Russia hits Ukraine N-plant

Facing worldwide indignation over the attack, Russia seeks to deflect blame

Kyiv, March 4: Russian invasion forces seized Europe's biggest nuclear power plant Friday in heavy fighting in southeastern Ukraine, triggering global alarm, but a huge blaze in a training building has been extinguished and officials said the facility was now safe.

Combat raged elsewhere in Ukraine as Russian forces surrounded several cities in the second week of the assault launched by Russian President Vladimir Putin.

A presidential advisor said an advance had been halted on the southern city of Mykolayiv after local authorities said Russian troops had entered it. If captured, the city of 500,000 people would be the biggest yet to fall.

The capital Kviv. in the path of huge Russian armoured column that has been stalled on a road for days, came under renewed attack, with air raid sirens blaring in the morning and explosions audible from the city centre.

The fire at a training building at the Zaporizhzhia nuclear power plant sent global stock markets plunging.

Although the plant was now said to be safe and the fire out, officials remained worried about the precarious circumstances, with Ukrainian staff operating under Russian control in

International Atomic Energy Agency chief Raphael Grossi described the situation as "normal operations, but in fact there is nothing normal about this."

New Delhi: Ukraine President Volodymyr Zelenskyy has survived at least three assassination attempts in the past week, The Times, UK, reported. Two different outfits have been sent to kill the Ukrainian President -- mercenaries of the Kremlin-backed Wagner group and Chechen special forces. Both have been thwarted by anti-war elements within Russia's Federal Security

Service (FSB), the report said. Last Saturday, an attempt on Zelenskyy's life was foiled on the outskirts of Kyiv. Ukrainian security officials said a cadre of Chechen assassins had been 'eliminated'.

India abstains from UNHRC vote

Geneva/United Nations: India Friday abstained from a vote in the UN Human Rights Council that has decided to urgently establish an independent international commission of inquiry as a result of Russia's aggression against Ukraine. The 47-member Council voted on a draft resolution on the situation of human rights in Ukraine. The resolution was adopted with 32 votes in favour, two against (Russia, Eritrea) and 13 abstentions, including India, China, Pakistan, Sudan and Venezuela. The countries voting in favour included France, Germany, Japan, Nepal, UAE, UK and the US. P9

199 Odia students 56 killed, 200 injured in blast at Pak Shia mosque

Peshawar, March 4: A suicide bomber blew himself up inside a crowded Shia mosque during the Friday congregation here in northwest Pakistan, killing at least 56 people and wounding nearly 200 others, in one of the deadliest attacks in the restive province, bordering Afghanistan.

The blast occurred at an Imambargah located near the Qissa Khwani Bazaar area of Peshawar when the worshippers were offering Friday prayers.

No group immediately claimed responsibility for the blast in Peshawar, the provincial capital of Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa which borders Afghanistan. However, the Islamic State and sectarian militant groups have claimed responsibility for the deadly attacks tar-



geting Shias in the past. Mohammad Asim, a spokesperson for Lady Reading Hospital (LRH), confirmed that at least 56 people were killed while 194 were injured in the blast.

An eyewitness identified a person as dressed in black as the suicide bomber, saying he entered the mosque, shot and killed the security guard first and then fired five to six bullets.

"After that, he quickly entered the [mosque's] main hall and blew himself up in front of the pulpit. Following this, there were bodies and injured people lying everywhere," the evewitness told Geo News. Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa government spokesman Barrister Mohammad Ali Saif said that two terrorists were involved in the suicide bombing.

Talking to the media, Peshawar SSP Operations Haroon Rasheed Khan said the explosion was a suicide blast. There were two attackers but only one of them was a suicide bomber, he said.

President Arif Alvi condemned the blast and expressed grief over the precious lives lost.

Prime Minister Imran Khan strongly condemned the blast and directed authorities to provide medical treatment to the injured. He also sought an inquiry report from the authorities concerned.

Cong announces BMC Mayor pick

Bhubaneswar, March 4: The Congress Friday announced Madhusmita Acharya as is its candidate for the election to the post of Mayor of Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation (BMC).

Senior Congress leader and Jatni MLA Suresh Routray announced the name of Madhusmita, who is the daughter-in-law of late Congress MLA Kangali Charan Panda, for the post.

Meanwhile, the ruling BJD is holding discussions to finalise the names of Mayor candidates for Bhubaneswar, Cuttack and Berhampur. The names can be announced at any moment, sources said. Former State Commission for Women chairperson Lopamudra Buxipatra, actress-turned Odisha Tourism Development Corporation chairperson Srimayee Mishra and the chairperson of Commission for Persons with Disabilities, Sulochana Das, are the key contenders from the BJD for the BMC Mayor post.

On the other hand, the BJP has given the responsibility of selection of suitable candidate for BMC Mayor post to local MP Aparajita Sarangi. Names of actress-turnedpolitician Anu Choudhury and BJP state general secretary Lekhashree are doing the rounds. However, nothing has been finalised, party sources said.

Youth strangulated to death in City

MUKESH, WHO WAS IN JAIL FOR HIS INVOLVEMENT IN A BIKE THEFT CASE SINCE 2020, HAD **COME OUT OF PRISON 4 DAYS BACK**

Bhubaneswar, March 4: A day after the ghastly murder of a Bihari mason from Bhubaneswar, the capital city Friday witnessed the killing of another youth of the neighbouring state in a city slum here.

The deceased was identified as Mukesh Kumar Choudhury who was staying at Munda Sahi slum in Mancheswar area over past few

Mukesh was held in a bike theft case in 2020 and released from jail four days back after spending more than a year in prison.

Mukesh's body was found under the heap of bricks at the under-

The victim's body was found from an under-construction Micro Compost Center

construction Micro Compost Center of the Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation near the slum. Sources claimed that construction, which was stopped for last three months for different reasons, was scheduled to resume from Friday.

However, the labourers while clearing the heap of broken and old bricks to unload new bricks found Mukesh's body underneath. They

immediately informed the contractor who called the police.

Upon receipt of information, the police of Mancheswar police station and other senior officials of commissionerate police reached the crime scene. A police scientific team also reached the spot and collected finger prints and other articles from the spot for excovered and sent to Capital hospital for post mortem. Police claimed that the autopsy report would unravel the causes of the death.

However, sources in police revealed that marks on Mukesh's neck indicated that he was strangulated to death by the murderers with a towel. After murder, the desperadoes had buried his body under a heap of bricks so that none could know about the case.

Police have started an investi gation into the matter after registering a case (61/22) under Section 302 of the IPC in this regard.

Meanwhile, locals revealed that some drugs peddlers of the locality are behind the murder. Due to the halt in construction work, the site has turned into a safe zone for illegal drug trade. Recently, Mukesh had a heated argument with one peddler identified as Chandan of the slum.

Some locals also claimed they had seen Chandan and four others arguing with Mukesh at the spot Thursday night. Meanwhile, Chandan and others are absent since Thursday night.

Students can avail outside scholarships

Bhubaneswar, March 4: The Higher Education (HE) department Friday permitted all degree colleges and public universities in the state to register themselves in the portals of other recognised educational institutions outside Odisha that award various scholarships to students.

Heckled, walked miles with Indian flag to cross Ukraine: Odia students

Bhubaneswar, March 4: Odia students returning home from war ordeal of having to walk miles in sub-zero temperatures waiving the Indian Tricolour and being heckled by Ukrainian soldiers before crossing the border to safety.

The Odisha government said that 65 students from the state were rescued from war-ravaged Kharkiv during the day, and efforts are underway to evacuate all Odia students from Ukraine within the next 24 hours. It said at least 199 Odia students have returned to the state from the east ern European nation so far.

Aritri Angelina Behera, a med ical student from Cuttack who was among the 11 students who returned to Odisha from Ukraine during the day, thanked both the Centre and the state government for making arrangements for their

resentatives of the Indian Embassy and the Odisha government made all arrangements for our safe return. But the real challenge was crossing the country. We lived in a bunker since February 24 and exited it only three days later. Every second was challenging while crossing Ukraine. However, we held the Indian Tricolour high and walked miles to reach the border," she said.

Eureka Choudhury, another student who returned to Odisha, alleged that Indians faced discrimination in Ukraine. "The Ukrainian soldiers were cordial to Nigerians and others but were harsh on Indians. I was heckled by them before crossing the international border to enter Romania. We walked 12 km in minus six degrees Celsius,

which was really painful," she said. Asish Bisi and Dinesh Sahu, who returned from Kharkiv, said that more students are still trapped in Ukraine, and they need to be evacuated immediately as the situation was worsening by the day.

In a letter to secretaries to government, director general of police, revenue divisional commissioners, heads of departments and district collectors, Chief Secretary Suresh Chandra Mahapatra said, government servants should remain absolutely impartial during the elections (ULB polls) and no one should indulge in any campaigning activities for or against any contesting candidate or any polit-

ical party. The Chief Secretary said vehicles, machinery and personnel belonging to government, public sector undertakings, cooperatives, local bodies and panchayati raj in-

stitutions should not be used in electioneering work in the ULBs. He also directed the officials not



to allow publication of any advertisement at the cost of the public exchequer, portraying the achievements of the government until completion of the polls.

"No public servant should accompany a minister/such other political functionaries for electioneering except on duties from security point of view in ULBs. While dealing with different political parties in day to day official transactions, each public servant shall maintain absolute neutral-

Regular promotion will also not be made without the approval of the commission. Transfer of any other level of staff is also not allowed in the 109 urban areas till March 26, 2022.

Notably, elections to 47 municipalities, 59 Notified Area Councils (NACs) and three municipal corporations of Bhubaneswar, Cuttack and Berhampur will be held March 24. The election results will be declared March 26.

Former Revenue Inspector (RI) of Aruha circle Basudev Sahoo, leaseholder Trinath Jena, former Dharmasala tehsildar and presently Deputy Collector of Gajapati Prabhas Kumar Behura were present during the hearing and they gave their clarifications.

Excess mining of the precious blackstone from Aruha hill has resulted in severe revenue loss for the state government. It was alleged that the lease owner mined blackstone from the hill in connivance with Jajpur local police and tehsil officials. The Lokayukta had issued a notice over a petition (1355/2020) filed by social activist Sarbeswar Behura on excess mining of blackstone from the hill and subsequent loss of revenue to the state government December 10, 2020.

The complainant, Behura, had prayed before the Lokayukta to direct an inquiry into the issue by the Crime Branch and accordingly order recovery of the lost revenue.

According to the petition, the Dharmasala tehsil office had issued a notice inviting applications for leasing of Aruha blackstone quarry-1, September 1, 2017. Accordingly, the lessee was given a five-year contract (2017-2018 to 2021-2022) for blackstone mining from Aruha hill on the basis of Odisha Minor Minerals Concession Rules, 2016.

Bhubaneswar, March 4: The Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) has identified 12 districts and five municipal corporations of Odisha for Intensified Mission Indradhanush (IMI) 4.0 drive, 2022.

The MoHFW has identified Cuttack, Ganjam, Jajpur, Jharsuguda, Kendrapara, Keonjhar, Koraput, Khurda, Malkangiri, Mayurbhanj, Sambalpur and Sundargarh districts for the IMI 4.0 drive. It has also identified Berhampur, Bhubaneswar, Cuttack, Sambalpur and Rourkela municipal corporations for the purpose, sources said.

The aim of IMI 4.0 is to strengthen routine immunisation coverage through tracking and vaccinating all left out/drop out children in the age group of 0 to 2 years and pregnant women. The Mission Indradhanush was launched in Odisha in 2015 and nine such drives have been conducted in the coastal state so far, sources added.

The state has achieved 90.5 per cent immunisation coverage as

per NFHS 5 report 2020-21. This is highest among all states.

The major strategy of the IMI 4.0 drive is cascade training, head count survey by ASHA/Anganwadi workers, sub-centre micro planning, vaccine & logistic supply, supervision & monitoring, and reporting. The district task force meeting is convened regularly by the Collectors to review the preparedness for this initiative. All line departments are involved in the drive.

Three rounds of IMI drive will be conducted from March to May this year and each round will be of seven days. The first round will start March 7 and the subsequent rounds are scheduled to begin April 4 and May 2.

The detailed operational guideline along with the timeline has been communicated to the 12 districts. Nodal officers have been engaged in all such districts for supervision and monitoring, sources said.

The state-level task force meeting was conducted under the chairmanship of Additional Chief Secretary, Health and Family Welfare department, for smooth conduct of the immunisation drive.

The officials of Panchayat Raj, Women & Child Development, Housing & Urban Affairs, School & Mass Education, Sports & Youth Affairs, ST & SC Development Labours & ESI, and Information & Public relations departments were present at the meeting.

The head count survey in the 12 districts has identified 10,997 children between the age group of 0-23 months and 2,631 pregnant women who are either unvaccinated or partially vaccinated. At least 4,625 IMI sessions will be conducted across the 12 districts for vaccination of such left out/drop out children and pregnant women,



Int'l School graded on merit

CBSE: Students of St Xavier

New Delhi, March 4: The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) has refuted the allegations of students against St Xavier International School Odisha with regard to preparation of the Class X results in 2021 and told the SC that students were graded on merit only.

The CBSE submitted that the petition alleging the school of putting undue pressure on the students who passed Class X in 2021 to take admission in Class XI at the same school deserves to be dismissed as the enquiry panel did not find any evidence supporting the charge.

A two-judge bench of the SC comprising Justices AM Khanwilkar and CT Ravikumar Friday granted two weeks time to the petitioners to file a rejoinder in the petition. The CBSE had contended that the inquiry panel, formed to probe allegations of the students, had submitted in its report that the marks have been awarded as per the historical data and range provided by the CBSE as per the school reference year 2020 by duly follow-

ing the Tabulation Policy. The CBSE also submitted that petitioners are entitled to know their internal assessment marks, highest average in the preceding three years and the marks assigned by the Result Committee to them, from their school but they can't claim the attendance sheet. report of result committee and detailed score card of all the students of Class X of their school.

filed in the SC by some Class X pass out students who alleged that an Odisha-based school has denied providing them detailed scorecard and answer sheets to 'conceal its malpractices' in awarding marks. The plea, filed by 24 students who have passed out Class X from the

examinations were cancelled in April last year amid the pandemic and the assessment policy was notified by the board in May 2021.

'Antibody therapies, vax blunted by Omicron subvariants'

he effectiveness of mRNA vaccines and antibody therapy is reduced against all three subvariants of Omicron, according to new research.

The study by scientists at Columbia University and the University of Hong Kong showed that only one currently authorised antibody treatment retains its activity against all Omicron subvariants. Omicron is a highly transmis-

sible variant of SARS-CoV-2 that has caused the biggest surge in Covid cases so far in many countries.

Researchers have identified three subvariants of Omicron that

share 21 mutations in the spike protein, and named them BA.1, BA.1.1 and BA.2.

The findings, published in the journal Nature, showed that in neutralisation experiments, all three variants exhibited a strong resistance to most of the monoclonal antibodies tested.

Of 19 antibodies, 17 were ineffective against the BA.2 subvariant. The researchers found that bebtelovimab, the latest monoclonal antibody to receive FDA Emergency Use Authorisation, is the only currently available antibody therapy that can adequately treat all three Omicron subvariants.



"The emergence of new variants is narrowing our treatment options and challenging the effectiveness of our current vaccines," said David D. Ho, Professor of Medicine at Columbia University Vagelos College of Physicians and Surgeons.

"It is critical that we don't relax prematurely and continue to devise novel strategies to contain this ever-evolving pathogen," he added.

In laboratory experiments, the team studied the ability of 19 monoclonal antibodies and the sera from individuals immunised with one of two available mRNA vaccines to neutralise the three known subvariants of Omicron.

The researchers observed a loss of neutralisation activity against BA.1.1 and BA.2 in blood samples from individuals who had received

Sal afforestation project flops

Keonjhar, March 4: An afforestation project aimed at revarious parts of mineral-rich Keonihar district has been lying in utter neglect, said sources.


Keonjhar was once rich in sal forests but over the years many sal forests have vanished while several others are depleting due to timber smuggling, rampant mining and lack of maintenance by the Forest department.

Now, unwanted herbs and shrubs have grown in the forest land allocated for sal plantation. Locals fear a few sal trees that are left in the forests might get burnt while people clean their fields by setting the unwanted herbs on fire.

Meanwhile, a few forest officials were seen cleaning the unwanted trees as the principal chief conservator of forests (PCCF) is due to visit Keonjhar to oversee the sal plantation project.

"They are doing it just to save their jobs," locals said condemning

such act of the officials. According to sources, the Forest department had prepared a blueprint to grow sal forests by setting



up nurseries. At least 9,600 sal saplings were grown on six hectares of forest land in 2021-22.

As per the project, the Forest department raised saplings through nurseries and then the saplings were transplanted on the forest land. Sal trees are valuable and they grow in natural settings.

Sal seeds also germinate naturally and grow faster. However, most of the sal saplings died due to lack of maintenance and proper care, locals alleged.

While locals had appreciated

the project idea and the effort of the Forest department in generating sal forests and were hopeful of its success, negligence by some officials ruined the entire project.

At least 80,000 sal saplings were raised at nurseries in Padmapur, Belda and other areas. However, most of the saplings have died leav-

ing crores of rupees down the drain. Now, since the PCCF is likely to visit the areas, forest officials are on their toes to save their jobs, angry locals complained and demanded strict action in this regard.

Scam alleged in 'Vyasa Sarovar' facelift

Jajpur, March 3: An ambitious plan for beautification of 'Vvasa Sarovar' shrine and its corridor at Vyasanagar here involving a whopping ₹64 crore is mired in allegations irregularities.

It is being alleged that the District Mineral Foundation (DMF) fund sanctioned for the project is not being spent properly. The quality of the work has come under scanner. And this comes at a time when the municipality election is round the corner.

Although the Tourism department had prepared a blueprint for the purpose, people have alleged that the construction company is botching up the work, raising doubts about the durability of the project.

Locals alleged that instead of stones, the construction firm is using bricks.



Similarly, it is using mud and murram instead of sand for laying the foundation for the boundary walls. The boundary is not being constructed as per the blueprint prepared by the

Tourism department, the locals added. Since this is a place of mythological significance, it was supposed to be

developed into a place of good tourist destination. "However, irregularities from the beginning of the project, has caused resentment among the people," said a local.

As per records, Vyasa Sarovar Peetha sees a footfall of over 7 lakh visitors every year. People from Keonjhar and Dhenkanal districts visit the place to offer prayers to lord Vyasadev and Raghabaji Gosain. But with no proper road to the shrine, the devotees are fac-

ing inconvenience When contacted, Vyasanagar Municipality executive officer Ashok Kumar Rout said a blueprint was prepared by the Tourism department for renovation and beautification of Vyasa Sarovar and the project was carried out through National Building Construction Corporation (NBCC).

"So, the officials of NBCC can give their response," he added.

Babu's posting challenged

division bench of the Telangana High Court has agreed to hear a plea filed by a social worker seeking directions to the state government to remove IAS officer Neetu Kumari Prasad from the post of Member Secretary, Telangana Pollution Control Board for allegedly not possessing the mandatory qualifications in subjects of environment, forests and science, which are statutory requirements according to the Supreme Court.

Earlier, responding to similar PILs questioning the legality of the guidelines fixed for selecting candidates to post of Member Secretary and Chairperson of the board, the state High Court too had ruled that the state government cannot decide to appoint only an officer from the IAS or IFoS to these posts. Further, the court had pointed out that appointing IAS or IFoS officers would affect the functioning of the board since the government would transfer these officers frequently whereas the post of Member Secretary requires a minimum tenure of two to three years.

Babu watchers say that given the Supreme Court's directive and the High Court's earlier ruling, it is unlikely that the current petition challenging Prasad's appointment will have a different outcome.

Ambitious target for Commerce babu

India's flagging exports have necessitated the restructuring of the Department of Commerce. Sources have told DKB that at a recent meeting with senior officials, Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal highlighted the need to revamp the department

to take advantage of opportunities in global trade due to the rapid growth of services and disruptive potential of climate change. The minister has given Secretary BVR Subrahmanyam and his team an ambitious target of facilitating exports worth \$2 trillion by 2027.

Those aware of these developments say that after the revamp the Directorate General of Foreign Trade and other organizations in the ministry that promote investment and trade will be given a freer hand to achieve the export targets. They also see a stronger role of overseas missions in trade promotion and market intelligence.

Apparently, Goyal has also indicated that a dedicated Trade Remedies Review Committee of specialists will be created, which will also include the Ministry of Finance and line ministries to ensure transparency in investigation outcomes. Clearly, this is yet another push to strengthen Brand India and Subrahmanyam and his colleagues have their work cut out.

Gujarat govt tightens screws on corrupt cops, IAS officers

Besides the recent avalanche of scams that have been unearthed in Gujarat, the state Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel faces another problem. Of late there have been several allegations of bribery and corruption against police officers. Most recently there have been allegations of bribery against the Police Commissioner of Rajkot Manoj Agarwal. The complainant is reportedly a BJP MLA, and thus cannot be overlooked.

Sources have informed DKB that the Patel government has received several names and anonymous complaints alleging extortion and misuse of the land grabbing law by cops. Apparently, it is becoming a serious issue, and not just in Rajkot. Now the government is believed to be preparing guidelines to keep police officers away from cases where land deals are involved. Among the new rules will be an instruction that police officials cannot take up an investigation of any complaint in a land matter without the government's permission. The government is planning to set up a high-powered committee to investigate all major allegations of corruption in land matters against senior IPS and IAS officers. The government will consider the recommendations of the panel and take necessary action.

for Apple, B for Ball, C for Cat. It's a useful way to teach children the Asounds of the letters of the alphabet. Apple, ball and cat are just usefully short and common words that just happen to begin with the letter. They're not the names of the letters, because in English we call the letters of the alphabet by invented words - ay, bee, see - that do no more than convey the sound that it represents (with the notable exception of the name for h, aitch, which doesn't have an initial h in it). But in some languages the names of the letters are words that have a meaning of their own. This is acrophony, the use of a word starting with a letter of the alphabet as the name of the letter. From such pictographic symbols, Egyptian scribes derived the world's first alphabet by the principle of acrophony, in which a hieroglyph for a word came to represent the first consonant of that word. So, for example, the Egyptian word for "owl" began with an (m) sound, so the glyph for "owl" became the letter m. The best-known cases are Classical Greek and Hebrew. both derived from ancient Phoenician. In Hebrew, for example, the first four letters of the alphabet are aleph (the Hebrew word for ox), beth (house), gimel (camel) and daleth (door). It's as though our children's alphabet had been transformed into the actual names for the letters, so that 'a' wouldn't be called or said ay, but apple. There has long been a scholarly disputation about the source of the Phoenician and Hebrew alphabets, with some researchers arguing the names were merely a way by which scribes recalled the alphabet. However, it's now agreed that these alphabets were originally hieroglyphs that pictured the objects named. As the hieroglyphs evolved into letters, the names were carried over with them. Acrophony combines the Greek prefix acro- meaning uppermost or head, with -phony, sound, hence "the sound of the initial letter".

BOYCOTT RUSSIAN ENERGY

locking the Russian central bank's foreign-exchange reserves was a brilliant move. Disconnecting some Russian banks from the SWIFT financial messaging system was helpful. And pursuing the offshore wealth of Putin's cronies is appropriate. But none of these sanctions have stopped the Russian invasion of Ukraine for one reason, and none of them will.

The reason is simple: Russia continues to export oil and gas. Indeed, the war has boosted the price for these products, benefiting the most important sector of the Russian economy. So, a week after it began, Western energy consumption is still financing Russia's invasion of Ukraine, and the Russian elite is doing better than ever. The only way to stop Russian President Vladimir Putin's aggression is to impose a comprehensive boycott on all Russian energy products.

Energy comprises the bulk of Russia's exports, primarily in two forms: gas to Western Europe, via pipelines and paid for on long-term contracts, and oil to world mar-

kets, sold mostly on spot markets. According to figures from the International Energy Agency, "Revenues from oil and gas-related taxes and export tariffs accounted for 45% of Russia's federal budget in January 2022. Considering current market prices, the export value of Russian piped gas to the EU alone amounts to \$400 million per day. Total export revenues for crude oil and refined products currently amount to around \$700 million per day."

So far: there have been some small disruptions to Russian oil exports, but no impact on gas exports, according to the IEA. With Brent oil prices up from around \$90 per barrel to around \$110 per barrel since the invasion started (and up from \$80 at the end of 2021), Russia has plenty of cash coming in. If there is a discount on Urals crude, it is smaller than the increase in oil prices - so Russian oil exporters are still ahead, financially.

Over the past month, the daily value of Russian oil exports has increased by around \$100 million per day (calculated from the IEA estimate of daily Russian exports, multiplied by our estimate of the increase in the effective price for

Urals crude). The Russian current-account surplus was about \$19 billion in January 2022, or about 50% higher than is typical for January (in most years, the monthly surplus is \$9-12 billion).

There is a view in policymaking circles in the United States that the current policy of financial sanctions is degrading Russian oil capacity in a way that serves US strategic interests. But by putting more cash into the pockets of oil producers, the US and its allies are having the opposite effect. There is no alternative to sanctions that immediately reduce the volume of Russian oil and gas exports.

Russian energy can start with the US imposing full sanctions, including secondary sanctions, on all Russian oil and gas exports. The world oil price will rise, but if the sanctions are fully enforced, none of that windfall will go to Russian producers. In this scenario, the IEA estimates that oil production around the world will be boosted very quickly – Russia exports five

million barrels per day; additional world supply can add at least three million bpd. Energy conservation measures can and should also be introduced where appropriate.

Of course, the European Union would need to follow suit. But, to put it bluntly, this is only a matter of time. The EU can either stop buying Russian gas now, to halt the invasion, or it can wait a month, until thousands more people have died - and the horrific photos of civilian casualties flood every channel. At some point soon, Europe will no longer be able to stomach the fact that it is paying for Putin's atrocities in Ukraine.

The IEA has a sensible plan for how to wean Europe off Russian gas, and a team at Bruegel has published important proposals and have addressed how to get through the next few months without Russian gas. Every European policymaker needs to confront the issue head-on. To be sure, Europeans will have

to make difficult decisions, not least how to finance the immediate transition away from Russian gas. But imagine the decisions that must now be made in Ukraine, to keep people alive and to prevent the greatest humanitarian disaster Europe has seen since World War II.

Nor will the impact be limited to Europe. For example, very soon Ukrainian agriculture will collapse: No one can plow or plant seeds while being attacked by Russian forces. This will push up global food prices, because Ukraine is the world's fifth-largest exporter of wheat, implying a major impact on budgets and poverty in

low-income countries. Some Europeans will need help to pay their heating bills, and they may face other economic costs because of what Putin is doing. But compare this with millions of Ukrainians already struggling to find food, safe drinking water, and essential medicine - and to avoid being shot or blown up. Hundreds of thousands of Ukrainian children are already traumatised for life, and their suffering will only get worse unless Putin is stopped immediately.

The outpouring of support for Ukraine and Ukrainians has been amazing. More than one million refugees have been welcomed by individuals and governments throughout the EU, and the US, the United Kingdom, and other countries are providing many forms of assistance. We are grateful for all of it.

But it is time to face the harsh reality that Putin and his cronies have gone berserk. The world can either boycott Russian energy fully today, to stop the invasion immediately, or it can continue to watch Russian forces commit one outrage after another - every day moving closer to the territory of EU countries. No one in the world should buy

Russian energy. The stigma should be worse than for blood diamonds. The world is arming and encouraging a violent, uncontrollable monster. It must stop. The author has been

resently we are reaping what is called "demographic dividend." Because of the increase in the production of food and improvements in medical sciences, the life expectancy of our people has increased. As a result, today a large population in age group of 12 to 25 years is entering the labour market. A paper published by the Apeejay School of Management has assessed that an increase of 1% in the GDP leads to about 0.2%growth in employment in India. Another study has assessed that at the global level 1% increase in GDP leads to a growth in employment of 0.3%. This means that if we are able to attain the projected 10% growth rate, which is considered to be very high, even then the increase in employment will only be 2% which is highly inadequate to absorb the increasing number of youths that are entering the labour force.

Capital expenditures have been increased in the Budget. This is most welcome. But it may not create the number of jobs that are required for our youth. In this situation we need to put in place an employment policy. We have to impart such skills to our youth which will be continue to be in demand even if robots and artificial intelligence take over the jobs of manufacturing and intellectual works. For example, education requires one to one interaction between the students and teachers, healthcare requires one to one interaction between the nurses and the patients, and tourism required one to one interaction between the hoteliers and the tourists. Such jobs are not likely to be extinguished because of robots and artificial intelligence. The difficulty is that obtaining such skills requires much effort. The youth of our country are more focused on obtaining government jobs. They find that those who have got government jobs are making huge money while those who are not in government jobs remain poor. Therefore, they have less interest in obtaining skills of education, health and tourism. The second step to be taken is to

encourage businesses to employ more numbers of workers. A businessperson has to decide whether

to do specified work by manual labour or by machine. For example, loading of trucks can be done by machines or it can be done by manual labour. The businessman may find it profitable to employ labour if it is efficient and the wages are less. However, the organised labour in our country is protected by labour law which makes it difficult to take work from them. There exists a further problem of unionization which leads to derailing production processes. Therefore, businesses are more inclined to use machines rather than labour. The solution is to simplify the labour laws so that businesses can fearlessly employ larger number of workers and create more jobs.

The third step to be taken by the government is to provide tax relief to small and medium industries who do more work by labour and less by machines. The difficulty is that GST has made a single rate of tax for all industries. Small industries are not able to compete with large industries. The market of small industries is increasingly getting transferred to large industries who are, in turn,

using robots or automatic machines. This is leading to less growth of jobs. That is the reason why 1% growth in GDP is leading to only 0.2% growth in employment in India against 0.3% growth in employment globally. The government should introduce two separate rates of GST for small and large industries. In Canada and United States there are number of GST rates yet it is possible to transport goods from one place to another place seamlessly. If we provide lower rate of tax for small industries then they will be able to compete with large industries and create more jobs.

Even if we increase in the capital expenditures and attain a 10\(\dagger\) growth rate, even then the increase in employment will only be 2% which will be much less than what is needed. Therefore, we need special efforts to create jobs. Unless this is done, we will see a large unemployment and social disturbances arising out of the same.

New entry point opens for evacuation

New Delhi: The Indian Embassy in Slovakia Friday said that Indian nationals from western and north-western Ukraine are now coming to the newly-identified border checkpoint at Vysne Nemecke to ramp up the evacuation. According to the officials in the Indian mission, Vysne Nemecke is a small village on the Slovakia- Ukraine border and opposite Ukraine's Uzhhorod city. From here, the evacuated Indians are transported to the regional capital, Kosice, from where the Indian flights under 'Operation Ganga' are being operated. The officials in the Indian mission in Slovakia have made arrangements for Indian nationals entering Slovakia from Vysne Nemecke. Union Minister Kiren Rijiju has personally visited the site to see the arrangement made there for Indian students who have been advised to get to Slovakia's Kosice, instead of going to Budapest in Hungary.

A bench headed by Chief Justice N V Ramana took note of the submissions of lawyer Prashant Bhushan that the other accused in the case are moving courts for grant of bail citing the relief granted to Ashish Mishra and asked him to intimate the high court that the top court is hearing the plea for cancellation of bail. "I can list March 11 only. Other judges have to be available," the CJI said. A single-judge bench of the high court, on February 10, had granted bail to Mishra who had spent four months in custody. Bhushan submitted that the high court while granting the bail, did not follow the law laid down and did not consider aspects like tampering with evidence and fleeing from justice.

"The problem is that other accused are also moving," he added. He sought a direction to the high court that for the time being, the bail plea of other accused be not considered. "File a memo before the high court that we are hearing March 11," the bench said.

Three family members of farmers, who were killed in the violence, have sought a stay on the February 10 bail order of the high court, saying the verdict was "unsustainable in the eyes of law as there has been no meaningful and effective assistance by the state to the court in the matter"

Recently, another plea seeking cancellation of bail of accused Ashish Mishra was filed by advocates Shiv Kumar Tripathi and CS Panda on whose letter the apex court had taken the suo motu cognizance of the incident. On October 3, last year, eight people were killed in Lakhimpur Kheri during violence that erupted when farmers were protesting against Uttar Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Keshav Prasad Maurya's visit to the area.

Shimla, March 4: In an election year, the BJP government in Himachal Pradesh led by Chief Minister Jai Ram Thakur Friday presented a budget of ₹51,365 crore for 2022-23 with the focus on the agriculture, horticulture and animal husbandry sectors, the state's mainstay, with a promise to create 30,000 jobs and no new taxes.

He announced that social security pension was being given to 6.35 lakh people and 40,000 new pensioners would be added to the list. He announced to increase the monthly old age pension

from ₹1,001 to ₹1,500 and to increase the Member of Legislative Assembly Local Area Development Scheme (MLALAD) fund from ₹ 1.80 crore to ₹2 crore. The honorarium of urban and rural local bodies, anganwari workers and Asha workers has been increased.

"According to the revised estimates for 2021-22, the total revenue receipts are ₹37.312 crore and the total revenue expenditure is estimated to be ₹37,034 crore. Thus there is a revenue surplus estimated at ₹278 crore.

"According to the budget estimates for 2022-23, the total revenue receipts are expected to ₹36,375 crore and the revenue ex-



penditure is estimated as ₹40.278 crore. The revenue deficit is es-

timated to be ₹3,903 crore. "The fiscal deficit is expected to be ₹9,602 crore which is 4.98 per cent of the state's Gross Domestic Product. The budget does not propose new taxes. We will ensure that adequate resources are arranged with effective tax compliance, cooperation of the government of India and better financial management," said Thakur.

According to the budget, out of every ₹100, ₹26 will be spent on salaries, ₹15 on pension, ₹10 on interest payment, ₹11 on loan repayment, ₹9 for grants for autonomous bodies, while the remaining ₹29 will be spent on other activities, including capital works. He said the state's economy is expected to grow at 8.3 per cent during 2021-22. Despite the Covid-19 pandemic, this increase is a big achievement of the government.

The excise and tax collections had risen by 15 per cent to ₹9,282 crore. According to the Advance Estimates for 2021-22, Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) is expected to be ₹175,173 crore. The estimates also indicate that the per capita income in the state will be ₹201,854 crore, which is ₹51,528 crore higher than the estimated per capita income at the national level. An outlay of ₹12,921 crore is

proposed for development expenditure in 2022-23, the Chief Minister said. "Out of this, ₹9,524 crore is proposed for the state development budget. An outlay of ₹2,400 crore is proposed for Scheduled Caste Development Programme and ₹856 crore is proposed for Tribal Area Development Programme.'

Expressing his gratitude to the House, the first-time Chief Minister said it was a matter of pride and joy that he had learned many new things during this period.

In this budget, he said, special care has been taken of all employees and para workers.

No tax hike, ₹1k crore for Mekedatu project

While presenting his maiden budget in the state Legislative Assembly, Chief Minister Basavaraj Bommai reserved ₹6,000 crore for Bangalore infrastructure development

Bangalore, March 4: Karnataka Chief Minister Basavaraj Bommaj proposed no increase in taxes in the Budget 2022-23 presented by him in the state Legislative Assembly Friday

The Chief Minister, who also holds the Finance portfolio, presented his maiden budget with an estimated ₹2,65,720 crore consolidated funds for 2022-23 and expressed his government's commitment for the implementation of the Mekedatu project across river Cauvery, to which neighbouring Tamil Nadu is opposed to, and provided ₹1,000 crore for it this year.

With just a year left for the Assembly polls in the state, this is most likely to be the last full-fledged budget ahead of the elections.

"The economy in 2021-21 is on the road to recovery. In these circumstances, I am not willing to put extra burden of additional taxes on the common man," Bommai said.

Presenting the budget in the Legislative Assembly, he said tax collection targets will be achieved by ensuring all the tax departments perform better.

The government has set a collection target of ₹77,010 crore for the Commercial Tax Department; ₹15,000 crore for the Department of Stamps and Registration: ₹29,000 crore for the Excise department and ₹8,007 crore for



transport department. The total revenue receipts amount to ₹2,61,977 while the public debt stands at ₹72,089 crore. The Chief Minister also said

that he is not increasing the petrol and diesel rates. "Realising the difficulties caused by the second and third wave of Covid-19 pandemic in 2021-22, sales tax on petrol and diesel was reduced in November 2021. Because of which the petrol and diesel rates had come down by ₹7 per litre," he noted. Compared to other south Indian states, the rates of petrol and diesel are less in Karnataka, he said adding, "I am not intending to increase the rates in 2022-23." He also announced ₹55,657 crore to boost economic activities in the state. The government allotted ₹40,944 crore for the comprehensive development of children.

Stating that the Mekedatu Balancing Reservoir and Bangalore Drinking Water Project will be implemented by getting required clearances from the appropriate authority of the Union government, Bommai said for implementation of the project, a grant of ₹1,000 crore will be provided in the current year.

Pointing out that his government has given more importance for preservation of cattle resources and has implemented the Karnataka Prevention of Slaughter and Preservation of Cattle Act, the Chief Minister said for effective implementation of the act, the number of 'Goshalas' will be increased from 31 at present to 100 and ₹50 crore will be provided for the purpose

Also for the first time in the state, the government will launch 'Punyakoti Dattu Yojane' to encourage public and private institutions to adopt cows in the Goshalas by paying ₹11,000

annually. To encourage the use of farm machinery and to reduce fuel expenditure for the first time in the state, diesel subsidy at ₹250 per acre subject to maximum for 5 acres will be given through DBT under a new scheme "Raitha Shakti" for which ₹500 crore has been provided in the budget.

An amount of ₹500 crore has been provided in the budget for the development of infrastructure in the government schools of the state, and priority will be given for selected aspirational taluks under this grant. Seven engineering colleges will be developed as the Karnataka Institute of Technology (KIT) on the lines of the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT). The government will collaborate with foreign universities in this regard,

The budget also proposes to establish 438 "Namma Clinics" in major cities of the state; also they will be established in all wards of Bangalore. In these clinics, the services of detection of non-communicable diseases and referral for higher treatment to specialists will be provided.

To enable establishment of enterprises, entrepreneurship training will be provided in the prestigious IIM Bangalore to 300 women graduates of SC/ST. The budget also allotted ₹43,188 crore for women empowerment.

The Chief Minister announced ₹33,700 crore for agriculture and related activities and ₹20,601 crore for the Water Resources Ministry. He also allotted ₹31,980 for Education; ₹16.076 crore for Urban development; ₹13,982 crore for health; ₹12, 655 for Power; ₹2,288 crore for Food and Civil Supplies; ₹16,388 crore for the Revenue Department; ₹9,389 crore for Social Welfare; ₹10,447 crore for the PWD; ₹3,594 for Housing and ₹8,457 for Agriculture And Horticulture.

He stated that the government would provide ₹5,000 each for 30,000 pilgrims going on the Kashi pilgrimage. Bommai also reserved ₹6,000 crore for Bangalore infrastructure development.



India abstains in UNHRC vote

The UN General Assembly this week overwhelmingly voted to condemn Russian aggression against Ukraine and demanded that Moscow "completely and unconditionally" withdraw all of its military forces from the territory of Ukraine

Geneva/United Nations, March 4: India Friday abstained in the UN Human Rights Council on a vote to urgently establish an independent international commission of inquiry to investigate alleged human rights violations and related crimes following Russia's military operation in Ukraine.

The 47-member Council voted on a draft resolution on the 'Situation of human rights in Ukraine stemming from the Russian aggression.'

The resolution was adopted with 32 votes in favour, two against (Russia and Eritrea) and 13 abstentions, including India, China, Pakistan, Sudan and Venezuela. The countries voting in favour included France, Germany, Japan, Nepal, UAE, UK and the US.

The resolution, which strongly condemned Russia's aggression against Ukraine, decides to "urgently establish an independent international commission of inquiry" to "investigate all alleged violations and abuses of human rights and violations of international humanitarian law, and related crimes, in the context of the Russian Federation's aggression against Ukraine, and to establish the facts, circumstances, and root causes of any such violations and abuses."

A day before the resolution was adopted, India said at the Urgent Debate Thursday regarding the human rights situation in Ukraine at the 49th Human Rights Council Session in Geneva that it is greatly



concerned over the steadily worsening humanitarian situation in

India urged for an immediate cessation of violence and an end to hostilities. "No solution can ever be arrived at the cost of human lives. Dialogue and diplomacy are the only solution for settling differences and disputes," India said.

India called for respect and protection of human rights of people in Ukraine and safe humanitarian access to conflict zones.

"We are also deeply concerned over the safety and security of thousands of Indian nationals, including young Indian students, who are still stranded in Ukraine. We are working together with neighboring States for their evacuation," it said.

Three human rights experts will be appointed to the Commission of Inquiry by the President of the Human Rights Council for an initial duration of one year.

India seeks ceasefire to evacuate its citizens

New Delhi, March 4: India Friday sought ceasefire by Russian and Ukrainian troops in eastern Ukraine for evacuation of Indian citizens stuck in conflict zones and said it is yet to see the implementation of the decision by the two sides to create safe corridors for the exit of the civil-

Arindam Bagchi, the spokesperson of the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA), said that around 300 Indians are stranded in Kharkiv and 700 are in Sumy while some citizens out of over 900 are being taken out of Pisochyn in

At a media briefing, he said India is primarily focusing on evacuating its nationals out of the conflict zones in eastern Ukraine including from Kharkiv and Sum, adding that the total number of Indians stuck in Ukraine could be roughly in the range of 2,000 to 3,000. Asked about Russian President

Vladimir Putin's comments Thursday that some Indians are being held hostage by Ukrainian forces, the MEA spokesperson once again rejected the claim saying India does not have any such information or reports.

On Thursday too, Bagchi rejected claims by both Russia and Ukraine that Indian students are being held hostage in Kharkiv.

In the briefing, he also said that India has evacuated one Bangladeshi national as part of its mission to bring back the stranded Bagchi said India was in touch

with all parties concerned on the evacuation of the Indians and sought a "local ceasefire" in the conflict zones to get them out of the areas witnessing fighting and vi-The spokesperson also said that

India has not seen any movement

Ukraine on Thursday agreed to the need for the creation of humanitarian corridors to help civilians leave the conflict zones.

"If that happens, it will certainly help our process. We have been asking for a cessation of hostilities by both sides. Local ceasefire or whatever works to get our people out of the conflict zones,' Bagchi said.

Mykhailo Podolyak, an adviser to Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelenskyy, said after talks between Russia and Ukraine that the two sides reached an understanding to establish safe corridors for civilians. Asked about reports that Russian reports that Moscow has arranged 130 buses for evacuation of Indians from eastern Ukrainian cities, Bagchi said the buses are around 50-60 km away

Bhagalpur blast toll mounts to 14

Patna, March 4: At least 14 persons have been killed and many others injured following a powerful explosion in a house in Bihar's Bhagalpur district, the police said Friday.

Bihar DGP SK Singhal said the main accused in the case has been identified as Leelawati Devi, who along with her family members used to manufacture illegal firecrackers in the house. Leelawati and four of her family members were killed in the blast.

'We have recovered 14 bodies from the debris so far, and rescue operations are still on. Ten persons have been injured in the explosion, who are battling for their lives at the Mayaganj Medical College and Hospital in Bhagalpur. Four adjacent buildings have been completely destroyed by the ex-

plosion that took place in Kajawali Chak village under Tatarpur police station," Singhal said.

"The explosion took place during the manufacturing of illegal firecrackers in the house by Leelawati Devi Thursday at around 11.30 pm. She was making crackers without any licence. Five of her family members, including herself, died in the explosion," he added.

"Leelawati was initially owning the building where the explosion took place. She had sold it recently and was living there with her family on rent," Singhal said.

The officer said that the main accused was a serial offender. Similar explosions had taken place there twice, in 2018 and 2020. Besides the family members of Leelawati, three members of Mahendra Mandal's family were also killed in the explosion. Mandal's house is located next Leelawati's house.


Hapur (UP): The principal of the Marwar Inter College School in Hapur, Uttar Pradesh, gave a haircut to 84 students with long hair from class 9 to 12 during the morning assembly.

He termed it a "punishment for

breaking school rules. Calling it a "humiliating move," two parents have complained to the higher authorities of the education department. However, according to the district inspector of schools, nothing in writing has been submitted to her yet.

One of the students, who received a haircut during the school assembly, said: "Our principal had asked around 84 students to stand in a line in a separate area. He then asked all of us to get down on our knees and then started chopping our hair. We pleaded for exemption and assured him that we would get a haircut from the barber but he refused to let us go.'

He added that his parents also called the police and staged a protest in front of the school premises. The principal took pictures and



made videos of the punishment that have now gone viral on social media. The faculty members also said that they were "fully in support" of the principal.

"This was the need of the hour to ensure students remained disciplined. These students had been warned many times. They were supposed to come to school with proper hair but many of them had long and coloured hair," said Babita Tomar, a teacher at the school.

The principal said that the students and even their parents were warned of their long hair on various occasions but when they continued to ignore him he decided to teach them a lesson. He also blamed Covid for "making students disobedient and fashion-

He said: "Students stayed at home for too long and grew their hair out. There was no one there to stop them. I cut their hair to teach them a lesson. It is my duty to teach students how to be disciplined."

The principal further claimed that no parents had objected to his punishment.

Brussels: NATO allies rejected Ukraine's demand for no-fly zones Friday, saying they were increasing support but that stepping in directly would lead to a broader, even more brutal European war so far limited to Russia's assault on its neighbour.

Ukraine, a former Soviet republic that wants to join the European Union and Western military alliance NATO, is not a currently a member of either. "We are not part of this conflict, and we have a responsibility to ensure it does not escalate and spread beyond Ukraine," NATO Secretary-General Jens Stoltenberg told a news conference.

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy has called for Western pow-

Horrific deja vu for those who fled other wars

NUREMBERG (GERMANY): When Russia launched its war on Ukraine, a Syrian student in the city of Kharkiv joined the exodus of people fleeing the onslaught. It was the third time that 24-year-old Orwa Staif, who grew up in the suburbs of Damascus, was being displaced by war and crises

For Staif, it was a jarring deja vu: columns of people, many on foot, carrying what few belongings they could, desperate to escape bombs and missiles. He had seen it all before, in his native Syria.

"The same sounds of bombs that I heard in 2013, I heard now in Kharkiv. I told my friends I can't believe I'm reliving the same experience'," Staif said in Germany, where he has since reunited with

According to the United Nations, more than 1 million people have fled Ukraine following Russia's invasion, the swiftest refugee exodus

this century. They fled to neighboring countries, with Poland taking in the highest number.

In 2013, rebels fighting to topple Syrian autocrat Bashar Assad were in Staif's hometown of Douma, at the doorstep of the capital, Damascus, Airstrikes, shelling and street fighting were common. His father defected from the army and the family was forced to leave Syria. Like so many other families, they scattered — some went to the United Arab Emirates, some to Germany. Staif went to neighboring Lebanon, where he graduated from high school.

In 2019, the situation in Lebanon deteriorated dramatically, with the economy crashing and people taking to the streets in mass protests. Poverty and inflation soared in an unprecedented economic collapse.

Staif's father advised him to go study in Ukraine, where getting a visa—at least in theory—was eas-

New Delhi, March 4: Foreign capital flows into the Indian real estate jumped over three-fold to \$23.9 billion during 2017-21 period as compared to the previous five years, according to Colliers-FICCI report.

In its report 'Foreign investments in Indian real estate turn a corner', property consultant Colliers mentioned that the global investors have shown an increased inclination towards investment in Indian real estate buoyed by regulatory reforms introduced in 2016.

"Foreign investors, who had previously refrained from investing in the Indian real estate market due to the lack of transparency started investing in the country with greater optimism from 2017,' Colliers said.

The investments in the industrial and logistics sector stood at third position, surpassing the residential sector. Foreign investors remained cautious about the residential sector in the aftermath of the NBFC crisis and subdued residential sales, Colliers said.

The share of residential assets in total foreign investments has

reduced to 11 per cent in 2017-2021, from 37 per cent in a preceding five-year period. Foreign investments in the office

sector have consistently reached \$2 billion in each year since 2017 except in 2021, where the quantum of investments almost halved. During 2017-21, alternative as

sets saw an inflow of about \$1 billion with a majority of it coming during the pandemic years. "Government policy for data lo-

calisation and infrastructure status received for data centres recently are likely to give a boost to the establishment of new data centres in the country," the consultant

New Delhi, March 4: Domestic passenger vehicle retail sales declined eight per cent in February as the companies continued to suffer production loss due to chip shortage, automobile dealers' body Federation of Automobile Dealers Associations (FADA) said Friday.

The passenger vehicle (PV) sales dropped to 2,38,096 units last month, down 7.84 per cent from 2,58,337 units in February 2021.

Even though the passenger vehicle (PV) segment saw some launches and slight respite in supply due to better production, it was not enough to meet customer demand. Vehicle waiting period thus remains similar to what it was in the past few months," FADA President Vinkesh Gulati stated.

CHIP WOES CONTINUE

The industry body warned that the Russia-Ukraine conflict could further impact the production of semiconductors.

"Russia is one of the largest producers of rare-earth metals, especially Palladium, which is an essential metal for semiconductors. Ukraine, on the other hand, is one of the biggest producer and exporter of neon gas, which is used in the manufacturing of semiconductors. Due to the ongoing war, we once again fear the shortage in semiconductors which will create additional supply side issues for PVs," the FADA noted.

PANT OWNS 'VIRAT DAY'

INDIAN WICKETKEEPER-BATTER MISSES OUT ON **HUNDRED BUT ENTERTAINS THE SPECTATORS,** WHO WERE LEFT DISAPPOINTED WITH FORMER SKIPPER KOHLI'S PERFORMANCE ON THE **OPENING DAY OF HIS LANDMARK 100TH TEST**

Mohali, March 4: Indian cricket's rapidly-rising box-office draw Rishabh Pant owned the centre-stage in Virat Kohli's landmark 100th Test, hammering Sri Lankan bowlers into submission with an enthralling 96 (97b, 9x4, 4x6) as the hosts reached a commanding 357/6 on the opening day of the first Test here.

The 5,000 odd spectators, who had come to watch Kohli (45, 76b, 5x4) perform on a grand stage, saw one of the most flamboyant batters in recent history make a mockery of an average Sri Lankan attack. R Ashwin (10 batting) was giving company to his spin partner Ravindra Jadeja (45 batting, 82b, 5x4) at stumps.

He was especially brutal when it came to going after left-arm spinner Lasith Embuldeniya (2/107), who was taken for 22 in one over.

The deathly silence after Kohli's shock exit for a well-made 45 was there for barely a second and half. Because at that point entered the stockily built 24-yearold from India's engineering city of Rourkee and that was followed by a deafening roar which showed his popularity.

On Kohli's day, he had completely overshadowed the legend. And those who came for Kohli, decided to stay back and savour Pant's mayhem as he started with a signature lofted six off Embuldeniya over mid-wicket fence.

Embuldeniya, who must have felt emboldened when he got one to turn a shade away and tickle Kohli's off-stump, didn't know what hit him.

In just over one and half session, Pant nearly reached his fourth hundred in Test cricket before veteran Suranga Lakmal (1/63), in his last international series, breached his defence. One couldn't but feel for the young man who looked completely devastated after another nearmiss, the fifth time that he has gotten out in the 90s.

The walk back to the pavilion took an eternity as it seemed that one would need someone to drag him out. But coach Rahul Dravid and skipper Rohit Sharma's decision to send him at No.5 to bring in the left-hander's advantage against a leftarm spinner, had paid the rich dividends

Mumbai take control versus sloppy Odisha

Bhubaneswar, March 24: Sarfaraz Khan (107 batting, 117b, 11x4, 1x6) struck an attacking century to help Mumbai take command of their Ranji Trophy Group D match against Odisha in Ahmedabad, Friday.

After restricting Odisha to 284 in the first innings, Mumbai reached 259/3 at stumps on Day 2, thanks to Sarfaraz, Armaan Jaffer (77 batting, 162b, 8x4, 2x6) and skipper Prithvi Shaw (53, 64b, 6x4, 2x6). Sarfaraz and Jaffer were at the crease, with an unbroken 183-run fourth-wicket stand, when the bails were drawn.

Mumbai were in a spot of bother when they slumped from 73 for no loss to 76/3 within three overs. And it was young Odisha pacer Rajesh Mohanty (3/64) who was responsible for all the three Mumbai wickets.

Mumbai started off strongly, when Shaw and Sachin Yadav (19) added 73 runs for the opening wicket. Mohanty got rid of dangerous looking Shaw to break the stand. In his next over, he dismissed Yadav before piling misery on Mumbai showing the way to Ajinkya Rahane for a first-ball

However, Rahane's dismissal turned out to be the last laugh on the day for Odisha as Jaffer and Sarfaraz ensured Mumbai of no further hiccups. Sarfaraz played the role of an aggressor, while Jaffer played the role of second fiddle, with his watchful strokeplays.

Mumbai were only 25 runs behind Odisha's first innings total of 284. It was after Odisha lost their remaining four wickets in just 34 runs. Mohit Avasthi (3/66) was the highest wicket-taker for Mumbai, and he was well-assisted by Dhwal Kulkarni (2/42) and Shams Mulani (2/53).

Resuming the day's play from their overnight score of 250/6, Odisha lost Abhishek Raut (39) after adding only 14 runs to the total. Rajesh Mohanty (39) tried his best to take Odisha past 300, but failed to do so.

Melbourne, March 4: Former Australia spinner Shane Warne, unarguably one of the all-time greats of the game who redefined spin bowling, has died of a suspected heart attack in Thailand, according to a statement from his management. He was 52.

Warne's management released a brief statement to the Australian media, saying that he passed away in Koh Samui, Thailand.

'Shane was found unresponsive in his villa and despite the best efforts of medical staff, he could not be revived." the statement reported by various media outlets here said. "The family requests privacy at this time and will provide further details in due course."

An iconic name in international cricket, Warne, since making his debut in 1992, played 145 Tests for Australia, picking up 708 wickets


with his leg-spin. In his 194 ODI appearances, Warne snared 293 scalps.

He was the second highest wicket taker in Test history and only Sri Lanka off-spinner Muttiah Muralitharan has more wickets than him with 800. In 2007, Cricket Australia and Sri Lanka Cricket named the Test series between the two sides the Warne-Muralitharan Trophy in the duo's honour.

Warne, who made his Test debut against India at the iconic Sydney Cricket Ground, was named as one of Wisden's Five Cricketers of the Century for his unparalleled achievements in a 15-year career between 1992 and 2007.

In 2013, he was inducted into the ICC Hall of Fame. He helped Australia win the World Cup in 1999 and took more wickets than any other bowler in Ashes cricket, the tally standing at 195.

After retiring from international cricket, Warne added to his legend by doubling up as captain and coach

of IPL team Rajasthan Royals' remarkable title triumph in the event's inaugural edition.

A flamboyant personality both on and off the field. Warne also found success as a commentator and was considered among the sharpest analysts of the game.

Warne has passed away on a day when Australian cricket was in mourning after the death of wickeeping legend Rod Marsh. He had condoled his demise in a tweet this morning.
