Held by Punjab cops, 'rescued' by Delhi cops

New Delhi/Chandigarh: Delhi BJP leader Tajinder Pal Singh Bagga was arrested by Punjab Police from his home, stopped in Haryana while being taken to Punjab and brought back to the national capital by Delhi Police hours later, on a Friday of dramatic developments that drew in the police of three states and led to a BJP-AAP slugfest. The BJP accused Punjab Police of 'abducting' its leader, who has been vocal in his criticism of Arvind

Kejriwal, and accused the Delhi CM of pursuing vendetta. The AAP rejected the charge and said the Delhi BJP spokesperson was arrested for allegedly stoking communal tension in Punjab. Delhi Police registered a case of kidnapping based on a complaint by Bagga's father Preetpal Singh. AAP rules Delhi and Punjab while BJP governs Haryana. However, Delhi Police comes under Union Home Ministry and MORE P7 not the AAP-led Delhi government.

Loudspeakers in mosques not fundamental right: HC

Prayagraj, May 6: The Allahabad High Court has dismissed a petition that sought the installation of loudspeakers in mosques, saying it is "not a fundamental right."

A division bench comprising Justice Vivek Kumar Birla and Justice Vikas said: "The law says that it is not a constitutional right to use loudspeakers in mosques.' The petition, filed by Irfan,

challenged the order issued by the Bisauli Sub-Divisional Magistrate (SDM) of Badaun district December 3, 2021.

The SDM had earlier refused permission to install a loudspeaker at Noori Masjid in Dhoranpur village for 'azaan.' In his plea, the petitioner said that the SDM's order was 'illegal' and that it "violates the fundamental rights and legal rights.'

The controversy over the use of loudspeakers at religious places sparked across several states, including Maharashtra and Uttar Pradesh. Recently, Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath said that the sound from loudspeakers at religious places should not be heard outside the premises.

Three militants killed near Amarnath route

Srinagar: Three Hizbul Mujahideen terrorists, including a self-styled commander of the outfit, were killed in an encounter with security forces near the route of the annual Amarnath Yatra in Anantnag district of Jammu and Kashmir Friday, police said. Based on specific inputs about the presence of terrorists in the Srichand Top forest area in Pahalgam, Anantnag, security forces

launched a cordon and search operation there, a police official said. He said the search operation turned into an encounter after the hiding terrorists fired at the security forces. In retaliation, three terrorists were killed, the official said.

State braces for cyclone

Low pressure to intensify into cyclone by May 8 System likely to reach north Andhra and Odisha coasts May 10 - Heavy rain likely in Ganjam, Khurda, Puri and Jagatsinghpur districts

Bhubaneswar; May 6: A low-pressure area formed over the South Andaman Sea Friday is likely to intensify into a cyclonic storm May 8 and reach Andhra-Odisha shores by May 10, IMD Director-General Mrutyunjay Mohapatra said.

The low-pressure area is very likely to move northwestwards and intensify into a depression by Saturday. The system is likely to further intensify into a cyclonic storm by Sunday evening, he said.

"We have not yet made any forecast on where it will make landfall. We have also not mentioned anything on the possible wind speed during the landfall," Mohapatra said. "When the system approaches the coast, we can say where it will make landfall."

Under the impact of the weather system, light to moderate rainfall is very likely at many places over the districts of coastal Odisha and heavy rainfall is very likely to occur at a few places over the districts of Ganjam, Khurda, Puri

Govt plea for maritime varsity in Odisha

Bhubaneswar, May 6: With an aim to boost maritime trade, the state government Friday urged the Centre for establishment of Indian Maritime University in Odisha.

Transport and Commerce Minister Padmanabha Behera raised this demand during the third meeting of the National Sagarmala Apex Committee (NSAC) held under the chairmanship of Union Minister for Ports, Shipping and Waterways, Sarbananda Sonowal, in New Delhi. Maritime transport is very

much important for the economic development of our country. About 95 per cent of India's trade by volume and 70 per cent by value is being carried out through maritime transport, which shows the importance of ports and their contribution in sustaining the growth of the Indian economy, Behera said.

"The establishment of a Maritime University is necessary

to facilitate and promote maritime studies, training and research," Behera added.

He urged the Centre to help Odisha establish the university for the development of maritime sector in the east coast of India.

The minister further said the state government has received a proposal for setting up of ship building and ship recycling industries at Chandabali in Bhadrak district.

Similarly, Odisha has six national waterways (NW-5, 14, 22, 23, 64 & 96). At present, the NW-5 is under active mode of being developed by the Inland Waterways Authority of India (IWAI), he pointed out.

Six investment proposals worth ₹493.62cr get nod

Bhubaneswar, May 6: The State Level Single Window Clearance Authority (SLSWCA), chaired by Chief Secretary Suresh Chandra Mahapatra, Friday gave in principle approval to six investment proposals worth Rs 493.62 crore that would generate jobs for around 1,317 people in Odisha.

Jatia Steel Limited's proposal to set up a 2,50,000 MT TMT rebar and 2,50,000 MT wire rod mill at Kalinga Nagar in Jajpur got the SLSWCA go ahead. With an investment of Rs 125 crore, the project would generate employment opportunities for over 150 people. The committee approved a downstream steel unit project of Sarangi Metal Works International Private Limited at Jajpur's Kalinga Nagar with an investment of Rs 65.37 crore. The project would generate jobs for around 568 people.

Overcast skies after nor'westers bring breather for state

Bhubaneswar, May 6: Overcast skies prevailed across Odisha Friday as nor'westers in the previous night took the mercury level down by several notches in most parts of the state, the Met office said.

The maximum temperature was below normal in many areas, and only six weather stations, as compared to 13 on the previous day, recorded a temperature of 40 degrees Celsius or more, the Bhubaneswar Meteorological Centre said.

There will be no large change in the maximum temperature during the next four-five days

The highest temperature in the state was in Bolangir as the district headquarters and Titlagarh recorded 41.2 degrees Celsius each.

The temperature was below normal by four notches each to settle at 33.5 degrees Celsius in the capital and 34 in Cuttack, the weather office said. Nor'westers with gusty winds of 50-65 kmph and moderate to heavy rainfall occurred in several districts of the state Thursday evening, it said. Khurda town received 86 mm of rainfall the previous day, the highest in the state, while there was downpour also in Nayagarh and Ganjam cities. Light to moderate rain can occur in the state Saturday due to the southwesterly winds from the Bay of Bengal, the Met office said. There will be no large change in the maximum temperature during the next four-five days.

AIIMS Bhubaneswar, Jodhpur counsels summoned by SC

New Delhi, May 6: The Supreme Court Friday summoned the counsels of AIIMS, Bhubaneswar and AIIMS, Jodhpur to appear before it in a petition challenging the existing system for institutional preference in postgraduate admissions.

Odisha logs 14 new Cov cases

Bhubaneswar, May 6: Odisha recorded 14 new Covid cases Friday, while there was no new fatality for the fourth consecutive day, the state Health department said in a bulletin.

There are 99 active cases and 14 more patients have recovered from the disease in the last 24 hours, according to the bulletin. The coastal state's daily test positivity rate stood at 0.09 per cent and two children were among the newly infected. Out of the total 14 new infections, eight were reported from quarantine centres while six persons contracted the virus locally. Gajapati district registered the highest number of new cases with three persons testing positive for the disease. It was followed by Bolangir, Kandhamal and Khurda districts with two new infections each Other districts that reported fresh Covid-19 cases include: Bargarh, Deogarh, Jajpur, Nuapada and Sambalpur (one each). The new cases were detected after testing 15,288 samples in the last 24 hours. The state had logged 18 cases Thursday. Odisha's Covid death toll remained at 9,126. A total of 53 patients have died of comorbidities so far. The state has reported 12,88,117 cases to date. The State Pool did not report any new case of persons coming from outside Odisha and testing positive for the disease. A total of 3,13,95,428 swab samples have been cumulatively tested so far. Meanwhile, state Health Minister Naba Kishore Das has directed the department to take special measures for screening passengers who are returning from the National Capital Region (NCR) by trains and flights as cases are rising there.

GPS satellites may warn of tsunamis faster than seismic sensors

HOW IT WORKS

PS satellites orbiting the Earth may be more effective and much faster than the seismic sensors in detecting tsunamis, finds a study.

The method could serve as an effective warning system for countries worldwide, said the researchers at the University College London, UK.

Tsunami waves are low in deep water but can travel at the speed of a jet, up to 800 kilometres an hour in a deep sea, and as they enter shallow waters, they slow down, growing in height.

Though the waves are typically a few centimetres high. it nonetheless causes a disturbance in the Earth's upper atmosphere by pushing up air and creating an acoustic wave that is amplified as it goes higher.

This acoustic wave can reach 300 km high in the ionosphere, in about seven minutes, and the depression in electron density that occurs as a consequence could be detected via satellite



signals in 10 to 15 minutes, the researchers found.

As the density of electrons in the area is reduced, it affects radio signals sent by GPS satellites to GPS receivers on the ground, delaying or speeding up different parts of the signal, or changing the signal's direction, depending on frequency, the team explained in the paper published in Natural Hazards and Earth System Sciences.

While some tsunamis reach coasts in under 10 minutes, the researchers pointed out that the method could also be used to predict second or third waves, helping determine whether a tsunami warning should be cancelled or maintained after the first wave.

"Our study demonstrates a new method of detecting tsunamis that is low-cost, as it relies on existing GPS networks, and could be implemented worldwide, complementing other ways of detecting tsunamis and improving the accuracy of warning systems," said Professor Serge Guillas from UCL

For the study, researchers from UCL and universities in Japan looked at GPS data at the time of the devastating 2011 Tohoku-Oki earthquake and tsunami.

They found that a tsunami warning could have been issued with confidence within 15 minutes of the earthquake occurring - that is, at least 10 minutes prior to the first tsunami hitting Japan's east coast.

They also found that a warning could have been issued using data from only 5 per cent of Japan's 1.200 GPS receivers - meaning that the method could be used in countries with a sparser GPS network than Japan's.

The team said the next step in the research will be to investigate this further to see if the method could be used for more precise predictions of tsunami size and range.

Promising to resolve the marital dispute, one day her motherin-law took the victim to SK Shoraff, a Muslim sorcerer. Shoraff forced

failing which her husband might die and evil things will happen. Later, after a few weeks, her modesty for 80 days.

Last week, the sorcerer forgot his mobile phone in the room after sexually abusing her, the complainant alleged. Taking advantage, the woman called up her parents, who had earlier lodged a missing complaint.

Her parents informed Morada police, who rushed to the spot and rescued the victim and her child. But, the sorcerer managed to give the police a slip. The victim has sustained injuries because of the sorcerer's torture. The accused has also assaulted her son, causing fracture in his hand.

A case has been registered under Section 498-A, 294, 323, 342, 417, 109, 376(2)(n), 506 and 34 of IPC, and Sec 4 of the Dowry Prohibition Act 1961 and Sec 5 and Sec 6 of the Odisha Prevention of Witch-hunting Act 2013 against her husband, mother-in-law, father-in-law, brotherin-law and the tantrik, police said.

17-time cost overrun in dam project

Berhampur, May 6: Tardy pace of the Ghatkeswar multipurpose irrigation project work in Ganjam district has escalated its cost by over 17 times, a report said.

According to sources, the then Chief Minister Janaki Ballabh Patnaik had laid the foundation stone for the project in tribal-dominated Kankia-Tamana area under Berhampur sub-division in 1987. Though 35 years have passed, the project is vet to see the light of day. Its initial cost was estimated at ₹10 crore, but it has now escalated to ₹172 crore – over 17 times of the original estimate. Notably, Chief Secretary Suresh Chandra Mahapatra, 5T Secretary VK Pandian, additional chief secretary of the Water Resources department Anu Garg visited the spot and took stock of the progress of the project about a week ago. The review revealed the whopping cost overrun.

The delay in the construction work is attributed to the delay in granting of environmental clearance by the Union Forest and Environment Ministry.

Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik laid the foundation stone of the project again during his the third term. Initially, displacement posed a setback for the proj ect. People of Sarakote and other tribal villages faced issues of displacement and rehabilitation. The government resolved the issues in a phase manner.

The work gathered pace since 2020 and the government has set a target to complete the project by December, 2022. The Chief Secretary had directed the construction agency to expedite the work. The dam is being constructed across Ghadaka creek near Kankia-Tamana under Kukudakhandi block of Digapahandi assembly constituency After completion of the project, it would irrigate 500 acres of land in Kukudakhandi and Rangeilunda blocks. apart from providing drinking water to 75,000 people of Gosaninuagaon area. The Water Resources department is executing the project.

It was in the first week of July 2019 when the project was reviewed for the first time at a meeting presided over by then revenue divisional commissioner (southern range) Chandrasekhar Kumar in the presence of then Ganjam Collector VK Pandian, and MLAs of Khallikote, Chhatrapur, Gopalpur and Berhampur. A decision was taken to adequately compensate the land losers and the displaced along with their proper rehabilitation.

Several other projects like Baghua, Baghalati and others have remained incomplete with their costs escalating over the years.

overrides politics erala Chief Secretary VP Joy's recent visit to Gandhinagar to study the dashboard system for e-governance in Gujarat is full of portent for good governance if picked up by other states. The dashboard monitoring system was started in 2019 when Vijay Rupani

was the Chief Minister. Apparently, Joy was impressed with it and said it was good for monitoring the delivery of services and collecting citizens' feedback. It is evident that Joy's visit had the support of the Left Democratic Front (LDF) government of Kerala, even though opposition parties in the state read 'politics' in the visit. But clearly, the Pinarayi Vijayan government believes that adopting e-technology for good governance transcends partisan politics.

Sources have informed DKB that the decision to study the 'Gujarat model' was taken after a recent meeting between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Vijayan in the capital. After returning to Kerala, the Chief Minister directed Joy to study the system.

Blame it on idealism

After resigning from the civil service in 2019, Kashmiri IAS officer Shah Faesal is back in babudom and now blames his misplaced idealism for his action. Sources have informed DKB that the Centre has accepted Faesal's application for



withdrawing his resignation and reinstated him in service early last month. Faesal was the first Kashmiri to top the civil services exam and served in the state in various capacities including in the education and power development departments. He had resigned in protest after the Centre repealed J&K's special status.

After a failed attempt at forming a political party, the Jammu & Kashmir People's Movement, Faesal had tried to go to the United States but was detained at Delhi airport and sent back to Srinagar and placed under detention, which was revoked four months later. For some time, he had been dropping hints of his return to bureaucracy. The Home Ministry and the Department of Personnel and Training (DopT) accepted his plea and reinstated him. His new posting will be announced soon.

Interestingly, another IAS officer Kannan Gopinathan, from Kerala too had resigned from service to protest against the abrogation of Article 370. He has become an activist

Before her elevation, Singh was Member, Audit and Judicial. Even in the run-up to the appointment, many believed that Singh had a slight edge over her rival for having held two additional charges. Moreover,

she is in the good books of the powers that be. The new chairperson has also edged out two other senior CBDT members Anuja Sarangi and Nitin Gupta, for the coveted post

Agnotology

A gnotology is the study of culturally induced ignorance. Historians of science have tended to focus on the processes by which scientific knowledge gets accepted. In recent decades, some scholars have come to see that processes that impede or prevent acceptance of scientific findings are also important. Such processes include the very human desire to ignore unpleasant facts, media neglect of topics, corporate or government secrecy, and misrepresentation for a commercial or political end. They often generate controversy, much of it ill-informed. Examples include the health implications of tobacco and of genetically modified plants, the safety of nuclear power, the environmental consequences of hydraulic fracturing (fracking), and the existence or extent of man-made climate change. The word's earliest appearance seems to have been in a book of 1995, The Cancer Wars: How Politics Shapes What We Know and Don't Know About Cancer. This was by Robert Proctor, a historian of science at Stanford University in California. He coined it from the classical Greek agnosis, not knowing, plus the suffix -(o)logy, a subject of study, from Greek logos, word or speech.

Cachinnatory

Cachinnatory refers to loud or immoderate laughter. Though this may seem to be celebrating boisterous high spirits, it dates from the early nineteenth century, at a time when gentlemen in England did not laugh out loud, at least not in public. It has about it a sense of the distaste we feel when persons nearby are carousing too loudly for comfort. That master of the second-rate novel, Sir Edward Bulwer-Lytton, was a great user of the word and illustrated its exuberance in his Paul Clifford of 1842: "If Paul's comrade laughed at first, he now laughed ten times more merrily than ever. He threw his full length of limb upon a neighbouring sofa, and literally rolled with cachinnatory convulsions; nor did his risible emotions subside until the entrance of the hung-beef restored him to recollection". It also appears in Fan by Henry Harford, published in 1892, in which the heroine is visiting London Zoo: "The laughing jackasses laughed their loudest, almost frightening her with their weird cachinnatory chorus". The Romans clearly knew of this unrestrained outpouring of immoderate humour, since the word is from Latin cachinnare with the same sense.

ince 1911, societies around the world have dedicated days, months, and even decades (in Africa's case) to celebrating women's achievements and promoting solutions to new and persistent challenges. But over the past two years, the COVID-19 pandemic has expanded the plight of women to outsize proportions, sharply highlighting the urgency of this year's International Women's Day theme: "Break the Bias."

The onus is on us, the world's women, to fulfill this charge. Relying on our own ingenuity, we must shift our focus, refresh our global discourse, and usher in a new era for women's leadership.

There is no doubt that women have borne the brunt of the pandemic's costs. Many were forced to shelter from a silent enemy that we now know to be less lethal than their own closest kin. Many women were victims of what UN Women calls the "shadow pandemic," suffering beatings, rape, insults, and psychological trauma in what should have been a safe haven from a biological scourge.

Among the more staggering statistics from this period is one documenting the number of women who didn't suffer or witness domestic violence: one in ten. You read that right: In Liberia, just one in ten survey respondents reported not witnessing sexual or genderbased violence, and only two in ten reported not experiencing it, during the COVID lockdown.

There is a clear inverse correlation between education and susceptibility to sexual and genderbased violence. Less-educated cohorts are generally more vulnerable because they tend to have low economic and political agency and scant access to the health sys tems that could detect and address risks. These women suffer alone but together, listening to each other's cries through windows and walls.

Despite the structural disadvantages we face, women have risen to the occasion. New Zealand Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern is one of the many women leaders stretching the bounds of ingenuity and determination to save lives. From Ethiopia, Germany, and Slovakia to Denmark, Namibia, and Finland, the world's 21 women heads of state and government serving when the pandemic erupted led the charge against it with transparency and integrity, outstripping their male

counterparts with effective public-health policies

Throughout the pandemic. women have shattered the myth that strategies based on compassion and consensus-building are weak and ineffectual. Rather than being defeated by the double standards held against us, women leaders have remained humble, diligent, and collegial.

Moreover, we have been learning from our experiences to assess accurately the uneven social and political terrain on which we operate. so that we can approach our conditions more strategically. In addition to sharpening our awareness of the difference between pandemic and endemic, COVID-19 and flu, we have also directed more attention to sexual and genderbased violence.

This problem has long been considered endemic – a cyclical scourge flowing from the honeymoon to the hospital. We should now treat it the same way we do a virus. That means isolating perpetrators and bringing them to justice, establishing systems to detect and address cases, and engaging with communities to stop the spread. We must devise curative and preventive measures that include men and boys, so that a lasting cultural transformation occurs.

We must target and reform the justice and social systems that have left women to the wolves, and we must harness the indirect, outsize force that politically and economically empowered women can bring to bear against violence. We must crowd legislatures and government offices with women, creating a critical mass that can shift the paradigm on justice, peace, security, and health.

Breaking the bias may not lead to an immediate ceasefire in domestic settings. But with more women leading at every level, we will gradually increase our collective access to education, gainful employment, and all the other resources needed to help women escape violence. If you are a woman reading this, we challenge you to consider pursuing a public leadership role. starting in your own community. We dare you, and we believe in you.

Power of PIL

Sir, The Supreme Court and the High Courts which are the watchdogs of Indian society, have been flooded with Public Interest Litigations(PILs). New Delhi. May 6: Sources in the intelligence agencies said that Pakistan's Inter-Services Intelligence(ISI) is pushing pro-Khalistani elements to carry out major terror strikes in India. The sources, quoting intelli-

gence inputs, said that pro-Khalistani entities with the help of ISI are continuing with their efforts to smuggle IEDs, arms, ammunition and explosives into Puniab to carry out terrorist strikes in major cities of the country. They also said that the ISI, in col-

lusion with foreign based pro-

Khalistani entities, is planning to use gangsters and local criminals in Harvana and Puniab to accomplish its terrorist agenda.

Harvana Police on Thursday claimed to have foiled a major terror attack bid with the arrest of four 'highly radicalised' Punjabbased terrorists, who were in touch with the ISI. from the Bastara toll plaza in Karnal in a joint operation with their Punjab counterparts and Central security agencies.

A large cache of arms, ammunition and explosives were seized from their possession. The accused persons were going to deliver the explosives at Adilabad in Telangana,



the police said. Besides key accused Gurpreet Singh, who had

Police (law and order), Sandeep Khirwar, said the police have recovered three IEDs. one Pakistanmade pistol, 31 cartridges and Rs 1.30 lakh in cash from the arrested persons in Karnal

Officials said the weapons were air-dropped using a drone at the behest of Rinda in Ferozepur, Punjab. During interrogation, Gurpreet confessed that they received the explosives from across the border.

Recently, Sikhs for Justice (SFJ), on ISI's behest, had posted a message on social media threatening the chief ministers of Himachal Pradesh and Punjab that banning the Khalistani campaign might lead to an armed conflict, the sources in the intelligence network said.

SFJ is a US-based separatist group that supports the secession of Punjab from India as Khalistan.

High drama over BJP leader Bagga's arrest SC Collegium proposes 15 names as High Court judges

New Delhi/Chandigarh, May 6: Delhi BJP leader Tajinder Pal Singh Bagga was arrested by Punjab Police from his home, stopped in Haryana while being taken to Punjab and brought back to the national capital by Delhi Police hours later, a Friday of dramatic developments that drew in the police of three states and led to a BJP-AAP slugfest.

The BJP accused Punjab Police of "abducting" its leader, who has been vocal in his criticism of Arvind Kejriwal, and accused the AAP chief and Delhi chief minister of pursuing vendetta through the state police. The Aam Aadmi Party rejected the charge and said the Delhi BJP spokesperson was arrested for allegedly stoking communal tension in Punjab.

Delhi Police registered a case of kidnapping based on a complaint by Bagga's father Preetpal Singh. The Punjab government, on its part, moved the high court against the "detention" of its police team in Kurukshetra, Harvana.

The AAP rules Delhi and Punjab while the BJP governs Haryana. However, Delhi Police comes under the Union Home ministry and not the AAP-led Delhi government.

Punjab Police had booked Bagga on charges of making provocative statements, promoting enmity and criminal intimidation. The case was registered on a complaint of AAP leader from Mohali Sunny Ahluwalia.

Bagga had also come under AAP fire for his tweet against the Delhi chief minister over the film "The Kashmir Files". Defending the Punjab Police's action, Bharadwaj told reporters that the state police registered a case against Bagga last month after the BJP leader, through his social media posts, "tried to create communal tension and incite violence in the state". "Because of such statements, the Punjab Police lodged an FIR and now arrested Bagga. His statements were communal in nature. A lot of BJP-linked people were instigating the vio-

Compensate or pay fine: DGCA

New Delhi: Airlines are indulging in "unfair practice" of denving boarding to passengers even when they report for their flights at the airport on time. Indian aviation regulator DGCA has stated. The Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) -- in an e-mail on May 2 -- asked all Indian carriers to give compensation and facilities to passengers affected by such denial of boarding, failing which it would will impose financial penalties on them. Sources alleged that Indian carriers have been overbooking their flights as COVID-19 cases are receding, and when the number of passengers exceed the number of seats in the aircraft, the airlines do not take them on-board.

New Delhi, May 6: After the WHO released its report on the Covid deaths, the Congress Friday demanded the constitution of a Covid commission and a compensation of Rs 4 lakh each to the families who lost their members in the pandemic.

Addressing a press conference, Congress spokesperson Gaurav Vallabh said, "Heeding to our demand for the last two years, the government must immediately form a Covid commission with members from all parties to analyze the deaths that happened due to unavailability of Oxygen, broken supply chain in case of vaccines and medicines and plan for better management during such pandemics and pay Rs 4 lakhs to the families

The Congress spokesperson said the Modi government has let India down on the World Stage once again as the mismanagement of the Covid pandemic by the BJP government is not hidden from anvone. He said the apathetic attitude has been evident all along. "The nation saw people gasping for oxygen during the second wave. India was shamed at the world

stage when pictures of the bodies floating were circulated in the International Media. Referring to the WHO report, he said it has exposed the death toll in India due to Covid between

January 1, 2020 and December 31, 2021 He said as per the government data, there has been only 5.24 lakh deaths due to Covid in India so far, but the few key points highlighted by the WHO report are that the world saw 1.49 crore excess deaths associated with the pandemic in

2020 and 2021. One in three deaths in the world due to Covid happened in India. India had 47 lakh deaths due to Covid-19 between January 2020 and December 2021.

HC admits plea against conversion in schools

Chennai, May 6: A vacation bench of the Madras High Court Friday admitted a public interest litigation plea to stop forcible conversion of students in schools and ordered notice to the Tamil Nadu government, returnable in four weeks.

The bench of Justices R Mahadevan and S Ananthi admitted the petition after having satisfied themselves that the issue raised, was maintainable. The matter will be posted before a regular bench after the summer vacation, which will come to an end on June 6.

Meanwhile, the petitioner, B Jagannath, a city-based advocate, filed an additional affidavit which alleged forcible conversions in more places. As per a secret probe carried out by a private TV channel, similar incidents of forcible conversion had occurred in five more places in the state, the counsel told the judges

The original petition prayed for a direction to the government to frame effective guidelines and take all steps necessary, including corrective measures, to prohibit/prevent and ban proselytisation and forced religious conversions in

In support of his petition, the petitioner cited the recent incident that

happened in Thanjavur district where Lavanya, a student, had committed suicide over alleged pressure to convert to Christianity. The Court had ordered a CBI probe into the matter and the Supreme Court had also confirmed it, petitioner claimed.

Petitioner also referred to another incident in a government school in Kanyakumari district where a student was allegedly forced to kneel down for not acceding to the demand for conversion. The petitioner wanted firm steps against conversion by some persons.

Gandhinagar, May 6: With Gujarat, which has a sizeable proportion of tribal population (14.8 per cent), slated to go to the polls later this year, all political parties are making all out efforts to woo tribal voters

The tribal voters can be the game-changers in Gujarat politics as of the 182-member House, 27 seats are reserved for them. Even after 27 years of rule and almost three decades of grassroots work, the BJP has been unable to make major inroads into the Congress' forte in the tribal belts. And the tribal voters, by and large, have remained loyal to the grand old party.

On April 21, Prime Minister Narendra Modi addressed the tribals in Dahod, while on May 1, Aam Aadmi Party national convener and Delhi Chief Minister Arvind



Kejrival shared the stage with Bharatiya Tribal Party (BTP) leader Chhotu Vasava and addressed adivasis at Chanderia village in Valia Taluka. Now, Congress leader Rahul Gandhi is slated to address the 'Adivasi Satyagrah' rally at Dahod on May 10.

To counter Rahul Gandhi's rally,

the BJP has organised its tribal cell national convention at the Statue of Unity from May 9 to 11, in which the party's tribal cell office-bearers, leaders, MPs and MLAs from across the nation will participate.

Party sources said that in this convention, the saffron party may float an idea of projecting a tribal leader as President of the country and spread it in the tribal belts across the nation. In that case, the frontrunner for BJP's Presidential nominee will be senior tribal leader Anusuiya Uikey, currently serving as the Governor of Chhattisgarh. The tribal belt in the state is

spread on the eastern border of

Gujarat from Danta in the north to Dangs in the south. If one goes by the electoral history of the 27 reserved tribal seats, in 2012, Congress had won 15 seats, the BJP 10 while the JD(U) had won 2 seats. In 2017, Congress had again bagged 15 seats, followed by BJP (9), Bharatiya Tribal Party (2), while one seat was won by an Independent candidate. Even after working for more than three decades in the tribal belt through sister concerns of RSS such as the Vanvasi Kalyan Parishad, Hindu Jagaran Manch and other organisations, and despite then BJP General Secretary Suryakant Acharya spending almost four years in the adivasi belt,

the saffron party has not been able end Congress' domination in the area. Same is the story of BTP leader Chhotu Vasava and Dadra & Nagar Haveli MP late Mohan Delkar. Both tried to be tribal lead ers of the entire belt, but failed. The root cause of the failure might be the strong sub-castes in tribals like Kotwaliyas in Banaskantha and Sabarkantha, Bhils in Dahod and Panchmahal, Rathwa in Chhotaudepur, Vasvas in Bharuch and Narmada districts, Chaudhary, Gamit, Dhodhiya in Surat and Tapi district, and Halpati, Nayakas, Kharva, Varli, Kumbhi and-Kotwaliyas in Dangs, whose traditions are different.

New Delhi, May 6: The Supreme Court Friday referred to a fivejudge Constitution bench the dispute between the Centre and the Delhi government over control of services in the national capital for an "authoritative pronouncement" on the issue. A bench comprising Chief

Justice N V Ramana and Justices Surya Kant and Hima Kohli, however, said all other issues, except the issue of control over services, had been "elaborately dealt with" by the previous Constitution bench in 2018 and they will not be revisited.

"Subject to the provisions of the Constitution and Article 239AA (which deals with Delhi's power) of the Constitution and considering the Constitution bench judgement (of 2018), it appears that all the issues except the one pending consideration before this bench have been elaborately dealt with there-

The law officer referred to the observations made by Justice Ashok Bhushan (since retired) in the subsequent judgement dealing with the division of power between the Centre and the Delhi government and said a case of reference was made

out from that interpretation only. The solicitor general had also said the model of governance of the NCT of Delhi would invariably require the Union government to play a central role, even if a legislative assembly or council of ministers is introduced.

The central government had also sought a joint hearing of two separate petitions of the Delhi government on control over services and challenging the constitutional validity of the amended GNCTD Act, 2021 and the Transaction of Business Rules, which allegedly give more powers to the Lieutenant Governor respectively, saying they are prima facie correlated. Justice Bhushan had ruled the Delhi government had no power at all over administrative services. Justice Sikri, however, made a distinction.

He said the transfer or posting of officers in top echelons of the bureaucracy (joint director and above) can only be done by the Central government and the view of the lieutenant governor would prevail in case of a difference of opinion on matters relating to other bureaucrats. In the 2018 judgement. a five-judge Constitution bench had unanimously held that the Lieutenant Governor of Delhi is bound by the "aid and advice" of the elected government, and both needed to work harmoniously with each other.

Khandwa, Madhya Pradesh, May 6: Chabutara village in Madhya's Pradesh's Khandwa district has always been arid.

The water-scarce summer months were particularly difficult in this primarily tribal village, with lack of water resulting in the death of cattle.

Women would need to trudge miles in search of drinking water. Most villagers would leave for cities and towns to earn a living.

Yet, in spite of back-breaking work for over three months, there was hardly much made to live on when they returned home.

Women take the lead

Typically patriarchal, Chabutara had never believed in letting its women access their rights as individuals.

Notwithstanding their contribution to running the household, women rarely had a say in any decision. Nor were they extended support when they needed it.

Take the case of Budhiyabai. After losing her husband, Budhiyabai had returned to her parents' home in Chabutara with an infant son. But they had refused to take her back, compelling her to set up a home in a little hut all by herself.

However, matters changed when she joined a local women's Self-Help Group (SHG), Durga Mahila Samuha. Budhiyabai was soon joined by Ramkali, Setibai, Rukmabai and many others, all of whom had been migrating every summer in search of work.

Following the death of several

heads of cattle during a particularly difficult summer, Budhiyabai decided to address the situation by appealing for help through Spandan, a local NGO that had been working with her SHG on nutrition. She took up the matter with Spandan social worker, Seema Prakash.

"Water was a major problem here, but we didn't have the means to help the women,"Prakash recalled. "So we took the matter up with our partner, Goonj, which is a nationwide NGO. Goonj decided to pay them in the form of 2 kg of rice (given daily) per person and clothes every fortnight, and the women went on to dig a dried-up [5-acre] pond so deep that it would hold water all through the year.' "We then helped them access a

government loan to opt for pisciculture," Prakash added.

"The loan helped them buy fingerlings to start their venture. The women pooled in money through their SHG and bought fishing nets and fish feed for fish cultivation. In three months, the fish grew big enough for the market. Thus, the women's group earned a neat ₹20,000 on their investment after a period of four years.'

Rather than exhausting the money, they decided to save the amount to return the loan. But even as their venture gathered steam. with regular harvests and the sale of fish in the weekly market, problems reared their ugly head.

The women fought a long battle against patriarchy and braved many underhanded activities perpetrated by the men in the village to scuttle their efforts at financial independence.

It was the consistent support of a few allies that helped them turn the tide.

'Delhi startup policy to boost entire ecosystem'

New Delhi, May 6: The Alliance of Digital India Foundation (ADIF) Friday welcomed the 'Delhi Startup Policy' which aims to support 15,000 startups by 2030 and generate new avenues of employment.

"The National Capital Region, which is already a hub for start-ups in India, will see an accelerated transformation under the aegis of these integrated and effective policy pillars in the coming years," the ADIF said in a statement.

"The multiplier effect of this ambitious policy will help boost the startup ecosystem of our entire nation," added the foundation that represents hundreds of startups.

The Delhi government will pay up to 50 per cent of the rent of a startup's office lease or pitch in for a portion of the salaries that these startups will pay to their employees. "We will also reimburse them

for the costs incurred on applying for patents, copyrights and trademarks," Kejriwal said. According to the Economic Survey 2021-22, Delhi has replaced Bengaluru as the startup capital of India.

Between April 2019 to December 2021, more than 5,000 recognised start-ups were added in Delhi while 4,514 startups were added in Bengaluru. The Delhi government said it would also offer collateralfree and interest-free loans to incentivise incubation centres and fabrication labs.

A 20-member task force will also be set up to oversee the registration of startups

Coming into existence in 2017, the 'Arth' is a venture started by a bunch of IIT alumni with the help of ENACTUS, IIT Delhi. With four machines, they started turning cow dung at Shri Krishna Gaushala in north Delhi's Bawana into cow dung logs first and then diya, havan cups, rakhis and now, the team has filed a patent for cow dung clay.

On Friday, Union Minister for Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying, Parshottam Rupala handed over yet another machine prepared by Rashtriya Godhan Mahasangh to them. "It needs woods from two fully grown trees to cremate a body. All those trees can be saved of people adopt such practices. It can also help the gaushala to clear roughly 150,000 to 170,000 kg of processed cow dung every month

Lucknow, May 6: Even as cases of stray dogs attacking children increase, cases of cruelty to animals are also on the rise.

Animal rights activist Kamna Pandey, former member of Animal Rights Commission, said that she has lodged FIRs in two cruelty incidents and is getting multiple complaints on a daily basis from animal lovers. "The first FIR has been lodged at Gudamba police station against a man who killed a puppy by cutting its leg, while the second has been lodged against a group for breaking the limbs of dogs before killing them in Husainabad area," she said.

"We have also got reports that some people have hired private persons to kill stray dogs in their localities. People must understand that killing dogs is not the solution, and, in fact, it leads to retaliation by animals in self-defence. For instance, the female dog whose puppy was killed by a man in Gudamba turned aggressive and has attacked a few

people," she said. Cases of cruelty to animals have been reported from Prayagraj where a vouth tied crackers to the tail of a stray dog in Naini area and set it on fire. The dog suffered burn injuries and later succumbed. In Kanpur, a group of men broke the teeth of a dog with a hammer after

he bit a local resident. Police action is these cases has not been reported. After the last month's Thakurganj incident in which a minor girl was mauled to death by stray dogs, Lucknow Municipal Corporation has stepped

up its drive to sterilise stray dogs. 'Some volunteers have informed that LMC squads are using wired iron rods to catch pigs at some places, which is banned under the Prevention of Cruelty Act 1979," Pandey informed. Chief veterinary officer, LMC, Dr Arvind Kumar Rao refuted all allegations of cruelty by squads and said that animals are caught in the most humane way possible. The sterilisation drive has also been stepped up and two more centres have been started, he added

ED raids multiple locations

JHARKHAND MGNREGA FUNDS FRAUD CASE

New Delhi/Ranchi, May 6: The ED Friday conducted raids at multiple premises, including that of Jharkhand Mining Secretary Pooja Singhal and her family, in connection with a money laundering probe linked to the alleged embezzlement of over Rs 18 crore MGNREGA funds in Khunti district of the state during 2008-11, officials said.

The agency seized a total of Rs 19.31 crore cash from two premises that were searched in state capital Ranchi. About Rs 17.51 crore cash has been recovered from the premises of a Ranchi-based Chartered Accountant-cum-fi-



nancial advisor whose links with the IAS officer and her family are under the scanner, they said.

Around Rs 1.8 crore cash has also been recovered from another location in the city, they said. The officials said a number of "incriminating documents that indicate political and higher bureaucracy links with alleged illegal mining activities in the state" have been seized.

The raids that were continuing till late evening are being carried out under provisions of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) at about 18 premises in Jharkhand, Bihar, West Bengal, Delhi, Punjab, and a few other states, they said. The officials said the premises of Singhal, an IAS officer and secretary of the Department of Mines and Geology of the Jharkhand government, in state capital, Ranchi, are also being covered as part of the action.

Singhal is a 2000 batch Indian Administrative Service (IAS) officer and was posted as the deputy commissioner in Khunti district earlier.

Stunting dips, obesity rises in most states: NFHS-5

The report said the level of stunting among children under five years has marginally declined from 38 to 36 per cent since the last four years

New Delhi, May 6: The level of stunting among children under five years has marginally declined from 38 to 36 per cent in the last four years while obesity has increased in most states and union territories, according to the fifth round of the National Family Health Survey (NFHS).

Stunting is the impaired growth and development that children experience from poor nutrition, re-

peated infection and inadequate psychosocial stimulation. The NFHS-5 (2019-21) report comprises detailed information on key domains of population, health and family welfare and associated domains like characteristics of the population, fertility, family planning, infant and child mortality, maternal and child health, nutrition and anaemia, morbidity and healthcare and women's empowerment.

The report said the level of stunting among children under five years has marginally declined from 38 to 36 per cent for India since the last four years.

"Stunting is higher among children in rural areas (37 per cent) than urban areas (30 per cent) in 2019-21. Variation in stunting ranges from the lowest in Puducherry (20 per cent) and highest in Meghalaya (47 per cent). A notable decrease in



stunting was observed in Haryana, Uttarakhand, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh and Sikkim (7 percentage points each), Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh and Manipur (6 percentage points each), and Chandigarh and Bihar (5 percentage points

each)," it said.

Compared with NFHS-4 (2015-16), the prevalence of overweight or obesity has increased in most states and UTs in NFHS-5."At national level, obesity increases from 21 per cent to 24 per cent among

women and 19 per cent to 23 per cent among men. More than a third of women in Kerala, Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Andhra Pradesh, Goa, Sikkim, Manipur, Delhi, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry, Punjab, Chandigarh and Lakshadweep (34-46 per cent) are overweight or obese," the report said.

The main objective of successive NHFS rounds has been to provide reliable and comparable data relating to health and family welfare and other emerging areas in India. The NFHS-5 survey work has been conducted in around 6.37 lakh sample households from 707 districts (as on March 2017) in 28 states and eight UTs, covering 7,24,115 women and 1,01,839 men to provide dis-aggregated estimates up to the district level, the report said.

It also provides data by socioeconomic and other background

characteristics, useful for policy formulation and effective programme implementation. The NFHS-5 shows an overall improvement in Sustainable Development Goals indicators in all states and UTs.

"The extent to which married women usually participate in three household decisions (about health care for herself: making major household purchases; visit to her family or relatives) indicates that their participation in decision making is high, ranging from 80 per cent in Ladakh to 99 per cent in Nagaland and Mizoram. Rural (77 per cent) and urban (81 per cent) difference is found to be marginal. The prevalence of women having a bank or savings account that 79 per cent in the last four years," the report said.

3 Israelis killed in stabbing attack near Tel Aviv

Tel Aviv, May 6: Israeli security forces Friday launched a massive manhunt for two Palestinians suspected of carrying out a stabbing rampage that killed three Israelis in the predominantly ultra-orthodox town of Elad on Israel's Independence Day, the latest in a series of deadly assaults deep inside the country in recent weeks.

Police have launched a massive search operation for the assailants, identified as As'ad Al-Rafa'ani, 19 and Sabhi abu Shakir, 20, both residents of Jenin area in the West Bank, setting up roadblocks and dispatching a helicopter.

The stabbing on Thursday night, Israel's Independence Day, is the seventh such incident in the past 45 days, taking the death toll from such attacks in Israel to 19, police said. It came as Israeli-Palestinian tensions were already heightened by violence at a major holy site in Jerusalem sacred to Jews and Muslims.

On Friday, Israeli Police and the Shin Bet security services released the names of the two suspects and said both are residents of Jenin area in the West Bank.

SPACEX BRINGS 4 ASTRONAUTS HOME

Cape Canaveral (US), May 6: SpaceX brought four astronauts home with a midnight splashdown in the Gulf of Mexico on Friday, capping the busiest month yet for Elon Musk's taxi service.

The three US astronauts and one German in the capsule were bobbing off the Florida coast, near Tampa, less than 24 hours after leaving the International Space Station. NASA expected to have them back in Houston later in the morning. "That was a great ride,' said Raja Chari, the capsule commander. As for the reintroduction to gravity, he noted: "Only one complaint. These water bottles are super heavy." NASA's Chari, Tom Marshburn and Kayla Barron, and the European Space Agency's Matthias Maurer, were out of the capsule within an hour of splashdown, waving and giving thumbsup as they were hustled away on rolling chaises for medical checks.

Russia must face war crimes justice, says AI

Kyiv, May 6: Amnesty International says it has documented extensive war crimes by Russian forces in communities around the Ukrainian capital, Kyiv, including arbitrary executions, bombardments of residences and torture.

'The pattern of crimes committed by Russian forces that we have documented includes both unlawful attacks and willful killings of civilians," Agnes Callamard, Amnesty International's Secretary General, said in a statement Friday. "It is vital that all those responsible, including up the chain of command, are brought to justice." The organisation said it collected evidence and testimony in eight cities near Kyiv, including Bucha.

After Russian forces retreated from Bucha in April, corpses were found lying on streets, many with their hands bound behind their backs, and in mass graves. Kyiv regional governor Oleksandr Pavlvuk said that at least 1.235 civilian bodies have been found in the region. Russia has consistently claimed that it hits only targets with military values. It has denied war-crimes allegations and claimed that the Bucha corpses were falsified as a "provocation." AI's report described the shoot-

Indian firms register growth in UK

London, May 6: Indian-owned companies operating in the UK have multiplied in the past year, up from 850 to 900, with a corresponding hike in revenues and job creation figures, according to latest research released here

The 2022 'India Meets Britain Tracker', launched on Thursday, revealed these companies employed 141.005 people, up from 116.046 in 2021, and had combined revenues of 54.4 billion pounds, also up from 50.8 billion pounds last year.

"India is a very special place, and its growth has been nothing short of remarkable," said Lord Gerry Grimstone, Minister for Investment in the UK's Department for International Trade (DIT).

'This growing, confident, out ward looking India has benefited the world and certainly benefited the UK. Our relationship is defined by our peoples, our mutual investment and mutual trade. In the last five years. Indian investment into the UK has more than quadrupled and we calculate that it supports almost half a million jobs

Brussels, May 6: Records amounts of cocaine are being seized in Europe while manufacturing of the drug is now taking place inside the European Union, officials in charge of fighting and monitoring drugs use in the bloc warned Friday.

More than 214 tons of cocaine were seized in Europe in 2020, a 6% increase from the previous year, and experts from the European Monitoring Center for Drugs and Drug Addiction (EM-CDDA) believe that amount could reach 300 tons in 2022

With a market retail value estimated at 10.5 billion euros in 2020 and about 3.5 million European citizens reporting having used it in

the past year, cocaine is the second most used drug in the EU after cannabis

Its availability in Europe has never been higher, with extremely high purity and low prices. While most cocaine manufacturing still occurs in Colombia, Peru and Bolivia, EU experts are worried by the processing now taking place inside the 27-nation bloc, particularly in Belgium, Spain and the Netherlands

Speaking at a news conference in Brussels, Laurent Laniel, a scientific analyst at the EMCDDA. said that cocaine powder is often smuggled from South America to Europe in carrier materials such as charcoal and plastics, then extracted in local laboratories. Alexis Goosdeel, the EM-

New Delhi, May 6: The power ministry has directed all imported coal-based plants to run on full capacity amid the ongoing dry fuel shortage at thermal plants crippling electricity generation.

In an office order issued in this regard Thursday by the ministry it is noted that most of the states have allowed pass-through of the higher cost of imported coal to consumers, which aided to make operational 10.000 MW capacity out of the total 17,600 MW imported coal-based thermal plants in the country.

However, the ministry said that "some imported coal-based capacity is still not operating".

The ministry issued directions under Section 11 of the Electricity Act. It has directed that all imported coal-based power plants shall operate and generate power

This order shall remain valid up to October 31, 2022, the ministry said.

"This (demand-supply mismatch) is leading to load shedding in different areas. Because of the mismatch between the daily consumption of coal for power generation and the daily receipt of coal at the power plant, the stocks of coal at the power plant have been declining at a worrisome rate," it noted.

The imported coal-based generation capacity is around 17,600 MW. The PPAS for imported coalbased plants do not have adequate provision for pass-through of the entire increase in the international coal price, it added.

EV FIRES Probe finds defect in battery cells, modules

New Delhi. May 6: Faulty battery cells and modules have been identified as the leading cause of electric scooters catching fire in India in recent weeks, according to the findings of an initial federal investigation, two government sources told Reuters.

The probe looked into fire incidents involving three companies, including Ola Electric, which is backed by Japan's SoftBank Group, and was the country's top-selling e-scooter maker in April.

"In Ola's case, the battery cells were found to be an issue as well as the battery management system," said one of the sources, who has direct knowledge of the report

In March, India launched an investigation over safety concerns after a spate of e-scooter fires, including one where a man and his daughter died when their e-bike "went up in flames".

India wants e-scooters and ebikes to make up 80% of total twowheeler sales by 2030, from about 2% today. But concerns over safety

New Delhi: Kotak Mahindra Bank Limited (Kotak) announced an increase in interest rates on fixed deposit across multiple tenor baskets for its retail customers by up to 0.35 per cent. The increase in FD (Fixed Deposit) rates comes after the Reserve Bank of India announced a 40 basis points hike in the repo rate. Kotak said in a release Reserve Bank of India (RBI) in a surprise hiked the benchmark repo rate -- at which it lends short term money to banks -- by 0.40 per cent to 4.40 per cent in order to contain inflation.

Naik said the average deal size for the companies has been \$25 million right now, and it has already had clients suggesting a merger, which will help it participate in bigger projects. Naik said it will be able to bid for deals of over \$100 million once the merger cre-

ates a bigger entity. The merger announcement comes at a time when the bigger players in the IT industry have

Sams, David fashion MI win RR aim to return to winning ways

Mumbai, May 6: Pacer Daniel Sams (0/18) displayed ice-cool temperament as he conceded just three runs in the last over to help Mumbai Indians pull off a stunning five-run victory over table-toppers Gujarat Titans in an IPL game Saturday.

MI were seemingly down and out with the Titans' opening pair of Wriddhiman Saha (55, 40b, 6x4, 2x6) and Shubman Gill (52, 36b, 6x4, 2x6) sharing a 106-run partnership in 12.1 overs while chasing 178.

However, the Titans kept losing wickets, including two crucial runouts as they required nine runs in the last over to win the match. They could score just three, while losing one wicket to slump to their sec ond successive defeat in the season.

For MI, who were already out of contention for a play-off berth, it was only their second win of the season as they remained at the bottom.

Opting to bowl, Gujarat restricted MI to 177/6, despite quickfire innings from opening pair of Rohit Sharma (43, 28b, 5x4, 2x6) and Ishan Kishan (45, 29b, 5x4, 1x6) and Tim David (44 n o, 21b, 2x4, 4x6).

Rashid Khan was the most successful bowler for the Titans with his two wickets for 24, while Pradeep Sangwan and Lockie Ferguson got one each. Alzarri Joseph also took a wicket but he bled 41 runs in his four overs.

Chasing 178, Saha looked in full flow as he cracked two fours and a six off Jasprit Bumrah's first over, before smashing Riley Meredith

for two boundaries.

Gill slog-swept Murugan Ashwin for a six, before picking up another four as the fifty-run stand came up in quick time, taking the Titans to 54/1 in six overs.

The Chandigarh batter exploded in the eighth over with three boundaries off Sams, who had bowled a briliant opening over.

Kumar Kartikeya was next in line as he yielded 15 runs with Saha smashing his first ball for a four and Gill producing a clean hit over long

off before slog-sweeping the bowler for another four.

Soon, 100 was up in 11 overs with Saha also completing his fifty. Gill too joined him as his single off Pollard took him to a 33-ball half century. A bizzare hit wicket ended Sai Sudharsan's (14) innings, while Hardik Pandya (24) fall short after going for an unnecessary single.

Needing 20 off last two overs, Miller deposited Bumrah over deep mid-wicket but the Titans couldn't score nine of the last over lose the

Kishan then took over, dancing down the pitch to send Rahul Tewatia over mid-wicket. Suryakumar Yadav produced his trademark whip for a maximum but perished in his next attempt off Pradeep Sangwan.

Back into the attack, Joseph then struck with a slower delivery which Kishan ended up sending to Rashid at mid-wicket as MI slipped to 111/3 in 12 overs.

Pollard lived dangerously with Sangwan and Ferguson bowling two quiet overs and was eventually cleaned up by Rashid, who set up the West Indian with two googlies.

MI thus seemed to have frittered away the solid start but Tilak Verma (21) and David then tried to put together a partnership with the latter launching Mohammed Shami for two fours at mid-off and long leg respectively.

Varma was run-out with Pandya producing a direct throw, while Sams too perished with a second-ball duck. However, David smacked Shami for two maximums in the last over to take the team past 170-run mark.

Madrid, May 6: A day after rushing from his victory to watch Real Madrid play Manchester City in the Champions League semifinals, Rafael Nadal needed the same fighting spirit as his favorite team showed to avoid his own elimination at the Madrid Open.

The "Si se puede!" ("Yes we can!") chants that echoed at the Santiago Bernabéu Stadium Wednesday were also present at the "Caja Magica" Thursday after Nadal saw himself against the ropes, like Madrid was the night before.

While Madrid scored twice in the final minutes to force extra time and defeat Man City, Nadal saved four match points to secure a three-set win over David Goffin and reach the quarterfinals.

"Our trajectory is about fighting, is about believing, is about trying till the last, until the match is done,' Nadal said. "We are a kind of team and player that we try till the end and we believe. So, yeah, yesterday (has) been unforgettable. Today of course for me is too.'

Nadal asked tournament organizers not to schedule his opening match Wednesday in the afternoon session so he could make it to the Bernabéu. He is an honorary member of the club and last week gave the ceremonial kickoff before the team clinched the Spanish league title with a win against Espanvol.

The third-seeded Nadal will next face Carlos Alcaraz, the youngster touted by many in Spain as Nadal's successor: The ninth-ranked Alcaraz marked his 19th birthday by defeating Cameron Norrie 6-4, 6-7(4-7), 6-3. Tournament organizers greeted him with a cake on the court after the match, and the home crowd sang "Happy Birthday."

The fourth-ranked Nadal needed more than three hours to defeat

the 60th-ranked Goffin 6-3, 5-7, 7-6(11-9) in only his second match after a six-week layoff because of a rib stress fracture.

In the women's semifinals, eighthseeded Ons Jabeur comfortably defeated qualifier Ekaterina Alexandrova 6-2, 6-3 to advance to the final. The Tunisian is the first Arab player to reach a WTA 1000 final.

She will face 12th-seeded American Jessica Pegula, who defeated Jil Teichmann 6-3, 6-4 to also make her first WTA 1000 final. Pegula and Jabeur are tied 2-2 in head-to-head meetings.

Frankfurt set up Europa League final vs Rangers

Frankfurt, May 6: Eintracht Frankfurt reached its first European final in 42 years by knocking West Ham out of the Europa League, setting up a title game against Scottish club Rangers.

Frankfurt beat 10-man West Ham 1-0 at home to complete a 3-1 aggregate victory in the semifinals, while Rangers overturned a 1-0 deficit from the first leg by defeating RB Leipzig 3-1 at a raucous Ibrox Stadium in Glagow.

It is Frankfurt's first European final since beating Borussia Monchengladbach in 1980 in an all-German matchup in the UEFA Cup, the predecessor to the Europa League. Rangers will be playing its first European final since losing to Zenit St. Petersburg in the UEFA Cup in 2008. The Scottish club is looking for a first European title in 50 years, after winning the Cup Winners' Cup in 1972.
