Man kills wife, slits daughter's throat

■ A 45-yr-old man in City enters into a heated exchange with his wife and knifes her to death while attacking his six-year-old daughter

Bhubaneswar, June 9: A 45-year-old man killed his wife and grievously injured his six-year-old daughter by slitting her throat over suspected family feud in Ghatikia area of the City here, Thursday.

Sources said Sanjit Das, the accused, had married Saraswati Das of the same locality around eight years ago. Saraswati used to work as a nurse in a nearby hospital while Sanjit, a lazy bum, is addicted to drugs and alcohol.

A jobless Sanjit used to borrow money from the near and dear ones for consuming alcohol and brown sugar. The family members had also admitted him to a deaddiction centre a few years back, but to no effect, said a source.

The couple entered into a heated argument in the wee hours of Thursday. Soon, a mountain was made out of a molehill and an infuriated Sanjit attacked Saraswati with a knife, killing her

year-old daughter's throat. Before fleeing the scene, Sanjit informed his mother

about the gruesome episode. Family members informed the police about the incident, it was learnt.

"We got a call from Sanjit's family members who informed us about the brutal incident. The couple also has

mitted to a private medical college and hospital here where her condition is stated to be stable," said DCP Prateek Singh, who reached the spot along with senior police officials and a forensic team. The police have recovered the knife used for the assault, it was learnt. According to a senior police official, Sanjit was unhappy with his wife for having two daughters.

Later in the day, police found Sanjit roaming in the locality and arrested him.

Presidential poll July 18

NO POLITICAL PARTY WILL BE ALLOWED TO ISSUE ANY KIND OF WHIP: EC

New Delhi, June 9: Election for the next President of India will be held July 18 in which 4,809 electors comprising MPs and MLAs will vote to elect incumbent Ram Nath Kovind's successor, the Election Commission announced Thursday.

Going by its strength in Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha, as well as in many state assemblies, the BJP is in a comfortable position to ensure the victory of the candidate nominated by it in the upcoming election.

The nominations can be filed after the issue of notification June 15 and can be filed till June 29, Chief Election Commissioner Rajiv Kumar said at a press conference. Kovind's term ends July 24 and an election for the next president has to be held before that day.

Kumar said the EC is fully geared to conduct the election in a free and fair way, while all Covid-related safety protocol would be followed during the voting and counting of votes. He further said that no political party will be allowed to issue any kind of whip. Scrutiny of nominations will take place June 30 and the last date for withdrawal of nominations will be July 2.

If necessary, the voting will take place July 18 and counting of votes July 21. Kumar said the total number of electors for the election will be 4,809 - 776 MPs and 4,033 MLAs. Voting for presidential election will take place in Parliament and the premises of state assemblies, while Rajya Sabha Secretary-General will be the returning officer. Normally, MPs cast their vote in Parliament and MLAs in their respective state assemblies.

ALL EYES ON **NAVEEN**

Bhubaneswar: With the announcement of dates for the prestigious presidential election, all eves are on the move of BJD supremo and Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik, who alone can ensure smooth victory for the BJP-led NDA candidate. Currently, opposition parties collectively have 51.1 per cent share of the electoral college, while the BJP and its alliance have 48.9 per cent. The NDA needs only 1.2 per cent to cross the halfway mark. With 21 MPs (12 in Lok

Sabha and nine in Rajya Sabha) and 114 MLAs in Assembly, the BJD has 2.9 per cent of votes in its kitty. So, the BJD is going to play a crucial role in the poll, it was learnt. The ruling party has not disclosed its card yet for the election to the top position in India. The CM had earlier stated that he will take a decision looking into the profile of the candidates for the election. Notably, the BJD had

supported non-UPA candidates

for the presidential poll during the last two elections held in 2017 and 2012. In 2020, Naveen supported NDA candidate Harivansh Narayan Singh in the election to the deputy chairman of Rajya Sabha. The party had also supported UPA candidate Gopalkrishna Gandhi during the vice-presidential poll in 2017.

If there is an emergency, the EC would need to be informed 10 days in advance for MPs to vote in a state assembly or for MLAs to vote in Parliament complex, Kumar said.

The President is elected by the members of the electoral college consisting of elected members of both houses of Parliament, and elected members of the legislative assemblies of states including the National Capital Territory of Delhi and the Union Territory of Puducherry.

Das Wednesday suggested that customers borrowing from unregistered digital lending apps should approach the local police in case of any issue. Most of the digital lending apps are not registered with the central bank and operate by them-

selves, he told reporters. Das said whenever it gets a complaint from any customer, the central bank directs customers of such unregistered apps to approach the local police, which will conduct an investigation and

take necessary action on the issue "It is my humble request to all those using such apps to first check if the app is RBI registered or not. If the app is RBI registered, the central bank will act immediately in case of any misdoing, I assure you," he had said.

Minors die as sand mound caves in

KENDRAPARA: Two minor boys died after a mound of sand caved in on them while they were playing near a pond at Magur Gandapatna village under Sadar police limits in the district, police said Thursday. The deceased were identified as Surendra Chamia, 11, son of Budharam Chamia and Surendra Jika, 7, son of Bula Jika of the locality. According to locals, the incident occurred Wednesday evening. Suddenly, a portion of mound of sand collapsed on them. They got buried under it. Family members launched a search operation after the duo did not return home in the evening. After finding the two buried under sand late in the night, family members rushed them to the DHH where doctors pronounced them brought dead.

Ex-tehsil official held after 6 yrs

BHUBANESWAR: Vigilance sleuths Thursday arrested a former nazir of Jajpur tehsil, who was on the run since 2016 in connection with his alleged involvement in the misappropriation of government funds to the tune of ₹4.95 crore. The irregularity by Rajat Kumar Routray was noticed during an audit in 2016. On the basis of the audit report, Vigilance had initiated an inquiry into the case. It found that Routray, in connivance with a few other staffers of the tehsil, was involved in the fraud during the period from April 2006 to April 2016, said Vigilance SP (Cuttack) Akshaya Kumar Mishra. When Routray's involvement in the case came to the fore, he managed to remain incognito.





Stampede-like situation for tickets ahead of T20

Cuttack, June 9: Tension prevailed near the Barabati Stadium here Thursday following a stampede like situation after cricket fans jostled for space to buy tickets for the India-South Africa T20 match to be held Sunday.

As per reports, police resorted to mild lathi charge to control the crowd

There was a brief quarrel between fans after some complained that a section of people had broken the queue. This led to scuffle and exchange of blows. There were also heated arguments involving some women after a section of those standing in the queue complained that several others had jumped

The offline ticket counters opened from 9am, but people had made a beeline from



dawn. Many women had to jostle for space to buy tickets even at counters meant especially for them.

"I have been standing from 6 am. But some came after 9 and jumped the queue," a native of Cuttack complained.

"A huge crowd had gathered and a few were seen breaking the queues, following which police had to intervene. There was a mild lathi charge to bring order," said ACP Ajay Das.

Around 12,093 offline tickets will be available for the public including 1,362 expensive tickets and 10,731 gallery tickets. The Odisha

Cricket Association (OCA) has set up nine counters to sell the tickets, out of that seven counters are for male and for the first time, the state cricket body has made two dedicated ticket counters for female fans.

One person can buy max imum two tickets by producing any of his/her identity proofs. A total of 5,000 tickets were sold online while 8.000 tickets were sold to clubs schools and other organisa tions associated with the OCA.

A broad range of security arrangements including the deployment of as many as 12 platoons of police force have been made to tackle any kind of untoward situation.



BJD unhappy over 'paltry' hike in paddy MSP

Bhubaneswar, June 9: A day after the Centre announced a hike of Rs 100 per quintal on paddy, raising the minimum support price (MSP) to Rs 2,040, the ruling BJD in Odisha expressed its dissatisfaction over the move and demanded that the amount be further increased to Rs 2,930 per quintal

BJD national spokesperson Sasmit Patra, at a press conference here, said the rise in MSP of the common grade variety of paddy was 'insufficient'.

"The BJD had been demanding a 1.5-time MSP rise over the cost of production of paddy, as per the recommendations of the Swaminathan Commission. The Centre. however, did not pay any heed." the BJD MP said.

He pointed out that the Odisha Assembly had unanimously passed a resolution on March 25, 2017, recommending Rs 2,930 per quintal as MSP of common paddy.

EOW urges Google to drop 45 fake loan apps from Play Store

Bhubaneswar, June 9: The Economic Offences Wing (EOW) of state crime Branch has asked Google Inc, popular information technology firm of USA, to immediately remove 45 fake loan apps from the Google Play Store, a digital distribution service platform operated by the tech giant.

In a letter sent to the Legal Investigations Support Team of Google Inc in California, the EOW informed that these fake apps have been violating the guidelines of Google as well as the Reserve Bank of India (RBI).

The apps include Beloan App, Go Cash, Go Go loan, INS Loan, Asan Loan, Fast cash/ Cash Fast, Flip cash, Rupee Wallet, Rupee King, Fast Rupee, Easy Credit Loan, Cash Cola, Infinity, Sunshine, Agile loan, AGLONR, Credit wallet, OB cash loan, On stream App, Money tree, Discover loan, Cash pocket, Hello



rupee, Small credit, Money house/Crystal loan, Fresh loan, Cash room, Pesin Bee, Life stream loan, Star loan, Yes rupee, Eslite loan, Ariaeko loan, Fast coin/ cash advance, Lucky rupee/quick loan/bike loan/cash market/money loan, Fair credit loan, Ok rupee loan. Hone loan/rupee tiger/get a cash/little borrow/rich cash, Rupee spark, More cash/fish loan, Flash rupee, Dhani loan, Magic money loan, Money voult, Instant loan/Dutta bike loan/mobile loan.

"These apps have been illegally providing short term loans at very high interest rates. These apps are not authorised by RBI to do so. Besides, these loan apps are using illegal methods of harassing, threatening, blackmailing, using extremely filthy languages in order to extort money from victims. They are also harassing their friends/relatives as these loan apps get access to the entire contact list of the victim. Many other state police in India are investigating such cases as well. It is also reported that many people have committed suicide because of such illegal, humiliating and torturous activities by these loan apps,' wrote EOW.

Google guidelines prohibit the operation of any app which involves in harassment, blackmailing, and threatening people. The apps available on the Play Store have to follow the local laws and respect the privacy of the users.— These fake loan apps have been flouting all these guidelines.

Govt health institutes will get composite facility centres: CS

Bhubaneswar, June 9: With an aim to provide of basic allied facilities to people and medical staff, the state government has decided to develop composite facility centers in all government medical college and hospitals in Odisha

Chief Secretary Suresh Chandra Mahapatra Thursday asked the Health and Family Welfare department to prepare a detailed proposal for building such facilities, where permanent Aahar Kendra attendant rest shed, ATM, OMFED stall and food cafeteria will be made available under one roof for pa tients as well as health staff.

He directed the officials to design the rest shed in such a manner that attendants can stay there when the patients are in hospital. The rest shed should have proper toilet fa cilities, said the Chief Secretary.

Mahapatra made it clear that the cafeteria should have a common eating space with three to four counters serving different kinds of food. Proper hygiene and cleanliness in food preparation and serving should be strictly maintained in these counters, he said.

The Health department was also directed to prepare the layout plan in 15 days for consideration of the

OPF demands self defense training to state girl students

Bhubaneswar, June 9: The Odisha Parents' Federation (OPF) Thursday wrote a letter to the state School and Mass Education (S&ME) department and the Higher Education (HE) department demanding self defense training to girl students in Plus II and Plus III colleges in state.

In a letter to HE department sec retary Saswat Mishra and S&ME secretary Bishnupada Sethi, OPF chairman Basudev Bhat said that in 2013, the state government had decided to impart self-defense skill to 2.5 lakh college-going girls to boost their self confidence. The objective has not been achieved fully.

He also wrote that Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik had declared that the girl students of Plus II and Plus III colleges would be given the said training. While 200 trainers were to be selected from college level, another 100 were to come from Odisha Police, and the self defense course would kick off in all over the state but the government has not met the target yet.

Bhatt wrote that the self defense training was essential for girls in view of the rise of crimes against women in state and the training would boost the confidence of female students. "Recently, a report stated that girl students are being forced to come to Bhubaneswar for self defense training, which is not possible for many who live in far away districts. In this situation, we propose to involve physical education teachers of schools, colleges and create female master trainers in self defense courses, aiming to reach out to all schools and colleges in state. We also request the government to include Khelo India concept in the initiative and create thousands of female self defense master trainers," the letter read.

In a high-level meeting chaired by CM Naveen Patnaik in 2013, the decision to provide self-defense training to 2.5 lakh girls from state colleges in the next six months was taken. The spurt in incidents of rapes and violence against women in the country has prompted various state and central authorities to initiate measures to ensure their safety and security.

Also in 2020, the HE department had decided to engage reputed and experienced martial arts institutes or sports organisations to provide self-defense training to collegegoing girls.

New Nationalism

The euphoria after the fall of the Berlin Wall in 1989 was not just about what Francis Fukuyama called an "unabashed victory of economic and political liberalism." It was also about the decline of nationalism. With the world economy rapidly becoming more integrated, it was assumed that people would leave their national identities behind. The project of European integration - embraced enthusiastically by well-educated, upwardly mobile young people - was not just supranational, but post-national.

But nationalism is back, and it is playing a central role in global politics. The trend is not confined to the United States or France, where former President Donald Trump and the far-right National Rally leader Marine Le Pen, respectively, lead new nationalist coalitions. Nationalism is also driving populist movements in Hungary, India, Turkey, and many other countries. China has embraced a new nationalist authoritarianism, and Russia has launched a nationalist war aimed at eradicating the Ukrainian nation.

There are at least three factors fueling the new nationalism. First, many of the affected countries have historical grievances. India was systematically exploited by the British under colonialism, and the Chinese Empire was weakened, humiliated, and subjugated during the nineteenth-century Opium Wars. Modern Turkish nationalism is animated by memories of Western occupation of large parts of the country after

Second, globalisation increased pre-existing tensions. Not only did it deepen inequalities in many countries (often in unfair ways, by enriching those with political connections); it also eroded longstanding traditions and social norms.

And, third, political leaders have become increasingly skilled and unscrupulous in exploiting nationalism to serve their own agendas. For example, under Chinese President Xi Jinping's authoritarian rule, nationalist sentiment is being cultivated through new highschool curricula and propaganda campaigns.

Similarly, under Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi's regime, the world's largest democracy has succumbed to majoritarian illiberalism. In Turkey, President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan initially eschewed nationalism, even spearheading a peace process with the Kurds in the early 2010s. But he has since embraced nationalism wholeheartedly and cracked down on independent media, opposition leaders, and

Today's nationalism is also a self-reinforcing reaction to the post-Cold War project of globalisation. In 2000, then-presidential candidate George W. Bush described free trade as "an important ally in what Ronald Reagan called 'a forward strategy for freedom' ... Trade freely with China, and time is on our side." The hope was

that global trade and communication would lead to cultural and institutional convergence. And as trade became more important, Western diplomacy would become more potent, because developing countries would fear losing access to American and European markets and finance

It has not worked out that way. Globalisation was organised in ways that created big windfalls for developing countries that could reorient their economies toward industrial exports while also keeping wages down (the secret sauce of China's rise), and for emerging economies rich in oil and gas. But these same trends have empowered charismatic nationalist leaders.

As well-placed developing countries have accumulated more resources they have acquired a greater ability to carry out propaganda and build coalitions. But even more important has been the ideological dimension. Because Western diplomacy has increasingly come to be seen as a form of meddling (a perception with some justification), efforts to defend human rights, media freedom, or democracy in many countries have proved either ineffective or

In Turkey's case, the prospect of accession to the European Union was supposed to improve the country's human rights record and reinforce its democratic institutions. And for a while, it did. But as the demands from EU representatives multiplied, they became fodder for Turkish national ism. The accession process stalled, and Turkish democracy has been weakening ever since.

The nationalism fueling Russia's invasion of Ukraine reflects the same three factors listed above. Many Russian political and security elites believe that their country has been humiliated by the West ever since the fall of the Berlin Wall. Russia's integration into the world economy has brought few benefits to its population while furnishing unimaginable riches to a cadre of politically connected, unscrupulous, often criminal oligarchs. And though Russian President Vladimir Putin presides over a vast system of clientelism, he skillfully cultivates and exploits nationalist sentiment.

Russian nationalism is bad news for Ukraine, because it has allowed Putin to make his regime more secure than it otherwise would have been. Sanctions or no sanctions, he is unlikely to be toppled, because he is protected by cronies who share his interests and nationalist sentiments. If anything, isolation may further strengthen Putin's hand. If the war does not weaken his regime, it could continue indefinitely, regardless of how much it dam-

This era of resurgent nationalism offers some lessons. We may need to rethink how we organise the processes of economic globalisation. There is no doubt that open trade can be beneficial for developing and developed economies alike. But while trade has reduced prices for Western consumers, it has also multiplied inequalities and enriched oligarchs in Russia and Communist Party hacks in China. Capital, rather than labour, has been the main beneficiary.

We therefore need to consider alternative approaches. Above all, trade arrangements must no longer be dictated by multinational corporations that profit from arbitraging artificially low wages and unacceptable labour standards in emerging markets. Nor can we afford to base trade relations on the cost advantages created by cheap, subsidised fossil fuels.

Moreover, the West may need to accept that it cannot reliably influence its trading partners' political trajectories. It also needs to create new safeguards to ensure that corrupt, authoritarian regimes do not influence its own politics. And, most importantly, Western leaders should recognise that they will gain more credibility in international affairs if they acknowledge their own countries' past misbehaviour during both the colonial era and the Cold War.

Recognising the West's limited influence on others' politics does not mean condoning human-rights abuses. But it does mean that Western governments should adopt a new approach, curtailing official engagement while relying more on civil-society action through organisations such as Amnesty International or Transparency International. There is no silver bullet to vanquish nationalist authoritarianism, but there are better options to counter it.

THE QUESTION **TO INVESTIGATE IS WHY INDIA AND CHINA ELICIT HIGHLY DISPROPORTIONATE REACTIONS FROM THE ISLAMIC WORLD**

ome remarks, clearly avoidable, made in a TV channel by a BJP spokesperson in reference to Prophet Mohammad triggered a storm. It also incurred the wrath of several Islamic countries. The reactions are coming in terms of summoning Indian ambassadors, avoiding official meetings, and boycotting Indian goods. The Government of India has clarified its position. The BJP has disowned the spokesperson making those comments. The law enforcement agencies have swung into action to contain the fallouts and punish the guilty by registering FIRs from both sides -against the person who made the remark, and against those issuing death threats to the offender.

Under normal circumstances, the leadership in India and in the countries in reference should have let the controversial episode rest as the legal procedures are taken to a logical conclusion. But that is not to be. Politics in any country including India is charged with emotions, polarisation, vindictiveness, and baying for blood. It is a sad commentary on the state of affairs, managed, rather mismanaged by the leadership that be.

However, since the issue has resumed international dimension. I would like to focus in this piece on the differential approach of Islamic countries, at least a prominent few, to India and China. Both countries in the Asia-Pacific are viewed as rivals which is not untrue. Yet, the question to investigate is, why India and China elicit highly disproportionate reactions from the Islamic world.

To illustrate the above, India, of late, is being portrayed as being polarised on the lines of religions and ethnicity. This is more so after the BJP came to power since 2014. This perception however is debatable and is being vigorously contested in the political domain in the country. The BJP-led government is claiming to take everybody along the path of progress and prosperity (Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas), whereas the Opposition

parties strenuously contest this accusing BJP of being partisan, and sectarian. Such political controversies and ideological contests are not uncommon in democracies. Factually though, there is no widespread violence in the country despite some contested structural changes.

But look at Communist China, the persecution of religious minorities is deep and distressing; be it Tibetan Buddhists, Christians or Uvghur Muslims, all of whom have been systematically repressed and subjugated by the Communist Party of China. In particular, rampant abuse of and inhuman treatment to Uvghur Muslims in Xinjiang province has shocked the human conscience. What is more, Beijing's so-called 're-education' is diabolically repulsive; aimed at eradicating Islamic beliefs of the Uyghur community and at changing the demographic composition in the region.

Intriguingly, the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation (OIC), Pakistan and Turkey, who claim to be champions of Islam have not protested, not spoken a word. Is it not that these countries regard their economic relations with China more important than defending the human rights of the **Uvghur Muslims?**

After the twin-tower attack in

New York, there were worldwide efforts to curb terrorism. As a result of such collaborations and consensus, some Uyghur separatist movements like ETIM, TIP, ETLO and so on, were labelled as terrorist groups by the UN and the US State Department. The CCP grabbed this opportunity to suppress the growing Islamic radicalisation in Xinjiang province. Furthermore, CCP treated every form of dissent against the PRC as

an act of extremism. Surprisingly, the human rights violations and despicable acts of torture of Uyghur religious activists, did not draw any sharp reaction from the Muslim world. While they talk about Palestine and Kashmir, and the persecution of Muslims in India, they did not talk about the sufferings of Uyghurs in China. When Pakistan's Prime Minister Imran Khan was questioned about the Uvghur persecution, he said. "Frankly I do not know much about it." Turkish President, Recep Tayyip Erdogan shockingly claimed that Uyghurs live happily in Xinjiang. Malaysia's former Prime Minister Mahathir Mohamad suggested that, "China should not be antagonised as it is beneficial to us."

The comment by Mahathir is the crux of comparison in this piece. India becomes an easy target be cause of its weaker economy than

China, and secondly, New Delhi, not projecting or marketing its democratic credentials. Let us be crystal clear that India can compete with China only by catching up with China with a rapidly growing economy, and consolidating and canvassing its democratic politics based on human rights, social justice, pluralism, equality, freedom and accountability.

Looking at these two determinants of India's foreign policy, especially vis-à-vis China, and of course, the rest of the world, the growth rate of GDP has been consistently declining since 2016 despite the assertions to the contrary Prime Minister Modi's announcement in 2019 of India hitting a \$5 trillion economy by 2024 could not be achieved without major reforms. From 2019 to 2024, the economy needed to grow at 14.8 per cent to reach the promised target. It has not been anywhere near it.

What the Indian economy needs today is a fresh policy based on clear targets and priorities. Without economic growth and distribution leading to alleviation of poverty, India would not achieve its aspiration of becoming a major power, let alone countering China, and attracting equal world attention as that of Beijing.

The second imperative is consolidation of democracy, which is the USP of India's foreign policy. In every country democracy is based mainly on four pillars - free and fair elections, a Constitution, abided by all citizens, integrity and independence of institutions, and finally the accountability of those in power. Mere elections are not adequate for democracy.

To conclude, the cascading complaints by the Islamic countries against comments made by a lightweight spokesperson of BJP point to the fact that they do not treat India with awe as they do to China. This is the lesson New Delhi must draw from this avoidable unsavoury episode of a TV talk-show last week

Economic growth: Missing the majority

and the overall growth recorded for the financial year 2021-22 is estimated at 8.7%. It seems the government is happy with the growth numbers, particularly in the light of the contraction of 6.6% that the country witnessed in the financial vear 2021.

According to the CSO's report, the private consumption expenditure grew by 7.9 per cent, reflecting some impact of pent-up demand. The eight core infrastructure industries (coal, steel, cement, fertilizer, electricity, natural gas, refinery products and crude oil) grew by 8.5 per y-o-y in April 2022 which was the six-month high. Experts from different quarters too have endorsed that most of the economic indicators have emerged higher than their pre-COVID days. The fall, if any, was attributed to the Omicron-led third wave and the ubiquitous Ukraine war.

However, when one shifts the focus to the millions at the bottom of the pyramid, we get a different picture. A picture of widening gap between the rich and poor, starving majority, and unemployed youth. It is not out of place to remember the statement of former RBI governor Dr D Subba Rao. The income inequality can also be attributed to wealth inequality. The top 10% of the population owns 65% of the total wealth and top 1% owns 33% of total wealth of the country. Income inequality shows present poor-economic status of the majority, and the wealth inequality on the other hand, sends a signal that economic inequality will continue to haunt us in future too.

The recent soaring prices of almost all products further aggravate the problems for the poor. The retail inflation touched an eight-year high of 7.79% in April 2022. It is even higher than the upper limit of RBI's tolerance band for the fourth consecutive month. Inflation increases poverty: therefore, it is being called the 'cruelest tax' on the poor. One needs to talk to one's domestic help or the driver or the street vendor to understand how difficult it has become to meet the day-to-day expenses. Today's inflation affects tomorrow's life for poor people. High prices keep the poor away from good quality food and the affect of which will be seen only in the future. Increase in the prices of essential commodities made even tomatoes, onions, and lemons be-

The disturbing fact is that policies in the direction of reducing economic inequality are often conspicuous by their absence. It is very clear that the economic policies of governments, both present and the previous, have benefited the rich (minority) rather than the poor (majority) even though, the policymakers depend on the poor to get the votes to remain in the power. Let us make policies that will enable us to celebrate prosperity-for-all, not prosperity-for-some.

How long we can go on talking about the bottom of the pyramid? It is time for our policymakers to follow the principle of "the greatest good for the greatest number" in the true spirit as was proposed by the English philosopher Jeremy Bentham (1748-1832). Let us make India a \$5 trillion economy by reducing income and wealth inequality



New Delhi, June 9: Delhi Police has registered two FIRs - one against former BJP spokesperson Nupur Sharma and the other against 31 people, including AIMIM chief Asaduddin Owaisi and controversial priest Yati Narsinghanand - for allegedly spreading hate and hurting religious sentiments, officials said Thursday.

The two FIRs were registered Wednesday after an analysis of social media, they said. Former Delhi BJP media unit head Naveen Kumar Jindal, who was expelled from the party over alleged remarks against Prophet Mohammad, and journalist Saba Nagyi, are among the people named in the second FIR.

The cases have been registered

against those who were posting and sharing messages against the maintenance of public tranquility and were inciting people on the basis of divisive lines," a senior police officer said. The cases have been registered under sections 153 (wantonly giving provocation with intent to cause riot), 295 (injuring or defiling place of worship with intent to insult the religion of any class), and 505 (statements conducing to public mischief) of the Indian Penal Code, he said. Reacting to the FIR. All India Majlis-e-Ittehadul Muslimeen (AIMIM) chief Owaisi said that he will not be intimidated by these tactics, asserting that criticising hate speech and giving hate speeches cannot be equated. Owaisi attacked Prime Minister Narendra Modi, alleging that if he were sincere, he would have stamped out

Remarks do not reflect views of govt, says MEA

New Delhi: Facing widespread anger in the Arab countries over the controversial comments on Prophet Mohammad, India Thursday said it has made it clear that the remarks do not reflect the views of the government. "We have made it pretty clear that tweets and comments do not reflect views of government," External Affairs Ministry Spokesperson Arindam Bagchi said at a media briefing. "Mallikariun Khargeji called and consulted about a common candidate for the presidential election. I told him that the CPI would support a common candidate with secular credentials and progressive outlook. He replied that Madam Soniaji and the Congress Party also have the same position," Viswam said in a tweet. 'Consultations for the presidential election have begun among various opposition parties," a senior opposition leader told PTI, adding that once a consensus is arrived at, a joint candidate may be put up.

Monsoon on track: IMD

New Delhi, June 9:The monsoon is progressing normally and is likely to reach Maharashtra in the next two days, the India Meteorological Department said Thursday.

The MeT office has also warned of isolated extremely heavy rainfall (more than 204.5 mm) in Arunachal Pradesh June 10-11, and Assam and Meghalaya during the next five days. The monsoon accounts for around 70 per cent of the country's annual rainfall and is considered the lifeline of its agriculture-based economy.

Senior IMD scientist R K Jenamani said monsoon touched the Kerala coast May 29 and covered south and central Arabian Sea. Kerala, parts of Karnataka and Tamil Nadu and the entire northeast between May 31 and June 7.

"There is no delay in the progress of the monsoon. It is likely to reach Maharashtra in the next two days and cover Mumbai in the subsequent two days," he told reporters here, dismissing reports that its progress had slowed down.

"We have strong monsoon fea tures -- there are strong winds and clouds have started developing -- for the next two days," he added.

The scientist said conditions are favourable for the further advance of monsoon over Goa and some more parts of Maharashtra. Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh and



be a limit to the stray round of counselling for All India Quota in NEET-PG-21 and the students cannot be given admission by compromising the education and the health of people.

The observation was made by a vacation bench of Justices M R Shah and Aniruddha Bose which reserved its order for Friday on a batch of petitions seeking a special stray round of counselling to fill the 1,456 seats in NEET-PG-21 that have remained vacant after the conduct of a stray round of counselling for All India Quota.

'Special stray rounds, special stray rounds-there must be a limit. For many years, the seats have remained vacant and it is not for the very first time.

'There must be a limit to the entire exercise. Merely because some



seats have been left vacant after 8-9 rounds of counselling can you say you will be given admission after one-and-half years in a threeyear course compromising with the education and the health of people? Try to appreciate this is a threeyear course," the bench observed

When the hearing commenced, the apex court asked Additional Solicitor General Balbir Singh, appearing for the Centre, not to treat the petitions as adversarial litigation.

"Don't treat and consider it as an adversarial litigation and don't stand on the technicalities. It is a question of 1,400 medical seats.

They are post-graduate (PG) seats. Government wants doctors also. Government wants doctors with PG also. Government wants super speciality doctors also. We have a dearth of doctors. They can serve the nation. And these 1,400 seats cannot be said to be a small number of seats," the bench said.

This observation of the top court came while perusing the affidavit filed by the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS) informing that it has concluded four rounds of online counselling for NEET-PG-21 and it cannot fill 1.456 seats by conducting a special stray round of counselling as the software

stands closed. The bench said the centre cannot take a technical ground and say that since the website is closed nothing can be done.

"We are not only concerned with the students. We are concerned with the nation as a whole. When the nation, our country is getting 1,400 super-specialist doctors, then it will be in the larger public interest also. Suppose these posts are unfilled, how will the medical council or the government will be benefitted? You tell us," the bench said,

"Instead of fighting, you try to find a solution and a way. How it can be cured and this problem can be solved." the bench observed.

The ASG submitted that this is an annual phenomenon, and seats in this segment are mostly nonclinical and nobody applies.

In 2021, out of the said 1,456 vacant seats, 800/900 seats were opted for but the students did not take admission.

B'lore: Probe intensifies in Hizbul terrorist arrest case

THE ARREST HAS TRIGGERED A DEBATE IF BANGALORE IS A CENTRE OF SLEEPER CELLS FOR TERRORISTS AND ANTI-NATIONAL ELEMENTS

Bangalore, June 9: The intelligence agencies and special wings of Karnataka police department have intensified investigation into the case of Hizbul Mujahideen terrorist Talib Hussain in Bangalore who was arrested last week, police sources said Thursday.

Sources say that the intelligence and investigation agencies have come under fire for not being able to track the movements of the most wanted terrorist, who planned killings of Hindus in Kashmir Valley and was involved in disruptive activities challenging the state of India.

Talib Hussain, who lived here with his family for three years, later went to get shelter at Okalipuram Mosque. He was finally arrested in a joint operation by the armed forces, police from Jammu and Kashmir along with Karnataka police department June 3.

Even as he was a key person of terror outfit Hizbul Mujahideen, Talib stayed in Bangalore in disguise, the Internal Security Division (ISD), intelligence wing, Anti-Terrorist Squad (ATC) had no idea about his presence in the city.

The authorities have now intensified their investigation and have asked for his phone call details from the service provider.

The ISD and ATC sleuths are verifying the details of the persons who came in contact with Hussain. They are also making inquiries at places where Talib Hussain worked, the places where he stayed and the masjid where he got the shelter after the Covid pandemic. The authorities are also coordinating with



VHP demands seizure of Masjid

Ishwa Hindu Parishad (VHP) Thursday filed a complaint with Bangalore Police Commissioner Pratap Reddy demanding seizure of the Okalipuram masjid from where Hizbul Mujahideen terrorist Talib Hussain was arrested. VHP leaders Tejas Gowda, Govardhan and Shivakumar have submitted a complaint to the top police official of Bangalore in this regard. The masjid where terror element Talib Hussain was given shelter must be seized. Action must be initiated against those who sheltered him and gave him SIM cards, the complaint said. They have also urged the Police Commissioner to gather inputs on terrorist activities in the city. The Hindu leaders brought to the notice of the Police Commissioner that if any Hindu festival is to be celebrated, the organisers have to struggle.

Jammu and Kashmir police to identify the persons who helped the Hizbul Mujahideen terrorist.

Talib Hussain, who belonged to Kishtwar district of Nagaseni Tehsil of Jammu and Kashmir, joined Hizbul Mujahideen in 2016. He belongs to a tribe and has 2 wives and 5 children.

Talib allegedly brainwashed youths and used them to kill Hindus in Kashmir Valley. He is also involved in many incidents of bomb explosions. When the armed forces intensified their hunt for him, he escaped to Bangalore.

He came to Bangalore with one of his wives and children. He ran an auto and led life as a normal man.

After his arrest, the neighbours were shocked to know that he was a terrorist. He led a quiet life here like a normal person.

His arrest has triggered a debate if Bangalore is a centre of sleeper cells for terrorists and antinational elements. The questions are being raised as to how Talib Hussain managed to stay here for 3 years without coming into the radar of intelligence agencies.

The authorities are on high alert, particularly after the hijab ban in classrooms which made international headlines. They can't take any chances with the security of the city.

Bangalore, June 9: After Jamia Masjid in Srirangapatna, Malali Masjid in Dakshina Kannada, and Peer Shah Dargah in Bidar, Karnataka is seeing another row loom large over another site - the Eidgah Maidan in Bangalore.

Hindu organisations have taken objection over the Eidgah Maidan in Chamrajpet area being treated as the property of minorities and decided to celebrate the Independence Day August 15 in the grounds and hoist the tricolour. They have also taken a decision to celebrate Yoga Day June 21 on the grounds.

Hindu activist Pathapat Srinivas Thursday said that Hindu leaders are meeting Chief Minister Basavaraj Bommai with a request to hoist the 'tiranga' (tricolour) and celebrate the Yoga Day there.

Congress MLA from Chamaraj Pet, Zameer Ahmad Khan, has been repeatedly making speeches that he would get the biggest masjid in Bangalore constructed in 2.5 acres of Edgah Maidan. There are plans of putting Leader of Opposition Siddaramaiah to contest elections from Chamrajpet, he alleged.

e alleged. Srinivas also claimed that the Supreme Court judgment in connection with the Eidgah Maidan was tampered with.

There are corrections and no short signatures are found in the order. There will be mention of the number of corrections, which are not found, he said.

The Bangalore civic agency had not contested the claims of the opposite party in the Supreme Court, which upheld the injunction order of the High Court not allowing constructions in Edgah Maidan by the civic agency, he added.

"We will demand from CM Bommai that Edgah Maidan should be preserved as a public property and cultural activities of all religions must be permitted," Srinivas said.

Firecracker makers in suspense as SC to take up hearing next month

Chennai, June 9: Like a boy filled with suspense and waiting for the cracker to burst after its fuse was lit, the over 1,000 units of firecracker industry in Sivakasi in Tamil Nadu is waiting in suspense with their fingers crossed.

The final hearing of the case against the industry will be heard by the Supreme Court next month. The Supreme Court's decision will determine the fate of the industry that feeds about eight lakh families, industry officials told IANS.

"The final hearing is to be held next month. We hope something good happens for the industry and the lakhs of families who are dependent on it. We feel more for the environment, but there is some other interest that is playing against the industry," A Asaithambi, President, Sivakasi Fireworks Manufacturers Association (SFMA) told IANS.

Asaithambi said as per a detailed study made by the Indian Institute of Technology Kanpur (IITK), the pollution from firecrackers ranks at 26th, way below of other sectors that contribute to the air pollution of Delhi like the automobile, thermal power stations, construction activities, stubble burning in Punjab and others.

"The industry is being targeted and being made a fall guy," Asaithambi added.

According to him, crackers are burst for only two days in a year that is during the Hindu festival Diwali. "Diwali is the only festival that is being celebrated across the country by crores of people. And firecrackers are an integral part of the festival celebration. Taking that out of the festival will dilute the core spirit," he added.

A bout 300,000 workers are directly employed whereas another 500,000 workers are in the allied sectors

Industry officials feel that the apex court was misled about the barium nitrate chemical that is used to manufacture several traditional firecrackers like sparklers, flower pots and others. Barium nitrate chemical is used by several industries like welding electrodes, tyres and others. Nowhere in the world the use of barium nitrate in making firecrackers has been banned, industry officials told IANS.

Industry officials also question the efficacy of the formulation provided by the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) and the National Environmental Engineering Research Institute (NEERI) to make green crackers.

For a long time, the fireworks industry has been a target in different forms. First, the manufacturers were targeted for child labour and it was followed up with the noise pollution charge. With the noise pollution issue getting resolved with the laying down of the norms, the industry is being charged with polluting the air.

The industry players and common people are of the view that Hindu festival Diwali is being targeted by vected interests.

geted by vested interests.

Manufacturers say that Sivakasi would have turned into a ghost city long back if firecrackers were the reason for air pollution in Delhi.

The museum is built on a domain-specific model with live, work, and play as major domains. It showcases various adaptations and technologies that will help people with all kinds of disabilities become independent. It showcases various items from a tactile geometry set and drawing tool, Braille Cube, alphabet plate, tactile wrist watch, tactile scrabble board with coins, talking bathroom scale, a signature guide to an adapted colour keyboard, appropriate paper-based technology (APT), standing crutches, pull down cloth hanger,



adjustable backrest and various other adapted kitchen utensils and bathroom utilities.

M Krishnamoorthy, whose son Deepak is a 21-year-old with disabilities, told IANS, "The Museum of Possibilities is a place that provides the necessary confidence to those with special abilities and I have brought my son over here. It's a huge relief for people like us who are worried about the future of our children."

"The museum aims to help people with disabilities participate in various events and could try new technologies and find if it works for them, he added." The museum displays products made by disabled persons that visitors can buy and it also has a cafe run by six specially-

abled persons.

The museum also has a skill development centre and a dedicated space to encourage and promote employment opportunities for the specially-abled. Murugan R told IANS, "I am a person with disabilities and the Museum of Possibilities is a place wherein we can get some help with employment and skill development opportunities."



IIT Madras develops robot to clean septic tanks

Ten units of the robot named 'HomoSEP' will be first deployed across Tamil Nadu, and later in Gujarat and Maharashtra

New Delhi, June 9: Researchers at the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Madras have developed a robot to clean septic tanks without human intervention.

Named "HomoSEP", ten units are planned to be deployed across Tamil Nadu and the researchers are in touch with sanitation workers to identify the locations, officials said. Gujarat and Maharashtra are being considered for the deployment of the robots that have been developed with an aim to eliminate manual scavenging in the

next phase, they said.
At present, first two HomoSEP

units have been distributed to selfhelp groups led by Nagamma and Ruth Mary whose husbands died tragically during sanitation work, through the support of the NGO, Safai Karamchari Andolan (SKA).

The septic tank is a poisonous environment, filled with semi-solid and semi-fluid human faecal material that make up about two-thirds of the tank, said Prabhu Rajagopal, Professor, Department of Mechanical Engineering, IIT Madras.

"Hundreds of deaths are reported every year across India, due to manual scavenging in septic tanks despite bans and prohibitory orders," he added.

Rajagopal explained

Rajagopal explained that the HomoSEP can homogenise the hard sludge in septic tanks through custom-developed rotary blade mechanism and pump the tank slurry using an integrated suction mechanism. "Sanitation workers will be able to operate the HomoSEP on their own, after being

provided with relevant training and appropriate guidance along with necessary safety measures, both of which our team is working on right now," he said. "Safety plays a vital role in this whole procedure, starting with the design of HomoSEP itself," he added. HomoSEP was

first developed as a final year Masters' project by Divanshu Kumar under the guidance of Rajagopal and showcased at the IIT Madras Carbon Zerp Challenge 2019, after receiving seed support from IIT Madras' Socially Relevant Projects initiative.

MANUAL SCAVENGING

Despite the pandemic-related difficulties over the next couple of years, the IIT Madras researchers collaborated with an IIT Madrasincubated start-up Solinas Integrity Private Limited (now headed by Kumar) to further develop HomoSEP. GAIL (India) further supported product development and CapGemini supported efforts towards miniaturisation and portability of the robot, through their CSR initiatives. Over the last year, NSE Foundation and L&T Technology Services Foundation have commissioned the fabrication and distribution of 8 and 2 numbers of HomoSEP robots respectively, through CSR support.

This is history in the making as Nagamma, a widow of a person who died in a septic tank, becomes the owner and an entrepreneur of mechanised septic tank cleaning services, she said.

This enterprise will focus on changing lives of sanitation worker communities with dignified livelihoods providing mechanised sanitation solutions to stop manual scavenging deaths, she added.

New Delhi, June 9: The Supreme Court Thursday said paternal grandparents would better take care of a six-year-old than his maternal aunt, as they are more emotionally attached, in a custody case where the child's parents died due to Covid last year.

A vacation bench comprising Justices M.R. Shah and Aniruddha Bose gave the paternal grandparents the custody of the boy, who was orphaned due to Covid -- his father died on May 13 and mother on June 12 during the second wave in Gujarat in 2021.

The bench said in our society paternal grandparents would always take better care of their grandchildren. "They are more emotionally attached to grandchildren." said the bench, adding



Ahmedabad. The bench emphasized that paternal grandparents should be given preference in custody matters of the child as he lost his parents.

The maternal relatives took the

child from his paternal grandparents house in Ahmedabad to attend the last rites of his mother and since then. the child had been living with his maternal aunt and her family. The paternal grandparents moved the Gujarat High Court seeking custody of the child. After interacting with the child, the high court said that he is comfortable with the petitioner and his wife (the grandparents), however he was not in a position to give an independent preference between the petitioner and the maternal aunt.

The high court gave the boy's custody to the 46-year-old aunt. The court noted that she was unmarried, working with the central government and she was in a joint family, and pointed out such a family is good for the upbringing of

The top court noted that income cannot be the sole criteria and cannot be the sole ground to deny custody to parental grandparents and quashed the high court judgment granting custody to the maternal aunt.

Upsurge in Covid cases, don't lower guard: Govt

New Delhi, June 9:The Centre Thursday asked all states and Union territories to ensure high level of testing in areas reporting new or cluster of Covid-19 cases while emphasising the need to follow the five-fold strategy of combating the

This strategy is test-track-treat, vaccination and Covid appropriate behaviour. In a letter to the states/UTs, Union Health Secretary Rajesh Bhushan said in the past two weeks, an upsurge in cases has been noticed even as there has been a sustained and significant decline in the number of cases across the country during the past four

In the week ending June 8, 4,207 average daily new cases were reported as compared to 2,663 average daily cases in the week ending June 1, he highlighted in the letter.

There has also been an increase in the weekly positivity rate from 0.63 per cent (week ending June 1) to 1.12 per cent (week ending June 8).

In the last 24 hours, 7,240 new coronavirus cases have been reported in India, out of which, 81 per cent cases have been reported from Maharashtra, Kerala, Delhi and Karnataka (in descending order of number of new cases reported).

Nearly 40% spike for 2nd day in a row

NEW DELHI: For a second day in

a row, India reported a nearly 40 per cent spike after it registered ,240 fresh Covid cases in the last 24 hours, against the 5,233 infections logged the previous day, the Union Health Ministry said Thursday. In the same period, the country has reported eight new Covid fatalities, taking the nationwide death toll to 5,24,723. Meanwhile, the active caseload of the country has also increased to 32,498 cases, accounting for 0.08 per cent of the country's total positive cases. The recovery of 3,591 patients in the last 24 hours took the cumulative tally to 1,26,40,301. Consequently, India's recovery rate stands at

Bhushan said specific strategic areas of intervention for states/UTs like testing and surveillance, clinical management, vaccination, Covid appropriate behaviour and community engagement with an increased focus on evidence-based decision-making was underlined.

"Given the significance of adequate testing in early identification of cases and providing an accurate picture of the level of infection spread, it is required that states/UTs must ensure high level of testing in all such areas that are reporting new cases/cluster of cases," he said.

The health secretary also advised the states and Union territories (UTs) to monitor average daily testing per million as well as share of RT-PCR in total tests conducted.

"This will enable states/UTs to take timely pre-emptive action wherever required," the letter States/UTs must also enhance

monitoring of Influenza like Illness (ILI) and SARI cases in all health facilities on a regular basis for detecting early warning signals of the spread of infection, he stressed.

Genome sequencing of prescribed samples of international passengers as well as collection of samples from sentinel sites (identified health facilities) and local cluster of new Covid-19 cases is equally important.

Bienniel elections to 57 Rajya Sabha seats were announced recently and all 41 candidates in Uttar Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Bihar Andhra Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Odisha, Chhattisgarh, Punjab, Telangana, Jharkhand and Uttarakhand were declared elected unopposed last Friday.

However, elections will be held for 16 seats of Haryana, Rajasthan, Maharashtra and Karnataka Friday as the number of candidates exceeds



the seats going to the polls.

Arch rivals BJP and Congress have corralled their MLAs in hotels and resorts lest they should be poached, treating them to generous hospitality.

Political parties in Maharashtra, where polling will be held for six seats, were Thursday engaged in hectic parleys to fine-tune their strategy.

NCP chief Sharad Pawar, Congress general secretary Mallikariun Kharge, and BJP leader and Union minister Ashwini Vaishnaw went into a huddle with with leaders of their respective parties in Mumbai to give final touches to their strategy.

Cops to appeal to JJB to try 5 juveniles as adults



Hyderabad, June 9: The city police is mulling filing a petition with the Juvenile Justice Board seeking to treat the five CCLs (child in conflict with law) as adults during the trial in the gang-rape case, to ensure that the accused get the maximum punishment.

Six people, including five juveniles have been apprehended in connection with the sexual assault of the 17-year-old girl May 28. One juvenile was purportedly seen in videos misbehaving with the victim, but was not involved in the offence, police said. Hyderabad Police Commissioner

30 per cent of the world population. In India, the overall prevalence of NAFLD in the general population is close to 40 per cent and may still be higher at certain places, in-

cluding Chandigarh, say doctors.


for the prevention and control of non-alcoholic fatty liver disease in India'.

Experts feel that educating the public on healthy lifestyle will go a long way in preventing and controlling this disease.

NAFLD is usually thought as a benign condition and is often ignored by the patients.

The main reasons for NAFLD in India are the metabolic risk factors related to sedentary lifestyle and intake of high calorie food.

Overweight or obesity, diabetes mellitus (blood sugar), hypertension



(high blood pressure) and dyslipidemia (deranged blood lipids) are the main risk factors for NAFLD, by the patients and physicians even though some patients may be predisposed genetically.

The diagnosis of NAFLD is usually simple, based on blood tests, ultrasound and few other tests, but may be delayed due to lack of symptoms in the early stage. The disease may also be ignored

alike due to slow progression and lack of specific complaints. In addition to affecting the liver, NAFLD has also become a very com-

mon risk factor for various extra-hepatic diseases like cardiovascular disease, chronic kidney disease, bone loss, obstructed sleep apnoea and cancers of various organs.

The treatment of patients with NAFLD revolves around maintaining a healthy lifestyle with good diet and regular exercise.

Those who are overweight are encouraged to lose weight by cutting down on their calorie intake and by burning more calories through aerobic or anaerobic exercises.

Patients who progress on to severe form of disease (NASH with or without fibrosis, cirrhosis, liver cancer) do require other modalities of treatment, including pharmacological drugs, endoscopy and liver transplantation for those with liver failure.

17 killed, 4 missing

Beijing: At least 17 people were killed and four are missing after flooding hit the central Chinese province of Hunan and a landslide buried parts of several villages in the southern Guangxi region, state media reported. House passes gun control bill

Washington: The House passed a wide-ranging gun control bill on Wednesday in response to recent mass shootings in Buffalo, New York, and Uvalde, Texas that would raise the age limit for purchasing a semi-automatic rifle and prohibit the sale of ammunition magazines with a capacity of more than 15 rounds. The legislation passed by a mostly party-line vote of 223-204. It has almost no chance of becoming law as the Senate pursues negotiations focused on improving mental health programs, bolstering school security and enhancing background checks. But the House bill does allow Democratic lawmakers a chance to frame for voters in November where they stand on policies that polls show are widely supported.

Thailand makes marijuana legal

Bangkok: Marijuana cultivation and possession in Thailand was decriminalized Thursday, like a dream come true for an aging generation of pot smokers who recall the kick the legendary Thai Stick variety delivered. The stated intention of the country's public health minister to distribute 1 million marijuana seedlings for cultivation has added to the impression that Thailand is turning into a weed wonderland. But for the time being, would-be marijuana tourists will be disappointed. Thailand has become the first nation in Asia to decriminalize marijuana – also known as cannabis, or ganja in the local lingo — but it is not following the examples of Uruguay and Canada, the only two countries so far that have legalized recreational marijuana on a national basis.

Vienna, June 9: Iran Thursday dealt a near-fatal blow to chances of reviving the 2015 Iran nuclear deal as it began removing essentially all the International Atomic Energy Agency monitoring equipment installed under the deal, IAEA chief Rafael Grossi said.

late on Thursday. Iran informed the agency overnight that it plans to remove 27 IAEA cameras and other equipment as of Thursday, which was "basically all" the extra monitoring equipment installed under the 2015 deal going beyond Iran's core obligations to the agency, Grossi told a news conference called at short notice.

That leaves a window of opportunity of three to four weeks to restore some of the monitoring that is being scrapped or else the IAEA will lose the ability to piece together all or essentially all Iran's most important nuclear activities and material, and restoring the deal requires that, Grossi said

"I think this would be a fatal blow (to reviving the deal)," Grossi said of what would happen if nothing were done within that window of opportunity. Indirect talks between Iran and the United States on reviving the 2015 deal are already stalled and have not been held since March.

Since then-President Donald Trump pulled

Washington out of the deal and re-imposed sanctions against Tehran in 2018, Iran has breached the deal's limits on its nuclear activities, enriching uranium to close to weaponsgrade, using more

advanced centrifuges and swelling its stock of enriched uranium.

While Western powers warn it is getting ever closer to being able to sprint towards making a nuclear bomb, Iran denies having such intentions. As part of its erosion of the deal's nuclear measures, Iran had already held onto the data recorded by the extra monitoring equipment since February of last year, meaning the IAEA can only hope it will be able to access it at a later date. Grossi said it was not clear what would happen to that data now. He added, however, that more than 40 IAEA cameras would continue to operate as part of the core monitoring of Iran's activities that predates the 2015 deal.


Basil Rajapaksa resigns from **Parliament**

Colombo, June 9: Basil Rajapaksa, the youngest brother of Sri Lanka's president and former finance minister, resigned from his parliamentary seat on Thursday, the second such resignation from the cash-strapped government in a month from the powerful Rajapaksa family amid massive public protest over the unprecedented economic crisis in the country.

With the Rajapaksas coming under intense public pressure for their mishandling of the economic crisis, Mahinda Rajapaksa, the prime minister and elder brother of President Gotabaya Rajapaksa, had to resign last month.

Talking to reporters here, Basil said, "I resigned my seat to allow Sri Lanka Podujana Peramuna (SLPP) to nominate someone suitable." Asked if he had preempted resignation as he would be disqualified to be in Parliament through the proposed 21st Amendment (21A) to the Constitution due to his holding of both the US and Sri Lankan dual citizenship, Basil, the youngest of the Rajapaksa brothers, said it wasn't so.



Basil, however, said he is opposed to the 21st Amendment, the Daily Mirror newspaper reported. The 21A aims, among other reforms, at barring dual citizens from contesting elections to hold public office.

The 21st Amendment is also expected to annul the 20A to the Constitution, which gives unfettered powers to President Gotabaya after abolishing the 19th Amendment that will strengthen Parliament.

The registered Hindus figure 22,10,566, followed by Christians 18,73,348, Ahmedis 1,88,340, Sikhs 74,130, Bhais 14,537, and as many as 3,917 Parsis, said the report, based on three national popula-

tion censuses held in Pakistan. There are 11 other minorities in Pakistan, accounting less than 2,000, who have been issued CNICs

by the NADRA. The Buddhists are 1,787, Chinese 1,151, Shintoism followers are 628, Jews 628, African religions followers are 1,418, Kelasha religion followers 1,522, and about six followers of Jainism

Karachi, June 9: A Hindu temple has been vandalised by a group of unidentified people in Pakistan's southern port city of Karachi, the latest incident of vandalism against the places of worship of the minority community in the country.

The attack on Shri Mari Maata Mandir in "J" area within the limits of Korangi police station in Karachi has caused panic and fear among the Hindu community in the area where police were deployed to avoid any untoward incident, police said. According to an FIR registered at the Korangi police station, five men on motorcycles stopped by the temple late on Wednesday night and inquired about the whereabouts of the caretaker, Dawn newspaper reported.

When two workers who were painting the walls inside the temple told the men that the caretaker wasn't available, the suspects started pelting stones at an idol, the complainant, Sanjeev Kumar, was

quoted as saying by the newspaper. "They also threatened the workers and then fled from the crime scene." he said. "We don't know who has attacked and why." After getting information, the police reached the area and inspected the temple and inquired about the incident.

Korangi Senior Superintendent of Police Faisal Bashir Memon said that the temple was located inside a hall of a house in the area and renovation work was underway there. A case against the miscreants has been registered under different sections of the Pakistan Penal Code, he was quoted as saying by the newspaper. The police are further trying to obtain CCTV footage of the area to arrest the suspects as soon as possible, Memon added.

Gaza, June 9: The water looks crystal blue, with no trace of sewage, the yellow sand is clean and the smell in the air is salty and pleasant, giving beachgoers in Gaza their first experience in years of clean and safe beaches.

Untreated sewage has flowed directly into the waters off Gaza for years, causing an environmental disaster that has ruined one of the few

affordable opportunities for swimming available to people locked into the narrow coastal strip.

This season has been different, as internationally-funded sewage treating facilities across the coastal enclave have stepped up their operations, reducing pollution to its lowest rates in many years, environment officials said. "We couldn't come before be-

cause the sea was polluted and if we did, our children used to come back home with viruses and skin diseases," said Sahar Abu Bashir, 52. "Today the area is clean and the sea is clean. We felt as if we were in another country," the mother of four said.

This week, the long sandy beach looked almost empty of red flags warning beachgoers against swimming because of the dozens of millions of cubic meters of untreated sewage that used to pour into the



ocean every day.





United Nations, June 9: Foreign Direct Investment inflows to India declined \$19 billion to \$45 billion in 2021 but the country still remained among the top 10 global economies for FDI last year, the United Nations said Thursday. According to the United Nations

Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD) World Investment Report, flows of foreign direct investment recovered to pre-pandemic levels last year, hitting nearly \$1.6 trillion. However, the prospects for this

year are grimmer as global FDI in 2022 and beyond will be affected by the security and humanitarian crises caused by the Ukraine war, by macroeconomic shocks set off by the conflict, by energy and food price hikes, and by increased investor uncertainty. India, which had received \$64 bil-

lion in FDI in 2020, recorded a decline in FDI inflows in 2021 at \$45 billion. But India was still among the top 10 economies for FDI inflows in 2021, ranking 7th after the US, China, Hong Kong, Singapore, Canada and Brazil. South Africa, Russia and Mexico rounded up the top 10 economies for FDI inflows in 2021.

"Flows to India declined to \$45 billion. However, a flurry of new international project finance deals were announced in the country: 108 projects, compared with 20 projects on average for the last 10 years,

Mumbai, June 9: The country's current account deficit is likely to hit a three-year high of 1.8 per cent or \$43.81 billion in FY22, as against a surplus of 0.9 per cent or \$23.91 billion in FY21, a report said Thursday. According to an assessment by

India Ratings, the Current Account Deficit (CAD) has moderated to \$17.3 billion or 1.96 per cent of GDP in the fourth quarter of FY22 as against \$8.2 billion or 1.03 per cent in the year-ago period, and massively down from \$23.02 billion or 2.74 per cent in Q3, which was a 13quarter high.

The improvement in the key numbers are due to the remarkable improvement in merchandise exports in FY22, when it grew 42.4 per cent as against a negative 7.5 per cent in the pandemic-hit FY121.

But exports could face significant headwinds from rising uncertainty and volatility in the global economy primarily because of the spike in commodity prices, especially crude oil after Russia invaded Ukraine, the report warned, and pointed to the lower forecast of global growth by the World Trade Organisation (WTO) which sees the global economy clipping at just about 3 per cent in 2022, down from 4.7 per cent forecast earlier

Belgium coach Roberto Martinez had been quick to dismiss accusations of his players lacking desire, and they backed up that support by recovering from going behind to Robert Lewandowski's 76th goal for Poland.

Axel Witsel launched Belgium's comeback with the equalizer in the 42nd, Kevin De Bruyne added a second in the 59th, before a double from Leandro Trossard — in the 73rd and 80th — a long-range effort

Against the unseeded Tunjung, Sindhu started on a bright note and played aggressively to surge to a 10-5 lead. She used her experience and reach to engage her opponents in long rallies
