CBSE Class X results by August 8

New Delhi: After the declaration of CBSE Class XII Board results 2021. Sanyam Bhardwaj, the Controller of Examinations, CBSE, confirmed that the CBSE Class X Board results, 2021 will be declared in a week. "We will start working on Class X result from Sunday and try to deliver it by next week," said Sanyam Bhardwaj. However, Bhardwaj didn't reveal the exact date and time when the CBSE Class X Board results, 2021 would be declared. Meanwhile, once the result is declared, students can check the CBSE Class X Board results 2021 on the official websites - cbse.gov.in and cbseresults.nic.in.

Maha reports first Zika virus case

Pune: Maharashtra officially confirmed its first case of Zika virus a mosquitoborne viral infection Saturday. A blood sample of the 50-year-old resident of Belsar village (Purandar taluka) in Pune district tested positive for Zikachikungunya co-infection at Indian Council of Medical Research-National Institute of Virology (ICMR-NIV) in Pune late Friday. The sample was drawn as part of routine surveillance to rule out mosquito-borne illnesses after some villagers showed dengue/ chikungunya-like symptoms in Belsar and Parinche villages in early July.

J&K: No jobs, passport for stone-pelters

Srinagar: The CID wing of Jammu and Kashmir Police has ordered the denial of security clearance required for passport and other government services to all those involved in stonepelting or subversive activities. In an order issued Saturday, the senior superintendent of police (SSP), CID, Special Branch (SB), Kashmir, has directed all the field units under it to ensure that the person's involvement in law and order, stone-pelting cases, and other crime prejudicial to the security of the state be specifically looked into during verification related to passport, service and any other verification related to government schemes.

Sindhu tames Bing Jiao, wins bronze

Tokyo, August 1: Reigning world champion PV Sindhu Sunday became only the second Indian and the country's first woman to win two Olympic medals, securing a bronze after a straight-game win over world No.9 He Bing Jiao of China in the badminton women's singles third-place play-off here.

Sindhu, who has returned with medals from each of the big-ticket events such as the Commonwealth and Asian Games and the BWF World Tour Finals in the last five years, outwitted eighth seed Bing Jiao 21-13 21-15 to add a bronze to the silver that she had secured at the 2016 Rio Games. "It makes me feel

really happy because I've worked hard for so many years. I had a lot of emotions going through me should I be happy that I won bronze or sad that I lost the opportunity to play in the final?" the 26-year-old said after the match. "But overall, I had

to close off my emotions for this one match and give it Bing Jiao, at the 2020 Summer Olympics, in Tokyo, Sunday РПРНОТ my best, my all and

think about the emotions. I'm really happy and I think I've done really well. It's a proud moment getting a medal for my country.' Wrestler Sushil Kumar is the first

and only other Indian to win two Olympic medals, following up his bronze at 2008 Beijing with silver at the 2012 London edition. She also became only the fourth

player to win two consecutive medals in women's badminton singles across the Olympic history.

Up against an opponent, who had beaten her nine times so far in the last 15 meetings. Sindhu showed great

determination to outplay Bing Jiao with her aggression to scoop India's third medal at Tokyo. Sindhu showed great fortitude as she recovered from her painful semifinal loss to world No.1 Tai

the Olympics," Sindhu said. "It's not easy. It's a big thing. There were really long rallies but I had to be patient and calm. Even though I was leading, I did not relax.

Sindhu galloped to a 4-0 lead early on but Bing Jiao started to engage her in rallies and waited for her to make errors. The rallies started getting intense as Bing Jiao set up the points with her angled returns and flat pushes to claw back at 5-5.

The Chinese didn't give Sindhu pace to play her power game but the Indian soon worked her way around even as her opponent committed a few unforced errors

Sindhu ended another superb rally with a cross court smash and entered the interval with another down the line hit at 11-8.

The Indian stepped up the pace after the break to gather three more points and looked in total control to pocket the opening game when her opponent went wide. After change of ends, Sindhu continued her aggressive game, egged on by coach Park Tae-Sang from the sidelines, to lead 4-1 with a cross court return.

Bing Jiao tried to change the momentum but Sindhu rode on her attacking half smashes and slices to keep her nose ahead at the interval with a three point advantage.

Bing Jiao erased the deficit quickly before a precise smash on the line helped Sindhu wrest back control. She soon restored the three point advantage with another cross court drop.

Woman shot dead in Nuapada district

Nuapada, August 1: A woman was allegedly shot dead at Duajhar village under Khariar block in Nuapada district Saturday night. Past enmity is said to be the reason behind the crime. The deceased has been identified as Basanti Meher (47), wife of Bibhishan Meher who runs an eaterv

Sources said that Basanti was at the eatery Saturday night when a person appeared from nowhere and shot her from point blank range before fleeing the spot. Hearing the agonising cries of Basanti, the staff of the hotel and other local residents rushed her to the Khariar sub-divisional hospital. However, doctors declared her "brought dead" on arrival.

On being informed, police reached the hospital and sent the body for post-mortem.

The cops also visited the spot where the crime took place. On the basis of an FIR lodged by the husband of the deceased, police have launched an investigation. Efforts are on to nab the culprit.

Sources said that Basanti had married off her daughter to a person in Jharsuguda. However, she was not on good terms with her daughter and son-in-law. The son-in-law used to visit the eatery quite often and during most of his visits he would have a spat with Basanti. There have been many occasions when he had threatened to kill Basanti.

SC to hear petitions on Pegasus Thursday New Delhi, August 1: A

two-member Bench, headed by Chief Justice NV Ramana, will hear the petitions. Justice Surya Kant is the second judge on the Bench.

The Supreme Court will be hearing a clutch of petitions seeking a special investigation into the Pegasus scandal involving allegations that opposition politicians, journalists and others were targets of the Israeli spyware.

Senior journalists N Ram and Sashi Kumar, CPM MP John Brittas and advocate ML Sharma have petitioned the top court to direct the government to disclose whether it has obtained a licence for the spyware or used it - directly or indirectly - to conduct surveillance of any kind. They also seek a probe by a sitting or former judge of the Supreme Court into the matter.

Senior Advocate Kapil Sibal, appearing for senior iournalists N Ram and Sashi Kumar, had said that the civil liberties of citizens, politicians belonging to Opposition parties, journalists and court staff were at stake as they were put under surveillance. He added that Pegasus snooping row was making waves in India and all over the world.

Ram and Sashi Kumar said in their plea that such "targeted surveillance" using a "military-grade spyware" is "grossly dispro-

portionate invasion of the right to privacy". It added, "The Pegasus hack is a direct attack on communica-

tional, intellectual and informational privacy, and critically endangers the meaningful exercise of privacy in these contexts. While Sharma's plea cited

media reports on the controversy and said "the Pegasus scandal is a matter of grave concern and a serious attack on Indian democracy, judiciary and country's security", Brittas said the Pegasus spyware allegations give rise to two inferences – which it was done by the Indian government or by a foreign agency.

"If it is done by the Indian government, it is done in an unauthorized manner. The spending of sovereign amount for personal and political interests of the ruling party cannot be permitted. If snooping is done by some foreign agency, it is an act of external aggression which also needs to be dealt in a serious manner", he contended.

Site showing excess **Covid mortality** data pulled down

GOVT SAYS DATA IS UNAVAILABLE DUE TO 'SERVER PROBLEMS'

New Delhi, August 1: Key official health data that pointed to excess mortality and disrupted health services during the Covid-19 pandemic have suddenly gone offline, an independent investigation by IndiaSpend shows. While government officials say that the reason for the data being unavailable is "server problems", all pre-pandemic data hosted on the same website remain available.

The National Health Mission's Health Management Information System (HMIS) is a public portal where data from over 200,000 public health facilities - most of them government-run and rural – across India are uploaded every month. The data currently available date back to 2008, and are available down to the sub-district level for every state.

Following reports of disruptions to routine health services during the first nationwide lockdown to stop the spread of Covid-19, which began March 25, 2020, IndiaSpend used these HMIS

data to show that immunisations for children as well as access for adults to drugs and treatments for life-threatening diseases had declined sharply during March-May 2020. Following the publication of the article, the data became unavailable from the HMIS website.

In early July 2021, the data became available again on the website, updated up until May 2021. IndiaSpend used the data to show that there had been a large and unexplained spike in mortality in rural India during the pandemic, which rural health experts interpreted as an indication of severe undercounting of Covid-19 deaths. Following IndiaSpend's

report, a team of researchers led by Prabhat Jha, director of the Center for Global Health Research and professor at the University of Toronto, Canada, used the HMIS data as well as other estimates to argue in a preprint paper that India saw 2.7-3.3 million deaths between June 2020 and June-2021 – 7-8 times higher than the official Covid-19 toll.

Satellite imaging to resolve North East border disputes

New Delhi, August 1: The Centre has roped in the North Eastern Space Applications Centre (NESAC), a joint initiative of the Department of Space and North Eastern Council (NEC), to undertake satellite mapping of border areas to help "scientifically" demarcate inter-state boundaries.

Union Home Minister Amit Shah came up with the suggestion some time back to commission NESAC with mapping the inter-state border areas and forests in the northeast region so that there is a "scientific" basis to demarcation of borders between states.

According to senior government officials, the task of demarcating boundaries has been given to the North Eastern Space Application Centre (NESAC), a joint initiative of the Department of Space (DoS) and the North Eastern Council (NEC).

Why is demarcation necessary

The inter-state border disputes have come under fresh focus after the recent violent clash on Assam-Mizoram border that resulted in the deaths of six Assam Police personnel and a civilian.

The idea for demarcation of interstate boundaries through satellite imaging was mooted by Union Home Minister Amit Shah a few months ago.

Shah had suggested giving the task to NESAC for mapping the inter-state borders and forests in the Northeastern region and coming up with a scientific demarcation of boundaries between states. Once the satellite mapping is done, the boundaries of Northeastern states could be drawn and the dis-

putes could be resolved permanently, the officials said.

The current tensions in the Assam-Mizoram border area first flared up in October of last year and then again in June. On June 5, two abandoned houses along the Mizoram-Assam border were burnt down by unidentified persons, fuelling tension along

the volatile inter-state border. On June 30, Mizoram accused Assam of encroaching upon its land in Kolasib, one of the bordering districts. Assam, in turn, accused Mizoram of building structures and carrying out plantations of betel nuts and banana saplings.

Konark to be India's first 'Zero Emission City' by 2022

A 10MW SOLAR PLANT AT KALAHANDI WILL CATER TO CITY'S ENERGY REQUIREMENT

energy demands. The government agencies involved in the work claimed that several aspects of the project have already been completed, while the remaining work is being completed on war footing. All off-grid (not connected to grids) interventions for the project are likely to be completed by September this year, while work on the remaining grid will be over by September next


of Bengal. Corrosion activities and vulnerability to cyclones could have created problem for such plants technically," he said.

Instead, OREDA plans to install a solar power plant at Kalahandi to cater to the energy demands of the city. A 10MW solar power plant for Konark will be setup soon at Kalahnadi soon. The tender process is already over and work will start soon, the official said.

As per the plan, the energy produced in Kalahandi will be supplied to the local grid. "If the energy produced in Kalahandi is in excess of the city's demands, Konark will be emission free. We are likely to complete the project by September 2022. Konark will be India's first zero emission city after achieving the target," he said.



Maintenance and equipment costs, salary bills and other expenses have already pushed the owners to the edge. Big cinema halls in the City have incurred losses of around Rs 20-30 lakh each due to the restrictions

Bhubaneswar, August 1: After months of shut down, the cinema halls in the City are getting ready to run again. However, the rules and guidelines set by the state government have upset the owners.

As per the guidelines, halls have been granted permission to run with 50 per cent seating capacity. However, people visiting theatres are required to furnish certificates of their second dose of vaccination.

Maharaja cinema hall owner Biswajit Mohapatra said, "The weekend lockdown is not good news for us as our business heavily depends on weekends. Also, as per the guidelines, the 8 pm deadline will hamper our business as there won't be night shows."

"We have started sanitising the seats and hall premises. We will be ready to reopen the halls after August 5," said Mohapatra.

Many opined that further probe into the matter would unearth the involvement of some more officials of OSSC in the alleged scam.

As per rules, the private secretaries are attached to Chairman and Members of the Commission who assist them in various official works. Additionally, the members form an integral part of Viva-Voce Boards and other recruitment

So the possibility of other officials' involvement in the racket cannot be ruled out.

Khurda, August 1: While many insist that Himachal Pradesh and Kashmir apples can't be grown in hot climate of Odisha, a farmer from Arikama village under Bolagarh block in Khurda district has proven them wrong.

Arun Kumar Nayak, who studied only till Class VIII, has successfully turned a patch of his land into an apple orchard here and has been a source of inspiration for

Narrating about his success story, Nayak said the seed of the desire to grow Himachal Pradesh apple in his land was implanted in his mind after he saw YouTube videos of apple farming there.

"I then consulted agriculture experts, got my soil tested and prepared accordingly. I gathered information about an organisation in Himachal Pradesh from YouTube and placed an order for 30 saplings around two years ago. I planted the saplings in pits each measuring three feet wide and three feet deep. Organic manure such as cow dung was used to process the soil,"



"Initially, three saplings withered and died. But I did not lose hope. I kept on working in my orchard and tending to the saplings. The saplings grew up to small trees and they began flowering around six months ago. Now, each tree has a few green apples. Seeing apple trees in my garden laden with apples, my joy knew no bound," Nayak narrated.

Nayak said he had to wait for one-

Nayak has recently planted saplings of top-quality guava and Indian Jujube in his orchard. He said he had ordered the guava and Indian Jujube saplings online. Only organic manure is being used in his orchard.

Besides these, Nayak is cultivating paddy and vegetables in his farmlands. "We also raise fish in our pond. We had never thought that apples could be grown in the hot and humid climate of Khurda. Now, we are sure that apple farming is possible in Odisha too," said Nayak's

Speaking about Nayak's achievements, a fellow villager Judhishtira Nayak said Arun may not be highly qualified, but his self-confidence, dedication and never-say-die attitude has transformed him into a successful farmer. As things stand, youths and other farmers from the village and nearby areas are taking a page from his book, he added.

ODISHA'S CORONAVIRUS CASELOAD SURGES TO 9.78.705 AS 1.437 MORE PEOPLE TEST POSITIVE FOR THE INFECTION, WHILE 64 FRESH FATALITIES TAKE THE COASTAL STATE'S TOLL TO 5,966

Bhubaneswar, August 1: Odisha's Covid-19 caseload Sunday surged to 9,78,705 after 1,437 more people tested positive for the infection. while 64 fresh fatalities took the coastal state's toll to 5,966, a Health department official said.

Of the 1,437 cases, 832 were from quarantine centres and the rest detected during contact tracing.

For the first time, the Test Positivity Rate (TPR) in Odisha dipped below 2 per cent-1.9 per cent—as 1,437 samples, out of the 74,735 tested in the past 24 hours, turned out to be Covid positive.

Khurda district, which encompasses state capital Bhubaneswar, reported 409 new cases, followed by Cuttack at 190 and Puri at 146, said the official, adding that these three districts together accounted for 51.84 per cent of the Covid cases. As many as 10 districts in the

state registered single digit Covid According to the official, eight

deaths each were recorded in Bhadrak, Cuttack and Khurda districts, seven each in Puri and Sundargarh, four in kendrapara, and three each in Dhenkanal and Nayagarh districts.

The Health department clarified that 'the list of fatalities does not reflect deaths that have occurred on a particular day. It gives details of past deaths for which

Bhubaneswar, August 1: With the Odisha government allowing reopening of religious institutions with Covid restrictions from Sunday as part of its unlock process, all eyes are now set on the meeting of Shree Jagannath Temple Administration (SJTA) to be held August 4, where the body will decide on the reopening of the 12th century shrine in Puri

SJTA Chief Administrator Krishan Kumar has convened the virtual meeting to decide on allowing the devotees into the Jagannath temple, a senior official said.

Puri's District Magistrate-cum-Collector, Superintendent of Police, Chief District Medical Officer and members of the temple coordination committee will attend the meeting to take stock of the Covid situation and decide when to reopen the shrine for devotees.

The state government, in its

guideline for August, has categorically stated that SJTA, Puri and the Lingaraj Administration, Bhubaneswar may decide on reopening of temples under their management for public in consultation with stakeholders concerned and in compliance with Covid safety protocols.

The notification said that places of worship across the state will be opened based on an assessment of the local situation by district authorities. However, no prashad will be offered by the devotees.

The Jagannath temple remained out of bounds for devotees for around 100 days due to a spike in Covid cases. They were even prevented from attending the Rath Yatra July 12, as shutdown and curfew were imposed in the Pilgrim City.

In the wake of the second wave of the pandemic, the SJTA had April 24 prohibited the entry of devotees to the shrine even as all daily rituals were performed by servitors and other temple staff.

SHG workers' income too low, alleges Congress

Contaminated water blamed for kidney diseases at Khurda village

Khurda, August 1: Many villagers of Boriknuagaon under Bolagarh block in Khurda district have been suffering from kidney ailments for the last few years. The villagers blamed contaminated drinking water for the health crisis. It has been alleged that at least

10 villagers of Boriknuagaon have died due to kidney ailments in last five years. The village has only four tube wells to meet the drinking water needs of around 300 people of 80 families. However, two among the four tube wells have turned defunct due to poor maintenance, sources said.

"Many people of our villages have been suffering from kidney ailments for last few years. Contaminated drinking water is said to be the main reason behind the health crisis. We have raised the issue with the administration several times but to no avail," said Sribatsha Behera, a villager of Boriknuagaon. According to the villagers, several health experts have cited impure drinking as the reason for the prevalence of kidneyrelated diseases in the village.

"I was taken ill a few months ago. Upon consulting a doctor, I came to know that I was suffering

from kidney-related diseases. The doctor told me that impure drinking water is the reason behind my illness, Now, I am under medication. I have spent around Rs 10,000 on medicines in the last three-four months," said a villager.

He claimed that at least five persons in his neighborhood are now suffering from similar ailments, "We have urged the administration several times to arrange pure drinking water for us. But, all our requests have

When contacted Bolagarh Block Development Officer (BDO) Dhobei Nayak said he would direct the officials of Rural Water Supply and Sanitation (RWSS) department to examine the quality of drinking water at Boriknuagaon. "We would raise the issue with our higher authorities and take appropriate steps," he added.

Estuarine crocodile nesting sites dip to 84 in Bhitarkanika

Kendrapara, August 1: The number of nesting sites of estuarine crocodiles in the marshy wetlands of Bhitarkanika National Park has dipped to 84 from 103 last year, a senior official said Sunday.

Tidal waves during cyclone Yaas might have washed away several crocodile nesting sites but the factors behind the drop are being examined. JD Pati Divisional Forest Officer of Rajnagar Mangrove (Wildlife) Forest Division said.

Female crocodiles lay around 50-60 eggs, and the hatchlings usually emerge from the nests after 70-80 days of incubation, he said.

The national park houses an estimated 70 per cent of the country's estuarine or saltwater crocodile population, conservation of which started

The number of saltwater crocodiles, which are not found in any other river system in Odisha, stood at 1,768 as per the census conducted in Bhitarkanika in January this year.

Bhitarkanika, a Ramsar site,

is one of the richest storehouses of mangrove genes. In the national park, researchers have come across 11 of the 70 mangrove species that were facing

a threat of extinction around the world. Officials claimed that conservation measures by the state Forest Department over the years have led to a systematic rise in the number of crocodiles. Bhitarkanika continues to remain out of bounds for tourists in view of the global

Covid-19 pandemic. It remains closed from May 31 to July 31 every year to ensure disturbance-free nesting of crocodiles, the official said. Incidentally, Odisha is the only state in the country where

three species of crocodiles saltwater, gharial and mugger – are found inhabiting the river systems

ndia and China held the 12th round of the Corps Commander-level talks July 31 on the Chinese side of Chushul-Moldo Border Personnel Meeting lacktriangle Point to end the nearly 15-month-long military standoff in eastern Ladakh. But, that does not seem to be indication that China has any intention to ease tension along India's borders. For, the past few days saw manoeuvrings by China at the highest level along India's borders with Tibet and Afghanistan. In a first ever exercise, China's President Xi Jinping visited Nyingchi in Tibet, close to Arunachal Pradesh, and Lhasa, while a key Taliban leader met China's top leadership in China. The two developments took place at a time when US Secretary of State Antony Blinken held high level talks with the Indian leadership on a range of issues, including the current turmoil in Afghanistan, and also met a representative of the Dalai Lama in Delhi. These are but calibrated moves by both China on the one hand and India and the USA on the other to test each other's nerves and diplomatic skills. The stakes are too high and China is acting from a vantage ground. The Taliban are making conciliatory gestures towards it and China's grip in Tibet is now firmer than ever before. These do not augur well for India.

Xi Jinping's Tibet visit is significant for a number of reasons and it impinges on the future of Tibet and India-China ties. The last time when a top ranking Chinese leader visited Tibet was in 1990 and it was Jiang Zemin, then General Secretary of the Chinese Communist Party. Xi's visit is planned to send clear political signals to the people of China, the Tibetans and India. He was accompanied by Zhang Youxia, vice-chairman of the Central Military Commission. The intent appears to flex muscles and possibly also browbeat India. Visits by India's leaders to Arunachal Pradesh are seen by China as politically provocative. Xi's visit to a place in Tibet opposite Arunachal Pradesh appears to be an act of provocation as well. Of course, India has accepted Tibet as part of China, but it would be naive to treat the visit of Xi and other top leaders as China's internal matters. For, Tibet is being used by China as a launching pad for advancing its persistent territorial claims on India. Moreover, the visit was timed when China is embroiled in a military confrontation with India.

Had Xi visited Tibet after the settlement of the current border dispute and restoration of the ground positions that existed in April 2020, India would have had no reason to be bothered about it. But, Xi didn't wait for the completion of negotiations on restoring the status quo ante and hammering out new terms of border management. This makes the purpose of the visit suspect and indicates China under Xi is toughening its stand on India on the

As for China's Tibet policy under the Xi regime, it is tightening its military hold over the region, exploiting its resources and building dams on the Brahmaputra, throwing to the wind environmental concerns. It plans to construct a dam at the river's bend before it enters India. China has already built roads and railway lines in Tibet for both military and economic reasons. It is systematically changing Tibet's demography through the settlement of Hans in newly-built villages close to India's border in the east. Xi's policies seem to aim at undermining the Dalai Lama's position on a truly autonomous Tibet

Intriguingly, China has settled its border disputes with Russia and contiguous Central Asian states. But, it has illegally acquired Indian territory in Shaksgam valley and is unflinchingly staking its maritime and land claims in South and East China Seas, Bhutan and India. Against this backdrop, it is only natural that China would take umbrage at the meeting Blinken had with the Dalai Lama's representative in Delhi. China is worried about US-India bonhomie with increasing military cooperation and joint stakes in the security of the Indo-Pacific region. Blinken's meeting with the Director of the Bureau of the Dalai Lama in Delhi, Ngodup Dongchung, has turned out to be a sore point with China. As the USA follows one-China policy, it is expected not to meddle with China's Tibetan affairs. This is why the Foreign Ministry in Beijing immediately lashed out at the US and asserted it won't allow "foreign interference with China's internal affairs in Tibet." China is extremely allergic to any form of contact between foreign officials and the Dalai Lama. Blinken's meeting, seemingly goaded by India, touched a raw nerve with China.

But, what is of greater concern for India is the meeting of nine Taliban representatives with China's Foreign Minister Wang Yi in the northern Chinese city of Tianjin. It is reported that peace process and security issues figured in the discussion. China could extract a promise from the Taliban delegation, headed by Mullah Abdul Ghani Baradar, that they would crack down on the East Turkestan Islamic Movement posing a threat to China by allegedly helping the Uygur Moslems being subjugated by China. The Taliban are seeking international legitimacy of their forcible occupation of vast swathes of Afghanistan weakening the Afghan rule of Prime Minister Ashraf Ghani. Pakistan is their ally and now China is veering to its side with mediation by Pakistan. China also wants to protect its economic interest and expand its Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) and China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) into Afghanistan. This is bad news for India. A Taliban regime, supported by Pakistan and China, has potential to turn the Kashmir tangle even more problematic and it could go well beyond that



 \mathbf{W}^{e} 're used to bound books, in which a blank page is unusual enough that the reader may on occasion encounter the reassuring — albeit paradoxical — legend, "this page intentionally left blank". It was very different when texts were hand-written scrolls on papyrus or parchment. To write on both sides would result in handling rapidly wearing away the writing on the outer side. It was also awkward to read the reverse side and it was difficult to unroll a scroll and roll it up the other way, because, once rolled, they took on a permanent bend. As a result, scrolls written on both sides are rare enough that a special term has been created to describe them; opisthograph. It comes via French and Latin from Greek opistho, behind, plus graphos, written. Rather rarely, the word also refers to a memorial slab that has been reversed so that a new inscription can be made on the blank side. Bound books (the technical term for one is codex, to distinguish it from the scrolled sort) are for the most part opisthographic, a useful property that was a key reason why they superseded scrolls. But hand-written documents are still commonly anopisthographic, written on one side only.





BID TO ERASE BAPU'S LEGACY

VARIOUS REPORTS IN THE MEDIA SUGGEST THAT THE **GOVERNMENT IS IN A VERY ADVANCED STAGE OF PLANNING THE** 'TAKEOVER' AND **REVAMP OF THE SABARMATI ASHRAM**

√or the past two years, frequent reports in the press suggest that the government of India through the government of Gujarat is going to redevelop Sabarmati Ashram and build a 'Grand World Class' monument there. There are many, very loud rumours but there is very scant official information; it seems officially they prefer secrecy. During this time, whenever I have visited Sabarmati Ashram, I have met many of the long-term residents of the Ashram precinct. These are descendants of those who lived in the Ashram since Ba and Bapu first established it in 1917 - families who have continued to live there for over a hundred years.

When Bapu left on the Dandi March 12th March 1930, he vowed not to return to the Ashram till India won freedom and in 1933 he finally decided to disband it but was dissuaded from doing so. In the wake of the Dandi Kooch and the subsequent nation-wide Namak Satvagraha, the colonial regime unleashed a brutal reprisal to crush the non-violent revolt. Farmers and Satyagrahis bore the brunt of the tyrannical oppression. Their properties were seized by the State along with all their possessions and they were rendered destitute. This anguished Bapu and he decided that he would surrender Sabarmati Ashram to the colonial power as a mark of protest against the brutal methods employed by it. Since he was the instigator of the regime's 'troubles', he believed he must be punished. When Bapu's associates were informed about his decision there was much consternation and a lot of voices were raised against this. Eventually, Thakker Bappa, one of Bapu's very senior associates, convinced him not to take such a drastic step. Bapu relented, and handed over the Ashram to the Harijan Sevak Sangh. He instructed them to use the Ashram for the uplift and benefit of Harijans in perpetuity. As he bid farewell to his home of 13 years, he instructed Maganlal Gandhi, who was managing the Ashram, to ensure that all those who were occupying Ashram properties were allowed to do so, as long as they lived according to the ideals of the Ashram, which were practiced when Ba and



Bapu in his bequest clearly stated that the Sabarmati Ashram has to work for the uplift and benefit of Harijans. How will the proposed revamp achieve this?

Bapu lived in the Ashram. Ever since then, families and descendants of the residents have continued to live in these tenements, some for over a hundred years continuously. Now they are faced with the possibility of being evicted, uprooted, displaced.

So, for the past two years, whenever I visit the Ashram, the current occupants of these properties, who feel threatened by the government's proposal, meet me with a plea to safeguard their Ashram and of course, their residences. I have grown up knowing many of them as belonging to the extended Ashram family. The thought of them being displaced is disturbing,

and naturally they are anxious. Various reports in the media suggest that the government is in a very advanced stage of planning the 'takeover' and revamp of the Ashram. Stories have circulated about the architect being appointed and detailed plans of the redesign of the Ashram keep appearing in the media and are in circulation; many of the reports are conflicting. One says that the government possesses a photograph of the Ashram as it was in 1947 when India became Independent and it intends to restore the Ashram to that state. The sinister implication of this move is that even the acclaimed and award-winning Sanghrahalaya, designed and built by the eminent architect Charles Correa will also be removed. Why? Because it was commissioned and inaugurated by the then Prime Minister Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru? Another report claims that a 'grand', 'world class' tourist attraction is planned. Bapu in his bequest clearly stated that the Sabarmati Ashram has to work for the uplift and benefit of Harijans. How will the proposed revamp achieve this? There are Harijan families living in the Ashram precinct, they too face eviction because of the 'proposed' revamp. How does that benefit them? The colonial government forcefully seized homes of farmers and Satyagrahis causing much distress to Bapu. Why is an Indian government acting like the authoritarian and tyrannical colonial administration?

All this and much more about the plans and intentions of the government are unofficially known, but nothing has been officially said. One thing is certain that it is a 'PM's Project' and like all the other 'PM's Projects' it is going to be steam-rolled through, and shoved down our throats. His men in Gujarat are driving the bulldozer. The present residents have given me many details, but when I talk to the trustees of the several trusts associated with the Sabarmati Ashram, who are custodians and caretakers of the Ashram, they keep reiterating that they have no 'official' information or intimation from the government, even now. Tenants and residents say they have been approached, some say threatened, to accept compensation and move out amicably or face being evicted. Yet the trustees have no official intimation. The whole thing smells bad, rotten and reeks of hidden and ill

intentions. Otherwise, why this shroud of secrecy? What is the government hiding? This is the background of what is happening to the Sabarmati Ashram. Soon it may be irrevocably lost!

Bapu said, 'My life is my message,' that is his legacy. In today's times it is very difficult to imagine the simplicity, frugality and openness of that man. His was a truly transparent life, there was no public man and a hidden, private person. In present times it is difficult to imagine, let alone believe that such a person ever lived. Sabarmati Ashram and Sevagram Ashram at Wardha are the visual symbols of the man's simplicity, his frugal existence, his transparency. On visits to Sabarmati Ashram, at Hridaykunj, I have often heard children ask their parents, "Such a great man lived in such a small and simple hut? He sat and worked in such an open place." It is when they see Hridaykunj at Sabarmati Ashram and Bapu Kutir at Sevagram that Bapu becomes believable to the present generation. When these are lost, Bapu will become a myth. Mythology is so convenient to live with and tweak as required.

Sabarmati Ashram today en shrines the ideals of Bapu's life and legacy. It is sparse, it is simple and it is starkly frugal. Those who understand Bapu's ideals and life know that this is his true legacy and the Sabarmati Ashram por trays them truly. It is only those who have never understood Bapu and are not bothered about understanding him, let alone emulating him, who feel that it needs to be made 'grand'. Their intention is not to preserve or conserve the Ashram or make it more attractive; their intention is to obliterate it and the legacy it enshrines. To convert a shrine of our Independence movement and the life of the couple who lived there into a tourist plaza, an amusement park. That is their real intention. The question now is not about saving Sabarmati Ashram, it is about saving the legacy of Bapu and Ba.

Time to inoculate our children

TIMELY AVAILABILITY OF A VACCINE FOR CHILDREN IS THE ONLY WAY OUT OF THE PRESENT SITUATION

hile over 40 crore vaccine shots have been administered to adults in the country, inoculation drive for children against Covid-19 is yet to take off and is long due. The education sector has been hit badly by the pandemic with school children missing their physical classroom sessions for nearly one and a half years. Although some states are embarking on ambitious plans for reopening schools in a restricted manner, parents have expressed their concerns in sending their wards to schools.

Availability of a dependable vaccine for children will be a milestone achievement in bolstering the education sector in the country as this would not only ensure the safety of children, but also facilitate reopening of schools in a graded manner. This would also boost the confidence of parents in letting their wards to go to schools. It is widely speculated that the impact of a possible third wave on children due to the new variants is likely to be more severe compared with the first or the second wave. Hence, the timely availability of a vaccine for children is the only way out of the present situation.

Some western countries have gone ahead with their vaccination programme for children. The US Food and Drug Authority and Canada's drug regulatory authorities have recently given the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine emergency use authorisation for children. This vaccine requires two shots to be given 21 days apart. Similarly, the European Union's regulatory authority, the European Medicines Agency, has recommended authorising the Moderna vaccine for use in children aged between 12 and 17 and, according to research conducted on more than 3,700 children of 12 to 17 age group, the shots indeed produced substantial antibody response.

Russia, the manufacturer of Sputnik V vaccine, has also tested a nasal spray version suitable for children aged 8-12 and plans to launch the new product in September

In India, the situation is fast picking up momentum and the government plans to rope in indigenous manufacturers to ensure adequate and timely supply of quality vaccine to fulfill its dream of inoculating its younger citizens. In India, two vaccine candidates, in

particular, are in the race for completing the formalities for launching their shots for children. Ahmedabad-based Zydus Cadila,

which is developing a DNA plasmidbased vaccine, has already concluded its trial for the 12-18 age group, and subject to statutory provisions, the vaccine might be available soon in the near future. The company has already applied to the Drugs Controller General of India (DCGI) for emergency use authorisation for its vaccine ZyCoV-D, which it claims would be effective for both adults and children. The vaccine will be the first needlefree shot to be administered as an intra-dermal injection using a spring-powered jet injector. The efficacy of the vaccine is reported to be 66.6 per cent against the symptomatic and 100 per cent against the moderate or severe patients based on the interim analysis of its phase III trial data. The vaccine contains a DNA plasmid vector that carries the gene encoding the spike protein of the virus. As with other DNA vaccines, the recipient's cells then produce the spike protein, triggering an effective immunogenic response against the virus.

Hyderabad-based Bharat Biotech

is going through its clinical trial phases (phases II and III) for its nasal spray for children and the data for the results is likely to be available by September. Similarly, Pune-based Serum Institute of India is all set to start phase II and phase III paediatric trials of its Covovax in 920 children (460 each in 12-17 year and 2-11 year groups) from next month. The primary objective of the study is to assess the safety and immunogenicity of the vaccine among children. If everything goes well, a first-hand vaccine for children is expected by early October.

Going by the 80 per cent coverage strategy, the government would have to ensure supply of enough vaccines to cover its 104 million strong children population against the disease. The exercise would, therefore, require at least 208 million doses of a two-dose vaccine. Hence, it is going to be herculean task for the government to bring back the lost glory of children's education in the country.

Groundwater level depletes in Jaleswar and Basta blocks, leaving people high and dry in summer

Jaleswar, August 1: In summer, a large number of people in many pockets under Jaleswar and Basta blocks have to face acute shortage of drinking water. This happens as groundwater level plummets sharply, leaving scores of tube wells defunct. The reducing level of groundwater has become a cause of concern for people in this coastal

an initiative under which small ponds are being dug up at different places to conserve rainwater. Through this process, officials feel that the groundwater level will also be replenished.

A mega drinking water project had also been planned few years back, locals informed. However, the project has since then remained in the 'planning' stage with no development. They said that the state government talks about providing clean and hygienic drinking water. However, when it comes to delivering on its promise, there is sheer indifference. The failure to start the drinking water project in the two blocks is a proof of the government's apathy.

The cost of building the drinking water project would be around ₹400 crore. Once implemented it would provide water from the

It submitted a detailed project report (DPR) to the Odisha government five vears ago. The project aims at meeting the drinking water needs of 3.5 lakh people. It should be stated here that the majority of people living in 35 panchayats of Jaleswar block and 13 panchayats under Basta block have been facing acute drinking water crisis in summer

In the first phase, a Bangalorebased agency had prepared a DPR for provision of water for 30,000 people in 17 wards under Jaleswar municipality. The cost was estimated at ₹50 crore. The report suggested lifting water from Subarnarekha at Sasanabada and setting up of a treatment plant at Sitabaghipada. Two more treatment plants were proposed at Deuli and Nahanjara near the Jaleswar

Kendrapara, August 1: After remaining closed for a little over three months to facilitate the breeding of crocodiles, the Bhitarkanika National Park in Kendrapara district will reopen for visitors from August 5. The national park, under Rajnagar block had been kept out of bounds for visitors from May 1 till July 31 as it was the breeding season of the endangered estuarine crocodiles.

Since the lockdown May 5, the national park had remained out of bounds for tourists due to Covid curbs

During the mating season, crocodiles tend to become ferocious and attack at the slightest hint of provocation. So a three-month ban is imposed each year on the entry

of tourists into the park to ensure safety of all and at the same time. give a congenial environment to the

Four days after shutting the park's gate for tourists, the Odisha government had imposed lockdown May 5 in the state due to the second wave of Covid-19. Since then the park had remained out of bounds for visitors even though, officially the ban ended July 31. Due to the Covid-19 guidelines visitors were prevented from visiting the park for few more days.

Now, with lockdown restrictions slowly easing in the state, the authorities of the Bhitarkanika National Park have decided to open the gates once more for visitors. Officials announced Sunday that the park will again reopen from August 5. However, the visitors will be allowed to visit the park during the day only. No decision has been taken regarding overnight stay of tourists inside the park, even though the facilities are there, officials said.

No govt jobs, no passport clearance for stone-pelters

Srinagar, August 1: The CID wing of Jammu and Kashmir Police has ordered the denial of security clearance required for passport and other government services to all those involved in stone-pelting or subversive activities

In an order issued Saturday, the senior superintendent of police (SSP), CID, Special Branch (SB), Kashmir, has directed all the field units under it to ensure that the person's involvement in law and order, stone-pelting cases, and other crime prejudicial to the security of the state be specifically looked into during verification related to passport, service and any other verification related to government schemes.

"The same must be corroborated from the local police station records," the order read.

The SSP also said digital evidence like CCTV footage, photographs, videos and audio clips, quadcopter images available in the records of the police, security forces, and security agencies be also referred during the verification.

"Any subject found involved in any such cases must be denied the security clearance," the SSP, CID-



SB, Kashmir said.

Jammu and Kashmir BJP chief Ravinder Raina Sunday welcomed the Jammu and Kashmir administration's decision to deny security clearance for passports and other government services to all those involved in stone-pelting or subversive activities. Raina said it is a great step and would serve as a severe blow to those elements conspiring against the country and fleeing abroad to escape accountability.

"They use passports to flee the country and also get absorbed in

government jobs besides getting contracts of (developmental) projects. As per the new order, they will not get the security clearance which is a good step and will serve as a severe blow to such elements," Raina said.

He said the J&K home department, police and Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha are worthy of praise for coming out with such a "major decision" in the interest of the country amid a spurt in anti-terrorist operations that has led to the killing of a number of dreaded terrorists.

Jaipur, August 1: BJP MP Kirori Meena was detained Sunday after he unfurled a tribal flag on the wall of the Ambagarh Fort by hoodwinking the heavy police force deployed at the monument, a centre of dispute between the members of the Meena community and Hindutva organisations.

The white flag was unfurled at a parapet in the rear side of the fort, where the tribal leader along with around a dozen supporters reached after walking on the hilly terrain during rainfall in the early hours.

Tensions had escalated between the Meenas and Hindu organisations in June after a saffron flag atop the fort here was removed by a group of youths from the Meena community, allegedly led by independent MLA Ramkesh Meena. Cross FIRs were lodged at Jaipur's Transport Nagar police station

Police had tightened the security around the fort in view of an announcement by Kirori Meena that he would visit it August 1. Editor-in-chief of Sudarshan TV, Suresh Chavhanke, had also announced on social media that he will go to the fort to unfurl a saffron flag August 1.

While Ramkesh Meena had accused the RSS of trying to tamper with the tribal culture by placing

a saffron flag, BJP leader Kirori Meena had opposed him, saying Meenas are Hindu too. Kirori Meena had demanded action against Ramkesh Meena for trying to disturb harmony.

Reacting to Kirori Meena unfurling the flag, Ramkesh Meena said he has no objection as long as the tribal flag is unfurled and not the saffron one.

Soon after the BJP Rajya Sabha MP released videos and photos of unfurling of the flag, police rushed to the spot and took him away from the fort. "I, along with dozens of youths of the Meena community have entered the fort and unfurled the flag in Ambagarh," he said in a video message.

Kirori Meena tweeted that he was "arrested", but police denied

this. Police officials said they took the MP to Vidhyadhar Nagar police station here to hold talks with him and he raised certain demands, including permission to the tribal people for worshipping at a Shiv temple located inside the fort, which is under the forest de-

Jaipur Police Commissioner Anand Srivastava said Kirori Meena was not arrested but he was detained for entering into a prohibited forest area.

Additional Police Commissioner Rahul Prakash said the BJP leader did not enter the fort and reached only up to its rear wall.

'The MP was not arrested. Talks with him were held on the issue during which he has made certain demands," the officer said.

Rajasthan BJP president Satish Poonia and former chief minister Vasundhra Raje condemned the police action against Kirori

"He always strives for nationalist thought and social harmony and action taken against him shows the petty mentality of the Congress government," Poonia tweeted.

Schools, colleges offer fee discounts amid pandemic

Jaipur, August 1: At a time when parents and schools are at loggerheads over the fee issue in many parts of the country, a few institutions in Rajasthan are trying to make it a win-win situation for both the parents and themselves.

Working on a corporate methodology, they have offered discounts and other attractive offers to generate revenue for themselves and benefit parents.

DPS Jaipur had announced a 10 per cent fee waiver if the parents deposit the entire term fee by July 31 this year.

A circular sent to parents on behalf of Aditi Misra, School Director. and Rita Taneja, Principal, had said: "A 10 per cent concession in the school fees if the entire year's fee is paid for the academic session 2021-2022, latest by July 31, 2021. We wish to inform that parents willing to avail the concession can do so as the last date is nonextendable.'

Another private institution, Seedling School, is giving 10 per cent concession to parents on depositing the complete school fee for the 2020-21 session.

Vidhyashram has declared 10 per cent waiver on school fees for

the year 2021-22. Besides the schools, there are

private universities that are giving benefits to the parents during the ongoing pandemic.

One such university is JK Lakshmipat University which started giving admissions to undergraduate students on the basis of Class X results when Class XII results had not been declared.


They are giving 100 per cent undergraduate scholarship to students that covers academic and hostel fees based on Class X marks.

Their message says: "Don't let the financial constraints be a hurdle to your global education. JKLU encourages talent with 'Education at no cost' for deserving students. Also, meritorious students can avail a 15 per cent to 100 per cent fee waiver (academic and hostel fees) under UG scholarship in the first year of the programme.'

A parent, Pawan Kumar, whose son got 75 per cent fee waiver on admission, said: "This is a guiding light for other universities. My son scored 92 per cent in Class X and he got a 75 per cent fee waiver. Imagine how relieved a parent will feel if other universities too follow the same model.'

While these educational institutes are setting an example by caring for parents during the pandemic, there are other institutions that have hiked fees, creating challenges for parents.

Kashmir farmer's son secures second rank in IES examination

Srinagar, August 1: Tanveer Ahmad Khan, a farmer's son from Kulgam district of Jammu and Kashmir, has brought laurels to the Union Territory by securing the second rank in the prestigious Indian Economic Services (IES) examination conducted by the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC).

Hailing from the remote Nigeenpora Kund village -- about 80 kms from here -- in south Kashmir, Khan did primary schooling from Government Primary School, Kund, and later from Government High School Waltengoo, officials said

They said Khan passed Class 12 from Government Higher Secondary School, Razloo Kund and did Bachelor of Arts degree from Government Degree College Anantnag in 2016.

Khan has been a bright student from the very beginning, secured third rank in University of Kashmir entrance test and got himself admitted in the post-graduate course in economics at Kashmir University, the officials said.

Continuing with his brilliance, he achieved another feat by securing Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) during his last year of the post-graduate programme, they



Being a JRF Fellow, he went to Institute of Development Studies, Kolkatta, for Masters in Philosophy (M.Phil) in Development Studies, which was awarded to him in April 2021. A son of a farmer, who also used to go to Kolkata in winters to work as a seasonal rickshaw puller, Khan believes that hard work pays off when one is focused and nothing seems impossible.

During the Covid period, I confined myself to the four walls of my room and started preparing for IES examination while doing my M.Phil. I never let Covid impact my schedule of studies," Khan said.

Khan, who achieved the feat in his maiden attempt only, remarks that it was a hard struggle, but he never lost hope.

"I worked very hard and considered my first attempt as my last attempt and in the end I achieved this feat," he said.

While appreciating the government for initiating several educational reforms, he suggested there was a dire need to revamp the basic education system.

"Government has initiated various steps for educational reforms and we should also focus on other aspects like research centers in all colleges with full-fledged faculty and priority should also be given to other lesser opted subjects,' he said. 'Valley's youths visiting Pak on valid papers, infiltrating back as terrorists'

Srinagar, August 1: The recent killing of terrorist Shakir Altaf Bhat and subsequent finding that he had left the country on a valid passport for studies in Pakistan in 2018 and returned as a terrorist set alarm bells ringing in the security establishment in Jammu and Kashmir, officials said here

Sunday. Security agencies made a quick estimate of passports issued between 2015 and 2019, and found that out of the 40 youths who had gone to Bangladesh or Pakistan for studies, 28 had infiltrated back into the country as trained ter-

rorists, the officials said. This is in addition to over 100 Kashmiri youths who travelled to Pakistan on valid visas for short durations, and have either not come back or disappeared after their return in the last three years.

The security agencies fear that they could be possible sleeper cells of terror groups operating from across the border.

The July 24 encounter in the heights of Bandipora led to the killing of three terrorists, including Bhat, a resident of the same district.

Security agencies believe that

Bhat had targeted to assassinate

Usman Majid, a former militant-

turned-politician who has withstood at least three such bids in Between April 1 to 6 of last year,

some youths hailing from Shopian, Kulgam and Anantnag districts of south Kashmir were seen as part of the infiltrating groups of terrorists and all of them had travelled to Pakistan on valid documents and never returned thereafter, they said.

A massive exercise was undertaken by the security agencies along with the immigration officials at Wagah border as well as at the New Delhi airport during which it was found that at least 40 youths who had travelled to either Bangladesh or Pakistan for studies were missing with their families not knowing about their wards, they said. As a precautionary measure,

even the youths from the valley who travelled on valid visas for a duration of over seven days over the last three years were questioned, the officials said.

The figures have surprised the officials as in some of the cases it was found that the youths never returned and in others they disappeared after their return, raising suspicion that they could have become "sleeper cells", waiting for instructions from their masters in Pakistan's spy agency ISI or handlers in terror groups located across the border.

The youths who had travelled

to Pakistan even two years back have been called for questioning and a proper analysis of their activities after their return was being carried


out by the security agencies.

Those questioned by the security agencies were asked for a valid reason for their travel to Pakistan, the officials said, adding that the background of all these people was checked and verified thoroughly.

The Jammu and Kashmir police also issued a directive on Saturday asking its Special Branch, a unit mandated for verification, to "ensure that during verification related to passport and any other government scheme, the individual's involvement in law and order,

stone pelting is specifically checked. Also, the digital evidence like CCTV footage, photographs, videos and audios clips, quadcopter images available in the records of police stations should be referred to by the unit. Any subject found involved in any such cases must be denied any

security clearance, the order said. The officials believe that there is a six weeks' training course for new terror recruits and intelligence inputs suggest that some of the youths were provided a quick module of fabrication of improvised explosive devices using easily available material within a week's time, they said.

New Delhi, August 1: In a confidence-building measure, the Indian and the Chinese armies Sunday activated a new hotline in the North Sikkim sector to facilitate their local commanders to speak directly and address any issue or differences on the ground along the Line of Actual Control (LAC), officials said.

The establishment of the hotline between the Indian Army in Kongra La in North Sikkim and China's People's Liberation Army (PLA) at Khamba Dzong in the Tibetan Autonomous Region came a day after the two armies held a nine-hour meeting with a focus on the disengagement process in remaining friction points in eastern Ladakh.

The Indian Army said the hotline has been established to further the "spirit of trust and cordial relations along the borders". The setting up of the hotline coincided with PLA Day. It said the inauguration of the new hotline was attended by ground commanders of the two armies and a "message of friendship and harmony" was exchanged through it. "A hotline was established between Indian Army in Kongra La, North Sikkim and PLA at Khamba Dzong in Tibetan Autonomous Region to further the spirit of trust and cordial rela-

tions along the borders. The event

coincided with the PLA Day August 1," it said in a statement. The two sides have already have hotline facilities for ground commanders in eastern Ladakh and Arunachal Pradesh sectors. "The armed forces of the two countries have well-established mechanisms for communication at ground commanders level. These hotlines in various sectors go a long way in enhancing the same and maintaining peace and tranquillity at the borders," the Army said. "The inauguration was attended by ground commanders of the respective armies and a message of friendship and harmony was exchanged through the hotline," the Army said.

Officials said with the setting up of the hotline, the ground commanders will be able to speak directly and resolve any differences if they crop up.

3rd wave scare amid rising cases

As India grapples with the threat of third COVID-19 wave, AIIMS Chief Dr Randeep Guleria has warned about the rising 'R-Value'

New Delhi, August 1: India saw a single-day rise of 41,831 new Covid-19 cases, taking the tally to 3,16,55,824, while the cumulative vaccine doses administered in the country has crossed 47 crore, according to Union Health Ministry data updated Sunday.

The death toll climbed to 4,24,351with 541 daily fatalities. Registering an increase for the fifth consecutive cases, the active cases have climbed to 4,10,952 and comprises 1.30 per cent of the total infections, while the national Covid-19 recovery rate was recorded at 97.36 per cent, the data updated at 8 am showed.

An increase of 2,032 Covid cases has been recorded in the total number Covid-19 caseload in a span of 24 hours. Also, 17,89,472 tests were conducted on Saturday, taking the

cumulative tests conducted so far for detection of Covid-19 in the country to 46,82,16,510, while the daily positivity rate was recorded at 2.34 per cent

Weekly positivity rate was recorded at 2.42 per cent, according to the health ministry. The number of people who have recuperated from the disease surged to 3,08,20,521, while the case fatality rate stands at 1.34 per cent, the data stated. Cumulative vaccine doses administered so far has reached 47.02 crore under the nationwide vaccination drive. India's Covid-19 tally had crossed the 20lakh mark on August 7, 30 lakh on August 23, 40 lakh September 5 and 50 lakh September 16.

It went past 60 lakh September 28, 70 lakh October 11, crossed 80 lakh October 29, 90 lakh November 20 and surpassed the one-crore mark December 19.

 $India\,crossed\,the\,grim\,milestone$ of two crore May 4 and 3 crore June 23. The 541 new fatalities include 225 from Maharashtra and 80 from Kerala and 68 from Odisha.

A total of 4,24,351 deaths have been reported so far in the country, including 1,32,791 Maharashtra, 36,562 from Karnataka, 34,076 from Tamil Nadu, 25.053 from Delhi, 22.756 from Uttar Pradesh, 18,136 from West Bengal and 16,293 from Punjab. The health ministry stressed that more than 70 per cent of the deaths occurred due to comorbidities. "Our figures are being reconciled with the Indian Council of Medical Research," the ministry said

Bommai leaves for Delhi amid speculation

Over 24K kids died by suicide from 2017 to 2019: NCRB data

New Delhi, August 1: Over 24,000 children in the age bracket of 14-18 years committed suicide from 2017-19, with failure in examination being the reason in over 4.000 such cases. according to government data.

The consolidated data of the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) on children's suicide was recently presented in Parliament. According to the data, as many as 24,568 children, including 13,325 girls, aged 14-18 years, died by suicide between 2017-19.

In 2017, as many as 8,029 children in the age group of 14-18 years died by suicide. The number rose to 8,162 in 2018 and then further increased to 8,377 in 2019, it said. The highest number of deaths by sui-



cide among children in this age bracket was reported from Madhya Pradesh at 3,115 followed by West Bengal at 2,802, Maharashtra at 2,527 and Tamil Nadu at 2,035.

Failure in examination was given as the reason behind the suicide of 4,046 children, while marriage-related issue was the reason behind the suicide of 639 children, in-

cluding 411 girls, according to the data. About 3,315 children died by suicide for reasons related to love affair, while illness was given as reason behind the suicide of 2,567 children. Physical abuse was given as reason for 81 children's death.

Death of a dear person, drug abuse or alcohol addiction, illegitimate pregnancy, fall in social reputation, unemployment, poverty and ideological causes or hero worshipping were other reasons given for the death of these children by suicide. Raising alarm over the probability of worsening of situation due to Covid-19 pandemic, child rights activists stressed on inclusion of life skill training in school curriculum and making mental health part of mainstream healthcare and wellness agenda.

Hidden talent of Ashwini Vaishnaw

Many theories are doing the rounds as to why Prime Minister Narendra Modi developed a fancy for Ashwini Vaishnaw to the extent that he telephoned BJD chief and Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik to spare a Raiva Sabha seat for him. The BJD could have won all three RS seats but spared one for Vaishnaw in 2019. What was Modi's connection with Vaishnaw? One theory is that Vaishnaw gave vital tips to Modi when he was working in the PMO under Vajpayee as

deputy secretary in 2003. But insiders discount this theory saying Vaishnaw had no access to Vajpayee at any point of time or any such tip as he was quite below in the hierarchy. It is said that Modi was looking for a pool of bright boys like Vaishnaw who have multiple experiences. Vaishnaw's actual qualification was that he was also very close to Naveen Patnaik as well. In fact, Vaishnaw set up his units in Gujarat and Odisha. Secondly, PK Mishra helped Vaishnaw in setting them up. Modi found virtues in Vaishnaw and he worked as Modi's backroom boy in his 2014 War Room like many such high-skilled persons.

Modi-Pawar bonhomie

What is the secret behind Modi-Sharad Pawar bonhomie? Not many are aware that it goes back to the UPA era when Modi was facing the ire of Central agencies and Congress' 'hawks' were seeking Modi's custodial interrogation. Sharad Pawar is reported to have

opposed at the highest level in the government any such move on the ground that political battles be better fought in the electoral arena rather than through agencies. Modi did face CBI's grilling but the UPA did not go to the extent of arresting him. Modi also got one relief after the other from courts. This apart, the personal rapport also developed when Gujarat cadre IAS officer PK Mishra had been promoted to the rank of Secretary at the Centre but no Union minister was willing to take him in his ministry. It was at this juncture that Modi reported to have called up Pawar to help Mishra as he was holding many portfolios. Pawar got Mishra appointed as Agriculture Secretary under him in 2006. Since then, both have had a perfect bonhomie.

Clock ticks after 27 yrs

There is a long list of politicians, officers and journalists paying the price for being dirty with Modi during the Gujarat riots. The latest in the series is RB Sreekumar who was Additional DGP Gujarat Police and led a unit when riots broke out in Godhara. The CBI has re-opened a probe in falsely implicating ISRO scientist Nambi Narayanan and others way back in November 1994 in Kerala. Sreekumar was Deputy Director, Intelligence Bureau, Kerala then. It was on the basis of his 'top secret' report that the Kerala Police arrested Nambi, two Maldivian women and others in the infamous 'ISRO Spy Ring'. Nambi Narayanan was ISRO's rising star and working on critical cryogenic technology. Though CBI gave Nambi a clean chit in December 1994 itself and filed a closure report acquitting all, the Supreme Court upheld the closure report terming it malicious and based on 'notions of fancy.' Nambi was given a compensation of Rs 1.9 crore from various agencies including the Kerala government in 2018. But Sreekumar escaped any penalty and the case has now been reopened by the CBI after SC's special permission for Sreekumar for his dubious fake IB report which caused immense damage. The CBI

may not have re-opened Sreekumar's case 27 years later had he not committed the hara-kiri in Godhara. He ostensibly filed a false affidavit and statements before the Nanavati-Mehta Commission and JM Lyngdoh Committee about the dubious role of law and order authorities under Modi. The Supreme Court, however, found all such claims to be false. But the ghost of the ISRO case is now haunting Sreekumar as the CBI has got a mandate from the Supreme Court now.

Why crib now?

ave a look at who all have the legal right to snoop! The Intelligence Bureau, CBI, Enforcement Directorate. Directorate of Revenue Intelligence, Central Economic Intelligence Bureau, Narcotics Control Bureau, Income Tax. Customs, NIA, National Technical Research Organisation and many CPOs have the authority to tap into your computers, mobiles and other devices. With 36 states and UTs snooping, the number of agencies is touching 60. The bizarre


governments, be it Congress, BJP or Third Front parties, have been acquiring legal teeth to tap more and more people in the name of national interest, public order, tax evasion, etc. An old hand who spent his life in the IB said more than 1 Lakh telephones are under observation at a given time legally or illegally by these agencies. Nay Pyi Taw, August 1: Myanmar's junta chief said Sunday that elections would be held and a state of emergency lifted by August 2023, extending the military's initial timeline given when it deposed Aung San Suu Kyi six months ago.

The country has been in turmoil since the army ousted the civilian leader in February, launching a bloody crackdown on dissent that has killed more than 900 people according to a local monitoring group.

In a televised address junta leader Min Aung Hlaing said "we will accomplish the provisions of the state of emergency by August 2023. I pledge to hold multiparty elections without fail.

The army has justified its power grab by alleging massive fraud during 2020 elections won by Suu Kyi's National League for Democracy in a landslide, and has threatened to dissolve the party.

ASEAN foreign ministers are to meet Monday, when diplomats say they aim to finalise a special



envoy tasked with ending violence and promoting dialogue between the junta and its opponents.

Months of protests

Across Myanmar small groups of demonstrators marched Sunday, six months after soldiers launched their putsch with pre-dawn raids ending a decade-long experiment with democracy.

Protesters in the northern town of Kale held banners reading "strength for the revolution" while demonstrators let off flares at a march in the commercial capital

Yangon, Tens of thousands of civil servants and other workers have either been sacked for joining rallies or are still on strike in support of a nationwide civil disobedience campaign.

"In the six months since the coup, the people of Myanmar have demonstrated remarkable courage and conviction in the face of widespread violence," said the US embassy in Myanmar on its official Facebook page Sunday.

"The United States remains firmly committed to supporting the people of Myanmar in their aspirations for

Israel, Iran tensions enter stormy waters

While no one has claimed responsibility for the attack, Iran and its militia allies have used socalled "suicide" drones in attacks previously

Sunday, Khatibzadeh described

the allegation Iran carried out the attack as "baseless" during his last news conference.

"Such blame games are nothing new," Khatibzadeh said. Those who are responsible for this (attack) are the ones who made it possible for the Israeli regime to set its foot in this region.'

He added "This is not strange, the well-known anti-Iran lobby in the US uses any opportunity to make ... Accusations against the Islamic Republic of Iran. In Jerusalem, Bennett directly

blamed Iran for the attack at a weekly Cabinet meeting.



The RBI is scheduled to announce its bi-monthly monetary policy review August 6 at the end of the three-day meeting -- August 4-6 of the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC). The RBI Governor-headed six-member MPC decides on the key policy rates. The panel had left the rates unchanged last time citing concerns on inflation.

New Delhi, August 1: Notwithstanding economic disruptions caused by the pandemic. public sector banks (PSBs) have managed to raise a record ₹58,700 crore from markets in FY2020-21 through a mix of debt and equity to enhance capital base.

This included ₹4,500 crore raised by Mumbai-based Bank of Baroda from qualified institutional placement (QIP). Punjab National Bank mobilised ₹3,788 crore through share sale on private placement basis during the financial year ended March 31, 2021

At the same time, Bangalorebased Canara Bank raised ₹2,000 crore from QIP, as per data collated from regulatory filings.

Series of successful QIP reflect confidence of both domestic and global investors in PSBs and their potential, said a senior official of a public sector bank.

In addition, $12\,PSBs$ raised funds from Tier I and Tier II bonds taking the total fund mobilisation to ₹58,697 crore, highest amount garnered in any financial year

Various reforms undertaken by the government including recognition, resolution and recapitalisation resulted in progressive decline in non-performing assets (NPAs) and subsequent rise in profit.

Tokyo, August 1: A determined Indian men's hockey team advanced to the Olympic semifinals for the first time in 49 years, beating Great Britain 3-1 in the quarterfinals here Sunday. It is a triumph which leaves the side within touching distance of a medal that has proved elusive for over four decades.

The eight-time former Olympic champions scored three field goals through Dilpreet Singh (seventh minute), Gurjant Singh (16th) and Hardik Singh (57th) to seal the win. Great Britain's lone goal was scored by Sam Ward from a penalty corner in the 45th minute.

India will take on World Champions Belgium in the semifinals Tuesday. Belgium however has always proved to be a bogey team for India.

India's last of the eight Olympic gold medals came way back in the 1980 Moscow Games, However, there were no semifinals in that edition as only six teams participated in the event. The last time India featured in the semifinals of the Olympics was in 1972 Munich Games where thev lost 0-2 to arch rivals Pakistan.

Belgium defeated Spain 3-1 in another quarterfinal to seal their place in the last four round.

Great Britain enjoyed the early share of exchanges, earning their first penalty corner as early as the third minute but India defended well to keep the danger away.

The Indians got their footing into the match as

time went by and took the lead through Dilpreet, who beat Great Britain goalkeeper Oliver Pavne after being fed by Simranjeet Singh. It was Simranjeet who created the chance after he stole the ball from a rival defender: just outside the latter's circle.

The Indians didn't let their rivals settle down and doubled their lead seconds into the second quarter through Gurjant. It was Hardik who created the opportunity by intercepting a pass just outside the Great Britain 'D'. He then sent the ball to an unmarked Gurjant, who kept a calm head to put the ball into the net through the legs of Payne. In the 35th minute, Gurjant had another chance to extend the lead but his reverse hit from a tight angle was easily saved by Payne.

Thereafter, it was all Great Britain as they pressed numbers in front in search of goals.

Leading by two goals, the Indians dropped back and tried to defend the lead but the move proved costly as minutes from the end of the third quarter Great Britain secured four back-to-back penalty corners the last of which was put

into the back of the net by Ward. In the fourth quarter, Britain launched an all out attack for the equaliser. They earned three penalty corners, but Sreejesh saved all. India extended their lead against the run of play when Hardik scored with a rebound from a counter-attack. after his initial shot was

saved by Payne.

The best-ever show by the women's team at the Olympics came 41 years ago at Moscow when they finished fourth among six teams. However, then the hockey

event was played in the roundrobin format. There were no quarterfinals and semifinals like the present tournament.

In spite of the odds stacked heavily against the Indian side, coach Sjoerd Marijne said Sunday that the Australians will be under pressure. "The pressure will be on Australia as they are one of the highest-ranked teams in the competition. We will be able to play freely, which is very important for us. Our own focus is on approaching each game one at a time and to keep improving with every match. We will take the field tomorrow (Monday) and try to express ourselves there," Marijne pointed out.

The Rani Rampal-led side showed grit and determination to bounce back after three consecutive defeats. It is this determination which may test the Australians. However, the Indians will have to utilise the chances that come their way. And for that reason hat-trick woman Vandana Kataria will have to lead from the front.

Also the team have to utilise the penalty corners that come their way. In the five pool games, India have earned 33 penalty corners, but have converted only four. Star drag-flicker Gurjit Kaur will have to come to the party, if the Indians have the aspiration to beat

INDIAN BOXER BRAVES STITCHES TO FIGHT WORLD CHAMPION

Gutsy Satish effort ends in bloody loss

Tokyo, August 1: A bruised Satish Kumar (+91kg) put up a gutsy performance against reigning World Champion Bakhodir Jalolov but it was not enough to upstage the rampaging Uzbek as the Indian boxer made a quarterfinal exit from the Olympic Games here Sunday. Taking the ring with multiple stitches on his forehead and chin after sustaining cuts in the prequarters, Satish lost 0-5 but the scoreline was not reflective of his brave performance.

Satish sustained the cuts during his pre-quarterfinal showdown against Jamaica's Ricardo Brown.

The 32-year-old Army man stood his ground, occasionally managed to land a shot with his right hand but Jalolov dominated the proceedings all through, relying on his imposing demeanour and excellent counter-attacking game to sail through. Satish's forehead cut expectedly opened up during the third round but he fought through even with that.

Jalolov, a 27-year-old footballerturned-boxer, acknowledged his rival's bravery at the end of the bout after securing his maiden Olympic Games medal. He is also a three-time Asian champion, all those gold medals coming in succession to him since 2017.

Satish had earlier scripted history by just qualifying for the Games as he was the first super heavyweight from India to achieve the feat

With Satish's defeat, the Indian men's boxing campaign came to an end in the Games.

Initially, there were doubts whether Satish would compete with stitches all over. However, he had no doubts about entering the ring despite the handicap.

"My chin has seven stitches and my forehead has another six. I knew I wanted to fight. Otherwise I would have lived with that regret of what if. Now I can be at peace and also probably a little content with myself that I gave my best," Satish said after the bout.

"My wife had told me not to fight. My father also said that it is too much to watch me fight like this. That's not unexpected, family can't see you hurt. But then they understood that I wanted to do this at any cost for my satisfaction," said the father of two school-going children.

Swimming's golden stars

Tokyo: Securing his place as one of the biggest stars of the Olympics here, swimmer Caeleb Dressel won his fourth gold medal with a victory in the 50-metre freestyle here Sunday with an Olympic record time of 21.07 seconds. An hour later, Dressel helped the United States break their own world record to win the last swimming gold from the men's 4x100m medley relay. However, Emma McKeon left quite a mark too in the pool with seven medals, the most by any woman in a single Olympics. A few minutes after Dressel climbed from the pool, McKeon completed her own

freestyle sweep. She touched in 23.81s to take the women's 50 freestyle, adding to her victory in the 100. Then McKeon entered truly rarified territory in the women's 4x100 medlev relav leading the Australians to a victory over the two-time defending champion Americans. It was her fourth gold of the Games in addition to the three bronze medals she had earlier won.

Biles opts out again

Tokyo: Simone Biles will not defend her Olympic gold medal on floor exercise. USA Gymnastics announced Sunday that the sixtime Olympic medallist has opted not to compete on floor, where

she won gold in Rio de Janeiro and was placed second in qualifying last week. Jennifer Gadirova of Britain will replace Biles in the finals, which are scheduled for Monday. Biles is dealing with a mental block that in gymnastics is referred to as 'the twisties'. In other words, Biles is having trouble figuring out where her body is in relation to the ground when in air. Biles has been dominant on floor exercise during her elite career, winning five World Championships along with her triumph in Rio.

Zverev takes gold Tokyo: Alexander Zverev followed

up his comeback win over Novak Djokovic by winning the men's singles gold here Sunday at the Olympics. The fifth-ranked German overwhelmed Russian opponent Karan Khachanov 6-3, 6 1 for the biggest title of his career. Zverey's previous best performance was reaching the final of last year's US Open. The women's singles gold went to Switzerland's Belinda Bencic who beat Marketa Vondrousova of the Czech Republic 7-5, 2-6, 6-3 and then dedicated her victory to Roger Federer.
