Bhubaneswar, Feb 13: Despite opposition from the Odisha government. the Andhra Pradesh government Saturday held panchayat elections in disputed Kotia gram panchayat.

Elections were held in Kotia area despite Koraput district Collector warning his Vizianagaram counterpart not to go ahead as the matter is currently sub-judice in the Supreme Court.

The Supreme Court is scheduled to hear a plea on Andhra Pradesh invading Odisha's territory February

Villagers of Patusineri under Kotia gram panchayat in Pottangi block were seen queuing up at polling booths in the morning to cast their votes even after efforts by Potangi BDO and Tehsildar to convince the villagers not to participate in the electoral

Police and poll officials from Andhra Pradesh were deployed in Kotia gram panchavat.

Pottangi block chairman Jagatjyoti

Pangi said Andhra Pradesh is holding rural polls Saturday despite the opposition from the Odisha government.

On Friday Koraput district Collector Abdaal Akhtar had written to his Vizianagaram counterpart M Hari Jawaharlal appealing not to conduct the elections in the disputed region of

"I am to bring to your attention that in Contempt Petition No. 172/2021 arising out of Original Suit No. 10/1968 (The State of Odisha Vs. M Hari Jawaharlal and Others), the Honorable Supreme Court of India has been pleased to issue notice to the State of Andhra Pradesh and post the case to Friday, the 19th February, 2021. In its oral observations, the Court has also observed that should the State of Andhra Pradesh go ahead with its plans as regards the subject mentioned above, necessary consequences will follow," said the Koraput

"The same was pronounced in the presence of counsel for the State of Andhra Pradesh. A copy of the associated case documents have been

New Delhi, Feb 13: "The right to protest cannot be anytime and everywhere", the Supreme Court said as it dismissed a plea seeking review of its verdict passed last year in which it had held the occupation of while dismissing a plea by one public ways during the anti-CAA protests at Shaheen

A bench of Justices Sanjay Kishan Kaul, Aniruddha Bose and Kirshna Murari said, "We have perused the review petition and record of the civil appeal and are convinced that the order of which review has been sought, does not suffer from any error apparent

warranting its reconsideration". The bench, which has passed the order recently, said it has considered the earlier judicial pronouncements and recorded its opinion that "the Constitutional scheme comes with a right to protest and express dissent but with an obligation to have certain duties".

"The right to protest cannot be anytime and everywhere. There may be some spontaneous protests but in case of prolonged dissent or protest, there cannot be continued occupation of public place affecting rights of others", the bench said

Massive quake hits Japan

TOKYO: A day after tremors jolted Tajikistan and parts of North India, a powerful earthquake of magnitude 7.1 on the Richter Scale struck the northern coast of Japan Saturday night, Apart from Tokyo, the quake was felt in Miyagi and Fukushima prefectures in Japan's Tohoku region. The Japanese Meteorological Agency issued a statement saying, "A powerful magnitude 7.1 earthquake, which measured a strong 6 on the Japanese seismic intensity scale - the second-highest level - jolted Mivagi and Fukushima prefectures in the Tohoku region late Saturday night." "The quake, which also felt in Tokyo, where it registered a 4 on the Japanese scale, struck around 11:08 p.m., according to the Meteorological Agency.

Shanghai, Feb 13: China refused to give raw data on early COVID-19 cases to a World Health Organization-led team probing the origins of the pandemic, one of the team's investigators said, potentially complicating efforts to understand how the outbreak

The team had requested raw patient data on the 174 cases of COVID-19 that China had identified from the early phase of the outbreak in the Chinese city of Wuhan in December 2019 as well as other cases but was only provided with a summary, said Dominic

"That's standard practice for an outbreak investigation," he told this news agency Saturday via video call from Sydney, where he is currently


undergoing quarantine. He said that gaining access to the raw data was especially important since only half of the 174 cases had exposure to the Huanan market, the nowshuttered wholesale seafood centre in Wuhan where the virus was initially detected.

'That's why we've persisted to ask for that," he said. "Why that doesn't happen, I couldn't comment. Whether it's political or time or it's difficult ... But whether there are any other reasons why the data isn't available, I don't know.

One would only speculate." While the Chinese authorities provided a lot of material, he said the issue of access to the raw patient data would be mentioned in the team's final report. "The WHO people certainly felt that they had received much much more data than they had ever received in the previous year. So that in itself is an advance.'

A summary of the team's findings could be released as early as next week, the WHO

said Friday. The WHO-led probe had been plagued by delay, concern over access and bickering between Beijing and Washington, which accused China of hiding the extent of the initial outbreak and criticised the terms of the visit, under which Chinese experts conducted the first phase of re-







Ganja worth ₹3.5Cr from Odisha seized in Mumbai

Mumbai, Feb 13: The Anti-Narcotics Cell (ANC) of Mumbai Crime Branch has seized 1,800 kg ganja worth ₹3.5 crore brought from Odisha and arrested two persons in the biggest such operation in recent past, an official said Saturday.

The kingpin of the inter-state smuggling racket is identified as Laxmikant Pradhan, a resident of Ganjam district

On a tip-off, police intercepted a truck at a foot over Express highway in suburban Vikhroli Friday evening and

found the contraband, he said. The cannabis was being smuggled in Mumbai from Odisha in the truck, the offi-

Yadav, 25, and Dineshkumar Saroj, 26, were arrested.

The kingpin of the interstate smuggling racket is identified as Laxmikant Pradhan, a resident of Ganjam district in Odisha, the official said.

"Members of this racket used to bring 5 tonne of ganja in Maharashtra every month and around 3 to 4 tonne of it was distributed in Mumbai and neighbouring districts," he said. Milind Bharambe, Joint Commissioner of Police (crime), told reporters that the gang used to hire trucks from Mumbai under the guise of importing coconuts, but would actually smuggle in ganja. He said the gang used to unload the smuggled ganja at a godown in Bhiwandi in Thane district.

The man responsible for distribution of the contraband in Mumbai and neighbouring areas has been identified as Sabdeep Satpute, he said adding that money was moved either through hawala or in cash. A hunt is launched for Pradhan, Satpute and other members of the gang.



crete sleepers have been sanctioned on the stretch between Ranital and Baudpur in Bhadrak. Apart from this, a new proposal has been given for similar works at vulnerable locations between Bhubaneswar and Retang, Vizianagaram & Nellimarla, Gopalpatnam & Visakhapatnam and between Kottavalasa & Pendurti stations.

About 110 new vulnerable places have been identified in ECoR jurisdiction. To reduce these activities, wide trench will be constructed parallel to track to stop trespassing of animals, pedestrians and bikers. Barricade by using rail sleepers and rail posts would be erected to stop two-wheelers from crossing the rail lines

To reduce unauthorised crossing on railway track, ECoR has closed crossings by erecting rail posts and deep trenching parallel to track in order to obstruct the pathways at some of the places.

NHAI PROPOSES EQUAL SHARE DISTRIBUTION; STATE GOVERNMENT AGREES TO BEAR 25% COST

Bhubaneswar, Feb 13: Following repeated demands from the state. the National Highway Authority of India (NHAI) has floated a tender for the much-awaited Kanupur spill channel on new NH-520 in Keonjhar district. The project has remained incomplete due to a fight between NHAI and the state gov-

In a recent letter to Water Resources Secretary Anu Garg, NHAI member (technical) Mahabir Singh said the tender has already been invited for construction of the bridge with a project cost of ₹102.40 crore. The target has been set to complete the project within 18 months from the date of com-

However, the cost sharing—the main reason behind the delay in completion of the project—has not been resolved yet. The NHAI has proposed the state government to equally distribute the project cost



while the state government has agreed to bear 25 per cent of the agreement cost.

The necessity of construction of the bridge is solely on account of the spill channel. The cost has also increased significantly due to site condition. Therefore, may I request you to consider the sharing of the cost equally between NHAI and the water resources department," Singh mentioned in his let-

The NHAI has floated the tender following repeated demand from the state government. The water resources department had taken up the issue with NHAI several times. Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik in November last year had also written a letter to Union Road Transport Minister Nitin Gadkari for early completion of the bridge project.

According to water resources department sources, the dam and the spillway work of the irrigation project are almost complete except for the river gap portion.

River closing is a vital activity for impounding the reservoir and this has been inordinately delayed due to delay in construction of the bridge over the spill channel of Kanupur irrigation project by

Later, the project authority started the work for the tendered cost of ₹40.68 crore of which NHAI agreed to bear 80 per cent. But, later on, the cost of the bridge was revised to ₹100 crore due to a change in its design because of underground geological conditions. As the NHAI didn't agree to bear their share of the 80 per cent of the revised cost, the work came to a halt.

The project was conceived 40 vears ago and three Chief Ministers have laid its foundation on different occasions. The Kanupur irrigation project over river Baitarani in Keonjhar will create irrigation for 29,578 hectares in the tribal dominated Keonihar district.

59 new Covid cases detected in state

Bhubaneswar, Feb 13: Odisha's COVID-19 tally mounted to 3.36,101 Saturday as 59 more people tested positive for the infection, a health official said. Half of the state's 30 districts did not report any fresh case, he said. Thirty-four new cases were reported in quarantine centres, while 25 infections were detected during contact tracing, the official said. Bargarh and Sundergarh districts reported the highest number of new cases at nine each. The state now has 787 active cases, while 3,33,351 people have recovered from the disease, 1,910 patients have succumbed to the infection and 53 others have died due to comorbidities, he said.

Odisha has so far tested over 80 lakh samples for Covid-19.

Ganjam, Gajapati villagers give slip to admin, take part in AP polls

Patrapur, Feb 13: Even as the Ganjam district administration claimed to have taken steps to prevent residents in bordering villages of this block from voting in panchayat elections of Andhra Pradesh, their plans were frustrated when people voted in the elections, Saturday.

Conscious of the district administration's plan, the candidates conducted meetings in the villages Friday night and arranged buses and tractors so that the voters could travel to the booths in Talguranthi and vote in the election. Many of the residents even did not put indelible ink on their fingers so as not to get caught by the district officials in Ganjam.

Several people from Kuladi, Satapuri, Gudikhala, Badanasahi, Banjuasahi and Tumba villages visited pooling booths across the border in the wee hours of Saturday and returned home after casting their votes before the arrival of district officials in the area.

The Patrapur block and tehsil officials had launched an awareness programme 'Mo Gaonre Tehsil' 'Mo Nibedan' and public hearing camp in five villages on the fringes of Andhra Pradesh after media reports claimed that the residents of Tumba, Duratal and Gudipadar panchayats voting in the panchayat election of the neighbouring state in exchange of various welfare benefits. Notably, two days back, the villagers had given in writing to the district administration not to par-

ticipate in the panchayat elections. As a result, the district administration's tall claims of not allowing people to vote in the panchayat elections were frustrated as several residents voted in the elections.

When questioned by the district officials, many claimed innocence and showed their fingers without ink mark. However, some of them were honest to show their ink marked fingers.

Sibaram Sabar of Kuladi village and Kundari Sabar of Satapuri village alleged that the state government has been neglecting them while the Andhra government is home-delivering them with pension, rations and providing good education to their children, power connection to villages and healthcare facilities. Some even went on to allege that the district officials and public representatives only visit their villages and make tall promises but never implementing them. Moreover, the attempt by the district administration of neighbouring Gajapati to prevent the residents of disputed Gudikhala village in Duratal panchayat from voting in Andhra election was also frustrated after over 30 people were found to have voted in the polls.

Ganjam sub-collector accompanied by Patrapur tehsildar Amit Kumar Nayak, Raigad (Gajapati) tehsildar Leelabati Achari visited the village but the villagers escaped through their backyard and boarded a tractor to vote in the election.

The Andhra government has renamed the village as Gudikhudi and provided houses to the residents under Indira Awas Yojana The neighbouring state has also built an Anganwadi centre in the village and providing allowances, pensions and even financial assistance to the residents after Titili cyclone while construction of a drinking water project is underway. 'The Patrapur block officials even conducted a 'Mo Nibedan' programme on a mandap constructed by the Andhra government.

More firepower to forest officials to tackle poachers

Dhenkanal, Feb 13: Amid reports of increasing poaching in Hindol range, the forest department has decided to equip its staff with more fire power, a report.

What is worrying was that on the same day, poachers had opened 17 rounds of bullets at forest officials who were conducting patrolling in

Though the forest department has been conducting investigation, it has failed to get any clue about the

In the wake of poachers' misadventure challenging the forest officials, the department has woken up from its slumber. Taking a serious note of the incident, the department has decided to impart training to forest officials on firing at Police Reserve line so that they will be able to counter poachers and timber mafia. DFO Dr Prakash Chand Gogineni and SPK Shiba Subramani have held talks with in this regard.

After this incident, the forest department is aware of the fact that poachers have become more active than before in the area. They, in fact, worried about the safety of ele-

Ignoring the urgent

The Budget delivered earlier this month was praised for two things. First that it was spending money in the right place: capital expenditure, which would create value over the long term. And second that it was transparent. The deficit is three times what it should be but at least the government has accepted it. Perhaps these two things are enough to make it a good Budget, though one does not know. There has not really been any Budget that I can remember that has made any difference to most people's lives, except perhaps one and that was in 1991

However, it is clear that the budget has ignored something that was urgent. The National Family Health Survey 2019-20 conducted by the government revealed some terrible numbers.

On four key metrics which represent the nutritional status of children, states recorded a significant fall in 2019-20 compared to the levels in 2015-16. In states like Gujarat, Maharashtra and West Bengal, the share of anaemic and wasted (low weight for height) children was significantly higher than the levels recorded 15 years earlier in 2005-06. This indicated a reversal of progress that had been hard to win. Even in states such as Kerala, which continued to lead in these indicators, the levels recorded in 2019-20 were poorer than the 2015-16 figures.

The survey put out data for 22 states and Union territories and an analysis of 10 major states was conducted. Anaemia among children was higher in all the 10 states in 2019-20 compared to 2015-16. In Gujarat, Himachal, Maharashtra and West Bengal, a higher percentage of children were anaemic in 2019-20 than were in 2005-06. The percentage of wasted children was higher in half of the 10 states. In Assam, Gujarat, Karnataka, Maharashtra and Bengal, a higher percentage of children were wasted in 2019-20 compared to 2005-06. In seven of the 10 states analysed, a higher percentage of children were underweight (low weight for age) in 2019-20 compared to 2015-16. Stunting (low height for age) was higher in six out of the 10 states compared to 2015-16.

The study also found that incident of diarrhoea had increased in half the states including Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Gujarat, Maharashtra, Karnataka and Bengal. In Bihar it was up from 10.4 per cent in 2015-16 to 13.7 per cent in 2019-20

This is the reality of the situation. We can debate what has caused this and that can wait for another day. The problem is that the budget did not acknowledge and therefore did not accommodate for this problem.

The mid-day meal scheme, on which crores of children depended for their one good meal of the day, found its budget cut from ₹13,400 crore in FY 2021 to ₹11,500 crore in 2022. This was lower in nominal terms than what it had been seven years earlier. Inflation adjusted it was 38 per cent lower. The Integrated Child Development Scheme (ICDS) meant to provide preschool children with food, education, primary healthcare, immunisation, health check-up and referral services to children under six and their mothers was also lower in nominal terms, at ₹16,888 crore in FY22 versus ₹18.691 in 2014-15. The programme, running rural anganwadis or creches, is meant to improve the nutritional and health status of children "to lay the foundation for proper psychological, physical and social development of the child," to "reduce the incidence of mortality, morbidity, malnutrition and school dropout" and "to enhance the capability of the mother to look after

for 2022 than it had been the year Modi took over.

Poshan Abhiyan, the flagship programme to improve nutritional outcomes by 2022, was also damaged. The government had released only 46 per cent of the annual outlay by October 31 and in 2022 the budget was cut by 27 per cent. The Drinking Water and Sanitation department saw its budget officially rise from ₹21,000 crore to ₹60,030 crore but of that ₹50,000 crore was for the "Central road and infrastructure fund" suggesting a fudge to avoid embarrassing questions. The numbers seemed deliberately made hard to compare with previous spends. ICDS was clubbed with Poshan Abhiyan, the Scheme for Adolescent Girls and the National Creche Scheme and the whole thing was called Saksham. Its budget for 2022 was less than the previous year's budget for ICDS alone

the normal health and nutritional needs of the child through proper nutrition and health education." Inflation adjusted, this figure was 36 per cent lower

The Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana, the Centre's maternity benefit programme, was clubbed with the Beti Bachao Beti Padhao scheme for girls' education, the Mahila Shakti Kendra and other general gender budgeting and the whole thing was called Samarthya. It received ₹2.522 crore in 2022, less than the ₹2.858 allocated in 2021

The allocation for Ayushman Bharat (dubbed 'Modicare' by Amit Shah) was the same for 2022, ₹6,400 crore, as it was for the year before. There was no provision for minimum wage and health insurance for anganwadi and Accredited Social Health Activist (ASHA) workers, the individuals whom Modi had called 'Covid warriors'

The numbers are not going to improve themselves. They will need external intervention from the government, but that has not happened in this Budget. Whether it was wise on an issue that concerns crores of our children we will not know till the government conducts the next survey

■ Makebate

✓ou've almost certainly met makebates — though you probably don't know them by that name — people whose chief aim or pleasure is to spread discord and disharmony. Sir Walter Scott was a great user of this word: Elsewhere he may be an useful and profitable member of the commonweal - here he is but a makebate, and a stumbling-block of offence (The Abbot, by Sir Walter Scott, 1820). Somebody who is a makebate is clearly making a bate. The second half survives today in abate and debate: it's from Latin battere, to beat or fight (the first sense of debate in English in medieval times was to quarrel or battle). As a noun, bate described discord that was severe enough to result in a fight. British readers might think they recognise in this another form of bate, a fit of rage or bad temper, an example of which appeared in the Daily Mail in January 2004: "Shrieking with simulated frustration, Clarkson flew into a bate. picked up a hammer and smashed his desktop to smithereens." But the evidence suggests that this derives from a nineteenth-century respelling of the verb bait, to persecute a person with persistent attacks, so that a person was said to be in a bate as a result of being baited. Among the other senses of bate, one in particular is known to falconers. A hawk that beats its wings in agitation and flutters off the perch is said to bate. This is ultimately also from Latin battere, but directly from the intermediate French batre, to beat, linked to the verb to batter.

FISCAL APOCALYPSE iscal prudence is still one of the main issues of concern for economists and policymakers and it is a

key criterion in rating the economic strength of a country. The pandemic-induced recession through supply disruption and demand compression has ravaged our economy in such a way that revenue generation has declined and spawned a mammoth fiscal deficit. Though the government is in de-

nial, an unfettered fiscal deficit of 9.5 per cent of GDP in a revised estimate of 2020-21 Budget and projected 6.8 per cent of GDP in next fiscal with concomitant other economic malaises indicates not only fiscal profligacy but the looming fiscal apocalypse.

The government has tried to remain unscathed by attributing unbridled fiscal deficit to recession and improved spending but it has failed to contain fiscal deficit within the limit in the past too. In 2019-20, fiscal deficit was pegged at 3.3 per cent but was revised upward to 4.6 per cent of GDP despite a massive expenditure cut.

The grim reality is that there is no increase in budgeted expenditure for 2021-22 in real terms when compared to revised estimate of previous fiscal. What is outlandish is that to camouflage the government's failure, fiscal deficit has been relegated to a secondary role in fiscal policy. The government which was opposed to higher fiscal deficit has legalised the ballooning fiscal deficit for failing to contain it. It has discarded its long-term commitment to bring the deficit down to close to 3 per cent of GDP and plans to lower the fiscal deficit to 4.5 per cent of GDP only by 2025-26, which may be changed again.

In its previous Budgets, the Modi government had preferred fiscal consolidation to increasing welfare expenditure. Economists advocating more public spending through higher fiscal deficit were condemned.

In the past, it was argued by market economists, even IMF and World Bank, that the more the fiscal deficit, the more market bor-

rowings and lower funds available for the private sector to borrow. The rise in government borrowing to finance an increase in the deficit leads to increasing money supply, triggers a spike in inflation, and causes interest rates to rise. Higher interest rates reduce or "crowd out" private investment and reduce growth.

It was also argued that market as well as the investor reacts negatively to the rise in fiscal deficit that results in the outflow of capital, stock market crash. However, it is proved wrong as Sensex rose 5 per cent or 2315 point on February 1, the best Budget-day performance since 1999 even if bond yields spiked due to widening fiscal deficit.

Relinquishment of fiscal rectitude is not only reflected in the budget but also was advocated in the Economic Survey of 2020-21 which argues that "counter-cyclical fiscal policy" or fiscal slippage is justified so as to boost sluggish demand and consumer sentiment. Earlier, a higher fiscal deficit was also opposed under the plea that rating agencies will downgrade ratings. But there is a chapter in the Survey attacking rating agencies. Further, printing of money is advocated without fear with the

plea that the same would "not necessarily lead to inflation and a debasement of the currency" if the extra money is invested in the right projects. This shows how our government changes rules to suit its purpose. The duplicity of the government, so-called intellectuals, and economists is exposed as those who earlier opposed higher fiscal deficit, have now started arguing that higher fiscal deficit creates growth-enhancing measures. Citing modern monetary theory (MMT), they also argue that sovereign nations capable of printing their own money cannot ever go bankrupt, because they can simply produce more fiat currency to service debts. However, this rule can be applied to those countries having reserve currencies like America.

Fiscal deficit is not bad if the money borrowed is spent on creating assets or the welfare of people and within the repayment capacity of the government. But a fiscal deficit of 6.8 per cent of GDP pegged in 2021-22 is too high and will push the economy into a debt-trap. What is worrisome is that the escalating fiscal deficit is not due to increased expenditure as propounded but primarily on account of revenues collapsing

or the inability of the government to tax the rich and the cor-

Not imposing new taxes or not raising the tax rates on the rich is tantamount to giving subsidy to rich/corporate indirectly. In the time of resource crunch, exacerbated by the pandemic, the government should have imposed wealth tax on those 100 billionaires whose wealth has increased 35 per cent in the lockdown period. The maximum tax rate should have been enhanced further to reduce dependence on borrowing. But the way the government is generating revenues by increasing excise taxes on petroleum products is not only regressive but hurts the masses by making everything costlier.

India cannot afford to go on debt splurge given the record mammoth contraction of GDP, and people are not benefited by present debt-induced growth as benefits of growth are garnered by a few but the cascading effects of debt falls on the masses. There is a certain limit to what extent debt can rise. It is immaterial if it rises in absolute numbers, but as a proportion of GDP, it should be within a certain limit, say 60 per cent of GDP as determined by the government in past

According to Nobel laureate Joseph Stieglitz, an important lesson of Covid-19 is that one cannot rely on a debt-dependent development strategy. The countries around the world that relied on debt are now facing difficult times. A study by the World Bank found that countries whose debt-to-GDP ratios exceed 77 per cent for long periods, experience substantia slowdowns in economic growth.

But, India's debt-to-GDP ratio is around 90 per cent now which is much high in any condition. If the economy does not grow by 14.4 per cent in nominal term and 10 per cent in real term in 2021-22 as estimated, then the debt problem may assume alarming proportions.

Jaipur, Feb 13: Continuing a scathing attack against PM Narendra Modi over the farm laws on the second day of his visit to Rajasthan, Congress leader Rahul Gandhi Saturday alleged that the prime minister wants to 'hand over' the entire agriculture business to his 'two friends'.

Gandhi addressed two farmers rallies at Rupangarh in Ajmer and Nagaur's Makrana. He had addressed farmers' rallies in Hanumangarh's Pilibanga and Sri Ganganagar's Padampur on the first day of his two-day Rajasthan trip Friday. At the Rupangarh rally, Gandhi said 40 per cent people of the country are stakeholders in the farming business.

"It is the business of 40 per cent people, which includes farmers. small and medium businessmen. traders and labourers. Narendra Modi wants to give this entire business to his two friends. This is the objective of the farm laws." he claimed but did not name anyone.

"Narendra Modi said he is giving options but the options are: hunger, unemployment and suicide," he alleged. Gandhi, wearing a Rajasthani safa or turban. reached the rally venue driving a tractor with Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot and state Congress chief Govind Singh Dotasra sitting with

Now, I will give in writing to the Speaker that all members in the Rajya Sabha and the Lok Sabha should observe a two-minute silence," he said while expressing confidence that the Speaker will allow this. About the farm laws he said, "The first law is about finishing the mandi system, the second is about allowing unlimited hoarding and the third is about snatching the rights of farmers to go to courts." Here, Gandhi also climbed on a camel cart and waived to people.

NGT directs closure

Green Tribunal has directed the authorities to take action against the illegal operation of brick kilns in Sri Ganganagar district of Rajasthan and shut down the units that are running without permis-

A bench headed by NGT Chairperson Justice A K Goel also ordered recovery of environmental compensation for the period of illegal operation following due process of law.

"For those not having consents, closure can be immediately, particularly when show-cause notice has already been given. For those having consents, it is necessary to verify whether they are meeting the prescribed pollution norms," the bench said

The tribunal directed that a joint committee of the Central Pollution Control Board, state pollution control board and the District Magistrate may look into these aspects and furnish a factual report within three months.

"The state pollution control board

and District Magistrate may take remedial action against kilns operating without consent forthwith and for assessment and recovery of compensation, after following due process. Similarly, action be taken, in accordance with law, against those found non-compliant, and action taken report filed. Notice is not being issued to individual kilns, as the statutory authorities will follow due process while taking action, in exercise of their statutory powers, for which hearing by this tribunal is not required," the bench said.

Advocate Pushpinder Singh, appearing for the petitioners, submitted that 225 brick kilns are operating without any consent to operate and should be closed im-

The tribunal was hearing a plea filed by Hakam Singh and others seeking compliance of environmental norms by the brick kilns in Sri Ganganagar district in Rajasthan.

The plea alleged absence of requisite consents under the Air and the Water Acts and siting criteria resulting in air pollution.



Herbal cigarettes marketed illegally cause of concern

Chandigarh, Feb 13: Online availability of cheap herbal cigarettes and 'bidis' which are being illegally marketed as healthier alternatives to traditional cigarettes is a matter of concern, warn researchers from the Oral Health Sciences Centre of the Postgraduate Institute of Medical Education and Research (PGIMER) here.

They said that regulations are urgently needed on sale and marketing of these products under the healthcare category.

These herbal products, containing potentially harmful substances rather than nicotine or tobacco, are being marketed as health-promoting products, said Oral Health Sciences Centre's head Krishan Gauba, one of the researchers.

In their research published on line in the journal Tobacco Control, they say the cheap herbal cigarettes and 'bidis' - a blend of certain herbs rolled in 'tendu' leaves -- are widely available online.

They are often marketed as a safer and healthier alternative to traditional cigarettes, along with various other unverified 'health' claims.

The fact is that though these products do not contain any nicotine or tobacco, but have other potentially harmful substances, and may act as a gateway product to conventional tobacco products, explained Arpit Gupta, a faculty from the PGIMER.

He advocated that the sale and marketing of these products must be urgently regulated.

Similar to the illegal sale of imported cigarettes, without adhering to specified health warnings, both in pictorial and text formats, in this region, the herbal cigarettes and 'bidis' are also widely available in the market.

Because of their rising popu-



In this study, Google, Yahoo and Bing search engines were used to find retail web pages offering herbal smoking products, including cigarettes and 'bidis'.

Out of the initial 1,044 records retrieved, 73 retail web pages were included in the final analysis which revealed 24 brands, produced by 18 manufacturers, offering 189 different flavours in packs of five to 20 sticks. Nearly two thirds (62 per cent) of the webpages sold herbal cigarettes; 12 per cent sold herbal 'bidis'; and 26 per cent sold herbal 'shisha' or

Forty-three websites (59 per cent) spelt out health benefits in their product descriptions, of which 41 per cent claimed the benefits to be based on complementary medicine; the remainder was manufacturers' own claims.

The claims included use as a smoking cessation aid (40 per cent); a stress reliever (19 per cent); and to ease respiratory symptoms, including Covid-19 (15 per cent). Other claims included use as a

jetlag; a concentration or energy booster; and digestive aid. Only 16 per cent of the webpages clarified that the claims had not been evaluated by the FDA (US Food and

Drug Administration)' or any other regulatory authority. Fewer than three per cent cautioned: 'Any type of smoking is injurious to health'. And none of the retail web pages listed the possible

Two thirds (67 per cent) of the included retail web pages didn't require any proof of age before purchase, and just 22 per cent stated 'not to be sold to minors'

New Delhi, Feb 13: Punjab has become the 13th state in the country to successfully undertake "One Nation One Ration Card system" reform stipulated by the Finance Ministry.

The state has now become eligible to mobilise additional financial resources of Rs 1.516 crore through Open Market Borrowings. Permission for the same was issued by the Department of Expenditure.

Punjab has now joined 12 other states namely, Andhra Pradesh, Goa, Gujarat, Haryana, Karnataka, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Tripura and Uttar Pradesh, which have completed this reform.

On completion of One Nation

One Ration Card system reform, these 13 states have been granted additional borrowing permission of Rs 34.956 crore by the Department of Expenditure.

One Nation One Ration Card System is an important citizen centric reform. Its implementation ensures availability of ration to beneficiaries under National Food Security Act (NFSA) and other welfare schemes, especially the migrant workers and their families, at any Fair Price Shop (FPS) across the country.

The reform also enables the states in better targeting of beneficiaries, elimination of bogus/duplicate/ineligible card holders resulting in enhanced welfare and reduced leakage.

Further, to ensure seamless inter-state portability of a ration card, Aadhaar seeding of all



ration cards as well as biometric authentication of beneficiaries through automation of all Fair Price Shops (FPSs) with installation of electronic point of sale

(e-PoS) devices are essential. Therefore, additional borrowing limit of 0.25 per cent of the Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) is allowed to the states only on

completion of both of the following actions: Aadhaar Seeding of all the ration cards and beneficiaries in the state; Automation of all the FPSs in the state.

In view of the resource requirement to meet multiple challenges posed by the Covid-19 pan-

demic, the Central government had on May 17, 2020 enhanced the borrowing limit of the states by 2 per cent of their GSDP. Half of this special dispensation i.e. 1 per cent of GSDP was linked to undertaking citizen centric reforms by the states.

Till now, 17 states have carried out at least one of the four stipulated reforms and have been granted reform linked borrowing permissions. Out of these, 13 states have im-

plemented the one nation one ration card system, 12 states have done ease of doing business reforms, 6 states have done local body reforms and 2 states have undertaken power sector reforms. Total reform linked additional borrowing permission issued sofar to the states stands at Rs 76,512



'Disengagement happening as per **India's intent'**

New Delhi, Feb 13: The Line of Actual Control (LAC) demarcated by India and China has had many claims and counterclaims in the past, but the latest disengagement is not happening as per the Chinese claims made to India in 1959.

"Disengagement at the LAC is not happening as per China's 1959 claim. It is absolutely incorrect and untrue that India has given in to China's claim on LAC," former Director General of Military Operations (DGMO), Lieutenant General Vinod Bhatia (retd), told IANS.

He said that India wanted a status quo ante that implies what was the location, position and deployment as of April 2020, just before the Chinese forward deployment started in May 2020. "As per that, the Chinese position has been at the east of Finger 8, a place called Sirijap on the north bank of the Pangong Lake. Our location had been a place called Dhan Singh Thapa. That was the position in April 2020, which has been a traditional position for the last many years," he said.

Talking about China's 1959 claim, Bhatia said that it is based on too many interpretations and perceptions. "The disengagement is taking place from the friction points which are the most sensitive on the north and south banks of

Pangong Lake," said the former DGMO, adding that these are the friction points where tanks, infantry combat vehicles and infantry soldiers get face-to-face in very close proximity.

"These frictional points have the probability of clashes. That is what has been addressed. First, the most sensitive area on the south bank of Pangong Lake. The disengagement process has started from there and subsequently it will be taken up in the other sectors," he said. Bhatia said that it is going to be

a long and tedious process, which won't be an easy doing. "These are high altitude areas and it will take time. They (China) will be vacating the constructions they have done, move bunkers and habitants from Finger 5 and Finger 6,' he said. "So India's aim was the position of status quo ante and it has been achieved. Now to say that the position was of 1959 and we have de facto accepted it is an absolutely incorrect statement to make," he said Talking about the way forward to resolve the issue, Bhatia said that first there should be disengagement from all the friction points and thereafter there will be de-escalation and then de-induction. The retired officer said that the first step is always to resolve the crisis and then take things forward step by step, adding that talks to resolve the border issues should continue.

Covaxin effective for 9-12 months, no serious side-effects so far: AIIMS

New Delhi, Feb 13: Mathematical calculations indicate that Covaxin may provide immunity against Covid-19 for 9 to 12 months, and there may be a booster shot after this period elapses, Y.K. Gupta, the President of AIIMS Bhopal and Jammu, told IANS.

Stressing on the safety and effectiveness of Covaxin, Gupta, former Dean (Academics), and ex-Department Pharmacology, AIIMS, New Delhi, said that no death has been reported so far due to Covaxin, nor has there been any case of major side-effects, adding that more clarity will emerge by March end when data from Phase 3 trials will be available to establish the efficacy of Covaxin. The approval for Covaxin, the homegrown vaccine developed by Bharat Biotech, had faced unrelenting criticism, especially when it was administered to scores of healthcare workers during Phase 1 of the vaccination drive. The crit-

ics have badgered Covaxin's approval in the absence of Phase 3 trial data. Speaking to IANS, Gupta said, "These are not scientifically correct claims. Covaxin was ap-

proved for emergency use and the data from Phase 1 and Phase 2 trials, and the ongoing Phase 3 trials, suggest that it is safe and effective, and by March-end tentatively, the data from Phase 3 trials will be available to establish its efficacy."

When queried on the safety of Covaxin and people developing side-effects after its administration, Gupta said: "The vaccine is being given to lakhs of people, and there are hardly any serious sideeffects. Rather there are only minor side-effects, whuihg indicate the effectiveness of the vaccine. No death has been caused by Covaxin so far." Commenting on India's vaccine technology in the backdrop the new mutant coronavirus strain reported in a few countries, Gupta said: "The Indian vaccine technology with minor tweaking has the potential to address these new

Addressing the attack on the efficacy of Covaxin by many scientists globally, Yadav said they have made irresponsible comments.

CWC conducting simulation studies on new glacial lake

THE HIMALAYAS HAS MORE THAN 2,000 GLACIAL LAKES OF 10 HECTARES OR MORE

New Delhi, Feb 13: The Central Water Commission (CWC) is conducting simulation studies on the artificial lake formed in the upper stretches of the Rishiganga river after the catastrophic Uttarakhand flood early this week, and also examining the possibility of carrying out a controlled blast to drain out the water.

CWC chairman Saumitra Haldar on Saturday said studies are being conducted keeping in mind the forecast of the India Meteorological Department (IMD) that the area could receive a rainfall of 1 cm and

snowfall of 10 cm on February 15 and 16. The CWC is also examining possibilities of what can be done if the water to rises to "critical" level.

'We are assessing what could be the impact if the water level rises following rains and snowfall as predicted by the IMD. We are also studying what volume of water would be released if the lake bursts and how much time it would take to reach downstream," Haldar told PTI. He said the lake is 400 metres in length, 25 metres wide and 60 metres deep.

'We don't want the size of the lake to increase any further. We are examining all possibilities that



also include controlled blast at the lake," Haldar said. He, however, pointed out that the site is not accessible and it has not been decided which agency will execute the controlled blast.


"So in case if the controlled blast is not possible, we are also exploring other ways to tackle the situation," he added.

Haldar said several agencies/ institutes like the Wadia Institute of Himalayan Geology, Defence Research Development Organisation (DRDO), ISRO's Indian Institute of Remote Sensing and Uttarakhand State Disaster Management Authority have conducted studies on the lake.

The temporary water body was formed after sediments that the Sunday's flash floods brought down, blocking the mouth of a stream that joins the Rishiganga river.

The CWC chairman said as of now there is no increase in the water level from Joshimath to Haridwar. "We are continuously monitoring the water levels downstream," he said.

In a tweet Friday, the CWC said, "An artificial Lake has formed on river Rishiganga in Chamoli district, Uttarakhand, with a length of 350 m height of 60 m with slope of 10 deg.'

Farmer unions seek high-level probe **TIKAIT SUPPORTS FARMERS' PROTEST**

New Delhi, Feb 13: Protesting farmer unions Saturday demanded a high-level judicial inquiry into the violence during the tractor rally in Delhi January 26 and the alleged 'false" cases slapped on the peasants.

Addressing a press conference at the Singhu border, Samyukta Kisan Morcha leaders asked farmers who are getting police notices not to appear before the force directly and instead approach the legal cell constituted by the unions for any assistance. Kuldeep Singh, a member of SKM's legal cell, said that a retired judge of the Supreme Court or high court should probe the incidents to unravel the "conspiracy" behind the January 26 violence and the alleged "false cases" against the farmers.

According to SKM leaders, 16 farmers who had participated in the tractor parade are still untraceable. In the Republic Day violence, over 500 police personnel had been injured, while a protestor had died.

On January 26, thousands of protesting farmers who reached ITO from the Ghazipur border clashed with the police. Driving tractors, many of them reached the Red Fort and entered the monument, where a religious flag was hoisted. At the press conference, another leader Ravinder Singh said that 122 farmers had so far been



The farmers' protests are continuing on the borders of Delhi against the agricultural laws with 'Mahapanchayats' taking place to boost the movement and spread it across the country while BKU leader Rakesh Tikait has emerged as the prominent voice of the movement However, enthusiasm in the farmers is less in Tikait's absence at the Ghazipur border protest. Tikait, national spokesperson of the Bhartiya Kisan Union, told IANS, "This movement is a mass liberation movement, people are in captivity and they have to be released, hence the mahapanchayat is being held." It has been 80 days of the protests and slowly the farmers leaders' properties are being questioned. On this Tikait said, "I do not know how many properties are bing talked about. I do not have anything, although more than what is being told."

Arrested Jaish-e-Mustafa chief's shocking disclosures

Jammu, Feb 13: Hidayatullah Malik, the chief of Jaish-e-Mustafa (JeM), a front outfit of Jaish-e-Muhammad (JeM) terror group, who was arrested February 6 in J&K's Jammu city, has made shocking disclosures to his interrogators sending the security paraphernalia into a tailspin, both here and in Delhi.

Malik was arrested from Sanjwani area of Jammu February 6 although he had been putting up in Bhatindi area of the city for quite sometime.

Malik, according to a top source, has disclosed that he had carried out a successful video recce of the office of Ajit Doval, the national security advisor, at Sardar Patel Bhawan in Delhi.

"He disclosed that he had carried out the video recce on the instructions of his handler in Pakistan who had directed him to do so because the terrorists were planning to target some of the highest value Indian targets," top source said.

Doval is one of the most highly protected persons in the country. He has been on the terrorist hit list because of his role in the Uri sur-

gical strike in 2016 and the Balakote attack in 2019.

Doval had also added to the worries of his enemies across the LoC by his masterly handling of the security situation in Kashmir in 2019 when articles 370 and 35A were abrogated and the state of J&K divided into two union territories.

To the utter bewilderment of his enemies, Doval, with the complete synergy of all the security agencies, was able to ensure that not a shot was fired in the aftermath of 370 abrogation. This, according to the disclosure made by Malik, was more than the terrorists and their handlers could take.

Humidity from masks may lessen severity of Covid-19

New Delhi/New York, Feb 13: The humidity created inside the mask, which we wear to protect ourselves from getting or spreading SARS-CoV-2, can also help in combating Covid-19 as face masks substantially increase the humidity in the air that the mask-wearer breathes in, a new study suggests.

This higher level of humidity in inhaled air could help explain why wearing masks has been linked to lower disease severity in people infected with SARS-CoV-2, because hydration of the respiratory tract is known to benefit the immune system, according to the paper published in the Biophysical Journal.

'We found that face masks strongly increase the humidity in inhaled air and propose that the resulting hydration of the respiratory tract could be responsible for the documented finding that links lower Covid-19 disease severity to wearing a mask," said lead author Adriaan Bax from National Institute of Diabetes and Digestive and Kidney

High levels of humidity can limit the spread of a virus to the lungs by promoting mucociliary clearance (MCC), a defence mechanism that removes mucus and potentially harmful particles within the mucus from the lungs, the researchers said.

'65% pvt hosps in Thane lack fire

Thane, Feb 13: The Thane Municipal Corporation (TMC) Saturday said that 65.20 per cent private hospitals in the city have not complied with fire safety regulations despite repeated reminders. In an official release, the civic body said that there are 347 private hospitals in the city. The TMC recently conducted a fire audit of these facilities.

However, 28 of them were found to be shut. Of the remaining 319 hospitals, 111 found to have complied with the fire safety regulations and submitted the certificates, it said. The remaining 208, which comes to 65.20 per cent are yet to comply with the fire safety norms and submit their certificates, the release said. The civic body has given time till February 22 to these 208 hospitals for compliance, in the absence of which they will face severe action, it added.

Indian astronomers spot a flare from very rare black hole

New Delhi, Feb 13: Indian astronomers have reported one of the strongest flares from a feeding super massive black hole or blazar called BL Lacertae, analysis of which can help trace the mass of the black hole and the source of this emission, the Department of Science and Technology said Saturday.

Such analysis can provide a lead to probe mysteries and trace events at different stages of evolution of the Universe, it said.

Blazars or feeding super massive black holes in the heart of distant galaxies receive a lot of attention from the astronomical community because of their complicated emission mechanism. They emit jets of charged particles travelling nearly at the speed of light and are one of the most luminous and energetic objects in the Universe.

'BL Lacertae blazar is 10 million light-years away and is among the 50 most prominent blazars that can be observed with the help of a



relatively small telescope. It was among the 3 to 4 blazars that was predicted to be experiencing flares by the Whole Earth Blazar Telescope (WEBT), an international consortium of astronomers," the statement said. A team of as-

Fuel tanker blast causes massive fire at Afghan-Iran border

Herat, Feb 13: A fuel tanker exploded Saturday at the Islam Qala crossing in Afghanistan's western Herat province on the Iranian border, injuring at least seven people and causing a massive fire that consumed more than 500 trucks carrying natural gas and fuel, according to Afghan officials and Iranian state media.

It wasn't immediately clear what caused the blast. Wahid Qatali, Herat's provincial governor, said Afghan first responders did not have the means to put out the fire and had requested support from Iran in the form of fire fighting aircraft.

'For the time being, we can't even talk about the casualties,' Qatali told The Associated Press.

The intensity of the flames meant ambulances were having trouble reaching the wounded or getting close to the site of the blast, said Mohammad Rafiq Shirzy, spokesman for the Herat regional hospital.

Seven people injured by the fire have been admitted to the hospital in Herat so far, he said. The fire has forced Afghanistan

to shut down its electrical supply from Iran, leaving Herat in the dark, said Wahidullah Tawhidi, spokesman for the Ministry of Power Supply.

Amazon sues NY **Attorney General** over Covid norms

New York, Feb 13: In an unusual move, Amazon has filed a lawsuit against New York Attorney General Letitia James in a bid to stop her from regulating the company's workplace safety response to the Covid-19 pandemic.

In the lawsuit filed on Frid Amazon has argued that the regulation of its response to the pandemic is already covered by federal law, CNBC reported.

The lawsuit by Amazon is an attempt to preempt what it says is a threat by James to sue the company "if it does not immediately agree to a list of demands, many of which have no connection to health and safety and have no factual or legal basis.'



In response to the lawsuit, the New York Attorney said that she will "not be intimidated by anyone," James said in a statement.

"Let me be clear: We will not be intimidated by anyone, especially corporate bullies that put profits over the health and safety of working people," he added.

SPACEX CREW-4 MISSION

NASA assigns 2 astronauts to ISS



Washington, Feb 13: NASA has assigned two crew members to launch on the agency's SpaceX Crew-4 mission to the International Space Station (ISS). NASA astronauts Kjell Lindgren and Bob Hines will serve as spacecraft commander and pilot, respectively, for the Crew-4 mission, the US space agency said on Saturday, adding that additional crew members will be assigned as mission specialists in the future by the agency's inter-

national partners. The mission is expected to be launched in 2022 on a Falcon 9 rocket from Launch Complex 39A at NASA's Kennedy Space Center

in Florida. Lindgren, Hines and the international crew members will join an

expedition crew aboard the space

station for a long-duration stay. This will be Lindgren's second trip into space, following a 141-day stay at the space station in 2015 for Expeditions 44 and 45.

Part of an Air Force family, he was born in Taipei, Taiwan, and spent a good part of his childhood living in England before finishing high school at Robinson Secondary School in Fairfax, Virginia, Before being selected as an as-

tronaut in 2009, he was a flight surgeon supporting space shuttle and space station missions. In December 2020, NASA named

him as one of the Artemis Team of astronauts helping to pave the way for NASA's upcoming lunar mis-Hines, a Lieutenant Colonel in the

US Air Force, was selected as an astronaut in 2017 and will be making his first trip into space.

EU calls on China to reverse ban on BBC **World News channel**

Beijing, Feb 13: The European Union Saturday called on China to reverse its ban on the BBC World News television channel imposed in apparent retaliation for Britain's pulling of the licence of state-owned Chinese broadcaster

The EU said in a statement that Beijing's move further restricted 'freedom of expression and access to information inside its borders," and violated both the Chinese constitution and the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.



The statement also said that Hong Kong's announcement that its public broadcaster would also stop carrying BBC broadcasts added to the "erosion of the rights and freedoms that is ongoing" in the semi-autonomous Chinese territory since the imposition last year of a sweeping new national security law.

Religion and death penalty collide at US Supreme Court

Washington, Feb 13: The Supreme Court is sending a message to states that want to continue to carry out the death penalty: Inmates must be allowed to have a spiritual adviser by their side as they are executed.

The high court around midnight Thursday declined to let Alabama proceed with the lethal injection of Willie B. Smith III. Smith had objected to Alabama's policy that his pastor would have had to observe his execution from an adjacent room rather than the death chamber itself.

The order from the high court follows two years in which inmates saw some rare success in bringing challenges based on the issue of chaplains in the death cham-

This time, liberal and conservative members of the court normally in disagreement over death penalty issues found common ground not on the death penalty itself but on the issue of religious freedom and how the death penalty is carried out. Justice Brett Kavanaugh, one

of three justices who said they would have let Smith's execution go forward, said Alabama's policy applies equally to all inmates and serves a state interest in ensuring safety and security. But he said it was apparent that

his colleagues who disagreed were providing a path for states to follow.

States that want to avoid months or years of litigation over the presence of spiritual advisers "should figure out a way to allow spiritual advisors into the execution room,

Alabama had up until 2019 allowed a Christian prison chaplain employed by the state to be physically present in the execution chamber if requested by the inmate, but the state changed its policy in response to two earlier Supreme Court cases.

Robert Dunham, the executive director of the Death Penalty Information Center, says the court's order will most clearly affect states in the Deep South that have active execution chambers.

Dunham said most state execution protocols, which set who is present in the death chamber, do not mention spiritual advisers.


For most of the modern history of the US death penalty since the 1970s, spiritual advisers have not been present in execution chambers, he said.

The federal government, which under President Donald Trump resumed federal executions following a 17-year hiatus and carried out 13 executions, allowed a spiritual adviser to be present in the death chamber.

The Biden administration is still weighing how it will proceed in death penalty cases.



RBI tightens investment rules for shadow banks

New Delhi, Feb 13: Reserve Bank of India (RBI) said Friday new investors who operate from jurisdictions not in compliance with the Financial Action Task Force (FATF) must hold less than 20% of the voting power in non-banking finance companies (NBFCs).

In a bid to stop money laundering, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) said investors from non-FATF compliant jurisdictions would not be treated on a par with those from other countries or regions. "New investors from or through non-compliant FATF jurisdictions, whether in existing NBFCs or in companies seeking Certification of Registration (COR), should not be allowed to directly or indirectly acquire 'significant influence' in the investee, as defined in the applicable accounting standards," the RBI said.

The move comes days after the central bank had proposed tighter. bank-like regulation of the socalled shadow lending sector to prevent the turmoil caused by the collapse of an infrastructure financing firm in 2018.


Chennai, Feb 13: Rohit Sharma oozed class with an aesthetically pleasing 161 (231b, 18x4, 2x6) on a challenging track, helping India seize the initiative with a solid opening day score of 300/6 against England in the second Test here, Saturday.

Ajinkya Rahane (67, 149b, 9x4) looked equally attractive during his knock and the two Mumbaikars added 162 runs for the fourth wicket, making it worth the effort for the 12.000 who flocked the Chepauk as Indian cricket welcomed its fans back in the stadium amid the COVID-19 pandemic.

A score of 350 plus in the first innings will be equivalent to 550 plus on any other track and Rishabh Pant's (33 batting) dangerous presence could also take India well beyond the magic figure on this track. At stumps, he had debutant Axar Patel (5 batting) for company.

Rohit had scored six Test hundreds prior to this knock but he will be the first to admit that in terms of conditions on offer and the quality of attack he faced, the seventh one

would be at the top of the list. On a hot Saturday, Rohit did two



things at one go. Firstly, he put India in a commanding position on a track which was way more difficult for batting than he made it look.

Secondly, he put all the naysayers in their place by scoring runs when it mattered the most. The team is aiming for a comeback after a crushing 227-run loss in the first Test.

Joe Root was marvellous with his sweep shot during the first Test but Rohit was simply magnificent with his execution on a doubly difficult track on which he gave England spinner Moeen Ali (3/112) a lesson in controlled aggression.

The way Rohit put a big front-foot stride outside the off-stump to sweep deliveries off both Moeen and Jack Leach (2/78) will not be forgotten by all who were fortunate to witness the innings.
