PANT, GILL, PUJARA SCRIPT INDIA'S REMARKABLE 3-WICKET WIN IN BRISBANE TO SEAL TEST SERIES 2-1

Brisbane, Jan 19: A fearless India, driven by its courageous youngsters, pulled off an exhilarating three-wicket win over Australia in the fourth Test to claim the series 2-1 and retain the Border-Gavaskar Trophy here Tuesday.

Resuming at four for none on the final day, India overhauled the target with 18 balls to spare in a match that went down to the wire. Rishabh Pant led the chase with his aggressive yet mature unbeaten 89 while Shubman Gill scored 91.

Cheteshwar Pujara endured many painful blows on his body for his dogged 56-run knock. Australia had won the pink-ball Adelaide Test while India struck back with victory in Melbourne. The Test in Sydney had ended in a draw. India had won a historic Test se-



ries Down Under two years back and now the team is cherishing back-to-back series victory. The visitors had lost the ODI series before winning the T20 series that preceded the Test rubber.

At the start, India lost experienced vice captain Rohit Sharma (7) early but young Gill rose to the occasion with an impressive knock that kept India in the hunt as Pujara dug heels on the other end. Rahane did try to build on the good start with his short but attacking 24-run knock before his soft dismissal.

With Pant's ability to strike the ball at brisk pace, India always had a chance to go for the kill. Pant pulled off some breathtaking cover drives off Pat Cummins and Josh Hazlewood in the final session though he benefitted from missed stumping chance.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi was

one of the first to congratulate the team, complimenting it for its passion and energy. "We are all overjoyed at the success of the Indian Cricket Team in Australia. Their remarkable energy and passion was visible throughout. So was their stellar intent, remarkable grit and determination. Congratulations to the team! Best wishes for your future endeavours," he tweeted.

Tendulkar lauded the fact that every member of the team took responsibility to take the side across the line at some point during the series.

"Every time we got hit, we stayed put & stood taller. We pushed boundaries of belief to play fearless but not careless cricket. Injuries & uncertainties were countered with poise & confidence. One of the greatest series wins! Congrats India," he said.

15 crushed to death by truck in Gujarat

Surat, Jan 19: Thirteen migrant labourers and a year-old girl from Rajasthan who were sleeping by the roadside in Gujarat's Surat district were among 15 dead after a dumper truck ran over them Tuesday, police said.

Those killed include eight women and a migrant worker from Madhya Pradesh, police said. While 12 of them died on the spot, three died during treatment at a hospital, police added. Except for the 19-year-old worker from Madhya Pradesh, all the other deceased were from villages in Banswara district in south Rajasthan, police said.

The tragedy took place near Kosamba village, around 60 km from Surat. The truck driver, who apparently lost control over the vehicle after hitting a sugarcane laden tractor, has been booked under sections of the IPC and Motor Vehicles Act, police said.

The truck driver and the vehicle's cleaner were also injured in the accident and are being treated at a hospital. The truck ran over the migrant construction workers on the Kim-Mandvi



road shortly after midnight, Surat SP Usha Rada said.

The truck driver lost control over his vehicle after dashing against the tractor and veered off the road onto the pavement where the workers were sleeping, she said. "The truck was on its way to Mandvi from Kim. The driver lost control of the vehicle after it hit sugarcane hanging out of the tractor trolley coming from the opposite direction.

"The truck's front window pane shattered on impact, which blocked the driver's vision. The truck then veered off the road and crashed into the sleeping labourers," she said. Except for one, a native of MP, all other victims were from Rajasthan, police said. Prime Minister Modi announced that ex-gratia of two lakh from the PM's National Relief Fund would be given to the next of kin of each person killed and ₹50,000 would be given to each injured.

Bose birth anniversary Parakram Diwas

New Delhi: The government has decided to observe January 23 as 'Parakram Diwas' to commemorate the birth anniversary of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose, Union Minister Prahad Singh Patel said Tuesday. Prime Minister Narendra Modi will participate in the first 'Parakram Diwas' programme in Kolkata January 23 on Bose's 125th birth anniversary and inaugurate an exhibition on the grounds of National Library to mark the occasion, Patel said.

No food subsidy in Parl canteen

New Delhi: The subsidy on Parliament's canteen food served to Members of Parliament and others has been stopped, LS speaker Om Birla said Tuesday. He also said that from now India Tourism Development Corporation will handle canteens in Parliament in place of Northern Railways. With the subsidy coming to an end, the Lok Sabha secretariat can annually save more than ₹8 crore. From now the food in Parliament canteen will be sold at their actual cost. The canteen had food priced at a very low cost.

Petrol, diesel prices breach record high levels

New Delhi, Jan 19: Petrol and diesel prices rose again by 25 paise per litre each Tuesday after oil marketing companies decided to continue the upward price revision of auto fuels in the wake of enlarging under recovery on sale of the two products.

The increase in the pump price of petrol and diesel has come on a day when global oil prices gave a glimpse of softening with crude falling below \$ 55 a barrel after almost a week of hovering above that range.

With Tuesday's increase, petrol is being sold at ₹85.20 a litre in Delhi from the previous day price of ₹84.95 a litre. Similarly, diesel prices also increased to ₹75.38 a litre, up from previous day's level of ₹75.13 a litre.

Across the country as well pump price of petrol and diesel increased but the quantum of the rise varied from state to state depending on the level of taxation on the two petroleum products.

The last two days of increase in pump prices in petrol and diesel has taken its price to record levels across the country in all major metro cities and other towns. The last time the retail price of auto fuels were closer to current levels was on October 4, 2018 when crude prices had shot up up ₹80 a barrel.

The current price rise is largely on account of steep increase in the central taxes of petrol and diesel as crude prices are still below \$ 55 a barrel.

2nd tranche of Covishield arrives

Bhubaneswar, Jan 19: The state government Tuesday received the second consignment of Covishield from the Serum Institute of India (SII) through a special aircraft to boost the ongoing inoculation drive in the state.

Now, the government hopes left-out health workers who were deprived of vaccination owing to short supply of the vaccine would be benefitted. The state health department Tuesday said it has now received ample supply of the vaccines to cover left-out health workers.

"We received a total of 3,34,534 Covishield doses from SII. With the first consignment, we had targeted to inoculate 1.92 lakh health workers. Now we have ample supply and the left-out health workers will be vaccinated," Bijay Panigrahi, Director, State Health and Family Welfare, said.

He said there is no information from Bharat Biotech on its next consignment of Covaxin. "Even if



we keep 10 per cent of vaccines as buffer stock, we are able to utilize the current supply for the people registered in the first list," he said.

The government is now looking into the requirement of the doses from each district and the new doses will be dispatched to districts as per their demand over next three days.

The vaccination drive continued in the state even Tuesday but with fewer people getting the shots owing to observance of the Village Nutrition Day in rural areas. The department vaccinated people at 192 sites and targeted a total of 16,261 beneficiaries against its earlier target of 31,902 Monday.

Fresh circular

BHUBANESWAR: State health and family welfare director Bijay Panigrahi Tuesday said the health department has issued circulars to clarify that those health workers who refused to take vaccines would not be given free vaccines from the government. He hinted that health workers who recently protested against government and boycotted the vaccination drive would not get free shots. He, however, said those who were absent due to other reasons can be considered for rescheduling. The officer said several health workers have given in writing that they would not take vaccines while several others have opted out of the current vaccination drive voluntarily. He requested the health workers to come forward and vaccinate themselves.

State asks Centre to clear ₹6039cr dues

Bhubaneswar, Jan 19: The state government Tuesday asked the Centre for urgent release of pending subsidy of ₹6,039 crore to complete the paddy procurement process in the state.

Food supplies and consumer welfare minister Ranendra Pratap Swain Tuesday wrote a letter to this effect to his counterpart at the centre, Piyush Goyal. The state government will get the dues pending against its claims made during 2014-15, 2017-18, 2018-19 and the current year till December, 2020.

Swain said the Odisha State Civil Supplies Corporation has so far borrowed a staggering ₹15,000 crore to run the programme due to non-release of subsidy by the centre although it has pending subsidy

claims towards provisional and advance subsidy of ₹6039 crore.

"Since all resources including the sanctioned limits of bank finances have been exhausted, further paddy procurement from farmers may be severely affected. The pending subsidy, therefore, may be released urgently," Swain said.

Raising another issue on the lifting of the surplus paddy from Odisha, he said the Food Corporation of India has asked the state government to limit the delivery of surplus parboiled rice to the extent of 50 per cent of the last year's delivery and not to accept any surplus in the form of parboiled rice during the rabi season of the current kharif marketing season 2020-21. Odisha is primarily a parboiled rice consuming state as 24 out of 30 districts consume parboiled rice.

India asks WhatsApp to withdraw changes to privacy policy

New Delhi, Jan 19: The Indian government has asked WhatsApp to withdraw the recent changes in the privacy policy of the messaging app, saying unilateral changes are unfair and unacceptable. In a strongly worded letter to WhatsApp CEO Will Cathcart, the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology said India is home to the largest user base of WhatsApp globally and is one of the biggest markets for its services.

The proposed changes to the WhatsApp Terms of Service and Privacy Policy, without giving users an option to opt-out, "raise grave concerns regarding the implications for

the choice and autonomy of Indian citizens," it wrote.

The ministry asked WhatsApp to withdraw the proposed changes and reconsider its approach to information privacy, freedom of choice and data security.

WhatsApp had January 16 delayed the introduction of the new privacy policy after user backlash over sharing of user data and information with the parent company, Facebook Inc.

Stating that Indians should be properly respected, the ministry said, "any unilateral changes to the WhatsApp Terms of Service and Privacy Policy would not be fair and acceptable." With over 400 million users in India, the changes will



have a disproportionate impact on the country's citizens, it said.

It asked WhatsApp to provide details of the services provided by it

in India, categories of data collected and permissions and consents sought. Also, WhatsApp has been asked to explain if it conducts pro-

cessing of Indian users on the basis of their usage, as well as explain difference between the privacy policy in India and other countries.

WhatsApp has also been asked to provide policy on data and information security, privacy and encryption. It has also been asked to detail data sharing with other apps and if it captures information about other apps running on the mobile phones of the user.

Besides, complete technical architecture and server hosting data of Indian users have been asked to be furnished along with details of access to a third party. The changes "enable WhatsApp, and other Facebook companies, to make invasive and precise inferences about

users which may not be reasonably foreseen or expected by users in the ordinary course of assessing these services, the ministry said.

The updated terms would enable WhatsApp to collect "highly invasive and granular metadata" such as time, frequency and duration of interactions, group names, payments and transaction data, online status, location indicators as well as any messages shared by users with business accounts.

"The collection and onward sharing with Facebook companies, of sensitive personal data of individuals portends an ecosystem where any meaningful distinction between companies and WhatsApp will cease to exist," it said.


Sherlyn accuses Sajid of sexual misconduct

SJTA floats tender to deposit funds

EARLIER, PVT BANKS USED TO TAKE PART IN THE BIDDING PROCESS. NOW, ONLY GOVERNMENT BANKS ARE ALLOWED TO PARTICIPATE

Puri, Jan 19: The Shree Jagannath Temple Administration (SJTA) invited tenders from 10 nationalised banks for the fixed deposit of around Rs 11 crore corpus fund of the 12th century shrine.

"The bidding would be held January 21. A total of 10 nationalised banks would participate in the bidding process. The bank promising highest rate of interest would be given priority," said SJTA administrator (development) Ajay Jena.

According to sources, the SJTA has added Rs 2 crore to its corpus fund by providing temple land for the establishment of a medical college in the Holy City.

It is worth mentioning here that the temple authorities have kept Rs 102 crore in the State Bank of India after withdrawal of Rs 592 crore from Yes Bank.

Similarly, 259.19 crore has been kept in Bank of Baroda and Union Bank as fixed deposit. Temple fund of Rs 231.31 crore has also been kept in these banks as fixed deposit.

These two banks had emerged highest bidder in the tender

process last year and agreed to give maximum rate of interest. Union Bank had offered 6.20% interest while Bank of Baroda had quoted 6.15 per cent annual interest.

Earlier, private banks used to take part in the bidding process. Now, only government banks are allowed to take part, sources said.

18 platoons for darshan

PURI: Arrangements for facilitating devotees' visit to Srimandir sans Covid negative reports has reached its last phase, said an official of the district administration Tuesday.

The administration would deploy at least 18 platoons (55 sections) of armed police personnel to ensure smooth darshan for devotees without producing Covid negative reports from January 21, said Puri district Superintendent of Police (SP) Kanwar Vishal Singh.

"If required, we would deploy additional number of police personnel in and around the 12th century shrine to facilitate darshan for the devotees with strict adherence to the Covid-19 norms," Singh added.

According to the SP, two inspectors, eight sub-inspectors (SIs) and assistant sub-inspectors (ASIs), 20 constables, 10 home guards and nine sections of police force would be deployed inside Srimandir to

regulate the crowd.

At least six SIs and ASIs, 13 sections of force and six constables would be deployed at the four gates of Srimandir, said the SP. "There would be special arrangement at the Lions' Gate of the temple. A total of eight inspectors, SIs and ASIs along with equal number of constables and four sections of police personnel would manage crowd at the Lions' Gate," he added.

The SP further revealed that a total of 16 inspectors, SIs and ASIs along with 14 sections of police personnel would be asked to regulate traffic and maintain law and order on the Grand Road. "We would also deploy adequate police personnel at some strategic places in the Holy city and on the beach for the safety of visitors. CYBER CROOKS TURN TO LOAN FRAUDS

Bhubaneswar, Jan 19: Cyber criminals adopt different modus operandi each time they dupe innocent persons of their hard-earned money. Popular tricks used by cyber crooks are fake loan apps, marriage offer through matrimonial sites and online shopping with victims' credit or debit card.

Meanwhile, Google removed around 30 fake loan apps from its Play store following barrage of complaints in connection with fraud through these loan apps. Cyber crooks were sending out loan offers under the guise of various government schemes to mobile phones of the victims.

Recently, some city youths reported that unknown miscreants sent SMS to their mobile phones offering them loan at very cheap interest rates under various government schemes.

Recently, a young scribe in city identified as Braja Mohan Mallick received an SMS from an unknown number in which the sender offered loan in the range Rs 1 lakhs to 25 lakhs at very cheap interest

rate. The criminals also informed through the SMS that anyone with their Aadhaar card or PAN can get loan without caring for any other documents.

Subsequently, the scribe contacted the miscreants on the number given in the message. The person who received the call promised Mallick that he was an employee of Central government and calling from Sansad Marg, New Delhi.

The miscreant said that the loan would be offered without any mortgage under the Mudra loan. The young scribe has to submit only his pan card, Aadhaar card and bank account details.

When the scribe asked to name the bank through which he would get the loan, the cyber criminal replied that the loan would be directly sent to his bank account.

Smelling arat, Mallick forwarded the mobile number and the bank account details to the cyber desk of commissionerate police for blocking the number and freeze his bank account.

Orissa POST scribe thrashed, looted

Parking and development works of other infrastructure will also begin from the same date, he said adding that efforts will be made to complete the stadium works within a year along with accom-

modation facilities for hockey players on the BPUT campus.

Speaking about the varsity, the CS said the number of professors and other non-teaching staff will be increased at the varsity in order to improve the quality of education. He assured that the construction of the stadium will not hamper the existing campus.

Notably, Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik in December last year had announced setting up of the new world-class hockey stadium in Rourkela city which is co-hosting the Men's Hockey World Cup 2023. The stadium will have a sitting capacity for 20,000 spectators.

"The stadium along with the allied facilities will be developed as a benchmark for other Hockey stadiums around the world. Spread over 15 acres of land, the stadium will be constructed in the Biju Patnaik University of Technology campus, Rourkela," Patnaik had said in a video message.

Among the fresh cases, 72 were reported from various quarantine centres and 50 detected during contact tracing, said the official.

Sundargarh recorded the highest number of new cases at 26, followed by Sambalpur (23) and Puri (17). Twelve districts have not reported any new case since Monday, said the official, adding that the fresh fatality was reported from Bargarh.

A total of 32,526 people had received shots of Covid-19 vaccine Monday, as against a target of 31,902, the official informed.

"The vaccination programme is going on at all the identified sites for the third day - Tuesday and the state recorded 102 per cent immunisation coverage January 18," the H&FW department official stated.

According to the Health department, 13,980 people received the jabs across the state January 16, the opening day of the nationwide inoculation programme.

Lathore, Jan 19: Children of migrant workers under Khaprakhol block in Bolangir have been deprived of school education as the seasonal hostels operating in schools are yet to reopen due to fund shortage and non-clearance of outstanding bills, a report said.

The hostels were established to help curb child migration and child labour but their closure has dealt a heavy blow to the education of the children of migrant workers.

As a result, hundreds of children belonging to the families of migrant workers have stopped receiving school education. As the hostels are yet to reopen, they have migrated with their parents for a living to outside of the state.

Every year, nearly 3,00,000 people from the state migrate to neighbouring states to work in brick kilns. Children accompanying their parents work with them, and suffer physical and mental torture, according to reports of rights group and civil society organisations working with migrant labourers.

Many suffer from health problems as well. However, establishment of these seasonal hostels in migration prone-districts of the state are

helping build the lives of migrant children, the report said.

Reports said that the Khaprakhol block in Bolangir district is prone to migration and every year thousands of people leave their homes and migrate to other states to earn their livelihood. Realising the gravity of the situation, the state government established seasonal hostels in various schools under the block so that the children are not deprived of education when their parents migrate to other states. These hostels do not function all round the year but are opened from the month of November till April for a period of six months.

The poor villagers who migrate to other states for work would take their children along. But establishment of these hostels have helped solved the problem. The children can now live in these hostels where they are looked after and educated till their parents return home from other states.

The state government sanctions funds for the food and lodging of these children in the hostels.

Accordingly, the district administration opened 15 hostels in various schools under the block in the 2018-19 financial year. As many as

715 students, all children of migrant workers within the age-group of six to 14 were admitted to these hostels.

The hostel authorities had to spend Rs 70,27,162 lakh towards providing food to these children. The district administration provided Rs 53,82,000 lakh to meet the cost of food to the teachers who were in-charge of these hostels. The teachers spend the money in providing food to these students while Rs 16, 45,162 lakh has remained as outstanding.

Similarly, seasonal hostels were opened in 16 schools in the 2019-20 financial year where 754 students were accommodated to receive education. The hostels were managed with the funds provided by the state government which fell short of the total expenditure incurred during the period. The hostel authorities have informed about it but the state government is yet to sanction the

in the last installment. As a result, the teachers in these schools are reluctant to take charge and reopen the hostels.

Some teachers on condition of anonymity said that they have borrowed from the provision stores and from outsiders to run the hostels but they are yet to receive the payment towards the arrears.

They have drawn the attention of the higher authorities but their pleas are yet to be addressed. When contacted, block education officer Sasthi Prasad Jhankar denied having any knowledge towards the outstanding bills of the teachers managing these seasonal hostels.

Prasant Saraf, district planning officer, blamed the teachers for the impasse. He alleged that these teachers have failed to submit the utilisation certificates in time for which the payment of outstanding bills has been delayed.

Dam construction across Saberi irks Malkangiri tribals

Malkangiri, Jan 19: Tribals here have opposed the construction of a dam by the Chhattisgarh government on Saberi river bordering this district, a report said.

The opposition of the tribals stems from the fact that the new dam at Kokram in Chhattisgarh 'will affect over 52 villages under nine panchayats of Mathili block in the district'.

The matter came to fore after the tribals under the aegis of Odisha Adivasi Sangh took out a rally at Kamarpalli and opposed the construction of dam. Tribals hailing from nine panchayats of Mathili block participated in the rally and demanded an immediate intervention of the state government to sort out the issue.

They warned of a serious confrontation on the issue if the Chhattisgarh government did not desist from the dam construction works soon. The tribals were seen holding their traditional weapons and giving away slogans against the Chhattisgarh government during the rally.

The tribals alleged that the dam construction will seriously affect their lands, water bodies, forest cover, and mineral deposits in the area which in turn will rob them off their livelihood.

They questioned how the dam construction received clearance at the government-level without looking into the damages it might cause to Malkangiri district in the state. The dam is being constructed for development of agriculture and boost power production in Chhattisgarh.

They alleged that the dam is being constructed at the cost of the interest of the residents in 52 villages under nine panchayats of Mathili block.

REPEATING TRUMP'S MISTAKES?

The Democratic Party does not appear to have a clear grasp over the nature of the mandate it has won. In a country desperate for economic relief, the Democrats are signalling they may repeat Trump's cardinal mistake of ignoring promises on the economy and spearheading the intensification of culture wars.

The Trump campaign in 2020 was as culturally toxic as in 2016. The difference lies in his economic agenda during both campaigns. Trump, in 2016, ran on a clear economic populist message breaking with the traditional Republican playbook. He slammed Clinton and Obama trade deals such as the North Atlantic Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) and the Trans Pacific Partnership (TPP), major factors in the immiseration of the manufacturing (rust belt) states that won him the Electoral College.

In 2016, Trump even eschewed standard Republican rhetoric on cuts to Medicare, a federal health insurance programme for Americans aged 65 and older, and Social Security Payroll Taxes, roughly the equivalent of India's Employees Provident Fund. In doing so, he won Hillary Clinton's supposed firewall by flipping voters that Obama had won in the previous cycles.

As President, Trump took a number of poor decisions, separating immigrant children at the borders to banning entry from some Muslim countries. However, voters gave Trump the lowest marks in his presidency when the Republicans passed \$1.8 trillion tax cuts for the rich. Taxes are an immensely significant political topic in America, which can trace its transformation from a colony to a country partly due to a famous tax protest - the Boston Tea Party.

The Trump administration negotiated the United States Mexico Canada Agreement (USMCA) that experts have termed a cannibalised copy of NAFTA. In the 2020 campaign, Trump proposed future cuts to Medicare and Social Security Payroll Taxes.

Disillusioned with Trump, Americans have given a clear mandate to the Democrats who now control the White House and both Houses of the US Congress. Control over all three levers will allow the

Democrats and Biden to act on their policy promises, such as efficient vaccination programmes, raising the minimum wage, using federal dollars to buy American goods, enacting criminal justice reform, re-joining global climate pacts, and improving on the health-care system passed during the Obama years.

However, one of the first legislative items executed by the Democratic Party, after it regained control of the House of Representatives by a slim majority, was the replacement of gender-specific words with gender-neutral words in legislative language.

The Speaker of the House, Nancy Pelosi, introduced changes in the "Rules of the House of Representatives," a document where an incoming Congress has to formulate and observe a new set of rules. The fresh rules substitute "he and she" with "such member, delegate," and "himself or herself" with "themselves." "Father, mother, son, daughter, brother, sister" were replaced with "parent, child, sibling" and so on.

Democrats claim the rules were changed to reflect the growing diversity in the US House of Representatives that saw the election of many openly LGTBQ+ members this cycle. However, the

Republican Party and its ideological partners in the media saw an opening to reignite culture wars and hide their own failure on developing popular economic agenda. They have begun the task of painting Democrats as immature cultural radicals and economic failures.

The Republican leader in the House of Representatives, Kevin McCarthy, tweeted the Rules document stating - "This is stupid. Signed, A father, son, and brother." Fox News host Tucker Carlson, widely seen as a future presidential candidate, said in his news segment - "Now, we learn it is an act of hostility against women to acknowledge that women exist. The word women itself is an offence against women." Right leaning media spun the move as Democrats trying to be inclusive by excluding the human experience and human biology that lies in gender.

Democrats have been happy to participate in this debate, while getting side-tracked from the economic promises they must now fulfil. Instead of using their majority and public platforms to corner Republican leadership on popular economic measures, they have begun their tenure playing defence on cultural debates.

Even before he takes office, Biden is personally under fire for wriggling out of a major campaign promise that won his party critical control of the US Senate this month. Had Democrats lost the Senate, their victory in the House of Representatives and presidential elections would have been meaningless with Republicans blocking legislation in the Senate.

Faced with the prospect of a razor thin defeat in two Senate races in the state of Georgia in January, Biden realised he needed economic populism and accept a proposal he was not keen on - \$2,000 in relief checks. Polls have shown support for the checks as high as 65 per cent among the American public.

In a campaign speech for Georgians, Biden said, "The debate over \$2,000 isn't some abstract debate in Washington. It's about real lives...If you send (Democratic candidates for Senate) to Washington, those \$2,000 checks will go out of the door...if you send senators (from the Republicans) back to Washington, those checks will never get there."

The announcement has been acknowledged as the push that helped Democrats tip two statewide races in a Republican state and achieve legislative control over the Senate. However, days later, Biden unveiled an economic package that has whittled down the promised relief to \$1,400. Biden supporters are now saying his campaign speech meant additional relief of \$1,400, following the \$600 relief checks that were passed under Trump, prior to the Georgia election. The backpedalling has infuriated some Democrats, who have called him out in public.

The two moves signal Democratic leadership has not grasped the answer on why Trump won in 2016 and lost in 2020. Contrary to mainstream media propaganda in the USA, Americans are not as culturally polarised as they are economically desperate. If the Democrats fail to use their political majorities to push on economic relief, they invite major electoral losses in the future.

Tractors and Tanks

The Supreme Court's ruling on January 18 about the farmers' proposed tractor rally in Delhi on Republic Day says that it is a matter of law and order and the Delhi police has to take a call. This nips in the bud an attempt by the executive to abdicate its responsibility and make the judiciary do its dirty work. The Apex Court, very smartly, observed during the hearing on a plea seeking an order against the rally that the Centre has all the authority to deal with this matter.

The ruling comes close on the heels of a controversial direction of the SC to form a four-member expert committee to ascertain whether the three contentious farm legislations against which the farmers have been spearheading an agitation at the borders of Delhi for nearly two months are beneficial for farmers or not.

The Apex Court's direction on constituting the committee was pronounced when the government was trying to buy time and tire out the agitating farmers after nine rounds of talks with them had failed to yield results, with both the sides refusing to budge from their respective stand. While the farmers have been insisting on repealing the three laws in totality, the government continues to parrot its position that it is ready to discuss the laws clause by clause, but would not concede the demand for their annulment.

To escape the yoke, the government has been conveniently diverting critical decisions to the judiciary. This has become the favourite escape hatch for the executive. The farmers easily saw through this game and refused to appear before the committee.

The composition of the committee was a big let-down as all the members are known supporters of the three laws. The court ignored the suggestion of senior lawyer Dushyant Dave appearing for a farmers' group to include former CJI RM Lodha in the committee to make sure there was balance. CJI SA Bobde did not consider well known journalist specializing on agriculture and rural development Magsaysay award winner P Sainath as a member, an idea he himself had toyed with earlier. Within hours of announcement of the names, one of the members, Bhupinder Singh Mann, national president of Bharatiya Kisan Union, recused himself from the committee. As if to strengthen the suspicion that the committee would only put its seal of approval on the government's position on the laws, Mann said he dissociated himself from the committee because he wanted to be on the side of the farmers.

The Apex Court, as is usual habit, strayed into the role of a mediator instead of adjudicating the legal challenge. The challenge was mainly on two grounds. First, it was contended the Parliament is not competent to enact the laws as the subject comes under the State List. The second plea is that the manner in which they were passed in the Rajya Sabha violated Constitutional provisions. Articles 100 and 107 of the Constitution and the rules of the House stipulate that all matters at any sitting of either House or joint sitting of the Houses shall be determined by a majority of votes of members present. The majority has to be determined only by recording of votes even if one member demands division. The three Bills were passed in the RS by voice vote amidst raucous demand by Opposition members for division. The Deputy Chairman of the House, who was conducting the proceedings, was in such a hurry that he declared them passed without recording the votes. According to Article 107, a Bill shall not be deemed to have been passed unless both Houses agreed to it. What strains credulity further about the honesty of the government exercise is that the President gave his assent to the Bills the same day they were presented to him.

In this backdrop, the SC ruling on tractor parade appears to be a boon to the government. It is a known fact that the Delhi police is administered by the Union Home Ministry. So much so that the Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal has often been physically attacked in the presence of Delhi police personnel and has not received any protection from them. Kejriwal's dissatisfaction with the Delhi police surfaced when he refused use of several sports stadiums of the Delhi government as 'jails' or detention grounds for farmers in the initial stages of the protests. The SC ruling is a clear under-cover support to the Union government to derail the tractor rally.

It would indeed be a victory for democracy if Delhi police would actually allow the tractor parade to take place and not hide under the pretext of breakdown of law and order or traffic issues to stop it.

Yale

Your first thought may be of the famous Yale University in the US, or perhaps of a make of cylinder lock. Neither is the sense that's involved here, though there is a close link with two colleges of Britain's Cambridge University and Yale does come into the story. We are concerned here with mythical beasts. Classical and modern literature is full of them, ranging from centaurs and dragons to jabberwocks and Harry Potter's blast-ended skrewts. This one is classical Roman, having first been described by Pliny the Elder. He gave it the name of eale - we don't know why: the word turns up nowhere else in classical literature - and included it as an animal of Ethiopia: It is the size of the river-horse, has the tail of the elephant, and is of a black or tawny colour. It has also the jaws of the wild boar, and horns that are moveable, and more than a cubit in length, so that, in fighting, it can employ them alternately, and vary their position by presenting them directly or obliquely, according as necessity may dictate -- The Natural History, by Pliny the Elder, circa 77 CE, translated by John Bostock. We know river-horse better by its ancient Greek name of hippopotamus. A cubit was a measure of length roughly that of the forearm, about 18 inches (44 cm). Nobody knows what animal Pliny was trying to describe. As so often, he may have been conflating inaccurate travellers' tales about a number of different kinds of beasts, such as a type of big-horned African ox, an antelope or a species of goat. Following Pliny's description, the yale is usually shown in illustrations as a mixture of bits of other animals, a chimera, with the snout of a wild boar, the body and head of an antelope, and a couple of long pointed horns of indeterminate origin. The beast turns up in English heraldry in late medieval times, with its form borrowed from Pliny. By then its coat had changed to silver with gold spots. In herald-speak these are bezants, a name originally attached to gold coins minted in Byzantium. Because of the animal's supposed skill in using its horns it came to represent proud defence. The connection with Cambridge University comes via Margaret of Beaufort, the mother of King Henry VII and reputedly the richest woman in medieval England. She founded two of the colleges of the university - Christ's and St John's - at the beginning of the sixteenth century. Because of this, her arms, including yales, may still be seen over the gatehouses of the two colleges. Yale University has borrowed the heraldic beast as a play on its own name. Two in chains flank the portico of Davenport College, one is depicted on the official banner of the president of the university and the campus radio station uses a yale as a logo. The university was actually named in memory of Elihu Yale, a governor of the British East India Company. His name comes from Iâl, a place in north Wales, which in turn is from the Welsh word for a fertile or arable upland.

Sharing a samosa in space

An Indian restaurant in the city of Bath, England, made news recently when it sent a samosa into space. The samosa went all the way to a foreign land and was enjoyed by a samosa-loving creature of some sort.

The samosa was sent into space by a restaurant called Chai Walla and its owner, Niraj Gadher, according to a report by Somerset Live, a news site that covers Bath, the cleanest city in England.

Chai Walla has been ranked as one of the best restaurants in Bath, but that distinction was not enough for Gadher. He apparently also wanted it to be recognised as the only restaurant in the world with a "samosa space program."

As he told Somerset Live, "I said as a joke once that I would send a samosa into space, and then I thought during this bleak time we could all use a reason to laugh."

Gadher used large weather balloons filled with helium to send a package holding the samosa, as well as a wrap, into the atmosphere. It took three attempts to send the samosa off on its mission, as you will undoubtedly read



one day in "The History of Samosas in Space."

Gadher attached a GoPro video camera and a GPS tracker to the package, so if you watch the video on YouTube, you can actually see the samosa looking down on the earth like some sort of Samosa God.

The balloons lifted the samosa so high that in one of the shots from the video camera, you can see a plane in the background. I wonder if any eagle-eyed passengers spotted it.

The samosa came so close to the plane that the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) of the United Kingdom almost recorded the first samosa-plane collision in history.

Thankfully the samosa made its way safely across the English Channel, before landing in a field in Caix, Northern France. Gadher pinpointed its location using the GPS tracker and turned to social media for help. An Instagram user named Axel Mathon drove to the location and found the package. The camera was still there, but the samosa and wrap had disappeared, presumably eaten by an animal of some sort—a hungry animal whose prayers had been answered by the Samosa God.

It's important to note that this wasn't the first time that a samosa has travelled to space. Indian-American astronaut Sunita Williams took a samosa with her on her expedition to the International Space Station in 2012. But Chai Walla did become the

Overburdened courts

Sir, A division bench of the Supreme Court headed by Justice SK Kaul has expressed serious concern over appeals made in each and every case decided by the lower courts. Elaborating on a case referred to it for further review where the Delhi High Court had upheld the orders passed by two academic authorities for vacating premises of an educational institution in larger public interests, the apex court has made it clear that there must be an end to referring the cases where judgements have been given by as many as two empowered authorities and a lower court. The court has not ruled out the possibility of its own judgements made null and void had there been an upper forum above it. The pronouncement carries substantial strength and intensity as the process of frequent referrals to the highest court of the land would cost not only time of the entire judicial process, but also money and energy involved in repetition of the procedures and leaving many more sensitive cases in cold storage of the already crowded volumes of cases in the registry. It's time for the appellants to be judicious by not knocking at the doors of the court each time they get a rebuff from the lower courts. This apart, the habitual litigants must be put on alert for not overburdening the High Courts and the Supreme Court for every trivial issue that can be solved in forums vested with quasi judicial powers.

Mumbai, Jan 19: Expressing serious concerns over the recent leaks of social media chats of two media personalities, the Maharashtra Congress Tuesday said they compromised national security and violated the provisions of the Official Secrets Act.



Sachin Sawant, Maharashtra Home Minister, said the leakage of the purported social media chats conducted between Republic TV chief Arnab Goswami and ex-BARC CEO Partho Dasgupta undermined national security of the 'highest order'.

In a memorandum submitted to Maharashtra Home Minister Anil Deshmukh, a Congress delegation led by spokespersons Sachin Sawant and Raju Waghmare said that the leakage of the purported social media chats conducted between Republic TV chief Arnab Goswami and ex-BARC CEO Partho Dasgupta undermined national security of the 'highest order'.

On his part, Deshmukh assured that he would take up the matter in the state Cabinet before taking a decision. Headed by Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray, the Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) government comprises Shiv Sena, the Nationalist Congress Party and the Congress.

The developments came a day after the NCP demanded a joint parliamentary committee probe into the matter and Deshmukh said January 18 that the government is trying to ascertain how Goswami got access to such highly classified details pertaining to national security.

Sawant and Waghmare pointed out how, in one of the chats, Goswami tells Dasgupta that he

knowledge of classified national security operations from revealing them to unauthorised persons," the two leaders said.

Besides, the OSA 1923 vests the power of investigating and prosecuting offences related to Sec. 5 with the concerned state government, said Sawant and Waghmare.

They urged the state home minister to order a probe and register an offence if needed against Goswami for compromising national security, probe how he was privy to the information and who leaked such sensitive information to him.

Sawant and Waghmare raised another issue of Republic TV allegedly illegally using Doordarshan Prasar Bharati satellite frequency signals without paying the uplinking fees to reach millions of additional subscribers free in an illegal manner.

The matter figured in another chat of Goswami in which he is claiming that the then Information & Broadcasting Minister Rajyavardhan Rathore kept the matter pending till Republic TV escaped action from the government.

This issue, the duo demanded must be investigated along with the TRP probe of Mumbai Police in which Republic TV and certain other private television channels manipulated viewership data causing huge losses to the Indian exchequer.

"Even the date and time stamps on this message show that this chat happened 3 days before the Indian Air Force conducted an air strike on Balakot in Pakistan on February 26, 2019," the Congress memorandum said.

Both leaders informed Deshmukh how it was a matter of serious concern that Goswami was not only privy to information of the highest secrecy regarding national security operations of the armed forces but was also openly sharing it with Dasgupta, and it is not known as to how many other people he (Goswami) may have leaked these secrets to.

Kerala expects Covid cases to fall only by July

Thiruvananthapuram, Jan 19: The Kerala Health Department, headed by Minister KK Shailaja, is sceptical as the number of Covid patients has been on the rise everyday and a study conducted by it says that the cases were expected to come down to 1,000 per day only by July.

Kerala has the highest number of Covid positive cases per day followed by Maharashtra. While the state had 3,346 positive cases Monday, Maharashtra had 3,081 cases.

The number of positive cases per day in other states has come down below thousand since the past few weeks. Karnataka had registered 745, West Bengal 589 and Tamil Nadu 589 per day once. Death figures per day show the

state is second only to Maharashtra.

As the number of recoveries was more than positive cases per day, the health department is of the opinion that the medication and precautions were giving results.

Shailaja said that the local body polls and the festivals were the reason for the increase in cases in the state and called upon the people not to let their guards down.

"The vaccination drive is a positive sign but it does not mean that we can relax. We have to be

on guard and all the security measures we are adopting have to continue," she told the media.

Health experts are of the opinion that sticking on to antigen tests and the population density are the main reasons for the rising Covid cases in the state. Antigen tests generally don't give proper results. Better results are generally obtained by RTPCR tests which other states were using.

However, Rajeev Sadanandan, Chief Minister's Covid Advisor, told the media: "No need to worry regarding the spike in cases. We are the only state where the number of deaths was not increasing."

Vaccination resumes in Maha after 2-day pause

There was hardly any rush of registered beneficiaries at the vaccination centres

Mumbai, Jan 19: After a gap of two days, the COVID-19 vaccination drive resumed in Mumbai and Pune Tuesday morning, but unlike the first day, there was hardly any rush of beneficiaries for taking jabs in the metropolises.

A doctor at a vaccination centre in Mumbai said the response was slow in the morning, but the process was gradually picking up.

The inoculation drive resumed at nine centres in Mumbai and 28 centres in the neighbouring Pune district, officials said.

The Maharashtra government had suspended the inoculation process Sunday and Monday due to some problems in the Co-WIN app, created by the Centre for managing registration for the vaccination.

On the first day of the vaccination on Saturday, only 1,923 out of 4,000 registered beneficiaries got the doses in Mumbai, as per the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC).

Tuesday, the vaccination process started around 9 am at all the centres in Mumbai, as per BMC officials. However, unlike Saturday, there was hardly any rush of registered beneficiaries at the vaccination centres.

The waiting room at a vaccination centre in the civic-run KEM Hospital was almost empty at around 10.30 am.

"Only 15 to 20 people have come



since the start of the process today," a staffer at the vaccination centre said. One or two registered beneficiaries are coming at a gap of 5 to 10 minutes, he said.

"The response was slow in the morning, but it is slowly picking up," a doctor at the facility said, adding that the centre will remain open till 5 pm. Some healthcare workers, who were asked to go to the KEM Hospital for inoculation, told PTI that they received calls for vaccination from the BMC's war room between 8.30 pm and 11.30 pm Monday.

Besides, some registered beneficiaries also said they either did not receive any message, while a few said they received the message early Tuesday morning.

"I got a call for vaccination at 11.30 pm Monday, which was very late, but haven't received any message," said a health care worker from the KEM Hospital's microbi-

ology department, who came to take the vaccine shot.

In Pune, the vaccination resumed at 28 out of the 31 centres Tuesday, a senior district health official said.

There are 31 vaccination centres in the district - eight each in Pune city and Pimpri-Chinchwad civic limits and 15 in rural areas. Pune Municipal Corporation's health chief Dr Ashish Bharti said the vaccination could not be started at three centres due to some technical issues.

"We are trying to rectify the issues at the three centres. The vaccination at the remaining five centres in the city started at 10 am," he said.

He also said the administration is trying to conduct more vaccinations than the designated target of 100 per day at bigger medical facilities in Pune, like the Sassoon Hospital and the Kamla Nehru Hospital.

Oommen Chandy to lead UDF in Assembly polls

MPs K Muralideharan, K Sudhakaran, Kodikkunil Suresh and Shashi Tharoor, besides former KPCC president, VM Sudheeran, are the other members of the committee.

Chandy (77), along with CWC member AK Antony, Ramesh Chennithala and Mullappally Ramachandran, had held discussions with Sonia Gandhi and Wayanad MP Rahul Gandhi at Delhi Monday.

Antony had later said the chief ministerial candidate would be announced after the front's 'victory'.

The leaders later told media personnel that they would face the polls unitedly and the only agenda



was to ensure that the party and the front come out with flying colours.

Chandy was showered with rose petals and given a warm welcome by party workers at the airport here on his return late last night from Delhi.

The Indian Union Muslim League and RSP, both coalition partners of the front, had come out openly after UDF's lacklustre performance in the recent local body polls and suggested that Chandy be brought back to the forefront and given more responsibility.

Meanwhile, KPCC president Mullappally Ramachandran said Tuesday said he would foray into the electoral arena in the polls if the party asked him to do so. "I have always obeyed whatever the party says. If the party asks me to contest, I will do so. Till today I have not gone beyond what the party has said," he told reporters at the airport here soon after he returned from Delhi after crucial meetings with the party high command.

entire state show that people have rejected the BJP. This can also mean that people have accepted the Thackeray government," the editorial said.



10,064 new Covid cases

New Delhi: India reported the lowest number of daily coronavirus infections in over seven months with 10,064 new cases, which took the caseload to 1,05,81,837, while recoveries have surged to 1,02,28,753, according to Union Health Ministry data updated Tuesday. The country's death toll increased to 1,52,556 as 137 fatalities, the lowest in around eight months, were recorded in a span of 24 hours, the data updated at 8 am showed. The number of people who have recuperated from the disease surged to 1,02,28,753, pushing the national Covid-19 recovery rate to 96.66 per cent, while the Covid-19 case fatality rate stands at 1.44 per cent.

Activist held in drugs case

Mumbai: A 49-year-old anti-drugs activist was arrested on Monday by the Anti-Narcotics Cell (ANC) of the Mumbai Police in connection with a drugs case, an official said. The name of the activist, identified as Asif Sardar, had cropped up as a supplier during interrogation of one Ayyaz Yakub Mandiwala (46).

Schools reopen in Tamil Nadu

Chennai: After a gap of 10 months, schools were reopened for Classes 10 and 12 in Tamil Nadu Tuesday with students undergoing body temperature and oxygen level checks before entering the premises. The Tamil Nadu government last week announced reopening of schools from January 19 which were shut following the Covid-19 outbreak since March 2020 while Chief Minister K Palaniswami appealed to parents and teachers to extend their full cooperation to the government in its efforts.

STRAINS IN CONGRESS-DMK ALLIANCE IN PUDUCHERRY

Puducherry, Jan 19: Cracks appeared to have developed in the decade-old alliance between the ruling Congress and DMK in the Union Territory just months ahead of the Assembly elections, with a senior leader of the Dravidian party pitching for contesting all 30 seats.

Party sources said DMK, which has been of late distancing itself from the Congress, felt the V Narayanasamy government had ditched the party on several occasions and matters, including appointment of chairpersons to various statutory bodies, and occasions though it had been supporting it from outside since 2016.

Amid the visible strains, senior leader and MP S Jagathrathagan, deputised by the party leadership, Monday told a party executive committee meeting here that DMK should win in all 30 constituencies in the next polls, likely in April-May, seen as an indication that it should go it alone.

At the meeting, local DMK leaders, including MLA R Siva and former minister SP Sivakumar, projected Jagathrathagan, who represents Arakonam in neighbouring Tamil Nadu, as the Chief Ministerial candidate of the party.

"The DMK should romp home in all the 30 Assembly constituencies in the Union Territory in the next polls," the MP said, adding the party needed to emerge a big winner so that it could strive hard to ensure that Puducherry made a rapid stride in every field.

While welcoming Jagathrathagan on his arrival at the venue of the meeting, the DMK workers raised slogans hailing him as the Chief Ministerial candidate of the party. DMK had won two seats out of the ten it contested under the Congress-led alliance in the 2016 Assembly elections. Its tally rose to three after the victory in the byelection to Thattanchavady held in 2019.

SC panel to keep aside personal views on farm laws: Ghanwat

New Delhi, Jan 19: Under attack from protesting unions for their "pro-government" public stand on three contentious farm laws, members of a panel set up by the Supreme Court to resolve the crisis said Tuesday they will keep aside their own ideology and views while consulting various stakeholders, even as they indicated a complete repeal won't augur well for much-needed agriculture reforms.

A key committee member and president of Maharashtra-based Shetkari Sanghatana, Anil Ghanwat said the farm sector reforms are much needed and no political party in the next 50 years will ever attempt them again if these laws are repealed.

He, however, added the panel will listen to all farmers, including those supporting and those opposing the laws, and accordingly prepare a report for submitting to the apex court.

He also said that the laws implemented in the last 70 years were not in the interest of farmers and about 4.5 lakh farmers have committed suicide.

"Farmers are getting poor and are under debt. Some changes are needed. Those changes were happening but the protest began," he added. After their first meeting here, Ghanwat said the first round of consultations with farmers and other stakeholders has been scheduled for Thursday. Noting that the "biggest challenge" is to convince

Govt-farmers talks postponed to Jan 20

New Delhi: The Union Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare on Monday said that the meeting between a group of ministers and farmer unions scheduled for January 19 has been postponed to January 20. It would be the 10th round of talks between Centre and the representatives of the agitating farmers who are on streets along the borders of Delhi since almost two months, demanding withdrawal of the newly passed

Stating in the letter that the meeting would be held on January 20, the farmers' leaders have been requested to attend the meet.

Kolkata, Jan 19: West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee said Tuesday, "Those who want to join the BJP can leave, but we will not bow our heads before the saffron party." Speaking about the defection of some TMC leaders, she further said, "Politics is a solemn ideology, philosophy; one can change clothes daily but not ideologies."

Addressing a rally in Purulia Tuesday, Banerjee spoke on a host of issues ahead of 2021 West Bengal Assembly elections. Mamata Banerjee said that the BJP is "more dangerous than Maoists".

"You all voted for the BJP in Lok

Sabha elections, but does your MP visit you? Have they given you anything? They will make false promises before election and once it's over, they will flee," said Banerjee.

"In Bengal, the BJP is more in media than on the field. The party is using IT to scare and intimidate the Opposition. They have created WhatsApp groups to spread fake news. The BJP is far more dangerous than the Maoists. They came and insulted Birs Munda. They say Bengal, but they are Kangal for votes," Mamata Banerjee said while launching a scathing attack at the BJP.

Hitting out at the Centre, Banerjee said, "We were the first to

announce that we will celebrate the day as Desh Nayak Divas. What the Centre has announced is their discretion, but we are not happy."

"I still think that the Central government should declare it a national holiday. They (Centre) said that it will declassify all Netaji files, but they have not. They only remember Bengal just before elections. They can't even pronounce Bengal properly," Banerjee said.

Taking a dig at the BJP over a complaint filed against actor Saayoni Ghosh, Banerjee said, "How dare the BJP threaten actor Saayoni Ghosh. I dare the BJP to touch her or anyone from the Bengali film industry."

RSS set to see changes; new face may replace Bhaiyyaji Joshi

New Delhi, Jan 19: The Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) is set to witness a major organisational change after its crucial meeting in March.

The Akhil Bharatiya Pratinidhi Sabha, the RSS' highest decision-making body, is scheduled to meet March 19 and 20 in Bangalore.

For the first time, the meeting related to the organisation's election would take place away from its Nagpur headquarters.

In the March meeting, a new face is likely to be chosen for the number two position in the RSS. Sources say that Suresh Bhaiyyaji Joshi may be replaced.

According to sources, Joshi, who has been the Sarkaryavah (general secretary) for the past 12 years, had

wished to give up the post three years ago in 2018. However, he was given an extension due to his organisational skills. Sources say that Bhaiyyaji Joshi may be given the responsibility of coordination among all the Sangh Parivar organisations in his new role.

In the RSS, the post of Sarkaryavah is elected every three years. It is an executive post in the organisation, while the Sarsanghchalak is regarded as the guide. Sarkaryavah is responsible for conducting the regular work of the organisation.

Bhaiyyaji Joshi, 73, has been on the post of Sarkaryavah since 2009.

In 2018, due to illness, he had wished to quit the post then but was asked to continue. However, this time, sources say, he may leave the post.

The election to the post of

Sarkaryavah in the RSS is always a unanimous decision, and the decision is unanimously taken by about 1,400 representatives from

all the provinces of the country.

Nagpur Sangh ideologue Dilip Deodhar told this news agency: "There is going to be a unanimous decision for the post of Sarkaryavah in the Akhil Bharatiya Pratinidhi Sabha. Sarkaryavah Bhaiyyaji Joshi will get an extension or a new face will get a chance. The delegates will take a unanimous decision on this. Dattatreya Hosbole's name is being discussed for this post."

Deodhar said the election for Sarkaryavah post in the Sangh is very important from the point of view of the next two events. First, the general election of 2024 and, second, the centenary year on the completion of 100 years of the Sangh in the year 2025. Considering these two key occasions, the election of new Sarkaryavah is important. Sources said if Bhaiyyaji Joshi

does not get the extension again, then the responsibility of the post of Sarkaryavah could be given to the present co-head Dattatreya Hosbole since in terms of the organisation-related work, he is considered senior to other co-workers.

Hosbole is 65-years-old. In such a situation, he can further complete two terms of Sarkaryavah until he reaches 71 years. Sources told IANS that the Sangh has a focus on the southern region as several states are slated to go to the polls.

In such a scenario, Hosbole, who oversees the southern affairs, could play quite an important role.

Dattatreya has developed organisational skills during his long stay at the ABVP. Also, the name of Krishna Gopal and Manmohan Vaidya are also in the discussion for the post of Sarkaryavah.

The gazette said that the people of India fondly remember Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose's unparalleled contribution to this great nation in his 125th birth anniversary.

"The Government of India has decided to celebrate the 125th birth anniversary year of Netaji beginning from January 2021 in befitting manner at national and international level," it said.

The announcement assumes significance ahead of the West Bengal Assembly elections scheduled later this year.

Bose, a noted freedom fighter, had floated Azad Hind Fauj to fight for India's independence.

The government Tuesday stepped up efforts to bolster trust in coronavirus vaccines after it was revealed that nearly a third of those invited to get jabs at the launch of a nationwide drive failed to turn up

New Delhi, Jan 19: The government has begun one of the world's most ambitious vaccine programmes, aiming to inoculate 300 million of the 1.3 billion population by July.

In the first three days of the drive, which started Saturday, the government said 381,305 vaccinations were carried out.

In the capital New Delhi, only 53 per cent of people came forward for jabs, according to a health official.

"These are initial days and we understand people are waiting to see how the procedure pans out and how other vaccines fare," said Suneela Garg, a member of the coronavirus task force for the capital.

"These numbers will go up as confidence is strengthened. And for that, we have to tackle misinformation." The Hindu newspaper reported that in Tamil Nadu the turnout was only 16 per cent.

At a community health centre in Rohtak district in Haryana, only 29 out of 100 people expected showed up, a doctor there told AFP.

"People are very scared. We can't force anyone to take the vaccine, it is voluntary," said the doctor, speaking on condition of anonymity.

With public doubt about the drugs spreading on social media, Health Minister Harsh Vardhan changed his Twitter profile header to say "VACCINES WORK".

Man rapes 13-yr-old Dalit girl, tries to bury her alive

Betul, Jan 19: A 13-year-old Dalit girl has been allegedly raped by a man who then tried to bury her alive in a pit in Madhya Pradesh's Betul district, police said Tuesday.

The incident took place Monday evening following which the 35-year-old accused was arrested, and the girl, whose condition is serious, has been referred to a hospital at Nagpur in neighbouring Maharashtra, they said.

The girl had gone to a farm in a village under Ghodadongri police station area to switch off a motor and on finding her alone, the accused allegedly raped her; Betul Superintendent of Police Simala Prasad said.

In a bid to hide the crime, the accused then dragged her to a drain and dumped her in a nearby pit which he covered with stones and thorny bushes, the official said.

When the girl did not return home till late evening, her parents and sister started searching for her; he said. When her sister reached near the pit, she heard the voice of someone writing in pain.

Gupkar Alliance suffers first blow as Sajad Lone moves out

Srinagar, Jan 19: In what comes as the first major blow to J&K's Gupkar Alliance, the People's Conference led by Sajad Lone has pulled out of it.

In a letter to Fariq Abdullah, chief of the Gupkar Alliance, Sajad Lone said he is leaving the alliance because other parties fielded proxy candidates against his party in the recent DDC elections.

"It is difficult for us to stay on and pretend as if nothing has happened. There has been a breach of trust between partners, which we believe is beyond remedy. The majoritarian view in our party is that we should pull out of the alliance in an amicable manner rather than waiting for things to get messier," Sajad Lone said.

Sources say Sajad Lone has been under pressure from within his party to pull out of the alliance.



A meeting of his party was held on Monday in Srinagar with most leaders weighing in for the discontinuation of any electoral tie-up with the Gupkar Alliance.

"This alliance needed sacrifice. Every party had to sacrifice on the ground in terms of giving space to fellow allies. No party is willing

to cede space and no party is willing to sacrifice. We fought against each other in Kashmir province, not against the perpetrators of August 5 (abrogation of Article 370 on August 5, 2019). And those who perpetrated August 5 and their minions are now vocally gleeful," Sajad Lone said in his letter.

Recently, leaders like Imran Reza Ansari and Abdul Ghani Vakil from the People's Conference had openly criticised Sajad Lone over his decision to remain in an electoral alliance with the National Conference and the People's Democratic Party.

The Gupkar Alliance, an amalgam of six political parties, was given a formal shape on October 15, 2020.

This was seen as a joint political approach by the mainstream political parties from Kashmir against the central government's move to abrogate Article 370 and strip J&K of its special status in 2019.

Dawood relocates key family members outside Pakistan

AS GLOBAL PRESSURE MOUNTS ON PAKISTAN TO DISMANTLE TERROR NETWORKS ON ITS SOIL, INDIA'S MOST WANTED FUGITIVE DAWOOD IBRAHIM HAS REPORTEDLY RELOCATED KEY FAMILY MEMBERS

New Delhi, Jan 19: As global pressure mounts on Pakistan to dismantle terror networks on its soil, India's most wanted fugitive Dawood Ibrahim, operating from Karachi, has reportedly relocated key family members, including his son and the children of two younger brothers. Earlier Dawood had arranged Portuguese passports for his eldest daughter Mahrukh, married to Pakistani cricketer Javed Miandad's son Junaid, Indian intelligence sources revealed to this news agency.

Sources said that Dawood's younger brother Mustakeem Ali Kaskar is already settled in Dubai and looks after D-company's "legitimate" business in United Arab Emirates, Bahrain and Qatar.

Mustakeem, who runs a garment factory in UAE, reportedly takes care of a few close relatives of the D-family who were recently flown to Dubai from Karachi. Intelligence sources said that Dawood's brother Anees Ibrahim, who lives in Defence Housing Area in Karachi, has also gone off the radar for the past two weeks. Dawood's notorious lieutenant and extortion points-man Chhota Shakeel is also lying low these days.

Looking after the D-company's financial empire, Anees Ibrahim, an accused in the Mumbai serial blasts of 1993, has also shifted his children to a country in the Middle East.

At present Ibrahim looks after Mehran Paper Mill located 154 km away from Karachi in Kotli



Industrial area of Sindh province. The paper mill, patronised by Pakistan's Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI), is allegedly involved in printing of Fake Indian Currency Notes (FICN). Earlier, the US Department

of the Treasury Office of the Foreign Assets Control had asked Islamabad to shut the paper mill as it was subject to the Foreign Narcotics Kingpin Designation Act filed against fugitive Dawood Ibrahim.

While Nurul Haque, another Dawood sibling, died in Pakistan, his eldest brother Sabir Ahmed was gunned down in a shootout in Mumbai in 1981. Sabir's family later shifted to Pakistan and is being looked after by Dawood. Sources said the don's son Moin Kaskar frequently flies to London after marrying the daughter of a well-known South Asian Muslim businessman in Britain. The couple was reportedly living in Dawood's Clifton bungalow in Karachi till 2019. Moin handles the D-company's multi-million real estate business in Karachi, Lahore and the UAE.

Reeling under pressure from the global agency Financial Action Task Force (FATF), the Pakistan government recently issued an ar-

rest warrant against Maulana Masood Azhar, kingpin of the banned terror organisation Jaish-e-Mohammed (JEM). As soon as JeM chief was targeted by the Imran Khan government, the focus (largely of media in South Asia) shifted to Dawood Ibrahim whose name also figures on the list of Interpol and global terrorists.

While the D-Company seems to face the heat after the arrest of Lashkar-e-Toiba commander Zakir-ur-Rehman Lakhvi, sources said that Prime Minister Imran Khan, a former cricketer colleague of Javed Miandad, might not give a go-ahead to pin down Dawood Ibrahim. From time to time, the entire D-company has been relocating its key members whenever the syndicate comes on the radar of global authorities.

Seoul: Twenty-six more American soldiers and five civilians have tested positive for the novel coronavirus upon their arrival in South Korea, the US Forces Korea (USFK) said Tuesday. In a statement, it said that the 31 USFK-affiliated individuals were infected with the COVID-19 after arriving in South Korea between December 29, 2020 and January 18, reports Xinhua news agency. The confirmed patients have been transferred to designated isolation facilities at the US Army Garrison Humphreys and the Osan Air Base.

US cop killed in armed standoff

Washington: A police officer was shot dead during an armed standoff in the US state of Ohio, authorities said. The incident took place Monday evening in Toledo city, Xinhua news agency reported. Officer Brandon Stalker, 24, was shot and died after being taken to hospital, said Toledo Police Department Chief George Kral. The police believed the suspect vandalised the Rosary Cathedral earlier in the day. The suspect was also shot during the standoff.

Yemen: 23 killed in clashes

Sanaa: At least 23 fighters from both Yemeni army and Houthi militia were killed in clashes in Yemen's Red Sea port city of Hodeidah, a local government military source said. "The clashes erupted after the Houthis attempted to infiltrate to the army positions in the liberated areas in the district of Al-Durayhimi in the southern part of the port city, but the army fought back, killing at least 21 rebels and forced them to retreat," the source told Xinhua news agency Monday.

Quake injures 3 in Argentina

Buenos Aires: A 6.4-magnitude earthquake struck in northwestern Argentina near the border with central Chile, injuring at least three people, authorities said Tuesday. Two children and an adult were hospitalised in San Juan province in Argentina after the quake hit just before midnight Monday, provincial Gov. Sergio Uñac said. The shaking caused the collapse of a house, damage to roads and some other buildings in several cities, as well power and water cuts, he said.

BIDEN'S GIFT TO IMMIGRANTS

ON DAY ONE OF HIS PRESIDENCY, JOE BIDEN MAY PROPOSE 8-YR CITIZENSHIP PATH FOR IMMIGRANTS

Washington, Jan 19: President-elect Joe Biden plans to unveil a sweeping immigration bill on Day One of his administration. It is hoped at providing an eight-year path to citizenship for an estimated 11 million people living in the US without legal status, a massive reversal from the Trump administration's harsh immigration policies.

The legislation puts Biden on track to deliver on a major campaign promise important to Latino voters and other immigrant communities after four years of President Donald Trump's restrictive policies and mass deportations. It provides one of the fastest pathways to citizenship for those living without legal status of any measure in recent years, but it fails to include the traditional trade-off of enhanced border security favored by many Republicans, putting passage in a narrowly divided Congress in doubt.

Expected to run hundreds of pages, the bill is set to be introduced after Biden takes the oath of office Wednesday, according to a person familiar with the legislation and granted anonymity to discuss it. As a candidate, Biden called Trump's actions on immigration an "unrelenting assault" on American values and said he would "undo the damage" while continuing to maintain border enforcement.

Under the legislation, those living in the US as of January 1, 2021,

without legal status would have a five-year path to temporary legal status, or a green card, if they pass background checks, pay taxes and fulfill other basic requirements. From there, it's a three-year path to naturalization, if they decide to pursue citizenship.

For some immigrants, the process would be quicker. So-called Dreamers, the young people who arrived in the US illegally as children, as well as agricultural workers and people under temporary protective status could qualify more immediately for green cards if they are working, are in school or meet other requirements.

The bill is not as comprehensive as the last major immigration overhaul proposed when Biden was vice president during the Obama administration. For example, it does not include a robust border security

element, but rather calls for coming up with strategies. Nor does it create any new guest worker or other visa programs.

It does address some of the root causes of migration from Central America to the United States, and provides grants for workforce development and English language learning. Biden is expected to take swift executive actions to reverse other Trump immigration actions, including an end to the prohibition on arrivals from several predominantly Muslim countries.

During the Democratic primary, Biden consistently named immigration action as one of his "day one" priorities, pointing to the range of executive powers he could invoke to reverse Trump's policies.

Biden allies and even some Republicans have identified immigration as a major issue where



the new administration could find common ground with Senate Republican Leader Mitch McConnell and enough other GOP senators to avoid the stalemate that has vexed administrations of both parties for decades.

That kind of major win — even if it involves compromise — could be critical as Biden looks for legislative victories in a closely divided Congress, where Republicans are certain to oppose other Biden priorities that involve rolling back some of the GOP's 2017 tax cuts and increasing federal spending.

In a statement to The Hill news website Monday, Giuliani, also a former New York City Mayor, said: "Due to the fact that I may be a witness, the rules of legal ethics would prohibit me from representing the President as trial counsel in the impeachment trial."

January 13, the House of Representatives impeached Trump for a second time following the riots at the Capitol building in Washington D.C. after he addressed his supporters during which called for "patriots" to take a stand against the 2020 election results.

Along with Trump, Giuliani had also addressed the supporters and called for "trial by combat".

The House has charged Trump with inciting an insurrection and threatening democracy.

Under the impeachment process, the Senate will hold a judicial-style trial of Trump with the senators acting as jurors.

No announcement has been made over who will represent Trump at the impeachment trial.

Giuliani told The Hill earlier this month that he would be willing to represent Trump at a Senate trial, as did Alan Dershowitz, the controversial celebrity attorney who was among those representing the outgoing leader at his first impeachment trial last year.

The House is yet to transmit the article of impeachment to the Senate. It is not immediately clear when the impeachment trial will begin.

Medical experts to help in rescuing trapped workers

THE BLAST TOOK PLACE JANUARY 10, AND 22 WORKERS ARE TRAPPED UNDERGROUND

Beijing, Jan 19: China's National Health Commission (NHC) Tuesday sent an expert team to Qixia in Shandong province to guide and assist the rescue mission for the trapped gold mine workers.

The team consists of five medical experts from leading hospitals in Beijing, Xinhua news agency quoted the Commission as saying.

The NHC has sent two medical experts from Shandong to Qixia to guide in the preparation of emergency medical aid.

The blast took place January 10, and 22 workers are trapped underground. Tuesday's development comes after the trapped miners sent a note Sunday, saying that 12 workers were still alive, while the state of the other 10 was unknown.

In a related development, China's National Mine Safety Administration has ordered a com-

prehensive inspection of the country's non-coal mines to forestall major accidents.

According to a directive issued by the administration, the campaign will last till the end of March, with efforts focusing on preventing the occurrence of severe accidents including collapses in mined-out areas and explosions.

In recent years, the workplace safety situation of mines in China has been steadily improving.

But the sector still faces safety risks given the huge number of scattered mines, many of which are small and ill-equipped, according to an official with the safety watchdog. At present, there are 32,000 non-coal mines in the country, 86.4 per cent of which are small.

Most of these mines are backward in technology and equipment, with undertrained staff and poor safety management, the official said.

Hong Kong's unemployment rate hits 16-yr high

Hong Kong, Jan 19: Hong Kong's unemployment rate hit a 16-year high in the period between October-December 2020 as the fourth wave of the Covid-19 pandemic further compounded the city's labour market situation, official data revealed Tuesday.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate rose from 6.3 per cent in the September-November period to 6.6 per cent in the October-December period, the city's Census and Statistics Department said in a statement.

Meanwhile, the underemployment rate remained unchanged at 3.4 per cent, Xinhua news agency reported.



Law Chi-kiang, Secretary for Labour and Welfare, said the unemployment rate in the consumption and tourism-related sectors, including retail, accommodation and food services, rebounded by 0.5 percentage point to 10.6 per cent in the October-December period. The Secretary added that the situation in the food and beverage services sector was the most severe, with the jobless rate being up to 13.8 per cent.

The unemployment rate in many other sectors also rose, Law said. Looking ahead, Law predicted that the labour market will remain under notable pressure in the near term as the coronavirus pandemic will continue to weigh on local consumption sentiment and disrupt economic activities.

The Hong Kong government has rolled out targeted measures to provide further support to the hard-hit sectors, and will continue to monitor the situation closely, Law said. Earlier this month, Hong Kong authorities launched an employment scheme to encourage local college graduates to pursue their careers in the mainland cities of the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area.

Afghan Prez & NATO chief discuss peace process with Taliban

Kabul, Jan 19: Afghan President Mohammad Ashraf Ghani and NATO Secretary General Jens Stoltenberg held a phone conversation during which they discussed the peace talks between the Kabul government and the Taliban, an official statement said here Tuesday.

The two sides Monday discussed "the Afghan peace process and NATO's continued support for Afghanistan Defense and Security forces," Xinhua news agency quoted the statement issued by Ghani's office as saying.

"NATO remains committed to supporting the Afghan Defense and Security forces and continues its mission to train, advise and assist the forces," the statement quoted Stoltenberg as saying.



The development comes as the second round began January 5 after a three-week break.

This round will focus on a ceasefire and reduction in violence in the war-torn country, TOLO News reported.

China & WHO should have 'acted quicker' to contain spread

Geneva, Jan 19: A panel of experts commissioned by the World Health Organization has criticized China and other countries for not moving to stem the initial outbreak of the coronavirus earlier and questioned whether the UN health agency should have labeled it a pandemic sooner.

In a report issued to the media Monday, the panel led by former Liberian President Ellen Johnson Sirleaf and former New Zealand Prime Minister Helen Clark said there were "lost opportunities" to set up basic public health measures as early as possible.

"What is clear to the panel is that public health measures could have been applied more forcefully by local and national health authorities in China in January," shortly after the coronavirus began sick-

ening clusters of people, it said.

The panel also cited evidence of cases in other countries in late January, saying public health containment measures should have been put in place immediately in any country with a likely case, adding: "They were not."

"The reality is that only a minority of countries took full advantage of the information available to them to respond to the evidence of an emerging pandemic," the panel said.

The experts also wondered why WHO did not declare a global public health emergency — its highest warning for outbreaks — sooner. The U.N. health agency convened its emergency committee on Jan. 22, but did not characterize the emerging pandemic as an international emergency until a week later. At the time, WHO said its expert committee was di-



vided on whether a global emergency should be declared.

"One more question is whether it would have helped if WHO used the word pandemic earlier than it did," the panel said.

WHO did not describe the COVID-19 outbreak as a pandemic until March 11, weeks after the virus had begun causing explosive outbreaks in numerous continents,

meeting WHO's own definition for a flu pandemic.

As the coronavirus began spreading across the globe, WHO's top experts disputed how infectious the virus was, saying it was not as contagious as flu and that people without symptoms only rarely spread the virus. Scientists have since concluded that COVID-19 transmits even quicker than the flu and that

a significant proportion of spread is from people who don't appear to be sick.

Over the past year, WHO has come under heavy criticism for its handling of the response to COVID-19. US President Donald Trump slammed the U.N. health agency for "colluding" with China to cover up the extent of the initial outbreak before halting U.S. funding for WHO and pulling the country out of the organization.

The U.N. health agency bowed to the international pressure at the annual assembly of its member states last spring by creating the Independent Panel for Pandemic Preparedness and Response, which produced its first report in November. The WHO chief asked Johnson Sirleaf and Clark — who both have previous ties to the U.N. agency — to lead the team.

An Associated Press investigation

in June found WHO repeatedly lauded China in public while officials privately complained that Chinese officials stalled on sharing critical epidemic information with them.

Although the panel concluded that "many countries took minimal action to prevent the spread (of COVID-19) internally and internationally," it did not name specific countries. It also declined to call out WHO for its failure to more sharply criticize countries for their missteps instead of lauding countries for their response efforts.

Last month, the author of a withdrawn WHO report into Italy's pandemic response said he warned his bosses in May that people could die and the agency could suffer "catastrophic" reputational damage if it allowed political concerns to suppress the document, according to emails obtained by the AP.

India's plans could hit Amazon

New Delhi, Jan 19: India is considering revising its foreign investment rules for e-commerce, three sources and a government spokesman told Reuters, a move that could compel players, including Amazon.com Inc, to restructure their ties with some major sellers.

The government discussions coincide with a growing number of complaints from India's bricks-and-mortar retailers, which have for years accused Amazon and Walmart Inc-controlled Flipkart of creating complex structures to bypass federal rules, allegations the U.S. companies deny.

India only allows foreign e-commerce players to operate as a marketplace to connect buyers and sellers. It prohibits them from holding inventories of goods and directly selling them on their platforms. Amazon and Walmart's Flipkart were last hit in Dec. 2018 by investment rule changes that barred foreign e-commerce players from offering products from sellers in which they have an equity stake.

Now, the government is considering adjusting some provisions to prevent those arrangements, even if the e-commerce firm holds an indirect stake in a seller through its parent, three sources said. The sources asked not to be named because the discussions are private.

The changes could hurt Amazon as it holds indirect equity stakes in two of its biggest online sellers in

India. Amazon said e-commerce created "huge job opportunities" and is a significant contributor to economic growth. "Any major alterations" to the policy will adversely impact small- and medium-sized businesses, it said in an emailed statement.

Walmart and Flipkart did not immediately respond to a request for comment. Yogesh Baweja, the spokesman for the Ministry of Commerce & Industry which is working on the issue, confirmed to Reuters any changes will be announced through a so-called "press note," which contains foreign direct investment rules. He did not give details.

"It's a work in progress," Baweja said, adding an internal meeting on the subject last took place about a month ago. "Of course Amazon's a big player so whatever advice, whatever suggestions, whatever recommendations they make, they are also given due consideration."

The 2018 rules forced Amazon and Flipkart to rework their business structures and soured relations between India and the United States, as Washington said the policy change favoured local e-tailers over U.S. ones. India's e-commerce retail market is seen growing to \$200 billion a year by 2026, from \$30 billion in 2019.

NEARLY TWO-THIRDS OF AUTO LOANS MET BY PRIVATE LENDERS

Mumbai, Jan 19: Nearly two-thirds of the auto industry's loan requirements are taken care of by the private and foreign lenders in the country, a report said Tuesday.

Referring to data dating back to June 2020, Crif High Mark, a credit information company, said state-owned lenders lead by loan volumes, accounting for nearly 35 per cent of the loans.

In terms of value of the loans extended, private sector lenders have the largest share at 41.4 per cent, foreign banks accounted for 24.4 per cent and state-owned lenders came third with 19.6 per cent share, the report prepared by the company in association with Sidbi said.

The auto industry had been facing problems because of the fall in economic growth and regulatory changes before the pandemic itself.

From an asset quality perspective, the non-performing assets (NPA) ratio on the loans taken by auto and auto components industry declined to 9.59 per cent as of June 2020, the report said.

It can be noted that starting March 2020, the RBI had given a six-month moratorium on loan repayments and allowed lenders not to recognize non-payments as NPAs. After the end of the relief period, the Supreme Court had ordered a standstill on loan recognition.

Tata Motors gets 98 patents in '20

New Delhi: Homegrown auto major Tata Motors Tuesday said it has received 98 patents last year under its accelerated drive for engineering excellence and innovation. These patents predominantly relate to the megatrend of CESS (connected, electrified, sustainable and safe) automobiles, the company said in a statement. The patents also encompass an eclectic mix of improvements in automotive electronics and noise vibration.

HT Media Q3 profit falls 54%

New Delhi: HT Media Tuesday reported 54.08 per cent fall in consolidated net profit at ₹9.43 crore for the quarter ended December 31, 2020, on account of lower total income. The company had posted a net profit of ₹20.54 crore during October-December period of the previous fiscal, HT Media said in a regulatory filing. Total income declined 37.64 per cent to ₹391.65 crore as against ₹628.05 crore in the year-ago period.

CSB Bank Q3 net up 88 pc

Mumbai: Aided by a smaller base, south-based CSB Bank on Tuesday posted an 88 per cent jump in December quarter net profit at ₹53 crore, but witnessed a jump in provisions for bad loans. The Kerala-based private sector lender's core net interest income grew by 61.8 per cent to ₹155.2 crore during the reporting quarter, while the treasury profits helped in non-interest income more than doubling to ₹116.6 crore. Its advances grew 22 per cent.

Bhubaneswar, Jan 19: Aluminium Association of India (AAI) Tuesday urged the Central Government to eliminate cess on coal to support highly power intensive industries like Aluminium.

AAI claimed that there is a GST compensation cess of ₹400 per metric ton which is a bone of contention and makes cost of producing aluminium higher than the world average.

As the union government is going present the Union Budget for 2021-22, AAI sought the government's attention to tide over this challenging phase and expected to see industry friendly measures in the forthcoming Union Budget. The Union Budget will be presented February 1.

AAI said that the challenges have been further compounded by the COVID-19 pandemic which has adversely impacted the domestic de-



mand for aluminium. The association also highlighted that the industry is not able to compete effectively in the global markets as the burden of Central & State taxes and levies amounting to 15% of aluminium production cost put the domestic industry in a significant disadvantage compared to its global peers.

AAI also urged to increase the

basic custom duty on primary aluminium and aluminium scrap to 10%. The association stated that to battle current challenges being faced by the industry in sustaining the share of the domestic aluminium demand, which is today being imploded with imported aluminium - both scrap aluminium and primary aluminium.

They also demanded reduction in

custom duty on critical raw materials for aluminium industry value chain such as Calcined and Raw Petroleum Coke, Caustic Soda and Alumina. This also encourages local manufacturers of aluminium goods to seek out import channels to meet their requirements, thereby making it a lose-lose for the country and the industry.

"This is part of revenue raising and Atmanirbhar Bharat (self-reliant India) plan," said one of the government sources. Last year, India raised import taxes on a wide range of products such as footwear, furniture, toys, electrical and electronics items by up to 20%.

Brisbane, Jan 19: An Indian cricket team saddled with broken bones and battered bodies showed a never-seen-before zeal to retain the coveted Border-Gavaskar trophy with a historic three-wicket win over Australia in the fourth and final Test here, successfully chasing a 328-run target to seal the four-match series 2-1.

A minefield of talent called Rishabh Pant (89 n o, 138b) channelled his inner 'Mad Max' to scare the daylight out of the Australians with his breathtaking strokeplay, ending the home team's 32-year-old unbeaten run at the 'Fortress Gabba'.

The result has the potential to end Tim Paine's reign as Australia captain having lost back-to-back home series against India.

The highlights package of Pant's battle with Nathan Lyon can be enjoyed repeatedly in times to come as he demolished the 100-Test man in company of debutant Washington Sundar (22), who hooked the world's best fast bowler, Pat Cummins, for a six.

While Shubman Gill (91, 146b) announced his arrival on the global stage, Cheteshwar Pujara (56, 211b) surpassed all the pain barriers en route his slowest Test fifty that held the game in balance for Pant to launch a final assault.

The Australian team wouldn't feel too good about not being able to win a Test match with an opposition that was finding it difficult to field a fit first XI a day prior to the Test match.

The series will be remembered for ages and the impact that Ajinkya Rahane's team had on the cricketing fraternity and the fans in general will be written in golden words

when a fresh history of Test cricket after 2000 is written.

In terms of relevance, a series won without Virat Kohli, Mohammed Shami, Ravindra Jadeja, Ravichandran Ashwin and Jasprit Bumrah not being available at various points, is zillion times more significant than the 2-1 win in 2018-19 when the opposition didn't have Steve Smith and David Warner in their ranks.

First time, people celebrated draws, became empathetic to players with limited abilities and believed in their team.

With its beautiful ebbs and flows, the fifth day was witness to three separate schools of batsmanship, so very dissimilar to each other.

Gill, who is now going to be the 'Real Deal', was free-flowing in his stroke-making with his 'beside the line of the ball' technique as he rode the bounce to hammer home the advantage and briefly make India favourites to win the battle.

Pujara, on the other hand, saw the Australian try out the menacing short ball tactic. He took a few on the helmet, a few more on the chest and other parts and a painful one on the knuckles but remained unfazed.

Gill and Pujara showed that there are multiple ways to skin a cat. If Pujara was ready to duck, sway and cop body blows off Josh Hazlewood and Cummins, showing the art of survival, Gill, on his first tour of Australia, was ready to be the intimidator by bringing the pull shot out of his repertoire.

The duo, during its 114-run stand, showed that very contrasting styles can co-exist without conflict even as fans of both genres argue who has the more appropriate approach for the format.

Even Pant with his cavalier ways would have added his two cents to the debate on various styles. But for the uninitiated, the three distinct schools can be suitably de-constructed - Pujara's was more of investing in an LIC policy with safe returns while Gill's





When he doesn't keep well, people criticise him but he can help you win matches like these.

Pant surpasses Dhoni

BRISBANE: Rishabh Pant Tuesday surpassed the iconic MS Dhoni to become the fastest Indian wicketkeeper-batsman to reach the 1000-run mark in Test cricket. Pant achieved the feat in only 27 innings, scoring at an average of 40.04. Dhoni had taken 32 innings to reach the milestone. South Africa's Quinton de Kock holds the record for being the fastest wicketkeeper batsman to reach 1000 runs in Test matches. He did it in 21 innings. De Kock is followed by Sri Lanka's Dinesh Chandimal (22 innings), England's Jonny Bairstow (22 innings), the legendary Kumar Sangakkara (23 innings) and AB de Villiers of South Africa (23 innings).

India on top of WTC standings

DUBAI: The stunning three-wicket victory over Australia at the Gabba, that resulted in a phenomenal series win, propelled India to the top of ICC World Test Championship (WTC) standings, Tuesday. The victory Down Under handed India 430 points, putting it ahead of New Zealand (420) and Australia (332). India have played 13 matches in five series, winning nine and losing three Tests. The team has got 71.1 per cent of the total possible points. England and South Africa are at the fourth and fifth spots respectively in the standings. India also replaced Australia at No.2 in the ICC Test Team Rankings after the Test series triumph. New Zealand is on top with 118.44 rating points, ahead of India (117.65) and Australia (113).

Rs 5 crore bonus for team

NEW DELHI: The BCCI Tuesday announced a Rs 5 crore bonus for the Indian cricket team after the Ajinkya Rahane-led side won the fourth and final Test against Australia to clinch the series 2-1 and retain the Border-Gavaskar trophy. BCCI President Sourav Ganguly and Secretary Jay Shah tweeted within minutes of each other to make the announcement. The Board later issued a formal statement, applauding the team. "The Board applauds the efforts displayed by the team on and off the field. The BCCI is proud of this magnificent feat and has announced a cash reward of 5 crore INR to the team," BCCI said.

32 Years since Australia lost at the Gabba. Last time they lost was against West Indies in 1988. In between these two defeats, Australia went unbeaten for 31 Tests. The only other venue to witness a longer streak is Karachi, where Pakistan remained unbeaten for 34 successive Tests between 1955 and 2000.

3 Previous instances in which a team has come back from losing the first Test of a series to beat Australia in Australia. On all the three occasions, it was England - in 1882-83, 1911-12 and 1954-55 - who managed that.

Squad named for England series

New Delhi, Jan 19: Virat Kohli returned to lead India against England in the upcoming home Test series while the selectors also recalled all-rounder Hardik Pandya and pacer Ishant Sharma to bolster the squad, announced by the BCCI Tuesday.

Kohli, who headed back to India on a paternity leave after the Adelaide Test, was named in the 18-man squad along with pace spearhead Jasprit Bumrah. The squad was named only for the first two Tests of the four-match series, starting February 5 in Chennai.

selection panel added Axar Patel to the squad as he would be more effective to counter England on Indian pitches. He is an apt replacement for Ravindra Jadeja.

The selection panel retained youngster Shubman Gill, Washington Sundar, Mohammed Siraj, Shardul Thakur and Mayank Agarwal.

The second Test will also be played in Chennai (February 13-17) while Ahmedabad will host the third (February 24-28) and fourth Test (March 4-8). The 4-Test series will be followed by a five-match T20I series and three-match ODI rubber that will conclude March 28 in Pune.
