he Capital city of Odisha, is home to several historical monuments. It is well-known for Hindu, Buddhist and Jain heritage sites. There are also legends which describe Bhubaneswar's tryst with the Pandavas of Mahabharat era.

As per the legend, the Pandavas and their queen Draupadi had spent a few days in five laterite stone caves located at Badagada Brit Colony of modern-day Bhubaneswar, during their 12 years of exile.

"It is believed that the Pandavas had taken shelter in these caves around 5,000 years ago. They were offering prayers before Bhimeshwar Mahadev after taking bath in the Bhimkund tank. Even today, one can find a Shivling and stone idols of the Pandava brothers in one of the five caves. An ancient well is also there," said Mantu Jena, a local.

The surroundings of these ancient caves were covered with thick forests till 1950s. The state government came to know about these caves around 60 years ago.

The Archaeology department of the state government took control over the site in 1970s. Subsequently, the government tried to preserve the caves by constructing concrete pillars and roofs, Jena added.

'We have heard that these caves had been connected with the twin hills of Khandagiri and Udayagiri with a tunnel. The Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) should carry out a detailed research on this site to unravel new dimensions," said Debashish Patnaik, a local youth.

According to the locals, some development works, including the construction of a boundary wall, were carried out at the site in 1999. Subsequently, the floors and walls of one of these caves were renovated with marble sheets.



The place pulls curious crowds every day. They hope that further excavation at the site may lead to findings of many other caves which may shed light into its antiquity and its extinct occupants.





## Allow scribes' entry to Press Appropriation Bill passed in House Gallery, Secretariat: Oppn

Bhubaneswar, March 31: Opposition BJP and Congress Thursday asked the BJD government to immediately withdraw restrictions on the entry of journalists into Lok Seva Bhavan (state secretariat) and the Assembly

The issue was raised during the Zero Hour in the Assembly by Congress Legislature Party leader Narasingha Mishra who came down heavily on the government for denying entry of journalists

to the Lok Seva Bhaban, the highest administrative office of the state and also to the press gallery of the Assembly.

The state government two years ago imposed restrictions on journalists in the wake of the Covid-19 pandemic outbreak and the order still

continues even as the situation has improved significantly.

"Media is the fourth pillar of democracy. Why are journalists being barred from entering the Assembly Press Gallery and Lok Seva Bhawan?" Mishra asked.

Bhubaneswar, March 31: The Assembly passed the Odisha Appropriation (Vote-On-Account) Bill, 2022 on the last day of the Budget Session Thursday allowing the state government to spend Rs 1.06 lakh crore from its consolidated fund during the first four months of the 2022-23 financial year.

Replying to the debate in the House, Finance Minister Niranjan Pujari said Rs 1 lakh crore has been allocated as programme expenditure, Rs 89,620 crore as administrative expenditure, Rs 3,210 crore as disaster response fund and Rs 7.170 crore towards transfers from the state to the local bodies during 2022-23 fiscal.

Besides, Rs 10,000 crore has been allocated for the Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) and other extra budgetary resources, which





Bhubaneswar, March 31: The Comptroller and Auditor General of India (CAG) found several irregularities in the execution of surface irrigation projects in the state

The state government had initiated various irrigation projects (major, minor, mega lift etc) at considerable cost with the objective of providing adequate and assured water supply for farming.

However, as noticed in the audit, lack of adequate and assured supply of water through completion of irrigation projects has deprived the farmers of irrigation facilities, the CAG said in its latest audit report on surface irrigation.

During the period (2014-19) covered by this performance audit, the CAG test checked five major irrigation projects, nine mega lift points (MLPs) and 10 minor irrigation projects (MIPs) for which a

sum of Rs 12,742.11 crore had been incurred up to March 2020.

Other than nine mega lift points (MLPs), increase in cost of the projects ranged between 182 and 4,596 per cent. Despite escalation, only one major project -- the Upper Indravati Irrigation Project (UIIP) had been completed and four other major projects were in different stages of execution, said the report, which was tabled before Assembly, Thursday,

"Performance audit of surface irrigation revealed several deficiencies in the planning, implementation and monitoring of the projects. The financial management of the test-checked projects was marred due

to surrendering of funds resulting in non-completion of projects despite availability," it said.

The auditor said there were also instances of loss of central assistance, parking of funds without utilization, non-realisation of government revenue, non-adjustment of advances and inadmissible pay-

Projects were found deficient in preparation and execution of DPRs and incorrect calculation of Benefit Cost Ratio (BCR) of the projects. These led to modifications in design and scope of works and revision in cost estimates affecting the schedule of implementation of the projects.

Similarly, in spite of incurring expenditure of Rs 12.742.11 crore in all of the test-checked projects, the irrigation potential (IP) achieved was 1,22,418 hectares against the proposed IP of 5,02,842 hectares which constituted only 24 per cent of the envisaged potential.

#### 1/3rd of coastline faces erosion: Centre in RS

New Delhi, March 31: About 33.6 per cent of the coastline is under varying degree of erosion, an analysis of the total 6,632 km-long Indian coastline of the mainland from 1990 to 2018 has found, the Rajya Sabha was informed Thursday.

The National Center for Coastal Research (NCCR), an attached office of the Ministry of Earth Sciences (MoES) has been monitoring the shoreline erosion since 1990 using

remote sensing data and GIS mapping techniques.

On the western coast, Kerala with 275.33 kms shoreline has lost 46.4 per cent to erosion while on the eastern coast, West Bengal with 323.07 kms coastline, has lost 60.5 per cent to it.

The reasons for coastal erosions include increase in frequency of cyclones and sea level rise and anthropogenic activities such as construction of harbours, beach mining and building of dams. Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) Earth Sciences Jitendra Singh said in a written reply to a question in the House.

There are 526 maps prepared for the entire Indian coast for identifying areas vulnerable to coastal erosion in 1:25000 scale along with 66 district maps, 10 state/UTs maps. A Report on 'National Assessment of Shoreline Changes along Indian Coast' was released in July 2018 and shared with various Central and state government agencies and stakeholders for implementing

shore line protection measures. The MoES had successfully demonstrated innovative coastal erosion mitigation measures at two pilot locations Puducherry Beach Restoration Project, Puducherry and Kadalur Periya Kuppam, Tamil Nadu.

#### Pinaki refutes Aparajita's charges on Srimandir construction work

New Delhi: BJD MP Pinaki Misra Thursday refuted the charges leveled by BJP MP Aparajita Sarangi in the Lok Sabha that the state government is doing constructions illegally in the prohibited area around Srimandir. The BJD MP said that the state government is strictly following the rules and the work is happening after the NOC from National Monument Authority He said the ASI was also involved in the work and they aren't digging big holes at the site. The state government is constructing four toilets.

"Female devotees face a lot of problems due to the absence of toilets at the shrine. Therefore, the state government is constructing two male and two female toilets. I request the MP to do some work at the Lingraj temple in Bhubaneswar instead of interfering in the work at Puri,"

Misra said. Earlier, Sarangi had said in the house that illegal construction work is going on in the prohibited area around Srimandir without any permission from ASI or NMA. She had requested the Union Culture Ministry to interfere and stop the work.

#### **Double murder rocks** Bolangir village

Bolangir, March 31: Two women were found dead with their throats slit and their bodies lying in a pool of blood at their residence in Nuapada village under Tushra police limits in this district, Thursday morning. Police suspect it to be a case of murder and efforts are on to identify the miscreants and nab them.

The deceased were identified as Ambika Meher, 50, wife of Subhranshu Meher. and her elderly mother-inlaw Premashila Meher, 65. No weapons however, have been found in close proximity to the murder spot.

The tragic incident has created panic in the locality. The alleged murders are stated to have been carried out when no male members were present in the house.

The gruesome killings came to the fore when Ambika's brother, who lives in the same village, came to meet his sister. He arrived at the residence and found the two women lying dead at around 10.00am, Subhranshu. who owns a medicine shop in the area, had gone to his workplace at that time.

On being informed, police reached the village and launched an investigation. A forensic team has been pressed into service. A case has been registered in this connection and the bodies have been sent for postmortem. Police are questioning Subhranshu and

two of his nephews.

Bhubaneswar: The Odisha government said Thursday that as of now there would be no orders and guidelines to contain Covid-19 for the month of April. Currently there are 345 active Covid-19 cases in Odisha. The Special Relief Commissioner's (SRC) office said in an order that under the Disaster Management Act, 2005, the Covid-19 containment measures will not be implemented from April 1. However, whenever there will be an increase in coronavirus cases, the Health and Family Welfare Department will implement preventive measures as advised by the Centre, the order further stated. This is the first time since March 13, 2020, that no guidelines or orders have been issued in the state to fight Covid-19.

## Partial rollback of **AFSPA in 3 NE states**

■ *Political parties and* people of Nagaland, Assam and Manipur were wanting the revocation of the draconian Act for decades now

New Delhi, March 31: In a major outreach to the Northeast, Union Home Minister Amit Shah announced Thursday reduction of the disturbed areas imposed under the Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act (AFSPA) in Nagaland, Assam and Manipur from April 1. This came after decades of protests and discussions.

A Home Ministry spokesperson, however, said the decision does not imply that the AFSPA has been completely withdrawn from the three insurgency-hit states but will continue to be in force in some areas. The move

came three months after the central government constituted a high-level committee to examine the possibility of lifting AFSPA in Nagaland where 14 civilians were killed by the Army in December 2021 in a case of 'mistaken identity'.

In Assam AFSPA has been completely revoked in 23 districts and partially in one district. In Manipur 15 police station areas of six districts will be excluded from the Act while in Manipur the notification is

being withdrawn from 15 police stations in seven districts.

The spokesperson also said in comparison to 2014, there has been a reduction of 74 per cent in militancy incidents in 2021 in the Northeast. Similarly, deaths of security personnel and civilians have also come down by 60 per cent and 84 per cent respectively during this period. Hence the decision to reduce the ambit of AFSPA has been taken and will be done in a phased manner for other areas

#### **BUS FARES HIKED AS FUEL RATES INCREASE**

Bhubaneswar, March 31: Bus fares in Odisha were hiked Thursday under the automatic fare revision mechanism after fuel prices were hiked for the ninth time in 10 days across the country. Fares for ordinary bus services have been increased from ₹0.87/km to ₹0.90/km. The same for express buses has been increased from 91 paise/km to 94p/km. Similarly, deluxe bus fares

rose from ₹1.25/km to ₹1.31/km and AC deluxe bus fares from ₹1.53/km to

₹1.59/km. Meanwhile state-owned oil marketing companies (OMC) raised Thursday the prices of petrol and diesel again. Both petrol and diesel prices were increased by 80 paise per litre each respectively across India. Petrol prices in the Odisha capital went up to ₹108.65/litre while diesel rate stood at ₹98.42/litre.











## Ranjan Nayak confesses; CB recovers victim's belongings





Bhubaneswar, March 31: In a significant development, Ranjan Navak, one of the accused involved in the sensational murder case of to the kidnapping and killing the victim during interrogation, the state Crime Branch claimed in a press note Thursday

Following the disclosure, the sleuths Thursday recovered incriminating items and the belongings of Manas, which the accused tried to destroy, from a place near Chandikhole.

"During interrogation, accused Ranjan Nayak confessed to have kidnapped Manas Swain in collusion with mastermind Sarmistha Rout. Jhuna Bhoi, Bhagyadhar Navak and Nilu alias Bibek in Sarmistha's car from Palaspur under Chandbali police limits in Bhadrak district to Dayal Ashram under Airfield Police Station in Bhubaneswar." revealed Crime Branch.

The Crime Branch also asserted that the accused including former OIS officer and I&PR Director Niranjan Sethi had brutally assaulted Manas at the old age home

## EOW arrests chit fund firm director in ₹500 crore fraud

Bhubaneswar, March 31: The Economic Offences Wing (EOW) of the state Crime Branch Thursday arrested Nikhilananda Pashupalak, regional director of a chit fund company, in a cheating case of ₹500 crore.

Pasupalak, who was on the run since January 2012, was arrested from Berhampur, police said.

The arrest was made on the basis of an FIR registered following a written complaint filed by Parsuram Behera against the office bearers of Success Online Service System (SOSS) Private Ltd, a chit fund company operated through its regional office at Berhampur, they said



Dilip Tripathy said the company was collecting illegal deposits by floating different schemes under the promise of giving healthcare commodities, food products and tour packages.

Besides, the company was also collecting money under three payment of ₹6,000, ₹15,000 and ₹25,000 promising 5 to 10 per cent interest, he said. The company has collected more

The STF identified two buildings, two vehicles (one mini bus & one car), landed properties and bank deposits possessed by Parida. The buildings owned by Parida have been evaluated by PWD R&B to be worth around ₹1.85 crore. While investigating into a case (29/21) related to the seizure of ganja weighing 10 guintal in August 2021, the STF unearthed the properties, "It is also suspected that he might have acquired such properties in Gujarat too out of drug business. Odisha Police is in touch with Gujarat Police in this regard. Step is being taken to take up the matter with Competent Authority, Kolkata as per provision of Sec 68 (F) NDPS Act, 1985 for forfeiture of the properties earned out of the contraband business," informed STF sources. The absconding Parida was arrested in the above case March 10, 2022 and was forwarded to the court of Dist & Sessions Judge cum-Spl Judge, Balasore.

On a unique mission

ince they often have to go through extreme conditions and deal with lawbreakers to protect the lives and properties of citizens, people hardly associate cops with soft emotions like love for music. But any words of appreciation fall short when a police officer, especially if she is a woman, vows to work for the survival of a folk art on the verge of disappearance.

Havaldar Jayanti Deep of the Odisha Reserve Police Force, posted at Bargarh, has been waging a battle for the survival of Sanchar, one of the oldest folk art forms of west-

ern Odisha.

For the unversed, a Sanchar is a form where an artiste plays the quadruple role of a dancer, singer, percussionist and explainer.

With the advent of the modern modes of entertainment, this art form is on the brink of extinction with its exponents fading into oblivion. "There was a time when

the performers would hold the audience spellbound," says Jayanti, who strikes a fine balance between the gun and the mrudanga

Though it seems quite challenging for a police officer to take time off from her job and pursue a unique passion like Sanchar, Jayanti

I would say I am extremely fortunate. While my uncle mentored me during my school days with strong support from my parents, my life partner Suresh Kumbhar, also a police officer, is an art connoisseur. I have the support of my in-laws also



has managed both with flair.

On her gun-music 'jugalbandi' she says: "Maintaining law and order is my profession, while keeping people entertained through an indigenous art form is my passion. I was attracted towards dance, music and stage when I was not even in school.'

After taking admission in Class I, she started learning Sanchar under the guidance of her uncle Kunjabihari Luhar, her first guru.

"By the time I was studying in Class VII, I had already become a known face in the cultural circles of western Odisha, earning the appreciation of critics," says Jayanti, who has a strong fan following in the rural pockets of western Odisha, Chhattisgarh and

For her exploits in this unique art form, she has been felicitated at the Rabindra Mandap and the Jaydev Bhawan in Bhubaneswar, at the world famous Dhanuyatra in Bargarh and by several cultural organisations across Odisha.

Jayanti has not only excelled in live performances, her soulful renditions often hold radio listeners spellbound. No wonder, she has been placed in the B-High category of All India Radio.

One may wonder, when many Indian families still look down upon dance, how challenging it must have been to pursue her passion especially when she hailed from an underdeveloped region (Jayanti was born in Dunguripali village of Jharbandh block in Bargarh district).



#### Dolphin count up in **GAHIRMATHA**

Marine Sanctuary in Kendrapara district has increased exponentially this year, according to the lat-

phins in the water bodies of Gahirmatha Marine Sanctuary and Bhitarkanika National Park.

During the drive, the forest officials found 540 dolphins of seven species - 45 Irrawaddy, 135 Bottlenose,

332 Humpback, 13 Striped and 15 Spiner dolphins.

This year, favourable climatic conditions played a major role in the dolphin census which helped in identifying an additional 198 dolphins. Nine teams of enumerators led by Divisional Forest Officer (DFO) Jagnyadatt Pati, Principal Chief Conservator of Forest (retired) NV Rajsekhar of West Bengal and scientist

The census started from outer Wheeler Island and was carried out in Chinchiri sea mouth, Barunei mouth, Paradip, Hansina bridge, Maipura mouth, Hansua river in Rajnagar, Khola, Dhamra mouth, Nalitapatia, Kalibhanjadiha island, Jambu island, Kharanasi, Hukitola island, Jatadhar mouth in

Apart from Gahirmatha Marine Sanctuary, the dolphin census was also carried out in areas of the Chilika Wildlife Division, the Puri Wildlife Division, the Berhampur Wildlife Division, the Bhadrak Wildlife Division and the Balasore Wildlife Division. The highest numbers of dolphins were identified in Gahirmatha sanctuary.



While Russian President Vladimir Putin continues to wage war on Ukraine, the Atlantic democracies are responding with impressive - and somewhat unexpected - unity as they arm Ukraine, reinforce NATO's eastern flank, and sanction the Russian economy.

Instead of turning away migrants, European Union member states are opening their doors to millions of Ukrainian refugees. The US Congress seems to have rediscovered the bipartisan comity that has long been missing in Washington. The political theorist Francis Fukuyama even foresees a "new birth of freedom" that will "get us out of our funk about the declining state of global democracy," adding hopefully that "the spirit of 1989 will live on, thanks to a bunch of brave Ukrainians."

Not so fast. The political ills plaguing the Atlantic democracies may be out of the headlines, but they have not gone away. While Russia's invasion is certainly a wake-up call for the West, the prospect of a new cold war will not by itself cure the United States and Europe of illiberalism and political dysfunction.

In fact, the war in Ukraine will likely have economic spillover effects that foster political blowback. Accordingly, both America and Europe need to keep

focusing on getting their own houses in order even while ensuring that the tragedy in Ukraine receives the resources and attention it deserves.

In Cold War America, the political discipline engendered by the Soviet threat did help mute partisan conflict over foreign policy. Similarly, the prospect today of a new era of militarised rivalry with Russia is reviving bipartisan centrism on matters of statecraft.

The left wing of the Democratic Party is no longer clamouring for cuts to the defence budget and a fast and deep pullback from fossil fuels. Both the hawkish and the neo-isolationist wings of the Republican Party have toned down their criticism of President Joe Biden and generally rallied behind his response to the Russian invasion.

But this return to bipartisanship is likely to be short-lived. The bipartisanship of the Cold War era rested not just on the Soviet threat but also on the ideological centrism sustained by widely shared prosperity within America. Yet prolonged economic insecurity and yawning inequality have since depopulated the US political center, and ideological moderation has given way to bitter polarisation.

This erosion of the political center explains the rapid evaporation of the surge in bipartisanship that followed the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks. And it explains why, just before the war in Ukraine captured the country's attention, public intellectuals in the US were debating the prospects for civil war. According to a poll conducted late last year, 64% of Americans fear that US democracy is "in crisis and at risk of failing."

The highest US inflation rate in 40 years is currently heightening the risk of a return to the illiberal politics of grievance. The rising cost of energy and food is one of the main reasons why Biden's approval ratings have remained low despite his strong handling of the war in Ukraine.

As the November midterm elections near, scant Republican support for Biden will translate into renewed partisan rivalry. And although the neo-isolationist wing of the Republican Party in Congress may be relatively quiet for now, it enjoys strong support among the party base and is likely to reassert itself as Western-led sanctions against Russia hurt US consumers.

Given the potential for illiberal populism to make a comeback in the US, the Biden administration urgently needs to continue advancing its domestic agenda. Investing in infrastructure, education, technology, health care, and other domestic programmes offers the best way to alleviate the electorate's discontent and revive the country's ailing political center. The budget that Biden proposed this week is a step in the right direction.

Europe, too, should keep a close eye on its home front as it focuses on its response to the Ukraine war. While Europe's political center has remained stronger than America's, and the EU has shown impressive unity in the face of Russian aggression, strains to European cohesion lurk just beneath the surface.

Europe's magnanimous welcome to Ukrainian refugees may trigger domestic backlashes as costs mount and the prospect of permanent resettlement looms. Weaning the EU off Russian fossil fuels will require consider able investment and could lead to even higher energy prices, potentially hampering Europe's economic recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic. And while Poland and Hungary are now frontline states that deserve allied support, both are still ruled by illiberal governments that threaten core European values: they should not be let off the hook.

Europeans, like Americans, need to continue working hard on domestic renewal. Economic restructuring and investment, reform of immigration policy and border control, and more pooling of sovereignty on foreign and defence policy can all help consolidate the EU's solidarity and democratic legitimacy.

Putin's brutal attack on Ukraine has helped revive the West. But the homegrown threats to liberal democracy that were front and center before the war still require urgent attention, even amid the strenuous effort to defeat Russia's attempt to subjugate its neighbour. It would be tragically ironic if the West succeeds in turning Putin's gamble in Ukraine into a resounding defeat, only to see liberal democracies then succumb to the enemy within

## WHY DID HE COME?

f we blinked, we would have missed the visit of the Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi. He was in New Delhi, 24-25 March 2022, meeting his Indian counterpart for three hours and a short meeting with the National Security Adviser. His visit to New Delhi was officially not announced in Beijing nor was he given any importance or serious audience in India. Unlike other dignitaries, Yi was ushered in at the airport through the normal lounge, not through the air-force station. As he happened to be around India, he dropped by New Delhi. All told, can the visit be downplayed as he represents China, which is in the eyes of world community because of its expansionism in its neighbourhood; and is a constant worry for New Delhi for its egregious attitude towards India.

Wang Yi was visiting Islamabad, Kabul and Kathmandu, and decided to have a stopover in New Delhi. Yi went to Kabul to meet the Taliban, including the UN designated terrorist, now the Afghan Interior Minister Sirajuddin Haqqani. He was there, in the wake of the visit of Russian special envoy to Afghanistan, Zamir Kabulov, for a conference next week in Beijing on Afghanistan land neighbours--Iran, Tajikistan, China, Uzbekistan, Turkmenistan, and Pakistan. He was in Islamabad to participate in the OIC meeting, wherein he mentioned Kashmir, and was promptly snubbed by New Delhi. His next stop was Kathmandu where he was going to take stock of their mega project, the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI), plus other infrastructure projects.

Why did Wang Yi come to New Delhi? He was not really taking a stopover, as flying from Kabul to Kathmandu is not hours on end. There are a couple of theories doing the rounds. One, he wanted to gauge the Indian mood vis-à-vis the Russia-Ukraine war: Both Beijing and New Delhi, for their respective reasons, have taken similar positions. They have continuously abstained from voting in the UN to name or condemn the Russian invasion.

Second, China would be hosting both the BRICS and RIC summits later this year. Beijing would like

Prime Minister Modi to attend both. Likewise, Xi Jinping should be cordially invited to SCO and G-20 meetings which will be hosted by New Delhi next year. Any dilution of BRICS, RIC or SCO will reflect poorly on Beijing as the initiator of such grouping. Beijing will not like these summits to go the SAARC way, become defunct, given the unabating conflict between India and Pakistan.

Be that as it may, the visit was significant, especially after the border stand-off between the two countries since April 2020; Indian soldiers dying in Galwan, and China occupying territories India claims to be hers; the patrolling point 5, Demchock, and Despang. That is not all. China has deployed 60,000 soldiers with missiles, rockets, and mobile airborne support. The stand-off continues spilling over to international forums. New Delhi maintains that there could be no other dialogue than the border disputes, that too, not until, China engages in demobilisation. disagreement and de-escalation. New Delhi fears that if the border stand-off is put on the backburner, it might end up reconciling to China's salami slicing tactics used from time to time.

In the meantime, New Delhi's China strategy consists of maintaining diplomatic openness and building capabilities while it puts the onus entirely on Beijing to bring about normalisation of relations. Furthermore, India is suspicious and wary of Chinese intensions. After 15 rounds of border commanders' talks, and eight rounds of meet ings of the special working mechanism for consultation and co-ordination on India-China border affairs, no substantial outcome has been achieved. On the contrary Beijing has been occasionally sounding out its appetite for more territory. New Delhi has rightly denied Wang Yi to have access to the Prime Minister Modi. It would continue to press for normalisation of relations vis-à-vis the standoff at LAC.

Conversely, China has a different point of view. It would like India to put the border issue at a proper place in bilateral relations. It would rather adopt a three-step strategy on India. One, both the countries should invoke the longterm civilization approach as they have a long and rich civilizational background, at times intersecting with each other's. The bilateralisms between Beijing and New Delhi should build on their civilizational legacies. Second, both countries should view each other's development as win-win situation, not win-lose scenario. Third step, both countries should cooperate at multilateral spheres especially those inspired by Beijing-- BRICS, RIC, SCO and so on.

Against such a backdrop, lesspublicised meetings of Wang Yi with S Jaishankar and Ajit Doval took place. The meeting with EAM lasted for three hours. What did Wang Yi and S. Jaishankar talk about? As it was anticipated, New Delhi would only reiterate its reservations on Beijing talking about Kashmir, and re-emphasise the urgency of resolving the border disputes. But they did talk about other issues too-trade, visa, Indian students, cooperation on health, Ukraine, Afghanistan and so on. India also raised the staggering trade deficit with China to the tune of \$103 billion and the nontariff barriers China imposes to isolate Indian companies. At any rate, China continues to hold the trade lever.

What is the way forward in India's bilateralism with China? While New Delhi is building itself and making strategic alliances vis-à-vis China, it is deeply worried about the stand-off and build-up at the border. Beijing considers QUAD, which includes India, as the Asian NATO and grudges India joining the Western bloc.

Wang Yi said India-China should come close. His assertion is that if India and China come on the same page, the entire world will have to notice it. The world cannot ignore the combined strength of India and China. But for that to happen, Beijing needs to have a demilitarised approach, avoid the policy of balance of terror and work towards a synergy between the countries. Certainly, the onus is on China, as the largest economy in the region, to lead in peace, se curity and co-existence.

In submission, one could say that New Delhi cannot ignore China, but cannot integrate with it. Both India and China should work in good faith and unite to make a better and more promising Asia. Chinese economy is strong, but will its political structure characterised by the dictatorial tendencies of its leader be conducive to Beijing's leadership role in the region?

In preparing for COVID-19 has taken lives, destroyed livelihoods, disrupted daily routines, and dominated political discussion around the world. As the acute phase of the pandemic comes to an end, we must evaluate what COVID-19 has revealed about the ability of democratic systems to respond to such emergencies.

There are several lessons to be learned from a crisis that has caused the death of over six million people and produced the deepest recession since World War II. Over the past year, Club de Madrid's Global Commission on Democracy and Emergencies brought together former heads of state and government, eminent experts, and civil-society leaders from around the world to discuss what COVID-19 has taught us, and how our countries can plan for future crises.

Just as no one ever steps into the same river twice, for it is not the same river and they are not the same person, no country ever experiences the same disaster twice. But learning from one emergency is essential to preparing for the next. Although pandemics are rare, epidemics, natural disasters, financial crises, and industrial accidents are regular occurrences. Governments, legislative bodies,

and international organisations must be equipped to promote resilience in the face of crisis.

For starters, governments must

elevate the status of emergency preparedness and work with their peers to embrace radical transparency, support responsible journalism and media, promote digital literacy, and work with civil-society organisations to debunk disinformation, especially online. They should engage with technology companies to solve problems arising from the digital environment and increase access to digital resources And, with COVID-19 having revealed serious gaps in social security systems, they also must advocate for better protections for vulnerable minorities, women, and young people.

In fact, government leaders should mobilise all available tools of fiscal policy to strengthen democratic resilience and improve equitv. At the same time, legislatures should evaluate their governments' COVID-19 response and recommend measures to improve performance in future emergencies. They should review their country's legal framework to ensure that how emergencies are defined adequately reflects current risks,

for declaring a state of emergency provide sufficient safeguards to mitigate the risk of abuse of power.

Legislatures also must ensure that their plans for emergency preparedness are robust enough to allow for effective oversight during future crises. These plans should include flexible rules of legislative procedure and embrace digital technologies to promote resilience and encourage citizen participation.

Judicial institutions, for their part, must ensure that the rule of law guides democracies' response to future emergencies. When the pandemic ends, courts will be called upon – as some already have – to scrutinise governments' actions against the criteria of necessity. proportionality, procedural fairness, and respect for fundamental rights. Courts must make sure that their emergency-preparedness plans allow for swift judicial oversight during times of crisis.

Civil society and the media bear most of the responsibility in a democracy for preventing the spread of disinformation. They also have the power to bring issues into the spotlight and act as a catalyst for emergency policies that better engage and meet the needs of underfuture emergencies, civil-society organisations should advocate for more public dialogue about critical risks and preventive action.

Lastly, multilateral organisations have a critical role to play, by coordinating lessons learned from member countries and strengthening shared values. International human-rights monitoring mechanisms can serve as a framework for upholding fundamental rights in countries' emergency response. Regional bodies that have instruments in place to protect democracy and the rule of law among their member states should reflect on how these tools might be used for regional oversight in emergencies.

Every democracy is different, and every emergency is different. But the most important lesson to be learned from the pandemic is that all democratic states have a responsibility, as they prepare for the next crisis, to safeguard their core values.

#### One nation, one entrance test

Sir, The National Testing Agency (NTA) has announced that central universities will now be required to consider scores from the Common University Entrance Test (CUET) for admission, instead of the traditional 12th-grade board exam results. UGC chairman M Jagadesh Kumar said that the endeavor is to ultimately reach the goal of "one nation, one entrance test." While it remains to be seen what the impact of the move will be, there are precedents to show how it may not necessarily be a good one. For one thing, it would further diminish the relevance of schools and the different pedagogical practices across boards. Second, homogenising an entrance test would make access to higher education difficult for students from marginalised backgrounds without the means to avail of coaching classes or extra resources that normally provide an advantage to their more privileged counterparts. On the other hand, stratospheric cut-off expectations from universities may now be obsolete. However, in a socio-cultural landscape rife with vast inequalities, a common entrance examination would increase competition and ensure educational access to those who can afford to spend the most time, money, and resources in training for the exam. The idea speaks to the general nature of competitive examinations in India, and the harmful impact they've had on young learners. The most notorious example of the same, of course, is the JEE for entry into the IITs. Coaching for JEE begins at a young age — and as competition increases, children are made to train for the exam at ever-younger ages. Coaching institutes, moreover, are prohibitively expensive and are a drain on students' creativity, freedom, and self-expression, as all identity or even learning is geared towards securing a seat in a college. 

the heart of Sundarpada, the 400year-old shrine, recently revamped for its preservation. sees thousands of devotees from across the state gather on the 10-day Makar Mela. The complex echoes with the breaking of thousands of coconuts offered by devotees. On the pious occasion of Deva Snana Poornima, Lord Dadhibamana is bathed with much festivity and fervour. Bhubaneswar's most celebrated festival, Mahashivratri, is celebrated here too. Devotees light lamps throughout the night on Sundareshwar temple premises and the Mahadeepa is lifted immediately following the

rituals at Lingaraj Temple. It is believed that Gokhibaba's consciousness nearby forests, helping villagers in every possible way, working towards keeping the village healthy, and meditation were part of his every day activities. Some of his said miraculous acts include finding people their lost goods, curing seemingly incurable diseases and friendliness from the wildest of animals.


One of the most famous incidents credited to the deity is also said to be the foundation of the communal harmony prevalent in the region. A local Muslim farmer was enraged at Gokhibaba for leaving the gate of his farmland open, as the latter used to bathe

advised him to break the boundaries and assured that not a single animal would intrude his land. Locals say they don't find even a cow in that piece of land, and have honoured the deity by naming the pool there 'Gokhichua'. During Makar Fest, hundreds of women carry water from the pool to His tomb as a bathing ritual. The fair also witnesses admirers from both the religions participating in various activities, sporting a beautiful miniature of a rather utopian India.

"His final day on the mortal realm established Him as an incarnation of God. Two days before, He had asked fel-

## 535 Ganjam high schools to go solar

POST NEWS NETWORK

Bhanjanagar, March 31: Schools in Ganjam district will harness solar energy to electrify their premises instead of using power from conventional energy sources.

The district administration has taken an initiative to make the high schools energy-independent by installing solar panels, Ganjam Collector Vijaya Amruta Kulange said.

The installation is set to be done from Friday by a Noida-based firm and likely to be completed in the next six months. There are 535 government high schools in the district, officials said.

The district administration will spend over ₹9 crore for the purpose.

Reports said 83 smart schools will be electrified in the first phase while 233 smart schools will be taken up in the second phase. Later, the rest of the schools will be electrified



with solar energy. The smaller schools will have solar power systems of 2kw while the bigger schools will be installed with 4kw solar panel

The district Collector talked to all concerned headmasters, block development officers (BDOs) and other officials in this regard through videoconferencing last week.

As part of this move, 25 high schools under Bhanjanagar block will be electrified through solar panels. The move, however, is likely to hit roadblocks as works on many of the schools upgraded to smart schools are yet to get completed.

Meanwhile, work on transformation of 11 schools into smart schools has started in the second phase in Bhanjanagar block. The state government is providing ₹45 lakh for upgradation of each school into a smart school. Moreover, those schools which require more funds will be assisted through block funds.

When contacted, Bhanjanagar BDO Anil Kumar Sethi said the schools will go solar for which funds will be made available from Mo School Abhivan and Corporate Social Responsibility initiatives. The district rural development agency will implement the project.

## 28 Malkangiri hosps win 'Kayakalp Award'



## 'No red' line for India's RS BIDS ADIEU TO 72 MPs **Russian oil imports: US**

Russia has long been India's biggest supplier

of defence equipment, despite growing purchases from the United States in the past decade. Defence analysts say Russian supplies are more cost-competitive and vital for India as it faces a superior Chinese military

New Delhi, March 31: The United States will not set any "red line" for India on its energy imports from Russia but does not want to see a "rapid acceleration" in purchases, a top US official said Thursday during a visit to New Delhi.

Lured by steep discounts following Western sanctions on Russian entities, India has bought at least 13 million barrels of Russian crude oil since the country invaded Ukraine in late February. That compared with some 16 million barrels for the whole of last year. data compiled by Reuters shows.

"Friends don't set red lines," Daleep Singh, US Deputy National Security Adviser for International Economics, told reporters, adding however that its partners in Europe and Asia had been urged to cut their reliance on "an unreliable energy supplier".

Singh spoke ahead of Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov's arrival in the Indian capital for a two-day trip.

Singh said the United States was ready to help India diversify its energy and defence supplies.

"We stand ready to help India diversify its energy resources, much like is the case for defence resources over a period of time. But there is no prohibition at present on energy imports from Russia," he said.

"What we would not like to see is a rapid acceleration of India's imports from Russia as it relates to energy or any other exports that are currently being prohibited by us or by other aspects of the international sanctions

He also said the United States would not like to see its allies helping resurrect the rouble, which nosedived immediately after the war began but has recovered in recent days.



New Delhi, March 31: The Rajya Sabha Thursday bid an emotional farewell to 72 members, including A K Antony, P Chidambaram, Anand Sharma, Jairam Ramesh and Subramanian Swamy, whose terms are coming to an end, with Prime Minister Narendra Modi urging them to take their experience across the country.

The terms of Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharman, Commerce and Industry Minister Pivush Goyal and Minority Affairs Minister Mukhtar Abbas Naqvi in the Upper House are coming to an end as well. However, they are likely to be re-elected.

Members cutting across party lines shared memories of their retiring colleagues and hoped that they would return to the House. While most MPs were emotional. there were some lighter moments as well.

Chairman M Venkaiah Naidu asked the lawmakers to desist from disrupting law-making bodies while upholding the honour and privilege bestowed on them by people, while Leader of Opposition Mallikarjun Kharge emphasised that the numbers on the Opposition benches may be less, but they have strength in their argument. Sixty five speakers, including those who

Chidambaram, Patel and Sibal were not present in the House when the prime minister, the chairman and the leader of opposition spoke in the morning session.

New Delhi, March 31: Riding on the second heat wave continuing over large parts of northwest and central India, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) Thursday said for April, similar above normal maximum temperatures are likely to be recorded in most parts of northwest and central India and some parts of northeast India

Normal to below normal maximum temperatures are likely over remaining parts of the country, the IMD said, adding that above normal minimum temperatures are likely over most parts of northwest, central and northeast India while normal to below normal temperature are likely over most parts of northwest, central and northeast India.



March witnessed two spells of heat waves, first between March 11-21 while second started March 26 and is still continuing

Normal to below normal minimum temperatures are likely over the south peninsular India, eastern parts of central India and extreme southern part of northeast India. IMD Director General Mrutyunjay Mohapatra said while announcing the Outlook for Temperature and Rainfall for April.

Meanwhile, except coastal peninsular areas, almost all of India received deficit rainfall in March. IMD said, the rainfall in April averaged over the country is most likely to be normal (89-111 per cent of Long Period Average). Below normal rainfall is most likely to occur over most areas of northwest and central India and some parts of northeast India. Normal to above normal rainfall is likely over many parts of south Peninsula, adjoining areas of west central India and some parts of northeast India, he said.

However, advisory in respect of health and hygiene protocols, including wearing of masks at all times, hand hygiene and sanitisation of public places shall continue to be strictly observed until further order," it stated.

Meanwhile, with 1,225 new coro navirus infections reported in a day, India's Covid tally rose to 4,30,24,440, while the active cases dipped to 14,307, the Union health ministry said.

The death toll climbed to 5,21,129 with 28 fresh fatalities, the data updated at 8 am showed.



#### Biden tapping oil reserve for 6 months to control gas prices

Washington, March 31: President Joe Biden is ordering the release of 1 million barrels of oil per day from the nation's strategic petroleum reserve for six months, the White House said Thursday, in a bid to control energy prices that have spiked after the U.S. and allies imposed steep sanctions on Russia over its invasion of Ukraine. The White House said Biden is

also calling on Congress to impose financial penalties on oil and gas companies that lease public lands but aren't producing. And he intends to invoke the Defense Production Act to encourage the mining of critical minerals for batteries in electric vehicles, part of a broader push to shift toward cleaner energy sources and reduce the use of fossil fuels.

The actions demonstrate forcefully that oil remains a key vulnerability for the US at home and abroad. Higher prices have hurt Biden's approval domestically, while also adding billions of oil-export dollars to the Russian war chest as it wages war on Ukraine.

# Heavy fighting rages near Kyiv

Kyiv, March 31: Heavy fighting raged on the outskirts of Kyiv and other zones Thursday amid indications the Kremlin is using talk of de-escalation as cover while regrouping and resupplying its forces and redeploying them for a steppedup offensive in eastern Ukraine.

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky said in an early morning video address that Ukraine is seeing "a buildup of Russian forces for new strikes on the Donbas, and we are preparing for that.'

Meanwhile, a convoy of buses headed to Mariupol in another bid to evacuate people from the besieged port city after the Russian military agreed to a limited ceasefire in the area. And a new round of talks aimed at stopping the fighting was scheduled for Friday. The Red Cross said its teams

were headed for Mariupol with relief and medical supplies and hoped to help pull civilians out of the beleaguered city. Tens of thousands have managed to get out in the past few weeks by way of humanitarian corridors, reducing the city's population from a prewar 430,000 to an estimated 100,000, but other efforts have been thwarted by continued Russian attacks.

At the same time, Russian forces shelled suburbs of the capital that Ukraine recently retook control of, a regional official said, two days after the Kremlin announced it would significantly scale back operations near Kyiv and the northern city of Chernihiv to "increase mutual trust and create conditions for further negotiations

Britain's Defence Ministry also

confirmed "significant Russian shelling and missile strikes" around Chernihiv. The area's governor, Viacheslav Chaus, said Russian troops were on the move but may not be withdrawing. Russia's Defense Ministry also reported new strikes on Ukrainian fuel stores late Wednesday, and Ukrainian officials said there were artillery barrages in and around the northeastern city of Kharkiv over the past day

Despite the fighting raging in those areas, the Russian military said it committed to a cease-fire along the route from Mariupol to the Ukraine-held city of Zaporizhzhia. Ukrainian Deputy Prime Minister Iryna Vereshchuk said 45 buses would be sent to collect civilians who have suffered some of the worst privations of the war. Food, water and medical supplies have all run low during a weeks long blockade and bombardment of the city. Civilians who have managed to leave have typically done so using private cars, but the number of drivable vehicles left in the city has dwindled and fuel

"It's desperately important that this operation takes place," the Red Cross said in a statement. "The lives of tens of thousands of people in Mariupol depend on it.'

As the new evacuation attempt was announced, evidence emerged that a Red Cross warehouse in the city had been struck earlier this month amid intense Russian

Islamabad, March 31: Pakistan's top security body Thursday decided to issue a strong demarche to a country, that it did not name, over a "threatening letter" - purportedly showing evidence of a foreign conspiracy to oust Imran Khan government -- and expressed concern at the undiplomatic communication and "interference" in its internal affairs.

Prime Minister Imran Khan

chaired the 37th meeting of the National Security Committee (NSC) at Prime Minister's House to discuss a controversial letter sent by the Pakistan ambassador in that country, which according to Prime Minister Khan threatened to remove him from office.

The meeting was attended by Federal Ministers of Defence, Energy, Information and Broadcasting, Interior, Finance, Human Rights, Planning, Development and Special Initiatives, Chairman Joint Chiefs of Staff Committee, Services Chiefs, National Security Adviser and senior officers.

According to a statement issued by the Prime Minister's Office (PMO), NSA Moeed Yusuf briefed the committee about the "formal communication of a senior official of a foreign country" to Pakistan's ambassador in that country in a formal meeting which was

subsequently conveyed.

"The committee expressed grave concern at the communication, terming the language used by the foreign official as undiplomatic," according to the statement. "The Committee concluded that the communication amounted to blatant interference in the internal affairs of Pakistan by the country in question, which was unacceptable under any circumstances." The NSC decided that the protest should be launched with that country.

"The Committee decided that Pakistan will issue a strong demarche to the country in question both in Islamabad and in the country's capital through proper channel in keeping with diplomatic norms," according to the statement.

The participants also endorsed the Cabinet's decision in the Special Cabinet meeting held on March 30 to take the parliament into confidence through an in-camera briefing of the National Security Committee of the Parliament.

The meeting comes a day after Khan shared some content of a letter - purportedly showing evidence of a foreign conspiracy to oust his government - with his cabinet members and a selected group of journalists. Khan waved the purported letter at a public rally on March 27 and claimed that a foreign conspiracy was afoot to remove him from power.

## Will Smith could face Academy expulsion

Los Angeles, March 31: "Disciplinary proceedings" are underway against Will Smith for slapping Chris Rock at the Oscars, said the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences, adding that the actor was asked to leave the awards ceremony after the incident but refused to do so. According to The Hollywood

Reporter, the Academy Wednesday

said through his actions Smith violated its Standards of Conduct, "including inappropriate physical contact, abusive or threatening behavior, and compromising the integrity of the Academv" In a statement released after a Board of Governors meeting, the institu-

tion said the actor could face suspension, expulsion or other sanctions if the board chooses to take action at the next scheduled meeting April 18. Smith will also receive 15 days' notice of a vote as well as an opportunity

to be heard by written response be-

forehand. "Things unfolded in a way

we could not have anticipated. While we would like to clarify that Mr. Smith was asked to leave the ceremony and refused, we also recognize we could have handled the situation differently," the Academy said.

The statement from the Academy didn't provide details about who asked Smith to leave. The Academy also apologized directly to Rock in the statement, as well as nominees, guests and viewers. While presenting the Oscar for best feature documentary on Sunday night, Rock cracked a joke about Smith's actor-wife Jada Pinkett Smith, who currently sports a shaved head due to alopecia. After apparently laughing at the quip, Smith walked up to the stage to slap Rock, which will go down as one of the most shocking incidents in Oscars history

Smith later went on to win the best actor award for his performance in "King Richard". In his maiden Oscar acceptance speech, he apologised to the Academy and fellow nominees but didn't mention Rock. After outrage and many condemnations, including from the Academy, Smith took to Instagram on Monday to publicly apologise to Rock. "Violence in all of its forms is poisonous and destructive My behavior at last night's Academy Awards was unacceptable and in excusable... I would like to publicly apologize to you, Chris, I was out of line and I was wrong," he wrote.

Arguing for the transfer, the prose-

cutor said that because the arrest warrants cannot be executed and defense statements cannot be taken, the case would remain inconclusive in Turkey. The development, comes as Turkey has been trying to normalise its relationship with Saudi Arabia, which reached an all-time low following Khashoggi's grisly killing.

Turkish Foreign Minister Mevlut Cavusoglu said in an interview on Thursday that Saudi authorities were more cooperative on judicial issues with Turkey, but did not elaborate.



#### Infra sector output rises by 5.8% in Feb

New Delhi: Production of eight infrastructure sectors expanded by 5.8 per cent in February against a contraction of 3.3 per cent in the same month last year on better show by coal, natural gas, refinery products and cement industries, according to official data released Thursday. Production of crude oil and fertiliser declined in February this year. The core sector industries had grown by 4 per cent in January. The growth rate of the eight infrastructure sectors - coal, crude oil, natural gas, refinery products, fertilisers, steel, cement and electricity - stood at 11 per cent during April-February this fiscal, as against a negative growth rate of 8.1 per cent during the same period last fiscal. According to the data, production of coal rose by 6.6 per cent, natural gas by 12.5 per cent, refinery products by 8.8 per cent, and cement by 5 per cent in February.

#### ONGC share sale fully subscribed

New Delhi: The government's 1.5 per cent stake sale in ONGC got fully subscribed, ensuring ₹3,000 crore to the exchequer that is to be accounted for in the next fiscal. The government is selling up to 1.5 per cent of its stake in the country's top oil and gas producer ONGC at a floor price of ₹159 per share. The Offer-For-Sale (OFS), which opened for retail investors on Thursday, received bids for over 1.33 crore shares. This represents 71 per cent of the total issue size of over 1.88 crore shares. The unsubscribed portion of retail investors will be allotted to institutional buyers, who Wednesday put in bids worth ₹4,854 crore, which is threeand-half times their quota.

#### **GAIL to buy back** 5.7 crore shares

New Delhi: GAIL (India) Ltd Thursday said it will buy back about 5.7 crore shares for ₹1,083 crore as it looks to use its healthy balance sheet to reward shareholders for the second time in as many vears. GAIL had in 2020-21 spent ₹1.046.35 crore on a similar share buyback. The board of directors of GAIL approved the "buyback of about 5.70 crore shares at the rate of ₹190 per share aggregating to about ₹1,083 crores (excluding taxes)," the company said in a statement. The buyback price of equity shares is at a 24 per cent premium over Wednesday's close price at NSE.

## Q3 CAD widens to 2.7% of GDP

Mumbai, March 31: India's current account deficit widened in the three months to December, mainly on the back the higher trade deficit, the Reserve Bank of India said Thursday.

New Delhi: The Centre's fiscal deficit at the end of February stood at 82.7 per cent of the full year budget target, mainly on account of higher expenditure, according to government data released Thursday. New Delhi, March 31: The government Thursday kept interest rates on small savings schemes, including NSC and PPF, unchanged for the first quarter of 2022-23 due to an elevated level of inflation. The interest rate has not been revised since the first quarter of 2020-21.

Public Provident Fund (PPF) and National Savings Certificate (NSC) will continue to carry an annual interest rate of 7.1 per cent and 6.8 per cent, respectively, in the first quarter.

"The rate of interest on various small savings schemes for the first quarter of the financial year 2022-23, starting from April 1, 2022, and ending on June 30, 2022, shall remain unchanged from the current rates applicable for the fourth quarter (January 1, 2022, to March 31, 2022) for FY 2021-22," the finance ministry said in a notification.

Interest rates for small savings schemes are notified on a quar-

The one-year term deposit scheme will continue to earn an interest rate of 5.5 per cent in the first quarter of the next fiscal, while the girl child savings scheme Sukanya Samriddhi Yojana account will earn 7.6 per cent.

The interest rate on the fivevear senior citizens' savings scheme will be retained at 7.4 per cent. The interest on the senior citizens scheme is paid quarterly.

The interest rate on savings de-



posits will continue to be 4 per cent per annum.

Term deposits of one to five years will fetch an interest rate in the range of 5.5-6.7 per cent, to be paid quarterly, while the interest rate on five-year recurring deposits will earn a higher interest of 5.8 per

Recently, the Provident Fund (PF) rate was reduced to a fourdecade low of 8.1 per cent for 2021-22 from 8.5 per cent. Defending the proposal to cut

interest rate paid on employees provident fund deposits, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, earlier this month, said the rate is dictated by today's realities where interest rate on other small saving instruments was even lower.

Sitharaman had also cited the comparative prevailing interest rates of other schemes saying Sukanya Samriddhi Yojana offers 7.6 per cent, Senior Citizen saving scheme (7.4 per cent) and PPF (7.1 per cent) while SBI's 5-10 year fixed deposits gives 5.50 per cent.

## SpiceJet settles \$24 million Natural gas price doubled to record levels dispute with Credit Suisse

New Delhi, March 31: SpiceJet Thursday said it has settled its commercial dispute worth around \$24 million with Swiss financial services company Credit Suisse, with the low-cost airline agreeing to pay the settlement amount over a mutually agreed period of time.

'With regard to the dispute pending between Credit Suisse and SpiceJet Limited, we would like to inform that the parties have now reached an in-principle commercial settlement of the dispute and the process of documentation is underway," SpiceJet said in a

Credit Suisse had filed a case in the Madras High Court alleging that SpiceJet failed to honour its commitment to pay the bills for over \$24 million raised by it towards maintenance, repairing, and

overhauling of the aircraft engines and components.

The high court in December 2021 ordered winding up the airline. SpiceJet then moved the Supreme Court, which January 28 stayed the high court order and granted three weeks to the budget carrier to resolve the commercial dispute. 'SpiceJet had already deposited

\$5 million on the direction of the Hon'ble Madras High Court in the Credit Suisse case and there is no adverse financial liability on the company," the statement said.

The settlement involves payment of settlement amount over a mutually agreed period of time, it mentioned. As per the statement, the settlement with Credit Suisse follows SpiceJet's successful settlements with De Havilland Aircraft of Canada Limited. Boeing, aircraft lessors CDB Aviation and Avolon.

months beginning April 1. Petrol and diesel prices have been raised nine times in the last 10 days, totalling ₹6.4 per litre while cooking gas LPG rates too have gone up by

₹50 per cylinder. The latest gas price hike will further fuel inflation.

New Delhi, March 31: India's top retailer, Reliance, has privately defended an abrupt takeover of the stores of debt-laden rival Future Retail, saying mounting dues of \$634 million compelled it to act beyond expectations, a company letter shows.

The takeover was part of the race to dominate a \$900-billion retail sector that set off a bitter dispute in which India's Supreme Court will decide whether Reliance or Amazon.com Inc gets to scoop up Future's assets.

The March 8 letter, seen by Reuters, reveals for the first time Reliance's stance on the events of

That move stunned not only Future but also Amazon, which has cited violation of certain contracts to legally block, since 2020, a \$3.4-billion deal between the two Indian giants.

These steps included financial support of ₹48 billion (\$634 million), comprising 11 billion rupees of unpaid lease rentals and ₹37 bil-



The No.16 seed has made the semifinals at the Miami Open, benefiting from a second consecutive abrupt ending. She won her quarterfinal against fifth-seeded Paula Badosa Wednesday, after the Spaniard retired five games into the first set.

Pegula has played four matches so far in this tournament, needing only 5 1/2 sets to record those victories. She had a first-round bye, won her next two matches in straight sets and her fourthround match ended when unseeded Anhelina Kalinina retired after Pegula won the first set 6-0. Then came Wednesday, when Badosa bowed out down 4-1.

Badosa — who was No.71 in the world rankings at this time last year — will climb to a career-best No.3 when the computer numbers are updated Monday. She would have gone to No.2 had she beaten Pegula.

Pegula will next face No.2 Iga Swiatek — who becomes No.1 in the world rankings next week in Thursday night's semifinals. Swiatek ousted No.28 Petra Kvitova 6-3, 6-3 in the last women's quar-

The other women's semifinal is Thursday afternoon, when No.22 Belinda Bencic will face unseeded Naomi Osaka.

The quick end of the Pegula-Badosa match meant the stadium court sat empty for nearly two hours, until No.9 Jannik Sinner — a finalist in Miami last year — faced unseeded Francisco Cerundolo in a men's quarterfinal. And after 22 minutes, that match was over — also in just five games. Cerundolo advanced when Sinner, down 4-1, retired with a blister on his right foot.

In the late men's quarterfinal, sixth-seeded Casper Ruud earned a semifinal matchup with Cerundolo. Ruud beat an ailing No.2 seed Alexander Zverev 6-3, 1-6, 6-3.

#### City, Liverpool wade into title-race finale

London, March 31: The final international break is over. The remaining games are right there in front of them. The starting gun is about to be fired on another sprint to the line between Manchester City and Liverpool in the Premier

Saturday marks the beginning of a six-week fight for the title between two teams that have dominated English soccer over the past five years and set a new bar when it comes to what's required to win the league.

And here they are again, back as the top two and separated by just one point with nine matches to go — one of which sees them face each other in what could be the defining match of the sea-

City, the defending champion, holds the lead as it has done since the end of December — but an advantage that was as large as 14 points in mid-January, when Liverpool had games in hand, has shrunk to such an extent that Jurgen Klopp's team might be some people's favorites.

Liverpool have fewer losses—two—and is on a nine-match winning run in the league. Heading into April, Liverpool has already won the League Cup and is still alive in the FA Cup and the Champions League. The unprecedented quadruple, amazingly, remains on.

City have won three of the last four league titles — and five of the last 10 — and has pedigree in mounting strong finishes. Their players know how to finish the job off.

Crucially, City have home advantage in their April 10 showdown with Liverpool at Etihad Stadium. Avoid defeat and few would be surprised if Guardiola's team wins its other matches.

It promises to be a riveting finale between two closely matched teams. City is at home and unbeaten in the teams' last four meetings. Liverpool has the momentum. It's a tough one to call and a draw might be the best bet. That would suit City more, keeping the destiny of the title in its hands, and Guardiola has curbed his attacking instincts to set his team up more compactly in the big games over the last two seasons.

If, however, the match turns out being more chaotic, Liverpool has the firepower to pull off victory. The availability of Alexander-Arnold, Liverpool's most creative player despite being a right back, could be key.

The Indian team also played two warm-up matches against England and Netherlands with both the games ending in a draw.












## LEWIS, DE KOCK LIFT LSG

While head coach Anil Kumble would expect more contributions from the middle order, the likes of Odean Smith and Shahrukh Khan proved their mettle when they steered the side home against RCB and would be keen to be among the runs again. ## Powar's term ends as eves team coach

New Delhi, March 31: Indian women's team head coach Ramesh Powar's contract has expired at the conclusion of the side's campaign in the ICC World Cup and he might have to reapply for the post as per BCCI rules.

The disastrous World Cup campaign could also lead to a radical shift in women's cricket, with National Cricket Academy (NCA) head VVS Laxman taking an active part in mentoring the next batch of the country's cricketers. The team failed to make the semifinals of the ongoing tournament.

Powar had replaced WV Raman, who had guided the team into the T20 World Cup final in 2020. "Powar's contract was till World Cup. There is no provision for extension. So the entire process starts with applications and interviews. Powar can certainly reapply and CAC

(Cricket Advisory Committee), as per the constitution, will take a call," a senior BCCI source told this agency on the condition of anonymity.

Eyebrows were raised after Raman wasn't given a second term after a good show with the team and Powar, who had a chequered history with skipper Mithali Raj, was brought back.
