Mirabai lifts silver

Tokyo, July 24: A confident smile never leaving her face, Mirabai Chanu ended India's over two-decade long wait for a weightlifting medal at the Olympics, clinching the 49kg category silver medal five years after leaving the same platform in tears following a disastrous debut.

With her historic triumph, she ensured that India was second on the medals tally for a brief while, a feat that has never been achieved before by the country. It was also the first time that India managed to win a medal on the opening day competitions.

The diminutive iron lady from Manipur lifted a total of 202kg (87kg+115kg) to better Karnam Malleswari's bronze in the 2000 Sydney Olympics. With this, she exorcised the ghosts of the 2016 Games where she had failed to log a single legitimate lift, leaving her shattered.

"I am very happy. I have been dreaming of this for the past five years. I am very proud of myself right now. I did try for gold but even silver is a great achievement for me," Chanu told reporters after her career-defining triumph for which she had been training in the US for past few months.

The 2016 experience was a watershed in her career and Chanu had spoken about how confused she had felt during her debut at the biggest stage. There was none of those nerves to be seen Saturday, just a very composed and focused athlete who knew she was destined for the podium.

"I am very happy to win the first medal for India at these Games. I don't just belong to Manipur, I belong to the whole country," she said in response to a query on what it meant for her as a Manipuri.

"I would like to thank my coach Vijay Sharma and the support staff for their continuous hard work, motivation and training," she added.

Her smile shone the brightest during the entire performance on Saturday but also hard to miss were the Olympic rings' shaped earrings that she was sporting, which were a gift from her mother. "I would like to thank my family, especially my mother for a lot of sacrifices and believing in me," she said.

The gold went to China's Hou Zhihui with an effort of 210kg (94kg+116kg), who created Olympic records in all three categories (snatch, clean and jerk and Total).

Aisah Windy Cantika of Indonesia took home the bronze.

Gangster Hyder killed in police encounter

Balasure, July 24: Notorious gangster Hyder was killed in a police encounter near Simulia in Balasure district when he was being shifted from Choudwar jail to Baripada jail for security reasons.

Balasure District Headquarter Hospital ADMO Dr Mrutunjay Mishra said Hyder was brought to the hospital in a critical condition where he died within three to four minutes.

The ADMO said a detailed cause of death will be ascertained only after post-mortem.

Hundreds of people on hearing the news rushed to the hospital and authority deployed four platoons of police force near the hospital as a precautionary measure to avoid any law and order problem.

Sources said that the gangster was taken in a vehicle with police escort from Choudwar jail at about 10 am to Baripada jail when he tried to escape from the clutches of the escort party in the pretext of attending a natural call.

Police sources said the gangster tried to flee by snatching a gun from one security personnel accompanying him at about 3.20 pm near Simulia.

In the encounter the security personnel fired three rounds to prevent him from fleeing from the spot. The bullet reportedly hit him around his stomach and hand.

It may be noted Hyder was undergoing life term imprisonment following his conviction in connection with the murder case of Rashmi Ranjan Mohapatra of Kendrapara in 2015. He was also convicted in the murder of one Seikh Chunu.

The gangster was also involved in scores of crimes including murder, extortion and kidnapping.

Hyder was lodged in Sambalpur jail after his conviction in the murder of a businessman.

On April 10 last, the gangster managed to escape from SCB Medical College and Hospital at Cuttack where he was admitted for treatment after giving food laced with sedatives to the Constable guarding him.

This incident created a hue and cry in the state. However, after a 120-hour-long operation, the Odisha Police successfully intercepted and arrested him April 15 evening from Sangareddy district in Telangana while he was moving in a motorcycle with another person.

He was brought to Odisha and produced before local court and was sent to Choudwar jail in Cuttack.

9 die in LPG cylinder blast

AHMEDABAD: Four children and five others have succumbed to severe burn injuries that they suffered in an explosion and fire that was triggered by leakage of gas from an LPG cylinder in a room on the outskirts of Gujarat's Ahmedabad city, a police official said Saturday. The incident had occurred on the night of July 20. While eight victims - labourers and their family members - died in the last couple of days during treatment, another one succumbed Saturday. All of them were from Madhya Pradesh, he said.

Millions sleep well at night for Pegasus: NSO

The company says Pegasus is rooted in the protection of human rights - including the right to life, security and bodily integrity

Jerusalem, July 24: Amid the raging controversy over its surveillance software Pegasus, Israeli cybersecurity company NSO Group has defended itself by saying that millions of people around the world sleep well at night and walk in the streets safely due to such technologies available with intelligence and law enforcement agencies.

The company also stated that it does not operate the technology nor does it have access to the data collected by its clients.

The alleged use of the Pegasus software to spy on journalists, human rights defenders, politicians and others in a number of countries, including India, has triggered concerns over issues relating to privacy.

"Millions of people around the world are sleeping well at night, and safely walking in the streets, thanks to Pegasus and similar technologies which help intelligence agencies and law enforcement agencies around the world to prevent and investigate crime, terrorism, and paedophilia rings that are hiding under the umbrella of end-to-end encryption apps," a spokesperson for NSO said.

"NSO, together with many of the other cyber intelligence companies in the world, provides cyber intelligence tools for governments because law enforcement agencies around the world are in the dark and there's no regulatory solution that allows them to monitor malicious acts on instant messaging and social media," the company said.

On the controversy around its



snooping software that has rocked the world, the spokesperson asserted that "NSO does not operate the technology, nor do we have visibility to the data collected".

"We are doing our best to help cre-

ate a safer world," it said.

NSO in a written response to PTI in October 2019, when the issue first came to the limelight with reports of misuse in India, had said that it considers "any other use of our prod-

ucts than to prevent serious crime and terrorism a misuse, which is contractually prohibited".

"We take action if we detect any misuse. This technology is rooted in the protection of human rights - including the right to life, security and bodily integrity - and that's why we have sought alignment with the UN Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights, to make sure our products are respecting all fundamental human rights," it said; a stand its executives still maintain.

Without confirming, or denying, if the software was sold to India, the company had said that its "products are licensed to government intelligence and law enforcement agencies for the sole purpose of preventing and investigating terror and serious crime".

'Vax for children likely by Sept'

New Delhi, July 24: India is likely to start vaccinating children by September, AIIMS chief Dr Randeep Guleria said as he underlined that it will be an important move to break the chain of transmission.

"I think Zyklus has already done the trials and they're waiting for the emergency authorisation. Bharat Biotech's Covaxin trials should be over by August or September; and by that time we should get an approval. Pfizer vaccine has been already approved by the FDA (Food and Drug Administration of the USA)."

Hopefully, by September, we should start vaccinating children, and that will be a big boost as far as breaking the chain of transmission is concerned," Dr Guleria said.

India has given over 42 crore doses of vaccines so far and inoculated nearly 6 per cent of its population while the government aims to vaccinate all adults by the end of this year. However, the country is yet to clear a vaccine for children amid concern over a third wave.

On Friday, the European medicines watchdog approved the use of Moderna's coronavirus vaccine for children aged 12 to 17 years. In May, the United States had authorised the Pfizer-BioNTech Covid-19 vaccine for children aged 12 to 15 years old.

"We need to get our own vaccines too - that's why both Bharat Biotech and Zyklus are important. Getting the Pfizer vaccine will also



be helpful, as there is enough data to suggest it's safe... but we can't be sure if we will get required numbers. We will hopefully have more than one vaccine for children by September," the AIIMS chief said.

A study published earlier this week by The Lancet, one of the world's oldest medical journals, underlined that "living with 11-17 year olds increases the risk of infection by 18-30 per cent."

Talking about it, Dr Guleria this morning said: "It's an important issue. Vulnerable people - the elderly or those having illnesses - are at an increased risk of getting the infection (in such cases). That's one of the reasons why people are worried about children about going to schools... they may get a mild infection but they may pass it to their grandparents. We need more data but this is something that has been shown even with influenza."

Earlier this month, Dr NK Arora, who heads the National Expert Group on Vaccine Administration, had said that vaccination for children will start by September with the Zyklus vaccine for 12 to 18-year-olds.

4TH NATIONAL SEROLOGICAL SURVEY

Over 50% children in 3 dists have antibodies

Bhubaneswar, July 24: A recent serological survey undertaken by the Regional Medical Research Centre (RMRC) in three districts of Odisha has revealed that around 85.53 per cent of the healthcare workers in the areas have developed antibodies against the virus.

Moreover, around 54 per cent of the children surveyed were also found to be exposed to the virus. The survey was undertaken jointly by the RMRC and state government in the districts of Ganjam, Raygada and Koraput. The survey studied 1,230 randomly selected individuals from the local community, while 311 healthcare workers also gave their blood samples to the survey team.

The survey results claimed that the highest sero prevalence (presence of antibodies in the population) was reported from Ganjam (70.9 per cent) fol-

lowed by Raygada (63 per cent) and Koraput (61.3 per cent).

The survey was undertaken under the fourth national serological survey of ICMR through its regional centre - RMRC here. The RMRC 10 clusters in each district and collected samples from those areas. This survey also studied kids for the first time.

RMRC Director Sanghamitra Pati said that the results hinted towards herd immunity. "The results showed that healthcare professionals and elderly above 60 years reported higher sero prevalence. This could be because of the natural infection and also because of the antibodies acquired through vaccination," she told **Orissa POST**.

She also added that as kids below the age of 18 years reported 54% prevalence, they seemed to be naturally exposed to the virus in the second wave of the pandemic.

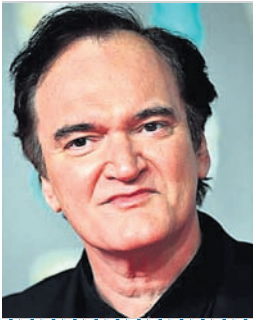

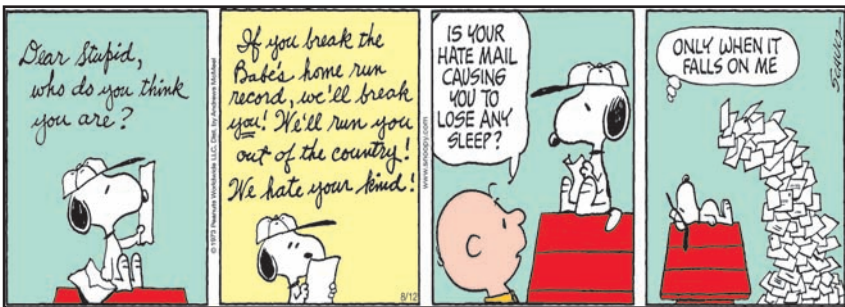

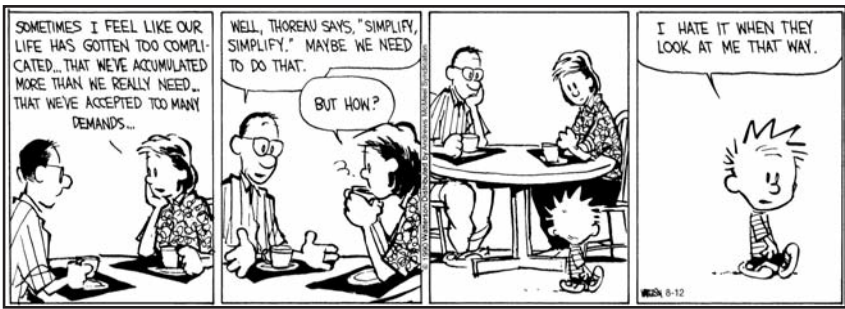
Tanya plays a very different character in the web series as compared to her earlier roles on the web like *School Days*, *Flames* and *A Suitable Boy*.

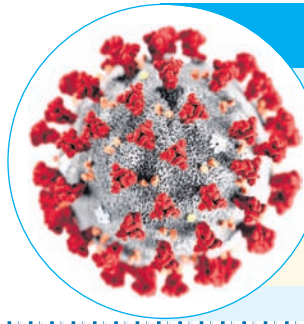

Covid era lifestyle leads to eye ailments

Experts say increased screen time during the pandemic triggers vision related issues like dry eyes

Bhubaneswar, July 24: With a large section of working class people and schoolchildren adapting to the lifestyle changes in Covid era, several eye ailments have come to the fore, thanks to an increased exposure to cellphones and laptops.

Ophthalmologists from the city claimed that more number of youths turning up with eye problems which was not the case in pre-Covid period. Most of the ophthalmologists blamed overuse of computers and mobile phones for the health hazard.

“We have seen a rise in vision related issues among youths and kids who are now spending more time on cellphones and laptops/computers. Most of the cases are implications of what we call ‘Computer Vision Syndrome’ wherein eyes are strained resulting in new vision related issues,” said Dr Amrita Mohanty, an ophthalmologist from LV Prasad Eye Institute here.

She also opined that the most common problem that arises due to this is dry eyes, which was earlier confined to elderly population and professionals who used to have

longer screen time.

“Problems like myopia (short-sightedness), refractive index issues and changes in vision power are also seen in kids who are now spending more time on computers due to online classes and assignments. Many youths who are

working from home are also becoming victims of eye disorders,” she said.

Other experts claimed that rampant use of mobile phones has also escalated the cases of eye disorders which include dry eyes.

According to Dr Anurag Mishra,

an ophthalmologist from Cuttack, “We are now observing a large number of people including youths and kids, who are using digital devices, are facing eye ailments. There are three main reasons how the increased screen time triggers dry eyes,” Mishra said.

“When we are exposed to screens, our blink rate reduces by around 60 per cent which interferes with the spread of tear films in our eyes and makes the eyes dry. Second, it avoids movement of eyes in different directions leading to less secretion of tears. Third, unlike book reading, we see the computer screens in a unidirectional manner,” he added.

Even paediatricians warn that excess use of mobiles and laptops can take a toll on kids’ eye health.

Dr Braj Kishore Behera, a paediatrician from the city, said, “Screen time should be restricted to one hour for preschool children and infants should not be allowed to cell phone exposure. Increased screen time leads to obesity, myopia, sleep deprivation, impaired learning ability, improper social skills and behavioral problems. Not too much and not too less but optimum screen time is advised with proper parental guidance.”

PRISON DECONGESTION

HPC EXTENDS PAROLE LIMIT TO 120 DAYS

Bhubaneswar, July 24: The High Powered Committee (HPC), set up to decongest the prisons across the state to stop the spread of Covid-19 among the inmates and staff, has extended the period for parole for the convicts to 120 days.

Following the orders of the Supreme Court May 7, as many as 747 convicted prisoners were earlier granted special parole or furlough for 90 days till July 16. Similarly, the state Prisons department, as per the directions of the HPC, has shifted 2,105 prisoners from overcrowded jails to prisons with lesser number of inmates till July 7, 2021.

Currently, as many as 1,584 prisoners have been kept in quarantine wards in the state jails after testing positive for Covid-19.

However, the state Prisons directorate, despite all its efforts, failed to decongest the jails satisfactorily. According to the available data, there are around 22,092 prisoners lodged in 87 jails of the state as against the capacity of 19,799.

New IIC for Infocity

Bhubaneswar: In a minor reshuffle, the Commissionerate Police Saturday appointed Samita Mishra as the new Inspector In-Charge of Infocity police station. The IIC post at Infocity police station had been lying vacant since the transfer of the then IIC Biswajit Mohanty to Koraput for alleged dereliction of duty in a high-profile gangrape incident last year. Similarly, another inspector-rank officer Durga Prasad Jena has been posted as the new IIC of Traffic police station-II at Chandrasekharpur here.

WODC chief for revamping tourism in Kandhamal dist

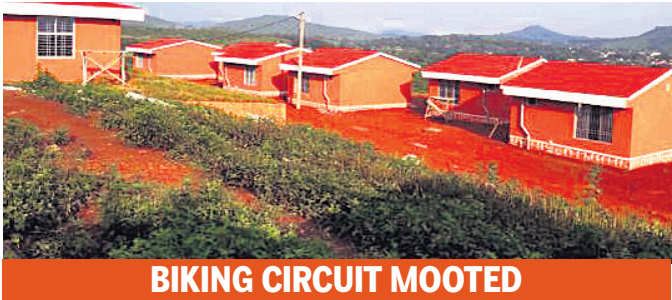

He also added that all the e-waste would be taken to Material Recover

Facilities (MRFs) in the city. It can be mentioned that the Odisha State Pollution Control Board (OSPCB) has earlier stated that the e-waste should be managed only by a certified e-waste collector. However, sources at the BMC said that the civic authority is yet to hand over management of such waste to dedicated e-waste collectors.

The department, however, has not issued any warning of heavy rain for Monday. It has only issued warning of thunderstorm and lightning Monday. However, it has warned of heavy to very heavy rainfall Tuesday and Wednesday.

The Met department also said that cloudy sky and drizzle could occur in different parts of the state capital while the maximum temperature could go upto 34 degrees Celsius.

The IMD forecast said that rainfall activity could increase due to formation of a low pressure area over north Bay of Bengal by July 28.

"Under its influence, rainfall activity is likely to enhance and light to moderate rain/ thundershower is likely to occur at most places over the districts Odisha with isolated heavy to very heavy rain in some districts of Odisha July 28, 2021 and in subsequent 2-3 days," the department said.

Bhubaneswar, July 24: Odisha's Covid-19 tally soared to 9,65,715 Saturday as 1,864 more people tested positive for the infection, while 68 fresh fatalities pushed the state's

coronavirus death toll to 5,445, a health official said.

As many as 1,082 new cases were reported in quarantine centres, while 782 fresh infections were detected during contact tracing.

High daily test positive rate

(TPR) in the coastal belt remains a major cause of concern for the state government as it was 5.18 per cent in Cuttack, 4.34 per cent in Khurda and 3.43 per cent in Kendrapara Friday, and is witnessing a rising trend.

Khurda district, under which Bhubaneswar falls, recorded the highest number of new cases at 496, followed by Cuttack (221) and Balasore (114).

The district also registered the highest number of fresh fatalities at 30, of which 23 were recorded in Bhubaneswar alone, followed by Puri (11) and Angul (eight). This apart, 53 coronavirus patients have died due to comorbidities so far.

"The rate of infection in Bhubaneswar and Cuttack is more because these two cities are the health, commercial as well as administrative hubs of the state. People from across Odisha and the country visit the twin cities,"

Khurda district registered the highest number of fresh fatalities at 30, of which 23 were recorded in Bhubaneswar alone

Directorate of Medical Education and Training (DMET) Chief Professor CBK Mohanty said.

The state now has 19,013 active cases, while 9,41,204 people have recovered from the disease so far, including 2,044 Friday. Odisha has thus far tested over 1.55 crore samples, including 74,707 Friday. The state's positivity rate stands at 6.22 per cent.

The coastal state has administered 1,51,24,809 vaccine doses to date, including 1,23,683 Friday. As many as 12,231 pregnant women have been inoculated so far.

Woman dies in wall collapse

Kendrapara, July 24: A 42-year-old woman was buried alive and three others were critically injured as the wall of their mud house collapsed due to incessant rain in Kendrapara district, police said Saturday.

The incident happened at Narendrapur village in the Aul police station area Friday night, they said. Nirupama Mohanty, who used to work as a cook at the village Anganwadi centre, died on the spot as a heap of soil caved in while she was sleeping, police said.

Three other family members sustained critical injuries, they said. A relief of ₹10,000 was given to the family, besides assistance to rebuild the house, officials said.

The other districts having pending cases are—Kalahandi (34,111), Kandhamal (14,613), Kendrapara (33,444), Keonjhar (46,672), Koraput (32,160), Malkangiri (9,015), Mayurbhanj (68,309), Nabarangpur (22,536), Nayagarh (21,011), Nuapada (21,011), Puri (68,106), Rayagada (68,106), Sambalpur (77,444), Sonepur (11,436) and Sundergarh (92,470), the Law Minister said in his written statement.

ILLEGAL SAND MINING

Lokayukta directs Vigilance probe

Bhubaneswar, July 24: The Odisha Lokayukta has directed the state vigilance directorate to investigate into the alleged illegal mining of sand on the river beds around the state capital here.

The Lokayukta issued the order July 22 while hearing a petition filed by advocate Deepak Kumar Sahu who alleged rampant mining of sand worth around hundreds of crores from the river beds of Daya, Kuakhai and Kushabhadra. The premier anti corruption wing of the state has been directed to submit the enquiry report within two months.

Earlier, the ombudsman had issued notices to Bhubaneswar tehsildar and the regional officer of State Pollution Control Board seeking their responses over the allegations. The tehsildar, in his response, reportedly admitted of the rampant mining from the riverbeds



flouting all prescribed norms. He also informed about the seizure of number of vehicles engaged in the act. He claimed that ₹54, 50,700 have been collected from various persons for their involvement in the illegal mining.

On the other hand, the regional officer of Pollution Control Board here told the Lokayukta that he had been repeatedly making complaints to the Collector of Khurda district in this regard. The Collector was allegedly informed by the officer about the illegality of the operation of mines and the need for immediate intervention several times but to no avail as no action

has been taken by the Administrator yet.

Notably, Sahu alleged in his petition that huge quantity of sand is being illegally transported to different places in the City every day. He claimed that around five hundred Hyva trucks have been engaged in the transportation of sand causing losses to the tune of lakhs to the government exchequer every day. The district administration has turned a blind eye to the rampant illegal mining on the river beds despite repeated letters from the Pollution Control Board authorities requesting immediate action against the illegal activities.

Sahu has submitted several documents, fetched under the Right to Information Act, on the illegal mining. He claimed, on the basis of the RTI reply, that almost none of the miners have valid license to engage in mining of sand on the beds of Daya and Kuakhai rivers on the outskirts of the City.

Several journalists of the district held a demonstration in front of the Collectorate here July 22 demanding action against the lady constable for assaulting the web media reporter.

The media persons had detained five MLAs of the district for a brief period on the same day and demanded a criminal case against the lady constable for assaulting a journalist and initiating action for not wearing masks while on duty.

The constable allegedly slapped and abused the reporter after he

clicked a photograph of her not wearing a mask while on duty violating the Covid protocols.

The IG said he has directed the Kendrapara SP to get the incident inquired by a DSP level officer and submit the report within a day or two. Sources said DSP KC Mallick was asked to look into the incident.

Action would be taken against the lady constable after the receiving the inquiry report, the IG said. After the incident, both the reporter and the lady constable have filed FIR and counter FIR in Kendrapara sadar police station.

Police have registered cases on the basis of the FIRs lodged by both the constable and the reporter and are looking into the incident.

Meanwhile, District Congress president Anshuman Mohanty and former minister Ganeswar Behera have condemned the action of the lady constable and urged the district Collector and the SP to take action against her.

in Bolangir district in connection with the probe. Bidyabharati had been pursuing higher studies in the institute. The probe team will collect information from office-bearers as well as the institute's hos-

tel inmates as to what circumstances led her to visit Bolangir after her marriage. During her visit, she had hosted a party in the institute.

It is pertinent to mention, Gajapati DFO Sangram Keshari Behera, who is an accused in the FIR lodged by the deceased ACF's father Abhiram Mohapatra, has refuted any relationship with Bidyabharati.

"The call detail record (CDR) analysis indicated that DFO had no link with the deceased ACF Soumya's wife. The DFO Behera has never visited Bidyabharati's residence," Gajapati SP Tapan Patnaik

told media persons.

The ACF had suffered severe burn injuries at his official residence in Paralakhemundi town where Bidyabharati was also present July 12 night. He had suffered 90 per cent burn injuries and succumbed July 13 while undergoing treatment at a private hospital in Cuttack.

Paralakhemundi police have registered a murder case against three accused persons namely Soumya's wife Bidyabharati Panda, divisional forest officer Behera and a cook who was present at the deceased ACF's government residence on the intervening day.

Angul: Jumbo electrocuted

This has been announced by the state government as it has sanctioned ₹16.44 crore for construction of the new library. This was stated here by Professor Dr Lalit Meher, director of VIMSAR.

Meher said the state of the art library will be a six-storied building having the facilities of a lift. It will be constructed on the basis of an ultramodern design and model. The library will also have the facilities of a canteen where 250 people can have their food at a time. The building will also house small offices.

As many as 350 persons can simultaneously study in the library. It will have separate facilities for the teaching staff and students.

Dr Sanjeev Mishra, a former president of junior doctors' association, said the new library was a long-felt need of the students and the teaching staff in VIMSAR. The old library was falling short for the teaching staff and students of VIMSAR where they were not getting the necessary scope for their studies and to conduct research.

A demand for establishment of a new library was made before the Development Commissioner in 2020. The state government had then directed the works department to submit a detailed estimate and the draw-

7-year jail for MD, BM of ponzi firm

Berhampur, July 24: A special Odisha Protection of Interests of Depositors (OPID) court in Ganjam sentenced two senior staff of a ponzi firm to seven years of imprisonment after convicting them of defrauding investors of their hard-earned money on the pretext of offering more interests on deposits, a report said.

Judge Debashis Panda of the OPID court heard the matter and handed down seven years and six months of imprisonment each to Chandrakant Bhargav Goel, the managing director (MD) of the ponzi firm Sriramkrishna Electro Control Pvt Ltd and its branch manager (BM) Suresh Chandra Padhi of Berhampur branch for the offence.

The court also slapped ₹50,000 fine on the two. In case of default, the

two have to undergo an additional six months of imprisonment, the judge observed.

According to the case diary, Chandrakant opened a lending firm at Janana Hospital Road in Silk City and lured people into parking their money in their schemes at attractive interests. Chandrakant was the managing director of the firm while Padhi was the branch manager of its Berhampur branch. Lured by the offer, many people in Ganjam deposited their money with the hope of higher interests, but their hopes were shattered after they failed to get back their money. The matter came to the fore after Lakshmi Charan Das, a depositor, who had deposited ₹50,000 in the ponzi firm failed to get back his money. Das lodged an FIR at the Baidyanathpur police station. Police registered a case against the MD and the BM August 27, 2013.

Tribal woman beheaded over 'witchcraft'

Baripada, July 24: A tribal woman was beheaded in Mayurbhanj district over suspicion of practicing witchcraft, police said Saturday. The incident took place at Purunapani village in the Bangripasi police station area, they said.

Police seized the skeleton and skull of the woman, Kuni Jerai (55), Friday, said inspector-in-charge Sanjay Kumar Parida. Jamira Singh

(30), the accused, was arrested and sent to judicial custody after being produced at the court Saturday, police said.

Singh suspected that his son died because of Jerai's witchcraft, they said. He beheaded the woman with an axe and threw the body at a place near the village July 9, police said. Jerai's family had filed a missing report, following which police began an investigation.

Police said they have seized the murder weapon.

KESINGA KENDU LEAF GODOWN SELLS RECORD 33K QNT LEAVES

Kesinga, July 24: Central kendu leaf warehouse here in Kalahandi district has created a distinct identity in the district by selling 33,000 quintals of kendu leaves in the first lot in 2021 fiscal.

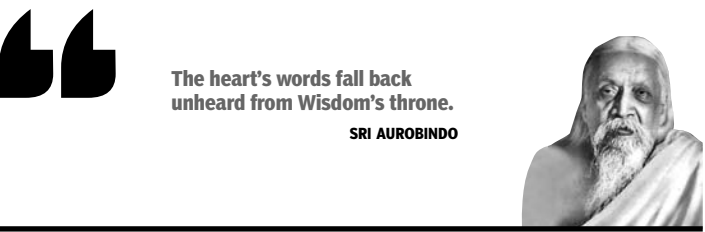
There are a total of 60 village kendu leaf godowns (locally known as 'fadi') under this warehouse this year. As many as 6,822 kendu leaf pluckers had deposited 93,84,590 bundles of kendu leaves at village kendu leaf godowns and the same were later sold to the central kendu leaf warehouse. In return, the pluckers had received ₹1,11,41,508.

This apart, ₹84,25,606 was also distributed among the pluckers towards 50 per cent bonus for 2020 fiscal. Binding workers and casual



workers also received 10% bonus. Similarly, 7,200 pluckers received ₹8,40,240 towards slippers in the 2020 financial year. In the second lot, the warehouse has so far sold 400 quintals of kendu leaves out of 1,850 quintals. Ranger, central kendu leaf warehouse, Daitari Nayak said that Kesinga range has achieved a distinction in the district due to the effort of pluckers, binding and casual workers.

Life will carry on

All a few weeks ago, the issue dominating the media in India and for a few days even in the world was India's management of the pandemic. Vaccines are still in short supply, as we are hearing daily from chief ministers, but for now the story is on the back burner. Another has moved to the front burner and that is the Pegasus: the Israeli software the government purchased to spy on journalists, politicians, sexual harassment victims and their relatives and officers of the Central Bureau of Investigation. Why did it do so? We do not know and will never be told. India is democratic but it is also opaque. The government is run like a kingdom and the elected leader does not need to respond to questions or hold press conferences. Media that reports the truth will be raided.

This column is however not about the current story but one that has been on the back burner for the entire period of the Modi era. It is about where we stand and what our future will be. Like on Pegasus, like Covid, there have been no answers from the government on the current economic situation and India's future. But the facts cannot be hidden. Here they are and ask your self at the end of it where you think India is today, and where it is being taken.

Spending on food by the poorest Indians had declined before the pandemic. Consumer expenditure of Indians was lower in 2017-18 than in 2011-12. The data on this came from the government but was not released. Joblessness rose consistently under Modi. The total number of Indians with work shrank under Modi from 44 crore in 2013 to 41 crore in 2016 to 40 crore in 2017 and then to 38 crore in 2021, though the workforce grew from 79 crore to 106 crore. Consequently, the Indian middle class stopped growing under Modi. Residential sales in eight major cities (Ahmedabad, Bangalore, Chennai, Delhi, Hyderabad, Kolkata, Mumbai and Pune) remained stagnant from 3.3 lakh units in 2012 to 3.2 lakh in 2019. In 2020 they fell to 1.5 lakh units.

Passenger vehicle sales remained stagnant for a decade, with sales of 27 lakh in 2012, 27 lakh in 2019 and 27 lakh in 2020. Two wheeler sales were stagnant at 1.6 crore in 2014, 1.7 crore in 2019 and 1.5 crore in 2020. Three-wheeler sales were 5 lakh in 2012, 5 lakh in 2015, 5 lakh in 2016, 6 lakh in 2019 and 2 lakh in 2020. Commercial vehicle sales were stagnant at 7.9 lakh in 2012, 6 lakh in 2015, 7 lakh in 2016, 7 lakh in 2019 and 5.6 lakh in 2020.

The total Indian market for consumer durables (air conditioners, washing machines, television sets) was estimated in 2014 to be worth ₹150,000 crore by 2020. It was ₹76,400 crore in 2019 and ₹50,000 crore in 2020.

Total passengers (rail plus air) fell from 840 crore in 2012 to 826 crore in 2019, and this is before the pandemic. China's premier Li Keqiang has developed an index which measures real GDP growth through three indicators: railway cargo volume, electricity consumption and loans disbursed. Total tonnes ferried by railways was 1.1 billion tonnes in 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2018. It was 1.2 billion tonnes in 2019 and 1.2 billion in 2020. Electricity generation remained at 1.3 billion units for four years in 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020 while India's population grew by 7 crore. The growth of bank credit to industry fell from 15 per cent in 2013 to 12 per cent in March 2014, 5 per cent in 2015, 2.7 per cent in 2016, minus 1.7 per cent in 2017, 0.7 per cent in 2018 and 6.9 per cent in 2019. Growth of credit to medium-sized industries was minus 0.5 per cent in March 2014, 0.4 per cent in 2015, minus 7.8 per cent in 2016, minus 8.7 per cent in 2017, minus 1.1 per cent in 2018 and 2.6 per cent in 2019. All this was before the pandemic. Credit to micro and small industries grew minus 2.3 per cent in March 2016, minus 0.5 per cent in 2017, 0.9 per cent in 2018 and 0.7 per cent in 2019. Before Modi, between 2009 and 2013, loans disbursed (non-food credit) had grown at an average of 17 per cent.

This then was the result of the performance of the Modi government. Why has it come to this? What does our future hold? How will we compete with the rest of the world and bring our crores out of poverty if we continue in this fashion? We do not know and the government has no interest in either acknowledging that this is the state of affairs, or about responding to what it is doing about it. It will deflect the current scandal and hope that it will ebb soon, just like the previous scandal ebbed. Life will carry on. Sab chhanga si.

Once upon a time

The expression has for a very long time indeed been an idiom, one that most of us take in at a gulp without much bothering about the meaning of the individual words. We've learned that it usually begins a mythical or fabulous story set in some unspecified moment in the past. "Once upon a time," Charles Dickens wrote in A Christmas Carol, "old Scrooge sat busy in his counting-house." People often use it in a hand-wavingly imprecise way to indicate a moment in the past or to imply a fairy tale: "Once upon a time we all believed in the magic of the Fed", the Independent headlined a story December 1, 2007. It's definitely English in origin, though it's hard to say how old it is. The Oxford English Dictionary has examples going as far back as Chaucer's Canterbury Tales in 1385, but it had probably achieved the status of a conventional phrase even then. We still use it in connection with time, though it often sounds formal ("we plan to meet upon another occasion"). It was once the done thing to attach it to any time-related term where we would now use on or at. Lord Dunsany wrote in Time and the Gods in 1905, "Upon an evening of the forgotten years the gods were seated on the hills." Another phrase with similar meaning to once upon a time was upon a day, as in Westward Ho! by Charles Kingsley: "And it befell upon a day, that we came into a great wood of ferns." Another was upon a time — an example is in Miles Coverdale's translation of the Old Testament book of Job, dated 1535: "Now upon a time ... the servants of God came and stood before the Lord."

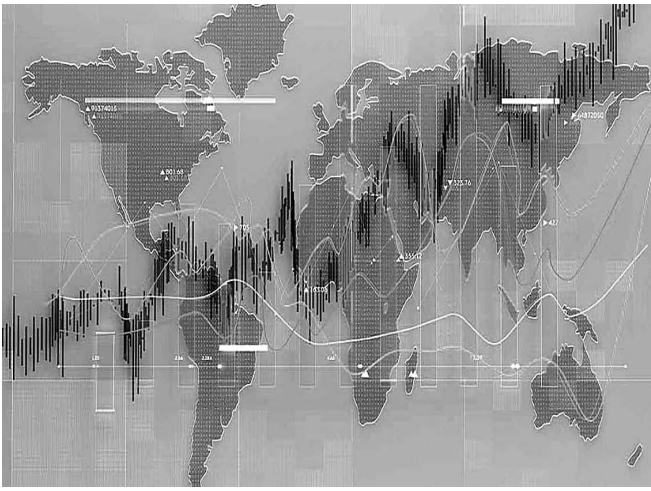
The International Economic Association's triennial World Congress has long been one of the most important global gatherings of economists, owing to its success in bringing together researchers and policymakers from the poorest to the wealthiest corners of the world. The 19th edition of the event earlier this month, albeit held via Zoom instead of in person, was no exception.

One recurring theme of this year's Congress was that the global economy and capitalism are at a crossroads. While the Covid-19 crisis was the immediate impetus for this view, other major shifts — from climate change and the rise of digital technology to the changing nature of labour markets — have been increasingly salient. The pandemic has merely accelerated these shifts or thrown them into sharper relief.

Covid-19 has forced us into one kind of "learning by doing," an idea that the Nobel laureate economist Kenneth J. Arrow, who emphasised that much learning "is the product of experience," developed in the abstract a long time ago. We have learned to give lectures and hold conferences by Zoom, and to make complex decisions in meetings conducted via Webex. People have suddenly realised that they had been spending more time than necessary in the office, and that they can do much of their work from home. And we have learned to shop at home, too, via digital platforms.

As a result, demand for office and retail space will fall, even after the pandemic. And because more people will have the freedom to work remotely, property prices will gradually rise where they were previously low and fall where they were high, leading to greater levelling.

On the other hand, salary disparities will increase, because the labour market will tend to be more of a common pool with heightened competition for talent. Most important, globalisation, after some initial stumbles, will accelerate, with rapid growth in cross-country outsourcing. This is likely to have a significant effect on labour markets, national politics,

and the nature of conflict. Understanding this new world will require major breakthroughs in economic thinking. Economics normally proceeds by contesting the explicit assumptions and axioms on which theory is built. But all scientific disciplines also have hidden assumptions that are so deeply embedded that we do not state them explicitly and often forget they exist. In their celebrated research in the 1950s that provided a formal structure for understanding Adam Smith's idea of the 'invisible hand,' for example, Arrow and fellow Nobel laureate Gérard Debreu showed the many assumptions that were needed for Smith's conjecture to be valid. There were other assumptions that were taken for granted — simply part of the woodwork of economics — including the symmetry of knowledge among buyers and sellers. One of the biggest breakthroughs of modern economics was the insight that knowledge is often asymmetric, and that this asymmetry can shatter the invisible hand. This breakthrough earned Joseph E. Stiglitz, George Akerlof, and Michael Spence the 2001 Nobel prize in economics, and led to new forms of regulation that made the modern economy possible. We owe many of our regulations concerning quality control and product standards to this breakthrough, which showed definitively that the market's invisible hand cannot ensure standards when information is asymmetric. It remains to be seen what form the economics profession's new intellectual discoveries will take and what regulations we will need to apply them. What is clear is that the strain humanity has imposed on the environment means growth as we currently know it cannot be sustained. But that does not mean we have to learn to live with lower growth. In fact, I believe future growth will be faster than we have seen thus far. The lower-growth camp's mistake stems from a common misunderstanding of GDP or national income. A higher GDP is often taken to indicate more wasteful consumption and consumerism of the kind we are indulging in now. But that need not — and now must

Coexistence, a unifying factor for Indians

For most political parties, sociologists and psephologists what an ordinary Indian on the street thinks matters the most. It is an insight into a common man's psyche, which allows them to strategise and formulate new plans and narratives. Though political parties are able to set the narrative for their own narrow agendas yet they are unable to control the common perceptions and thinking among the populace.

Studies like a recent one by the US-based Pew Research Centre's Survey of Religion across India not only help the narrative formulators but also offer a peep into the common man's psyche. The recent Pew study based on nearly 30,000 face-to-face interviews of adults conducted in 17 languages between late 2019 and early 2020, finds that Indians of all religious backgrounds overwhelmingly say they are very free to practice their faiths. Indians see religious tolerance as a central part of who they are as a nation. Across the major religious groups, most people say it is very important to respect all religions to be 'truly Indian'. And tolerance is a religious as well as a civic

value: Indians are united in the view that respecting other religions is an important part of what it means to be a member of their own religious community. Yet, members of India's major religious communities often don't feel they have much in common with one another. The majority of Hindus see themselves as very different from Muslims (66 per cent), and most Muslims return the sentiment, saying they are very different from Hindus (64 per cent). Indians, then, simultaneously express enthusiasm for religious tolerance and a consistent preference for keeping their religious communities in segregated spheres — they live together, yet separately. These two sentiments may seem paradoxical, but for many Indians they are not. Indeed, many take both positions, saying it is important to be tolerant of others and expressing a desire to limit personal connections across religious lines. Indians who favour a religiously segregated society also overwhelmingly emphasise religious tolerance as a core value. In other words, Indians' concept

of religious tolerance does not necessarily involve the mixing of religious communities. While people in some countries may aspire to create a 'melting pot' of different religious identities, many Indians seem to prefer a country more like a patchwork fabric, with clear lines between groups. This is what I ascribe to the syncretic Indian values, which you'll not be able to see in any Western society. Indians in spite of all differences and antagonisms try to view themselves as colours of a rainbow, which India is and this is what makes India united. Most of India's Muslims say that Indian culture is superior: Today, India's Muslims almost unanimously say they are proud to be Indian (95 per cent), and they express great enthusiasm for Indian culture: Eighty-five per cent agree with the statement that "Indian people are not perfect, but Indian culture is superior to others." A few Muslims say their community faces 'a lot' of discrimination in India (24 per cent). In fact, the share is similar to the share of Hindus who say Hindus face widespread religious discrimination in India (21 per cent). In addition, most Muslims across the country (65 per cent), along with an identical share of Hindus (65 per cent), see communal violence as a big national problem. Many Indians, across a range of religious groups, say it is very important to stop people in their community from marrying into other religious groups. Roughly two-thirds of Hindus in India want to prevent inter-religious marriages of Hindu women (67 per cent) or Hindu men (65 per cent). Even larger shares of Muslims feel similarly: Eighty per cent say it is very important to stop Muslim women from marrying outside their religion, and 76 per cent say it is important to stop Muslim men from doing so. The survey throws up many findings which may sound contradictory and unbelievable, yet they represent the true feelings of Indians, however convoluted they may be. And this contradictory, yet assimilating feeling is what makes India what it is.

Rural electrification scam under scanner

Chandahandi, July 24: The government has executed various schemes to ensure electricity reaches all at the grassroots level – like street-lighting and electrification of Anganwadi centres.

However, people are still deprived of the benefits from these schemes in many panchayats under Chandahandi block in Nabarangpur district due to large-scale irregularities.

It was alleged that irregularities were committed in rural electrification works in 14 panchayats under this block. Locals have demanded a Vigilance probe into such wrongdoings.

Reports said, funds of 14th Finance Commission were allocated for electrification in each panchayat and Anganwadi centre. The district administration floated a tender for the work while a contractor was awarded the electrification work.

As per the tender agreement, electrification of all Anganwadi centres should ensure quality works. But it was alleged that sub-standard electrical kits were used along with a fan and bulb in each Anganwadi centre. If calculated, as per the market rates, the contractor has spent only ₹1500 to ₹2,000 for purchase of electrical kits for each Anganwadi centre. Most of the electrical kits are not in working condition.

“Whenever children, pregnant women and lactating mothers visit the Anganwadi centres, they are unable to get service due to sub-standard kits for which lakhs of rupees have been drained out,” local residents pointed out.

However, it was alleged that the

contractor has been paid ₹10,000 as bill for each AWC. “Electrification of Anganwadi centres is nothing but a waste of money. The child development project officer (CDPO) has cleared the bill of the contractor despite the sub-standard work,” locals lamented, adding that the work should have been properly assessed before payment.

Locals have demanded Vigilance probe into all such irregularities and role of the CDPO in such mess.

When contacted, Chandahandi CDPO S. Gita said the contractor has completed electrification of 94 Anganwadi centres out of a total of 130 centres in the block.

“After receiving complaints about use of sub-standard electrical kits, I am getting the matter investi-

gated by Anganwadi supervisors. If the allegation is substantiated during the investigation, we will recommend the higher authorities to stop the bill payment to the contractor,” the CDPO said.

It was learnt that the same contractor had been allowed the street electrification work at Gabhirapada, Saradhapur and Malagaon panchayats at a cost of ₹5.5 lakh each.

Locals alleged that the work in Saradhapur panchayat has not been completed, but the bill of the contractor has been cleared.

The street lights installed at Malagaon are of poor quality while lights have gone out of order even though it was claimed that ₹30,000 has been spent on each street light, it was alleged.

Interstate dacoit gang busted, 8 held

Nabarangpur, July 24: In a major crackdown Saturday morning, police busted an interstate gang of dacoits in Nabarangpur district and arrested eight persons in this connection, an official source informed.

According to police, six of the arrested were identified as Udaya Pujari, Mukesh Patra, Sunil Harijan and Rajesh Nayak from Papadahandi, Sushant Harijan

from Kodigaon in the district and Karna Majhi from Pottangi in Koraput.

Identities of two others have not been ascertained yet. The gang was looting motorcycles and various other valuables from Nabarangpur and had been subsequently selling those in Vishakhapatnam of Andhra Pradesh.

The gang was active in Papadahandi, Nabarangpur,



Kodigaon and Vishakhapatnam areas. Five motorcycles, a laptop,

a desktop printer, two mobile phones, a home theatre audio-visual system, gold jewellery and several other electronic items were seized from their possession.

Acting on an FIR lodged with Nabarangpur police by Vivekananda Sahu July 19 alleging that his motorcycle was stolen, the police launched a probe and seized a number of stolen motorcycles from Papadahandi leading to arrest of the members.

Missile-like object falls in Balasore village, triggers panic among locals

Bahanaga, July 24: Panic gripped residents of coastal Maharudrapur Adia village under Baripada panchayat in Bahanaga block of Balasore district after a missile-like object fell in front of the house of a villager at about 4 pm Friday.

The missile-like object, measuring around 3.5 metre long and weighing around 60 kilograms, should have fallen in the sea. Instead, it fell in the village with a deafening sound, leaving men and animals alike in fear. It dropped in front of Akshaya Nanda Das's house and created a four-foot deep hole in the ground.

There is a test range on the coast, few metres away from Maharudrapur Adia village. At the time of the incident, some DRDO officials rushed to the house, only to face the anger of the villagers.



The villagers later dug out the object and wanted to hand it over to officials, but they refused to take it. Instead, they left the place after noting down a number written on it. This led to further resentment among villagers.

“Had the object fallen on the house or in a crowded place, the outcome would have been totally different,” one of the villagers rued.

According to the villagers, ammunition were being test-fired

from DRDO's Integrated Test Range at Chandipur in Balasore district Friday. As many as eight ammunition were test-fired in presence of DRDO officers and staff at the test range at 3pm and they all fell into the sea. But, the object test-fired at 4:00 pm did not fall in the sea. For some reasons, it veered towards the village and fell in front of Akshaya's house.

When it landed, it produced such a deafening sound that Das's son, who was then sitting on a cot, went up along with the cot to a height of one or two feet.

Das's father was sitting in front of his house. He too ran into the house. He was so frightened that he could not speak for some time. The cattle in Das's cowshed were also terrified. It was also noticed that blood was oozing out of some cows' noses.

The villagers are in a state of panic over the incident, it was learnt.



Faced challenges from day one, says Yediyurappa staring at exit

Bangalore, July 24: As he stares at his possible exit, BS Yediyurappa Saturday said he had to face several challenges from the day he took charge as the Chief Minister, but is satisfied that he has made honest efforts to better the lives of the people.

The Chief Minister also said that he feels proud to have paid back to the people of Shivamogga district and his Shikaripura constituency, by ensuring its all round development. He was speaking after virtually inaugurating projects worth Rs 1,074 crore and laying the foundation for various projects worth Rs 560 crore in Shivamogga district, from his home office here.

“I am satisfied that in the last two years we put maximum efforts for the development of Shivamogga district. The projects that are being inaugurated are evidence for it. I feel proud to say that through all-round development, I have made honest efforts to pay back to the people of Shivamogga district, and more specifically Shikaripura taluk, which gave me political birth,” Yediyurappa said.

“From the day I took charge as the Chief Minister till now, I had to face several challenges like natural disasters that the state had never faced in the past and the corona pandemic, which ravaged lives. Now once again there is a flood like situation,”



Yediyurappa noted.

Stating that he has spoken to Deputy Commissioners of eight districts, including Shivamogga and directed them to take up relief and rescue works, he said “I’m satisfied that despite all these (challenges), I have been able to take steps to improve the living standard of the people and their financial position...I thank the people for their support in facing the challenges.”

Indicating that Monday might be his last day in office, Yediyurappa had recently said that based on the instructions that the central leaders will give him July 25, he will begin ‘his work’ from July 26. His government will complete two years in office July 26.

Yediyurappa, who began his political career as Purasabha president in Shikaripura, was first elected to the Legislative Assembly from Shikaripura in 1983 and went

on to win eight times from there.

Pointing out various initiatives on infrastructure development, irrigation works to provide water to farms, filling up of lakes in Shivamogga, among others, Yediyurappa expressed confidence that the irrigation projects taken up in the district would change the financial condition of the farmers in the days to come.

Noting that Shivamogga airport work at Sogane village was under progress, he said the Rs 384 crore airport is viable for operating Airbus aircraft and would also benefit neighbouring districts in terms of tourism, industries and employment generation. The airport will start operations by next April, he added.

BJP top brass mulls over next Karna CM

Bangalore, July 24: As the stage is being set for a possible change of guard in Karnataka, the BJP high command is yet to finalise the successor of Chief Minister BS Yediyurappa. However, the high command is mulling over three candidates from the final list prepared in consultation with the RSS unit of Karnataka Pranth (region).

The final list included the names of Union Minister for Parliamentary Affairs and Coal Pralhad Joshi, National General Secretary CT Ravi, MLA and former Union minister Basavanagouda Patil Yatnal, the Speaker of Legislative Assembly Vishveshwara Hegde Kageri, Minister for Mining Murugesh Nirani and MLA Aravind Bellad, sources said. The name of National Organising Secretary BL Santhosh is also doing the rounds, they added.

The high command is thinking of various possibilities in Karnataka as it is being hailed as the gateway to South India. This includes caste, region, loyalty to Hindutva principles and ability to take the party out from the shadow of Yediyurappa.

The party is also focusing on winning the next assembly elections scheduled to be held in 2023. The strategy is said to be to install a candidate in the form of a chief minister, who could cut through caste politics and bring all castes under the Hindutva umbrella.

Union Minister Pralhad Joshi has been a party president in Karnataka and is credited with enrolling as many as one crore members for BJP in the state. His participation in ‘Save Kashmir movement’ and ‘Flag hoisting movement in Edgah Maidan of Hubli’ is an added advantage. The caste factor, however, seems to put him on the negative side.



The party is also keen on CT Ravi, a former minister, who was snubbed by Yediyurappa and is now elevated to the higher ranks by the party. If the high command decides to give leadership to a candidate from other than the Lingayat community, he stands a better chance, say party insiders.

Basavanagouda Patil Yatnal, known for his fiery speeches, is a Lingayat from north Karnataka. The party thinks he could be the person to sideline Yediyurappa by taking independent pro-party decisions. However, the party will have to take a chance with his temperament, sources say.

Vishveshwara Hegde Kageri, a senior leader is among the most loyal party men in the state. His clean image might help him to get the CM’s post.

Can CM-level meet resolve Assam-Meghalaya border row?

Shillong, July 24: The first Chief Minister-level meeting to resolve the inter-state border troubles between Assam and Meghalaya was held here Friday with both sides deciding to remove the disputes in the 12 bordering locations in a phased manner.

After the maiden meeting with his Meghalaya counterpart Conrad K. Sangma, Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma said that the next CM-level meeting would be held in Guwahati August 6, and if necessary, both of them would visit all the 12 disputed sites.

“We have agreed to go beyond the status quo in resolving the border disputes between the two states. Claims and counter claims would be discussed thoroughly and a solution towards the vexed problem would be reached as soon as possible in a phased manner,” Sarma told mediapersons.

An Assam government statement said that after detailed discussions between the Chief Ministers along with the concerned officials, both the state governments have decided to adopt a pragmatic approach and move from status quo to solution.

“It was a very fruitful discussion. We came to a common understanding and we are firm and committed to resolve the border disputes,” the Assam Chief Minister said, adding that in view of the contradictory claims, there would be more discussions and reviews so that a lasting solution can be reached.



Meghalaya Chief Minister Sangma, while thanking his Assam counterpart for his visit, said that since it is a long-pending issue, it would take some more time as well as consultations to reach an amicable and accepted solution that is agreeable to both the states.

Terming Friday’s meeting as ‘historic’, Sangma said that the inter-state border issues would be taken up on priority, as both the states are committed to resolve the long-pending issues.

The Meghalaya Chief Minister said that delay in resolving the issues

has led to problems in the inter-state border areas, and there have many instances of violence as well. He said that resolving the issue is not simple and it would require many consultations, adding that the local issues, history and factual data would be considered to move forward and find a practical and acceptable solution.

Assam Chief Secretary Jishnu Barua, Director General of Police Bhaskarjyoti Mahanta, Meghalaya Chief Secretary MS Rao, Additional Chief Secretary RV Suchiang, Commissioner and Secretary R.

Lyngdoh and Secretary (Home and Political) CVD Diengdoh were present in the meeting. Inter-state boundary disputes between Assam, Mizoram, Nagaland, Tripura, Meghalaya, Manipur and Arunachal Pradesh during the past several years have witnessed many violent activities and skirmishes among the security forces and the people living along the boundaries of these states.

Encroachment in the border areas, and various unlawful activities, including attacks and abductions, infrequently took place

along the inter-state borders of the northeastern states, occasionally leading to major incidents.

Central para-military forces have been deployed in some of the inter-state borders to prevent further escalation of violence.

Assam shares borders with six other northeastern states -- Nagaland (512.1 km), Arunachal Pradesh (804.1 km), Manipur (204.1 km), Mizoram (164.6 km), Tripura (46.3 km) and Meghalaya (884.9 km). Of the inter-state border troubles in the northeastern region, the Assam-Mizoram border disputes witnessed many violent incidents since October last year.

The Assam-Mizoram border predicament was tamed last year following the intervention of Union Home Minister Amit Shah, top Home Ministry officials and Chief Ministers of both the states, following which Central para-military troops were deployed along the borders to prevent further trouble after a series of clashes and blockades on National Highway 306.

But since June 29, the troubles along the borders of the two northeastern states have resumed after the two states accused each other of encroachment of either territories.

According to Assam police, since October last year, several inter-state border skirmishes have taken place along the 164.6 km Assam-Mizoram border in which one man was killed, over 50 were injured, besides causing large-scale damage to properties of government schools and homes of the bordering people.

Assam’s small tea growers seek MSP for green leaves

Guwahati, July 24: Small tea growers of Assam have urged the state government to fix a minimum support price for their produce as the low price realisation has been a longstanding issue for them, a statement said.

Small tea growers sell their crops to bought leaf factories (BLFs). During an interaction with Industry and Commerce Minister Chandra Mohan Patowary Thursday, representatives of small tea growers’ associations of the state raised the issue of low price realisation and sought the MSP for their produce in the peak and lean seasons.

They requested the state government to fix a fair price or minimum rate of their tea leaves.

The issue of overpriced manure and challenges of the small tea growers of Assam were raised in the meeting, the statement said Friday. “There will be no compromise on the quality of tea leaves and fair price,” the minister said, adding that their grievances

will be addressed.

The minister will hold a meeting very soon with all the deputy commissioners of districts to monitor that BLFs buy only quality tea leaves and ensure a fair price for the small growers, the statement said. Patowary asked Tea Board India’s executive director (north-east zone) Arunita Phukan Yadav to instruct all its development officers to visit the BLFs and monitor strict compliance with the quality of tea leaves.

The minister also urged small tea growers to ensure the quality of their produce and encouraged them to opt for orthodox variety that can help fetch remunerative prices in the international markets.

He also advised them to set up bought leaf factories through self-help groups. Around 2 lakh small tea growers in Assam contribute nearly 50 per cent of the state’s annual production.

Of the 618.20 million kg of tea produced in the state in 2020, small tea growers’ share was 285.19 million kg.

Rain plays havoc in Karnataka

Bangalore, July 24: Torrential rain continued to cause a flood-like situation across Karnataka Saturday with the death toll rising to nine.

The continuous rain affected 12 districts of north Karnataka, coastal Karnataka and Malnad region.

It is estimated that some 830 houses collapsed, 15 school buildings were damaged and 8,733 people, including women and children, have been shifted to safer places across the state.

The state government has opened 80 relief centres. As heavy rain continued to lash the Western Ghat region, life was thrown out of gear in north Karnataka districts and coastal Karnataka region.

The body of a 12-year-old girl Kiran Shanura Veebhuti, who was washed away in the floods on Friday, was found by rescue teams at Chikkodi in Belagavi district.

The National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) and the State Disaster



Response Force (SDRF) have been deployed in 12 districts for rescue operations.

Since the water flow towards the dams across the state is steadily increasing, water is being released from dams and this is causing the rivers to cross danger levels, endangering the safety of people.

Due to floods in the Western Ghats, all major connecting roads to the rest of Karnataka have been closed. The Bangalore-Mangalore highway has also been closed as it is impossible to cross the inundated stretch of roads that run through thickly forested areas.

As many as 300 people in Yaduravadi village of Belagavi dis-

trict were evacuated in boats to safer places as the village was inundated. The rain water has submerged thousands of houses and several others are on the verge of collapse in the region.

The floods have damaged state highways across Kodagu district. Many villages in Hassan, Chikmagalur and Shivamogga districts have been flooded.

Meanwhile, the Indian Meteorological Department has warned that heavy rain will continue to lash Udupi, Mangalore, Karwar, Chikmagalur, Shivamogga and Hassan districts for five more days. A red alert has already been sounded across the state.

‘PM-KISAN scheme used to influence voters’

THE ASSAM JATIYA PARISHAD CLAIMS THE ‘HIGHEST NUMBER OF INELIGIBLE BENEFICIARIES’ UNDER THE FARMERS’ WELFARE SCHEME HAS BEEN DETECTED IN THE NORTHEASTERN STATE

Guwahati, July 24: The AJP Saturday alleged that benefits under the Centre’s PM-KISAN scheme were provided to a section of ineligible farmers to influence voters by the previous BJP government in Assam and by the saffron party in several other states where assembly elections were held earlier this year.

The Assam Jatiya Parishad (AJP) also claimed that the “highest number of ineligible beneficiaries” under the farmers’ welfare scheme has been detected in the northeastern state where the BJP-led government was in power and retained it in the last assembly polls.

Tamil Nadu where the BJP had an alliance with the AIADMK was in the second position with 7,22,271 ineligible farmers under the central scheme, AJP president Lurinjyoti Gogoi alleged.

Addressing a press conference here, Gogoi said, “The benefits under the PM-KISAN scheme were used for political gains. It is evident from the fact that ineligible farmers in Assam and Tamil Nadu got benefits under the programme. The BJP has been in power here and had an alliance with the then ruling AIADMK in the southern state.”

As per information provided by Union Agriculture Minister Narendra Singh Tomar in the Lok Sabha on July 20, Assam had provided the PM-KISAN benefits to 8,35,268 ineligible farmers, he said.

This forms one-fifth of over 42 lakh ineligible farmers detected under the welfare programme in the country, the AJP president said.

“However, in West Bengal where assembly polls were held together with Assam and Tamil Nadu, the number of ineligible farmers is 19. The BJP was not in power in Bengal,”

Gogoi said. Under the PM-KISAN scheme, a financial benefit of Rs 6,000 per year is provided to the eligible farmer families, payable in three equal instalments of Rs 2,000. The fund is transferred directly to the bank accounts of the beneficiaries.

“If we assume that there are four persons in a family, then over 33.41 lakh voters were influenced in Assam. This scam also raises a question on how many genuine beneficiaries have been included in other government schemes,” Gogoi said. The AJP president also alleged that there was a “discrepancy in the figures of ineligible beneficiaries under the PM-KISAN scheme in Assam.”

Assam Agriculture Minister Atul Bora had July 5 said that 36 lakh beneficiaries were given funds under the farmers’ welfare scheme in the state. Of them, 19.47 lakh were found eligible and 11.72 lakh were not, he

said, adding that about 5 lakh beneficiaries, who have received the money, are yet to be identified.

“Again, it was informed in reply to a query under the RTI Act that 9,39,146 ineligible farmers in the state have been asked to return the money. There is inconsistency in giving numbers of ineligible beneficiaries,” Gogoi said.

He also questioned the government’s sincerity to unearth the scam and urged the opposition parties to raise the issue in the state assembly to ensure that eligible farmers are not deprived of benefits of the scheme. The AJP and the Congress had earlier demanded a CBI inquiry into the irregularities. The alleged scam had first come to light last year and then chief minister Sarbananda Sonowal and Bora had admitted that some anomalies took place in implementation of the programme.

Oxygen Express for Bangladesh

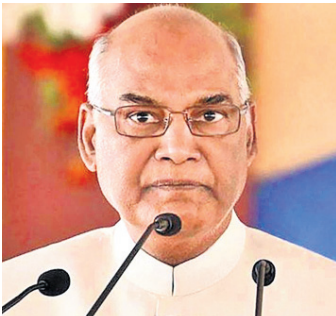

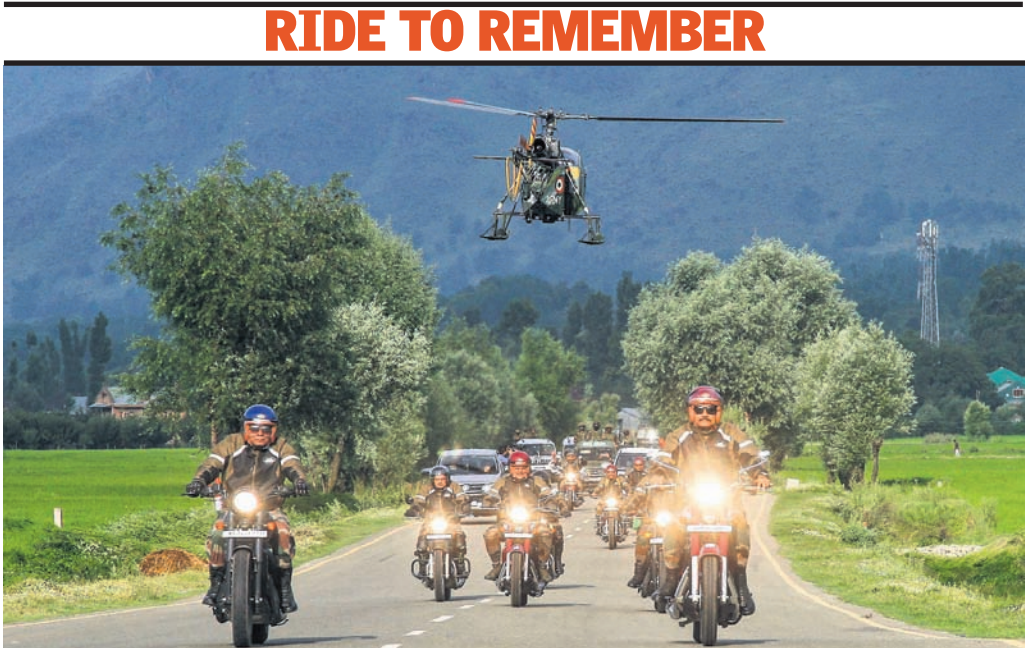

CBI searches 40 locations in J&K, Delhi

ARMS LICENCE CASE

Srinagar/New Delhi, July 24: The CBI Saturday conducted searches at 40 locations in Jammu and Kashmir, and in the national capital in connection with cases related to alleged irregularities in the issuance of over 2.78 lakh arms licences to non-residents on forged documents during 2012-16, officials said.

The search operation was spread across Jammu, Srinagar,

Udhampur, Rajouri, Anantnag, Baramulla and Delhi at the official and residential premises of public servants, including IAS officers, around 20 gun houses among others in an ongoing investigation of a case related to arms licence racket, a CBI spokesperson said in a statement.

Premises of two IAS officers - Shahid Iqbal Choudhary, posted as Secretary of Tribal Affairs in the Jammu and Kashmir government, and Niraj Kumar, Additional Resident Commissioner of UT in the national capital - were searched,

the officials said.

With reference to media reports, I have to confirm that CBI did search my residence and found nothing incriminating in ongoing arms licence probe.

Media friends may note the probe covers 4 years across all districts. I am fully answerable to CBI for my tenure, Choudhary tweeted.

He said oversight or procedural indiscretion in a few cases cannot be completely ruled out as these pass through several clerical stages.

Of the 36,000 licences issued in

Udhampur between 2012-16, only 1,500 odd (less than 4 per cent) issued under my tenure, Choudhary said, adding that this number was the lowest among licences issued by all DMs.

He said he has complied with agency queries, and was committed to do so in the future as well.

He added that out of 4.49 lakh arms licences issued in Jammu and Kashmir during 2012-16, only 56,000 were issued in the three districts of Reasi, Kathua and Udhampur where he served as the DM.

34 teams of NDRF engaged in rescue ops

New Delhi, July 24: The National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) has enhanced the number of its teams from 26 to 34 for undertaking rescue operations in the coastal areas of Maharashtra that have been hit by landslides and floods triggered by heavy rainfall.

A spokesperson for the federal contingency force said these teams are being deployed in affected areas of Mumbai, Ratnagiri, Thane, Palghar, Raigad, Satara, Sangli, Sindhudurg, Kolhapur, Pune and Nagpur for rescue and relief work after consultation with the state administration.

"In view of the severity of the situation, additional eight NDRF teams have been airlifted from Kolkata and Vadodara base which are being deployed in affected areas of Maharashtra," the spokesperson said. "This will take the total NDRF deployment to 34 teams," the

spokesperson said.

The NDRF teams have rescued about 1,800 stranded people and evacuated 87 people to safer places till now, he said.

"These teams have also retrieved 52 bodies from various landslide sites and extensive searches are on for the missing persons," he said.

The force is constantly tracking the India Meteorological Department's weather forecast and the Central Water Commission's report with regard to Mumbai and coastal districts of the Konkan region in Maharashtra that are witnessing heavy rainfall since the last few days, the spokesperson said. An NDRF team usually has 47 personnel and they are equipped with life-saving equipment, inflatable boats and tree and pole cutters.

At least 76 people have died, 38 have been injured and 59 are missing after many areas in Maharashtra were hit by floods and landslides.



Blinken to visit India with vaccines and China in focus

IT WILL BE BLINKEN'S FIRST VISIT TO THE WORLD'S LARGEST DEMOCRACY AS PRESIDENT JOE BIDEN'S SECRETARY OF STATE

New Delhi/Washington, July 24: US Secretary of State Antony Blinken will travel next week to India, an important partner in US efforts to counter China and in vaccine diplomacy that is hobbled by its own Covid-19 crisis.

It will be Blinken's first visit to the world's largest democracy as President Joe Biden's secretary of state and he will meet Wednesday with Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Foreign Minister Subrahmanyam Jaishankar.

Blinken will also visit Kuwait at

the end of his July 26-29 trip.

Washington sees India as helping in US efforts to stand up to China's increasingly assertive behavior in Asia and beyond. Blinken's trip will follow a visit by Deputy Secretary of State Wendy Sherman to China and coincide with one to Southeast Asia by Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin.

On Blinken's agenda will be Indo-Pacific engagement, shared regional security interests, shared democratic values, and addressing the climate crisis as well as the response to the coronavirus pandemic, the State Department



said. Blinken is also likely to discuss plans for an in-person summit of the so-called Quad. The grouping of India, Japan, Australia and the United States is seen as a counter to China's rising influence.

The meeting - which diplomats and others said could coincide with the late-September UN General Assembly, pandemic travel permitting - is expected to focus on ways to develop regional infra-

structure in the face of China's Belt and Road Initiative.

The United States hosted a virtual Quad summit in March at which the countries agreed Indian drugmaker Biological E Ltd would produce at least a billion coronavirus vaccine doses by the end of 2022, mainly for Southeast Asian and Pacific countries, which have seen Covid-19 surges and where Washington has been competing in vaccine diplomacy with China.

However, India, the world's largest vaccine producer, was subsequently hit by a catastrophic wave of infections and halted vac-

cine exports.

Washington sent raw materials for vaccines, medical equipment and protective gear to India and India expects to receive 3-4 million doses of US-made vaccines by August.

India is such a critical country in the fight against Covid-19, Blinken told MSNBC Friday adding that it would eventually become a vital source of vaccines to the world.

Sydney: Thousands of anti-lockdown protesters gathered in Australia's largest city of Sydney Saturday amid a deteriorating Covid-19 situation in the country. New South Wales (NSW) Police Force accused the protest activity as unauthorised and said a high-visibility policing operation was launched in response to it, reports Xinhua news agency. The protesters marched towards the downtown through the suburb of Haymarket, which had just moments earlier been declared a virus hotspot by the state's health department.

Vietnam shuts capital Hanoi

Hanoi: Vietnam announced a 15-day lockdown in the capital Hanoi starting Saturday as a Coronavirus surge spread from the southern Mekong Delta region. The lockdown order, issued late Friday night, bans the gathering of more than two people in public. Only government offices, hospitals and essential businesses are allowed to stay open. Earlier in the week, the city had suspended all outdoor activities and ordered non-essential businesses to close following an increase in cases.

Beijing, July 24: China shut down ports and railways Saturday as it braced for Typhoon In-Fa as parts of the country struggled to recover from devastating floods earlier this week.

Chinese authorities have issued a level III alert -- the third-highest -- for the storm, while more than 100 trains travelling through the region have been cancelled, according to China Railway.

Shanghai authorities closed some public parks and museums and warned residents Saturday to "stop large-scale outdoor gatherings" and to stay indoors.

Meanwhile, all container ship docks were shut down from Yangshan Port south of Shanghai



and 150 vessels including passenger ships and cargo vessels were evacuated from the area.

Monsoon rains flood Philippines

Philippine authorities moved thousands of residents in the capital, Manila, out of low-lying communities Saturday as heavy monsoon rains, compounded by a tropical storm, flooded the city and nearby provinces. I do not know where all this talk (about province) has sprung from, Khan said, while dismissing any such idea. Instead, the Prime Minister said that a day would come when Kashmiris would be allowed to decide their future as per the UN resolutions and expressed the confidence that the people of Kashmir on that day would decide to join Pakistan.

He added that following the UN mandated referendum, "his government will hold another refer-



PM deviating from Pak's historical stand: Oppn

Pakistan's Opposition leader Shehbaz Sharif Saturday rejected Prime Minister Imran Khan's remarks that Islamabad would let the people of Kashmir decide if they want to join Pakistan or become an independent state, saying he was deviating from the country's historical and constitutional position by proposing a second referendum other than the one mandated by the UN. The entire nation rejects anything other than Pakistan's historic position on the Jammu and Kashmir dispute and UN Security Council resolutions, he said. The Jammu and Kashmir dispute will be decided according to a transparent and independent plebiscite held under the auspices of the United Nations and this is the position of the people of Pakistan and Kashmir, he said. He said that imposing a solution on Kashmiris without their consent and consultation is tantamount to helping India and betraying the Kashmiri cause.

Prime Minister Khan departed from the policy by talking about the third option. There is no third option of independence in the UN resolution.

Washington, July 24: With the last US forces on the way out of Afghanistan, US President Joe Biden assured President Ashraf Ghani of US diplomatic and humanitarian support Friday as Taliban advances piled pressure on the US-backed government in Kabul.

In a phone call, Biden and Ghani "agreed that the Taliban's current offensive is in direct contradiction to the movement's claim to support a negotiated settlement of the conflict," a White House statement said.

Biden told Ghani the United States would remain engaged diplomatically "in support of a durable and just political settlement," the White House said.

Violence has risen sharply since the withdrawal plan was announced in April, with the Taliban launching offensives, taking districts and important border crossings, and encircling or closing in on several provincial capitals.

Educated Afghans - especially women and girls who were barred from school and most work under Taliban rule - have voiced alarm at the insurgents' rapid advance, as have members of ethnic and sectarian minorities persecuted under the Taliban's severe interpretation of Sunni Islam.

About 2,500 Afghans could be brought to the facility, about 30 miles (48 km) south of Richmond, the Pentagon said Monday.

The source said she received fractures on her hands and legs and she is under medical treatment presently.

Pakistan's Interior Minister Shaikh Rashid however, termed the incident a drama and said it was a huge conspiracy hatched against Islamabad.

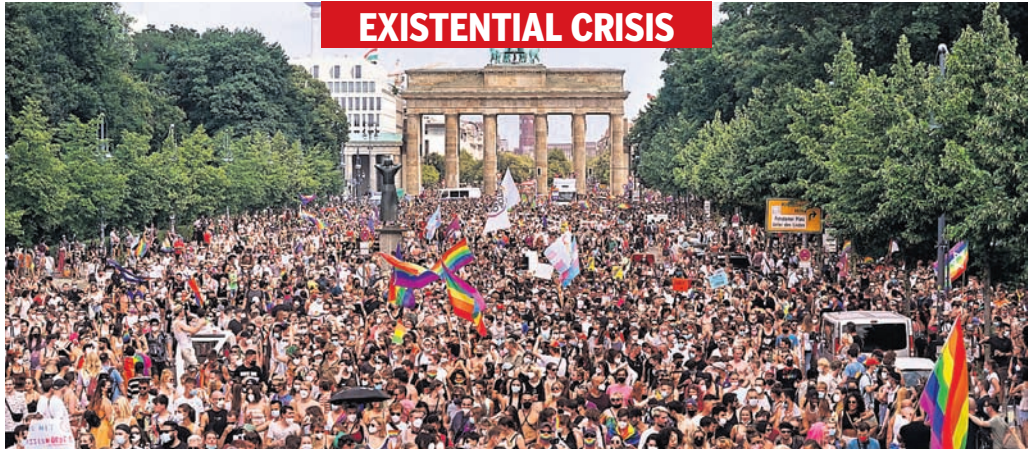
Beijing, July 24: A warehouse fire in northeastern China Saturday left at least fourteen people dead and twelve seriously injured, state media reported.

The logistics warehouse, located in Changchun, the capital of the northeastern province of Jilin, caught on fire Saturday afternoon, and rescue work is still underway, the official Xinhua news agency reported.

Images published by the agency showed firefighters using ladders and cranes outside the burned-out shell of a glass-walled building.

"The cause of the incident is under investigation," Xinhua said.

Deadly fires are not uncommon in China, where lax enforcement of building codes and rampant unauthorised construction can make it hard for people to escape burning buildings.

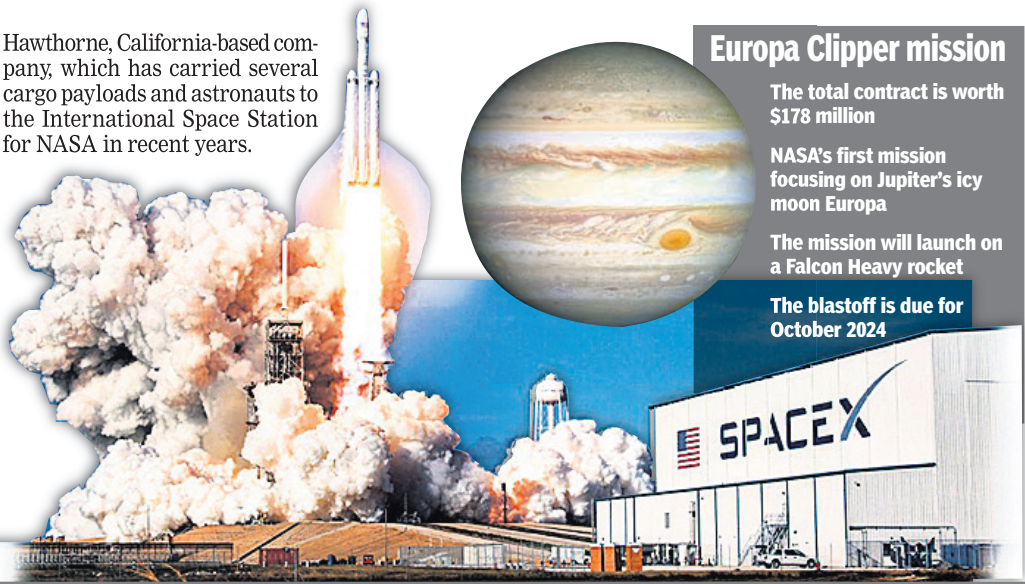

Los Angeles, July 24: Elon Musk's private rocket company SpaceX was awarded a \$178 million launch services contract for NASA's first mission focusing on Jupiter's icy moon Europa and whether it may host conditions suitable for life, the space agency said Friday.

The Europa Clipper mission is due for blastoff in October 2024 on a Falcon Heavy rocket owned by Musk's company, Space Exploration Technologies Corp, from NASA's Kennedy Space Center in Florida, NASA said in a statement posted online.

The contract marked NASA's latest vote of confidence in the

Hawthorne, California-based company, which has carried several cargo payloads and astronauts to the International Space Station for NASA in recent years.



Europa Clipper mission

The total contract is worth \$178 million

NASA's first mission focusing on Jupiter's icy moon Europa

The mission will launch on a Falcon Heavy rocket

The blastoff is due for October 2024

In April, SpaceX was awarded a \$2.9 billion contract to build the lunar lander spacecraft for the planned Artemis program that would carry NASA astronauts back to the moon for the first time since 1972.

But that contract was suspended after two rival space companies, Jeff Bezos's Blue Origin and defense contractor Dynetics Inc, protested against the SpaceX selection.

The company's partly reusable 23-story Falcon Heavy, currently the most powerful operational space launch vehicle in the world, flew its first commercial payload into orbit in 2019.

NASA did not say what other

companies may have bid on the Europa Clipper launch contract.

A bend in Europa's magnetic field observed by NASA's Galileo spacecraft in 1997 appeared to have been caused by a geyser gushing through the moon's frozen crust from a vast subsurface ocean, researchers concluded in 2018. Those findings supported other evidence of Europa plumes.

Among the Clipper mission's objectives are to produce high-resolution images of Europa's surface, determine its composition, look for signs of geologic activity, measure the thickness of its icy shell and determine the depth and salinity of its ocean, NASA said.

Demand to sustain revenue traction

New Delhi: Pent-up demand, coupled with work-from-home provisions, will sustain the strong revenue traction of the consumer durables sector in the coming quarters. Besides, improving housing activities and resumption of Capex will support this trend. "Leading companies have taken price hikes to pass on the raw material inflation, while restoration of operational costs will be compensated for by op-lev. Hence, the EBITDA margin will remain healthy in the coming quarters," HDFC Securities said in a report.

'Pharma industry to touch \$130bn by 2030'

Hyderabad: The Indian pharmaceutical industry is expected to grow almost by three times to about 130 billion US dollars by 2030, Chairman of Dr Reddy's Laboratories, K Satish Reddy said Saturday. "If you see, currently the pharma industry is about \$42bn, half between the domestic sales, half between the exports. We expect that it will grow almost by three times in the coming decade, reaching almost 120 to 130 billion dollars by 2030," he predicted.

ICICI Bank net profit rises 78%

Mumbai: ICICI Bank reported a 78 per cent rise in net profit to ₹4,616 crore on a standalone basis for the April-June quarter in the financial year 2021-22, compared to ₹2,599 crore in the year-ago period. The country's leading private sector lender's provisions - excluding provision for tax, declined sharply as it has changed its policy on nonperforming loans in the quarter to make it more conservative.

Musk expects 'temporary tariff relief' for EVs in India

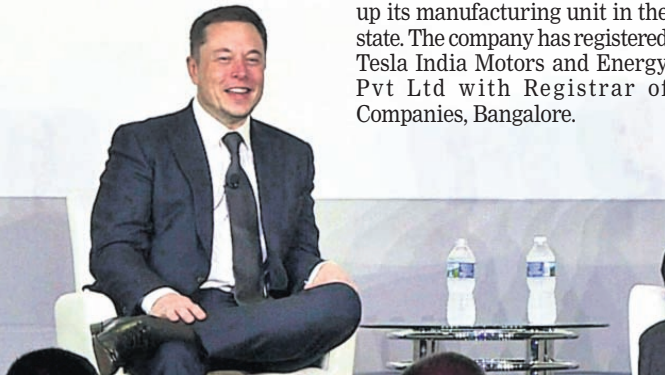

New Delhi, July 24: American electric vehicle (EV) maker Tesla may set up manufacturing unit in India if it first succeeds with imported vehicles in the country, according to company CEO Elon Musk. He, however, said at present import duties in India are "the highest in the world" and is hoping for "at least a temporary tariff relief for electric vehicles".

Interacting on twitter with followers who asked him to launch Tesla cars in India Musk said, "We want to do so, but import duties are the highest in the world by far of any large country!"

Currently, India imposes 100 per cent import duty on fully imported cars with CIF (Cost, Insurance and Freight) value more than USD 40,000 and 60 per cent on those costing less than the amount.

Musk further said, "Clean energy vehicles are treated the same as diesel or petrol, which does not seem entirely consistent with the climate goals of India." He, however, said, "We are hopeful that there will be at least a temporary

tariff relief for electric vehicles. That would be much appreciated." Asked by a follower if Tesla could start with local assembly in India, Musk said, "If Tesla is able to succeed with imported vehicles, then a factory in India is quite likely."

A senior government official on Friday had said Tesla had asked for reduction in import duty. Recently, Union Minister Nitin Gadkari had said Tesla has a golden opportunity to set up its manufacturing facility in India given the country's thrust on e-vehicles.

Tesla is already sourcing various auto components from Indian automakers and setting up base here would be economically viable for it, the road transport and highways minister had said.

In February this year, Karnataka Chief Minister BS Yediyurappa had claimed that Tesla would set up its manufacturing unit in the state. The company has registered Tesla India Motors and Energy Pvt Ltd with Registrar of Companies, Bangalore.

'High iron ore price draws poor response in auction'

Bhubaneswar, July 24: The steel companies in Odisha showed their low interest to participate in recent iron ores auction due to the continual hike in base price of iron ore lumps and fines.

Odisha Mining Corporation (OMC) has recently invited buyers to participate in e-auction for six iron ores. According to OMC officials, about 18 firms expressed their interest by paying the earnest money deposit (EMD) to take part in the e-auction. But only two firms took part in the final bidding.

According to sources, "The poor response to the auction has been due to the OMC's continued hike in base price of iron ore lumps and fines."

"OMC has increased the base price about 5% over the last auction price. Steel companies, which are reeling under soaring raw material price, shied away from the auction because of the price hike. The steel industries in Odisha are already under stress because of two to three fold rises in iron ore price in last one year. The further hike in



iron price by OMC will make the survival of the industry difficult," said a senior official of a steel company.

Recently, about 20 companies have applied to the state government for allotment of iron ore under iron ore pre-emption scheme. Several industry bodies such as Confederation of Indian Industries (CII), Federation of Indian Mineral Industries, Sponge Iron

Manufacturers Association and others have highlighted the severe shortage and increasing price of iron ore in Odisha. They have sought the state government's intervention to safeguard Odisha-based industries.

Considering the poor response to the auction by the OMC, the state government-owned miner may go for re-auction with reduced base price, sources said.

Global supply chains buckle as virus variant, disasters strike

London/Beijing, July 24: A new worldwide wave of Covid-19, natural disasters in China and Germany, a cyber attack targeting key South African ports are some of the events that have conspired to drive global supply chains towards breaking point, threatening the fragile flow of raw materials, parts and consumer goods, according to companies, economists and shipping specialists.

The Delta variant of the coronavirus has devastated parts of Asia and prompted many nations to cut off land access for sailors. That's left captains unable to rotate weary crews and about 1,00,000 seafarers stranded at sea beyond their stints in a flashback to 2020 and the height of lockdowns.

"We're no longer on the cusp of a second crew change crisis, we're

in one," Guy Platten, secretary general of the International Chamber of Shipping, told Reuters. "This is a perilous moment for global supply chains."

Given ships transport around 90% of the world's trade, the crew crisis is disrupting the supply of everything from oil and iron ore to food and electronics. German container line Hapag Lloyd described the situation as "extremely challenging".

"Vessel capacity is very tight, empty containers are scarce and the operational situation at certain ports and terminals is not really improving," it said. "We expect this to last probably into the fourth quarter - but it is very difficult to predict."

Meanwhile, deadly floods in economic giants China and Germany have further ruptured global supply lines that had yet to recover from the first wave of the pandemic, compromising trillions of dollars of economic activity that rely on them.



The Chinese flooding is curtailing the transport of coal from mining regions such as Inner Mongolia and Shanxi, the state

planner says, just as power plants need fuel to meet peak summer demand.

In Germany, road transportation of goods has slowed significantly. In the week of July 11, as the disaster unfolded, the volume of

late shipments rose by 15% from the week before, according to data from supply-chain tracking platform FourKites.

Nick Klein, VP for sales and marketing in the Midwest with Taiwan freight and logistics company OEC Group, said companies were scrambling to free goods stacked up in Asia and in U.S. ports due to a confluence of crises. "It's not going to clear up until March," Klein said.

MORE PAIN FOR AUTOMAKERS

Manufacturing industries are reeling. Automakers, for example, are again being forced to stop production because of disruptions caused by Covid-19 outbreaks. Toyota Motor Corp said this week it had to halt operations at plants in Thailand and Japan because they couldn't get parts.

Stellantis temporarily suspended production at a factory in the UK because a large number of workers had to isolate to halt the spread of the virus.
