## 12 dead in Guj factory wall collapse

**Morbi (Gujarat):** At least 12 labourers were killed Wednesday when a wall collapsed at a salt packaging factory in this district, officials said. The tragedy took place at Sagar Salt factory situated inside the Halvad industrial area, said Gujarat's Labour and Employment Minister and local MLA Brijesh Merja. PM Narendra Modi expressed grief over the tragedy and announced compensation of ₹2 lakh each for the kin of the deceased. He also announced a relief of ₹50,000 to those injured. The Gujarat government also announced a compensation of ₹4 lakh for the families of those dead.

## Anti-ship missile successfully tested

**Balalore:** The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) and Indian Navy successfully conducted Wednesday the maiden flight-test of indigenously-developed Naval anti-ship missile. It was launched from a helicopter from the Integrated Test Range (ITR) in Chandipur off the coast of Odisha, DRDO sources said. The mission met all its objectives. It is the first indigenous air launched anti-ship missile system developed for the Indian Navy. The DRDO said that the missile hit the designated target with degree of accuracy and it employed many new technologies, including an indigenously developed launcher for the helicopter, the defence organisation added.

# Badadanda: Rickshaw man falls into drain, dies

The incident brings back memories of Jyoti Prakash Behera who fell into an open drain and died in Bhubaneswar in September, last year

**Puri, May 18:** A rickshaw puller died reportedly after falling into an open drain at Market Square here late Tuesday night, an official said Wednesday. The incident on the Grand Road (also known as Badadanda) has shocked many. The deceased was identified as Nidhi Bhoi, 41, of Biranarasinghpur Gohiri Sahi here.

The incident came to the fore after a few locals spotted a lifeless Nidhi in the drain and informed the police. Kumbharpada police reached the spot and sent the body for autopsy.

On being informed, the aggrieved family reached the hospital and took Nidhi's body for his last rites.

According to Kumbharpada inspector-in-charge (IC) Bichitrnanda Sethi, they are yet to ascertain the exact cause of death. "We have registered a case (7/22) of unnatural death in this regard. The autopsy report will help ascertain if suffocation is the cause of death," the IIC said.

Local residents and shopkeepers meanwhile, raised questions as to why the drain was not covered.



According to Seshadeb Rath, a local, the cleaning of drains has been completed for around two months now. However, the authorities are yet to cover those with slabs. "This four-foot-deep drain is no less of a death trap. On several occasions, we've urged the civic body to cover the drain with slabs but to no avail," said Rath.

Meanwhile, Nidhi's widow Sulochana, mother of a 12-year-old boy, blamed the civic body and the district administration for the mishap and demanded compensation for the death of her husband. "My husband was the sole bread-

winner of the family. Don't know how we'll survive now. It's the district administration's carelessness," an inconsolable Sulochana said as tears rolled down her cheeks.

When asked, Puri Municipality executive officer Saroj Kumar Swain said a committee will probe the matter. "Cleaning of drains is on. Although the drain near Market Square was cleaned a fortnight ago, it was not covered. We've formed a committee to probe why the drain was kept open despite completion of the cleaning long back. Action will be taken against those found guilty," Swain informed.

# SC relief for Indrani

**New Delhi, May 18:** The Supreme Court granted bail Wednesday to Indrani Mukerjea, the prime accused in the murder of her daughter Sheena Bora. A three-judge bench headed by Justice L Nageswara Rao said the trial is not going to be completed anytime soon. Indrani was arrested August 25, 2015.

"The allegation made against the petitioner is that she planned the murder in view of the live-in relationship of her daughter with Rahul Mukerjea, who was the son of Peter Mukerjea and his earlier wife," the bench said.



"We are not making comments on the merits of the case. Even if 50 per cent witnesses are given by prosecution, the trial would not be over soon. She will be released on bail subject to satisfaction of the trial court. The same conditions imposed on Peter Mukerjea will also be imposed on her," the bench also comprising Justices BR Gavai and AS Bopanna said.

Senior advocate Mukul Rohatgi appeared for Indrani, who is currently lodged at the Byculla women's prison. Rohatgi submitted that a large number of witnesses are yet to be examined.

## RAJIV KILLING: CONVICT RELEASED

**New Delhi:** Invoking its extraordinary power under Article 142 of the Constitution, the Supreme Court ordered Wednesday the release of AG Perarivalan, who has served over 30 years in jail in the Rajiv Gandhi assassination case. A bench comprising Justices L Nageswara Rao and BR Gavai said the Tamil Nadu Cabinet's advice recommending the premature release of all seven convicts in the case was binding on the governor. The apex court also discarded the Centre's argument that the president exclusively has the power to grant pardon in a case under section 302 of the IPC. It said this would render article 161 (power of governor to grant pardon) functionless.

# Mission Shakti extended by another 5 years

**Bhubaneswar, May 18:** The State Cabinet headed by Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik approved 32 proposals Wednesday including extension of the Mission Shakti scheme for another five years with a budgetary allocation of ₹4,973.39 crore.

Also approved was a proposal to build a barrage at Pandara on the outskirts of the Odisha capital to provide clean drinking water to its residents.

Mission Shakti, a popular and vote bank scheme of the BJD government will now continue till the financial year 2026-27.

Briefing about the decisions taken at the Cabinet meeting, Chief Secretary SC Mahapatra said that Mission Shakti launched in 2001 as an initiative to form self help groups (SHGs), has grown organically and developed into one of the most successful women's empowerment programmes.

"In just two decades, Mission Shakti has been able to organise 70 lakh women into more than 6.02 lakh SHGs. A pioneering initiative in Odisha has also been to enable government departments to source goods and services worth ₹5,000 crore from SHGs in the next five years," informed Mahapatra.

During the next five years, many more milestones have been targeted under this scheme, including ₹50,000 crore bank credit to SHGs, interest subvention of ₹1,200 crore to SHGs and 500 Mission Shakti bazaars and outlets to be set up across Odisha, the chief secretary added.

The Cabinet also approved the proposal from IDCO to procure 871.427 acres of land from Tata Power Co Ltd. The land had earlier been leased out for its coal-based thermal power plant at Barang tehsil in Cuttack district. The procured land can be utilised for attracting new industrial and infrastructure projects, which will create huge employment opportunities for the people of Odisha, said the chief secretary. Mega drinking water projects for Mayurbhanj, Sambalpur and Deogarh districts were also approved. **More P3&4**

# Andhra gobbles up Odisha village again

Villagers blame Koraput district admin officials alleging that their grievances are never addressed in a proper manner

**Pottangi, May 18:** Taking advantage of the Odisha government's apathy in dealing with the problems of people living close to the borders of neighbouring state Andhra Pradesh, the latter has once again included a few villages of the former in its jurisdiction.

Officials of the Odisha government do not regularly visit the fringe areas under Pottangi block in Koraput district. Lack of monitoring and vigilance on the border situation has provided the neigh-

bouring state an opportunity to lure people by carrying out various developmental activities and offering sops in these areas.

Reports said, Bangargudi village in Talagolur panchayat is close to the Andhra border. There are 35 families in the village with a population of 120. The residents are availing various facilities from the Odisha government - road connectivity, pension and rice at subsidised rate. But they feel it is not enough.

"The problem is no MLA, BDO or child welfare officer ever visit

the village to redress our grievances," the residents said.

Two years ago, construction of an Anganwadi centre started in

the Bangargudi village, but work is progressing at a snail's pace. A total of 14 children are studying at this semi-completed building. Most of the time they are exposed to the harshness of nature as there is no rooftop to protect them.

Residents pointed out that an Anganwadi worker from AP often visits the village and invites the children to a pucca house where they are taught. The kids are also provided meals.

Sources said that the Andhra government has taken advantage

of the negligence on the part of the district administration. It has included Bangargudi village under its Paspandi block in Parvatipuram district. The village has been shown as part of Ward-8 in Muduku panchayat in Andhra Pradesh.

To keep the families living in the village happy, the Andhra government has provided 25 housing units. Five villagers are also receiving monthly pension from Andhra government. However, only two residents get the same benefit from the Odisha government. **Contd... P4**

## VOLODYMYR ZELENSKY AT CANNES 'The world needs a new Chaplin'



**New Delhi:** Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky outshone the galaxy of stars assembled at the Cannes Film Festival after he addressed the opening night crowd of actors and filmmakers, delivering an emotional plea on behalf of his war-torn country, reports Variety. Appearing via video, Zelensky said "We continue fighting and we have no choice but to do it for our freedom."

Zelensky's remarks came shortly before the premiere of *Final Cut*, which Variety describes as "a wacky zombie comedy that seems far removed from the brutality on display in Ukraine after Russia's illegal invasion." Even as Cannes returned in glamorous form after two years of the pandemic, Zelensky's "passionate rallying cry served as a reminder of the political turmoil still roiling

the world," Variety noted. Ukraine's President spoke about the responsibility of cinema in promoting the values of democracy and freedom. "Hundreds of people are dying today," Zelensky said to an audience that included Deepika Padukone and Iranian filmmaker Asghar Farhadi, both serving as jury members, as well as Hollywood stars Julianne Moore and Eva Langoria, and the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences CEO Dawn Hudson. "Is cinema going to stay quiet or is it going to stay out of it?" Zelensky asked rhetorically. He said movies have always played a crucial role in uniting people against authoritarianism and cruelty, reminding the crowd of the power of Charlie Chaplin's *The Great Dictator*, a satire of Nazism that debuted before America had even entered World War II. "The world needs a new Chaplin who will prove [to] us that cinema isn't silent," Zelensky said.

# Now, fire stations in all 314 blocks

Revenue Minister Sudam Marandi and MoS, Home, Dibya Shankar Mishra Wednesday virtually inaugurated new fire stations at Chandua under Kuliana block of Mayurbhanj and Swabhiman Anchal of Malkangiri

**Bhubaneswar, May 18:** With the inauguration of two new fire stations Wednesday, the state now has at least one fire station in each of 314 blocks, fire service officials said.

Revenue Minister Sudam Marandi and MoS, Home, Dibya Shankar Mishra have jointly inaugurated two new fire stations at Chandua under Kuliana block of Mayurbhanj district and Chittrakonda Swabhiman Anchal under Chittrakonda block of Malkangiri district on a virtual platform.

With this inauguration, the fire service directorate has fulfilled the state government's ambition to have one fire station in each

block. The total number of fire stations operating in the state has now gone up to 341, said the officials. The newly operated fire station

at Chittrakonda will cater to the needs of Swabhiman Anchal (earlier known as cut-off area) of Malkangiri district.

The state government has already sanctioned 15 staff for each of the two newly opened fire stations at Chandua and Chittrakonda. The two stations are now operating on temporary accommodations and will soon be shifted to their own buildings, they said.

The Malkangiri collector has already allotted land at Chittrakonda for construction of its own fire station building with staff quarters. Similarly, the land selected for Chandua fire station is awaiting forest clearance, the officials said.

In November 2015, Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik had announced that his government will set up 335 fire stations across the state in a phased manner with an objective to open at least one fire station in each block of the state.

# Nod to 5 drinking water projects worth ₹1,081cr

The state government has decided to provide financial assistance of ₹428.95 crore to develop a mega aluminum park at Angul

**Bhubaneswar, May 18:** The State Cabinet Wednesday approved tenders for execution of five piped drinking water projects worth ₹1,081 crore.

The government has taken a decision for execution of two of mega piped water supply projects worth ₹369.11 crore to provide safe drinking water in Sambalpur and Deogarh districts out of Jal Jeevan Mission funding, Chief Secretary SC Mahapatra said.

## 1,280 more check dams in 3 yrs

**BHUBANESWAR:** The state Cabinet Wednesday decided to build 1,280 check dams under Mukhya Mantri Adibandha Tiari Yojana (MATY) in three years with an outlay of Rs 811.45 crore.

"With an investment of Rs 811.45 crore, the state government will create irrigation potential of 27,600ha during 2022-23 to 2024-25," said Chief Secretary Suresh Chandra Mahapatra.

The state Cabinet has also decided to install one lakh deep borewells in five years under the Biju Krushak Vikash Yojana- Deep Borewell Secha Karyakrama. The scheme will be implemented in 256 blocks of 26 districts, subject to feasibility, said Mahapatra.

An amount of Rs 4,198.16 crore will be spent for creation of irrigation potential of 2 lakh hectare in Rabi and 5 lakh hectare in Kharif seasons, he said.

The Cabinet has also decided to construct two in-stream storage structures across river Kuakhai

near Pandara in Khurda with an outlay of Rs 127.32 crore and across IB river near Kudabaga in Sundargarh with an expenditure of Rs 162 crore.

The Cabinet has given its approval to tender of Rs 177.10 crore for construction of Gangadhar Meher Lift Irrigation Project and another tender of Rs 160.33 crore for rehabilitation and renovation of Bargarh main canal.

The state has decided to sanction lease of 100.05 acre land in Basantpur under Sambalpur tehsil for a Sainik School on free of premium and free of incidental charges.

The government will provide gross financial assistance of Rs 856 crore to Idco from 2021-22 to 2025-26.

The Cabinet has decided to provide government grants to 24 private upper primary schools from January 1, 2022 as per GIA order 2013. The state exchequer will bear Rs 68.55 lakh per annum for the purpose.



With the execution of these projects, around 1,68,418 people of 481 villages under 50 Panchayats of Kuchinda, Jamankira and Rengali blocks of Sambalpur district and Tileibani block of Deogarh district will be provided with safe drinking water.

Similarly, the Cabinet has approved another tender of ₹183.23 crore for execution of another mega piped water supply project in Sambalpur district out of JJM funding. Around 1,31,587 people of 221 villages under 37 panchayats of

Kuchinda and Bamra blocks of Sambalpur will be benefited through the project, he said.

The government has also approved executions of two mega piped water supply projects in Mayurbhanj district out of OM-BADC funding.

With the execution of a project worth ₹151.43 crore, drinking water will be provided to around 1,13,540 people of 164 villages under 19 panchayats of two blocks in Mayurbhanj, he said.

The tender for the second project worth ₹377.23 crore has also been approved by the Cabinet to

provide piped drinking water to 3,23,414 people under 484 villages of 62 panchayats under four blocks of the district.

The state government has also decided to provide financial assistance of Rs 428.95 crore to develop a mega aluminum park (including land acquisition) at Angul. The project would be completed in three years, said Mahapatra.

A proposal for enactment of a separate legislation for establishment of a self-financed private unitary university in the name of DRIEMS University has also been approved by the Cabinet.

**Puri, May 18:** The construction work of chariots for Lord Jagannath, Lord Balabhadra and Devi Subhadra for the world famous Rath Yatra in Puri is in full swing.

While the work for nine 'Tumba' and 'Bindha' for Nandighosa chariot of Lord Jagannath has been completed, construction of six

'Tumba' of Taladhwa chariot of Lord Balabhadra and five 'Tumba' for Debadalana chariot of Goddess Subhadra is nearing completion, sources said.

Similarly, 'Kanaguja' work of the three chariots has begun from Nrusingha Chaturdashi.

Rupakar servitors are providing all kinds of assistance in the construction work. The Shree Jagannath Temple Administration (SJTA) and the Maharana servitors are confident that the chariot construction work will be completed on time. The Maharana and the Bhoi servitors are now working in two shifts to meet the deadline.

Notably, the chariot construction work for the mega festival began on the auspicious day of Akshyaya Tritiya.

The SJTA has decided to install additional 236 CCTV cameras at

Srimandir and Gundicha temple as part of its effort to enhance security arrangement during Rath Yatra.

"The CCTV cameras will be installed at Srimandir and Gundicha shrine to ensure safety for the devotees during Rath Yatra. However, the cameras will be switched off during the performance of rituals," said a temple official.

Puri Collector Samarth Verma had earlier said the administration has two plans for the Rath Yatra—either holding the festival sans devotees as was the case the last two years, or with the participation of the public. This year, the nine-day festival will begin July 1.

As the Rath Yatra was held without the participation of devotees last two years, the administration estimates that more than 15 lakh people may turn up this time, he added.

## Barang woman 'commits' suicide

## CURBING TAX EVASION

# Realtors' turnover under govt scanner

**Bhubaneswar, May 18:** In view of large-scale tax evasion by real estate developers, Commissioner of CT and GST, Wednesday, asked the regional heads to make a scrutiny of returns of such developers to ascertain the authenticity of their turnover.

In a letter to enforcement units and commercial tax (CT) and goods and service tax (GST) circle heads, the State Commissioner stated that real estate developers who have taken up residential and commercial projects should be scrutinised for the genuineness of the turnover disclosed by them and payment of tax by the real estate sector. While conducting this exercise, the Commissioner also instructed to ensure that no genuine taxpayer is put into any kind of harassment.

It can be mentioned here that based on complaints received from flat owners, the state GST enforcement wing found that



some of the real estate developers having turnover of more than Rs 100 crore have shown no turnover in their VAT returns. Moreover, some developers have collected VAT @2% on gross value of the apartment but have not deposited the same with the government. Similarly, some others have collected VAT on the strength of money receipt and not through invoice with an intention to evade tax.

## 7 rice bran oil units raided

**BHUBANESWAR:** State CT and GST Enforcement Wing Wednesday raided seven rice bran oil units in three districts on allegations of tax evasion.

On the allegations of oil extraction plants (rice bran) purchasing raw materials out of accounts and selling oil manufactured out of the same without issuing tax invoice in order to evade tax payment, seven teams of the wing, comprising 30 officers, raided as many rice bran oil units and godowns in Sambalpur, Bargarh and Kalahandi, said a source.

"Data has been collected from Odisha Real Estate Regulatory Authority (ORERA) by the state GST department. Investigations in respect of 12 developers have

been completed and adjudication against eight developers for tax default of Rs 38 crore has already been initiated," said a senior GST official.

Sources said the teams verified sale-purchase details and manufacturing accounts. "Investigation revealed that these units have paid very negligible amount of differential tax on their sales despite having huge turnover. These units are also not reversing Input Tax Credit (ITC) on exempted sales, leading to non-payment of legitimate tax due to excess claim of ITC," an official said.

The official added the details regarding the result of inspection shall be ascertained soon after completion of the investigation.

## Woman found dead

The daily positivity rate was 0.09 per cent and four children were among the newly infected, it said, adding that 14,295 samples were tested in the past 24 hours, a bulletin stated.

The state had logged three infections and zero death Tuesday.

The toll stood at 9,126 and these are confirmed as Covid deaths after an audit. Fifty-three other coronavirus patients have died due to comorbidities so far, according to data. The tally rose to 12,88,327, including 12,79,025 recoveries, it added.

# Efforts soon to bring dropouts back to school: Min

**Bhubaneswar, May 18:** Worried over the absence of nearly 15,000 students in the final exams of Class IX, School and Mass Education Minister Samir Ranjan Dash Wednesday said that steps will be taken to bring the students back to schools. As per reports, a total of 14,935 students had skipped the Class IX annual examinations.

Dash said Wednesday that the department has already asked officials to submit a report by May 31 regarding candidates remaining absent in the examinations. He asserted that efforts will be made to bring the students back to schools after holding discussions with their

parents. Dash also said that the government has started analyzing the reasons behind such absenteeism.

In the Class IX annual exams, a total of 30,138 students got grade F (II) while 27,358 got grade F (I).

Those who got Grade F (II) will have to improve their performances in tests to be conducted by the schools concerned, said a Board of Secondary Education (BSE) official.

Grade F (I) candidates have been

declared passed because they fulfil some minimum criteria with regard to aggregate and individual subject marks. Grade F (II) candidates will be given three chances to acquire qualifying marks in each subject they have failed in.

The improvement tests will be conducted June 1, 8 and 16. Schools will prepare questions of 20 marks each and the test will be of 40 minutes duration. Earlier, the BSE had declared the results of Class IX HSC and Madhyama examinations 2021-22.

A total of 5,51,334 students had appeared in the exams while 14,935 students remained absent. In Madhyama exam, 3,279 students appeared while 128 remained absent.

# Man killed over suspected witchcraft

Madkami was on the radar of the villagers over his alleged practice of witchcraft and sorcery as he was regularly conducting some rituals at his home

The villagers were into discussion when some irate locals thrashed Madkami on the spot suspecting him of practicing witchcraft. They beat him up with lathis leading to his death on the spot. The irate youths also assaulted Bira when he tried to save his father. Failing in his bid, he fled the scene and saved his life.

Reports said that sorcery is a vicious practice in the remote and tribal hinterlands of the state where the tribal inhabitants rely on witchcraft to cure diseases and ward off evil forces by invoking their gods and goddesses despite advancement in healthcare services.

Even in urban areas, most educated people believe in black magic. Many fall prey to suspected witchcraft and sorcery practice with superstition ingrained in the minds of people.

A case registered in this connection, the IIC said.

According to sources, Madkami was on the radar of the villagers over his alleged practice of witchcraft and sorcery as he was always conducting some rituals at his home. A week back, a woman of his family had fallen ill for which her family members consulted some sorcerer instead of hospitalising her.

Later, the woman died which reinforced the suspicion of villagers and others that the woman died due to alleged sorcery and witchcraft practice of Madkami.

Wednesday's ghastly incident occurred when over 60 villagers had assembled near the village road to participate in the 10th day rituals of the deceased woman. Madkami and his son Bira were also present there.

### Three critical in bear attack

Two of the injured were admitted to Karanja sub-divisional hospital in Mayurbhanj and later shifted to Keonjhar district headquarters hospital. The injured were identified as Nilakantha Mohanta, 50, of Baunsanali, Sekhar Mohanta, 47, of Kamarmara and Majura Siddhu, 80, of Kaliaduma. The animal is reportedly holed up in Kamarmara forest. Forest officials have initiated efforts to drive out the bear from the forest.

### Locals' plea for land records

**Dasamantapur:** People of Liguma under this block of Koraput district have demanded land pattas for their dwelling places under Forest Rights Act. In the absence of land records, they are being deprived of availing various government benefits like housing and caste certificates. They have to live in huts when they are eligible to get pucca houses under Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (PMAY) and Biju Pucca Ghar Yojana (BPGY). "The government provides houses to us, but we have no land records to claim our rights," said some local residents. Tehsildar Ajay Prakash Tirkey said he would talk to the revenue inspector to issue land pattas to them.

**Balasore, May 18:** The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) and Indian Navy Wednesday successfully conducted the maiden flight-test of indigenously-developed Naval anti-ship missile launched from a Naval helicopter from Integrated Test Range (ITR), Chandipur off the Odisha coast, DRDO sources said.

The mission met all its objectives. It is the first indigenous air launched anti-ship missile system developed for the Indian Navy, they said. The missile followed the desired sea skimming trajectory and reached the designated target with high degree of accuracy validating the control, guidance and mission algorithms, they said.

Stating that all sub-systems performed satisfactorily, DRDO said that sensors deployed across the test range and near impact point tracked the missile trajectory and captured

all events.

The missile employed many new technologies, including an indigenously developed launcher for the helicopter. The missile guidance system includes state-of-the-art navigation system and integrated avionics. The flight test was witnessed by senior officers of

# SUNFLOWER FARMERS RUE LACK OF GOVT AID

**Bhapur, May 18:** Although the government is promoting cultivation of cash crops including oilseeds through incentives, farmers of Ostapal region under Odapada block of Dhenkanal district have alleged lack of access to credit facilities which is dampening their spirit.

These farmers have reportedly set an example by cultivating oilseeds like sunflower without the aid and support from the state Agriculture department, said sources. However, what has hit them hard is lack of loan facilities and provision of other aids.

This year, they have a bumper crop and they hope this would help them get a handsome amount. Though sunflower cultivation has the potential to make them self-reliant, the apathetic attitude of the Agriculture department has disappointed them. Reports said that the cli-



mate of Dhenkanal district is conducive to sunflower cultivation, which is being undertaken in Ostapal under Odapada block, Chandrasekharprasad, Beguniapal villages under Sadar block and in Bhapur block of the district.

However, what makes it difficult for them to undertake cultivation of this cash crop is lack of government support and bank loan for which many farmers are giving up this farming.

The Agriculture department is neither providing them with technical assistance nor with agricultural equipment or good seeds. As

a result, many youths are turning away from sunflower cultivation.

Moreover, many farmers are unaware of government schemes and incentives available for sunflower farming for which they are unable to come out of their traditional paddy and vegetable farming. When contacted, Suraj Prasad Sahu, agriculture officer Kalang panchayat, said sunflower seeds were earlier provided to farmers while this year they are yet to get the seeds. The seeds, once available, will be provided to the farmers who have irrigation facilities, on priority basis.

Kamesh Parida, a farmer, said sunflower oil is high in demand and that he produces oil worth around ₹25,000 by spending only ₹10,000.

Prasant Khatua, another farmer, said he has been cultivating sunflower for the last two years but his interest in the cultivation is declining due to lack of government assistance.

December 31, 2014, can fast-track the process to acquire Indian citizenship.

The demolition drive at Shaheen Bagh in Delhi, the epicentre of the protests against the CAA, was thwarted by the inhabitants of the locality, but till when? Ultimately, the government at the Centre will have its say, sooner or later.

The bulldozers and the restrictions on 'azaan' are all smaller steps to threaten and intimidate the minorities to fall in line, or face the consequences. Who will dare to raise their voice against the government, once they become familiar with the repercussions that will follow?

The smaller steps (ban on 'azaan' and demolition drive) and the bigger steps (CAA, Uniform Civil Code, Hindi as Link Language) will, therefore, go side by side till the creation of Hindu Rashtra. It's an alarm bell for liberal Hindus and the secular Opposition, to join hands to halt the BJP on its track. Already, except for West Bengal, Maharashtra, Punjab, Chhattisgarh, Rajasthan, Jharkhand, Delhi and some North-Eastern states, the BJP is in power in all the other states.

To think that the BJP will retrace its steps is next to impossible, as it is religiously following its ideological path that will earn the party rich political dividends. For this, they can go to any extreme, even amend the Constitution, if they can muster a two-thirds majority in Parliament. It is only the saner voices within the political spectrum which inclined to retain the secular identity of India that can rein-in the BJP. Unless, the saner voices join hands, India will cease to be a secular country, where Taj Mahal will be renamed a Shiva temple, Qutub Minar a Vishnu Stambh; and all roads and lanes will be christened after Hindu leaders.

Whether it's the demolition drives, or restrictions on 'azaan' on loudspeakers, wittingly or unwittingly, rights of an estimated 15.4 per cent of the country's population are at stake. There is apprehension of abuse of laws like Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA), Sedition Laws, and Foreign Contribution (Regulation) Act (FCRA), which are perceived to be tools for a larger design. There is international outcry in the form of the United States Commission on International Religious Freedom (USCIRF). Perception gaining ground is that focus is on implementing the core agenda for the formation of Hindu Rashtra.

In times like this, with tempers running high, Prime Minister Narendra Modi needs to step in and press the pause button. Modi has to bring back sanity, by effectively taking charge and gaining control over the situation, which threatens to spiral out of control. After the pandemic, India has emerged with a promise of becoming the fastest-growing large economy. India has a burgeoning middleclass, technology and start-ups. The country needs to take advantage of its strong points and forge ahead.

While restrictions on 'azaan' and use of bulldozers in localities inhabited by minorities have become the order of the day under some municipal bodies and state governments, in the larger perspective, it is tantamount to nothing else but undue harassment of Muslims.

If we see the Hindutva trajectory, the ruling dispensation with electoral numbers on its side in Parliament succeeded in reaching its goals. First, it was the abrogation of Article 370, surprising both party colleagues and the Opposition, and the bifurcation of Jammu and Kashmir into two Union territories. Though there is talk that after the delimitation exercise, the statehood of J&K would be restored, it remains a distant possibility. Unless the region's majority community is brought in line, the BJP cannot afford to give them back their free-

dom. They will have to be controlled from Delhi.

The construction of the grand Ram temple in Ayodhya, the declaration adopted at the BJP convention in Palampur, way back in 1989, has also been achieved by the BJP. It was a Herculean task, but the BJP did not shy away from demolishing the Babri Masjid 6 December, 1992. Modi and Shah have achieved what Advani and Vajpayee could not achieve during their entire careers.

To fulfil their agenda, what they require is popular mandate. No wonder that the BJP is bent upon forming governments in one state after another. With a series of state elections due this year and the next, the BJP has once again turned belligerent on its Hindutva agenda.

The language issue raked up by none other than Union Home Minister Amit Shah emphasised that Hindi should be the language of communication in the country, a statement that infuriated leaders from many parts of the country. Social media was witness to a vitriolic spat between Hindi film actor Ajay Devgn and Kannada actor Sudeep. Trivial issues are being deliberately raked

up to assess the response of the masses.

By bringing in non-issues into public discourse, it becomes easier for the BJP to assess the timeframe by which it can reach its political goal. Take the issue of Uniform Civil Code. Minister of State for Home Ajay Mishra, or any Chief Minister raises the issue out of the blue to evaluate the fallout of the comment. If the issue is resisted severely, they will keep quiet for a while and again some maverick will be heard talking about it.

In the case of Citizenship (Amendment) Act (CAA), the entire Muslim community stood up against the law, forcing the Modi government to go slow on its implementation. But, the Act has been shelved only till such time when the NDA government attains more power to bring it back.

The CAA is a classic example of virtually establishing India as Hindu Rashtra, the goal of the RSS. Just as a Jew in any part of the world can go back to Israel as his or her natural homeland, a Hindu can similarly move back to India, as a natural homeland. According to the CAA, any Hindu, who arrived in India before

## Whither Cooperation

When US Secretary of the Treasury Henry Morgenthau opened the Bretton Woods Conference almost 80 years ago, he reminded delegates that failures of international cooperation had led to the Great Depression, social division, and ultimately war. "Prosperity, like peace, is indivisible," he concluded, "we cannot afford to have it scattered here or there among the fortunate ... Poverty, wherever it exists, is menacing to us all."

That message speaks across the ages. We are again facing global challenges that can be met only through international cooperation. Large swaths of the developing world are being excluded from global prosperity. Extreme poverty is rising. Hard-won gains in health, education, and nutrition are under threat. Already obscene economic inequalities between and within countries are widening. The window of opportunity for averting a climate catastrophe is about to slam shut. And yet multilateral cooperation is paralysed by complacency, petty rivalries, and inward-looking nationalism.

Consider this year's IMF and World Bank Spring Meetings, which offered an opportunity to mobilise the finance needed to prevent wholesale reversals of progress toward the 2030 SDGs. Instead, Western governments and the G20 arrived with no shared agenda, spent a week swapping platitudes, and left the world with a set of vague and incoherent declarations.

We cannot afford leadership failures on this scale. The IMF and the World Bank, the twin pillars of the Bretton Woods system, should be at the heart of international cooperation in responding to the defining challenges facing our generation, starting with the two-tier recovery from the economic downturn triggered by COVID-19.

Unlike advanced economies, which have recovered on the back of vast government financing and vaccination programmes, many developing economies have suffered deep scarring. Growth has slowed, tax revenues have fallen, and two-thirds of low-income countries are either in or at risk of debt distress. The IMF estimates that the poorest countries will need an additional \$450 billion to return to their pre-pandemic development trajectories.

Budget pressures are limiting governments' capacity to defend human development gains. The pandemic pushed almost 100 million people into extreme poverty. That figure is set to rise as safety nets are cut and Russia's war in Ukraine fuels food-price inflation, raising the spectre of increased malnutrition, or even famine, in some parts of the world. More than 40 of the poorest countries are spending more servicing their debts than on public health. Education budgets are being cut even as millions of the world's most disadvantaged children return to classrooms carrying the learning losses inflicted during pandemic-related school closures.

Against this grim backdrop, international cooperation to finance an "SDG recovery" has gained new urgency. The OECD estimates that the already-large pre-pandemic SDG financing gap has increased by \$1.2 trillion. That's without the incremental investments of \$2 trillion annually needed to support renewable-energy investments in developing countries to achieve the 2015 Paris climate agreement's goals.

When governments committed to the SDG agenda seven years ago, they pledged a bold new approach to development finance that would convert "billions into trillions." The architects of the Bretton Woods system created the vehicle to do so in the form of multilateral development banks (MDBs).

Designed to support postwar European reconstruction, the MDB system – the World Bank and its regional counterparts – enshrines a simple but powerful financial model. With small amounts of paid-in capital underpinned by much larger government guarantees, the MDBs can use their AAA credit ratings to issue bonds at low interest rates and lend to developing countries, effectively mobilising private finance for public investment. The World Bank, the largest MDB, has only \$19 billion of paid-in capital, and \$278 billion of callable capital.

Multilateral finance has multiplier effects that bilateral aid cannot duplicate. Every \$1 invested in the World Bank through paid-in capital mobilises \$4 in new finance. Yet the MDB system is at best weakly exploited. Apart from its soft-loan facility, the International Development Association, the World Bank system played a muted role in supporting developing countries during the pandemic, and the MDBs' financing portfolio for climate interventions in low- and middle-income countries is just \$38 billion – a fraction of what is needed.

While the MDBs are undercapitalised, the bigger problem is a deeply entrenched conservatism in financial governance. Major shareholders – the US and European governments – refuse to allow callable-capital guarantees to be integrated into lending operations. Researchers at the Overseas Development Institute estimate that changing this rule could mobilise an additional \$1.3 trillion, with only a marginal change in credit ratings and borrowing costs.

Speaking at the spring meetings, US Secretary of the Treasury Janet Yellen lamented the MDBs' failure to mobilise the trillions needed for pandemic recovery. And yet the Biden administration has failed to overhaul the rules on callable capital.

Other attempts at innovation have run into a bureaucratic brick wall. Gordon Brown, the UN's Special Envoy for Global Education, has proposed a system of modest grants and guarantees that could double MDB financing for education, unlocking \$10 billion. Yet even in the face of an unprecedented education crisis, donors have failed to act.

This is a travesty of the Bretton Woods system. In the misplaced defense of AAA credit ratings, the MDBs are eschewing solutions that would support recovery, prevent devastating reversals in human development, and bring hope to millions of children.

Sadly, it is not just the MDB agenda that is stuck. Nine months after G20 governments pledged to allocate \$100 billion of the IMF's new issuance of special drawing rights to poor countries, not a single cent has been transferred. Meanwhile, with debt servicing set to surge by 45% this year – most of it going to commercial creditors and China – vital investments are being crowded out, and the risk of disorderly sovereign defaults is growing. Yet we are no closer to a comprehensive debt-reduction framework than we were a year ago.

As the crisis triggered by COVID-19 has deepened, some commentators have called for a new Bretton Woods system. They have a point. The World Bank and the IMF maintain anachronistic Western-dominated governance systems. But what is missing from the response to today's defining human-development challenges is not financial architecture, but rather the sense of urgency, shared purpose, and common endeavor that defined the original Bretton Woods conference.

# Inside a bubble of digital space

**WE ALL HAVE MORE TO WORRY ABOUT IN DIGITAL SPACES THAN JUST TIME SPENT**

The metaverse is the conjunction of two ideas – virtual reality and a digital second life. Metaverse is unstated as a graphically rich virtual space, with reliability, where people can work, play, shop, socialise. It is often called a hypothetical iteration of the internet as a single, universal virtual world that is facilitated using virtual reality and augmented reality headsets. Metaverse development is often linked to advancing virtual reality technology due to increasing demands for immersion.

There are a few things that have catapulted to the forefront of the tech industry's thinking in the past few years. One of them is a couple of technologies closely associated with visions of the metaverse. Virtual reality, which was taking its first vacillating steps in the '90s, is now, well, a reality. Commercially available headsets of decent quality exist, including standalone wireless devices like Quest. Another is blockchain, the barely comprehensible and energy-hungry technology that has made cryptocurrencies and non-fungible tokens (NFTs) possible. NFTs, which have

become an obsession for crypto enthusiasts, snake-oil salesmen, suggestible executives, and (bizarrely) some parts of the art world over the last year or so, could enable the ownership of virtual items and real estate within the metaverse.

We all have more to worry about in digital spaces than just time spent. The probable idea that this is the direction technological innovation is heading does little to consider whether it should be the direction we are heading. "It's indispensable for humans to be with humans in real life." To that, I think that as kids grow up in this space, there will have to be channels for people to engage, go for a coffee together, walk in on a track, have a chat with family, friends and have real fun under the shade of sun. Although we can simulate the same, but the simulation is not the same. It's bad for kids as they cannot socialise nor their cognitive skills can be developed.

At the time when the internet first arrived, it started with a series of technological innovations like the ability to let computers talk to each other over great dis-

tances or the ability to hyperlink from one webpage to another. These technical features were the building blocks that were then used to make the abstract structures we know the internet for: websites, apps, social networks, and everything else that relies on those core elements. And that's to say nothing of the convergence of the interface innovations that aren't strictly part of the internet but are still necessary to make it work, such as displays, keyboards, mice, and touchscreens.

There are some new building blocks in place, like the ability to host hundreds of people in a single instance of a server (idealistic metaverse predictions suppose this will grow to thousands or even millions of people at once, but this might not be too cheerful), or motion-tracking tools that can distinguish where a person is looking or where their hands are. These new technologies can be very exciting and feel futuristic.

But, there are limitations that may be impossible to overcome. When tech companies like Microsoft or Meta show fictionalised videos of their visions of the future, they

frequently tend to gloss over just how people will interact with the metaverse. VR headsets are still very clunky, and most people experience motion sickness or physical pain if they wear them for too long. Augmented reality glasses face a similar problem, on top of the non-insignificant issue of figuring out how people can wear them around in public without looking like huge dorks. And then there are the accessibility challenges of VR that many companies are shrugging off for now.

From snow crash to The Matrix, metaverses are envisioned as an escape. It's a spectrum world and we stay inside a bubble of digital space where attachment, emotion, sense and social behaviours failed to develop. Two years of the COVID-19 pandemic in digital space taught a great view of what metaverse would be. Be with real, be with time, not future. Virtual, imaginary and metaverse are equally treatable future proceedings.

**MCDs to be formally merged May 22**

**New Delhi:** The three municipal corporations of Delhi will be formally merged May 22, the central government announced Wednesday. According to a notification issued by the Union Home Ministry, the Municipal Corporation (Amendment) Act, 2022 will come into effect from May 22. The legislation was approved by Lok Sabha March 30 and by Rajya Sabha April 5. President Ram Nath Kovind had given his assent April 18. "In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Delhi Municipal Corporation (Amendment) Act, 2022 (10 of 2022), the Central Government hereby appoints the 22nd day of May 2022 on which the Municipal Corporation of Delhi shall be constituted," another notification said.

**13-yr-old girl gangraped by 8**

**New Delhi:** A 13-year-old girl was gangraped in the national capital by eight people, including one juvenile. The police have apprehended four persons in connection with the case, who have been identified as Mohit (20), Aakash (19), Shahrukh (20) and one juvenile. Deputy Commissioner of Police (south district), Benita Mary Jaiker, said that at around 5 p.m. on April 24, the victim had gone to the market to purchase vegetables. "The girl took an auto for Shani bazaar which was about 2 km from her house," the DCP said.

**SC orders release of Perarivalan**

**New Delhi, May 18:** Invoking its extraordinary power under Article 142 of the Constitution, the Supreme Court Wednesday ordered the release of A G Perarivalan, who has served over 30 years in jail in the Rajiv Gandhi assassination case, and said the Tamil Nadu Governor ought not to have sent the "binding" advice made by the State Cabinet for his release to the President.

While ordering that Perarivalan is "set at liberty forthwith," the apex court also said the reference to Tamil Nadu Cabinet's recommendation to the President after two and a half years was without any constitutional backing and the "inexplicable" delay in deciding remission is "inexcusable" as it contributes to adverse physical conditions and mental distress to the inmates.

A three-judge bench headed by Justice L Nageswara Rao said the Tamil Nadu state cabinet's advice is binding on the Governor in the exercise of his powers under Article 161 of the Constitution.

"The advice of the State Cabinet is binding on the Governor in matters relating to commutation/remission of sentences under Article 161. No provision under the Constitution has been pointed out to us nor any satisfactory response tendered as to the source of the Governor's power to refer a recommendation made by the State Cabinet to the President of India," the bench also comprising Justices B R Gavai and A S Bopanna said.

Observing that the Tamil Nadu Governor ought not to have sent the recommendation made by the State Cabinet to the President, the apex court said such action is contrary to the constitutional scheme elaborated above. "It is relevant to point out that the recommendation made by the State Cabinet was September 9, 2018, which remained

**A**rticle 142 deals with the Supreme Court's power to exercise its jurisdiction and pass the order for doing complete justice in any cause or matter pending before it

pending before the Governor for almost two and a half years without a decision being taken. It was only when this Court started enquiring about the reason for the decision being delayed, that the Governor forwarded the recommendation made by the State Government for the remission of the Appellant's sentence to the President," the bench said. The apex court said it was fully con-

scious of the immunity of the Governor under the Constitution with respect to the exercise and performance of the powers and duties of his office or for any act done or purported to be done by him in the exercise and performance of such powers and duties.

The bench, however, said it has the power of judicial review of orders of the Governor under Article 161, which can be impugned on certain grounds, and non-exercise of the power under Article 161 is not immune from judicial review.

"Given petitions under Article 161 pertain to the liberty of individuals, inexplicable delay, not on account of the prisoners is inexcusable as it contributes to adverse physical conditions and mental distress faced by a prisoner, especially when the State Cabinet has taken a decision to release the prisoner by granting him the benefit of remission/commutation of his sentence," the bench said.

**Pb farmers end protest**

**Chandigarh, May 18:** Punjab farmers ended their protest at the Chandigarh-Mohali border Wednesday after the Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann-led state government accepted several of their demands.

The development came after representatives of more than 20 farmer bodies held a marathon meeting with Mann at Punjab Bhawan here.

Conceding one of the key demands of the protesting farmers, Mann announced a fresh schedule for staggered sowing of paddy June 14 and June 17, thus restricting the total number of zones to just two instead of the earlier four.

However, the border belt across the fence has been excluded from the zonal restrictions and farmers of this region have been allowed to sow paddy from June 10.

Notably, it was earlier decided to undertake paddy cultivation in a staggered manner by dividing the entire state into four zones with dates of sowing being June 18, 22, 24 and 26 but the farmer bodies had rejected this schedule.

Mann told the farmer leaders that the state government has already issued a notification to procure the entire moong (green gram) crop at a minimum support price (MSP) of ₹7,275 per quintal, according to an official statement.

He also said the state government is finalising modalities to also procure maize at MSP to give a boost to its ambitious programme of crop diversification.

On the issue of MSP for Basmati crop, Mann said he will call on Union Home Minister Amit Shah Thursday to urge the Centre to announce MSP on Basmati crop so as to encourage growers to cultivate it in a big way.

**'China building new bridge near Pangong Tso in eastern Ladakh'**

**New Delhi, May 18:** China is constructing a second bridge in an area held by it around the strategically key Pangong Tso lake in eastern Ladakh and it could help the Chinese military to quickly mobilise its troops in the region, according to satellite imagery Wednesday.

It is learnt that China has recently completed the construction of the first bridge in the area. The people cited above said the new bridge is being built in an area that is over 20 km from the Line of Actual Control (LAC).

Damien Symon, a geospatial intelligence researcher, who keeps track of Chinese activities along the LAC, posted satellite images of the new construction on Twitter.

Symon, who uses the handle @detresfa, said a "larger bridge" is being developed parallel to the first one, adding the likely aim of the construction is to "support larger/heavier movement" (of the military) over the lake.

The satellite image posted by Symon noted that the bridge is being built from both sides simultaneously. The bridge is likely

to cut the distance significantly from the depth area of Rudok to the region around the LAC in Pangong Tso. The eastern Ladakh faceoff began May 4-5 in 2020. India has been insisting on the restoration of the status quo ante prior to the standoff.

India and China have held 15 rounds of military talks so far to resolve the eastern Ladakh row. As a result of the talks, the two sides completed the disengagement process last year on the north and south banks of the Pangong lake and in the Gogra area.

**Centre asks states to be better prepared in view of Monsoon**

**New Delhi, May 18:** Union Home Secretary Ajay Kumar Bhalla Wednesday said that the central and state governments should be better prepared in view of the South West Monsoon so that the losses due to natural disasters such as floods, cyclones and landslides can be minimised.

He stressed on the need for building up capacities and response reflexes to ensure round the clock preparedness throughout the year.

Speaking at the Annual Conference of Relief Commissioners and Secretaries of Departments of Disaster Management of States and Union Territories, Bhalla said that through continued efforts over the last

several years, the disaster management system has been able to reduce the impact of natural disasters on human lives.

He said that before 2014, the approach towards disasters was only relief centric but now it has changed and the focus on saving human lives has become an additional component of disaster management. Bhalla called on the states to undertake capacity building of urban local bodies, their State Disaster Response Forces (SDRFs), Fire Service and Civil Defence, since they are the first responders during a calamity. He emphasised on the importance of building capacities at the city and district levels and involving communities.

Noting that besides floods, in recent years cyclonic storms, forest fires, heat wave conditions and lightning strikes have shown an increasing trend, he stated that there was a need for synergies and effective coordination amongst institutions.

The two-day conference is being held to review the preparedness of states, UTs for dealing with any natural disasters that may occur during the coming South-West Monsoon season.

**LINEN SHORTAGE IN TRAINS**

**Some material damaged during Cov waves, some used for masks**

**New Delhi, May 18:** The Railways is struggling to provide linen to passengers even two months after announcing the restoration of the facility, with officials saying 60 per cent of the stock was damaged during the Covid waves and a significant amount went into making masks.

Sources said the facility was available in 1,114 pairs of trains before the onset of the coronavirus pandemic, but now it is being provided only in 520 pairs. While 1,308 trains were provided with curtains in the compartment before Covid, currently they are available in 1,225 trains. The officials said the coronavirus crisis resulted in a major disruption in the supply chain over the last two years.

Earlier, linen provided on board trains was sourced from the Khadi and Village Industries Commission (KVIC), now they have empowered Divisional Railway Managers in the zones to procure the linen from mills. The Railways needs



**W**ith the Covid-related restrictions largely lifted, the Railways had March 10 said the linen facility would be restored in trains in a phased manner.

The officials said the railways has placed orders for over 15 lakh bedroll items including bedsheets, towels, blankets and pillow covers to make up for the losses and restore the linen services fully

**H**owever, it has not been restored in full even more than two months after the announcement

around 7.5 lakh packets of such linen set daily which comprise bedsheets, pillow case, blanket and hand towels. As of now,

only around half of this is available, the officials said. Around 60 per cent of the stock that the Railways had from over the last two years has been damaged and a significant amount has already been used to make masks, they said.

Even the 70 laundries that the Railways used to clean their linens at need overhauling and the national transporter has already started restoration and re-commissioning them, the officials said. They said the railways has to procure a total of 15,28,447 bed linen items, including 2,24,456 pillow covers, 4,73,591 handloom bed sheets, 92,743 handloom blankets, 29,124 bath towels and 1,36,118 handloom face towels among other items. Passengers have complained they are not informed about the train where they will get the linen set, leaving them confused and guessing.

After being inundated with queries about the same, the Railways now sends messages to passengers after they book a ticket, informing them about the availability of linen on board.

# Half a million people flee floods in NE

# 40 new highlands built to save animals from flood

**Guwahati, May 18:** Assam Forest Minister Parimal Suklabaidya Wednesday said that 40 new scientifically designed highlands have been constructed to save the wildlife of Kaziranga National Park...

Suklabaidya said the forest department is in a state of "complete preparedness" to rescue animals from the ongoing floods in Kaziranga and other national parks and wildlife sanctuaries across the state.

"We have successfully completed the construction of around 40 highlands for tackling the prevailing flood situations in Kaziranga and other national parks and wildlife sanctuaries," he said.

The new highlands have been designed scientifically with provision for adequate grass and plants yielding fruits such as elephant apple and Indian gooseberry, Suklabaidya said in a statement.

"The highlands enable us to reduce the animal casualty during annual floods," he added.

Suklabaidya, who is closely monitoring the flood situation in the national parks and wildlife sanctuaries, said that the department is fully geared to deal with it.

"Kaziranga bears the brunt of floods every year, be it small or big. We are fully equipped to tackle any sort of exigency along with food arrangements for officers and forest personnel deployed for rescue operations of animals in Kaziranga," he said.

More than 25 boats are kept ready for rescue of animals in Kaziranga National Park and a slew of initiatives have been taken by his department to deal with any deluge in a better and efficient manner, he said.

Kaziranga National Park and Tiger Reserve director Jatin Sharma said the park has a total of 144 man-made highlands, including 33 big ones for housing animals during floods. "In addition to that, we have built an 8.5 km long road-cum-highland for providing shelter to animals during floods and for patrolling," he said.

**New Delhi, May 18:** More than 1,000 passengers on board the Guwahati Express and the Guwahati-Silchar Express trains, which were stuck in the flood-hit areas of Assam, were helped by the RailTel's wi-fi facility at stations, where there was a complete breakdown of the mobile network, the rail PSU said Wednesday.

RailTel made special arrangements for providing communication using station wi-fi to the stranded passengers of the two trains stuck on the Lumding-Badarpur hill section in Assam last week because of heavy rains that led to a total breakdown of

mobile services of all operators in the affected area.

The affected area falls under the Lumding railway division of Northeast Frontier Railway (NFR). The passengers could communicate with their families using this special arrangement.

The railway administration also used this connectivity facility for organising the relief-and-rescue operation effectively.

Inclement weather and incessant rain caused massive landslides and waterlogging at several locations of the Lumding-Badarpur hill section. This resulted in dam-

age to the railway track, bridges, road and communication network in this hilly terrain.

The NFR zone had geared up its entire machinery and controlled train services over the affected section due to this serious condition. However, two trains got stranded in these flash floods, each with about 1,400 passengers. One was train number 15616 Silchar-Guwahati Express at the Ditokcherra station and another was train number 15615 Guwahati-Silchar Express at the New Hailong station in Assam's Dima Hasao district.

The railway administration

launched a massive evacuation operation with the help of the Air Force, the Railway Protection Force (RPF), the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF), the Assam Rifles and locals.

But another big challenge was the total breakdown of mobile services of all operators in the affected area, which left the passengers and the railway administration isolated from the world.

In this difficult situation, the wifi facility already available at railway stations provided by RailTel Corporation proved very useful in providing connectivity. Special arrangements were made for passengers to use station wifi to contact their families.

The railway administration also used this connectivity facility for organising the relief-and-rescue operation effectively. This special arrangement was made by temporarily suspending the requirement of OTP on the mobile phone of a user, as required under standard procedure for authentication purpose as mobile services were down in that area, the company said.

# Cal HC upholds order for CBI probe

**Kolkata, May 18:** A division bench of the Calcutta High Court Wednesday upheld a single bench order for CBI inquiry into alleged illegal appointments made by the West Bengal Board of Secondary Education on the recommendations of the School Service Commission (SSC).

The bench, chaired by Justice Subrata Talukdar, maintained that the single bench order requires no intervention.

Shortly after, Justice Gangopadhyay directed Bengal minister Partha Chatterjee to appear before the CBI in connection with the appointment scam.

Chatterjee's lawyer immediately moved an urgent oral plea before another division bench, led by Justice Harish Tandon, seeking a stay on Justice Gangopadhyay's order, but to no avail.

The bench, also comprising Justice Rabindranath Samanta,



refused to hear the plea saying that the appeal has not been filed in the registry of the court, and hence cannot be heard as per the rules of the high court.

Later, in the evening, the minister visited CBI office here for his questioning.

Chatterjee, now the state industry, commerce and parliamentary affairs minister, held the education portfolio when the scam was allegedly pulled off.

Justice Gangopadhyay, in his order, observed that he expects Chatterjee to step down as minis-

# WBSSC chairman resigns

A mid row over irregularities in recruitment in the West Bengal School Service Commission (WBSSC), its chairman Siddharta Majumdar Wednesday resigned from his position. His resignation was forwarded to the state education secretary, Manish Jain on Wednesday evening at a time when the former state education minister and the Trinamool Congress secretary general, Partha Chatterjee was facing the grilling of the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) officials pertaining to the recruitment scam.

He also directed all five members of a committee - constituted by the West Bengal School Education Department in November, 2019 for monitoring pending recruitments of teaching and non-teaching staff in government-run and aided schools - to appear before the CBI.

# Tripura may use Chittagong port to transport essentials

All train services in Tripura, Mizoram and lower Assam have been suspended till May 25

**Agartala, May 18:** Tripura government is contemplating to transport essentials into the state through Chittagong port in Bangladesh in view of the possible shortage of food stuff and fuel due to the snapping of railway services in the ongoing flood and landslides in Assam, an official said Wednesday.

There has been no confirmation over the restoration of train service through Lumding-Badarpur section in Assam which has been majorly affected by landslides triggered by incessant rain, principal secretary to the Tripura transport department, LH Darlong said at a press conference.

The Assam-Agartala national highway has opened for vehicular movement from Wednesday after a brief halt, he said.

"Even though the Assam-Agartala national highway is

Additional secretary to the food and civil supplies department, Tapan Kumar Das said "IOCL has already started sending petrol and diesel to Tripura through tankers from Guwahati and Silchar to prevent the possible shortage of fuel".

In view of the situation, the Tripura government has restricted the selling of petrol. Two wheelers can buy petrol of maximum Rs 200, three wheelers for Rs 300 and four wheelers for Rs 1000. A litre of petrol costs Rs 108.26 in Agartala.

There are, however, no restrictions on the sale of diesel but many of petrol pumps here have downed shutters in the capital town as they have run out of reserves.

Darlong said the state has already requested the civil aviation ministry to increase flight services to and from Maharaja Bir Bikram (MBB) airport here in view of the disruption in train service at Maibong in Assam since May 13.

Currently 18 flights are operating in MBB airport and prices of air tickets to Kolkata and Delhi, the two favoured destinations from Tripura, have already gone up substantially.

North East Frontier Railway sources said that all train services in Tripura, Mizoram and lower Assam have been suspended till May 25 and the situation will be reviewed after the date.



# Cops use water cannons to quell ABVP protest

**Kolkata:** Police Wednesday used water cannons and baton-charged activists of the Akhil Bharatiya Vidyarthi Parishad, who tried to force their way past the security cordon near Bikash Bhavan here in protest against alleged irregularities in appointments to various posts of the education department. An officer of the Bidhannagar Police Commissionerate said around 100 ABVP members turned violent when they were stopped near Bikash Bhavan - the headquarters of the department - prompting security personnel to baton-charge and deploy water cannons. ABVP national secretary Saptarshi Sarkar said four of our activists were arrested while at least six others suffered injuries in the police action.

# Mamata pans Centre for fuel, gas price hike

## Pollution killed 2.4mln Indians in '19: Lancet

New Delhi, May 18: Pollution was responsible for nine million deaths in 2019 - equivalent to one in six deaths worldwide - and India leads with nearly 2.4 million deaths, according to a study published Wednesday in The Lancet Planetary Health.

Of the nearly 2.4 million deaths in 2019, air pollution accounted for 16.7 lakh deaths - the highest by any country. Further, more than 5 lakh lives were lost in the country due to water pollution, followed by occupational pollution (more than one lakh) and lead exposure (over 2 lakh).

Globally, of the nine million pollution - attributable deaths in 2019, air pollution (both household and ambient) remains responsible for the greatest number of deaths at 6.67 million worldwide.

Water pollution was responsible for 1.36 million premature deaths. Lead contributed 9,00,000 premature deaths, followed by toxic occupational hazards at 870,000 deaths.

The report states that although the number of deaths from pollution sources associated with extreme poverty (such as indoor air pollution and water pollution) have decreased, these reductions are offset by increased deaths attributable to industrial pollution (such as ambient air pollution and chemical pollution).

"The health impacts of pollution remain enormous, and low- and middle-income countries bear the brunt of this burden. Despite its enormous health, social and economic impacts, pollution preven-

tion is largely overlooked in the international development agenda," said Richard Fuller, from Global Alliance on Health and Pollution, Geneva, Switzerland.

"Preventing pollution can also slow climate change - achieving a double benefit for planetary health - and our report calls for a massive, rapid transition away from all fossil fuels to clean, renewable energy," added co-author Professor Philip Landrigan, Director, Global Public Health Programme and Global Pollution Observatory at Boston College.

The decline in deaths from traditional pollution since 2000 (household air pollution from solid fuels and unsafe water) is most evident in Africa. This can be explained by improvements in water supply and sanitation, antibiotics and treatments, and cleaner fuels. However, this mortality decrease has been offset by a substantial in-

crease in deaths from exposure to industrial pollution - such as ambient air pollution, lead pollution, and other forms of chemical pollution - across all regions over the past 20 years.

This is particularly evident in Southeast Asia, where rising levels of industrial pollution are combined with ageing populations and increasing numbers of people exposed.

Ambient air pollution was responsible for 4.5 million deaths in 2019, up from 4.2 million deaths in 2015 and 2.9 million in 2000. Deaths from hazardous chemical pollutants increased from 0.9 million in 2000, to 1.7 million in 2015, to 1.8 million in 2019, with 900,000 deaths attributable to lead pollution in 2019.

Overall, deaths from modern pollution have increased by 66 per cent in the past two decades, from an estimated 3.8 million deaths in 2000 to 6.3 million deaths in 2019. Figures on deaths from chemical pollutants are likely to be underestimated as only a small number of manufactured chemicals in commerce have been adequately tested for safety or toxicity, the report noted.

#### Delhi LG Anil Bajjal resigns

New Delhi: Delhi's Lt Governor Anil Bajjal resigned Wednesday, citing personal reasons. According to the sources, Bajjal sent his resignation to President Ram Nath Kovind. A 1969 batch IAS officer from the AGMUT (Arunachal Pradesh-Goa-Mizoram and Union Territory) cadre, he served as 21st Lt Governor of Delhi for a period of five years and four months from December 31, 2016 to May 18, 2022. As the Lt Governor, he had been at loggerheads with Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal over several issues. Bajjal had also served as Union Home Secretary during the Atal Bihari Vajpayee government.

#### Wild fire triggers landmine blasts

Jammu: A forest fire triggered several landmine explosions along the Line of Control in Jammu and Kashmir's Poonch district, officials said. The fire that started in a forest across the LoC Monday spread to the Indian side in the Mendhar sector, they said. The fire triggered the explosion of nearly half a dozen landmines that were part of the anti-infiltration obstacle system, officials said.

## Guj: Factory wall collapse kills 12

THE INCIDENT OCCURRED IN SAGAR SALT FACTORY IN HALVAD INDUSTRIAL ESTATE

Morbi (Gujarat), May 18: At least twelve workers were killed and 15 feared trapped in the wall collapse of a salt factory in the Halvad GIDC of the Morbi district in Saurashtra region of Gujarat. The Morbi district administration has claimed that 90 per cent of the rescue operation has been completed.

Sharing information about the tragic incident, Minister of State for Labour and Employment Brijesh Merja said that around 12 p.m., a wall collapsed in the Sagar Salt factory situated in Halvad GIDC. Till the time he briefed the media in Gandhinagar, 12 dead bodies of the workers were found from the debris.

He added that 90 per cent of the rescue operation has been completed, but it is not yet clear what caused the wall collapse. It is a matter of investigation, which will be done by the police.

The Minister said that the factory processed and packaged salt. Sources from the factory said, workers died after bags of salt stacked along the wall fell on them, and they got trapped.

Morbi District Collector JB Patel and District Superintendent of Police Rahul Tripathi along with

their team rushed to the accident site and closely supervised the rescue operations. The district administration pressed in JCB machines to remove salt bags, hard rock salt and wall debris.

SP Tripathi said once the rescue operation is concluded and the area is completely cleared, FSL team with local police will investigate the incident. If factory management is found guilty for any negligence, a case can be registered against them too.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi expressed grief over the tragedy and announced a compensation of ₹2 lakh each for the kin of the deceased. The PMO also informed on Twitter that a compensation of ₹2 lakh each will be given to the next of kin of the deceased from the Prime Minister's National Relief Fund. The injured would be given ₹50,000 each, it added.

Union Home Minister Amit Shah also took to Twitter to express grief over the tragedy.

Gujarat Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel announced a compensation of ₹4 lakh each for the kin of the victims and gave instructions to the district administration about the rescue and relief work, said a statement by his office.

## Rains continue in Kerala, Red alert in four districts

The Kerala State Disaster Management Authority has predicted widespread rain in the state for the next 5 days with chances of isolated thunder, lightning and strong winds due to the cyclonic circulation in and around Kerala as well as a low pressure trough from north Kerala to Vidarbha region.

The Central Meteorological Department has predicted isolated heavy and very heavy rainfall showers in the state for the next 2 days and heavy rainfall on the 2 days after that. Kerala has been experiencing heavy rainfall for the past few days and it has disrupted normal life in certain places of the state.


## GYANVAPI MOSQUE CASE Hearing deferred due to lawyers' strike

Varanasi, May 18: Hearing in the Gyanvapi mosque case could not take place in a court here Wednesday as lawyers in the district were on a strike in protest against the remarks of a government official.

The Banaras Bar Association and the Central Bar Association, Varanasi had decided to boycott work as they were upset over the remarks of a Special Secretary against lawyers, according to advocate Abhay Yadav, representing the Muslim side in the case.

The court was scheduled to hear two petitions related to the case Wednesday. One of them filed by the Hindu side to remove a wall and debris around a "Shivling" which was claimed to have been found during a court-mandated videography survey, and the other moved by District Government Advocate Mahendra Pandey on shifting fish from a pond located on the premises. Madan Mohan Yadav, representing the Hindu side, said they had



urged the Bar Association to allow the lawyers to participate in the hearing in the case Wednesday since the eyes of the whole country are on the Gyanvapi Masjid case, but it did not yield any result.

On Tuesday, Pathak, Vyas and Sahu had filed a fresh plea in the court claiming that there is a basement to the east of the spot where the "Shivling" was claimed to have been found. The basement has been sealed with brick, stone and cement, they have said. Besides, there is also a wall and a basement in front of an idol of Nandi in the Kashi Vishwanath temple, and this basement has also been blocked with brick, stone, sand and other items, they have said.

## 'Eye on Pak-China, India plans to deploy S-400 missiles by June'

New Delhi/Washington, May 18: India intends to deploy the Russian-made S-400 missile defence system by next month to defend itself from Pakistani and Chinese threats as it is pursuing an extensive military modernisation effort encompassing air, ground, naval and strategic nuclear forces, Pentagon's top intelligence official has said during a Congressional hearing.

India started receiving the delivery of the S-400 missile defence system from Russia in December last year, Lieutenant General Scott Berrier, Director of Defence Intelligence Agency, told members of the Senate Armed Services Committee during a recent Congressional hearing.

As of October 2021, India's military was seeking to procure advanced surveillance systems to strengthen its land and sea borders and boost its offensive and defensive cyber capabilities.

"In December, India received its initial delivery of the Russian S-400 air defence system, and it intends to operate the system to defend

against Pakistani and Chinese threats by June 2022," Lt Gen Berrier said. "India continued to develop its own hypersonic, ballistic, cruise and air defence missile capabilities, conducting multiple tests in 2021. India has a growing number of satellites in orbit, and is expanding its use of space assets, likely pursuing offensive space capabilities," he said. Lt Gen Berrier told the lawmakers that New Delhi is pursuing an extensive military modernisation effort encompassing air, ground, naval and strategic nuclear forces with an emphasis on

domestic defence production. India is taking steps to establish Integrated Theatre Commands that will improve its joint capability among its three military services.

Since 2019, Prime Minister Narendra Modi has given priority to strengthen India's economy by expanding its domestic defence industry and establishing a negative import list to curtail defence purchases from foreign suppliers.

According to Lt Gen Berrier, throughout 2021, New Delhi continued to implement a foreign pol-

icy aimed at demonstrating India's role as a leading power and net provider of security in the Indian Ocean region. ## Finland, Sweden hand in applications to join NATO

Turkey has surprised its allies by saying it had reservations about Finnish and Swedish membership, adding the two countries harbour individuals linked to groups it deems as terrorists & hitting out at arms export embargoes imposed on it after its 2019 Syria incursion

**Brussels, May 18:** Finland and Sweden formally applied to join the NATO alliance Wednesday at allied headquarters, a decision spurred by Russia's invasion of Ukraine, but face objections from Turkey to an accession process that is expected to take only a few weeks.

Neutral throughout the Cold War, Sweden's and Finland's decision to join NATO is one of the most significant changes in Europe's security architecture for decades, reflecting a sweeping shift in public opinion in the Nordic region since Russia's February 24 invasion.

With the applications formally submitted, the Nordic countries and their many backers now face uncertain months where any resistance to their bids needs to be overcome, with all 30 of NATO's members needing to approve the enlargement. Ratification by all allied parliaments could take up to a year, diplomats say.

NATO Secretary-General Jens Stoltenberg said Wednesday that he thought the issues between Turkey, Finland and Sweden could be resolved. "We are determined to work through all issues and reach rapid conclusions," Stoltenberg said, noting strong support from all other allies.

Seeking to move the member-

overcome. The decision to seek a place under the NATO umbrella represents a setback for Moscow, with the war in Ukraine triggering the very kind of enlargement of the alliance on Russia's borders that it took to arms to prevent.

So far, Moscow's response has been unexpectedly muted, having previously warned of steps of a "military-technical" nature and that it could deploy nuclear weapons in its European exclave of Kaliningrad were the countries to join.

## Mariupol finally falls as last fighters surrender



Ukrainian officials have spoken of hopes to arrange a prisoner swap for Mariupol defenders they describe as national heroes. Moscow says no such deal was made for fighters it calls Nazis

**Kyiv, Ukraine, May 18:** Nearly 700 more Ukrainian fighters surrendered at the Mariupol steelworks in the past 24 hours, Russia said Wednesday, but leaders were reported to still be holed up inside, delaying the final end of Europe's longest and bloodiest battle for decades.

Russia's ministry of defence said the surrender of 694 more fighters meant a total of 959 people had now laid down their arms at the vast Azovstal steelworks - last bastion of Ukrainian defenders in the city.

If confirmed, the Russian announcement would resolve much

of the mystery surrounding the fate of hundreds of fighters inside the plant, since Ukraine announced Tuesday it had ordered the entire garrison to stand down. The Ukrainian defence ministry, which has so far confirmed only about 250 having left the plant, did not immediately respond to a written request for comment.

The leader of pro-Russian separatists in control of the area was quoted by a local news agency as saying the main commanders inside the plant had yet to surrender. They have not left, DAN news agency quoted Denis Pushilin as saying. The final surrender of Mariupol would bring a close to a near three month siege of the once prosperous city of 400,000 people, where Ukraine says tens of thousands of civilians died under Russian siege and bombardment, many buried in mass graves.

Kyiv and Moscow had both said Tuesday that around 250 people left the plant, giving little clue as to the fate of hundreds more believed to be inside. Ukraine said it would not reveal how many were there until the operation to rescue all of them was complete.

### EU offers 9bn euro loan to Ukr

**Brussels:** The European Commission proposed Wednesday a 9 billion euro (\$9.5 billion) loan to Ukraine to keep the country going as it struggles to fend off the Russian invasion and wants to set up a reconstruction facility for after the war. The money for the 9 billion loan would be borrowed by the Commission on the markets under the macro-financial assistance mechanism, backed by guarantees of EU governments.

### UK inflation hits 40-year high

**London:** There are growing fears of a recession as the latest statistics released Wednesday show that the UK economy's inflation has hit a 40-year high at 9 per cent. The Office for National Statistics (ONS) found that inflation, which is the rate at which prices rise, has surged from an already high 7 per cent in March. UK Chancellor of the Exchequer Rishi Sunak, who is under increasing pressure for further measures to ease the cost of living crisis amid rocketing household bills, blamed the inflation hike on global energy prices.

### Pak bans import of luxury items

**Islamabad:** Pakistan government Wednesday decided to impose a ban on the import of non-essential and luxury items as the cash-strapped nation tried to avert a financial meltdown amid depleting foreign reserves, according to a media report. Quoting sources, Geo News reported that Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has imposed a ban on the import of non-essential items that are not used by the common man. The decision is said to be important to control the dollar flight, it said.

### Japan's quarterly economy contracts

**Tokyo:** Japan's economy shrank at an annual rate of 1 per cent in the first quarter, as rising prices and Covid-19 restrictions deadened spending and investment, according to data released Wednesday. Japan's real gross domestic product, or GDP, the sum of the value of a nation's products and services, contracted 0.2 per cent in January-March compared to the previous quarter, as household consumption and government investments fell, the Cabinet Office said.

## Taliban orders UN staff to wear hijab

**Kabul, May 18:** The Taliban-led government has ordered female staff members of the UN Assistance Mission in Afghanistan (UNAMA) to wear the hijab.

The directive was issued by the Ministry for the Propagation of Virtue and the Prevention of Vice, Khaama Press reported.

According to a UNAMA statement, a delegation of Taliban officials from the Ministry said that female employees should consider wearing the hijab, while reporting

out a hijab, they will talk to her "politely" to wear it as it is mandatory outside, Khaama Press reported.

In addition to that, outside the UN office, the Ministry has also placed a poster calling on women to wear the "hijab".

## 'Pak's relation with India will drive its defence policy'

**Washington, May 18:** Pakistan is likely to continue to modernise and expand its nuclear capabilities by conducting training with its deployed weapons and developing new delivery systems in 2022 as it perceives it as key to its survival, given India's nuclear arsenal and conventional force superiority, the Pentagon's top intelligence official has told lawmakers.

Lt Gen Scott Berrier, Director, Defence Intelligence Agency told members of the Senate Armed Services Committee during a recent Congressional hearing that Pakistan's tense relationship with India will continue to drive its de-

fence policy. He said Pakistan "perceives nuclear weapons as key to its national survival, given India's nuclear arsenal and conventional force superiority. Pakistan very likely will continue to modernise and expand its nuclear capabilities by conducting training with its deployed weapons and developing new delivery systems in 2022," Mr Berrier said.

"Pakistan's relations with India remain strained since a high-profile anti-India militant attack in the Union Territory of Kashmir in February 2019," he said, referring to the Pulwama attack in which 40 Indian paramilitary troopers were killed.



"New Delhi's August 2019 revocation of Kashmir's semi-autonomous status added to these tensions. However, cross-border violence has decreased since February 2021, when both countries recommitted to a ceasefire," Berrier said, adding, "India and

Pakistan have not made meaningful progress toward a long-lasting diplomatic solution since then." India announced withdrawing the special powers of Jammu and Kashmir and bifurcation of the state into two union territories in August 2019.

## US shares videos of UFOs at rare Congressional hearing

The hearing comes after the release of a brief report in June 2021 from the director of national intelligence on UAP that led to the creation of a task force to investigate the issue. The task force now has a database of over 400 UAP reports but nothing is conclusive

**Washington, May 18:** In a first public Congressional hearing in over 50 years on UFOs sightings in the US, the country's military officials unveiled new footage of what they call as unidentified aerial phenomena, or UAP, but nothing suggests the presence of aliens, media reports said.

According to Deputy Director of Navy Intelligence Scott Bray who shared the clips recorded by military personnel at a 90-minute committee hearing in the House of Representatives Tuesday, CNET reported.

One of the videos taken in 2019 from a US Navy ship through night

vision goggles shows an unidentified triangular object. Another clip of the same phenomenon was also observed at a later date from a different location.

Bray explained that analysts suspect the object was actually an optical effect "correlated with unmanned aerial systems in the area". That's likely a drone appearing as a triangle because of the effect of light from the object passing through the goggles and then through the lenses of the SLR camera that recorded the clip, the report said.

Bray also shared another short video, taken in 2021, from the cockpit of a military jet appearing to show a spherical object for a frac-



tion of a second.

"In many other cases we have far less than this," Bray was quoted as saying. He later added that there is currently no explanation for the object. "There are a small handful

(of sightings) in which there are flight characteristics or signature management we can't explain with the data that we have," he said.

Bray also said that the military has never communicated with, fired

upon or collided with a UAP although there have been 11 documented near misses, as mentioned in last year's unclassified report from the director of national intelligence.

The June 2021 report by Pentagon on UAP sightings had listed five possible explanations for UAPs, which included things like airborne clutter, natural phenomena in the atmosphere, top-secret US technology, or technology from foreign adversaries like Russia and China, the Verge reported.

The report also included a fifth explanation, "other", which encompasses everything they can't explain. Those are the ones that continue to capture the imagination of the public. And while Bray emphasised that the UAP Task Force hasn't seen any wreckage that "isn't consistent with being of terrestrial origin", they are focused on explaining the unexplainable.

### Oilmeals exports up 10% in April

**New Delhi:** Oilmeals export increased by 10 per cent in April to nearly 3.34 lakh tonne on higher shipments of rapeseed meal, according to industry data. In a statement, Solvent Extractors' Association of India (SEA) said the export of oilmeals in April 2022 is provisionally reported at 3,33,972 tonne compared to 3,03,705 tonne in the same month last year. Rapeseed meal exports increased to 2,29,207 tonne during April from 93,984 tonne in March 2022.

### IOB profit jumps 58% to ₹552cr


**New Delhi:** State-owned Indian Overseas Bank (IOB) Wednesday reported a nearly 58 per cent jump in net profit at ₹552 crore in the quarter ended March 2022, mainly due to lower provisioning for bad loans. The bank had posted a net profit of ₹350 crore in the year-ago period. However, the total income of the bank during the latest March quarter fell to ₹5,719 crore as against ₹6,074 crore in the same period a year ago, according to a regulatory filing.

### ITC Q4 net profit plunges 11.60%

**New Delhi:** ITC Ltd Wednesday reported an 11.60 per cent rise in its consolidated net profit to ₹4,259.68 crore for the fourth quarter ended in March 2022. The company had posted a net profit of ₹3,816.84 crore during the January-March quarter of the previous fiscal, ITC said in a regulatory filing. Its revenue from operations was up 15.25 per cent to ₹17,754.02 crore during the quarter under review, as against ₹15,404.37 crore in the corresponding period of the previous fiscal.

### IndiGo appoints Elbers as CEO

**New Delhi:** The Board of Directors of InterGlobe Aviation, which operates the airline IndiGo, Wednesday appointed Pieter Elbers as Chief Executive Officer. Elbers will join IndiGo on or before October 1, succeeding Ronojoy Dutta, who has decided to retire September 30. IndiGo Managing Director Rahul Bhatia said: "The Board of Directors and I would like to thank Rono for effectively leading our business for almost four years with a steady hand through what has been the most turbulent period in the airline's history and aviation globally."

## CPSEs empowered on divestment of units

**New Delhi, May 18:** Giving more autonomy to state-owned companies, the Cabinet Wednesday empowered their boards to decide on the closure and divestment of units/subsidiaries.

Presently, the board of directors of holding or parent public sector enterprises have powers to make decision on equity investments for setting up joint ventures (JVs) and wholly-owned subsidiaries and undertaking mergers/acquisitions, subject to a net worth threshold.

However, the boards do not have powers for disinvestment or closure of their subsidiaries or units or stake in JVs, except for some limited powers given to Maharatna public sector enterprises (PSEs) for minority stake disinvestment in their subsidiaries.

Therefore, approval of the Cabinet was required for both strategic disinvestment and minority stake sale or closure of the subsidiaries/units or sale of their stakes in a JV, irrespective of the size of operations or capital deployed of such subsidiaries.

"The Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has approved the proposal for empowering the Board of Directors of the Holding / Parent Public Sector



Enterprises to recommend and undertake the process for Disinvestment (both strategic disinvestment and minority stake sale) or closure of any of their subsidiaries/units/stake in JVs," an official statement said.

The alternative mechanism on disinvestment will accord 'in principle' approval for disinvestment (both strategic disinvestment and minority stake sale) / closure of subsidiaries of Maharatna PSEs, which was delegated to them and review the process of disinvestment or closure by the parent or holding PSEs.

The process for undertaking the strategic disinvestment transactions/closures to be followed by the PSEs should be based on the principles of competitive bidding and consistent with the guiding principles to be laid down.

"For strategic disinvestment, such guiding principles will be laid down by DIPAM. For closure, DPE shall issue guiding principles," the statement added.

**New Delhi, May 18:** The Union Cabinet Wednesday approved advancing the target of blending 20 per cent ethanol in petrol by 5 years to 2025-26 as well as allowing more feedstocks for the production of biofuels in a bid to cut reliance on imported oil for meeting the country's energy needs.

The Cabinet, headed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, at its meeting Wednesday approved the amendments to the National Policy on Biofuels, an official statement said.

The main amendment is for advancing the target of blending 20 per cent ethanol in petrol (20 per cent ethanol, 80 per cent petrol) to 2025-26 from 2030. Currently, about 10 per cent of ethanol is blended in petrol.

Also, more feedstocks have been allowed for the production of biofuels which can be doped with auto fuels. It also provides for promoting the production of biofuels in the country, under the Make in India programme, by units located in Special Economic Zones (SEZ)/ Export Oriented Units (EOUs).

The Cabinet also approved granting "permission for export of biofuels in specific cases," the statement said.

"This amendment proposal will pave the way for the Make in India drive thereby leading to a reduction in import of petroleum products by the generation of more and more biofuels. Since many more feedstocks are being allowed for the production of biofuels, this will promote the Atmanirbhar Bharat and give an impetus to Prime Minister's vision of India becoming 'energy independent' by 2047," the statement added.

The amendments will also attract and foster developments of indigenous technologies which will pave the way for the Make in India drive and thereby generate more employment



## Gencos directed to timely import coal for blending

**New Delhi:** Union power minister R K Singh has asked several states to direct electricity generation companies to ensure timely imports of coal for blending purposes so as to meet the requirements during the monsoon season. According to the power ministry, directions have also been issued to all gencos (power generation companies) asking them to place import orders well in time. The ministry has clarified that if orders for coal imports are not placed by May 31, 2022 and the imported fuel does not start arriving at power plants by June 15, the defaulter gencos will have to increase their imports to the extent of 15 per cent. The ministry had earlier advised state gencos to import 10 per cent of coal of their requirement for blending purposes. States were advised to place orders by May 31, 2022 so that delivery of 50 per cent quantity is ensured by June 30, 2022. The minister has also said that state gencos may lift the entire quantity of coal offered under RCR mode expeditiously to build coal stock. In case of failure on either account, it would not be possible to give additional domestic coal to make up for the shortfall.

## 28% GST levied on casinos, horse racing, online gaming

**New Delhi, May 18:** The panel of ministers tasked to review the GST levy on casinos, race courses and online gaming has finalised its report, which will be taken up in the upcoming GST Council meeting.

The Group of Ministers, chaired by Meghalaya chief minister Conrad Sangma, had in its previous meeting earlier this month unanimously decided on hiking the tax rate on these services to 28 per cent.

The GoM met again Wednesday and finalised the method of valuing these services for the purpose of levying this tax.

"The Group of Ministers (GoM) on casinos, race courses & online gaming has come to a consensus. The report of our submissions will be handed over to Hon'ble FM, Smti. @nsitharaman Ji in a day or two & the matter will be presented in the next @GST\_Council Meeting," Sangma tweeted.



At present, services of casinos, horse racing and online gaming attract 18 per cent GST.

The government had in May last year set up a panel of state ministers for better valuation of services of casinos, online gaming portal and race courses for levying Goods and Services Tax (GST). The report of the GoM is likely to be taken up in the next meeting of the GST Council expected later this month.

## BIDDERS WALKOUT BPCL privatisation stalled

**New Delhi, May 18:** Privatisation of BPCL, which was dubbed India's biggest ever, has been stalled with just one bidder left in the fray after two others walked out over issues such as lack of clarity in fuel pricing, a top source said.

The government had planned to sell its entire 52.98 per cent stake in Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd (BPCL) and invited Expression of Interest from bidders in March 2020. At least three bids came in by November 2020 but only one remains now after the others withdrew from the race.



"We are in a single bidder situation and it doesn't make sense that the single bidder dictates the narrative. So the disinvestment process is stalled for now," the source, who wished not to

be identified, said.

The privatisation of India's second-largest state oil refining and fuel marketing company had not attracted much interest first due to the volatile global oil price scenario and later due to a lack of clarity in domestic fuel pricing.

Public sector fuel retailers, which control 90 per cent of the petrol and diesel market, sell petrol and diesel at prices below the cost. This has forced private sector retailers Reliance-bp, Rosneft-backed Nayara and Shell into a situation where they either sell fuel at losses or lose market in case they raise prices to the level of cost.

## Zombie unicorns: Indian startups go from feast to famine

**Mumbai, May 18:** The valuation of Meesho, the Indian e-commerce rival of retail giant Amazon, more than doubled last year to \$5 billion, after marquee investors such as SoftBank and Fidelity pumped in hundreds of millions of dollars. They aimed to ride a boom in India's tech startups, which raised a record \$35 billion in new funds in 2021, but the tide has since turned, as corporate governance concerns loom large for investors facing a new uncertainty in global markets.

"We haven't seen a slowdown like this in at least five to six years. It is going to be brutal," said Anand

Lumia of venture capital firm India Quotient, an investor in more than 70 startups since 2012.

"I expect to see a lot of zombie unicorns. Companies which became unicorns but have no business models have stopped hiring - they are not dying, but will become irrelevant." Now Meesho is trying to raise debt and cut expenses after efforts to raise fresh funds of \$1 billion floundered, making investors wary of its monthly cash burn of \$45 million and stiff competition, two people familiar with the talks told Reuters. But its struggles are among the first signs of a painful future awaiting many Indian startups. Plummeting Indian tech stocks



are a worry, but investors spooked by fears over corporate governance are stepping up scrutiny during

due diligence efforts, which delays funding rounds, two venture capital executives said.

And there are concerns that valuations in India are already too high, even when startups' business models are being led by discounts and there is a bleak outlook for revenue, they added.

That could slam the brakes on the unprecedented growth and dull the lure of Indian startups. Eight venture capital and startup executives said fears were growing that a funding crunch would lower valuations, leaving less cash to achieve growth and bring job cuts.

Lumia said he had told companies in which his firm has invested to ensure they hold liquid cash sufficient for at least 18 months, reduce spending and headcount, if nec-

essary. Just last week, BharatPe, an Indian payments startup backed by Sequoia Capital, said it would overhaul governance practices following an internal review.

Another startup Vedantu, which offers online tutoring courses and is backed by Tiger Global with a valuation of \$1 billion, laid off nearly 600 staff this month in a "load rebalancing" move it said was based on growth expectations.

Typically, Tiger has targeted bigger Indian startups, but it has now told bankers it will only consider deals involving those with a valuation of less than \$200 million, in a bid to reduce risk, said two executives with direct knowledge of the matter.

# De Kock ton lifts LSG Titans challenge awaits RCB


De Kock gave a batting masterclass as he and Rahul powered LSG to 210 for no loss, the highest opening stand in IPL history.

KKR needed 38 runs off the last two overs and they both brought the equation down to 21 off the final over. Rinku came up with couple of sixes and a four to make it five off the last three balls but he fell to a special one handed catch from Evin Lewis to bring LSG back into the game.

With three needed off the final ball, Marcus Stoinis landed a yorker to dismiss Umesh Yadav and help his team win a humdinger. The loss knocked KKR out of the com-

bowlers and was at his innovative best against the seasoned spin duo of Sunil Narine and off coloured Varun Chakaravarthy.

Out of the sixes he hit, De Kock's reverse sweep off Narine stood out. Anything short from the pacers, de Kock was happy to put it away over deep square leg region.

De Kock cruised to his hundred in the 18th over with a cut shot off Russell and the innings meant a lot to him, something that was visibly by his down on knees celebration.

The southpaw was in no mood to stop even after reaching three figures. Tim Southee was poor in the death overs as he fed balls after balls in the slot for de Kock to deposit it into the stands. His 19th over yielded as many as 27 runs with De Kock finding the boundary at will.

Rahul watched De Kock's breathtaking knock from the best seat in the house. The skipper did not have much to do in the slog overs but he too played some sublime strokes on way to his third half century of the season.

Rahul also completed 500 runs in the tournament for the fifth season in a row. KKR bowlers leaked 88 runs in the last five overs with Southee and Russell proving to be the most expensive bowlers.

**Mumbai, May 18:** Runaway leaders Gujarat Titans would look to continue their winning momentum ahead of the playoffs while Royal Challengers Bangalore need a big victory to keep their last-four stage hopes alive when the two teams face each other in their final IPL league match here Thursday.

Newcomers GT have so far had a dream opening season as they are already assured of a top spot in the standings with 20 points from 13 games.

RCB, on the other hand, have had a mixed bag this season, registering seven wins and six losses to occupy the fifth spot with 14 points from 13 matches.

But what could hurt RCB is their net run rate of -0.323. A win against GT would move them to 16 points but that might not be enough as they also need a few favourable results going their way.

Delhi Capitals, who are currently at fourth spot, can also secure 16 points if they beat Mumbai Indians in their last match and they have a much better net run rate than RCB at +0.255.

## Nikhat in final, two others bag bronze

**New Delhi, May 18:** Nikhat Zareen (52kg) was the lone Indian to enter the final, while two others signed off with bronze medals in the Women's World Boxing Championships in Istanbul Wednesday.

Nikhat made short work of Brazil's Caroline De Almeida to notch up a dominant 5-0 win. However, Manisha Moun (57kg) and debutant Parveen Hooda (63kg) settled for bronze medals.

While Manisha lost to Tokyo Olympics bronze medalist Irma Testa of Italy by 0-5 unanimous decision, Parveen went down by a 1-4 split verdict to European championship bronze medalist Amy Broadhurst.

Zareen, who is a former junior world champion, stayed calm and completely dominated her rival for a 5-0 win by unanimous decision

in the last-four bout of the 52kg competition.

The 2019 Asian Championships bronze medalist Manisha, competing in her second world championship, tried hard to outdo her technically superior opponent with her power punches but Testa defended superbly.

Six-time champion MC Mary Kom, Sarita Devi, Jenny RL and Lekha C are the only Indian women boxers who have won the world title and now Hyderabad-based Zareen has the opportunity to join the elite list. India's best performance in the event came in 2006 when the country snared eight medals, including four gold, one silver and three bronze.

In the last edition, four Indian boxers returned home with medals — Manju Rani clinched the silver, while Mary Kom bagged an unparalleled eighth world medal in the form of a bronze.



## Even biggest of players can struggle: Ishan

**Mumbai, May 18:** Ishan Kishan has failed to live up to the most expensive player tag in this IPL but the Mumbai Indians wicket-keeper batter is not unduly worried about his form, saying even the best of cricketers "struggle" at some point.

The 23-year-old was bought by MI for a whopping Rs 15.25 crore at the IPL auction earlier this year. He scored 370 runs from 13 matches at an average of 30.83, with the help of three half-centuries.

"Even the biggest of players (can struggle), I have seen the likes of Chris Gayle taking time (to start hitting)," Kishan said at the post-

match conference after MI lost by three runs to Sunrisers Hyderabad Tuesday night.

"Every day is a new day, every match is new. Someday, you get a good start, some day, opposition bowlers come prepared and they bowl the balls at good areas. The planning inside the dressing room may be different from what the outside people want."

He said his role was not about hitting straightaway without analysing the situation of the game. "In cricket, it can never be sure that you have just one role and I will just go out and hit the ball. If you think about the team, it is more important to understand about your role," Kishan said.

"If the opposition bowlers are bowling well you need to give respect to them and if you can save wicket it makes easier for the batters coming later."

"There cannot be just one situation. Someday, you need to go all out when you are chasing a big total, some day, you need to analyse the strength of opposition team whether they have good bowlers to bowl at the death or not, or whether we have to save wickets or not."

Kishan also said that MI could have won the match had Tim David, who had smashed 46 off just 18 balls down the order, was there till the end. "Unfortunately, Tim David was run out. If he was till the end, he could have finished the game."



## Thailand Open: Sindhu, Srikanth advance

**Bangkok, May 18:** Two-time Olympic medalist PV Sindhu huffed and puffed her way to the women's singles second round while Kidambi Srikanth and HS Prannoy, the protagonists of India's historic Thomas Cup triumph, suffered contrasting fates in the opening round of Thailand Open here Wednesday.

Sindhu, seeded sixth and ranked seventh in the world, staved off a spirited challenge from world number 62, USA's Lauren Lam 21-19, 19-21, 21-18 to set up a clash with Sim Yu Jin, who had played a pivotal role in Korea's Uber Cup win.

Fresh from playing a major role in the Thomas Cup victory, Srikanth, seeded eighth, produced a gritty show to get the better of Brice Leverdez of France 18-21, 21-10, 21-16 in 49 minutes.

The World No.11 Indian will next face Ireland's Nhat Nguyen, who defeated Hans-Kristian Solberg Vittinghus of Denmark 21-12, 23-21 in the first round.

Prannoy, who won the decisive third singles during the quarter-

finals and semifinals of Thomas Cup, went down fighting 17-21, 21-15, 15-21 to Daren Liew of Malaysia.

Among other Indians in the fray, Ashwini Bhat K and Shikha Gautam beat Thailand's Kittipak Dubthuk and Prinda Pattanawarithiphan 21-12, 21-17 to enter the second round.

Ishaan Bhatnagar and Tanisha Crasto got a walkover from USA's Mathew Fogarty and Isabel Zhong to also advance to the second round.

London Olympic bronze medalist Saina Nehwal battled hard for 50 minutes before losing 21-11, 15-21, 17-21 to Korean Kim Ga Eun in the women's singles first round.

Indian qualifier Ashmita Chailha lost to seventh seeded Ratchanok Intanon of Thailand 10-21, 15-21 in a first round match that lasted 29 minutes. Compatriot and another qualifier, Aakarshi Kashyap lost to Michelle Li of Canada 13-21, 18-21 to bow out of the tournament in the first round.

Malvika Bansod battled her way into the second round with a fighting 17-21, 21-15, 21-11 win over Ukraine's Maria Ulina. She will next face Line Christopherson of Denmark.



The mixed doubles pair of B Sumeeth Reddy and Ashwini Ponnappa also suffered a first round exit, losing to the eighth-seeded Japanese duo of Yuki Kaneko and Misaki Matsutomo 17-21, 17-21 in 34 minutes.

It was also curtains for B Sai Preneeth and Sourabh Verma in the men's singles opening round. While Praneeth lost 12-21, 13-21 to Kantaphon Wangcharoen of Thailand, Sourabh was shown the door by Toma Junior Popov of France 20-22, 12-21.

Abhishek Verma, Aman Saini and Rajat Chauhan rose above expectations to shock USA 234-228 in the quarterfinals before getting the better of South Korea in the shoot-off to seal their place in the title clash, where they will take on World No.4 France.

Later, the women's compound team of Avneet Kaur, Muskan Kirar and Priya Gurjar suffered a two-point defeat against South Korea in



the semifinals but managed to claim a bronze, defeating Turkey 232-231.

The biggest shocker came earlier in the day in the men's compound team event when the Indian trio of Abhishek, Aman and Rajat defeated USA in a one-sided quarterfinal.

Continuing their giant-killing run, the Indians then bounced back from a two-point deficit at the halfway mark to oust the Korean trio of Kim Jongho, Choi Yonghee and Yang Jaewon in a shoot-off 233-233 (29-26) to advance into the final. India had begun their campaign with a 235-229 win over Italy in the round of 16 in the men's compound section.

In the women's compound team event, the Indians, who got a bye into the quarterfinals, started off defeating Chinese Taipei 228-226. But in the semifinal, they lost to Korea 228-230.
