Klaasen show sinks India

Cuttack, June 12: Comeback man Heinrich Klaasen followed Rassie Van der Dussen's suit in turning out to be an unlikely hero with a careerbest 81 as South Africa once again outwitted India by four wickets on a tricky pitch to take a 2-0 lead in the five-match T20I series at Barabati Stadium here Sunday.

On a two-paced track where most of the batters struggled, Klaasen made it look ridicu-

lously easy as he **Indian batters found** smashed seven fours it tough to get going and five towering sixes against some tight in his 46-ball knock to bowling display by help his team knock off a target of 149 with South Africa to be 10 balls to spare. restricted to a The wicketkeeper-

modest 148 for 6 batter, who was included into the side as a forced change for injured Quinton de Kock, completed his fourth T20I fifty in 32 balls before he smashed three sixes off Yuzvendra

Chahal to virtually seal the chase. Looking to finish it off with a six, he fell victim to Harshal Patel and in the very next over, Bhuvneshwar Kumar dismissed Wavne Parnell

to finish with a superb 4-0-13-4. But it was not enough as they just needed three runs from the last two overs and the in-form David Miller (20 not out) completed the win to give the Proteas a commanding 2-0 lead going into the Vizag T20I June 14.

The visitors seek their first ever bilateral T20 series win in India.

Making a comeback after more than seven months, Klaasen never took his foot off the pedal and got his team out of the woods after Bhuvneshwar pegged them back to 29/3 inside the powerplay overs.

Klaasen first shared a matchturning 64 run partnership from 41

balls with skipper Temba Bayuma (35) before in-form David Miller joined him in the middle

Defending a modest 149, the Rishabh Pant-led India got off to a superb start thanks to 'Swing King' Bhuvneshwar's

triple blow in successive overs. Bhuvneshwar, who looked out of

sorts in the Kotla T20I, was back in his element as he sharply swung the ball back in to clean up Reeza Hendricks in his first over. He then dismissed Dwaine Pretorius with a knuckle ball before castling the in-form Rassie van der Dussen (1).

Over 400 held for violence War of words over CM's tour

Lucknow/Kolkata/Ranchi, June 12: Over 400 people have been arrested so far in a clampdown on those involved in the violent protests Friday in several states against the controversial remarks on Prophet Mohammad by two nowsacked BJP functionaries, with authorities in Uttar Pradesh razing 'illegal' houses of the accused for the second day.

There were a few sporadic incidents of violence and protests, with a group of people attacking and damaging a local train at Bethuadahari railway station in West Bengal's Nadia district Sunday evening.

Among those arrested, 304 were held in eight districts in Uttar Pradesh and 100 in Howrah and Murshidabad districts in West Bengal, while the Ranchi police registered 25 FIRs against 'thousands' of people for the clashes

that left two dead and scores of others injured in the Jharkhand capital, and stepped up security in other parts of the state also.

Political parties, including the Samajwadi Party, and activists have accused authorities of highhandedness in the aftermath of the protests. Senior Congress leader and former home minister P Chidambaram said the prime minister should have spoken and acted immediately after the offensive utterances. Authorities had strengthened security and clamped prohibitory orders in many districts after people took to the streets fol-

lowing Friday prayers, indulged

in stone-pelting and clashed with security personnel, demanding the arrest of Nupur Sharma and Naveen Kumar Jindal

The Bhiwandi police in Maharashtra has summoned Sharma to record a statement Monday, while Jindal has also been summoned June 15 in the case registered against them on a complaint lodged by a representative of the Raza Academy May 30.

Earlier, the police in Thane asked Sharma to appear before them June 22 while the Mumbai Police had summoned her June 25.

In Uttar Pradesh, where Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has vowed

to act tough on rioters, Additional Director General of Police (Law and Order) Prashant Kumar said 13 cases have been registered and 304 people have been arrested in eight districts.

'91 persons have been arrested in Prayagraj, followed by 71 in Saharanpur, 51 in Hathras, 34 each in Ambedkar Nagar and Moradabad, 15 in Firozabad, six in Aligarh and two in Jalaun," he said. In Pravagrai, where mobs went on a rampage, the civic body Sunday demolished the house of the alleged mastermind of Friday's violence amid heavy police deployment. In Ranchi, internet services were restored in the district after nearly 33 hours even as Rapid Action Force, anti-terrorism squad, special task force and district police remained deployed at strategic locations, including 38 identified vul-

nerable pockets. Meanwhile, the West Bengal Leader of Opposition, Suvendu Adhikari, was prevented by police from visiting violence-hit areas in Howrah, where several BJP of-

fices were also targeted by mobs. He was later allowed to proceed after a two-hour-long standoff on the condition that he would go straight to Kolkata, without making any pit stop in violence-hit areas in the adjoining Howrah district.

Bhubaneswar, June 12: The BJP and BJD Sunday crossed swords over Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik's proposed foreign tour during the Budget session of the Assembly.

BJP state chief Samir Mohanty said Patnaik should have planned his foreign tour either before or after the Budget session of the Assembly beginning July 2.

Reacting to media reports that Patnaik will go on a foreign tour in the last week of June and is likely to attend the upcoming Assembly session through virtual mode, Mohanty said it would be disappointing if the Chief Minister attends the Monsoon session of the House virtually.

The state government was yet to make any formal announcement on the Chief Minister's proposed visit to Dubai and Rome. BJD spokesperson Lenin Mohanty hit back at the saffron party, saying it was not proper on part of the state BJP president to give his opinion on the Chief Minister's foreign tour, which is not yet finalised.

Noting that state Finance Minister Niranjan Pujari will present the full-fledged budget for 2022-23 fiscal on the opening day of the session, the BJP leader said in a statement and a series of tweets that it would have been better if the Chief Minister had planned his foreign tour before or after the

2,000-YEAR-OLD ARTEFACTS FOUND IN BARGARH

■ Excavations at Barpali in Bargarh district have unearthed 2,000-year-old artefacts, uncovering a civilisation dating back to the post-Mauryan period

Bargarh, June 12: Excavations at Barpali in Bargarh district have unearthed 2,000-year-old artefacts, uncovering a civilisation dating back to the post-Mauryan period.

With an objective to ascertain the cultural sequence of Asurgarh in Barpali, the excavation was started at the site by the history department of Gangadhar Meher University (GMU) May 31. Around 60 students took part in the excavation.

Extended over 17 hectares, the site has two moats and two forts



with three gateways, assistant professor Atul Pradhan said.

From the excavations and recovered artefacts, it could be concluded that the habitation was an

urban settlement belonging to the post-Mauryan period, which was

about 2,000 years ago, he said. During excavations, ancient artefacts such as coins, seals, iron

weapons, fragmented terracotta figurines, black slipped ware and

red slipped ware were found. There were large numbers of knobbed ware pottery, which is a

unique feature of early urbanisation and a sign of trade and commerce. The excavation also yielded an iron smelting hearth.

Other important antiquities such as saddle querns, arrowheads, a fragmented crucible, microlithics. polished stones and beads of semiprecious stones were also recovered.

'The structures and habitation remains are still visible in sections of the mound. Other important antiquities found at the site include hopscotch and fragmented part of terracotta ring wells. The findings clearly indicate that it was an early trade centre. We have sent some samples to a laboratory in Nasik," Pradhan said.

The things were found during excavation of only a metre from the surface, he said.

'We stopped the excavation today (Sunday). However, we have planned to dig more after the monsoon. We are hopeful to get links beyond the post-Mauryan period," he added.

5 LeT terrorists killed in J&K

Srinagar, June 12: Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) terrorist Adil Parray, who was involved in the recent killings of two police personnel, was killed in a 'chance' encounter with a 'small team' of police here Sunday, taking the number of ultras killed in Jammu and Kashmir in the last 24 hours to five.

"LeT #terrorist Adil Parray of #Ganderbal who was involved in #killing of 02 JKP personnel Gh Hassan Dar in Sangam and Saifulla Qadri in Anchar Soura and injuring a 9 year old girl, killed in a chance #encounter with a small team of police," Inspector General of Police (IGP), Kashmir Vijay Kumar wrote on Twitter. The encounter took place in the Kreesbal Palpora Sangam area here.

Parray's killing took the number of terrorists killed in the last 24 hours to five.

FROM ABU SALEM TO CHHOTA SHAKEEL

How SRK talked his way out of ganglord threats

THE MUMBAI POLICE **GAVE THE ACTOR A BODYGUARD AND ADVISED HIM TO LIMIT HIS MOVEMENTS: HE WAS MADE TO CHANGE CARS AND HIS ROUTES TO WORK EVERY DAY**

Mumbai: Back in January 1997. Rakesh Maria, former Maharashtra DGP dialled up Bhatt to pass on the information that a sharpshooter hired by dreaded gangster Abu Salem was on the prowl looking for an opportunity to kill Shah Rukh Khan.

The reason? SRK had not signed a film being made by a producer close to Abu Salem.

The Mumbai Police gave Shah Rukh a bodyguard and advised the actor to limit his movements; he was made to change cars and his routes to work every day.

One day, when Shah Rukh was returning from Khandala after shooting for Dil To Pagal Hai. he got a call from Abu Salem, who first abused him in Hindi. The actor did not lose his cool. He kept up a polite tone, but spoke

only in English. Salem then said he was angry because SRK had refused to do a film being made by a Muslim producer. He said SRK should have shown his own community some support.

Shah Rukh calmly replied that he was already working with Mansoor Khan, Abbas-Mustan and Aziz Mirza. Moreover, Mahesh Bhatt's mother was also a Muslim. Maria, incidentally, had coached SRK about how to handle the gangster.

In Shah Rukh's own words, he told Salem: "I don't tell you who to shoot so don't tell me which film to do." Hearing this, the gangster hacktracked

Soon, members of the Chhota Rajan gang also started calling SRK, but, in the words of Chopra, "they withdrew with surprising decency



498 fake teachers detected in state

Scores of fake teachers are still out of scanner as document verification gets delayed

Jajpur, June 12: Teachers who have got jobs by furnishing forged BEd/CT certificates and fraudulently obtaining ST documents are being exposed due verification by the School and Mass Education department. Till date, 498 fake teachers have been caught in 25 districts in Odisha.

However, the number of 'fake' teachers could be higher than what has been stated so far. A serious allegation has come out that some 'fake' teachers who have been identified, have managed to strike off their names from the list by using the clout of political leaders.

It is an irony that these fake teachers have been enjoying all kinds of government facilities, putting a pressure on the state exchequer. On the other hand, scores of educated and trained youths are being deprived of teaching

Meanwhile, joint director of the Directorate of Elementary

Education, Gourairani Navak has directed the district education of-

ficers (DEO), the district project officers (DPO) and block education officers (BEO) of 25 districts to investigate reports about 498 fake teachers

Besides, the collectors of 25 dis-

tricts have been requested to initiate action against the fake teachers. The DEE ha also sought report about teachers who have managed

to get their names struck off the list. Notably, in the last five years, DEOs have been sent reminders for over 100 times to submit reports about fake teachers. Due to political pressure, the verification of documents has been deliberately delayed while documents of score of fake teachers have not been verified, it was alleged.

As per sources, 163 fake teachers were identified in Bolangir district; 96 in Ganjam; 54 in Bhadrak; 36 in Khurda; 15 in Sundargarh; 13 in Kalahandi; 12 each in Rayagada, Mayurbhanj, Koraput; 10 each in Jajpur and Gajapati; eight each in Jharsuguda and Malkangiri; seven each in Nayagarh, Kandhamal and Balasore; six in Nabarangpur; five in Dhenkanal; four each in Cuttack and Kendrapara; three in Puri and one each in Nuapada and Sambalpur.



Firms call the shots on poultry prices

Kendrapara, June 12: Poultry farming in this district has slipped into the hands of big companies who own or control everything except the farms, a report said.

It is alleged that farmers who have set up farms to earn a livelihood are earning only peanuts while the companies are making huge profits by exploiting Ninety-seven per cent of the poul-

try meat consumed by people is produced by a farmer under contract with a big company. These poultry farmers are the last independent link in the company-owned supply chain.

In this scenario, a company owns every link of a product's supply chain from start to finish. This has happened as the Odisha government has failed to regulate the big companies

Reports said that the Odisha government is providing loans to women of self-help groups and youths to run poultry farms for their livelihood.

The loans are provided through banks under its ambitious Mission

Shakti scheme. This has encouraged women and youths to start a poultry farms as it will help them earn a livelihood for their family.

The poultry farmers have been trapped by the big companies supplying them with poultry feeds, chicks and medicines. As a result, the farmers are facing losses instead of mak-

The situation has remained unchanged despite a rise in price of poultry meat all over the state. Recently, poultry meat was being sold around ₹250-Rs 270 per kilogram in urban as well as rural areas of Odisha.

Farmers have failed to reap any profit from the business despite an increase in price of poultry meat. This has disappointed youths who had started poultry farms to earn a livelihood.

Poultry farmers Kalia Samantaray of Indupur, Subhasis Jena of Kansar village, Ramakant Mallick of Pakhar village and Sheik Hassan of Barimula village alleged that the government has no role in regulating the market price of poultry products for which the big companies are calling the shots in the business.

They alleged that big traders from Andhra Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and two to three local firms have invested in the poultry trade in Odisha The big companies sign a contract with the independent farmers while the latter spend only on construction of farms, houses, water, power supply and manpower required to run a farm

In exchange they supply them with poultry feeds, chicks and medicines on time. The farmers raise the chicks and in exchange get only ₹3 to ₹5 per kg of poultry meat notwithstanding the market price at that time

The farmers cannot directly sell their products in the market. Staff of the company with who the farmers have signed the contracts, collect the fully-grown chicken and they sell them both outside and inside Odisha

These companies charge exorbitant prices for their products if the farmers are unwilling to sign an agreement with them. In such a situation, poultry farmers have asked the Odisha government to intervene and bail them out of this situation.

India's Silence

hina is building infrastructure along the border with India – a second bridge in an area held by it around the strategically key Pangong Tso lake in eastern Ladakh which it occupied in 2020 during the pandemic. The Indian Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) has, in an official statement, said that it is closely 'monitoring' the development. Some may find MEA's communiqué to be kind of funny. The Union government has been constantly bashing past Congress led governments for supposedly giving up vast tracts of Indian territory to the Chinese since the 1960s. Today, the BJP led government admittedly stands as a mute spectator to the developmental activities being taken up by China on recently annexed Indian territory.

There have been 15 rounds of diplomatic and military talks between India and China which have, as yet, yielded no results. No one is aware of who the negotiators from the Indian side are nor does anyone care what arguments or historical proofs are being put forth by the bureaucracy of New Delhi. The new construction is expected to help the Chinese military quickly mobilise its troops in the region. China has also been establishing other infrastructure such as roads and residential buildings in the border areas with India. It probably aims to populate that high altitude terrain with Han Chinese so that the rear of the military will be safe during operations.

Unfortunately, it took a US general to inform the Indian public about the fresh Chinese build-up which he called an "eye-opener" and "alarming." It is very possible that Indian intelligence had known all along about these Chinese activities but preferred to keep the public in the dark. The reason, most likely, could be that they did not want to expose their own failings. Unfortunately the Americans exposed the Indian government through their public declaration. The US Pacific Area Commanding General Charles A Flynn termed China's build-up near Ladakh and strengthening of its military infrastructure as part of Beijing's "corrosive and destabilising behaviour." The General has been part of the Pacific Command since 2014 under various ranks and his assessment does carry weight.

The Government of India owes an explanation to the people of this country as to why it is keeping quiet and not registering protest publicly nor raising the issue with the Chinese authorities, both bilaterally and at international forums. The moot point is the behaviour and the manner in which China is acting should be a matter of great concern for India and other countries as well.

A day after the US General articulated his views of the situation, an MEA spokesperson indulged in diplomatic obfuscation. He merely said the government "carefully monitors developments along our border areas, including construction of infrastructure by the Chinese side in the Western Sector, as well as that being undertaken further in-depth areas." While the government, according to the spokesperson was "committed to, and takes all adequate and appropriate measures to safeguard territorial integrity and sovereignty," he forgot to mention what are the tangible measures that the government has taken to safeguard territorial integrity. This means China can get away with doing whatever it likes, treating the border talks in a cavalier manner and India would only dance to its tune.

China, of course, sought to discredit the US General for spilling the beans about its build-up. Its foreign affairs spokesman said that the US was playing a dangerous game by commenting on matters that India and China are trying to resolve through negotiations. It is only natural that China would not brook any adverse reactions from the US when it can continue playing its own game without any protests from India.

■ Tergiversate

f you've ever spotted somebody wriggling and being evasive, trying to avoid giving a straight answer to a straight question, then you have observed tergiversation. The Romans observed this phenomenon as often as we do, and already had the word for it, tergiversari, to turn one's back, shuffle, or practise evasion, from tergum, back, and vertere, to turn. One of its English senses, in older dictionaries often given as the main one, is of a deserter from a party, a renegade or apostate. An example in that sense appeared in Blackwood's Magazine in 1831: "I am liberal in my politics,' says some twenty-times tergiversated turncoat." Dickens seems to be using it in the more modern sense in A Tale of Two Cities: "He knew ... that flight was impossible; that he was tied fast under the shadow of the axe; and that in spite of his utmost tergiversation and treachery in furtherance of the reigning terror, a word might bring it down upon him." As those who tergiversate in either sense usually show similar symptoms of ducking and weaving, as John Barsad was doing in Dickens's book, the link between the two senses is clear enough, and in fact it's sometimes difficult to decide which sense was meant. The turncoat sense is still sometimes encountered, but the main one is now of someone trying to weasel out of an untenable position.

Tetrapyloctomy

lacktriangleetraplyoctomy is the art or skill of splitting a hair four ways. Don't be a mere two-way hair-splitter; grasp your pedantry firmly in both hands and split your hair crosswise into four. This word has found a secure if niche existence in the lexicons of academics with a sense of humour since it was invented by Umberto Eco in his novel Foucault's Pendulum, published in English in 1989. In a mocking attempt to reform higher education, one character proposes a School of Comparative Irrelevance, whose aim would be to turn out scholars capable of endlessly increasing the number of unnecessary topics. In it would be a Department of Tetrapyloctomy, whose function would be to inculcate a sense of irrelevance in its students. Another department would study useless techniques, such as Assyrio-Babylonian philately and Aztec Equitation. The word combines tetra, four, with pilus, hair (as in depilatory), and the ending -tomy, a cutting. As the component parts come respectively from Greek, Latin and Greek it's a miscegenated linguistic sandwich that no self-respecting scholar would invent, which is no doubt why Umberto Eco found it to be appropriate.

STAGFLATION LOOMS LARGE

WAS THE RBI OVERLOOKING A TICKING BOMB OR WAS IT TOO ACCOMMODATIVE UNDER COVID AND OTHER PRESSURES?

The Monetary Policy Committee of the RBI raising key policy interest rates by 0.5% to 4.9, the second in five weeks, indicates further tightening of the economy and also raises the question how it overlooked the inflation control for the last over two years. It woke up at a critical juncture when the MPC itself hints at stagflationary trends - growth stagnation and continued price rises - and the World Bank almost confirms it citing investors, bankers, and entrepreneurs discussing chances of recession.

Was the RBI overlooking a ticking bomb or was it too accommodative under COVID and other pressures? It has been speaking about inflationary trends since 2020, but was apparently being industry-friendly in keeping the rates low, ignoring the concern for safeguarding the interests of depositors and severe profiteering. Since most central banks were following the same policy, including in the US, the RBI escaped scrutiny.

The RBI has woken up late even as the US inflation that used to remain low around 2% has shot up to 8.5% and has become a problem for President Biden and the world economy. It may be pointed out that the MPC in July 2021 had discussed stagflationary trends but desisted rate rise despite a dissent note on the price front and cut on taxes. Then RBI Deputy Governor Michael Patra accepting that inflation was prime concern of the RBI, added, "It is important to bring that down."

But till May, it did not act. The RBI has similarly ignored it in 2008 right after the global financial crisis or the Lehman Brothers meltdown. Then too it appeared accommodative before it resorted to the control mechanism and raised the rates. The large lenders benefited immensely from it as they took huge credit at low rates.

At this juncture the first signs of inflation were noticed in January-March quarter of 2020 when inflation touched 6%

As consumer price index (CPI) touches 7.9% and wholesale price index (WPI) 15.1%, the highest in three decades, the RBI has remained complacent and even now it pegging inflation at around 6.7% by end of 2022-23 is unreal. It is a bit surprising that despite noticing malignant trends the RBI remained quiet till May 2022. Now it takes swift action to raise repo rate by 0.9% between May 4 and June 8. Some more quick steps are likely to increase repo rates.

The RBI again is optimistic on growth to remain at 7.2% though World Bank predicts global growth to come down to 2.9% from 5.7% in 2021. The RBI seems still cushy and not using the MPC power. Except in 2021, the dissent has not been there despite uncertainty over economic situation most poignantly pointed out by its Consumer Confidence Survey 2021. It revealed weakness in the bargaining powers of the working class and high prices squeezing the spending pattern.

For quite some time low-cost borrowing had been priority of the RBI despite it affecting the health of the banking sector and vielding low gains for the common man, senior citizens and women. Inflation harms the poor the most. RBI has to target bringing down CPI inflation to 4% but now it also warrants targeting run-away WPI, a trend that needs deeper study of the changing market dynamics. High WPI accompanied by yet another high CPI means the actual inflation level is around 20%

No wonder the MPC considers stagflation now a greater possibility as does the World Bank. In the prevailing situation it should have come out with detailed reports on the market functioning in India. It has a contrast. While high profits are being cornered by only select companies, most others are going into severe losses.

In its latest global economic forecast, the World Bank says even something worse is possible as growth is expected to slow down. It is dismayed by growing income gaps, thawing of poverty alleviation measures and the war-induced soaring fuel prices and disruption of international trade. In such a situation, the RBI looks more optimistic in its growth forecast.

Monetary tightening has its aftermath too. It can ripple out faster and act as a drag on private consumption that is already at a low for over a year. RBI has to listen to World Bank President David Malpass, who says: "For many countries, recession will be hard to avoid." The World Bank predicts "several years of aboveaverage inflation and below average growth with potentially destabilising consequences for low and middle income economies. It's a phenomenon -- stagflation -- that the world has not seen since the 1970s.

The warning is severe and grim. The RBI must take a note of it to attune Indian economy to a low price regime and impress upon the government to desist from investing on infrastructure like roads, railways, cosmetic architecture that are adding to severe inflation and the woes of the poor. It has to be tough, but the flip side would be the higher rates to help the poor hedging savings and help in future growth.

How Oz revived the political middle

IN COUNTRIES IN WHICH POLITICS IS **BECOMING INCREASINGLY POLARISED, THE AUSTRALIAN ELECTION SHOULD INCREASE SUPPORT FOR VOTING REFORM**

ike many other democracies, Australia has experienced ✓ growing political polarisation in recent years, particularly during the last nine years of conservative government, led by the Liberal Party, in coalition with the smaller, rural-based National Party That is why the result of the federal election in May could hold important lessons for other polarised polities.

Consider the outcome in Kooyong, the safest of all Liberal seats. The electorate covers some of Melbourne's most affluent suburbs and, since its creation in 1901, has always elected a Liberal or a representative of its conservative predecessors. In the recent election, the sitting member for Kooyong, Josh Frydenberg, served as federal treasurer and deputy leader of the Liberal Party and was widely talked about as a future prime minister.

No one gave the main opposition Australian Labor Party any chance of winning Kooyong - and they were right about that. But Frydenberg also faced a more unusual opponent this year: Monique Ryan, a paediatric neurologist who ran the neurology department of Melbourne's leading children's hospital. Ryan stepped away from that role to campaign as an independent candidate in the electorate where she lived because she was bitterly disappointed with the Liberal government's failure to tackle climate change. She also campaigned for an independent body to investigate corruption in politics, and for equality and respect for women. Australia's lower house consists

of single-member electorates, with members elected by preferential voting, also known as ranked-choice voting, or instant run-off, which is not to be confused with proportional representation. After the distribution of preferences was tallied, Ryan defeated Frydenberg, 53%-47% Similarly, in three Sydney elec-

torates that were almost as safely conservative as Kooyong, the incumbent Liberals were defeated by local professional women campaigning for stronger action on climate change. The same thing hap pened in Perth, and in another Liberal stronghold in Melbourne. Altogether, six new teal independents, all women, and all focused on climate change, were elected to the House of Representatives. With three independents who were re-elected to seats they had held previously, and another new independent who is not aligned with the teal group, the Australian parliament will have ten independents.

The Australian Greens, which prior to the election had never held more than a single seat in the lower house will have four in the new parliament. In a lower house of 151 members, 14 for whom climate change is an issue of supreme importance will be unaligned with the major parties.

Several factors made this remarkable result possible. The independents who campaigned on

the need for stronger action on climate change were supported by Climate 200, a fund-raising body that distributed AUD\$12 million (\$8.7 million) to 23 climate-focused independents. Its practical campaign advice was also important for candidates who had never run for office. Each independent ran in their own community, supported by local volunteers who knocked on a lot of doors.

Preferential voting was essential to the victories of the teal independents, because it meant that they could win without receiving the most first preference votes. The six new teal independents who won did so by finishing ahead of the Labor candidate in the electorate they were contesting and keeping the Liberal candidate below 50% of the vote. The candidates with fewer votes were then progressively eliminated, starting with the candidates who received fewest votes, and the preferences of voters for these candidates were distributed. Predictably, both the Greens and Labor recommended that their voters give their preferences to the independents ahead of the Liberals. Those preferences were then enough to put the independent candidate ahead of the Liberal.

Labor won a narrow majority of two seats in the lower house, so, strictly speaking, it will not need the support of the Greens and independents there. But Labor will need support from the Greens and at least one independent in the Senate. The new Prime Minister, Anthony Albanese, will almost certainly receive it, having signaled a shift in climate policy by saying that he wants to make Australia "a renewable energy superpower." In countries in which politics

s becoming increasingly polarised. the Australian election should increase support for voting reform. Outside Australia, preferential voting is used nationally in Ireland, Malta, Nauru, and Slovenia. In the US, it is used in Alaska and Maine, and in many cities, including New York, and there is support for introducing it in several other jurisdictions.

Extremism flourishes in voting systems in which the candidate with the most votes wins, even if the winner has the support of a minority of voters. None of the six new teal independents received the most first preference votes in their constituency; but in each case, a majority of voters preferred them to the Liberal candidates who did receive the most first preferences. Allowing voters to express their second or third preferences helps moderates defeat extremists.

If community-based independents could make a dent in the major party duopoly in Australia, then, with the right voting system, they can do so elsewhere as well.

Sir, Whenever Indian women's cricket is spoken of the name of Mithali Raj will always stand out. The Test and ODI skipper has called it quits. She had earlier hanged her boots from Twenty20. Mithali has had an eventful 22-year career. Not surprisingly, she was the most capped international cricketer. Also, eight hundreds and 85 fifties in international cricket bear testimony to her consistency and class. June 12: With a growing indigenous base of manufacturers, India's drone industry may play an instrumental role in public services such as agriculture, defence, healthcare and infrastructure maintenance in the future, say experts while also highlighting some concerns around the safety and privacy of these unmanned

aerial vehicles. Drones are mini pilotless aircraft operated by remote control and can be accessed through simple devices like a smartphone app. These unmanned vehicles require far less effort, time and energy, and can reach far and difficult terrains while being controlled by a single person remotely.

Popularity and adoption of drone technology is catching up across regions and sectors and India is no exception to it. Aviation Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia said last month that India will need approximately one lakh drone pilots in the coming years.

In order to showcase the potential of the indigenous drone industry, India recently organised its biggest drone festival in the national capital. Bharat Drone Mahotsay, a two-day event held on May 27 and 28 in the capital saw over 1,600 delegates, including government officials, foreign diplomats, PSUs, private companies



and drone startups etc.

Heatwave abates in central, east India

New Delhi, June 12: A few areas in northwest India braved intense heat on Sunday, though heatwave conditions have abated in most places in central and the adjoining eastern parts of the country, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) said. Heatwave conditions prevailed

in parts of Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, Jharkhand and Delhi, it said. At least 22 towns and cities in these states reported maximum temperatures above 44 degrees Celsius, the IMD said. 'Heatwave conditions have

abated from most parts of central and adjoining east India," the IMD said in a statement. However, the heatwave spell in isolated areas of Punjab, Haryana, Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand will continue till Monday, it said.

Northwest India is reeling under a heatwave spell since June 2 due to an onslaught of hot and dry



westerly winds. Weather experts said a major relief is likely from June 15-16. Under the influence of a fresh Western Disturbance and lower level easterlies, scattered to fairly widespread rainfall and thunderstorms are predicted in Jammu and Kashmir, Ladakh, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, east Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana and Delhi on June 15-16, the IMD said.



Post Covid, elderly return to workforce

New Delhi, June 12: This, too, is a Covid effect. Pushed out of their comfort zones by a pandemic that took away their financial security, many people in the twilight of their lives or recently retired are returning to the workforce – be it taking tuitions, applying for office assistant posts or setting up a hawker cart.

The reasons for seeking financial independence are varied as is the income bracket. It could be somebody whose son lost his job. another whose savings dwindled in the long months of lockdown or an elderly person who may have seen an earning child die of Covid and is forced to again support the family.



"Many elderly no longer have the concept of tomorrow and this is creating many uncertainties in the minds of people," said Himanshu Rath, founder and chairperson of Agewell Foundation. The number of job applications received at the Foundation's employment exchange portal, which provides employment opportunities to the elderly, has jumped since

We would receive about 400 to 450 applications every month before the pandemic. In the last couple of months, the num-

bers have jumped to almost 550. The number

of enquiries on phone either from new job seekers or those who have already applied has gone up from five to six a day to over 10 calls per day. So there is an increase of at least 30-35 per cent," Rath said.

According to a recent Agewell Foundation survey based on interactions with 5,000 older persons, more than 61 per cent retired older persons (81.5 per cent in the 60-75 age group) are in search of gainful work. Among those seeking employment is 79-yearold Gunn Shivdasani. It has been nearly 20 vears since he retired from his job in the garment industry but the vicissitudes of the lockdown have left him with little option but to look for work.

"My son lost his job in this pandemic and now he is earning much less than before. I want to help him so I am thinking of working again." the Delhi-based Shivdasani said. He has one son, one daughter, a daughter-in law and four grandchildren. Shvidsasani is willing to do anything but would prefer taking tuitions. "My grasp on English is good and it can help students. Any amount of money would actually help," he said. At 62, Sattar Khan is 17 years younger and in the same predicament. After his retirement as an office assistant at a private firm, he was looking forward to spending time with his family But that was not to be "I worked as an office assistant at a private firm all my life. When I retired I thought I would spend some time with my family but now there is so much uncertainty that I want to earn money. It should be enough for my needs so I am not dependent on my sons for anything," Khan, who also lives in Delhi, said.

Prophet remarks: 2 held over Jama Masjid protest

New Delhi, June 12: Delhi Police have identified and arrested two peo ple who were part of a large gathering that protested outside the Jama Masjid in the national capital two days ago, an official said

The accused, identified as Mohd Nadeem (43) and Faheem (37), both residents of Delhi, were arrested

DCP (Central) Shweta Chauhan said a case was registered on June 10 under section 188 (Disobedience to order duly promulgated by public servant) of the Indian Penal Code against the protesters.

However, the police has now added section 153 A (Promoting enmity between different groups on

grounds of religion, race, place of birth, residence, language, etc., and doing acts prejudicial to main-

tenance of harmony) to the FIR. The people of the minority community, in large numbers, had gathered outside the Jama Masjid to reg-

ister their protest against the

controversial remarks made by former Bharativa Janata Party leaders Nupur Sharma and Naveen

The agitators were demanding immediate arrest of Sharma and Jindal. Jama Masjid's Shahi Imam

given for the protest. "I didn't know who the protesters were," he said.

An FIR was also previously lodged against Sharma and several others for their alleged hate remarks during a debate on a TV news channel.

"We have lodged the FIR against those who were spreading messages of hate, inciting various groups and creating situations which are detrimental to the maintenance of public tranquility. One case has been registered against Nupur Sharma and another one has been registered against multiple social media entities based on the analysis. Notices will be sent to the social media intermediaries for the details." Delhi Police PRO Suman Nalwa had said earlier.

Guj's diamond industry hit hard by Russia-Ukraine war

Ahmedabad, June 12: The Russia Ukraine war has adversely affected the livelihood of lakhs of workers of the diamond industry in Gujarat, especially in rural parts of Saurashtra region where many units import small-size diamonds from Russia for processing and polishing, according to industry representatives.

The state's diamond industry employs nearly 15 lakh workers, the Gems and Jewellery Export Promotion Council's regional chairman, Dinesh Navadiya, told PTI.

Due to the shortage of supply of small-size rough diamonds from Russia, businessmen in Gujarat are forced to buy the raw material from African countries and other places, affecting their profits.

Hence, the diamond units in the state have curtailed the working hours of their workers and polishers, thus impacting their livelihood, he said.

The processing of big-size diamonds is mainly carried out at units in the state's Surat city.

The US, where 70 per cent of the cut and polished diamonds are exported from India, has imposed a ban on Russian companies.

Navadiva said a few large companies in the US have already sent them emails, saying they will not purchase goods of Russian-origin.

Hence, this has adversely affected the diamond industry workers in Guiarat, mainly in Bhaynagar, Rajkot, Amreli and Junagadh districts of Saurashtra as well as in some northern parts of the state, the industry stakeholders said.

"We had been importing nearly 27 per cent of rough diamonds from Russia. But, due to the war, now that much quantity is not reaching the processing units in Gujarat, affecting the work there,' Navadiya said.

Nearly 50 per cent of the entire

processing in Gujarat works on small-size diamonds, locally known as 'patli', he said.

Before the war, about 30 per cent of the total rough diamonds imported to Gujarat for polishing were brought from Alrosa, the Russian diamond mining company,

Out of all the cut and polished diamonds processed in Gujarat, 60 per cent are of Russian-origin, most of them being small-size diamonds, said Navadiya.

"There is a shortage of rough diamonds due to the Russia-Ukraine war, hence we are procuring the raw material from African countries at a higher price. This has affected our profit margins by around 25 per cent," said Lalit Thummar, a diamond trader from Amreli district.

Some diamond units have also cut the working hours of polishers employed there by 5-10 per cent, he said. Thummar said the diamond units are trying their best to ensure continuous supply of 'patli' diamonds from other sources, like small miners in African countries and lab-grown small-size diamonds

in China, but the price of such stones has also gone up, affecting their profits

"The diamond units are providing jobs to workers, but not on a scale seen before the war. They are being given six hours of work instead of eight hours earlier, and two weekly offs as against one day earlier," Navadiya said.

"As of now, manufacturers are sustaining despite facing losses. The production cost has increased and ready goods are not fetching the right price. Hence, the diamond units are providing limited jobs by trimming down the working hours of employees," he said.

Vitthal Mendapara, who owns a diamond unit in Bhavnagar, said smaller units are the most affected due to the ongoing Russia-Ukraine war. "There is a shortage of rough diamonds, but traders are using stocks lying with them to keep the polishers engaged. Workers in smaller units are affected due to the short supply of rough diamonds," said Mendapara, the former president of the Bhavnagar Diamond

At half-time, only 20% of waste at Delhi's landfill sites processed



New Delhi, June 12: Less than a fifth of the legacy waste at the three landfill sites -- Ghazipur, Okhla and Bhalswa -- in Delhi has been processed since the project to flatten the mountains of garbage started in October 2019, while the deadline is just two and a half years away, government data showed.

According to the data gathered from several reports of the Delhi Pollution Control Committee (DPCC), a total of 21 lakh tonnes of legacy waste is being bio-mined at the three landfill sites per year (since October 2019)

Ironically, around 20 lakh tonnes of fresh municipal solid waste found its way to the dump sites every year during this period.

The National Green Tribunal had in July 2019 directed the erstwhile municipal corporations to biomine the legacy waste using trommels instead of capping of the

by December 2023, the deadline for Ghazipur and Bhalswa dumpsites is December 2024

According to the latest DPCC report, only 52.5 lakh tonnes of the legacy waste has been processed so far at the three sites

The Ghazipur landfill site has seen the slowest progress. Only 11 lakh tonnes (7.86 per cent) of the legacy waste has been processed by May-end at the dump site in east Delhi.

It processed 3 lakh tonnes of the old waste in the first year of the project (from October, 2019 to October, 2020), 4.81 lakh tonnes in the second year (from October 2020 to October 2021) and around 3.2 lakh tonnes in the third year so far.

The data showed the erstwhile East Delhi Municipal Corporation (EDMC) bio-mined 4.4 lakh tonnes of waste per year on an average. At this pace, it will take the authorities around 29 more years to process the entire legacy

At the Okhla dumpsite, 16.5 lakh tonnes of the 60 lakh tonnes waste has been processed. The erstwhile SDMC bio-mined around 1.6 lakh tonnes of waste in the first year, 5.84 lakh tonnes in the second year and 8.66 lakh tonnes in the third

On an average, 6.6 lakh tonnes of legacy waste is being processed at the Okhla landfill, which means another 6.5 years are needed to deal with the old waste.

The erstwhile North MCD has bio-mined 25 lakh tonnes (31.25 per cent) of legacy waste since the project started -- 10 lakh tonnes every year on an average. At this rate, it will take the authorities another 5.5 years to complete the work. The data showed 12, 8 and 15 trommel machines, respectively, were operational at Ghazipur, Okhla and Bhalswa landfill sites in October 2019. While the number of machines reduced to eight at Ghazipur, it jumped to 26 at Okhla and 44 at Bhalswa during

this period. The increase in the number of machines at Okhla and Bhalswa explains the increase in the rate of processing there.

Apart from the legacy waste, the three dumpsites receive a lot of fresh waste every day.

Concerned over uncertain future, parents knock at govt's door

New Delhi, June 12: It's been more than two months since the Indian students studying in Ukraine returned home from the war-torn country, but they are still worried about their studies and future. The only question on the minds of the parents and students is 'What next?' The students are feeling cheated by the government.

Kamal, who returned home from Ivano city of Ukraine, is currently completing his first year studies in Varanasi. "The government is not listening to us; it has been more than two months. What will happen next? I am unable to understand anything. Medical education cannot be done online, while teachers are going through the formalities to collect fees. We have reached a point from where we cannot go back to study and we cannot study from here as well," he added.

Kamal claimed that "Some students have even left their studies. They include three or four of my friends."Ritika Nigam, a thirdyear student who returned from the city of Ternopil in Ukraine said, "No specific instructions have come from the government regarding our studies, but a couple of states have provided practical and other education-related assistance in government colleges. We want to be accommodated in a government college. The Madhya Pradesh government is not helping as compared to the



governments.

"We have got assurances so far

that something can happen by July, so we are just waiting. My exam is still going on but I do not understand what will happen next, how to complete my studies," she said.

The Parents Association of Ukraine MBBS Students had written a letter to the Uttar Pradesh government on the issue on June 10. in which it said that there are 2400 medical students in Uttar Pradesh alone while there are about 16,000 students across the country, most of them are now in depression.

Under Operation Ganga, the students and their parents who have returned home are demanding arrangements for further education in the medical colleges of the state itself.

They are also demanding that

arrangements should be made for the medical students of UP in the nearest medical colleges only till the next orders of the Central Government.

Apart from this, the parents have also sought time to meet the Chief Minister on this issue. Harsha Singhal, Coordinator of the Parents Association of Ukraine MBBS Students said, "Our applications for the education of the students have been sent to all the places from the PMO to the district level, we are making every effort from our side. From the government side, it was said that they will get the students admitted in Hungary. Studying in Hungary is very expensive. The second problem will be about the language and how

will thousands of students study in places where only 10 children can be admitted?"

"It is only because they don't get admission in India that we have sent them abroad to study. We are not begging, we are suffering from war. If the government is not able to help, we will approach the Supreme Court," she stated.

The Association's national general secretary Pankaj Dheeraj said, "There are 596 medical colleges in India. No authentic statement has been given by the government regarding thousands of students. However, the students whose studies are almost complete, they are allowed to do internship by NMC. But the children from the first year to the fourth year are in depression."

Nadda, Rajnath to hold talks with parties

New Delhi, June 12: The BJP Sunday authorised its president J P Nadda and Union minister Rajnath Singh to hold consultations with different political parties, including those in the opposition, on the president's election, in what is being seen as an outreach by the ruling party to arrive at a consensus on the choice for the top constitutional post.

The two senior leaders will talk to both ruling National Democratic Alliance (NDA) and opposition United Progressive Alliance (UPA) constituents, besides other political parties as well as independent members, the BJP said in a statement issued by its general secretary Arun Singh

Nadda and Singh will start holding these consultations soon, it added. The election for the next President will be held July 18, in which 4,809 electors, including MPs and MLAs, will vote to elect incumbent Ram Nath Kovind's

Going by its strength in the Lok Sabha and the Rajya Sabha as well as in many state assemblies, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) is



in a comfortable position to ensure the victory of the candidate nominated by it in the upcoming election. Singh, who enjoys a good rapport with leaders across the political spectrum, was also part of the BJP's committee during the 2017 presidential polls to deliberate with opposition parties.

In 2017, then BJP president Amit Shah had constituted a three-member panel of then senior Union ministers Singh, Arun Jaitley and M Venkaiah Naidu to hold talks with all the political parties over



the presidential polls. The BJP had fielded then Bihar governor Kovind as its candidate

Kovind went on to become the

president after defeating opposition-backed Meira Kumar. With relatively less numbers on

its side this time, the BJP-led NDA's nominee will require the support of one of the two fence-sitters -the Biju Janata Dal (BJD) and the YSR Congress Party. In the last presidential polls, both parties had supported Kovind.

Ink attack on 'rape' victim

New Delhi, June 12: A 23-yearold woman, who has accused Rajasthan minister Mahesh Joshi's son Rohit Joshi of raping her, was allegedly attacked with blue ink near Kalindi Kunj Road in southeast Delhi, police said Sunday.

The attack took place Saturday when the woman and her mother came to Delhi from Jaipur for some work, they said, adding that an FIR has been registered. Deputy Commissioner of Police (Southeast) Esha Pandey said a PCR call was received after some miscreants threw a liquid on a woman and ran away. A preliminary enquiry revealed

it was a blue liquid and looked like ink, the police said. The victim gave a statement, saving she was walking with her mother near Kalindi Kunj Road on Saturday when two people in an auto-rickshaw threw something at her and fled. The woman was thoroughly examined at the AIIMS Trauma Centre. Pandev said.

'The blue liquid prima facie looks like ink. In the matter, a case under section 195 A (threatening any person to give false evidence), 506 (criminal intimidation), 323 (voluntarily causing hurt) and 34 (common intention)

A preliminary enquiry revealed it was a blue liquid and looked like ink, the police said

of the Indian Penal Code was registered at the Shaheen Bagh police station and an investigation is underway," she added.

The DCP said police were looking for CCTV footage from the area to identify the culprits and ascertain the sequence of events. After slapping one of them,


the woman went inside the hotel to meet her husband. Later, when the couple came out

Scrub Typhus is an infectious disease caused by the Orientia tsutsugamushi, a mite-borne bacterium. It may be noted that chigger mites, the larval stage of mites, transmit the disease from rats, squirrels, rabbits and dogs.

In its latest monkeypox situation report, the Nigeria Center for Disease Control said Saturday that the country has recorded since January 110 suspected cases in total and 31 confirmed cases from 12 states.

Oz reports record flu cases in May

Canberra: Australia has reported a record 65,770 flu cases in May, which marked an increase of more than 100 per cent from the previous record set in May 2019, authorities said Sunday. HK to distribute about 40K RAT kits

Hong Kong: The Hong Kong government announced that it will distribute around 40.000 sets of Covid-19 rapid antigen test (RAT) kits as part of a follow-up on the recent detection of the virus in sewage samples. The test kits will be distributed to residents, cleaning workers and property management staff working in estate in Kwun Tong with positive sewage testing results showing relatively high viral loads, in order to help identify infected persons.

Destroyed depot with Western weapons in Ukraine: Russia

Moscow has repeatedly slammed the United States and other nations for supplying Ukraine with weapons

Kyiv, June 12: Russian forces fired cruise missiles to destroy a large depot containing US and European weapons in western Ukraine's Ternopil region, Interfax reported Sunday, as street fighting raged in the eastern city of Sievierodonetsk.

The governor of the Ternopil region said a rocket attack on the city of Chortkiv fired from the Black Sea had partly destroyed a military facility, injuring 22 people. A local official said there were no weapons stored there.

President Vladimir Putin said earlier this month that Russia would strike new targets if the West supplied longer-range missiles to Ukraine for use in high-precision mobile rocket systems.

Ukrainian leaders have renewed pleas to Western countries in recent days to speed up deliveries of heavy weapons as Russian forces pound the east of the country with artillery Sievierodonetsk has become epicentre of the battle for control over the industrialised Donbas region in the east, made up of Luhansk and Donetsk provinces.

Parts of the city have been pulverised in some of the bloodiest fighting since Moscow began its invasion February 24.

Luhansk Governor Serhiv Gaidai said Sunday that Ukrainian and Russian forces were still fighting street by street in Sievierodonetsk. He said that while Russian forces have taken most of the city, Ukrainian troops remain in control of an industrial area and chemical plant where hundreds of civilians are sheltering.

After being forced to scale back its initial campaign goals Moscow has turned to expanding control in the Donbas, where pro-Russian separatists have held a swath of territory since 2014.

Ukraine has said some 800 people were hiding in bomb shelters under the Azot plant, including employees and city residents. In Lysychansk – Sievierodonetsk's twin city across the Donets River - a woman was killed in Russian shelling while four houses and a shopping centre were destroyed, Gaidai said.

To the south and southwest of Sievierodonetsk, Russian forces were firing mortars and artillery around a number of settlements, according to a daily update from Ukraine's general staff. But it said Ukrainian forces had repulsed Russian attempts to advance towards some communities.

SL PM says he's open to Russian oil

Western nations largely have cut off energy imports from Russia in line with sanctions over its war on Ukraine

Colombo, June 12: Sri Lanka may be compelled to buy more oil from Russia as the island nation hunts desperately for fuel amid an unprecedented economic crisis, the newly appointed Prime Minister said.

Prime Minister Ranil Wickremesinghe said he would first look to other sources, but would be open to buying more crude from Moscow. In a wideranging interview with The Associated Press Saturday, Wickremesinghe also indicated he would be willing to accept more financial help from China, despite his country's mounting debt.

And while he acknowledged that



Sri Lanka's current predicament is of "its own making", he said the war in Ukraine is making it even worse and that dire food shortages could continue until 2024. He said Russia had also offered wheat to Sri Lanka. Wickremesinghe, who is also Sri Lanka's finance minister, spoke to the AP in his office in the capital, Colombo, one day shy of a month after he took over for a sixth time as prime minister.

Appointed by President Gotabaya Rajapaksa to resolve an economic crisis that has nearly emptied the country's foreign exchange re-

serves, Wickremesinghe was sworn in after days of violent protests last month forced his predecessor, Rajapaksa's brother Mahinda Rajapaksa, to step down and seek safety from angry crowds at a naval base. Sri Lanka has amassed \$51 billion in foreign debt, but has suspended repayment of nearly \$7 billion due this year. The crushing debt has left the country with no money for basic imports, which means citizens are struggling to access basic necessities such as food, fuel, medicine — even toilet paper and matches.

China accuses US of trying to 'hijack' support in Asia under the guise of multilateral-AGENCIES

Singapore, June 12: China's defence minister accused the United States Sunday of trying to "hijack" the support of countries in the Asia-Pacific region to turn them against Beijing, saying Washington is seeking to advance its own interests "under the guise of multilateralism.

Defense Minister Gen. Wei Fenghe lashed out at US Secretary of Defense Lloyd Austin, rejecting his "smearing accusation" the day before at the Shangri-La Dialogue that China was causing instability with its claim to the selfgoverning island of Taiwan and its increased military activity in

Austin had stressed the need for multilateral partnerships with nations in the Indo-Pacific, which Wei suggested was an attempt to back China into a corner.

"No country should impose its will on others or bully others

ism," he said. "The strategy is an attempt to build an exclusive small group in the name of a free and open Indo-Pacific to hijack countries in our region and target one specific country — it is a strategy to create conflict and confrontation to contain and encircle others.

China has been rapidly modernizing its military and seeking to expand its influence and ambitions in the region, recently signing a security agreement with the Solomon Islands that many fear could lead to a Chinese naval base in the Pacific, and breaking ground this past week on a naval port expansion project in Cambodia that could give Beijing a foothold in the Gulf of Thailand.

Zara logs over 61% growth in FY22

New Delhi: Spain's Inditex which owns luxury fashion brand Zara, posted a net profit of ₹148.76 crore and revenue of ₹1.815 crore for the financial vear ended March 31, 2022. according to the latest annual report of Trent Ltd. In FY21. Inditex Trent Retail India Private Ltd (ITRIPL), a JV which is engaged in the operation of Zara stores in India, had reported a net loss of ₹41 crore and its revenue fell 28.3 per cent to ₹1.126 crore in the pandemic impacted year. The entity for Zara currently operates 21 stores across 11 cities. There has been no increase in the number of stores in the last two years.

Netflix frontrunner to buy rival Roku

San Francisco: Streaming giant Netflix that is struggling to retain long-term paid subscribers may acquire rival platform Roku, the media reported. According to a report in Insider citing sources, Roku employees have long been speculating about the company being sold to Netflix. The buyout would reportedly cost around \$13 billion (based on its current valuation) and will give Netflix a foothold in the hardware market.

BharatPe sees more high-profile exits

New Delhi: After facing the months-long Ashneer Grover saga, fintech platform BharatPe is witnessing some high-profile exits and now, its founding member Satyam Nathani has resigned. Top 100 global firms' m-cap tops \$31.7tn

The United States continues to dominate the 'Global Top 100' list in terms of market capitalisation and number of companies, with 59 firms accounting for 65% of total market capitalisation

New Delhi, June 12: The market capitalisation of the top 100 companies globally increased from \$10.3 trillion to \$31.7 trillion, an increase of 48 per cent, from March 2020 till March 2021, a new report said Sunday

Apple topped the list with \$2.85 trillion in market cap, followed by Saudi Aramco, Microsoft, Alphabet and Amazon, according to the data provided by London-based accounting company PwC

Apple regained its crown as the world's largest company by market capitalisation with a valuation 6 per cent and 13 per cent ahead of Saudi Aramco and Microsoft, respectively.

Elon Musk-run Tesla's market capitalisation increased from \$96 billion in March 2020 to \$641 billion in March 2021, an astonishing 565 per cent increase and a clear outlier in the top 10 risers.

Amazon's market capitalisation increased by 61 per cent in the year to March 2021, supported by the growing "stay-at-home economy" seen throughout 2020 and into 2021, although Amazon did not move up from fourth position.

Samsung Electronics Co was the world's 22nd-largest company

in terms of market capitalisation, down seven notches from a year earlier. The tech giant was the only South Korean company on the list with a market value of \$342 billion, as of March.

Taiwan Semiconductor Manufacturing Co came in 10th, with its market cap reaching \$541 billion, up by one notch from a year earlier. Global Top 100 Technology companies saw a 71% increase as compared to their value as at March 2020, in-line with the wider industry index performance.

"As a point of comparison, in the private company domain, half of the Top 100 unicorns valued at \$1 billion and above (at 31 March 2021) were from the US, broadly in line with the 'Global Top 100' of public companies," the report noted. The value of the top 100 unicorns grew by 30 per cent to \$1.1 trillion in the year to March 2021, behind the public companies' market capitalisation increase in the same period (49 per cent).

There were no direct entrants to the 'Global Top 100' companies via IPO despite a buoyant IPO market. "The threshold to enter the list is now \$129 billion, potentially creating a barrier to future entrants via IPO," the report noted.

Govt loses \$111mn gas

New Delhi, June 12: The government has lost its appeal in the million arbitration award in favour of Reliance Industries Ltd (RIL) and Shell in a cost recovery dispute in the western offshore Panna-Mukta and Tapti oil and gas fields.

High Court judge Ross Cranston June 9, 2022 ruled that the government should have brought its objections over the arbitration tribunal not meeting the required thresholds, when issuing the 2021 award earlier, two sources with knowledge of the matter said.

Reliance and Shell-owned BG Exploration & Production India December 16, 2010, dragged the government to arbitration over cost recovery provisions, profit due to the State and amount of statutory dues including royalty payable. They wanted to raise the limit of cost that could be recovered from sale of oil and gas before profits are shared with the government.

The government of India also raised counter claims over expenditure incurred, inflated sales, excess cost recovery, and short accounting.

A three-member arbitration panel headed by Singapore-based lawyer Christopher Lau by majority issued a final partial award (FPA) October 12, 2016. It upheld the government view that the profit from the fields should be calculated after deducting the prevailing tax of 33 per cent and not the 50 per cent rate that existed earlier.

It also upheld that the cost recovery in the contract is fixed at \$545 million in Tapti gas field and \$577.5 million in Panna-Mukta oil and gas field. The two firms wanted that cost provision be raised by \$365 million in Tapti and \$62.5 million in Panna-Mukta.

Royalty, it said, had to be calculated after inclusion of marketing margin charged over and above the wellhead price of natural gas.

The government used this award to seek \$3.85 billion in dues from Reliance and BG Exploration & Production India Ltd (BGEPIL).

The government had used the 2016 partial award not just to raise a \$3.85 billion demand on Reliance and Shell but also sought to block Reliance's proposed \$15 billion deal with Saudi Aramco on grounds that the company owed money to it.

New Delhi, June 12: India's power demand this year has jumped by a record 40,000-45,000 MW per day as an intense heat wave sweeps through northern parts of the country the economy expands, and electricity reaches millions of unelectrified homes, Power Minister

RK Singh has said. Power plants are operating at full throttle to meet this demand. and the government has ordered coal import to meet the shortfall in domestic supplies.

"The whole power sector has changed (in last 8 years)," Singh said. "Before (2014), we were power deficit. load shedding was endemic".

According to a survey by an NGO, the average availability of power in rural areas was about 12.5 hours at the national level.

"Today it is 22.5 hours," he said. A power deficit nation with an average shortage of anywhere be-

tween 17 and 20 per cent, India has been transformed into a power surplus country.

Power plants operate at run rates much lower than their capacity. This in the case of renewable energy units, such as solar power, is just one-fifth of the rated capacity.

However, local production of coal - the feedstock for most of the power generated in the country - has kept

pace with the spurt in demand. Coal India Ltd has already floated tenders for the import of coal, he said.

Singh said the government was working to move domestic coal to power plants, as well as imported one to prepare for the monsoon season when output from local mines comes down. In addition to fossil fuel-based

power generation capacity, renewable capacity addition has soared. "India pledged that by 2030, 40 per

cent of our capacity will be non-fossil fuel-based. We achieved this target 9 years in advance in November 2021," he said. "Today, established renewable capacity is 1.58,000 MW and another 54,000 MW is under construction".

Added to that 6,000 MW of nuclear capacity, the total renewable capacity comes to 1.65,000 MW -which is 41 per cent of established capacity, he said.

Facing 'polycrisis', WTO chief warns of rocky road to deals

Geneva, June 12: World Trade Organization chief Ngozi Okonjo-Iweala expressed cautious optimism Sunday that more than 100 trade ministers meeting in Geneva would achieve one or two global deals this week, but warned the path there would be bumpy and rocky.

The director-general from Nigeria said the world had changed since the WTO's last ministerial conference nearly five years ago.

"I wish I could say for better. It has certainly become more complex," she told a news conference before the meeting, listing the lingering Covid-19 pandemic, the war in Ukraine and major food and energy crises as pieces of a "polycrisis"

She urged trade ministers to go the extra mile over the coming days to achieve agreements such as to reduce fishing subsidies, boost access to Covid-19 vaccines, address food security and to set a course for reform of the WTO itself.

"Let me be clear, even landing one or two will not be an easy road. The road will be bumpy and rocky. There may be a landmine along the way," Okonjo-Iweala said, adding she was "cautiously optimistic" that the meeting would conclude with one or two deals

Moscow, June 12: It might look and smell like McDonald's but now it's Vkusno & tochka. The golden arches are gone, the filet-of-fish is simply a fish burger. The Big Mac has left Russia.

A new era for Russia's fast-food and economic scene dawned Sunday as McDonald's restaurants flung open their doors in Moscow under new Russian ownership and with the new name, which translates

as "Tasty and that's it". The fortunes of the revamped chain, which McDonald's sold when it exited the country over the conflict in Ukraine, could provide a test of how successfully Russia's economy can become more self-sufficient and withstand Western sanctions.

Sunday, scores of people queued outside what was once McDonald's flagship restaurant in central Moscow. The outlet sported a new logo - a stylised burger with two fries - plus a slogan reading: "The name changes, love stays".

The queue was significantly smaller than the thousands of people who thronged to the original McDonald's opening there in 1990 during the Soviet era. Vkusno & tochka's menu was

McDonald's closed its restaurants in Russia March 14 and said in mid-May it decided to leave the market.

Alexander Govor, the new owner of the chain, said up to 7 billion roubles (\$125.56 million) would be invested this year in the business, which employs 51,000 people.

"The corporation asked me to, first of all, keep the headcount, to provide people with work. That's

what I'm going to do," he added. Govor said the company was looking for new suppliers of soft drinks as Coca Cola, which has said it was suspending its busi-

ness in Russia. Moments after the press conference finished a man stood up in front of the cameras holding a sign that read "Bring back the Big-

Mac". He was swiftly escorted out by restaurant staff.

Klaasen outclasses India

Cuttack, June 12: Sports is all about seizing the moment Wicketkeeper- batter Heinrich Klaasen (81, 46b, 7x4, 5x6) did just that to propel South Africa to a four-wicket victory over India in the second of the five T20 Internationals at the Barabati Stadium here Sunday. The win helped the visitors take a commanding 2-0 lead in the series.

Chasing a target of 149, South Africa were rocked early on by Bhuvneshwar Kumar's (4/13) seam and swing. Klaasen coming into bat at 29 for three knew he had to strike back. And he did just that. Such was his assault that Axar Patel bowled only one over in which the left-arm spinner gave away 19 runs. Yuzvendra Chahal (1/49 off four) also faced the wrath of Klaasen and was hit for two huge sixes in the leg-spinner's fourth over.

Klaasen steadied the ship putting on 64 runs for the fourth wicket with skipper Temba Bavuma (35, 30b, 4x4, 1x6) first to steady the ship. He then put on 51 runs for the fifth wicket with David Miller (20 no, 15b, 1x4, 1x6) to completely turn the match in South Africa's favour. When he finally fell caught in the deep off Harshal Patel (1/17) the visitors were only five runs away from winning the game. Miller then finished the game off.

Defending 148 was always going to be tough irrespective of the 'slowness' of the pitch. It was only the brilliance of Kumar that enabled India to have a sniff. However, the spinners and Hardik Pandva (0/31 off 3) failed to keep things under check. South Africa had managed only 57 runs in their first 10 overs. But in the next 8.2 overs they scored 92 runs to romp home. It just goes to show the number of loose deliveries that their batters got to hit. Yes, some good deliveries were also tonked, but both Patel and Chahal were guilty of bowling too many drag down deliveries which helped the opposition.

Earlier India posted 148 for the loss of six wickets after being put in. Shreyas Iyer (40, 35b, 2x4, 2x6), Ishan Kishan (34, 21b, 2x4, 3x6) looked in sublime touch before they got out.

However, had it not been for eternal comeback man Dinesh Karthik (30 n o. 21b. 2x4, 2x6). India would not have inched closer to the 150-run mark. Karthik hit two sixes in the last over off Dwaine Pretorius and that helped India put up some useful runs on the board.

For the visitors Anrich Nortje (2/36) was the most successful bowler. However, it was the duo of Kagiso Rabada (1/15 off 4) and Wayne Parnell (1/23 off 4) who did not allow the Indian batters break the shackles. They hit the deck hard and with the pitch offering uneven bounce, they made life difficult for the Indian batters.

Ruturaj Gaikwad (1) was the first to depart, caught by Keshav Maharai at backward-point while trying to drive Rabada. He did not get to the pitch of the ball and could not keep it down.

Kishan and Iyer then added 45 runs for the second wicket. Kishan was the more aggressive of the

BLUE TIGERS JUST 1 WIN AWAY FROM OUALIFYING FOR AFC ASIAN CIP

Kolkata, June 12: Their tails up after two successive wins in front of a strong home crowd, captain of the Indian football team, Sunil Chhetri has backed his team to beat Hong Kong in the last qualifying game and secure a berth in next year's AFC Asian Cup.

India prevailed over Afghanistan 2-1 in a thrilling match that saw three quick goals being scored at the fag end of the game at the Salt Lake Stadium here which had 40,000 spectators in the stands Saturday evening.

The day coincided with talismanic skipper Chhetri completing 17 years in international football. "It feels great to celebrate my 17th year in international football in this fashion. I felt that maybe we will be splitting the points after Afghanistan equalised. But the boys did what they did." Chhetri said after the end of the game.

"But at the same time, such milestones don't mean much to me. I am honoured and privileged to wear the national team jersey for so long. I want to serve India as long as I can." Chhetri added.

Chhetri laughed when reminded about him sprinting like Usain Bolt to celebrate Abdul Sahal Samad's decisive strike in injury time.

The GPS will say that that was my fastest sprint of the night. We will rest, recover and have a look at the videos. Hong Kong are a good side, but we are at home, and will be backing ourselves. All of the fans will be there too," Chhetri pointed out

The win helped India consolidate their position in the group as they seek to make a second straight appearance in the Asian Cup and fifth overall, having been knocked out in the group stage in the last edition in 2019.

Samad, who scored the winner late in the second half sounded ecstatic. "The victory was earned in front of the fans, and hence, it tastes sweeter. I had to back myself, and placed it (ball) beyond the goalkeeper. And even before I could realise, the entire team was there to celebrate," he stated.

It was Chhetri who had put India ahead with a brilliant free-kick from just over 20 yards. It was the Indian superstar's 83rd goal in international football as he closed in on second-placed Argentine genius Lionel Messi among active

"We failed to take wickets at regular intervals during the second half of the innings and that was the problem for us. Our spinners couldn't deliver." Pant added.

Hima not ruling out return to 400m

SPRINTER STILL WORKING ON HER FITNESS AND SAYS THAT SHE IS EYING A GOOD SHOW AT ASIAN GAMES

Chennai, June 12: Star sprinter Hima Das is not ruling out a return to 400m, an event which shot her to fame in 2018. She is hoping to make a comeback to the quartermile in the now-postponed Asian Games, which is likely to be held next vear.

The 22-year-old 'Dhing Express' last ran a major 400m race during the Asian Championships in Doha in April 2019, but pulled out of that race midway due to a lower back injury.

After returning from the injury lay-off, Hima has been running 100m and 200m. She holds the national record of 50.79 seconds in the 400m. "I have not cut (off) running the 400m. It (recovery from injury) is a long process. During my in-

jury time, I was not being able to run 400m because a lot of pres-

sure developed on the right side of my back," Hima said Sunday.

Sachin (Tendulkar) sir once told me that a sportsperson and injury are like friends. How to face that (injury) and move ahead and give result is the challenge you have to overcome. His words inspire me

"I may not run the 400m at this point in time, but will surely do it (in near future). It may happen at the end of this year, otherwise I may prepare 400m for the postponed Asian Games because I will get time to prepare," the sprinter added. She also said that she is well off running (till 300m, but the last 100 metres are turning out to be a problem
