
### Naveen tops CM popularity chart

# 9th round of talks fails '120%'

No progress towards ending stalemate between Centre and farm unions; next round of talks January 19

New Delhi, Jan 15: The ninth round of discussion between farmers demanding repeal of the three agriculture laws and the centre -- held days after the Supreme Court stayed their enactment "until further orders" -- ended today with no progress towards ending the stalemate.

'It was a 120 per cent failure. We suggested that the government remove the changes made to the Essential Commodities Act instead of scrapping it altogether. But the Agriculture Minister has not said anything on this,' farmer leader Dr Darshanpal said.

Farmer leader Joginder Singh Ugrahan told reporters after the meeting that the unions urged the government to repeal the three laws, but the Centre was unwilling to do so. "We decided to meet

Farmer leader Darshan Pal said there was a good discussion on all three laws. "There is a possibility of some resolution. We are positive," he added.k

# Pari: HC denies govt claims on probe

Cuttack, Jan 15: The Nayagarh minor's murder case took an unusual twist Friday with the Orissa High Court denying the state government's claim that it has sought the appointment of a sitting High Court judge to monitor the SIT probe.

In reply to a query on court-monitored inquiry into the case by RTI activist Hemant Panda, the Orissa High Court has clarified that the state government hasn't wrote any letter seeking a court-monitored investigation.

Various reports earlier suggested that senior IPS officer and special secretary, Home, Santosh Bala had

written to the Registrar General of the High Court November 28 informing that the state government has proposed the SIT to be monitored

by the High Court. While briefing journalists here Friday, Panda said he had sought information through RTI from the High Court regarding the state government's letter for court-monitored SIT probe into Pari death case and follow-up action.

As per the Additional Deputy Registrar of the court B Das, "No letter of request has been received from the state government as on date regarding the appointment of the Honourable sitting Judge of this court to monitor the SIT probe

into the murder of the minor girl, namely Pari of Nayagarh district. Since no such letter is received, the

question of action does not arise." It may be mentioned here that a five-year-old girl named Pari from Jadupur village in Nayagarh district went missing June 14 and her body was found June 23. The case attracted state-wide attention November 24 when the parents of the deceased girl attempted immolation in front of the Orissa Legislative Assembly while the winter session was underway.

Three days later, Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik had ordered a SIT probe into the case. The state government formed a five-member special investigation team (SIT) with senior IPS officer and then-IG of police Arun Bothra being the head.

### **CBI** arrests wife of Rose Valley group chairman

Kolkata, Jan 15: The Central Bureau of Investigation Friday arrested Subhra Kundu, wife of the jailed owner of Rose Valley Group chairman Gautam Kundu, from Kolkata in connection with the probe into the multi-crore chit fund

scam, sources in the agency said. Sleuths of Economic Offences Wing of the CBI apprehended Subhra Kundu and will take her to Bhubaneswar after obtaining transit remand from a court in Kolkata, they said. The case was registered in the Odisha capital. She was wanted by the CBI and the Enforcement Directorate (ED) in connection with the case.



The Rose Valley group allegedly cheated thousands of depositors, promising abnormally high returns on investments in its illegal schemes. The amount of money garnered by the group through such schemes could be more than ₹12,000 crore.

Rose Valley had also made substantial investments in hotels and resorts across the country, they said. Subhra Kundu was running a jewellery chain, Adrija, which has been sealed since the investigation started. The ED, which is looking into the money laundering aspect of thescam, issued a look-out notice against her in November 2019.

# Biden's picks: Pro India, tough on China

New Delhi, Jan 15: In 2009, India and US began their first officiallevel dialogue on China and the Asia-Pacific. The Indian side was represented by Gautam Bambawale, then joint secretary in MEA and the US by the assistant

secretary, Kurt Campbell. Over the next couple of years, Campbell and Bambawale explored the growing convergences in their respective foreign and security policies for this region. "That dialogue, the first of its kind between the US and India, set the stage for the

Bambawale. The Japan-India-US trilateral grouping began under their watch, which later became a summit-level exercise

Kurt Campbell is due to be named the Indo-Pacific coordinator by US president-elect Joe Biden, and in that role, is likely to oversee the Biden administration's approach to China and building up the Indo-Pacific policy. While Campbell may have started the ball rolling in the first Obama administration, the second Obama administration did not give that measure of impor-

tance to the "pivot" or "rebalance". For instance, the US gave China a pass over the PCA verdict on the South China Sea in 2016. Campbell's successor in the State Department, Danny Russel, stopped the East

Asia dialogue with India as well. The pandemic in 2020 only indays, the Trump administration this week lifted the curbs on diplomatic contact with Taiwan, something that may have been fraying, but had been maintained as the proverbial fig leaf. This week, the Trump White House also declassified its Indo-Pacific strategy as well as the notes of the former deputy national security adviser, Matt Pottinger.







# **ODISHA POLICE TO** WEED OUT INEPT **INSPECTORS**

Bhubaneswar, Jan 15: The state police department plans to axe senior police Inspectors with a lackluster performance during the last five years. Earlier, the state government had issued a circular instructing all the departments to set up a screening committee to weed out non-performing officials and while reward those who have performed well.

The step aims at enhancing efficiency and accountability among the officers by giving premature retirement to inefficient ones.

Following the instructions, the state police department has recently prepared a list of 228 Inspector-rank officers who have completed 30 years in service or attained or will attend 50-55 years of age between October 1, 2020 and March 31, 2021. The fate of these officers now depends upon their performance during the last five years ending December 31, 2020.

In a letter issued to various establishments, including Odisha Human Rights Commission, Vigilance, Commissionerate police, the AIG (Police Personnel) has asked the heads of the establishments to send the nomination rolls and service book details of the concerned officers. The authorities have also been asked to send details regarding the punishments and rewards received by the officers named in the list during the last five years or even prior to that.

The nomination rolls of officers who were transferred during the last three years are to be sent by the

### **OSSC** increases seed production

Bhubaneswar, Jan 15: Amidst lockdown and shutdown restriction imposed due to Covid-19 pandemic, state-run Odisha State Seeds Corporation Ltd (OSSC) has achieved a new high in production and sale of seeds during the 2020.

The corporation has produced 3,95,032 quintals of paddy and 25,034 quintals of non-paddy seeds during the year through its own production programme 'Mo Bihan Yojana', sources said Friday.

The corporation has produced 25 new varieties of paddy seeds, four varieties of ragi, 14 varieties of pulses and 16 varieties of oil seeds during 2020.

Similarly, the OSSC sold 4,07,444 quintals of paddy and 57,243 quintals of non-paddy seeds during 2020, which was the highest quantity of seeds sold by the corporation after implementation of DBT since 2016. It has installed eight seed processing plants in Sonepur, Bolangir, Baragarh, Bhubaneswar, Cuttack. Rangeillunda, Babanpur and Sheragada, the source said

# Action against corrupt co-op officials put on hold

Bhubaneswar, Jan 15: On many occasions, the state government receives complaints of financial irregularities and illegal practices against cooperative organisations. In a bid to check such anomalies, the Registrar of Cooperative Societies (RCS) had issued an order in September 2019 to initiate strong action against irate employees of such cooperative organisations.

However, now the order has been put on hold – the reason best known

In its letter No 21446, dated 30.09.2019, the Registrar of Cooperative Societies had asked all divisional deputy registrars of cooperative societies and circle assistant registrars of cooperative societies to take disciplinary actions against the secretary and other employees of the Primary Agriculture Cooperative Societies (PACS), Large-sized Adivasi Multipurpose Cooperative Society (LAMPCS), Farmers' Service Cooperative Societies (FSCS) and

concerned banks.

of PACS, LAMPCS and FSCS have the right to take disciplinary actions against their secretaries and other employees.

"During raids it was found that these vendors were selling stale and unhygenically-prepared chicken and rice-based food items to people. We destroyed more than 60 kg of food. "The minimum temperature is very likely to be below normal by 3-4 degree Celsius during next 3-4 days in the interior districts Odisha. It will gradually rise by 2-3 degree Celsius after 4 days," said the Met Centre in its evening bulletin.

The Met Centre has also issued yellow warning for cold wave in Sundargarh and Jharsuguda districts Friday and Saturday.

In view of the cold wave alert

issued by the Met, the Special Relief Commissioner (SRC) issued advisory for the municipal commissioners and Collectors of all districts in the state. The SRC observed that there is increased likelihood of cold related ailments among people which may aggravate due to prolonged exposure to cold. Livestock may also be affected due to prolonged exposure to cold.

People in the districts under Yellow warning and also in other areas where there will be intense cold have been advised to stay indoors during the night and avoid exposure to cold, the SRC stated. Movement during night especially by two-wheelers or in open cars

Of the new cases, 108 were reported from quarantine centres and 78 detected during contact tracing. Sundargarh district recorded the highest number of fresh cases

at 35, followed by Sambalpur (20) and


The two fatalities were reported from Khurda and Sundargarh.

### OSRTC bus yet to ply for Berhampur-Chandahandi

Jharigaon, Jan 15: A direct government bus between Berhampur and Chandahandi in Nabarangpur district has still been a dream for people in both the regions. As a result, people have been routinely suffering from commuting problems on this route.

It has been a long demand of people in the regions. Owing to apathy of the Odisha State Road Transport Corporation (OSRTC), the long awaited service has not been executed, a report said. According to the report, in 2008,

the OSRTC had granted route permission for its buses to operate be-



tween the two places. But the road and the transport department has not been able to run this service in the large interest of the public.

In 2017, with efforts of the then road and transport minister and the present MP Ramesh Chandra Majhi, Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik had launched an AC bus

service from Berhampur to Chandahandi. But the service was limited to Umerkote. As a result people have to pick up another bus from Umerkote to Chandahandi. They faced a lot of difficulties in commuting at Umerkote. After repeated demands of the

people, the bus service was extended to Chandahandi for a few days. It was halted on the ground that there were fewer passengers, Maoist threat and bad road condition. Meanwhile, three years have passed since the bus service was launched, but people of Chandahandi are deprived of its service. They have expressed their displeasure over it.

It was learnt that a large number of people from Ganjam live in Jharigaon and Chandahandi blocks. They have been facing commuting problem on a daily basis without a direct bus service. Most of the people and students of Jharigaon and Chandahandi blocks depend on Berhampur for educational and healthcare needs. Passengers booking tickets on an OSRTC bus to go to Chandhandi are dropped at Umerkote, but they pay fare for Chandhandi. A new road has been laid from Umerkote to Chandhandi at a cost of ₹70 crore. Despite this good road infrastructure, the OSRTC bus service has not been ensured to Chandahandi, locals lamented.

# Road safety to be observed for a month this year

Jajpur, Jan 15: Odisha ranks 12th among the states and Union territories in road accident deaths as the Centre has decided to observe National Road Safety Month instead of National Road Safety Week in view of the burgeoning number of deaths due to road mishaps in the

country every year. The matter came to the fore after the Union ministry of transport and highways issued a notification directing to observe road safety month from January 18 to February 17, 2021 instead of National Road Safety Week. Accordingly, during this period, various nation-wide activities have been planned throughout the country in association with the state governments/ UT administrations, OEMs and other stakeholders.

The month-long event will see awards being given away to best performance in road safety to a state as well as swacchta award. road safety activities by NHIDCL (National Highways and Infrastructure Development Corporation Limited), HOAI (Highway Operator Association of India), NHAI among others.

Reports said 1.50 lakh people die every year in the road mishaps for which the Centre has decided to observe the National Road Safety Week for a month instead of a week. According to report by the state Crime Branch and CID, Odisha ranks 12th in road mishap deaths in the country which have become a cause of concern for all. The state commerce and transport department is laying stress on it and has started making preparations for the success of the road safety month.



The departmental joint secretary Kishore Chandra Das has convened a preparatory meeting January 15 in this regard.

According to available reports, 3931 persons died in 2014 and 5,333 persons in 2019 in road mishaps which is a 36 per cent increase during these five years. As a result, the position of Odisha rose to 12th position from earlier 16th position

in the whole country. This has become a cause of concern as a Supreme Court-appointed committee has directed a 50 per cent reduction road mishap deaths. The state Crime Branch and CID in their reports have said 684 deaths occurred in September and October, 2019 while 871 deaths occurred during the same period in 2020. The Jajpur district witnessed 28 and 35 deaths during the same period in

Poor performance in 35 transport offices and 34 police districts is blamed for the increasing

Delay in construction and expansion of National Highways, narrow roads, encroachments, rash driving, violation of traffic norms, lack of restrictions in movement of heavy vehicles, bad road conditions are also to be blamed for the increasing road mishaps. Illegal parking, speed driving, helmet less driving, use of mobile phones during driving, drunk driving, use of mobile phones during driving are other

factors for road accidents. Sachhidananda Panda, RTO, confirmed the development stating that he is yet to receive a proper communiqué in this regard.

### The war of letters

erhaps service rules stopped them from airing their views but after retirement bureaucrats are not bound anymore and can voice their thoughts freely. This has led to the formation of pro- and anti-government groups among retired babus who jump into the fray at the behest of their conscience (or political leaning).

In the most recent instance, the "love jihad" law legislated by the Yogi Adityanath government in Uttar Pradesh has triggered a "letter war" between former bureaucrats, those who criticize the law and those who have rallied behind the state government. The ranks of the ex-babus have been joined by retired army officers, members of the judiciary and others.

Earlier, a group of 104 retired bureaucrats wrote to Yogi Adityanath, expressing "deep disapproval" and concern at the use of "love jihad" law. Noted signatories included retired bureaucrats like former NSA Shiv Shankar Menon, former chief of R&AW AS Dulat, former Chief Information Commissioner Wajahat Habibullah, former principal secretary in PMO, TKA Nair and former Union health secretary K Sujatha Rao among other notables.

Now, a Forum of Concerned Citizens, comprising of over 250 retired officers has written to the Chief Minister endorsing the 'Uttar Pradesh

Prohibition of Unlawful Conversion of Religion Ordinance 2020' and the motive behind it. In their letter, the group of former babus and exarmy officers said that the legislation rightly provides that the marriages done for sole purpose of unlawful conversion can be de-



clared null and void by family courts. They termed the letter by anti-love jihad babus a 'politically motivated pressure-group' and said that they don't represent thousands of civil servants who believe in New India emerging as the greatest democracy of the world.

One may be tempted to believe that this is an instance of political battles being fought by proxy!

### **CADRE MERGER**

More than a year after the Centre abrogated Jammu & Kashmir's special status under Article 370 and bifurcated the state into union territories, the J&K cadre of IAS, IPS and IFoS has been merged with the Arunachal Pradesh, Goa, Mizoram and Union Territory (AGMUT) cadre. This allows officers posted in these states and UTs to work in J&K and vice versa.

Necessary modifications may be made in the corresponding cadre allocation rules by the Centre. The notification issued by the government states that officers allocated to AGMUT cadre shall function following the rules framed by the Centre. Observers see in the move a message of total integration of J&K with the Centre. It also solves the Centre's problem of the reluctance of J&K cadre officers to serve in Ladakh, as it now creates a larger pool of UT cadre officers. Ladakh, they say, suffers a paucity of officers. Due to its harsh climate officers are reluctant to serve there. But with the Chinese threat looming, the Centre wishes to focus on Ladakh's development. So, clearly, it is as much a political move as an administrative one.

### MAMATA'S BIG PROMOTION PUSH

Political or administrative compulsion? West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee has promoted 31 IAS officers as secretaries and additional secretaries in one big push to bolster the state government's administration ahead of the Assembly elections.

With the BJP making a determined effort to breach her stronghold, the TMC leader is taking steps to strengthen the administrative machinery which has come under fire from various quarters. Among the 19 officers promoted as secretaries are additional secretaries Smita Pandey, Vijay Bharti, Shubhanjan Das, Samir Kumar Bhattacharya, CC Guha, Rajat Bose, Kaushik Halder, NC Sarar and TK Rudra. The new additional secretaries include V Lalithalakshmi, Sourav Pahari, Mukta Arya, Devi Prasad Karanam, Shakeel Ahmed, Uttam Patra, Santanu Saha, Nirmalya Ghosh, Anindya Narayan Biswas and Dipankar Chowdhury. But this is early in the poll campaigning and chances of further changes in the state administration cannot be ruled out as the CM seeks to stave off the BJP's onslaught to dislodge her party from power. Watch this space for updates.

### ■ Wormwood

Icohol awareness campaigners were horrified to learn a British company's plans to import and sell absinthe, the original version made with wormwood. There can hardly be an alcoholic drink with a worse reputation, even after nearly a century of prohibition in many countries. Two things made absinthe such a terror. It was about twice the strength of any other spirit (more than two-thirds alcohol). And the wormwood in it not only provided part of its green colour and a characteristic bitter taste, but also thuione, an hallucinogen that is a relative of the active ingredients in cannabis. No wonder it drove people mad and it was banned in many countries early this century. But the story of wormwood goes back much further than the absinthe manufactory set up by Henri-Louis Pernod in 1797. As a name for a native European species it originates in an old Germanic language, and it came into Old English as weremod or wermod. Its derivation is far from certain, but it may have been formed as a combination of wer. "man" (as in werewolf) and mut, "courage" (from which we get our mood). So it could be that its mood-altering properties were known from an early time. The name changed in medieval times, being thought by folk etymology to be a combination of worm and wood (the plant is rather a woody shrub), because it had been known since the time of the ancient Greeks to be an effective worming agent. Its other benefits were lauded by John Pechev in 1694: "It strengthens the Stomach and Liver, excites Appetite, opens Obstructions, and cures Diseases that are occasion'd by them; as, the Jaundice, Dropsie, and the like." That may sound like a snake-oil advertisement, but the plant was genuinely useful and was a regular part of the European herb garden. Pechey said it also keeps away clothes moths. It was known to have the same effect on fleas, so much so as to be celebrated in verse: Where chamber is sweeped, and wormwood is strowne. No flea for his life dare abide to be knowne. We know of the plant also from the Bible and Shakespeare, often as gall and wormwood, implying something acutely mortifying or vexing. The word has long been employed figuratively for something bitter or unpleasant to experience, reflecting its best known characteristic, its taste. It was commonly used to flavour both ale and wine. a practice that went back at least to Roman times, and in some rural areas it was used to flavour and preserve ale for many years after hops had been introduced to more prosperous places. Today we actually have two names for drinks derived from the same word in the English language, because the German name, which by then had become Wermut, was taken into French and used as the name for another drink that was at one time flavoured with wormwood, vermouth. (The name absinthe is from the French word for the plant, derived from its former Latin name, absinthium.)

# **SOCIAL CAPITAL & PROSPERITY**

TRUSTING ONE **ANOTHER IN GENERAL IS AN IMPORTANT FACTOR FOR SOCIETIES TO FUNCTION SMOOTHLY AND BE PROSPEROUS** 

🛮 wo years ago I moved 🏾 💃 into the household of my current hosts - an Italian and Chinese husbandwife couple in Hong Kong. I found them using AirBNB - a service that allows people to host complete strangers as paying guests in their homes. They have since become very close friends and great benefactors. Trusting one another in general is an important factor for societies to function smoothly and be prosperous. In the USA, the UK and India there is a visible decline in social trust in recent decades, whereas in countries like Canada, Australia, New Zealand. Scandinavian countries and the Netherlands seem to be heading in the opposite direction. Many leading economists such as professor of Economics at Cornell University Kaushik Basu believe that the downturn in Indian economy has more to do with social disharmony caused by divisive politics than disastrous policy decisions such as demonetisation and a flawed GST implementation. Essentially social capital consists of trust among close knit units such as family and friends and social harmony among diverse

ethnic, religious or racial groups. David Halpern, head of the UK's Behavioral Insights Team, says social trust is like the proverbial 'dark matter' when it comes to economics or well being. Its effect is important but it gets little attention. It has a stronger impact on future national economic growth rate than even skill level in population. Social trust can have a bigger impact on individual health than even 'quitting smoking' for example. Therefore, it is important to be able to measure the level of social trust and that's what social scientists have been doing for decades by asking auestions like "Do you trust others, especially strangers?" and variation of the same. There is a big difference among countries when asked "What percentage of people can be trusted?" While in countries like Brazil, it could be in the range of 10-20 per cent, in Scandinavian countries such as

Norway and Sweden or the Netherlands it may be in the higher range of 60-70 per cent. Countries like the US and the UK would fall somewhere in between.

Just like physical capital (infrastructure) and financial capital (GDP), social capital also has an important role in what makes a community or country prosperous in a broad sense. Research shows that people with a larger network of friends, family members, and colleagues tend to do better financially and even in terms of their health. This applies both at the individual and community level. Prof Robert Putnam, a public policy expert at Harvard University and author of a landmark book 'Bowling Alone' (2000), established that presence of a healthy civic network or civil society organisations made people trust each other more and made governments function better. At the same time, in societies with high levels of social capital, children do better in school, crime rates are lower and economic growth rate is higher. Interestingly, in the USA, a correlation was found between falling levels of social trust with a decline in membership figures in civic groups like parent-teacher associations, Rotary clubs, Scout troops and even bowling leagues.

In a society or community with low levels of mutual trust, people have to constantly look over their shoulders, have more lawsuits, try to avoid paying taxes or recycle. Small business owners tend to employ their relatives to work for them rather than strangers even if they

are much better at the job. There are two types of social capitals - 'bonding social capital' refers to your closeness to your friends. your family and those you interact with often. This is important for health outcomes and sense of personal security. 'Bridging social capital' on the other hand is trust between strangers, particularly among diverse groups, say whites and non-whites, Hindus and Muslims or higher castes and lower castes or the well off and the poor. This is really important for a healthy business environment leading to general well being and prosperity of the society at large.

It's universally agreed that more ethnically and racially diverse communities do much better in terms of innovation and creativity and lead to a more vibrant social environment. In India, our diversity has always been considered a great strength. Diverse teams always do better than less diverse ones in business, sports or any other group endeavour. The world

is becoming increasingly diverse with global travel and migration. Unfortunately, increase in diversity also seems to correlate with decrease in social capital. The increasing social tensions in India over inter-caste marriages or relationships across religious divides are results of such decline of trust or bridging social capital.

It is well established that the decline in social trust can be addressed in a number of ways. For example, university education that allows young people to meet and know their peers from dif-ferent backgrounds helps build social trust. People connecting with one another across lines of race or economics or gender or age is helpful in increasing social capital. Some examples are sports teams, the military, college, social service like NSS/NCC, travelling, etc. Addressing rising inequality is important as illustrated by the Netherlands, which has made a conscious effort to build a more equitable society and thereby increase its social capital successfully.

Before the age of cell phones and social media, television was considered the biggest enemy of civic engagement as it made people literally couch potatoes. With the ubiquitous cell phones it was thought that people will connect with each other more and hence it will mitigate some of the negative effects of TV. Same was expected of social media. However, both seem to have caused a negative impact on social capital by all counts. This was most dramatically illustrated by the recent mob attack on the US Capitol. Let's hope we will not allow such divisive tendencies to develop in India and Odisha by being watchful of our power hungry politicians and their machinations.

The movement – which went viral in October 2017 – undoubtedly mobilised women and spurred positive change. But its prominence in media coverage and political discussions of sexual harassment has also been problematic, overshadowing activism for women's rights in other parts of the world that predates the emergence of #MeToo.

In many countries, social movements had already been taking on sexual harassment and abuse for decades. Many of them, including campaigns like #MeshBasita in Lebanon, HarassMap in Egypt, and the "Shefarers" in the Philippines, emerged long before the rise of #MeToo, or were overshadowed by it. A new publication by the Institute of Development Studies brings together reports on women's rights activism in countries including Benin, Burkina Faso, Egypt, India, Lebanon, Pakistan, the Philippines, and Uganda. The authors cover a wide spectrum of experiences, from well-defined and visible collective action to activism that happens behind the scenes in order to safeguard women's lives.

They claim either that local women are not interested in such causes, or that sexual harassment has been fabricated by the West to destroy family values.

Then #MeToo happened. Subsequently, organisers experienced a backlash, including reactions like, "Why are you guys talking about it?" and, "This is an American

thing, a European thing. Laws against sexual harassment do exist in many of these places. But much of the legislation is dysfunctional, with women still not getting the accountability and justice they deserve. In Pakistan, for example, every workplace is now required to establish sexual-harassment inquiry procedures, including a committee to hear complaints. But research among female Pakistani politicians reveals that despite the legislation and the existence in their own workplaces. And the struggle for women's rights is not confined to physical spaces. In the past few years, online abuse has increased rapidly. This can take many forms, including "revenge porn" (sharing real or photoshopped nude or intimate images of women without their permission, for blackmail or shaming purposes). People worldwide now own smartphones and can capture, alter, and put these types of images online in minutes.

Shame and embarrassment frequently stop women and girls from reporting crimes against them, even when they are protected by existing laws. Women in all countries share these feelings, but the situation is particularly severe for women marginalised by extreme inequality and subject to norms and values that hold them responsible for anything that can tarnish their reputation. Many never speak up, terrified of being blamed by others and ostracised by their families.

Clearly, #MeToo doesn't begin to capture the story of how women and men in diverse contexts mobilise against sexual harassment. Yes. collective action against sexual harassment did coalesce around the #MeToo campaign, and in some

gised existing movements. But if it lier campaigns in other countries – whether Egypt, India, or South Africa – might have been the spark that inspired solidarity.

It is important to recognise diverse global movements and campaigns for women's rights and to see them as sources of knowledge and inspiration. Learning from the hard-won successes of women's rights activists worldwide can aid us in understanding and overcoming the obstacles women and men everywhere face in their struggle to address sexual harassment.

It would of course be counterproductive to pit voices and perspectives from the Global South against those from the West, Instead. the goal should be to amplify voices, experiences, and insights from around the world to create learning opportunities and, ultimately, to establish the conditions for greater cooperation. Sexual harassment and abuse problems are universal problems. Only through global solidarity can we hope to overcome them.

Jaipur, Jan 15: Call it an irony or bad luck for Rajasthan that despite earning huge revenues as a leading tourist state of India, it is operating without a tourism minister for the last seven months. Since then, the tourism ministry is operating sans a minister and even during the COVID crisis the industry received no significant help from the state government, say industry leaders.

# 10 months on, Kota coaching business raring to reopen

The city's coaching business has an annual turnover of ₹3,000 crore and employs at least 5 lakh people

Kota (Raj), Jan 15: The coaching industry here is set to restart January 18 after the Rajasthan government's nod to reopen schools and other educational institutes, closed for almost 10 months due to the coronavirus outbreak.

Home to at least 10 big coaching giants and 50 other institutes, the city has around 25,000 paying guest (PG) facilities and 3,000 hostels to cater to nearly 1.50 lakh students from across the country every year. The institutes coach students

preparing for competitive admission examinations of medical and engineering colleges. The coaching business in Kota

has an annual turnover of ₹3.000 crore and employs at least 5 lakh people, according to those in the

The Kota district administration has formed 11 teams, including health and police officials, to ensure compliance of the standard operating procedure (SOP) for COVID at the coaching institutes.

They are fully prepared for the resumption of classes in coaching institutes and schools with proper compliance of the coronavirus pro-



tocol from January 18 and have constituted 11 teams to oversee it, Kota Collector Ujjawal Rathore told PTI Friday. He said the teams will visit every coaching institute to ensure the compliance of the guidelines.

According to the SOP the number of students in a teaching session has been restricted to 50 per cent of total strength. Students will be checked for body temperature before being allowed to attend a class.

Classrooms will have to be sanitised after every teaching session and wearing of masks will have to be ensured.

Only one student will be allowed to stay in a hostel room and a separate isolation place will be reserved for suspected coronavirus patients in every hostel and paying guest (PG) facility.

Allen Career Institute director Naveen Maheshwari said they have created a 31-bed hospital for students where all primary health care services are available.

An ultraviolet (UV) lighting system has been installed for sanitisation of classrooms. Maheshwari said. He said UV lights equipped with sensors have been fixed in the classrooms

The UV lights automatically switch on for sanitisation as soon as students leave the class.

Meanwhile, a cleanliness drive is underway at hostels with caretakers and managers being explained about the government guide line, said an office-bearer of a body representing hostels.

Saheel Dogra, a Class 12 student who came to Kota from Mumbai said he was happy to be here as it was difficult to concentrate on studies during the online classes.

"Back in Kota, I have resumed my flow of studies and have learnt to schedule every task," said Aditi Sharma, who hails from Punjab's Amritsar and wants to be a scientist. Expressing gratitude to the government for allowing reopening of coaching institutes, Ayush Goyal of Reliable Institute said they are committed to follow the government guidelines. They are gearing up for the reopening of classes and have ensured the compliance of the guidelines, said Nitin Vijay, director of Motion Education.

### Sale, consumption of organic products rise during pandemic

Jaipur, Jan 15: There has been a substantial growth in both sale and consumption of organic products during the pandemic in Rajasthan, according to a survey.

**CUTS** International surveyed over 4,000 sellers as well as consumers of organic food products in 10 districts of Rajasthan including Kota and Jhalawar to ascertain the factors that drove the consumers to buy organic food products. As per the survey, there has been a remarkable surge in the sales of organic products in the country over last 10 months, which has encouraged several organic retailers to come up overnight.



"This change has occurred because of the changing eating habits of consumers, who are turning to organic foods in order to enhance immunity against COVID-19," it said. As many as 91 per cent sellers said there was a growth in their sales during the last 10 months of pandemic, out of which 69 per cent confirmed a substantial growth in the overall income.

Of the total surveyed consumers. 89 per cent confirmed to switching over to organic consumption mode. The survey noted the growth in sales was despite the fact that cost of organic products is higher than non-organic products.

# Scindia faction ignored in BJP's executive committee

**EXPERIENCE SHOWS THAT WHILE THE BJP CAN SHARE POWER WITH** PARTY CHANGERS. IT ALWAYS SHUNS THEM IN THE ORGANISATION

Bhopal, Jan 15: The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has finally constituted the state executive committee in Madhya Pradesh. The committee has a regional balance in the portfolios of the office bearers but the so called 'Scindia faction' has found little space in it.

Former Union Minister and Rajya Sabha member Jyotiraditya Scindia had joined the BJP leaving the Congress just before the Assembly elections, delivering a big jolt to the Congress

More than 10 months have passed since Vishnu Dutt Sharma took and people were curiously waiting for the re-formation of the executive committee. The BJP made a comeback in Madhya Pradesh in March 2020. Since then the restructuring process was on halt due to the Assembly by-polls. A total of five state General Secretaries were appointed before the by-elections and the reorganisation of the committee was expected after the

A total of 12 Vice Presidents have been appointed under Sharma along with 12 state secretaries. A Treasurer, Deputy Treasurer, Office Secretary and Media in-charge have also been appointed.

Overall, every possible effort has been made to give space to those close to various BJP leaders in the state with four representatives each



from Gwalior-Chambal, Vindhya region, Central, Bundelkhand and Mahakaushal. These apart, eight people from Malwa-Nimar have been given major responsibilities.

The front is dominated by the central region. From here have come presidents of the Mahila Morcha, Kisan Morcha, Scheduled Caste Morcha and Backward Class Morcha. The Yuva Morcha chief has been named from Mahakaushal. Scheduled Tribe Morcha president from Nimar and Minority Morcha president from Chambal.

At the same time, if one considers the supporters of the veteran leaders of the state, then one thing becomes clear: This executive is dominated by those close to Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan. Along with this, supporters of Union Minister Narendra Singh Tomar and National General Secretary Kailash Vijayvargiya

have been given place, besides the choice of the Rashtriya taken care of.

Moreover, this new executive committee is full of young faces. But only one person close to Scindia

has found space in the committee. Sources said that the BJP always ignores people who change parties. This is the reason that the 'Scindia faction' failed to get much traction. The Cabinet has a good number of Scindia supporters and they will also be taken care of in the

Corporation boards. Political analyst Arvind Mishra believes that the BJP makes its team only with "pure" people as reflected in the executive committee. Pro-Scindia people have not been given importance. Experience shows that while the BJP can share power with party changers, it always shuns them in the organisation.





New Delhi, Jan 15: Around 300 to 400 Pakistan-based terrorists are waiting in launchpads across the Line of Control to infiltrate into the Indian side, said Indian Army Chief General Manoj Mukund Naravane on Friday, adding that forces at forward locations are keeping an eye on their

The Army Chief also said that the forces deployed at Line of Control are giving a befitting reply to Pakistan's Ceasefire violations.

There has been a around 44 per cent increase in ceasefire violations by Pakistan at the LoC," said General Naravane, speaking during the Army Day celebrations on January 15 in Delhi.

Till December 28 this year, Pakistan carried out 4,700 incidents of ceasefire violations at Line of Control in Jammu and Kashmir, Ceasefire violations have jumped to 4,700, the highest in the last 17 years.

In 2019, there were 3,168 ceasefire violations. Interestingly, out of the 3.168 ceasefire violations, 1.551 have taken place since August. The security establishment noticed that it was after the government abrogated Article 370 in August last year that there was a



steady rise in ceasefire violations. In 2018, Pakistan carried out 1629 incidents of ceasefire violations.

Talking about the situation in North East states, Gen Naravane said that around 600 extremists surrendered in the last one year and huge cache of arms and ammunition were recovered. "We have got huge success in counter-terror operations working along with the Myanmar army," the Indian Army chief said. He also said that the force, along with Assam Rifles and state governments is able to successfully implement the government's Act East Policy.

### EC steps in to protect 'honest' **election officials**

New Delhi, Jan 15: Taking note of some incidents of "victimisation" of state chief electoral officers and other election officials in the post-election period on flimsy grounds, the Election Commission has directed all states to seek its prior approval before initiating any disciplinary action against such officers during their tenure, as also up to one year after completion of their stint with the poll panel.

In a letter addressed to the cab inet secretary and chief secretaries of all states and union territories Thursday, the EC said it has noted some incidents of "victimisation" of CEOs and additional, joint, deputy and assistant CEOs in the post-election period. "Many a times they are targeted for political vendetta by charging them with disciplinary cases on flimsy grounds for their earlier tenures in the state government after the completion of their tenure. An environment of fear is created to convey that the upright, steadfast and sincere officers can be taken to task at any time, on the flimsiest of the grounds," the Commission noted.

It said in such a scenario, these officers are not only "demotivated but also their morale is greatly reduced, which severely affect their efforts to ensure free and fair elections". "Left to go on unfettered, it causes a situation where officials are reluctant to join as CEOs and those who are inducted face the uncertainty of fair treatment in post-election phase," it

New Delhi, Jan 15: Rahul Gandhi led the Congress's protest in the national capital in support of agitating farmers on Friday and said the opposition party will not relent till the three new farm laws are repealed.

He was accompanied by AICC general secretary Privanka Gandhi Vadra and Delhi Congress leaders at the protest outside the lieutenant governor's residence here as part of the party's countrywide agitation. Addressing the gathering, Gandhi

said the Congress will not step back till the government repeals the three new farm laws.

"These laws are not to help farmers, but to finish them. These laws are aimed at helping corporates like Ambani and Adani instead. That is why we are standing in support of the farmers," he said.

The BJP government will have to take these black laws back. Till the time these laws are repealed, the

Congress party will not relent, Gandhi told the protesting Congressmen. "The Narendra Modi government tried to take away the land of farmers earlier, when it brought the Land Acquisition Act, and the Congress had stopped it at that time. Now, the BJP and its two-three friends are once again attacking the farmers and have brought these farm laws," he said. Rahul Gandhi and Priyanka Gandhi Vadra later joined Congress MPs and leaders from Punjab at Jantar Mantar, where they have been sitting on a "dharna" against the farm laws for 41 days. "Prime Minister Modi does not respect farmers and wants to tire out those protesting against the Centre's agriculture laws," Gandhi said at Jantar Mantar. The Congress took out protest marches at all state capitals in the country and gheraoed Raj Bhawans on Friday. It also protested against the rising fuel prices. # Domestic air travellers drop by 50% in 2020: DGCA

THE IMPACT OF THE PANDEMIC CONTINUES TO BE FELT ON THE INDIAN AVIATION SECTOR

New Delhi, Jan 15: A total of 6.3 crore domestic passengers travelled by air last year, 56.29 per cent lower than 2019, Indian aviation regulator DGCA said

The impact of the coronavirus pandemic continues to be felt on the Indian aviation sector as the regulator said that only 73.27 lakh people travelled by air domestically in December last year, which was 43.72 per cent lower than in the corresponding period of 2019.

While IndiGo carried 3.25 crore passengers last year, a 51.7 per cent share of the total domestic market, SpiceJet flew 93.9 lakh



passengers, which is 14.9 per cent share of the market, according to data shared by the DGCA.

Air India, GoAir, AirAsia India and Vistara carried 69.32 lakh,

54.38 lakh, 43.87 lakh and 39.39 lakh passengers, respectively, in 2020, the data showed. The occupancy rate or load factor of six major Indian airlines was be-

tween 65.1 per cent and 78 per cent in December 2020, it stated. The passenger load factor in the

month of December 2020 has shown declining trend compared to the previous month primarily due to the end of tourist season, the Directorate General of Civil\_ Aviation (DGCA) said.

The occupancy rate at SpiceJet was 78 per cent last month, highest among the six major Indian carriers. India resumed domestic passenger flights May 25 after a gap of two months due to the coronavirus pandemic.

Indian airlines are allowed to operate a maximum of 80 per cent of their pre-COVID-19 domestic

# IS terrorists using secured messaging platform

New Delhi, Jan 15: Amid the debate over privacy concerns, several people are switching to Telegram and Signal from WhatsApp, but the terrorists in India and abroad are using a much more advanced secure messaging platform to communicate with their counterparts across the globe without being traced and without leaving any digital footprint, a National Investigation Agency (NIA) probe has revealed.

The NIA during its probe into the Islamic State Iraq and Syria

Khorasan Province (ISIS-KP) case has found that arrested accused Jahanzaib Sami Wani and his wife Hina Bashir Beigh and Bengalurubased doctor Abdur Rahman aka 'Dr Brave' were using Threema, a secure messaging platform.

Wani and Beigh were arrested in March 2020, while Rahman in August. In a statement January 12, an NIA spokesperson had said: "Till recently Rahman was in regular communication with ISIS terrorists located abroad as well as in India, including Sami on 'Threema', a secure messaging platform."

The revelations were made



Tuesday when the anti-terror-probe agency filed a chargesheet against Rahman, who had returned from Syria in December 2013 and was

misusing his medical knowledge to develop laser-guided missile system for the banned terror group.

According to NIA officials related to probe, who wished ro remain anonymous, said that Rahman was using his knowledge of ophthalmic lasers for developing a project on laser-guided system through which the trajectory of an unguided missiles can be changed with laser technology for the benefit of ISIS.

The official said that the "basic components" for such system are pulse transmitters and receivers. which are same or almost similar in flight circuits or ophthamology nanosecond lasers and could be used to guide missiles or rockets or payloads towards intended targets...

The NIA ISKP case is based on the one registered by Delhi Police's Special Cell in March 2020 after the arrest of Wani and his wife from Okhla Vihar in Jamia Nagar area here for alleged links with the the terror group. The NIA had taken over the probe March 20, 2020.

However, this is not the first time that the NIA has come across the secure messaging platform used by the IS terrorists as well as Hizbul-Mujahideen, Lashkar-e-Toiba and Al Qaeda terrorists.

# India all set for world's largest vaccination drive

New Delhi, Jan 15: Almost a year after reporting the first case of deadly coronavirus, which has claimed over 1.5 lakh lives in India till now, the country is set to witness a historic moment Saturday with the commencement of the eagerlyawaited vaccination drive against the dreaded disease.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will virtually launch the world's largest vaccination programme at 10:30 a.m. on Saturday and almost three lakh beneficiaries, belonging to the priority groups, will be administered the silver bullet at over 3,006 vaccination sites across the country, Around 100 beneficiaries will be vaccinated at each session site.

The vaccine will be first offered to the healthcare workers, frontline workers and those above 50 years of age, followed by the below 50 population with comorbidities, and finally to the remaining population based on disease epidemiology and vaccine availability.

The vaccination drive has been planned in a phased manner, identifying the priority groups. Healthcare workers, both in government and private sectors, including Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) workers, will receive the vaccine in the



Two vaccines -- Oxford Covid vaccine Covishield manufactured by the Serum Institute of India, and indigenously developed Covaxin by the Bharat Biotech -- will be administered to priority groups. Till now, the Central government has procured 1.1 crore Covishield and 55 lakh Covaxin vaccines at a cost of ₹200 and ₹206 per dose, respectively.

Earlier Friday, Union Health Minister Harsh Vardhan said that India's exercise to vaccinate its population against Covid-19 will be the largest immunisation drive in the world. The minister reiterated that both the indigenously manufactured vaccines have proven to be safe.

The Covid-19 Vaccine Intelligence Network (Co-WIN) system, a digital platform, will be used to track the enlisted beneficiaries on a realtime basis. Prime Minister Modi will launch the app Saturday.

The platform enables national and state administrators to view and sort the data of the beneficiaries as per their gender, age and comorbidity. They can also view the metadata of vaccination and the Adverse Event Following Immunisation (AEFI) reported from the constituent districts

At the vaccination site, only pre-registered beneficiaries will be vaccinated as per prioritisation, and there will be no provision for on-the-spot registrations. A dedicated 24x7 hotline - 1075 - has also been set up to address questions related to the vaccine rollout and the Co-WIN app.

The entire vaccination process will be broadly similar to the election process. Each vaccination team will consist of five members, including security personnel, nurses, paramedics and a doctor. Three will be a waiting area, an inoculation room and a post-vaccination observation area. There will also be a reception desk for registration and verification of the beneficiaries.

Explaining the process of the vaccination drive, Ajeet Jain, the nodal officer of Delhi's Rajiv Gandhi Super Specialty Hospital, said, "The whole process from registration of beneficiaries to observation post-vaccination will take 45 minutes. At the entry point, vaccination officer-I will verify all the documents of the beneficiaries. On being cleared, they will come to the waiting area and wait for their turn."

Notably, only those above 18 years will be vaccinated. Pregnant women or who are not sure of their pregnancy and lactating mothers should not take the vaccine. Those with a history of bleeding or coagulation disorder will be administered the vaccine with utmost caution.

Vaccination will have to be deferred for four to eight weeks after recovery of patients with active Covid symptoms, or those who have been given plasma therapy, and those who are unwell or have been hospitalised for any other reason.

# India, Nepal make efforts to restore normalcy in ties

New Delhi, Jan 15: Foreign ministers of India and Nepal on Friday held a comprehensive review of all aspects of bilateral ties and explored ways to further strengthen cooperation in key areas of connectivity, trade and energy, in the first high-level engagement between the two nations after relations nosedived following a boundary row last year

In the sixth India-Nepal Joint Commission Meeting (JCM), External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar and his Nepalese counterpart Pradeep Kumar Gyawali discussed cooperation in a range of areas including economy and trade, border management, power, oil and gas, water resources, capacity building and tourism among others, an official statement said. Gyawali, accompanied by Nepalese Foreign Secretary Bharat Raj Paudyal arrived here on Thursday on a three-day visit in the midst of a political turmoil in Kathmandu, triggered by Prime Minister KP Sharma Oli's sudden decision to dissolve Parliament and call for fresh elections. Ties between India and Nepal came under severe strain after Nepal last year published a new political map that showed the three Indian territories - Limpivadhura. Kalapani and Lipulekh - as part of Nepal. In the statement, the

mentioned border management among several areas of cooperation that the two sides discussed in the meeting. However, it was not immediately known whether the dispute over the three areas figured in the talks

# Construction of new Parl building begins

Excavation work has started at the site where a sufficient number of labourers have been engaged to ensure that the project is completed on time, the official said. PM Modi had laid the foundation stone for the new Parliament building on December 10 last year.

Earlier this week, a 14-member

### 13 KILLED IN **KARNATAKA ROAD MISHAP**

Dharwad (Karnataka), Jan 15: In a major road mishap, at least 13 people, including 11 women, were killed and six others were critically injured when a tempo traveller collided with a truck near Itigatti village in Karnataka's Dharwad district Friday morning.

The deceased have been identified as Asha Jagadish, Praveena, Poorninma, Manasi, Pramjyothi, Rajeshwari Shivakumar, Shakuntala, Usha, Veda, Nirmala, Maniula Neelesh, Rajini Sriniyasa and Preethi Ravikumar. According to the police, the

tempo traveller was carrying 17 passengers, mostly women, from Davangere to Goa for a family function when the tragedy struck.

Dharwad Superintendent of Police P. Krishnakant told IANS that 11 women passengers and two drivers died on the spot, while six passengers who sustained critical injuries have been shifted to the Karnataka Institute of Medical Sciences (KIMS) for treatment

Krishnakant added that the truck was going to Hubballi from Belagavi while the tempo traveller was heading from Davanagere to Goa. Apparently, the truck had overtaken the tempo, resulting in a massive accident.

Another police officer, who was on the spot, told IANS that the cops had to take the help of a crane to extract nine bodies from the mangled tempo traveller. The police said that about fortnight ago, the group had planned this trip to Goa and had decided to leave their family members behind.

# Drone operations feature for first time at Army Day parade

New Delhi, Jan 15: Drones of the Indian Army carried out mock kamikaze attacks and first-aid delivery exercises as the service showcased its latest assets during the Army Day parade held at the

Cariappa ground here Friday. This is the first time drones featured at the parade that also had detachments of the upgraded antiaircraft weapon system Schilka, BrahMos missile system, infantry fighting vehicle BMP-2, T-72 bridge laying tanks and multi-rocket launcher system Pinaka. Army Chief Gen M M Naravane conferred gallantry awards and unit citations at the event, which was also attended by Air Chief Marshal R K S Bhadauria, Navy Chief Admiral Karambir Singh and Chief of Defence Staff Gen Bipin Rawat.

The Indian Army said it carried out a live demonstration of "drone swarming capability" using 75 indigenously designed and developed drones, which executed an array of artificial intelligence (AI) enabled simulated offensive missions and close support tasks, at the event.

'This demonstration is a recognition of the Indian Army's steady embrace of emerging and disruptive technologies to transform itself from a manpower-intensive to a technology enabled force to meet fu-



ture security challenges," it said in a statement. Around 75 drones of

the Indian Army carried multiple mock operations including kamikaze

attacks, first-aid delivery and parachute payload delivery exercises at the event. The first detachment of the parade was of the upgraded anti-aircraft weapon system Schilka and it was commanded by Captain Preeti Chaudhary of the 140 AD regiment (self-propelled).

Marching contingents of the Jammu and Kashmir Rifles, the Mahar Regiment, the Garhwal Regiment and the Jat Regiment also participated in the parade.

Thirteen Army officers of the Northern Command, eight officers of the Eastern Command, one officer each of the Southern Command and the Central Command received unit citations from the Army chief, while 15 Army personnel were

awarded the Sena Medal. Army Day is celebrated on January 15 every year in recognition of Field Marshal K M Cariappa's taking over as the first Commanderin-Chief of the Indian Army from Sir Francis Butcher, the last British Commander in 1949. It is celebrated in the national capital, as well as in all the six Army Command > Headquarters.



### Syrian Air spreads wings

Beirut: Syrian Air conducted its first flight in a decade between the northern city of Aleppo and Lebanon's capital Beirut early Friday, resuming a round-trip route that's been halted since Syria's conflict began in 2011. Precautionary measures against the coronavirus were in place, with passengers required to show PCR tests taken less than three days before the flight, according to Syria's state news agency SANA.

### Gas pipeline gets approval

**Berlin:** German authorities Friday gave immediate permission for work to resume on a subsea pipeline bringing natural gas from Russia. The decision by the Federal Maritime and appealed, meaning there could be another halt to the construction on the Nord Stream 2 project, which has drawn major criticism from the United States, some other European countries and environmental groups.

### Pak schools to reopen

Islamabad: Pakistan announced Friday that all secondary and higher secondary level schools in the country will reopen from January 18, nearly two months after the educational institutions were closed due to the second wave of the coronavirus pandemic. All educational institutions were closed November 25 last year due to a surge in the number of coronavirus cases during the second wave of the pandemic. Initially, it was decided to reopen them January 11 but the decision was delayed for a week.

### China builds new quarantine center

Beijing: A city in northern China is building a 3,000-unit quarantine facility to deal with an anticipated overflow of patients as Covid-19 cases rise ahead of the Lunar New Year travel rush. # 'US has dropped to 2,500 troops in Afg'

Washington, Jan 15: The US military has met its goal of reducing the number of troops in Afghanistan to about 2,500 by Friday, a drawdown that appears to violate a lastminute congressional prohibition.

"Today, the United States is closer than ever to ending nearly two decades of war and welcoming in an Afghan-owned, Afghan-led peace process to achieve a political settlement and a permanent and comprehensive ceasefire," the acting secretary of defense, Christopher Miller, said in a written statement,

adding that 2,500 troops is enough to continue countering extremist groups in Afghanistan and training Afghan government forces. "Continued fulfillment of these

two complementary missions seeks to ensure that Afghanistan is never again used to harbor those who seek to bring harm to the United States of America," Miller said.

President Donald Trump, who ordered the reduction in November, said Thursday that troop levels in Afghanistan had reached a 19-year low, although he did not mention a troop number.

Last February his administra-



tion struck a deal with the Taliban to reduce American troop levels in phases and to go to zero by May 2021. It is unclear how the incoming Biden administration will pro-

# Dutch govt resigns over childcare subsidies scandal

The Hague, Jan 15: Dutch Prime Minister Mark Rutte said his government had resigned Friday over a scandal in which thousands of parents were falsely accused of benefit fraud, admitting the system had gone "terribly wrong".

Many parents were forced to pay back large amounts of money and ended up in financial ruin as a result. Some were also targeted for investigation because they had dual nationality. "The buck stops here," Rutte told a press conference after



a crisis meeting of his four-party coalition cabinet in The Hague.

'We are of one mind: if the whole system has failed, only joint responsibility can be borne. And that leads to the conclusion that I have just now offered the king the resignation of the entire cabinet."

Rutte, who came to power in 2010 and is one of Europe's longest serving leaders, added: "The rule of law must protect its citizens from an allpowerful government, and here that's gone terribly wrong." The government's resignation comes just two months before the Netherlands was due to hold elections, and as it battles surging coronavirus cases. Rutte said the cabinet would stay on in a 'caretaker" role until the polls March 17 and "do what is necessary in the interests of the country."

# Another recession looms for UK economy as lockdowns bite

London, Jan 15: The British economy looks set to fall back into recession after official figures on Friday showed that it shrank by 2.6% month-on-month in November. when much of the country was in a second coronavirus lockdown.

The Office for National Statistics said that as a result of the fall, the economy is 8.5% smaller than its prepandemic peak. When the pandemic struck last spring, the economy contracted by up to a fifth over the first half of the year, before a summer easing of restrictions saw the economy recover a chunk of those

Because of the November fall,

the economy is set to contract again in the fourth quarter.

With most of the UK in an even tighter lockdown at the start of 2021 following a spike in new cases that has been blamed on a new variant of the virus in London and southeast England, it looks inevitable that the economy will shrink further in the first quarter of the year. That means it will have contracted for two consecutive quarters, the techni-

cal definition of a recession. "Its clear things will get harder before they get better and today's figures highlight the scale of the challenge we face," said Britain's Treasury chief Rishi Sunak.

The November decline was not as bad as some economists feared, an





New Delhi, Jan 15: Strong demand and prices for steel in China should provide a cushion to regional and Indian steel prices already at lifetime high levels, Motilal Oswal Institutional Equities said in a report

"China's domestic steel prices remain strong and are at nine-year highs (led by robust overall demand and higher raw material cost locally) which we believe should provide a cushion to regional and Indian steel prices (at lifetime highs)," the brokerage said in its report on the steel sector. Steel prices have already touched all-time high in the domestic market and are currently hovering around ₹57,250 per tonne. Through Q3, HRC (hot roller coils) and Primary rebar prices increased by ₹12,000 per tonne and ₹15,500 per tonne respec-

On average, per-tonne HRC/Rebar prices were up by ₹6,500/Rs7,200. Higher prices have also been sup-



which on an average, rose by ₹1,270 per tonne in Q3, driven by strong steel production and also iron ore shortage after the auction of 19 mines in Odisha which did not match up the production rates prior to the auction.

But one of the reason for an upturn in the steel sector is rising demand in China. The country's December 2020 trade data exhibits a normalization of the steel trade as net steel exports turned positive Y-o-Y for the first time since the onset of the pandemic. While the country's steel exports rose marginally Y-o-Y for the first time in eight months, imports (which had surged 100% due to supply disruption in China) also declined Y-o Y for the first time in ten months.

According to the brokerage, demand for flat steel remains strong, with passenger car sales up 7% Y-o-Y. "We believe demand for long steel has however moderated, possibly weighed by weakened construction activity" the report said.

# 'India took decisive steps to deal with pandemic'

Washington, Jan 15: IMF chief Kristalina Georgieva has praised India for taking "very decisive" steps to deal with the coronavirus pandemic and its economic consequences and asked the country to do more this year to support an accelerated transformation of the economy

The IMF Managing Director during a global media roundtable on January 14 predicted a less bad outlook for India in the upcoming World Economic Update due to the steps taken by it.

When I called on everybody to stay tuned for January 26, that applies very much to India. You would see a picture in our update that is less bad. Why? Because the country actually has taken very decisive action, very decisive steps to deal with the pandemic and to deal with the economic consequences of it," Georgieva said.

The International Monetary Fund is scheduled to release its



World Economic Update January 26. Talking about India, she said it was a very dramatic lockdown for a country of this size of the population with people clustered so closely together.

"Then India moved to more targeted restrictions and lockdowns. What we see is that that transition, combined with policy support, seems to have worked well. Why? Because if you look at mobility indicators, we are almost where we were before COVID-19 in India, meaning that economic activities

have been revitalised quite signif-

icantly," she said. "What the government has done on the monetary policy and the fiscal policy side is commendable. It is actually slightly above the average for emerging markets. Emerging markets on average have provided six% of the GDP. In India, this is slightly above that, Good for India is that there is still space to do more..... If you can do more, please do," Georgieva said. According to the IMF Managing Director, 2021 is the year to use that space.

# Digital payments well entrenched across households: Survey

New Delhi, Jan 15: Digital payment methods are well accepted by Indian households and are not just the 'preserve' of the rich or well-educated, finds a study conducted by People Research on India's Consumer Economy (PRICE) in partnership with the National Payments Corporation of India

Covering 5,314 households across 25 states with a sample designed to represent states and households across the income spectrum, the survey was aimed at understanding the awareness, adoption and use behaviour of households with respect to digital payments.

The study showed that while one

of two of India's richest 20% households use digital payments, as many as one out of four households in the poorest 40% also use it. In addition, there is a suppressed demand of people who say they desire to use it but need someone to show them how to, and a smaller group who used it earlier and discontinued.

If this 'ready' demand is enabled

through effective training and education, then over half of all Indian households (54% or 151 million households) will become digital payment users - 55 million of these households will come from the poorest 40% of Indian households, 61 million will come from middle India or middle 40% income band and only 36 million will come from the richest 20%. The report also points to



ership is no longer a bottleneck for the adoption of digital payments with 68% of the respondents (those in charge of looking after banking and payment work for the household, typically the Chief Wage earner)

smartphone usership is near universal at 90% for the richest 20% of Indian households, but as high as 57% of India's poorest households have a smartphone.

The report revealed a very high level of awareness of UPI and payment apps and that households



may not be completely aware about interoperability of the platform. There is a potential to create the awareness that any bank or payment app can be used to make UPI payments to any UPI user and users should know their UPI ID.

The RuPay card volumes have

also witnessed a rise not only in urban areas, but also in remote PIN codes that had hitherto remained silent. According to the study, the banking system is also very well connected digitally to respondents via Aadhaar linkages and SMS facility even at the lower income groups. The report finds 87% of the respondents are aware of the fact that they get SMS from the banks, which gives them the confidence to manage their money safely.

As per the report, the Direct Benefit Transfers (DBT) delivery system has worked exceedingly well for the respondents and got even better during lockdown as around 85 per centof the households received DBTs on their bank accounts.

For someone, who was supposed to be a net bowler, India's Test Cap No.300, did well enough on the first day despite not exactly being a natural. He also knows that he doesn't have the express pace to trouble batsmen (his average speed is 130

Nobody would have blamed a Natarajan or a Shardul Thakur or 'leader of the attack' Mohammed Siraj (1/51), all of whom toiled manfully throughout their multiple spells in a battle of unequals.

The inexperience was palpable as Thakur (1/67) bowled a lot of full pitched deliveries which Labuschagne pounced on in the second and third sessions during his innings.

If all the injuries weren't enough, Navdeep Saini (7.5 overs) now seems to be in trouble as he has sustained a groin niggle moments after his skipper Ajinkya Rahane dropped a dolly at gully when Labuschagne was on 37.

By far, Australia's most consistent batsman in the series, Labuschagne batted in two gears during the day. In the first session, he faced 82 balls and sedately moved to 19 but in the next 113 balls, scored another 82 runs to reach his fifth hundred in 195 balls.

He trusted the bounce, hit some lovely drives and was also ready to pull anything that was short. During his partnership with Smith, the

former Australian skipper was the aggressor but

looking to get a move on, fell for the leg trap that was set for him.

Rohit stationed himself at short mid-wicket for a whip that Smith plays on the on-side. They were banking on the extra bounce that they had seen Washington generate with the white ball.

The plan worked as Smith flicked one straight into Rohit's hands just few minutes after the lunch. Having lost four of their key players (Bumrah, Ashwin, Ravindra Jadeja and Hauma Vihari) due to various injuries, Rahane couldn't have lost a worst toss as Tim Paine elected to bat.

The new-look Indian bowling line-up kept it steady at the onset removing openers David Warner and Marcus Harris in the first session.

That Australia forced a half-fit Warner (1) to play was evident when he had no apparent footwork while trying to drive an angular delivery from Siraj, which was brilliantly snapped by an agile Rohit diving to his right.

It could be seen that Warner, after his groin injury, was still finding it difficult to stretch his front-foot and get to the pitch of the delivery.

Thakur, whose debut against West Indies ended in a nightmare after bowling only 10 deliveries, achieved success, bowling the 11th one in the Test arena. It was a gentle outswing, an inswing for lefthanded Harris (5), who instinctively clipped it straight to debutant Sundar at square leg

BRISBANE: Pacer Thangarasu Natarajan, who came to Australia as a net bowler. Friday became the first Indian cricketer to make his international debut across all three formats during the same tour.

The 29-year-old Tamil Nadu player was one of the rookies named in the playing eleven of the injury-ravaged Indian team against Australia in the fourth and final Test which started here Friday.

He made his international debut in the third ODI against Australia December 2 in Canberra, Natarajan made an immediate impact by taking two wickets for 70 runs from his 10 overs. Natarajan then played his part in India's 2-1 series win in the subsequent three-match T20I series by taking six wickets during the series.

"Welcome to Test cricket... Thangarasu Natarajan becomes the first Indian player to make his International debut across all three formats during the same tour," the ICC tweeted.

The Tamil Nadu player, whose mother worked as a daily wager, picked up two wickets in the 20 overs he bowled on the day.

"The stuff dreams are made of. A perfect treble for @Natarajan\_91. As he is presented with #TeamIndia's Test No.300. It can't get any better! Natu is now an allformat player," tweeted the BCCI.
