Oil tanker blast kills 98 in Sierra Leone

FREETOWN: An oil tanker exploded near Sierra Leone's capital, killing at least 98 people and severely injuring dozens of others after large crowds gathered to collect leaking fuel, officials and witnesses said Saturday. The explosion took place late Friday after a bus struck the tanker in Wellington, a suburb just to the east of Freetown. The mortuary at Connaught Hospital reported 98 bodies had been brought in by Saturday morning. About 30 severely burned victims were not expected to survive, according to Foday Musa, a staff member in the intensive care unit. Hundreds of people milled outside the main gates of the mortuary and near the hospital's main entrance, waiting for word of their loved ones.

8 dead in music concert stampede

Houston, Nov 6: At least eight people have died and scores of others injured in what authorities described as a 'mass casualty' incident on the opening night of a popular music festival here in Texas attended by some 50,000 fans of American rapper Travis Scott.

The sold-out concert by Scott at the Astroworld Festival in Houston had to be cancelled immediately after people started falling after the massive crowd began "to compress toward the front of the stage" around 9:00-9:15 pm (local time) Friday, CNN reported.

Multiple fans were trampled as hundreds rushed the event's perimeter. Once inside, some people began climbing onto portable toilets as security personnel worked to try and contain the crowd, ABC 13 news website reported.

'We had scores of individuals that were injured," Houston Fire Chief Sam Pena said during a news conference early Saturday morning. More than 300 people were treated at the field hospital set up near the festival, Pena said, adding that the concert drew about 50,000 attendees. So far, eight people have died and hundreds of others have been injured.

11 Covid patients perish in ICU blaze

Pune, Nov 6: Eleven coronavirus patients were killed after a major fire broke out in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU) of the district civil hospital in Maharashtra's Ahmednagar city Saturday, officials said.

The blaze erupted around 11 am in the ICU where 20 COVID-19 patients, many of them senior citizens and some on ventilator or oxygen, were undergoing treatment.

The fire was doused around 1.30 pm, said chief fire officer of the city civic body Shankar Misal, adding that a short circuit was suspected to be the cause though it was vet to be confirmed. After the incidents of fire at hospitals treating COVID-19 patients elsewhere, fire audits had

been ordered across the state. As per Ahmednagar District Collector Rajendra Bhosale, such an audit had been carried out at this hospital too. But according to Misal. after the audit, the work of installing necessary safety systems was incomplete due to 'want of funds'. As injured patients were rushed to a nearby hospital, 10 of them were declared brought dead, police said. One patient succumbed later.

As many as 15 patients were on ventilator or oxygen in the ICU. 'Saving them was the priority. But due to their critical condition, to remove the oxygen support and bring them out was a tough decision," said one fire brigade official.

Most of those who died were aged between 65 and 83, according to hospital officials.

A probe committee headed by Misal will look into what led to the tragedy, the collector said.

According to Misal, after the recent fire audit, the hospital had been told about the measures needed to be taken. It was asked to put in place an effective firefighting system including a pipeline and a sprinkler system. But the work was incomplete due to 'want of funds' though 'they had fire extinguishers at the hospital,' he said.

Parties for 7-day liquor ban ahead of panchayat elections

Bhubaneswar, Nov 6: Ahead of the three-tier panchayat elections, the State Election Commission (SEC) Saturday held a meeting with the representatives of various political parties of the state. During the meeting, the political

parties have suggested to the Commission to bring in a ban on liquor sale for a period of seven days ahead of the election for its smooth conduct. State Election Commissioner Aditya Prasad Padhi, who chaired the all-party meeting, said many parties have suggested banning liquor sale for seven days ahead of the elections. Voters who attained the age of 18 years on or before November 1, 2021, will be eligible

to exercise their franchise during the panchayat elections, he said.

The final voters' list will be prepared before the ensuing elections without any mistakes, Padhi said. The Electors Photo Identification Card ID number of the voters will be added along with their names to the list, said Padhi. A discussion on the extension of polling time was held during the meeting. Usually the voting time was from 7 am to 12 pm. As this time, there will be a central counting at the block-level instead

of booth-level counting on the same day, parties have proposed to extend the timing, he said. A discussion on enhancing the limit on election expenditure by candidates was also held, the Commissioner said.

Many parties have proposed to increase the election expenditure limit of Sarpanch and Samiti member candidates from ₹80,000 to ₹2 lakh. It has been proposed to increase the amount from ₹2 lakh to ₹5 lakh for Zilla Parishad candidates,

fuel by Centre and VAT cut by state government lead to lower fare for all categories of passenger buses

■ *Reduction in excise duty on*

Bhubaneswar, Nov 6: With the reduction of excise duty and VAT on diesel by Centre and Odisha, the state government has reduced the fare of all categories of passenger buses.

According to an order issued by the State Transport Authority (STA), the fare of ordinary and express buses has been reduced by 5 paise per km whereas it has been decreased by 10 paise per km for deluxe and AC deluxe buses.

Similarly, the fare of super premium buses was slashed down by 15 paise per km. The bus fare in Odisha was last revised October 16

following a spike in the diesel price. "Due to decrease in diesel price from ₹102.34 per litre October 16, 2021 to ₹91.61 per litre Saturday, the fare for stage carriages other than town buses plying within the state shall be fixed at decreased rate. It will be effective from the date of issue of order," said the STA. While the fare for ordinary buses

has been reduced from 92 paise to 87 paise per km, express bus fare has been slashed down from 96 paise to 91 paise per km. Similarly, the fare of deluxe

buses has been reduced to ₹1.25 from ₹1.35 per km and AC deluxe buses from ₹1.73 to ₹1.53 per km. Moreover, the travellers in super

deluxe buses will now have to pay ₹2.38 per km instead of ₹2.53 per km.

Recently, the Union government had cut the excise duty on diesel by ₹10 per litre while the Odisha government has reduced VAT on the fuel by 4 per cent (approximately ₹3 per litre).

In view of this reduction, the loss of VAT revenue to the state exchequer will approximately be ₹1,400 crore per annum. This is in addition to loss in VAT collection of ₹1.60 per litre on petrol and ₹2.80 on diesel which the state is likely to incur in view of the reduction of excise duty implemented by the Centre. This loss will approximately be to the tune of ₹700 crore per annum. Hence the total loss to the state exchequer will be more than ₹2,000 crore.

Ice on edge of survival: Warming is changing the Arctic

Bhubaneswar, Nov 6: The Crime Branch of Odisha police, which is investigating the DRDO espionage case, has detected the involvement of another woman and a Mumbai link in the sensitive case, a senior police officer said Saturday.

Earlier, the Crime Branch had found the involvement of a female operative, suspected to be from Pakistan, in the espionage case at DRDO's Integrated Test Range (ITR) in Balasore district

Another female operative was in touch with one of the five arrested employees of the Chandipur ITR and money transaction has also been detected, said Additional Director General (ADG), Crime Branch, Sanjeeb Panda.

Panda said the woman had come in contact with one of the accused identifying herself as a native of his area and presently working in

Dubai. After establishing a contact with the accused, the woman had borrowed ₹40,000 with a promise to return. Accordingly, the accused transferred ₹40,000 in two installments to two different bank accounts in Mumbai April 18, 2021, the

On the very next day, the amount was returned to the SBI account of the accused at Chandipur branch, Panda said, adding, "We suspect that the money transaction was made to win the confidence of the accused." The ADG further said a team of the Crime Branch will soon visit Mumbai for further investigation into the case

Greenland, Nov 6: While conducting research in Greenland, ice scientist Twila Moon was struck this summer by what climate change has doomed Earth to lose and what could still be saved.

The Arctic is warming three times faster than the rest of the planet and is on such a knife's edge of survival that the UN climate negotiations underway in Scotland this week could make the difference between ice and water at the top of the world in the same way that a couple of tenths of a degree matter around the freezing mark, scientists say.

Arctic ice sheets and glaciers are shrinking, with some glaciers already gone. Permafrost, the icy



soil that traps the potent greenhouse gas methane, is thawing. Wildfires have broken out in the

Siberia even hit 100 degrees Fahrenheit (38 degrees Celsius). Even a region called the Last Ice Area showed unexpected melting this year. In the next couple of decades, the Arctic is likely to see

summers with no sea ice.

As she returns regularly to Greenland, Moon, a researcher with the US National Snow and Ice Data Center, said she finds herself "mourning and grieving for the things we have lost already" because of past carbon dioxide emissions that trap heat.

But the decisions we make now

about how much more carbon pollution Earth emits will mean "an incredibly large difference between how much ice we keep and how much we lose and how quickly,' she said. The fate of the Arctic looms large during the climate talks in Glasgow — the farthest north the negotiations have taken place — because what happens in the Arctic doesn't stay in the Arctic. Scientists believe the warming there is already contributing to weather calamities elsewhere around the world.

"If we end up in a seasonally sea ice-free Arctic in the summertime, that's something human civilization has never known," said former NASA chief scientist Waleed Abdalati, who runs the University of Colorado's environment programme. "That's like taking a sledgehammer to the climate system.'

What's happening in the Arctic is a runaway effect. "Once you start melting, that kind of enhances more melt," said University of Manitoba ice scientist Julienne Stroeve.

When covered with snow and ice, the Arctic reflects sunlight and heat. But that blanket is dwindling.

And as more sea ice melts in the summer, "vou're revealing really dark ocean surfaces, just like a black T-shirt," Moon said. Like dark clothing, the open patches of sea soak up heat from the sun more readily. "The Arctic isn't just changing

"It's changing in state. It's becoming a different place." This isn't just a problem for people living in the Arctic. It spells trou-







Bhubaneswar, Nov 6: Odisha Pradesh Congress Committee (OPCC) Saturday called Odisha bandh November 12 demanding the resignation of Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik for shielding the Minister of State (MoS) for Home Dibya Shankar Mishra, who is allegedly involved in the murder of school teacher Mamita Meher.



OPCC working president Chiranjeevi Biswal said the bandh would be observed for six hours from 6am to 12pm. Biswal appealed to the people to make it a success.

Meanwhile, the Odisha Pradesh Youth Congress under the leadership of its president Smruti Ranjan Lenka Saturday started its daynight demonstration in front of the Raj Bhawan here demanding ouster and arrest of Mishra and an impartial inquiry into the murder.

Lenka said they would intensify and continue their agitation till action is taken against Mishra and all others involved in the murder case are arrested.

The Youth Congress would submit a memorandum to the Governor November 8 seeking action against the minister and a fair probe into the incident.

He said if no action was taken, the Youth Congress would hold demonstration in front of the office of the Resident Commissioner at Delhi November 10 and at Jantarmantar the next day.

The party would also submit a memorandum to the President November 11 in support of their demand, he added.

Independent agency to check impact of OMBADC projects

Bhubaneswar, Nov 6: In order to assess the impact of various infrastructure and social development projects sanctioned under OMBADC fund, the state government has decided to conduct a ground level study through an independent agency.

This was informed by Development Commissioner PK Jena during a meeting of the Oversight Authority of Odisha Mineral Bearing Areas Development Corporation (OM-BADC) held under the chairmanship of retired Supreme Court Judge AK Patnaik.

Jena said that the sanctioned projects of OMBADC brought new hopes and confidence among the people in mining areas.

Presenting the updates at the meeting, CEO of the Corporation, Uma Nanduri said the OMBADC has so far received ₹19,537 crore, including the interest accrued from the compensation money. On the other hand, projects worth ₹14,990 crore were sanctioned for the mineral bearing districts.

Projects worth ₹722.21 crore were sanctioned for supply of piped drinking water, ₹2,896.40 crore for quality education in primary and secondary schools, ₹2,943.53 crore for improving the health and nutrition service delivery at Anganwadi centers, ₹460.45 crore for enhancing livelihood options, ₹742.55 crore for connectivity, ₹24.75 crore for pollution control and ₹701.14 crore for water conservation and ground water recharge, she

According to sources, 95 per cent of drinking water projects, 73 per cent of solar power projects for schools, 66 per cent of infrastructure development projects in residential schools, 50 per cent of the upgradation of health infrastructure projects and 51 per cent of the rural connectivity projects were completed. The work for all other projects has been expedited to meet

Bhubaneswar, Nov 6: The Excise department arrested 448 persons involved in illegal trade of various psychotropic drugs and liquor between April and October of the current financial year.

During the previous financial year, the Excise department sleuths had arrested only 142 such criminals.

Bhubaneswar, Nov 6: The Health and Family Welfare (H&FW) department Saturday said that the state government should now open schools for children as the Covid-19 situation has significantly improved in Odisha.

The Director of Health Services Bijay Mohapatra said that though the new variants of coronavirus have been detected in other countries, Odisha has no reason to be worried over it as the state has already experienced it.

Stating that children have better immunity power than adults, Mohapatra said the number of daily Covid positive cases is gradually going down. "There is no harm in reopening the primary and upper primary schools," he said.

Mohapatra, however, explained that the Covid-19 guidelines could not be relaxed despite improvement of the situation. "Even if all the schools are reopened, we must follow the guidelines like wearing masks, maintaining social distance



and washing hands to prevent the spread of the virus," he added

Meanwhile, Odisha Saturday logged 208 new Covid-19 cases, 38 more than the previous day, taking the state's tally to 10,43,151 while four fresh fatalities pushed the coronavirus death toll to 8,354, a Health department official said.

The 208 cases included 23 children and adolescents in the age group of 0 to 18 years. The rate of infection in this age group now stands at 11.05 per cent against the previous

day's 14.11 per cent.

The coastal state had reported $170\,\mathrm{new}$ cases Friday, the lowest in the last seven months, 351 Thursday, 322 Wednesday, 327 Tuesday and 316 Monday.

Of the new cases, 119 were reported from quarantine centres while the remaining 89 were local contacts. Khurda district, of which state Capital Bhubaneswar is a part, recorded the highest of 99 cases, followed by Cuttack (20). Nine districts reported zero cases.

State Urban Development Authority (SUDA) Project Director Sarada Prasad Panda had earlier written a letter to all municipal commissioners and executive officers of municipalities and Notified Area Councils directing to start the campaign 'No one will sleep under the open sky & let us make our city homeless free'.

The officials have been asked to take sincere initiative on winter action plan. "The shelters should have bedding and heating facilities, sanitisers, hand wash solution, drinking water, and toilets among other necessary amenities,' he stated

As per a survey in three Revenue Divisional Commissioner (RDC) zones of the state, as many as 13.651 homeless persons have been identified, out of which 12,742 are permanent and 909 seasonal.

The Central RDC zone, which comprises 10 districts including Khurda, Cuttack, Puri, Jajpur and Bhadrak, has the highest of 7,911 urban homeless people. The Southern RDC zone comprising Koraput, Malkangiri, Ganjam, Kandhamal and six other districts has 4,660 homeless persons.

and share other people's emotions, a new research suggests The study, led by researchers at Cardiff University, found that people with facial paralysis, people seeing others who wear face masks or even children sucking on dum-

mies could struggle to show em-

pathy or detect positive social cues. 'People tend to automatically imitate others' facial expressions of emotion when looking at them, whether that is a smile, a frown, or a smirk. This facial mimicry, where the brain recreates and mirrors the emotional experience of the other person, affects how we empathise with others and interact socially," said lead author Ross Vanderwert from Cardiff University's School of Psychology.

"Our study suggests that when movements of the lower part of the face are disrupted or hidden, this can be problematic, particularly for positive social interactions and the ability to share emotions. Wearing a face mask continues to be vital to protect ourselves and others during the Covid-19 pandemic. But our research suggests this may have important implications for the way we communicate and interact," Vanderwert added.

For the study, published in the journal Cognitive, Affective, and Behavioural Neuroscience, the team recorded the brain activity of 38 individuals via an electroen-

Logs seized from police van: 4

Paralakhemundi: Four personnel of the Odisha Special Armed Police (OSAP) were arrested Saturday morning in connection with teakwood logs having been seized November 3 from a police van in Gajapati district. According to official sources, the vehicle has been seized along with teakwood logs, the value of which is around ₹65,000 in open market. The arrested police personnel were directly involved in the alleged smuggling. Additional Director General (ADG) RP Koche has initiated a departmental probe into the incident. Six forest officials have already been interrogated by the ADG Koche. Statements of a few other officials will be recorded later in the day. Koche has been interrogating to ascertain from where the teakwood logs came from, where the logs were loaded on the police van and to whom it was planned to be delivered in Bhubaneswar. It is pertinent to mention, a team of forest officials had recovered more than 100 teakwood logs from the police van following a thorough inspection of the vehicle early Wednesday morning at a check gate near Ramasagar Square in Paralakhemundi town of the district. Forest officials had also detained the police van (registration number OD-05 AK-5733) in which the teakwood logs were being carried. 

Ex-Cong MP Pradeep Groundwater level depleting in 6 blocks

Jaipur, Nov 6: Groundwater levels have been depleting in six blocks of the state. The precarious condition was reflected in a recently published Groundwater Resources Assessment Report-2020.

A report was jointly prepared by Odisha State Level Committee (SLC) and the Central High Level Expert Group (HLEG), which stated the condition to be 'semi-critical'. The six blocks are Korei in Jajpur, Baliapal in Balasore, Garadpur in Kendrapara, Bhubaneswar and Bolagarh in Khurda and Nuapada district, the report stated.

According to the GWRA report, 18,79,150.53 hectare/metre (HM) of groundwater gets recharged in Odisha every year. Out of which, 1,53,173.16 HM goes deeper into the ground and is wasted.

On the other hand, 7,01,866.01 HM (amounting to nearly 40.66 per cent) is used for different purposes, of which 5,57,330.55 HM is used in a year for irrigation, 15,684.44 HM is used by industrial units and 1,28,851.02 HM is used for household purposes.



Besides, 302 blocks in the state are in better condition in respect of groundwater level and six more have saline water, the report read.

At present, the Korei block in Jajpur has groundwater of 8,730.67 HM, of which 7,549.86 HM (amounting to nearly 86.48 per cent) is being used in a year for various purposes. Out of the total groundwater used in Jajpur district, 6,868.71 HM is used for irrigation of farmlands.

Out of the total resources available in respective districts, 86.30 per cent of groundwater is used in Baliapal block, 74.67 per cent in Garadpur block, 80.34 per cent in Bhubaneswar, 80.37 per cent in Bolagarh and 75.35 per cent in Nuapada, the report mentioned.

Based on the report, Secretary of the Ministry of Water Resources and River Development Pankaj Kumar has recently written a letter to Chief Secretary Suresh Chandra Mohapatra requesting the latter to take appropriate steps $\,$ for the restoration of groundwater

Ganjam: NGT directs action plans for five water bodies

Chhatrapur, Nov 6: Five major water bodies in Ganjam have been polluted while the district administration has been directed to prepare action plans for these water bodies including Humuri Tampara lake, a report said.

According to the report, an order (OAN-325/2015) of the National Green Tribunal(NGT) is not being executed for the water bodies. Some guidelines set by the NGT are not being followed in case of these water bodies

Humuri Tampara lake in Chhatraur block is spread over 337.857 acres; Daha

reservoir in Bhanjanagar is spread over 96.71 acres; Jilundi pond in Bhanjanagar in 15.23 acres; Kendraghai pond in Khallikote block in 27.279 acres and Jagannath Sagar in Chikiti block in 20.895 acres

The NGT had issued an order for protection, cleanliness and renovation of these water bodies.

Taking serious note of the issue, secretary of the water resources department Anu Garg has issued a letter to the Ganiam Collector November 5, directing him to prepare separate action plans for renovation of these water bodies. In the letter, it was stated that the Collector should hold a meeting with the chief engineer and the executive engineer of the water resources department and work out separate action plans by November 15.

The action plans would focus on aspects like expanse of the water bodies, their users, quality test of the water, causes of pollution and setting up of treatment plants.

BJP's incomplete Hindu Rashtra

For many years, I had the opportunity to visit and study Pakistan and also to write for its newspapers. My special interest was in the 20 years period just after the creation of Bangladesh till the exit of the President General Zia ul Haq. For the 30 years before that time, Pakistan had attempted to Islamise itself but had not been able to.

Even today, Pakistan's laws are the same as India's and the residents of Lahore and Karachi and Peshawar are familiar with things like Sections 420, 302 and 144. This is because the subcontinent's criminal laws were written by an Englishman named Macaulay in the 19th century. In Dhaka, as in Delhi, even today the Section invoked for promoting enmity is 153a.

In that two decade period of the 1970s and 1980s, Pakistan tried to change this. It introduced what was thought to be Quranic or Islamic punishment. This included public flogging (80 lashes) for those who drank alcohol, and at the other end it included stoning to death for adultery. The punishment for theft and robbery was chopping off of the right hand from the wrist. In case of a second offence by the same person, his foot from the ankle down was to be amputated. Pakistan's terrified doctors were given some training in how to do this, but these punishments were never implemented. Nobody has been stoned to death in Pakistan and nobody's hand or foot has been cut off. The punishments remained on the book but the State, which was a modern one with modern judges trained in common law just like India's judiciary, was unable to implement the new punishments. Indeed, as the years went by Pakistan actually secularised its law. Under President General Pervez Musharraf, some of the offences, in-

The reason of course is that there is no alternative to the modern State with laws that are in alignment with freedom as the whole democratic world understands that word. The reason for talking about this here is that India is today going through the same sort of period that Pakistan did in those 20 years. India is today excluding its minorities from politics just as our neighbour did. There is no Muslim Chief Minister in India today and no Muslim Lok Sabha MP in the ruling party's 303 members. In 15 states there is no Muslim minister at all. Muslims cannot today pray in designated areas for their prayer in the capital of India. Their mosques are constantly targeted.

Several states that are ruled by the BJP have introduced after 2014 laws that specifically target minorities, especially Muslims. After the Prime Minister's encouragement, the then BJP-ruled state of Maharashtra and then Haryana criminalised the possession of beef, leading to a sequence of lynchings which continues, though it has dropped out of the news cycle. In Gujarat, the punishment for cattle slaughter is life imprisonment though it is supposed to be an eco-

Interfaith marriage between Hindus and Muslims has been criminalised in the BJP states of Uttarkhand (in 2018), Himachal Pradesh (2019), Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh (2020) and Gujarat (2021). Madhya Pradesh said this week that it will replicate a 2020 law from UP aimed at seizing the property of protestors. The UP law came after the state killed several Muslims protesting against the Citizenship Amendment Act. The CAA of course is also a law targeting Muslims and, along with the National Register of Indian Citizens, is a pincer aimed at doing to minorities everywhere what has been done in Assam.

Those who studied Pakistan in that period that is being referred to will be familiar with the intent of such legislations as India has passed in the Modi years. They are not aimed at the betterment of Hindu society and do not seek to uplift those in that community who are marginalised or poor. These are laws that are written out of hate and intolerance. A judiciary that is frightened or complicit (or perhaps both) has refused to step in on these laws and has been truant even on the issue of habeas corpus for Muslims in Kashmir.

The question is: how long will this continue and what is the final destination that India is being led to? The answer is that it will not continue long. Pakistan's two decades of Islamisation was in another era. India's legal misbehaviour with its own citizens will last perhaps half that time. And of course the answer to the second question is that there is no final destination. One the venom has been expended, India will limp back to where it was before 2014. That may not have been an ideal time but things will get better from there. The modern world will not accommodate bigotry of the sort India is showing the world today. The Hindutva project will fail and just like Pakistan is an incomplete Islamic republic, India will remain an incomplete Hindu Rashtra.



FACEBOOK'S DISASTERS

¶he ugly American," the title of a novel published in 1958 by Eugene Burdick and William Lederer, entered the language to refer to boorish American officials abroad who sought to improve the lives of natives without taking the trouble to learn their language, culture, or needs. A long line of ugly Americans, mostly politicians and government officials from both parties, have believed that applying simple formulas based on idealised versions of US institutions - democracy, markets, and human rights - could convert long-suffering places like Afghanistan and Iraq into Westernstyle consumer utopias. Inevitably, these Americans caused more harm than good.

Today, the ugliest of all Americans is not a government official but a private citizen, the CEO of Facebook, Mark Zuckerberg. Zuckerberg has received an endless stream of criticism because of Facebook's lamentable impact on American politics and culture. Less attention has been given to Facebook's impact on foreign markets, which Zuckerberg recklessly penetrated with no evident concern about the possible consequences of conducting massive social experiments in countries with weak institutions and histories of instability.

Back in 2015, Zuckerberg teamed up with the musician Bono to advocate a human right to Internet access. The all-too-common belief among America's business elite that one's economic self-interest coincides with the global good appeared as a paean to cyberspace that the duo wrote for the New York Times.

In Ethiopia and Tanzania, for example, farmers connect to get better prices, track inventory and make mobile insurance payments in case of bad weather. In Nigeria, citizens use BudgIT, a mobile app, to assess whether governments keep their spending promises. In Guatemala, cellphones inform mothers how to have healthy pregnancies. In Kenya, women receive financial services via their cellphones thanks to the brilliant M-Pesa microfinance scheme.

Reality has turned out a bit different. In Ethiopia, Facebook posts "incite[d] mob violence, ethnic

clashes, and crackdowns on independent press or outspoken voices." In Nigeria, Facebook users circulated grisly images of dead bodies, which were falsely presented to suggest that members of one ethnic group massacred members of a rival ethnic group, and sparked a wave of horrific killings. In a country with 24 million Facebook users, only four people were employed to fact-check Facebook posts.

In Myanmar, Facebook accounts were used to stir up ethnic violence against the Rohingya, tens of thousands of whom have been killed and many more driven into exile. In India, Facebook users stirred up sectarian violence, including lynching, against Muslims. Similar accounts of Facebook being used to inflame conflict and provoke massacres have been given for Sri Lanka, Yemen, Iraq, and Bangladesh. And in many other countries, from Vietnam to Poland, governments or their supporters have used Facebook to target, harass, and endanger dissidents, political opponents, and vulnerable minorities.

In the Times piece, Zuckerberg was touting Internet access, not Facebook itself. But by now we know that Internet access and Facebook are intertwined, both in Zuckerberg's plan and in reality. In many countries, Facebook and its properties, Instagram and WhatsApp, are the dominant social

media platforms, as they are in the United States. Both the Internet and Facebook

have done very well since that article was published. From 2015 to today, the percentage of the global population with Internet access increased from 41% to 66%, while Facebook's monthly active user base increased from 1.49 to 2.89 billion. While the extent of Facebook's contribution to the erosion of democracy and human rights over this period is unknown, the platform has clearly played a role in some of the worst atrocities around the globe, and in the coarsening of political life virtually everywhere.

But while Zuckerberg's goal of "building a global community," as he put it in 2017, resembles American foreign policy (or at least American foreign policy before it was reduced to ashes in Iraq and Afghanistan), Facebook is of course a private entity. It is subject to American jurisdiction and not the other way around. The chastened US foreign policy establishment, along with Congress and the President, might consider whether America owes it to the world to rein in Facebook, to the extent possible, in countries that lack the institutional capacity to rein it in themselves

A few possible reforms suggest themselves. The US Congress could pass a law that requires American social media companies to devote resources to monitor and factcheck content in foreign countries in proportion to the amount they spend on these activities in the US. (Facebook currently devotes

vastly more resources in the US.) Another possible law would allow foreigners to bring lawsuits in US courts when American social media companies spread misinformation and hate speech, as defined under local law. While such a law would be challenged under the First Amendment, courts may give Congress more latitude to reg ulate speech abroad than at home, especially when doing so shows comity with foreign countries. And Congress could enact a law that imposes penalties on social media companies that are shown to have recklessly contributed to, or failed to stop, major atrocities that were facilitated by their platforms.

The title of Burdick and Lederer's novel actually referred ironically to one of the few good Americans in the story. The negative meaning stuck because the shorthand was more useful: the bad type of American greatly outnumbered the good. And now, thanks in part to Facebook's foreign policy, the ugly American is everywhere.

The main reason for increasing unemployment today is technological change. This has happened many times in human history. The invention of automobiles led to the unemployment of horse-drawn cart runners. However, in course of time more roads were constructed for running cars, more jobs were created for manufacture and repair of cars and this led to higher growth rate and creation of more employment. The total employment in the transport sector in the age of automobiles would be more than the employment for runners for horse-drawn carriages. Similarly. we can see large number of jobs being lost to robots and artificial intelligence (AI) today. Whether these technologies will lead to generation of more employment as it was for the repair of cars, will depend on how much increase in growth rate will take place due to these technologies and whether new jobs are created in these new sectors. Unlike in the past, it is nevertheless possible that robots and artificial intelligence will lead to less

eration of employment leading to an increase in unemployment.

The second reason for increased unemployment is that the manufacturing sector is increasingly being undertaken by large industries where production is undertaken by automatic machines. Thus, higher growth rate is leading to fewer employment opportunities. The production of jaggery, for example, required large number of workers previously. Only 10 per cent of those may be required in manufacturing the same amount of sweeteners in a sugar mill. The crucial point is that new technologies displace labour directly but may yet lead to an increase in employment if there is high increase in the GDP. We cannot hope that the market will generate sufficient employment in this situation.

The first step the government needs to take is to reform the educational system. The difficulty is that at present most youth are interested only in obtaining certificates that would enable them to get a government job. The wages of government employees are so high that a primary teacher with fewer

skills may earn ₹70,000 per month, while a more skilled nurse or a data entry operator without a government job may earn as little as ₹15,000 per month. As a result, the youth are not interested in obtaining skills like nursing and data entry operator. They only join educational courses for obtaining certificates. The only way to get the youth to obtain skills is to reduce the wages of the government servants so that the attraction of a government job is reduced and the youth get interested in obtaining skills that would enable them to earn in the private sector.

The second step is to loosen the labour laws in the organised sector. There is a huge tendency to use automatic machines and less labour because labour losses are rigid and it becomes very difficult for an employer to remove a worker even if he/she is undisciplined, inefficient or not required. A study undertaken by the World Bank in East Asian countries showed that more jobs were created in those countries where labour losses were flexible. Therefore, the government should reform the labour laws and

make it possible for businessmen to hire and fire workers as per their requirements. This will encourage the businesses to use workers instead of computers and machines.

The third step required is to provide fiscal incentives to the small industries. The cost of production of small industries is higher than the large industries because of economies of scale. They cannot face competition from big industries in a free market. Therefore, the government should reduce the GST on goods produced by small industries so that they can stand competition from large industries. This will enable small industries to grow and they will generate more employment.

The present policy of the government is to let the market generate employment spontaneously. However, this is not happening and I don't think economist of the Niti Aayog have any solution to provide jobs to the 120 lakh youths entering the labour market every year.

KANPUR MEGA IRRIGATION PROJECT

Oustees take up R&R issues with NCST

Joda, Nov 6: Problems related to rehabilitation and resettlement of project-affected people of Kanpur mega irrigation project continue to remain unresolved with the administration evicting one village after another in Keonjhar. The displaced people have taken up the issue with the National Commission for Scheduled Tribes, seeking justice, a report said.

The National Commission for Scheduled Tribes (NCST) has become active on the issue. Most of the project affected villages are inhabited tribals. A five-member delegation of the oustees led by member of the NCST Anant Nayak visited the project site in Basudevpur under Joda block Thursday.

The delegation first visited Murusuan and Chamakpur and took stock of the rehabilitation activities by the state government for the oustees.

Four families of Murusuan have moved the court seeking rehabilitation along with a provision of farmlands. The court had also ordered the administration to evict the families only after their rehabilitation and provision of farmlands. However, it was alleged that

the court order has not been carried out. The houses of these oustees have been pulled down to make space for project work.

Members of these four families had appealed to the NCST about their plight. The NCST member visited the village to look into the matter. Nayak saw as houses of the four families have been demolished, they have been living under open sky for some months. One the family members was a pregnant woman.

The delegation expressed its displeasure over the miserable condition these evicted families are living in. They live under polythene sheets. Women after delivery live in a deplorable condition along with her newborn.

The team also visited Dhubulabeda rehabilitation colony. The team members saw that construction work of the colony has not

been completed while villages have not been provided land pattas for

their homestead land. The colony has not been made habitable for the oustees while basic infrastructure like road connectivity, drinking water, school building, club house, Anganwadi centre, a place of worship, and cremation ground have not been made.

The administration has identified the colony for rehabilitation of people displaced from Bikikala, Dadhuan and Gobindapur: It was said that as basic facilities have not been put in place at the colony, people are not keen to set up their houses.

Meanwhile, the administration told people of the three villages that police will carry out the evic-

Project affected people alleged before the team that the Collector has been given a report about completion of all construction works at the colony in 2019, but in reality many works have been left incomplete.

Nayak later held a meeting with official of the irrigation project and local people and sought to know about the steps taken for their livelihood, economic and cultural development

Keonjhar: 2-yr-old crushed under wall

The deceased was identified as Sourabh Mahakud, son of Chhalu Mahakud of Golabandh Mahakud Sahi. According to a source. labourers were pulling down the walls of the old house of Chhalu. Unaware of the danger, Sourabh was playing near the house. The family members were busy otherwise. All of a sudden, a portion of the wall fell on him. He was rescued and immediately rushed to Jagamohanpur primary health centre (PHC). He was then shifted to Telkoi community health centre. The doctors there declared him received dead.

3 villages demand roads, bridge

Koraput: People of three villages under Boipariguda block in Koraput have been suffering in the absence of basic facilities like road, bridges, healthcare and education. They have drawn attention of the district administration towards their plight. People of Atalguda, Janguguda and Jhaliaguda have demanded immediate intervention of the district administration for development works. "As there is no bridge across a creek, we have to face commuting problems throughout the year. We appeal to the administration to build roads and a bridge in the area," they said.

Kendrapara, Nov 6: Absence of employment opportunities, lack of farm work and low agricultural income have combined to trigger distress migration in this district, a report said.

The main economic activity of Kendrapara district is agriculture. There are no mines or industries to help the residents earn their livelihood. However, due to lack of farm productivity coupled with low agricultural income, youths in the district migrate to other states in search of greener pastures. As a result, the lands are lying uncultivated.

The problem of unemployment can be gauged from the fact that over 57,000 technically qualified youths and graduates have registered their names in the district employment exchange but they are yet to get any employment opportunities.

The claim is not unfounded after several youths were recently seen boarding a private passenger bus for Kerala at Gupti under Rajnagar block. Locals alleged that buses from Kerala and Tamil Nadu frequently visit the district and pick up youths to work in various units.

Moreover, many women and minor girls migrate to other states in search of jobs. A private estimate says that youths from 51 per cent of families living in Rajnagar, Mahakalapara, Aul, Pattamundai, and Rajnagar blocks have migrated to other states. They migrate to other states and end up being tortured and exploited in those firms where they are engaged.

Reports said youths migrating to other states have a sorry tale to tell. Sudarshan Rout of sea-erosion hit Satabhaya panchayat of Rainagar block said he is forced to leave for other states to earn livelihood for him and his family.

Bharat Behera said they were living in Satabhaya and were earning their livelihood by tilling the farmland. However, they were forced to leave the area as seven villages in the panchayat were washed away into the sea due to constant sea erosion. The district administration has shifted 571 families to nearby Bagapatia. They were robbed of their livelihood after the farmlands were washed away.

The state government provides them with ration with which they can survive hardly for a fortnight. Moreover, the price rise of essentials has severely affected them. They find it hard to meet the expenses of their family and the costs of studies of their children and other needs for which he is leaving for Kerala with a hope of better earning.

Sarojkanta Swain of Gupti said he works in a plywood factory at Perumvur in Ernakulam district while others work in cotton mills, fish farms in those states. He returns home during Ganesh Puja and leave for Kerala after Lakhsmi Puja or Kali Puja.

He said back to back natural calamities have robbed the sheen of agriculture while people withdraw from cultivation due to lack of government incentives.

Moreover, youths leave for Kerala, Tamil Nadu and Surat due to lack of industries in the district. Industrial firms which were lying closed in other states due to

Covid pandemic have opened now.

The respective firms have made arrangements for buses to pick them for other states. He said had there been any job opportunities in the district they would have never gone work in other states. He said this problem could be resolved if the government establishes small and medium scale industries in the district and promote cultivation of disaster resistance crops.

'Waze, Singh extorted huge money from cricket bookies'

Mumbai, Nov 6: Mumbai Police officer (now dismissed) Sachin Waze, along with the then city Police Commissioner Param Bir Singh extorted huge money from cricket bookies by threatening them with arrest, police told a court here while seeking an extension of Waze's custody in an extortion case registered at suburban Goregaon police station.

The Mumbai Police's Crime Branch had taken Waze's custody November 1 based on the complaint filed by builder-cum-hotelier Bimal Agrawal, in which Param Bir Singh is also named as

Waze was produced before a holiday court Saturday as his remand expired. Police sought an extension of his custody for seven days for further probe, which was allowed by the court till November 13. Police told the court that Waze and the wanted accused Param Bir Singh extorted a huge amount of money from cricket bookies by threatening them with arrest.

How this was done has to be investigated, the court was told.

The Crime Branch further said they wanted to probe whether Waze took money from anyone else at the instance of Singh and who else. apart from Singh, helped Waze in extortion. The crime branch said it wanted to probe the trail of the extorted money.

The Crime Branch also wants to probe how many other such offences have been committed by the

Waze is close to Param Bir Singh and the Crime Branch wants to question him on the current where abouts of the senior IPS officer, it said, adding the complainant's (Agrawal's) voice samples have been sent for a forensic test and wit ness statements have been recorded.

Mobile phones given to Sachin Waze by the complainant as part of the extortion have also been seized, police said.

Agrawal had alleged that the accused extorted ₹9 lakh from him for not conducting a raid on two bars and restaurants, which he ran in partnership, and also forced him to buy two smartphones worth around ₹2.92 lakh for them.

The alleged incident occurred between January 2020 and March 2021, police had said.

One of the absconding accused, Alpesh Patel, was arrested from Mehsana railway station in Gujarat, the crime branch said.

Patel destroyed a mobile phone and a SIM card used during the offence, Hence, Section 201 of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) has been invoked on the ground that possible evidence in the offence has been destroyed, it said.

According to the Crime Branch, Waze has volunteered to give his voice sample while in custody which was recorded in the presence of two.

It told the court that Waze is not cooperating and giving evasive replies when questioned about the extorted money. He is not giving relevant information, the crime branch said. Waze's lawver Rounak Naik said they agreed to (extension) of Waze's custody as he "volunteered" to cooperate with the probe agency.

Waze, 49, was in judicial custody after his arrest in March by the National Investigation Agency (NIA) in the 'Antilia' bomb scare and businessman Mansukh Hiran murder case. On Agrawal's complaint, a case was registered under Indian Penal Code Sections 384 and 385 (both pertaining to extortion) and 34 (common intention) against the six accused including Waze, Singh, Sumit Singh alias Chintu, Alpesh Patel, Vinay Singh alias Babloo and Rivaz Bhati.

Ready to 'relocate' evicted families: Assam THE EVICTED FAMILIES OF DHALPUR VILLAGES

IN GORUKUTI WILL NOT, HOWEVER, BE PAID ANY **COMPENSATION AS THEY ARE "ENCROACHERS"**

Guwahati, Nov 6: The Assam government said it has earmarked about 134 hectare for relocating the evicted families of Gorukhuti in Darrang district provided they are valid citizens besides a set of other requirements.

The evicted families of Dhalpur villages in Gorukuti will not, however, be paid any compensation as they are "encroachers", the government said in an affidavit to Gauhati High Court in response to a PIL filed by the Leader of the Opposition Debabrata Saikia.

"An area of about 1,000 bighas (about 134 hectares) of land in the southern part of No 1 & No 3 Dhalpur village has been earmarked for relocating the evicted persons subject to verification of the status of erosion affected and landless status in their respective original places and districts, citizenship and existing rehabilitation policy of the state," the affidavit by the gov-

Sipajhar Revenue Circle Officer Kamaljeet Sarma, representing the Assam government, said in the affidavit that the occupants of the areas were encroachers and they were "liable to be evicted at any time" as per rules framed under Assam Land and Revenue Regulation, 1886.

'The matter is related to encroachment and eviction only and is not at all related to acquisition of land. Therefore, the question of resettlement, rehabilitation and compensation etc as per Land Acquisition Act is irrelevant,' he added. Besides Saikia's case the Gauhati High Court had itself registered a suo motu PIL after the violent eviction drive at Sipajhar and both the matters were clubbed together.

The Gauhati High Court bench, headed by Chief Justice Sudhanshu Dhulia and Justice Kakheto Sema, heard the matter Wednesday and granted one week's time to the state government for filing a detailed counter affidavit and fixed December 14 for the next hearing.

The court also noted the state government's assurance that as of now for the remaining alleged



encroachers no coercive measure is being adopted as efforts are being made to convince them to move to the demarcated area on their own. "All the same, as and when such measures are adopted, the petitioner would be at liberty to move an application before this Court," the order said.

When contacted, Saikia's counsel Talha Abdul Rahman told PTI that there is a due process to detain foreigners. "You cannot just evict people from their homes on suspicion of being foreigners and later make their rehabilitation contingent on proof of citizenship. "NRC is not published and the state doubts the correctness of NRC drive. How does it then rely on the same NRC to exclude people?" he asked. According to different accounts, around 1,200-1,400 houses were razed to the ground September 20 and September 23 at Dhalpur I, II and III villages in Gorukhuti, leaving over 7,000 people homeless. Village markets, mosques, kabarstans, madrassas

and maktubs were also bulldozed The eviction drive had passed off peacefully on the first day but met stiff resistance by local people on the second instance and also left two dead in a police firing September 23. Among the dead was a 12-year-old boy who had got his first identity proof, an Aadhaar card, before he was shot dead. Over 20 people were injured, including policemen.

"The analysis of bank data on 'Core Banking Solutions' (CBS) and the statements of key persons recorded during the search action has revealed the glaring irregularities in opening the bank accounts." "More than 1,200 new bank accounts were opened in the said branch without PAN. The investigations have revealed that these bank accounts were opened without following KYC norms and all account opening forms are filled in by the bank staff and they have put their signature or thumb impressions." As per the statement, in all these accounts, multiple cash deposits each of exact denomination of ₹1.9 lakh, were made to-

talling to ₹53.72 crore. "Out of these, more than 700 bank accounts have been identified which were opened in series, where cash deposits of more than ₹34.10 crore were made immediately within 7 days of opening of bank accounts mainly during the

period August 2020 to May 2021." "These deposits have been structured to avoid mandatory PAN requirement for cash deposits over ₹2 lakh. The money has been subse-

New Delhi, Nov 6: The newly constituted Special Investigation Team (SIT) led by Narcotics Control Bureau Deputy Director General Sanjay Singh Saturday started probe in six drug cases including of Aryan Khan lodged with Mumbai Zonal office. Singh, a 1996 batch IPS officer, will

take over the investigation of all six cases which were headed earlier by Zonal Director Sammer Wankhede including the sensational cruise ship party raid of October 2 in which Aryan Khan, son of Hindi film megastar Shah Rukh Khan, was arrested.

On Friday, the NCB constituted an SIT headed by Singh to probe into these cases and removed Wankhede from the investigating team a week after the agency initiated probe into the alleged allegations of bribery and extortion against him. The NCB statement issued Friday

Nagaland to take up coffee cultivation

Kohima, Nov 6: To create employment and to stop unscientific farming of crops, Nagaland has taken up coffee cultivation in a big way with a target to expand its farming to 50,000 hectares by 2030 from the existing 10,000 hectares, Agriculture Production Commissioner Y Kikheto Sema said.

Sema said that the hills of Nagaland are now growing organic coffee, which is not only being sold locally but exported to the international markets.

He said that coffee was introduced to the farmers of Nagaland in the 1980s but lack of market linkages and other factors forced the farmers to give up the cultivation. The Land Resources department headed by Sema in 2016 again decided to revive coffee cultivation and learn about the new varieties of coffee seeds, how to plant and grow them in the cool and hilly climate of Nagaland.

"Nagaland currently cultivates coffee in nearly 10,000 hectares of land and it is taking steps to expand it to 50,000 hectares by 2030. Mumbai, Nov 6: India's media and entertainment earnings fell by a quarter to \$18.7 billion last year, according to accounting firm EY, and most multiplex chains suffered major losses.

But the industry is anticipating a rebound with theaters now back in business across the country, most recently in Bollywood capital Mumbai.

Hindi film "Sooryavanshi" starring top names Akshay Kumar and Ranveer Singh - is the first marquee Hindi film to be released on the big screen in 18 months.

Delayed since the start of the pandemic, Kumar stars as an antiterrorism chief working to stop an attack in Mumbai.

Its performance at the box office will be seen as a litmus test of whether audiences will flock back to cinemas in the world's most prolific movie market.

'This film is very crucial for the film industry," Rajender Singh Jyala, chief programming officer for the country's second-largest cinema chain INOX, told this news

"The buzz is also very good." 'The biggest films' India is currently celebrating Diwali, the country's biggest Hindu festival, and traditionally what

film distributor Akshave Rathi said was a "very lucrative time" for "Traditionally, it's when the biggest films release," he told AFP.

Also debuting this week will be "Eternals," the latest installment in Hollywood's Marvel franchise and the colorful drama "Annaatthe" featuring Tamil superstar Rajinikanth. Fans excited about "Annaatthe"

"For the coming releases, we hope (and) wish for the best.'

In a country where going to the movies has long been a central fixture of cultural life, the pandemic's theater closures prompted a surge in subscriptions to streaming platforms. US giants Netflix, Amazon's Prime Video and Disney's Hotstar have rushed to tap into the growth in online audiences as smartphone

adoption rises. But Jyala of INOX said cinema owners were unfazed by the competition.

"People are coming back to theaters... and there are several more big titles in the pipeline," he added.

Anil Deshmukh sent to 14-day iudicial custody

Mumbai, Nov 6: A special holiday court here Saturday remanded former Maharashtra Home Minister Anil Deshmukh in 14day judicial custody in connection with an alleged money laundering case.

The Enforcement Directorate (ED), probing the case, sought his remand for nine more days, but the court refused the probe agency's plea and sent him to judicial custody. Deshmukh was arrested by the ED late Monday night after 12 hours of questioning. A court had on Tuesday remanded him in the agency's custody till November 6.

He was produced before the special at the end of his ED custody. The money laundering case against Deshmukh and others was made out after the CBI booked him in a corruption case related to allegations of at least Rs 100 crore bribery made by former Mumbai police commissioner Param Bir Singh.

Besides, the ED had initiated a probe against Deshmukh and his associates after the CBI filed its FIR against the NCP leader on April 21 on charges of corruption and misuse of official position.

The ED's case is that Deshmukh, while serving as home minister, misused his official position and through dismissed cop Sachin Waze collected Rs 4.70 crore from various bars and restaurants in Mumbai.

Besides Deshmukh, the ED has arrested his two aides - Kundan Shinde and Sanjeev Palande - in connection with the case. The duo is currently in judicial custody.

"There is a concerted attempt by vested interests to malign the functioning of the Congress party in view of coming elections in Punjab for their selfish political gain by politicking the constitutional office of the Advocate General of Punjab," he added.

Sidhu, the Amritsar East MLA, has been opposing Deol's appointment as the state AG and Iqbal Preet Singh Sahota's as DGP. Both Deol and Sahota are considered Chief Minister Charanjit Singh Channi's choices.

Last month, Sidhu had said that the Congress would have "no face" if the AG and DGP were not removed. Deol had represented former Punjab DGP Sumedh Singh Saini in cases related to the 2015 sacrilege incidents and police firing on protesters, while Sahota was the head of the special investigation team formed by the previous SAD-BJP government to probe the sacrilege incidents.

Women's rights activist shot dead

Kabul: A 29-year-old rights activist and lecturer of economics has been shot dead in northern Afghanistan. in what appears to be the first known death of a women's rights defender since the Taliban swept to power almost three months ago, The Guardian reported. Parliament nod to euthanasia

Lisbon: Lawmakers in Portugal voted to legalise euthanasia by approving a revised bill that fixed objections raised earlier by the Constitutional Court. The vote was 138 in favour, 84 against and five abstentions. The original bill was vetoed by President Marcelo Rebelo de Sousa in March. The new law specifies the conditions under which medically assisted death is not punishable, thus changing the country's Penal Code. The rules are quite restrictive, and only people over 18, who are Portuguese citizens or foreigners legally resident in the country, can resort to euthanasia, the practice of intentionally ending life to relieve pain and suffering.

25 IS militants surrender in Af

Jalalabad: A total of 25 militants affiliated with the hardliner Islamic State (IS) laid down arms and surrendered to authorities in Jalalabad Saturday, head of intelligence agency in Afghanistan's eastern Nangarhar province Mohammad Bashir said. The former militants were active in Spinghar, Pachiragam and Batikot districts, and the security forces would further stabilize the situation in Nangarhar and its vicinity, Xinhua news agency reported quoting Mohammad Bashir.

Berlin, Nov 6: A knife attack on a high-speed train in Germany has injured several people, police confirmed Saturday morning.

Local police told The Associated Press that they received a call about the attack around 9 am local time Saturday.

The train in question, one of Germany's high-speed ICE trains, was travelling between the Bayarian cities of Regensburg and Nuremberg at the time of the attack.

One man has been arrested in connection with the attack at the train station in Seubersdorf, where the train is currently stopped, police said. Police said multiple people were injured but were unable to provide a specific number. Around 200 people were removed

from the train and taken to a local restaurant for refreshments, according to German broadcaster Bayerischer Rundfunk. Interior Minister Horst Seehofer

said the background behind the "terrible" attack was "still unclear" and is "now being clarified." He said people in in Seubersdorf,

a municipality is located about 473 kilometres south of Berlin, faced no "acute danger."

Pak HC acquits six JuD leaders

Lahore, Nov 6: The Lahore High Court Saturday set aside a trial court's conviction and acquitted six senior leaders of Mumbai attack mastermind Hafiz Saeed's banned Jamat-ud-Dawah (JuD) in a terror financing case.

Saeed-led JuD is the front organisation for the proscribed Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT), the terror outfit responsible for carrying out the 2008 Mumbai attack that killed 166 people, including six Americans

The anti-terrorism court Lahore in April this year had handed nineyear imprisonment each to JuD senior leaders – Prof. Malik Zafar Iqbal, Yahya Mujahid (JuD spokesperson), Nasarullah, Samiullah and Umar Bahadur and six months' jail term to Hafiz Abdul Rehman Makki (brotherin-law of Saeed) after an FIR was registered by the Counter Terrorism Department (CTD) of the Punjab Police.

The trial court had found these leaders guilty of terror financing. They had been collecting funds and unlawfully financing the proscribed organisation Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT). It had also ordered the confiscation of assets made from funds collected through ter-

Freetown (Sierra Leone), Nov 6: An oil tanker truck exploded near Sierra Leone's capital, killing at least 98 people and severely injuring dozens of others after large crowds gathered to collect leaking fuel, officials and witnesses said Saturday.

The explosion took place late Friday when the tanker collided with another truck as it was pulling into a gas station near a busy intersection in Wellington, just east of the capital of Freetown, according to the National Disaster Management Agency.

"Both drivers came out of their vehicles and warned community residents to stay off the scene while trying to address a leakage emanating from the collision," the agency said. In this deeply impoverished

country, however, crowds still rushed in to scoop up fuel, witnesses said. It was not immediately known

what caused the leaking fuel to ignite but a massive explosion soon

India's absence from the event

that kicked off Thursday, for unclear reasons, also contrasts with robust growth in China-India bilateral trade this year, a trend that is increasingly irresistible for the South Asian economy despite its growing political hostility toward China, experts said, as per the report. The number of Indian companies that attend the CIIE has been decreasing progressively in recent years and dropped to zero at this year's CIIE, according to an official catalog of participants for

The catalog of 4th CIIE exhibitors displayed at the exhibition halls showed that no Indian company is listed. A search for Indian exhibitors in the expo's digital cata-

logue, presented on the CIIEs' official website, also showed no results. At the second CIIE, India was one of the 15 guest-of-honour

The Global Times then saw around 10 small Indian pharmaceutical firms displaying their products at one of the expo venues. The booths were also crowded with visitors who asked about those products. Last year, the Global Times only found three Indian companies at the CIIE, one of which was a manufacturer of gift products.

Border disputes and New Delhi's intention to follow in the US' footsteps could by no means suppress India's reliance on a variety of Chinese goods such as auto parts and various small commodities. Wang Dehua, a senior South Asian affairs expert in Shanghai, told the Global Times Thursday.

In the first three quarters of 2021, China's trade with India soared 49.3 per cent to \$903.75 billion, according to Chinese customs data. The strong reading is believed to have paved the way for bilateral trade to top \$100 billion for the first time, achieving a target the two countries set in 2010, the

Oil gains as renewed supply concerns loom

Washington, Nov 6: Crude prices settled higher Friday fuelled by renewed supply concerns after OPEC+ producers rebuffed a US call to accelerate output increases even as demand nears pre-pandemic levels.

Brent crude rose \$2.20 to settle at \$82.74 per barrel, while US West Texas Intermediate crude (WTI) gained \$2.46 to \$81.27.

The Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries and allies including Russia, collectively known as OPEC+, agreed Thursday to stick to their plan to raise oil output by 400,000 barrels per day from December. US President Joe Biden had called for extra output to cool rising prices.



"OPEC's decision to stay the course and the Biden administration's lack of a substantial response has the oil rally continuing," said Bob Yawger, director of energy futures at Mizuho. Only a coordinated effort, with China and others involved, would address the

lack of barrels in the market, Yawger added

The White House said it would consider all tools at its disposal to guarantee affordable energy, including the possibility of releasing oil from strategic petroleum re-

"Markets know that the release of strategic reserves can only have a temporary bearish effect on prompt prices and is not a lasting solution for an imbalance between supply and demand," Rystad Energy head of oil markets Bjornar Tonhaugen said in a note.

Brent fell for a second straight week, slipping about two per cent, while WTI shed 2.7 per cent.

"While factors such as a very cold winter - which may drive the use of more oil for heating - could be supportive for prices, it will be tough for Brent to break above the \$87 mark," said Ann-Louise Hittle, vice president, oils research at consultancy Wood Mackenzie, noting a limited capacity for gas-to-oil switching despite the high price of the former.

Startup Odisha grants ₹92.76L to 12 firms



New Delhi, Nov 6: About half of the world's fossil fuel assets will be worthless by 2036 under a net-zero transition. The Guardian reported.

It highlights the risk of producing far more oil and gas than required for future demand, which is estimated to leave \$11tn-\$14tn in so-called stranded assets -- infrastructure, property and investments where the value has fallen so steeply they must be written off, the report said.

Countries that are slow to decarbonise will suffer but early movers will profit; the study finds that renewables and freed-up investment will more than make up for the losses to the global economy. a worst-case





Paris, Nov 6: Top seed Novak Djokovic might be out of pocket after trashing the floor of a Roland Garros gym but there was little else troubling the Serb after he opened his French Open bid Monday by dismantling Poland's **Hubert Hurkacz**

The 32-year-old, bidding for a second Roland Garros title and to become the first man in the professional era to hold all four Grand Slam titles on two separate occasions, mixed power and precision in equal measure to win 6-

Reigning champion Rafael Nadal, the man most likely to block Djokovic's path to a second "Nole Slam", had earlier launched his bid for a 12th title on the Parisian clay in sublime style.





But Diokovic more than matched the Spaniard's display with a near faultless performance in the afternoon sunshine on Court Philippe Chatrier to seal a 22nd consecutive win in Grand Slam play since losing in the quarter-finals here

Djokovic is bidding for his second title at Roland Garros having beaten Andy Murray in 2016 to hold all four Slams together and match Rod Laver's 1969 feat.

Since his first, the French Open has undergone a huge makeover and Djokovic said he is impressed with the revamp of Chatrier, hinting that it could give him a subtle

City pile more Old Trafford misery on Man United

Manchester, Nov 6: It took only seven minutes of the Manchester derby to be in no doubt about the parlous state of United. When Eric Bailly clumsily intercepted Joao Cancelo's cross to divert the ball into his own net, it was the start of another agonizing Old Trafford encounter with a now far superior rival.

The only surprise from Saturday's derby was United escaping with a 0-2 loss to Manchester City after Bernardo Silva met another delivery into the box from Cancelo, got ahead of Luke Shaw and beat goalkeeper David De Gea

at his near post in stoppage time Humiliation was avoided, two weeks after being routed 0-5 by Liverpool here, but it was another encounter to reinforce just how

far United has slipped behind the Premier League's elite.

It was so serene that Pep Guardiola didn't even make a single substitution. This was City's first Premier League win over United since March 2019 but in that time Guardiola's side has won the title twice, while the trophy hasn't been on the red half of Manchester

City and United do boast the world's most expensive football squads — each assembled for more than USD 1 billion — but that wouldn't be obvious watching in the lashing northern English rain.

On paper, six points now separate defending champion City in second from United in fifth. The gulf in quality, tactics and style looks greater, with City effortlessly cruising to victory.

It wasn't Guardiola's name City fans were singing at Old Trafford. They were mercilessly mocking Solskiaer: "Ole's at the wheel," they serenaded the United manager, sarcastically adopting the United

Solskjaer limps on in the job, with just one win from six league games. The only success came last Saturday against Tottenham, which acted swiftly to decide managerial change was required. And in firing Nuno Espirito Santo and hiring Antonio Conte.

Later in the day, Burnley denied Chelsea a home win at the Stamford Bridge. Kai Havertz put the league leaders in the lead on 33 minutes to put the fans in joy. However Matej Vydra (79th) struck the equaliser nine minutes after coming on as a substitute for Burnley.
