After petrol & diesel, consumers face LPG price rise

WHILE CONSUMERS' FOCUS HAS REMAINED ON AUTO FUEL PRICES, THE COOKING GAS PRICE RISE HAS GONE ALMOST UNNOTICED

New Delhi, Feb 26: The government seems to be in no mood to subsidise the price of common man's cooking gas which like the price of petrol and diesel has maintained consistent increase for the past few months. The price of domestic 14.2-kg LPG cylinder was increased by ₹25 Thursday, the third increase in the month of February itself, taking its price to ₹794 a cylinder in Delhi. While the practice of weekly or fortnightly price revision of cooking gas is normally done for non-sub-

sidised cylinders, this year oil companies shave maintained almost equal increase in price of subsidised LPG cylinders as well.

This has equated its price with market prices of cooking gas and thus helping the government to completely eliminate direct benefit transfer (DBT) benefits extended to cooking gas consumers.

"There may just be some element of subsidy that still may be involved in cooking gas if it is getting transported to far off distances from bottling plants. Otherwise, subsidised and non-subsidised cooking gas

THE PRICE OF LPG INCREASED BY OVER ₹100 A CYLINDER IN FEBRUARY FROM A LEVEL OF ₹694

cooking gas price rise has gone almost unnoticed. The price increased sharply by over ₹100 a cylinder in February itself from a level of ₹694 to ₹794

With the government not supporting even cooking gas consumers in the time of rising prices, consumers are bearing the brunt of increase in both their transportation and cooking expenses during the pandemic.

There are around 30 crore LPG connections in the country and the levelling of non-subsidised and subsidised LPG cylinder means that the

government substantially reduces DBT payments in FY22 as well.

The government provides 12 subsidised LPG cylinder to a household in a year. While the household buys LPG cylinders at market price, the gap between subsidised and non-subsided cylinders is transferred to the consumers' bank accounts under the DBT scheme.

This transfer has remained suspended during most parts of FY21 as oil companies have raised price of even subsidised cylinders to market levels.





After corona, Holding **Tax terror for citizens**

Addition of half the benchmark value of land resulted in 10-50 times hike in the tax

Bhubaneswar. Feb 26: Even though serial lockdowns and shutdowns triggered by coronavirus have financially ruined the common man, the Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation's (BMC's) decision to not provide rebate on the inflated holding tax rates has put denizens in a tight spot.

Holding tax, a major source of revenue for the civic body, is collected at the rate of 17.5 per cent of annual rent value (ARV) of a property. The ARV of properties varies based on whether it is residential or commercial. However, for reader's convenience we would explain how ARV is calculated for a residential building.

First, the ARV takes into account the area of the property. This is multiplied by ₹13.65 which is the municipal tax. The calculated amount now adds 0.5 of benchmark value of land cost. The land cost varies for mouzas (tax wards) in the city. Then there is a deduction of 15 per cent on account of repair and maintenance costs. In certain cases where the holding has no establishment/building, no cost is deducted.

The problem occurred when the BMC, in October 2019, revised the benchmark value for land cost of different mouzas and effected the new rates from April 2020 onwards while complying with the instructions of the General Administration (GA) department. This resulted in an unprecedented hike in taxes with some property owners complaining about a 10 to 50 times surge in holding tax. And this happened during the



coronavirus pandemic.


"Earlier, I used to pay about ₹800 as holding tax. However, it is now amounting to about ₹7,000 per month. How am I supposed to pay such large sums suddenly? The civic authorities haven't even considered the impact of Covid on the common man's pocket, especially on people like us who barely survive on pensions,' rued Prafulla Panda, a senior citizen at Bomikhal in city.

Sources say certain property owners who were earlier paying ₹2 core as holding tax annually will now have to cough up ₹18 crore. The new dynamics in taxes is also said to have affected small vendors and tenants who are now forced to pay more.

"I have loans adding up to ₹7 lakh. I need to pay ₹30,000 towards salaries of my employees. Now, the BMC is asking me to pay about ₹20,000 holding taxes instead of ₹1,000 earlier. This is becoming hard as we struggle to earn profits post lockdown," Binayak Mohapatra, a jeweller, said here.

It can be mentioned that the BMC presently has about 1,600 defaulters with an outstanding holding tax dues to the tune of ₹43 crore. The civic authority has recently taken various measures to retrieving the dues.

Defending the civic body's decision, BMC's Deputy Commissioner, Revenue, Srimanta Mishra said the move was taken following the state government's order and in best interests of the city. "Following High Court's interim order, we have decided to collect 50 per cent

Moreover, we have also done away with retrospective taxes and only asked for amounts from the month the order took effect. There has also been no change in holding tax rate (17.5%) except for the benchmark value," he said.

SHARAD BAID 'REAL ESTATE PRICES TO GO UP MARGINALLY'

India's real estate industry faced unprecedented challenges due to coronavirus. The pandemic brought construction activities to a halt and severely eroded the market of its potential buyer-base. Property transactions dipped to near-zero level during the nation-wide lockdown. The real estate sector hopes for a better future. Managing Director of Utkal Builders Ltd, Sharad Baid shared with Orissa POST about his take on the future of the sector in the post pandemic period.



What is the current status of the real estate market of Odisha? How did the pandemic affect it?

Covid has certainly impacted the market but I guess the general public has realised the importance of a home. A home is where your safety net is. In March when the whole world was confined to their homes due to pandemic, nothing else mattered but a secure & safe home. So we have seen a lot of traction in ready properties. People want to shift from their rental accommodation to their own homes. People also need ready to move in flats where they exactly know what they are buying. So to that extent pandemic has caused a pragmatic shift in demand to ready homes.

How much more time will it take for normalcy to return?

Hopefully, things will come to normalcy by June this year when the vaccine is expected for general public. But again there are talks of a new variant of the virus which apparently is much stronger and is affecting the younger population and even people with stronger immunity.

- In Odisha which one is a bigger market: land or apartments?
- Land comes with a lot of baggage. It's not for everyone. Finding a clear and marketable title of a land is a Herculean task. For seasoned developers like us, who have a battery of lawyers for doing due diligence, sometimes we even find it difficult to get a clear land title. Apartments on the other hand are a safer real estate investment. From that perspective we feel apartments are a bigger market.

What is Utkal's future plan for Odisha?

This year we are celebrating our 31st foundation year in Odisha and we have massive plans for the state of Odisha because we feel there is a big mismatch in the premium housing segment. I believe our Utkal Royal Residency in Kalpana Sq, till date is one of the most premium residential projects in the city. We have plans to build such premium residential projects with top notch finishes where the owners get a sense of pride in staying in an Utkal property. In the commercial segment, we believe in building asset classes - a build to lease model, which makes it imperative to build non fatigue properties to earn attractive sustainable rents over time. When one builds to own, you treat the asset like an investment, which enhances quality. Our Utkal Kanika Galleria in Kalpana Square & Utkal Centre Point in a small city like Jajpur is a testimonial to that.

What is your take on current real estate price?

The construction costs have gone up because of rise in steel & other raw material prices. The project costs have gone up significantly due to new GST norms & increased fee structure of statutory clearances. On top of that the inventory of ready flats has come down significantly, hence I see the prices coming up marginally in the times to come especially for the ready apartment projects. For the under construction projects, prices may be consistent for sometime but eventually will go up. With the growth in urban population & rising aspirations, there is no substitute to MoGhara.

SPEAKER ASKS REVENUE MINISTER TO PREPARE SAND POLICY SOON

Bhubaneswar, Feb 26: The Assembly witnessed uproarious scenes as members cutting across party lines expressed concern over sand smuggling across the state during the Question Hour, Friday.

The opposition BJP and Congress members created ruckus demanding formulation of a policy to curb illegal sand mining in the state. Even, Speaker SN Patro said that sand is being transported to Andhra Pradesh from his own constituency (Digapahandi).

Though a draft 'Odisha Sand Policy' was prepared by the state government in April, 2018, it is yet to be implemented, they alleged.

Govt to prioritise **Covid workers in jobs**

Bhubaneswar: In a relief for agitating auxiliary nurse midwives (ANMs) and other paramedics, the state government Friday announced that temporary health care workers who had worked in Covid-19 care facilities during the pandemic will get priority in regular appointments on the basis of their qualifications. This was announced by Health and Family Welfare Minister N K Das while replying to guestions raised by BJP whip Mohan Majhi and Congress whip Taraprasad Bahinipati in the Assembly. The minister said that about 21,000 ANMs, staff nurses, pharmacists, radiographers and multipurpose health workers (MPHW) were appointed purely on a temporary basis keeping in view the pandemic situation last year.

The minister, in his reply, said that the government is in the process of consultation with different stakeholders and will soon formulate a policy on sand mining.

However, those who are unable to register themselves online can visit the regis tration centres directly and could register themselves on the spot," Bijov Panigrahi, Director of Health and Family Welfare said.

The official also talked about the criteria for consideration for elderly for the vaccination drive. Panigrahi said. "From March 1 we are going to see the process to vaccinating the senior citizens. Those who are



going to complete 60 years by January 1, 2020 will be considered as senior citizens for the vaccination drive.

He also said that those who are above 45 years and having co-morbidities would be allowed to get inoculated. Those below 45 years will need to furnish a medical certificate

Panigrahi told the media, "Under the BSKY scheme, we have several empanelled hospitals. Those will be used for the vaccination. Vaccine will be free at government hospitals while at private hospitals it will be charged. The price has not been fixed as yet."

He also added, "Decisions will be taken whether empanelled private hospitals will give the vaccine for free or on payment basis. We have ample vaccines to start the drive March 1 and we are also going to get more vaccines soon. We are fully prepared to vaccinate the elderly too.'





The Perseverance rover. which landed on Mars this month, marks a new leap toward answering fundamental questions about our solar system, including where else we might find DNA. The rover will roam the surface of Mars looking for signs of life, make its own oxygen, launch a helicopter, and collect soil and rocks for a follow-up mission in 2028. If all goes as planned, NASA, with the help of European Space Agency (ESA) spacecraft, will return soil samples Finding DNA on Mars would not

in the spring of 2032 - the first Martian material to visit Earth. be a complete surprise. Though Perseverance was constructed in the Spacecraft Assembly Facility (SAF) clean room at NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL), even that setting cannot be made 100% free of background microbial or human DNA. We have known about "microbial hitchhikers" since the very first interplanetary missions in the 1960s, when scientists such as Carl Sagan highlighted the problem. It is a persistent, unavoidable risk of space science. Because scientists must build the spacecraft one layer at a time, shedding skin and droplets of saliva over years of construction, it is almost certain that a little bit of California DNA just landed on Mars.

As such, when the samples arrive on Earth in 2032, they will need to go through a "planetary-scale genetic filter" to rule out any DNA that might have been present in the SAF during the rover's construction from 2015-20, as well as any other fragment of DNA observed on Earth up until the launch of the spacecraft in July 2020. This is an ongoing project between our laboratory at Weill Cornell Medicine and JPL. By sequencing the DNA found in, around, and on the SAF during the construction of robots, we will draw up a genetic map to avoid or minimize any forward or backward contamination (where we send genetic material somewhere else, or genetic material



The successful landing of NASA's Perseverance rover on Mars is about far more than scientific curiosity or national prestige. For the sake of humanity's long-term survival, it is imperative that we embrace our technological know-how to establish life beyond planet Earth

from somewhere else lands here). Ever since the first two Soviet probes landed on Mars's surface in 1971, followed by the US Viking 1 landing in 1976, some fragments of microbial and possibly human DNA are likely to have ended up on the red planet. And given the planet's global dust storms, this DNA is almost certainly located in various places across the surface.

Fortunately, we are living in an extraordinary era for genetics. The low cost of DNA sequencing allows us to build an ever-growing genetic catalogue of life on Earth, genetic maps of SAF clean rooms, and the firstever planetary-scale genome maps (MetaSUB and the Earth Microbiome Project). Moreover, in a 2016 mission with astronaut Kate Rubins, we showed that we can sequence DNA in space and match it to profiles of novel organisms on Earth. Anything that can survive in space, on spacecraft, or in extreme conditions on Earth is a decent candidate for life that can survive on Mars. Eventually, instead of sending DNA to Mars by accident, we will do it deliberately, for a purpose.

After all, manned missions to Mars are technologically achievable. They can bring out the best in humanity, and we already have the physical, pharmacological, and biological means to pursue them. In my new book, The Next 500 Years: Engineering Life to Reach New Worlds, I highlight studies that we performed on dozens of astronauts, including the twins Scott and (US Senator) Mark Kelly, following Scott's one-year mission in space. Based on our findings, we are now confident that humans can travel to Mars, and with some additional inno-

vation and technology, stay there. Enjoy unlimited access to the ideas and opinions of the world's leading thinkers, including weekly long reads, book reviews, and interviews; The Year Ahead annual print magazine; the complete PS archive; and more – All for less than \$9 a month.

We need humans to be able to live on Mars sustainably, responsibly, and safely not so that we can abandon Earth, but because the best way to ensure our species' survival is to make it possible to live elsewhere. Mars is not Plan B: it is Plan A, and always has been.

We have an ethical duty to prevent our own species' extinction as well as that of all others on Earth. No other species (that we know of) possesses such awareness of its potential future, nor the ability to preserve life. Only we can perform this function; and in the long term, doing so requires that we make our way to other planets. Settling Mars is the necessary first rung on the ladder of longterm survival (not least because Venus is too hot).

To meet this imperative, however, we will need to bring NASA's budget back to 1960s levels, when it was 4.4% of the federal budget (compared to 0.48% today). We will need more international cooperation (including with China) as well. To that end, my colleagues and I recently published a series of papers and launched an international collaboration on aerospace medicine that includes representatives from NASA, ESA ROSCOSMOS (Russia), and JAXA (Japan). The United Arab Emirates and others have also started studying space biology, and more space agencies are working with commercial platforms such as SpaceX and Blue Origin.1

Some duties we choose for ourselves. But the duty to preserve life is inextricably bound up with the awareness of our own mortality and the possibility of extinction. Humanity's stewardship of life is both a selfish imperative and an innate, unique obligation. By doing what it takes to preserve life as we know it, we may yet find new life in the universe.

Buckley's chance

his term for a very slim hope or no chance at all is well known in both Australia and New Zealand but isn't, I think, recorded anywhere else. That suggests that the Buckley concerned is a local person. The expression has been known in various forms; as well as the ones you quote, there are also the older and longer forms Buckley's chance, Buckley's hope and Buckley's show; the name is used alone in "There are just two chances, Buckley's or none", two notional possibilities that in reality amount to next to no chance at all. There are, as it happens, just two known choices for the answer. One points to William Buckley, a convict in the early days of European settlement in Australia, who escaped in 1803 from the short-lived penal settlement at Port Philip Bay (where Melbourne is today) and lived for 32 years with the Aborigines in southern Victoria, gaining the sobriquet of The Wild White Man, before giving himself up and being pardoned. The implication is that, like Buckley, you have no chance of success, it being assumed that you measure success by an escape to a part of Australia colonised by European immigrants. One problem is that Buckley died in 1856, whereas the expression doesn't appear in print until 1895.

in the news and have received some attention. For one, the Finance Minister made a Budget allocation of Rs 1.000 crore for the welfare of tea workers in Assam and West Bengal. Prime Minister Narendra Modi, in an election rally in early February at Sonitpur, Assam, said that those who were out to malign India's image also wanted to "systematically" attack Indian tea. India's tea has been "systematically" attacked, but not by external forces. Systemic weaknesses in the Assam tea industry and the plight of tea garden workers in Assam are all manifestations of the joint failure of the market, state and civil society. There are three systemic weak-

nesses in the tea ecosystem in Assam that require urgent attention from the government. First, Assam's tea industry is mostly confined to the tea supply chain's unremunerative plantation activities. In the tea value chain, value addition such as blending, packaging, and even more lucrative marketing takes place outside the state. An ILO-funded study observes that 53 per cent of the profit from tea goes to the retailer, 33 to the blender, 7 to the factory, 6 to

Tea corporates engaged in plantation activities have not evolved with time. They lack innovation and imagination, evident in the colonialstyle practices that are still followed in human resources, labour management and outdated production technology. A plantation manager has to oversee tea planting and related activities like pruning, 'tea making' in the factory and the management of an entire community of workers, their families, schools, ration, health centres etc. In such a context, it provides little room for management in the plantation to innovate or maybe that is the reason for lingering colonial practices like 'Bichaar Din', where the plantation management ridiculously resolves

household conflicts. Second, the tea garden workers are a marginalised community. Tea plantations come under the Plantation Labour Act (PLA), 1951, which requires the tea company to provide several social benefits apart from wages. Tea companies in Assam, therefore, raise concerns about the high labour cost of producing tea which is roughly 60 per cent of the total cost of production. To bring down the social

company to make the sector competitive. Several studies, however. show that very few tea plantations fully implement the welfare schemes guaranteed under the Plantation Labour Act (1951), while the state turns a blind eye to such violations.

Low development indicators of Assam and more than that the abysmal condition of tea tribes reflect the systemic weaknesses. The community is among the most marginalised in the state. This is evident because the tea workers are still considered 'outsiders' and denied affirmative action benefits in a state where they have lived for more than 150 years. The community constitutes 20 per cent of the population and is the backbone of this industry, and one of the state's main revenue generators, yet it remains the most marginalised!

Thirdly, the tea tribes are denied the Scheduled Tribe status in Assam, thereby depriving them of various constitutional provisions and government schemes for STs. The government reaffirmed its commitment to provide ST status to the tea tribes to garner the support of the community during the anti-CAA uprising in the state, but

limited access to the community, as the majority is confined within the tea company's property. In most cases, it is NGO intervention that usually highlights the plight of the community.

A series of systemic reforms are needed to address conditions that sustain a low level of equilibrium in the local tea industry. First and foremost, reforms are needed to create incentives for investment in improving tea quality and adopting sustainable practices in the plantation. For the last six to seven years, the average price of tea has remained flat and may have even declined in real terms. While the poor prices may be partly due to the weak demand for tea in the recent period, this alone does not appear to be the complete explanation for unremunerative prices. It is suspected that large buyers of tea are coordinating on low prices in tea auctions and keeping prices artificially low.

Quarry blasts

Sir, The unprincipled operators of illegal establishments do not believe in licences and are past masters in fudging them. It goes without saying that most of the immoral institutions function with the blessings of the bureaucracy and the government. In Karnataka's Shivamogga district, land owners, explosive suppliers and crushing unit operators were apprehended after a massive stone quarry blast that claimed six lives January 21. Almost exactly after one month, another blast killed as many people in Chikkaballapur district of the state. It is said those involved with the quarry were hurriedly moving the explosive gelatin sticks used for stone crushing below the land, at their disposal, away to "safer places" at unearthly hours to escape detection leading to an unimaginable blast. Those carrying the sticks were killed on the spot. The police had raided a few unauthorised quarries nearby, and, fearing a similar action, the owners of the quarry in question, were trying to hide the gelatin sticks. In both the Shivamogga explosion and the Chikkaballapur blast it is more than evident that the people handling them were ill-trained or not trained at all, in the nuances of the materials used in gelatin sticks and in their safe transport. The question also for consideration is why there is always a piecemeal action on illegal crushers and quarries. Ganapathi Bhat, AKOLA

Kolkata, Feb 26: Union Home Minister Amit Shah is leading the BJP's campaign in the upcoming West Bengal Assembly election as the party eyes victory over Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee-led Trinamool Congress

For a party that won just three seats in West Bengal Assembly election 2016, a lead in over 120 segments in the Lok Sabha election 2019 was a huge boost. The BJP was ahead in just 23 Assembly segments in 2014 Lok Sabha polls. To put things in perspective, the BJP had won two seats in 2014 and 18 in

2019 parliamentary polls. Though the BJP's pre-2016 election claim of winning 75-80 seats in Bengal Assembly did not fructify, its show in the state polls reflected its organisational strength. The BJP won three seats in West Bengal Assembly for the first time in 2016. But more than that, its vote share proved to be a shot in the arm of the BJP leadership. Overall, the BJP's vote share reduced from 17.5 per cent to 10 per cent.

But the devil lies in details. In 2011, the BJP had polled just four per cent of votes in the Bengal Assembly election and later won two by-polls. In micro-analysis, the BJP improved its number of votes from 19.5 lakh to around 56 lakh a near three-fold jump.

Further, the BJP became a player in over 260 of 294 Assembly constituencies by polling more than 10.000 votes. The BJP secured 20.000-30,000 votes in 66 Assembly seats,



30.000-40.000 votes on 16 seats, and 40.000-50,000 votes in six seats.

With this pan-Bengal show in 2016 Assembly poll, the BJP not only showed its organisation presence across the state but also played a spoil-sport to the Congress-Left alliance. Some analysts pointed out that the Congress-Left alliance suffered

at around 70 seats due to the rise of the BJP. The Congress-Left alliance had won 77 seats in 2016 Bengal poll. This was why Bengal CPM chief Surya Kant Mishra had alleged that

MHA extends COVID-19 guidelines till March 31

New Delhi, Feb 26: The home ministry Friday said the existing COVID-19 guidelines will remain in force till March 31.

In a statement, the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) said while there has been a substantial decline in the active and new COVID-19 cases, there is need to maintain surveillance, containment and caution so as to fully overcome the pandemic.

The states and union territories have also been advised to speed up the vaccination of the target population so as to break the chain of transmission and overcome the pandemic. Accordingly, containment zones continue to be demarcated carefully; prescribed containment measures strictly followed within these zones; COVID-appropriate behaviour promoted and strictly enforced; and the Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) prescribed in respect of various permitted activities followed scrupu-

on surveillance, containment and strict observance of the guidelines and SOPs, as envisaged in the guidelines issued January 27 need to be enforced strictly by states and union territories, it said.

The MHA issued an order Friday extending the existing guidelines for surveillance, containment and caution and they will remain in force up to March 31, the statement said.





New Delhi/Beijing, Feb 26: India has told China that disengagement at all friction points is necessary to contemplate de-escalation of troops in eastern Ladakh even as the foreign ministers of the two countries agreed to establish a hotline for "timely" communication and exchange of views.

In the first high level contact after the two countries agreed early this month to disengage from the Pangong Tso area in eastern Ladakh, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar told his Chinese counterpart Wang Yi during a telephonic conversation Thursday that peace and tranquillity on the border is essential for development of bilateral relations.

The armies of the two sides last week concluded withdrawal of troops and weapons from the North and South banks of the Pangong lake. Releasing details of the 75minute conversation, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said in a statement on Friday that China was told that bilateral relations have been impacted severely over last year. The tense military standoff in eastern Ladakh erupted May 5 last. The two leaders discussed the situation along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in eastern Ladakh and issues related to overall India-China relations. "EAM said that Boundary Question may take time to resolve but disturbance of peace and tranquillity, including by violence, will inevitably have a damaging impact on the relationship,"

the MEA said. "The two ministers



External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar and Chinese State Councillor and Foreign Minister Wang Yi

agreed to remain in touch and establish a hotline." "A prolongation of the existing situation was not in the interest of either side. It was, therefore, necessary that the two sides should work towards early resolution of remaining issues. It was necessary to disengage at all friction points in order to contemplate de-escalation of forces in this sector. That alone will lead to the restoration of peace and tranquillity and provide conditions for progress of our bilateral relationship," the MEA statement said.

According to a late-night press release issued by the Chinese Foreign Ministry in Beijing on Thursday, the two foreign ministers agreed to set up a hotline for "timely communication and exchange of views". Wang said China and India should firmly follow the right path of mutual trust and cooperation between neighbouring major countries, and not go astray with suspicion and distrust nor fall back on a road of "negative retrogression".

Wang, also a State Councilor, noted that the two countries need to properly handle the border issue so as to prevent the bilateral ties from being trapped into a "vicious cycle" because of it. When asked for an update on disengagement of troops in other areas after the withdrawal of soldiers by both sides from the Pangong lake area. Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesman Wang Wenbin told a media briefing Friday that the situation on the ground has significantly eased. "Recently frontline troops of both sides completed disengagement in the Pangong Lake area and the situation on the ground has significantly eased," he said.

The MEA statement said Jaishankar also referred to his meeting with Wang Yi in September 2020 in Moscow where the Indian side had expressed its concern on provocative behaviour and unilateral attempts of the Chinese side to alter the status quo at the LAC. The border standoff between the Indian and Chinese armies erupted on May 5 last year following a violent clash in the Pangong Lake area and both sides gradually enhanced their deployment by rushing in tens of thousands of soldiers as well as heavy weaponry. Subsequently, 20 Indian soldiers were killed in a fierce hand-to-hand combat on June 15 in Galwan Valley, an incident that marked the most serious military conflicts between the

NIA files chargesheet against 11 terrorists

The NIA officer said the terror group members planned to attack individuals whom they consider 'kafirs'

New Delhi, Feb 26: The National Investigation Agency (NIA) Friday filed a chargesheet against 11 terrorists of Al Qaeda, who were planning to execute terror attacks in several parts of the country.

An NIA Spokesperson said the agency had filed the chargesheet in a Special NIA court here against 11 members of Al Qaeda from West Bengal and Kerala - Murshid Hasan aka Sofiq, Mosaraf Hoseen, Mainul Mandal. Lea Yean Ahmed aka Leion, Najmus Sakib, Iyakub Biswas, Samim Ansari, Abu Sufian, Atiur Rahman, Al Mamun Kamal, Abdul Momin Mandal under several sections of the Indian Penal Code as well as sections of the Unlawful Activities Prevention Act and the Arms Act.

The NIA had registered a case based on information about an Al Qaeda-inspired module sprouting and operating in West Bengal and Kerala under the leadership of Murshid Hasan and that the members of this module were in an "advanced stage" of the conspiracy to execute terrorist attacks in different parts of the country.

The NIA carried out raids September 19, 2020 in West Bengal and Kerala and arrested nine terrorists

The official said that two more Al Qaeda operatives were arrested from West Bengal on August 26 and November 1 last year.

The official said, "Investigation has revealed that Murshid Hasan was in touch with Al Qaeda handlers based in Pakistan and Bangladesh and had received in-



structions along with radical propaganda material through encrypted social media platforms from them."

Murshid Hasan along with his other associates conspired to radicalise and recruit more individuals into the terrorist organisation Al Qaeda, the NIA official added.

"They disseminated radical material through social media and encrypted chat platforms with an intention to radicalise and recruit others for establishing an Islamic State by waging jihad in India," the official said.

"The group members had conducted a series of conspiratorial meetings for raising funds for the purchase of arms and ammunition or explosive materials, radicalising and recruiting more members and charting out the future course of action, including establishing a 'Markaz' (a training centre for providing religious and weapons training to new recruits)," the official added.

He said, "The accused persons were also in active communication with an arms dealer through their foreign-based handlers and were planning to receive a consignment of sophisticated arms and ammunition in New Delhi. However, their nefarious plans were obviated by their timely arrest by the NIA."

MANDATORY FASTag **SC REFUSES TO ENTERTAIN PLEA**

New Delhi, Feb 26: The Supreme Court Friday refused to entertain a plea challenging the Centre's decision to make FASTag mandatory for all the vehicles.

The government has made FASTag mandatory from February 15 midnight and any vehicle not fitted with it will be charged double the toll at electronic toll plazas across the country, the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways has said. A three-judge Bench of Chief Justice Bobde, Justice Bopanna and Justice Ramasubramanian asked the petitioner to approach the Delhi High Court and granted the petitioner liberty to withdraw the plea. 'Counsel appearing for the petitioner prays for withdrawal of this petition with liberty to approach the High Court of Delhi. Prayer is allowed. Accordingly, the writ petition is dismissed as withdrawn with the liberty aforesaid," the bench said.



'Work from home leading to eye, hearing issues'

"Before the pandemic, a few patients used to visit hospitals/clinics who were developing hearing problems after Diwali last year due to firecrackers but amid Covid-19, a number of patients from all age groups are visiting doctors' clinics due to hearing problems and eve infection complications," a doc said.

Gurugram, Feb 26 : Doctors in Gurugram district say online classes and work from home due to the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic is causing eve and ear problems among children, adolescents and young adults.

Doctors have warned that this could lead to hearing and eye difficulties among those who failed to curb the use of earphones, mobile phones and laptops.

However, the doctors also asserted that one other reason which causes hearing problems is the noise pollution in Gurugram.

Rahul Garg, Head of RG Ear-Nose-Throat (ENT) Hospital, said lifestyle choices lead to more cases of hearing and eye impairment than age-related factors.

"Before the Covid-19 pandemic, a few patients used to visit hospitals/clinics who were developing hearing problems after Diwali last



year due to firecrackers but amid Covid-19, a number of patients from complaints are directly linked to extensive use of headphones at all age groups are visiting doctors' clinics due to hearing problems higher volume, mobile and laptops. and eve infection complications.

use of earphones, mobiles and laptops at high volume is leading to such problems among people.

"120 decibels is harmful for ears and 140 decibels can permanently damage our ears. Any noise more than 100 decibels can impact the physical as well as the mental health of our body," Garg said, adding that adults can set the volume of earphones or headphones but children don't know to set the volume of earphones which causes hearing problems. ENT Specialist Yogesh Goyal said, "Multiple people are working for more than eight hours wearing headphones and in front of laptops. This is putting a lot of stress on their ears and unsterilised earbuds or ear-plugs could spread infection.

Goyal advises removing the earphones from time-to-time in order to allow fresh air to go inside the ears. He said school children should not be using headphones at all. If they are attending classes on a laptop or personal computers, then the device volume is sufficient.

The doctors also suggest that the concerned authorities should strictly tackle noise polluters who are responsible for noise pollution. The traffic police should increase the use of audio meters which help to catch noise polluters.

D.K. Bhardwaj, Deputy Commissioner of Police (Traffic), informed that 326 challans were issued for pressure honking and 291 fines were issued for removal of silencer from motorbikes and other vehicles in 2020. "We will not tolerate anyone in Gurugram who breaks traffic rules. The Traffic police from time-to-time has launched various campaigns to catch traffic violators. I would like to appeal to the motorists in Gurugram to follow traffic rules across the district or be ready to face hefty traffic fines, Bhardwaj said.

Experts welcome ceasefire pact between India and Pak

New Delhi, Feb 26: The cease fire agreement announced by India and Pakistan is a welcome move as any measure that saves lives on the border and reduces violence must be given a chance, experts said Friday, but cautioned that cross-border terrorism needs to be closely watched.

A joint statement issued in Islamabad and New Delhi said the Director Generals of Military Operations of the two countries held discussions over the established mechanism of hotline contact and reviewed the situation along the LoC and all other sectors in a "free, frank and cordial" atmosphere. The agreement came into effect from the midnight of February 24/25. Lt. Gen. (retd) Satish Dua, who was the Corps Commander of the Srinagar based XV Corps when the Indian Army undertook surgical strikes

post the Uri attack in 2016, said the ceasefire is a welcome step and more importantly, a joint statement on it is "rare". He said the agreement comes at the time of commencement of summer when there is a rise in infiltration bids and CFVs.

At the regional level, Pakistan's attempts to create unrest in Kashmir post August 2019 have also not been successful. Even during the stand-off with China in eastern Ladakh, the Indian forces stood strong and did not back down. The United States has also welcomed the agreement, saying it is a positive step towards greater peace and stability in South Asia. White House Press Secretary Jen Psaki also said at her daily news conference Thursday that the Biden administration remains closely engaged with a range of leaders and officials in the region, including those in Pakistan.

Hong Kong kicks off vax drive

Hong Kong: Hong Kong began administering its first Covid-19 vaccines to the public Friday, kicking off its program offering free vaccinations to all 7.5 million residents. People aged 60 and older and health care workers are among the some 2.4 million people currently prioritised to receive vaccines at community centers and outpatient clinics across Hong Kong. Participants so far will be receiving the vaccine by Chinese biopharmaceutical firm Sinovac.

Another Boeing 777 emergency landing

Moscow: Russian media report that a Boeing 777 plane made an emergency landing in Moscow in the early hours of Friday after the pilot reported a problem with the engine. The Interfax news agency cited an anonymous source saying that the pilot on the flight from Hong Kong to Madrid reported a failure of one of the left engine control channels and requested an emergency landing at the Moscow Sheremetyevo airport.

Baghdad, Feb 26: A US airstrike in Syria targeted facilities belonging to a powerful Iranian-backed Iraqi armed group, killing one of their militiamen and wounding a number of others, an Iraqi militia official said Friday

The Pentagon said the strikes were retaliation for a rocket attack in Iraq earlier this month that killed one civilian contractor and wounded a US service member and other coalition troops.

The Iraqi militia official told The Associated Press that the strikes against the Kataeb Hezbollah, or Hezbollah Brigades, hit an area along the border between the Svrian site of Boukamal facing Qaim on the Iraqi side. He spoke on condition of anonymity because he was not authorised to speak of the attack. Svria war monitoring groups said the strikes hit trucks moving weapons to a base for Iranian-

backed militias in Boukamal. "I'm confident in the target that we went after, we know what we hit," Defence Secretary Lloyd Austin told reporters flying with him from California to Washington, shortly after the airstrikes which were carried out Thursday evening Eastern Standard Time.

The airstrike was the first military action undertaken by the Biden administration, which in its first weeks has emphasized its intent to put more focus on the challenges posed by China, even as Mideast threats persist. Biden's decision to attack in Svria did not appear to signal an intention to widen US military involvement in the region but rather to demonstrate a will to defend US troops in Iraq. The US has in the past targeted facilities in Syria belonging to Kataeb Hezbollah, which it has blamed for numerous attacks tar-

The group said 22 fighters from the Popular Mobilization Forces, an Iraqi umbrella group of mostly Shiite paramilitaries that includes Kataeb Hezbollah, were killed. The report could not be independently verified.

LANKA ENDS FORCED COVID CREMATIONS

Colombo, Feb 26: Amidst mounting international criticism. Sri Lanka has revised a controversial mandatory order to cremate the bodies of Covid-19 victims, which denied minority communities, including Muslims, their religious rights.

The government Thursday revised a gazette notification issued April last year. The new notification has allowed both burials and cremations

For 10 months, Muslim and Christian minorities in the country and international rights groups have been lobbying the government to end the policy of forced cremations.

The government was resisting calls to allow burials citing health concerns. It cited the opinion of some experts who claimed that the burial of Covid-19 victims would contaminate the water table thereby spreading the pandemic further.



The country had earlier come under intense criticism from rights groups, including the UNHRC, over the cremation order.

They said it failed to respect he religious feelings of the victims and their family members, especially of the Muslims, Catholics and some Buddhists. The cremation of bodies is forbidden in Islam. The decision to end forced cremations followed the visit of Pakistan Prime Minister Imran Khan. The Muslim minority leaders, who met Khan, said the decision to allow burials was linked to Sri Lanka seeking the support of the Organisation of Islamic Countries (OIC) at the ongoing UN Human Rights Council session in Geneva.



Thursday. India Wednesday dispatched the first batch of six lakh Covid-19 vaccine doses to the African country of Ghana under the COVAX facility in collaboration with UNICEF,

which aims to cover 92 countries under the initiative. The doses are a part of the first batch of Covid-19 vaccine the country is acquiring through the Covid-19 Vaccine Global Access Facility (COVAX), which Ghana among nearly 92 countries have signed into.

The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said February 12 that India has provided over 229 lakh doses of coronavirus vaccines to various

countries out of which 64 lakh doses have been supplied as grant assistance and 165 lakh on commercial basis.

MEA Spokesperson Anurag Srivastava said India will continue to take forward the global vaccine supply initiative and cover more countries in a phased manner.

The vaccines are even being sent to Latin American countries.

India, the largest drug producer in the world, is currently manufacturing two Covid-19 vaccines-Covishield and Covaxin.

While Oxford-AstraZeneca's Covishield is being manufactured by the Serum Institute of India in Pune, Covaxin is being produced by Bharat Biotech.

Resident Musa Mustapha said the gunmen also attacked a nearby military camp and checkpoint, preventing soldiers from interfering while the gunmen spent several hours at the school. It was not im-

mediately clear if there were any casualties. Several large groups of armed men operate in Zamfara state, described by the government as bandits, and are known to kidnap for money and for the release of their members from jail.

'We are angered and saddened by yet another brutal attack on schoolchildren in Nigeria," said Peter Hawkins, UNICEF representative in the country. "This is a gross violation of children's rights and a horrific experience for children to go through." He called for their immediate release.

Nigeria has seen several such attacks and kidnappings over the years, notably the April 2014 mass abduction by jihadist group Boko Haram of 276 girls from the secondary school in Chibok in Borno state. More than a hundred of the girls are still missing.

Russian envoys hand-push trolley over N Korea border

Moscow, Feb 26: A group of Russian diplomats and their family members returned to Russia from North Korea on a handpushed rail trolley Thursday because the coronavirus pandemic has halted all passenger traffic between the countries, Russia's Foreign Ministry said in a Facebook post.

"Since the borders have been closed for over a year and passenger traffic has been halted,' staff members of the Russian Embassy in North Korea and their family members embarked on "a long and difficult journey to get home," the ministry said.

The group of eight people took a 32-hour train ride, followed by two hours on a bus. They then boarded a rail trolley and pushed themselvesfor about a kilometer (half a mile) across the border into Russia.

MOST COUNTRIES MISSED THE DEC 31 DEADLINE FOR SUBMITTING OFFICIAL EMISSION-CUTTING TARGETS

United Nations, Feb 26: The newest pledges by countries to cut greenhouse gas emissions are falling far short of what's needed to limit global warming to what the Paris climate accord seeks, a new United Nations report finds.

So the UN climate chief is telling nations to go back and try harder. Most countries — especially top carbon polluters China, United States and India — missed the December 31 deadline for submit-



ting official emission-cutting targets for November's climate negotiations in Scotland.

Friday's report provides an incomplete snapshot of the world's efforts: The world's pledges so far are only enough to reduce global carbon dioxide emissions to less than

1 per cent below 2010 levels by 2030. The world has to cut carbon pollution 45 per cent below 2010 levels to achieve the more stringent official Paris goal of limiting future warming to another half a degree (0.3 degrees Celsius) from now, UN Officials said. "We are very, very far

from where we need to be," UN Climate chief Patricia Espinosa said. "What we need to put on the table is much more radical and much more transformative than we have been doing until now."

UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres called the report "a red alert for our planet."

UN Officials applauded the more than 120 nations, including the US and China. that have made longterm goals of net-zero carbon emissions by mid-century. But those same nations must translate longterm talk into immediate action "that people and the planet so desperately need," Guterres said.

Instead of limiting the world to only 1.5 degrees Celsius (2.7 degrees Fahrenheit) of warming since preindustrial times - the more stringent of two Paris accord goals — the data shows that world "is headed to close to 3 degrees Celsius (5.4 de-

New Delhi, Feb 26: The central government's fiscal deficit soared to ₹12.34 lakh crore or 66.8% of the revised budget estimates at the end of January of the current fiscal. The fiscal deficit at the end of January in the previous financial year was 128.5% of the Revised Estimates (RE).

In the current fiscal ending March 31, the fiscal deficit is likely to touch ₹18.48 lakh crore or 9.5% of the GDP.

In absolute terms, the fiscal deficit stood at ₹12.34.004 crore at the end of January 2021, as per the data released by the Controller General of Accounts (CGA).

The lockdown imposed to curb spreading of coronavirus infections had significantly impacted business activities and in turn contributed to sluggish revenue realisation.



Mumbai, Feb 26: The RBI on Friday extended the deadline to apply for an umbrella entity, which the central bank wants to set up to focus on retail payments system in the country, by over a month to March 31 in view of the pandemic.

In August last year, RBI had released a framework for authorisation of an umbrella entity for retail payments in the country and had invited applications from desirous entities by February 26, 2021.

Requests have been received from various stakeholders including Indian Banks" Association for extending the deadline, keeping in view the COVID-19 related disruptions and inconveniences. RBI said in a release.

Ahmedabad, Feb 26: Intent to score and not just survive was the key to flourish on the Motera pitch, asserted India opener Rohit Sharma who batted effortlessly on the 'interesting but normal' pitch that was declared difficult and challenging by visiting England batsmen.

Rohit attributed his sublime first innings half-century to the positive intent that he displayed during the day-night third Test in which England got thrashed by 10 wickets inside two days on the spin-friendly pitch.

"When you are playing on a pitch like that, you need to have an intent and look to score runs as well. You can't just keep blocking," Rohit said during the virtual conference after the match Thursday.

England captain Joe Root and Zak Crawley had earlier described the track as challenging. The senior opener scored India's only half century of the game with the home side spinners accounting for 19 wickets. England batsmen were deceived by left-armer Axar Patel's straighter deliveries that skidded straight instead of turning.

Rohit felt that during his innings of 66, he was a step or two ahead of England bowlers. "You just need to be slightly ahead at times and try
