TN LS seats cut after population control



CHENNAI: Tamil Nadu has faced "unfair" political representation in the Lok Sabha since 1962 after the state managed to successfully bring down its population, the Madras High Court said recently. In its order passed August 17, the court asked the Centre to see if the Lok Sabha representation of Tamil Nadu and Andhra Pradesh - the other state that has seen a drop in representation in the Parliament - be restored, or to see if the two can be compensated monetarily. The court pegged the monetary compensation to Tamil Nadu at ₹5,600 crore.



FM to launch NM Pipeline today

NEW DELHI: Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman Monday will launch the National Monetisation pipeline (NMP), which will list out the government's infrastructure assets to be sold over the next four years, according to the Finance Ministry. "The NMP comprises a four-year pipeline of the Central government's brownfield infrastructure assets. Besides providing visibility to investors, NMP will also serve as a medium-term roadmap for the asset monetisation initiative of the government," the Finance Ministry said in a statement Sunday.

Srimandir to reopen doors for public today

Puri, August 22: After remaining out of bounds for over four months for devotees, the Srimandir is all set to reopen for the public Monday.

Considering people's safety as its top priority amid the pandemic, the Shree Jagannath Temple Administration (SJTA) has carried out thorough sanitisation in and around the temple.

In a tweet Sunday, SJTA wrote about the steps taken ahead of welcoming devotees.

"In view of reopening of Shreemandira for the public tomorrow and prioritising safety during the COVID-19 pandemic, as per the protocol, necessary arrangements are made by SJTA, Puri, for

complete sanitisation of Shreemandira (sic)," read the tweet. Notably, in view of rising Covid-19 cases during the second wave, the temple was closed from April 24. It reopened August 12, but all devo-

tees were not allowed inside. Like last year, family members of the servitors had darshan of the deities following Covid-19 guidelines. They visited the temple August 12 and 13 from Mangal Alati till Rati Pahuda.

After the weekend shutdown, Puri town residents visited the

temple from August 16 to 20. On August 21 and 22, the temple was closed due to weekend shutdown. During these two days, the SJTA carried out necessary steps to sanitise the temple premises.

Bhubaneswar; August 22: Farmers in 20 of the 30 districts of the state are staring at a drought-like situation and they are yet to commence agricultural activities owing to scant rainfall this monsoon.

Till August 14. the state has received an average rainfall of 51 mm compared to the normal 150 mm -the deficit being 66 per cent. What may aggravate the situation is that the metrological office has predicted rainfall in the range of only 30 mm to 40 mm till August 30. As a result, the soil moisture is likely mildly dry category.

According to a senior official of the state Agriculture Extension Service department, who spoke on the condition of anonymity, "Good rainfall is crucial in August as it facilitates sowing activities. The crops reach the flowering stage in mid-September: Any rise in aridity during this period will be detrimental for the crops. Moreover, if the aridity extends up to mid-September, farmers will stare at crop loss." In fact, no district in the state comes under the wet category. As per the estimation of the Standardised

Precipitation Index (SPI), Keonihar, Jajpur and Bhadrak are extremely dry districts, while Sambalpur, Balangir, Angul and Gajapati are known to be severely dry. On the other hand, Ganjam, Kandhamal, Nabarangpur, Kalahandi and Subarnapur districts fall under the moderately dry districts. The remaining districts come under the

A report of the Pune-based Indian Metrological Department (TMD) said all the districts in Odisha recorded negative SPI values during the period from June 1 to August 21. This reveals a dip in soil moisture, in addition to very scanty rainfall. So it is not surprising that transplanting as well as broadcasting of paddy in rain-deficit areas have been held up due to water scarcity. At the same time, the crop condition is getting worse due to growth of weed. "If the condition persists for a few more days,

it would be difficult to save the crops," said a senior officer of the state Agriculture and Farmer Welfare department.

As the state is witnessing a drought-like situation, the government last Tuesday directed the Agriculture department to prepare a contingency plan to save the Kharif crops from the nature's wrath.

Ågriculture Minister Arun Kumar Sahoo and Cooperation Minister Ranandra Pratap Swain reviewed the crop situation in the state at a highlevel meeting. The Water Resources department has been asked to release water from all reservoirs. The Lift Irrigation Corporation has been directed to operationalise all lift points in areas facing acute shortage of water. The district Collectors too have been directed to take stock of the situation and prepare advance plans for Rabi crops, especially in areas where it may be difficult to save (More P3) the Kharif crops.

Kabul, August 22: A panicked rush of people trying to enter Kabul's international airport killed seven Afghan civilians in the crowds, the British military said Sunday, showing the danger still posed to those trying to flee the Taliban's takeover of the country

The deaths come as a new, perceived threat from the Islamic State group affiliate in Afghanistan has seen US military planes do rapid, diving combat landings at the airport surrounded by Taliban fighters. Other aircraft have shot off flares on takeoff, an effort to confuse possible heat-seeking missiles targeting the planes.

The changes come as the US Embassy issued a new security warning Saturday telling citizens not to travel to the Kabul airport without individual instruction from a US government representative. Officials declined to provide more specifics about the IS threat but described it as significant. They said there have been no confirmed attacks as yet by the militants, who have battled the Taliban in the past.

On Sunday, the British military acknowledged the seven deaths of civilians in the crowds in Kabul.

On Saturday, British and Western troops in full combat gear tried to control the crowds pressing in. They carried away some who were sweating and pale. With temperatures reaching 34°C (93°F), the soldiers sprayed water from a hose on those gathered or gave them bottled water to pour over their heads.

"Listen sir, you need to calm down," one soldier told a man lying in the dirt, as another gave him an orange liquid. "Calm down."

It wasn't immediately clear whether those killed had been physically crushed, suffocated or suffered a fatal heart attack in the crowds. Soldiers covered several corpses in white clothes to hide them from view.

Meanwhile, Amir Khan Motaqi, chief of the Taliban's guidance council, criticised America over the situation at the airport in an audio clip posted online Sunday. He described the US' actions as

"tyranny" – even as it is Taliban fighters who have beaten and shot at those trying to access the airport over the last week.

"All Afghanistan is secure, but the airport which is managed by the Americans has anarchy," he said.

Similarly, in Mumbai and Kolkata, the fuel was sold for ₹107.66 and ₹101.93 per litre, against the previous levels of ₹107.83 and ₹102.08 per litre respectively.



In Chennai, petrol price was cut to ₹99.32, down from ₹99.47 a litre. In the Tamil Nadu capital, petrol prices fell by almost ₹3 per litre August 14 after the state government cut VAT on the fuel.

Diesel prices also declined across the four metros Sunday. Price of the fuel in Delhi was lowered by 20 paise to ₹89.07 per litre from the previous level.

Similarly, diesel prices in Mumbai, Chennai and Kolkata were cut to ₹96.64, ₹93.66 and ₹92.13 per litre, respectively.

This cut in fuel prices comes amid declining global crude oil prices. The October contract of Brent crude oil on the Intercontinental Exchange (ICE) was trading at \$65.18.

The pump prices of auto fuels were static since July 18.

The long price pause for auto fuels came after fuel prices increased for 41 days in the current financial year. The 41 increasestook up petrol prices by ₹11.44 per litre in Delhi.

Drinking water management in Odisha dismal: Niti Aayog

Despite tall claims of providing 24X7 tap water in Puri, the state's performance in groundwater management & drinking water supply are deplorable

Bhubaneswar, August 22: Notwithstanding the tall claims made by the Odisha government providing round-the-clock tap water to residents of Puri city, the ground realities in the state and its track record on restoration of ground-

water to drinking water supply has come under scrutiny.

In its last Water Composite Management Index, the NITI Aayog, the Central government's think tank, had mentioned about the poor management of the water in the state and termed it a "worst performer" among the 17 non-Himalayan states.

The index was developed by the Aayog involving multiple stakeholders, both national and state, as well as a data validation process that took into account the Central and state government data on the performance of the state on water issues

The Aayog attributed Odisha's

dismal performance to its failure in implementing and operating the irrigation projects, while missing its canal lining targets. It also blamed the state for limited improvement in the quality of rural water supply.

Besides the poor indicators highlighted by the Aayog, several others related to groundwater contamination, drinking water facil ities and others hinted towards the state's failure in providing equitable water justice.

According to the data made available by the Ministry of Jal Shakti till July 26, 2021, which was tabled in the Lok Sabha recently, Odisha

is home to 3,465 habitations where the drinking water sources are affected by chemical contaminants like fluoride, arsenic, iron, salinity, nitrarte and heavy metals. It also revealed that after Assam, Bihar and

Rajasthan, Odisha is the fourth state in India with the level of contaminated drinking water.

This comes after several crores were allocated to the state by the Union government to ensure safe drinking water to the people under several schemes. In 2021-22 the state was allocated ₹3,323.42 crore under the Jal Jeevan Mission alone. In addition, the urban-rural divide vis-à-vis tap water supply is also evident in the state, as in rural Odisha 68.40 per cent of the population do not receive tap water supply. Bhubaneswar, August 22: The officials of Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation (BMC) along with the police personnel Sunday sealed two bars in the Cuttack Road area of the city here for violating Covid guidelines. Laxmisagar police had conducted

raids on the two bars on a tip-off

Saturday evening. The two bars were running their business during the weekend shutdown, BMC sources said.

The police arrested 13 persons, including three women, from Pentagon Bar at Laxmisagar for their involvement in gambling activities. They had also seized Rs 2, 56,000 in cash and other incriminating items from the gam-

bling den. Police sources revealed that the woman employees of the bar used to serve liquor and card tokens to the gamblers.

Similarly, the police carried out a raid on another bar in the locality for serving liquor to customers during the weekend shutdown.

A senior police official informed the media that the bars were sealed for violating the Covid guidelines and hosting illegal activities like

gambling. According to sources, the Commissionerate Police and the civic authorities had sealed four bars in the city for violating the Covid guidelines in December last vear.

Bhubaneswar; August 22: Odisha's Covid-19 caseload Sunday rose to 10,00,937 as 853 more people, including 100 children, tested positive for the infection, a Health department official said.

Sixty-nine fresh fatalities raised the coronavirus death toll to 7,358, said the official.

At least 100 children are among the new patients, and the infection rate among people below 18 years of age remained around 12 per cent, the official pointed out.

The new cases were detected from 67,834 sample tests conducted Saturday, and the daily positivity rate was at 1.26 per cent.

Of the fresh cases, 496 were reported from quarantine centres and 357 detected during contact tracing.

Khurda district, which comprises the state Capital Bhubaneswar, recorded the highest number of fresh cases at 286, followed by Cuttack at 140.

Boudh, Nabarangpur and Nuapada did not report any fresh Covid-19 case Saturday, while the new patients were detected in the remaining 27 districts of the state.

Of the fresh fatalities, 13 each were reported from Cuttack and Jagatsinghpur, 11 from Dhenkanal,

3 dead, 2 critical in road mishap

Malkangiri, August 22: Three persons died and two others were injured critically when a tractor had a head-on collision with a truck near MV-16 village under Model police station in Malkangiri, Sunday. According to reports, a tractor loaded with stone chips was on its way from Kalimela to Malkangiri last night. On the way, one of its tyres got flattened. Hence, the tractor was parked on roadside. A truck coming from Andhra Pradesh hit the tractor. There were five labourers sitting on it. One of them died on the spot while four were critically injured. The injured were immediately rushed to the DHH. As their conditions worsened, two were shifted to Koraput. However, on the way, another died while the third labourer died on reaching the hospital.

'People with low immunity prone to invasive fungal infections'

Dr Vinaykumar Hallur, a mycologist from the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), Bhubaneswar, along with his team, is credited to have discovered a new species of fungus, Cunninghamella arunalokei, responsible for mucormycosis in a healthy human being. In an interview with Manish Kumar of **Orissa POST**, *Dr* Hallur speaks on his latest discovery. Excerpts:

Why is your discovery Many people often describe a rare phenomenon?

- It could be termed as rare because usually invasive fungal diseases like mucormycosis mainly infect people with low immunity like those patients with uncontrolled diabetes, those who recently underwent organ transplant, and cancer patients taking anti-cancer drugs. But we found a rare case where a healthy human being infected with was Cunninghamella (a variety of fungus). Minute microscopic studies revealed that it was an entirely new species. Moreover, there were only three cases where Cunninghamella was found in healthy persons, and ours was the fourth such case.
- What happened to the patient infected with the new fungus?

mucormycosis as black fungus. There were also talks of white fungus, yellow fungus. Does medical science agree with this classification?

This is not acceptable to the scientific community and medical science. It was used by the media just for the sake of simplification which is far from reality. Usage of such terms leads to unnecessary confusion as another group of fungi unrelated to mucormycosis was called black fungus before the Covid-19 pandemic. Mucormycosis should be called by its name and not by any misleading terms.

How many mucormycosis cases were reported prior to the Covid-19 pandemic?

The number was very less. At AIIMS-Bhubaneswar, we had seen only five such cases before the Covid-19 pandemic. But we have seen around 70 mucormycosis cases during the second wave of the pandemic since May this year. One prime reason for the low detection of such cases earlier was the lack of awareness of the disease even among the medical fraternity.

- What are the survival chances of mucormycosis patients?
- Mucormycosis is a medical emergency. It spreads very fast within hours and lack of timely treatment increases the chances of fatality manifold. Studies have claimed that the survival chances are around 40 to 60 per cent if the patient is provided with the best medical attention and the disease is confined to sinuses. If the infection goes into the brain, the chances of death are 80 per cent even with the best medical attention.
- What are the major challenges in India on fungal research?
- Globally, there are very few researchers who work on fungal infection whereas the health issues arising from this are quite high in numbers. There are now an increasing number of recurrent ringworm infections among Indians, drug resistance among few species of fungi and many other cases that need more research and attention. Due to a lack of awareness among policymakers, there is also less funding in areas of fungal infections, leading to a vicious cycle of neglect with regard to fungal diseases

False cases against agitators alleged

Aul, August 22: Reports on registration of false cases against protesters of the mega drinking water project on the Kharasrota river has sparked sharp resentment among the residents and in various quarters, a report said.

The residents under the banner of 'Kharasrota Nadi Banchao Sangram Samiti' have been op posing the construction of the mega drinking water project at Barunadiha on the river. At the behest of the ruling party, Rajkanika police is implicating the office bearers of the outfit and other protesters in false cases which is the most agonising way of

police harassment. Police have produced the arrested persons in court by obtaining false medical report from the doctors without conducting actual medical examinations. This was stated by Debendra Sharma, a former MLA and advisor of the outfit while addressing a press con-

ference here, Sunday He demanded the Chief Minister and the DGP to intervene and take action on the unlawful activities of Raikanika police.

Sharma alleged that this is being



done to instill fear in the minds of the protesters when they were carrying out an agitation, which was by and large peaceful. Speaking to mediapersons, he said that thousands of men and women were participating in a peaceful road blockade opposing the project August 12, when police suddenly misbehaved with the women and

lathi charged them. This angered the protesters. Subsequently, they broke the prohibitory order under Section-144 and marched towards the project site. Meanwhile, some anti-socials owing allegiance to the ruling party ransacked the project site to heap the blame on the protesters.

Sharma alleged that the whole

scene was unfolding in the presence of police but the latter deliberately acted late and did not take any action against the persons involved in the violence. Later, police implicated the innocent protesters

in false cases. One of the cases (284/21) was registered over a complaint by the Rajkanika police IIC while another case (285/21) was registered over a complaint lodged by the consultancy agency involved in construction of the project. The names of the accused are mostly same in both the cases while the two cases are contrasting in nature.

In the case lodged by Rajkanika police IIC, it has been alleged that the protestors destroyed the properties of the consultancy agency by violating the prohibitory order and breaking the barricade at 12.15noon. In the second case lodged by the consultancy agency, it was alleged that the agitators accompanied by their leaders destroyed its properties at 12.05noon.

Sharma alleged that the timing is different in both the cases. He questioned if the agitators had been participating in road blockade till 12.15noon, then how they could have destroyed the properties of the consultancy agency at 12.05noon. He alleged that the complaint had been pre-conceived and prepared in advance to implicate the agitators in false cases.

He alleged that even people who were bedridden at home after having heart surgery had been arrested. He himself and former MLA Dolagobind Nayak and other office bearers of their outfit have been implicated in false cases. Among others, Rajkanika block Congress president Manguli Behera, former president Baburam Jena, Aul block Congress president Rabi Narayan Behera, Kendrapara district Youth Congress president Satyapriya Samal and a host of other Congress leaders attended the press conference.

Drought looming large over Padmapur farmers

Bargarh, August 22: Farmers in most parts of this district have completed paddy transplantation and other related works. but farmlands are now dry owing to scanty rainfall in July and August. Farmers say, the post-transplantation activities in the farmlands have been affected by the dry spell. Given such conditions, the farmers of Padmapur subdivision fear possible footfall of drought in their region. Their hopes of har-

vest have been spoilt this kharif season. According to reports, the amount of

rainfall in June was 205.6mm. But farming activities in June could not progress due to some problems, it was said. However, the amount of rainfall sharply

came down in July. In August, rainfall was miserably low, leading to possibility of drought. Farmers in these areas expressed concern over the scanty rainfall that has badly affected farming activities.

We apprehend a probable drought with the monsoon almost doing a vanishing act. Telltale signs of drought are found at several places. Farmlands have been left dry for want of rain," farmers said.

"Paddy saplings have started wilting in the dry farmlands. The situation is worse in unirrigated areas. Here, paddy cultivation solely depends on rains," some farmers lamented. Deficit rainfall has badly affected paddy cultivation. In the current scenario, saving the paddy plants is too difficult, they rued.

District agriculture officer Santosh Kumar Moharana said that rainfall has reduced a lot and the situation in Padmapur is not encouraging.

Illegal sawmill raided; logs, machinery seized

Policing Marriage

The Gujarat High Court's interim order staying certain sections of the controversial Gujarat Freedom of Religion (Amendment) Act, 2021, dubbed the 'love jihad law', is expected to calm passions being worked up in several other BJP-ruled states.

Legal experts opine that for the state to interfere with a citizen's personal freedom to choose one's life partner through interfaith marriage is draconian and undemocratic. This interim order puts a question mark on the constitutionality of not just the Gujarat law but also similar legislation in Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh and Himachal Pradesh.

The amendment to the original law enacted in 2003 to prevent forcible conversion has seemingly insidious intentions as it has incorporated interfaith marriage as a means of forcible conversion.

Quite pertinently has the Bench of Chief Justice Vikram Nath and Justice Biren Vaishnav ruled the law "interferes with the intricacies of marriage including the right to choice of an individual." The court stayed some sections of the Act and said these provisions will not be applicable to inter-faith marriages till there is something to show there is force, allurement or fraud involved. The Bench's most crucial observation is that the law puts consenting parties entering validly into inter-faith marriage "in great jeopardy." The ambit of the amended law is such that individuals choosing their life-partners, professing different religions, through marriage on their own volition, can be targeted by too many persons who have no business to decide on the conjugal life of two adults who take a solemn vow to live together.

Section 6A of the 2003 Act places the burden of proof on the parties entering into an inter-faith marriage to prove that the marriage was not solemnised on account of any fraud, allurement or coercion. The court questioned concerns about how a common man may determine every instance of inter-faith marriage as prohibited. The Amending Act of 2021, which was brought into force through a notification June 6, presupposes a marriage itself to be a tool for unlawful conversion being effected by way of allurement, force or other fraudulent means. A plain reading of Section 3 indicates that any conversion on account of marriage is to be banned. This is considered a gross infringement of Article 21 of the Constitution of India.

The HC's ruling that pending further hearing the rigors of Sections 3, 4, 4A to 4C, 5, 6 and 6A shall not operate merely because a marriage is solemnised by a person of one religion with a person of another religion without force or by allurement or by fraudulent means. This is in consonance with the freedom granted by the Constitution to live one's personal life according to one's own choice.

Moreover, the amended law seeks to circumvent the legal challenge to the charge of conversion through marriage from the consenting individuals by making them irrelevant in framing a case. It has added more categories to the list of persons who can complain about instances of "forced conversion" under Section 3A. The "aggrieved person" as per the Section could be parents, brother, sister, or any other person related by blood, marriage, adoption. Any one of them is accorded the right to file FIR with the police making a mockery of the personal freedom of two consenting individuals tying the nuptial knot. This, in effect, legitimises mob interference in an individual's private life. By shifting the burden of proof on the individual accused of forcibly converting another person, the law gives sanctity to communal prejudice and paranoia backed by state power. This may be considered as harassment as has already been seen in UP where some such individuals had to flee their homes in order to avoid arrest. In the case of a couple in Pune, their parents, who readily accepted their marriage, were so much intimidated by one community that they had to cancel the reception in a hotel for which invitations had been sent to friends and relatives. It was only after a state minister threw his weight behind the two families that the celebration could later take place.

Intriguingly, the added sections slap a jail term for three to five years and fine of up to ₹2 lakh. They enjoin on individuals to seek permission from the district administration for the marriage. There are penal provisions also for institutions and priests effecting the marriage.

The opinion of legal experts could seem acceptable that this legislative exercise is a comprehensive and well organised attempt by the state to bring religious intolerance into play in the personal affairs of individuals. Also that this goes against the fabric and ethos of the country's secular and democratic structure. The Gujarat HC order, even though interim, should make the state give fresh thoughts to this ill-conceived design.

It is more important to make a new beginning and allow citizens to live happily and peacefully if the economic growth dreams of every Indian are

mperialism, which finally died in Afghanistan last week, had actually begun to hiccup in the mid 70s. Of this hiccupping, Vietnam was the most serious convulsion. In the wake of decolonisation such eruptions had become commonplace, in Africa for instance, where the withdrawal of Portugal led to the direct ascent to power by Communist parties in Angola and Mozambique. Then Mengistu appeared in Ethiopia; a little later Daniel Ortega in Nicaragua. Such an outcome had to be forestalled in Iran, South Asia region.

Ironically the Saur revolution, or the April coup of 1978 brought Afghan Communists, Khalq and Parcham, to power. This epochmaking event was a consequence of a botched-up adventure instigated by US intelligence. The Shah of Iran's notorious Savak took the operational lead. I was in Kabul for the first press conference by Noor Mohammad Taraki, the Communist Prime Minister.

Jimmy Carter's National Security Adviser, Zbigniew Brzezinski, was embarked on securing a global order in which 'regional influentials' would play a key role. The Shah, arch regional power in Brzezinski's book, allowed Savak to clean up the stables in nearby Kabul where Mohammad Daud, a Marxist 'numa' (look-alike) was leaning excessively on Moscow.

Diehard Communists around Daud had to be eliminated. As happens in many intelligence operations, the plot hatched by Savak was leaked. Mir Akbar Khyber, a Communist trade union leader, was inadvertently killed, alerting the Communists across the country of the Savak plan.

In a pre-emptive move, military officers Aslam Watanjar and Abdul Qadir Dagarwal mobilised armoured carriers, drove into the Presidential Palace, killed Daud and his relatives. Communist took power.

Kabul under the Communists paved the way for the Soviets into the country. Once again, Brzezinski was in action. Peering into Afghanistan from the automatic 'frontline state', Pakistan, he began to think tactically towards a strategic end.

The US, Saudi Arabia and f Pakistan got into a huddle for their own purposes. The US would provide military training and hardware to drive the Soviets out of Afghanistan. Saudis and the Pak establishment wanted this outcome too, but the two had key agendas of their own. Saudis would spend billions in the project to manufacture a kind of Arabized Islam to undermine the Shia Ayatollahs in Iran who had come to power just the previous year. It suited President Zia ul Haq of

Pakistan. He was able to embark on his Nizam-e-Mustafa, or government based on Islamic laws. This would Arabise the country's Islam and wrench it away from the 'mumbojumbo' of secularism and composite culture being promoted in India. Had he lived, the social evolution of India would have pleased him.

Hundreds of madrassas or seminaries came up on the Pakistan side of the border, hatcheries to breed the Mujahideen who eventually helped drive the Soviets out in 1989. True, a year later the Soviet Union fell but the departing Americans left behind unemployed Islamic militants who farmed out

for work in Kashmir, Egypt, Algeria. The spiritual heirs in the diaspora of this brand of militancy were utilised most recently in the Syrian carnage.

All of this, in every detail, was lucidly exposed at a Congressional hearing by Hillary Clinton. Her statement is still available on YouTube. Some years ago, Russian Deputy Foreign Minister Morgulov Igor Vladimirovich told a high powered Raisina Dialogue that Islamic militants from Syria were being airlifted to Northern Afghanistan. The following week, Iran's supreme leader Ayatollah Khamenei repeated the allegation at a sermon following Friday prayers in Tehran. Is it true? Or has the narrative changed in the last few years?

In 1996, the Taliban, a progeny of the Mujahideen, fired by the kind of Islam instilled into them in the madrassas, were once again boosted by the Americans. Others, including the section of South Block which had joined the US camp after the collapse of the Soviet Union in 1991, acquiesced in the Taliban's surge. The lemon sold to everybody was: Taliban will control Afghanistan and the US will control the Taliban. This co-ordination will facilitate UNOCAL's TAPI (Turkmenistan-Afghanistan-Pakistan-India) gas pipeline. After UNOCAL was sold to Chevron in 2005, the US found other reasons to stay on: Pakistan next door was too nuclear to be ignored; Uyghurs in Xinxiang and Muslim populations in the Caucasus looked like low hanging fruit, accessible from Afghan real estate. Priceless poppy in Helmand?

Founder of Al Qaeda, Osama bin Laden had made Afghanistan his headquarters since 1980 with a singular mission: to help the Taliban see the backs of the Soviets. Their occupation of a Muslim country was an insult to Islam. Once the Soviets had been driven out, bin Laden set his sights on foreign soldiers and oil companies in his homeland He raised his banner of revolt against Riyadh, soon after Juhayman al-Otaybi and his al-Ikhwan group (an extremist cousin of Muslim Brotherhood) shook the Kingdom by occupying the mosque of Mecca for 20 days. The Saudi Royal family's strong links with the Bush family was the backdrop for the clash of civilisations as soon as George W Bush entered the White House in January 2001. Eight months later 9/11 happened. Egged on by the neocons, the US occupied Afghanistan.

It is being made out that this is the first time that soldiers trained by the Americans waged no battle against the Taliban. What happened in Vietnam? Google C-Span and see Gen. Lloyd Austin, now Defence Secretary, being grilled by the Senate Armed Services Select Committee on a \$500 million project to train Syrian militants. "How many of our trainees are fighting?"

Huge pause. Austin: "Four or five."

Media neo-cons will not give up. In a satirical piece Thomas Friedman of the New York Times expects the Taliban "the morning after the morning after" to turn up at the White House, turbans in hand. Please sir, take over our country once again.

n his parish newsletter, the Reverend David Leaver, curate at the parish church at Wilmslow in Cheshire, accused local people of being more interested in worldly goods and status than in the care of their souls. He said Wilmslow people were "as pagan as any group of people I have ever met." In every sense, pagan is a fighting word. To search out its origins we have to delve into Roman military slang. In Latin, one meaning of the word pagus was that of a country district or a rural area. From this came paganus, a country dweller or villager, the opposite of urbanus, someone who lived in a town. Then as now, many townspeople felt themselves superior to those from the countryside, which is why the latter has spawned urbane but why pagus has given us peasant, by way of the French pays and paisant. For the urban Roman, paganus had much the same undertones as peasant has for us now. Roman soldiers, who called themselves miles, used paganus as a belittling slangy term for somebody not in the army, a civilian. The early Christians in Rome thought of themselves as soldiers of Christ, taking seriously St Paul's instruction to put on the whole armour of God. They adopted the same vocabulary as Roman soldiers - miles for one of their number and paganus for a person who wasn't a Christian. Pagan isn't just a fighting word, it's also a slippery one, at least to judge from the attempts of various dictionaries to get across what it means. Oxford dictionaries have variations on "a person not subscribing to any of the main religions of the world", which leaves open the question of what is a main religion, who decides what is or isn't one, and whether those not subscribing to any of them have a say in the matter. Chambers Dictionary defines the word as referring to someone who has pre-Christian beliefs, especially ones involving worship of more than one god. This neatly reinterprets the word for our modern and sensitive, PC generation, albeit ignoring about a millennium of usage. Others attempt multiple definitions that often include something like "a heathen; a barbarous or unenlightened person". Heathen is a Germanic word that means exactly the same as pagan, since it originally referred to a person who lived on a heath, an upcountry and wild bit of land, and so was uncultured or savage. It took on its religious sense in imitation of pagan. Using it to define pagan is a circularity that inquiring minds can do without. Other dictionaries try meanings for pagan such as "a person who has no religion or disregards Christian beliefs", or "someone who has little or no religion and who delights in sensual pleasures and material goods; an irreligious or hedonistic person". This is where we arrive at Mr Leaver's sense of the word, for he can hardly regard his parishioners as non-Christians, however much they backslide.

'home-seeker' category in the London Borough of Newham, a place with an acute shortage of housing. She made an application for housing to the Permanent Council Accommodation. Meanwhile, due to a long waiting list, the government implemented another programme known as the 'Bond Scheme.' She decided to avail of the Bond Scheme after a promise from the authorities that she would "still retain the right to bid for Permanent Council Accommodation." Her priority on the waiting list was reduced. It was this promise by the authorities that was the cause of the dispute before the England Court in the case of Queen (on the application of Alansi) v. London Borough of Newham. The Court ruled that it has to check whether a 'legitimate expectation' is created in favour of the individual based on her understanding and background knowledge of the matter. It said that the authorities' withdrawal from their commitment was unreasonable and demanded justification. However, after hearing the explanations, the Court finally concluded that the new policy was a fair so-

rs Alansi belonged to a lution to the social problem.

The above case law provides us with a few points on the doctrine of 'legitimate expectation.' They are (i) citizens have a high level of faith in promises made by officials and the latter are bound by the promises; (ii) the legitimate expectation of the citizens and their background knowledge of the promise are to be considered in adjudication; (iii) an over-riding public interest would be an exception to the above doctrine; (iv) the exception has to be clearly established in the court: (v) a lot of discretion is allowed to judges to decide on the facts of the case.

The above doctrine is also applied in India with some added characteristics. They are (i) the doctrine helps in promoting honesty and good faith in governance; (ii) it helps in maintaining the uniform fiscal policy and insulates policies from a change in government.

It is in this context that the judgement of Najma v. Govt. of NCT Delhi has to be considered. The facts of the case were that Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal attended a press conference 29 March 2020. In his address, the CM directed that (i) landlords should not collect rent from tenants for two to three

months if the latter are unable to pay it and to postpone the same; (ii) if any tenant is unable to pay rent, the government would pay on his behalf. The above promises were made during the peak of the pandemic to a stop the exodus of migrants from Delhi and assure them that the government will give them a helping hand. A few landlords and tenants decided to enforce these promises in the Delhi High Court.

The Court observed that in a democratic system, elected officials, particularly leaders of government, and others in positions of responsibility, are required to offer responsible assurances to their constituents, particularly during times of crisis. Proper governance necessitates that the government acts on the guarantee provided by the CM. Further, the public has a legitimate expectation that an assurance given by the CM himself will be carried out. A statement made at a carefully staged press conference, against the backdrop of the pandemic-induced lockdown and the enormous departure of migrant labourers, cannot be dismissed. Hence, the Court directed the government of Delhi to decide on the implementation of the

scheme within six weeks.

This judgement empowers the common man against the mighty State. It prevents the State and its authorities to give false promises. Accountability is attached to the rulers so that schemes do not remain merely on paper. Citizens test the rulers routinely and prevent the State from turning into a dormant symbolic democracy. Importantly, it reiterates the basic idea of democracy -- a government of the people, by the people, and for the people. Hence, leaders are bound by their promises and citizens can enforce them in a court of law.

However, the Court made an interesting observation. It said that "the said assurance is not a political promise, as is sought to be canvassed before this Court. It was also not made as a part of an election rally." It is an inadvertent acceptance by the Court that words spoken in an election rally are outright 'jumla'. In the quest for a Ram-Rajya, let the government preach and practice, "power jaye par vachan na jaye."

Berhampur, August 22: Police claimed Sunday that they cracked the case in which ₹24 lakh was looted from a cash-carrying van on the crowded Aska Road under Bada Bazaar police limits here. They said three persons including the mastermind have been arrested

The van driver identified as Ashis Kumar Digal is the mastermind of this robbery while Manyabar Naik, 43, and Kartik Naik, 35, of Katringia village under Sarangagada police limits in Kandhamal district are his two accomplices.

The accused were produced in court and remanded to judicial custody after their bail pleas were rejected. This was stated here by Berhampur SP Pinak Mishra at a press conference held at the district police headquarters here. Sunday.

Mishra said that the mastermind and his accomplices looted the money and tried to give a different picture regarding the crime. However, during interrogation. the driver admitted to be the main person behind the planning and execution of the loot. On the basis of his admission, a team of police officials led by Berhampur Town SDPO and Bada Bazaar IIC Prasant

Bhupati raided the Katringia village and recovered ₹20,90,000 buried in a secluded place. A Honda bike and four mobile phones have also been seized from the possession of the three accused.

The SP said that Digal was working as the driver of 'AGS Secure', a private agency engaged in transporting cash to various ATMs in the town.

The incident occurred when four officials of agency carrying ₹26 lakh cash left for various ATMs in the town, August 18. First they replenished cash at the ATM located in Rajasahi and later stopped at an Axis Bank ATM counter on Aska Road.

The two gunmen and two officials went inside the ATM leaving cash in the van with the driver. They returned after some time but found the van and the driver missing.

They informed their location manager Padmanabha Panda who with the help of GPS tracked the van to Girisola on the Andhra Pradesh border. They informed the Golanthara police who traced the van at Girisola-Sorala Road and found the driver lying unconscious inside the vehicle.

Police quizzed the driver after the agency lodged a complaint. Digal admitted he committed the crime with the help of two accomplices.

Bari: Sacrifice of 4 martyrs recalled

Bari. August 22: About 80 years ago, four freedom fighters of Bari locality in Jaipur district had laid down their lives while taking part in the 'Quit India' movement against the British rulers. The fateful day was 'Gamha ollect the supreme sacrifice made by the four as 'Gamha Punei'is

Influenced by the 'Quit India' movement called by Mahatma Gandhi in 1942, over 100 youths from Bari area had plunged into the freedom movement and were imprisoned by the British. Incidentally this is the locality which was once the workplace Sarvodaya leaders Gopabandhu Choudhury and Rama Devi,

On a rain-swept Rakhi Purnima day/Gamha Punei (August 26, 1942) the British police launched a manhunt in Kalamatia and Kaipada villages to arrest some freedom fighters who had set the Kaipada post office on fire. As the message spread in the area about the raid.

19 inhabitants of Krushna Nagar locality were also handed prison sentences for taking part in the freedom movement. Since then Krushna Nagar has turned famous and is also referred to as 'Sangrami Village'. To remember the sacrifice of four martyrs, some villagers had erected in 1975 a Sahid Stambha (martyr tower) at the spot where the four were shot dead. Bari MLA Sunanda Das and Kalamatia sarpanch Samir Mallick said they are proud of having taken birth on the soil tinged with blood of four freedom fighters.

'Gamha Dian' ritual slowly losing its sheen in Ganjam

Berhampur, August 22: Several traditions and rituals once closely associated and celebrated in Odisha have taken a backseat. Those are not celebrated with the same fervour and gaiety as was the case even a few years back. The net has played a role in the decreasing of importance of such rituals and in the last couple of years the Covid-19 pandemic has proved to be the last nail in the coffin.

One such tradition is 'Gamha Dian'. It is a type of game organised in southern districts of Odisha on the occasion of Rakhi Purnima. Since, this festival is also called 'Gamha Purnima' in Odisha, the game got its name as 'Gamha Dian'. 'Dian' means jump. The event used to be observed in almost all villages in the southern districts to add festive spirit on the occasion of Raksha Bandhan. There was a time when youngsters would collect donations from the villagers they staved in to celebrate 'Gamha Dian'. On the day of 'Raksha Bandhan', they would build a raised platform with stones, bricks, earth and straw. In front of it they would



erect two bamboo poles on the two sides of the platform. They would then tie a rope between the two poles and hang lucrative gifts on it. Many took part in the event and there would always be hundreds of spectators watching it.

The rules of the game were simple. A participant would have to announce the gift he was aiming for. He would then have to run from a distance, jump on the platform and leap into the air trying to touch the gift of his favoured choice. If he managed to get his fingertips on the object of his choice, it would

be given to the participant. Excitement would run high with the spectators cheering on the participant.

However, this tradition of 'Gamha Dian' is virtually non-existent now. These days most youngsters are glued to their mobile phones and they do not show the urge to organise 'Gamha Dian'. Barring a handful of villages, the festival is not observed at all.

The situation has come to such a pass that there are many young adults who hardly have any knowledge about 'Gamha Dian'.

New Delhi, August 22: "Everything is finished", don't know what the future holds for us"-- these were the words of an Afghan lawmaker and a mother of an infant who burst into tears as soon as they arrived at the Hindon airbase along with over 160 other evacuees from Taliban-besieged Afghanistan Sunday morning.

The group included Afghan lawmakers Anarkali Honaryar and Narender Singh Khalsa and their families, people familiar with the evacuation mission said.

"I feel like crying. Everything is finished. It is a very difficult and painful decision to leave the country. We have not seen such a situation. Everything has been snatched away. It's all over," Sikh Lawmaker Khalsa told reporters.

Terming India his "second home", Khalsa narrated his horror story which unfolded as their vehicle was separated from a convoy of those being taken to the Kabul airport for rescue. Explaining the ground situation in Afghanistan

The mother of an infant who broke down while she was waiting with the baby in her arms for an RT-PCR test here, said, "The past seven days have been very stressful for us with no clue about

what future holds for us. It all looks very uncertain". Another infant was among the evacuees who arrived Sunday. An overhwhelmed little girl could be seen kissing the infant in pictures from the airbase. Unconfirmed reports suggested that the infant has

travelled to India without a passport. Honaryar, a member of the Upper House of Afghan Parliament, in a video message, said "I thank the Government of India, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the Ministry of External Affairs and the Indian Air Force for lifting us from Kabul and saving my life."

All the evacuees arriving at Hindon and Delhi's IGI airport underwent RP-PCR tests, officials said. Alladad Qureshi, an Afghan national whose wife hails from Kashmir, expressed a sense of relief as he interacted with mediapersons at Hindon.

Manik Mandal, a young jeweller who had gone to Afghanistan six months ago in search of livelihood, smiled as he said, "We faced a lot of problems in Kabul, but our government saved us.'

India carried out the evacuation missions in coordination with the US and several other friendly countries. Two days after the Taliban seized control of Kabul, India evacuated 200 people, including the Indian envoy and other staffers of its embassy in Kabul

India brings back **392** people

ndia Sunday brought back 392 people, including two Afghan lawmakers, in three different flights as part of the mission to evacuate its nationals and Afghan partners from Kabul. A total of 168 people, including 107 Indians and 23 Afghan Sikhs and Hindus, were flown from Kabul to Hindon airbase near Delhi in a C-17 heavy-lift military transport aircraft of the Indian Air Force (IAF). Another group of 87 Indians and two Nepalese nationals were brought back in a special Air India flight from Dushanbe, a day after they were evacuated to the Tajikistan capital in an IAF 130J transport aircraft, officials said.

in two C-17 heavy-lift transport aircraft of the IAF.

The first evacuation flight brought back over 40 people, mostly staffers at the Indian embassy, Monday last. The second C-17 aircraft evacuated around 150 people, including Indian diplomats, officials, security personnel and some stranded Indians from Kabul on Tuesday. The Taliban swept across Afghanistan this month, seizing control of almost all key towns and cities, including Kabul in the backdrop of the withdrawal of the US forces. As per official estimates, the total Indian assistance to Afghanistan is estimated at \$3 billion during the last twenty years. Going beyond the economy and by extending the hand of friendship, India has always been a partner to Afghanistan. Naturally, the country offers solace for the vulnerable people escaping from the persecution of Taliban. It has done so in the past and is committed to do so in these turbulent times too.

Malabar wargame to begin Thursday

New Delhi. August 22: The Quad countries -- India, the US, Australia and Japan -- will carry out the next edition of the high-voltage Malabar naval exercise from August 26 to 29 off the coast of Guam amid mounting global concerns over China's growing military muscle-flexing in the Indo-Pacific region.

Indian stealth frigate INS Shivalik and anti-submarine warfare corvette INS Kadmatt arrived in Guam, an island territory of the US in the Western Pacific, Saturday to take part in the exercise that will feature an array of complex drills, Indian Navy officials said Sunday.

"The Malabar-21 would witness high-tempo exercises among destroyers, frigates, corvettes, submarines, helicopters and long-range maritime patrol aircraft of the participating navies," Indian Navy spokesperson Commander Vivek Madhwal said. "Complex surface, sub-surface and air operations including live weapon firing drills, anti-surface, anti-air and anti-submarine warfare drills, and joint manoeuvres and tactical exercises will be conducted during the exercise,' he said. Though the exercise is not part of the framework of cooperation under Quad, it is increasingly seen as a reflection of increasing partnership among the four countries. Later this year, US President Joe Biden is expected to hold an in-person summit of the leaders of the Quad countries in Washington to ex-

plore ways to further expand cooperation among its member countries. Senior officials of India and the

other member nations of the Quad August 12 held extensive talks on advancing practical cooperation in areas of infrastructure, maritime security, counter-terrorism and cybersecurity to achieve the goal of a free and open Indo-Pacific.

Srinagar, August 22: A ban under the stringent Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act may be imposed on both factions of the secessionist conglomerate Hurriyat Conference which has been spearheading the separatist movement in Jammu and Kashmir for over two decades, officials said.

They said a recent probe into the granting of MBBS seats to Kashmiri students by institutions in Pakistan indicates that the money collected from aspirants by some organisations which were Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, or the UAPA, under which "if the Central Government is of opinion that any association is, or has become, an unlawful association, it may, by notification in the Official Gazette, declare such association to be unlawful.

The Hurrivat Conference came into existence in 1993 with 26 groups, including some pro-Pakistan and banned outfits such as the Jamaate-Islami, JKLF and the Dukhtarane-Millat. It also included the People's Conference and the Awami Action Committee headed by Mirwaiz Umer Farooq.

The separatist conglomerate broke into two factions in 2005 with the moderate group being led by

Conference who have been acting in connivance with active militants of proscribed terrorist organisations Hizb-ul-Mujahideen (HM), Dukhtaran-e-Millat (DeM) and Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT).

The cadres raised funds in the country and from abroad through various illegal channels, including hawala, for funding separatist and terrorist activities in Jammu and Kashmir, they said.

The funds collected were used for causing disruption in the Kashmir Valley by way of pelting stones on security forces, systematically burning schools, damaging public property and waging war against India as part of a criminal conspiracy, they claimed.

Indian fishermen Rescue centre becomes home for orphaned rhinos

Guwahati, August 22: A fourmonth-old Ganga had lost her mother to surging waters of the Brahmaputra nearly two decades back, but she has now found her home on the banks of another river and is a healthy mother of four young ones.

Orphaned by the floods in



Assam's famed Kaziranga National Park, Ganga had found a refuge on the periphery of the Park where she was raised before setting out to live on her own in her natural habitat.

Ganga was the second rhino to be rescued by the Centre for Wildlife Rehabilitation and Conservation (CWRC) in Kaziranga in 2003, along with another rhino calf, Rathin Barman of Wildlife Trust of India (WTI) told PTI.

Hand-raised by the staff of the CWRC, the pair was translocated to Manas National Park (MNP), about 300 km away from their birthplace, four years later where they have thrived over the years.

Named Ganga-Jamuna for their bonding by the frontline staff of MNP, they were the second lot of rhinos sent to the Park with the first being Mainou (Lakhsmi in local Bodo language) preceding them by a year to Manas, also from the CWRC. While Ganga gave birth to her fourth calf in the last week of July this year, Jamuna has three calves of her own and Mainou had also become mother to three calves over the years before dying of natural causes a couple of years back, Barman said.

It is located at the periphery of the Kaziranga National Park and attends to wildlife displacements originating mainly from the Park and adjoining Dibru-Saikhowa National Park

The Centre has been engaging in rescue of wildlife that stray out of their natural habitats and rhinos of KNP have been among such animals that have found a new lease of life in its premise. It has handled 101 rhino cases since its inception.

There are close to 3,000 rhinos in Assam, with the major numbers present in Kaziranga National Park. "The CWRC annually rescues two to four rhino calves during floods in the KNP. In 2016, we rescued as many as nine rhino calves," he said. The rescued rhino calves from KNP have been mostly translocated to the MNP, while two were 'experimentally' released in KNP itself and two sent to the state zoo's breeding facility at Guwahati, Barman said.

The CWRC has four rhino calves rescued during the 2019 floods at its establishment at Kaziranga currently, Dr Bhaskar Choudhury, veterinarian at the Centre said.

He said the calves are kept at the Centre till they are about oneand-a-half to two years of age, after which they are released back in the wild. The rhinos are generally not released back into KNP due to high tiger concentration which leads to high predation and high rhino density in the Park, he added. "We bring the rhinos to the Centre only if they are too young or ailing. Else, along with the Forest personnel, we try to send them back into their original habitat," Choudhury said.

Since the inception of CWRC and its satellite facilities, altogether 7,532 numbers of wildlife cases, belonging to 258 species of mammals, birds and reptiles, have been attended to by the Centre in the state till July 2021.

Rameswaram (TN), August 22: Around 60 Indian fishing boats from here were damaged in stone pelting, allegedly by the Sri Lankan navy, a Fisheries department official said on Sunday.

The Lankan naval personnel also damaged fishing nets in 25 boats, while they were involved in fishing near Katchatheevu late last night, he said . Quoting fishermen, the official said the naval personnel came in about five vessels and pelted stones on the Indian boats, causing damage to about 60 of them. However, no fisherman was injured in the incident. Fishermen's association representative S Emerit said about 556 boats had put out to sea on Saturday night and alleged that some of \rightarrow them were targeted by the Sri Lankan navy.

Expressing concern over such 'recurring' incidents, he sought the intervention of the Central and state governments to work outa solution to the issue and ensure their livelihood.

London, August 22: G7 leaders will discuss the crisis in Afghanistan Tuesday in a virtual summit. Britain's Prime Minister Boris Johnson announced Sunday, a week after the Taliban retook power

"It is vital that the international community works together to ensure safe evacuations, prevent a humanitarian crisis and support the Afghan people to secure the gains of the last 20 years, Johnson tweeted

The United Kingdom currently occupies the chair of the grouping of wealthy nations comprising Britain, Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Japan and the United States, and Johnson has been pushing for a meeting for the past week.

The Western allies have faced mounting criticism over their handling of the crisis in Afghanistan amid chaotic scenes as thousands of Afghans and foreigners try to



flee Kabul following the Taliban's return to power. Following a virtual meeting

Thursday G7 foreign ministers urged the Taliban to provide safe passage for those trying to flee the capital, the bloc's first formal statement on the crisis. The US, which has sent thou-

sands of troops temporarily to try

to secure the airport and help evacuate its nationals and Afghans who helped them, has set a deadline to complete the airlifts by August 31.

However, allies including the UK have suggested they would support extending the deadline, an issue likely to feature prominently at Tuesday's discussion.

NRF ready for conflict but prefers negotiations

"The conditions for a peace deal with the Taliban is decentralisation -- a system that ensures social justice, equality, rights, and freedom for all," said Nazary, the NRF's head of foreign relations, adding if the Taliban do not agree there will be "long-term conflict". 'The Taliban are overstretched.

They cannot be everywhere at the same time. Their resources are limited. They do not have support amongst the majority."

Pak allows fully-vaccinated Sikh pilgrims to visit Kartarpur Sahib

Islamabad, August 22: Pakistan has decided to allow fully-vaccinated Sikh pilgrims to visit Gurdwara Darbar Sahib, Kartarpur from next month with strict Covid-19 protocols, ahead of the 482nd death anniversary of Sikhism founder Guru Nanak Dev September 22, media reports said Sunday.

On this occasion, three-day rituals will be held at the shrine from September 20. Guru Nanak died in Kartarpur September 22, 1539.

Pilgrimage to the Kartarpur Sahib gurdwara was suspended in March 2020 because of the Covid-19 outbreak.

The decision to open the Kartarpur shrine was taken by the National Command and Operation Centre (NCOC) Saturday due to the approaching death anniversary of Sikhism founder Baba Guru Nanak Dev September 22.



Dawn newspaper reported that the NCOC meeting unanimously decided to allow Sikh pilgrims to visit Kartarpur next month under strict Covid-19 protocols.

Due to the Delta variant, India was in category C in Pakistan from May 22 till August 12, and a special approval was required for people coming from the country, including Sikh pilgrims.

However, fully-vaccinated persons with certificates will be allowed to enter Pakistan provided they show Real-Time Polymerase Chain Reaction (RT-PCR) test reports which should not be more than 72 hours old.

Apart from this, a Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) will also be conducted at airports and in case of a positive result, the individual will not be allowed to enter Pakistan.

Besides, as per Non-Pharmaceutical Interventions (NPIs), a maximum of 300 people will be permitted to assemble at a time at the darbar.

According to an official of the Ministry of National Health Services (NHS), Pakistan had introduced three categories to deal with the Coronavirus spread.

"Countries in category A are exempted from the mandatory COVID-19 test, travellers from areas falling in category B are required to present a negative PCR test that must be taken within 72 hours of the travel date, while visitors from nations in category C are restricted and can travel only under specific NCOC guidelines." the official said

Colombo, August 22: Sri Lanka will issue captive elephants with their own biometric identity cards and ban their riders from drinking on the job under a wide-ranging new animal protection law.

Many rich Sri Lankans including Buddhist monks keep elephants as pets to show off their wealth, but complaints of ill treatment and cruelty are widespread.

The new measures are aimed at protecting the animals' welfare and include strict regulations around working elephants, as well as mandating a daily two-and-a-

half-hour bath for each creature. Official records show there are about 200 domesticated elephants in the South Asian nation, with the population in the wild estimated at about 7.500. The new law will require all owners to ensure that animals

under their care have new photo identity cards with a DNA stamp. Baby elephants can no longer be used for work even cultural pageants and cannot be separated from their mothers.



Logging elephants cannot be worked for more than four hours a day and night work is prohib-

ited. There are new restrictions on the tourism industry too from now on, no more than four people

can ride an elephant at once, and they must sit on a well-padded saddle. Their use in films is banned, except for government productions under strict veterinary supervision, as is allowing their riders to drink while working.

"The person who owns or has the custody of such elephants shall ensure that the mahout (rider) is not consuming any liquor or any harmful drug while employed,' Wildlife Protection minister Wimalaweera Dissanayaka said in a gazette notification dated Thursday.

Owners must send their animals for a medical check-up every six months

Those who violate the new law will have their elephant taken into state care and could face a threeyear prison sentence.

Capturing wild elephants in Sri 🔶 Lanka is a criminal offence punishable by death, but prosecutions are rare.

Animal rights activists as well as elephant experts have alleged that over the last 15 years, more than 40-(baby elephants have been stolen from national wildlife parks.

3 insurance firms to raise ₹10,000cr

Mumbai: Adding more fire to the already-frenzied IPO market, three insurance sector companies are entering the primary market with initial public offerings in coming months to mop up over ₹10,000 crore. These companies are - PB Fintech, which runs the insurance brokerage Policybazaar; standalone health insurer Star Health & Allied Insurance Company; and third-party administrator Medi Assist Healthcare Service. They have already filed their draft prospectus with markets regulator Sebi. Already over 40 companies have hit the IPO market so far this year, raising close to ₹70,000 crore. August alone saw four listings, and the fifth one (Nuvoco Vistas Corp, which raised ₹5,000 crore) is slated for Monday

FPIs pump in ₹7,245cr in Aug so far

FinMin summons Infosys CEO over I-T portal glitches

New Delhi, August 22: As the new I-T portal continues to remain unavailable for two consecutive days, the Finance Ministry has "summoned" Infosys MD & CEO Salil Parekh Monday to explain to Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman the reasons for continued glitches even after over two months of launch.

The new income tax e-filing portal www.Incometax.Gov.In, developed by Infosys, had a bumpy start from the day of its launch June 7, as it continued to face tech glitches with users complaining that certain functionalities were either unavailable or working slow.

Consequently, the I-T department had to allow manual filing of remittance forms and also extend due dates for electronic filing of forms related to intimation by pension funds and sovereign wealth funds. "Ministry of Finance has sum-

moned Sh Salil Parekh, MD &CEO @Infosys on 23/08/2021 to explain to hon'ble FM as to why even after 2.5 months since launch of new efiling portal, glitches in the portal have not been resolved. In fact, since 21/08/2021 the portal itself is not available," the Income Tax department tweeted.

As users complained of various glitches after a fortnight of launch, Sitharaman June 22, called a meeting with key officials of Infosys to review the issues on the portal.



The Minister had then asked Infosys to address all issues without further loss of time, improve their services. and redress grievances on priority as it was impacting taxpayers adverselv.

Infosys CEO Salil Parekh, and COO Pravin Rao, along with other company officials, took note of the issues highlighted by the stakeholders. They also acknowledged the technical issues in the functioning of the portal and shared the status of the resolution with respect to the issues highlighted by the stakeholders, an official statement issued after the meeting had said.

In 2019, Infosys was awarded a contract to develop the next-generation income tax filing system to reduce processing time for returns from 63 days to one day and expedite refunds. Till June 2021, the government has paid ₹164.5 crore to Infosys for developing the portal.

Indian startups raised \$6.5bn in funding in Q2 2021

New Delhi, August 22: Indian startups received about USD 6.5 billion in funding in the April-June 2021 quarter, while 11 of them entered the coveted unicorn club, a report by Nasscom-PGA Labs said.

During the second quarter, 160 funding deals were closed - up 2 per cent from the January-March period

Q2 2021 has been impeccable for the start-up growth story. From being the most funded quarter, it has also added the most number of unicorns. Standing tall during the pandemic second wave headwinds, Indian start-up ecosystem has shown a strong resilience in this

quarter," the report said. Funding raised in June quarter was at USD 6.5 billion, up by 71 per cent quarter-on-quarter. The biggest deal during the quarter was the USD 800 million fund

raise by food delivery platform Swiggy, followed by ShareChat (USD 502 million), Byju's (USD 340 million), PharmEasy (USD 323 million) and Meesho (USD 300 million), the report said.

Pine Labs raised USD 285 million, Delhivery USD 277 million, Zeta USD 250 million, Cred USD 215 million and Urban Company USD 188 million in the June 2021 quarter, as per the report.

'The Indian startup ecosystem that generated 53 unicorns till June 2021 has made great strides in the April-June quarter. From recording most funding deals to adding the most number of unicorns in a quarter, investors' confidence in



good-quality digital businesses has strengthened like never before," PGA Labs Director, Competitive Intelligence Abhishek Maiti told PTI.

He added that the deal flow looks promising for the latter half too as India opens after series of lockdowns and sectors such as fintech, foodtech and healthtech continue to benefit from pandemic-induced adoption.

Fintech was the most funded sector, accounting for 27 per cent of the total deal value in the reported quarter.

This was followed by foodtech (13 per cent), enterprise tech (11 per cent), edtech (10 per cent), and media and entertainment (8 per cent). Growth stage funding accounted for 61 per cent of the total deal value, it added.

This has taken the total number of unicorns in the country to 53 as of June 2021.

About 27 per cent of the unicorns added in the second quarter of 2021 were fintech startups, while 18 per cent each belong to SaaS (software as a service) and social commerce, the report said.

Interestingly, Tiger Global invested in 64 per cent of the unicorns during the second quarter of 2021. The report noted that B2B startups raised over USD 1.9 billion across 85 deals, with an average deal size of USD 22 million.

The top three B2B funded startups were Zeta, Razorpay and Axtria. ২ B2C startups raised over USD 4.2

billion across 75 deals, with an average deal size of USD 56 million. Top three B2C funded startups

New Delhi, August 22: Former India footballer Syed Shahid Hakim died Sunday at a hospital in Gulbarga, Karnataka, family sources said. He was 82. Hakim was a member of the team that played in the 1960 Rome Olympics. He had recently suffered a stroke, after which he was admitted to a hospital. "He passed away at 8.30am today (Sunday)," his wife Sadia Syeda stated.

In his more than five-decade association with Indian football, the Dronacharya awardee has also been an assistant coach to the late PK Banerjee during the 1982 Asian Games, and also independently has been in charge of the national team during a tournament.

At the domestic level, his finest hour as coach came when he guided the erstwhile Mahindra & Mahindra to the Durand Cup title in 1998, beating a formidable East Bengal team. He has also coached Salgaocar and Hindustan FC. His last serious coaching assignment was with Bengal Mumbai FC in 2004-05.

Hakim was also a FIFA badge holder international referee having officiated in the 1988 AFC Asian Cup and was also conferred with the prestigious 'Dhyan Chand' award. A former squadron leader of the Indian Air Force, Hakim was also a regional director of SAI and his last assignment was as project di-

NCA INTRODUCES NEW MODULE FOR TRAINERS UNDER DRAVID'S LEADERSHIP 'Corporate classes' for aspiring coaches

New Delhi, August 22: Under Rahul Dravid's stewardship, the National Cricket Academy (NCA) has revamped the coaching manual, which now comprises 'corporate classes' for aspiring coaches tackling off-field issues, including selection pressure from various quarters.

Recently, a batch of distinguished former first-class cricketers attended the BCCI's Level-2 coaching course and also appeared for the theory and practical examinations.

The module has been tweaked to make it more appealing for modern coaches. However, what came as a pleasant surprise was the introduction of a 'corporate problem solving class'. In it the incumbents were asked to find methods of trouble-shooting while dealing with multiple off-the-field stakeholders.

"The course has been devised by former Mumbai seamer Kshemal (Waingankar), who is an MBA and has a corporate background. I have never attended a class like this but it was very unique and helped me broaden my horizon," a distinguished first-class cricketer, who attended the course, told this agency

on the condition of anonymity. So what is this corporate class all about? "Well, it was about mak-



ing us understand the difference between 'bargaining' and 'negotiation'. We were told that we don't need to solve a problem but it needs to be checked what are the troubleshooting methods that we deploy (approach) in a critical situation," the person said. While the Level-2 course is com-

plete, all the aspirants now go back to their respective cities and, in

the next three months, will have to at least work with one player and prepare a project report.

"All of us will have to pick a player and make a complete video analysis of his bowling or batting depending upon our area of expertise. Then we prepare a project report on what specifics we are working on. After we have worked on corrective measures, we will

have to again prepare a video of changes we have done. Then only our Level-2 course will be complete," said another player.
