Give votes, get vaccines

Bihar BJP Manifesto: This is the first time that a vaccine, especially one that is in the works, is part of an election manifesto

Patna, Oct 22: BJP's "free coronavirus vaccination for all" promise in Bihar ahead of next week's election has become hugely controversial with the ruling party fending off allegations of an "appalling" attempt to use the vaccine for its political agenda.

"As soon as a COVID-19 vaccine is available for production at a mass scale, every person in Bihar will get free vaccination. This is the first promise mentioned in our poll manifesto," Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman said Thursday, announcing the BJP's manifesto for the Bihar election.

"What about non-BJP ruled states? Indians who didn't vote BJP will not get free Covid vaccine?" - Arvind Kejriwal's Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) questioned.

Union Minister of State for Health Ashwini Chaubey faced the question in Bihar. "The corona vaccine is being made across the world. When it is ready, we have prepared an elaborate plan on distributing the vaccine, who will be given preference etc... Every state will


The move will enable foreign na-

The government has now decided to make a graded relaxation in visa and travel restrictions for more categories of foreign nationals and Indian nationals who wish to enter or leave India.



Doubts over plasma efficacy

The response from the state health department came after the ICMR recently admitted lesser effect of the therapy on critical Covid-19 patients and an announcement of the apex government research

The State government had launched several Plasma Banks to boost the treatment of critical patients in the state with the help of the plasma of the COVID cured

The plasma was extracted from cured persons because of it developing antibodies against the viral disease. However, ICMR Director General Balram Bhargava recently said that there had been discussions on discontinuing Plasma Therapy for treatment of COVID 19 for serious patients.



The project would be implemented in Sambalpur, Dhenkanal, Nayagarh, Deogarh, Koraput, Nabarangpur and Sundargargh districts from next financial year. State Agriculture and Farmers' Empowerment department would execute the project with help of its Soil Conservation and Watershed Management

The state government expects a \$50 million loan from the World Bank to implement the REWARD project in the seven districts over a period of six years.

The REWARD project would be implemented in Karnataka and Andhra Pradesh apart from Odisha, with the World Bank extending \$178 million loan to the three states. The total project cost in the three states is estimated to be 350 mil-

States' views sought over MDM for pre-school kids

New Delhi, Oct 22: The Union government has written to Odisha and other states seeking their suggestions on giving mid-day meal (MDM) to pre-school students.

The letter sent by Union Education Ministry asked the state governments to give their opinions on extension of MDM scheme to the students of pre-primary

After receiving suggestions from states, the Expenditure Finance Committee will take the final decision on the extension of the scheme to pre-school students, sources said

As per existing rules, MDM is being provided to primary and upper primary students. Around 11.6 crore children have been enrolled in the MDM scheme in around 12 lakh schools across the

The Union government had launched the scheme with a view to enhancing enrolment, retention and attendance in schools. Besides, the MDM scheme aims at improving nutritional levels of children.

The scheme was turned into a cooked meal programme in 2001. As per the scheme, every child in government and government-aided primary school would be served a prepared MDM with a minimum content of 300 calories of energy and 8-12 grams of protein daily for a minimum of 200 days.

The scheme was further extended in 2002 to cover the children studying in Education Guarantee Scheme (EGS) and Alternative & Innovative Education (AIE) centres. In 2007, the scheme was extended to cover upper primary students.

SILVER PLATING OF EIGHT SRIMANDIR DOORS SOON

Puri, Oct 22: The doors at as many as eight gates of Srimandir here would be plated with silver, said sources in the Shree Jagannath Temple Administration (SJTA).

Earlier, the temple administration had planned to cover the doors of three prominent gates at Srimandir with silver. A devotee had expressed his willingness to donate the required amount of silver and bear the expenses for covering the doors at Jay-Vijay, Kalahata and Beharana gates of the 12th century shrine with silver.

'The doors at five more gates of Srimandir would be plated with silver. A 15-member committee has been formed for the purpose. The first meeting of the committee is scheduled to be held at Niladri Bhakta Niwas October 27," said a source in the SJTA.

RTOs to remain open for registration Oct 24, 26

Bhubaneswar, Oct 22: The registration sections of regional transport offices (RTOs) across the state would remain open during Dussehra, State Transport Authority (STA) said Thursday.

According to a tweet by STA, a large number of vehicles are likely to be sold during the festival. Dealers, however, have been asked not to deliver any vehicle without registration and ensure that high security registration plates (HSRPs)

are affixed to them. In an order, State Transport Commissioner Sanjeeb Panda said, "It is hereby ordered that the Registration section of all RTOs shall remain open on two days i.e 24.10.2020 and 26.10.2020 from 3 pm to 5 pm to receive the registration documents from the dealer and allotment of regis-



tration number."

The RTOs will also approve registration of NTV vehicles done through dealer points on 'work from home' basis. The respective RTOs shall make roster arrangements with adequate intimation to the dealers under their limits, the STA office order stated.

"In case the dealer is found delivering vehicles without registration and without affixing

HSRP, steps shall be taken for cancellation or suspension of the trade license of the dealer," Panda warned.

Notably, there are four government holidays starting from October 23 and 26 on occasion of Dussehra. The STA office order was issued apprehending that dealers might face difficulties in getting newlysold vehicles registered at the respective transport offices.

Ensure Covid norm compliance during fest: Health secy

Bhubaneswar, Oct 22: The state Health department Thursday directed the district Collectors to ensure compliance of Covid-19 rules during the festive season to ward off the chances of spread of the killer

Bhubaneswar, Oct 22: State's novel coronavirus disease (Covid-19) caseload rose to 2.76.094 Thursday as 1,913 more people tested positive for the infection, while 15 fresh fatalities pushed Odisha's coronavirus death toll to 1,196, an official of the Health & Family Welfare (H&FW) department said.

The state reported less than 2,000 $\,$ cases for the fourth consecutive day, Thursday.

As many as 1,109 new cases were reported frok quarantine centres, while 804 infections were detected during contact

tracing, said the 1,913 NEW COVID-19 Only three dis-**CASES, 15 DEATHS** tricts reported more than 100

coronavirus cases with Khurda, under which Bhubaneswar falls, registering the highest 254 cases followed by Cuttack 150 and Angul 106, the official added. Three fresh fatalities each were reported in Angul and Mayurbhanj, two each in Dhenkanal, Khurda and Subarnapur, and one each in Cuttack, Puri and Sundargarh districts, the official further said.

Ganiam district has so far reported the highest number of coronavirus fatalities at 225, followed by Khurda 205 and Cuttack 105. As many as 53 Covid-19 patients have died due to other ailments so far. said the official.

Six districts—Khurda, Ganjam, Cuttack, Puri, Balasore and Sundargarh— have together reported about 61.28 per cent of the total Covid deaths and 45.12 per cent of the viral infections.

The state has so far tested over 41.99 lakh samples for Covid-19, including 40,114 Wednesday, the official pointed out. On the other hand, as many as 2.128 Covid patients recovered Thursday, taking the total recoveries in the coastal state to 2,57,041. The recoveries include 210 from Khurda, 149 from Angul, 140 from Cuttack, 114 from Sundargarh and 104 from Balasore.



Campaign on for safe nesting of Olive Ridley turtles

Konark/Bhubaneswar, Oct 22: Even though the pandemic has affected millions of people, there are many who have continued their relentless efforts towards preserving environment and protecting marine ecosystem.

Soumya Ranjan Biswal and his team members of Odisha Paryavaran Sangrakshan Abhiyan Trust braved all the difficulties during the lockdown period and pulled out more than 5 tonne plastic waste from the Odisha beaches to ensure a safety of the endangered Olive Ridley sea turtles.

The 30-day beach cleaning campaign known as 'Devi Kachhap Kalyanam' was started by Biswal and volunteers of the trust at Devi nesting zone September 27, 2020.

"There are three main nesting sites in Odisha - Rushikulya, Gahiramatha and the Devi river mouth. Since Devi nesting zone is not officially protected, it is getting degraded by the day with increasing pollution levels and rampant mangrove deforestation,"

"Over the last few years, pollution has been steadily increasing in our area. Every year, we find that the Devi nesting zone is littered with plastics and fishing waste. We also come across plastic waste deep within the sand. As it is widely acknowledged, the plastic pollution is extremely dangerous for the ma-

rine ecosystem," he added. These turtles need a pristine environment for nesting, and the presence of fishing nets and other waste on the beaches injure them in multiple ways. Baby turtles, while trying to make their way to the ocean, often end up getting trapped in the discarded waste, he maintained. 'Hence, it is necessary to clean the beaches every year before the nest ing season starts," said Biswal.

'Keeping in mind the COVID-19 crisis and other environmental issues, we decided to launch **THE 30-DAY BEACH CLEANING CAMPAIGN KNOWN AS 'DEVI** KACHHAP KALYANAM' WAS LAUNCHED BY THE VOLUNTEERS AT **DEVINESTING ZONE SEPTEMBER 27**

this mission to restore the turtle beach. We have set up a full-time camp on the beach and clean up the beach for more than eight hours a day. Every day, we collect about a quintal of trash comprising of polythene, nets, footwear, cigarettes, medical waste and others," he added.

The district administration of Puri extended its support to the cleaning campaign by transporting the collected trash to the nearest waste management plant. "We also got help from private companies who provided tractor for the

Missile testing in Wheeler Island might hit arrival of Olive Ridleys at Gahirmatha

Kendrapara, Oct 22: The annual arrival of Olive Ridley turtles at Gahirmatha, their favourite nesting site, may be affected this year due to large scale testing of missiles by the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) at Wheeler Island renamed as Dr Abdul Kalam island, a report said.

The environment around Bhitarkanika is gradually getting degraded due to man-made interference. Problems of habitat disturbance have affected the wildlife sanctuary, the report said.

This is because the missile testing at the Wheeler Island near the Bhitarkanika Wildlife Sanctuary is directly affecting the movement of wildlife and marine creatures in Gahirmatha which is known as the nursery of the sea turtles.

The turtles are believed to have been distracted by light caused by uranium burning.

Every year Olive Ridley sea turtles arrive at Gahirmatha sanctuarv in lakhs from November onwards for mating and mass nesting. The fishermen are warned not to venture into sea for fishing between November 1 and May 31 which is the mating and mass nesting period

of these sea turtles. The nuclear powered missiles during test fire emit a lot of smoke and light which directly affects the survival of the marine creatures. Environmentalists apprehend that this might lead to a decline in the number of sea turtles arriving at Bhitarkanika

Biswajit Mohanty, President of Wildlife Society of Odisha, said the atmosphere of Bhitarkanika is degrading day by day due to natural calamity and man-made in-



made interference. Problems of habitat disturbance have affected the wildlife sanctuary, the report said.

He alleged that an eco-retreat fair was held at Pentha beach in 2019 but at the end of the fair, tonnes of polythene were found lying scat-

tered on the beach This is condemnable as the polythene is a deterrent for the free movement of the turtles on the beach. While polythene has proved dangerous for the turtles, the missile testing for last two months has dealt a huge blow to their arrival in Gahirmatha. He alleged that testing of missiles would distract the turtles from arriving at Gahiramatha. Earlier, noted environmentalist Banka Bihari Das had urged then DRDO head Dr Abdul Kalam not to test fire missiles during mating and mass nesting

season of the sea turtles. Later, Dr Kalam presented de-

emitted by the missiles distract the turtles from their way to Gahirmatha. Dr Kalam had assured Das that missile testing will not be carried out starting from the arrival of turtles to the return of the hatchlings into the sea.

However, after Kalam's death test fire of missiles is continuing in Wheeler Island. Environmentalist Hemant Kumar Rout alleged that the natural calamity like cyclonic storm Amphan had led to beach erosion of Nasi-2 island where the sea turtles congregated in large numbers.

He also admitted that the test fire of missiles would impact the arrival of sea turtles. Acting on the complaint, Champua sub-collector issued an order for land measurement. Additional tehsildar of the Jhumpura Kresansiva Tirkev and Malda revenue inspector Sonali Sethi along with a police force identified the encroached land near Naibuga.

The company had encroached upon 10 decimal land of Raimani Champia of Dubuna village, 20decimal land of Bana Munda of Kotupalli village and six decimal



land of Sombari Munda of Dubuna village for several years.

The company has forcibly constructed a road on the land for transportation of minerals by scores

Though tribals have been protesting against the company for their land, the company was ignoring their agitations.

Upset over it, the land losers had taken up the issue with Champua sub-collector, who held a hearing on the complaint October 16 and directed the Jhumpura additional tehsildar, Malda revenue inspector and revenue inspector to reclaim the land.

After reclaiming their land, tribals had planted trees on their land. The officials said that detailed information about the land recla-

mation will be provided to the administration However, the lease holder TP Mohanty said the land was not grabbed while the road was being

used for over 30 years.

Vegetable terror

egetable prices have gone through the roof. So much so, that an average middle-class consumer has been forced to cut down on his daily vegetable intake. Most people hesitate to visit markets. The price terror has come on top of vanishing jobs and truncated salaries triggered by a Covid-19 induced lockdown. Every consumer item starting from cereals, edible oils to vegetables sells at nearly 50 per cent more than their prepandemic rates. People, who used to spend ₹800 a week on vegetables, now have to spend around ₹1,500 a week. The price shock has worsened the miseries of the common man. Prices of onion and potato are rising when tomato has become the latest bugbear. Onion rules over ₹80 a kg in the local market, while potato costs ₹45/kg. Every vegetable, both locally produced and those coming from outside, has gone out of the reach of people. Prices of brinjal, beans, potato, carrots, green chilly et al are now out of bounds. Even 'untouchables' in the market like pumpkins, gourds, arum, snake gourds, Malabar spinach, ivy gourds from whom people turned away and that were available at throw-away prices have gone up in their standing. Each of these vegetables commands not less than ₹60 a kg. The reason dished out for the price rise is their short-supply from producing regions.

Despite its highfalutin efforts over years, the state government has failed to protect ordinary people from the vagaries of price volatilities of kitchen essentials. Such price shocks are not new in the state. But, unfortunately the government has not learnt a thing or two from its failures. Our farmers are no less hardy and industrious than farmers of other states. If provided with wherewithal and facilities, there is no reason why we cannot become self-sufficient in vegetables. Odisha is endowed with a suitable climate and soil to produce enough kitchen staples like potatoes and onions besides other vegetables. Farmers in Bolangir, Boudh and Kandhamal have shown that we can produce good quantities of onions. However, we continue to depend on others states for our daily quota of essentials such as onions, potatoes, fish and eggs. The failure of the government to generate enough farm produce could be made good of if we had proper agriculture infrastructure like warehouses and cold-storages to preserve perishable commodities. The government has failed on this count also. In the absence of the state-promoted scientific warehouses and market linkages, out farmers shy away from growing cash crops like vegetables. They prefer to grow only those commodities that come under minimum support price (MSP). There are scores of policies but they mostly remain on paper. For onions, we continue to depend on Maharashtra and Andhra Pradesh while West Bengal gives us potatoes. We look to Andhra Pradesh for our fish and eggs quotas. The much-talked about Potato Mission of the state government has flopped. Matters could be compounded in the future once the amended farm Acts are implemented here. Under the changed laws, potatoes and onions have been kept out of the ambit of the Essential Services Maintenance Act.

Onion prices have surged after crops were damaged due to rainfall in various parts of the country, especially in Maharashtra. However, with Unlock 5.0 here, inter-state transportation has resumed and there is free flow of labour. The rain may have caused temporary delays in supply of vegetables. But vegetable prices have been soaring for over a year now. The rising inflation is a result of the consistent price rise over months. We can see a peculiar phenomenon. Inflation is going up even as people have no money to purchase things. This is high time the state produced enough vegetables to meet its own requirement and set up warehouses and cold-storages to preserve them. Perishable items such as vegetables cannot be imported all the time. The government should develop proper infrastructure and logistics to ensure seamless flow of farm produce. Or else, there will

be no end to the miseries of the common man.

Unclarity

he Archbishop of Canterbury, the Most Rev Rowan Williams, plunged into enormous controversy by saying in a radio interview and a lecture in early February 2008 that "it is inevitable that some aspects of sharia law will have to be incorporated into UK law to accommodate our Muslim population." The lecture, at the Royal Courts of Justice before an audience of senior members of the legal profession, was a detailed and subtle academic argument, hard for a layperson to understand. Leaving aside the issues he raised and the reasons for the immense criticism he has since been subjected to, his half-apology to the meeting of the General Synod of the Church of England this week raised a linguistic issue. He said, "I must take responsibility for any unclarity and for any misleading choice of words that has helped to cause distress or misunderstanding among the public." Unclarity? Every journalist, broadcaster and cartoonist who quoted that sentence has focused on the word through some sort of emphasis. This may have been because it is rare. But why didn't he use confusion or obscurity? Was it a scholar's diffidence or was he trying to euphemise his error by means of a terribly British type of negative? It was probably the former and that he undoubtedly meant unclarity literally, an utterance that lacked clarity. But its history suggests its users often prefer it to retain a penumbra of imprecision. Unclarity has a longer history.

Under the rose

he allusion goes back to classical times. The Romans adopted the Egyptian sun-god Horus as part of a cult of Isis and Serapis that reached them through Greece. The Greeks had taken him over as Horus the child (whose name in Egyptian was her-pa-khrad), Greeking his name to Harpocrates. The Egyptian hieroglyph for a child was a seated boy sucking his finger; the Greeks thought this showed him with his finger to his lips and so made him the god of silence and secrecy. He became popular among Romans once the cult had been officially sanctioned during the reign of Caligula in the first century AD. There's a famous story from those times in which Cupid — the Roman god of love — was said to have given a rose to Harpocrates as a little thank-you bribe for not letting on what his mother Venus, the goddess of sensual love, was up to (very filial, that). So the rose became the symbol of confidentiality in the classical Roman world. The ceilings of Roman dining rooms were decorated with roses to remind guests that what was said there under the influence of wine (sub vino) was also sub rosa, under the rose, privileged and not to be made public.

FESTIVITIES AMID PANDEMIC

♥he Calcutta High Court has directed the state government to treat all Durga Puja pandals as "no-entry zones" and keep devotees at a distance by erecting barricades. Chief minister Mamata Banerjee has also urged devotees to watch pujas "virtually". In the present stage of combining locking and unlocking normal life in the fight against the Covid-19 pandemic, temple festivals have emerged as a big issue.

In Maharashtra, a war of words has broken out between Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray and Governor Bhagat Singh Koshyari over re-opening temples in this festival season when a decision has already been taken to re-open markets and shops, restaurants and hotels, liquor shops and bars, and theatres and entertainment parks. Koshyari, in his letter to Thackeray, forwarding representations to reopen temples that were closed during lockdown, asked him if he, a "votary of Hindutya" had "turned secular". Union Health Minister Harsh Vardhan called for extra vigil. He warned that the country may head for "big trouble" if precautionary guidelines to prevent spread of the virus are not followed.

The pandemic has released a political drama in the phase of relaxation of lockdown restrictions. All states are contributing to this re-opening tamasha, ignoring the seriousness of the pandemic. We are faced with economic compulsions to resume our usual activities.

When and how a country should "unlock" are best known to the concerned nations. WHO has warned nations against premature lifting of lockdown as it would spark resurgence and cause "even more severe, longer-term damage to the economy". It has cautioned against any relaxation of response as festival season and winter would together aggravate the situation.

Cumulative Covid-19 positivity rate in India is below 8 per cent now. But, Kerala, where unlocking started earlier than in other states. has seen a sudden increase in cases. Harsh Vardhan says certain districts in some states are witnessing community transmission;

mainly in densely populated localities. Avoiding large gatherings has become the standard instruction to all.

A second wave of Covid-19 is turning out to be more destructive in Europe. Some have re-imposed lockdown and shutdown.

Pandemic has divided the population into two groups - one comprising the over-cautious and health conscious people, and the other including opposite types and the economically poorer who cannot afford the precautions. Less-informed citizens are eagerly awaiting unlock instructions which to them mean first and foremost more freedom of movement.

Unlocking temples is as much a technical question as lockdown to be decided by knowledgeable authorities on the basis of data on the prevalence of the disease and certain scientific calculations regarding the risks involved in unlocking. It cannot be decided by secular-communal standpoints or political pressures and popular demand or made an election issue. Temple lockdown is no insult to

"Until a vaccine against Covid-19 becomes available, it is essential that people follow safety precautions when they are outdoors and avoid crowded places for Diwali shopping" - a typical advice from health secretaries and medical personnel who have to deal with certain inevitable consequences of lifting lockdown in the festival season is on test. Such an advice should not be necessary for people with normal intelligence.

Crowded markets remain a concern because of flagrant violation of social restrictions. Collecting fines from violators has proven to be no solution. This was seen in Koyambedu wholesale market in Chennai which was for some time shifted elsewhere as the place became Covid-19 hotspot. Its reopening is greeted within a day with 50 new cases detected among traders at the market.

The scene is repeated across India in all major markets in all cities and towns and in fairs and mandis in villages. They are spontaneous eruption of crowds going on their business or enjoying the liberty of unlocking phase. Festival shoppers crowd market areas with little space to breathe, posing a health risk to themselves. and others.

The country faces the difficult problem of balancing health protection, economic safety, and social cooperation for various restric tions. The need to protect jobs and livelihoods lost or curtailed under lockdown with the need to prevent the resurgence of the epi-

demic is faced in all countries. On the whole, India seems to have done well in educating people on the need for limited activities and adopting alternatives to their routines, but groupism, political enmities, and communal hatred are encouraged to distract attention from fighting the common enemy of all in the Coronavirus.

Unlock strategies are different in different countries and even between states within a country. They are based on certain parameters of the pandemic and of the state of the economy. Most important is said to be Ro-the basic reproduction number which represents the magnitude of the epidemic in a place. Ro shows the number of social infections caused by an infected person during his/her infection period. If the number is more than one, the person may infect more than one on average which may increase escalation of the virus. This has happened in the case of the Covid-19 pandemic. Ro has to be brought to less than one to contain the disease. Unlock steps must invariably follow the pulse of the economy and society and cannot be taken on the basis of demands and pressures or notions of com-

parative or equal rights. In case unlocking fails and necessitates re-imposition of lockdown, people's resentment is likely to grow more and make lockdown a failure. The situation is complicated due to lack of the spirit of cooperation among people often fanned by social-political differences, even during a national health emergency. Unity should not be difficult to find as a vaccine to prevent Coronavirus.

ALTHOUGH NATIONALISTS AND PATRIOTS ARE BOTH NOMINALLY DEVOTED TO THEIR SOCIETY, THEY RELATE TO IT DIFFERENTLY

patriotism are commonly bandied about to describe people's entrenched political commitments, and both labels have made frequent appearances in the run-up to next month's US elections. For a psychologist, however, these terms represent distinct but variable expressions of how humans identify with their society. In fact, the personality differences between nationalists and patriots seem to be universal across cultures, suggesting they are part of our common heritage as humans.

Although nationalists and patriots are both nominally devoted to their society, they relate to it differently. Patriots show pride in a shared identity and sense of belonging sentiments that come naturally to native-born citizens and naturalized immigrants alike. With their passion directed toward their own group, patriots emphasise the quotidian needs of their communities: food, housing, schools, and so forth.

By contrast, nationalists couch their identity in glorification. As concerned as patriots are with caring for their fellow citizens, nationalists are preoccupied with preserving what they perceive as a superior way of life, and with side threats.

But patriots and nationalists also have divergent ideas about who constitutes "their people. Nationalists prize those aspects of their identity that set them apart from others. Hence, they place great importance on demonstrations of loyalty, customary rules of order, obedience to recognised authorities, and the preservation of established social relationships.

Patriots also give "their people" a high standing, but they regard that status as something to be earned rather than merely defended. By implication, patriots allow for the possibility of continual improvement.

Looking across the natural world, we find the closest parallels to nationalists shown by the ants, which stick tightly to what amounts to a colony flag: a particular scent that all members share as a kind of emblem of the group's identity. In humans, a natriot can become as teary as any nationalist in displaying allegiance to emblems such as a flag or anthem; however, nationalists are especially sensitive to such symbols.

For nationalists, even a brief exposure to the national flag or a respected leader spurs an intense reaction, as does the absence of a

is exemplified by the uproar among American white nationalists over Black professional athletes who kneel during the national anthem to protest police violence.

While nationalists are much more suspicious of diversity than patriots are, that doesn't mean the latter are immune to prejudice. By reserving their ardor for fellow citizens or members of their own race or ethnicity, patriots may also end up discriminating against those unlike themselves. As it happens, the emergence of these conflicting perspectives may have been integral to our survival. After all, each mode of thinking can be beneficial in certain contexts. In my own work as a biologist, I've found that groups ranging from chimpanzee communities to termite nests tend to serve two overlapping purposes: to provide for community members and to protect them.

The patriot-nationalist dimension of our identities could be an adaptation to coping with these divergent social needs. Similar balancing acts between responsibilities exist in other animals, too. Scientists have found that ant colonies are most successful when they contain not just individuals

he words nationalism and keeping their people safe from out-symbol when one is expected. This who boldly rush to the colony's de fense, but others who retreat from dangers while fastidiously tending the nest. Take away too many of the latter group, and the young will starve; remove too many of the former, and parasites will steal the colony's resources.

While we think of healthy societies functioning through cooperation between their members, conflicts can be advantageous, too. Even though people with opposing outlooks seldom see eve to eve. the fact is that human societies with too few or too many people at either end of the spectrum will be vulnerable to catastrophe.

Many of our current social divisions reflect the fact that we evolved in largely homogeneous societies. Multiethnic and multiracial societies are relatively new in our history, and many people patriots and nationalists alike remain partial, consciously or not, to their own ethnicity.

Yedi assesses flood damage Will the floods exacerbate in Karnataka

Bangalore, Oct 22: Karnataka Chief Minister BS Yediyurappa Wednesday conducted an aerial survey of flood-hit districts in the state's northern region and assured the affected people of more funds.

"The Chief Minister undertook aerial survey of Kalaburagi, Yadgir and Raichur in the state's northern region and Belagavi, Bagalkote and Vijayapura in the northwest region and assured the affected the people of releasing more funds for their relief and rehabilitation," an official told IANS here.

The state government released Rs86 crore last week for rescue and relief operations in about dozen districts, which were battered by heavy rains and flash floods, resulting in huge loss of houses, crops and infrastructure.

"As Prime Minister Narendra Modi has assured the state of all help, including financial aid to rehabilitate the affected people, more funds will soon be released to compensate them for losses they suffered," the official asserted.

State Home Minister Basayarai Bommai, Animal Husbandry Minister Prabhu Chauhan and state disaster management authority commissioner Manoj Rajan accompanied the Chief Minister in the aerial survey of the worst-hit districts. The affected districts are Bagalkot, Ballari, Belagavi, Bidar, Gadag, Kalaburagi, Kodagu, Koppal, Raichur, Yadgir, Vijayapura and Udupi across the state's north, northwest, coastal and southern

Besides torrential rains, the flash floods were caused due to discharge of excess water from the dams in

"The excess water turned the rivers into spate and inundated villages and towns in Kalaburagi, Yadgir, Raichur, Bagalkot and Vijayapura districts. Normal life was disrupted as roads and bridges were submerged and power lines were snapped due to strong surface winds," the official recalled.

"A central team will soon visit the affected districts and assess the damage caused to crops, houses and public infrastructure to prepare a report and for releasing financial aid from the national disaster relief fund," said the official.

Incessant rains and flooding have damaged the red gram (tur dal) crops in hundreds of hectares in Kalaburagi, Bidar and Yadgir districts before they could be harvested in October and November.

growers' association, the loss from the damaged pulses crop is estimated to be about Rs500 crore for kharif season.

The state agriculture department is surveying the rain-affected crop areas to assess the damage compensation insurance claims.

As the southwest monsoon was timely and excess in the region, sowing was undertaken in 7.6-lakh hectares of agricultural lands for growing cash crops such as a variety of pulses, cotton, jowar, bajra, maize, sunflower, sugarcane and groundnuts since July.

"Excess rains and flash floods have damaged about 50 per cent of the standing crops in the affected districts, resulting in heavy loss to farmers," added the official.

About 37,600 farmers have insured their crops this year while the area insured is over 51,500 hectares in the northern district.

STATE TO SEE MORE RAINS AS MONSOON EXTENDS: OFFICIAL

Bangalore, Oct 22: With the southwest monsoon extending further, delaying the onset of the northeast monsoon, more rains have been forecast across Karnataka till this weekend, a weather official said Thursday.

"Favourable weather conditions due to low pressure in the Bay of Bengal and surface winds are continuing the spell of southwest monsoon rains over the state during this week too," state meteorological centre head CS Patil said here.

Though the southwest monsoon withdraws from the state by September, it has extended for over three weeks into October due to unseasonal weather systems like depression in the Bay of Bengal and a trough in the Arabian Sea.

"As the southwest monsoon spilled over to October, the northeast monsoon, which commences in the third or fourth week of this month has been delayed, as cloud



formation and wind conditions will take 10 days for rains to occur," said Patil.

Moderate to heavy rains are forecast in the coastal, southern and central regions of the state till Sunday before the monsoon withdraws from the state by this month-end.

With the north and northwest regions of the state reeling under flash floods due to heavy rains and release of excess water from dams across Krishna and Bheema rivers. the weather office has advised the authorities in the coastal and southern regions to evacuate the people from low-laying areas and river

Telangana's Covid tally crosses 2.27L

Hvderabad, Oct 22: Telangana's Covid-19 tally crossed 2.27 lakh Thursday as the state reported 1,456 new cases during the last 24 hours Health officials said the fresh

cases pushed the cumulative number to 2,27,580. Of this only 20,183 cases are active, including 16,977 who are in home or institutional

Five more persons succumbed to the virus during the last 24 hours ending 8 pm Wednesday, pushing the

The fatality stands at 0.56 per cent against the national average of 1.5 per cent. The officials said the percentage of deaths due to Covid 19 was 44.96 while the remaining 55.04 had comorbidities.

The state continued to see more recoveries than new infections. A total of 1.717 people recovered from the infection, taking the cumulative recoveries to 2,06,105. The state's recovery rate climbed further to 90.56 per cent as against the national average of 89.2 per cent. The declining trend in new infections continued both in the state capital and the districts.

According to the media bulletin issued by the office of the director of public health, Greater Hyderabad reported 254 new cases. After several weeks, none of the districts reported more than 100 cases. Medchal Malkajgiri and

Rangareddy recorded second highest number of cases at 98 each followed by Nalgonda (92), Khammam and Komaram Bheem Asifabad (89 each), Bhadradri Kothagudem (82) and Siddipet (47). Out of 2,27,580 total positive cases

so far, 70 per cent (1,59,306) were asymptomatic while the remaining 30 per cent (68,274) were symptomatic. During the last 24 hours, 38.565 tests were conducted. Of this. 35.931 samples were tested in the government-run laboratories and 2,634 in private. Of the total samples 16,968 were primary and 4,627 were secondary.

With this the cumulative number of samples tested have gone up to 39,78,869. Eighteen government-run laboratories, 46 private laboratories and 1,076 Rapid Antigen test centres are conducting the tests.

Samples tested per million population ratio rose further to 1,06,901.

arrested for kidnap and murder. The police officer said the accused kidnapped the boy to make easy money. "Since he was known to the boy, he accompanied the kidnapper. After taking the boy to a secluded place, he realised that controlling the boy single handedly will be difficult. He strangulated the boy to death as he was worried that the boy may reveal the incident to his family," the SP said.

Hyderabad, Oct 22: A five-member inter-ministerial team is sent by the Centre to assess the damage caused by the floods in Telangana, the state government officials said Thursday

The team, led by Joint Secretary Praveen Vashista, met Chief Secretary Somesh Kumar at the state Secretariat and discussed the flood situation and relief measures in the state.

Somesh Kumar informed the Central team that the state government has taken all measures to minimise loss of lives and property arising out of the recent

He gave a powerpoint presentation and briefed about the extent of damage caused due to the floods in the state. A photo exhibition was arranged to depict the damages caused by the floods.

Officials of Irrigation, Municipal Administration, Roads & Buildings, Agriculture, Energy, and Panchayat Rai Departments as well as from the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) and the Water Board interacted with the Central team and gave an overview of the loss incurred in the state.

Officials informed that there was excess rainfall during the last 10 days which has resulted in flooding. The state government has already released Rs 550 crore for immediate flood relief.

Though there were rains in the entire state, excessive damage was in and around Hyderabad and the neighbouring districts adjoining the city. Breaches to three major tanks coupled with flooding in Musi river has resulted in low-

The other members of the team are RB Kaul, Consultant, Ministry of Finance; K Manoharan, Director, Department of Agriculture; SK Kushwaha, Senior Engineer, Transport and Highways: and M Raghuram, Senior Manager, Ministry of Water Resources.

The Centre sent the team a week after Chief Minister K Chandrasekhar Rao said that due to heavy rains and flash floods. the state suffered losses to the tune of Rs 5,000 crore.

He wrote a letter to Prime Minister Narendra Modi, urging him to release Rs 1,350 crore immediately for the relief and rehabilitation works.

Heavy rains and floods since October 13 have wreaked havoc in various parts of the state, especially Hyderabad, claiming at least 70 lives.

Not allowed to step out: Umar to court

New Delhi, Oct 22: Former JNU student leader Umar Khalid, arrested under the stringent Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act in connection with north-east Delhi riots in February, told a court here Thursday that he was not allowed to step out of his cell and it was sort of a "solitary confinement".

Additional Sessions Judge Amitabh Rawat directed Tihar Jail Superintendent to be present before the court Friday to hear the matter. Khalid made his submissions directly to the court through video conferencing when he was produced before it on expiry of his judicial custody in the case.

The court also pulled up the Assistant Jail Superintendent of Tihar prisons for not unmuting the microphone when Khalid told him that he wanted to speak to the judge. Khalid said the official told him the microphone will be unmuted if the judge gave the permission for it.

"If an undertrial wants to say something, then unmute and let him speak or you tell us that he wants to say something," the judge told the jail official. Khalid alleged that he was alone in his cell and not



allowed to step out of his cell or talk to anyone.

"I have not been allowed to step outside at all. I am alone in my cell. No one is allowed to meet me. It is practically sort of a solitary confinement. I am not well for the last three days. I am feeling discomfort. This is like a punishment. Why am I given this punishment? I reiterate that I need security but it cannot be that I have to be in my cell all day," he claimed.

He further said that Wednesday he was shown an order passed by Additional Superintendent Pradeep Sharma of Jail number 2, in which it was stated that Khalid should not be allowed out of his cell for 24 hours a day.

"I request a recall of that order. In the morning, the Jail Superintendent came and asked the jail staff to allow me to go outside. I was allowed to step out for 10 minutes and then after he left, I was not allowed to go outside since then," Khalid alleged.

When his counsel, advocate Trideep Pais, told the court that no adverse steps should be taken against him by the jail authorities for putting forward his grievances, the judge said, "Khalid should not be punished for putting forward his grievances. You should take care of it."

The court had October 17 directed the Tihar Jail Superintendent to provide adequate and security in judicial custody. The directions came on an application filed by Khalid seeking adequate security in prison so that he was not harmed by anyone in judicial custody.

Communal clashes had broken out in northeast Delhi February 24 after violence between citizenship law supporters and protesters spiralled out of control leaving at least 53 people dead and around 200 injured.

Anti-tank missile passes final test

Himalayas poised for a series of big quakes: Study

New Delhi, Oct 22: The entire Himalayan arc is poised to produce a sequence of great earthquakes, and the next big quake -- of the magnitude of 8 or above -- may occur during our lifetimes, according to a study reviewing geological, historical, and geophysical data.

The human toll of such an event in the densely populated countries across the arc is likely to be unprecedented, the researchers said. The study notes that the sequence of future Himalayan earthquakes could be similar to the great earthquakes that occurred in the twentieth century along the Aleutian subduction zone, which extends from the Gulf of Alaska to Kamchatka in Russian Far East.

The review, which appeared in the journal Seismological Research Letters in August, used basic geological principles --stratigraphic analysis, structural analysis, soils analysis, and radiocarbon analysis -- to estimate the size and timing

Prior studies have examined the rate of strain accumulation that is occurring along the Himalayan arc from satellite observations. In the latest study, the timing and size of most recent prehistoric earthquakes were defined from geology.

New Delhi, Oct 22: The third edition of the two-plus-two dialogue between India and the US October 27 will entail a comprehensive discussion on cross-cutting bilateral issues as well as deliberations on regional and global developments, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said Thursday.

US Secretary of State Michael Pompeo and Defence Secretary Mark T Esper will visit India October 26 and 27 for the high-level dialogue aimed at further boosting defence, security and global strategic ties between the two countries. The Indian side at the talks will be represented by External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar and Defence Minister Rajnath Singh.

"The third ministerial dialogue will entail a comprehensive crosscutting bilateral issues of mutual interests. In addition, both sides will also exchange views on regional and international issues,' MEA Spokesperson Anurag Srivastava said at a media briefing. He said Pompeo and Esper will have bilateral meetings with their Indian counterparts as well.

They will also be meeting the National Security Advisor. There will be a joint call on the prime minister," Srivastava said. Asked why the talks have been scheduled just days ahead of the US presidential election, Srivastava said: "Diplomatic calendars have their



Delhi violence 'worst' since partition: Court

New Delhi, Oct 22: The riots in north east Delhi in February this year was the "worst communal riots since partition" in the national capital and that it was a "gaping wound" in the conscience of a nation aspiring to be a "major global power," observed a Delhi Court Thursday.

"It is common knowledge that the dreary day of February 24, 2020 saw parts of north-east Delhi gripped by a communal frenzy, reminiscent of carnage during the days of partition. Soon, the riots spread like wildfire across the smoke-grey skyline of Capital, engulfing new areas and snuffing out more and more in-



nocent lives. 'The Delhi riots 2020 are a gaping wound in the conscience of a nation aspiring to be a major global power. Even if there were no direct acts of violence attributable to the applicant, he cannot shy away from his liability under the provisions of the sections invoked against him, particularly on account of the fact that his house/building became the hub/centre point for the rioters and rabble-rousers to unleash the worst communal riots since partition in Delhi," Additional Sessions Judge Vinod Yadav said.





12 peaceful protestors killed

Abuja: Nigeria's security forces fired upon two large gatherings of peaceful demonstrators, killing 12 people protesting against police brutality in Lagos, according to a report by Amnesty International Wednesday. Soldiers fired at the protesters who had gathered in the Lekki district of Nigeria's largest city Tuesday night in defiance of an indefinite curfew imposed hours earlier by the authorities, according to several witnesses. Hundreds of people were at the site at the time of the shooting.

Global Covid-19 cases top 41.1mn

Washington: The overall number of global coronavirus cases has increased to 41.1 million, while the deaths have soared to more than 1,130,400, according to the Johns Hopkins University. As of Thursday morning, the total number of cases stood at 41,148,042, while the death toll surged to 1,130,405, the University's Center for Systems Science and Engineering (CSSE) revealed in its latest update. The US is the worst-hit country with the world's highest number of cases and deaths at 8.333.591 and 222.063, respectively, according to the CSSE.

Hariri named as **Lebanon's PM**

Beirut: Lebanon's President Michel Aoun designated Sunni Muslim politician Saad al-Hariri as Prime Minister Thursday to form a new government to tackle the worst crisis since the country's 1975-1990 civil war. Hariri won the backing of a majority of parliamentarians in consultations with Aoun. He faces major challenges to navigate Lebanon's powersharing politics and agree a cabinet, which must then address a mounting list of woes: a banking crisis, currency crash, rising poverty and crippling state debts.

EU rights prize to Belarus Oppn

Brussels: The European Union has awarded its top human rights prize to the Belarus opposition movement and its leader, Sviatlana Tsikhanouskaya, for their challenge to President Alexander Lukashenko's long, hard-line reign. "It is an honour to announce that the women and men of the democratic opposition in Belarus are the 2020 Sakharov Prize laureates. European Parliament president David Sassoli said.

US proposal on H-1B visa may affect hundreds of Indians

Washington, Oct 22: The State Department has proposed not to issue temporary business visas for H-1B specialty occupations which allowed several companies to send their technology professionals for a short stay to complete jobs on site in the US, a move which could affect hundreds of Indians

The proposal, if finalised, will eliminate any misconception that the "B-1 in lieu of H policy" provides an alternative avenue for foreign professionals to enter the US to perform skilled labour that allows, and potentially even encourages them and their employers to circumvent the restrictions and requirements relating to the H non-immigrant classification established by Congress to protect the US workers, the State Department said.

The move, made public Wednesday, less than two weeks ahead of the November 3 presidential election, is likely to impact several Indian companies which send their technology professionals on B-1 visas for a short stay to complete jobs on site in the US.

"The proposed changes and the resulting transparency would reduce the impact of foreign labour on the US workforce of aliens per forming activities in a specialty occupation without the procedural protections attendant to the H-1B classification," it said.

In its federal notification issued

said the US architecture firm seeking protection from rising labour costs in the country might believe it could lay off its US architects and contract for the same professional architectural services to be provided by a foreign architecture firm.

If the foreign firm sought H-1B visas for its architects, it would be required to pay the prevailing wage for architects in the area of intended employment in the United States, presumably the same wage the US architects had been paid, and meet the other requirements enacted by the Congress to protect US workers.

But under the B-1 in lieu of H policy, the foreign architects could ostensibly seek B-1 visas and travel to the US to fill a temporary need for architecture services, as long as they retained a residence in the foreign country and continued to receive a salary, perhaps significantly lower than what is customary for US architects, dispersed abroad by the foreign firm (or under the auspices of a foreign parent or sub-

sidiary), the State Department said. Under the department's guid-

tiple architects planning temporary work in the US in certain situations. However, a foreign employer may succeed in undermining the US immigration law and policy by rotating architects between the US and the foreign country to effectively fill the position of one US architect at a significantly lower cost, the notification said.

"If the architects who intended to perform skilled labour were "of distinguished merit and ability... seeking to perform (temporary architectural services) of an exceptional nature requiring such merit and ability, one might argue the current regulatory language suggests this type of labour is a permissible basis for B-1 non-immigrant visa issuance," the State Department said.

This potential outcome is harmful to the US workers and contrary to the policies of the Trump administration, it said.

The State Department said the application process for a B-1 visa does not include similar procedural requirements to protect the US workers like that of H-1B visas



Iran, Russia have US voter information: FBI

Washington, Oct 22: The Federal Bureau of Investigation officials have accused Iran of being behind a flurry of emails sent to Democratic voters in multiple battleground states that appeared to be aimed at intimidating them into voting for

President Donald Trump. The officials did not lay out specific evidence for how they came to pinpoint Iran, but the activities attributed to Tehran would mark a significant escalation for a country some cybersecurity experts regard as a second-rate player in online espionage. The Wednesday announcement was made at a hastily called news conference 13 days before the election.

The allegations underscored the US government's concern about efforts by foreign countries to influence the election by spreading false information meant to suppress voter turnout and undermine

American confidence in the vote. Such direct attempts to sway public opinion are more commonly associated with Moscow, which conducted a covert social media campaign in 2016 aimed at sowing discord and is again interfering this year, but the idea that Iran could be responsible suggested that those tactics have been adopted by other nations, too

Russia dismisses 'meddling' charges

Moscow: The Kremlin Thursday dismissed as "absolutely groundless" claims that Moscow had obtained US voter information and taken actions to influence public opinion ahead of the November 3 election. "Accusations are raining down every day. All of them are absolutely groundless, they are not based on anything," Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov told reporters.

"These actions are desperate attempts by desperate adversaries," said John Ratcliffe, the government's top intelligence official, who, along with FBI Director Chris Wray, insisted the US would impose costs on any foreign countries that interfere in the 2020 US election and that the integrity of the election is still sound.

"You should be confident that vour vote counts." Wrav said. "Early. unverified claims to the contrary should be viewed with a healthy dose of skepticism.'

The two officials called out both Russia and Iran for having obtained voter registration information, though such data is sometimes easily accessible.

S Korea sticks to flu vaccine plan despite 25 deaths

Seoul, Oct 22: South Korean officials refused Thursday to suspend a seasonal influenza inoculation effort, despite growing calls for a halt, including an appeal from a key group of doctors, after the deaths of at least 25 of those vaccinated.

Health authorities said they found no direct links between the deaths and the vaccines. At least 22 of the dead, including

a 17-year-old boy, were part of a campaign to inoculate 19 million teenagers and senior citizens for free. the Korea Disease Control and Prevention Agency (KDCA) said.

"The number of deaths has increased, but our team sees low possibility that the deaths resulted from the shots," the agency's director, Jeong Eun-kyeong, told parliament. South Korea ordered more flu vaccines this year to ward off what it calls a "twindemic", or the prospect that people with flu develop coronavirus complications and overburden hospitals in winter.

"I understand and regret that people are concerned about the vaccine," said Health Minister Park Neung-hoo, who confirmed the free programme would go ahead. "We're looking into the causes but will again thoroughly examine the entire process in which various government agencies are involved.'

Won't give up cartoons, vows France

"We will not give up cartoons," President Emmanuel Macron earlier told a solemn ceremony at the Sorbonne university in Paris attended by Paty's family, who was tar-



geted for having shown cartoons of the Prophet Mohamed in a civics class discussion on free speech early this month. The President gave France's highest civilian award, the Legion of Honour, to Paty and said he had been killed by "cowards" for representing the secular, democratic values of the French "He was killed because Islamists

want our future," Macron said "They will never have it." Earlier, anti-terror prosecutor

Jean-François Ricard said the two teenagers – aged 14 and 15 – had been in a group of pupils who shared 300-350 euros (\$356-\$414) offered by the killer to help find Paty.

The two staved with the killer. Chechnya-born 18-year-old Abdullakh Anzorov, for more than two hours waiting for Paty.

Riyadh/Washington, Oct 22: Saudi Arabia's crown prince enioved a near free pass under his personal relationship with U.S. President Donald Trump, but the kingdom's brazen young leader will have to tread more carefully should Democrats take the White House and reset strategic ties.

Riyadh's human rights record, with the brutal 2018 murder of Washington Post Saudi journalist Jamal Khashoggi and detention of women activists, will be a prime point of friction with a Joe Biden administration, as will the Yemen war.

At issue for the Gulf powerhouse,

which lobbied hard for Trump's maximum pressure campaign against foe Iran, is how Biden will address Tehran's ballistic missiles and support for regional proxies in any talks to revive an international nuclear pact with Iran that Washington quit in 2018.

While Riyadh and its Gulf allies prefer a Trump administration that also prioritised lucrative deals over human rights concerns, a Biden win would not upend decades-long alliances, five regional sources and diplomats said. Biden may, however, place stronger conditions on US support, they said.

'There will be challenges but there are long-term strategic in-

stitutional relationships and no one wants to break the camel's back. though a Biden administration will

want compromises," said one Gulf source. A foreign diplomat in the region echoed the view that Saudi-US ties would not be unduly harmed: "I imagine (Biden) would demand a few high-profile concessions ... something on women's rights defenders maybe.

In his campaign, Biden pledged to reassess ties with Saudi Arabia, an oil exporting giant and major buyer of American arms, demand more accountability over Khashoggi's killing in Riyadh's Istanbul consulate and end US support for the Yemen war

"Instead of giving blank checks to dictators and authoritarians around the world, as the Trump Administration has done, Joe Biden will stand up for universal values with friends and foes alike, and stand with the democratic world as we address common challenges,'

a campaign spokesman told Reuters. De facto ruler Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman has firmly consolidated power, crushing dissent and detaining rivals to the throne, measures that tainted a reformist image initially lauded abroad as

he moved to open up the kingdom. He has denied ordering Khashoggi's killing, which sparked global outrage and spooked investors, but in 2019 indicated some personal accountability by saying

it happened under his watch.

New Delhi: SBI Card Thursday reported a 46% dip in its net profit at ₹206 crore for the second quarter ended September 30. The credit card company had posted a net profit of ₹381 crore during the corresponding period of the previous financial year. However, its total income during July-September 2020 rose 6 per cent to ₹2.513 crore as against ₹2,376 crore in the year-ago period, SBI Card said in a release.

Festive sales bring cheer among retailers, e-Tailers

Kolkata, Oct 22: A buying spree among consumers during the current festive season has ushered in green shoots of recovery in the retail sector, which was severely affected due to the COVID-19 crisis. while e-commerce companies enjoy a higher pie of sales as people prefer online shopping now, officials said

Leading e-tailers have received overwhelming response during their annual festive sale days, while traditional traders witnessed increasing sales in several categories, though their revenue is still lower than that of last year, they said.

A report by RedSeer, a consulting firm, estimates that the festive sales this year are expected to touch \$7 billion in gross merchandise value (GMV) as compared to \$3.8 billion in the same period last year.

Walmart-owned Flipkart and



Amazon India said lakhs of sellers, including those from small cities and towns, have received orders during the initial days of festive sales on their platforms.

Fashion e-tailer Myntra said 50nt of shoppers on its platform on the first day (October 16) of its sale were from tier II and III cities.

Sellers from small cities have received a greater share of orders this year, it said.

Several organised retailers having omnichannel presence also said their online sales have grown significantly as people are preferring shopping from home, the officials said.

'Next stimulus should focus on short gestation infra projects'

New Delhi, Oct 22: Niti Aayog Vice Chairman Rajiv Kumar Thursday said the Indian economy might end up with a lower contraction in the current fiscal than projected by various organisations and also stressed that the next stimulus should focus on shortgestation infrastructure projects.

Participating in a virtual event organised by Public Affairs Forum of India (PAFI), Kumar said helicopter money is not something that the government is looking at. Generally, helicopter money

refers to quantitative easing policy by the central bank to ensure more liquidity in the system. There are some people who now

say that it may not be as bad as it has been forecast and there are signs that we may not have economic contraction (of) 9.5% or 10% that we thought about," he said. According to him, recovery in

August and September was quite smart, and it has been witnessed across many high frequency indicators. "I think this third quarter, we will see smaller contraction (in economic growth) than had been fore-



cast and fourth quarter could well be a wash if not a small positive.

"So if that is true, then, I think we might end up with a contraction, which is lower but nonetheless contraction itself is very unprecedented thing," he said.

The RBI has projected the Indian economy to contract 9.5% in the current fiscal while the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and the World Bank havd estimated contraction at 10.3% and 9.6%, respectively. Kumar also said the next stimulus should focus on short-gestation infrastructure projects as it will have a strong multiplier effects and can sustain growth.

"There are enough productivity enhancing expenditures which can be rolled out in a relatively short span," he said

tures into their existing commerce and customer solutions. This will help many small businesses who have been most impacted in this time," WhatsApp said in a statement.


"We will charge business customers for some of the services we offer," it added.

'Media, entertainment sector to grow over 10% till 2024'

A ROBUST LONG-TERM OUTLOOK AS IT IS EXPECTED TO GROW AT 10.1% COMPOUND CAGR TO REACH \$55 BILLION BY 2024

Mumbai, Oct 22: The media and entertainment industry is expected to grow at an annual rate of over 10% to reach \$55 billion by 2024, according to a report. The sector's growth, which would be like a Kshaped bifurcated recovery, is on the horizon led by over-the-top (OTT), online advertising, video/games/e-sports, music and podcasts, PwC India said in the report released Thursday.

The advisory has a robust longterm outlook as it is expected to grow at 10.1% compound annual growth rate (CAGR) to reach \$55 billion by 2024. In terms of individual

segment market size as a percentage of total industry revenue, OTT video is expected to see the largest gain and reach 5.2% by 2024, closely followed by online advertising. Though India will remain the

world's biggest cinema market in admission terms, cinema revenue will contract at (minus) 2.6% CAGR to total \$1.5 billion over the reporting period. "Our research shows that India

will be the fastest growing entertainment and media market globally in terms of pure consumer revenue," the report said. Over the next four years, the out-

look remains highly positive for

digital segments such as OTT, on-



line advertising, online gaming and music and podcasts that were perfectly positioned to meet consumers where they are in 2020, predominantly at home and online.

The report sees the OTT space as the key driver of growth and revenue overtaking South Korea, Germany

and Australia to become the sixthlargest OTT market by 2024.

Subscription video on demand will be the prime driver of revenue, increasing at a 30.7 per cent CAGR from USD708 million in 2019 to USD2.7 billion in 2024. The exponential growth of OTT is at the cost of the cinemas and traditional TV, which has de-grown already in 2020. OTT is directly benefiting from the closure of cinemas, as some film studios choose to fast-track new re-

leases to home video platforms. When it comes to online advertising, India is already the sixthlargest market in the Asia Pacific

region, said the report. It added that mobile will be the primary driver of revenue in this space due to increased data affordability, new mobile-first formats, ability to measure, and strategic targetting. Gaming and e-sports are capitalising on the need to bring live experiences in more personalised and more engaging ways. E-sports was under 1 per cent of overall market in 2019 but has become one of the fastest-growing segments with a projected 33 per cent CAGR by 2024.

The podcast industry was already experiencing rapid growth prior to the pandemic. Fuelled by the uptake of music-streaming brands, the overall space is expected to grow at a 13.5 per cent annually till 2024 to \$1.7 billion.

Becker accused of failing to surrender Big W titles

London, Oct 22: Tennis great Boris Becker appeared in a London court Thursday, accused of failing to surrender two of his Wimbledon trophies to be sold to settle his debts.

The 52-year-old Becker, who was declared bankrupt in 2017, has also failed to turn over his two Australian Open trophies, according to a new 28-count indictment that claims he hasn't complied with orders to disclose information.

The German pleaded not guilty to all counts during his appearance at Southwark Crown Court. Becker has allegedly concealed property holdings and more than



Wimbledon trophies from 1985, when at age 17 he became the youngest men's singles champion at the All England Club, and 1989. Becker also won the tournament in 1986. He won the Australian Open in 1991 and 1996.

Becker, who lives in London, was told that his trial would begin September 2021. He faces several years in jail if convicted. He remains free on bail.

"He is determined to face and contest these charges and restore his reputation in relation to the allegations made against him," said Jonathan Caplan, Becker's attorney.

Lucky Liverpool win at Ajax

Amsterdam, Oct 22: Liverpool beat Ajax Amsterdam 1-0 away with a fortunate own goal in their Champions League group-stage opener Wednesday, riding their luck at times but still showing their title credentials.

Ajax fullback Nicolas Tagliafico turned the ball into his own net in the 35th minute to ensure a winning start in Group D for the English champions, who looked the stronger of the two teams despite Ajax creating several good chances at the Johan Cruyff Arena.

Davy Klaassen struck the post with a powerful shot and Quincy Promes had a point-blank effort stopped by the legs of Liverpool goalkeeper Adrian as the Dutch club created a handful of excellent opportunities.

Yet Liverpool, who won their sixth Champions League title in 2019, still proved value for their victory, dominating possession and counter attacking at pace while keeping a clean sheet despite missing defensive talisman Virgil van Dijk, who suffered a serious knee injury at the weekend.

Fabinho moved from midfield to centre defence to replace Van Dijk and had an outstanding game,
