AGENCIES Excise duty on petrol

New Delhi, July 25: Central excise duty on petrol has almost doubled and gone up by 88 per cent in the last six years while excise duty on diesel has gone up by three times and witnessed a 209 per cent hike during the same period, as fuel prices across the country have crossed ₹100 per litre.

As on July 1, 2021, central excise duty on petrol is ₹32.90 per litre in-

clusive of cess, whereas July 1, 2015 it was ₹17.46 per litre on petrol including cess, according to official data. This shows that excise duty has almost doubled on petrol in six years between July 2015 and July 2021 and witnessed 88 per cent increase.

Excise duty on diesel has gone up by a humungous 209 per cent during the same period, as it is ₹31.80 per litre including cess as July 1, 2021 while it was ₹10.26 per litre including cess as July 1, 2015. Petrol prices in the four metro cities of Delhi, Mumbai, Chennai and Kolkata have crossed more than ₹100 per litre while diesel prices in the four metros are in the vicinity of ₹90 to ₹98 per litre.

In several cities across the country, especially in Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh, petrol prices have crossed the ₹100 per litre mark.

Meanwhile, fuel prices were paused for the eighth consecutive day Sunday.

Lok Seva Bhawan staff missing since one month

Bhubaneswar, July 25: The Commissionerate Police has failed to trace an employee of the Department of Culture at the Lok Seva Bhawan who has been missing since last month. The wife of the missing employee, Santosh Kumar Dalabehera, has been running from pillar to post for the whereabouts of her husband. Dalabehera is a desk officer at the Culture department in the Lok Seva Bahwan.

Talking to the media, Dalabehera's wife, Manjulata Naik, claimed that she last spoke to her husband June 26 and has no contact with him since June 29

According to Naik, she came to know about Dalabehera's disappearance when the department officials informed her about the long absence of her husband without informing the higher authorities. Later, Naik, a resident of G. Udayagiri in Kandhamal, reached his official quarter at Bhoi Nagar in Unit-IX area

June 30, Naik lodged a missing report at the Sahid Nagar police station after failing to find Dalabehera at his official accommodation. However, police are yet to trace Dalabehera.

Finding no other way, Naik Sunday sought the help of Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik and other senior officials through the media. She alleged that Dalabehera had accused senior officials of humiliating him at office.

Mamata lines up **Oppn meet in Delhi**

Kolkata, July 25: West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee is likely to attend a meeting in New Delhi's Banga Bhawan during her July 26-30 visit for which senior Opposition leaders will be invited, senior TMC leaders said Sunday. The meeting has been tentatively scheduled July 28 at 3 pm.

Before that, on the same day, Mamata is scheduled to meet Prime Minister Narendra Modi around noon. The proposed meeting, unlike the other such meetings in the past, will not be held at the residence of any party leader. Mamata had in her July 21 meeting urged NCP leader Sharad Pawar and Congress leader P Chidambaram for a meeting with Opposition leaders. According to sources. TMC has now taken the onus of organising the meeting given the short window of the CM's Delhi travel

Sources said Trinamool national general secretary Abhishek Banerjee and poll strategist Prashant Kishor, who reached Delhi immediately after the July 21 meeting, are playing a key-role to revive the Opposition "front". A party leader said the presence of senior leaders of all Opposition

20 times in City

Bhubaneswar, July 25: With no let-up in dengue cases in the capital city, health experts and denizens blamed the Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation's (BMC) poor sanitation and drain management for failing to control the outbreak of the disease amidst Covid-

19 pandemic. Dengue cases in the city climbed to over 350 with 20new cases being reported Sunday. With only 17 cases being reported till July 5, the total cases has seen a 20 times increase within a span of just three weeks.

"Dengue in the city is a recurring problem. Every year the cases see a surge during monsoons but the BMC seems to do nothing to check it. Spread of dengue is mainly owing to the Aedes mosquitoes that breed in the raw sewage and stagnant water. This could be prevented if adequate sanitation and drains are not clogged," said Samarth Mohanty, an epidemiologist here. Sources at the BMC revealed that most of the dengue cases have been reported from the slums in the city. Seventy-five cases were reported from Niladri Vihar and this was followed by Sailashree Vihar (37). Many cases have also been detected from Chandrasekharpur, Unit VIII, Kalpana Square and other

localities in the city.

"Garbage collection is not regular in our locality and the waste keeps lying in open for days. Similarly, water also gets accumulated in various places during monsoon due to improper drainage system providing ideal conditions for mosquitoes to breed," alleged Laxmikant Behera, resident of Sitanath Nagar slum of Sailshree Vihar where about 10 cases

were recorded initially. It may be mentioned that the civic body spends about ₹14 crore annually for garbage collection and disposal. It has deployed three agencies in different wards of the city for waste management and cleaning drains. More than 1500 sanitation workers are

engaged in the exercise. However, a senior official of the BMC said, "Rise in dengue cases are largely due to unawareness of the people. Till now we have destroyed more than 451larva sources and have identified 1,029 more.'

'Liberate Hong Kong' at heart of landmark case

Hong Kong, July 25: Three Hong Kong judges will rule Tuesday whether the protest slogan "Liberate Hong Kong. Revolution of our Times" is a call for secession when they deliver a verdict on charges against a man arrested at a demonstration last year.

The landmark ruling could have long-term implications for how a national security law that China imposed on its freest city a year ago against secession, terrorism, subversion and collusion with foreign forces reshapes its common law traditions, some legal scholars say. Activists say a ruling to outlaw the slogan will tighten limits on free speech.

The slogan was chanted during

pro-democracy protests, posted online, scrawled on walls and printed on everything from pamphlets, books,

stickers and T-shirts to coffee mugs. During the 15-day trial of 24-yearold waiter Tong Ying-kit, the court heard how he rode a motorcycle, carrying a black flag bearing the slogan into several riot police in central Hong

Kong on July 1 last year. Tong was the first person charged under the national security law. Lead government prosecutor Anthony Chau argued in court that this was a terrorist act, and that Tong had sought to incite people to secession, both "grave" offences under the security law that could bring prison terms of several

years to life, if convicted. Tong has pleaded not guilty to charges of terrorism, incitement to commit secession and dangerous driving causing grievous bodily harm. Chau did not respond to requests for comment. Defence barrister Clive Grossman declined to comment.

A cornerstone of the trial has been the prosecution's argument that slogan "connotes Hong Kong independence" - a position unacceptable to China, which considers the financial hub and former British colony an

"inalienable" part of its territory. During the protests that began in 2019 and paralysed the city, millions took to the streets to oppose a perceived clampdown by China's Communist Party leaders on the city's constitutionally enshrined freedoms. The slogan was ubiquitous.

Angul murder case: NHRC moved seeking compensation to victim's kin

Bhubaneswar, July 25: A rights activist Sunday approached the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) seeking Rs 30 lakh compensation to the kin of a 21-year-old college girl who was found dead at Mahidharpur in Angul July 24

In his petition, rights activist Himanshu Sekhar Nayak informed the commission that the victim had gone to take a bath to a nearby river Saturday morning, but did not

in the afternoon and informed her family. The college girl was found with her hands and legs tied," said the petitioner.

Police reached the spot and sent the body for post-mortem. Banarpal police registered a case

Alleging that the college student was raped before being killed, villagers blocked the Old Cuttack-Sambalpur Road and demanded arrest of the accused and justice to the victim.





Forest dept for sal forest regeneration

Keonjhar, July 25: Mineral-rich Keonihar district was once rich with sal forests, but over the years. many sal forests have vanished while several others are depleting due to a number of factors like timber smuggling, rampant mining and lack of maintenance.

However, the Forest department has initiated a move to revive and create sal forests in various parts of the district.

According to reports, the Forest department has drawn up a blueprint to grow sal forests by setting

It will raise sal saplings through nurseries and then saplings will be transplanted elsewhere. Sal trees are valuable and they grow in natural settings. It is said that sai seeds that germinate within 24 hours after touching the soil can only be grown into trees.

Sal seeds germinate naturally and grow faster. It was thought that artificial germination of sal seeds will not be very effective earlier. So, sal trees had not been included in the plantation pro-

Now, the Keonjhar forest division has planned to take up artificial ger mination and sapling care. The department has managed to

grow 10,000 sal saplings on six hectares of forest land near Padmapur on an experimental basis. If the artificially grown sal saplings manage to survive through

transplantation, it will give a new

dimension to sal forest regenera-

tion in the days to come, said DFO

Sayam Mallick. The DFO also said that the success of sal forest regeneration depends on how long the sal saplings are nursed in nurseries (at least for one and a half year), provision of water and their protection.

If the saplings survive till December, sal forests can be created, he added.

The Odisha Mining Corporation is going to carry out compensatory afforestation at Jhadebelada next year. The department has signed an agreement with the OMC to meet 50 percent of the compensatory afforestation with sal saplings. The department has decided to make provision of protection and water at the site.

It has raised 80,000 sal saplings at nurseries running in Padmapur. Belda and other areas. The saplings will be taken care of for one and a half year before transplantation.

Some experts observed that the department should lay focus on creating sal forests on an area of 100 hectares rather than that of 1000 hectares. They have appreciated the effort of the Forest department in generating sal forests and hope-

Machinery doing MGNREGS work, job card holders sit idle

Khajuripada/Balsakumpa, July 25: During the troubled times of Covid-19, difficulties of rural people and migrants have compounded with repeated shutdowns and lockdown. In view of this situation, both the Central and the state governments have laid much importance to effective implementation of the MGN-REGS projects in rural areas to ensure scope of manual labour for people.

But at many places of Khajuripada block in Kandhamal district, machines are allegedly being used in MGNREGS projects while job card holders are sitting idle.

Sadly, the concern of the government has allegedly been thrown to the winds during execution of projects in Pirikudi panchavat. It was alleged that the officials responsible for this are doing little to ensure proper execution of the projects.

Villagers alleged that a pond has been dug out with a machine on



plot-122 at Bedangpaju village in Pirikudi panchayat. The plot belongs to the watershed and energy department.

The villagers alleged that Bichitra Pradhan, a resident of Bedangpaju, is supposed to dig a farm pond on his own land, but he is digging it on the aforesaid land owned by watershed and enegy department, and that too with machines

Following allegations, Khajuripada tehsildar Swapnita Nayak, Gudari RI Sunil Kumar Digal had visited the site and demarcated the plot. The official asked Pradhan to stop the

Junior engineer of the watershed department Hrushikesh Das said that the matter has been intimated with the SDO and the tehsildar.

This is not the lone case where machines have been used in MGNREGS works. There are several instances, it was alleged.

It was alleged that scores of labourers are sitting idle in rural areas for want of work while such violations are taking place and these should be taken seriously.

The villagers observed that the use of machines has impacted earning scope of the poorest in the area, who depend on MGNREGS for a livelihood. There were instances of machines being used and fake rosters of workers being made under MGNREGS works in the past.

Locals said that a lot of workers do not get the work and wages they deserve. If machines are allowed for the work, job card holders would not get any benefits, they lamented.

2 empty bullet shells seized

Balasore, July 25: Police and the scientific team Sunday seized two empty bullet shells from the place where dreaded gangster Sheikh Hyder was injured in police encounter Saturday.

Problems galore in Swabhiman Anchal

Malkangiri/Chitrakonda, July 25: Even as the establishment of the Gurupriya bridge in Chitrakonda reservoir completes three years Monday there remain numerous villages where basic facilities still elude people, a report said.

The establishment of the b ushered in a new era of hope, progress and prosperity for the inhabitants of 151 villages living in the cut-off areas of Chitrakonda

Since then three years have passed but residents in many villages continue to lead a life of utter neglect and impoverishment. Many a problems of the people in the cut-off areas have been resolved in between these three years but still a lot more needs to be done to fully integrate the people with the mainland of the state.

Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik inaugurated the bridge July 26, 2018, which proved to be a game changer for the people of cut-off areas by bringing in a change in the lives and livelihood of people. The Chief Minister while unveiling the bridge named the cut-off areas of the reservoir as Swabhiman Anchal and announced a ₹100 crorepackage for the area.

The funds sanctioned were spent on construction of roads, electri-



fication works, healthcare facilities and fish farming as a part of livelihood projects for the residents.

Reports said that the Chitrakonda soil embankment project in Malkangiri district was constructed for establishment of Chitrakonda hydro-electricity plant and to provide irrigation facilities to the farmlands in the area. Over 151 villages were severed from the mainland due to construction of the hydro-electricity project.

The then state government had rehabilitated and relocated a handful of the displaced people while the rest 80 per cent displaced had cleared the jungles in undivided Koraput district and settled there. The 151 villages severed from the mainland of the state comprise nine panchayats.

Left with no other option, the people in these cut-off villages continued to travel in the reservoir

and eked out their living by taking up shifting cultivation by clearing jungles.

The opening of the Gurupriya bridge opened up new avenues for the residents. The fishermen living in the area were encouraged with incentives to start fish cultivation. They were also provided with fishing boats and nets to earn a better living. The administration is also giving small loans to residents for ginger and turmeric cultivation.

Self-help groups were formed in various villages and the people were encouraged to take up goatery, livestock, poultry and vegetable farming. The infrastructure development has brought about a change in the mindset of the villagers. They are no more supporting the Maoists nowadays. Five BSF camps and three police stations have been established in the area to provide security to the residents.

30 Years

his year 24 July marked the completion of 30 years of economic liberalization in India. The resources of the Government of India (GoI) in 1991 had been under terrible financial strain. Unable to manage a system that was crumbling from within due to a long time protected and enclosed financial structure, the then Union Finance Minister Dr Manmohan Singh, with the blessings of former Prime Minister PV Narasimha Rao, had declared 'Liberalization, Privatization and Globalization' as a state policy for India. This policy was commonly known, at that time, as LPG and the rich in India, delirious with happiness for this development, found this to be the mantra they were advocating for long. Media, owned and controlled by the same rich citizens of this country, went whole hog in support of Manmohanomics and the poor were made to believe that this decision of changing the earlier policy and opening up the economy would be the panacea for all the ills of poverty. Gullible as we Indians are, most if not all did indeed trust the loud shouts of welcome that LPG received. The ensuing period brought in flashy foreign cars, private airlines and gated communities for the rich but the poor seemed to further shrink back into the shadows of poverty. Yet people hoped that those whom we have voted to power with trust and love will eventually take care of our interests

In the meanwhile, thirty long years have crawled by. The world has greatly transformed itself in this period. Neighboring Asian nations have succeeded in becoming large economic hubs. Do not look at China. India must stop comparing itself with China for various reasons that many of us are aware of. Instead, it should look at nations such as Vietnam, South Korea, Thailand and many others across the globe. These countries have very limited natural resources compared to India. It is only positive policies of governments and enterprising nature of the people of those countries that catapulted them into global economic players in a parallel period. The growth also seems to have been inclusive and development has not remained ensconced in small groups. Growth has touched the lives of the poor in those countries and the proof is clearly visible during this current pandemic induced dis-

Since 1991, successive political parties that formed governments in India remained true to the LPG policy. No one dared change the outlook that was formed in the early 90s in the last century. However, every Indian would have observed that the disparity between the haves and have-nots has become very acute. In today's situation, that gap is drastically widening, which could possibly create social fissures in the future. In its drive towards Privatization, today's gov-



ernment has adopted a policy where starting from Delhi's Red Fort to most of the land belonging to the Indian Railways and the Defence establishment are being hived off to private ownership. This myopic vision could prove extremely dangerous for the nation in the future. Every family values its ancestral heirlooms. Indian society is replete with instances of mothers passing on to their daughters old jewellery that were passed down from generations. This was simply not an idea of hoarding but instead a safety net for the following generation. Today, we hear about bullet trains and modern faster transportation systems that will be required to strengthen and enlarge our economy. To achieve this, the establishment will require vast amounts of land in the future. If, to fill the coffers today, the government decides to sell these railway lands, then the future generations would face tremendous limitations to plan growth. Similarly, when land belonging to defence is being sold off to get money today, then, in a warlike situation in the future, the nation could be stressed to set up military camps, field hospitals, equipment storage space and millions of other requirements that crop up during war. It is imbecile to think that a future war with China would always be limited along the present Himalayan border. Hostilities may not be limited near Pangong Lake or Arunachal. One may see naval battles off the coast of Orissa or Kerala in this lifetime. Nothing should be considered impossible or farfetched in today's situation. Just like nobody could have foreseen today's manmade pandemic as being possible in July 2019. Extrapolate this situation to the 2016 Demonetization that broke the economic back of India for good. Many in this country even today are unwilling to accept or are unable to comprehend the damage done by that single act for a purely petty political end. No black money was eradicated since all the rupee bills ever issued returned back to the Reserve Bank. The government or the RBI, till date, have not come clean with the results of Demonetization. Counterfeit currency remains rampant and eradication of terror could not happen. But the terrible act decapitated Indian economy

To sum up, LPG has not been a positive long term policy that could uplift the poor of India. Unless every citizen is made economically and socially stronger, the nation can never be strong. One may remember the saying "The chain is as strong as the weakest link."

One fell swoop

he phrase is one of those fixed expressions that we hardly think about most of the time. It means all at once, suddenly. It's been around in the language for at least 400 years. Shakespeare is first recorded as using it, in Macbeth: when Macduff hears that his family has been murdered, he says in disbelief: All my pretty ones? Did you say all? O hell-kite! All? What, all my pretty chickens and their dam At one fell swoop? The image that Shakespeare's audience would have brought to mind at once was a falcon plummeting out of the sky to snatch its prey (like the kite for example, which was a bird of prey long before it became an aerial machine). You might guess that fell has something to do with fall, but it hasn't. It actually means some thing of terrible evil or deadly ferocity. We now never see it outside this fixed phrase (or perhaps only occasionally in poetic use) but once it was a common word in its own right. One of its relatives is still about: felon, which comes from the same Old French source, fel, evil. Originally a felon was a cruel or wicked person; only later did the word evolve to mean a person who commits a serious crime. Since fell swoop doesn't mean anything to most English speakers these days, it's frequently changed to foul swoop. There are actually four fell words in English: apart from this one. there is the verb meaning to cut down (intimately linked with fall), the one meaning an animal skin (as in the obsolete trade of fellmonger), and the one meaning a hill (as in the fells of Cumbria). They all come from different source words.

Oneirodynia

t is a rare word and needs a larger dictionary than the average to be sure of finding it. It comes, like other words starting in oneiro-, from the Greek oneiros, 'a dream'. So we have oneiromancy, foretelling the future by interpreting dreams, and oneirism for a dream-like hallucination in a waking state. In oneirodynia it's paired with a suffix that comes from the Greek odyne, 'pain'. It refers to troubled sleep, nightmares, perhaps sleepwalking.

DEVELOPMENT DEFICITS

ndia in April-June, 1991 shipped 67 tonne of gold to garner \$600million from the United Bank of Switzerland and the Bank of England to tide over its precarious foreign exchange balance. PV Narasimha Rao as PM realised that market economics rather than socialism is India's way forward. India changed its policy track from License Permit Quota Raj to Liberalisation, Privatisation and Globalisation. Dr. Manmohan Singh was familiar with the Washington Consensus coined by Prof. Williamson which advocated for free market in interest rate determination, exchange rate, free trade, fiscal discipline, moderate tax rate, encouragement of FDI and privatisation of PSUs. India accepted all these, except rapid privatisation of PSUs. Economic liberalisation in India was a natural corollary to the fall of the Berlin Wall in November 1989, and disintegration of the USSR in 1991 which capsised communism as an ideology. Francis Fukuyama in his iconic book 'End of History' prophesised that 1991 is the end point of history, with liberal democracy and free market taking firm roots.

The 30 years gone by have witnessed significant structural changes in the Indian economy. The share of agriculture and allied services which was around 28.5 per cent of GDP in 1990 came down to 15.4 per cent by 2020. Share of industries has gone up marginally from 27.3 per cent to 31.2 per cent. However, the major sectoral shift has been in the area of service sector where it has gone up from 43.9 per cent to 53.4 per cent. Inflow of FDI and FII has gone up from 2 per cent to 7 per cent. The most significant change has been the dominant role of private sector where its share of GDP has gone up from 1.5 per cent to 11 per cent. The average growth of 3.5 per cent per annum has nearly doubled during the period from 2000 to 2020. FE reserves of around \$618 billion now can take care of 14 months of imports, as against two weeks in 1991! India is now a more private sector dominated, glob-

ally better connected economy. The high growth has also brought out around 300 million from the poverty trap.

The paradigm shift in growth has unfortunately co-terminated with a snail like movement in the human development parameters. India has slipped very badly on three development parameters of Millennium Development Goals (1995-2015). As against MDG target to reduce hunger to 26 per cent by 2015 India's hunger percentage is around 40.1 per cent. About 65 per cent of adolescent girls are severely anaemic (Rapid Survey of Children, 2014). In Ease of Doing Business, India's rank improved from 136 to 106, while in the Global Hunger Index it has moved up from 83 to 97th position.

The hoopla around high growth from 2004 to 2009 was also marked by very poor growth in job creation. As against a growth of 8.7 per cent during 2004-2009, the growth in employment was a measly 0.1 per cent. This mismatch is understandable as the manufacturing sector's share which contributes significantly to job creation, remains stagnant at 16 per cent. The National Manufacturing Zone Policy, 2011 which envisaged an increase in the share of manufacturing from 16 per cent to 25 per cent and create an addition of 10 million jobs per year has remained an unfinished agenda. In contrast, China whose economic liberalisation started in 1980 has become a global manufacturing hub with manufacturing contributing 30 per cent of the GDP.

Economic liberalisation has not made much of a dent on rural distress. As per the SECC Report, 2011, the percentage of people who are landless and casual labourers is as high as 38.3 per cent. Illiteracy is rampant at 36 per cent with quality of educational outcome in rural government schools abysmally poor. The New Education Policy, 2020 has brought out how early childhood education and care (3-6 years) remains pathetic. The SECC Report brings out how around 75 per cent of rural household has income below ₹5,000. The NABARD Report brings out how people working in agriculture and non-agricultural activities in rural areas have an average indebtedness of around ₹80,000 per capita. The access to formal credits for agriculturalists is very poor as only 4 per cent have Kisan Cards. The rhetoric of doubling farmers' income sits on shift-

In a perceptive article, Nobel Laureate Abhijit Banerjee and Thomas Piketty in March 2019 have observed "Ram Mandir, Caste Reservation and Cows Slaughter are more salient than important dimensions like better schooling, health facility, land and income re-distribution. The Indian Constitution in its Preamble combines the guest for individual free dom and liberty with the need to promote socio-economic justice for all. It envisages distribution of material resources, early childhood care, improving level of nutrition and minimising income inequality. Our tryst with free market economics has turned the constitutional mandate of socioeconomic justice upside down. To be fair to the present government, economic liberalisation has brought in a sea change in em bracing digital technology though the JAM (Jan Dhan, Aadhaar, Mobile number) trinity, GST reforms, abolition of top down planning through Planning Commission, bank insolvency code are testimony to the continuity in economic ideology despite a major change in political power.

The SDG has flagged zero hunger, zero poverty, quality education and health care as its four cardinal goals. India seems to be far away from these targets and the free market approach will not help. It's time for the government to invest substantially more in quality public education, health care and bridge the digital divide which has widened during the Covid-19 pandemic. Prof. Jeffrey Sachs believes that this will require a collaborative development approach where government, business enterprises and NGOs are active partners. Robert Frost wrote: "We have miles to go before we sleep.' Case for a trans-inclusive police force

IT IS HEARTENING TO NOTE THAT **ODISHA POLICE HAS TAKEN** A BIG STEP IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION **ALLOWING** TRANSGENDER **PERSONS TO BE RECRUITED AS OFFICERS**

Varmies...is so powerful as an idea whose time has come. wrote Victor Hugo. The Sub Inspector of Police recruitment in Odisha this year is indeed a special one. For the first time, 26 transgender persons will be taking the exam with the hopes of joining the prestigious Odisha Police. It is also the first time a public advertisement has been issued seeking applications from transgender persons for government jobs in the state.

It is commonplace knowledge that the transgender community has always lived a difficult life bereft of any social identity and respect. Living on the margins, transgenders have long suffered extreme discrimination at the hands of all sections of the society, including the police, merely due to their sexual

orientation. For years, they have been subjected to sexual abuse and violence, despite the protection they have been guaranteed by the law like everyone else. What's concerning is that such incidents have continued to happen, often in the presence of police personnel, and sometimes even at their hands. Their almost non-representation in the police force have made them voice-

Tothing else in the less with their demands often being our personnel are representative of place, ensuring equal working conworld...not all the scorned at and their rights for a dignified existence trampled.

Transgender people have always had a strained and an asymmetric relation with the police. They deride the police and look them with mistrust and contempt. On the other hand, the perception as well as treatment of the police towards transgenders has been roughshod and insensitive.

Police's insensitive response towards transgender persons can be attributed to the complete lack of knowledge and appreciation about the complexities of identity issues related to them. Another plausible reason for the harsh and discriminatory treatment by the police is negligible representation of transgender persons in the police force. It was only in 2017 when India's first transgender police officer was appointed in Tamil Nadu.

However, it is now presumed that the enactment of the Transgender Persons (Protection of Rights) Act. 2019, which prohibits discrimination against them in employment and other services, will usher in a new dawn for transgender persons in securing their rights.

Law enforcement or policing is executed through societal consent and that makes it imperative that

the communities that we serve. More diversity and inclusion will only help increase the legitimacy of the police force

Besides, successful policing isn't just accomplished by brute force, it requires emotional intelligence and sensitivity too. In keeping transgenders out, we may have been overlooking talented applicants from an entire community. It is, therefore, heartening to note that Odisha Police has taken a big step in the right direction allowing transgender persons to be recruited as officers.

Making transgender people a part of the force will help sensitise other personnel towards the problems faced by the community. It will also make the successful among them ambassadors of their community and a role model for others to emulate. Not only that, it will also heighten the police personnel's cultural competence and help them act more professionally while addressing the issues of transgender people.

While the recruitment of transgender persons into the police force is a milestone in addressing the entrenched discrimination against them, there are several challenges that lie ahead including securing a non-discriminatory and safe workplace, expecting unbiased behaviour of their colleagues towards them. and most importantly negotiating with them in their new professional role.

Therefore, it is incumbent upon the organisation to ensure that transgender persons overcome these challenges. More than a stated policy it must be a solemn resolve for everyone to create a safe working place and an accommodative working condition. Any exhibition of inherent bias by fellow colleagues towards them will be detrimental to their success and growth.

The journey of true assimilation of transgender persons will only be possible by an accommodative organisation and a sensitive workforce. We have, since long, relegated an entire community to obscurity depriving them of basic rights and opportunities. Now the time has come to right those wrongs. Trans-inclusivity in the higher ranks of police is not just the right thing to do; it's an idea whose time has come.

Micro plastic pollution

In July 2019, this pest had been spotted for first time in Odisha at Sapnapada. The insect had gobbled up maize grown over vast acres of land.

Following complaints, agriculture scientists have visited the village a couple of days ago. The pests have damaged maize production of Motiram Singh and Sundar Singh. Local farmers are apprehensive that their produces will also be eaten up by the insects. District agriculture officer Druba Charan Mohanty, scientist Soumendra Baral, agriculture officer Sanjay Soreng took stock of situation in Kutra and collected information about the worm.

The maize farmers lamented about the way they have suffered losses. "If pest attack is not checked immediately, all the effort and money invested in maize cultivation will go in vain," they lamented.

Pest problems plague Poor rainfall hits cultivation in Kutra maize farmers Jajpur, farmers fear crop loss

Jajpur, July 25: Farmers in this district are staring at huge crop losses due to the lack of rain in the agricultural season, a report said. It said that the district has received 18 per cent less rainfall this season than what is required for agricultural activities.

In spite of the setback, farmers were hopeful that there will be sufficient rainfall in August. They had hoped it will compensate their earlier water loss.

However, much to their despair, rainfall has not been sufficient in July also. Till July 23, the amount of rainfall received is 67 per cent less than the district usually gets during the month. So the farmers are in distress as they stare at a bleak future.

According to reports, Jajpur district should have received 350.9mm rainfall in the month of July. The district got got only 116.78mm rain-

fall till Friday, informed officials. Farmers in Sukinda, Danagadi, Korei, Dharmasala and Rasulpur blocks are the worst off as there are

Much to farmers' despair, rainfall has not been sufficient in July also. Till July 23, the amount of rainfall received is 67 per cent less than the district usually gets during the month. So the farmers are in distress as they stare at a bleak future

Notably, the Danagadi block which houses the Kalinganagar Industrial Complex has recorded only 73 50mm rainfall Toxic materials produced by the industrial units have had a huge effect on weather and it has led to shortage of rainfall, locals opined.

Sources said the monsoon arrived in the district at the right time, but rainfall has been scanty

The district officials have set a target of paddy cultivation on 1,11,000 hectares this kharif season out of 1,43,645 hectares of farmland. Farmers started cultivation after the monsoons arrived on schedule. However, rainfall scarcity and lack of water in the high-level canal has seriously affected cultivation work.

The farmers in the non-irrigated areas are trying to plant the saplings but they have failed to make any headway due to lack of rainfall. It is alleged that water and air pollution caused by the major industrial firms in Jajpur is responsible for the change in climate and low rate of rainfall.

This has happened as the Odisha State Pollution Control Board (SPCB) is hand in glove with the violators and have has failed to act against them. Moreover, mindless felling of trees in the mining region has also had an impact on the weather and contributed to climate change and irregular rainfall, some locals opined.

According to an estimate of the Agricultural department the district should receive 238.5mm rainfall in June, 350.9mm in July, 341.2mm in August and 238mm in September: Then only will the farmers be able to properly cultivate paddy, officials said.

Reports said that Jajpur block received 68mm rainfall, Binjharpur block 131.40mm, Dasarathpur block 64mm, Korei block 129mm, Danagadi block 73.50mm, Sukinda block 177.60mm, Rasulpur block 85.60, Dharmasala block 103mm, Barchana block 170mm and Bari block 134mm.

The district has a network rivers, creeks and canal but it lacks adequate facilities for irrigation of the farmlands. A year on, beneficiaries still not paid wages

Keonjhar, July 25: Scores of job card holders have worked in MGN-REGS projects about a year ago, but they are yet to get their wages in Dimbo panchayat under Keonjhar sadar block. The pending wages of poor tribals has put a question mark on the execution of the rural job scheme during the troubled times of pandemic, a report said.

The government has laid thrust n proper implementation of Maĥatma Gandhi National Rural **Employment Guarantee Scheme** (MGREGS) as a panacea to ensure scope of earning for the rural workforce in their localities at the time of the pandemic. But, delay in clearing wages of the card holders has allegedly become a cause of concern for labourers. In the process, work regarding various projects is being affected, the report said.

A road project under the MGN-REGS has been done from Gahalachatuabandh Sahi to the local club house in Dimbo panchayat at a cost of ₹7 lakh. Locals alleged that the construction of road has been sub-standard. Following a heavy shower, the road has turned into a nightmare for locals.

Besides, another project (upgra-

dation work of Nalia bund) was executed in the same village at a cost of ₹5 lakh. Though work has been completed and the bill paid, the labourers have not got their wages. There are allegations that the fund may have been misappropriated.

Pubun Munda, Mina Munda, Moti Munda, Sambhari Maharana, Raj Munda and Jatri Munda among others were engaged in the MGN-REGS projects. They alleged that their pending wages are yet to cleared. It is alleged that in many cases, wages of gullible tribals are misappropriated using job cards of

Social activists have demanded an investigation into such irregularities. The beneficiaries have urged the Collector to look into the matter. Some daily wagers lamented that they are going through hardships and finding it difficult to manage their families.

"We do hard labour under the scheme with a hope to earn for our families. Our wages have not been cleared till date during this troubled times. What is the use of doing work under this scheme,' they lamented.

It should be stated here that under the MGNREGS, the payment of wages has to be done within 15 days of completion of work.



In reply to a question about the fate of the People's Alliance for Gupkar Declaration (PAGD), a conglomerate of six mainstream political parties including the NC and its arch rival PDP Abdullah said the alliance stands and "we are together...We all are there. We haven't

He said the alliance was cobbled up together in a hurry when the special status of Jammu and Kashmir was abrogated August 5, 2019. "We all are like-minded people who joined together to work for restoration, knowing fully well that under this government it will not be restored.'

"But we will continue to fight democratically and legally. People after us will also stand and try and work for the restoration of this, he said.

Abdullah also pointed out that earlier this month the Delimitation Commission came to Jammu and Kashmir and no members of Parliament, who are its associate members, were invited to sit and watch the proceedings.

Abdullah, who currently represents Srinagar in Parliament, urged the Opposition national political parties to 'forget' their plans and standings and get together to put the pillar of democracy far more strongly because the 'time is running out'.

'The tragedy with India is that the Opposition is divided and unless they unite for restoration of democracy and forget their own party plans and party standings, we will never be able to get our democratic structure back. And I think efforts are being made. I see they are trying to get together and I hope it does happen soon because time is running out," he said.

'Pak trying to maintain supply lines to terror groups using drones'

Srinagar, July 25: The improvised explosive device (IED) dropped using a drone along the Indo-Pak border July 23 was meant for triggering at a crowded market in Jammu region, and it shows that Pakistan is maintaining its supply lines to various terror groups despite the February ceasefire agreement, Jammu and Kashmir Police chief Dilbag Singh said

Singh, a 1987-batch IPS officer, said terror groups such as Lashkare-Taiba (LeT) and Jaish-e-

Mohammed (JeM) have been running short of arms and ammunition after the police and other security agencies managed to choke it by arresting many of their modules of Over **Ground Workers** (OGWs).

"We see that some of the state actors in Pakistan have adopted the use of drones for dropping arms, ammunition and even cash to cater to the demands of terror groups since September last year," he told PTI

The police managed to shoot down a hexa-copter that had come from Pakistan in Kanachak area of Jammu region along the International Border on July 23.

It carried an IED, weighing five kg, that was almost ready to be used and the intelligence suggested that the Jaish-e-Mohammed terror group wanted to trigger it in a crowded place in Jammu for inflicting maximum casualties, he

The police chief said that despite the ceasefire agreement along he Line of Control and the International Border since February this year, some "state actors" have been helping Pakistanbased terror groups operating in Jammu and Kashmir, by trying to maintain their supply chain of arms, ammunition and cash.

The police chief said there was a difference of single digit in the flight controller serial numbers of the drone shot down July 23 and another brought down a year ago in Kathua's Hiranagar sector in Jammu region.

Some parts of the assembled unmanned aerial vehicle brought down last week were from China and Taiwan.

He said since drones have added a new dimension to the security threats from see that some of

The police chief had earlier said that the signatures of explo-

"Drones have come recently, say in September last year. First, it came as a big surprise, but we were able to gear up our resources to counter that threat. I am happy to report that in cases of use of drones carrying weapons and narcotics and other explosives... Our security grid, intelligence grid of police and security agencies were very effective in taking countermeasures," the Director General of Police (DGP) said.

With the shooting down of another drone, the security agencies have been able to intercept around 33 sorties out of roughly 41 sorties which were made so far, the police chief said.



DU sets new record

New Delhi: In the wake of the Covid-19 pandemic, educational institutions across the country have remained closed. However, Delhi University (DU) worked round the clock and burnt midnight oil to prepare results of the examinations for undergraduate courses held in June this year. The varsity has set a new record under which the results of all undergraduate courses have been prepared within just one month of the conduct of the examination. This is the first time since its inception that the university has taken less than 30 days to prepare the results of undergraduate courses.

MONSOON 'FURY' BATTERS INDIA

Heavy to very heavy rainfall is very likely at isolated places over Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, east Rajasthan, west Madhya Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, and Meghalaya today, as per the IMD report

New Delhi, July 25: Heavy rainfall continued to wreak havoc in several parts of the country, including Maharashtra where 113 people have so far died in rain-related incidents, while nine people were killed in fresh landslides in Himachal Pradesh's Kinnaur district Sunday.

Several parts of Kerala in south India also witnessed heavy rainfall with the MeT issuing a yellow alert for several districts, including Thiruvananthapuram, Kollam, Pathanamthitta, Idukki, Kottayam, Alappuzha and Ernakulam.

The India Meteorological Department issued orange and yellow alerts predicting heavy rainfall, thunderstorm and lightning in Madhya Pradesh. Delhiites experienced a sultry Sunday with the maximum temperature settling at 37.3 degrees Celsius, three notches above the season's average. The minimum temperature was recorded at 27.6 degrees Celsius, normal for this time of the year.

The IMD has issued a yellow alert for the city Monday and forecast generally cloudy sky with moderate rain/thundershowers towards the evening. An orange alert has been issued for Tuesday with the forecast of rain accompanied with gusty winds. Parts of

Uttar Pradesh recieved light rain Sunday. Agra was the hottest place in the state with the maximum temperature settling at 37 degrees Celsius. According to the MeT office, heavy rain is very likely at isolated places in the state Monday, while thundershowers are likely at most places in the state July 27 and July 28. Heavy boulders fell on a tempo traveller carrying 11 people, killing nine and injuring two, according to the police.

In a similar incident, one person was injured in another landslide in Kinnaur district, they added. The police said they have started rescue operations and further details are awaited. In rain-battered Maharashtra, the number of deaths due to flooding, landslides and other rain-related incidents reached 113 with one more casualty reported in the last 24 hours, while 100 people were missing after the monsoon fury, the state government said. The National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) said 89 bodies have been retrieved and 34 people are missing following landslides triggered by heavy rainfall in the coastal regions of Maharashtra. According to the official data. NDRF rescuers have retrieved a total of 89 bodies with the highest number of 47 from the worst-hit Taliye village under Mahad tehsil of Raigad.

On behalf of the nation, particularly from people of Telangana, I express my gratitude to Hon PM @narendramodi for his guidance and sup port," Union Culture Minister G Kishan Reddy said in a tweet.

The temple, a 13th century engineering marvel named after its architect, Ramappa, was proposed by the government as its only nomination for the UNESCO World Heritage site tag for the year 2019.

"Excellent! Congratulations to everyone, specially the people of Telangana. The iconic Ramappa Temple showcases the outstanding craftsmanship of great Kakatiya dynasty. I would urge you all to visit this majestic temple complex and get a first-hand experience of its grandness," Prime Minister Narendra Modi tweeted.

Reddy also said that owing to the Covid-19 pandemic, the meeting of the World Heritage Committee (WHC) of the UNESCO could not be conducted in 2020. and the nominations for 2020 and those for 2021 were discussed in a series of online meetings.

The discussion on the Ramappa Temple took place Sunday. Reddy stated that there are 21 members in the WHC with China currently as the Chair which selected the Telangana temple for the tag.

THERE HAS BEEN NO DATA BREACH, SAYS CLUBHOUSE

New Delhi, July 25: As the news of data breach surfaced online revealing that millions of phone numbers of Clubhouse users are 'up for sale' on Dark Web, the chat app maker on Sunday informed that there has been no data breach.

The company also said that it continues to invest in industry-leading security practices as privacy and security are of the utmost importance to Clubhouse.

"There are a series of bots generating billions of random phone numbers," the company's spokesperson told IANS.

"In the event that one of these random numbers happens to exist on our platform due to mathematical coincidence, Clubhouse's API returns no user identifiable information," it added.



On Saturday, leading cyber-security expert Jiten Jain wrote on Twitter that a database of phone numbers of Clubhouse users is up for sale on the Darknet. "It also contains numbers of people in user's phonebooks that were synced. So chances are high that you are

listed even if you haven't had a Clubhouse login," he wrote.

However, according to independent security researcher Rajshekhar Rajaharia, the data leak claim appears fake as the alleged Clubhouse data contains only mobile numbers without names.

"No names, photos or any other details are available. This list of phone numbers can be generated very easily. The data leak claim appears fake," Rajaharia told IANS.

In February this year, researchers at Stanford University in the US had warned that the app may be leaking users' audio data to the Chinese

government. The Stanford Internet Observatory (SIO) had claimed that Agora, a Shanghai-based provider of real-time engagement software, supplies back-end infrastructure to the Clubhouse app.

14 seats vacant in Rajya Sabha

The bye-poll for three Rajya Sabha seats has been held back without any explanation by the EC in Tamil Nadu also. Of course, elections to four seats in Jammu & Kashmir cannot be held as there is no Assembly and Sharad Yadav seat in Bihar due to a court order. The Rajya Sabha secretariat has already declared these seats

vacant and it is for the EC and concerned authorities to hold byepolls. Therefore, the delay for seven seats is a cause of concern as states remain unrepresented.



Kabul: A total of 81 militants were confirmed dead as the Afghan forces, backed by helicopters and fighter planes launched airstrikes in the northern Balkh province, an army statement released here Sunday said. The sorties were launched Saturday in parts of the restive Kaldar and Chamtal districts, leaving 81 insurgents dead and injuring 43 others, reports Xinhua news agency. The typhoon, the sixth of this year, hit land in Zhoushan city's Putuo district at approximately 12:30 PM, the local flood control headquarters said.

Weather authorities have forecast the typhoon will make a second landfall in coastal areas between Zhejiang's Jiaxing city and Jiangsu province's Qidong city Sunday.

Meanwhile, the death toll in the July 21 unprecedented floods in Henan province climbed to 63 with five people still unaccounted for.

The torrential rains have affected about three million people in Henan province and a total of 376,000 local residents have been re-



located to safe places, according to the provincial emergency management department said.

As Zhengzhou city of 12 million people limped back to normalcy, rescuers are assisting thou-

sands of people caught in the floodwaters.

Over 8,000 military personnel worked in 10 different danger zones around the city, the state-run Xinhua news agency reported.

US headed towards wrong direction on **Coronavirus: Fauci**

Wilmington, July 25: The United States is in an "unnecessary predicament" of soaring Covid-19 cases fueled by unvaccinated Americans and the virulent delta variant, the nation's top infectious diseases expert said Sunday.

"We're going in the wrong direction," said Dr Anthony Fauci, describing himself as "very frustrated."

He said recommending that the vaccinated wear masks is "under active consideration" by the government's leading public health officials. Also, booster shots may be suggested for people with suppressed immune systems who have been vaccinated, Fauci said.

Fauci, who also serves President Joe Biden's chief medical adviser, told CNN's "State of the Union" that he has taken part in conversations about altering the mask guidelines.

"This is an issue predominantly among the unvaccinated, which is the reason why we're out there, practically pleading with the unvaccinated people to go out and get vaccinated," Fauci said.

The fire was burning in a remote area with limited access, hampering firefighters' efforts as it charged eastward, fire officials

said. It has prompted evacuation orders in several small communities and along the west shore of Lake Almanor, a popular area get-

Meanwhile, the nation's largest wildfire, southern Oregon's Bootleg fire, was nearly halfway surrounded Saturday as more than 2,200 crew members worked to corral it in the heat and wind, fire officials said. The growth of the sprawling blaze had slowed, but thousands of homes remained threatened on its eastern side, authorities said.

In California, Gov Gavin Newsom has declared a state of emergency for four northern counties because of wildfires that he said were causing "conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property." The proclamation opened the way for more state support.

'Cos struggling to manage reporting on climate risks'

New Delhi, July 25: Businesses are finding it hard to manage reporting on climate risks and need to take urgent steps to meet the expectations of regulators as well as investors, according to a report.

Leading consultancy EY's report covered over 1,100 organisations across 42 countries, including India, and focussed on efforts made by them to publish their climate-related risks and opportunities based on the recommendations set by the Task Force on Climate-related Financial Disclosures (TCFD).

The TCFD was established to improve and increase reporting of climate-related financial information. The scores of companies are based on the number of recommended disclosures that they

make (coverage) and the extent or detail of each disclosure (quality).

The EY Global Climate Risk Disclosure Barometer 2021 also showed that coverage and quality of climate-related disclosures remain below global averages in India. As per the report, only half of companies examined worldwide make all recommended disclosures and therefore have full coverage, and on an average, the coverage was 70%.

"Companies based in India presented 28% on quality disclosure and 49% coverage. Only 3% of global companies reviewed meet the highest levels of quality and the average quality score is 42%," EY said in a release Sunday.

Among others, the number of Indian companies responding to disclosure platforms such as carbon disclosure project is on the rise. In

the coming year, greater TCFD reporting is expected, driven by pressure from financiers, investors

and customers, it added. In November last year, 24 Indian companies signed a pledge to work with the government toward achieving the 2015 United Nations Paris Climate Change Conference (Paris Agreement) goals.

The EY Global Climate **Risk Disclosure Barometer 2021 showed** that coverage and quality of climaterelated disclosures remain below global averages in India

'Businesses around the world are struggling to manage the report ing of climate risks and should consider taking urgent action in order to meet the requirements and expectations of regulators and investors," it noted.

Chaitanya Kalia, Partner and National Leader, Climate Change and Sustainability Services (CCaSS) at EY India, said the pandemic has

spurred the importance of climate change and the gravity of climate crisis which go beyond an organisation's own footprint, requiring more complex data management, analysis and forecasting.

Indian organisations are making progress on climate risk disclosures, and Sebi's business responsibility and sustainability reporting norms designed to be mandatory from FY23 onwards will further help investors identify firms' business sustainability risks, Kalia added

Globally, the report said that only 41% of the organisations reviewed have disclosed that they have conducted crucial scenario analysis, which is also a TCFD recommendation, to examine the likely scale and timings of particular risks and prepare for the worst-case outcomes.

CII suggests mandatory life insurance cover for PMAY borrowers

New Delhi, July 25: Industry chamber CII on Sunday called for relaunch of the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (PMAY) scheme with mandatory life insurance for all borrowers to ensure that the intent of providing 'Housing for All' does not take a hit due to death or disability of the primary borrower.

The PMAY is the ambitious mission of the government aimed at 'Housing for All' as India completes 75 years of Independence by the vear 2022. The scheme, however, falls short of covering the risk of death or disability of the borrower as the loans sanctioned under the scheme do not have an in-built insurance provision, the chamber said in a statement.

Addition of insurance component will ensure that in all circumstances, the intended benefit of the scheme of 'Housing for All' is fulfilled, and the families are able to retain their home, it said.

"There is a need for a relaunch of the PMAY scheme with an inbuilt credit-linked insurance or a mandatory life insurance for all borrowers under the PMAY scheme to ensure that the intent of providing 'Housing for All' does not take a hit due to death or disability of the primary borrower. The family should inherit a home-not a loan," CII Director-General Chandrajit Baneriee said.

With an in-built insurance cover in the PMAY loans, the inherent lacuna of risk-protection can be plugged with minimum additional disruptions," Banerjee said.

The scheme could have standard premium rates which could be utilised by any insurer to offer the credit cover with their partner banks, he said adding that the inbuilt level cover equal to the loan amount could be taken at by the borrower at the inception.

As per the current version of the scheme, the banks or lenders are partially protected as the property is mortgaged with them, however the family is left to pay the loan or lose their home, the director-gen-

90% willing to pay premium for buying EV: Survey

New Delhi, July 25: With global electric vehicles (EVs) sales expected to boom in the next 12 months, nearly 90% of consumers in India are willing to pay a premium for buying an EV, according to a survey by consultancy firm EY.

The EY Mobility Consumer Index (MCI), a survey of more than 9,000 respondents from 13 countries, including 1.000 respondents from India. also found that 40% of the respondents were ready to pay a premium of up to 20%. The survey concluded in the second half of July.

"Among the car buyers in India, 3 in 10 respondents would prefer to buy an electric/hydrogen vehicle," the survey said.

A majority of the respondents surveyed in India consider a driving range of 100 to 200 miles from

a fully charged EV, EY said. It further said, "Nearly 90% of

About 67% of those looking to buy an EV feel it is their responsibility to reduce their personal environmental impact, and 69% feel buying an EV is one way to achieve this goal.


When it comes to charging, the survey found that "nearly a third of the existing EV owners expect vehicle charging to take less than an hour compared to 45 per cent of the respondents who are planning to buy an EV".

The 38-year-old Mary Kom, who is a 2012 Olympic bronzemedallist and a multiple-time Asian champion, prevailed 4-1 against a rival who is 15 years her junior and a Pan American Games bronzemedallist.But Manish, a Commonwealth Games silver medallist and a World Championship bronze-winner, went down 1-4 to Britain's Luke McCormack in an edge-of-the-seat clash.

Mary Kom's bout was also exciting from start to finish. The Manipuri displayed some brilliant tactics to overcome the fight that

Garcia put up. "It has been very painful, the last couple of years, for everybody because of the pandemic and everything shut down. We are all suffering the same problem and every athlete has to train at home, but for us boxers, we need a training partner," Mary Kom said in the mixed zone after her triumph.

Top-ranked Ash Barty was beaten 4-6, 3-6 by her 48th-ranked Spanish opponent Sara Sorribes Tormo in a first round women's singles match Barty's Olympic singles debut. She won her doubles Saturday with Australian teammate Storm Sanders.

One step better

Russian shooter Vitalina Batsarashkina won Sunday gold in women's 10-metre air pistol, five years after taking silver at the Rio de Janeiro Games. Batsarashkina shot an Olympicrecord of 240.3 points, finishing 0.9 ahead of Bulgaria's Antoaneta Kostadinova. Jian Ranxin of China took bronze after matching Greece's Anna Korakaki's threeyear-old record of 587 points to lead qualifying.

Creating history

Nina Salukvadze of Georgia made history Sunday by becoming the first athlete to compete in nine Olympics when she took part in the 10 metres air pistol event. However, she failed to qualify for the finals and announced her retirement to the Russian media immediately. The 52-year-old Salukvadze first competed at the 1988 Seoul Olympics for the Soviet Union, winning a gold and a silver.

After winning the first set easily, Sania was serving for the match at 5-3 in the second set. But she failed to close out the set and lost it in the tie-breaker to allow the Ukranian pair to level the score. Then in the super tie-break, the Indian duo failed to make amends and was sent packing.

However, G Sathiyan suffered an upset 3-4 defeat at the hands of lower-ranked Siu Hang Lam to make an early exit from the men's singles competition. Sathiyan was

India's lone gymnast at the Tokyo Olympics, Pranati Nayak failed to qualify for the all round finals of artistic gymnastics competition. overall in 29th position. Only the

Indian swimmer Maana Patel could not qualify for the semifinals of the women's 100m backstroke event as she finished second in her heat at the Tokyo Games. Competing in her first Olympics, Maana finished with a time of 1.05.20 seconds behind Zimbabwe's Donata Katai, who clocked 1:02.73. Overall the 21-year-old Indian finished 39th in the standings.

Tokyo, July 25: The Indian men's hockey team were pummelled 1-7 by World No.1 Australia in their second Pool A match of the Olympic Games here Sunday It was moraleshattering loss which exposed every possible chink in the side's armour. It was India's biggest loss since Australian Graham Reid took charge of the team as coach in April 2019.

Australia looked dominant and

were in complete control from the onset, scoring through Daniel Beale (10th), Joshua Beltz (26th), Andrew Flynn Ogilvie (23rd), Jeremy Hayward (21st), Blake Govers (40th, 42nd) and Tim Brand (51st) to secure the easy win. India's lone goal came from the stick of Dilpreet Singh in the 34th minute.

India had earlier defeated New Zealand 3-2 in their opening fixture Saturday. The Manpreet Singhled side will next play Spain, Tuesday

The eight-time former champions looked completely off colour from the start. The team's backline was put under relentless pressure by the Australians.

It was India who had the first chance at scoring, earning a penalty corner in the eighth minute, but Harmanpreet Singh failed to execute from the set piece.

Two minutes later, Australia surged ahead when Beale deflected in Jacob Whetton's strike after a poor penalty corner execution. A minute later, Dilpreet missed a golden chance from close range to level the scores.

The second quarter completely belonged to Australia. They scored three goals in a span of five minutes to take the game away from their opponents.

The Indians showed some spark after the change of ends and attacked the Australian goal in numhers. In the process they secured three back-to-back penalty corners but wasted all of them. Dilpreet then infused some life into the game by pulling one back for India, beautifully deflecting in Rupinder's defence splitting pass from the mid-field. But that was as far as

Shooters disappoint

Tokyo, July 25: The fancied Indian shooting team drew a blank for the second day running in the Tokyo Olympics here Sunday. A major weapon malfunction led to the sad exit for the young Manu Bhaker in the women's 10 air pistol event.

Appearing in her maiden Olympics, the 19-year-old Manu finished a creditable 12th, despite losing nearly 20 minutes during the qualifications after the cocking lever in her pistol broke down,_ forcing her to go to a designated area for getting it fixed. Manu shot 575. while the cut-off was 577.

Yashaswini Singh Deswal, the other first-timer at the Games, recovered from a subdued start to end 13th, with a total score of 574.

In the men's 10 air rifle event, both the experienced Deepak Kumar and the teenaged Divyansh Singh Panwar finished a lowly 26th and 32nd respectively.

Deepak aggregated 624.7 while Divyansh shot 622.8 over the six series, scores which were never going to be enough to make the final.

Taken together, the first two days' performance, or, the lack of it, is certainly going to raise a few evebrows within the Indian shooting fraternity, including the National Rifle Association of India (NRAI).

INDIA BEAT SRI LANKA EASILY BY 38 RUNS IN FIRST T201

Surya, Bhuvi script victory

Colombo, July 25: Suryakumar Yadav's (50, 34b, 5x4, 2x6) second T20 international half century helped India comprehensively beat Sri Lanka by 38 runs in the first of the three-game series at the Premadasa Stadium here Sunday India scored 164 for five and then bowled out the hosts for 126 in 18.3 overs.

Except for Charith Asalanka (44, 26b, 3x4, 3x6) and to some extent Avishka Fernando (26, 23b, 3x4), none of the Sri Lankan batsman looked comfortable against the Indian bowling attack. Even though Bhuvneshwar Kumar (4/22) and Deepak Chahar (2/24) were the major wicket-takers, it was legspinner Yuzvendra Chahal (1/19) who stood out with his variations. All the Indian bowlers used in the match got their names on the wickets column.

Earlier Surya's continued his rich vein of form with another attractive half century. It was complemented by useful contributions from skipper Shikhar Dhawan (46, 38b, 4x4, 1x6) along with Ishan Kishan (20 n o, 14b, 1x4, 1x6) at the



back-end. Dhawan added 62 with

Surya in eight overs to provide a

solid launch-pad but the latter's dismissal surely cost India 20 extra runs. The way Surya batted it seemed that he has been born to play T20 cricket only. It was Surya's innings that helped Kishan launch the final assault.

 $Two\,Indians\,made\,their\,debut\,in$ the T20 format, Prithvi Shaw and Chakravarthy. However, Shaw (0) would like to forget this debut while Chakravarthy (1/28) came in for some harsh treatment from Asalanka. In fact the debutant was hit for two sixes and a boundary by Asalanka while the other batsmen struggled to pick him.

IPL to resume with **MI-CSK** encounter

New Delhi, July 25: Defending champions Mumbai Indians (MI) will meet Chennai Super Kings (CSK) in Dubai, September 19 when the IPL resumes in the United Arab Emirates (UAE), the BCCI announced Sunday. The tournament was suspended in May after multiple Covid-19 cases were reported in its bio-bubble.

"The 14th season, which was postponed in May this year in the wake of the pandemic, will resume September 19 in Dubai with a blockbuster clash between Chennai Super Kings and Mumbai Indians," the BCCI said in a statement. A total of 31 matches including the final will be played in 27 days.

"There will be 7 double headers (five matches already played in India -total of 12 matches) with the first match starting at 3.30pm (IST). All evening matches will start at 7.30pm

(IST)," the statement further said. The first Qualifier will be played in Dubai, October 10, the Eliminator and Qualifier 2 will be played in Sharjah, October 11 and 13 respectively with Dubai hosting the final, October 15. In all, 13 matches will be held in Dubai, 10 in Sharjah

and eight in Abu Dhabi.
