasubramanian, that the top court has made "harsh observations" regarding handling of the situation by the government.

"That was the most innocuous factual thing for us to say," the bench said. The apex court, which said it will pass orders on the issue concerning farm laws and farmers' protest in part

in the matter, asked the parties to suggest two-three names of former CJIs including former CJI RM Lodha who can head the apex court-appointed panel. At the outset, the bench said, "What is going on? States are rebelling against your laws". "We are extremely disappointed with the negotiation process," it said, adding, "We don't want to make any stray observations on your negotiations but we are extremely disappointed with the process." The apex court, which was hearing a clutch of pleas challenging the new farm laws as well as the ones raising

issues related to the ongoing agitation at Delhi borders, said it is not talking about the repeal of these farm laws at the moment. "This is a very delicate situation," the bench said, adding, "There is not a single petition before us which says that these farm laws are beneficial". "We are not experts on economy; you tell us whether the government is going to put on hold farm laws or we will do this," the bench said. "We are sorry to say that Centre has not been able to solve the problem and the farmers agitation." Attorney General K K Venugopal argued that a


Stay not a solution: Farmer leaders

New Delhi: Farmer leaders Monday said they would continue their agitation even if the government or the Supreme Court stays the implementation of the new agri laws. The farmer leaders were also of the view that a stay is "not a solution" as it is only for a fixed period of time. They were reacting after the SC indicated that it may stay the implementation of the farm laws and refused to grant more time to the Centre to explore the possibility of an amicable solution saying it has already granted the government a "long rope". "We welcome the SC observation, but ending the stir is not an option. Any stay is only for a fixed period of time... till the issue is taken up by the court again," farmer leader Gurnam Singh Chaduni said.

law cannot be stayed unless the court finds it violates fundamental rights or constitutional schemes. "Our intention is to see whether we can find an amicable solution to all this. That is why we had asked you (Centre) whether you are willing to keep these laws on hold for sometime. But you wanted to buy time," the bench said.

PANEL LIKELY

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court will pronounce orders on Tuesday on various issues related to the new farm laws and the farmers' ongoing protest at Delhi borders and may take a call on setting up of a committee headed by a former Chief Justice of India (CJI) to find ways to resolve the impasse. A bench, headed by Chief Justice S A Bobde, which indicated during the hearing that it may pass orders in parts on the issues concerning farm laws and farmers' protest, later uploaded the information on the website. "List these matters tomorrow i.e. 12.01.2021, for orders," said the bench which also comprised justices A S Bopanna and V Ramasubramanian.

India returns captured PLA soldier to China

NEW DELHI: The Indian Army on Monday handed back to China a soldier of the Chinese People's Liberation Army (PLA), three days after apprehending him at the southern bank of Pangong Tso in eastern Ladakh, official sources said. The soldier was returned to China at the Chushul-Moldo border point in eastern Ladakh at 10.10 am, they added. The Chinese soldier was captured at the southern bank of Pangong lake in the early hours of Friday after he transgressed across the Indian side of the Line of Actual Control (LAC). "The PLA soldier, who was apprehended on January 8, was handed back to China at Chushul-Moldo at 10.10 am on Monday," a source said. Indian and Chinese troops are locked in a tense border standoff in eastern Ladakh for over eight months. The faceoff began in May last year, following a clash between the two sides. PB

Bird flu outbreak in 10 states confirmed

New Delhi, Jan 11: The Centre Monday said bird flu has been confirmed in 10 states so far and stressed on increased surveillance around water bodies, live bird markets, zoos and poultry farms.

"Till January 11, 2021, Avian Influenza has been confirmed in 10 states of the country," the department of animal husbandry and dairying said in a statement.

The outbreak was confirmed in seven states - Kerala, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, Haryana, Gujarat and Uttar Pradesh - as on January 10. On Monday, bird flu has also been confirmed in Delhi, Uttarakhand and Maharashtra.

States have been asked to build awareness among the public and avoid the spread of misinformation. "States/ UTs have been requested to increase surveillance around water bodies, live bird markets, zoos, poultry farms, etc. Along with proper disposal of carcass, and strengthening of biosecurity in poultry farms," it said.

Transmission to humans unlikely

NEW DELHI: The Centre Monday asked states not to close mandis or restrict sales of poultry products as there are no scientific reports of transmission of bird flu to human beings. The outbreak of bird flu or avian influenza (AI) has been confirmed in 10 states so far. Briefing reporters, Minister of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying Giriraj Singh said there have been no scientific reports on transmission of bird flu to humans and consumers should not be scared.

The Centre has also directed states to maintain adequate stock of PPE kits and accessories required for culling operations. It has asked state animal husbandry departments to ensure effective communication and coordination with health authorities for close vigilance of the disease status and avoid any chances of transmission of the disease into humans.

Meanwhile, the department said that ICAR-NIHSAD has confirmed the death of crows and migratory/wild birds in Tonk, Karauli, Bhiwar districts of Rajasthan as well as Valsad, Vadodara and Surat districts of Gujarat.

UG, PG FINAL YR CLASSES RESUME

Bhubaneswar, Jan 11: Classes in colleges and universities in the state resumed from January 11 for the students of final year in undergraduate and post-graduate courses. The higher education department had issued guidelines for the colleges and universities January 3.

Apart from colleges and universities, technical universities, engineering/professional colleges, diploma/post diploma institutions of the state under the administrative control of the skill development and technical education (SDTE) department also commence their physical classroom teaching for the final year students of PG/UG/Diploma/Post diploma programmes from Monday.

The penultimate semester exams for the students of UG/PG courses will be held from March 16 to March 31 and the final semester examinations will take place between June 16 and June 30, a notification issued by the Higher Education department said. Higher education minister Arun Sahoo Monday visited several colleges in the city and talked with students and asked them to follow the Covid guidelines during the classes.

The government decided to reopen colleges and universities considering the improvement in Covid-19 situation in the state and the huge academic loss of students due to the pandemic situation. The students while entering the premises had



to carry Covid negative reports with them. "The state public universities and government as well as non-government degree colleges (coming under HE department) are hereby directed to commence physical classroom teaching for students of 2020-21 final year UG/PG courses from 11-01-2021 (Monday)," the notification said. For UG students, the government also issued norms for the conduct of classroom teaching which should be held in a regular manner to cover all chapters of the syllabus irrespective of coverage of some chapters by online mode. "Whenever possible, physical classroom teaching shall be recorded and shared with absentee students," the guideline said adding that Covid-19 prevention protocols need to be followed. It has been made mandatory for all the persons coming to colleges and universities to wear facemasks. Social distancing should be maintained in classrooms and, if needed, crowded classes can be divided into batches and teaching hours in a day can be extended.

Covid breaks traditions: In a first, Budget to go paperless

New Delhi, Jan 11: The voluminous budget documents will not be printed this year following the Covid-19 protocol and will instead be distributed electronically to the Members of Parliament (MPs).

This will be the first time since the presentation of independent India's first budget November 26, 1947, that the documents containing income and expenditure statement of the Union government along with finance bill, detailing new tax and other measures for the new financial year, will not be physically printed. Due to COVID-19, it has been decided not to print documents related to the Union Budget for the fiscal beginning April (FY 2021-22), sources said.

All MPs will get soft copies of the budget and Economic Survey that contains an account of the state of the economy. The printing of documents requires staff to be locked up in the basement print-

ing press of the finance ministry couple of weeks ahead of the presentation of the Budget. The printing all these years began with a 'Halwa' ceremony that marked the staff going into the basement press only to emerge after the budget is presented.

This will be the first time since independence that physical copies of budget documents will not be shared with MPs to avoid the risk of COVID-19 infection, the sources said, adding all MPs will get soft copies of the Budget and Economic Survey. The familiar sight of trucks loaded with budget papers in Parliament on the budget day and scanning of these by security guard will also be given a miss.

The budget for FY22 will come on the backdrop of an economic contraction of 7.7 per cent, the first time in the history of independent India. So, all stakeholders have great expectation from the upcoming Budget, which could provide a healing touch to the pandemic-battered



economy and push growth. Even Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman last month promised a "never before" like Union Budget to the people of India. While invest-

ment in health, medical Research and Development (R&D) and developing greater skills to handle telemedicine is going to be critical, livelihood challenges will have

to be seen in a newer canvas with the latest perspective on vocational training and skill development. "Send me your inputs so that we can see a budget which is a budget like never before, in a way 100 years of India wouldn't have seen a Budget being made post-pandemic like this. "And that is not going to be possible unless I get your inputs and wish list, clear observation of what has put you through the challenge... Without that, it is impossible for me to draft something which is going to be that Budget like never before, a Budget which is being made after a pandemic," Sitharaman had said.

The Union Budget for 2021-22, the eighth Budget of Prime Minister Narendra Modi-led government, is scheduled to be presented in Parliament on February 1, 2021. Sitharaman will be presenting her third full-time Budget.

The Modi-led government scrapped a colonial-era tradition of presenting the budget at the end

of February. Then Finance Minister Arun Jaitley had for the first time presented the annual accounts February 1, 2017.

With the budget date being advanced, the ministries are now allocated their budgeted funds from the start of the financial year beginning April. This gives government departments more leeway to spend as well as allow companies time to adapt to business and taxation plans.

Yashwant Sinha, as a finance minister of the BJP-led government in 1999, also made a departure from the tradition of presenting the budget at 11 am from the colonial set practice of 5 pm. Sinha, however, retained the budget date of February 28 or the last working day of February. The concept of the 5 pm Budget was followed by the British regime as the members of Britain's parliaments 'House of Commons' and 'House of Lords' used to listen to India's budget before independence.

Vaccines to reach state in 2/3 days

Bhubaneswar, Jan 11: Clearing doubts in the minds of people, the state government Monday said the two vaccines against Covid-19 approved by the Centre are safe and effective.

Health director and state vaccine in-charge Bijay Panigrahi said the vaccines are likely to reach Odisha in two to three days. He said the vaccination drive will be conducted at 160 session sites covering all 30 districts and 100 health workers will be vaccinated at each session site on the first day.

Arrangements will be made for two-way communication at two places-Sundargarh District Headquarters Hospital (DHH) and Capital Hospital here, from where the ministry of health and family welfare can directly take feedback on the vaccination.

Besides, the state monitoring teams will be formed for smooth execution of the vaccination drive. The teams will monitor the programme at the district-level, he added. The Pulse Polio immunisation drive in the state scheduled to be held January 17, 18 and 19 has been put on hold in view of the vaccination programme.

Addressing a presser here Monday, the state government's technical adviser (Covid-19) Jayant Panda said, "The vaccines are completely safe and effective because it has been tested by the Drug Controller General of India (DCGI) and other regulatory authorities."

Over last 10 months, experts have been conducting tests on the vaccines, he said. The DCGI has approved two vaccines - Bharat Biotech's Covaxin and Oxford-AstraZeneca's Covishield - for emergency use.

"Though the vaccination is not mandatory, we recommend the vaccines for betterment of people. The vaccines are also helpful against

the UK strain of the virus. It will take two months to complete the first phase of vaccination which will be done free of cost," Panda said.

Stating that everyone has to take two doses of the vaccine, he said, "We must ensure that 28 days after taking the first dose, we take the second dose of the same vaccine and not another one."


Panda said a pregnant woman can take the vaccine after consulting her doctor. Similarly, he advised people who recovered from the disease to undergo vaccination.

Centre to bear first round cost



NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi announced Monday that the Centre will bear the expenses of vaccinating nearly three crore healthcare and frontline workers in the first round and suggested that public representatives, a reference to politicians, should not be part of this initial exercise.

Interacting with state Chief Ministers, Modi underscored the enormity of what he described as the world's biggest vaccination exercise, which begins from January 16, saying over 30 crore citizens will get the jabs in the next few months in India against only 2.5 crore people who have received them in over 50 countries in around a month so far.

In his theatre journey of over 20 years, Madan has performed in more than 30 plays, produced and toured with a dozen, and curated two national theatre festivals.



On his take on digital theatre and how different it is for him as an actor, he says:

"It isn't different for a recorded performance, unless the director is changing the blocking to favour camera angles and such, which wasn't the case with this production. If the play is being streamed live, however, there are several new skills and aspects of craft which require consideration and rehearsal in their own right. I think asking and answering these questions is important, but so is doing work and seeing what comes of it. Some amazing strides have been made this year, globally, in integrating theatre with the internet (not just technology) and I hope we continue to innovate with integrity."

The cast of the play includes Vivek Madan as Sherlock Holmes, Arghya Lahiri as Dr. Watson and Nadir Khan as Sir Charles Baskerville. Celebrating a cult novel from over a century ago, the artistes along with the entire production team have created a piece that is thoroughly entertaining while delivering remarkable performances. The gloriously funny parody of this famous story becomes special with greater reason - the three seasoned actors - Madan, Lahiri and Khan - play not 3 but a total of 15 characters.

"A cricket team!" the actress replied when asked about how many children she would like.


"I do want children, as many as I can have. A cricket team? I'm not so sure," she added.

The actress opened up about her hope for her future family in an interview with *The Sunday Times*, reports usmagazine.com.


Priyanka got married to Nick in India in December 2018, just five months after getting engaged.



Fire Services dept to procure modern equipment

Bhubaneswar, Jan 11: The state Fire Services directorate is all set to procure a huge number of advanced equipment to further enhance its capabilities in disaster response. The fire services personnel of the state have received laurels for their performance during the natural disasters in the past.

According to sources at the Fire Services Directorate, the department has floated tender to purchase plasma cutters, generators, tractors, JCB cranes, quick deploy antennas (QDAs) and advanced fire resistant suits among other equipment. The directorate has sanctioned ₹32 crore to procure the equipment. As many as five quick deploy antennas will be acquired by the directorate.

The directorate felt the need of the quick deploy antennas during the severe cyclonic storm when the normal communication services came to a standstill. The fire services personnel with the antennas in disaster-hit areas will be able to keep normal communication with the control room at the headquarters. The directorate is planning to procure more number of fire resistant suits too.

72% attendance in schools on day-4

Bhubaneswar: The attendance of Class X and XII students in schools has increased to 72 per cent in the state, Monday. The attendance was 50 per cent on the reopening day (January 8), which rose to 53 per cent and 56 per cent on subsequent two days—January 9 & 10, respectively, as per a statement issued by the School & Mass Education department.

We will not turn this room into museum. This will be an active part of the embassy," said Sidharto R Suryodipuro, the Ambassador of Indonesia.

While speaking about any future investment by Indonesia in Odisha, the Ambassador said, "Once the pandemic is over, we hope that we can participate in many other ways like in Bali Yatra. We hope that can serve as a bridge between

Odisha and Indonesia". It is to be mentioned here that when the Dutch attempted to quell Indonesian Independence July 21, 1947, President Sukarno ordered Sjahrir, the former prime minister of Indonesia, to leave the country to attend the first Inter-Asia Conference, organised by Jawaharlal Nehru in July 1947 and to foment international public opinion against the Dutch. Sjahrir was unable to leave as the Dutch controlled the Indonesian sea and air routes. Then, Jawaharlal Nehru asked Biju babu, who was an expert pilot, to rescue Sjahrir. Biju Patnaik and his wife Gyan Patnaik flew to Java and brought Sultan Sjahrir on a Douglas C-47 (Dakota) military aircraft reaching India via Singapore July 24, 1947.

Biju Patnaik was felicitated with Bhoomi Putra award, the Indonesian award for his act of bravery. In 1965, he was awarded with Bintang Jasa Utama, the highest nation award on the occasion of 50th Independence Day celebration of Indonesia.

₹92.37Cr bonus, aid for kendu leaf workers

Bhubaneswar, Jan 11: Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik Monday announced ₹92.37 crore bonus and other incentives for kendu leaf pluckers, binders and other labourers.

Bhubaneswar, Jan 11: Cold-wave is likely to return to interior Odisha as night temperature would fall by 3 to 5 degrees Celsius from Tuesday night, Bhubaneswar Meteorological Centre said here Monday.

"The minimum temperature (night temperature) is very likely to fall by 3-5 degrees Celsius in the districts of interior Odisha after 24 hours and it is likely to fall by 2-3 degrees in coastal Odisha after two days," it said. Besides, dry weather will prevail in the state till January 16, the Centre said.

The Met centre also predicts shallow to moderate fog over the districts of Keonjhar, Mayurbhanj, Bhadrak, Jajpur, Balasore, Cuttack, Khurda, Nayagarh, Kandhamal and Koraput during Tuesday night and early Wednesday.

Similarly, shallow to moderate fog is very likely to occur at one or two places in Angul, Boudh, Dhenkanal, Cuttack, Jagatsinghpur, Kendrapara, Khurda, Nayagarh and Kandhamal districts Wednesday night and early Thursday, it said.

Lowest temperature of 13.5 degrees Celsius was recorded at Daringbadi while it was 13.6 degrees at Koraput. All other places of the state witnessed a temperature of 15 degrees or above temperature during past 24 hours.

NZP's walkthrough aviary shut for visitors

Bhubaneswar: The Nandankanan Zoological Park (NZP) has decided to close the walkthrough aviary at the zoo for the visitors as a precautionary measure to prevent possible spread of avian influenza. In a notice appearing on the website and social media, the NZP authorities also said that the Safari and the battery-operated vehicle facility at the zoo is closed for the visitors until further order. In the wake of death of over 100 poultry birds in Khurda district, the Odisha government has asked people not to panic over the incident as the avian influenza virus test came negative for all the selected samples. The Fisheries and Animal Resource Development (F&ARD) department in a statement said that people can consume chicken meat, eggs and other poultry products after cooking them thoroughly.

State's Covid-19 toll at 1,892

Eligibility criteria for SIs relaxed

Bhubaneswar, Jan 11: State's Covid-19 caseload Monday surged to 3,32,106 as 244 more people tested positive for the virus, while one more fatality pushed the coronavirus death toll to 1,892, a senior Health and Family Welfare (H&FW) department official said.

The 244 new cases were detected in 24 of the state's 30 districts with 142 reported from different quarantine centres and 102 are local contact cases.

Sambalpur district recorded the highest of 37 new cases followed by Bargarh (23) and Sundargarh (22).

Meanwhile, the Jharsuguda district administration declared a part of Brundaban Colony in this industrial town as a containment zone after 11 girl students of a train-

itive patient of Khurda district." With the fresh fatality, the death toll in the highly infectious disease has mounted to 1,892. This apart, 53 other Covid-19 positive patients have also died in the state due to comorbidities, said the official.

Of the total 1,892 fatalities reported so far, Khurda district of which the state capital Bhubaneswar is a part, alone accounted for 329 deaths followed by Ganjam (247), Sundargarh (167), Cuttack (140) and Puri (117).

Currently, Odisha has 2,118 active Covid-19 cases, while as many as 3,28,043 patients have recovered from the infection.

The state has so far conducted over 72.01 lakh sample tests for Covid-19, including 29,646 Sunday. Odisha's positivity rate now stands at 4.61 per cent, the data released by the H&FW department said.

Bhubaneswar, Jan 11: The state government Monday relaxed the service period required for the promotion of Sub inspectors to the rank of Inspectors of Police from ten years to eight years. The state home department Monday issued an order in this regard.

Earlier, the state Police had sent a proposal requesting the government to make changes the Police Manual Rules prescribing details regarding the eligibility required for the promotion of SI to Inspectors of Police.

The state police in its proposal has stated that only 51 SIs would be able to get promotion with the 10-year service rule prescribed in PMR. It has requested the state

government to reduce it to eight years keeping in view the huge vacancies in Inspector rank officers in the force. With the relaxation, the state police gets a pool of 234 eligible SIs out of which the SIs having good track record will get promoted as Inspectors.

"After careful consideration of the proposal of State Police Headquarters, Odisha, Cuttack, the government is pleased to relax the eligibility criteria prescribed under Rule-650 (ii) of Police Manual Rule from 10 years to 08 years on one time for the S.I.s of Police, who have completed and passed the S.I.s course of training, eligible for consideration of promotion to the rank of Inspector of Police for the year 2021," reads the home department Order.

OSBCL pays dividend of ₹7.58 crore

Implement HC order on school fee waiver: OPF

Bhubaneswar, Jan 11: The Odisha Parents' Federation (OPF) Monday welcomed the Orissa High Court's decision on school fee waiver in the wake of Covid-19 pandemic.

Briefing the media here Monday, OPF chairman Basudev Bhatt urged the government to implement the Orissa High Court order wherein it has asked the Odisha government to take a decision on waiver of school fees on basis of a memorandum of understanding (MoU) signed with the private schools.

Meanwhile, on the HC's decision of reduction in school fees, School and Mass Education Minister Samir Ranjan Dash said, "We are yet to receive the High Court order. We will take a decision once we get the order."

Bhatt said, "The HC has confirmed that all unaided private schools are under the control of the state government as per

Odisha Education Act, 1969. As per the rule, the fee and charges should commensurate with the facilities provided by the institutions. Fee should normally be charged under the heads prescribed by the Dept of School and Mass Education. No capitation fee for voluntary donations for graining admission in the school, or any other purpose should be charged/collected in the name of the school. In case of such malpractices, the government may take drastic action leading to withdrawal of NOC."

Earlier, the state government had informed the HC that the MoU was inked by all stakeholders regarding waiver of fees at private schools suitable for the parents whose income has been adversely affected during the Covid-19 pandemic.

The parents have agreed to the provisions under the MoU regarding the waiver of school fee.

Faruqui's arrest 'violates' freedom of expression

Bhubaneswar, Jan 11: Based on a complaint lodged by the son of a BJP M.L.A. Gujarat stand-up comedian Munawar Faruqui and four others were recently arrested by the Indore police for allegedly insulting Hindu deities. They were also beaten up by a Hindutva mob before being taken into custody, it was alleged.

While the incident has sparked a row across the country, this is what a few city humourists have to say over the issue.

Comedian Satyabrata Mohapatra said, "What comedians perform are just enactments of their observations from life. It may be on politics, religion or any other issues. But people in power often don't take it too kindly. This is what happened in Faruqui's case which is unfortunate. It is certainly an assault on freedom of speech."



Comedian Roshan Bisoi says, "Ours is a nation having many ethnic groups following different cultures and religions. Therefore, anything you speak on a public platform will hurt one group or the other. So, there is a need to take these things in the right spirit instead of putting artistes behind the bars."

Another artiste Akash Baghar is of the opinion that the government

has a number of issues to deal with but it sadly has picked something as imaginary and frivolous as religion to feel upset about. Faruqui's arrest is definitely an attempt to gag the voice of a free citizen, adds Baghar.

Theatre actor Dipanwit Dashmohapatra was also found agitated over the arrests of artistes for cracking 'offensive' jokes having reference to political parties and

religions. "Your judgmental capabilities play a great role in understanding certain jokes. In my view, if you can't laugh at the stereotypes of your own faith, maybe you ought to do a little soul-searching," he said.

Before Faruqui, other standup comedians like Kunal Kamra and Agrima Joshua too had to bear the brunt. Even Alokesh Sinha, a local artiste, also received threats for uploading videos on YouTube which had a religious reference. Though he was forced to take it down, he had a different take in this regard.

Alokesh said, "If you are performing in a live show, you know your audience and vice-versa. Here, you can get away with a few edgy humours. But when you upload them on social media, they can hurt the sentiments of a section. Artistes need to be really careful about what they present on bigger platforms."

Trump Card Taiwan

President Donald Trump has done it again and with vengeance. After failing to deny victory to President-elect Joe Biden through legal challenges and then instigating vandals, who went berserk at the Capitol on January 6, Trump has now chosen to make life difficult for Biden's presidency even before he is sworn in. One of the easiest ways to achieve this end is to provoke and antagonise China and damage US-China relations. Secretary of State Mike Pompeo announced late on January 9 that restrictions on contacts between US officials and their Taiwanese counterparts are being lifted. Taiwan is overjoyed and immediately welcomed the move, while China has charged that the USA is playing with fire during the last few days of the Trump regime.

In a statement Pompeo said the US State Department had imposed the complex internal restrictions on itself in an attempt to appease the Communist regime in Beijing, and he was now lifting them all. The guidelines included restrictions on where representatives could meet and limited the ranks allowed to attend Taiwan's national day celebrations.

The Communist Party of China (CPC) has never ruled Taiwan, but it considers the island nation a wayward province that must be returned to the fold. According to it, Taiwan government, which treats the island as a sovereign state, is run by separatists.

In Beijing's eye, the status of Taiwan is the most sensitive issue in the China-US relationship. The US has no formal diplomatic ties with Taiwan, but has, for decades, operated under legislation mandating the US provide Taiwan with support in its resistance to Chinese pressure.

Taiwan's unofficial embassy in Washington immediately reacted to Pompeo's announcement by stating that the US move showed the strength and depth of the US relationship with Taiwan. But, the shift in US policy towards Taiwan seems to have less to do with Taiwan and more to antagonise China to make things difficult for Biden. Even if there are some merits in the new policy, the fact that Pompeo did it a mere 11 days before a transition of power and apparently without consulting with his successor makes the whole move suspect.

The inescapable conclusion is that this announcement is purely political and vindictive so as to push Biden into a stand-off with China in his first weeks. Trump has, in the process, used a double edged sword since reversal of the policy will give him the opportunity on the platter to portray the new President as soft on China.

The seeming lack of coordination with the incoming administration and the suddenness of the announcement made in the backdrop of domestic political turmoil have the potential to create a dangerous situation of making Taiwan a partisan issue in the US foreign policy. The US policy towards Taiwan has endured and benefited from consistent support from both sides of the political divide.

That things are going to be messy is clear from the statement of a spokesperson for the Biden transition team that the new President is committed to the 1979 Taiwan Relations Act which defined relations between the two governments.

The US has maintained close ties with Taiwan since the latter split from China after a bloody civil war. But, Washington has avoided major displays of friendship so as not to antagonise China. Chinese President Xi Jinping has articulated his ambition to reunify the island with the mainland, if necessary, through use of force. Under the 'One China' policy, the US has unofficial relations with Taiwan and posts unofficial representatives to Taipei. It also provides arms to the island under the terms of the 40-year-old Taiwan Relations Act.

Pompeo's last minute diplomatic decisions seem like the Trump administration, unable to stomach defeat, has sought to queer the pitch for Biden by putting a spanner in the US' relatively successful Taiwan policy.

INDIANS IN TRUMP'S WAR

FOCUS INDIAN AMERICANS

Vincent Xavier Palathingal, a businessman from Kerala, now living in the United States, has attracted a lot of attention in our media. He was noticed waving an Indian flag at the Trump rally in Washington DC January 6 which turned violent as it attacked the Capitol building, resulting in deaths.

He told our media that he had migrated to the US in 1992 after his education in the Government Engineering College, Thrissur. He claims to be a member of the State Central Committee of the Republican Party in Virginia and had gone to attend the Trump rally to protest against a 'stolen election'. He added that he was formerly a Democrat and had voted for Barack Obama twice.

Vincent claimed that a few delinquents had infiltrated the otherwise peaceful rally and committed acts of violence. He told a Malayalam news channel that the lawbreakers appeared to him to be from the left-wing ANTIFA (Anti-Fascist and Anti-Racist Front) or BLM (Black Lives Matter). This was the fifth time he had attended Trump's rallies and the first one which ended in violence. Trump had always blamed ANTIFA for violence during the "Black Lives Matter" demonstrations.

In any case, the US Justice Department is probing the incident in cooperation with the Capitol Police who would no doubt investigate the claims made by Vincent too. Latest reports from the US indicate that the man with a painted face with "Viking" horns, whose face was beamed all over the world, was identified as Jake Angeli from Arizona, a regular Trump supporter belonging to the Far Right wing "QAnon".

However, the purpose of this piece is not to look into the incident at Capitol Hill but to offer a retrospective of the political activities of Indian Americans based on my personal experience in the US and how it transformed from the original bipartisan movement into a community deeply divided on religious lines.

The Indian diaspora in the US was politically active during the 1920s-30s under the leadership of

The real benefits occurred under the presidency of Lyndon Johnson when the 1965 Immigration & Naturalization Act (Hart-Cellar Act) gave preference to reuniting immigrant families after abolishing the quota system based on national origin. However, the arrival of a large number of South Asian families led to a peculiar cloistered style of living, confining their activities around temples or mosques and celebrating South Asian festivals. This was the period of the ABCD (American Born Confused Desi) syndrome. The growing Indian community remained only a fringe group in national politics since they made no attempts to integrate into the American mainstream by taking part in the political process.

However, the 1946 law re-introduced the quota system established under a 1924 Act. It was heavily in favour of Northern and Western Europe. Notwithstanding this limitation, the 1946 law benefited 3,000 Indians already living in the US, and helped them get naturalised. The McCarran-Walter Act, also called The Immigration & Nationality Act, passed in 1952, continued quotas-based immigration. Asian countries were given a meagre quota of 100 visas each per year.

It was Dr Joy Cheria, a former Youth Congress activist and his colleagues like Krishna Srinivasa, Gopal Bashist, Dinesh Patel, Dr Suresh Prabhu, Swadesh Chatterjee and many others belonging to the Republican and Democratic parties who exhorted Indian Americans to join American political activities in the 1980s. They replicated the tactics of the Jewish bipartisan lobby group American Israel Public Affairs Committee (AIPAC) founded by Tom Dine in 1963 to build con-

stituency pressure on American Congressmen to look after the interests of Israel. In a similar way the bipartisan Indian American leadership established the Indian-American Forum for Political Education (IAFPE) in 1983 to further the interests of India.

Other Indian American activists like Dr Thomas Abraham and Inder Singh widened the ambit of Indian Americans to several countries like Fiji, Guyana, Surinam etc which were the destinations of old Indian indentured labour. They did so by establishing a global Indian diaspora platform named Global Organization of Indian Origin (GOPIO) in 1989. The visibility of the Indian diaspora improved. All of them were secular; bipartisan groups belonging to all religions and communities.

Unfortunately, the first blow to the bipartisan movement of the Indian American Community was given by, of all persons, senior Congress leader the late Siddhartha Shankar Ray as Indian Ambassador to America. In 1993 he excluded the "Overseas Friends of BJP" from the "1883 Vivekananda Chicago Speech Centenary Celebrations" in America, with the bureaucratic reasoning that it was strictly an official programme of the Indian government. Since then, the BJP segment of Indian Americans, seen taking an active part in all the bipartisan programmes of the Indian American organisations earlier, started staying away.

This schismatic trend was reinforced after Prime Minister Narendra Modi assumed power in 2014. Only pro-BJP or pro-RSS Indian Americans were involved in prime ministerial and high-level visits. Others were not invited. Just prior to the 2016 American elections, a new organisation named "Hindus for Trump" came on the scene. The old bipartisan group felt left out. In the process, the Indian lobbying power in the US has suffered to Pakistan's advantage because of the exclusion of non-Hindus from the mainstream of Indian American activities.

Bribery
It was reported recently that Dutch archaeologists had found an administrative centre of the ancient Assyrian empire, 3400 years old, in which an archive listed the names of "employees accepting bribes". After a wry thought about how nothing changes, it seemed appropriate to look up the history of bribery. And what a convoluted story it turns out to be. It starts in medieval French, where bribe meant "a piece of bread". A linguistic game of consequences led the sense from this to "a piece of bread given to a beggar", then more generally to "alms" and "living upon alms", to "begging" and so to associations with mendacity and vagabondage. By a further very short step the meaning arrived at "theft; stealing". It was with the last of these senses that the word first appeared in English in the fourteenth century, in the works of Chaucer and his contemporaries. It soon evolved further to take in the idea of extortion, or demanding money with menaces. Only in this usage did bribe finally come to mean a sum of money, though at this time briber meant the person doing the menacing and so getting the money.

Bridegroom

Groom is common as a short form of bridegroom. How the word that we now use for a man who looks after horses came to be linked to one half of a marrying couple is one of the classic stories of popular misunderstandings — folk etymology — that cause language to evolve in unpredictable ways. In Old English, a bridegroom was a brydguma, a compound of bryd, a bride or marriage, and guma, a man. Guma, which is related to Latin homo, was a poetic term for a man, which turns up in the epic poem Beowulf, as does another version of the same word, gome. By the sixteenth century brydguma had become brydegome (though the spelling was variable). This was starting to look puzzling, because gome had become obsolete, and people didn't connect it with that old word for a man. On the other hand, they did have groom. In the twelfth century, this had been a term for a boy or lad, with something of the colloquial informality about it that kid still possesses, though it could only refer to a male child. Where it comes from is a mystery. Two centuries later it had grown up to mean an adult man, but it had also taken on the idea of a menial male, a serving-man or manservant. In the 1500s and 1600s it could also mean a shepherd, sometimes in the extended herd-groom.

Update the leadership script

As governments around the world seek to "build back better" from the pandemic, addressing women's under-representation in political and corporate leadership must be at the top of the agenda. We simply cannot achieve the resilient, inclusive, and sustainable societies that we need if the current gap between women and men persists.

Closing the gap would yield massive economic benefits. The World Bank estimates that bringing women's lifetime earnings up to the same level as those of men would translate into a "gender dividend" of \$172 trillion in global human-capital wealth. We already know that companies with higher levels of both gender and ethnic diversity tend to deliver better economic performance.

Nonetheless, new research from the Reykjavik Index for Leadership shows a lack of progress in public perceptions of women's suitability for leadership roles in comparison to the way that men in such roles are perceived. An Index score of 100 indicates that there is complete agreement that men and women are equally suitable for leadership. That score has remained stagnant across all countries sur-

veyed for the last three years, averaging 73. Conducted in 67 countries as well as Kenya, Nigeria, and India, the Index finds that harmful gender stereotypes remain deep-rooted, as does the equality gap in every country surveyed. There is still an effective "birthright" of equality for men, set against the everyday reality of inequality for women around the world.

In France, only 45% of respondents would feel very comfortable having a woman as head of government. In Germany, where a woman has served as chancellor for 15 years, the figure is 41%, up from 31% in 2019. In Italy, 46% of people would be very comfortable having a woman as the CEO of a major company, compared to just 39% in Japan. Entering the Index for the first time this year, Nigeria and Kenya register similar numbers: only 44% of Nigerians and 40% of Kenyans would be very comfortable with a woman as head of government.

One remarkable conclusion from the survey is that women are more likely than men in all countries to perceive men and women as equally suitable for leadership. Another sobering finding, however, is that younger people overall tend to be less progressive on this issue. The most prejudiced group is young men be-

tween 18 and 34 years old; and the tensions concerning work and equality within this group are further reflected in data showing that women continue to perform the majority of household chores.

Regardless of how one feels politically about figures like Indira Gandhi, Margaret Thatcher, and Angela Merkel, these names stand out for belonging to a small cohort of women leaders who have steered their respective countries with a steady hand through especially challenging times. The year 2020 was a watershed moment, with global challenges like COVID-19 further underscoring the need for women's leadership. According to an analysis of 194 countries by the Centre for Economic Policy Research and the World Economic Forum, those led by women have had "systematically and significantly better" outcomes, suffering half as many deaths on average as those led by men.

Last year marked not only the 75th anniversary of the United Nations, but also the 25th anniversary of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action — a global blueprint for securing women's rights. Now, in 2021, we enter the last decade for achieving the UN Sustainable Development Goals, many of which

touch on issues of diversity and equality. Despite the urgency, we have yet to grapple with the scale of the hurdles still standing between us and true parity between women and men. Among other things, we must invest far more in education and health services for women and girls, so that they will have the same opportunities as their male counterparts. Governments and businesses should help pave the way, by committing and then following through with measures to close the gap between women and men.

When women are equally represented in politics, they have a clear and measurable impact on public health, the economy, and security, and their presence leads to more inclusive, sustainable, and democratic policies that benefit everyone. When women are underrepresented in senior positions, everyone loses. You cannot be what you cannot see. Reorienting public perceptions of what leadership looks like should be one of our top priorities.

Karna cabinet expansion tomorrow

Bangalore, Jan 11: The Karnataka Cabinet would be expanded January 13 to induct seven legislators as ministers, said state Chief Minister BS Yediyurappa Sunday night.

"The BJP high command has permitted to induct seven legislators in the cabinet. They will be sworn-in on January 13 afternoon, as there is 'habba' (Sankranti festival) on January 14," Yediyurappa told news channels in Kannada on return from New Delhi.

He, however, did not disclose names of the legislators to be inducted in the cabinet expansion, as they have to be "finalised and confirmed."

"The list of would-be ministers will be finalised tomorrow (Monday) after taking oath in the afternoon of January 13," added the Chief Minister.

In the 34-member ministry, seven posts are vacant to be filled in the third cabinet expansion.

During his day-long visit to the national capital Sunday Yediyurappa met the ruling BJP's national leadership, including Union Home Minister Amit Shah, party's national president JP Nadda and party's Karnataka unit in-charge



Arun Singh.

The cabinet was expanded for the second time February 6, 2020 when 10 legislators, who defected from Congress and JD-S were inducted after they won in the December 5, 2019 by-elections, caused by their resignations in July 2019, which led to the fall of the 14-month JD-S-Congress coalition government on July 23, 2019 and return of the BJP government on July 26, 2019.

The first cabinet expansion, in which 17 ministers were inducted, took place August 20, 2019.

Yediyurappa was sworn-in as BJP Chief Minister for the third time July 26, 2019.

Placating rebel MLA

Bangalore registered 453 fresh cases on Saturday, taking the city's Covid tally to 3,92,581, including 6,068 active cases, while 3,82,166 recovered so far, with 261 discharged in the last 24 hours.

Of the 202 Covid patients in the intensive care units (ICUs) across the southern state, 85 are in Bangalore hospitals, 15 in Kalaburagi, 12 in Tumakuru and 10 in Hassan districts.

Out of 1,13,206 tests conducted in the day, 4,680 were through rapid antigen detection and 1,08,526 through RT-PCR method.

Four returnees from UK Sunday also tested positive through the RT-PCR method. "Positivity rate for the day was 0.69 per cent and case fatality rate was 0.25 per cent across the state," added the bulletin.



Thiruvananthapuram, Jan 11: In a move to help the film industry in the state, the Kerala government Monday decided to waive entertainment tax for cinemas from January to March 2021 along with 50 per cent reduction in the fixed charges on electricity during the lockdown period since March last year.

The decision was taken after Kerala Film Chamber of Commerce officials met Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan here.

"The state government has decided to exempt cinema theatres from entertainment tax from January to March 2021. The government has also decided to reduce the fixed charges by 50 per cent," the chief minister's office said in a release.

In the meeting, it was also decided that the property tax, which

should have been paid to local bodies before March 31, 2020, can be paid in monthly instalments. The government also informed that it cannot take any decision on the professional tax.

"The validity of various licenses for the cinemas from the local bodies, electrical inspectorate films division, building fitness, health, fire force have been extended till March 31," the state government said.

The meeting was chaired by the chief minister and attended by Power minister MM Mani, Minister for local self-government, AC Moideen, Kerala State Electricity Board Chairman NS Pillai, among others.

"The chief minister understood the difficulties faced by the film fraternity and assured us of all the help."

"With such an assurance in



hand, our organisations will meet at Ernakulam today itself and decide on the opening of the cinemas," Antony Perumbavur, a producer and officer bearer of one of the film associations, told reporters after the meet-

POCSO case gets murkier

Thiruvananthapuram, Jan 11: Harshitha Attaloori, Inspector General of Police, South Zone, will investigate the child abuse case under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act in which a 35-year-old woman was arrested. She was jailed following a complaint by her husband that said their 14-year-old son was allegedly sexually assaulted by her.

The woman is in Attakulangara women's jail.

However, proceedings took a curious turn with the relatives and friends of the woman came together and formed an action council which demanded a proper investigation by the police.

The action council leader Vakkom Pradeep, while speaking to IANS, said: "The local police at Kadakkavoor police station was over-enthusiastic to register an FIR and did not take into consideration all aspects of the case. This woman and her husband are estranged and he has remarried without divorcing her and the child had lodged the complaint following immense pressure from this person."

In a related development, the woman's 11-year-old younger son told the media that their father used to beat them up cruelly and his brother was forced to make such a statement by their father.

The couple has three sons and a six-year-old daughter.

The mother of the accused also said her daughter was innocent. "My daughter is innocent and every-

Navy to conduct two-day mega drill from today

New Delhi, Jan 11: The Indian Navy will kick-start Tuesday a two-day multi-agency military exercise covering India's 7,516 km-long coastline, involving 13 coastal states and Union Territories, to further bolster maritime security and surveillance, officials said.

Billed as India's largest coastal defence drill, the second edition of exercise 'Sea Vigil' is being organised to check the efficacy of the measures initiated to plug gaps in coastal security following the Mumbai terror attack in 2008, they said. "The scale and conceptual expanse of the exercise is unprecedented in terms of the geographical extent, the number of stakeholders involved, the number of units participating and in terms of the objectives to be met," the Indian Navy said. "The exercise will provide a realistic assessment of our strengths and weaknesses and thus will help in further strengthening maritime and national security," it added.

Officials said Indian Navy will deploy a sizeable number of its ships and other key assets in the Sea Vigil exercise. The Indian Navy and the Coast Guard have taken a series of measures to bolster India's coastal security after the Mumbai terror attack in which over 166

people including 28 foreigners from 10 nations were killed by a group of Pakistani terrorists.

On November 26, 2008, a group of 10 Pakistani terrorists carried out the coordinated attack on a railway station, two luxury hotels and a Jewish centre, after they sneaked into India's financial capital using the sea route in the Arabian sea. The inaugural edition of the Sea Vigil exercise took place in January 2019. The exercise is taking place at a time when India and China are locked in a bitter border standoff in eastern Ladakh. In sync with the national security doctrine, the Indian Navy significantly increased its deployment of warships, submarines and other assets in the Indian Ocean Region, in an attempt to send across a message to China that Indian armed forces are fully prepared to deal with any challenge. The two-day drill is a build-up towards Theatre-level Readiness Operational Exercise (TROPEX) which the Indian Navy conducts every two years, officials said.

"Sea Vigil and TROPEX together will cover the entire spectrum of maritime security challenges, including transition from peace to conflict. Assets of the Indian Navy, Coast Guard, Customs and other maritime agencies will participate in Sea Vigil," the Navy said.

Chinese cyber threats

New Delhi, Jan 11: In fresh trouble for WhatsApp, which is facing backlash over its upcoming user data policy in India, New Delhi-based think-tank Cyberpeace Foundation said Monday that China-based hackers are targeting WhatsApp users in the country with the promise of 'part-time' jobs.

Such proliferating messages on WhatsApp, which come with attached links, claim that one can earn Rs 200 to Rs 3,000 in a day in 10 to 30 minutes.

"There are multiple links that redirect to a common URL and each link uses different numbers to send a message," the foundation said in a statement.

"It can be observed that the same outgoing link is used for all the links with variation in the numbers. The parameter in the links indicates that they can be redirected to WhatsApp in all regions and in languages other than English," said the report.

The CyberPeace Foundation

along with experts from Autobot Infosec Private Ltd has launched an independent investigation into the matter.

"In all the links, the same redirection and outgoing sources were generated. However, in one link, a different URL was found and one new IP address that belongs to one of China's hosting company Alibaba Cloud," the report said.

When the URL is manipulated, an error code is displayed in Chinese language, the report said, adding that the domain names found during the investigation seem to have been registered in China.

"The IP address of the link is 47.75.111.165 and it can be traced to Alibaba Cloud, the city Hong Kong and the country China," it further claimed.

The news comes at a time when WhatsApp is asking users to either give their consent to sharing data with Facebook or lose their accounts after February 8, triggering a heated debate globally, including in India.

New Delhi, Jan 11: The Indian Army Monday handed back to China a soldier of the Chinese People's Liberation Army (PLA), three days after apprehending him at the southern bank of Pangong Tso in eastern Ladakh, official sources said.

The soldier was returned to China at the Chushul-Moldo border point in eastern Ladakh at 10.10 am, they added. The Chinese

soldier was captured at the southern bank of Pangong lake in the early hours of Friday after he transgressed across the Indian side of the Line of Actual Control (LAC). "The PLA soldier, who was apprehended on January 8, was handed back to China at Chushul-Moldo at 10.10 am on Monday," a source said.

Indian and Chinese troops are locked in a tense border standoff in eastern Ladakh for over eight months. The faceoff began in May

last year, following a clash between the two sides in the Pangong lake area. "The PLA soldier had transgressed across the LAC and was taken into custody by Indian troops deployed in this area. Troops from either side are deployed along the LAC since friction erupted last year due to unprecedented mobilisation and forward concentration by Chinese troops," the Army said in a statement Saturday.

Following the capture of the soldier by the Indian Army, China had sought his immediate return Saturday. It was the second such incident of India capturing and subsequently returning a Chinese soldier in the last three months. Indian troops had captured Corporal Wang Ya Long of the PLA October 19 last year after he 'strayed' across the LAC in Ladakh's Demchok sector. The corporal was handed back to China at the Chushul-Moldo border point following the laid-down protocols.

'Submit report on your plans to control stubble burning'

New Delhi, Jan 11: The Supreme Court Monday asked the Centre to file an affidavit detailing "concrete steps" to deal in future with the situation of stubble burning, which is a major cause of air pollution in the Delhi-national capital region (NCR) during the winters.

The order by a bench comprising Chief Justice S A Bobde and Justices A S Bopanna and V Ramasubramanian, came after it was submitted that the pollution caused due to stubble burning will again come to fore in future.

"Mr Tushar Mehta (Solicitor General), you come back with some concrete steps on stubble burning," the bench said. The top court was hearing a petition which has

raised the issue of pollution caused due to stubble burning in neighbouring states of Delhi.

Senior advocate Vikas Singh, appearing for the petitioner, told the bench, "The issue will arise again. For this year, the issue of stubble burning is over and it will start again next time. The Centre has said nothing on this". The bench asked solicitor general to file an affidavit on the issue.

The apex court had last month said it was "not satisfied" with the work done by the Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM) in the National Capital Region and Adjoining Areas, which has been constituted by the Centre to tackle air pollution. "We don't know what your commission is doing. People in Delhi are not satisfied with your



work. We are also not satisfied," the bench had said.

Mehta had earlier told the bench that the commission is working on

"war footing" and several steps have been taken to deal with pollution. On November 6, the apex court had asked the Centre to en-

Govt places order with SII for 11mn vaccine doses

New Delhi, Jan 11: The Union government Monday placed a purchase order with Serum Institute of India (SII) for 11 million doses of Oxford COVID-19 vaccine, Covishield, each costing Rs 210 including GST, official sources said. Dispatch of the vaccine is likely to start by late Monday evening, they said. According to the order placed, each dose of the vaccine has been priced at Rs 200 and with GST of Rs 10 it would cost Rs 210.

The health ministry is also likely to soon sign a purchase order for another anti-coronavirus vaccine, Covaxin, which has been indigenously developed by Bharat Biotech, a source said. Covishield vaccine doses would be initially shipped to 60 consignee points from where those would be distributed to various vaccination centres across India, the sources said.

As many as 2,54,500 doses of Covishield are set to be delivered at Delhi's central storage, Rajiv Gandhi Super Speciality hospital, in Tahirpur. The HLL Lifecare Limited, a public sector undertaking, issued the supply order on behalf of the Union Health Ministry in the name of Prakash Kumar Singh, Additional Director, Government and Regulatory Affairs at Serum Institute of India.

"The Ministry of Health has nominated HLL Lifecare Limited vide letter dated January 11 as procuring agency for procurement of vaccine. For the purpose of this order, the Ministry of Health, Government of India is the 'purchaser' and HLL Lifecare Limited (HLL) is 'procuring agency'. Vaccine-laden trucks will move out from Manjari location of the Pune-based SII amid elaborate police security. The Maharashtra government has decided to provide police security

to the trucks carrying the vaccine up to airports and to the borders of the state.

India had recently approved two vaccines, Oxford's Covishield manufactured by the Serum Institute in the country and Bharat Biotech's Covaxin, for restricted emergency use. According to the Health Ministry, two doses of the vaccine need to be taken by an individual 28 days apart to complete the immunisation schedule. Protective levels of antibodies are generally developed two weeks after receiving the second dose, it has said.

The country will launch its COVID-19 vaccination drive from January 16 in what Prime Minister Narendra Modi has called the world's largest inoculation programme with priority to be given to nearly three crore healthcare and frontline workers. According to the 'COVID-19 Vaccine Operational Guidelines', the shots will be offered first to healthcare workers, and frontline workers and then to persons above 50 years of age, followed by persons younger than 50 years of age with associated comorbidities based on evolving pandemic situation.

'Made in India vaccines most cost effective': Prime Minister Narendra Modi Monday emphasised that India is entering into a decisive battle against Covid-19, as the country prepares for the Made in India vaccination drive from January 16. Making the closing remarks at the meeting with the Chief Ministers on Covid vaccine roll-out, the Prime Minister said that the public representatives are not in the priority list and the first round of vaccines will be given to the frontline workers. He also said that the state governments will not have to pay for the first round of Covid vaccines as the Centre will bear the cost.

Rawat in Ladakh

New Delhi: Chief of Defence Staff Gen Bipin Rawat is on a visit to Ladakh to review the country's overall military preparedness as thousands of Indian and Chinese troops remained deployed in a high state of combat readiness in various mountainous locations in the region amid the eight-month-long border standoff. Official sources said Monday that Gen Rawat will be briefed by Lt Gen PGK Menon, the commander of the Leh-based 14 Corps, popularly known as Fire and Fury Corps, and other senior military officials on the dynamic security matrix in eastern Ladakh.

Yellow alert in Raj

Jaipur: The Meteorological Department here Monday issued a yellow alert for cold wave in several areas of Rajasthan for the next 24 hours. Cold wave conditions prevailed in parts of the state as the minimum temperature dropped by up to four degrees Celsius in the last 24 hours, a MeT Department official said. Churu recorded 1.9 degrees Celsius Sunday night while Ganganagar registered a low of 3.9 degrees Celsius, showing a drop of three and four notches respectively against the previous night.

Girl ends life

Moradabad (Uttar Pradesh): A Class 12 student allegedly shot herself with an unlicensed revolver after she was scolded by her mother for not studying. The girl was rushed to a private hospital where she succumbed during the treatment.

Teacher dies

Jaipur: A 55-year-old woman, who was a relative of a Rajasthan Administrative Services (RAS) officer, died at a hospital after being found unconscious with her hands and legs tied in Mansarovar area here Monday, police said. Vigya Devi (55) was the sister of an RAS officer posted as a sub-divisional magistrate (SDM) in Jaipur.

Union Min Sripad Naik injured in road mishap, wife killed

Bangalore, Jan 11: Union Minister for Ayush and Defence Sripad Y Naik was injured and his wife Vijaya and personal assistant killed when their car overturned at Ankola in Uttara Kannada district Monday night, police said.

The minister's condition was stable, they said. Police said Naik, along with his wife, personal assistant Deepak, his close confidante Sai Kiran, gunman and the driver were heading from Yallapur to Gokarna Monday night.

On the way, the driver lost his control over the car near Hosakambi village in Ankola Taluk of Uttara Kannada and the vehicle overturned. "It was not a collision between vehicles. Prima facie it appears to be the case of the driver losing control of the car" a police officer told PTI.

Chief Minister B S Yediyurappa expressed shock over the accident and condoled the demise of Naik's wife. "Shocked to know that the car which Union Minister Sripad Naik ji was travelling met with an accident in Uttara Kannada and the death of his wife. My heartfelt condolences on the tragic death of Smt Naik and prayers for the speedy recovery of Shri Naik and those injured," Yediyurappa tweeted.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has spoken to Goa Chief Minister Pramod Sawant to make sure that proper arrangements were made for the treatment of Naik. Sawant visited the hospital where Naik is being treated. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh also spoke to the Goa Chief Minister and asked him to fly Naik to Delhi if the need arose.

'Galwan heroes' likely to be honoured on Republic Day



New Delhi, Jan 11: Colonel B Santosh Babu and some of the other Indian Army personnel, who were killed while valiantly fighting Chinese troops in the Galwan Valley in eastern Ladakh in June last year, are expected to be honoured with gallantry awards on Republic Day, sources said Monday.

Col Babu, the commanding officer of the 16 Bihar regiment, was among 20 Indian soldiers who laid down their lives in the fierce hand-to-hand combat on June 15 in the Galwan Valley, an incident that marked one of the most serious military conflicts between the two sides in decades.

China is yet to disclose the number of its soldiers killed and injured in the clash though it officially admitted to having suffered casualties. According to an American intelligence report, the number of casualties on the Chinese side was 35. The Galwan Valley clash had escalated the border row in eastern Ladakh and resulted in a large deployment of troops and heavy weaponry by both the armies in the friction points.

"Some of the Army personnel including Col Babu who displayed extreme courage during the Galwan clash are expected to be honoured on Republic Day," said a source. The Chinese soldiers used stones, nail-studded sticks, iron rods and clubs in carrying out brutal attacks on Indian soldiers after they protested the erection of a surveillance post by China around patrolling point 14

Last month, India and China had held another round of diplomatic talks under the framework of Working Mechanism for Consultation and Coordination (WMCC) on India-China border affairs.

'Holding breath may increase nCoV infection risk'



Chennai, Jan 11: Researchers, at the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Madras, have found that the process of virus-laden droplets being transported into deep lung increases with decreasing breathing frequency.

The team modelled the breathing frequency in a laboratory and found that low breathing frequency increases the time of residence of the virus and therefore, it increases chances of deposition and consequently the infection. Also, the multi-scale lung structure has a significant effect on a person's susceptibility to Covid-19.

"Covid-19 has opened a gap in our understanding of deep pulmonary systemic diseases. Our study unravels the mystery behind how particles are transported and deposited in the deep lung," the researcher, Mahesh Panchagnula, Department of Applied Mechanics, IIT Madras, said in a statement on Monday. "The study demonstrates the physical process by which aerosol particles are transported into the deep generations of the lung," Panchagnula added.

The research team worked to gain a deeper understanding of how the rate of flow of droplet

laden with virus determines the deposition of the virus in the lungs. In their research, the team reported that holding the breath and having low breathing rate can

increase chances of virus deposition in the lungs. Airborne infections such as Covid-19 spread immensely through sneezing and coughing as it instantly releases a lot of tiny droplets. The research team imitated the droplet dynamics in the lung by studying the movement of droplets in the small capillaries which were of a diameter similar to bronchioles.

They took water mixed with fluorescent particles and generated aerosols from this liquid using a nebulizer. These fluorescent aerosols were used to track the movement and deposition of particles in the capillaries.

SECURITY ALERT IN KASHMIR

Recovery of mortar fuze used by Pak army alarms forces

Srinagar, Jan 11: Security agencies have raised an alarm over the recovery of three Point Detonating (PD) fuzes, used by the Pakistani army in their 82 mm mortar shells, from a terrorist in North Kashmir two weeks back, officials said Monday.

The three PDs were recovered by the Baramulla Police on the eve of New Year when the force intercepted a vehicle. Unaware of the material recovered, the police had declared it as "unique grenade". However, senior officers at the police headquarters examined the material and came out with a finding that it was a PD used by the



Pakistani army for the 82 MM mortar shells, they said. A report was shared with other security agencies including the army which has now taken up the matter with all seriousness, the officials said. They

said the PD could be used during the fabrication (manufacture) of an Improvised Explosive Device (IED) to increase its impact. It helps in super-quick detonation of explosives or at times can delay the impact mode for a bigger damage, the officials said.

The terrorist, identified as Asif Gul, from whom the PDs were recovered, is alleged to be a known Over Ground Worker (OGW) of The Resistance Front (TRF), a shadow outfit of banned Lashker-e-Taiba terror group. He had concealed the fuze inside a sack full of charcoal.

Gul, against whom 29 cases have been registered since 2015, was in touch with now Pakistan-occupied Kashmir-based Aabid Qayoom Lone,

who is believed to be a top commander of TRF and instrumental in running modules of shadow terror groups in the valley from across the border. Gul had picked up the consignment from North Kashmir and was on his way to deliver it to his cadres in South Kashmir, the officials said.

This is the first case of mortar fuze being seized by the police, and the officers fear that some consignments may have remained undetected and reached the terror modules in the Valley. The year 2020 saw several consignments of arms being smuggled from the other side of the border, some of them being dropped from across the LoC using drones.

Iron rod inserted in widow's private part, three held

Sidhi (Madhya Pradesh), Jan 11: In a shocking incident, an iron rod was inserted in a widow's private part by three men in Sidhi district of Madhya Pradesh, leaving her seriously injured, police said Monday. The three accused have since been arrested.

The woman is admitted in a Rewa hospital in a serious condition. The woman along with her two sons lived in a shanty and ran a tea stall in Amaliya area. The three men went to her shanty on Saturday night and asked for water. When she refused, they barged into her shanty and inserted an iron rod in her private part. The woman was admitted in the Sanjay Gandhi Hospital in Rewa district, where doctors removed the rod after an operation.

Home Minister Narottam Mishra said that strict action will be taken against the accused. On the other hand, senior Congress leader KK Mishra said: "Shivraj Singhji (Chouhan), the Hathras and Badaun spirit has entered Madhya Pradesh. Gang rape in Sidhi, rod inserted in private part. All nationalists, self-styled guardians of faith have turned deaf and dumb. Pro-Tem Speaker is also silent; you also have not tweeted; till when will the double face remain?"

Democrats begin 2nd attempt to impeach Trump

Washington, Jan 11: Democrats began the process of impeaching President Donald Trump for a second time Monday if Vice President Mike Pence and the Cabinet do not remove him from office.

Democrats introduced a resolution calling on Pence to invoke the 25th Amendment of the Constitution and remove Trump from the White House for being unfit to discharge his duties.

Republicans blocked an immediate vote on the resolution and Democrats followed up by introducing an article of impeachment of Trump for "incitement of insurrection" over his role in Wednesday's storming of the US Capitol by his supporters.

The dramatic moves come just nine days before Trump is to leave the White House and President-elect Joe Biden is to be sworn in as the 46th President of the United States.



Democratic Representative Steny Hoyer of Maryland introduced the resolution calling on Pence to invoke the 25th Amendment and declare Trump "incapable of executing the duties of his office."

Republican Representative Alex Mooney of West Virginia objected to passing the resolution by what is known as "unanimous consent" and it will be put to a vote Tuesday.



After Republicans blocked the resolution, a single article of impeachment against Trump was introduced in the Democratic-controlled House of Representatives.

Earlier, US House of Representatives Speaker Nancy Pelosi has served a notice to Vice President Mike Pence and the cabinet that they should oust President Donald Trump using their consti-

TRUMP REMAINS DEFIANT

WASHINGTON: President Donald Trump enters the last days of his presidency isolated and shunned by former allies and members of his own party as he faces a second impeachment and growing calls for his resignation after his supporters launched an assault on the nation's Capitol in an effort to disrupt the peaceful transfer of power. Cut off from the social media channels that have been the lifeblood of his presidency, Trump will nonetheless

try to go on offense in his last 10 days, with no plans of resigning. Instead, Trump is planning to lash out against the companies that have now denied him his Twitter and Facebook bullhorns. And aides hope he will spend his last days trying to trumpet his policy accomplishments, beginning with a trip to Alamo, Texas, on Tuesday to highlight his administration's efforts to curb illegal immigration and border wall construction.

UN chief Guterres seeks second term: Report

United Nations, Jan 11: United Nations Secretary-General Antonio Guterres told the five permanent members of the Security Council that he would like to stay on for a second term, Bloomberg News reported on Sunday citing two diplomats familiar with the matter.

Guterres is likely to officially inform the president of the UN General Assembly soon, the report added.

Guterres, 71, took office as the ninth secretary-general in January, 2017 for a five-year term

Guterres, 71, took office as the ninth secretary-general in January, 2017 for a five-year term that finishes at the end of the year.

Guterres was waiting for the results of the November election in the United States before coming to a decision and was seeking a second term following the win of President-elect Joe Biden, according to Bloomberg. The United States and the United Nations were not on the same page in many instances during the administration of President Donald Trump.

Under Trump, the United States left the World Health Organization and upset Security Council members with its withdrawal from the Iran nuclear deal. It also exited the Paris climate accord. Guterres' office had no comment on the Bloomberg report.

Three suspected terrorists arrested

Barcelona: Spanish police have arrested three suspected terrorists in Barcelona suspected to be members of the Islamic State (IS) militant group, a local media report said. 25 domestic terror cases in US

Washington: At least 25 domestic terrorism cases have been opened as a result of Wednesday's assault on the US Capitol by supporters of US President Donald Trump, US Army Secretary Ryan McCarthy told a Democratic lawmaker Sunday. Representative Jason Crow, a former Army Ranger and member of the House of Representatives Armed Services Committee, said McCarthy also told him the Pentagon was aware of "further possible threats posed by would-be terrorists" in the days up to and including the inauguration of President-elect Joe Biden January 20.

Burns to be new CIA director

Washington: President-elect Joe Biden announced Monday he has chosen veteran diplomat William Burns to be his CIA director. A former ambassador to Russia and Jordan, Burns, 64, had a 33-year career at the State Department under both Republican and Democratic presidents. He rose through the ranks of the diplomatic corps to become deputy secretary of state before retiring in 2014 to run the Carnegie Endowment of International Peace.

Writer Ved Mehta dies at 86

New York: Celebrated Indian-American novelist Ved Mehta, who overcame blindness and became widely known as the 20th-century writer most responsible for introducing American readers to India, has died at his home here at the age of 86. The New Yorker magazine, where he had been a staff writer for 33 years, reported that Mehta died Saturday. Mehta, a writer for The New Yorker for more than thirty years, died at the age of eighty-six, Saturday.

US designates Yemen rebels as terrorists

THE PLANNED DESIGNATION, ANNOUNCED BY US SECRETARY OF STATE MIKE POMPEO LATE SUNDAY, WOULD TAKE EFFECT A DAY BEFORE PRESIDENT-ELECT JOE BIDEN IS INAUGURATED JANUARY 20

Cairo, Jan 11: Yemen's Iran-backed rebels Monday dismissed the US move to designate them a terrorist organisation in the final days of the Trump administration while a leading aid agency warned such a designation would deal another "devastating blow" to the impoverished and war-torn nation.

The planned designation, announced by US Secretary of State Mike Pompeo late Sunday, would take effect a day before President-elect Joe Biden is inaugurated January 20. It was not clear whether Biden would overturn the decision.

Yemen is mired in a disastrous humanitarian crisis, with millions of people in wide swaths of the country on the brink of famine as a result of six years of civil war.

Pompeo said he was proceeding



with the designation of the rebels, known as Houthis, along with separate terrorist designations for the three top rebel leaders. At the same time, he pledged the US would help absorb the impact on aid groups and allow humanitarian assistance to continue to flow into Yemen.

Hours later, several senior rebel figures slammed Pompeo's announcement. "We are not fearful," tweeted Mohammed Ali al-Houthi. "America is the source of terror-

ism. It's directly involved in killing and starving the Yemeni people."

Others said the designation was an attempt to deflect attention from the US political crisis in the wake of the deadly Capitol rioting and efforts to impeach President Donald Trump. "We are honored to be terrorists and the world's gangsters," tweeted the Houthi media official Abdel-Rahman al-Ahnuumi.

In Iran, the Foreign Ministry spokesman Saeed Khatibzadeh con-

demned the designation as a "doomed-to-failure" action at the end of Trump's administration. He said the US would eventually have to enter into negotiations with the legitimate representatives of Yemen - referring to the Houthis - to find a peaceful solution to the conflict.

Yemen's internationally recognised government described the Houthis as a "terrorist militia" and in a statement called for a "continuation of the escalation and intensification of the political and legal pressures on the Houthis to pave the way for a peaceful solution to the conflict."

Yemen, on the tip of the Arabian Peninsula, is the scene of the world's worst humanitarian disaster. The war has killed more than 1.12,000 people and has left the majority of the country's nearly 30 million people in need of humanitarian aid.

N Korea's Kim adds title: Now, General Secretary of ruling party

Seoul, Jan 11: North Korean leader Kim Jong Un was given the title of general secretary of the ruling Workers Party formerly held by his late father and grandfather, state media reported Monday, in a move apparently aimed at bolstering his authority amid growing economic challenges.

The designation was North Korea's latest step taken during its first ruling party congress since 2016.

During the meeting, Kim also vowed to build more sophisticated nuclear weapons, disclosed economic developmental goals and reshuffled party officials. But observers doubt whether such moves can offer North Korea any substantial solutions to difficulties that include coronavirus-related economic shocks, natural disasters and persistent US-led sanctions.

The congress announced Kim's



new title during the sixth day of the meeting Sunday. A congress statement said Kim "has gloriously realised the historic mission to complete the country's nuclear build-up plan," according to the official Korean Central News Agency.

Kim already was the party's top leader. During a 2016 party congress, he was named party chairman and before that had led the party with the title of first secretary. But general secretary has important symbolism in the country led by dynastic rule since it was the title held by his father, Kim Jong Il, and grandfather, Kim Il Sung.

WHO EXPERTS' TEAM TO VISIT CHINA JAN 14

THE TEN-MEMBER TEAM OF WHO EXPERTS IS EXPECTED TO VISIT WUHAN, BUT IT IS NOT CLEAR YET WHETHER THEY WOULD VISIT WIV TOO

Beijing, Jan 11: China said Monday that a group of experts from the WHO will arrive in the country Thursday for a long-anticipated probe into the origins of the coronavirus pandemic, ending the uncertainty and delay which drew sharp criticism from the world health body.

Experts from the WHO will conduct a field visit to China January 14, the state-run CGTN quoted China's National Health Commission as saying in a report.

Confirming the visit, Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesman Zhao Lijian told a media briefing Monday that China supported scientists around the world to conduct a global study on the origins and trans-

mission routes of the virus. Zhao declined to provide details of the schedule of the experts and whether they would be permitted to visit the Wuhan Institute of Virology (WIV).

US President Donald Trump, who has termed coronavirus "China virus", has alleged that the virus may have emanated from WIV and called for a probe into it.

WIV has denied the allegation, saying it is politically motivated.

The ten-member team of WHO experts is expected to visit Wuhan, but it is not clear yet whether they would visit WIV too.

When asked about it, Zhao directed the questions relating to the schedule of the WHO experts to relevant authorities. "China stands ready to closely



cooperate with WHO and international experts. With specific details of itinerary, I refer to you to competent authority," he said. "The origin tracing may involve

more countries. The WHO needs to conduct similar studies in other countries and regions," Zhao said, highlighting Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi's recent comments

that China "raced against time" and was the first country to report coronavirus cases to the world.

"More and more research suggests that the pandemic was likely to have been caused by separate outbreaks in multiple places in the world," he said.

The team's visit to China, especially to Wuhan where the virus first emerged in December last year, has become a bone of contention as Beijing, which questions the widely-held view about the virus' origins in Wuhan, had delayed granting permission to the 10-member team of experts.

China has been proactively questioning the view that the deadly outbreak took place in a wet market in Wuhan where live animals, birds and reptiles are sold and

spread to humans. The market remained closed and sealed since early last year.

Monday's confirmation came after WHO chief Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, who is often accused of being pro-China, in a rare instance of criticism, expressed disappointment over Beijing for not finalising the necessary permissions for the experts' team's arrival.

"I'm very disappointed with this news, given that two members had already begun their journeys and others were not able to travel at the last minute, but had been in contact with senior Chinese officials," he said.

Tedros said he "made it clear" that the mission was a priority for the UN health agency and it was eager to get it "underway as soon as possible".

Auto registrations log positive growth in Dec

New Delhi, Jan 11: Vehicle registrations in December 2020 logged an 11 per cent growth on a year-on-year (Y-o-Y) basis, the first positive growth in a month in the current financial year.

Data released by the Federation of Automobile Dealers Associations (FADA) Monday showed that over 18.44 lakh vehicles were registered last month, compared with over 16.61 lakh units in December 2019.

"December registrations for the first time in FY20-21 witnessed positive growth of 11 per cent (Y-o-Y) largely due to the festival spillover demand and pre-buying due to announcement of price hike in January '21," said a FADA statement.

Registration of two-wheelers, personal vehicles, and tractor categories rose by 11.8 per cent, 24 per

cent, and 35.5 per cent (Y-o-Y) respectively while that of commercial vehicles and three-wheelers continued to decline by 13.5 per cent and 52.7 per cent respectively compared with the same period in 2019.

As per the data, dealer inventory continues to fall with personal vehicles' inventory ranging from 15-20 days and two-wheelers' inven-

tory from 30-35 days.

Personal vehicle dealers continued to face supply-side issues for the second straight month, leading to higher waiting period that went as far as eight months.

Commenting on the registration data, FADA President Vinshesh Gulati said: "A good crop season, bet-

ter offers in 2W segment, new launches both in PV as well as 2W and a fear of price increase in January 2021 kept the demand going."

"Supply-side issues in passenger vehicles continued for the 2nd straight month, thus making the waiting period stretch to as long as 8 months in select OEM vehicles," he said.

Gulati noted that the commercial vehicle segment continues to see demand pressure even though on a Y-o-Y basis the segment fell by 13.5 per cent.

Increased intra-city goods movement continued to help small commercial vehicles outperform medium and heavy commercial vehicles' segments as axle-load norms, increased fuel and vehicle costs and higher freight rates continued to play the spoilsport, he said.

Tractors continue to outshine the supply for six straight months, further confirming the fact that the rural economy carries on to lead India's economic recovery, the FADA President added.

FADA looks forward to initiatives to spur demand in the upcoming Union Budget and specific initiatives for the auto industry to continue auto sales in higher gear, said the statement.

Soybean meal exports nearly triple to 2.68L tonnes in Dec

Indore, Jan 11: India's soybean meal (soybean khali) exports rose nearly three times to 2.68 lakh tonnes during December last year on higher demand in the global market, SOPA said Monday.

In December 2019, soybean meal exports stood at 90,000 tonnes, as per data released by Indore-based Soybean Processors Association of India (SOPA).

France (43,257 tonnes) and Iran (41,500 tonnes) were among the biggest importers of Indian soybean meal in December, the data showed.

The leftover product after extracting soybean oil is called soybean meal.

India's soybean meal exports grew two-and-a-half times to 5.99 lakh tonnes during the first quarter of current oil marketing year (October 2020-September 2021).

During the previous oil marketing year, 2.36 lakh tonnes of soybean meal was exported from the country during October-December.

"Indian soybean meal prices are competitive against this product from the US, Brazil and Argentina. This is increasing India's soya khali exports and we are looking forward to regaining our lost market," SOPA Chairman Davish Jain said.

Stretched valuations of financial assets pose risks to stability: Das

New Delhi, Jan 11: Raising concerns over a disconnect between the financial markets and the real economy, RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das Monday said that stretched valuations of financial assets pose risks to financial stability.

In his foreword to the Financial Stability report of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) for January, he noted that banks and financial intermediaries need to be cognisant of these risks and spillovers in an interconnected financial system.

"The disconnect between certain segments of financial markets and the real economy has been accentuating in recent times, both globally and in India. Stretched valuations of financial assets pose risks to financial stability," he wrote.

The Governor's statement comes at a time when the Indian equity markets are scaling new highs amid the pandemic, while the economy is going through a recession.

Das said that in spite of rising public commitments for mitigating the impact of the pandemic, fiscal authorities are also witnessing revenue shortfalls. The resultant expansion in the market borrowing programme of the government has imposed additional pressures on banks, he added.

So far, the borrowing programme has been managed smoothly so far, with the lowest borrowing costs in 16 years and elongation of maturity, Das said, adding that the corpo-

rate sector has also raised substantial funds from financial markets amidst easy financing conditions, which have been mainly used for deleveraging and building up precautionary buffers.

"As growth impulses take root, the private sector capex cycle should revive as existing capacities get utilised and new capacities are added. This will require the financial system to intermediate expanded growth requirements of Indian business," Das wrote in the foreword.

Noting that India's banking sys-

tem faced the pandemic with relatively sound capital and liquidity buffers built assiduously in the aftermath of the global financial crisis, he said: "Notwithstanding these efforts, the pandemic threats to result in balance sheet impairments and capital shortfalls, especially as regulatory reliefs are rolled back."

In addition, banks will be called to meet the funding requirements of the economy as it traces a revival from the pandemic. Consequently, maintaining the health of the banking sector remains a policy priority and preservation of the stability of the financial system is an overarching goal, Das said.

Centre releases ₹2,578.45cr to Odisha in 11th tranche

New Delhi, January 11: The Union government has released ₹2578.45 crore to Odisha so far to meet the GST compensation shortfall. The Finance ministry Monday released eleventh weekly instalment of ₹208.08 crore to Odisha.

The Union government has also allowed ₹2,858 crore additional borrowings to the state to meet the shortfall to help them in mobilising additional financial resources.

According to the Ministry of Finance, an amount of ₹6,000 crore as back-to-back loan to states to meet the GST compensation shortfall has been released as eleventh weekly instalment.

The Union government has released ₹5,516.60 crore to 23 states and an amount of ₹483.40 crore to 3 Union Territories (UTs) with Legislative Assembly (Delhi, Jammu & Kashmir & Puducherry) who are members of the GST Council. The Finance Ministry said that the remaining five states, Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, Mizoram, Nagaland and Sikkim do not have a gap in revenue on account of GST implementation.

The Ministry also informed that 60 per cent of the estimated GST



compensation shortfall has been released to the states and UTs with Legislative Assembly. "An amount of ₹60,066.36 crore has been released to the states while ₹5933.64 crore has been released to the three UTs with legislative assemblies," the Finance ministry said.

Significantly, the Union government had set up a special borrowing window in October 2020, to meet the estimated shortfall of ₹1.10 lakh crore in revenue arising on account of implementation of GST. The Finance Ministry informed that the borrowings are being done through this window by the Union government on behalf of the states and UTs.

"The amount has been borrowed this week at an interest rate of 5.1057 per cent. So far, an amount of ₹66,000 crore has been borrowed by the Union government through the special borrowing window at an average interest rate of 4.7271 per cent," the ministry said.

ECoR breaches 150 MT-mark

Bhubaneswar, Jan 11: East Coast Railway (ECoR) carried 150.86 million tonne of freight traffic up to January 10, 2021 of the current financial year. With this achievement, it became the 1st zonal railway to reach 150 MT freight loading in the current fiscal.

During the period of time, ECoR carried 84.10MT of Coal, 20.50MT of Iron Ore, 13.03mt of Iron & Steel, 5.67mt of raw materials for steel plants, 5.30MT of fertiliser, 2.29MT of container, 2.05MT of food grains, 2.03MT of petroleum products and 15.88MT of other commodities.

Around 6.58 million tonne of freight was carried during January



1-10 with registering a growth of 15.6% as against the corresponding period of last year.

Also, ECoR carried 20.53MT of freight in the month of December, 2020 only of the current financial year by increasing 11.8% more than the corresponding period of 2019.

By the end of December, 2020 of the current financial year, East

Coast Railway has carried 144.25MT of freight. This include 80.50MT of Coal, 19.50MT of Iron Ore, 12.44mt of Iron & Steel, 5.25mt of raw materials for Steel Plants, 5.16mt of fertilizer, 2.21mt of container, 1.93mt of food grains, 1.95mt of Petroleum Products and 14.77mt of other commodities.

To achieve this loading figure, East Coast Railway has utilised 9945 Wagons per day in December, 2020 as against 8864 wagons during the correspondence period of last financial year. Similarly, up to the end of December, 2020, East Coast Railway has utilised about 7,899 wagons per day from 1st April, 2020 and aims to load more rakes to achieve the goal.

Future-RIL deal: Amazon urges Sebi to suspend review

New Delhi, Jan 11: E-commerce major Amazon has written to Sebi yet again, apprising the market regulator of the formation of the arbitration tribunal at SIAC while urging it to suspend the review of the ₹24,713 crore Future-RIL deal.

It has also filed an appeal with the Division Bench of the Delhi High Court against the December 21 order of the single member bench, according to sources.

On December 21, a single member bench of the Delhi HC had rejected Future Group's plea to restrain Amazon from writing to regulatory authorities about the

SIAC (Singapore International Arbitration Centre) arbitral order but gave a go-ahead to the regulators to decide over the deal.

The court had also made several observations indicating that Amazon's attempt to control Future Retail through a conflation of agreements Amazon has with an unlisted unit of the Indian company will be violative of the FEMA FDI rules.

Emails sent to Amazon and Future Group seeking response on these matters did not elicit a response.

In its letter dated January 5 - a copy of which was seen by PTI - Amazon informed Sebi that the

A three-member tribunal consisting - Singaporean barrister Michael Hwang has been formed at SIAC. The other two members of the tribunal are Albert van den Berg and Jan Paulsson.



'Mutual fund AUM rises 17%

Mumbai: A massive rally in the equity markets since May bringing in heavy inflows into equity ETFs and open-ended debt funds has helped mutual fund AUM grow 17% to top the ₹31L-cr-mark in 2020, which is 1 percentage point lower than 2019, according to a report. During the year, the 44-player industry has added ₹4.5L cr to the AUM, while in 2019 it grew 18% from ₹22,86L cr in 2018, when it had grown only 7.5%, as per Crisil data.



Sydney, Jan 11: Ravichandran Ashwin and Hanuma Vihari battled pain and a hostile Australian bowling attack while resolutely displaying the largely extinct art of Test-saving batsmanship to snatch a remarkable draw for India after Rishabh Pant raised visions of an improbable win here Monday.

Chasing a Herculean target of 407, Pant (97, 118b) and the ever-steady Cheteshwar Pujara (77, 205b) produced an amazing 148-run stand before India were forced to down the shutters finishing on 334/5 in 131 overs when players shook hands.

The series stands at 1-1 going into the fourth Test in Brisbane but an Indian team who have turned into a 'mini-hospital' would be walking away with a lot of pride. They put up a proper fight in adverse cir-

umstances already soured by racist chants and abuses from the crowd here during the course of the game.

Pant's innings will be remembered for a long time but none can forget that Ashwin (39 n.o., 128b) and Vihari (23 n.o., 161b), battling a hamstring injury, put their bodies on a line to save a game which could have been lost in a jiffy after their two best batsmen were gone on the day. Pat Cummins (1/72), Josh Hazlewood (2/39), Mitchell Starc (0/66) and Nathan Lyon (2/114) threw everything they had, peppering them with short balls, hitting the patches with a few jumping from the spot. The duo, in 42.4 overs, scraped their way for a 62-run stand, which certainly would have made Rahul Dravid proud on his 48th birthday. Vihari hobbled with a torn hamstring but defended doggedly. Ashwin got hit on the ribs but carried on manfully while also engaging in some chatter with Tim Paine and close-in fielders. Catches landed in no man's land and that was the slice of luck they

needed. When Marnus Labuschagne was brought in the 112th over, one knew that they had done their job.

Perhaps, it was the best way to honour the brilliance of Pant and the assuredness of Pujara. So much so that Ravindra Jadeja, with his broken thumb, was all gloved up and ready to go in if needed to be.

There was method to madness in Pant's exhilarating innings. His 'cat and mouse' game with off-spinner Nathan Lyon was one for the ages. But it was Lyon, who had the last laugh when Pant's desperation to get to the three-figure mark before the second new ball saw him try to hit the spinner against the turn.

The result would have horrified his partner Pujara, who looked far more purposeful during his 205-ball knock. He got a beauty from Josh Hazlewood and was bowled in the manner he has often been - playing inside the line to a delivery that moves a shade after pitching.

Pant was promoted above Vihari as playing the surviving game wouldn't have helped on this track at least in the first session and also the left-right combination needed to be in place.

MAJOR TALKING POINTS

RACIAL ABUSE: On Day 4, play was held up for 10 minutes and six spectators were thrown out after the Indian seamer Mohammed Siraj complained of abuse from a section of the crowd. New South Wales Police and SCG security were seen walking the fans out of the stands after Siraj and Indian captain Ajinkya Rahane pointed them out to officials. It followed similar complaints on Day 3 from Siraj and teammate Jasprit Bumrah.

NOT THE SPIRIT OF CRICKET: Steve Smith was caught in the act apparently trying to disturb Pant's batting mark, sparking a furious response from fans terming it as a 'bad sportsmanship'. The stump camera showed Smith walking up to the crease and attempting to rough up Pant's (crease) guard. When Smith returned to his fielding position, Pant was seen asking the umpire for guard.

PAINE'S MIND-GAME: Paine and Ashwin were involved in some heated sledging on the final day. Referring to Friday's series-deciding Test at the Gabba in Brisbane, where Australia haven't lost since 1988, Paine said to Ashwin: "I can't wait to get you to the Gabba, Ash, I'll tell you what, woo hoo." The quick-thinking Ashwin hit back: "Just like we want to get you to India. That will be your last series." Paine then replied: "Maybe. Are you a selector here as well?" The Aussie skipper then added: "At least my teammates like me, d***head. I've got a lot more Indian friends than you do. Even your teammates think you're a goose, don't they? Every one of them." At this point, Ashwin had stepped out of his crease to compose his thoughts with spinner Nathan Lyon waiting at the other end to bowl. "Tell me when you're done," Ashwin asked Paine. "I'll talk all day, mate," was Paine's response. "Wait until you get to the Gabba, pal." With Lyon asking what the hold-up was, Ashwin gestured towards him and said: "It's your guy, man, not me." Paine couldn't resist another dig shortly afterwards, saying: "How many IPL teams wanted you when you asked every single one of them to have you? Oh, I'll come if I'm captain. I've played a series in India. Yeah. Can't remember my average, 60-something."

POST MATCH REACTIONS

AJINKYA RAHANE

DAY 5 STRATEGY: Our talk coming this morning was to show character and fight till the end. Not to think about the result. Really happy with the way we fought especially today but also throughout the game. Even in the first innings when Australia were 200/2 and getting them all out for 338 was really good.

ON VIHARI: I think this knock was more special than his hundred (in 2019 in the West Indies) especially the way he batted after getting injured. To show that kind of motivation, hunger and hang in there for your team, that's what shows the character of an individual. It's all about what the team wants and credit to him. There was pressure and the way he batted was special.

CREDIT TO TEAM: This is as good as winning a Test match. When you come abroad and play a match like this, it was really special as I said. It's as good as victory. Credit to Vihari, Ashwin, Pant, Pujara, the way they batted. Rohit at the start. Everyone chipped in but credit to those two guys (Vihari & Ashwin) in the end.

ON PANT: As captain and team man-

agement, you can make strategies but it's upto the individual to execute that plan (No.5). Rishabh did that for us. Unfortunately he was out on 97. The way he counter-attacked was really good to see and about Rishabh's character, we know that he can actually win the game for us in any situation. We had that belief, he is improving day by day as a cricketer.

ON RACISM AGAINST SIRAJ: We have lodged a complaint and I spoke to the match referee and umpires whatever I had to speak. Whatever happened is not acceptable at all and shouldn't happen anywhere in the world and we were upset about it

TIM PAINE

DROPPED CHANCES: The dropped catches have played a part in the result. Probably going both ways to be fair. But I am bitterly disappointed, I pride myself on my wicketkeeping. Haven't had too many worse days than that today. It's a horrible feeling knowing our fast bowlers and our spinner (Nathan Lyon) bowled their hearts out and gave everything to the team. I certainly feel I let them down. I have to wear that (gloves), but I'll get another

crack at it next week so move on.

DUEL WITH ASHWIN: There was a bit of by-play going on. They were wasting a bit of time, we were getting a bit frustrated, we let him know, he had a bit of say back and again it's all part of the game. No harm done.

ON THE RESULT: Well, obviously, we wanted to win the game. I thought we created enough chances to do so, wouldn't say it's deflating, thought there were a lot of positives out of the game and it was an awesome game of Test cricket. Thought India fought hard like we knew they would. Clearly, we are disappointed not to get a win but thought there were some good signs for us after the Melbourne Test. We were good enough to get over the line and India fought really hard and deserved the result.

ON RACISM AGAINST SIRAJ: I think it's bitterly disappointing. Cricket Australia and the Australian cricket team, we don't condone any sort of abuse, particularly racial abuse. I just wanted to let the Indian team know we were with them on that. Like I said, it's not condoned by any of us and really disappointed that that happens when teams come to Australia and we want it to stop. Vihari ruled out of Brisbane Test

NEW DELHI: India's injury woes in the Test series against Australia compounded Monday after the hero of their drawn game in Sydney Hanuma Vihari, was ruled out of the fourth and final Test with a hamstring tear that could keep him out of action for a considerable time.

It has been learnt that Vihari was taken for scans after the match. However, a BCCI source confirmed to PTI that Vihari is unlikely to be fit in

time for the next Test match starting in another three days' time.

"The extent of Vihari's tear can only be ascertained after the scan reports come through. But even if it's a grade 1 tear, he is out for at least four weeks and then will need some rehabilitation time. So it's not only Brisbane Test but also, he won't be a part of England Tests at home," a senior source revealed Monday.

As far as Vihari's replacement is concerned, the team only has two

options - either to play Wriddhiman Saha as a wicketkeeper and Rishabh Pant purely as a batsman or bring in Mayank Agarwal as a middle-order batsman.

In another important development, Shardul Thakur, with way more first-class experience and better batting abilities compared to rookie T Natarajan, is likely to replace an injured Ravindra Jadeja on a track that is supposed to be the bounciest of the series.

terfinals Monday after a three-set loss to Maria Sakkari.

The Greek player hit nine aces against none for Kenin and 23 winners to the American's eight. Sakkari's next opponent is fourth-seeded Aryna Sabalenka, who made it 13 tour wins in a row by beating Elena Rybakina 6-4, 4-6, 6-3 for a place in the semifinals.

Sabalenka finished last season with titles at the Ostrava and Linz indoor tournaments and has started 2021 with four wins in Abu Dhabi. Sabalenka has won three of the four matches she has played against Sakkari, all of them on hard courts.
