Covid deaths cross 5,000-mark in state

BHUBANESWAR: With reports of 66 fresh fatalities, the total deaths due to Covid-19 in the state crossed 5.000mark Sunday. Now, the death toll stands at 5,058. According to the state health department, the highest 23 deaths were reported from Khurda district, eight in Ganjam district and six in Mayurbhanj and Sundargarh districts each. Similarly, five casualties were recorded in Boudh district while three deaths occurred in each of Bargarh and Nayagarh, two each in Gajapati, Kendrapara and Puri and one each from Bhadrak, Bolangir, Rayagada, Jagatsinghpur, Jajpur and Kandhamal district. However, the above list does not reflect deaths occurring on a particular day. It gives details of past deaths for which the death audit process has been duly completed and the cause of death has been identified as due to Covid-19, the department said.

OPPN PREPARES TO CORNER GOVT

GOVT LINES UP 17 BILLS. SAYS WANTS HEALTHY DISCUSSION

New Delhi, July 18: The government has readied a big legislative agenda for the Monsoon session of Parliament beginning Monday even as the Opposition seeks to corner the ruling dispensation over its handling of the second wave of Covid-19 and the rise in fuel prices.

The government has listed 17 ne Bills for introduction in the session. Three of the Bills seek to replace or-

dinances issued recently. Once a session starts an ordinance has to be passed as a bill within 42 days or six weeks, else it lapses. One of the ordinances issued June 30, prohibits any agitation and strike by anyone engaged in the essential Defence services.

The Essential Defence Services Ordinance 2021 came in the backdrop of the announcement by major federations of the Ordnance Factory Board (OFB) to go on an indefinite strike from the later part of July to protest the government's decision to corporatise the OFB. The Essential Defence Service Bill, 2021 has been listed to replace the ordinance, according to a Lok Sabha bulletin issued July 12.

2 Maoists surrender, claim many rebels affected by Covid

Malkangiri, July 18: Two Maoists carrying bounties on their heads surrendered before Odisha DGP Abhay in Malkangiri district Sunday, and claimed that many red rebels have been infected with Covid-19 and some of them have succumbed to the infection due to lack of proper treatment in the jungles, police said.

The surrendered Maoists said they were scared of the infection and preferred surrender over contracting the disease. They were identified as Rame Podiami alias Sabita, an area committee member and Pallachalam local organisation squad commander of the CPI (Maoist) outfit, and Raidhar Dhurua, secretary of its Daldali cell, an officer said

Sabita carried a bounty of ₹2 lakh on her head, while Dhurua had ₹1 lakh reward for his arrest, he said. Speaking to reporters, the duo claimed that many Maoists have been infected with Covid-19 and some have succumbed to the disease due to a lack of proper treatment in the jungles.

"We were scared of the infection and preferred to surrender," the Odisha Police said in a statement quoting Sabita. The duo claimed that many Maoists from state want to return to the mainstream but are being prevented by the leaders from surrendering.

Reviewing the Left-wing Extremism (LWE) situation in Malkangiri and Koraput districts during a one-day visit, Abhay said, "Maoist activities in formerly cut-off area Swabhiman Anchal have come down significantly as many security camps have been established, bringing peace in the area."

Mumbai, July 18: At least thirty-three people died in house collapses triggered by landslides following incessant overnight rains in Mumbai, which caused severe water logging and disruption of suburban train services and vehicular traffic in the financial capital Sunday, officials said. The Western Railway and

Central Railway briefly suspended suburban train services in Mumbai after the heavy rains, and many long distance trains were terminated or regulated at various stations, officials said.

Seventeen people died as a compound wall came crashing down on some houses located on a hillock after a landslide, a fire official said.

The retaining wall of the Bharatnagar locality in Mumbai's Mahul area collapsed at 1 am, the official said. Seven people were injured and taken to nearby Rajawadi hospital, he added.

Seven hutment dwellers died as six shanties collapsed after a landslide following incessant overnight rains in

at 2.30 am, a civic official said. Two persons were injured and were sent to a nearby hospital, he added.

A 16-year-old boy died after a forest department compound wall collapsed in suburban Bhandup, an official said.

A viral video showed a two-wheeler being dragged in water in an inundated street in Chinchpokli area. The suburban train services were suspended due to water logging on the tracks due to the overnight heavy downpour, railway officials said, adding the services were resumed in the morning.

Before the pandemic, both the Central Railway and Western Railway used to ferry over 75 lakh commuters a day in over 3000 suburban train services which are now allowed only for emergency services staff_ and government employees.

As per tradition three chariots were pulled one by one with South turn from the entry gate parking and stationed at the exit gate of Gundicha temple known as Nakachanadwar facing towards the main temple Saturday. This exercise is called "Dakshini Moda".

After the observance of the daily needs of deities in the Adap mandap, three Puja pandas came with the "agyamallvas" in a procession Saturday and handed over the order of the deities to park the chariots in front of the Nakachanadwar for the return journey. About five hundred police personnel were engaged in making all the three chariots on

the Dakshini Moda exercise Meanwhile, the administration has geared up activities to conduct devotees "Bahuda Yatra" as was done during the Rath yatra July 12 last. This apart from the preparation by the temple administration was on to observe Sunabesh, the golden attire of the trinity and Adharpana rituals of deities after their arrival at the Simhadwar of the main temple.

The entire city and Badadanda would be placed under curfew for 48 hours for the Return Car Festival. Amazon's Jeff Bezos to blast off into space tomorrow

THE MISSION COMES DAYS AFTER VIRGIN GALACTIC FOUNDER RICHARD BRANSON CROSSED THE FINAL FRONTIER. NARROWLY BESTING THE AMAZON MAGNATE IN THE BATTLE OF THE BILLIONAIRES

Washington, July 18: Jeff Bezos, one of the richest person in the world, is set to join the astronaut club Tuesday on the first crewed launch by Blue Origin, another key moment in a big month for the fledgling space tourism industry.

The mission comes days after Virgin Galactic founder Richard Branson crossed the final frontier narrowly besting the Amazon magnate in their battle of the billionaires.

Blue Origin's sights are, however, set higher: both literally in terms of the altitude to which its reusable New Shepard craft will ascend compared to Virgin's spaceplane, but also in its future ambitions.

Bezos founded Blue Origin back in 2000, with the goal of one day building floating space colonies with artificial gravity where millions of people will work and live.



Today, the company is developing a heavy-lift orbital rocket called New Glenn and also a Moon lander it is hoping to contract to NASA under the

Artemis programme. "They've had 15 successful New Shepard uncrewed flights and we've

been waiting years to see when they're going to start flying people," Laura Forczyk, founder of space consulting firm Astralytical, told AFP, calling it an "exciting time" for enthusiasts.

New Shepard will blast off at 8:00 am Central Time (1300 GMT) July 20 from a remote facility in the west Texas desert called Launch Site One, some 40 kilometers north of the nearest town, Van Horn. The event will be live streamed on BlueOrigin.com beginning an hour and a half before.

Oldest and youngest

Joining Bezos on the fully autonomous flight will be barrier-breaking female aviator Wally Funk, who at 82 is set to be the oldest ever astronaut, Dutch teenager Oliver Daemen, the company's first paying customer, who will become the youngest astronaut.

Rounding out the four-member crew is Jeff Bezos' brother Mark, a financier who directs the Bezos Family Foundation and works as a volunteer

The pair is best friends, and Jeff shared the moment he asked his younger sibling to join him in a viral

video on Instagram last month. Notably absent is the mysterious winner of a \$28 million auction for a seat, who had "scheduling conflicts" and will take part in a future flight, and has asked to remain anonymous, the company said.

After lift-off, New Shepard will accelerate towards space at speeds exceeding Mach 3 using a liquid hydrogen/liquid oxygen engine with no carbon emissions.

The capsule soon separates from its booster, and the astronauts unbuckle and begin to experience weightlessness.

The crew will spend a few minutes beyond the Karman line - the internationally recognised boundary between Earth's atmosphere and space, at 100 kilometers altitude, as the spacecraft peaks at 65 106 kilometers high.

The booster returns autonomously to a landing pad just north of its launch site, while the capsule freefalls back to Earth before deploying three giant parachutes, and finally a thruster, to land gently in the west Texas desert.







2 gunrunners nabbed; 10 firearms seized

Bhubaneswar, July 18: The Special Task Force (STF) of Crime Branch (CB) has arrested two persons al legedly involved in illegal arms trade and seized 10 guns from their possession, a senior police officer said Sunday.

Following a tip-off, the STF personnel nabbed Basanta Moharana of Nayagarh and Krushna Chandra Srichandan of Khurda town while they were preparing to sell the illegal arms. The seized arms comprised five pistols/revolvers, 5 SBML guns, 8 rounds of live ammunition and one empty cartridge said STF SP Tejeswar Patel.

This apart, one motorcycle and other materials have been seized from their possession, he said.

The STF carried out a raid on the basis of intelligence input regarding illegal possession/sale of illegal firearms near village Siko under Jankia police limits in Khurda district.

The SP said the arrested per sons were booked under different Sections of the Arms Act and they were also involved in other criminal cases in different districts. The STF, since 2020, has seized as many as 47 firearms, 84 live ammunition and arrested several criminals.



'Ashirvad Yojana' spills beans on Covid-related deaths in Bolangir

Bolangir, July 18: The Odisha Covid-19 dashboard informs that so far 23,070 persons in Bolangir district have tested positive for the virus. It also points out 22,898 persons have recovered while 87 have succumbed to the disease. However, there are doubts regarding the exact number of fatalities. It has led to controversies in various quarters in the district.

It has been alleged that the district administration and the Odisha government are fudging Covid-19 data and concealing the actual number of Covid-related deaths in the district.

The enlistment of orphaned children due to both or one of the parents succumbing to Covid-19, in the 'Ashirvad Yojana' has suddenly put the spotlight on Covid-19 deaths in the district. Over 2,733 children have applied for financial assistance in 'Ashirvad Yojana'. The applicants have lost either both parents or one. However, the actual reason for the deaths is not available. Hence officials are at a loss to tackle the situation. Many feel that in the process, children actually orphaned due to Covid-19 will be deprived of their financial benefits

Notably, Prime Minister Narendra Modi had announced that financial assistance will be provided to the children orphaned due to Covid-19 much before the Odisha government had launched the 'Ashirvad Yojana'.

Lack of irrigation facilities hits cultivation in Salipur block

Salipur, July 18: Lack of irrigation facilities has hit cultivation on hundreds of acres of farmland under this block in Cuttack district, a report said.

With monsoon playing hide and seek, farmers are vet to start cul tivation in the block. The canal through which water could have been supplied to the farmers is presently clogged with aquatic plants and other debris. As a result. it has sparked resentment among the farmers in the area

area mainly depend on rain and the canal water for their farmlands. The Tentol branch canal which originates from the Kendrapara canal is not functional at all. The flow of water has completely stopped and so the farmlands are not getting proper supply.

In such a situation, farmers are hoping that there will be sufficient rainfall soon and they can start cultivation. Saplings have already been planted, but those are withering due to lack of proper supply of water. Most of the agricultural land now has shrubs and wild grass growing. Farmlands on

the upstream of the canal have also developed cracks due to heat and insufficient water.

Also, farmlands in Bodamundai, Pikol and other villages on the upstream also are suffering due to lack of irrigation facilities. This is because the authorities have not cleaned the branch canal No 6 which also originates from Kendrapara canal.

The canal authorities have released water in the Kendrapara canal from July 9. However, Salipur block is not being able to avail of the facility as most of the smaller canals are clogged with silt.

The village still does not have any mobile network available. There are mobile phones, but without



When asked, the trio said they have regularly been trekking the distance to attend the online classes and exams. "We don't have mobile networks in our village. So we have no other option but to travel this arduous journey every day as the network is only available there." the three said in unison.

Cuban Crisis

It is an irony of history that when China is celebrating the centenary of its party, the Communist Party of China (CPC), another communist country, Cuba, is confronted with the biggest mass demonstrations for three decades against food shortage, high prices, power outage and one party political system. As thousands of protesters took to the streets in towns across Cuba, it was not simply an expression of nation-wide anger against a temporary economic crisis compounded by the Covid-19 pandemic. The outpouring of anger is a tell-tale manifestation of the people's lack of faith in the Cuban variety of communism that has failed to improve the common man's quality of life. This is mainly because Cuban communism has all these years been doggedly refusing to effect economic reforms or combine socialism with the market forces the way Chinese communism has done to emerge as the second largest economy of the world.

The assertion by Cuban President Miguel Díaz-Canel July 17 that the protests are nothing but a black 'lie' spread by the USA does not cut much ice as images circulated on social media sites in Cuba clearly show all's not well. The protests began in the morning of July 11 in the town of San Antonio de los Baños in the west of the island. With millions of Cubans now with mobile internet on their phones, news of the protests quickly swept to Havana and thousands erupted in central Havana chanting 'homeland and life' and 'freedom'. This was a parody on the clarion call given by Cuba's Communist liberator Fidel Castro in the 1950s – 'homeland or death'. The protesters are angry because there is an acute shortage of basic food and medicine and there are power-cuts in the current spell of gruelling heat. The common refrain of the protesters is change of government, multiparty elections and end of communism.

Even if there is an element of truth in the Cuban President's charge that the USA is engineering the demonstrations to overthrow Communist rule in Cuba, fact remains that the Cuban economy is collapsing for a combination of factors including the rulers' refusal to reform it for the past 30 years. The Trump administration dealt a severe blow to the island's economy with over 200 new sanctions aimed at sabotaging Cuba's economy and stirring discontent. The measures are being continued by his successor Joe Biden. The pandemic has worsened the crisis with drastic fall in tourism, a key revenue earner for Cuba, drop in remittances contributed by Cubans working in the USA and the crude oil crisis in friendly Venezuela.

Cubans have become accustomed to waiting in queues for hours to buy basic goods such as chicken and detergent. Medicines have disappeared from pharmacy shelves

Cuba had witnessed the biggest protests in 1994, when tens of thousands demonstrated at Havana's Malecón promenade amid an acute economic crisis brought on by the fall of the Soviet Union. But, the charisma of Fidel Castro had bailed the Communist rulers out at that time.

Now, Cuba's economy is struggling like never before and Miguel lacks Castro's stature. Apart from the toll the pandemic has taken on tourism, the poor harvest of sugar this season has hit the economy hard. Sugar, which is mostly exported, is a key earner for Cuba. As a result, the government's reserves of foreign currency are depleted and it is unable to buy imported goods to supplement shortages, as it would normally do.

But, the main problem that has brought this crisis to Cuba is the country's Soviet-style, centrally planned economy and its hesitation to adopt market-oriented reforms that other remaining communist countries have taken up. Its economy has contracted by over 35 per cent and it never recovered from the crisis the collapse of the Soviet Union in 1991 plunged it into, economists say. At the same time Cuba did not heed advice from China and Vietnam to reform its economy. During an official visit in 2018, the general secretary of Vietnam's Communist Party, Nguyen Phu Trong, urged Cuba to adopt the model of market economy as Vietnam had done in the 1980s. Over 30 million Vietnamese were lifted out of poverty in the wake of the new experiment. Cuba's government owns and operates most industries, while most of the labour force is employed by the state.

Faced with severe shortages of food and medicine, Díaz-Canel recently picked up the pace of reforms, unifying the country's dual currency and legalising the status of private businesses allowed to operate decades ago. He also promised more movement in that direction. But for the average Cuban, the reforms are too little, too late and they lack credibility. Former leader and brother of Fidel, Raul Castro had also promised ambitious economic reforms in 2011, but they were never fully implemented.

Hence, it won't serve much purpose to the current Cuban leadership either to see an American plot in the spate of protests or put down massive demonstrations with an iron hand. The challenge is to the economic model and political ideology and the response will show the mettle of the leadership.

■ On all fours



hy privatise LIC? The government says it is not privatisation but only an initial public offering of some stake. That was what Anurag Thakur, then Minister of State for Finance and Corporate Affairs, unequivocally stated in the Parliament sometime back. The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs has recently given its inprincipal approval for LIC's IPO. The government's fast and preparatory steps indicate the actual sale is most likely to start during the last quarter of the current fiscal.

IPO or with whatever name it is called, the government is going to ease its monopoly control on LIC, selling a part of its stake.

Considering its unparalleled achievement in terms of not only the enormous social benefit it generated but the support it provided to the exchequer during troubled times, does not LIC qualify to be excluded from any plan for privatisation? The enormous potential of the milch cow (LIC's IPO alone is estimated to fetch around ₹1 lakh crore in the ₹1.75 lakh crore disinvestment plan) and the urgent need for funds make the government blind to the damage it is going to cause in the long run. It is not at all reasonable to sell LIC's stake, the family silver, for fiscal deficit needs.

Even a cursory look at the birth and evolution of LIC shows how ludicrous is the idea of easing monopoly control on it. Private insurance did not work in the public interest during the pre and early post-Independence years. The very first life insurance company, Oriental Life Insurance Company, set up in Calcutta (now Kolkata) in 1818 served only the European community. This and many other foreign companies did not cover Indians' lives at all. It required concerted efforts by persons like Babu Mutty Lal Seal to make the British companies agree to insure Indians' lives. Even after agreeing to this, Indian lives were treated as sub-standard and heavy extra premiums were charged. Although this anomaly was removed, private insurance could not be freed from fraud and incompetence.

Before nationalisation, 25 insurance companies went into liquidation, 80 did not even file their statutory returns, 245 life and 108 general insurance companies failed the policyholders. The Vivian Bose Commission, set up during Nehru's time, noted many other irregularities like money-laundering and false claims of big business houses and their accommodating sister concerns in the insurance business.

To protect the public interest, the LIC was formed just with ₹5 crore capital in 1956, amalgamating 245 private entities which included 154 Indian, 16 foreign and 75 provident fund societies. Although the capital was enhanced to ₹100 crore, it was not an extra burden; the LIC had internally generated the sum. The present authorised capital of ₹25,000 crore, too, doesn't serve any useful purpose as long as the sovereign guarantee to policyholders (Section 37) remains intact.

Despite minimal government support and private competition since 1999, the LIC's growth has been phenomenal. Its market share in the number of policies (the number is more important than money because the public sector's focus is on low-income groups) in March 2021 was 81.04 per cent and for the whole financial year was 74.58 per cent. In case of premium amount, it was 64.74 per cent and 66.18 per cent for March 2021 and the whole financial year respectively. The customer service of the public sector insurer has been excellent as found when the MARG's survey was employed by the RN Malhotra Committee in 1993; 97 per cent of the respondents rated the service good/excellent.

The LIC has eight zonal offices and 113 divisional offices, 2,048 branches, 1,526 satellite offices and 1,178 mini offices in the country (March 31, 2020). It has foreign branches, in Fiji (Suva and Lautoka), Mauritius (Port Louis) and the United Kingdom (Wembley) and joint ventures in Bahrain, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Kenya, Saudi Arabia and Bangladesh and a wholly-owned subsidiary in Singapore.

With its ₹31 lakh crore balance sheet, LIC is the country's second-largest financial services institution next only to the SBI with ₹39.51 lakh crore assets. The sum assured stands at ₹56,86,035.01 crore. LIC has 1,14,498 employees besides 10,80,809 active agents out of total 12,08,826 agents (March 31, 2020).

Although the government gets only 5 per cent of the surplus leaving 95 per cent to the policyholders, it got ₹2,697.74 crore dividend in 2019-20. The net total income was ₹6,15,882.94 crore. The taxes LIC paid that year amounted to ₹10,225.24 crore.

Besides being the biggest institutional investor in the country (Rs 30,69,941.67 crore as of March 31,2020), LIC gives funding support to the government in a big way. During 2019-20 it subscribed ₹1,78,717.61 crore to the government of India securities and ₹1,28,483.62 crore to the state gov-

ernments' borrowings. During the same year, it invested ₹52,297.79 crore in the social sector: power, housing, water supply and sewerage, roads, bridges and railways.

The investments, as of March 31, 2020, for Central, state, social sector and other government guaranteed securities aggregated to ₹24,01,456.50 crore. LIC operates varied other activities: it owns LIC Housing Finance Ltd (with ₹2.10 lakh crore outstanding loans as of March 31, 2020), LIC Mutual Fund Asset Management Company Ltd, LIC Pension Fund Ltd, LIC Cards Services Ltd and IDBI Bank.

At least one thing that should deter the government from LIC's disinvestment is the support it gets for other PSUs' disinvestment; LIC purchases a substantial portion of other PSUs' stake. Examples: LIC was allotted 4.4 per cent of the 5 per cent stake of ONGC's disinvestment in 2012; 60 per cent (Rs 6,000 crore) of NMDC's stake (of ₹9,928 crore) in 2009-10 and ₹4,263 crore of NTPC's ₹8,480 crore. Other purchases include: SAIL (71 per cent in 2013), BHEL (Rs 2,685 crore in 2014), Coal India Limited (Rs 7,000 crore in 2015), Indian Oil Corporation (Rs 8,000 crore in 2015), GIC (Rs 8,000 crore in 2015); New India Assurance Company (Rs 6,500 crore in 2017) and HAL (Rs 2,900 crore in 2018). Also, LIC bought 51 per cent of the beleaguered IDBI Bank's stake in 2019.

LIC is not only providing efficient life insurance service to the people but utilising people's money for the country's economic development besides giving huge funding support to the government. It is an 'apatbhandhava' (a friend in need), in its true sense, to this, previous, and future governments. So, the present government has no right to sell the stake without the approval of the people in general and the workforce of the organisation in particular. It is not correct for the government to kill the goose that lays the golden eggs or the 'kamadhenu' that fulfills all its wishes. Hope the government will reconsider. Or, is this going to be hoping against hope?

or many generations of Arab ing and working in the United States was a coveted opportunity to experience freedoms, possibilities, and the sense of egalitarianism that the American way of life embodied. It was a doubly enriching experience for those of us raised in authoritarian or conservative societies. It was thrilling to be able to think and act independently, without societal pressure. I was excited to take home some of the lessons I learned from a functioning democracy, not least the vital role of freedom of expression, the importance of civil society, and the exceptional benefits of empowering people.

benefits of empowering people.
Of course, I was also aware of the US system's failings, and in particular the perpetuation of racism and inequality. I remember the Jim Crow laws enforcing racial segregation in the former Confederate states, and the assassination of Martin Luther King, Jr., who articulated African-Americans' dreams of equality and human decency. But I was hopeful that America's democratic system had the tools it needs for self-correction. I remain so, based on the major transformations in values,

laws, and mindsets that I witnessed.
What shocked me most was how
the US, a country that prides itself

on its love of freedom and justice, could all too often pursue a hegemonic and repressive foreign policy, from its appalling wars in Vietnam and Iraq to its support of ruthless dictators. Regardless of its cause, the disconnect between America's selfimage and its foreign policy fuelled a confused perception of the country in the Arab world and elsewhere. While many young Arabs wanted to become US citizens, almost all of them loathed US foreign policy.

Arabs and Muslims saw the

Arabs and Mushins saw the Israeli-Palestinian conflict as Exhibit A in the case against America. They found it difficult to grasp why a sense of empathy for the Jewish people – which was fully justified, given the horrible atrocities committed against them –should somehow translate into injustice against the Palestinians. This US bias in favour of Israel has become, over time, a matter of consensus in American politics; for many lawmakers, support for Israel is synonymous with the fight against anti-Semitism.

Even more dangerous was the conflict's religious dimension,

which added to a creeping schism between the Muslim and Western worlds. Relations soured further as a result of US-led wars in the Middle East, and hit rock bottom with President Donald Trump's Muslim travel ban and his "Deal of the Century" to secure peace in the region – an offering to the Palestinians that deepened mistrust by being far worse than any that had come before.

The latest outbreak of Israeli-Palestinian violence again brought to the surface the deep-seated sense of humiliation and rage harboured not only by Palestinians in the occupied territories, but also among Israeli Arabs and across the Arab and Muslim world. It was widely hoped that US President Joe Biden's administration would make the promotion of democracy and human rights central to its foreign policy. But this hope quickly dissipated when the US government simply repeated the familiar mantra that "Israel has the right to defend itself" without mentioning the elephant in the room: Israel's crawling expansion of settlements in occupied Palestinian territory, its policy of discrimination, and its denial of the Palestinians' right to an

independent state.

On a personal level, this was profoundly disheartening. Over five decades, I have seen how the US approach to upholding Palestinians' rights has become almost apologetic. Today, I contemplate in disbelief how the Jewish people, who suffered so much for so long, are capable of inflicting on another people some of the same atrocities previously committed against them.

But I still sense a glimmer of hope, and a widespread acknowledgment that a return to the status quo ante and the hellish cycle of violence is not viable. I also sense the beginning of some soul-searching inside Israel, among the Palestinians, and across the Arab world to find new ways forward based on coexistence and mutual acceptance.

A more evenhanded US approach would help the Palestinians, Israel, the region, and the world. If Biden can manage the necessary shift in US foreign policy, then America truly will be back.

Scant rainfall, defunct LI points trigger farm crisis

Saplings wilt as farmlands go dry POST NEWS NETWORK FARMERS FUME AS LI PROJECTS GO KAPUT

Bhanjanagar, July 18: With monsoon playing truant, the farming sector is affected by insufficient rain in Bhanjanagar and other areas in Ganjam district. Adding to the crisis are defunct lift irrigation points. Farmers are worried a lot, a report said.

According to the report, farmers alleged that they were supplied seeds by government authorised agencies for the kharif season. The seeds were sub-standard and the saplings were affected by pest

Moreover, the farmlands are dry due to dearth of water while most lift irrigation points in the region have gone kaput. They apprehend a looming crisis in the agriculture sector owing to insufficient rainfall.

Farmers are unsuccessfully trying to save the paddy saplings while resentment is growing among them. Upset over supply of sub-standard seeds and defunct lift irrigation points, farmers in Bhanjanagar, Jagannathprasad and Bellaguntha blocks are bracing themselves for an agitation. They demand immediate supply of fertilisers.

By the second week of June. Bhanjanagar has received much less rainfall than normal. Therefore hectares of farmlands are lying

Bhanjanagar and Sorada reservoirs are the lifelines for agriculture in this area. This year, both the reservoirs do not have adequate



water to feed the agriculture sector. Farmers observed that if the area does not get rain in five to six days, water supply from the reservoirs will stop.

Water will be released from Daha reservoir July 25 while Baghua reservoir lacks water to meet the needs of agriculture, they added.

Panipanchayats looking after the reservoirs will decide when water will be released through

When contacted, executive engineer, Gokula Chandra Padhi of the Water Resources department said that they have started releasing water through canals. "This process will go on for four months. Normal rainfall is expected in coming days," he added.

Farmers of Tanarada under Bellaguntha block - Sania Bisoyi, Akula Nayak and Radhamohan Sethi alleged that they were supplied

which saplings are prone to pests. "Saplings are wilting due to pest attacks. Help of agriculture officials is sought, but they do not come out for our rescue at the time of crisis," they lamented.

There are two irrigation points in Bhanjanagar area, but they are of no use for the last few years due to electrical problem.

Despite scanty rainfall, farmers are still trying their best to save crops. "We now need good seeds and fertilisers. The department should immediately look into this issue in the larger interest of farmers," locals said.

Mukund Chandra Padhi, agriculture officer of Jagannathprasad block, said that the department is receiving reports from different areas about saplings being affected by pests. Farmers are being advised to apply pesticides, he added.

Khandapara, July 18: Two lift irrigation points have been set up near Sunamuhin river on the outskirts of Khandapara town in Navagarh district. Farmers alleged that these two facilities are of no use for farming as they are lying defunct due to lack of repair and maintenance for last nine

Nine years ago when the two projects were made functional. farmers were enthused about prospects for the agriculture sector in the region. However, the projects failed to deliver their service as the concerned department did not pay attention to their maintenance.

"Lakhs of rupees have been spent for the two projects to bolster irrigation for farming in the riparian pocket, but it seems the funds spent on the project have gone down the drain," local farmers lamented.

Now, farmlands are dry due to poor rainfall. "Had the lift irrigation project been repaired earlier, they would be of good use at this time of crisis," farmers noted.

Time after time, farmers have drawn attention of the lift irrigation department towards the sorry state of the projects. But no step was taken to set them right

Mayawati's Brahmin outreach was considered as one of the key factors for her win in the 2007 UP assembly election.

The BSP chief said she is fully confident that the members of the "Brahmin community will not get misled by the BJP" and will vote

for her party in the upcoming elections. The ruling BJP hit back, alleging the BSP chief is 'remembering' the Brahmins only because of assembly elections next year and is

pursuing 'opportunistic politics'. On the agitation against the farm laws, the BSP chief said all political parties should come together and hold the Centre ac-

She said the BSP MPs will raise issues such as the rise in fuel and cooking gas prices and matters related to COVID-19 vaccination during the Monsoon session of Parliament which begins Monday.

"There are many issues on which the public wants accountability of the government," she said.

She claimed that people from the 'upper castes' especially the Brahmin community are 'feeling extremely sad as they had voted for the BJP and helped form its government for five years

She also praised the Dalit community, saying it stayed united in the last assembly election and voted for her party.

"I feel proud of the people of the Dalit community in the state who did not deviate, remained united, and voted for the BSP. As a result, in the 2017 UP Assembly elections, we may have got less number of seats, but our vote percentage stood at 22.23, more than the Samajwadi Party's 21.82 per cent.

She said that not only the BJP but the Congress also had tried to "lure the Dalits by using different tactics"

"They ate 'khichdi' in the house of Dalits, although it was brought from their own house as they did not like the 'khichdi' cooked by the Dalits and brought from the home of the Dalits. Rath Yatra was also taken out." she said.

Lucknow, July 18: Congress general secretary Priyanka Gandhi Vadra Sunday said her party is 'open-minded' about forging an alliance with other political parties for the Uttar Pradesh Assembly polls.

New Delhi, July 18: The charging of exorbitant fees by private schools has become a major contentious issue for thousands of parents across the national Capital during the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic.

Hundreds of parents, who have been financially hit due to Covid-19, have discontinued their children's studies from private schools after private schools took strict action against those who could not deposit their fees.

All India Parents Association National President, Ashok Agarwal, told IANS that all such parents should consider shifting their children from unaided private schools to Delhi government schools so that they do not have to pay high fees.

At such a time the government should not deny admission to any such student based on any particular ground. Quality education should also be ensured through proper recruitment of teachers.

Poonam Kochitty, Principal of Seth Anandram Jaipuria School, says that her school is following req-

> On the subject of paying school fees during the Covid-19 pandemic, Heritage Xperiential Learning School says, "Although most of the parents of children studying in our school have paid the fees, Covid-19 has posed financial challenges for many parents. We offer a discount in fees to parents facing financial challenges

At the same time, the Delhi gov ernment has decided that such students studying in private schools across Delhi, who now want to leave private schools and enroll in government schools will no tificates. These students will be granted admission to Delhi government schools without submitting the transfer certificate. The Education Department officials will take the transfer certificates of these students from private schools at their level.

Delhi deputy chief minister Manish Sisodia, who is also the education minister, said due to Covid-19 several people have lost their jobs. In such a situation many parents cannot afford to pay the exorbitant fees charged by private schools and are getting their children enrolled in government schools. However, many private schools are demanding arrears according to the hiked fees for the last one vear.

In case of non-payment of this amount, transfer certificate is not being issued by private schools to

children. Therefore, the Delhi government has provided this relief to the students in case of a TC, he said. The daughter of Kiran Pathak, a parent from Delhi, studies in class 7. According to her, the new decrees of the school that have come out in the past few days have increased the troubles of the parents. Many private schools are now not only charging hiked fees but also demanding fees hiked in the last one year. According to Kiran, if the situation persists she will have no option but to send her daughter to a government school by shifting her from private school.

Manish Sisodia said the Delhi government is firmly defending the students and parents in the court over fee hike by private schools. The AAP government appeals to the parents that if they want they can enroll their children in Delhi government schools.



No nod for Eid congregational prayers in Kashmir

Srinagar: No congregational prayers would be allowed in the Kashmir Valley on Eid-ul-Zuha because of the COVID protocol that limits the number of people offering prayers in any group to 25, officials announced Sunday, Divisional Commissioner Kashmir, PK Pole said that no congregational prayers will be allowed on Eid-ul-Zuha in Kashmir in view of the prediction of Covid's third wave. He said that it will be difficult to limit the number to 25 if congregational prayers are allowed, and Eid prayers will be allowed in a decentralised manner like it has been allowed during the peak of Covid's second wave. Pole appealed to the people to follow government SOPs and medical experts' instructions on the occasion of Eid and avoid the Covid-19 threat. Considering the damage caused by the third wave of Covid in other countries, everyone should follow the guidelines and precautions strictly on the occasion of the upcoming Eid, he said.

According to the Union Home Ministry data, a total of 326 cases were registered under the sedition law between 2014 and 2019, with the highest 54 cases in Assam.

Out of these cases, charge sheets were filed in 141 cases while just six people were convicted for the offence during the six-year period.

The data of 2020 has not been compiled by the home ministry vet, officials said. In Assam, out of the 54 sedition cases registered. charge sheets were filed in 26 cases and trials were completed in 25 cases. However, there has not been a single conviction in the state in any of the cases between 2014 and 2019, the data says. Jharkhand has registered 40 cases under Section 124 (A) of IPC during the six years in which charge sheets were filed in 29 cases and trials were completed in 16 cases in which just one person has been convicted. In Haryana, 31 cases were registered under the sedition law in which charge sheets were filed in 19 cases and trials were completed in six cases in which just one person has been convicted.

Intense rainfall over north India from July 18-21: IMD

New Delhi, July 18: The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has predicted intense rainfall activity over north India from July 18-21 and over the west coast till July 23.

The IMD said moderate to severe thunderstorms with lightning are very likely at isolated places over Uttar Pradesh, Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, and east Rajasthan during the next 24 hours.

"They may cause injuries leading to casualties to people and animals staying outdoor," the MeT department cautioned.

The IMD said rainfall activity is very likely to increase with widespread rainfall to isolated heavy to very heavy rains very likely over the western Himalayan region (Jammu, Kashmir, Ladakh, Gilgit, Baltistan and Muzaffarabad. Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand) and adjoining northwest India -- Punjab, Haryana, Rajasthan, UP and north Madhya

Pradesh -- from July 18 to 21. There will be decrease in rainfall activity over the same regions thereafter. Isolated, extreme heavy rainfall is also very likely over Uttarakhand on July 18 and 19 and over northwestern parts of UP July 19.

Moderate to heavy rainfall at isolated places are also very likely over Delhi and Chandigarh July 18 and 19. Western and southern India is also expected to receive heavy rains.

'China's first human infection case with Monkey B virus dies'

Beijing, July 18: A Beijing-based veterinarian who was confirmed as China's first human infection case with Monkey B virus (BV) has died, amid rising concerns. the official media here reported.

The 53-year-old male vet, who worked for an institution researching on non-human primates, showed early-onset symptoms of nausea and vomiting, a month after he dissected two dead monkeys in early March, the state-run Global Times reported Saturday, citing English Platform of Chinese Centre for Disease Control and Prevention.

The vet had sought treatment in several hospitals, and eventually died May 27, the report said.

His close contacts are safe from it, for now, it added.

It said that there were no fatal or even clinically evident BV infections in China before, thus the vet's case marks the first human infection case with BV identified in China.

Researchers had collected the cerebrospinal fluid of the veterinarian in April and identified him as positive for BV, yet samples of his close contacts suggested negative results for the virus.

The virus, initially isolated in 1932, is an alphaherpesvirus enzootic in macaques of the genus Macaca. It can be transmitted via direct contact and exchange of bodily secretions and has a fatality rate of 70 per cent to 80 per cent.

US, Iran feud over prisoner swap talks

Washington, July 18: The Biden administration lashed out at Iran Saturday for accusing it of delaying a proposed prisoner swap to force a quick resumption of indirect nuclear talks.

In a pair of tweets from his verified account, Seyyed Abbas Araghchi said the nuclear talks in Vienna could not resume until Iran's hardline president-elect is inaugurated in early August. "We're in a transition period as a democratic transfer of power is under-

"These comments are an outrageous effort to deflect blame for the current impasse on a potential mutual return to compliance with the JCPOA," Price said.

Price called Aragchi's reference to the possible imminent release of 10 prisoners on all sides "just another cruel effort to raise the hopes of their families.

"If Iran were truly interested in making a humanitarian gesture, it would simply release the detainees immediately," he said.

Historic heavy rainfall also battered Switzerland, Luxembourg and the Netherlands.

As the waters began Rhineland-Palatinate and neighbouring North-Rhine Westphalia (NRW), concern shifted south to Germany's Upper Bavaria region, where incessant rains inundated basements and led rivers and creeks late Saturday to burst their banks.

One person died in Berchtesgadener Land, a spokeswoman for the Bayarian district told AFP. Pope Francis expressed his "nearness" to the people of the stricken regions.

UK PM to self isolate after backlash

London, July 18: British Prime Minister Boris Johnson and finance minister Rishi Sunak will both self-isolate in line with national guidance, abandoning heavilv criticised plans to take part in a pilot scheme that would have allowed them to continue working.

The U-turn comes a day after health minister Sajid Javid said he had tested positive for COVID-19 and at a time when the government's coronavirus response is under intense scrutiny.

Almost all remaining restrictions in England will be lifted Monday despite a surge in infections as ministers put their faith in the advanced vaccine programme.

Cases are rising by more than 50,000 a day and hundreds of thousands of Britons are being asked to self isolate for 10 days, causing havoc for employers and parents, prompting train cancellations and forcing some businesses to close their doors.

The government announced at 0700 GMT that Johnson and Sunak had been exposed to a person with COVID-19 and would take part in a

trial scheme that allowed them to keep working instead of self-isolating.

But less than three hours later that decision had been reversed after a flurry of criticism from voters, political opponents and business owners.

Opposition politicians had said it was hypocritical for Johnson and Sunak to exempt themselves from some of the rules

Facts tell a different story, FB tells Biden

San Francisco, July 18: After US President Joe Biden said that social media platforms like Facebook are "killing people" with Covid-19 misinformation, the social network giant has replied saying that facts tell a very different story to the one promoted by the administration in recent days.

Guy Rosen, VP of Integrity at Facebook, said in a blog post_ Saturday that at a time when Covid-19 cases are rising in the US, the Biden administration has chosen to blame a handful of American social media companies.

Rosen said that the Biden ministration is calling for a whole of society approach to this challenge.

"We agree. As a company, we have devoted unprecedented resources to the fight against the pandemic, pointing people to reliable information and helping them find and schedule vaccinations. And we will continue to do so," he posted.

According to him, since January, vaccine acceptance on the part of Facebook users in the US has increased by 10-15 percentage points and racial and ethnic disparities in acceptance have shrunk considerably

"The data shows that 85 per cent of Facebook users in the US have been or want to be vaccinated against Covid-19. President Biden's goal was for 70 per cent of Americans to be vaccinated by July 4. Facebook is not the reason

this goal was missed," Rosen said. The social network said that since the pandemic began, more than 2 billion people have viewed authoritative information about Covid-19 and vaccines on

After war with Israel, mourning Gaza marks Eid al-Adha holiday

Gaza city, July 18: For Palestinians who lost loved ones in the fighting between Gaza militants and Israel two months ago, there is little cause for celebration during the upcoming Muslim holiday of Eid al-Adha.

Known as the Feast of Sacrifice, it commemorates for the faithful the prophet Ibrahim's readiness to sacrifice his son to show his dedication

The holiday, coinciding with Hajj, the annual Islamic pilgrimage to Mecca, begins Tuesday, and Muslims traditionally mark the occasion by slaughtering sheep or

cows and exchanging gifts. For this year's four-day festival, Mahmoud Issa, a 73-year-old re-

tired teacher, bought new clothes for his grandchildren and took them to a farm to choose an animal to slaughter. But, he mourns the death of his daughter Manar, 39, and her daughter, Lina 13, who he said were killed by an Israeli missile that destroyed their house in the Bureij refugee camp May 13. Manar's husband and three other children survived.

More than 250 Palestinians were killed in hundreds of Israeli air strikes in Gaza that were launched after Hamas began firing rockets at Israel in retaliation for what the group said were rights abuses against Palestinians in Jerusalem.

Thirteen people were killed in Israel during rocket barrages that disrupted life and sent people running for shelter.

Seoul: Renault Samsung Motors will temporarily suspend production at its plant in the southeastern port city of Busan due to shortages of chips for vehicles, the company said Sunday. 'Services exports may grow 10%

New Delhi: The country's services exports are expected to grow 10% in 2021-22 due to healthy growth of sectors such as professional and management consulting, audio visual, freight transport and telecommunications, according to SEPC. Services **Export Promotion Council** (SEPC) Chairman Maneck Davar said despite the pandemic, the sector recorded a decline of only 3% in exports in 2020-21 to \$205.27 billion.

Auto exports recover amid improved pandemic situation

New Delhi, July 18: Automobile exports from India recovered in the first quarter with all vehicle segments, including passenger vehicles and two-wheelers, witnessing growth following an improvement in the pandemic situation across various international markets.

As per the latest SIAM data, total vehicle exports during the April-June quarter this fiscal stood at 14,19,430 units as compared with 4,36,500 units in the same period of 2020-21 which saw massive disruptions due to the COVID lockdowns across the country, hampering sales as well

overseas shipments. SIAM Director General Rajesh Menon said that while two-wheeler shipments were better than previous three years, passenger vehicles, three-wheelers and commercial vehicles export numbers were yet to catch up with numbers in the first quarter of 2018-19 fiscal.

"If we just compare export numbers of Q1 of 2021-22, two-wheelers have done better than previous three years, however, the total number of passenger vehicles, threewheelers and commercial vehicles exports were higher in Q1 of 2018-19." he noted.

In the April-June quarter, passenger vehicle exports from the

country stood at 1,27,115 units as against 43,619 units in the same period of 2020-21.

Passenger car exports stood at 79,376 units, utility vehicle shipments at 47,151 units while van ex ports were at 588 units.

Maruti Suzuki India led the passenger vehicle segment with exports of 45,056 units followed by Hyundai Motor India which shipped 29,881 units during the period. Kia Motors shipments stood at 12,448 units while Volkswagen India

Flipkart says CCI probe shouldn't treat it the same as Amazon

New Delhi, July 18: Walmart's Flipkart should not be treated the same as rival Amazon in an Indian antitrust probe as the evidence against the two firms was "qualitatively different", Flipkart argued in a court filing seen by Reuters.

Both Amazon and Flipkart have challenged the Competition Commission of India (CCI) in court as they seek revocation of an Indian court's June decision to allow an antitrust probe against them to continue. The companies deny any wrongdoing.

India's government has called the US firms arrogant and accused them of using legal routes to stall the investigation.

In final submissions made to a court in Karnataka, the Walmart unit argued that CCI and the court "confuse the facts" between the case of Amazon and Flipkart, and overlooked that they were "fierce competitors'

To back its arguments, it said that a business agreement examined by the CCI before ordering its probe was only between Amazon and its sellers, and there was no such evidence against the Walmart unit.

"The allegations and the evidence before the CCI against the Appellant were qualitatively different from those relating to Amazon...The CCI should have independently examined the case against each of the two platforms," Flipkart said in its 46-page submission, which was not public.

Flipkart and Amazon did not immediately respond to a request for comment. The CCI didn't respond outside regular business hours Sunday.

For years, Amazon and Flipkart have denied allegations from brickand-mortar retailers about circumventing Indian law by creating complex business structures.

Trade minister Piyush Goyal last month lashed out on US e-commerce giants for filing legal challenges and failing to comply with the CCI's probe, saying "if they have nothing to hide ... why don't they respond to the CCI?"

In February, a Reuters' investigation based on internal Amazon

documents showed the US firm for years had helped a small number of sellers prosper on its platform in India, using them to bypass foreign investment laws. Amazon also has indirect equity stakes in two of its big online sellers, Cloudtail and Appario, which get "subsidized fees". Reuters reported.

The Walmart unit argued in its submission that "unlike in the case of Amazon", there were no structural links of any kind between Flipkart and its sellers. Flipkart "ought to have been treated differently from Amazon," it said.

Dubai, July 18: OPEC and allied nations Sunday agreed to raise the production limits imposed on five countries, ending an earlier dispute sparked by the United Arab Emirates (UAE) that roiled global energy prices.

The disagreement, sparked by a demand by the UAE to increase its own production, temporarily upended an earlier meeting of the cartel. In a statement Sunday, the cartel announced that Iraq, Kuwait, Russia, Saudi Arabia and the UAE would see their limits rise.

"What bonds us together is way beyond what you imagine," Saudi Energy Minister Prince Abdulaziz bin Salman said. "We differ here and there but we bond.'

Prince Abdulaziz declined to elaborate on how they came to that cartel "lose our advantage of being mysterious and clever."

But he clearly bristled at earlier reports on the dispute between Saudi Arabia, long the heavyweight of the Vienna-based cartel, and the UAE. Prince Abdulaziz deferred at the beginning of a news conference afterward to al-Mazrouei in a sign of respect.

"The UAE is committed to this group and will always work with it and within this group to do our best to achieve the market balance and help everyone," al-Mazrouei

New Delhi, July 18: Foreign portfolio investors (FPIs) have pulled out ₹4,515 crore from the equities segment in the first half of July as they turn cautious towards the Indian market.

"With markets trading near alltime high, FPIs would have chosen to book profits. They have also been staying on the sidelines given high valuations and most likely on the back of the risk of a potential third wave of the coronavirus pandemic," said Morningstar India Associate Director (Manager Research) Himanshu Srivastava.

Though the continuing firmness in the dollar and the possibility of rising bond yields in the US do not augur well for capital flows into emerging markets like India, there is no immediate worry at the moment, he said.

Besides, he also added that the outflows have not been huge which signifies that foreign investors are adopting a cautious stance towards__ Indian equities rather than being negative on it.

ANALYSTS EXPECT 'MUTED' JUNE QUARTER FOR TELCOS

Tokyo, July 18: Excited and cautious in equal measure, the first batch of athletes from India's Olympic contingent arrived here Sunday. They cleared the exhaustive Covid-19 related protocols at the airport before entering the Games Village.

The arrival of the Indians came on a day when two athletes staying in the Olympics Village tested positive for Covid-19. The 88-strong Indian contingent were given a grand send-off at the Delhi airport Saturday night. They were joined here by the shooters and boxers who were training in Italy and Croatia till Saturday.

The group included archers, badminton and table tennis players and both the men's and women's hockey teams. Participants for judo, gymnastics, and swimming also were in the first contingent. They landed in the Japanese capital aboard a chartered Air India flight from New Delhi

"It was a six hour wait at the (Tokyo) airport where we underwent Covid-19 tests but that was expected. All came out clear and we have checked into the village. All smooth so far," a contingent member said Sunday.

Tokyo, July 18: Three athletes, two of them staying at the Olympic Village, have tested positive for Covid-19, the Games Organising Committee (GOC) announced Sunday. This new development has added to the scepticism around the troubled event which opens July 23.

It is the first instance of athletes staying at the village catching the infection. Their identities have not been revealed by the organisers. The third infected athlete is staying at a designated Games hotel

A total of 10 cases were detected on the day, including five 'Games concerned personnel', one contractor, and a journalist, according to the Covid-19 positive case list uploaded by the GOC. The total number of Games-related Covid-19 cases has now risen to 55 as per the GOC records.

"When there is a positive Covid-19 - it means action. There is a clear procedure to identify close contacts. A case is not just data in a spread sheet but leads to action, including immediate follow-up testing," International Olympic Committee's (IOC) Games execu-

tive director Christophe Dubi stated. 'We can safely say that 40,000 Covid-19 tests have been carried

out before coming to Japan for the 18,000 Games participants. Then there is the screening at the airport followed by regular screening, test-

ing for athletes every day," he added. The organisers did not specify whether the two infected athletes staying at the village will be quarantined elsewhere.

The development comes a day after a non-athlete at the Village tested positive for the dreaded virus. He was shifted out of the premises. "... We believe we have the situation under control. As such, properly if cases are found, the individuals are isolated and we trace all close contacts if there are any other cases, that's what is most important," Hide Nakamura, chief Games delivery officer for Tokyo

2020, said in a press conference. "Even with all measures fully taken, there will be some positive (coronavirus) cases. What is important is that when such cases arise, we properly systematically isolate them so that there will be no fur-

Somaya was in the team that won the hockey gold in the 1980 Moscow Olympics. "The Tokyo Olympics team are one of the fittest to leave our shores. This enables them to play highintensity hockey for the entire duration of a match. Besides, they are more aware tactically than earlier teams. The 'rolling substitution' rule in particular is being leveraged well by the team and this should enable them to maintain a blistering pace right through the tourney," Somaya said.

Midland: India's golfer Aditi Ashok and Thailand's Paiaree Anannarukarn missed out on their maiden LPGA success but won a lot of praise after finishing tied-3rd at the Dow Great Lakes Bay Invitational tournament here. Pogacar retains crown

Paris July 18: Tadej Pogacar of Slovenia won his second straight Tour de France title Sunday thus establishing a new era of dominance after dominating over his competitors for nearly two weeks. In the end, his triumph was a foregone conclusion as he did not leave any room for serious competition.

The race's outcome had been known for days, and Pogacar, 22, entered the traditionally celebratory final stage with an unassailable lead of 5 minutes 20 seconds. It was the margin he had established Saturday and he held on to it to retain his crown with ease. Fans who have been following the race regularly were of the opinion that even in the years to come, Pogacar will not really face any serious challenge.

In a sport where superlative

performances are routinely shadowed by suspicions of cheating -Pogacar has been hailed as a machine, a tornado and a champion who might leave his mark on the Tour's history as past greats like Bernard Hinault and Eddy Merckx have done, Merckx, 76, said last week that Pogacar was on his way to at least five Tour de France titles; others have said the race has entered

'the Pogacar era' However, in spite of his dominating win, Pogacar is not ready to consider himself as the boss of Tour de France. "Except for media attention, nothing has changed for me," he said after the win Sunday. "There's a bit more media, more press: more and more questions that are actually the same. You get more and more comfortable, and everything else is the same," he added.

Dhawan, Kishan script win

Colombo, July 18: Debutant and birthday boy Ishan Kishan's (59, 42b, 8x4, 2x6) blitzkrieg and a patient unbeaten knock by skipper Shikhar Dhawan (86, 95b, 6x4, 1x6) helped India achieved a resounding sevenwicket victory over Sri Lanka in the first ODI of the three-match series here Sunday. Chasing 263 for a win, India easily achieved the target in the 37th over to stamp their dominance in the match. In the process, Dhawan also crossed the 6.000-run milestone in ODIs.

Kishan, who celebrated his 23rd birthday Sunday, dominated the Sri Lankan bowling hitting the bowlers all over the park. He was confidence personified and put India in a commanding position before his departure. In the process, he scored the fastest half century on ODI debut, reaching his 50 in

Dhawan on the other hand anchored the innings. He was associated in three useful partnerships that made the chase look easy. First. he put on 58 runs for the first wicket with Prithvi Shaw (43, 24b, 9x4), then he added another 85 for the second wicket with Kishan and finally 72 runs for the third wicket with Manish Pandey (26) to seal

an easy win for India. Earlier, Kul-Cha' were seen back in action together after a long time as India restricted Sri Lanka to 262 for nine. Kuldeep Yadav (2/48) and Yuzvendra Chahal (2/52) bowled

Boxing coach exudes confidence

New Delhi, July 18: "It's like the big final exam after studying very hard," according to Indian boxing's high performance director Santiago Nieva. He is a touch nervous but mostly excited ahead of his own Olympics debut. Nieva is aware that all the 'good work of past four years wouldn't count if there is no medal to show in Tokyo'. 'I am a little tense, not all the

time but sometimes. Mostly I am excited because it is like the final exam after all the hard work,' Nieva said ahead of his departure with the Indian boxers, Saturday. "This is my first Olympics, I was there in London 2012 as an expert on the sport, if that counts for anything," he added.

Nieva said results matter, nothing else. "Everything that we have done so far, all that we have worked on will not be appreciated if we don't get an Olympics medal. I am aware of that," the boxing coach pointed out.

The five Indian male boxers who will compete in Tokyo are World

No,1 Amit Panghal (52kg), Manish Kaushik (63kg), Vikas Krishan (69kg), Ashish Choudhary (75kg) and Satish Kumar (+91kg). In the women's segment, it will be MC Mary Kom (51kg), Simranjit Kaur (60kg), Lovlina Borgohain (69kg) and

Pooja Rani (75kg). Nieva said that Indian pugilists have improved in three aspects that make them better medal contenders. "We were poor in clinches,

close range boxing and mental strength. The boxers have worked on these aspects and have improved by 70-80% in all the three departments," Nieva informed.

"For example, Amit is a fantastic long range boxer and we have made sure that he improved in close punches as well. He is not the tallest boxer in his category, so he had to improve in close range boxing," Nieva added.

Nieva who has also been associated with Swedish and Argentina boxing teams in the past was quick to point out that the boxers will have to take control of the centre of the rings if they are to win medals. "They have to do that. They cannot evade that and expect to win," asserted Nieva.

Controversy mars Hamilton's triumph

London, July 18: In the end defending Formula One (F1) champions Lewis Hamilton won Sunday the British Grand Prix. He took 52 laps to win the race. However, most present at the Silverstone race track talked only about the first lap and forgot the remaining 52. It was the story about nine thrilling corners on the opening one that completely changed the com-

plexion of the title race. It was in the opening lap that championship leader Max Verstappen crashed out of the British Grand Prix when a spirited battle with Hamilton sent the Dutchman spinning hard into a barrier. The race was red-flagged Sunday for the tire barrier to be repaired and Hamilton was dealt a 10second penalty for making contact with Verstappen. The seven-time world champion had no reaction on his radio when Mercedes informed Hamilton of the penalty. He coolly overcame the penalty to emerge

Verstappen beat Hamilton at the start for the second day in a row at

victorious.



Silverstone and the two title contenders furiously zigzagged for position. The drivers touched at least twice as Hamilton tried to slip past Verstappen for the lead.

Hamilton's front wheel touched Verstappen's rear wheel the second time the drivers made contact, and the Red Bull careened off course, through the gravel and into the tire barrier. A tire from Verstappen's car bounced off the car during the spin. The driver however, escaped unscathed.

Hamilton told his Mercedes team the position in the corner was his and he was not to blame. "I was ahead going in there, man, Hamilton said over the radio. "I was fully alongside him, my line. — Yeah, he turned in on me, man,' he added.
