BLACK LIVES MATTER Cop who killed George Floyd gets 22¹/₂ yrs in prison

Washington, June 26: A judge sentenced former Minneapolis police officer Derek Chauvin to 22½ years in prison Friday for the murder of George Floyd during an arrest in May 2020, video of which galvanised a national protest movement against racism. A jury found Chauvin, who is white,

A jury found Chauvin, who is white, guilty April 20 of unintentional seconddegree murder, third-degree murder and second-degree manslaughter in the death of Floyd, a Black man. The verdict was widely seen as a landmark rebuke of the disproportionate use of police force against Black Americans.

Chauvin's sentence was one of the longest given a former police officer for using unlawful deadly force in the United States, Minnesota Attorney General Keith Ellison, whose office



prosecuted the case, told reporters. Successful prosecutions of police officers in such cases have been rare.

'Today's sentencing is not justice but it is another moment of real accountability on the road to justice," Ellison said outside the courtroom, calling on law enforcement leaders around the United States to see it as a moment for reform. At the White House, US President Joe Biden, who has spoken several times with the Flovd family, said the sentence seemed appropriate. Both Floyd's brother Rodney and his nephew Brandon Williams criticised the sentence as a "slap on the wrist." "We were served a life sentence," Williams said outside the courthouse.

Delta Plus variant found in 12 states

New Delhi, June 26: Fiftyone cases of Delta Plus variant of the coronavirus have been detected across 12 states in the country, with Maharashtra reporting the highest number of 22, the Centre said Friday, stressing that there are still very limited cases of this mutation and it cannot be inferred that it is showing an upward trend.

These 51 cases were detected from over 45,000 samples sequenced so far in the country.

Sujeet Singh, Director of the National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC), said 22 cases of Delta Plus variant have been found in Maharashtra, followed by nine in Tamil Nadu, seven in Madhya Pradesh, three in Kerala, two each in Punjab and Gujarat, and one case each in Andhra Pradesh, Odisha, Rajasthan, Jammu and Kashmir, Haryana and Karnataka.

"There is very limited number of cases of this mutation (Delta Plus). In India, there are very limited cases (of Delta Plus). There are nearly 50 cases that are found

in 12 districts and this has happened in the last three months. It cannot be said that in any district, state it is showing an increasing trend. Till the time we don't correlate this we will not say this is a rising trend because its mutations are the same as Delta variant," Sujeet Singh told a media briefing of the health ministry.

There was some variance in the figures in the slides presented at the briefing but officials confirmed later that the total cases of the Delta Plus variant detected so far stand at 51 across 12 states.

So the transmission potential in the Delta variant can also found in the Delta Plus variant, he added.

The NCDC is among the 10 institutes involved in genome sequencing of the coronavirus in the country.

Sujeet Singh said the Delta Plus variant signifies the Delta variant with an additional mutation – B.1.617.2.1. This specifically refers to the acquisition of the K417N genetic variant in the background of Variant of Concern (VoC) Delta (B.1.617.2).

However, four years down the line and despite investment of ₹6.02 crore, no major breakthrough has been achieved in the case. In fact, the state even failed to get a stay from the Tribunal on the issue.

As per information available, the state government employed 14 lawyers, including former Attorney General of India and senior Supreme Court lawyer Mukul Rohatgi to present Odisha's side before the Tribunal.

The lawyers' panel also included noted advocates like Harish N Salve, former Solicitor General of India, and Mohan V Katarki. The RTI query revealed that the state government paid ₹4,44,84,832, including taxes, to various reputed lawyers and law firms of the country during the period between March 1, 2018 and January 31, 2021.

The RTI reply claimed that the

Similarly, ₹1,80, 90,000 was paid to another senior advocate Mohan V Kartaki who appeared before the tribunal for the state for ten times between 2018 and 2020.

Meanwhile, the Odisha government also paid ₹41,73,664 to Sri Agarwal Law Associates, a New Delhibased law firm, for the services rendered in the case.

Similarly, the state government also employed non-legal technical experts to study various aspects of the Mahanadi water dispute in order to assist the state government in preparing its representations and spent around ₹1.59 crore on the visits of these officials and experts to New Delhi and other places between 2017 and 2021.

The expert committee included engineers like ME Haque, Suresh Yoganarasingham, Ramesh Kumar Gupta, Arun Kumar Padhi, GC Sahoo and BP Das. Interestingly, the government spent around ₹87.93 lakh on the air travels of these officials alone.

Odisha had been at loggerheads with neighbouring Chhattisgarh over the 'illegal' construction of several barrages and pick-up weirs upstream of Mahanadi river and had sought the intervention of the Supreme Court in the case.

Following the Supreme Court's intervention, the Central government constituted Mahanadi Inter-State River Water Disputes Tribunal to settle the dispute between Odisha and Chhattisgarh over the sharing of Mahanadi waters, March 12, 2018.

However, the Tribunal has so far failed to address the concerns raised by Odisha. The state government appointed noted lawyers to present its side before the Tribunal but is yet to get the desired results. **MORE P3**

27 new ministers tipped in Modi Cabinet

SINCE PM MODI CAME BACK TO POWER IN 2019, THIS WILL BE THE FIRST SUCH RESHUFFLE-CUM-EXPANSION

New Delhi, June 26: With the all-party meeting on J&K done and dusted, the impending Cabinet reshuffle has once again gathered pace. As many as 27 probables, including heavyweights Jyotiraditya Scindia, Sushil Modi, Sarbananda Sonowal, Narayan Rane and Bhupender Yadav, could be part of the massive reshuffle of the Union Cabinet reportedly imminent.

The new ministers in the Narendra Modi government, who are likely to be sworn in include former Congress heavyweight from Madhya Pradesh, Scindia, who is now in the BJP; former Bihar Deputy Chief Minister Sushil Modi; senior BJP organisational heavyweights party general secretary Bhupender Yadav from Rajasthan and Kailash Vijayvargiya from Madhya Pradesh who was in charge of the BJP's campaign in West



Bengal. BJP spokesperson and minority face Syed Zafar Islam is also tipped for a Central government role. Also on the master list are former Assam CM Sarbananda Sonowal and former Maharashtra CM Narayan Rane, besides, Maharashtra Beed MP Pritam Munde and Gopinath Munde's daughter is on the reshuffle candidates list. From Uttar Pradesh which is headed for 'make or break' elections for the BJP next year, BJP UP chief Swatantra Dev Singh, a certainty; Pankaj Chaudhary, MP from Maharajganj, Varun Gandhi, and alliance partner, Anupriya Patel are among the probables.

Rajya Sabha MP Anil Jain, Odisha MP Ashwini Vaishnaw and former MP Baijayant Panda; former Railway Minister from Bengal Dinesh Trivedi are also on the list. Jain is also president of the All India Tennis Association. There is a sizeable contingent from Rajasthan, including former Union Minister in Modi government PP Choudhry, youngest MP from Rajasthan hailing from Churu, Rahul Kaswan and Sikar MP Sumedhanand Saraswati.

The lone entrant from Delhi will be New Delhi MP Meenakshi Lekhi.

Amid the significant churn in Bihar, Pasupati Paras who rebelled against Chirag Paswan is likely getting a Central berth from LJP, as are JDU nominations RCP Singh and Santosh Kumar. Karnataka may well be represented by Rajya Sabha MP Rajeev Chandrasekhar. Gujarat BJP president CR Patil is moving to the government along with Ahmedabad West MP Kirit Solaki.

From Haryana, Sirsa MP Sunita Duggal, a former Income Tax officer is also among the probables. Ladakh MP Jamyang Tsering Namgyal who impressed with his Parliament speech is also being considered. The reshuffle is being necessitated by some vacancies caused due to untimely deaths like Ram Vilas Paswan and Suresh Angadi and exits of Akali Dal and Shiv Sena.

Many ministers are saddled with multiple portfolios due to the deaths and exits of some memers. Upcoming elections in UP are a factor in the reshuffle and also the need to add some heft to government with the entry of Bhupender Yadav.

Bhubaneswar, June 26: Seeking modification in the vaccination policy, the state government has urged the Centre to allocate Covid-19 vaccines in 95:5 ratio between the state government and private hospitals instead of 75:25 earlier.

State Health and Family Welfare Minister Naba Kishore Das in a letter to Union Health and Family Welfare Minister Harsh Vardhan Saturday said that the vaccination activities will be "severely affected" if the Centre does not change its guidelines.Earlier June 14, Additional Chief Secretary, Health, Pradipta Kumar Mohapatra had written to the Union Health secretary for a similar demand.

Noting that the presence of private hospitals is very low and limited to only about 5 per cent of the total healthcare sector in Odisha, Das said the state government apprehends that, as per the existing guideline, the state may lose out its proportionate share of 25 per cent allocation of vaccines to the private sectors.

Das urged Vardhan to revise the allocation of vaccines to Odisha at a ratio from 75:25 to 95:5 keeping in mind the ground reality. And, the share of the private sector may be handed over to the state government, he demanded.

"Since June 21, 2021, we are able to vaccinate more than 3 lakh beneficiaries per day and will continue our endeavour to achieve 100 per cent vaccination in the state.' Das mentioned in the letter

New Delhi, June 26: The Mahanadi Water Disputes Tribunal Saturday directed the Central ministries and agencies to supply documents related to Mahanadi basin to Odisha and Chhattisgarh.

A three-judge bench of the tribunal headed by Supreme Court judge Justice AM Khanwilkar and comprising Justices Ravi Ranjan and Indermeet Kaur issued directions to the Central agencies after both the states apprised the tribunal that they haven't received all the documents required in the adjudication of Mahanadi river water dispute between the riparian states. The tribunal has posted the matter for hearing to August 14.

During the hearing, the counsels appearing for Odisha and Chhattisgarh complained before the tribunal that agencies like Central Water Commission (CWC), India Meteorological Department (IMD), Ministry of Jal Shakti, Ministry of Environment and Forests and others have not supplied complete documents sought by

Bhubaneswar, June 26: As many as 11 out of 30 districts in the state have received deficit rainfall till date ever since the onset of southwest monsoon, Bhubaneswar Meteorological Centre said Saturday

The state has received 169.6 mm rain during the period from June 1 to 26 which is 3 per cent less than the normal average rainfall of 175.3 mm. The highest 255.3 mm rainfall was recorded in Sundargarh district while Ganjam district recorded the lowest rainfall of 79.5 mm.

Districts like Mayurbhnaj, Keonjhar, Jajpur, Bhadrak, Boudh, Bolangir, Kandhamal, Ganjam, Gajapati, Rayagada and Nabarangpur have recorded deficit rain ranging from 20 to 59 per cent during the period, the Met Centre said.

Bhadrak district recorded the highest 49 per cent deficit rain, followed by Ganjam & Gajapati (46 per cent each), Kandhamal (35 per cent), Jajpur (34 per cent), Keonjhar (27 per cent), Bolangir (26 per cent), Nabarangpur (25 per cent) and Mayurbhanj, Rayagada & Boudh (24

DELTA PLUS IN ODISHA Epidemiology team rushed to Deogarh

POST NEWS NETWORK

Bhubaneswar, June 26: A day after the detection of a Delta Plus variant case coming to the fore in the state, the Odisha government Saturday rushed an epidemiology team to Deogarh district which reported the first such case, official sources said.

The patient who has been found carrying the Delta Plus variant of the SARS-CoV-2, was stable and has no such health complaints. The epidemiology team will further examine his health condition after six weeks of his illness, said Director of Health Services (DHS) Dr Bijay Mohapatra.

He said the state government had undertaken contact tracing of the infected person and the health condition of all of them will now be examined again. The team will also verify the vaccination status of the people who have come in contact with the patient.

The DHS said that the Delta Plus variant infected person from Deogarh had taken the first dose of the vaccine March 30. He was infected in April, maybe after coming in contact with another Covid patient. He was asymptomatic due to the effect of vaccination. His entire genome has been sequenced and he has fully recovered, he said.

The case of Deogarh proves that vaccines are effective against the Delta Plus variant, which is also called as a variant of concern," Dr Mohapatra said, adding



the epidemiology team will ascertain the impact of the new variant on the patient and his contact persons.

Meanwhile, the Director of Institute of Life Sciences, Bhubaneswar. Dr Ajav Parida said there is no point in panicking over detection of the Delta Plus variant in Deogarh district in Odisha

"We have found only one Delta Plus variant case in Odisha so far. The concerned person of Deogarh district was infected in April. It has been found during genome sequencing conducted on over 3,000 samples collected from four states like Odisha, Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh and Bihar. However,

we have not found any other case of this variant, so far,' Dr Parida said.

Dispelling the fear of the Delta Plus variant among the people, Dr Parida said: "Had it (delta plus) been so dangerous, we could have found more such cases. But since April, no other sample has tested positive for the new variant."

As not a single case has been detected in the last two months, it indicates that the new strain has not spread fast as predicted, Dr Parida said. "If it was highly contagious, then we must have found a number of variants of the same strain from April to till date. So, we should not unnecessarily panic about the new strain," he said.

The ILS director said the Delta variant was found in plenty during the second wave of the pandemic. But, now it has been mutated and named as Delta Plus. The Delta Plus variant is as dangerous as the Delta variant, he opined.

Meanwhile, what has come as a matter of concern for the health experts in the state is that the test positivity rate (TPR) in some districts remained around 10 per cent. The state government had earlier relaxed lockdown norms keeping in view the TPR rate, said Dr Mohapatra. The state government will further review lockdown restrictions at a high-level meeting June 30.

Cash loading firm staff held for loot of ₹34L from ATMs

Rourkela, June 26: Police arrested an employee of a cash loading firm on the charge of looting cash to the tune of ₹34 lakh from the ATMs of four banks, Saturday.

The accused was identified as Harish Chandra Das, a B. Tech graduate and an employee of a private cash loading firm in the city, an official of the Sector-7 police station said. He was working with Writers Pvt Ltd for the last one year.

According to police, Das managed to commit the loot by using the secret passwords of the ATMs in which he used to load cash on be-

Gang of dacoits busted in Jeypore

Jeypore, June 26: In a major crackdown. Jevpore town police busted a 16-member gang of dacoits in Koraput district as part of its anti-criminal drive.

The gang includes nine minors as well, Jeypore sub-divisional police officer (SDPO) Arup Abhisekh Behera informed media persons at a presser held here.

"A total of 16 dacoits including nine juveniles have been apprehended in connection with two cases of theft and robbery in Jeypore town, two cases in Sadar and one case in Sunabeda area,'

Years of Growth Lost

ill four years ago, the Indian government would use the phrase "fastest growing economy." The prime minister would repeat the phrase "one bright spot in the global economy" to describe, and used it last at 8 pm November 8, 2016, when he gave us the Demonetisation speech

Since then, we have not heard much about the fastest growing bright spot. There is not much talk about the economy and has not been for the last four years. When it looked like India's economy had run into trouble, the boasting paused. Now that it is clear that India's economy has been ruined, we have stopped speaking about it entirely. Of course, just because the government does not speak about something does not mean that the problem does not exist. It does and we must try and understand what has happened to India.

According to government data, our economic growth began braking sharply before January 2018. From here, for some reasons which we need not speculate about today, we fell into a decline which we could not pull out of. For the four quarters of 2018 and for the next four quarters of 2019 and for the first quarter of 2020, we fell. This was before the Covid pandemic and by the time the national lockdown was announced, we had stopped growing completely.

The government did not tell us why our economy had imploded. The prime minister simply stopped speaking on the subject. On October 14, 2019, The Hindu published a piece written by Parakala Prabhakar, who is finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman's husband. Assessing the economy, he wrote: "There is anxiety all over about the economic slowdown in the country. While the government is still in denial mode, data flowing uninterruptedly into the public domain show that sector after sector is staring at a seriously challenging situation. Private consumption has contracted and is at an 18-

quarter low of 3.1%; rural consumption is in a deep southward dive and is double the rate of the urban slowdown; credit off-take by micro and small industries remains stagnant; net exports have shown little or no growth; GDP growth is at a six-year low with the first quarter of FY20 registering just 5%; and unemployment is at a 45-year-high. The government, however, is yet to show signs that it has come to grips with what ails the economy. Much less evidence is available to believe that it has a strategic vision to address the challenges.

This was 20 months ago and before the pandemic, and before the recession of 2020 and before the second wave of Covid. I received a newsletter from a business daily this week which listed what the position was for the last financial year, which ended a few weeks ago in April. Consumer spending contracted by 9 per cent and investments contracted by more than 10 per cent. Manufacturing, services, and construction lost value somewhere in the range of 8 per cent. What happened in the last financial year was that we went back to the past. We slowed down, then we stopped growing and then we started going back. The rest of the world kept growing and left us behind. The reason the average Indian is today poorer than the average Bangladeshi is to be found in the last 48 months. By April 2021, manufacturing, trade, transport and communications were down at the same level that they were in 2018. That is three years of growth lost. Construction has lost two years. The output of core industries such as cement.

refineries, steel is the same as it was in March 2017. That is four years India lost while the rest of the world produced more.

Sales of passenger vehicles including cars have gone back to their 2016 levels. That's a loss of five years. This is not an anomaly. The auto sector has been hammered for many years now and it is clear that the middleclass has stopped growing. Two wheeler sales are today at the same point that they were 10 years ago. The sales of commercial vehicles, meaning trucks that carry around goods, are today below where they were when Narendra Modi first became prime minister.

he Hong Kong newspaper Apple Daily has been forced to close. On the day it was shuttered, people queued to buy one last copy: a million were printed. The paper was doomed since last year, when China's Communist government imposed a harsh National Security Law on Hong Kong. Its offices were raided by the police. Its journalists were threatened with violence. Its assets were frozen. Salaries could no longer be paid. Senior editors and a chief columnist were arrested.

The paper's alleged crime was "collusion with foreign powers," or as the former Chief Executive of Hong Kong, CY Leung, crassly put it, "collusion with scum from foreign countries." Its real crime was its highly critical coverage of the Communist Party of China of the Hong Kong government, and of corrupt local tycoons and politicians ever since Jimmy Lai founded the paper in 1995.

Lai himself has already been in prison for almost a year, charged with fraud, collusion with foreign countries, and taking part in unlawful demonstrations. He could in theory be locked up for life. Neither Lai, nor his paper, fit

the high-minded ideal of progressive activism. Apple Daily is partly a sensationalist tabloid full of stories about the sexual transgressions of movie stars and other local celebrities, salacious gossip, and general muckraking. In most liberal democracies, such publications are usually seen as the unfortunate price to be paid for the right to free speech. The British tabloid press, for example, is hardly progressive, high-minded, or principled. But Apple Daily was principled

in its way. True, the paper's tone was populist and not always civil. People from mainland China arriving in Hong Kong to share in its riches were once compared to "locusts." But Apple Daily also offered some of Asia's sharpest political reporting and was often the only publication in Hong Kong

that regularly exposed and analysed financial or political wrongdoing. Lai is a fascinating and com-

plicated figure. An avowed admirer of Donald Trump and a devout Catholic convert, he holds rather strident views on the superiority of Western Christian civilization over what he sees as the tyrannical nature of Chinese civilization. This opinion is not uncommon among Christian Chinese political activists, but it tends to find more backing from the far right in the West than from liberals.

Lai is what might be described as a rough diamond. After fleeing China in 1959 at the age of 12, in less than 30 years he worked his way up from being a child labourer in a garment factory to become a textile magnate whose jeans brand, Giordano, sold well all over China and elsewhere in Asia. He became a very rich man.

Everything changed radically for Lai after the savage crackdown on the pro-democracy demonstrations in China in 1989. He had supported the student protesters occupying Tiananmen Square and sent them free T-shirts. When the Chinese authorities sent in troops to crush the protests, killing thousands, Lai became a vocal opponent of the Communist regime. He sold his garment business, which was threatened with closure in China anyway, and started a magazine called Next, and then Apple Daily. "Information to me is freedom," he said.

Lai wrote articles calling Li Peng, who carried out the savage crackdown in 1989, an "idiot" and 'the son of a turtle egg" (a particularly nasty insult among mainland Chinese). Since Li was rumored to have been adopted by Zhou Enlai after his own father was killed - a claim Li has denied calling his parentage into question was an especially stinging affront. The government denounced Lai as a "traitor," a "black hand," a "rotten apple," and so on, and viewed his support of democratic politicians and activists in Hong Kong, and his efforts to keep the memory of 1989 alive, as danger-

ously subversive. It was in fact unusual for a Hong Kong tycoon to defy the Communist government and promote democ-

Among the five BRICS economies, China is placed at 16th rank, Russia at 45th, Brazil at 57th, and South Africa at 62nd. India was placed at 41st rank in 2016. We then slipped to 47th in 2017, climbed back to 43rd in 2018 and remained there in the last two years. Another Global Competitiveness Index of 141 countries is made by the World Economic Forum. They have placed China on 28th, Russia on 43rd, South Africa on 60th, India on 68th and Brazil on 71st position. Here too India has been slipping. India was placed at the 58th rank in 2018 and slipped to 68th rank in 2019. The main cause of this slippage is our education system. India was placed at 59th rank among 64 countries in education. They have also said that unemployment increased from 10.4 per cent to 23.0 per cent in the last year. It is clear that our education system is not providing skills to the youth that may enable them to earn a living. This unfortunate situation exists despite considerable expenditures being made by the Union and state governments. According to RBI, the governments spent 3.3 per cent of GDP on education in 2019-20. ■ Nosopoetic

Despite its form, this has nothing to do with poetry (or noses). The first part is from Greek nosos, a disease, while the second is a disguised form of poietikos, creative or productive, which is the source of the English adjective poietic with the same sense plus a number of specialist compounds, including galactopoietic, relating to the production of milk, and morphopoietic, of the formation of organic structures. So something nosopoetic causes disease. You might think the term would have found favour with doctors, as it would be a useful addition to their vocabulary. It never caught on, however - despite appearing in a couple of glossaries of medical terms in the early nineteenth century - and around the middle of the century was supplanted by pathogenic. Nosopoetic was invented by the extraordinary mathematician, physician and satirist Dr John Arbuthnot, who also created the persona of John Bull who symbolises the English character and nation. He introduced nosopoetic in his work of 1733, An Essay Concerning the Effects of Air on Human Bodies. More than a century later, it appeared in a work written by a pioneering educationalist in Indiana to encourage students to learn new words by putting them in context: The multifarious cibarious substances engorged into inane and jejune stomachs, during the nuptial festivity, were extremely nosopoetic on the guests (Letters to Squire Pedant, by Samuel Hoshour, 1856). Cibarious means relating to food, or edible; inane is being used here in its ancient sense of void or empty: jeiune is likewise in its earliest meaning of fasting or being hungry. This periphrastic conglomeration may be reduced to "The wedding guests became ill from overeating on empty stomachs."

is ₹14,196 per year. This money is being spent in paying hefty salaries to government teachers. The government is giving attractions like no fee, free books and mid-day meals to encourage students to enroll in government schools where they get sub-standard education. The government teachers fundamentally have no interest in teaching because their salaries are secure irrespective of the results of their students. The curriculum is also 'backward' looking with focus on regional languages against English; and on languages instead of mathematics and sciences. Time has come to undertake surgery of the government education system. The governments must give this huge money directly to students in the form of 'education vouchers' with which they may pay the fees in a school or university of their choice. My estimate is that about 1/3rd students will not use these youchers. The 2/3rd students who use these vouchers can be given vouchers of ₹24,000 per year which would be more than sufficient for them to pay fees of good English medium schools in most small towns and villages which are charging about ₹1,000 per month as per my as-

In this background the New Education Policy is entirely a failure. It fails to introduce English at primary level, technical education at secondary level and fails to create a carrot-and-stick policy for teachers. Unfortunately, the policy is being made by the same education bureaucracy.

The second weakness in our competitiveness ranking is in the area of environment and health. The IMD has ranked India at the lowest among 64 countries. We are at 64th rank in both componentspollution and human development. The policy of the Union government is to look the other way on environment in order to attain economic growth. For example, in the recent past the government has relaxed requirements of air pollution for thermal power plants; it has promoted pollution of our rivers by converting them into waterways; and it has proposed amendments to the Environment Impact Assessment that would take a number of activities out of the requirement to obtain an environment clearance. The government's policy is counterproductive. The pollution is leading to a decline in our competitiveness and hitting growth.

curative health. Public health constitutes vaccination, health education, epidemiology and similar activities that can only be undertaken by the government. The expenditures on curative health are substantially made to provide free healthcare to government employees though, of course, private patients are also treated. The government must dismantle the curative health system and provide 'health vouchers' to every citizen with which she can buy healthcare from either private or government hospitals. About ₹1500 per year can be provided from the present expenditures, including to government servants.

The situation is serious. It is necessary to improve our competitiveness in the community of nations. That, in turn, requires that we repair our education, environment and health policies that are pulling our competitiveness down. We are slipping and will continue to slip as the GDP growth rate will continue to fall as has been happening over last seven years.

> Ekamania gram panchayat in Aul block of Kendrapara district is a case in point. Ekamania, Nalapahi and Dakhinadiha villages constitute this panchayat which is 15 km from the block headquarters. The panchayat is surrounded by the Brahmani and the Kharashrota rivers

Four thousand people living in these three villages are cut off from the outside world as most of the time in a year they find themselves marooned. They have no access to health, education and transportation.

People cannot avail a facility as

basic as an ambulance whenever there is a health emergency or a fire tender when there is a fire the village. The only link for their association with the outside world is by way of boats. Their long-held demand for a bridge to their panchayat has been buried under bulky files of the administration.

The state government had laid the foundation stone of a bridge in 2016. However, the irony is that there is no follow-up action after that. Officials visit these waterlogged villages whenever there are some official functions, politicians also visit them before elections, but they forget the hard fate of these people once their work is over.

As the surrounding rivers of these villages are connected to the Bhitarkanika sanctuary, these rivers are always infested with crocodiles. The villagers always live under the fear of death.

People's miseries know no bounds whenever there is a flood in the rivers. Regular floods have turned to be a permanent curse for these residents. Floods inundate their farmlands and get them sand-cast. This is high time the government did something for these people, claim local intelli-

gentsia Health services have been a dream for these people. Residents, even if they are afflicted by a small cold, are forced to visit hospitals in Rajnagar or Mahu. As it were, there is no government or the administration to listen to the plight of these people. Villagers of the paanchayat have against appealed to the government to construct a bridge over the rivers, without further delay.

Survey begins for 3rd railway line of SER

Jaleswar, June 26: Even as people in this region have long demanded upgradation of the Jaleswar railway station on the outskirts of Balasore district, the authorities have paid scant regard to this demand. Besides Jaleswar, people of Baliapala, Bhograi, Rasgovindpur, Raibania areas depend on this railway station. Even people in East and West Midnapur districts of West Bengal look to this railway station for their transportation.

As this station falls under the south-east division of the railways, it has not made enough

progress, sources said. Even as this station generates revenue in the region of ₹10 crore per annum, it has not been upgraded to NSG-4 category. Many outfits on behalf of the people of Jaleswar and members of the social welfare development council have met the railway divisional railway manager (DRM) at Kharagpur and additional general manager at Kolkata, but to no avail.

The railway authorities had promised these delegations that their demands will be favourably considered whenever work for the third rail line begins. However, nothing has come off this promise

Kesinga, June 26: The residents of Kesinga town in Kalahandi district are opposing the construction of a crematorium close to the stadium.

In order to prevent the sanctioned money from returning, the crematorium is being constructed near the stadium,' he added.

According to sources, the ringroad project includes a portal frame bridge (PFB) on a 1,250 metre-long stretch starting from Kumbharpada to Dasamati Ghat. A concrete retaining wall will be constructed on the side facing the Mahanadi river. A tender was floated for the project with an estimated cost of ₹56,09,83,000, several months ago.

Soil was tested at 45 peer points to facilitate the bridge construction, in January this year. Chief engineer of the works department had inspected the project site and advised the contract firm to col-



However, after recollection of soil samples from the peer points, the project did not witness any

progress, the locals lamented. Meanwhile, Sonepur MLA and finance minister Niranjan Pujari had ordered the department officials to expedite the project work.

Notably, the ancient town is sur-

rounded by the Mahanadi and the Tel rivers from three sides. Erstwhile king Birmitrodaya Singh Deo had planned to build a ring road to save the town from flood.

Later, the state government took up the project and decided to complete the ring road as it would not only protect the town from possi-ble floods but also ease the traffic woes on roads inside the town.











Punjab, Haryana farmers take out protest marches

Chandigarh, June 26: Scores of protesting farmers from Punjab and Haryana Saturday took out protest marches against the Centre's three farm laws even as police used a water cannon to disperse cultivators as they broke barricades at the Chandigarh-Mohali border.

Farmers had planned to march towards Punjab and Haryana Raj Bhavans here and submit a mem orandum to mark the completion of seven months of their agitation against the three central agri-marketing laws June 26.

A heavy police force was deployed in and around Chandigarh to stop protesters from heading towards Punjab and Haryana Raj Bhavans, said officials.

Barricades were put up at many places to prevent farmers coming from Mohali and Panchkula to go towards Chandigarh. However, agitating farmers, com-

ing from the Mohali side, entered Chandigarh after forcing their way through barricades put up at the Chandigarh-Mohali border while facing water cannon. A protester could be seen climbing to the top of a water cannon vehicle.

Earlier, a large number of farmers from several parts of Punjab as-



sembled at Gurdwara Amb Sahib in Mohali before moving towards the Punjab Governor House.

Similarly, farmers from several parts of Harvana also gathered at Gurdwara Nada Sahib in Haryana's

Panchkula. They headed towards Haryana Raj Bhavan. Farmers in Panchkula forced their way through a layer of barricades but they were not allowed

to enter Chandigarh and stopped

at the Chandigarh-Panchkula border where Haryana police had deployed water cannon and trucks. Farmers coming from the Mohali side were led by farmer leader

Mumbai, June 26: The coronavirus pandemic has hit the tourism industry hard everywhere and the Gharapuri island that houses famous Elephanta caves, a world heritage site off Mumbai coast, is no exception to it.

The residents of this tiny island, which comprises three hamlets- Rajbunder, Shetbunder and Mora Bunder- are completely dependent on tourism for livelihood, and in normal times, except during monsoon, this place witnesses a heavy footfall of tourists who come to see the collection of cave temples predominantly dedicated

to the Hindu god Shiva. However, the situation changed after the Covid-19 crisis broke out last year. The pandemic and the subsequent nationwide lockdown as well as the state-level restrictions have affected the lives of the people.

The residents said that besides them, the gram panchayat has also

New Delhi, June 26: The pace of vaccination of the 60-plus population has become sluggish in the past few weeks after an initial high. with healthcare experts attributing it to mobility issues and misinformation and unsubstantiated apprehensions about the jabs.

According to Health Ministry data, 2.29 crore elderly people have been fully vaccinated so far while 6.71 crore have received just one dose of Covid-19 vaccine till now.

The 60-plus population in India was projected to be at 14.3 crore in 2021, so that would imply that just 16 per cent of them have been fully vaccinated till now.

Vaccination for those over 60

years of age and those of 45-plus with co-morbidities started from March 1 at both government and

private centres. On an average about 80.77 lakh vaccine doses were given to the 60plus population per week between March 13 and April 2, but the weekly figure dropped to about 32 lakh between June 5 to 25, according to the data. Healthcare experts expressed

concern over the slow pace of vaccination of the 60-plus people who are more prone to have co-morbidities and remain more susceptible to severe disease.

Dr Sujeet Ranjan, Executive Director of The Coalition for Food and Nutrition Security (CFNS), said myths, misconceptions and

rumours about Covid-19 vaccines are the biggest hurdle to vaccination coverage

Some people think they will never contract Covid-19, others believe that the virus itself is on the way out. Irrational mistrust of scientifically approved vaccines is also a factor. While vaccine hesitancy has always been a phenomenon in our country, today it tends to accentuated by opinions on social media, where even people with no subject expertise but having wide following can influence people, he said.

Official sources said Deshmukh has now been asked to appear next week by Tuesday. Earlier, lawyers of Deshmukh handed over a letter written by the politician to the investigators.

"He (Deshmukh) will not appear today. We have not been given documents related to this case and we have given a letter to ED demanding these documents and case details in which he is to be questioned. We will furnish our reply accordingly," lawyer Jayvant Patil told reporters outside the ED office.

The central agency early on Saturday arrested his personal secretary Sanjeev Palande (51) and personal assistant Kundan Shinde (45) after it carried out raids against them and Deshmukh in Mumbai and Nagpur Friday.

The aides were brought to the ED office for questioning following the searches and arrested subsequently. They were sent to ED custody till July 1 by a special PMLA here. The ED case against Deshmukh and others was made out after the CBI first carried out a preliminary inquiry followed by a regular case being filed on the orders of the Bombay High Court. The court had asked the Central

A further complication is that Delta seems to largely bypass immunity that might be conferred by a previous infection, said Samuel Alizon, a biologist specialised in infectious disease modelling.

"We can't really rely on natural nmunity anymore." he told AFP.

The delta variant is currently the greatest threat in the US to our attempt to eliminate Covid-19," Dr Anthony Fauci, the country's top infectious disease expert, warned at a White House briefing. "Good news: Our vaccines are effective against the delta variant." The variant makes up more than 50 per cent of new infections in Iowa, Kansas, Missouri, Nebraska, Colorado, Montana, North Dakota, South Dakota, Utah and Wyoming.

UNITED KINGDOM

The number of Delta variant cases of Covid-19 in the UK have risen by 35,204 since last week to a total of 111,157, representing a 46 per cent increase, health officials said in the weekly report released Friday. While the Delta variant now accounts for approximately 95 per cent of cases that are sequenced across the UK, PHE said the both doses of a COVID-19 vaccine continue to provide good protection against hospitalisations. The latest figures show that an additional 514 people were admitted to hospital in England with a diagnosis of Covid-19 in the week up to June 21. There have now been a total of 117 deaths in England of people confirmed as having the Delta variant - eight of which were people under the age of 50. Six of these eight people were unvaccinated, while two died after more than 21 days of receiving a first dose of a Coronavirus vaccine.

AFRICA

In Africa, which has so far been spared the worst of the pandemic, infections are surging at an alarming rate in at least 12 countries, with continental cases expected to hit a record peak in around three weeks. The Delta variant has been reported in 14 African countries, making up the bulk of new cases in the Democratic Republic of Congo and Uganda, according to the World Health Organisation. The highly contagious Delta variant is driving a surge in South African Covid-19 infections that is testing the capacity of hospitals and forcing authorities to mull tighter restrictions. The hardest-hit country in Africa recorded 18,762 new infections Saturday -- its highest daily figure since January.

Coronavirus infections in Russia have surged in recent weeks, with the daily tally of new cases growing from approximately 9,000 in early June to over 17,000 Friday.

BANGLADESH

Bangladesh has announced it will impose a tough new lockdown starting Monday, after a "dangerous and alarming" surge in Delta variant cases of Coronavirus. All government and private offices will be shut for a week and only medical-related transport will be allowed, the government said late Friday. "No one can step out of their homes except in emergency cases," a statement added. Infection rates have been rising sharply since mid-May in Bangladesh, home to around 170 million people. The government recorded almost 6,000 new cases and 108 fatalities June 25, the second-highest death toll yet in the pandemic.

AUSTRALIA

Central Sydney's streets were deserted Saturday as Australia's largest city began a week-long lockdown to contain the highly contagious Delta Coronavirus variant, with authorities warning broader restrictions could follow. More than 80 Covid-19 cases have been reported so far in an infection surge linked to an international flight crew transported to a quarantine hotel from the airport. Health authorities have flagged a string of new possible virus exposure sites, including a popular city bar, in addition to the scores of businesses and public places already identified as risks.

US inflation measure posts biggest y-o-y increase since 1992

to all Primary (Urban) Co-operative Banks. The RBI had exempted UCBs with a deposit size of less than ₹100 crore from the requirement of seeking prior approval of the Reserve Bank for appointment/reappointment/termination of appointment of MDs or WTDs.

Under the propriety criteria, the person to be nominated as MD or WTD shall not be engaged in any other business or vocation; shall not hold the position of a Member of Parliament or state legislature or municipal corporation or municipality or other local bodies; and shall not be a director of any company other than a company registered under Section 8

of the Companies Act. 2013. In addition, he shall not be a partner of any firm which carries



on any trade, business or industry; should not have substantial interest in any company or firm as defined in Section 5 (ne) read with Section 56 of the Banking Regulations Act, 1949; and shall not be a director, manager, managing agent, partner or proprietor of any trading, commercial or industrial concern.

In addition, the person should not be of unsound mind and stands so declared by a competent court; should not be an undischarged insolvent: should not be convicted by a criminal court of an offence involving moral turpitude; and should not be a director of any other co-operative bank or a cooperative credit society.

The person shall submit a selfdeclaration form on personal integrity. While the exempted UCBs are not required to obtain prior approval, they are required to formulate a board approved policy based on all the other provisions of these directions for appointment / re-appointment / termination of appointment of MD or WTD.

Mumbai, June 26: The Covid-19 related travel curbs in different parts of the country have had a lasting impact on the track and tourism industry. With mobility restricted, less Indians were travelling for non-essential work for most part of the last year.

Now with the second wave of the pandemic subsiding and people are coming out, the most pertinent question in the travel industry is whether finally leisure travel will pick up pace? What will be the trend in the post-Covid world?

A survey by Thomas Cook India and SOTC Travel as part of their Third Holiday Readiness Report has found that people's interest in travel has increased tremendously during the month with several expressing desire to start travel im-

mediately to get over the period of relative immobility brought about by the pandemic.

A significant 69 per cent of the respondents in the survey indicated keen interest to travel in 2021 post ease in restrictions -- with 18 per cent ready to travel immediately post unlock and 51 per cent within the next 3-6 months.

What has changed from pre-Covid period to now is that people are increasingly preferring travel choices that provide hygienic staying options coupled with best safety protocols. In the survey, 70 per cent re-

spondents ranked health & safety as the key consideration while resanitation of rooms was selected by 52 per cent respondents as a key requirement.

Majority or about 66 per cent of the respondents showed willing-



ness to increase spends to ensure higher levels of health and safety on their holiday. Another interesting trend brought out by the survey is that a whopping 81 per

cent respondents reiterated their need for refundable or zero cancellation products.

With the uncertainty created by the virus, people want flexible prod-

ucts where cancellations would be allowed as a rule.

The Thomas Cook India and SOTC Travel surveyed over 4,000 customers across India's Tier 1-3 cities to identify emerging consumer behaviours and trends that will drive travel preferences in the Covid era.

The survey covered consumers of India's top eight metros, mini metros like Pune and key Tier 2/3 markets such as Jaipur, Indore, Tiruchirappalli, Madurai, Nagpur, Surat, Baroda, Bhubaneswar, Lucknow, Chandigarh, Mysore, Coimbatore, Visakhapatnam, Guwahati, Patna etc.

What is interesting is that travellers want options for both domestic and international travel in just about equal number of preferences expressed in the survey. Among the domestic destina-

tions, Kashmir, Leh-Ladakh, Himachal, Andamans, Goa and Kerala have caught the fancy of the travellers, while Dubai-Abu Dhabi, Maldives, Mauritius, Thailand, Europe etc. remain hot travel destinations globally. Also, 35 per cent respondents chose holidays between 3 and 5 days; 52 per cent for 6-12 days; and 13 per cent for over 12 days.

About 62 per cent respondents prefer to travel with family/friends; 20 per cent as couple/solo; and 18 per cent in a vaccinated group.

Even with the pandemic still lurking, 77 per cent respondents continued to express strong preference for interaction with an expert for guidance/reassurance, 27 per cent opting to purchase holidays through retailoutlets while 17 per cent for home service.

Budapest, June 26: The Netherlands outfit is arguably exceeding expectations under Frank de Boer prepare for battle in the round of 16 stage of Euro 2020 as they take on the Czech Republic at the Puskas Arena, Sunday.

The Oranje eased through Group C as winners to advance to the knockout stages, while the Czech Republic booked their spot in the elite 16 as one of the four best thirdplaced outfits.

The ruthless nature of the Netherlands has shone through at these Championships, with no other team in the group stage topping the eight goals that Oranje scored in their three group matches, and De Boer has witnessed his side score at least two goals in each of their last 10 matches in all competitions.

Having seemingly found the optimal formula for success with a new-look 3-4-1-2 set-up, De Boer is slowly winning over his critics after some pre-tournament pessimism with regard to their chances, and another welcome fixture with Wales or Denmark awaits should the Netherlands progress as expected. Not since Euro 2000 - when De

Boer was an integral cog in the Oranje machine – have the Netherlands opened a European Championships campaign with four straight victories, but having dazzled and delighted so far, a first quarterfinal appearance since 2008 is no less than their ardent supporters will accept.

Following in the footsteps of Scotland and Croatia, Czech Republic became the third team to be thwarted by England's staunch defence at Wembley, as a first-half header from Raheem Sterling was all that separated the two sides during a low-key affair in the English capital.

Despite falling to their first and only defeat of the group stage at Wembley, the Czechs' victory over Scotland and dogged draw with Croatia was enough for them to advance as one of the best thirdplaced outfits, and they have been rewarded with a fixture of daunting proportions.

In doing so, Jaroslav Silhavy has already steered his side further than Pavel Vrba could during their ill-fated 2016 run - keeping with the theme of the Czech Republic bowing out at the group stage one year then progressing to the knockout rounds during the next cycle.

The Czech Republic have never been knocked out at the last 16 stage of the Euros as an independent nation, but if they are to break the cycle of going one worse than they did in previous knockout rounds (runners-up in 1996, semifinalists in 2004 and quarterfinalists in 2012), Silhavy will need Patrik Schick and co to be firing on all cylinders at the Puskas Arena.

Swimmer Sajan Prakash creates history for India
