Jawad landfall near Puri 'My govt committed to

Bhubaneswar, Dec 3: Cyclonic storm 'Jawad' is likely to make landfall near Puri Sunday, the IMD said Friday.

The cyclonic storm is likely to reach the west-central Bay of Bengal off the coast of north Andhra Pradesh and Odisha by Saturday morning, IMD Director General Mrutyunjay Mohapatra said during a media briefing.

Thereafter, it is likely to recurve north-northeastwards, move along the coast of Odisha and adjoining Andhra Pradesh and touch the coast around Puri by December 5 noon, he said. The name of the cyclone - 'Jawad' -- has been proposed by Saudi Arabia.

Heavy rainfall which started in parts of north coastal Andhra Pradesh and south coastal Odisha by Friday evening, was likely to increase in intesity Saturday.

A red warning has been issued for Gajapati, Ganjam, Puri, Jagatsinghpur districts.

The wind speed will increase up to 100 kmph from Saturday evening for the subsequent 12 hours, the central MeT office said. The cvclonic storm will intensify into a severe cyclonic storm in the sea for a temporary period, with wind gusting to 110 kmph, Mohapatra said.

Speaking to reporters here, Special Relief Commissioner (SRC) PK Jena said, cyclonic storm Jawad is likely to make landfall somewhere in Puri district before head



"There's also a possibility of the cyclonic system changing its course, thus avoiding a landfall in Odisha. It could just pass along the coastline, with Puri experiencing a ruboff effect." the SRC said.

Jena said the state government is making necessary preparations to deal with eventualities in all coastal districts, with focus on

lief and rescue teams to the districts which are more likely to get affected by the cyclone and accompanying rain. The SRC, however, said that there is no possibility of flood due to heavy rainfall, but streets might get waterlogged, both in urban and rural areas of the coastal districts.

Meanwhile, Chief Secretary SC Mohapatra held a video conference with collectors of the vulnerable districts and suggested measures to tackle the effects of the approaching cyclone.

Sunday has been declared a working day for state government employees in the districts which are likely to be affected by the cvclonic storm, while schools in 19 districts will remain closed MORE ON P3 & P7

Bhubaneswar, Dec 3: Following continuous attack by the Opposition over the sensational Mamita Meher kidnap and murder case, Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik Friday broke his silence over the issue and slammed the Opposition for politicising the crime.

Making a statement in the Assembly, Patnaik said his government is fully committed to ensure justice to Mamita Meher.

"The death of Mamita Meher was a very sad and unfortunate incident and we are all deeply anguished and pained by this heinous crime. She was a young and bright daughter of Odisha, having a brilliant future. Her death is a terrible and irreparable loss. My heart goes out to the family of the victim," he said.

"My government will

see that the perpetrators of the crime are brought to justice as per law in the shortest possible time," Patnaik said.

"In the aftermath of this terrible incident, the manner in which this very sensitive and heinous crime has been politicised shocked me as well as the people of Odisha," he said. "I, as the Chief Minister of

Odisha have always worked to ensure justice for all especially for women and vulnerable sections of the society. Similarly, in this case we will move the competent court for fast track trial so that the perpetrators of the crime are brought to justice in the quickest possible time," Patnaik assured the House. "To bring about transparency in the investigation of this case my government had written to the Orissa High Court to appoint a sitting judge, or a retired judge of the court

New Delhi, Dec 3: The Union government Friday expressed difficulty in lifting surplus parboiled rice from Odisha stating that this category of rice is not in demand in other states.

While responding to a question by BJD MP Sasmit Patra in the Rajya Sabha, Union Consumer Affairs & Food

& Public Distribution Minister Piyush Goyal said that the Food Corporation of India (FCI) can only procure what is in demand. He said parboiled rice is not in demand in other states.

'We can only distribute the kind of rice that people want to eat. We cannot force people to eat a particular type of rice. The Food Corporation of India can only procure the kind of rice that is in requirement in other states. Since parboiled rice is not a requirement in other states, the FCI cannot procure the excess rice under the central pool," the Union minister said. He also informed the House that

Lockdown should be 'last resort' to curb Omicron: WHO

New Delhi, Dec 3: Imposing lockdown to curtail transmission of Omicron could prove to be very costly and should be used as a last resort, according to the World Health Organisation.

The new super mutant Covid variant, which contains more than 30 mutations on the spike protein

that the virus uses to infect human cells, has rapidly spread in South Africa and some other countries. "Strengthening surveillance to rapidly detect importation of any tinue to be our focus," WHO South-East Asia Regional Director, Dr Poonam Khetrapal Singh, said in a statement.

While studies are underway to evaluate Omicron's transmissibility, severity, reinfection risk, and immune escape potential, preliminary evidence suggest higher transmissibility and potential immune escape that could lead to surge in cases

However, "it is reasonable to assume that currently available vaccines offer protection against severe disease and death," Singh said.

She called for intensifying efforts to accelerate Covid-19 vaccination coverage, and applying a multi-layered risk mitigation approach to potentially delay export or import of the new variant.

Following the news about the Omicron variant from South Africa and Botswana, many countries including the US, and the UK, moved to bring in travel bans or quarantines for travellers from a number of African countries.

But, according to Singh, blanket travel bans will not prevent the international spread, and instead, they place a heavy burden on lives and livelihoods. In addition. such bans can adversely impact global health efforts during a pandemic by disincentivising countries to report and share epidemiological and sequencing data.

'The option of imposing lockdown to curtail virus transmission, though effective, is a very costly measure and should be used as a last resort."

"We cannot and should not let the virus and its variants spread and mutate further and continue to challenge us. We need to do everything we can to curtail their spread. We know what to do. The pandemic has lasted just too long and is draining our precious human and other resources. We need to stop this," the Regional Director said.

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Should we dump surplus rice in **Bay of Bengal: BJD to Centre**

New Delhi, Dec 3: Cautioning over countrywide farmers' agita tions, Biju Janata Dal (BJD) MP Prasanna Acharya Friday urged the Union government to start procuring parboiled rice from Odisha and other states and not create more problems for farmers.

Speaking during the Zero Hour in the Rajva Sabha, the senior BJD MP said that the surplus parboiled rice in Odisha this year will be of around 28 lakh tonnes. He informed the House that earlier, the Food Corporation of India was procuring all the surplus rice from states like Odisha and Telangana among others. The BJD MP said the Union government has given directives that not a single grain of parboiled rice will be procured from Odisha.

'When the entire country is in turmoil and farmers are agitating over their problems, you are adding another problem for them. If you are not going to procure

parboiled rice, should we throw all our surplus rice into the Bay of Bengal?" asked the BJD MP.

He also reminded the government that the Union Food and Civil Supplies minister had given

assurance in February that all surplus parboiled rice from Odisha will be procured by the Centre.

Verma said the district administration has put in place necessary measures to face the impending storm-Jawad-amid the Covid crisis. "Dry food, drinking water, cattle feed, gensets and medicines have been stored adequately. In a bid to curb chances of Covid spread among the evacuees, the shelters have been provided with adequate hand sanitisers and facemasks," said the Collector. According to Verma, Fire

Services, Electricity, Rural Development, Works department and medical teams have been readied to ensure expeditious evacuation and post-cyclone restoration. Dedicated block-level control rooms

women from Krushnaprasad, Brahmagiri, Puri Sadar, Gop, Kakatpur, Astaranga and Kanas areas have been shifted to their nearest healthcare facilities. Many elderly and children in the lowlying areas have been evacuated to safety, said the Collector.

He added that the regulated market committee has been asked to keep ready adequate quantity of tarpaulins. Block-level officials have been asked to ensure speedy assessment and reporting of cyclone damage, if any. Fishermen have been asked not to venture into the sea and to ensure safety of their boats. Jawad: 36 vulnerable points in Capital city POST NEWS NETWORK P

Bhubaneswar, Dec 3: The Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation (BMC) Friday identified 36 vulnerable points that are prone to waterlogging ahead of impending winter storm 'Jawad' that would hit Odisha coast Sunday.

This was revealed during a review meeting for smooth rescue, relief and restoration works in the Capital city.

BMC Commissioner Sanjay Singh held discussions with officials and field staffers from all 67 wards here and instructed them to identify potentially hazardous and low-lying settlements in their wards and evacuate citizens to nearby schools, cyclone shelters or safer places. Special focus was given on rescue of homeless and beggars who are spending nights under

the open sky.

"All officials must ensure that sufficient stock of dry foods like rice, chuda (flattened rice), guda (sugar molasses) and candles are in readiness. Arrangements should be made for providing cooked meals at all cyclone shelters. All essential workers should be provided with necessary resources to carry out the work efficiently. Leaves of all officials have been cancelled and instructions have been made to be prepared for any eventuality between December 3 and 6," Singh said.

There are 29 cyclone shelters in South-East Zone while South-West and North Zones have 21 and schools, colleges and community centres under BMC jurisdiction. Sources said concerned officers of District Education Office and District Welfare Office have been asked to remain alert.

BMC's Engineering Division has identified 36 vulnerable lowlying areas including Garage Chhak, Sarada Matha Lane, Sriram Nagar, Ratna Villa, Rabindra Garden and Paikanagar, and it is set to deploy water pumps to avoid waterlogging during this period.

Moreover, to meet any healthcare emergency, Additional District Urban Public Health Officer (ADUPHO) Antaryami Mishra has also been informed to keep power back up ready at Primary Health Centres and Community Health Centres from their own fund. Chief Municipal Medical Officer (CMMO)

Mining at Parabhadi hill for Puri facelift

LOCALS OPPOSE GOVT'S DECISION TO EXTRACT STONE FROM THE HILL HOUSING AN ANCIENT BUDDHIST STUPA

Jajpur, Dec 3: The state government has decided to mine Parabhadi hill at Bandareswar and Kesaraipur areas under Darpan tehsil in Jajpur for stones required in Puri beautification project, a source said Friday.

Meanwhile, locals in Jajpur have vehemently opposed the government's decision in this regard as Parabhadi hill is a historic site and has an ancient Buddhist stupa. It is on the verge of extinction due to lack of conservation and proper upkeep, they alleged.

"The historical stupa built in third century AD is the oldest of ancient Buddhist stupas in the Diamond Triangle of Jajpur district. The Archeological Survey of India (ASI) has not spent a single pie on its maintenance since its discovery,' Pradipta Kumar Bhuyan, a local, said

According to sources, the Odisha Mining Corporation (OMC) will carry out mining and arrange to send the excavated stones to Puri for the purpose.

It has been also decided that a patch of the hill area of around 114 acres at Sukhuapada under Bandareswar mouza and 47 acres under Kesaraipur mouza will be mined in the first phase.

Parabhadi Buddhist stupa was discovered at the same time when historians discovered the world famous Lalitgiri shrine and undertook its excavation between 1975 and 1982. The ASI had then claimed the necessity for excavation and conservation of the Buddhist stupa. Subsequently, the excavation was forgotten.

The Parabhadi stupa was 40-ft in height when the ASI took the site in its possession. Due to constant soil erosion and for several other reasons the height of the stupa dropped to 15-ft and is on the verge of extinction owing to lack of maintenance.

Noted historian and Buddhist researcher Harish Chandra Prusty said the Parabhadi stupa came to be known when Chinese traveler Hiuen Tsang had visited Odisha. He visited the site and conducted a review of the ancient stupa which finds mention in the 'Si-yu-ki' book written by the Chinese traveler.

Vig court sentences 2 officials after 31 yrs

Jeypore, Dec 3: After 31 years, the Jeypore Vigilance court Friday pronounced its verdict in a case of fund misappropriation at a Odisha Forest Development Corporation (OFDC)-run timber depot. Special Vigilance Judge Rakesh Ekka Ray, hearing the case, found two officials guilty in the case.

Turtle mating begins near Rushikulya river

Ganjam, Dec 3: Mass mating of Olive Ridleys has started in the sea of Rushikulva rookerv near Purunabandh village in Ganjam district. However, environmentalists claimed that the mating of the turtles had got delayed in the current year.

It started in the second week of November, but the mating has been sporadically spotted 20 km from the coast during the patrolling, said Ranger Abinash Choudhry. He, however, expected that to-

wards the end of the month and the beginning of December, mating of turtles will happen in hordes. When southern wind will start

blowing, the turtles will move

ashore for laying eggs.

For mating and nesting of Ridleys, the forest department has declared the area from Prayogi till Aryapalli along the coast as prohibitory area.

All the nesting spots of the turtles have been barricaded while coast guards have been deployed along the coast to ensure smooth mating and nesting of the endangered turtles. The department said patrolling has been intensified around the river mouth.

Environmentalists expect that the turtles will come ashore to lay eggs towards the last week of January or the first week of February. However, they said high tidal

waves are affecting the egg-laying process every year.

Govt changed mind after repatriation order?

s hinted earlier in this column (November 16), there is something strange about the repatriation of Union Defence Production Secretary Raj Kumar to his parent state of Gujarat. The general view is that Kumar is most likely to replace Pankaj Kumar as the state's new Chief Secretary when the latter retires in May 2022, and until then the babu can 'acclimatise' to the state after having been away since 2015. But oddly, even 10 days after the announcement, there is no sign that the Centre is letting him go or the state is showing any urgency in getting him back.

Some now wonder whether the repatriation order was issued in haste, and now both the Centre and the state government have developed cold feet. Apparently, Kumar finds favour with both governments, and the move to Gujarat was probably planned to get him in place to steer the state through the crucial months leading up to the Lok Sabha elections in May 2024. What may have stopped the authorities from making him Chief Secretary of Gujarat straightaway is that three senior 1986 batch babus would need to be reassigned to desirable slots since Kumar would supersede them. Likely then, that the Gujarat government will sort out this issue first before giving Kumar the green light. If that is so, there was no need for the announcement now.

Cadre choice is not a right

The Supreme Court has ruled that successful UPSC aspirants do not have the right to be allocated the cadre of their choice. The court order came on the appeal of the Centre against a verdict of the Kerala High Court, which directed the Centre to grant home cadre to A Shainamol, a woman IAS officer, who was posted in Himachal Pradesh.

The apex court has further stated that the procedure for cadre allocation for the IAS is a "mechanical process and admits to no exception" except in terms of the recruitment rules.

Shainamol had cleared the UPSC

civil services exam in 2006 and despite belonging to the Muslim OBC category, she was selected in the general category and allocated Himachal cadre in 2007. The Supreme Court has now clarified that since Shainamol did not take benefit of the quota and entered as general category she was not entitled to OBC reserved seat in her state. Consultation with the Kerala government was not required in this instance.

The ruling obviously has implications for IAS aspirants who hail from SC/ST or Other Backward Classes and do not take benefit of quota and get selected in the general category. These individuals cannot take recourse of reservation after their selection and cadre allocation.

MP to ditch 'dual control' police system

Madhya Pradesh will join states like Maharashtra, Delhi and Rajasthan, among others, in replacing the 'dual control' system with the Police Commissionerate system. Though Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan hasn't a specific date for implementing the new system, Director General of Police VK Johri has indicated that the government is likely to effect the new rule from April 2022.

Though the new system was first suggested several years ago, the move gained momentum after Prime Minister Narendra Modi in his recent interaction with IPS probationers praised it saying that 16 states had adopted it and others should do so too. Under the current system, the police are required to take permission from district magistrates before taking any action. The new system will confer some magisterial powers to police commissioners, which will help the police to curb crime more effectively and also make it more accountable to the people.

The reason this proposal was hanging fire for so long, sources say, is due to the stiff resistance from the powerful IAS lobby, which is reluctant to hand over more power to the police department. They managed to scuttle the earlier moves, but this time the commissionerate system has got the green light from the PMO itself, leaving the IAS lobby with no choice.

WHAT COMES NEXT

There is an adage that you cannot have backto-back financial crises. The implication is that a financial crisis causes people to be more careful - so any bank. investment firm, or investor who survives one crisis will not be taking big risks anytime soon. But two years after the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic forced lockdowns, quarantines, and other restrictions, the arrival of the Omicron variant is forcing people to ask: Are we about to go through it all again?

Many governments' initial reaction – attempting to ban travel from South Africa and neighbouring countries, even though Omicron had already spread far and wide - seems a bit desperate. In fact, there are three reasons why governments may be much better prepared than they think for whatever comes next.

First, most policymakers have by now grasped the key importance of defending the most vulnerable people against the virus. This means, whatever happens, better protections for nursing homes and other congregate care settings. Many lives were lost in 2020 because politicians in the United States, Europe, and elsewhere struggled to understand the importance of this point. One hopes that level of miscomprehension is never repeated.

Second, vaccines work. On this issue, there was widespread political consensus in 2020, and the vaccine development programmes stand out as a historic success for public-private science partnership. Unfortunately, in 2021, people have become confused or perhaps deliberately misled. Still, over 68% of Americans have now had at least one shot, and boosters are widely available. The US goal remains to vaccinate as many people around the world as possible, and it should step up the pace. Omicron has shown once again that no one country can hold COVID-19 at bay by itself. Third, governments have a con-

siderable amount of COVID testing capacity. When this capacity was developed in 2020, some people expressed concern that there would be no long-term need. But

while there is still some debate about exactly which tests to use when, epidemiologists and public-health experts have made a great deal of progress on what works for various populations. We just need to keep at it, for example through the federal government's Expanded Testing programme

Ideally, any community - childcare facilities, schools, universities, and companies - would be protected as much as possible by vaccination, backed up by a regular testing program and thoughtful use of masks (and other mitigants). These tiers of protection improve the odds that school and work will continue in as normal a fashion as possible, even in the face of new variants.

The US, however, is still struggling to overcome the problems posed by former President Donald Trump's persistent denial that COVID-19 posed a genuine threat. The work of public health officials was disrupted for political purposes, resulting in a great deal of confusion (and myths) in the communication of everything that matters when it comes to fighting the pandemic.

The legacy of Trump's mixed messages has become the main

weakness in US pandemic defences, including against Omicron. Without it, the US would have more people vaccinated, more willingness to be tested, and less fighting about masks. It is a terrible irony of contemporary America that many of the people who are least protected against new variants is those who take Trump and his public health views more seriously.

In 2020, Trump and his allies claimed that fighting COVID-19 undermined the economy - for example, because it involved lockdowns. That logic was always flawed. Local economies shut down on the order of governors only when hospitals were flooded with infected patients and unable to cope. Hospital overload is the ultimate circuit breaker and still what must be avoided at all costs. If emergency services cannot function, people die from heart attacks and accidents at much higher rates. If cancer care and other more routine procedures are disrupted, more people die.

The bottom line is that fighting harder against COVID-19 is exactly what we need to do if we want to avoid economic turmoil. Closing and reopening economies is costly for everyone. In addition to all the obvious direct costs supply-chain disruptions fuel large price movements and appear to be contributing to inflation. Higher inflation, in turn, makes it harder (or riskier) for the central bank to support the economy, should that be necessary.

Unfortunately, Trump's legacy has left President Joe Biden's administration little option but to stay the course: keep the nurs ing homes strong, persuade as many people as possible to get vaccinated, and continue to improve the availability of highquality testing. At the same time, however, the administration must confront that legacy head-on Surgeon General Vivek Murthy's campaign against health misinformation is one promising initiative. To protect themselves and the economy, Americans - and the world – need many more.

High value crops can substitute for MSP

Cantankerous

was looking at this word in some book or other a while ago - my ageing memory fails to remind me which - and wondered how such a collection of letters could have come together to make an adjective that meant badtempered, argumentative or uncooperative. A curiosity of this passage is that it appears in numerous places as "bitter cantankerous road", an unfortunate error that led the late Ivor Brown to base a molehill of discursiveness on this pimple of misinformation by reasoning falsely that it could apply to things as well as people. The fault is traceable to a misprint in volume two of Farmer and Henley's Slang and its Analogues of 1891, which quotes only the last part of the excerpt, so denuding it of the context that would expose the error. (We may forgive the absence of the second c from cantanckerous, which modern editions of the play also omit.) The error has been perpetuated by writers who borrow the quote without troubling themselves to check the original. It must indeed have been new in Goldsmith's day, for the good Doctor Johnson didn't give it house room in his Dictionary of 1755. It may be that he felt it was too slangy for him - Farmer and Henley called it "colloquial" more than two centuries later. But for Goldsmith it already had the sense we know today, of a person with a guarrelsome, cross-grained, ill-natured personality. One proposal is that it was a blend of two words, each of which by itself suggested its sense: contentious and rancorous. But it's also argued that it can be traced to the Middle English conteke, contention or quarrelling, via its compound conteckour, a person who causes strife. The latter word may have later changed spelling under the influence of these other words.

Cantrev

A cantrev – the word has been spelled in numerous ways, including cantref and canthrif - turns out upon enquiry to have been a medieval legal division of Wales (from the Welsh cant, a hundred, plus tref, a town or place). It's closely similar in sense to the English hundred, a division of a county or shire for administrative purposes. In fact, in medieval England yet another form of the word, cantred, was used almost synonymously with hundred. The word has long had only historical interest. But it has enjoyed a minor revival in SF and fantasy - as in Lloyd Alexander's Prydain Chronicles as an unfamiliar term with which to communicate a guality of being different or elsewhere. The revival is most probably due to modern interest in the medieval Welsh epic The Mabinogion, in which cantrev often appears.

he first solution to the minimum support price (MSP) imbroglio is that the government should try to shift the farmers from low-value MSP-supported crops like wheat and paddy to high-value crops. Our farmers produce pepper in Kerala, silk and areca in Karnataka, mango in Maharashtra and Uttar Pradesh, palm in Andhra and pan leaves in Bihar. Farmers producing these high-value crops generally do not agitate for MSP. They are already getting good income from these crops. The situation at the global level is even more dramatic. Tunisia produces olives, France produces grapes, Netherland produces tulip flowers, the United States produces walnuts, and Saudi Arabia produces dates. These countries sell these crops at a high price in the global market. The farm worker in the Netherlands earns about ₹10,000 per day by producing tulip flowers. We should be able to pay our farm workers a wage of ₹10,000 per day if we can also produce tulip flowers. Our special advantage is that we have a variety of climates from Kashmir to Kanyakumari. We could produce tulip flowers in winters in the south and in summers

in the north. We can supply specialised agricultural produce to the entire world at a very high price throughout the year - some thing that France and Netherlands cannot do. They would not be inclined to spend their time in demanding MSP if they can make money from tulip flowers. like the pepper farmers of Kerala.

The second solution is to increase the level of cash transfer already being done. There are about three crore farmer families in the country. The government could transfer ₹1,00,000 per family per year and assure them of a basic minimum income. Having done this, the government can dismantle the MSP and also scrap all the subsidies being given on fertilizers, electricity, water, food grains and exports. The price of wheat and paddy in the market would then reduce and the farmers would produce more mango and pan leaves. The farmers would have no reason to complain because their minimum incomes are assured by cash transfers. In my reckoning, the Centre and state governments would save about ₹6,00,000 crore if they scrap MSP and all the subsidies. One

half of this, or ₹3,00,000 crore can be given to the farmers as direct cash transfer of ₹1 lakh per family per year. Then the farmers would have no argument to agitate because their basic incomes would be assured.

The difficulty in implementing these solutions is that the research bureaucracy of the Indian Council of Agricultural Research laboratories and our universities are just not interested in undertaking any research. Their salaries are secure. They continue to get the salaries irrespective of whether they do any research or not. They make a good bio data by publishing cut-and-paste academic papers in fake journals. Therefore, the government should dismantle this entire research bureaucracy and give research contracts to these government laboratories as well as private institutions to undertake mission-based research and produce specialized crops that can provide high income in every part of the country. The second difficulty in imple-

menting this solution is that the bureaucracies of the Food Corporation and the Public Distribution System thrive on the

Vaccine vacillators

Sir, Amid declining number of Covid-19 patients, all spheres of life have opened. People using self-protection measures are few and far between. Most Indians believe that the Covid-19 pandemic is a thing of the past irrespective of emergence of a new strain of the virus. Nothing can be further from the truth. It is preposterous to lower one's guard before the picture is absolutely clear. States have added or modified many regulations only for namesake. Both the people and the authorities have lost the motivation and necessity to maintain and regulate the all important personnel protection. This is one side of the coin, the other, of course, is the vaccination drive that has lost its steam. Recently, the Centre patted its own back while releasing the vaccination numbers. Even now the country continues to record a positive number of cases in excess of 10,000 per day, and now we have the Omicron variant of the virus. Indians who have received their first dose of vaccine are completing the course. But what about those who are yet to receive their first dose? Top court asks Centre, NCR states to implement panel's order to curb air pollution

New Delhi, Dec 3: The Supreme Court has directed the Director General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) to ensure that differently-abled persons are not asked to remove prosthetic limbs/calipers to maintain human dignity while ensuring the requirement of security checks.

A bench of Justices Hemant Gupta and Justice V Ramasubramanian also said that lifting a person with disability during air travel or security checkup is inhumane, and held that it should not be done without his or her consent.

"Another aspect we want to mention is about some of the differently-abled person use prosthetic limbs/calipers. Sometimes, they are directed to remove their prosthetic limbs/calipers as a part of the security check.

"In the draft guidelines circulated, it has been mentioned that scanning of prosthetic limbs/calipers though full body scanner but to what extent differently- abled persons with prosthetic limbs/calipers are required to be checked for the purpose of security should be in a manner where, no such person is asked to remove prosthetic limbs/calipers to maintain human dignity while ensuring the requirement of security checks," the bench said.

Parties spent big in elections: Study

New Delhi, Dec 3: Nineteen political parties, including the BJP and the Congress, received over ₹1,100 crore during assembly polls in five states and union territories in 2021 and spent over ₹500 crore, a big chunk of which went towards advertisements and travel expenses for star campaigners, a study said Friday.

The Congress received the secondhighest amount of ₹193.77 crore and spent ₹85.625 crore, including ₹31.451 crore on publicity and ₹20.40 towards travel expenses, it said.

The DMK, which received the third-highest amount of ₹134 crore, incurred a total expenditure of ₹114.14 crore, with the party spending ₹52.144 crore on publicity and ₹2.414 crore towards travel expenses of its star campaigners and other leaders. The report noted that the CPI(M) received a total fund of ₹79.244 crore. TMC ₹56.328 crore, AIADMK ₹14.46 crore and the CPI ₹8.05 crore during the elections.

While the CPI(M) incurred an expenditure of ₹32.74 crore, spending ₹21.509 crore towards publicity and ₹1.173 crore on travel expenses, the TMC spent ₹154.282 crore, incurring an expenditure of ₹ 27.009 crore on publicity and ₹33.02 towards travel expenses, according to the report.

The AIADMK's total expenditure during the elections stood at ₹57.33 crore, and of that, ₹56.756 crore went towards publicity. The CPI spent ₹5.68 crore in elections, incurring an expenditure of ₹3.506 crore on publicity, according to the report.

The ADR-National Election Watch analysed funds received and expenditure incurred by a total of 19 political during the assembly polls in the five states and union territories in 2021. The BJP, Congress, BSP, NCP, TMC CPI(M), CPI, DMK, AIMIM CPI(ML)(L), AIFB, AGP, AIADMK AIUDF, PMK, JD-S, KC-M, SP and the AINRC are the parties whose funds and expenditures were analysed.

'Total funds collected by 19 political parties during Assam, Kerala Tamil Nadu, West Bengal and Puducherry Assembly Elections held in 2021 was ₹1,116.81 crore and total expenditure incurred was ₹514.30 crore," the non-government election watchdog said in its report.

Kolkata, Dec 3: The BJP has moved the Supreme Court with a prayer to deploy the Central Armed Police Force (CAPF) for the December 19 Kolkata Municipal Corporation (KMC) election.

West Bengal BJP president Sukanta Majumdar said that a "free, fair and peaceful" election was not possible under the state police.

We had made a deputation to Governor Jagdeep Dhankhar and told him that a free, fair and peaceful election in West Bengal is not possible with the state police force. We had appealed to the Governor to look into our demand for deployment of the Central Armed Police Force for the KMC election. Now we have decided to move the Supreme Court to press the same demand. We have already filed a petition before the apex court, seeking its directives to West Bengal State Election Commission (WBSEC) to deploy central force," said Majumdar in a video message.

Currently in Delhi, Majumdar led a delegation of party MPs from West Bengal for a meeting with Prime Minister Narendra Modi Friday. The BJP had earlier asked WBSEC to deploy CAPF for civic polls – an appeal the poll panel is yet to consider.

Majumdar's reaction came hours after Governor Jagdeep Dhankhar Thursday met State Election Commissioner Saurav Das on upcoming KMC election, at the Raj Bhavan. Sources said the Governor asked Das why elections to over 100 civic bodies were not being held in a single phase. Dhankhar also sought the SEC view on CAPF deployment.

"SEC @MamataOfficial indicated to Governor Shri Jagdeep Dhankhar that as regards deployment #CAPF he would revert by December 04 and assured that all steps for fair, impartial and free elections will be diligently taken,' tweeted the Governor.

Leader of Opposition in the state Assembly Suvendu Adhikari Thursday likened the state police to TMC cadre.

"The Governor has rightly asked the state election commissioner to share his views on deployment of CAPF as the law and order situation in the state is deteriorating every day. Post-poll violence is still continuing here. Police have become the ruling party's cadre.

"Therefore free and fair polls cannot be held here without CAPF," said Adhikari.

Later in the day, a BJP delegation met the state election commissioner and reiterated its demand for CAPF deployment. "We draw your attention to our letter dated November 29, 2021 on the subject of deployment of Central Forces. Since then we have announced our list of 144 candidates for Kolkata Municipal Corporation elections No sooner this was done our candidates have been receiving threatening calls, warning the candi-

dates with dire consequences, including threat to life," read the BJP memorandum submitted to commissioner Das. "We once again call upon the

Commission to deploy Central Forces for area domination, confidence building and conducting of polls, failing which we will have no option but to hold the Commission responsible for any untoward incidence that may happen," it added.

Congress in 'deep freezer': TMC

The worst performers among states, which were already among the top 10 manufacturing ones during the period, were Rajasthan. cording to the data released by the Telangana and Andhra Pradesh, with average annual growth rates of 3.8 per cent, 5.5 per cent and 6.9

per cent, respectively.

GVA is essentially GDP minus net product taxes and reflects growth in supply of goods and services. The other states with the highest manufacturing GVA were Tamil Nadu at ₹3.43 lakh crore. Karnataka at ₹2.1 lakh crore and Uttar Pradesh at ₹1.87 lakh crore. India's manufacturing GVA grew to ₹16.9 lakh crore in FY20 at an average growth rate of 9.7 per cent since FY12. Higher investment in Gujarat during the period likely played a key role in allowing the state to outpace the rest of the country in manufacturing growth.

Gujarat witnessed the highest level of capital investment in terms of gross fixed capital formation (GFCF) – a measure of investments – between FY12 and FY19 at a total of ₹5.85 lakh crore, ahead of Maharashtra which saw investment of ₹4.07 lakh crore during the period, and Andhra Pradesh, which witnessed cumulative GFCF of ₹1.49 lakh crore.

A report by KPMG said key reforms by Gujarat, including the introduction of a single window for business clearances, easing of labour norms as well as smoother administration of incentive



schemes, contributed to boosting ease of doing business in the state and making it one of most attractive destinations for Foreign Direct Investment.Maharashtra, however, retained its spot as the leading provider of services in the country, with the state's services GVA grow-

ing at 12.6 per cent per annum hitting ₹15.1 lakh crore in FY20.

Karnataka posted the fastest growth in services GVA at 15.1 per cent per annum during the period. achieving the second highest services GVA in the country at ₹9.72 lakh crore in FY20

Thakor has his task cut out as Guj Cong chief

Ahmedabad, Dec 3: Jagdish Thakor, who emerged as a consensus candidate for the post of president of the Gujarat Pradesh Congress Committee (GPCC), is facing a formidable task of defeating the ruling BJP in the next year's Assembly elections.

Congress President Sonia Gandhi has appointed Thakor as new president of the Gujarat Congress, replacing Amit Chavda, the party announced earlier in the day.

An OBC leader, Thakor, who has good oratory skills, will have to take along all factions in the state unit while taking on the well-organized BJP which has been in power in the state from 1998.

Congress sources said Thakor was a consensus candidate as former state unit chiefs Bharatsinh Solanki and Arujn Modhwadia were also in the race.

The party high command also toyed with the idea of picking voung Patidar leader Hardik Patel for the post, but he faced considerable opposition from within the



state unit, they said.

Rajya Sabha member Shaktisinh Gohil was asked to take the responsibility but he declined saying he would like to contribute at the national level, sources said.

"Thakor does not belong to any faction and that was the reason he has been given the responsibility," said a state Congress leader.

Solanki, Modhwadia and Hardik Patel congratulated Thakor after his name was announced and expressed hope that Congress will defeat the BJP under his leadership in the 2022 elections. With Thakor's appointment, the party seems to be sticking to its traditional Kshatriyatribal-Muslim-Dalit vote base. In the 2017 elections the party had tried to woo the Patels.

Zakia Jafri, the wife of Congress leader Ehsan Jafri who was killed at the Gulberg Society in Ahmedabad February 28, 2002, during the violence, has challenged the clean chit by a Special Investigation Team (SIT) to 64 people including Narendra Modi, then

Senior advocate Mukul Rohatgi, appearing for the SIT, argued that the allegations about a larger conspiracy during the riots are being "driven" by Teesta Setalvad, who is petitioner number two in the plea filed by Zakia Jafri in the Supreme Court.

[•]My respectful submission is that there is a larger conspiracy orchestrated by petitioner number two (Teesta Setalvad) to defame one

entire state for almost 20 years,' Tushar Mehta told the bench, also comprising Justices Dinesh Maheshwari and CT Ravikumar.

"I have nothing against petitioner number one (Zakia Jafri), she is wounded, and she has lost her near and dear ones. I can have nothing to say against her. But, and I am choosing my words very carefully, there has to be a limit of exploiting the miseries of a widow," he said. Mehta told the bench that the

SIT had periodically filed status reports before the top court and in the last one: it was "at pains" to point out that Ms Setalvad was "tutoring witnesses, was preparing pre-typed computerised statements and sending them".

"And it has remained my complaint from the beginning why the SIT did not prosecute her for fabricating false evidence. This is nothing but fabricating false evidence," he said during the arguments, which will now continue December 7

This is nothing but fabrication of evidence to involve "innocent persons" in the offence, Mehta said.

"What is the cause, what is the reason, what is the motivation, what is that larger conspiracy which compels them to still keep the pot boiling," he said. Tushar Mehta also referred to the Gujarat HC order passed in a separate matter dealing with allegations of misappropriation of funds received by the NGOs of Setalvad for the 2002 riot victims.

New Delhi, Dec 3: The Centre Friday said it anticipates the severity of the Omicron variant of coronavirus to be low in the country given the fast pace of vaccination and high exposure to the Delta variant, a day after the first two cases of the new variant was reported in Karnataka, and that a decision on a Covid vaccine booster dose will be on the basis of scientific guidance from experts.

The Union Health Ministry, however, said the scientific evidence for the expected severity of the disease is still evolving, as debates about the booster jabs heat up and several states ramp up testing and step up surveillance for the potentially more contagious variant.

It also noted there is no evidence to suggest that existing vaccines do not work on the new variant that was reported by South Africa to the World Health Organisation(WHO) November 24.

"However, vaccine protection is also by antibodies as well as by cellular immunity, which is expected to be relatively better preserved.'

Hence, vaccines are expected to still offer protection against severe disease and vaccination is crucial. If eligible one should get vaccinated, it added

UN to expand plastic waste management in India

New Delhi, Dec 3: The United Nations Development Programme aims to almost triple its plastic waste management to 100 cities in India by 2024, A UNDP executive said, to combat the damaging effects of plastic pollution.

Across India's many towns and cities, which are often ranked among the world's most polluted, the absence of an organised management of plastic waste leads to widespread

littering and pollution. The UNDP programme, which began in 2018, has so far collected 83,000 metric tonne of plastic waste. India generates about 3.4 million tonnes of plastic waste annually, according to official estimates.

In India although about 60% of plastic is recycled, we are still seeing the damage that plastic pollution is causing, Nadia Rasheed, Deputy Resident Representative, UNDP India, said in an interview.

The UNDP is working with federal think tank, NITI Aayog and have jointly developed a 'handbook' model for local municipalities as well as the private sector. In a country like India with

nearly fifth of the world's population, a key challenge is how do we make these models scalable,

Rasheed said in an interview recorded November 22.

The government needs stricter enforcement on controls around dumping of plastic waste and has a long way to go to raise awareness among households, Rasheed said, addding there was a need for investment into research for alternatives.

The programme suffered a setback after the Covid-19 pandemic led to widespread increase in waste, including medical plastic waste, and hit livelihoods of collectors, who often work in hazardous conditions.

There was a real need to expand waste collection efforts and that was coming at the same time as lot of (Covid-19 related) restrictions were disrupting the normal waste collection, Rasheed said.

Plastic pollution is set to triple by 2040, the UN Environment Programme (UNEP) has predicted, adding 23-37 million metric tons of waste into the world's oceans each year.

India, also the world's thirdbiggest emitter of greenhouse gases after China and the United States, has set 2070 as a target to reach net-zero carbon emissions, much later than those set by oth-ers and twenty years after the UN's global recommendation.

Measures against Delta work for Omicron too: WHO

Manila, Dec 3: Measures used to counter the delta variant should remain the foundation for fighting the coronavirus pandemic, even in the face of the new omicron version of the virus, World Health Organisation officials said Friday, while acknowledging that the travel restrictions imposed by some countries may buy time.

While about three dozen countries worldwide have reported omicron infections, including India on Thursday, the numbers so far are small outside of South Africa, which is facing a rapid rise in COVID-19 cases and where the new variant may be becoming dominant. Still, much remains unclear about omicron, including whether it is more contagious, as some health authorities suspect, whether it makes people more seriously ill, or whether it can evade vaccine protection.

"Border control can delay the virus coming in and buy time. But every country and every community must prepare for new surges in cases," Dr. Takeshi Kasai, the WHO regional director for the Western Pacific, told reporters Friday during a virtual news conference from the Philippines. "The positive news in all of this is that none of the information we have currently about omicron suggests we need to change the directions

of our response." That means continuing to push for higher vaccination rates, abiding by social-distancing guidelines,

Pak to let India transport wheat

Islamabad, Dec 3: Pakistan Friday agreed to let India transport 50,000 metric tonnes of wheat and life-saving drugs as humanitarian assistance for the people of Afghanistan on Afghan trucks through the Wagah border crossing, after a row erupted between the two countries over the modalities of transportation.

Thursday, India said that discussions with Pakistan are going on to finalise the modalities for the transportation of its aid to Afghanistan through Pakistani soil and insisted that no conditionalities should be attached for sending the humanitarian assistance.

In New Delhi, Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) spokesper son Arindam Bagchi said that humanitarian assistance should not be subject to conditionalities. Pakistan last week formally informed India about its decision to allow the transportation of wheat and life-saving drugs to neighbouring Afghanistan through its territory on an "exceptional basis for humanitarian purposes". Thursday, Pakistan turned down India's wheat transit proposal. However, the Foreign Office said in a statement that the decision to let New Delhi send wheat and life-saving drugs to Afghanistan through Pakistan on Afghan trucks was formally conveyed to India.

Beijing/Vientiane, Dec 3: China Friday launched the first USD 6 billion cross-border train of its multi-billion-dollar Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) from Laos, which Beijing says will help the small and only landlocked country in South East Asia turn into a landlinked hub, boost regional connectivity and supply chain resilience.

Chinese President Xi Jinping and his Laos' counterpart Thongloun Sisoulith jointly witnessed the opening of the China-Laos railway via video link on Friday. The first train of the China-Laos Railway left Vientiane soon after the cross-border railway was officially put into operation, the

Construction of the section in Laos from the border town of Boten to Vientiane started in December 2016, and construction of the section in China from the city of Yuxi to the border town of Mohan started in December 2015.

As a docking project between the China-proposed BRI and Laos' strategy to convert itself from a landlocked country into a landlinked hub, the railway is of great significance to bilateral economic. social and cultural exchanges as well as the regional connectivity, the report said.

With a maximum operating speed of 160-km per hour, the travel time from Kunming to Vientiane takes about 10 hours, including customs clearance time.

Nice (France), Dec 3: France announced the signing Friday of a 16 billion-euro (USD 18 billion) armaments mega-contract for the sale of 80 of its upgraded Rafale warplanes to the United Arab Emirates.

The French Defense Ministry said the deal was France's largestever weapons contract for export. It came as French President Emmanuel Macron is in the Emirates on the first stop of a twoday visit to the Persian Gulf. There was no immediate confirmation of the signing from Emirati officials.

Manufacturer Dassault Aviation said the UAE is buying the upgraded F4 version of its multi-role combat aircraft. That will make the Emirates Air Force the first Rafale F4 user outside of France, it said. The deal offers a shot in the arm for France's defense in-

WHO rushes experts' team to South Africa Johannesburg: The WHO has rushed a team of experts to South Africa's Gauteng province, the epicentre of the new Omicron variant of COVID-19, to ramp up surveillance and con-

tact tracing efforts as the country grapples with rising cases of infections. Omicron, which was first iden tified in South Africa exactly a week ago, now has been detected in at least 24 countries around the world, including India. "We are deploying a surge team in Gauteng province to support surveillance and contact tracing," World Health Organisation's Regional Emergency Director for Africa Dr Salam Gueye said in a media briefing on Thursday. A team is already working in South Africa on genomic sequencing, he said. The Gauteng province, which is the economic hub of South Africa, has accounted for almost 80 per cent of the infections over the past week.

Colombo, Dec 3: China has suspended a project to install hybrid energy plants in three islands of Sri Lanka, citing "security concern" from a "third party", amid reports of India raising concern over its location.

In January, the Chinese firm, Sino Soar Hybrid Technology, was awarded the contract to install a hybrid renewable energy system in Delft, Nagadeepa and Analthivu islands, off the coast of Jaffna, according to a report in newsfirst.Lk news website published on Thursday.

The three islets are located close to Tamil Nadu. Without naming India, the Chinese embassy here in a tweet on Wednesday confirmed that "Sino Soar Hybrid Technology, being suspended to build Hybrid Energy system in 3 northern islands Flag of Sri Lanka due to 'security concern' from a third party".

The purchase marks a sizeable step up for the UAE's military capabilities in the oil- and gas-rich region. Charles Forrester, a senior analyst at Janes, said the fighter "will significantly upgrade UAE's airpower capabilities in terms of strike, air-to-air warfare, and reconnaissance."

Dassault said the Rafale will give the UAE "a tool capable of guaranteeing sovereignty and op-erational independence." Macron and Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, the crown prince of Abu Dhabi, were present at the contract signing, it said.

French defense officials were jubilant. The defense minister, Florence Parly, said the deal "directly contributes to regional stability.

A caller reported seeing the threat late Wednesday night, according to the Broward Sheriff's Office. Officials said the 17-year-old high school junior had sent a text message to his classmates in a social media chat room just after 9 pm Wednesday. "I feel like school shooting tmrw (tomorrow). When I sneeze it's a signal go to the bathroom OK. I hope y'all aren't snitches," the text message said, according to a probable cause affidavit.

Honolulu, Dec 3: Cheri Burness' dog was the first to signal something was wrong with their tap water. He stopped drinking it two weeks ago. Then Burness started feeling stomach cramps. Her 12-year-old daughter was nauseous.

"It was just getting worse every day," said Burness, whose husband is in the Navy. Their family is among hundreds of military families living near Pearl Harbour with similar complaints after the Navy's water system somehow became contaminated by petroleum.

The problems have afflicted one of the most important Navy bases in the world, home to submarines, ships and the commander of US forces in the Indo-Pacific region. The

issues may even threaten one of Honolulu's most important aquifers and water sources

The Navy said Thursday that tests had identified petroleum in its Red Hill well which taps into an aquifer near the base. Rear Adm. Blake Converse, Pacific Fleet deputy commander, told a town hall meeting the Navy took this well offline on Sunday because it was nearest well to affected housing areas. Converse said the Navy will flush

clean water through its distribution system to clear residual petroleum products from the water. This process, followed by testing to make sure it the water meets Environmental Protection Agency drinking standards, could take four to ten days, he said.

The Navy will investigate how

contaminants got into the well and fix the well, he said. The crisis comes after the Navy on November 22 said a water and fuel mixture had leaked into a

fire suppression system drain line in a tunnel at a massive fuel storage facility 3 miles (4.8 kilometers) inland of Pearl Harbour. The Navy said it removed about

14,000 gallons (53 kiloliters) of the mixture, and said the liquid hadn't leaked into the environment. The Navy said so far it's received calls about a fuel odor or physical ailments from 680 homes in Navy housing and 270 in Army housing on the Navy's water system. The Navy water system serves 93,000 people.

In the days after Thanksgiving, Burness's daughter felt so sick she didn't want to eat any leftovers, including potatoes, turnips and carrots that had been boiled in water. "I don't want you to have to throw out food because I know it's expensive, but I can't eat this Mom," Burness said her daughter told her.

On Sunday, Burness started seeing comments on social media from

military families saying their tap water smelled like fuel. She didn't smell it, but people told her to turn on her hot water and check. She did and smelled it too.

She told her family not to drink the water and not to wash their hair and face with it. She ordered private water delivery for USD 120 a month. They family has mostly been eating off of plastic and paper plates and eating out.

On Monday, when she gave her dog some bottled water, he immediately drank a full liter's worth and then drank two more liters over the next 12 hours.

New Delhi: Foreign direct investment (FDI) in food processing sector declined 54 per cent to ₹2.934.12 crore in 2020-21 as compared to the previous year, the government said Friday. In a written reply to the Raiva Sabha. Minister of State for Food Processing Industries Prahlad Singh Patel informed that the FDI in the food processing sector stood at ₹4.430.44 crore in 2018-19. ₹6.414.67 crore during 2019-20 and ₹2.934.12 crore during the 2020-21 financial year.

Forex reserves down by \$2.7mln

Mumbai: The country's foreign exchange reserves declined by \$2.713 billion to \$637.687 billion in the week to November 26, RBI data showed. In the previous week ended November 19, the reserves had increased by \$289 million to \$640.401 billion. It touched a lifetime high of \$642.453 billion in the week ended September 3, 2021. In the reporting week ended November 26, the dip in the foreign exchange reserves was on account of a decline in foreign currency assets (FCA), a major component of the overall reserves and gold reserves.

New Delhi, Dec 3: The government Friday said during the April-October period this fiscal, the US has once again emerged as the largest trading partner of India with bilateral merchandise trade of \$67.41 billion.

The US has been the largest trading partner of India with respect to merchandise trade since 2018-19, except in 2020-21, when trade with America declined marginally on account of the Covid-19 pandemic, Minister of State for Commerce and Industry Anupriya Patel said in a written reply to the Rajya Sabha.

Minister of State for Finance Pankaj Chaudhary tabled the second batch of supplementary demands for grants tabled in Lok Sabha envisaging a net cash outgo of over ₹2.99 lakh crore and ₹74,517 crore extra expenditure would be matched by savings by different ministries.

As per the document, ₹62,057 crore would be given to the Civil Aviation Ministry for equity infusion in Air India Assets Holding Company (AIAHL) for re-payment of past government guaranteed borrowing and past dues/liabilities of Air India. Besides, an additional ₹2.628 crore would be given towards loans and advances to Air India

The additional fertiliser subsidy include ₹43,430 crore on account of payment towards indigenous and imported Phosphatic and Potassic (P&K) Subsidy and

scheme. Besides, the Department of Food and Public Distribution would be given an additional ₹49,805 crore for meeting expenditure towards various schemes of food storage and warehousing.

Another over ₹5,000 crore and over ₹4.000 crore has been earmarked for additional spending by the Ministries of Defence and Home, respectively.

The Surat-based company has recently raised over ₹100 crore from White Oak Capital and IIFL in the pre-IPO round.

Bangalore, Dec 3: Activity in India's dominant services sector continued to grow at a robust pace last month supported by a strong recovery in domestic demand, a private survey showed, but elevated price pressures remained a major concern.

Asia's third-largest economy expanded at the fastest pace among major economies last quarter, boosted by coronavirus vaccinations and stronger government spending. The economy grew 8.4% annually during the July-September quarter.

That positive momentum seems to have been largely sustained in the first two months of this quarter. The Services Purchasing Managers' Index, compiled by IHS Markit, eased to 58.1 in November from 58.4 in October, but last month's rate of growth was the second-best

in over a decade and well above the

50-mark separating growth from contraction for a fourth straight month. Excluding October: new business expanded at its quickest pace in nearly nine years in November, primarily driven by the robust recovery in domestic demand.

'The recovery of the Indian service sector was extended to November: Companies were somewhat convinced that output levels would continue to increase in the

year ahead, but worries regarding inflationary pressures weighed on confidence again," noted Pollyanna De Lima, economics associate director at IHS Markit.

Despite reporting the biggest jump in input costs since April, firms were only able to pass on some of costs to customers, pointing to further pressure on margins. Prices charged rose at a slower pace in November compared to October.

Patent for Lay's potatoes revoked

New Delhi: India has revoked a patent for a potato variety grown exclusively for PepsiCo Inc's popular Lav's potato chips, according to an order issued Friday by the **Protection of Plant Varieties** and Farmers' Rights (PPVFR) Authority. In 2019, PepsiCo sued some Indian farmers based in the western state of Gujarat for cultivating the FC5 potato variety, which has a lower moisture content required to make snacks such as potato chips. Even at the global level, this is the first time that the multinational had to face such a defeat.

slumped by ₹2.7 lakh crore. The slump in deposits follows an abrupt increase by ₹3.3 lakh crore in the previous fortnight ending November 5, 2021-- this was 36 per cent of the incremental deposit growth for the period to Rs 9.35 lakh crore.

In fact, the ₹3.3 lakh crore fortnightly deposit bulge is the fifth largest fortnightly increase since 1997 and the ₹2.69 lakh crore subsequent deposit slump (fortnight ended Nov'19) is the largest since 1997. Such an increase in deposits and subsequent slump is quite a con-

trarian trend, he said, adding while it is difficult to decipher the increase and subsequent decline, it does poses questions on liquidity management/financial stability or a shift in behavioural trend in customer payment habits through digitisation and hence lower currency leakage and concomitant deposit bulge or both.

On the fortnightly deposit slump in the subsequent days period, Ghosh said "it was possible that there was a large influx of deposits into banking system for the fortnight to November 5, 2021 in anticipation of a buildup in rally in stock markets postprimary issuances of new age companies and others. However, when such a rally did not materialise, deposits slumped and almost 80 per cent of incremental deposit was withdrawn".

On the possible reason of the IPO rush, Ghosh noted the massive influx of new investors that began since the lockdowns began in March 2020 and which got accelerated in the past few months even as bank deposits have decelerated.

According to NSE data, monthly investor registrations rose to record high levels in September 2021 to the tune of 15.6 lakh. Almost 50 lakh additional new investors have been registered with brokerages between April and September 2021 over the same period in 2020.

If deposits and credit grew by ₹5 lakh crore during the rest of the FY22 (from November 19, 2021 to Mar 25, 2022), then the deposits growth will be around 12 per centand credit growth around 8.5 per cent in 2021-22.

Agarwal, who is all but certain to sit out once Rohit Sharma and KL Rahul come back during the next series (if South Africa then away, if West Indies then home), added to a happy headache for coach Rahul Dravid, on a day when vice-captain Ajinkya Rahane had to be 'dropped' because of a hamstring niggle.

Worse, Cheteshwar Pujara and Virat Kohli failed to trouble the scorers and it was a hundred that came under pressure with India being 80/3 and 160/4 at different stages of the game.

Had the Indian team management been forced to play Rahane, the axe was likely to fall on Agarwal and it's never a great feeling to go out there in such a situation.

He was jittery to begin with as a streaky boundary through slips came early on but once he marched down the track to loft Ajaz Patel (4/73) for a straight six, his nerves had all but vanished. The boundaries off Patel showed

his class as he got his fourth hundred in Tests. In fact. Patel. who was by far the best New Zealand bowler in view, having reduced India from 80 for no loss to 80/3, did look pedestrian in front of Agarwal at times.

When an airborne Agarwal punched the air after a square driven boundary off part-time seamer Daryl Mitchell, one could sense that pressure weighing a thousand tonne must have come off his chest

opener during the England series but before the first game, he got hit on the head and KL Rahul coming in his place, grabbed the opportunity with both hands. With Rohit also having his best

overseas series as Test opener, Agarwal was confined to the reserves. He could again be back in the reserves but he made a statement of intent with his strokeplay as he dominated the 80-run fourth wicket stand with Shreyas Iyer (18).

Along with another reserve player in Wriddhiman Saha (25 batting, 53b, 3x4, 1x6), Agarwal

added another 61 runs before the close of play. New Zealand had erred in not playing Neil Wagner on a track where there was a lot of bounce on offer.

If Agarwal showed discretion, same couldn't be said about Shubman Gill (44, 71b, 7x4, 1x6), who was dazzling till he was around in their 80run opening stand before Patel snuffed him out. Gill looked fluent before paying for his impetuosity which led to a mini collapse.

Mumbai-born left-arm spinner Patel also picked up Cheteshwar Pujara and Virat Kohli in quick succession with both failing to trouble the scorers

Patel became the second Mumbai-born cricketer after legendary England captain Douglas Jardine to play against India in his city of birth.

He had Gill on the mat when he flighted one to entice him to come out and the ball tuned and jumped with keeper Tom Blundell making a hash of a stumping. However, the very next ball saw him shorten the length as Gill tried jabbing at it and it turned enough to take the outside edge into Ross Taylor's palms.

Pujara's confidence has hit nadir after too many failures and he survived a DRS appeal from New Zealand before he jumped down the track to york himself. Patel, very wisely, fired one with an angle straight into his toes and what happened with Pujara often happens with out-of-form batters.

For skipper Kohli, it was a delivery that straightened after pitching as the Indian skipper tried to play a forward defensive stroke. Straight umpire Anil Chaudhary gave him out and Kohli immediately asked for a review. The replay was inconclusive on whether it hit the bat first or pad and as per rule. TV umpire Virender Sharma went with his on-field colleague, leaving Kohli absolutely livid.

He had a word with leg umpire Nitin Menon and was seen expressing his displeasure. The TV cameras then caught him standing in the dressing room balcony, visibly upset with the decision, which was a touch and go one.

There was another 80-run stand between Agarwal and Shreyas Iyer (18) before Patel got rid of the latter to reduce India to 160/4.

Kuala Lumpur, Dec 3: The topseeded Indian men booked a spot in the final of the 20th Asian squash Team Championship with a 2-0 win over Hong Kong in the semifinals here Friday.

However, the women's team, seeded third, went down 1-2 to Hong Kong in the semifinals despite the No.1 player Joshna Chinappa giving them the lead.

In the men's match, Saurav Ghosal beat Yip Tsz Fung in four games after losing the first game after Ramit Tandon had given India the lead with a defeat of Henry Leung to set up a summit clash on Saturday against second-seeded Malaysia, a 2-0 winner over Japan.

Ghosal, the World No.15, bounced back after being a game down to Fung by winning the next three to win 10-12, 11-6, 11-6, 15-13 in a 55-minute match. Tandon had similarly hit back after losing the opening game to beat Leung in a fourgame clash.

This is the third time the Indian men have entered the final after having previously done so in 1981 and 2012.

In the women's semifinal, Chinappa gave India the lead with a hard-fought win in four games over Liu Tsz Ling. However, Sunayna Kuruvilla and Urwashi Joshi proved no match for their opponents, going down in straight games to hand victory to Hong Kong.

Hamstring niggles are believed to be the most painful as it tends to hamper movement and batting becomes an issue with restricted feet movement.
