Petrol prices flare up

New Delhi: Petrol prices have risen again in the country improving its gap with diesel as global oil market flipped turning the cycle of price rise in favour of gasoline. In the national capital, petrol prices rose for third consecutive day Tuesday by 17 paisa to ₹80.90 a litre. Pumn prices of petrol rose by 14 paisa a litre on Sunday breaking a 47-day pause since June 29. This was even as diesel prices, which maintained a regular increase since late June, was now holding on to the retail price line for the last two weeks. Sources in oil marketing companies said that international petrol prices were on a boil now resulting in revision on its prices while diesel remained steady.

2,062 road fatalities in state from Jan to June

Bhubaneswar, August 18: Over 2,000 people perished in road accidents across the state between January and June of 2020 registering a 31 per cent decline in the rate of fatalities.

According to data from the transport department, road mishaps claimed 2,062 lives in the state between January and June of 2020 while 3,013 deaths had been recorded during the same period last year. Similarly, the number of road accidents sharply dropped in the state from 5,802 last year to 4,404 during the same period this year.

However, the state witnessed 1,523 road mishaps and 709 deaths between April and June even though lockdown was enforced during this period to contain Covid 19 pandemic

As many as 2,881 road accidents and 1,353 deaths occurred in the state during the first three months of this year while 3,058 road mishaps and 1,580 deaths had been recorded during the same period last year, the data shows.

The fatality rate in the state is very high compared to the national average. In 2019, 11,064 accidents had occurred which had claimed 5,333 persons and left 11,177 persons injured. At least 5.315 people died in road accidents in the state in 2018.

Over last 10 years, more than 43,000 people were killed in the state. Most of the victims are young but economically active. The Supreme Court Committee on Road Safety, which is closely monitoring the situation, expressed displeasure over the state government's failure to control the rising fatalities.

Various districts have been asked to reduce the fatality rate by 10 per cent, 15 per cent and 18 per cent during this year, officials said.

Meanwhile, State Transport Commissioner Sanjeeb Panda has fixed e-challan targets for detection of road safety related MV offences for all regional transport officers (RTOs).

"While enforcing the motor vehicle laws the major focus should be given to Road Safety i.e. to prevent accidents and reduce fatalities. The statistics shows that more than 90 per cent of the accidents are occurring due to the fault of drivers. Therefore enforcement plays a crucial role in reducing road accidents and fatalities thereof," Panda wrote to all RTOs.

The RTOs were asked to ensure that 100 per cent of DLs of offending drivers are suspended for the offences as per the direction of the SC Committee.

The state has finalised a strategy for highway patrol, use of technology for licensing and removal of black spots to control road mishaps.

No summons to CEOs in 1st case of GST evasion

New Delhi, August 18: The Directorate General of GST Intelligence (DGGI) has issued guidelines, which seek to soften the impact of investigations and ensure that no excesses are committed that include minimal personal summons, no repeated summons and generally not issuing summons to CEOs and CFOs of large companies in the first instance for GST evasion.

In a circular issued last week, the Directorate said, "As an enforcement agency, it is imperative for the DGGI to maintain a balance wherein investigations should proceed strictly, as per law, while simultaneously ensuring that no excesses are meted out to the taxpayers and their sensibilities are respected.



The officers have been asked to ensure that a summon for personal appearance is issued only when specifically required. This would imply that the personal presence of an individual is min-

In addition, summons should not be issued repeatedly and as far as practicable, a comprehensive statement should be recorded in the first instance itself. The implication of this measure is that any harassment is avoided with repeated summons, personal appearances and whatever needs to be recorded

is done at the first instance. The DGGI has also prescribed that summons for calling for information should also not be issued in piecemeal manner and as far as possible all relevant information should be gathered in one go.



Vivo out, Dream‼ wins IPL sponsorship at ₹222 cr

New Delhi, August 18: Fantasy gaming platform Dream11 Tuesday won the IPL title sponsorship rights with a bid of ₹222 crore, replacing Chinese mobile phone company Vivo for a four and a half month deal. Dream11 has been one of the IPL sponsors for a couple of years now.

"Dream11 has won the rights with

a bid of ₹222 crore," IPL chairman Brijesh Patel told media. It is learnt that multinational conglomerate Tata group didn't place a final bid while two education technology companies - BYJUs (201 crore) and Unacademy (170 crore) -- came second and third respectively. Vivo and the BCCI suspended a

₹440 crore per year deal for this season owing to the border standoff between India and China. The IPL starts September 19 in the UAE, moved out of India due to the COVID-19 pandemic this year.

There are certain questions about Chinese company Tencent's investment in Dream11 but one of the BCCI insiders privy to the development said that it is less than 10 per cent. Dream11 is an Indian company founded by Harsh Jain



and Bhavit Sheth.

ing its founders plus all 400 plus employees, are Indian," a BCCI source said. "Their Indian investors are Kalaari Capital and Multiples Equity. Even Dream11's product is available exclusively for use only by Indians. Only a single-digit percentage minority stake is held by

Tencent," the official added. However, as recently as last



month, the BCCI's Anti Corruption Unit (ACU) had sought an inquiry against the company after it was reported that the platform had links to a fake T20 league which was held in a Punjab town but was livestreamed as a game in Sri Lanka.

The ACU investigations showed that kits used by players in the tournament had the Dream11 logo and the event was live streamed on FanCode. Both Dream11 and

FanCode are part of Dream Sports group. While the BCCI managed a title sponsor at a short time but the money coming in is less than what it was getting from Vivo.

...that was always going to be the case. Those who were expecting that Vivo's bid will be matched were unaware about current economic climate. The Tatas may have had filed Expression of Interest but they were never interested in bidding.

"BCCI wanted Tata as their presence adds a lot of credibility," an industry insider said. BCCI insiders feel that Dream11 deal, along with the official sponsorship amount coming from UnAcademy and payment app Cred -- the two companies that have come on board in Central sponsorship pool -- will cover the losses to a considerable degree.

No need for CAG to audit **PM-CARES: SC**



New Delhi, August 18: The Supreme Court said Tuesday that the National Disaster Response Fund and PM-CARES are two entirely different funds with different objectives and purposes. A bench comprising Justices Ashok Bhushan, R Subhash Reddy and M R Shah said this while hearing a petition filed by the Centre for Public Interest Litigation (CPIL).

Senior Advocate Dushvant Dave. appearing for the petitioner, submitted that he is not questioning the bonafides of the constitution of the PM-CARES fund, but his submission was that the NDRF is audited by the CAG but the PM-CARES fund is not.

Rather, he contended, the audit is done by a private chartered accountant. The court replied: "The guidelines issued under the Act of 2005 (Disaster Management Act) with regard to NDRF specifically provides for audit of NDRF by the CAG, whereas for public charitable trust there is no occasion for CAG audit." The bench noted that the contributions made by individuals and institutions in the PM-CARES fund are to be released for public purposes to fulfil the objective of the trust. The PM-CARES fund is a charitable trust registered under the Registration Act, 1908 at New Delhi March 27.

'The PM-CARES fund is a public charitable trust and is not a government fund. The trust does not receive any budgetary support or any government money. It is not open for the petitioner to question the wisdom of the trustees to create PM-CARES fund, which was constituted with an objective to extend assistance in the wake of public health emergency, that is COVID-19 pandemic," the court said.



CURTAINS MAY COME DOWN ON 50% CINEMAS BY YEAREND

Bhubaneswar, August 18: Although the government has allowed shopping malls and gyms to operate in strict compliance with Covid-19 guidelines after several months of lockdowns, cinema halls in the state are yet to get the green signal to resume shows.

The big screens have remained shut since March this year when the first lockdown was imposed. The financial burden on City theatres is getting heavier each passing day as maintenance and equipment costs, salary bills and other expenditure keep piling up, without any income.

Meanwhile, the over-the-top (OTT) platforms releasing new movies has emerged as an additional headache for the cinema halls.

Speaking to **Orissa POST**, Maharaja Cinema Hall owner Biswajit Mohapatra said, "Before Lockdown-1 was announced in March, we had renovated the theatre with new seats and furnished the entire picture palace. We were disinfecting the theatre space everyday as a precautionary measure. However, despite all the precautions, the government has again declared a lockdown for cinema halls.

Frequent lockdowns have hampered the maintenance of film equipment and machines which may go out of order if they remain non-functional, he mentioned. "We are feeling the pinch of maintenance costs as expenditures don't stop though halls are closed," Mohapatra added.

'We had requested the government to stop sending us power bills as there is no business at all. However, we are getting bills of Rs 50,000 every month. We have incurred a loss of around Rs 20-30 lakh as release of films on big

Odisha Film Development Corporation (OFDC) chairman Kuna Tripathy said that there is no decision yet on reopening of cinema halls either by the Centre or by the state government.



SC reserves order on UG, PG final exams

New Delhi, August 18: The Supreme Court, Tuesday, reserved its judgement in a batch of petitions challenging University Grants Commission (UGC) guidelines which mandate universities across the country to conduct final year exams September 30.

A three-judge bench of the apex court comprising Justices Ashok Bhushan, R Subhash Reddy and MR Shah completed the hearing in the case and asked all counsels to submit their written submissions within three days.

Significantly, Odisha has opposed the guidelines issued by UGC making it mandatory to hold the final year examinations of UG and PG courses.

Bhubaneswar, August 18: The flood-like situation witnessed in parts of Odisha showed signs of improvement Tuesday with the intensity of rainfall subsiding, even as 933 villages were affected and 321 houses damaged in the worst-hit Malkangiri district, officials said.

However, a fresh downpour is likely in parts of the state over the next few days as another low-pressure area is all set to form over Bay of Bengal by Wednesday. The state has been battered by heavy rains due to the formation of three-back-toback low-pressure areas this month, they said.

Special Relief Commissioner (SRC) P K Jena said the district Collectors have been asked to remain alert and closely monitor the situation in view of the fresh low-pressure area forecast by the IMD.

A clear picture of the intensity of rainfall and areas where it may occur will emerge after the low-

pressure area forms, he said.

As per preliminary reports, around 933 villages in Malkangiri have been affected by the heavy rains that pounded Odisha since August 13, Revenue and Disaster Management Minister Sudam Marndi said after conducting an aerial survey of the affected areas in the district.

The minister, who along with Jena held a review meeting with senior officials of Malkangiri, said that crops over 1.971 hectares of agricultural land have been affected due to the torrential rainfall, which also damaged 321 houses.

Marndi said Malkangiri Collector has been asked to conduct a thorough survey and submit a report on the extent of the damage within a week. The state government will take steps for payment of compensation to the affected farmers and people within 48 hours of getting the assessment report, he said.

STATE'S COVID-19 TALLY NEARS 65K

Bhubaneswar, August 18: At least 2,239 more people tested positive for COVID-19 in the state, pushing Odisha's tally to 64,533, a senior official of Health and Family Welfare (H&FW) department said Tuesday.

The death toll in the coastal state climbed to 362, with nine more persons succumbing to the infection, said the official.

Of the 2,239 fresh cases, 1,416 were reported from various quarantine centres while the remaining were detected during contact tracing exercise, the official pointed out.

Khurda registered the maximum number of new cases (419), followed by Ganjam (246), Nayagarh (147), Balasore (130), Rayagada (120), Cuttack (117). The remaining cases were recorded in 23 other districts

Nine fatalities were reported from six districts—three in Ganjam, two in Rayagada, and one each in Malkangiri, Sambalpur, Khurda and Balasore districts.

Fifty-three COVID-19 patients have so far died in the state due to co-morbidities. Meanwhile, 1,535 patients recovered.

As many as 50,525 samples were tested for coronavirus in Odisha Monday, taking the total number of such examinations to 10,09,454.

BMC SOP for opening Covid Care Homes

Bhubaneswar, August 18: The Bhubaneswar Corporation (BMC), Tuesday, issued an SOP for setting up of COVID Care Homes (CCH) by Resident Welfare Associations (RWAs) in gated residential complexes and colonies for suspected, mildly symptomatic and asymptomatic patients.

Issuing an order, the BMC stated that communities living in gated complexes should create small CCHs comprising up to 20 beds within their vicinities which should be managed by the RWAs. Such CCHs are aimed to provide psychological comfort to patients who will feel at home and will also reduce burden on existing COVID health facilities

Issuing the SOP for setting up CCHs, the order said that community halls, empty flats, common utility areas or any place within the complex having an isolated location should be preferred for a CCH. The CCH must have separate entry and exit doors and have adequate space to place beds within 6-ft distance.

"Separate partitions should be made for suspected and confirmed cases and shouldn't be allowed to mix under any circumstances. Adequate cross ventilation should be provided with ACs set between 24-30 degrees Celsius. Relative humidity should be around 40-70 per



cent as per CPWD guidelines," the order stated.

Furthermore, the order also advised for providing either a volunteering doctor residing within complex or from nearby hospital along with a caregiver to the CCHs. Along with this, the BMC will appoint a rapid response team (RRT) that will visit the CCH and will rectify and provide anything that a CCH will be missing before being operational.

"The zonal RRT will also be responsible for medically examining the patients and designating them as suspected, asymptomatic, mild or pre-symptomatic case. Patients admitted to CCHs will use triple-layer masks all the time. The RWAs will monitor patients through video cameras to ensure that no patient leave facility premises and visit their household, parks or other common utility areas," the order added.

The RWAs as per the SOP are also directed to put all bio-medical waste such as PPE kits, syringe, gloves, masks and others in a yellow garbage bag which will be disposed as per Biomedical Waste Management guidelines

Bhubaneswar, August 18: Agriculture Minister Arun Kumar Sahoo Tuesday urged the Centre to take steps to meet Odisha's need for urea fertilizer during the ongoing kharif season

In a virtual conference with Union Minister of State for Chemical and Fertilizers, Mansukh Laxmanbhai Mandaviya, Sahoo took up the fertilizer issue and urged the former to send required amount of urea for the month of

Sahoo informed the Union minister that farmers in Odsiha usually require more than 60 per cent of the urea need for the kharif season between July and September.

Farmers in Odisha required more than 70,000 tonne urea in June but the state got only 57,000 tonne from the Centre. Similarly, the state also received less than the required amount of urea in July. At present, Odisha requires around 1.3 lakh tonne urea fertilizer, Sahoo informed the Union Minister.

Sahoo further said that the state government had discussed with Indian Farmers Fertiliser Cooperative Limited (IFFCO) and Rashtriya Chemicals & Fertilizers Limited (RCF) for providing fertilizer. But, the state is yet to get the imported fertiliser from Centre, he

He also urged the Centre to provide urea to Odisha through Indian Potash Limited.

Sahoo claimed that the state government has taken steps for making urea retail sale digital and cashless. More than 1,000 urea fertilizer distribution centres in the state has been made digital, he said.

Land acquisition roadblock to ring road

IT HAS BEEN NINE YEARS SINCE THE PROJECT AT TARABHA IN SUBARNAPUR IS CONTINUING SPORADICALLY

Tarabha, August 18: The longawaited ring road is a major project that can save people from the flood fury in Tarabha town of Subarnapur district. But it has been stuck due to land hurdles, a report said.

Every year floodwater from Nibriti rivulet plays havoc with the town. The Water Resources department has started work of the right road on the right side of the rivulet, but land acquisition has been a bottleneck.

Though the administration and local political leaders had held talks with locals to sort out the issue in the past, there has been no breakthrough

The present and erstwhile Finance minister Niranjan Pujari took the initiative and the work on the ring road project began in 2011. In between, the work was paused for three years because the government stopped

The Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement Act, 2013 (LARR Act) has replaced the 120-year-old colonial statute, the Land Acquisition Act, 1894. The LARR Act was introduced to bring transparency in the process of land acquisition, development of essential infrastructural facilities, urbanisation with the least disturbance to the land owners and provide just and fair compensation to the affected families and make adequate provisions for their rehabilitation and resettlement.

The pandemic is making Dongria Kondhs cry

FROM A HEALTH CRISIS TO AN ECONOMIC DEBACLE, THE DEADLY METAMORPHOSIS OF THE COVID-19 HAS NOT **EVEN SPARED THE REMOTEST TRIBAL POCKETS OF ODISHA**

Bhawanipatna, August 18: The Covid-19 pandemic has significantly impacted all sectors in the country. Its far reaching effect is also felt in the Niyamgiri hill, the home to Dongria Kondh tribal, one of the primitive tribes in the state, a report said.

The pandemic has impacted the primitive tribals to a great extent by snatching away their livelihood. This has pushed them into distress sale. The minor forest produces they sale to earn a living has few takers these days after the outbreak of the

The Dongria Kondhs comprising 2,075 families live on the Niyamgiri hill which is spread over Kalahandi and Rayagada districts. The Kondhs living on the Niyamgiri hill sustain themselves from the resources of the Niyamgiri forests, practising horticulture and shifting cultivation.

The subsequent lockdown announced in the country to contain the spread of the coronavirus has led to an immediate, alarming loss of



income for the tribal communities, raising the spectre of impending hunger.

The Dongria Kondhs - among the 75 particularly vulnerable tribal groups have been struggling to sustain their livelihood after the lockdown abruptly closed their tradi-

tional marketplaces. The Dongria Kondhs are innocent, honest in nature and never have the habit to bow or beg before others to earn a living, said a social activist. "They work hard in collecting minor forest produce and practise shifting cultivations which sustain them and their families all round the years.

The means of earnings of the tribals are varied in nature. They cultivate vegetables, raggi, maize, corn, some indigenous varieties of pulses, ginger, alsi, turmeric, mangoes, pineapples oranges and tamarinds. They also prepare leaf plates,

honey, raisins, medicinal herbs and mushrooms and sell them in the local market to earn a living. However, the coronavirus induced lockdown and subsequent shutdown have broken their backbone by snatching away their livelihood.

This has happened as all the local haats have remained closed due to the lockdown and subsequent shutdown. Moreover, the fear of getting infected by coronavirus has prevented people to buy anything from the tribals.

As a result, the tribals are now forced to sell their produce at a throwaway price to private traders or to the households during the lockdown. The Dongria Kondhs are traditionally dependent on forest resources for survival.

Sale of minor forest produce is a critical source of livelihood, especially during the pre-monsoon dry season of March to June, when chances of availing alternative sources of income are slim.

A dozen of banana which earlier used to be sold at ₹40-50 is now being sold at ₹10. The sale of Karadi which is a flavoured delicacy of the tribals and local residents has also declined. The Dongria women who earlier used to sell a bundle of Karadi for ₹10 are now selling three bundles for ₹10. Observers and intellectuals have demanded the state government to intervene and make alternative arrangements for the livelihood of the tribals.

Bolangir, August 18: Bolangir district has scripted a record in providing 100-days work to migrant returnees under Mahatma Gandhi National Rural **Employment Guarantee Act** (MGNREGA), a report said.

According to the details available from the district administration, the district has stood first among the 30 districts in providing 100-days work to maximum 3,898 families by Tuesday. Ganjam district comes sec-

ond in providing work under the Act to 3,815 families while Sundargarh is placed at third position for providing work to 3,521 families. Nabarangpur district is placed

Jagatsinghpur district, 23 in Bhadrak district, 41 in Puri district, 79 in Kendrapara district have been able to get 100 days work.

The rural job scheme since its implementation was predicted that it will be of much help in providing work to people in Bolangir district which is known for its rampant migration to other states.

The scheme raised hopes after lakhs of migrants returned to the district post the coronavirus induced lockdown and subsequent shutdown.

The situation caused concern for the district administration after lakhs of migrants returned to the district post the Covid-19

The district administration led by Collector Arindam Dakua and PD, DRDA Maheswar Swain spearheaded the rural job scheme to provide work to migrant returnees.

As a result, over 1 lakh migrants were provided work on a single day in the month of June which has become an alltime record. Currently, the district administration has been able to provide 100 days work to 3,898 families. Currently, the district has 3,087,519 active

However, the Act will not be sufficient to provide work to all the returnees in coming days for which the district administration has to devise new schemes to provide work to all the needy people, observers said.

Despicable Face

acebook Inc. has been in news recently. Not just in India but globally. \dashv Recent history has shown the company in a very poor light in its own motherland, the United States of America. With the November 2020 Presidential election campaign picking up, this social media platform has been facing intense flak due to its lenient attitude towards hate mongering and violence propagating users supporting incumbent President Donald Trump. While many other SocMed platforms, including Twitter, have either blocked such handles or are flagging them to caution other users about possibilities of fake news being spread by them, Facebook remained steadfast in its opinion that it will not interfere with the freedom of millions of its users.

However, very recent reports suggest the company might be buckling to intense pressure from social activists backed by major US corporates who have withdrawn their advertisement support to Facebook, protesting against its hideous policy of tolerating racism, hate and violence.

In India, the story of Facebook is unraveling in quite a similar pattern. Facebook boasts of nearly 300 plus million users from India alone. In a recent report, the Wall Street Journal (WSJ) has highlighted the use of the platform to spread hate, divisiveness and violence against minorities and

political opponents by the ruling BJP. The WSJ report claims many employees of Facebook in India allege favoritism is being shown to the ruling party. They have cited the instance of hate postings by a BJP MLA, T Raja Singh, who had said Rohingya Moslems should be shot, called Moslems traitors and threatened to raze mosques. It is said Facebook watches such users for some time and if the employees charged with policing the platform were satisfied that such



postings and the real world activities of the concerned users were converging, then they could ban those users permanently. The biggest threats were designated as Dangerous. Singh and few other right wing users in India had already qualified for that label by the company's internal system of checking. However, no action was being taken by Facebook since long.

The Policy Head of Facebook in India, Ankhi Das, has been reported as saying that 'any such action of punishing violations by politicians from Modi's party would damage the company's business prospects in the country.' While Das' concern, as a devoted employee, for the well being of her company is understandable yet the social damage being inflicted on India is not. Unlike the US and some other countries India, unfortunately, does not possess a corporate culture that would stand up for social harmony. Business in India has always aimed at robbing and plundering the nation. Never has it been known to involve itself in positive action to help create a stable, peaceful and progressive society. Therefore big Indian commercial advertisers have kept a distance from the present bickering concerning Facebook and its behavior. This helps people like Ankhi Das to feel they are insulated.

Facebook Inc., no doubt, has an uphill task of monitoring such voluminous postings and is expected to adopt disciplinary actions. A truly tough job when the user base runs into millions.

These are some of the dark sides of modern technological advancements. On one side, the world might be shrinking as communications become faster but on the other side the evil plans of people out to destroy civilized life cannot be wished away. We have to learn to live with these elements in the future. For instance, religious bigotry and intolerance have been integral parts of human nature for centuries. Whether it is good or bad can only be decided by people who are on this or that side. There surely is no direct method to judge. The judgement becomes relevant only when such personal beliefs of one individual (or a group) infringes on the life and independence of other individual(s). Facebook, being one of the biggest SocMed platforms, has to ensure that it does not get used by any element that means harm to others. Unwillingness to do so is criminal.



t's almost as ancient as the verb to tell. It comes from a Germanic source that mainly meant to relate something, but it also had the sense of counting or reckoning (the modern German verb zählen, to count, comes from the same root, as do words in other Germanic languages). It suggests that the original sense may have been something like "put in order". The sense of counting attached to the verb is recorded from about the year 1000 and remained in the language until the nineteenth century at least. The rustic poet John Clare had a line in his poem The Village Minstrel of 1821: "The shepherd had told all his sheep," meaning not that he had announced some item of news to his flock, but that he had counted them. (Don't confuse this with "They went and told the sexton, and / The sexton tolled the bell," from Faithless Sally Brown by that arch-punner Thomas Hood.) We still have a strong echo of that when we use tell to mean decide or determine something correctly or with certainty: "you can tell they're in love;" "I can't tell who has won." The sense of teller for a person who counts money dates from 1480 at the latest. At the time in Britain there were officials called tellers, in particular four officers of the Exchequer who were responsible for the receipt and payment of money. The same word also turns up a little later in reference to a person who counts the votes at an election. Those who do that job in various places to this day are still called tellers. In 1669 the poet Andrew Marvell wrote in a letter that "The tellers for the ayes chanced to be very ill reckoners, so that they were forced to tell several times over."

With more than one billion children out of school because of socialdistancing and lockdown measures, the crisis threatens to leave behind a 'Covid generation' whose future prospects have been irreparably damaged. According to a recent study, Pakistani children who were displaced from school for just three months in 2005 by an earthquake showed signs of having lost 1.5 years of education four

Worse, the crisis is deepening pre-existing inequalities. Unlike the more fortunate children who have been able to continue their educations online and in alternative venues, the world's poorest have been locked out entirely from learning, as well as from free school meals. Without this critical source of nutrition, 300 million boys and girls are facing the threat of hunger.

Another immediate concern is the estimated 30 million children who may never return to school at all. These are among the world's least-advantaged children, for whom education is often the only route out of poverty. For adolescent girls in this cohort, school is the best defense against forced marriage; and for many poor children, it is the last protection against exploitative and dangerous labour.

Because education is a critical factor in almost every area of human development - from child survival and maternal health to gender equity, job creation, and inclusive economic growth - today's crisis has implications for the fate of the entire 2030 Sustainable Development Agenda. According to the World Bank's latest estimate, the educational losses now being inflicted on the Covid Generation could result in lifetime foregone earnings totaling

Those who are in a position to prevent millions of young people from losing a fair chance in life must not stand idly by. This is the time to redouble global efforts to ensure that all children receive quality primary education.

Even before the pandemic, there were 260 million children out of

school, including many of the 13 million child refugees and 40 million internally displaced children. Moreover, half of all children in developing countries suffer from 'learning poverty,' demonstrating little to no basic literacy or numeracy even at age 11. Around 800 million young people have left school with no labour-market qualifications whatsoever.

To have any chance of reversing these bleak trends, the millions of children who have already lost half a year of education will need to be afforded assistance so that they can catch up. Resources are urgently needed to resume young people's education and 'build back better' with investments in online and personalised learning, more trained teachers, conditional cash transfers for poor families, safer schools, and other outlays.

To push for more funding in these areas, a coalition of global organisations recently came together to launch the Save our Future initiative. The effort is a response to the fact that while extra resources are needed now more than ever, education funding is facing a triple whammy.

First, the pandemic-induced recession will result in less revenue to fund public services, not least education. Second, as governments determine how to allocate scarce funds, they inevitably will focus spending on public health and economic recovery, once again neglecting education. And, third, the intensifying fiscal pressure on developing-country governments will perversely lead to a reduction in international development aid for education, which has already been losing out to other priorities in the allocation of bilateral and multilateral aid.

In fact, the same multilateral donors who already underinvest in education may now reallocate even more funds away from schooling. Hence, the World Bank estimates that over the next year, overall education spending in low and middle income countries could fall by \$100-150 billion below what was planned.

This funding crisis will not resolve itself. It is thus imperative that the G20, the International Monetary Fund, the World Bank, regional development banks, and all countries recognise the scale of the crisis and intervene to help displaced children catch up.

First, every country should pledge to protect education spending and emphasise the needs of the most disadvantaged children wherever possible, including through conditional and unconditional cash transfers to promote school attendance.

Second, the international community must increase aid for education, particularly for the most vulnerable, including the poor,

girls, children in conflict zones and the disabled. The fastest way to free up resources for education is through debt relief. With the world's 76 poorest countries on track to incur \$86 billion in debtservicing costs over the next two years, debt suspension is urgent so that this money can be reallocated to education and other highpriority investments for children

Third, the IMF should issue \$1.2 trillion in Special Drawing Rights (its global reserve asset), and its members should agree to channel these resources toward the countries that need them most For its part, the World Bank should unlock more support for low-income countries through a supplementary International Development Association budget And all advanced economies should follow the lead of Britain and the Netherlands, which together have pledged \$600 million to the new International Finance Facility for Education, which will leverage such donations to extend grants and guarantees on a much larger scale.

All of these new sources of funding should be in addition to the funds for replenishing the Global Partnership for Education and Education Cannot Wait over the next two years. And, obviously all governments must continue to support UNESCO, UNICEF, and other United Nations agencies working to provide all children with an education.

The challenges posed by Covid-19 are momentous, to be sure. But they also represent an occasion to redouble our efforts to achieve the fourth Sustainable Development Goal: quality education for all. The children of the Covid Generation deserve nothing less than the chance to reach their full potential.

y fourteen-year-old son, Rahul, is 5-foot-8 (172 cm) and still growing. I can't help wondering how tall he will be in a few years. I'm 6-foot-2 (187 cm) and my wife is 5-foot-2. So, Rahul is right in the middle and about to find out which side of the family he has inherited his 'height genes' from.

That's why I'm always disappointed when I visit a Puniabi restaurant with a buffet. I never have enough room in my stomach to taste every dish more than five times. According to Wikipedia, the average height of an Indian man is 5-foot-5. But if you don't include Satnam Singh, the average drops to 5-foot-4. Well, perhaps Satnam alone doesn't make such a difference, but the entire population of Punjab certainly does. Indeed, the average height of a man in Patiala, Punjab, is 5-foot-10. That's why I won't be surprised if Punjabi cuisine is one day considered the official food of the NBA.

Violence-hit Visva Bharati seeks PM's intervention

Bolpur (WB), August 18: Visva Bharati authorities have decided to seek Prime Minister Narendra Modi's intervention for deployment of central security forces on its premises, a day after vandalism forced its closure, a top official of the prestigious institution said Tuesday.

The heritage university founded by Nobel laureate Rabindranath Tagore was shut down indefinitely Monday following violent protests against Visva Bharati's decision to construct a boundary wall around the venue of Poush Mela, a prestigious annual cultural event started more than a century ago.

"The executive council (of the university) has unanimously decided to write to the honourable chancellor (the prime minister) for deployment of any of the central security forces to deal with security issues on the campus," one of its members told PTI. According to Shyam Singh, the Birbhum district superintendent of police, nine persons have been arrested for campus violence.

Palpable tension prevailed at the institute with barely any movement seen Tuesday morning.

According to district officials, tension had been brewing in the area over the past few days as local traders were miffed at the university's decision to cancel this year's Poush Mela, a year-end annual fair that draws lakhs of visitors from across the world. Trouble erupted Monday after the fencing work began on the fair ground, with thousands of protesters vandalising construction equipment and tearing down the main gate.

The Trinamool Congress gov-

but threw its weight behind the protesters. Chief Minister Mamata Baneriee said she was against any construction at the site and asked the district administration to convene a meeting of the stakeholders.

The university authorities, however, said a fence around the fair venue was required to honour an order of the National Green Tribunal, which had November 1, 2017, said that a "barrier needs to be constructed to demarcate the Mela ground from the university and the locality." "Given the vandalism today leading to the destruction of university property worth several lakhs (of rupees) due to the complete absence of police deployment in spite of having two police stations within the university campus, it is decided to bring this to the notice of the Hon'ble Chancellor," a Visva Bharati statement had said Monday.

It said the university will remain closed till the situation improved.

Meanwhile, TMC's Dubrajpur MLA Naresh Bauri, who was present at the site during the violence, said he had gone there as a former student of the institute and not a party leader.

Act against those spreading hatred on Facebook: Sena

Mumbai. August 18: The Shiv Sena Tuesday sought action 'irrespective of party affiliations' against those who spread hatred and talk of disintegrating the country on social media platforms like Facebook.

Companies like Facebook can't ignore someone spreading hatred because the person belongs to the ruling party, the Sena said and asked the social media platform to observe rules and ethics of business.

The party's comments come a day after Congress leader Rahul Gandhi accused the BJP and RSS of spreading fake news using Facebook and WhatsApp to influence the elec-

Gandhi's claim followed a Wall Street Journal report that said Facebook ignored applying its hate speech rules to politicians of the ruling party in India.

There is no objection to debates on a medium like Facebook. But action should be taken irrespective of party affiliation if hatred is spread and language of disintegrating the country and communities is used," the Sena said in an editorial of its mouthpiece

"Companies like Facebook cannot ignore the person spreading hatred just because he/she belongs to the ruling party," it said.

The Sena said India's population forms a big market for Facebook. Politics is being played the most on social media platforms like Facebook and WhatsApp, it said. The world has come closer, but these platforms have also caused a divide between communities, the party said.

The Sena said it has now become a 'paid profession' to defame others on social media and nobody has been spared.

"You (Facebook) have come to our country to do business and will have to observe minimum ethics rules of business," it said.

Philippines to follow 'Dharavi model'

Mumbai, August 18: The BrihanMumbai Municipal Corporation's 'Chase the Virus' strategy in Dharavi -- Asia's biggest slum -- has found a new fan in the Philippines government as the Southeast Asia nation also grapples with the pandemic, a top official said here Tuesday.

"The Philippines government will follow and implement the Dharavi Model for containing Covid in densely populated slums," an elated BMC Municipal Commissioner IS Chahal told IANS.

The BMC has already shared details of the 'Chase the Virus' policy with the Philippines' Department of Health (DOH). A news portal, Inquirer.net

Tuesday, has quoted the Philippines DOH which declared that it would follow the Dharavi-Mumbai campaign conceptualised by BMC's Assistant Municipal Commissioner Kiran Dighavkar which earned all round praise.

The Philippines, with a population of around 10.1 crore crammed in an area of nearly 2.98 lakh sq.km, with 3.07 lakh sq. km area and a pop-

Chahal said that as a result of its strategy, there are only 17,704 'active cases' in Mumbai, of which around 5,338 symptomatic patients are currently in hospitals.

The city - which last week came down to the second worst-hit city (after Pune district moved to the top slot) in terms of Covid cases - is witsucceeded in achieving what was nessing an average of less than 1.000 new cases daily, the recovery rate

is 80 per cent, doubling rate of cases is 86 days, and infection rate is 0.8 per cent - among the lowest anywhere.

The situation has eased to the extent that since late June, the BMC started moving out of Dharavi, and later shut down several small or medium quarantine facilities in the city. Patients are now being referred to the jumbo facilities at NSCI, Mahalaxmi Race Court, Bandra Kurla Complex and in Dahisar and Mulund to ensure cen-

Amid apprehensions of patients unable to get beds, the current bed strength is 16,075 for complicated or serious cases, 23,437 for mild and asymptomatic patients besides 10,525 oxygen beds, 1,844 ICU beds and 1,096 ventilator beds.

Of these, nearly 14,548 are vacant, but ready for operationalisation whenever required, besides 330 vacant in ICUs, giving a very comfortable position, said Chahal.

But this year's celebrations are expected to be muted, with authorities in the virus-plagued city urging people to mark the 10-day festival at home in a bid to ensure social distancing.

"As our pottery sales dwindled, I decided to make Ganesha statues... as a means of survival and also to promote environmentally friendly (alternatives)," 40-year-old Galwani

His clay creations are designed to disintegrate quickly and turn into soil. They also contain a seed inside which can germinate if watered like a plant.

Sold for Rs 1,500 each, Galwani has received orders for 800 statues so far and hopes to see his neighbourhood bounce back economically after tackling the virus.

Made famous by the 2008 Oscarwinner 'Slumdog Millionaire', Dharavi was thrown back into the spotlight in April over fears that the lack of social distancing or sanitation in its densely packed streets would make it an easy target for the

But a sharp focus on testing accompanied by tough quarantine and lockdown measures have seen infections plunge across the slum. "Previously I lost business as

customers were wary of stepping into the slums," Galwani said. "Now, things have changed and they're willing to even come and pick

up their own orders." A third-generation potter, he said he saw no conflict in practising his faith while catering to the needs of Hindu worshippers

"What's the big deal if I am a Muslim making statues of Hindu deities like Ganesha? India is a secular democracy and we have grown up with many cultures living together," Galwani added.

Kolkata, August 18: Migrant workers recovering from coronavirus have been inducted by the West Bengal government as members of "Covid-19 warriors club" to provide a healing touch to people undergoing treatment for infection in different hospitals in the metropolis, a senior government official said Tuesday.

Forty-nine migrant workers cured of the deadly disease have been enrolled in the club to assist patients admitted to hospitals for virus.

They hail from Birbhum, Coochbehar, Purba and Paschim Medinipur besides Murshidabad, he said.

They are given a monthly honorarioum of Rs 15,000, he said.

"The primary job of these COVID-19 warriors is to keep up the morale of the patients currently undergoing treatment in the coronavirus wards in hospitals by sharing with them their own stories of recovery. These men also provide updates to the relatives of those being

treated," he said. Before pressing them into service, the cured migrant labourers were imparted training for at least seven days about safety measures while assisting a patient at the COVID-19 wards, the official said.

"They are basically providing non-medical services mainly through counselling. They also play a role in raising awareness about the contagion among the patients, their relatives and others," the official said.

What is Bengal's Covid patient mgmt system

Kolkata, August 18: The West Bengal government Monday launched a COVID Patient Management System to deal with admission and treatment-related issues at the hospitals.

Addressing a press conference, Chief Secretary Rajiva Sinha said the system has been started with three COVID hospitals in Kolkata, and in another week 84 hospitals in the state will be brought under its

The system will help people get an update about the facilities available in a particular hospital, facilitate admissions, and ensure that a patient does not have to move around for bed in case of an emergency, he said.

Oxygen support will be available in all the 11,775 beds now, he said

West Bengal's COVID-19 discharge rate crossed the 75-per cent mark Monday with the state reporting more recoveries, even as record 3,080 new cases were detected, as per an official bulletin.

The state's COVID-19 tally rose to 1,19,578 with reporting of the fresh cases. The toll increased to 2,473 as 45 more people died, the bulletin issued by the Health Department said.

Man poisons wife. kids, kills self

Jaipur: A man allegedly poisoned his wife and two children before killing himself in Karauli district of Rajasthan but the bodies were discovered at least four days later, police said Tuesday. However, no suicide note has been found. The incident appears to have taken place last week and came to light after neighbours informed police about a foul smell emanating from their home Monday evening, they said.

60-year-old woman raped in UP

Gorakhpur: An elderly woman was allegedly gangraped in Uttar Pradesh's Siddharthnagar district, police said Tuesday. The 60year-old woman belonging to the Shohratgarh area of the district was found injured and unconscious on the outskirts of a village Saturdav. thev said. Tw people have been arrested on the rape charge. Police said they were informed about the incident by some villagers after which the woman was rushed to a community health centre of the area.

Doctor held for 'links' with ISIS

New Delhi: The NIA has arrested an ophthalmologist from a medical college in Bangalore for allegedly being in touch with ISIS operatives, working to develop medical and weaponry-related applications to help terrorist cadres and furthering its activities in the country, officials said Tuesday. Abdur Rahman, 28, working at MS Ramaiah Medical College. was taken into custody Monday in connection with the Islamic State Khorasan Province (ISKP) case being probed by the agency, they said. The ISKP case was initially registered by the Delhi Police Special Cell in March, 2020.

Tuskers trample youth in J'khand

Ramgarh: A 25-year-old man from Ramgarh district who was trampled by tuskers two days ago, died at Raiendra Institute of Medical Sciences (RIMS) in Ranchi Monday, an official said. Ramesh Murmu was trampled by a herd of elephants August 15, Divisional Forest Officer (DFO), Ramgarh, Vijay Shankar Dubey said. He was taken to RIMS in Ranchi for better treatment but he succumbed to injuries on Monday, he said, adding the dependents of deceased would get ₹4 lakh ex gratia from the government.

UGC says final year exams cannot be cancelled, SC reserves verdict

New Delhi, August 18: The UGC told the Supreme Court Tuesday that its July 6 directive, asking universities and colleges to conduct final year exams by September 30 amid the COVID-19 pandemic, is "not a diktat" but states cannot take decision to confer degrees without holding the examinations.

Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for the University Grants Commission (UGC), told a bench headed by Justice Ashok Bhushan that the directive is for the "benefit of students" as the universities have to start admissions to postgraduate courses and state authorities cannot override the UGC's guideline.

The bench, also comprising Justices RS Reddy and MR Shah, observed that the issue is if the state disaster management authority has decided that situation is not conducive for holding exams, can they overrule the UGC.

The bench, which reserved its verdict on a batch of petitions questioning the validity of the UGC's July 6 directive, said that another issue is whether the commission can override state authorities and ask the universities to hold examinations on given dates.

During the hearing conducted through video-conferencing, Mehta told the bench that states might seek extension of the deadline but they cannot take the decision to confer degrees without holding the exams.

"The deadline was given for benefit of the students. It is not a diktat," Mehta told the bench, adding that "all universities have to start admissions of postgraduate courses. The country is working

It observed that another issue was whether the state can take decision under the Disaster Management Act and say that they would not hold examinations and declare results based on past performances of a student.

Advocate Alakh Alok Srivastava, appearing for some of the petitioners, told the bench that UGC's July 6 guideline makes it mandatory for the universities to hold exams by September 30 and the decision was taken without proper

The counsel appearing for one of the states argued that not holding final year exam does not lead to dilution of standards and even premier institutes like the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) has said that they would give degree without holding exams.

One of the lawyers raised the issue of problems faced by students during the recent online exams conducted by the Delhi University.

The apex court was earlier told by one of the petitioners that nobody is against the university examinations in "normal times" and the students are challenging the UGC's decision because of the pandemic.

The UGC had said that final examination is a "crucial step" in the academic career of a student and the state government cannot say that its July 6 directive was "not binding".

Assailing the decisions of some states like Maharashtra and Delhi of cancelling the final year exams, the UGC had said such decisions directly affect the standards of higher education and will be an encroachment on the legislative field of coordinating and determining the standards of higher education.

Amit Shah admitted to AIIMS again for 'post-COVID care'

New Delhi, August 18: Home Minister Amit Shah, who tested negative for COVID-19 last week. has been admitted to AIIMS in Delhi, the government hospital said in a statement. The Home Minister has been "complaining of fatigue and body ache for last three-four days", the hospital said.

"Amit Shah has been complaining of fatigue and body aches for last three-four days. He has tested negative for COVID-19. He has been admitted to AIIMS for COVID care. He is comfortable and is continuing his work from hospital," AIIMS media and protocol division chairperson Dr Aarti Vij said in the statement.



Shah, 55, was discharged from the private hospital Medanta in Gurgaon last week after testing negative for COVID-19. He had tweeted August 14 he would be in home isolation for a few more days on the advice of his doctors. A day later he was seen taking part in Independence Day celebrations and hoisting the national flag at his official residence.

The Home Minister had taken part in a cabinet meet three weeks ago, just before he was tested positive for the highly infectious COVID-19. The meeting was attended by all top ministers, including Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman.

Bhopal, August 18: Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan Tuesday said necessary legal provisions will be made to ensure that only local people get jobs in the state government.

He also said resources of the state are meant for residents of

"The state (BJP) government has taken an important decision today that government jobs will be given only to youths of Madhya Pradesh. We are making necessary legal provisions for this purpose. Resources of Madhya Pradesh are meant for children of the state,' Chouhan said in a video statement.

He, however, did not elaborate on the proposed legal provisions.

Later in a tweet addressed to youths, the CM said, "From today, the children of Madhya Pradesh will have the first right over the resources of Madhya Pradesh. All government jobs will be reserved only for the children of Madhya Pradesh. Our aim is to involve the local talents in the uplift of the state".

An official statement quoted Chouhan as saying that students of the state will be taken in government services and "necessary statutory provisions will be made to ensure this"

In his Independence Day speech, Chouhan had announced that preference would be given to local people in government jobs. He had also said his government will devise a mechanism to ensure employment to youths on the basis of their marksheets of Classes 10 and 12.

The then Kamal Nath-led



Congress government had also announced to reserve 70 per cent of jobs in industrial units for locals.

Reacting to the announcement made by the CM, Nath, who heads the state Congress unit, said, "Students and youths of the state should not be cheated again as had happened during the earlier 15-year stints of the BJP". Hopefully, this announcement was not made with an eve on upcoming Assembly by-polls.

By-elections are due on 27 seats. 25 of which fell vacant after resignations of sitting MLAs this year while two legislators had died. 22 of the 25 MLAs had walked out

with Congress rebel Jyotiraditya Scindia in March this year and joined the BJP, leading to collapse of the Nath-led government.

Nath demanded that the government make public the data on the number of youths who have been provided jobs by the BJP in its previous stints of 15 years.

Senior Congress leader Digvijaya Singh said he had been demanding that residents of the state get jobs in government. "Thank you for conceding my de-

mand, Shivraj ji. But how to trust you till the issuance of government order in this regard?" Singh

CONG ALLEGES FB EXEC ANKHI HAS LINKS WITH BJP

1.89 crore salaried people lost jobs since April: CMIE centre's CEO Mahesh Vvas said.

New Delhi, August 18: The number of salaried people losing their jobs amid the coronavirus pandemic has surged to 1.89 crore since April, with around 50 lakh iobs lost last month, according to data from the Centre for Monitoring Indian Economy (CMIE).

The loss of around 50 lakh jobs in July comes after around 39 lakh jobs were gained in June, as per the data. In April, 1.77 crore salaried jobs were lost, followed by 1 lakh job losses of salaried employees in May.

"While salaried jobs are not lost easily, once lost, they are also far more difficult to retrieve. Therefore, their ballooning numbers are a source of worry," the

"Salaried jobs were nearly 19 million (190 lakh) short of their

average in 2019-20. They were 22 per cent lower than their level in the last fiscal year," he added. The latest CMIE data also showed that around 68 lakh daily wage earners lost their jobs dur-

1.49 crore people took to farming during this period. Since the lockdown was announced, several companies across sectors have taken to job cuts, along with salary reduc-

ing this period. However, around

Industry bodies and several economists have called for government support to industry to avoid mass job losses and for the companies to survive the on-

HIV +ve children 'dragged out of shelter home' in Ch'garh

Bhopal, August 18: Fourteen HIVpositive children at a shelter home run by a non-profit in Chhattisgarh's Bilaspur were allegedly dragged out by officials who had orders from the district administration to close the facility. CCTV footage shows a lawyer who has been representing the children against being shifted from the

facility being pushed by officials. A police case has been filed against the lawyer, Priyanka Shukla, after the incident at Apna Ghar where 14 children between four and 18 years old have been staying. The shut down the facility.

When NGO staff Deepika Singh asked for a copy of the order to shut down the facility, the officials started manhandling her, dragged out the children and refused to give a copy of the eviction order, Apna Ghar director Sanjeev Thakkar said on phone. He shared audio recordings of the children calling him and complaining of alleged misbehaviour by the officials. Women and Child Development Department officials, accompanied by the police, had gone

Bilaspur senior police officer Prashant Agrawal denied the officials manhandled the lawver or the children. "The officials acted as



per the orders of the Collector. It was the lawyer Priyanka Shukla who got into a brawl with the officials, who suffered bruises. Shukla was arrested on a complaint by Women and Child Welfare Officer Parvati Verma," Agrawal said.

The NGO's director Sanjeev

Thakkar said Apna Ghar is Chhattisgarh's only shelter home for HIV patients run on a non-profit basis. He said he has been running the shelter home for several years with volunteers. A police case has also been filed against Thakkar, who said he was not at the building when the incident happened.

With a high monthly expense of ₹75.000. Thakkar said they decided to apply for a grant from the Women and Child development Department, adding their troubles started soon


Thakkar alleged some officials demanded a "30 per cent commission" from the grant, and when he refused, the officials checked the shelter home and claimed they have found certain discrepancies and recommended cancellation of the NGO's registration and shifting of the children. Thakkar said when they met

with Women and Child Development Minister Anila Bhediya, the minister asked questions like how the children get infected with HIV. The matter then reached the

Bilaspur High Court, which ordered the Collector to hear Apna Ghar and take a decision. In March this year, Collector

Sanjay Alang had ordered officials to shift the children. In his order, hesaid a second report has also cited irregularities at the shelter home.

Exercise of contempt *jurisdiction by the apex* court SC does more self-harm, says Bar Association of India

New Delhi, August 18: In a statement released to the Supreme Court as well as the people of India at large, the Executive Committee of Bar Association of India has questioned the suo motu exercise of contempt jurisdiction by the apex court which found lawyer Prashant Bhushan guilty of contempt of court last Friday.

At the outset, the letter, signed by 1,923 members of the Bar Association of India, expresses the 'deep dismay and concern' of the

committee at the exercise of the contempt jurisdiction by the Supreme Court against a member of the legal profession.

"The association is of the view that the exercise of contempt jurisdiction by the apex court in this manner has potential for more selfharm than the avowed purpose of safeguarding the prestige of the institution," it adds. The letter, signed by the Bar

Association of India president Dr Lalit Bhasin among others, records that the association had filed an intervention application in the Bhushan case but it was not listed. In its application, the associa-

tion had submitted that members of the Bar had a "duty to speak on institutional and structural matters concerning the judiciary, judicial officers and judicial conduct".

New Delhi, August 18: Some hospitals in the national capital have said they are seeing recovered coronavirus patients returning to them with recurrence of the infection.

Earlier this month, the Delhi government-run Rajiv Gandhi Super Speciality Hospital saw two instances of patients with relapse of coronavirus, almost one-and-ahalf months after they were cured of the infection. In both the instances of relapse, the patients had moderate symptoms.

Aakash Healthcare in Dwarka had also reported a case where a cancer patient recovered from coronavirus and contracted the disease again after a couple of months. The second time proved fatal for the

patient and he died due to the virus. Last month, the case of a Delhi policeman having a relapse of the novel coronavirus had emerged

which had left experts baffled. In the same month, a similar case had surfaced in the national capital after a nurse employed at a civic-run dedicated COVID-19 hospital had tested positive again after recovering from the contagious disease.

nCoV tally crosses 27-lakh mark

NEW DELHI: A spike of 55,079 cases took India's COVID-19 tally past 27 lakh Tuesday just a day after it crossed the 26-lakh mark, while 19.77 lakh people have so far recuperated from the disease pushing the recovery rate to 73.18 per cent according to the Union Health Ministry data. The COVID-19 caseload stood at 27,02,742, while the death toll climbed to 51,797 with 876 people succumbing to the disease in a span of 24 hours, the data updated at 8 am showed. Case fatality rate stands at 1.92 per cent.

AIIMS lost exceptionally bright students to self-harm: Guleria

New Delhi. August 18: All India Institute of Medical Sciences has expressed concern over the increase in suicides in the institute and urged students as well as the faculty members to reach out for support.

The remarks came after the decomposing body of a 40-yearold AIIMS doctor was recovered from his residence.

Over the last two months, the premier institute in the capital city has seen six suicides, including that of three doctors.

"A number of unfortunate recent events have caused us great distress. This has led us to lose some of our exceptionally bright and caring students and part of our family due to self-harm,' Guleria said, reassuring that AIIMS will do everything possible to prevent its recurrence.

Alluding to a survey conducted by British Medical Journal, the AIIMS Director said that 30 per cent of students experience or have received treatment for mental health issues. He rued that it is a huge number, much more that what is seen in the general population.

"The American Medical



Student Association stated that the cycle of stress, anxiety and depression takes place during medical school since students frequently lack time for enough sleep, healthy eating, regular exercise and smaller support system. I think that is something we need to work on," he added.

Guleria, who is also the part of a core team monitoring the pandemic, said that the Coronavirus has itself taken a toll on mental health. "We, as a community, thrive on social interaction and freedom and we are suddenly forced into a life of isolation, fear and restrictions. Although we talk of physical distancing, we really do not want that there should be any social distancing.'

To deal with the issue of suicide, he said that there is a 24x7 students' wellness wing led by Pratap Saran and the department of psychiatry. Five clinical psychologists run the wing.

Besides this, there is a mobile helpline and email which is available 24x7, emergency support from the department of psychiatry, skill development workshop to help in stress management, communication skills, system for providing financial assistance to students belonging to deprived backgrounds, eleven wellness clubs. A wellness website is also near completion.

Manipur cop, accused in drug case, given gallantry medal

Srinagar, August 18: Two deadly militant attacks in central and north Kashmir districts of Srinagar and Baramulla August 14 and August 17 left 5 security men dead, giving sufficient indications that the ultras are re-strategising after south Kashmir areas ceased to be safe havens for

them. The attacks in Nowgam area of Srinagar and Kreeri area of Baramulla occurred in broad daylight even as senior police officers said there was no security lapse that allowed the militants to carry out these hit and run attacks.



Senior police officers including Dilbag Singh, DGP, and Vijay Kumar, IGP (Kashmir), have said they are developing leads to neutralise those responsible for carrying out the attack in Nowgam (Srinagar).

"You can't kill a security man and get away with it. We will get them and neutralise those who carried out the Nowgam attack.'

"There is no record of any militant who killed a security person and survived for long during the last 30 years of violence.

There is little doubt that the militants are finding the south Kashmir districts of Anantnag, Kulgam, Pulwama and Shopian too hot to operate in."

"There is a perceptible change in public mood in these districts where parents are increasingly becoming concerned about their sons joining the militant ranks.

"Militants are clearly shifting their activities to central and north Kashmir districts with two main objectives." "One is their belief that shifting of security forces focus from south Kashmir areas would ease pressure on their overground workers and sympathisers.

"Secondly, militants feel that densely populated areas like Srinagar and remote areas of Baramulla and other north Kashmir

districts would give them more mobility." "Initially, the militants had some element of surprise while shifting focus to Srinagar and Baramulla districts, but that psychological cover is now blown" said a senior intelligence officer who did not want to be named. The officer added that despite

CHINA BUILDS TOILET ON XINJIANG MOSQUE SITE, ORDERS FORCIBLE ABORTION OF UYGHURS

New Delhi/Urumqi, August 18: Authorities of the Chinese Communist Party (CCP) regime have built a public toilet on the site of a mosque after demolishing it in Xinjiang province and also ordered forcible abortions of pregnant women as part of a campaign against the Uyghur Muslims.

As per the reports of Radio Free Asia (RFA), a public toilet has been erected on the site of the demolished Tokul mosque in Suntagh village of Atush city and hospitals have been "forced to abort and kill babies born in excess of family planning limits or who were in uterus less than three years after the mother's previous birth," in what is called the Xinjiang Uyghur Autonomous Region.

The region was captured by the People's Liberation Army (PLA) in 1949 and assimilated into China completely by 1955.

Since then, Uyghurs have been seeking independence but as the resistance movement against the authoritarian rule of the CCP, grew bigger, Beijing cracked down on the human rights of the minority com-

RFA reported that the authorities had razed two of three mosques in Suntagh village, "carrying out a directive to destroy Muslim places of worship en masse.'

The drive against mosques was launched in late 2016 as a "part of a series of hardline policies under top leader Xi Jinping.'

Suntagh village in Atush, is a county-level city of about 270,000 people under the administration of Kashgar prefecture in the cotton- and grape-growing region of southwestern XUAR, RFA reported.

Quoting the village committee chief, RFA said that the Tokul mosque was demolished in 2018 and a lavatory built upon it even as people in the village have toilets at

"The committee chief said that with Suntagh located about 3 km outside of central Atush, the area sees few to no tourists who would require access to a washroom," RFA

The toilet was likely built to cover

up the ruins of the destroyed Tokul mosque, as well as for the needs of inspecting groups or cadres visiting the area, RFA quoted the village head as saying.

In 2019, the Azna mosque had been replaced with "a convenience store" that sells alcohol and cigarettes, the use of which is frowned upon in Islam, RFA said.

Besides, the Bastaggam mosque has been destroyed while Teres mosque, the smallest, is in the poorest condition of all three.

RFA said the authorities have destroyed 70 per cent of the mosques in the region under the 'mosque rectification' campaign.

In addition to mosques, Chinese authorities have been systematically destroying Muslim cemeteries and other religious structures and sites across Xinjiang since 2016, the RFA said.

Last year, the Washington-based Uyghur Human Rights Project (UHRP) published a report, titled 'Demolishing Faith: The Destruction and Desecration of Uyghurs Mosques and Shrines', which was based on a study using geo-location and other techniques.

It showed that anywhere between 10,000 and 15,000 mosques, shrines, and other religious sites in the region were destroyed between 2016

Local media footage showed several vehicles and houses damaged by the rocket explosions and initial reports found that rockets struck Police Districts 1, 2, 10, 9, and 16.

The blasts sent columns of thick smoke into the sky in several locations and triggered panic.

The capital police have arrested two suspected terrorists from Police District 17 after the rocket attack, according to Arian. No group has claimed responsibility for the attack yet.

Ardern hits back at Trump over Covid 'surge'

Wellington, August 18: New Zealand Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern hit back Tuesday against US President Donald Trump for saying her country is experiencing a "big surge" in COVID-19, calling the remarks "patently wrong".

Trump sparked uproar in New Zealand when he told a crowd in Minnesota that the South Pacific country of 5 million people was in the grip of a "terrible" upsurge in COVID-19 cases, having earlier succeeded in eliminating the disease. Thirteen new infections were

confirmed in New Zealand Tuesday, taking the country's total number of cases since the pandemic began to 1,293, with 22 deaths. This compares with the U.S. tally of more than 5.2 million cases and 170,000 deaths. 'You see what's going on in New

Zealand?" Trump said. "They beat it, they beat it, it was like front page they beat it ... because

they wanted to show me something.

"The problem is ... big surge in New Zealand, you know it's terri-



ble. We don't want that.'

Ardern said there was no comparison between New Zealand's handful of new cases a day and the "tens of thousands" reported in the United States.

"I think anyone who's following COVID and its transmission globally will quite easily see that New Zealand's nine cases in a day does not compare to the United States' tens of thousands, and in fact does not compare to most countries in the world," she told reporters.

"Obviously it's patently wrong," she said of Trump's comments.

"We are still one of the best-performing countries in the world when it comes to COVID ... our workers are focused on keeping it that wav.'

what she called "cold, hard truths." Obama was seeking to show the sharp differences between Trump and former vice president Joe Biden. with less than 80 days to go before the November election. She chose



to underline a recurring theme of Biden's empathy. Tragedy has followed Biden from the early 70s till after he became vice president. Biden lost his first wife and baby daughter after he was elected to

the US Senate in 1972; he lost his son

Beau from brain cancer in 2015. "Joe knows the anguish of sitting at a table with an empty chair, which is why he gives his time, so freely

to grieving parents," Obama said. Trump knocked Obama and the video format of the Democratic convention from a rally in Wisconsin: 'Who wants to listen to Michelle Obama do a taped speech?"

There was an urgency in her address, there was an intimacy to it. She gave people clear instructions. She asked people to vote like their life depends on it. Pretty strong!" is how former Obama campaign manager David Plouffe assessed the Michelle Obama speech.

Robert Gibbs, former White House press secretary, said Michelle Obama set the ball rolling for what will be the single biggest takeaway from this Democratic convention-how the party

defines Joe Biden for American voters. The Biden campaign is hoping for the famed Obama bump from this high profile endorsement.

Nearly four years after leaving the

White House, Michelle Obama remains hugely popular with the Democratic base, and among Black women in particular.

Dressed in a dark chocolate coloured silk dress, Obama roasted Trump in her keynote speech, describing him as someone who "cannot meet the moment" amid a global pandemic. Obama slammed Trump for downplaying the threat from the coronavirus which has killed more than 1,70,000 Americans and left the economy in "shambles."

"I am one of the handful of people living today who have seen firsthand the immense weight and awesome power of the presidency," Obama said, speaking of her personal experience in the White House

from 2008 to 2016.







Last month, Reuters reported India was looking to privatise more than half of its state-owned banks to reduce the number of governmentowned lenders to just five as part of an overhaul of the banking industry

India currently has a dozen public sector banks in addition to IDBI, in which the government owns 47.11% while the state-owned insurance behemoth Life Insurance Corp owns a 51% stake.

The move to privatise banks also comes ahead of an anticipated surge in bad loan growth at the lenders, which could force the government

state-run lenders.

However, the stake sale in these lenders will be challenging and may spill into the next financial year as these banks are already burdened with a higher proportion of bad loans, banking and government officials have previously said.

Another government official, involved in the stake sale push, said more consultations would be held before the process proceeds.

While the government is keen to push through reforms amid the pandemic, some officials have advised that the government restructure these banks before privatisation to cut down their losses by offering voluntary retirement to surplus staff and closing lossmaking domestic and overseas branches to make them more attractive assets, the sources said.

New Delhi, August 18: Data and artificial intelligence (AI) can add USD 450-500 billion to India's GDP by 2025, representing about 10 per cent of the USD 5 trillion economy aspiration of the Indian government, a report by industry body Nasscom said Tuesday.

New Delhi, August 18: Coal Minister Pralhad Joshi Tuesday reviewed the progress made in operational activities of Talcher Fertilizers Ltd and asked it to expedite the coal gasification project.

Talcher Fertilizers Ltd is a joint venture between GAIL India Ltd, Coal India Ltd, Rashtriya Chemicals and Fertilizers Ltd and Fertilizer Corporation of India Ltd (FCIL).

India urges auto firms to cut royalties to foreign parents

TOP-SELLING CARMAKERS PAY MILLIONS OF DOLLARS IN ROYALTIES TO PARENT COMPANIES IN JAPAN AND SOUTH KOREA FOR USING THEIR TECH & BRAND

New Delhi, August 18: India's commerce minister has asked automakers to find ways to reduce royalty payments to foreign parent companies for use of technology or brand names, two sources told Reuters, in an effort to boost local investment and reduce outflows.

In India's competitive auto market, top-selling carmakers Maruti Suzuki (MRTI.NS) and Hyundai Motor's (005380.KS) local unit pay millions of dollars in royalties to parent companies in Japan and South Korea for using their technology and brand to build and sell cars.

The minister, Piyush Goyal, in a meeting last week asked officials from groups representing carmakers and auto parts manufacturers to review such payments with a view to reducing them, said people with direct knowledge of the discussions.

"The concern raised during the meeting was that the outflow is high, even for old technologies, and something should be done about it," said one of the sources.

The sources declined to be named as the talks are private. The ministry did not respond to a request for comment. India, for years, has debated imposing stricter caps on royalty payments which spiked after 2009 when foreign investment rules were eased and restrictions on such payments were removed.

The country's markets regulator last year suggested imposing curbs on payments exceeding 2% of revenue. The limit was finally set at 5% after complaints from some sectors and fears it may dissuade foreign firms from investing or shar-



ing technology.

Recently however, Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi's government has made a renewed push

to make the country a major manufacturing hub by encouraging domestic production and curbing imports. It also wants to increase local

investment and reduce foreign outflows. While India does not restrict the amount that can be paid as royalty, any payment by a locally listed company exceeding 5% of revenues needs shareholder approval.

Listed companies such as Maruti Suzuki (MRTI.NS) and parts makers including Bosch (BOSH.NS), Schaeffler India (SCHE.NS) and Wabco India (WABC.NS) typically pay royalties of between 1%-5% to their foreign owners.

Maruti Suzuki paid 38.2 billion rupees (\$510 million) as royalty to its Japanese parent Suzuki Motor (7269.T) in the fiscal year ending March 31, 2020, amounting to 5% of its revenue, according to its annual report.

Privately-owned companies such as Hyundai's local unit paid \$150 million or 2.6% of revenue as royalties to its South Korean parent in fiscal 2019 and Toyota Motor's (7203.T) India arm paid \$88 million or 3.4% of revenue to its Japanese parent, government data shows.

Royalty provision has been important in attracting foreign investments into various sectors in India, especially autos, said Vaibhav Gupta, partner at tax firm, Dhruva Advisors.

"Depending on the form in which the government brings back such caps ... it may impact the ability of auto companies to benefit from the $use\,of\,for eign\,brands\,and\,technical$

know-how," said Gupta. He said for many foreign companies royalties are a profit repatriation strategy and changes to these could impact operating and supply chain structures from a fis-

cal perspective.

Serie A side rip through Shakhtar Donetsk defense as they reach Europa League final following a 5-0 rout over Ukrainian club

Dusseldorf (Germany), August 18: Inter Milan are back in a European final for the first time in a decade, and the Italian team are playing like they've never been

Lautaro Martinez and Romelu Lukaku scored twice each as Inter ended their wait Monday, demolishing Shakhtar Donetsk 5-0 in the Europa League semifinals.

Inter grounded down Shakhtar in what was at first a tight, defensive game before scoring four times in the last half-hour. The Italian club will face five-time winner Sevilla in the final Friday in Cologne. "We reached the final by beat-

ing a very strong team, don't get fooled by the result," Inter coach Antonio Conte said. "We were good not allowing them to play the way they wanted. Since arriving last year, Conte

has imposed discipline on what had been a fractious Inter squad and rebuilt it around Lukaku, who has 33 goals in his first season Headers from Martinez in the

19th minute and Danilo D'Ambrosio in the 64th put Inter on course to play for their first major continental trophy since winning the Champions League in 2010 under Jose Mourinho. Martinez and Lukaku added three more goals in 10 minutes to make sure of the result.

Shakhtar was also trying to emulate past European glories after winning the UEFA Cup in 2009. The only remaining player from that team, goalkeeper Andriy Pyatov, was at fault for the opening goal.

Pyatov sliced a pass directly to Inter midfielder Nicolo Barella, who sped down the right flank and sent in a cross which eluded Lukaku but left his strike partner Martinez an easy header at the far post for the opening goal.

Inter tightened its grip when D'Ambrosio headed in at the far post off an outswinging corner from Josip Brozovic. That came less than two minutes after Shakhtar's best chance of the game, headed from point-blank range by



goalkeeper Samir Handanovic.

Inter suffocated Shakhtar's usual passing style, relentlessly pressing the Ukrainian champions' defensive line to stop them developing any passing moves. "They completely closed down the start of our attacks," coach Luis Castro said through a translator.

Martinez got his second in the

74th with a low shot from the edge of the box and four minutes later set up Lukaku to score Inter's fourth. Lukaku outpaced defender Davit Khocholava to score his second and Inter's fifth in the 84th.

The Belgian has scored in all five of Inter's Europa League games this campaign, and in a record 10 including five he played for Everton in 2014-15.

Inter won the UEFA Cup, as the Europa League was then known, in 1991, 1994 and 1998. Conte's team will go into the final on a six-game winning run, having conceded only once in their last seven games, in the 2-1 win over Bayer Leverkusen

Barcelona sack Setien

Koeman likely to be the next coach of the Catalan giants

Barcelona, August 18: Barcelona fired coach Quique Setien, three 2-8 loss to Bayern Munich in the quarterfinals of the Champions League, the first step in what it said would be 'a wide-ranging restructuring' of the club.

The decision was announced after an urgent board meeting summoned by president Josep Bartomeu in Barcelona. The club also announced new elections for March 2021 and said 'profound changes' were coming for the first team.

A replacement to Setien was not immediately announced but Spanish media said Dutch coach Ronald Koeman was the front-runner to take charge. The former Barcelona defender was reportedly already in Barcelona.

Barcelona said 'the new coach will be announced in the coming days as part of a wide-ranging restructuring of the first team'.

The new elections next March mean that the board will 'assume full responsibility regarding the 2020-2021 financial year'.

'The club will continue to implement the plan to reverse the sporting and economic situation, based on profound changes to the first team, plus a redefined budget to deal with the new situation caused by COVID-19, before the end of the current mandate," Barcelona said in a statement.

Bartomeu, who was heavily criticised for his club management recently, has been at the club's helm since 2014. The loss to Bayern ended a disappointing season for the Catalan club, the first without a title since 2007-

He has been coaching the Dutch national team since 2018, leading it to the Nations League Finals last year. His contract with the national team was valid until after the 2022 World Cup. Koeman previously also coached Everton, Southampton, Ajax, PSV Eindhoven and Valencia,

New Delhi, August 18: Star cricketer Rohit Sharma, wrestler Vinesh Phogat, and women's hockey captain Rani Rampal were among an unprecedented five picked for the Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna, while another unparalleled 29 were recommended for the Arjuna award by the sports ministry's selection committee here Tuesday.

Paddler Manika Batra and Rio Paralympic gold-winning high jumper Mariyappan Thangavelu were the other two recommended for the country's highest sporting honour by a 12-member selection committee.

Rampal was a late addition to the initial list of four. She is only the third and lone female hockey player to have been recommended for the honour. Before Rani, only Dhanraj Pillay (2000) and Sardar Singh (2017) won the prestigious award. Sardar, incidentally, was a part of the 12-member selection committee this year.

For the Arjuna, India pacer Ishant Sharma, recurve archer Atanu Das, women's hockey team player Deepika Thakur, kabaddi player Deepak Hooda, and tennis player Divii Sharan were among the 29 short-listed, an official source told this agency after the selection committee's meeting here.

This is the first time in the history of awards that five athletes have been recommended for the top sporting accolade with the final



decision resting on sports minister Kiren Rijiju.

In 2016, four athletes - shuttler PV Sindhu, gymnast Dipa Karmakar, shooter Jitu Rai, and wrestler Sakshi Malik - were collectively given this award.

The 33-year-old Rohit will only be the fourth cricketer after Sachin Tendulkar, just-retired MS Dhoni and current skipper Virat Kohli to be conferred with the Khel Ratna. Tendulkar was the first Indian cricketer to get the honour in 1998, followed by Dhoni in 2007 and Kohli in 2018. Kohli won it jointly with weightlifter Mirabai Chanu.

The committee, comprising the likes of Virender Sehwag and former hockey captain Sardar Singh, met at the Sports Authority of India (SAI) headquarters here and finalised the names after deliberations that took up the first half of the day.

Mighty Bayern test awaits Lyon

Lisbon, August 18: After stunning Manchester City in the quarterfinals, Lyon's unpredictable run set to face the mightiest hurdle this term when they take on German powerhouse and a free-scoring Bayern Munich in the second semifinal.

They will face off at the Estadio Jose Alvalade Wednesday evening with a place in the Champions League final up for grabs.

German champions Bayern thrashed Barcelona 8-2 to book a place in the semifinals, while Lyon stunned Manchester City with a

Even before crushing Barcelona, Bavern were already the favourites of many to go all the way in this year's competition and lift the European Cup for a sixth time.

After becoming the first side to





score eight goals in a Champions League knockout match, it is now tough to see exactly which team will stop them from winning a famous treble.

Nineteen teams have tried and failed to stop the Bavarian giants from winning in a run stretching back to February 16.

In fact, going further back, Hansi Flick's men have now won 24 of their last 25 matches in all competitions, the exception being a stalemate with fellow semifinalists RB Leipzig. The manner of their crushing win over European heavyweights Barca really was one of those 'where were you?' moments, with six different players getting on the scoresheet.

Even more impressive than that, all eight goals were assisted by a different player, showing just how much attacking depth Bayern have in their ranks.

As witnessed in the last round against a much-fancied Man City side, though, Lyon cannot be written off in this intriguing final-four

Incredibly, Lyon have not won consecutive Champions League matches in a single campaign since the 2011-12 season when defeating Dinamo Zagreb and APOEL.

Les Gones also knocked Italian champions Juventus in the last 16, however, and will enter this match full of confidence. In what could be a good omen for

Lyon - and they will no doubt take whatever they can - Bayern have failed to progress from each of their last four semifinals.

Bayern came out on top when the sides met at this stage in the 2009-10 semis, albeit with that tie being played over two legs, unlike this one-off clash on neutral soil.

In a unique campaign that has provided many surprises, Lyon will be hoping for one more massive twist as they look to overcome the
