Odisha is the first state in India to place an order for the OmiSure kits. It had placed orders to procure 5 lakh kits, of which 30,000 kits

Bhubaneswar: The state Wednesday witnessed a sharp rise in its Omicron tally with 145 new cases of the highly contagious variant of Covid-19 being detected, Health and Family Welfare Department said. The Indian Life Sciences conducted the genome sequencing of 249 samples from which traces of Omicron strain were found in 145 samples. P3

"The OmiSure kits have arrived There are many variants of Covid-19. Omicron is one among them, which is highly transmissible. The OmiSure kits will be sent to places having a high caseload for an internal study," said State director of health services, Bijay Mohapatra.

The kits will be sent to Bhubaneswar, Berhampur, Cuttack and Rourkela where a high number of Covid cases are being detected in comparison to other places of the state, he informed.

The Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) had recently approved the OmiSure kits developed by the Tata Medical and Diagnostics Ltd. (Tata MD) for RT-PCR detection of the Omicron variant.

B'lore-Bhub plane averts crash

New Delhi, Jan 19: Two IndiGo planes averted mid-air collision over the Bangalore airport just after their take-off on the morning of January 9, senior officials of aviation regulator DGCA said Wednesday.

The incident was not logged in any logbook and it was not reported by the Airports Authority of India (AAI) either, they said. Meanwhile, DGCA chief Arun Kumar told PTI that the regulator is investigating the incident "and shall take strictest action against those found delinquent".

IndiGo and the AAI did not respond to PTI's request for a statement on this matter. Officials of Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) said that the two IndiGo planes -- 6E455 (Bangalore to Kolkata) and 6E246 (Bangalore to Bhubaneswar) -- were involved in 'breach of separation' at Bangalore airport.

Breach of separation happens when two aircraft cross the minimum mandatory vertical or horizontal distance in an airspace. Both these aircraft departed from the Bangalore airport within a span of approximately 5 minutes on the morning of January 9, the officials mentioned.

"Both aircraft after departure were on converging heading i.E. Moving towards each other. Approach radar controller gave diverging heading and avoided mid-air collision," one of the officials noted. The Bangalore-Kolkata flight carried 176 passengers and six crew, while the Bangalore-Bhubaneswar flight carried 238 passengers and six crew - a total of 426 passengers.



INDIA EXTENDS BAN ON INT'L FLIGHTS TILL FEB 28

New Delhi: India's civil aviation regulator, the DGCA, Wednesday extended the ban on scheduled international commercial flights till February 28, 2022. At present, India suffers from a third Covid wave which is said to be driven by the Omicron variant. In a notification. the DGCA extended the ban on scheduled international commercial flights till February 28, 2022. "This restriction shall not apply to international all-cargo operations and flights specifically approved by the DGCA. "However, flights under Air Bubble agreement will not be affected." Last month, the civil aviation regulator had extended the ban on scheduled international commercial flights till January 31, 2022.

Borrowers to gain as govt sanctions ₹974cr **loan moratorium** AGENCIES

New Delhi, Jan 19: In a major relief for borrowers, especially of home loans, hit by the outbreak of Covid and the lockdown, the Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Wednesday approved the payment of ex-gratia amount of ₹973.74 crore to the SBI as reimbursement related to loan moratorium.

This is pertaining to remaining claims submitted by Lending Institutions (LIs) under the scheme for grant of ex-gratia payment of difference between compound interest and simple interest for six months to borrowers in specified loan accounts from March 1, 2020 to August 31, 2020, when India was hit hard by the pandemic, finance ministry said. About 1,612 LIs have 23,89,30,080 beneficiaries with a claim of ₹6,473.74 crore, out of which ₹5,500 crore have been disbursed earlier, and claims of ₹973.74 crore were pending.

In the context of the Covid-19 pandemic, a scheme for grant of ex-gratia payment of difference between compound interest and simple interest for six months to borrowers in specified loan accounts from March 1, 2020 to August 31, 2020 was approved by the Cabinet in October 2020, envisaging therein an outlay of ₹5,500 crore. Budget allocation of ₹5,500 crore was made for the scheme in FY 2020-2021. The amount of ₹5,500 crore has been disbursed to SBI, the nodal agency under the scheme, for consequent reimbursement to lending institutions. The SBI said it received consolidated claims of ₹6,473.74 crore approx from lending institutions. As ₹5,500 crore has already been disbursed, the Cabinet's nod wassought for a balance amount of ₹973.74 crore.

Sania to hang up her racquet post this season

Melbourne, Jan 19: Frailblazing India tennis Mirza Sania Wednesday announced that she will hang up her racquet at the end of 2022 season as her body is "wearing down" and the motivation and energy for everyday grind is not the same anymore.

Winner of six Grand Slam titles, including three mixed doubles, Sania will retire as India's most accomplished woman tennis player. The 35-year-old made the retirement announcement after losing the Australian Open women's doubles first round with partner Nadiia Kichenok. They lost to Slovenia's Tamara Zidansek and Kaja Juvan.

"There's a bunch of reasons for it. I do feel my recovery is taking longer and considering my son is three years old, I do feel I am putting him at risk by travelling so much with him. Unfortunately the pandemic is making us take certain decision for the well-being of ourselves and family," Mirza said at the post-match press conference.

"Also, my body is wearing down. My knee was really hurting today and I'm not saying that's the reason we lost but I do think that it is taking time to recover as I'm getting older," she said. Sania, who became world number one in doubles during her successful partnership with Swiss legend Martina Hingis, said there were a certain issues that influenced her decision.

"Also for me to find that motivation everyday to come out, the energy is not the same anymore. Right this minute, it's there but there are days where I don't feel like doing that. "I've always said that I will play until I enjoy that grind, the process and not just winning but you have to enjoy the

process and I am not sure I'm enjoying it anymore. "I am enjoying it enough to play this season. I've worked very hard to come back, get fit, lose the weight and try to set a good example for mothers, new mothers to follow their dreams as much as they can. Beyond this season, I don't feel my body doing it. It's beat," said the world number 68.

She reached top-30 in singles with 27 being her career best rank. Sania quit singles after a wrist injury to focus on doubles and enjoyed exceptional results. Sania said she feels that she was playing at a decent level but she always knew that 2022 will be her last season and Wednesday's defeat was no trigger for it.





Cuttack, Jan 19: Orissa High Court Chief Justice S Muralidhar Wednesday inaugurated six new courts, one each at Malkangiri, Kalahandi, Kendrapara, Jajpur, Bolangir and Keonjhar districts, through videoconference, an

The new courts are: Court of civil judge-cum-JMFC at Kudumuluguma in Malkangiri district, court of senior civil judge-cum-assistant sessions judge (women's court) at Bhawanipatna in Kalahandi district, court of senior civil judge (LR & LTV) at Kendrapara, court of senior civil judge (LR & LTV) at Jajpur, court of senior civil judge (LR & LTV) at Bolangir and court of senior civil judge-cum-assistant sessions judge (women's court) at Keonjhar, it was learnt.

The Orissa HC Chief Justice said the collective efforts of judges, judicial officers, members of the Bar, local administration and police play a key role in the success of justice delivery system.

Bhubaneswar, Jan 19: The state Wednesday recorded 11,607 new Covid-19 cases, 521 more than the previous day and 145 more Omicron cases taking the tally of the new variant to 347, a Health department bulletin said.

The caseload is now 11,67,094, it said. The new Omicron cases were confirmed after genome sequencing by the Institute of Life Science (ILS), Bhubaneswar out of a total 249 samples collected between January 9 to January 16, 2022, a health department official said.

Odisha government Wednesday started trial run of OmiSure test kits for early detection of Omicron virus within four hours. The tests in the first phase will be conducted in places reporting high test positive rates (TPR), the official said.

Meanwhile, the Covid-19 toll in Odisha mounted to 8,494 with six fresh fatalities, the highest singleday count in more than three months, he said.

Fifty three other coronavirus-positive patients have died due to comorbidities so far, the bulletin said. At least 991 children were among the new patients and the TPR stood at 16.7 per cent, it said. VITAL DATA

Puri and Mayurbhanj are among the 11 districts that are in the yellow zone with over 1,000 patients each. The state tested 69.502 samples in the last 24 hours in comparison to 70,117 Monday and 81,065 last Wednesday.

Health Services Director Bijay Mohapatra said the government will look at how much testing could be increased after considering various aspects, including the recent ICMR guidelines.

His statement came hours after the union government flagged a decline in the number of tests in many states, including Odisha, directing them to enhance it to effectively track the coronavirus spread and initiate immediate citizen-centric action.

Mohapatra urged people to conduct tests even if they developed minor symptoms.

Around 2.31 crore people have been fully vaccinated in the state so far, the department added.

Don't panic, follow Covid norms: CS

Bhubaneswar, Jan 19: Amid rising Covid-19 cases in the state. Chief Secretary Suresh Chandra Mahapatra Wednesday advised people to remain cautious and follow all Covid-related norms in order to curb the spread of the infection.

Mahapatra said the infection rate is rising rapidly and daily cases are hovering around 10,000 to 11,000 for one week now. "We can't let our guard down," said Mahapatra.

Stating that the next few days are very crucial, he urged the people not to panic and religiously follow Covid-19 guidelines.

Due to the cooperation of all, the state has so far been able to tackle the third wave from exploding out of control. Stringent restrictions like lockdown and shutdown have not been enforced in the state in order to protect the livelihoods of people, he pointed out.

The hospitalisation and ICU requirement is currently low as compared to previous waves. Only 2 per cent of active cases have so far been hospitalised against the 10 per cent during the second wave and only 10 per cent of hospital beds in the ଡ-୧୯ ସଚେଡନଡା ସମ୍ମକିଡ

state have been occupied, he said The Chief Secretary appealed to people to use masks when stepping outside the house and while talking to others. Mahapatra also urged the people to take care of the vulnerable group, including the elderly, pregnant women and children, who have not been vaccinated.

He further advised to immediately undergo a Covid test in case of any symptoms. "Take medicines only as per the advice of doctors. In Odisha, the government is providing medicines and hospital treatment to the people for free," he added.

Mishra said the funds were provided to the colleges for repair and renovation of infrastructure during 2020-21 fiscal


"No further infrastructure grants shall be released unless the UCs are received from the defaulting col-

Geneva, Jan 19: Although average global temperatures were temporarily cooled by the 2020-2022 La Nina events, 2021 was still one of the seven warmest years on record, according to six leading international datasets consolidated by the World Meteorological Organisation (WMO).

The average global temperature in 2021 was about 1.11 degrees Celsius above the pre-industrial (1850-1900) levels. 2021 is the 7th consecutive year (2015-2021) where global temperature has been over 1 degrees C above pre-industrial levels, according to all datasets compiled by WMO.

Since the 1980s, each decade has been warmer than the previous one. This is expected to continue. The warmest seven years have all been since 2015. with 2016, 2019 and 2020 constituting the top three. An exceptionally strong El Nino event occurred in 2016, which contributed to record global average warming.

Global warming and other long-term climate change trends are expected to continue as a result of record levels of heat-trapping greenhouse gases in the atmosphere, the WMO said in a global release.

WMO uses six international datasets to ensure the most comprehensive, authoritative temperature assessment. The same data are used in its annual State of the Climate reports, which inform the international community on global climate indicators.

The rankings of individual years should be considered in

the long-term context, especially since the differences between individual years are sometimes marginal.

"Back-to-back La Nina events mean that 2021 warming was relatively less pronounced compared to recent years. Even so, 2021 was still warmer than previous years influenced by La Nina. The overall long-term warming as a result of greenhouse gas increase is now far larger than the year-to-year variability in global average temperatures caused by naturally occurring climate drivers," said WMO Secretary General Petteri Taalas.

"The year 2021 will be remembered for a record-shattering temperature of nearly 50 degrees Celsius in Canada, comparable to the values reported in the hot Saharan Desert of Algeria; exceptional rainfall, and deadly flooding in Asia and Europe as well as drought in parts of Africa and South America. Climate change impacts and weatherrelated hazards had life-changing and devastating impacts on

communities on every single continent," Taalas said.

La Nina refers to the large scale cooling of the ocean surface temperatures in the central and eastern equatorial Pacific Ocean, coupled with changes in the tropical atmospheric circulation. It usually has the opposite impacts on weather and climate as El Nino. La Nina has a temporary global cooling effect, which is typically strongest in the second year of the event.

International datasets

WMO uses datasets developed and maintained by the United States National Oceanic Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), NASA's Goddard Institute for Space Studies (NASA GISS), the United Kingdom's Met Office Hadley Centre and the University of East Anglia's Climatic Research Unit (HadCRUT), and the Berkeley Earth group.

WMO also uses reanalysis datasets from the European Centre for Medium Range

Copernicus Climate Change Service, and the Japan Meteorological Agency (JMA).

The Copernicus Climate Change Service estimated that 2021 was the 5th warmest year on record, but only marginally warmer than 2015 and 2018. NOAA and Berkeley Earth found that 2021 was nominally the sixth warmest year. NASA GISTEMP and HadCRUT have 2021 effectively tied for sixth warmest. Data from the Japanese Meteorological Agency (JMA) Reanalysis rank 2021 as nominally the seventh warmest year. The small differences among these datasets indicate the margin of error for calculating the average global temperature. Even the India Meteorological Department (IMD) had last week announced that the year 2021 was the fifth warmest year for India since nationwide records com-

menced in 1901. The Paris Agreement seeks to hold the increase in the global average temperature to well below 2 degrees Celsius above pre-industrial levels while pursuing efforts to limit the temperature increase to 1.5 degrees Celsius above preindustrial levels. At 1.11 degrees Celsius above the pre-industrial (1850-1900) levels, the global average temperature in 2021 is already approaching the lower limit of temperature increase the Paris Agreement seeks to avert.

Temperature is just one of the indicators of climate change. Others include greenhouse gas concentrations, ocean heat content, ocean pH, global mean sea level, glacial mass and sea ice extent.

The tehsil office needs to be run by a tehsildar and three additional tehsildars. However, it has been over a year that the office functioning with a tehsildar and a lone additional tehsildar.

The additional tehsildar Puja Lenka was also discharging some additional duty. She was discharging her own duty along with that of a sub-registrar as the government has not appointed a sub-registrar in the area. However, with Lenka going on maternity leave, tehsildar Preetiparna Mishra is now discharging the duty of sub-registrar along with her own responsibility of a tehsildar. All the functions in the tehsil office come to a grinding halt if the tehsildar leaves office and goes outside on law and order duty.

Many a times, the tehsildar has to visit Dhinkia, the site of the proposed JSW steel project on law and order duty and other works. As a result, students and their guardians visiting the office for income, residential, legal heir and caste certificates have to return

Man shoots dogs; animal rights activists file FIR


Johannesburg, Jan 19: The Omicron variant of coronavirus may reduce the incidence of severe Covid-19 disease, and the infection may become less disruptive to individuals and society in future, according to a study conducted by researchers in South Africa.

The findings of the yet-to-be peerreviewed study are consistent with the previous observations of Omicron displacing Delta, since the variant can elicit immunity which neutralises Delta

The researchers from Africa Health Research Institute observed in samples from 23 people infected with Omicron in November and December that the variant escapes neutralising immunity elicited by Delta infection.

This indicates that Omicron can re-infect Delta infected individuals but not vice-versa, giving Omicron an advantage over Delta, they said.

The implications of such displacement would depend on whether Omicron is indeed less pathogenic than Delta. If so, then the incidence of Covid-19 severe disease would be reduced and the infection may shift to become less disruptive to indi-



viduals and society, they authors of the study noted.

The finding is an update to the study by the same research team which found enhancement of immunity against Delta variant with Omicron infection.

"We were able to add study participants to see more clearly the

effect of vaccination," Professor Alex Sigal, from Africa Health

However, the team also observed that the participants developed some enhanced immunity against the Delta variant, with Delta neutralisation increasing 4.4-fold.

The study also showed that vaccinated participants were able to mount a better neutralising response against Delta, while the response in unvaccinated participants was more variable.

Hopefully, all this means Delta is on its way out as Omicron may shut the door on Delta re-infections. Provided enough people vaccinate. The unvaccinated lose out on the extra Omicron protection and don't gain a boost to Delta, said Sigal.

The Omicron variant of SARS CoV-2, the virus which causes COVID-19, was first identified in November last year in South Africa and Botswana.

The variant has been shown to be highly transmissible and have extensive evasion of neutralising antibody immunity elicited by vaccination and previous SARS-CoV-2 infection.

₹296.17cr for drinking water projects

Berhampur, Jan 19: At least 11 out of 22 blocks will have women chairpersons as 1,82,362 new voters were added to the voters' list during the last five vears, a report said.

There were altogether 22, 61,254 voters in 503 panchayats of the district during 2017 panchayat elections. This year, it has increased to 24, 43,616. Moreover, transgenders were not included in the voter list during the previous elections but 180 of them have been enlisted this year.

Since the state government is laying stress on adequate representation of women in Panchayati Raj system, 11 out of 22 blocks in the district will have women chairpersons, government sources said. Similarly, over 250 women

Breaking COVID's Grip

wo years into the worst pandemic in a century, it is tempting to think that the world is stuck in a time warp, unable to shake off a virus that has so far killed more than 5.5 million people and wrecked countless livelihoods. But the truth is that in the 15 months since the COVID-19 Vaccine Global Access (COVAX) facility first gained the support of the international community much has changed.

In September 2020, we did not know whether scientists would be able to develop a safe and effective COVID-19 vaccine. Now we have several. Nor did we know back then that industry would succeed in scaling up production. But, in the event, 11 billion doses were manufactured last year

Sadly, these successes also serve to highlight where the world has failed in its efforts to combat the pandemic. Although the world produced enough COVID-19 vaccine doses in 2021 to vaccinate every adult on the planet, more than three billion people, most of them living in lower-income countries, have yet to receive their first dose. High-income countries have an average vaccination rate of over 75 per cent and are now focusing on booster programmes. In Africa, by contrast, roughly 10 per cent of the population is fully vaccinated, on average, and health systems are still catching up with primary vaccinations

COVAX's recent delivery of its one billionth COVID-19 vaccine dose represents significant progress toward increasing supply, ensuring equitable access, and thus remedying the current appalling global disparity. This milestone also shows that COVAX - and multilateralism - can work, despite hoarding or restricting exports of vaccines and ingredients by some gov-

Given this momentum, it is essential that COVAX – a partnership established by the Coalition for Epidemic Preparedness Innovations, the World Health Organisation, UNICEF, and Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance – continues to receive the world's backing. Otherwise, as rich countries press ahead with booster rollouts in the face of the Omicron variant, lower-income countries risk falling even further behind.

Such an outcome would constitute not only a moral failure, but also a public-health catastrophe. We all know by now that no one is safe from COVID-19 until everyone is safe. Until we can vaccinate people in all parts of the world, the coronavirus will continue to mutate, resulting in the emergence of new and potentially more dangerous variants. There is a significant risk that we will become trapped in an endless cycle of booster vaccinations, chasing the virus rather than getting ahead of it.

Alternatively, by protecting people everywhere, we can reboot the global economy and fully resume trade, commerce, and travel. This will require renewed commitments by high-income countries and vaccine manufacturers to put orders for those most in need first. Providing

equitable vaccine access also means ensuring that COVAX has the flexibility to respond to future needs, including those related to booster programmes, variant-adapted vaccines, or simply additional doses

Progress in combating the pandemic over the last year has been slower than everyone involved in COVAX – including me, as chair of Gavi – wanted and expected, and many lessons need to be learned. And despite the widespread and growing perception that Omicron is somehow less dangerous than previous variants of this coronavirus, we are still very much in the midst

But while further supply-side and demand-side challenges will arise in 2022, we are at last in a position where breaking COVID-19 is a realistic prospect. Speed is of the essence, and the faster we limit the virus' ability to spread, the sooner we will end the cycles of havoc it has wreaked on our societies and economies. That requires ensuring rapid, fair, and equitable access to COVID-19 vaccines to people in all countries.

The delivery of COVAX's one billionth dose proves that, when push comes to shove, we can collaborate effectively to tackle massive global challenges. But this achievement is also a timely reminder that much more remains to

COVAX and the other international organisations committed to vaccine equity cannot end the pandemic without the help of governments, industry, and civil society. By working together, we have a chance to break the grip of COVID-19 once and for all. We must make the most of it.

t now means some lengthy and complicated procedure but an older sense was of an incoherent set of statements or a wandering discourse —the history of this word is more than a little odd and takes some recounting. In medieval times, there was a game called ragman, which seems to have been like consequences but with predefined statements. It used a rolled-up scroll containing descriptions of characters, each with a string attached. Players selected a string at random, the scroll was then unrolled and the associated passage read out, to the hilarity of all present (these were simpler times). There are also some suspicions that the same system was used for a gambling game. The origin of the name for the game is obscure: the oldest form was rageman, said as three syllables, and this suggests it may have been French in origin — a character called Rageman the Good appeared in some French verses of about 1290. Others think it might have come from rag in the sense of tatters, used as a name for a devil (as in ragamuffin, originally a demon). The name was transferred to various English statutes at the end of the thirteenth century, which were written on scrolls. With the seals and ribbons of their signers sticking out, these reminded people of the scroll used in the game. The most famous such document was the one in 1291 in which the Scottish nobility and gentry subscribed allegiance to Edward I before John Balliol took the Scots throne. It seems the terms ragman and ragman roll passed into the language as a description of a long and rambling discourse, no doubt from the disconnected nature of documents like the rolls of allegiance. It later seems to have fallen out of use; it reappeared in the eighteenth century in various spellings, such as riggmon-rowle, but it eventually settled down as rigmarole, in the process losing any clear connection with the older term.

IT SEEMS THAT PUTIN'S OBSESSION WITH UKRAINE IS DUE TO BOTH STRATEGIC AND HISTORICAL FACTORS

ussia has demanded for a new security arrangement in Europe, and threatened war if the US and its NATO allies fail to comply. Western analysts are split over interpreting Russian President Vladimir Putin's motives. Some say he is using the impossible list of demands as a pretext to invade Ukraine. Others think he is playing a weak hand to try to divide the West and reorder Europe's security architecture in Russia's favour.

The Russian Foreign Ministry, asking the US to remove its nuclear umbrella from Europe and allow Russia to re-establish its Soviet-era sphere of influence over Eastern Europe, issued the new Russian demands in a rather unusual manner. December 17, 2021, the Russian Foreign Ministry unilaterally published two draft treaties: one focussing on Russia and the US, and the other between Russia and NATO.

Russia's draft "Treaty between the United States of America and the Russian Federation on Security Guarantees" listed more than a dozen demands including no NATO membership to all states of the former USSR including the Baltic States which have been members of the alliance since 2004. It asks the US to remove all its nuclear weapons from Europe, and halt deploying groundlaunched intermediate-range and shorter-range missiles outside of its territory.

The draft focussing on NATO "Agreement on Measures to Ensure the Security of the Russian Federation and Member States of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization" put forward additional demands such as: NATO member states are prohibited from deploying military forces to any country that became a member of the alliance after May 27, 1997 when NATO and Russia signed the Founding Act on Mutual Relations; NATO is also prohibited from deploying land-based intermediateand short-range missiles to a location from where such missiles can reach Russia; NATO is prohibited

from any further enlargement including military cooperation with Ukraine as well as other states in Eastern Europe, the South Caucasus and in Central Asia.

Russian Deputy Foreign Minister Sergei Ryabkov declared that both texts are part of a whole and are not to be understood as being "a menu, where you can choose one or the other.

While Russia expects NATO and the US to comply with its demands, Moscow, in return, has offered only a vague commitment to "not create conditions or situations that threaten the national security of the other parties." The draft treaty imposes no requirements for Moscow to redeploy Russian forces. December 23, 2021, Putin, during a four-hour press conference, repeated his stance that "any further NATO movement to the east is unacceptable.' A few days later, the Kremlin described NATO expansion as "a matter of life and death" for Russia. December 26, Russia warned Finland and Sweden against joining NATO.

Initially there was no response from either the US or NATO, as both said that they have scheduled meetings with Russian leaders in the second week of January.

and it would give them a chance to parley before making their stand clear. The Geneva talks between Russia and the US were followed by other sessions in Brussels with NATO and Vienna with Organisation for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE) delegates aimed at averting a crisis. But at all three meetings there were no signs of progress from either side. While both sides dug in on their positions with Ukraine's future hanging in the balance, Russian Deputy Foreign Minister Sergei Ryabkov said 'no progress' was made on the central demand on NATO expansion.

Meanwhile, Michael Carpenter, the US ambassador to the OSCE, has said that Washington and its allies are supporting the on-going dialogue to scale down tensions with Russia. He further said: "We're facing a crisis in European security. The drumbeat of war is sounding loud, and the rhetoric has gotten rather shrill." This came as Russia said that the talks with the West over the situation in Ukraine have hit a 'dead end'.

Recently, Moscow has been especially unsettled by the prospect of Ukraine being admitted to NATO and has warned of serious measures to counteract that

scenario. It seems that Putin's obsession with Ukraine is due to both strategic and historical factors. The Russian-Ukrainian ties date back to even before the emergence of Soviet Union — and even before the days of the Russian empire beginning in the 18th century. Further Putin wants to stem his country's decline in global influence. Moscow's leverage in places like Ukraine is one way to preserve that influence. Ukraine is also a key component of Russia's plans for a Eurasian customs union with some other former Soviet states.

Ukraine's move toward the Western bloc in the name of having a democratic state has made the Russian establishment feel betrayed because Kiev's national identity and history is much more linked to Russia than Turkic states in Central Asia and Baltic States in Eastern Europe, which were also part of the USSR. The emotional presence of Kiev in the Russian heart has not changed much. Putin has continued to call Ukraine 'Little Russia', quoting a former Russian general, Anton Denikin. Russian influence has significantly decreased over time across the Balkans, where Moscow was once the leading power. It has already lost Baltic States to the EU after the Soviet fall. As a result, Moscow feels that it can't concede Ukraine to the West.

Moreover, Russia may not like to have too many pro-EU neighbours with NATO sympathies along its western border. Lithuania and Estonia, the two Baltic States neighbouring Russia, already joined the union much to the dismay of the Russian establishment So it would do everything in order to maintain its influence over Ukraine. There is little doubt anymore that Vladimir Putin is seeking nothing less than a transformation in European security, with a much-reduced NATO presence along its borders.

Evidently the general government fiscal balance of countries. nominal GDP) in 2020 was worst for the United States (-14.9%) followed by Brazil (-13.4%), India (-12.8%), United Kingdom (-12.5%), Saudi Arabia (-11.3%), and China (-11.2%) due to the COVID-19 pandemic. And the projections on overall fiscal balance (for 2026) for these countries is apparently gloomy with India (-7.8%) being projected to be the slow mover on fiscal balance front. Further, the fiscal balance projections (for 2026) for emerging market economies (-4.1%) is worse than that for low-income developing countries (-3.9%), the world (-3.5%), advanced economies (-3%) and oil producers (-1.6%). Besides, the general government debt (percentage of nominal GDP) in 2020 for the US (133.9%), UK (104.5%), Brazil (98.9%), India (89.6%), and China (66.3%) was high and projections for 2026 are no less. It is noteworthy that in the medium term countries will require more financing for debt servicing. Currently, most of the central banks have used their reserves to purchase government bonds which have kept the borrowing rates at a lower level but it is a matter of time before they are forced to raise the policy rate

s per the International to keep inflation in check. This is space held the economic recovery even though India's (8.5%) growth Monetary Fund (IMF) data, expected to further worsen the fis-

ment fiscal overall balance of India, one of the fastest growing emerging economies, is possibly the hardest hit due to the pandemic. The Government of India (GoI) took several above-the-line measures those for which full cost is reflected in the fiscal deficit, government debt, and increased borrowing needs in the short term. These measures include additional spending, capital grants and targeted transfers or tax measures. In addition to this, the GoI initiated several below-the-line measures those involve the creation of assets like equity injections, loans and asset purchase. The GoI through abovethe-line measures has additionally spent 109 billion USD on health and non-health sectors as a direct response to mitigate the effects of the pandemic; and an additional 166 billion USD as liquidity support through below-the-line measures. The above-the-line measures and below-the-line measures constitute 4.09% and 6.22% (of 2020 GDP), respectively.

Earlier as the second wave set in, in India like many other emerging economies and less developed economies, lack of adequate vaccine supply and crunched fiscal for far too longer and even pushed it back by a few notches. Nonetheless, if the economic recovery packages announced by the GoI are expected to increase consumption, investment, exports and thereby growth then there is no denying the fact that India has started experiencing early signs of rise in real interest rate, food prices, oil price, and therefore, inflation. Thus, the pandemic has two potential outcomes; first, the massive investment in health and physical infrastructure accompanied by the pandemic-induced structural change may promote productivity and equity and thereby can reduce future debt obligations. On the contrary, with soaring current debt levels, very high future debt service expectations, continuously diminishing fiscal space accompanied by upside risks to interest rate, inflation and exchange rate might push the economic prospects into a quagmire.

What's more is spike in job cuts, policy uncertainty, unimproved tax revenue collection and a risk of an emerging new coronavirus variant (Omicron) can make a dent in the government exchequer. In India, as per the CMIE data. 2.27 crore jobs were lost during April and May 2021. Moreover, these concerns remain elevated

projections based on world economic outlook (Oct 2021) for fiscal 2021-22 is placed comfortably higher as compared to other major economies like China (5.6%) and the US (5.2%). At this juncture, tightening of monetary or fiscal policy is uncalled for so also any marked fiscal slippages, otherwise a fiscal crisis can be around the corner. Thus the role of central banks as autonomous institutions becomes crucial in establishing an optimum level of debt to GDP ratio as no macroeconomic theory specifies a threshold level of debt.

The extraordinary volume of the fiscal response to the crisis has entailed that the design of fiscal frameworks must encompass three broad goals: (i) sustainability of public finances; (ii) stabilisation of the economy through countercyclical fiscal policy, when appropriate; and (iii) simple fiscal rules to facilitate communication and accountability to the public. A trustworthy pledge to maintain fiscal sustainability allows that flexibility and time to the government for financing its deficits through easy and relatively cheaper means.



SC pulls up states, summons AP, Bihar chief secretaries

The top court told the state governments to reach out to the families who lost their loved ones to Covid-19, and emphasised, the governments should not wait for them to file applications to claim compensation

New Delhi, Jan 19: In an effort to provide some help to over 10,000 $\,$ children who lost both their parents to Covid-19, the Supreme Court Wednesday directed all state governments to reach out to those kids and pay them compensation.

The apex court, which was annoved over non-disbursal of ₹50,000 ex-gratia to the kin of those who lost their lives due to Covid-19, pulled up the state governments and summoned the Andhra Pradesh and Bihar Chief Secretaries virtually to seek explanation during the course of the day.

It also issued a show cause notice to Andhra Pradesh Chief Secretary Sameer Sharma as to why contempt action be not initiated against him for non-compliance of top court's earlier order on disbursal of claims.

A bench of Justices M R Shah and Sanjiv Khanna took note of the submissions of petitioner Gaurav Bansal and advocate Sumeer Sodhi, appearing for intervenors, that over 10,000 children have been orphaned due to Covid and other reasons since the start of the pandemic and they be compensated.

"It is stated that in the entire country as per the information uploaded on Baal Swaraj portal (of NCPCR) approximately 10,000 children have lost their both the parent or a surviving parent. It



cult for them to make their application or submit the claim for compensation. "We direct the concerned states to reach out to those children, who have lost both their parents and whose particulars are already uploaded in the Baal Swaraj portal and so that the amount of compensation can be paid to them,' the bench said.

"We also direct the concerned states to share the full information/particulars with regard to the number of deaths recorded by the concerned states as well as the particulars/information uploaded in Baal Swaraj portal to the con-cerned State legal service Authority," it added.

The bench said it would pass a detailed order by Thursday. The apex court was hearing a batch of pleas by Bansal and intervenors, seeking ex-gratia assistance to family members of Covid-19 victims.

The bench noted from the chart submitted by Additional Solicitor General Aishwarya Bhati, appearing for the Centre, that majority of the states have rejected number of claims and gave example of Gujarat (4,234), Maharashtra (49,113), Tamil Nadu (10,138) and Telangana (1,489).

Assurance was given by Bihar Chief Secretary and advocate Abhinav Mukerji, appearing for the state government,

LIQUOR WILL BE CHEAP IN MP

Bhopal, Jan 19: In the new Excise Police for the next Financial Year, the BJP government in Madhya Pradesh has decided to allow the sale of liquor at all airports in the state and select supermarkets in four big cities, and issue home bar licenses to those earning ₹one crore or more annually.

In the Excise Policy 2022-23, approved by the state Cabinet Tuesday, the government also decided to slash retail prices of liquor by 20 per cent in a bid to "make them practical".

Explaining the rationale behind the proposed cut in rates of alcohol, an official said that the prices will become competitive with neighbouring states. Meanwhile, the opposition Congress took a swipe saying the state government is not willing to provide any relief to common people by slashing taxes on fuel but is reducing the prices of liquor. The Cabinet meeting chaired by Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan also cleared the Madhya Pradesh Heritage (Traditional) Liquor Policy.

Under the new Excise Policy, counters selling liquor can be opened at all the airports in MP while licenses for (opening) such outlets can now be issued in select supermarkets in Indore, Bhopal, Jabalpur and Gwalior at a fixed fee, an official statement said

SC to consider hearing PIL challenging use of EVMs

New Delhi, Jan 19: The Supreme Court Wednesday agreed to consider listing a PIL challenging the Constitutional validity of a provision of the Representation of People Act which had led to the introduction of electronic voting machines (EVMs) instead of ballot papers for polls in the country.

A bench comprising Chief Justice of India (CJI) N V Ramana heard the submissions of lawyer ML Sharma, who filed the plea in his personal capacity, that the petition required hearing in view of



upcoming assembly polls in five states - Uttar Pradesh, Goa, Punjab, Manipur and Uttarakhand.

"We will see it... I may list it before some other bench as well," the CJI said. Sharma said Section 61A of the Representation of People Act, which permitted the use of EVMs, was not passed by Parliament and hence cannot be im-

"I have filed the petition which is supported with the evidence on the record. A judicial note can be taken note of the case...Let the election be held through ballot papers," the lawyer said. The plea, which made the Union Law ministry a party, sought declaration of the provision as "void, illegal and unconstitutional" as there was no provision of EVM. The upcoming assembly polls in the five states will be held between February 10 and March 10.

ED seizes ₹8-cr cash from CM's relative; ₹21L gold

New Delhi/Chandigarh, Jan 19: The ED Wednesday said it has seized cash amounting to over ₹10 crore, including about ₹8 crore from a relative of Punjab Chief Minister Charanjit Singh Channi, during raids conducted in connection with an anti-money laundering investigation against illegal sand-mining operations in the pollbound state.

In a statement, the Enforcement Directorate (ED) said "incriminating" documents related to "illegal" sand mining and property transactions, mobile phones, gold worth more than ₹21 lakh and a Rolex watch worth ₹12 lakh were



also seized during the searches that ended Wednesday. Agency sources also refuted allegations of high-handedness during the raids, saying the action launched on Tuesday was undertaken by following "due legal procedures and no personal comments or individual threats were made".

PM to meet Central **Asian leaders virtually**

New Delhi, Jan 19: Prime Minister Narendra Modi will host the first India-Central Asia Summit in a virtual format January 27 during which the leaders are expected to deliberate on steps to take forward relations to newer heights as well as the evolving regional security situation.

The virtual summit will be held with the participation of the five presidents - Kazakhstan's Kassym-Jomart Tokayev, Uzbekistan's Shavkat Mirziyoyev, Emomali Rahmon, of Tajikistan, Turkmenistan's Gurbanguly Berdimuhamedow and Sadyr Japarov of Kyrgyz Republic.

This will be the first engagement of its kind between India and the Central Asian countries at the level of leaders, the Ministry of External Affairs said in a statement. The summit will be held a day after the Republic Day and sources said this year too like 2021, there will be no foreign head of state or government as the chief guest for the Republic Day event in view of the Covid-19 pandemic and the rising cases.

The first India-Central Asia Summit, the MEA said, is a reflection of India's growing engagement with the Central Asiancountries, which are a part of India's "extended neighbourhood".

Docs remove mobile phone swallowed by Tihar inmate

THE INCIDENT TOOK PLACE JANUARY 5 WHEN THE INMATE LODGED AT JAIL NO. 1 SWALLOWED A MOBILE PHONE TO HIDE IT FROM THE STAFF WHILE HE WAS BEING SEARCHED

New Delhi, Jan 19: Doctors at Delhi's GB Pant Hospital have successfully removed a mobile phone from the stomach of a Tihar inmate who had swallowed it in a bid to hide it from the authorities

during a surprise check. Director General (Prison), Sandeep Goel, told IANS that the mobile phone was removed via endoscopy and the prisoner has been sent back to the jail.

The inmate was immediately taken to the Deen Dayal Upadhyay Hospital in the city from where he was referred to the GB Pant

Hospital. Doctors at the GB Pant Hospital,



who performed the endoscopy, told IANS that it was not the first time that they performed the procedure of removing a foreign object from a person's stomach.

"It was probably the tenth time we were doing such a procedure," said Siddharth Srivastava from Department

Gastroenterology, GB Pant Hospital. He said that the presence of the mobile phone was established with the help of an X-Ray and later on they performed an endoscopy and removed it through the patient's

mouth with the help of a snare. He further said that in 2021, the doctors at the hospital had published a case study in a gastro journal based on such a procedure.

Notably, the inmate had swallowed the mobile phone January 5 and the procedure was done January 15, which meant that the inmate was carrying the mobile phone in his stomach for exactly 10 days. "He was admitted to the hospital for over a week and was under constant medical observation," the DG Prison added.

The Tihar Jail authorities have been strengthening the security arrangements in the prison following the major backlash they received over jail officials being caught providing facilities to the inmates, including cellphones.

Over 40 officials at Tihar Jail

have been booked by various law enforcement agencies during the past six months for extending benefits to the prisoners in one way or the other.

Goel, in an earlier interview with IANS, had said that the Tihar Jail will soon have two X-ray based human body scanners that can prevent infiltration of illegal articles and gadgets inside the prison premises. Goval said they are installing three new towers inside the jail premises that would confine the mobile signals emanating from

the prison. 'All these measures are steps in the right direction and can prove beneficial in the future, he added.

Leopardess 'Jaya' had died Monday after it

was squeezed inside the poorly maintained rusty cage at the zoo

Chennai, Jan 19: The Postmortem report of a 14-year-old leopardess at Arignar Anna Zoological park has revealed that esophageal rupture and pulmonary hemorrhage as the primary reasons for the death.

The leopardess, 'Jaya' had died Monday after it was squeezed inside the poorly maintained rusty cage at the zoo. The postmortem conducted by the veterinarians of the Tamil Nadu Veterinary and Animal Sciences University (TANUVAS) said that the leopardess ribs were squeezed leading to the cut-off of

oxygen flow to its lungs. A zoo official, while speaking to IANS on conditions of anonymity,



said, "Nasal swab samples of animals, including lions and leopards, were taken and 14 samples were sent to the National Institute of High-Security Animal Diseases for testing. The samples of this leopardess were also taken but while releasing the animal the cage got jammed and the animal was squeezed inside.

We could not rescue it.

Tamil Nadu Chief WildLife Warden, Shekar Kumar Neeraj while speaking to IANS said, "National level experts will be roped in for a total review of the management practices in the zoo. Some shortcomings are observed here and I have already written to

the Central Zoo Authority to depute expert veterinarians on a consultancy basis.'

Covid has affected the Zoo with 70 staff becoming positive and the animals were also affected. According to staff in the zoo, during the pandemic of 2021, several lions had tested positive due to

Covid-19 and two died of the disease. It may be noted that the Vandalur Zoo, which houses the Arignar Anna Zoological Park, is going through a deep financial crisis and a proposal for sanctioning an amount of ₹12 crore was presented to the state government. The zoo is mainly affected due to the paucity of funds as the gate collection, which has been the major source of revenue, has dropped drastically following shutdowns and closures due to pandemic.

The zoo department is expecting the state government to provide the necessary support as well as rope in a few private corporatecompanies so that their CSR funds could be used for this project.

R-Day: Curbs on charter flights

New Delhi: Restrictions have been imposed at the Delhi airport on charter flights and airlines' non-scheduled flights due to approaching Republic Day January 26, stated a notice to airmen (NOTAM) issued by the Airports Authority of India (AAI). No landing or take off will be permitted from the Delhi airport for airlines' nonscheduled flights and general aviation companies' charter flights between 10.15 am-1.15 pm till January 24.

Air pollution rises in Maha, Gujarat

New Delhi: Most cities in Maharashtra and Gujarat indicated a rising trend in annual PM2.5 levels with a drop through 2020 (during lockdowns) followed by a rebound and a rising trend visible in 2021, an analysis by the Centre for Science & Environment (CSE) said. Stating that the air pollution is rapidly becoming a matter of concern in the two western states, the new analysis of regional air pollution levels said cities in Gujarat are more polluted than those in Maharashtra.

T'gana: 3 killed in road mishap

Hyderabad: Three persons were killed and three others iniured in a road accident in Telangana's Nirmal district Wednesday, police said. An auto-rickshaw carrying six people fell into a canal near Bellal in Kaddam mandal of Nirmal district. Three of the occupants died on the spot while three others were rescued by locals.

1.12cr domestic air passengers in Dec

New Delhi: Around 1.12 crore domestic passengers travelled by air in December, approximately 6.7 per cent higher than the 1.05 crore who travelled in November, the country's aviation regulator said Wednesday. Overall, 8.38 crore people travelled on domestic flights in 2021 as compared to 6.3 crore in 2020, showing a jump of 33 per cent, the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) said.

Boat capsizes, 10 missing

Patna: At least three persons were drowned and 10 others were missing after an overloaded boat, on which a tractor was also taken, capsized on the Gandak river in Bihar's West Champaran district Wednesday, police said. Police said there were around 20 people, mainly farmers, on the boat, as well as tractor.

Fresh cases hit eight-month high

New Delhi, Jan 19: India reported new coronavirus infections at an eight-month high Wednesday and a government scientist warned it will take weeks before data on hospitalisations and deaths will show how severe the latest wave driven by the Omicron variant will be.

The federal authorities have said Omicron was causing fewer hospitalisations and deaths than the Delta variant, which killed hundreds of thousands last year.

But Tarun Bhatnagar from the ICMR-National Institute of Epidemiology in Chennai said the impact of the current run-up in infections will show up with a lag.

"We have to worry about hospitalisation and deaths and that will come later," he told Reuters in a phone interview. "There will always be a lag of two-three weeks.' India reported 282,970 new infections over the last 24 hours, the highest in eight months, bringing the total to 37.9 million, secondhighest globally behind the United States. Deaths crept up to 441 fatalities, including 83 from a previous wave that the southern state of Kerala is recording only now, making the nationally tally one of the highest this year.

While infection rates have recently fallen in India's big cities, experts say cases nationally could peak by the middle of next month. About 70% of its 939 million adult population has received two primary vaccine does and a booster campaign for health workers and at-risk population is underway. But millions still await their first shot and Bhatnagar cited reports from some states that those unvaccinated or not fully vaccinated



Over 159.54cr jabs administered till date

NEW DELHI: The cumulative COVID-19 vaccine doses administered in the country crossed 159.54 crore Wednesday, the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare stated. More than 62 lakh (62,39,005) vaccine doses were administered in the day till 7 pm. Over 61 lakh precaution doses have been administered to frontline workers, healthcare workers, and citizens aged 60 and above, the ministry stated. A total of 3,82,93,986 doses have been given to adolescents in the age group of 15 to 18 years, according to the health ministry's interim data. government rolled out the countrywide vaccination drive January 16 last year with healthcare workers getting jabbed in the first phase.

India also reported on Wednesday the first major rise in Covid-19 testing in a week after the health ministry warned states of the risks of missing the spread of the virus. UP Deputy Speaker Agarwal, an SP MLA from Hardoi Sadar assembly seat said he has also resigned as deputy speaker of the House. Besides Agarwal, SP MLA Sharadveer Singh from Jalalabad assembly segment in Shahjahanpur district too resigned from the party, saying the SP has deviated from its ideology and he will now work for the victory of the BJP.

In a news conference in Lucknow, Agarwal said, "I have sent my resignation from the SP to its national president Akhilesh Yadav. I have also resigned from the assembly

BJP announces alliances with Apna Dal, Nishad Party

NEW DELHI: BJP president J P Nadda Wednesday announced an alliance with Apna Dal and Nishad Party, which draw their support primarily from sections of backward castes, for the Uttar Pradesh assembly polls. Details about how many seats each party will contest will be announced later, their leaders said. Addressing a press conference, Nadda said the three National Democratic Alliance partners in the state will fight the elections to 403-member assembly together and lauded Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath-led government for its performance on a host of issues including law and order, investment and improvement in social indicators.

"The ticket from here has been given to a candidate, who, during the BSP regime, committed atrocities on traders and other sections of the society. Hurt by your decision, I am resigning," he added. When contacted, Singh told PTI over the phone that he has not joined the BJP yet but applied for its ticket.

"If I get the BJP ticket, I will contest from here otherwise I will help whosoever gets the BJP ticket from here and ensure his victory," he said. "My aim is to ensure the defeat of SP candidate Neeraj Maurya. All my supporters are with me,"he added.

Maha: MVA trumps **ANXIOUS WAIT** over BJP in Nagar

Mumbai, Jan 19: The ruling Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) allies trumped the Opposition Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) by unitedly bagging a majority of the 1,649 seats in the crucial Nagar Panchayat held in 32 of the state's 36 districts, officials said here Wednesday.

The BJP emerged as the single largest party bagging 384 seats against the MVA tally of 944 comprising Nationalist Congress Party's 344, Congress' 316 and Shiv Sena's

The counting for 163 seats in 9 Nagar Panchayats of Gadchiroli district, which went to the polls, shall be conducted Thursday.

Besides the four major parties, the CPI-M bagged 11 seats, Maharashtra Navnirman Sena and Bahujan Samaj Party got 4 each, other parties secured 85 seats and a chunk of 206 seats were won by independents.

The election results evoked sharp reactions from both the MVA and the BJP as they could have ramifications in the upcoming local bodies and major civic corporations. The NCP termed the outcome as the BJP's "rejection" by the people of the state. Congress expressed immense "satisfaction" while the Sena also made "inroads" into newer territories.

NCP National Spokesp Minority Affairs Minister Nawab Malik said that the "people of the state have rejected the BJP" and the MVA allies who fought separately, jointly or unitedly in different areas have been accepted by the masses.

Woman, 4 kids die after inhaling toxic smoke from brazier

New Delhi, Jan 19: A 30-year-old woman and her four children died allegedly after inhaling toxic smoke emanating from an 'angithi' (brazier) kept in their room in Shahdara's Seemapuri area Wednesday, police said. According to police, a PCR call

was received around 1.30 pm regarding four to five people lying unconscious in a room on the fifth floor of a house in Old Seemapuri. Upon reaching there, the woman and three of her kids were found dead while the fourth and the youngest one was taken to a hospital but declared dead by doctors, a senior police officer said. During inquiry, it was found that one Mohit Kalia (35) along with his wife Radha and four children -- two daughters and two sons -- lived in the rented accommodation, he said. The flat belongs to Amarpal Singh (60), a resident of Shalimar Garden. Preliminary inquiry suggests they all died of suffocation due to the brazier kept inside the room amidsevere cold conditions as the small room had no ventilation, police said.

Govt extends tenure of NCSK for 3 years

New Delhi, Jan 19: Government Wednesday extended the tenure of the National Commission for Safai Karmacharis (NCSK) by three years up to March 31, 2025. The decision was taken at a

meeting of the Union Cabinet chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, I&B Minister Anurag Thakur told reporters here. The mandate of the Commission

includes recommending to the central government specific programmes of action towards elimination of inequalities in status, facilities and opportunities for sanitation workers.

The total implication of the extension for three years would be approximately Rs 43.68 crore.

The NCSK was established in the year 1993 under the The National Commission for Safai Karamcharis Act 1993 initially for the period up to March 31, 1997. The validity of the Act was initially extended up to March 31, 2002 and thereafter up to February 29, 2004. The NCSK Act ceased to have effect from February 29, 2004. After that,



the tenure of the NCSK has been extended as a non-statutory body from time to time through resolutions." The tenure of the present Commission is up to March 31, 2022. "The issue is very close to the heart of PM Narendra Modi. We have taken several steps for it," Thakur said.

"The NCSK was made for the welfare of sanitation workers and bring policies towards tackling the challenges faced by them. Modi ji has through Swacchta Abhiyan also tried to change the perception of the people towards safai karamcharis. This step to extend it is another move in the direction of welfare of safai karamcharis," Union minister Anurag Thakur said.

New Delhi, Jan 19: India's two main vaccines -- Bharat Biotech's Covaxin and Serum Institute of India's Covishield -- Wednesday got the nod for regular market authorisation.

An expert panel of Central Standard Control Organisation (CDSCO) -- India's regulatory body for pharmaceuticals, medical devices and cosmetics -- Wednesday recommended granting regular market approval to Covishield and Covaxin, which are currently only authorised for emergency use in the country, subject to certain conditions.

"CDSCO has recommended for upgrade of Covishield and Covaxin's status from restricted use in emergency situations to grant of new drug permission with conditions in adult population. The DCGI (Drugs Controller General of India) will evaluate the recommendations and give its decision," CDSCO said in a tweet.

Indian vaccines manufacturer Serum Institute of India and Bharat Biotech had submitted applications to the DCGI seeking regular



French actor dies after ski mishap

Lyon: French actor Gaspard Ulliel, known for appearing in Chanel perfume ads as well as film and television roles, died Wednesday after a skiing accident in the Alps, according to his agent's office. He was 37. Ulliel portrayed the young Hannibal Lecter in 2007's "Hannibal Rising" and fashion mogul Yves Saint Laurent in the 2014 biopic "Saint Laurent." He is also in the upcoming Marvel series "Moon Knight," and was the advertising face of the Chanel men's fragrance Bleu de Chanel. Ulliel was hospitalised Tuesday after the accident in the Savoie region's Rosiere ski area, the Savoie prosecutor's office said. The office of the actor's agent said Ulliel died on Wednesday. It provided no details.

Oil flow resumes after pipeline blast

oil from Iraq to world markets resumed operating Wednesday after an explosion in southeastern Turkey forced it to shut down for several hours. No one was hurt in the explosion late Tuesday near the town of Pazarcik in Kahramanmaras province. The blast caused a huge fire, and authorities also closed a highway, state-run Turkish news outlet Anadolu Agency reported. The pipeline carries oil from the Kirkuk oil fields in northern Iraq to the Turkish port of Ceyhan. A statement from Turkey's pipeline company, BOTAS, said the oil flow resumed after "all necessary precautions" were taken. The cause of the explosion was under investigation. But the Kahramanmaras governor's office said preliminary findings indicate an electricity pole that toppled over in severe weather triggered the blast.

Nursing home fire kills 6 in Spain

Madrid: Six residents of a nursing home in eastern Spain perished after a fire broke out in the night. authorities said Wednesday. Valencia's regional head. Ximo Puig, said that 17 more residents were hospitalised. with three in serious condition. Firefighters said that they rescued 25 residents out of a total of 70 that were evacuated from the nursing home in the municipality of Moncada just north of Valencia. Firefighter chief José Basset told Spanish news agency EFE that the fire appears to have started in a bedroom on the second floor. He said that when the firefighters arrived "there was a large number of people asking for help who were trapped by the smoke.'

'In the name of God, go': UK PM faces demands to resign

It's a stunning reversal of fortune for a politician who just over two years ago led the Conservatives to their biggest election victory in almost 40 years

London, Jan 19: British Prime Minister Boris Johnson defied calls to resign in a feisty performance Wednesday in Parliament — but it may be too little to prevent his Conservative Party's lawmakers from trying to oust him over a string of lockdown-flouting government parties

Pressure on the prime minister grew as one Conservative lawmaker defected to the opposition Labour Party and a former member of Johnson's Cabinet told him: "In the name of God, go!"

The demand from ex-Brexit minister David Davis came during a combative Prime Minister's Questions session in the House of Commons, where Johnson defended his government's record running the economy, fighting crime and combating the coronavirus pandemic. He also tried to brush aside ques-

tions about the "partygate" scandal that threatens his career.

"We delivered while they dithered," he said of opposition politicians, several of whom told Johnson he was regarded by Britons as a charlatan, a hypocrite, a liar and "stupid."

The opposition Labour Party was boosted by the defection to their ranks of Conservative law-



whole have shown themselves incapable of offering the leadership and government this country de-

Johnson brushed aside calls to quit, but his defiant performance was met with muted cheers on the Conservative side of the House of Commons.

Conservative legislators are judging whether to trigger a no-confidence vote in Johnson amid public anger over the "partygate" scandal. It's a stunning reversal of fortune for a politician who just over two years ago led the Conservatives to their biggest election victory in almost 40 years.

Under Conservative Party rules, a no-confidence vote in the party's leader can be triggered if 54 party lawmakers write letters to a party official demanding it.

So far only a handful of Conservative members of Parliament have openly called for Johnson to quit, though several dozen are believed to have submitted letters, including some elected as part of a Johnson-led landslide in December 2019.

Conservative lawmaker Andrew Bridgen, who is calling for a change, said he thought the 54-letter threshold would be reached "this week," setting the stage for a confidence vote within days.

If Johnson lost a confidence vote among the party's 359 lawmakers, it would trigger a contest to replace him as Conservative leader. The winner would also become prime minister.

Justice Ayesha Malik to be Pak's first woman **Supreme Court judge**

Islamabad, Jan 19: A parliamentary panel in Pakistan Wednesday approved the elevation of High Court judge Ayesha Malik to the Supreme Court, moving a step closer to appoint the first woman judge of the apex court in the conservative Muslim-majority country.

The name of Justice Malik, currently working as a judge of the Lahore High Court, was sent to the Parliamentary Committee on Judges Appointment by the Judicial Commission of Pakistan (JCP) headed by Chief Justice Gulzar Ahmed earlier this month.

The bipartisan Parliamentary Committee headed by Senator Farooq H Naek of Pakistan People's Party, in its meeting held in Islamabad endorsed her nomination, removing the last big hurdle in her elevation to the apex court.

The committee while approving her nomination created an exception by setting aside the seniority principle because Justice Malik. who is on the fourth position on the seniority list of the judges of the Lahore High Court, would be the first woman top judge, according to Naek. "We have approved Justice Ayesha's name in national interest," he said.

Normally seniority of high courts judges is considered while approving their elevation to the Supreme Court and it was the reason when her name was rejected by the JCP last year. Even the latest JCP meeting held on January 6 hotly contested the issue before finally granting approval of Malik's nomination by a marginal difference of five members of JCP supporting her while four opposing the nomination.

Russia says it will take nothing less but NATO expansion ban

Moscow, Jan 19: Russia maintained a tough posture amid the tensions over its troop buildup near Ukraine, with a top diplomat warning Wednesday that Moscow will accept nothing less but 'watertight' US guarantees precluding NATO's expansion to Ukraine.

Deputy Foreign Minister Sergei Ryabkov, who led the Russian delegation at the security talks with the US in Geneva last week, reaffirmed that Moscow has no intentions of invading Ukraine as the West fears, but said that receiving Western security guarantees is the categoric imperative for Moscow.

The talks in Geneva and a related NATO-Russia meeting in Brussels last week were held as Russia has amassed an estimated 100,000 troops near Ukraine in what the West fears might herald an invasion.

In a move that further beefs up forces near Ukraine, Russia has moved an unspecified number of troops from the country's far east to its ally Belarus for major war games this month. Belarus shares a border with Ukraine.

Amid the soaring tensions, US Secretary of State Antony Blinken visited Ukraine on Wednesday to reassure it of Western support in the face of what he called "relentless" Russian aggression.

Russia has denied that it intends to attack its neighbour but demanded guarantees from the West that NATO will not expand to Ukraine or other former Soviet nations or place its troops and weapons there.

It also has urged NATO to roll back the deployments of its troops and weapons to Central and Eastern European nations that have joined the alliance after the end of the Cold War. Washington and its allies firmly rejected Moscow's demands but kept the door open to possible further talks on arms control and confidence-building measures intended to reduce the potential for hostilities.

Houthis have used bomb-laded drones and missiles to attack Saudi Arabia, the UAE and key oil targets in the Persian Gulf over the course of the war, now in its 8th year

Dubai, Jan 19: Yemen's rebels used cruise missiles, ballistic missiles and drones in an attack on Abu Dhabi this week that killed three people and set off fires at a fuel depot and an international airport, the Emirati ambassador to the United States said Wednesday.

The remarks by Ambassador Yousef Al-Otaiba marked an official acknowledgement that missiles — and not just drones — were used in Monday's attack, claimed by the Iran-backed Houthis.

'Several attacks — a combination of cruise missiles, ballistic missiles, and drones — targeted civilian sites" in the United Arab Emirates, Al-Otaiba said.

'Several were intercepted, a few of them didn't and three innocent civilians unfortunately lost their lives," he added in remarks at a virtual event hosted by the Jewish Institute for National Security of America.

Al-Otaiba did not elaborate or respond to further questions from The Associated Press about how many missiles targeted the UAE and how many were intercepted.

Washington, Jan 19: The House committee investigating the US Capitol insurrection issued subpoenas to Rudy Giuliani and other members of Donald Trump's legal team who filed bogus legal challenges to the 2020 election that fueled the lie that race had been stolen from the former president.

The committee is continuing to widen its scope into Trump's orbit, Tuesday demanding information and testimony from Giuliani, Jenna Ellis, Sidney Powell and Boris Epshteyn. All four publicly pushed Trump's baseless voter fraud claims in the months after the election.

'The four individuals we've subpoenaed today advanced unsupported theories about election fraud, pushed efforts to overturn the election results, or were in direct contact with the former President about attempts to stop the counting of electoral votes," Mississippi Rep. Bennie Thompson, Democratic chairman of the panel, said in a statement.

Epshteyn in a tweet called the committee illegitimate and its efforts part of a "witch hunt" against Trump and his supporters. The others who were subpoenaed did not respond to messages seeking comment. Wellington, Jan 19: The blast from the volcano could be heard in Alaska, and the waves crossed the ocean to cause an oil spill and two drownings in Peru. The startling satellite images resembled a massive nuclear explosion.

And yet, despite sitting almost on top of the volcano that erupted so violently Saturday, the Pacific nation of Tonga appears to have avoided the widespread devastation that many initially feared.

In its first update since the eruption, the government said Tuesday it has confirmed three deaths - two local residents and a British woman. Concerns remain over the fate of people on some of the hard-hit



smaller islands, where many houses were destroyed. Communications have been down everywhere, making assessments more difficult.

But on Tonga's main island of Tongatapu, perhaps the biggest problem is the ash that has transformed it into a gray moonscape,

contaminating the rainwater that people rely on to drink. New Zealand's military is sending fresh water and other much-needed supplies, but said Tuesday the ash covering Tonga's main runway will delay the flight at least another day.

On Tongatapu, at least, life is slowly returning to normal. The tsunami that swept over coastal areas after the eruption was frightening for many but rose only about 80 centimeters (2.7 feet), allowing most to escape

'We did hold grave fears, given the magnitude of what we saw in that unprecedented blast," said Katie Greenwood, the head of delegation in the Pacific for the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies. "Fortunately, in those major population centers we are not seeing the catastrophic effect we thought might happen, and that's very good news.

Greenwood, who is based in Fiji and has been talking with people in Tonga by satellite phone, said an estimated 50 homes were destroyed on Tongatapu but that nobody needed to use emergency shelters. She said about 90 people on the nearby island of 'Eua were using shelters

U.N. Humanitarian officials and Tonga's government reported significant infrastructural damage around Tongatapu and concerns about the lack of contact from some of the low-lying islands. The Geneva-based U.N World Health Organization reported that many people remained unaccounted for.

New Zealand's High Commission in Tonga also reported significant damage along the western coastof Tongatapu, including to resorts and the waterfront area.



New Delhi, Jan 19: The government Wednesday approved equity infusion of ₹1,500 crore in the Indian Renewable Energy Development Agency (IREDA), which would raise its additional lending capacity by ₹12,000 crore.

"The enhanced lending capacity will enable IREDA to finance addition renewable energy capacity of up 4000MW. Present loan book size of IREDA is around ₹27,000 crore," an official told PTI.

"The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, today approved the equity infusion of ₹1,500 crore in IREDA," an official statement said.

Briefing reporters after the Cabinet meeting, Information and **Broadcasting Minister Anurag** Singh Thakur said the decision has been taken in the wake of the RBI's lending norms.

The official statement said that additional equity infusion of ₹1.500 crore by the government will enable IREDA to lend Rs 12,000 crore approximately to the RE sector

The official statement said that additional equity infusion of ₹1,500 crore by the government will enable IREDA to lend ₹12,000 crore approximately to the RE (renewable energy) sector, thus facilitating the debt requirement of RE of additional capacity of approximately 3500-4000 MW.

According the statement, the equity infusion will also enable IREDA to enhance its net worth which will help it in additional RE

financing, thus contributing better to the government targets for RE and also to improve the capital-torisk weighted assets ratio (CRAR) to facilitate its lending and borrowing operations.

Grover informed the company's board about his decision to proceed on leave earlier in the day the statement noted.

For now, the Board has accepted Ashneer's decision which we agree is in the best interests of the company, our employees and investors, and the millions of merchants we support each day, it said.

It added that the company will continue to be led by its CEO Suhail Sameer and its management team.

Earlier this month, an audio clip surfaced on social media with claims of Grover abusing and threatening a Kotak Mahindra Bank employee for missing out on share allotment during the initial public offering (IPO) of FSN E-Commerce Ventures, which operates online fashion and wellness company Nykaa.

Grover was quick to deny the clip, saying it was fake and was put out by a scamster but he subsequently deleted the post. It later emerged that he and his wife Madhuri Grover had October 31, 2021, sent a legal notice to Kotak for failure to provide IPO financing for the Nykaa IPO.

January 9, the Mumbai-based lender had responded saying it will take legal action against Grover. Kotak Mahindra Bank had acknowledged that the couple had October 30 sent a legal notice to it, without elaborating on the rea sons for the same.

Jio edges out BSNL as largest fixed line broadband provider



New Delhi, Jan 19: JioFiber added 0.19 million subscribers to become the number 1 operator in the fixed broadband segment in just about two years from commercial launch, with 4.34mn FBB subs.

Crude oil throughput in December dipped 3% to 5.08 million barrels per day (21.48 million tonne) from the previous month, but was 2.2% higher on an annual basis, provisional government data showed Wednesday Indian refiners operated at an av-

erage rate of 101.2% in December, below November's 104.6%, but up from 99.1% in the same month last year, data showed.

Refineries can operate at more than their usual capacity through technical alterations.

Top refiner Indian Oil Corp last month operated its directly owned plants at 99.74% capac-



ity. Reliance, owner of the world's biggest refining complex, operated its plants at 95.46% capacity in December.

In 2021, refinery throughputs recovered almost half of the 620,000 barrels per day loss in 2020, but demand for refined products recovered only by one third, the International Energy Agency (IEA) said Wednesday. 'In 2022, demand is expected to

slightly surpass the pre-pandemic peak of 2019, with refinery runs also back to 2019 levels.

Paarl, Jan 19: India's inexplicable middle-order collapse ensured that fine half-centuries from Shikhar Dhawan (79, 84b, 10x4) and Virat Kohli (51, 63b, 3x4) did not count for much as the team was handed a 31-run defeat by a resolute South Africa in the opening ODI here Wednesday.

Chasing a challenging 297, India were cruising at 138/1 before wickets fell in a heap dashing the hopes of the visitors who trail 0-1 in the three-match series. India's innings ended at 265/8.

South Africa skipper Temba Bavuma (110, 143b, 8x4) and Rassie van der Dussen (129 n o, 96b, 9x4, 4x6) had scored contrasting hundreds en route to their 204-run stand to take South Africa to 296/4 after opting to bat.

India were comfortably placed to get home when Kohli and Dhawan were in the middle but it all came crashing down with the end of their 92-run stand.

India have been guilty of relying too much on their top three in the past and once again, the middle-order could not capitalise on the platform provided by Kohli and Dhawan after they lost skipper KL Rahul (12) cheaply.

Chase master Kohli, playing his first game since his captaincy tenure ended across formats last week hardly broke a sweat in reaching his half-century before a sweep shot off Tabraiz Shamsi (2/52), a stroke he doesn't play regularly, led to his downfall leaving him in disbelief.

Dhawan looked in sublime touch during his stay and played Marco Jansen rather comfortably, collecting five of his 10 fours off the tall left-arm pacer.

The stage was set for the likes of Rishabh Pant (16), Shreyas Iyer (17) and debutant Venkatesh Iyer (2) to get the job done but they fell in quick succession, leaving India at 188/6 from a strong 138/1. Shardul Thakur (50 n o, 43b, 5x4, 1x6) tried



his best towards the end but the damage had already been done.

Earlier, Jasprit Bumrah (2/48) was the stand out bowler for India in an otherwise ordinary bowling effort. After a sluggish start, Van der Dussen and Bavuma shared the second highest partnership ever against India in ODIs to ensure a competitive total for the home team.

South Africa opted to bat on a slow surface at the $\rm \bar{B}ol$ and Park. The white ball did a bit early on with

both Bumrah and Bhuvneshwar Kumar getting to move it off the pitch as well as in the air.

After an inaccurate first over, the usually accurate Bumrah got his act together and had opener Janneman Malan (6). South Africa struggled to 39/1 in 10 overs with Indian bowlers restricting the flow of runs.

Quinton de Kock (27), playing his first game since announcing his Test retirement, and Bayuma found



the going tough with the ball not coming on to the bat. De Kock perished while trying to break the shackles. Ashwin, featuring in his first ODI since June 2017, found de Kock's stumps with a slider as the opener went for a cut shot.

It became 68/3 in the 18th over when Aiden Markram got run out from a direct hit by Venkatesh after he went for a single that was not for the taking.

At that stage, it seemed South

Africa would find it tough to get past 200 but a fighting stand between Van der Dussen and Bavuma changed the course of the innings. **BRIEF SCORES**

Osaka, Barty face likely showdown

Melbourne, Jan 19: For the first set, Naomi Osaka's rediscovered love of the game meant it was anything but fun for Madison Brengle in the third round of the Australian Open.


The defending champion conceded only four points in the first four games Wednesday and rifled forehand winners seemingly at will as she breezed to 6-0 in a mere 20 minutes. She wrapped up the match with a 6-4 win in the second set.

She will next face Amanda Anisimova, a 20-vear-old American who beat Olympic gold medalist Belinda Bencic 6-2, 7-5. The winner of that is likely to face top-ranked Ash Barty, a 6-1, 6-1 winner over Lucia Bronzetti, in the fourth round.

Osaka won the Australian Open last year, her fourth Grand Slam title, but then withdrew from the French Open and skipped Wimbledon as she took a break for her mental health. She then was ousted early at the US Open.

Since the draw for the first major of the year was made, a big focus has been on a potential encounter between Osaka and Barty, the 2021 Wimbledon and 2019 French Open champion who is aiming to be the first Australian woman since 1978 to win her home championship.

Barty was front and center when the tournament celebrated its inaugural First Nations Day, albeit only for 52 minutes as she beat 142nd-ranked qualifier Bronzetti. Barty, who has Indigenous heritage, said of the day dedicated to



the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people of Australia.

Rafael Nadal didn't get it all his own way in the subsequent match on Rod Laver Arena, needing five match points before beating 126thranked German qualifier Yannick Hanfmann 6-2, 6-3, 6-4.

The sixth-seeded Nadal is aiming for a men's record 21st Grand Slam singles title. The Spaniard shares the men's record of 20 singles titles with Roger Federer and Novak Djokovic, and he doesn't have either of them in the draw this time.

Federer is skipping the Australian Open while he continues his recovery from injury. Djokovic, a nine-time champion at Melbourne Park, was deported after an 11-day saga that he ultimately lost because he didn't meet Australia's strict COVID-19 vaccination regulations.

Miomir Kecmanovic, who was originally drawn to meet Diokovic on the opening night, advanced to the third round with a 7-6(9-7), 7-5, 7-6(10-8) win over Tommy Paul of the United States. Wimbledon finalist Matteo

Berrettini and No.23 Reilly Opelka advanced in straight sets, while No. 19 Pablo Carreno Busta beat Tallon Griekspoor 6-3, 6-7(6-8), 7-6(7-3), 3-6, 6-4. In two marathon five-setters,

No.14 Denis Shapovalov held off Kwon Soon-woo 7-6(8-6), 6-7(3-7), 6-7(6-8), 7-5, 6-2 in 4 hours, 25 minutes on Margaret Court Arena, and Sebastian Korda edged Corentin Moutet 3-6, 6-4, 6-7(2-7), 7-5, 7-6(8-6). In the women's draw, French Open champion and fourth-seeded Barbora Kreicikova beat Wang Xivu 6-2. 6-3 to move into a thirdround match against No.26 Jelena

Eighth-seeded Paula Badosa advanced in straight sets and twotime Australian Open champion Victoria Azarenka moved into a third-round match against 15thseeded Elina Svitolina, who was leading 6-3, 5-7, 5-1 when Harmony Tan retired from their secondround match.

Svitolina waited on court at Margaret Court Arena until Tan, who had received treatment on her lower left leg, was removed in a wheelchair.

2 members of Indian women's team test positive for Covid-19

in Navi Mumbai Thursday. The two positive cases will not threaten the tournament as AIFF president Praful Patel Monday said that matches will not be cancelled if 13 players are available in each of the two competing teams.
