Pilot grounded from all posts



Jaipur/New Delhi, July 14: The Congress Tuesday cracked down on Sachin Pilot, stripping the dissident leader of the posts of Rajasthan's deputy chief minister and the party's state unit president and sacking two loyalists from the state cabinet.

Though the party seems to have the numbers for now to hang on to power in Rajasthan, the development deepens the crisis in the Congress which has lost two major states - Karnataka and Madhya Pradesh - over the past year.

Ministers Vishvendra Singh and Ramesh Meena were also removed from the state cabinet after a meeting of the Congress Legislature Party, its second in the last two days. The meeting was billed as a "second chance" for Pilot, who had turned down appeals from the party's top leadership – including Rahul Gandhi and Priyanka Gandhi -- to return to the fold. Pilot has been upset since the Congress picked Ashok Gehlot as the chief minister in 2018, while his own supporters insisted that he deserved credit for the party's vic-

tory as its state unit president. His



next move is not immediately clear. During the run-up to Tuesday's CLP meeting, his supporters insisted that he had no plans to join the BJP. They said their aim was a leadership change in Rajasthan.

"Truth can be rattled, not defeated," Pilot tweeted in Hindi soon after he was sacked. Gehlot accused his former deputy of playing into the hands of the BJP. "I am very sad that horse-trading was going on," he said.

Pilot had kept away from the first CLP meeting Monday and sources said 18 other Congress MLAs had also skipped it, giving an indication of the dissident leader's strength. A video clip circulated by the Pilot camp appeared to show a group of 16 Congress MLAs. Pilot Sunday claimed the support of 30 Congress MLAs.

Plasma therapy in 3 hospitals from today

Bhubaneswar, July 14: The state government Tuesday decided to start plasma therapy to treat critically ill patients in three dedicated COVID-19 hospitals in Bhubaneswar and Cuttack, officials said. The decision was taken at a review meeting presided by Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik. The plasma therapy will be introduced in SUM Hospital and KIIMs hospitals in Bhubaneswar and Ashiwini Hospital in Cuttack, they said.

SCB Medical College and Hospital in Cuttack has been chosen as the nodal centre for plasma therapy to be implemented for the first time in the state from Wednesday, said Additional Chief Secretary, Health and Family Welfare, PK Mohapatra.

He said plasma therapy has been helpful in reducing mortality rate in other states. The fatality rate in Odisha, however, is below one per cent and presently stands at 0.50 per cent, Mohapatra said.

During the review, the chief minister told the officials to focus on five selected districts - Ganjam, Cuttack, Khurda, Jajpur and Sundargarh which have recorded a surge in COVID-19 cases. "The situation in the five districts continues to remain challenging," an official said, adding that of the total 14,280 positive cases in the state, Ganjam accounted for 4,335 cases. Ganjam also tops the list of fatalities by reporting 44 of the 74 deaths in the state. Interacting with the district observers, Patnaik asked them to augment the health

Ganjam towns sealed

CHHATRAPUR: The district administration Tuesday completely sealed all entry points to 18 towns including Berhampur and Chhatrapur in Ganjam district to prevent the spread of coronavirus. Moreover, travel from one town to another has been banned while residents have been asked not to leave their residences and visit other areas. The move has been done to break the chain of coronavirus in the district. Vehicles carrying essen tial commodities, food and government officials with valid ID cards as well as medical staff have been allowed to travel.

care infrastructures in the five districts in view of the rise in COVID cases. Bhubaneswar in Khurda district, Cuttack and Ganjam districts have been badly hit by the COVID-19 following the return of many migrant workers from different hotspot states in the country and abroad, the observers informed Patnaik.

Referring to allegations of COVID victims' funerals not being done properly, Patnaik asked the authorities to ensure that last rites of the corona deceased are performed with dignity. While around 7,000 samples are being tested for COVID everyday at present in the state, the daily testing will be increased up to 9,000 within a week, the meeting was informed.

On training of the frontline workers like health workers, anganwadi workers and others, the state government has imparted training to above 5 lakh people.



New Delhi, July 14: Dilip RISE Lamba, who owns a transport company in Jodhpur in western India, has had more than three-quarters of his fleet of 50 trucks idling for months. Dharampal Nambardar, a farmer who grows wheat and mustard seed in Haryana state, is worried he might not make any profit this year.



BMC seals 2 hotels in Capital for flouting Covid guidelines

Bhubaneswar, July 14: Acting tough against violation of Covid-19 guidelines in the Capital city, the Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation (BMC), Tuesday, issued closure notices to two hotels at Kharavel Nagar here who were found blatantly violating the norms. The two hotels that were oper-

ating behind Bhubaneswar Development Authority (BDA) office were found serving food to customers inside hotel dining space. The action came after a clear violation of Covid-19 guidelines, which allows hotels, restaurants and other eateries to operate only with 'takeaway and home-delivery orders',

was found. 'The guidelines for restaurants and hotels specifically mentioned that no dining options will be made available. This was done to discourage public gatherings and enforce social distancing. However, both the hotels were found to be violating the guidelines and thus were fined Rs 5,000 along with closure notice for 7 days," Zonal District

Commissioner, Anshuman Rath.

Rath also added that satisfac-



tory undertakings from hotel owners have been taken and would be presented to the BMC Commissioner who would further reconsider opening of the eateries. Moreover, people present in the hotels at the time of inspection were sanitised and sensitised about the spread of Covid-19 under such circumstances.

Two deaths were reported from Khurda district and one each from Ganjam and Cuttack districts, said the official.


The H&FW department took to the Twitter to say, "Regret to inform the demise of four Covid-19 positive patients while under treatment in hospitals."


Many people are now reluctant to participate in the burial or cremation of bodies of patients dying at the isolation wards due to infection threat, sources said.

Bhubaneswar: July 14: As a little more than a million migrant labourers have registered with the state government's dedicated Covid-19 portal and a large number of them have returned back home, this is the time to map their skills to redraw livelihood strategies for them.

This was revealed at a webinar titled 'Mainstreaming Migrant Workers' organised by city based civil society outfits 'Focus Odisha Foundation' and 'Mahashakti Foundation' in collaboration with 'Migration Watch India' Tuesday.

In the webinar: experts opined that the government should work out both long-term and short-term strategies so that the livelihoods of migrant workers are secured which would help avert distress,

Experts said the govt should work out both long-term & short-term strategies so that the livelihoods of migrant workers are secured

human trafficking and re-migration through alternative pathways. The migrants, after losing jobs, are facing unemployment and poverty back home as uncertainty looms large all over.

Sandeep Chachra, executive director of Action Aid Association India, which works for the migrants, said the need for rebuilding livelihood strategies and ensuring social safety net for both returnees and informal workers working else-



where in the country - a huge community estimated to be one fourth of the total population of the country. Chachra further said, "We need to think beyond MGNREGS and explore alternative skill based livelihoods.'

The experts stressed the need for ensuring legitimate entitlements of migrant workers as there has been large-scale resentment across the country following the alleged denial of their rights as

these communities facing identity crisis.

State head of United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), Abha Mishra, highlighted the need for mapping skills and knowledge of migrants. "This will enable us to draw a line between skilled and unskilled people and plan for the restoration of their livelihoods." She further added that there is a

need to think about developing natural industries like livestock and dairy development, focusing on nutri-gardens, organic farming besides emphasising agricultural and tourism development.

Hati river erosion leaves riparian villages on edge

Bhawanipatana, July 14: Come monsoon, thousands of people living in riparian pockets along Hati river in Kalahandi district live in fear. Continuous riverbank erosion has posed threat to many villages. With no flood control measures till date, the river plays havoc to land, crop and properties, every year, a report said.

Erosion of riverbanks has been a major cause of concern of the people in Kalampur block.

"Floodwaters enter villages, and damage houses and crops. Over 10 houses have been flattened by the floodwaters over years. As the river keeps on advancing due to erosion, the houses of Jayram Ghi, Yudhistir Pujari, Bilat Majhi and Prasad Majhi have come to the brink of collapse," the locals said.

Devastating erosion by the river has devoured vast tracts of arable land and the floods have left the farmlands sand cast.

The erosion of the riverbanks continues to be more devastating at Temara, Khengarguda, Biripur, Matikhala, Jampada, Karmel, Balichhada, Bankapala, Rasdumer and Sanakuti.

People in over 21 villages face the fury of the floods and river-

bank erosion throughout the monsoon. Scores of villages remain cut off from the rest of the world for days together.

Local said: "Over 50 acres of farmland, including five acres each at Balichhada and Biripur, four acres at Karmel and two acres at Khengarguda have merged with the river over the last two decades." Samiti member of Balichhada.

Bikash Behera, said, "Over the years, Hati river has eroded a stretch of 15 metres into my farmland." Last year, low-pressure induced floods left over 30 acres of land in





A search was launched after the hospital authorities lodged an FIR with the local police Monday. The Excise Intelligence officials arrested

two persons from Berhampur New Bus Stand on the charge of smuggling cannabis, July 3. After seizing huge quantities of cannabis from the duo, they sent the duo to Berhampur jail. As per the COVID-19 guidelines swab samples of the two marijuana peddlers had been collected for COVID-19. The test reports of the duo came out positive. Then the jail authority shifted them to the COVID hospital, July 10 for their treatment. However, two days after being admitted to the hospital, the duo fled from the hospital. 'Mo Upakari Bagicha' to reduce corona impact on nutrition

Malkangiri, July 14: The Malkangiri district administration in its bid to combat the long-term nutritional challenges caused by the Covid-19 pandemic and reverse migration of labourers is emphasising on the state government-sponsored 'Mo Upkari Bagicha' (My Beneficial Garden), a report said.

The programme aimed at eradicating malnutrition and providing livelihood has come as succour for scores of women in this district during these trying times.

Covid-19 spreading rapidly in this district has robbed the livelihood of the people. The Odisha Livelihoods Mission (OLM) has come to the rescue of women through the statesponsored programme 'Mo Upakari Bagicha'.

The programme implemented by the district rural development agency (DRDA) aims at encouraging women in the district to grow vegetables and fruits at a minimal cost in the backyards of their houses to get fresh vegetables to meet their need



and sell the surplus in the market to earn a living. The district administration is of the view that a welldeveloped nutrition garden is likely to supplement the daily dietary requirement of a vulnerable family, including pregnant women, lactating mothers and children.

Reports said over 4,000 women in 18 panchayats under Mathili, Malkangiri, Khairput and Chitrakonda blocks have benefitted

from this programme in 2019-20 fiscal. Tasting success, the women are now eager to spread their area of cultivation. "Prompted by this success, the district administration is now implementing the programme on priority basis in Swabhiman (cut-off) Anchal to bring in change in the lives and livelihood of tribal women," Balmukund Bhuyan, Project Director, DRDA said.

Here Comes Google

oogle Inc CEO Sundar Pichai, in a virtual meeting with Prime Minister Narendra Modi on 13 July, has said that Google will invest US\$10 billion in the next five to seven years in India. Pichai's words must have sounded like honey and sugar to an economically battered Indian government. Pichai has said that the money Google will invest will be done through a mix of investments in large companies, startups, partnerships and infrastructure investments. The spheres mentioned for investment seem quite broad based and non-specific. While national media has speculated Google's first big investment will be in Jio Platforms of Reliance Industries, the negotiations are not yet completed. However, like morning shows the day, the over enthusiastic response to Google by the government of India shows there is more, much more, to what meets the ordinary citizen's eye.

Take for example, the government of India's response to Jeff Bezos, founder CEO of Amazon. Bezos had physically visited India in January 2020 and come with an initial offer of investing US\$1 billion, which he wanted to put mainly in small and medium industries. The business model of Amazon is known to all globally. It depends on physical employees since its mainstay is E-commerce based retail. Therefore, it was believable when Bezos had said that he would create over 1 million jobs in India. Unlike Amazon. the investment promise of Google would mostly be in the sphere of data, which would not percolate to the ground level as jobs for large number of people. Surprisingly, Bezos was snubbed and not given appointment by either PM Narendra Modi or any senior member of the government. On the other hand, Union Minister Piyush Goyal had publicly stated that Amazon would not be doing any great favour by investing in India. Had Amazon's investment been welcome, it is possible that the money and the employment opportunities would have started opening up now in the dark Covid era. Yet, it is not difficult to understand why the BJP government was unwilling to entertain Jeff Bezos.

In the meantime, Facebook Inc has invested more than US\$5 billion in Reliance Jio and cornered a little less than 10 percent stake in that company. There is no doubt that, in today's India scenario, Reliance Industries is the best bet for large investors whose focus lies on data collection. With a successful spread of Jio, RIL is the most powerful operator in this field. However, Amazon would have created problems by disrupt-



ing the retail sector of India in which big interests are at play. Unlike the West and especially the US, E-Commerce related retail has blossomed very late in India. Indigenous industrialists were preoccupied with large industries such as petroleum, steel and fibre. The sudden waking up of Indian business to large scale physical and E-Commerce retail was bound to get a massive jolt with the entry of Amazon. This jolt would have had two aspects. For small and medium players, the Amazon umbrella would have injected life back into them, which would have, in turn, created huge employment opportunities. Apart from this, customers would have got access to a wider range of products with competitive pricing. The second aspect would, of course, be considered negative because large Indian giants entering retail would have been stressed out. To protect these giants, the government, understandably, snubbed Bezos. On retrospect, had Amazon started supplying more products manufactured in India within India, these Covid times would have become a boon not only for that company but for India as well. It has been internationally acknowledged that Amazon is probably one of the few corporates that grew in volume during these lockdown months. It would also have been easier to replace Chinese products in the Indian market had Amazon been encouraged here since it has access to alternative global manufacturers. Instead of banning TikTok and such superficial data collecting apps, the government of India has officially welcomed the father of all Data Collectors to gain a chokehold on the Indian public.

the best of times to discuss population explosion and the strain that it puts on a nation's resources, exchequer, and the national and social fabric. Look no further than New Zealand as a case in point. A country with the number of inhabitants less than that of Ahmedabad has managed to contain the Covid-19 crisis, essentially because of a manageable population. As India becomes the third worst-hit country by the pandemic, it's instructive to look at its burgeoning population and the possibilities for the future. Now at 137 crore, India is home

to the world's second-largest population. According to the UN World Population Prospects 2019. India will overtake China as the world's most populous country by 2027. With 18 per cent of the global population, India today is not fighting just a pandemic. It's striving to be hunger-free. It wants to get rid of social inequities. It has to create job opportunities for all. A workforce of the size of Australia gets added to our country every year. A growing army of the unemployed can create massive social upheavals, besides widening the "haves-have nots" divide.

Won't it be better, then, if we have an institutionalised mechanism to check, control, and manage population growth, and keep it at stable levels? Look at the irony: We aspire to be a \$5 trillion economy by 2025. Yet, we rank a lowly 103rd on the Global Hunger Index among 119 countries (2018 rankings). India has 2.4 per cent of the world's land mass, and 4 per cent of water resources. Compared to many other parts of the world, this makes India among the most dense, large countries (over 464 people per sq km), also making the spread of a Covid-19-like pandemic a lot faster. Over a period of time, the population growth puts tremendous pressure on natural, national and social resources. India's quest for the Sustainable Development Goals. too, could get impacted.

India, incidentally, was the first developing country to initiate a family planning programme in 1951. The first National Population Policy was conceptualised in 1976. The National Health Policy was formulated in 1983, and a new pol-

icy in 2000. Population explosion has concerned governments and lawmakers of all shades. Since Independence, as many as 35 Private Member Bills have been introduced in Parliament to control population. I am of the firm belief that we need a national consensus to stabilise our population. And, we need to work in mission mode. As an MP, I had participated in discussions on the issue in the Parliament and remember clearly that during the discussions members across the political spectrum spoke in unison on the need for population stabilisation

As a result of the efforts of governments, pressure groups, civil society and the media, and after the creation of an enabling environment through education, especially girls' education. India's average yearly population growth rate has come down from 21.5 per cent to 17.7 per cent between 1991-2001 and 2001-2011.

It's been argued in the National Family Health Survey-4 that India should have a Total Fertility Rate (TFR) of 1.8 (meaning women having less than 2 children). The current TFR is 2.2. Some argue that India can do with a TFR of 2.1, touted as 'replacement fertility rate' which would ensure that there would be no tangible growth

in the population while ensuring at the same time that there is no population decline. According to an estimate. 13 Indian states are at this rate or a rate below this.

While population control and stabilisation have gained currency especially after Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Independence Day speech last vear, some, including state governments, and those moving Private Member Bills in Parliament, advocate punitive measures against those "violating' the two-child norm. According to one count, more than 10 states have such measures in place. which, for instance, bar one from holding a public office (say, in panchayats), if he or she has more than two children. While the efficacy of this needs to be debated. we need to focus a lot more on girl child's education. We have seen a marked decline in TFRs in states with a good girl education machinery. States like Kerala. Tamil Nadu, Punjab, Maharashtra, Himachal Pradesh have low TFRs, primarily because girls here have better access to education, for a longer period in a life cycle. In contrast, states like Bihar and

Uttar Pradesh, which have not

done enough on education, have

high TFRs. According to data from

the Sample Registration System (SRS) for the year 2018, Bihar is the only state where a woman is likely to have over three children.

So, this is simple math — we have to invest massively in girls' education. And, thus, help them exercise choices in their lives. We need to vigorously promote the small family norm in school curriculum. Small families with good education would ensure a better quality of human resource. We need to stress on the quality of our human resources, working population, and the country as a whole. It's only then that we will be able to meet our ambitious targets that we set for ourselves.

We also need to increase the governmental spend on healthcare, and family planning measures and schemes. A recent trend has seen a drop in the usage of contraceptives, and some even argue that Indian men are less likely to use contraceptives than women. Contraceptives' use needs to be encouraged.

I had in the past delved into the systemic issue of why the poor want to have more children, and how we can help them with a safety net. Some reports in the present context argue that the Modi government is considering a Narasimha Rao government proposal to make population control a fundamental duty, while some claim that a small family norm could even be a prerequisite for contesting an election. While punitive measures may appeal to some, and may appear to work in the short term, especially in authoritarian regimes, I would argue that a democracy must employ the power of persuasion.

The government must engage with community leaders and religious and spiritual gurus. Spiritual gurus have used their offices constructively for cam paigns like Pulse Polio. We must get them on board and get them to talk about the small family norm. In addition to this, we can incentivise small families — for instance, with tax rebates. A two child norm is eminently desirable. But we need to promote the idea rather than enforce or impose it.

his term dates back to the 1920s and is originally and mainly American. It appears first in the obvious sense of something, often food, that is below the highest quality or grade, inferior. By the 1970s it had begun to be linked with finance, at first in the sense of a commercial lending rate lower than the prime rate, one that was typically offered only to the most desirable borrowers. At that time to be offered a subprime loan was a mark of your creditworthiness and financial stability, ironic in view of what happened later. The word began its slide into notoriety in the early 1990s. It started to mean a loan, often on unfavourable terms, to borrowers who didn't qualify because of a poor credit history or other circumstances those who in plain language would be called bad risks, who had court judgements against them, who had financial problems due to redundancy or divorce, or who were simply poor. Though subprime could be used for borrowing money for any purpose, the most significant use has been for mortgages. There have always been firms who were prepared to lend money to people in these groups, at a price, but in the nineties established lenders moved into this market. A surprisingly large number of euphemisms were coined, including sub-standard, impaired credit, Bpaper, non-conforming, near-prime, and second chance, but subprime has become the most common. Lenders wanting to offset the risks of such loans began to package them into complex and ingenious financial instruments which they sold on to banks and hedge funds, who were keen to acquire them. Unfortunately, the rising levels of mortgage foreclosures in the US during 2006 and 2007 has left many of these instruments valueless and created a worldwide crisis in banking.

Bangalore, July 14: The Bengaluru Metropolitan Transport Corporation (BMTC) has suspended all its operations for a week from July 15 to 21, owing to the Covid-induced lockdown here amid rising cases. Only 134 skeletal essential services will be operated, an official said Tuesday.

"BMTC bus services to the general public are suspended from Wednesday to next Tuesday. However, as per the orders of the government, BMTC will operate essential services for permitted activities during the lockdown period,' said an official from the road transport corporation.

During the lockdown, the city bus service will operate 134 essential services, excluding the containment zones for 12 hours between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m.

Only selected essential services providers working in government departments and others, students attending examinations and those taking trains and flights will be allowed to move out.

Meanwhile, the Karnataka State Road Transport Corporation (KSRTC) has scheduled 1,100 buses Tuesday to facilitate the homeward journey of many people scrambling to go back.

As many as 20 pick-up points have been arranged by the road transport corporation to ferry the passengers to the interior districts. KSRTC Managing Director Shivayogi C. Kalasad held a video conference Monday and directed

the officials to arrange sufficient number of buses, so that the public is not inconvenienced. The transporter is deploying



Bihar announces total lockdown

Patna: There will be a total lockdown in Bihar from July 16-31 to contain the spread of COVID-19, Deputy Chief Minister Sushil Kumar Modi Tuesday announced. On his official Twitter handle, Modi said the 15-day lockdown will remain in force at all municipal, district, subdivisional and block headquarters level and that guidelines were being prepared. The move comes close on the heels of recent spike in positive cases which had necessitated lockdowns, imposed by the local administrations, in several districts.

Bulandshahr: Six people were arrested for allegedly attacking a police team last week in Uttar Pradesh's Bulandshahr district, officials said Tuesday. CENTRE ISSUES GUIDELINES FOR ONLINE CLASSES

New Delhi, July 14: The HRD Ministry Tuesday announced guidelines for online classes by schools and recommended a cap on duration and the number of sessions in a day for students.

The guidelines have been framed by the ministry, following concerns raised by parents about schools conducting online classes like regular schools, which has increased children's screen time after the COVID-19 pandemic mandated a shift from classroom teaching to online learning as schools continue to remain shut for over four months.

In the guideline called "Pragyata", the Ministry of Human Resource Development has recommended that the duration for online classes for pre-primary students should not be for more than

30 minutes For Classes 1 to 8, the HRD Ministry has recommended two online sessions of up to 45 minutes each while for Classes to 9 to 12. four sessions of 30-45 minutes duration have been recommended. The COVID-19 pandemic has led to closure of schools and has impacted over 240 million children

of the country who are enrolled in schools. Extended school closures may cause loss of learning. "To mitigate the impact of the

pandemic, schools will not only have to remodel and re-imagine the way teaching and learning have happened so far, but will also need to introduce a suitable method of delivering quality education through a healthy mix of schooling at home and schooling at school,' HRD Minister Ramesh Pokhriyal

'Nishank' said. He said that the guidelines have been made with a focus on online education for students who are at home.

"The guidelines have been developed from the perspective of learners, with a focus on online, blended, digital education for students who are presently at home due to the lockdown. These guidelines on digital education provide a roadmap or pointers for carrying forward online education to enhance the quality of education,' Nishank added.

Universities and schools across the country have been shut since March 16, when the Centre announced a countrywide classroom shutdown as part of measures to contain the COVID-19 outbreak. A nationwide lockdown was announced on March 24, which came into effect the next day.

While the government has largely eased restrictions, schools and colleges continue to remain closed.

New Delhi, July 14: India recorded a spike of more than 28,000 cases for the second consecutive day in the last 24 hours, pushing the tally to 9,06,752 cases with a death total of 23,727, the Health Ministry's data stated Tuesday.

India crossed nine lakh mark from eight lakh within three days. India had crossed the 8 lakh COVID-19 cases July 11.

According to data, India witnessed a spike of 28,498 fresh cases taking the total number of cases to 9,06,752 and with 553 deaths in the last 24 hours the total number of fatalities crossed 23,727. According to Health Ministry data, as many as 5,71,459 patients have recovered, over twice the number of active patients which stand at 3,11,565.

The rate of recovery has touched 63.02 per cent. India, however, remains the third worst-affected coun-

It said that Mehta, who was appearing for Uttar Pradesh, "may file reply affidavit" on the pleas by July 16.

Eight policemen, including DSP Devendra Mishra, were ambushed in Bikru village in Chaubeypur area of Kanpur when they were going to arrest Dubey and fell to

bullets fired from rooftops shortly after midnight July 3.

Dubey was killed in an encounter in the morning of July 10 when a police vehicle carrying him from Ujjain to Kanpur met with an accident and he tried to escape from the spot in Bhauti area, the police had said.

Four policemen, including an inspector posted in Nawabganj, were injured in the July 10 accident, IG, Kanpur Range, Mohit Agarwal had said. The police claimed that Dubey, the prime accused in the ambush in which cops were killed, was rushed to the hospital where he was declared dead.

Prior to Dubey's encounter, five of his alleged associated were killed in separate encounters.

The latest wave of floods in Assam has affected over 21.40 lakh people in 26 districts Dhemaji, Lakhimpur, Biswanath, Sonitpur, Darrang, Baska, Nalbari, Barpeta, Chirang, Bongaigaon, Kokrajhar, Dhubri, South Salmara, Goalpara, Kamrup, Kamrup (Metro), Morigaon, Nagaon, Golaghat, Jorhat, Majuli, Sivasagar, Dibrugarh, Tinsukia, Karbi Anglong and West Karbi Anglong.

Barpeta is the worst-hit district with 5.44 lakh people being affected in the deluge, followed by 1.92 lakh in South Salmara, 1.30 lakh in Dhemaji, 1.18 lakh in Golaghat, 1.13 lakh in Darrang, 1.12 lakh in Bongaigaon, 92,000 people in -Lakhimpur, 83,000 in Nalbari, 82,000 in Morigaon, 79,000 in Kamrup, 78,000 in Sivasagar district.

About 2,816 villages in the floodhit districts are currently under water and the flood waters have submerged 1.21 lakh hectares of agricultural land.

'Iran drops India from Chabahar rail project'

New Delhi, July 14: Iran has decided to move ahead with the construction of a railway line from Chabahar port to Zahedan without any assistance from India due to delay in funding. India has been dropped four years after the project was finalised as part of a broader trilateral agreement.

According to a report, the entire project will be completed by March 22 and \$400 million will be sanctioned by the Iranian National Development Fund for the project. The project, however, will be completed without any assistance from India The railway line project was

part of India's commitment to the trilateral agreement with Afghanistan and Iran to build an alternate trade route to Afghanistan and Central Asia.

The deal was finalised during Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Tehran in 2016 after he signed an agreement with the Iranian President Hassan Rouhani and Afghanistan President Ashraf Ghani.

Indian Railways Construction Ltd (IRCON) had promised assistance to the railway line project besides financing worth \$1.6 billion. However, the work was never started as the United States imposed sanctions on Iran.

Over 90 doctors on COVID

DOCTORS HAVE DIED WHILE ON COVID-19 DUTY IN

INDO-ASIAN NEWS SERVICE

New Delhi, July 14: The Indian Medical Association's initial findings have revealed that 93 doctors have died while on COVID-19 duty in India.

Dr Rajan Sharma, head of IMA, revealed that as per the latest count, 93 doctors have died so far, while 1,279 doctors have been infected.

At least 771 doctors less than the age of 35 years, 247 doctors above the age of 35 years and 261 doctors above 50 years have been infected so far, the IMA chief said. This figure does not include healthcare workers such as nurses and other healthcare-related staff.

"We are working on a research paper of causes of these deaths, and how many have died in general practice, resident category very soon. IMA will come out with all figures and reasons behind this. We are not hiding from revealing this data," Dr Rajan Sharma said.

Dr Sharma confirmed that these figures have been "collated by IMA when presented with data collated by Dr Rajeev Jayadevan, who is the president of the Kochi branch of IMA in Kerala"

Dr Jayadevan claimed that 110 doctors lost their lives. His data comes from news that has been reported by publications both local and national. He also said he is collating data of nurses and other healthcare workers.



Dr Jayadevan said that the report is his personal work and does not reflect the opinion of the IMA. "I collected the information as

a tribute to doctors, nurses and healthcare staff across India who have been working in the pandemic and lost their lives, it was a report titled '100 Doctor Deaths in India during the times of COVID. Lessons, and a tribute'," Dr

Jayadevan said. "I have tried my best to exclude those where the virus affected their lungs or their immunity and it killed them. Many were working amongst COVID patients and died and these deaths were attributed to COVID-19," he said.

Woman ends life at quarantine centre in Assam

Silchar (Assam)/Agartala, July 14: A 32-vear-old woman, who was in institutional quarantine in Southern Assam's Hailakandi district along with her family on return from Bangalore, reportedly committed suicide by hanging herself, police said.

The husband of the deceased woman suspects that delay in the sample's report might have caused the suicide. A police official said that the woman was found hanging on Sunday night from the window of the washroom of a government school, which was earlier turned into a quarantine centre. The woman, her husband and their eight-year-old son had returned to Hailakandi from Bangalore by flight June 28. Police quoting the health officials said that after their return, swab samples were collected and sent to the Gauhati Medical College and Hospital and all of them were put under quarantine. Though the husband and son were tested negative but the test report of the woman was awaited due to the technical reasons. The health officials subsequently (after the suicide) conducted a rapid antigen test of the samples of the deceased woman and the result came negative. For more confirmation, the swab sample of the woman has been sent to Silchar Medical College and Hospital for RT-PCR test.

The report said that almost 690 million people globally were undernourished (or hungry) in 2019, up by 10 million from 2018. The hungry are most numerous in Asia, but expanding fastest in Africa.

Across the planet, the report forecasts, that the COVID-19 pandemic could push over 130 million more people into chronic hunger by the end of 2020.

In percentage terms, Africa is the hardest hit region and becoming more so, with 19.1 per cent of its people undernourished. At the current trends, by 2030. Africa will be home to more than half of the world's chronically hungry.

Beijing, July 14: China Tuesday announced sanctions on top American arms manufacturing firm Lockheed Martin in retaliation to the US State Department's approval of a request by Taiwan for the recertification of PAC-3 air defence missiles built by the company.

"China firmly opposes US arms sales to Taiwan. We urge US to earnestly abide by the One-China principle, stop selling arms to Taiwan and cut its military ties with Taiwan, so that it will not cause further harm to bilateral ties, peace and security across the Taiwan straits," Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesman Zhao Lijian told a media briefing here. His remarks comes days after the US State Department last week approved Taiwan's request for the recertification of its Patriot Advanced Capability-3 (PAC-3) air defence missiles at an estimated cost of \$620 million.

In a statement Thursday, the US Defence Security Cooperation Agency (DSCA) said Congress had already been notified of the possible sale. According to US media reports quoting DSCA, Taiwan has asked to buy parts to refurbish its PAC-3 missiles to support an operational life of 30 years.

Lockheed Martin Corporation is the main contractor for the deal. The Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesman said Beijing will impose sanctions on Lockheed Martin in retaliation. "China has decided to take essential measures. We will impose sanctions on main contractor of this sale Lockheed Martin," he said. Analysts say China's sanctions may be symbolic as Lockheed

Washington, July 14: The world will not allow China to treat the strategically important South China Sea as its "maritime empire," the US has asserted, as it vowed to support worried Southeast Asian countries against Beijing's "campaign of bullying" to control the resource-rich region.

Beijing claims almost all of the 1.3 million square mile South China Sea as its sovereign territory. China has been building military bases on artificial islands in the region also claimed by Brunei, Malaysia, the Philippines. Taiwan and Vietnam.



Beijing has impeded commercial activity like fishing or mineral exploration by countries like Vietnam and the Philippines, claiming that the ownership of territory belonged to China for hundreds of years.

Asserting that the "Chinese predatory world view" has no place in the 21st century, US Secretary of State Mike Pompeo Monday categorically rejected the territorial claims made by Beijing in the South China Sea. The United States, he said, stands with the international community in the defence of freedom of the seas and respect for sovereignty and rejects any push to impose "might makes right" in the South China Sea or the wider region. Pompeo said China cannot law-

fully assert a maritime claim -- including any exclusive economic zone (EEZ) claims derived from Scarborough Reef and the Spratly Islands -- vis-a-vis the Philippines in areas that a tribunal found to be in the Philippines' EEZ or on its continental shelf. The US, he said, rejects any

Chinese claim to waters beyond a 12-nautical mile territorial sea derived from islands it claims in the Spratly Islands (without prejudice to other states' sovereignty claims over such islands).

Also, China has no lawful territorial or maritime claim to (or derived from) James Shoal, an entirely submerged feature only 50 nautical miles from Malaysia and some 1,000 nautical miles from China's coast, Pompeo said. In the South China Sea, the US seeks to preserve peace and stability, uphold the freedom of the seas in a manner consistent with international law, maintain the unimpeded flow of commerce and oppose any attempt to use coercion or force to set-

According to the unidentified official, the bases were in Helmand, Uruzgan, Paktika and Laghman provinces, reports TOLO News.

Indian newspapers published in 1966 recovered from French glacier

London, Jul 14: Indian newspaper copies with headlines such as "India's First Woman Prime Minister", referring to Indira Gandhi's election win in 1966, have been recovered from the melting French glacier of Bossons on the Mont Blanc mountain range in western Europe, 54 years after an Air India plane crashed there.

The newspapers belong to the residue of an Air India plane that crashed into Europe's highest mountain January 24, 1966, and were discovered by Timothée Mottin, who runs the cafe-restaurant La Cabane du Cerro at an altitude of 1,350 metres above the French resort of Chamonix. "It's not unusual. Every time



we walk on the glacier with friends, we find remains of the crash. With experience, you know where they are. They are being carried along by the glacier according to their size," he said. The Air India Boeing 707 had crashed into the range after a verbal flight control miscommunication, leading to the loss of all 177 passengers and crew. Copies of the "National Herald"

and "Economic Times" are among a dozen newspapers discovered by Mottin, whose cafe is about 45 minutes by foot from the Bossons glacier, where the plane named after the Himalayan peak of Kangchenjunga mysteriously crashed over 54 years ago.

Mottin said he was lucky to discover the papers when he did because the ice in which they had been encased for nearly six decades had probably only just melted. Once the papers have dried out, they will join a growing collection of items from the crash that Mottin has put on display at his cafe to share it with visitors. Since 2012, there have been a number of finds relating to the 1966 Air India crash emerging from the melting ice caps.


Alcohol-based hand sanitisers to attract **18% GST: AAR**

New Delhi, July 14: The Authority for Advance Ruling (AAR) has said that a GST of 18% will be levied on all alcohol-based hand sanitisers

UK to purge Huawei from 5G by 2027

London, July 14: Prime Minister Boris Johnson ordered Huawei equipment to be purged completely from Britain's 5G network by 2027, risking the ire of China by signalling that the world's biggest telecoms equipment maker is no longer welcome in the West.

The seven-year lag will please British telecoms operators such as BT, Vodafone and Three, who had feared they would be forced to spend billions of pounds to rip out Huawei equipment much faster. From the end of the year, it will

be illegal for operators to buy any 5G equipment from Huawei, Britain's Digital, Culture, Media and Sport Secretary Oliver Dowden told parliament.

He said the decision would mean a delay to the roll-out of 5G by two to three years, and add costs of up to 2 billion pounds (\$2.5 billion).

The United States had long pushed Johnson to reverse a decision he made in January to grant Huawei a limited role in 5G. London has also been dismayed by a crackdown in Hong Kong and the perception China did not tell the whole truth over the coronavirus.

Dowden said the cyber arm of Britain's GCHQ eavesdropping agency, the National Cyber Security Centre, had told ministers it could no longer guarantee the stable supply of Huawei gear after the United States imposed new sanctions on chip technology.



REAL ON CLOUD NINE

Los Blancos script ninth straight win post pandemic break beating Granada 2-1 as they are on brink of Spanish league title

Madrid, July 14: After their ninth successive win following the coronavirus pandemic break, Real Madrid are on the verge of reclaiming the Spanish league title. Real defeated Granada 2-1 Monday to move within two points of winning the trophy.

Ferland Mendy and Karim Benzema scored first-half goals to keep Real four points ahead of second-placed Barcelona with two rounds to go.

Real can clinch their first title since 2017 Thursday with a win at Villarreal, or if Barcelona lose points when they host Osasuna. Two draws in the final two rounds will also be enough to secure Madrid a record 34th league trophy.

"We are a step closer but we can't relax, we haven't won anything vet," Real captain Sergio Ramos said. "There are still points to be won. We depend on ourselves and we have a game at home coming up, hopefully we can win it and celebrate the league title.'

Real was in control early in Granada and Mendy's first goal since joining the Spanish club this season came from a beautiful angled shot into the top corner after getting past a defender inside the area in the 10th minute.

Benzema added to the lead six minutes later by scoring his 19th league goal with a right-footed strike into the far corner.

Granada, which was 10th in the standings, got on the board with a goal by Darwin Machis in the 50th and pressured to the end.

The hosts came closest to the equalizer with about five minutes left, when Real goalkeeper Thibaut Courtois had to make a difficult save and Ramos cleared a shot at the

goal line. Real had not conceded a goal in its last five league matches. Sevilla secured the final Champions League spot after Villarreal lost to Real Sociedad 1-2. The defeat left Villarreal nine points behind fourth-placed Sevilla with two rounds to go. Sevilla beat Mallorca 2-0 Sunday for their fourth straight win.

Real Madrid, Barcelona and Atletico Madrid have the other berths in the Champions League. Sevilla last featured in the Champions League in 2018 when they were eliminated by Bayern Munich in the quarterfinals. They played in the Europa League in 2018-19 and this season, where they will face Roma in the round of 16. Villarreal needed a win to keep

alive their hopes of making it to the Champions League. It has won six of their nine matches following the pandemic break, but the home setback against Sociedad ended their chances of qualifying. It remains in good position to grab a Europa League spot, though, as it kept fifth place.

Sociedad also stayed in contention for the Europa League with its third win since the break, moving to seventh place. Willian Jose scored in the 61st minute and Diego Llorente in the 75th, while the hosts pulled closer through Santi Cazorla in the 85th.

Getafe stayed in sixth place after drawing at relegation-threatened Alaves 0-0. A late goal disallowed by video review kept Getafe from earning its second win since the league resumed after the pandemic stoppage

Alaves has also won only once since the break and is winless in seven straight league matches. It is four points above the relegation

Leicester City are fourth, ahead of United on goal difference, with Chelsea third on 60 points. City and title winners Liverpool have already secured Champions League places for next season.

"Victories are important to raise morale and create a sense of certainty, especially for the players," Inter coach Antonio Conte said.



Dubai, July 14: Jason Holder Tuesday attained the highest rating points by any West Indies bowler in 20 years, reaching a career-best second place in the ICC Test Player Rankings after leading his team to a famous win over England at Southampton.

Holder, who picked seven wickets including a haul of 6/42 in the first innings, is now on a career-best 862 rating points, the best for any West Indies bowler since Courtney Walsh's tally of 866 in August 2000. Indian cricketers, who have not

taken the field since March due to the COVID-19 pandemic, have retained their positions in the top 10 of batsmen and bowlers rankings. Skipper Virat Kohli remains second in the batsmen standings behind

Steve Smith while Cheteshwar Pujara and Ajinkya Rahane remain seventh and ninth respectively. Jasprit Bumrah is the only Indian bowler in the top-10 at seventh spot.

World No.2 among all-rounders, Ben Stokes has also made huge gains to attain a career-best tally of 431 points, narrowing the lead from 66 to 54 points. Stokes has equalled his career-high ninth position among batsmen that he achieved last November.

Other England players to move up the rankings include left-handed opener Rory Burns, who is in the top 30 for the first time, while middle-order batsman Zak Crawley is in the top 100.

Christchurch, July 14: Star allrounder Ben Stokes had sneaked off for a 'cigarette break' in order to calm his nerves ahead of the Super Over during last year's epic World Cup final, an anecdote which finds mention in a new book on England's

triumph. A year ago, England had claimed their maiden 50 over World Cup title after beating New Zealand by virtue of a contentious boundary count-back rule as scores were tied even after the Super Over. It was ar-

guably one of the greatest finals in the Cup history. On the first anniversary of that historic triumph, excerpts from a book called 'Morgan's Men: The Inside Story of England's Rise from Cricket World Cup Humiliation to Glory' has revealed the pressure that Stokes felt on that day at Lord's.

"Finding a quiet spot as the frenzy of the Super Over approached was hard in a ground packed out with 27,000 supporters and television cameras following the players from the middle, through the Long Room and up the stairs to the dressing room," authors Nick Hoult and Steve James wrote and the excerpt has been published by stuff.co.nz.

"But Ben Stokes had played at Lord's many times. He knows every



nook and cranny. As Eoin Morgan tries to bring calm to the England dressing room and sort out their tactics, Stokes nips off for a moment of peace.

"He is covered in dirt and sweat. He has batted for two hours and 27 minutes of unbelievable tension. What does Stokes do? He goes to the back of the England dressing room, past the attendant's little office and into the showers. There $he \, lights \, up \, a \, cigarette \, and \, has \, few$ minutes on his own.'

The 29-year-old Stokes was adjudged the Man of the Match for his unbeaten 84, plus eight runs in the Super Over, which helped England claim that momentous victory.
