HSC EXAM RESULTS BY JUNE END: MIN

Bhubaneswar: The results of the High School Certificate (HSC) Examinations are likely to be announced by June end, said School and Mass Education Minister Samir Ranjan Dash Saturday. The minister said the evaluation of answer sheets has been completed and subsequent works have begun for the publication of the results. "The process for publication of the results has already begun and we are planning to announce the matriculation exam results by this monthend," Dash added. The HSC examination was conducted between April 29 and May 7, 2022. The evaluation process had started May 21 at 58 centres across the state.

NAVEEN RESHUFFLES TEAM

It is for the first time that Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik asked his entire council of ministers to resign before taking up the reshuffle. 21 MLAs including five women are all set to take oath today

Bhubaneswar, June 4: A day after winning the Brajarajnagar bypoll with a thumping majority, Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik, Saturday, made a complete revamp of his Cabinet.

Before the reshuffle, for the first time in his 22-year tenure, Naveen asked all the ministers to resign from their positions with immediate effect. There were 20 ministers in the state Council of Ministers, of which nine were given Minister of State (MoS) sta-

The Chief Minister is likely to have 21 members in his new Council of Ministers of which 13 will be in the Cabinet while eight others will be given Minister of State (MoS) status.

Nine ministers including Ranendra Pratap Swain, Naba Kishore Das, Samir Ranjan Dash, Tukuni Sahu, Ashok Chandra Panda, Niranjan Pujari, Prafulla Mallik, Tusharkanti Behra and Jagannath Saraka have been retained in the new team of Naveen. These leaders have resigned from their posts and will again be sworn-in along with other

MLAs Sunday. Senior BJD MLAs Pratap Keshari Deb, Pramila Mallick, Atanu Sabyasachi Nayak, Usha Devi and Pradip Kumar Amat are

also likely to take oath Sunday. These leaders have already served as ministers during different tenures of Naveen.

Similarly, seven legislators - Rajendra Dholakia, Aswini Kumar Patra, Rohit Pujari, Srikanta Sahu, Pritiranjan Gharai, Basanti Hembram and Rita Sahu -are all set to take oath as ministers for the first time in their political career.

As many as 11 ministers have been dropped from the new council of ministers. They are: Bikram Keshari Arukha, Padmanabha Behera, Pratap Jena, Arun Kumar Sahoo, Sudam Marndi, Susanta Singh, Dibya Shankar Mishra, Jyoti Prakash Panigrahi, Premananda Nayak, Raghunandan Das and Padmini Dian.

However, no official confirmation has been made by the Chief Minister's Office (CMO) of Raj Bhawan about the reshuffle till the paper goes for print.

On the other hand, Assembly Speaker Surya Narayan Patro has also resigned from his chair. The Speaker has submitted his resignation to deputy speaker Rajani Kanta Singh. He has denied taking any further assignment in government due to his health problems, family members

45°C at Bolangir as heatwave singes state

Bhubaneswar, June 4: A searing heatwave roasted parts of western Odisha Saturday even as overcast skies gave some respite to the coastal region from the blazing sun, the weather office said.

At least 13 weather stations recorded a maximum temperature of over 40°C, out of which eight saw the temperature climbing to 43°C or above, the Bhubaneswar Meteorological Centre said.

Heatwave conditions prevailed over Bolangir, Boudh, Subarnapur, Bargarh, Sambalpur and Jharsuguda districts, according to a bulletin.

The blistering heat baked Bolangir as the maximum temperature rose to 45°C in the district headquarters, the highest in the state, and 44.8°C in Titilagarh, a bulletin stated.

Sambalpur recorded 44.7°C, followed by 44.5°C in Subarnapur. The mercury climbed by two notches above average to settle at 43.6°C in Jharsuguda, while it was 43°C each in Nuapada and Bargarh.

The temperature in the twin cities of Bhubaneswar and Cuttack was 35.7°C and 35.6°C respectively, two levels below normal, the department said.

The weather office issued a yellow warning of heatwave in Bolangir, Boudh, Subarnapur and Bargarh for the next two days. It denotes that the heat is tolerable, but there is a slight health concern for vulnerable sections like the elderly and infants.

Bhubaneswar, June 4: A 34-year-old man was reportedly caught in his own trap while trying to implicate his father in a false case on the outskirts of the capital city here.

The Balianta police Saturday arrested accused Biswajit Dash of Pahala area and his friend Avinaya Mohapatra, 34, of Ranihaat in Cuttack in connec-

tion with the incident, sources said. Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP) Prateek Singh said Biswajit Friday informed Balianta police that his father had close links with several criminals and the elderly man had kept a gun in his vehicle.

Biswajit also told police that his farther was involved in various criminal activities, Singh said.

Soon, a joint team of the Special Task Force (STF) and Balianta police carried out a raid at the residence of Biswajit's father Surendra Kumar Dash in Rangabazar area of Balianta. The cops seized a country-made pistol with empty magazine and two mobile phones

during the raid.

During investigation, Surendra expressed his ignorance about the gun and he also denied allegations regarding his involvement in criminal activities. Surendra also informed the police that Biswajit was using the vehicle in which the gun was recovered.

Meanwhile, the police found several discrepancies in the statements of Biswajit. Smelling a rat, the cops interrogated Biswajit.



New e-Skin that can feel pain may help create touch-sensitive robots

team of researchers. led by one of Indian origin, has developed an electronic skin which can learn from feeling "pain" and could help create a new generation of smart robots with human-like sensitivity.


The team from the University of Glasgow developed the artificial skin with a new type of processing system based on asynaptic transistors, which mimics the brain's neural pathways in order to learn.

In earlier generations of electronic skin, that input data would be sent to a computer to be processed.

In the new e-skin, described in the journal Science Robotics, a circuit built into the skin acts as an artificial synapse instead, reducing the input down into a simple spike of voltage whose frequency varies according to the level of pressure applied to the skin, speeding up the process of reaction.

The team used the varying output of that voltage spike to teach the skin appropriate responses to simulated pain, which would trigger the robot hand to react. By setting a threshold of input voltage to cause a reaction, the team could make the robot hand recoil from a sharp jab in the centre of its palm.

"What we've been able to create through this process is an electronic skin capable of distributed learning at the hardware level, which doesn't need to send messages back and forth to a central processor before taking action. Instead, it greatly accelerates the process of responding to touch by cutting



down the amount of computation required," said Professor Ravinder Dahiya, of the University's James Watt School of Engineering.

"We believe that this is a real step forward in our work towards creating large-scale neuromorphic printed electronic skin capable of responding appropriately to stimuli," he added.

3,480 trees cut down for slurry pipeline

Keonjhar, June 4: Forests and environment in the mineral-rich Keonjhar district have been taking a heavy toll due to rampant mining, industries and developmental projects like dams and roads. To add to the problem, a slurry pipeline project is being executed by felling trees. It is dealing another blow to the ecology in the district.

Reports said, a slurry pipeline work has started to transport minerals from the district.

Big pipes are being laid underground and trees coming their way are being removed from the Joda mining area along the NH-20 upto Jajpur district. Till date, 3480 trees have been felled in Keonjhar. In fact, scores of medium and small plants felled have not been taken into account. This has caused a grave concern for the environmentalists.

Social activist Pradip Mohanty said that the number of trees cut down will be more than what is officially stated. An investigation can only detect how many trees in fact have been felled, he added.

The district has already lost thousands of *sal, neem, jamun* and mango trees due to expansion of NH-215 and NH-49. Moreover, due to mining, scores of trees are being cleared on a daily basis. However, compensatory plantation along the NHs have not been carried out, it was alleged.

Besides, trees are chopped off in the name of development and beautification works in different areas without planning to compensate the damage done to the greenery.

DFO Dhanraj HD said that action is being taken in cases of trees being cut down without permission. Lakhs of saplings are planted in the district every year, he added.

Minors beat father to death in Sundargarh



On being informed, police rushed to the spot and started an investigation into the matter. The two minors were detained.






Story of Neighbours

initial column writing for many years was for newspapers in Pakistan. I have visited it many times, have spoken at its universities and its literature festivals often and know the place intimately also through study over the last three decades.

What is striking to me is that while India has been moving consistently away from secularism and towards a Hindutva-style State, Pakistan has been attempting to move in the other direction, meaning away from religion.

In 1947, Pakistan wanted to be constitutionally a religious state. Integration of religion into law and government would lend a positive impulse to the nation, according to Jinnah's successor Liaquat Ali Khan. Speaking only a few years after the atom bombs were dropped on the Japanese, Liaquat said mankind's material and scientific development had leapt ahead of the development of the human individual. The result was that man was able to produce inventions that could destroy the world and society. This had happened only because man had chosen to ignore his spiritual side and if he had retained more faith in god, this problem would not have come up. Religion tempered the dangers of science, Liaquat felt, and as Muslims, Pakistanis would adhere to Islam's ideals and make a contribution to the world. The State's enabling of Muslims to lead their lives in alignment with Islam did not concern non-Muslims, so they should not have a problem with the reference to that, he said.

This is what was intended by the Muslim League, but what happened was different. The focus shifted from Muslims to non-Muslims. Pakistan constitutionally restricted minorities from becoming president (in the 1960s) or prime minister (from the 1970s). Meanwhile, the laws concerning Pakistan's Muslims fell away in time. The law enforcing fasting in Ramzan — quite needless because most sub-continental Muslims observe the fast anyway — ran into opposition after Muslim restaurant owners and multiplex owners complained. The law enforcing zakat by debiting 2.5 per cent from the bank accounts of Pakistan's Sunnis failed because people withdrew their money just before it was due to happen. The Shias, who have a hierarchical clergy to whom they give the money directly, had previously objected and were exempted.

Pakistan shares with India the penal code and Pakistanis are as familiar with the numbers 302, 420 and 144 as we are. Here they tried to change the laws. Early Islam existed at a time when there were no jails. Punishment for criminal offences was usually corporal instead of detention. In the 1980s Pakistan introduced amputation of limbs as punishment for theft and trained a set of terrified doctors to carry these out. But Pakistan's judges, trained in

Common Law like India's, were reluctant to pass these sentences and so the laws remained frozen and unused. Pakistan introduced stoning as a punishment for adultery but nobody has been stoned to death.

A brief period of enthusiasm, also in the 1980s, for lashing those accused of drinking alcohol ended. In 2009, Pakistan's Federal Shariat Court read down the punishment for drinking, with the judges saying it was not a serious crime. Under president Pervez Musharraf Pakistan returned the punishment for rape — which was conflated with fornication if the survivor could not produce witnesses to the act—from shariah back to the penal code. A shariat court order demanding a ban on interest in the banking system, which would finish off the economy, has been ignored by successive governments.

The last major attempt to Islamise Pakistan was over two decades ago under Nawaz Sharif: The so-called 15th Amendment, which was defeated in the Senate. Pakistan remains insufficiently Islamic and, with no hierarchical clergy like Iran's, can never become theocratic. Unlike Saudi Arabia it has never had moral police because Pakistanis are culturally South Asians with local practices.

While Pakistan has attempted to secularise.

India has gone the other away. The one thing India can claim is that it does not prevent Muslims from holding high office. India has had Muslim presidents but unlike Pakistan, India's presidents are figureheads with no real authority. If they had the power to dismiss Parliament, such as Pakistan's presidents had, it would be interesting to see how many Muslims India would have elevated.

Today, there is no Muslim chief minister in India for the first time since 1947, no Muslim minister at all in 15 state Cabinets, and in 10 states there is only one Muslim minister usually given minority affairs. Of the 303 Lok Sabha MPs of the ruling party, none is Muslim. There was no Muslim among its previous 282 Lok Sabha majority either. When Mukhtar Abbas Naqvi, who has not been given a Rajya Sabha seat, loses his position as minister, there will be no Muslim in India's Union Cabinet for the first time. Whether the exclusion of minorities from power is through law as in Pakistan or through practice as in India, the exclusion is real.

On the side of the laws of course India has moved substantially away from pluralism. Starting in 2015, Bharatiya Janata Party states began criminalising the possession of beef, triggering a series of beef lynchings.

In 2019, India's Parliament criminalised the utterance of triple talaq in one sitting, punishing Muslim men for a non-event (because the Supreme Court had already invalidated triple talaq earlier). After 2018, seven BJP states criminalised interfaith marriage by disallowing conversions and invalidating such marriages, including those which had children. Conversions to Hinduism — defined as "ancestral religion" — are exempt and not counted as conversions in the BJP states of Uttarakhand and Madhya Pradesh. Nobody has ever been convicted of forced conversion in India so these laws are not required but the intent is to harass.

In 2019, Gujarat tightened a law that keeps Muslims ghettoised by denying them access to purchase and lease of properties from Hindus. In effect, foreigners can buy and rent properties in Gujarat that Gujarati Muslims cannot. We need not get into the treatment of Kashmiris here because the collective punishment imposed on them no longer arouses interest in us. In effect there is no real difference between India and Pakistan as they move towards each other from two sides. One began at the communal end but has edged towards secularism. The other began at the secular end and has slipped into

But fossil-fuel financing has continued. JPMorgan Chase, a bank that uses IEA modeling and data for its own "net-zero" commitment, ended up supplying the fossil-fuel industry with \$61.7 billion last year. And this year, Russia's war in Ukraine has caused fossilfuel stocks to surge, even while equity markets overall approach bear territory.

Despite the rapid growth of environmental, social, and governance (ESG) investing, it is well known that leading financial institutions remain major funders of the climate crisis, bankrolling coal plants, oil pipelines, gas infrastructure, and other emissionsgenerating projects around the world. But now that the financial sector's annual general meeting (AGM) season has started, shareholders have an opportunity to demand more robust climate policies and decarbonisation strategies from financial institutions and institutional investors.

Because commercial banks' ownership is structured through publicly traded shares, AGMs allow shareholders to leverage their relative influence over the institution's investments and policy decisions. They are also an opportunity for civil-society groups to call attention to an institution's practices and demand change.

Climate-change activists have a strong business and financial case to make. Between the war in Ukraine, soaring energy prices, and hopes to sustain a post-pandemic economic recovery, there are numerous incentives to accelerate investment in renewables. Such investments would drive the post-pandemic recovery, create widespread job opportunities, and increase returns for investors.

Moreover, notwithstanding the recent energy-price spikes, fossilfuel investments continue to pose an enormous risk to financial institutions. As the energy transition progresses, fossil-fuel assets will lose their value and become stranded. Since the start of the pandemic, many banks, pension funds, and global investment houses have started pulling away from fossil-fuel investments for precisely this reason.

It started with BlackRock CEO Larry Fink's surprising annual letter to CEOs, in which he singled out climate change as a key riskmanagement issue. A few days later, BlackRock announced that one of its fastest-growing sustainability funds will stop investing in tar sands, one of the dirtiest fuel sources on the planet. We know that shareholder activism works. Last year, co-filers

from 350.org Japan, Kiko Network, Rainforest Action Network, and Market Forces proposed a climate resolution at the AGM of Japan's largest bank, Mitsubishi UFJ Financial Group, which has some \$3.1 trillion in assets and is the world's third-largest lender to the coal industry. The resolution sought to inform investors of the risks associated with the bank's continued financing of fossil fuel, and it called on the bank to adopt a strategy aligned with the Paris climate agreement's targets. Over the following months, the bank released a carbon-neutrality declaration, an updated business plan, and a revised environmental and social policy framework.

Similarly, following engagement between shareholders and investors at HSBC's 2021 AGM, the bank announced in March that it will phase down fossil-fuel financing on a schedule aligned with a 1.5oC target, as well as update its oil, gas, and coal policies by the end of 2022.

For good reason, the climate movement increasingly sees bank

AGMs as an effective theater of intervention. They provide a platform not only for shareholder resolutions but also for activists to send a clear message to the broader business community – as hap pened at the French bank BNP Paribas' recent AGM in Paris. Activists also have launched demonstrations at HSBC, Barclays, and Standard Chartered's AGMs, prompting some financial insti tutions to try to avoid being called out for their fossil-fuel financing by moving their meetings online.

True, with fossil-fuel stocks up and ESG commitments potentially being sidelined by more immediate market concerns, the climate movement could be facing headwinds this year. But other recent developments have generated forward momentum. Climate scientists have issued increasingly stark warnings about what awaits us if we fail to decarbonise rapidly. Viewed in the proper context, the slight uptick in fossil-fuel stocks is a mere blip against the backdrop of record-setting temperatures across Europe, deadly heatwaves in Pakistan and India, and drought concerns around the world.

Given these warnings and the accelerating effects of climate change, it is rational for investors to expect much tighter carbon regulations and public support for renewables in the near future. These policies will have significant economic ramifications in many regions of the world. They will be part of a bigger global transition that is already shifting our economies in the only sustainable direction: toward carbon neutrality.

If banks want to show that they are trustworthy and serious about the risks they and their shareholders face, they will use this AGM season to advance climate resolutions and remove expansion of fossil-fuel investment from their

ur environment is a complex dynamic system that includes both living and non-living components of the biosphere with a constant exchange of materials and energy among them. While we consume many useful things from the environment like air, water, and food we also try to replenish some materials in the form of new plantations, carbon dioxide by our breath. Over a large period of time, equilibrium is established among the various components of the environment allowing life to flourish. A key requirement for life to flourish on Earth is the prevailing of a moderate range of temperature in which water, the prime necessity for life, exists in all its three

different forms. However, it is a matter of great concern that since the Industrial Revolution, our contribution to environment has been minuscule compared to the vast benefits that we have enjoyed. Further, man's interference with nature has resulted in an irreversible change of the ecological balance that formed the very basis of our survival on the planet. One of the prime problems threatening our survival today is global warming and the climate change phenomenon arising out of it. The main cause for global warming is the increase of certain greenhouse gases in our atmosphere like carbon dioxide primarily due to manmade emissions.

The combustion of fossil fuels in industries and automobiles, in particular, has resulted in huge emissions of carbon dioxide into our atmosphere. According to a report, Earth's average temperature has risen by 10C since pre-industrial times and the temperature is steadily rising at a rate of 0.20C per decade. Although this is not very alarming from the figure point of view, this has a significant effect over our delicate ecological balance.

The natural presence of carbon dioxide in our atmosphere is very small, nearly 0.03%. Traces of greenhouse gases like carbon dioxide, to some extent, are desirable for life. This is because they trap the Sun's radiant heat producing a minimum temperature for life to exist. However, due to excess emissions of these gases from hectic industrial activities of recent times, the global temperature has taken an upward trend making conditions unsuitable for life. According to a report published in 2019, the two main greenhouse gases -- carbon dioxide and methane --have increased by 48% and 160% respectively since preindustrial times.

The thick tropical rainforest on the Amazon basin used to absorb most of the carbon dioxide from atmosphere leveraging the greenhouse effect and, hence, called the Lungs of the Planet. However, the forest is now fast dwindling because of burning and felling of trees. According to a report, the forrate of 2.00,000 hectares annually of developing and under-develand 150 acres per minute. A total of 20% of this precious jungle has already vanished and if the trend continues the days are not far when the entire jungle will be wiped out.

Monsoons, crucial to our agriculture, are now turning untimely. Fertile farm lands which were once abounding with vegetation have now gone parched due to shortfall of rain. Summer time temperature in some parts of India is inching towards 500C while winters have become extremely frigid with mercury plummeting below 00C in some parts. Frequency of tropical cyclones has increased. Rivers have gone dry and lack any potential for sustaining agriculture. Ground water level, which is the major source of water for people, is constantly declining due to excessive pressure. Climate related disasters like floods, droughts, cyclones and forest fires have been frequent. Climate change has also affected the livelihoods of people. Acidification of sea water has resulted in destruction of coral reefs which are the main breeding grounds of fish, affecting the fishery industry all over the world. Climate change has also affected

many other sectors like tourism, insurance, health and entertainment all over the world. The most vulnerable sections to climate est is shrinking at an alarming change are, however, the people oped countries of Africa, Asia and Latin America, with women and children forming the bulk of the

What is the way out? We have to minimise the use of fossil fuels and explore alternative and green sources of energy like solar, wind and geothermal. In personal life, energy saving techniques and ecofriendly practices should be cultivated. We should prefer bicycles to go over short distances rather than motorcycles that spew emissions. Mass transport vehicles like city buses should be used for commuting between fixed destinations within a city to save fuel. Use of polythene bags should be avoided so as to preserve the quality of soil. We should refrain from interference with nature in all our activities and learn how to live in complete harmony with it. To remind us of all these facts and our commitments to safeguard our fragile environment and the basic life support system of our planet, June 5 is celebrated as the World Environment Day.

The war must end

Sir, This refers to "War completes 100 days," Orissa POST, June 4. For over 100 days now, the Russian invasion of Ukraine has caused human suffering, triggered a global food and commodity price crisis, and destabilised the global geopolitical order. It has strengthened the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, with newer members queuing up to join the bloc. And it has fundamentally weakened Moscow, which has failed to meet its war objectives. And the war shows no signs of ending, proving the old adage that conflicts may be easy to begin, but there is no knowing how they evolve or end. India, a friend and well-wisher of Russia, is still absorbing the costs of Moscow's misjudegment. Delhi wanted Washington and Moscow to get along in order to face an assertive Beijing; instead, the US and Russia are locked in a deep conflict. It did not want a Moscow that would be dependent on Beijing; instead. China, despite its stated ambivalence about the current moment, will remain among Russia's strongest allies when the war ends. India wanted a conducive post-pandemic economic climate to grow; instead, it is staring at a slowing of growth and spiralling inflation, which has political implications and narrows the government's strategic choices. India wants an end to the war, but has little ability to influence its outcome. All it can hope for is that better sense prevails in Moscow, which created the crisis; Washington moderate its ambitions and refrain from escalatory steps; and Kyiv, while preserving its sovereignty, recognises the limits of what it can achieve on the battlefield. The war must end.

K'taka mosque row: VHP stages protest

Mandya (Karnataka), June 4: Amid heightened security arrange ments, Vishwa Hindu Parishad (VHP) activists staged a demonstration in Srirangapatna town of the district here, demanding the Jamia mosque be returned to Hindus claiming that it was a Hanuman temple razed by the 18th century ruler Tipu Sultan.

Defying prohibitory orders imposed in the temple town under Section 144 of the CrPC to prevent any untoward incident, large number of Hindu activists took out a motorcycle rally heeding the call of VHP's 'Srirangapatna Chalo' campaign. Wearing saffron scarves turbans and saffron flags, the activists raised 'Jai Sri Ram' slogans. The activists recited 'Hanuman Chalisa' and 'Ram Bhajan' at a nearby temple.

According to the police, the protesters were barred from marching towards the mosque. No untoward incidents were reported in the town. Earlier in the day, Sriram Sena chief Pramod Muthalik condemned the ruling BJP government for imposing the restrictions in the town.

A Bajrang Dal activist from here Manjunath, who was part of the agitation, said that the mosque was a Hanuman temple with its gopuram (temple tower) razed by Tipu Sultan and it got converted into Jamia Masjid in Srirangapatna, which was the capital of the ruler of Mysore Kingdom.

"The mosque Archaeological Survey of India protected monument where no one should stay as per rule. However, nearly 100 people including some Bangladeshis reside there and a madrassa (Islamic seminary) also operates there, which is against the law," the activist claimed.

Sisodia targets Assam CM for PPE kit deal; Sarma denies

New Delhi, June 4: AAP leader Manish Sisodia Saturday alleged that Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma gave contracts to companies of his wife and son's business partners to supply PPE kits at "exorbitant rates" in 2020, a charge rebutted by the BJP leader who threatened to file a criminal defamation suit against him.

At a press conference in the national capital, Delhi Deputy Chief Minister Sisodia said two websites had collaborated on the story on the alleged "scam" and published it two days ago. Assam government spokesman Pijush Hazarika said the allegations against the Sarma family were "false, imaginary and malicious". He said there was no scam and asked why are the two media organisations were not going to the court if they have evidence.

Sisodia claimed that while the Assam government procured PPE kits at Rs 600 apiece from other companies, Sarma, who was then the state health minister, gave urgent supply orders to his "wife's firm, JCB Industries, and Meditime Healthcare, which belonged to a close associate," at Rs 990 apiece "taking advantage of the COVID-19 emergency".

"It is a major scam by the chief minister of Assam and his close associates. It is a solid corruption case and the ED is after (Satyendar) Jain who is working hard to provide quality healthcare to the residents of Delhi," Sisodia said. The

Hyd gangrape case: 2 arrested

Hyderabad, June 4: Hyderabad police Saturday arrested two juveniles in the sensational gang rape case, taking the total number to three. Now, the police teams are on the lookout for the remaining two accused.

On Friday, the police made the first arrest in the May 28 gang rape of the 17-year-old girl. Of the two juveniles, the police confirmed that one of them is the son of a VIP but declined to reveal the latter's name as this would lead to identification of the accused thus violating the rules. Deputy Commissioner of Police Joel Davis said two CCLs (Child in Conflict with Law) were arrested by Jubilee Hills

He said they were being produced before the Juvenile Court for their safe custody. "So far out of five accused persons identified, three are juveniles while one accused and two juveniles have been apprehended and efforts are on to arrest the remaining accused who are absconding," he said.

Though traced on Friday, one of the minors could not be apprehended as police clarified that rules didn't permit them to apprehend him during night hours. The DCP had told reporters on Friday night that five accused including two juveniles aged 16-17 have been identified. One of the major accused Saduddin Malik (18) was arrested on Friday while the police teams were searching for Omair Khan (18). Since the accused were not known to the victim and the crime was reported three days later, the accused escaped to other places.

Twitter, YouTube told to remove perfume ad

The I&B Ministry says the videos are 'detrimental to the portrayal of women in the interest of decency and morality'

New Delhi, June 4: The Information and Broadcasting (I&B) Ministry Saturday asked Twitter and YouTube to remove from their social media platforms the videos of advertisement of a perfume brand that triggered outrage for "promoting gangrape culture". In letters to Twitter and YouTube, the

Ministry of Information and Broadcasting said that the videos were "detrimental to the portrayal of women in the interest of decency and morality" and in violation of Information Technology (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media) Ethics Code. The videos of the perfume brand

Layer'r Shot sparked outrage among a large section of social media users, who claimed the advertisement sought to promote sexual violence against women.

'It has come to the notice of the Ministry of Information & Broadcasting that an inappropriate and derogatory advertisement of a deodorant is circulating on social media. The Ministry has asked Twitter



and YouTube to immediately pull down all instances of this advertisement," an official spokesperson said.

The ministry, in the letters to Twitter and YouTube, said that the Advertising Standards Council of India (ASCI) too has found the videos in violation of its guide lines and asked the advertiser to suspend the advertisement on an immediate basis. "Fuming at cringe worthy ads of the perfume 'Shot'. They show toxic masculinity in its worst form and clearly promote gang rape culture! The company owners must be held accountable. Have issued notice to Delhi Police and written letter to I&B Minister seeking FIR and strong action," Swati Maliwal, Chairperson on the Delhi Commission for Women said. "How does this kind of ads get approved, sick and outright disgusting. Is @layerr_shot full of perverts? Second ad with such disgusting content from Shot," said Rishita, who described herself as a social media influencer, on Twitter.

New Delhi, June 4: Despite the decline in infant mortality rate (IMR) over the past few decades, one in every 36 infants still dies within the first year of his/her life in India, according to official data.

The IMR, which is widely accepted as a crude indicator of overall health scenario of a country or a region, is defined as the infant deaths (less than one year) per 1,000 live births in a given time period and for a given region. According to the new data released by the Registrar General of India, the present level of IMR i.e. 28, for 2020, is less than one-fourth as compared to 129 in 1971.

In the last 10 years, the IMR has witnessed a decline of about 36 per cent and the



has declined from 44 to 28 in the last decade.

"The corresponding decline in rural areas is 48 to 31, and for urban areas it is from 29 to 19, thereby exhibiting about 35 per cent and 34 per cent decadal decline respectively," it said.

However, the bulletin said that "despite the decline in IMR over the last decades, one in every 36 infants die within first year of their life at the national level (ir-

respective of rural-urban)". In 2020, the maximum TMR has been reported from Madhya Pradesh (43) and the

minimum from Mizoram (3). The birth rate at the all-India level has declined drastically over the last five decades from 36.9 in 1971 to 19.5 in 2020, it said.

The rural-urban differential has also narrowed over these years. However, the birth rate has continued to be higher in rural areas compared to urban areas in the last five decades.

Birth rate has declined by about 11 per cent in the last decade, from 21.8 in 2011 to 19.5 in 2020. The corresponding decline in rural areas is 23.3 to 21.1 (about 9 per cent decline), and for urban areas it is from 17.6 to 16.1 (about 9 per cent decline). Birth rate is a crude measure of fertility of a population and is a crucial determinant of population growth.

New Delhi, June 4: As Mirzapur meets Mansa, the Gangs of Punjab have now hit national and international headlines, probably the biggest blowback of high profile gangland killings in a while similar to the erstwhile Bombay un derworld attacks many years ago As per media reports, now the terrorists' angle is coming into the stunning hit job on Punjabi singing superstar Sidhu Moosewala's murder. Sidhu Moosewala was said to have been shot dead by gangsters May 29 in Jawaharke village in a gruesome daylights assassination. Canada-based gangster Goldy Brar from the Lawrence Bishnoi gang claimed responsibility for the mur-

According to reports, it is also being revealed that the murder was carried out by Lawrence Bishnoi along with Harinder Singh Rinda, a Khalistani terrorist of Babbar Khalsa. It is suspected that the assassination of Sidhu Moosewala was carried out by an alliance of gangsters and terrorists. True Scoop reported. The SIT set up by Punjab DGP VK Bhavra has also been asked to look into this aspect of the alliance of terrorists and gangsters. According to sources, the Babbar Khalsa militants may have helped the gangsters in providing the weapons used to carry out the anti-social activities. Babbar Khalsa is already trying to terrorise Punjab for a long time. The recent incidents

the smuggling of arms are being done because they want to terrorise the people of Punjab. Terrorists, smugglers, and gangsters are working together to create an atmosphere of terror, the report said.

Harinder Singh Rinda is considered to be a key man of Babbar Khalsa and a new face of terrorism has emerged shortly. He was also named in the recent attack on the Mohali Intelligence Headquarters. Rinda was a gangster who later turned into a terrorist. His name has been associated with many terrorists and gangsters in the past. When it comes to the alliance of these gangsters and terrorists, it first came to knowledge in November 2016 when the terrorists and gangsters escaped from Nabha

When it comes to weapons, the gangsters nowadays have the latest technology weapons that are not easily available. It is noted that these weapons are being given to these gangsters only by terrorists. The gangster had also used the latest technology Russian weapon AN-94 in the murder of Sidhu

report said According to Central agencies, arms shipments have reached Punjab to such an extent that it is not easy for the police to deal with them. Terrorists and gangsters are currently using AN-94, Assault Rifle, C-30 Pistol, Beretta Pistol, GLOCK 17, and Rocket Propelled Grenade weapons. The Punjab Police also has some modern weapons but not enough to make them available to every police officer. In addition to AK-47, 303, ALR, and LMG, the Punjab Police has American Made Roger 38 bore However, the force has 1.25 lakh weapons on 82,000 counts which has not changed much. For the last few months, gang wars are increasing in Punjab. Their numbers surged and there was a spurt in extortion and loot, striking fear in the hearts of residents. 'Khalistan' returns to spook Punjab again

1.25 crore farmers, domestic consumers get power subsidy

Jaipur, June 4: Over 1.25 crore farmers and domestic electricity consumers have been benefitted the Rajasthan government has provided subsidies of Rs 1.044 crore. chief minister Ashok Gehlot

said Saturday Electricity bills of about 43 lakh consumers have now become zero. Power supply in the state has become smooth due to proactive and efficient management of the state government, according to an official statement.

Gehlot Saturday held a review meeting of the energy department at his residence, the statement said.

He said that the power supply remained normal despite scorching heat and the state has sufficient power to meet the demand during June and July.

The chief minister said that under the Mukhyamantri Kisan Mitra Yojana, a subsidy of Rs 291.54 crore has been given to over 12.66 lakh farmers on agricultural electricity connections.

To give relief in electricity bills to more than 1.15 crore domestic consumers of the state, a subsidy of Rs 752.58 crore has been given under the Chief Minister's Household Electricity Grant Scheme. Due to this, the electricity bills of about 36 lakh domestic consumers and 7 lakh farmers



have become zero.

Expressing concern over the problems being faced in coal supply. Gehlot said that the state government is making every effort to resolve it at the earliest in consul-

tation with the Centre. The chief minister said that at present irrigation of crops is going on in many parts of the state. Therefore, adequate supply of electricity should be ensured to the

Gehlot said that by 2024, 4.88 lakh farmers in the state would be given new agricultural electricity connections in a phased manner.

Governor returns third Bill presented by Gehlot govt

Jaipur, June 4: Rajasthan Governor Kalraj Mishra has returned a Bill which was presented in the Assembly to change the qualification requirements for the Vice Chancellor's post at the Haridev Joshi Journalism and Mass Communication University here.

According to information received, the Raj Bhavan has sent back the Bill saying that it needs to be re-examined keeping in mind the provisions of different regulatory bodies and the minimum

experience required. This was the third Bill of the government which was returned by the Raj Bhavan. The government had introduced the Journalism University Bill during the Assembly session. Under this Bill, a person having experience of 20 years in journalism in the public or private sector is allowed to become the Vice Chancellor of a journalism university. Till now, to become the Vice Chancellor in all universities, it was necessary to have a professor's experience of 10 years, but the government wanted to amend it.

New Delhi, June 4: Khalistan had become a thing of the past after India trudged on from the grisly period of peaking insurgency in Punjab, the assassination of a powerful Prime Minister, and the anti-Sikh riots that followed.

But certain occurrences in the past few months hint at the unearthing of a buried hatchet.

It was reported in February this year that pro-Khalistan groups like the proscribed Sikhs for Justice have been trying to rake up sentiments and revive the movement in Punjab. Expressions of anti-India sentiments from Canada are no secret, but India's big security concern lately has been this outfit which has a strong virtual presence and is able to radicalise a good number people to rebel against the government of India.

An NIA team reached Canada last November, to probe the funding channels of pro-Khalistan groups which can contribute to unrest in India. Reportedly, over one lakh USD was collected in the name of farmers' protests, as cited by officials. May 5, Haryana Police apprehended four people at a toll plaza in Karnal carrying three



IEDs weighing 2.5 kg each. May 8, flags of Khalistan were found affixed to the main entrance of the Himachal Pradesh Assembly

complex in Dharamsala. Himachal Pradesh Police booked SEJ leader Gurpatwant Singh Pannun under UAPA and sealed the state's borders

and beefed up security in the state citing pro-Khalistan activities. The outfit's announcement of a

Khalistan referendum day on June 6 has also been banned.

May 9, a Pakistan-made rocketpropelled grenade explosion was reported from the Punjab Police Intelligence headquarters in Mohali. just a day after the state police seized an IED loaded with RDX from Punjab's Tarn Taran district.

These developments gravely point to efforts of Khalistani elements to sow seeds of distrusts in India, and this is a concern niggling at India's security.

12 killed, 21 injured [←] in boiler explosion

Hapur (UP), June 4: At least 12 workers died and 21 were injured when a boiler exploded at a factory in western Uttar Pradesh's Hapur district Saturday afternoon, officials said.

There were around 30 people in the affected area at the factory in the UPSIDC industrial area in Dholana, around 80 km from the national capital, when the incident occurred, they said.

The impact of the explosion was so intense that the roofs of some of the factories located in the vicinity were damaged.

It took three hours for fire tenders to douse the blaze. Superintendent of Police of Hapur Deepak Bhuker said 12 people had died and 21 were injured and undergoing treatment.

"The factory was given the licence to manufacture electronic items. And now, it is a matter of probe what exactly was going on here. This is a sad incident. Forensic teams have reached here and are collecting samples," District Magistrate of Hapur Medha Roopam said.

"Our efforts are to ensure that the injured persons get the best medical treatment. Some of them have been referred to Safdarjung Hospital," she added.

Other factories in the area will be inspected, the district magistrate said, adding that action would also be taken against officials concerned if it was found in the probe that the incident took place due to their laxity. The factory is located adjacent to a CNG pump. Rescue and relief measures were taken up at the site, according to officials.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath expressed grief over the loss of lives.

Gangs across India upgrade their deadly arsenal

New Delhi, June 4: The murder of acclaimed Punjabi singer Shubhdep Singh Sidhu, popularly known as Sidhu Moosewala, has shocked probe agencies as the weapon used was an AN-94 Russian Assault rifle. This is the first time that the AN-94 has been used in a gang war as criminals would earlier carry out killings and encounters with AK-47s.

Sources said that the sophisticated assault rifles were being smuggled through Nepal, but the neighbouring nation had no clue about the AN-94 deliveries to India. The AN-94 is a Russian-made assault rifle, whose initials stand for 'Avtomat Nikonova' 1994 model.

The name Nikonova is homage to its chief designer, Gennadiy Nikonov, who had previously worked on the Nikonov machine gun. Intelligence agencies and police

are of the view that such sophisticated weapons are also being supplied to other state-based gangsters. They also doubt the involvement of an international racket. "Through the sea route in Mumbai. AK-47s were supplied many times, through Nepal border it were smuggled into other part of India. Even the security staff of Moosewala had the AK-47. But now we have to focus on the AN-94, its buyers and sellers in the underworld." the sources said. adding that such sophisticated



weapons can be procured only after making their payments via hawala channel. The AK-47 culture started with Mumbai's notorious D-Company led by underworld don Dawood Ibrahim in 1988. The Mumbai underworld had the AK-47 which they used in extortion, land grabbing and other criminal activities. In 1991, a shootout took place between the police and criminals of the Maya Dolas gang at the Lokhandwala Complex in which the latter were armed with the AK-47.

Several years later, the AK-47 culture reached Uttar Pradesh. Shri Prakash Shukla, an Indian gangster and contract killer active during the 1990s, used the AK-47. Shukla had threatened to kill BJP leader Kalyan Singh. Shukla, apart from land grabbing and extortion, murder. used to get railway contracts to earn money

The Uttar Pradesh Special Task Force, which was first formed in 1998 to kill Shukla, ultimately gunned him down on September 22 of that year. In 1997, BJP leader Brahm Dutt Dwivedi was killed by gangster Sanjeev Maheshwari using an AK-47.

On November 29, 2005, BJP MLA from Ghazipur Krishnanand Rai was killed by Munna Bajrangi, who also used an AK-47. In 2016, BJP leader Brijpal Tewatia was shot dead by car borne assailants using an AK-47. In Western Uttar Pradesh. a number of gangsters are using AK-47. The gangs who used to have this sophisticated weapons are Sundar Bhati and Randeep Bhati gang of Noida; Anil Dujana Gang; Vicky Tyagi of Muzaffarnagar; Sunil Rathi of Baghpat-Uttrakhand; and the Narender Fauji Gang. In Delhi, an AK-47 was recovered from former MLA Rambir Shokeen who was allegedly supporting hisnephew Neeraj Bawana, a dreaded gangster.

Saturday, the Counter-Terrorism Department of Punjab Police said: "Arrested terrorists Abdul Razziq and Sanaullah Sattar who were involved in Anarkali Blast were killed in a shootout with terrorists' companions."

Stabbing at Calif hosp: 1 arrested

Los Angeles: A man stabbed a doctor and two nurses inside a Southern California hospital emergency ward Friday and remained inside a room for hours before police arrested him, authorities said. The man walked into Encino Hospital Medical Center in the San Fernando Valley shortly before 4 pm, Los Angeles police Officer Drake Madison said.

Police patrol Hong Kong park to enforce vigil ban

Hong Kong, June 4: Heavy police force patrolled Hong Kong's Victoria Park on Saturday after authorities for a third consecutive year banned public commemoration of the anniversary of the deadly Tiananmen Square crackdown in 1989, with vigils overseas the only place marking the event.

For decades, Hong Kong and nearby Macao were the only places in China allowed to commemorate the violent suppression by army troops of student protesters demanding greater democracy in Beijing's Tiananmen Square on June 4, 1989. Hundreds, if not thousands, were killed.

The ban is seen as part of a move to snuff out political dissent and a sign that Hong Kong is losing its freedoms as Beijing tightens its grip over the semi-autonomous Chinese city.

The vigil organisers, the Hong Kong Alliance in Support of Patriotic Democratic Movements of China, disbanded last year after many of its leaders were arrested on suspicion of violating the national security law, which was imposed following massive pro-democ-



racy protests in 2019.

Authorities have cited risks from the coronavirus for banning the public commemoration over the past three years. Critics say the pandemic is used as an excuse to infringe on the right to assemble.

A government statement Friday said that parts of Victoria Park, which traditionally served as the venue for the candlelight vigil, will be closed as it may be used for "illegal activities.

The move was to "prevent any unauthorised assemblies" in the park and to reduce the possibility of COVID-19 spread.

Earlier in the week, a police superintendent warned that anyone who gathered in a group "at the same place, with the same time and with a common purpose to express certain views" could be considered part of an unauthorised assembly.

Despite the ban, some residents wore black in a silent show of support, and some even carried bouquets of flowers, held candles or turned on the flashlight on their cellphones.

'Today, this is to commemorate June 4th. Every year I have to do it," said Man Yuen, who appeared in a black T-shirt with the words "the people will not forget" while walking down the streets carrying an unlit candle

China plans to wrap up space station with latest mission

Beijing/Jiuquan, June 4: China will launch three astronauts on a spacecraft Sunday on a six-month mission to complete the construction of the country's space station currently orbiting the earth, China Manned Space Agency (CMSA) announced Saturday.

Astronauts Chen Dong, Liu Yang and Cai Xuzhe will travel on the Shenzhou-14 spaceflight which will dock with the Tiangong space station, currently under construction.

The Shenzhou-14 will be launched Sunday from the Jiuquan Satellite Launch Centre in the northwestern province of Gansu, sending three astronauts to its space station.

The mission will build the space station into a national space laboratory, said Lin Xiqiang, the deputy director of the CMSA.

The Shenzhou-14 crew will work with the ground team to complete the rendezvous, docking and transposition of the two lab modules with the core module, Lin said at a press conference.

They will enter the two lab modules for the first time and help make the environment suitable for their stay, he said, adding that they will unlock and install a dozen of scientific experiment cabinets in the two modules, Lin told the media in Jiuquan. This is the 2nd set of six astronauts China will be sending to build its space station.

Earlier, a three-member Chinese astronaut crew, which included a woman, returned to the earth in April after spending a record six months building vital parts of the space station which was expected to be ready by this year.

They had completed the verifi-

cation of key technologies of its space station, according to the CMSA. Once ready, China will be the only country to own a space station. The International Space Station (ISS) of Russia is a collaborative project of several countries.

China Space Station, (CSS) is also expected to be a competitor to

the ISS built by Russia. Observers say CSS

may become the sole space station to remain in orbit once the ISS retires in the coming years.

In February, China unveiled an ambitious plan for its burgeoning space industry which included

over 50 space launches and six manned space flights to complete the building of its space station.

The China Aerospace Science and Technology Corporation (CASC) said China will carry out more than 50 space launches in 2022, sending over 140 space-





8 EV makers adopt US govt recommendation

Washington, June 4: Eight electric vehicle manufacturers have adopted a recommendation by the US National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB) on improving their emergency response guidelines and incorporating vehicle-specific information for fighting high-voltage lithium-ion battery fires.

Honda, Hyundai, Mitsubishi, Porsche, Proterra, Van Hool, Volkswagen and Volvo have successfully completed the actions asked for in the NTSB recommendation, the agency said in a statement.

NTSB issued the recommendation in January 2021 to 22 electronic car manufacturers.

Twelve manufacturers (BMW, BYD, Stellantis, formerly Fiat Chrysler Automobiles US, Ford, General Motors, Gillig, Kia, Mercedes-Benz, Nissan, Subaru, Tesla and Toyota) are making progress on the steps identified in the recommendation.

Two manufacturers, Nova Bus Corporation and Karma Automotive, have not yet responded.

"Our recommendation is a simple but powerful action that can save the lives of first responders and crash victims alike. I congratulate the eight electric vehicle manufacturers that have stepped up and call on the remaining 14 companies to implement our recommendation immediately," Jennifer added.

The recommendation was issued over two main safety issues. The first issue is the inadequacy of vehicle manufacturers' emergency response guides and the secresearch related to high-voltage lithium-ion batteries involved in high-speed, high-severity crashes.

Fires in electric vehicles powered by high-voltage lithium-ion batteries pose the risk of electric shock to emergency responders from exposure to the high-voltage components of a damaged lithiumion battery.

"A further risk is that damaged cells in the battery can experience thermal runaway - uncontrolled increases in temperature and pressure - which can lead to battery reignition," said the US agency.

The risks of electric shock and battery reignition/fire arise from the "stranded" energy that remains in a damaged battery.

'CANARY IN THE COAL MINE' Musk's warning signals a recession in auto industry: Report

Washington, June 4: Tesla CEO Elon Musk's super bad feeling about the economy could be the auto industry's canary in the coalmine moment, signaling a recession for an industry whose bosses have shown no signs of

Musk said the electric carmaker needed to cut about 10% of its workforce in an email to executives seen by Reuters. He later told staff that white-collar ranks were bloated and he would keep hiring workers

to make cars and batteries. Musk's warning is the first loud

and public dissent in a united stance by the auto industry that underlying demand for cars and trucks remains strong despite two years of global pandemic. One executive this week called demand sky high.

"Tesla's not your average canary in the coal mine. It's more like a whale in the lithium mine," Morgan Stanley analyst Adam Jonas said in a research note, referring to the metal used in EV

If the world's largest EV company warns on jobs and the economy, investors should reconsider their forecasts on margins and topline growth, he added. Tesla stock



fell 9%. The auto sector was hit two vears ago by the onset of the Covid-19 pandemic, which forced the closure of factories. That shutdown subsequently played a role in the semiconductor chip shortage that further

hobbled vehicle production.

Now supply-chain snarls, exacerbated by Russia's invasion of Ukraine, have dragged down sales. US new-car sales in May finished at a weak annualized rate of 12.68 million, according to Wards Intelligence. That's a far cry from the glory days of 17 million a year pre-Covid.

Those issues mostly affect supply, however, while inflation is a threat to demand.

Risk of recession is high, so what he is saying certainly isn't extreme, Jeff Schuster, president of global forecasting at LMC Automotive, said of Musk.



DENMARK UPSET FRANCE

Brussels, June 4: Denmark stunned titleholder France 2-1 in their opening Nations League match at the Stade de France, ending the World Champions' sevenmatch winning streak.

After Karim Benzema put the hosts in front, substitute Andreas Denmark their first win over France since the 2002 World Cup. Cornelius levelled with a fine volley then hit the winner in the 88th minute.

France were unbeaten in their past 20 matches. It will next travel to Croatia, which lost to Austria 3-0 at home in Group A1.

Meanwhile, Memphis Depay scored twice as the Netherlands produced its first win against bitter rival Belgium in 25 years by 4-1 in Brussels, in another group of the top-tier League A.

A week after the Champions League final was marred by crowd chaos, there were no reported incidents at the Stade de France this

France was under pressure in the opening 10 minutes but gradually found the right balance and created its first good chance in the 13th minute through Benzema, back at the Stade de France a week after he claimed the Champions League trophy for Real Madrid.

break. He had an immediate impact and in the 51st minute set up Benzema, who dribbled his way past defenders and shot low for his 37th international goal.

But Cornelius beat the offside trap and volleyed into the net in the 68th. Christian Eriksen came close in the closing stages but France

Denzel Dumfries made it 3-0 in the 61st, and Depay completed his brace soon after from Daley Blind. Michy Batshuayi scored a consolation goal in stoppage time.

Match tickets sold out in 10 minutes

Kolkata, June 4: Tickets for India's upcoming Asian Cup qualifying round match against Cambodia at the Salt Lake Stadium June 8 were sold out within 10 minutes, forcing the AIFF to issue more.

Chhetri had Friday urged the state government authorities to allow more people than the mere 12,000 tickets allowed for the Asian Cup qualifiers final round matches.

While the All India Football Federation has made all the tickets "complimentary", the state government has "allowed just 12,000 tickets" in the 70,000-capacity Salt Lake Stadium to avoid any law and order problem.

"They (opposition teams) should feel it. If in a stadium of almost 90,000 people if only 10-15,000 what's the point of having a home advantage?" Chhetri had asked. "I hope they (state government) will allow it, otherwise it will be a chaos and they will barge in."

Back at the football-crazy Kolkata for their Asian Cup qualifiers, Chhetri, who will complete 17 years of International football June 12, said the fans can make a "massive difference" at the 70,000-capacity Salt Lake Stadium. "I mean I genuinely love you guys. With you guys behind us, it's a different level," the star Indian forward said in his message posted on the Indian Football Team's Twitter handle.

"Let the three teams that are going to play against us, play against us plus you, because that will be a massive difference. So, if you're free, please come. We will try to make it a good experience for you guys," he had added. "Last time, when we played here we played

against Bangladesh, there were 50,000+ of you in the stadium. I cannot tell you how happy we were.'

Apologising for their result, Chhetri promised that the Blue Tigers would make up for the disappointment last time. "We couldn't get a result as good as the support you gave. Apologies, because we didn't do well. But please come again this time. We'll try our best to put in the best effort that we can," he concluded.

After Chhetri's reaction made headlines, there was a meeting between the state government and the AIFF this morning and it was "decided to open up the stadium as long as there's demand".

'Whoever quoted the number 12,000, spoke out of his hat, it's all rubbish. There was never any restriction from the West Bengal government. The whole stadium was open to the public," a reliable source, who attended the meeting, told this agency.

"But, the AIFF initially decided to issue 20,000 tickets to assess the interest. Each ticket costs Rs 5 and since it's complimentary, the AIFF will have to incur the loss. The AIFF will never deprive any fan to watch the match. We will keep issuing tickets till the last seat is available in the stadium. More the merrier," added the source.

During India's Intercontinental Cup campaign in Mumbai, Chhetri also had made a passionate appeal in the social media to come and support the national team at the stadium. India's second and third matches are slated against Afghanistan (June 11) and Hong Kong (June 14) and tickets for which would be available from June 8 and 11 respectively
