

From not being able to advance beyond a certain level in the 1980s to rising to the highest ranks in corporate sector, today's women are expanding their entrepreneurial horizons and venturing into a wide range of businesses

G one are the days when women were confined to the four walls of their homes to perform household chores. From not being able to advance beyond a certain level in the 1980s to rising to the highest ranks in the corporate sector, today's women have traversed a long way. They are no more cowed down by the 'glass ceiling' effect. In fact, the women entrepreneurs are expanding their entrepreneurial horizons and venturing into a wide range of business areas. They are now becoming their own boss.

There is no dearth of examples of women who have reached the top in their respective fields defying gender stereotypes.

Ahead of International Women's Day, **Sunday POST** talked to a few successful women entrepreneurs who have blazed new trails in the industry to inspire thousands.

Jayashree Mohanty

(Top entrepreneur in IT sector)

While talking about women entrepreneurship in Odisha, Jayashree Mohanty is certainly a name that has motivated hundreds of wannabe entrepreneurs. As the co-founder and president of Luminous Infoways, a Bhubaneswarbased IT services company, she has broken the gender bias from the word go. In 2001, she decided to set up her business in Bhubaneswar when startups were not recognised as a viable career option. She took the plunge turning down a lucrative job offer in the government sector. Her bold decision was backed by Tanmay Mohanty, then her business partner who eventually became her co-pilot in life. From starting the company in a 2 BHK rented house with just two people to employing over 1,000 IT professionals today, Jayashree has consistently proven her mettle as a technology entrepreneur, managing more than 100 small and medium scale projects across different geographies like India, USA, Middle East, Norway, New Zealand and Australia. Luminous Infoways offers a proven integrated portfolio of IT & IT-enabled services in both open source & Microsoft Technologies. In addition to Bhubaneswar, the company has its offices in London, Delhi, Itanagar, Jharkhand, Andhra Pradesh and Guwahati. Jayashree has received several awards for her IT Solutions in the e-Governance and Corporate sectors. She also won the Leading Lady Entrepreneur 2015 STPI Exports award and was recently recognised for her promotion of women empowerment in the MSME segment. An alumnus of Indian Institute of Foreign Trade and Nyenrode Business

University, Netherlands, Jayshree has been championing the cause of women entrepreneurship in Odisha for many years now.

Asked about her motivation, she says, "The desire to do something different which will help the society grow was my motivation. I wanted to create an army of techsavvy people in my enterprise."

However, Jayashree's journey was not a cakewalk as it entailed lots of dedication and effort. About the initial challenges, she recalls, "Twenty years back the word 'startup' was not even coined. The ecosystem was not conducive.





I have to deal with all the challenges starting from finance, markets, brain drains and the factors affecting the markets. With resilience and connecting with the right people, I could overcome the hurdles. With our rigorous efforts, we are now recognised as a brand of Odisha and pride of India. We provide equal opportunities to women and men. We now have a core group of experts that converts Government schemes, Acts and Rules into IT initiatives having a strong citizen centric perspective."

About her biggest achievement, Jayshree says, "The Govt of Odisha inducted me into the Startup Task-force, which gave an opportunity to use my expertise to grow and help all startups that accessed me, to grow."

Talking about her future plan, she says, "I would like to build a world class centre of excellence and research centre to learn industry practices and best technologies to resources here. As CII IWN chairperson I would also like to see more women taking up key positions in the industry."

Before signing off, she advises budding entrepreneurs to believe in themselves and have a determination to work hard to get recognised by the people or organisations that matter.

her journey from a banker to Sarpanch, she says, "I was the first girl student at our village to get first class in Class X board examination in 1999. After pursuing MBA, I was working at IDBI Bank in Berhampur. In 2012, I decided to switch profession by contesting panchayat polls as I thought it was the best time to do something for society. After winning the poll, my first priority was to improve village-level governance and streamline the Public Distribution System (PDS) in the village as I have noticed how families were deprived of getting stuff through PDS.

Besides, she also launched a literacy project in her panchayat under which 750

This foundation has officially been registered in 2018, where our vision is to make Odisha free from hunger by 2030. God has created this earth giving cated. She has planted around 1.5 lakh trees and dug up ponds for the wellbeing of animals. For her immense contribution towards nature, she received the Prakruti Mitra Award.

Asked about her foray into wellness products, she adds: "I believe nature has a lot of healthy and beneficial ingredients that Ayurvedic science had formulated centuries ago. Thereafter, I started my quest to come up with products and develop a range of hair, face and body care products using natural ingredients and with approved Ayurvedic formulation. Known widely for her outstanding contribution for the growth of tribal community, Chidatmika Khatua also received Honorary Doctorate for Peace Education, from United Nations University for Global peace, USA. She has got the biggest recognition as founder of India's 1st tribal queen contest 'Adi Rani' with a mission to make tribal women empowerment and uplift tribal culture and tradition with its originality. All she wants is to create an India where all tribal women will get equal opportunity as other women's get in the society and connect all tribal women globally to showcase their talent, tradition and culture worldwide

What made you launch the tribal beauty pageant? To this, she responds "Basically everyone knows that tribal people all over the world are distinct for their unique tradition and culture, their honesty, simplicity and all. But they were somehow moving away from their originality and individuality. With an aim to stop the decline and to enable them to present themselves before people with confidence, I conceptualized the 'Adi Rani' project. The idea was to empower tribal women and make them join the mainstream of the society. More than 100 tribal women participated across the country out of which 30 got shortlisted. And finally Pallavi Durua from Koraput won the title."

HOME TO MOUNTAINS LIKE SKYSCRAPERS AND WATERFALLS CASCADING LIKE VELVET AND THE QUIET, THE ISLAND NATION IN THE SOUTHWESTERN PACIFIC OCEAN IS A PLACE TO EXPERIENCE THE TRUE, RAW BEAUTY OF NATURE

ew Zealand's landscapes are breathtaking and are a true delight to the eyes. One is certain to be astonished by beautiful landscapes at every bend. While the entire country is gorgeous, there are a few areas that stand out for being the most unique and untouched places in New Zealand. Home to mountains like skyscrapers, wa-

terfalls cascading like velvet and the quiet, stillness of a land before time, it's a place to experience the true, raw beauty of nature. New Zealand is full of these marvels which are sure to awaken your inner explorer. Here are four beautiful and untapped New Zealand landscapes that are sure to leave you in awe of the beauty of nature:

AUCKLAND

The largest city in the country is more commonly known for its urban centre, but just a short drive beyond the high-end stores and bustling city streets is a tale of nature from two diverse coasts. The east coast lends itself to calm, turquoise waters and white sand beaches like Pakiri, perfect for horse riding. While the west attracts scenes of raw, moody nature with black sand beaches at Piha and Karekare, towering sand dunes at Bethell's beach and dense forests filled with immersive walking tracks in the Hunua Ranges. Both attract wildlife, off the east coast islands in the Hauraki Gulf like Motuihe, Rotoroa and Rangitoto are sanctuaries for native birds, meaning you can spot Kiwi, Takahe and Pateke in their protected environments.

MT COOK/MACKENZIE

The Mackenzie region is tucked nicely halfway between Christchurch and Queenstown, but if feels like a world all of its own. It's one of the few International Dark Sky Reserves in the world, known for transforming into a crystal-clear blanket of stars by night. Gaze at the Milky Way from a hot pool at Tekapo Springs or if you want a closer look at the planets, the Dark Sky Reserve offers tours at Mt John Observatory, New Zealand's premier astronomical research centre. By day, the region offers sights just as spectacular with remarkable glaciers set amongst towering mountains.





SOUTHERN COASTLINE (CATLINS, WAITAKI, DUNEDIN)

Throwback to a time when nature felt raw, untouched and unchartered, the Southern end of the country wraps around a moody coastline and lends itself to panoramic views, endlessly stretched horizons and other worldly landscapes. Nugget Point offers striking ocean views dotted by rocky islets named by Captain Cook for looking like pieces of gold, and a pathway leading to the towering lighthouse perched on the edge of the cliff. With nature comes wildlife and this region is bursting with cute and furry animals. Whether it's Oamaru's Little Blue Penguins adorably running in from shore to find shelter or Dunedin's Fur Seals and Yellow Eyed Penguins parading on the beach, there's plenty to discover. AGENCIES

HAMILTON WAIKATO

V oice recognition technology, designed to automatically transcribe audio, is becoming steadily more advanced. Throw the concurrent advances in smartphones into the mix and you can now have dictation available whenever you need it.

Here are some of the best voice recognition applications.



Dragon Dictation Platform: iOS

D ragon products have been a leader in the speech transcription field since it was a fledgling category on desktop. Available only on iOS, Dragon Dictation requires a network connection to work.

Press a button to record and then the text can be copied and pasted into other applications. Unlike Dragon's upcoming Dragon Anywhere app, which will charge a subscription fee, Dictation is free.

ListNote Speechto–Text Notes Platform: Android

Produced by Khymaera, the free ListNote boasts over 16,000 downloads on Google Play. The interface provides a searchable index of notes, with options to back up notes on the SD card. You can customise the app according to your preferred way of speaking.

There are also password protection options offered, with protected notes encrypted with the AES standard after the first 20 characters.





Voice Texting Pro Platform: iOS

This free offering from Sparking Apps is rated 4+ in the App Store. Requiring devices on iOS 5.1.1 or later, the mobile app is optimised for the iPhone 5.

Like most Apple software, the app prioritises user interface. All of its features are usefully offered from a single screen. There are in-app purchases available including voice texting and adding languages.

Evernote Platform: Android

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As Evernote uses the built-in Android speech recognition software, the app requires you to be connected to a network to use it. The audio and text file are saved together to allow you to track down a note more easily.

There are also features to interact with other Evernote users such as in-app chat. Another free application, Evernote has been downloaded by over a million users from the Google Play Store.





Speech to Text Platform: Android

This simple app from Xenom Apps, with many downloads on Google Play, allows you to dictate text and send it as an SMS, email or within another app. You can also send the dictations to phonebook contacts.

Based on Android's built-in Speech Recogniser, it is unavailable to iOS users. A common complaint about the app is the way it automatically stops when the speaker pauses in speech, even for a relatively short period.
