

PROTESTS IN ODISHA

Bhubaneswar: Protests against the Centre's Agnipath scheme spread to Odisha Friday as hundreds of aspirants for recruitment in the Armed Forces blocked the arterial Ring Road in Cuttack and tore down hoardings in Cantonment area. Many among the protesters claimed to have already cleared fitness and medical tests for recruitment in the Army last year and were waiting to write Common Entrance Examination. Police resorted to lathi charge to disperse protesters and detained some of them, said DCP Pinak Mishra.

ASPIRANT ENDS LIFE

Balasore: A 27-year-old man Dhananjay Mohanty, a resident of Tentei village in Soro police station area who had cleared the physical fitness test one and half years ago during a recruitment drive by the Army, allegedly committed suicide due to frustration over the Agnipath scheme. His family members said that Mohanty had received the admit card for the CEE to be held August 30. But he apprehended that the examination stood cancelled after the announcement of the Agnipath scheme.

234 TRAINS CANCELLED

New Delhi: The Railways cancelled 234 trains while 340 trains have been affected so far due to protests against the Agnipath scheme for recruitment in the defence services, the Railways said Friday. It said that 94 mail and express trains and 140 passenger trains have been cancelled due to the protests, while 65 mail and express and 30 passenger trains were partially cancelled. The Railways has also diverted 11 mail and express trains. The total number of trains affected so far stands at 340, officials said.

Angry crowds, some armed with brickbats and stones, fanned out across large parts of India, from Uttar Pradesh to Telangana and Bihar to Madhya Pradesh.

The protests spread, seemingly uncontrolled, with crowds squatting on tracks and highways. pelting stones and vandalising public property to vent their anger resulting in losses worth many crores of rupees.

A mob attacked the home of BJP leader and Bihar Deputy Chief Minister Renu Devi in Patna. In Secunderabad, a parcel coach of a passenger train was set ablaze by a crowd of about 300-350.

One person was fatally injured



when police fired in the air to disperse protesters on the rampage at the Secunderabad station.

Confirming the death, a senior official of the South Central Railway told PTI the firing was done by Railway Protection Force (RPF).

There was mayhem with people running helter-skelter and shops in the vicinity hurriedly downing shutters.

The scenes of chaos over the de fence recruitment scheme that touched an emotive chord in thousands of youth and led to rail and road traffic being disrupted were mirrored elsewhere in the country.

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi cited schemes such as GST, noteban, farm laws and now Agnipath and said they were projected to be for the welfare of the people but were

rejected by the citizens.

'Be ready for possible disasters'

Bhubaneswar, June 17: Noting that the period between June and October is crucial for Odisha in terms of natural calamities, Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik Friday asked the state administration to follow the state's policy of 'every life is precious' while dealing with all possible disasters.

Patnaik said this 'every life is precious' policy has made Odisha a leading state in the field of disaster management and risk reduction. The coastal state has emerged as a pioneer in managing disasters, especially cyclones, by reducing human loss during calamities.

In April 2018, Odisha became the first Indian state to have an early warning system in place for natural disasters such as cyclones and tsunamis for people living



along its 480 km-long coast.

Natural disasters like floods, cvclones, and droughts occur in the June-October period every year, and therefore the state administration must strengthen its preparedness to handle such calamities, the CM said.

Patnaik issued the directions while presiding over the state-level Natural Disaster Management Committee Meeting here.

The entire administrative machinery, Patnaik said, should be ready with early information dissemination systems, rescue, and relief arrangements, drinking water supply systems, and health and animal care. The CM said officials must ensure the availability of enough food stocks in disasterprone and remote areas, 24-hour functioning of district-level emergency centres, and opening of veterinary camps. Special attention should be given to pregnant women. people with physical and mental disabilities, children, widows, and

Guj riots, Mughal courts out from NCERT books

CHAPTERS TITLED 'DEMOCRACY AND DIVERSITY', 'POPULAR STRUGGLE AND MOVEMENTS' AND 'CHALLENGES TO DEMOCRACY' DROPPED

New Delhi, June 17: The NCERT has removed portions about the 2002 Gujarat riots, Emergency, Cold War, Naxalite movement and Mughal courts from its class 12 textbooks as part of its 'syllabus rationalisation' exercise.

The National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT) has cited 'overlapping' and 'irrelevant' as reasons for dropping those portions from the syllabus. Many of these changes were

announced earlier this year when the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) rationalised its syllabi in April. Besides schools under CBSE, some state boards also use NCERT textbooks.

Listing the changes, the NCERT, in a note, said, "The content of the textbooks has been rationalised for various reasons, including overlapping with similar content in other subject areas in the same class, similar content included in the lower or higher classes on the same subject.'



In class 12 political science textbook, pages on the topic 'Gujarat Riots' will be excluded from the chapter titled 'Recent Developments in Indian Politics'. The mention of the National Human Rights Commission report on the 2002 violence and the 'raj dharma' remark by then Prime Minister Atal Behari Vajpayee have been dropped from the textbook. Also, chapters on Mughal courts in a history textbook, a poem on the Dalit movement and a chapter on the Cold War, are among the exclusions from the political science textbook.

In class 10, the excluded chapters included verses of poet Faiz Ahmed


Faiz in the 'Religion, Communalism and Politics — Communalism. Secular State' section of the textbook 'Democratic Politics II'. Also, chapters titled 'Democracy

and Diversity', 'Popular Struggle and Movements' and 'Challenges to Democracy' have been dropped.

In the social science textbook of classes seven and eight, references to Dalit writer Omprakash Valmiki were removed. In the class seven textbook titled 'Our Past-2', the topic 'Emperors: major campaigns and events', has been removed.

SEXUAL ABUSE CASE

NHRC seeks report from DGP, Khurda DM

Bhubaneswar, June 17: The National has sought action-taken reports (ATRs) from the Director General of Police (DGP) and Khurda Collector and District Magistrate (DM) within four weeks in connection with the alleged sexual harassment of a minor girl by a police official in the capital city here.

The NHRC gave this direction June 16 while hearing a plea filed by rights activist Himanshu Sekhar Nayak. The rights activist has informed the commission that the accused, a constable at Lingaraj police station in the capital city, sexually exploited the minor girl for



four years by promising to marry her. "Accused Rajanikanta Gamango, who hails from Gajapati district, came in contact with the girl, a resident under Lingaraj police limits, while visiting one of his friends—a neighbour of the minor. Gamango sexually abused the girl when she was 13 and video recorded the same. The victim was then black-

mailed and subjected to frequent sexual abuse. He continued to exploit the girl for at least four years now," Nayak said in his complaint while quoting the victim's police complaint.

Recently, the victim mustered courage and approached the Childline authorities who helped the minor get her complaint registered with the Mahila police here.

The Mahila police registered a case under relevant Sections of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO)

Council of Ministers approves Budget

Bhubaneswar, June 17: The state government has approved the budget for the remaining eight months of the current financial year 2022-23 in the first meeting of the newly formed Council of Ministers held here under the chairmanship of Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik Friday

Finance Minister Niranjan Pujari will present the budget before the Assembly July 2, the first day of the monsoon session of the House.

Sources indicated that the total budget for the entire financial year will be Rs 2 lakh crore.

In March 30, the state government had approved a budget of Rs 1.06 lakh crore for the first four months April-July of the financial year. At that time, the government had estimated the total size of the budget at Rs 2 lakh crore.

In view of the model code of conduct, imposed due to the panchayat and urban body elections in the state, the government had opted for a vote-on-account budget instead of the regular budget. Out of Rs 2 lakh crore, the total programme expenditure outlay was Rs 1,10,000 crore.

Similarly, the outlay for disaster response funds was Rs 3,210 crore while the outlay for transfers from the state to the local bodies was Rs 7,170 crore.

The monsoon session will continue till August 4.

Bhubaneswar, June 17: The Economic Offences Wing (EOW) of state Crime Branch has arrested a realtor on charges of duping investors of more than ₹1 crore on the pretext of providing flats in a housing project by Basera Designs Pvt Ltd at Sijua on the outskirts of the Capital city.

The accused was identified as Amaresh Chandra Sarangi, a resident of Nuagan Barabati under Fategarh police station in

Nayagarh district.

The EOW Thursday arrested the accused following a probe into the EOW police station case (2/22) based on a complaint lodged by one Jyoti Shankar Panda. He was Friday produced before the OPID court at Cuttack that sent him to judicial custody. Panda

had accused in his complaint that Sarangi along with three other accused duped several persons including the complainant to the tune of ₹1.15 crore.

Sarangi introduced himself to Panda and his brother Subha Shankar as a partner in the real estate firm Basera Designs Pvt Ltd in 2016. Sarangi and other accused individuals including the Managing Director of the firm induced the siblings to buy a flat in their project.

Subsequently, the siblings booked a 3BHK apartment (no 306) in 'Basera Fresco' at Sijua here for ₹41,50,000. They also executed the agreement for acquisition of ownership of apartment with the MD April 25, 2016. The accused persons had promised the complainant to hand over the flat by June 30, 2017.

The siblings later approached the Old Station Square Branch of Allahabad Bank through the builder for a housing loan of ₹32 lakh. A tripartite agreement between the bank, the complainant and the realtor was executed following which the bank transferred ₹18,50,000 to the account of the real estate firm through Demand Draft.

"The accused persons including the Builder, by entering into a conspiracy, neither handed over the apartment to the complainant, nor did they return the amount so received from the complainant. The accused persons also did not renew the approval of BDA which should have been done after 3 years of approval. The accused persons closed down their office at Palasuni, Bhubaneswar and absconded," revealed the EOW sources.

During the course of investigation, the EOW also came to know that the accused have cheated several others to the tune of ₹1,15,82,550 in similar fashion.

The sleuths found out that a large chunk of the money collected from the investors through Basera Designs have been diverted to the bank account of 'Sadangi Traders', a firm owned by the accused Sarangi. This apart, he is the director of 'Cottage Design Pvt Ltd' and 'LX Max Developers Pvt Ltd'.

Search is on to arrest other accused persons involved in the case, said EOW sources.

'StartUps for Railways' to help improve rail safety

Bhubaneswar, June 17: 'StartUps for Railways' would leverage innovative technologies developed by startups in order to improve operational efficiency and safety of the Indian Railways, said East Coast Railway (ECoR) General Manager (I/C) Sharad Kumar Srivastav while highlighting the ambitious policy of the national transporter at Rail Sadan here Friday.

Launched by Railways, Communications and Electronics & Information Technology Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw June 13 this year, StartUps for Railways aims at bringing scale and efficiency in the field of operation, maintenance and infrastructure creation in Indian Railways through participation of very large and untapped startup ecosystem, said Srivastav.

As per the new policy, Srivastav said, grant up to Rs 1.5 crore will be given to innovator on equal sharing basis with provision of milestone-wise payment. "Complete process, from floating of problem

statement to development of prototype, will be done online through Indian Railway Innovation portal with defined timeline to make it transparent and objective." he said. Srivastav added that trials of prototypes will be done in Railways. Enhanced funding will be provided to scale up deployment on successful performance of prototypes.

Efficiency and Research Directorate of Railway Board shall be the nodal directorate for policy implementation and process execution. Selection of innovator will be done by a transparent and fair system which will be dealt through online portal. Developed Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) will remain with innovators only, he said.

In Uttar Pradesh's Ballia town, youths raised slogans such as "Bharat Mata ki Jai" and "Agnipath Vapas Lo" and set an empty train on fire and vandalised a few other trains, prompting police to lathicharge them. Protests also erupted in Varanasi, Firozabad and Amethi, causing damage to government buses and other symbols of public property.

Madhya Pradesh's commercial capital Indore saw hundreds gather on tracks and hurl stones. About 15 protesters were arrested.

"Nearly 600 youths gathered in different groups on the tracks near Laxmibai Nagar railway station in the city, forcing the railway administration to stop a few trains," Indore Police Commissioner Harinarayan Chari Mishra told PTI.

The fight against the government scheme escalated in Haryana with youths burning tyres and several others squatting on rail tracks in Narwana and blocking the Jind-Bathinda track, officials said.

Following the violent protests in Palwal, the Haryana government has suspended mobile internet and SMS services for 24 hours in Ballabhgarh area of Faridabad district as a precautionary measure. Police booked over 1,000 people for the violence on Thursday in Palwal district.

An official said verification and identification of all the accused from video clippings and CCTV footage was being done. He did not divulge further information.

The national capital was relatively quiet but Metro travel was disrupted with members of the Left-affiliated All India Students' Association staging demonstrations. The entry and exit gates of some Delhi Metro stations had to be closed.

The volatile agitation that spread like the proverbial wildfire saw politicians ranged against each other.

While the government defended the scheme, saying it will secure the future of youths and help maintain a youthful profile of the armed forces, opposition leaders maintained it would adversely impact the functioning of the armed forces.

Unveiling the scheme on Tuesday, the government had said youngsters between the ages of 17-and-a-half and 21 years would be inducted for a four-year tenure, while 25 per cent of the recruits will be retained for regular service.

Utkal University organises seminar on climate change

Bhubaneswar, June17: Rapidly changing climate coupled with soaring pollution is one of the major challenges of this century and steps should be taken immediately to control the situation, said Partha Nayak, a researcher from University of Texas, USA in a seminar on climate change organised by Utkal university here Friday.

Speaking on the seminar titled Climate Change, Sustainability and Public Health', Nayak who was the special guest on this occasion said that mining and plastic production are causing major threat to the environment in the world due to which pollution is increasing, thus impacting the public health adversely. Indian subcontinent has been witnessing tremendous greenhouse gas (GHGs) emissions and is in fact one of the most vulnerable countries in the world to the present climate. 'We should emulate the efforts of Mundra in Gujarat where mangrove plantation has been done on

species,' he emphasised.

He also gave a presentation on his studies and research from different countries like French Polynesia, 145 islands and their problems and sustainable plans to save the marine species.

Sabita Acharya, Vice Chancellor, who was the chief guest on this occasion, said that the issue of climate change should be taken up on war footing by government and other international organisations.

Turning away head by 9° during short talks reduces Cov risk

urning the head away by nine degrees during short conversations reduces the risk of Covid infection, the Indian Institute of Science (IISc) said in a statement Friday.

A team of researchers from the Department of Aerospace Engineering, IISc, along with collaborators from the Nordic Institute for Theoretical Physics (NORDITA) in Stockholm and the International Centre for Theoretical Sciences (ICTS) in Bangalore have been involved in the study which was published in the journal Flow

lished in the journal Flow.

Based on the results, the team suggests that just turning the head away by about nine degrees from each other while still maintaining eye contact can reduce the risk for

the speakers considerably.

The statement explains that when a person sneezes or coughs, they can potentially transmit droplets carrying viruses like SARS-CoV-2 to others in their vicinity. Does talking to an infected person also carry an increased risk of infection? How do speech droplets or "aerosols" move in the air between the people interacting?

To answer these questions, the research team carried out computer simulations to analyse the movement of the speech aerosols.

The team visualised scenarios in which two mask-less people are standing two, four or six feet apart and talking to each other for about a minute, and then estimated the rate and extent of spread of the speech aerosols from one to another.

Their simulations showed that the risk of getting infected was higher when one person acted as a passive listener and did not engage in a two-way conversation. Factors like the height difference between the people talking and the quantity of aerosols released from their mouths also appear to play an important role in viral transmission.

"Speaking is a complex activity and when people speak, they are not really conscious as to whether this can constitute a means of virus transmission," said Sourabh Diwan, Assistant Professor in the Department of Aerospace Engineering, and one of the corresponding authors.

In the early days of the Covid-19 pandemic, experts believed that



the virus mostly spread symptomatically through coughing or sneezing. Soon, it became clear that asymptomatic transmission also leads to the spread of Covid-19. However, very few studies have looked at aerosol transport by speech as a possible mode of asymptomatic transmission, according to Diwan.

To analyse speech flows, he and his team modified a computer code they had originally developed to study the movement and behaviour of cumulus clouds - the puffy cotton-like clouds that are usually seen on a sunny day.

The code, called Megha-5, was written by S Ravichandran from NORDITA, the other corresponding author on the paper, and was used recently for studying particleflow interaction in Rama Govindarajan's group at ICTS.

The analysis carried out by the team on speech flows incorporated the possibility of viral entry through the eyes and mouth in determining the risk of infection - most previous studies had only considered

shaping its evolution.

when the height difference was moderate - the variation looked like a bell curve.

Moving forward, the team plans to focus on simulating differences in the loudness of the speakers' voices and the presence of ventilation sources in their vicinity to see what effect they can have on

viral transmission.

They also plan to engage in discussions with public health policymakers and epidemiologists to develop suitable guidelines. "Whatever precautions we can take while we come back to normalcy in our daily interactions with other people, would go a long way in minimising the spread of infection," Diwan said.

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Blast fishing annihilates river ecosystem

Binika, June 17: Rampant fishing through explosion in Jira river using dynamites and other explosives has become a cause of serious concern for the people here in Subarnapur district. This dangerous and illegal act of fishing poses a severe threat to the river ecocystem, reports said.

Though an easy method to catch fishes from the river, blast fishing highly contributes to the destruction of aquatic animals and plants in the riverbed. Such methods of fishing destroy habitats of aquatic wildlife, killing animals indiscriminately.

This apart, it has affected the liveli-



hood of local fishermen who depend on the Jira and Mahanadi river for livelihood as the fish catch has reduced. As per the allegations, some anti-social elements are illegally using blasts as a method of fishing, despite

fish from the river. 'The unbridled explosions are not only causing destruction to the aquatic ecosystem in the river but also polluting its water, leading to serious setbacks to the livelihood of thousands of fishermen community in the region,"

In a bid to catch the fishes in huge quantities, the mafia gangs put explosives inside beer bottles and use it for the blasting. Locals have further alleged that despite sincere requests, officials are not bothered to curb the illegal act and take necessary action.

gal blasting has affected our livelihood so much that our children are forced to go out of state in search of income," rued a local fisherman.

When contacted, Binika tehsildar Mukteswar Panigrahi said, "This illegal blasting in rivers to catch fish is a punishable offence. I have directed the local revenue inspector (RI) to conduct a probe and take stringent action in this connection."

On the other hand, the police have assured to take stringent action against those found guilty in the case.

"We haven't received any complaint about the illegal blasting. We will take steps to stop the illegal act," Binika IIC Pabitra Sahu said.

11 people declared 'dead' in records

Kendrapara, June 17: Eleven people have been "wrongfully declared dead" and government aid for their funeral has been allegedly embezzled in Kendrapara district, officials said Friday.

The incident came to light recently when one of the 'deceased' persons, identified as Sanyasi Khuntia, saw his name on a list of 11 people from Kurunti gram panchayat, declared having died in May this year, on state social security department website with their relatives mentioned as receivers of ₹2,000 each under the Harishchandra Sahayata Yojana for their funeral.

However, the relatives of the 'deceased' people claimed they haven't received any money under the scheme as all the 11 of them are alive.

Techie reaps success with marigold farming

Bhadrak, June 17: Youths of his age are idling away time while some others are vainly running after government jobs, but Ramakant Padhiary, 26, an engineering student of Bant area in Bhadrak district, has chosen a different path and tried his luck in marigold farming. And his efforts have finally paid off as this farming has made him self-reliant.

His successful initiative has shown others the way of earning handsome money.

Ramakant, son of Gangadhar Padhiary of Odanga panchayat, completed his BTech from Barpada College of Engineering and Technology, two years ago. Thereafter, he prepared himself for a government job, but could not crack one. He gave up running after jobs, but focused on farming on his seven acres of land.

Initially, he lent his helping hands to his father in farming. After fencing the seven acre land, he grew papaya, plantain, other vegetables and cereals. Then, he dug a pond in the farmland and took up fish farming, which fetched him good earning.

However, he observed that the local market has good demand for marigold flower. Hence, he brought high-yielding marigold saplings from Kolkata in December, last year. He initially invested ₹20,000 in marigold

farming and sold out the flowers for ₹60.000. He sees good earning scope in this flower farming and has a plan to expand it further.

"A kg of marigold is sold for ₹40 to 50. I have raised marigold on around 2.5 decimal land and the daily flower yield is one quintal to one and a half quintals," he said.

Importantly, he does not have marketing issues. "I have no problem in selling my produce, because traders come to my farm to buy flowers. If the horticulture department makes provision of training and financial assistance, I would take the farming a step further," he said.

Babu on a Mission

The "heaven-born" often catch a lot of flak, usually when they are seen as misusing their privileges or as pliant tools of their political masters. But many IAS officers get appreciated for silently going about their work, often below the radar. Certainly, it's not often we hear of IAS officers winning international plaudits.

Rajasthan cadre IAS officer Sandeep Verma was selected for the "Best Paper" award at an international conference on data analytics organized by the Arun Jaitley National Institute of Financial Management. Verma is the CMD of Rajasthan State Road Transport Corporation and is considered within babu circles as a specialist in public procurement systems.

Sources have informed DKB that Verma is a familiar presence at international conferences where he is widely sought for his insights and expertise in public procurement reform and project management. His specialty is in using public procurement rules to increase domestic manufacturing and stimulate innovation in high-tech areas.

During his career; besides his regular postings, Verma has reportedly trained nearly 2,000 senior IAS officers and military officials on various aspects of defence procurement, government contracts and project management. He has influenced the defence procurement procedures and helped draft the public procurement rules for the Assam government, among others. Most recently, Verma drafted a new public-private partnership policy for his cadre state

of Rajasthan. During his stint as Home Secretary in Rajasthan and other postings, Verma has contributed immensely to increase professionalism in project management in government depart-



Clearly, the IAS officer is equally at home in the power corridors as well as the rarified environs of the IAS training academy in Mussoorie and influential think tanks.

Ex -cops to probe serving IPS officers

The Gujarat Home Department has named two retired IPS officers Anup Kumar Singh and Keshav Kumar to lead preliminary enquiries (PE) and departmental enquiries (DE) against any IPS officers who are accused of corruption.

The move has raised eyebrows since traditionally such enquiries are conducted by a panel of officers in the Home Department. But in recent times, there have been some instances where allegations against top-ranking IPS officers have been probed by other serving IPS officers. Recently, former Rajkot police commissioner Manoj Agarwal was transferred as Principal of the State Reserve Police Training School following an enquiry report against alleged corruption.

The reason that ex-IPS officers have been chosen to conduct enquiries is that serving IPS officers are already occupied with their own portfolios and cannot devote time to conducting preliminary enquiries, which delays the process. Also, Additional Chief Secretary (Home) Raj Kumar admitted that the government realises that serving IPS officers conducting a PE or DP against another IPS officer is not ideal, and can compromise the enquiry.

While this would be evident to anyone, babu or not, the appointment of Singh and Kumar is meant to send a signal that the government wishes to be seen as impartial in inquiries against senior state cops.

Centre eases off on changing IAS cadre rules

The acute deficit of All India Service (AIS) officers that the Centre faces is likely to get prolonged. The proposal to depute IAS, IPS and IFoS officers to the Centre without the approval of their respective state governments has been shelved for the time being, DKB has learnt.

In 2021, only 10 per cent of mid-level IAS officers were posted with the Union government, a sharp dip from 19 per cent in 2014. The best indication of the deepening crisis can be seen in the recent appointment of 23 joint secretary-rank officers in various ministries. Only six were IAS officers and one from the IPS. The majority are from other Central services.

Now the reason for this shortfall has emerged, in the Department of Personnel and Training (DoPT) response to an RTI query. The DoPT has stated that a final view on the proposal is yet to be taken and that DoPT cannot disclose the information held in a "fiduciary relationship". Reading between the lines, what this means is that the Centre has put off the proposal due to stiff opposition from officers in the states. At least eight states including Odisha, Meghalaya, Jharkhand, Rajasthan, West Bengal, Kerala, Tamil Nadu and Telangana have opposed the move. The political faultlines are only too apparent.

For now, the Centre has prudently decided not to push further. It already has too many irons in the fire. But once it refocuses on the issue, the battle will surely be resumed.

iddle French had gogue, entertainment, fun or amusement. From this developed en gogues, in good humour. English took it in and gave it a home, but changed the first element to on and then to a-, at the same time shortening the unpronounced ending. It's still widely to be found, though its usage has dropped off in the last half century. Standard dictionaries say it has the sense that you're using - eager or curious to hear or see something. The compound all agog ("I was all agog to discover who the new Dr Who would be") has an air of bouncy immature anticipation that makes it difficult to use in serious contexts. Looking around, I discovered that agog is having serious identity issues. Typical of recent usage was a headline in the Irish Times in 2011, "Americans left agog at confused cruelty of Irish abortion law". To me, agog can't mean "astonished", but its entry in the Oxford English Dictionary, revised in 2012, says it now can. Might its users have been confusing it with goggle? Another compound form, less common, is agape and agog, which communicates a sense of utter gobsmacked astonishment. Incidentally, a related Middle French form was à gogo, uninhibitedly or joyfully, probably formed from gogue by reduplication. This is still in the French language and appeared in Paris in 1952 in the name of the nightclub and pioneering discotheque called the Whisky à Gogo (that is, Whisky Galore, presumably from the film of the book by Compton Mackenzie). The format became fashionable and it and the name were brought into English, leading to the modified version a-go-go appearing all over the place during the 1960s as a fashionable creation meaning fashionable. This presumably influenced go-go, a native English reduplication of go that appeared about the same time, especially in the erotic dancers called go-go girls, as well as the triply emphatic go-go-go for continual movement, hustle and bustle.

LEBANON'S GRIDLOCK

ebanon's political economy is gridlocked. The country's political leaders will not commit to the kinds of economic reforms that it needs, because doing so would undermine their own power. For good reason, most published analyses of Lebanon include references to problems such as corruption and institutional decadence. But what most commentaries miss is the role played by external stakeholders who see little reason to push for changes to the dysfunctional status quo.

While foreign powers with interests in Lebanon often do voice support for reforms, they lack the proper incentives to back up their rhetoric with concrete action, because doing so would simply undercut their own influence in the country. Meanwhile, the Lebanese people have been left to suffer at the hands of an oppressive economic structure. In 2021, the country's GDP was just \$20.5 billion, down from \$55 billion in 2018. With poverty rates soaring and the currency having lost 90% of its value, the economy is teetering on the edge of collapse, and a humanitarian crisis is looming.

It doesn't have to be this way. If foreign stakeholders wanted to effect positive change within the country, they would have many tools for doing so. They could easily tie the hands of Lebanon's political elites by applying existing laws in their home countries, and by leveraging their influence over global financial institutions to hold politically exposed persons (PEPs) in Lebanon to account.

While the Lebanese authorities have largely failed to bring corrupt officials to justice, foreign disclosures of stolen wealth could still create the domestic pressure for change. For example, the SWIFT interbank messaging service for cross-border payments can be used to identify potentially corrupt wealth transfers made from Lebanon at any point over the past three decades. And information on property registries could be used to identify Lebanese public officeholders who might have accumulated assets beyond their

Moreover, British, the US, and

the EU financial agencies can make similar public disclosures using information from the Western banking system. The UK Financial Conduct Authority, the US federal banking agencies, and the European Commission all require financial-system "gatekeepers" to perform enhanced checks on PEPs, their families, and their close associates. Each jurisdiction recognises that there is a risk of PEPs abusing their positions and using the financial system to launder ill-gotten gains. Under existing laws, Lebanese oligarchs and officials can and should face enhanced scrutiny when they try to access these parts of the global financial system.

Lebanon's foreign stakeholders thus have ample leverage with which to push for domestic reforms. The problem is that punitive measures can succeed only if they target all politicians, officials, and bankers who may be involved in corruption, regardless of their political affiliations or foreign-policy positions. But owing to Lebanon's complicated, factionalized domestic politics and its geo-strategic location, broad-brush enforcement tends to be a nonstarter for foreign stakeholders. each of which has its own transactional, patronage relationships with various Lebanese political

The US, for example, wants to

ensure that its allies in Lebanon vote in line with US interests in the ongoing negotiations over Lebanon's southern maritime border. EU countries want their allies to oppose a "Going East" campaign that envisions Lebanon (which currently gets 38% of its imports from Europe) deepening its economic ties with China, Russia, and other countries. And Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates want their allies in Lebanon to remain aligned with their own foreign-policy positions regarding Iran and Palestine.

Taken together, these strategic interests prevent foreign stakeholders from pursuing broad anticorruption measures, because their own Lebanese allies could be ensnared. Without broadly coordinated action to tackle all corrupt elements without fear or favour, and to identify and seize all ill-gotten gains across multiple jurisdictions with varying legal structures, Lebanese elites will not be held accountable under the law. But no foreign power will implement punitive measures unless it is convinced that competing stakeholders will do the same.

In addition to being coordinated, punitive measures also need to be consistent and credible. Any foreign action needs to be backed by ample, transparent evidence against the accused, and it needs to adhere to due process under the relevant do-

mestic and international laws. Lebanese citizens are more likely to trust actions by foreign powers if they can see that enforcement is not selective, discriminatory, or designed merely to advance narrow strategic objectives.

Coordinated action among strategic rivals is a tall order; but it is the only option. Lebanon's institutional troubles cannot be wished away. The international community must reassess the costs of the country's perverse political equilibrium, and Lebanon's main foreign patrons must recognise that they ultimately share an interest in breaking the country's institutional gridlock.

Lebanon's foreign patrons are members of the G20, which recognises the negative effect of corruption on economies. The G20 Anti-Corruption Working Group can lead anti-corruption efforts in Lebanon, especially as it works with the International Monetary Fund, which is currently negotiating with Lebanon regarding conditional financial support, and the World Bank, whose Stolen Asset Recovery Initiative (StAR) plays an advisory role on related issues, including asset recovery and anti-money laundering policies. In short, such existing initiatives of global governance could be harnessed to improve Lebanon's governance.

In the absence of such coordinated global action, tensions in the country will escalate, resulting in a growing number of asylumseekers, which will affect Europe in particular.

Greater emphasis should be placed on preventing displacement, rather than mitigating the refugee crisis through foreign aid. The diagnosis and the cure have been identified, but the physician still seems to have an incentive to keep the patient sick.

Checking soil erosion vital

The recently concluded conference of UN Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD COP 15) at Abidjan, Cote d'Ivoire found that desertification has been on the rise in most parts of the world.

An earlier UNCCD report released in April showed that 40 percent of all ice-free land is already degraded globally, affecting 50 percent of humanity. It also noted that the current scale of degradation threatens half of global GDP (US\$44trillion). According to Ibrahim Thiaw, Executive Secretary, UNCCD, the best comprehensive solution is to indulge in land restoration, which addresses many of the underlying factors of degraded water cycles and the loss of soil fertility. He voiced the need for rebuilding landscapes better, mimicking nature wherever possible and creating functional ecological

systems.

Today, there can be no doubt that desertification has emerged as a major global issue. The fact is that we are only beginning to see the grave impact of climate change. Experts believe that these are expected to become more deadly as temperatures continue to spiral,

which may get out of hand. Also such desertification has an impact on soil health and food production.

It is vital to understand the importance of soils, which play a crucial role in areas such as:helping combat and adapt to climate change by storing carbon and decreasing greenhouse gas emissions in the atmosphere; provide water infiltration through soil, trapping pollutants and preventing them from leaching into ground water:capture and store water for crops; minimise surface evaporation and maximise water use efficiency; host a quarter of the planet's biodiversity and contribute to global cycles that make all life possible; and provide fibre, fuel, medicinal products and other ecosystem services.

Coming to the case of India, it has about 160 million hectares of arable land, but nearly 40 percent of this soil is labeled as distressed soil. That means in another twenty-five to thirty years' time, we may not be able to grow the food that we need in this nation. When there is no water and food, the level of civil strife that will happen will impact demolish the nation adversely in

many ways. People from rural areas, where water completely runs out, are going to migrate in large numbers into urban centres. With no infrastructure, they may find their way in squatter settlements and even pavements. It could also lead to social strife.

Soil erosion that is quite rampant in the country is affecting soil health and productivity by removing the highly fertile topsoil and exposing the remaining soil. It has been decreasing agricultural productivity, degrading ecosystem functions and amplifies hydro-geological risk, such as landslides or floods. Experts believe that soil erosion has been causing significant losses in biodiversity, damage to urban and rural infrastructure and, in severe cases, leads to displacement of human populations. They are unanimous that soil erosion has to be stopped at all costs. "It takes up to 1,000 years to form one centimetre of topsoil, but this one centimetre can be lost with just one heavy rainfall if soil cover is not protected," they say.

There is a cry the world over to fight soil erosion for it is needed to "save our future." A movement

to save soils has gained momentum and it is expected that by December 5 (World Soil Day) there would be renewed efforts and awareness generation at the grass-root levels to focus attention on the importance of healthy soil and to advocate for the sustainable management of soil resources.

Meanwhile, it is indeed distressing to note that various factors of warming, specially droughts and excessive pressure on soils has led India to figure at the bottom of the 2022 Environmental Performance Index (EPI) ranking of 180 countries. The US, the largest historical polluter, is ranked 43rd while the current biggest emitter, China has been ranked at the 160th position. The report pointed out: "India, with its increasingly dangerous air quality and rising greenhouse gas emissions falls to the bottom of rankings for the first time.

Considering all these developments and also the increasing use of chemicals and pesticides, which are not just hazardous to human health but also to soil health, there is need for the government to formulate a guideline to check desertification and ensure that soil health is not disturbed.

Toddler rescued

According to information given by the child's parents, they had agreed to take Rs 5 lakh in exchange for the child, of which Rs 20,000 was paid immediately and the remaining amount was promised later to them. However, seven months after the baby's parents were promised the money, the remaining amount was not paid to them following which the child's mother approached the DCW hoping that the remaining money will be paid to them.

'Agnipath' recruitment process to start soon

New Delhi, June 17: As protests against the Agnipath military recruitment scheme intensified, the Army, Navy and the Air Force Friday announced that they will start the enrolment process under the new model by next week while Defence Minister Rajnath Singh appealed to the youths wanting to join the armed forces to start preparing for the induction. Air Chief Marshal VR

Chaudhari said that the selection process by the Indian Air Force for recruitment under the new scheme will start from June 24 while the Army said it will begin the initial exercise within two days. While the Indian Navy said it

will start the recruitment process "very soon", a senior naval commander said the notification for the recruitment would be out within a week. The three services are planning to deploy the first batches of recruits under the new scheme both in operational and non-operational roles by June next year, senior military officials said.

The officials also said the agitating youths are not fully aware of the benefits of the Agnipath scheme. In an attempt to pacify the protesters, the government on Thursday night increased the upper age limit for recruitment for soldiers under the Agnipath scheme to 23 years from 21 for the year 2022.

Jaipur, June 17: Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot Friday hit out at the Centre over the CBI raid at his brother's residence, saying this is not going to panic him but will ultimately harm the BJP only.

Gehlot said that the raid was an act of revenge by the centre for his recent activism in Delhi. Congress State President Govind Singh Dotasra and former Deputy Chief Minister Sachin Pilot also criticised the CBI action by calling it motivated by political vendetta. The CBI Friday raided Agrasen Gehlot's residence in Jodhpur in connection with a corruption case. An Enforcement Directorate (ED) team too had raided his place in 2020.

"If I am active in Delhi or have participated in this movement for Rahul Gandhi, then why revenge is taken from my brother? When there was a political crisis here in our government in 2020, at that time also the ED had raided my brother's place," Gehlot said at the airport here after returning from the national capital.

Covid cases rising in Delhi

New Delhi, June 17: Delhi logged 1,797 Covid-19 infections in a single day, highest in nearly four months, along with one fatality while the positivity rate rose to 8.18 per cent, according to data shared by the health department here

The fresh cases came out of 21,978 tests conducted in Delhi the previous day to detect the infection. This is the third consecutive day that Delhi has recorded over 1,300 cases in a day.

The capital has logged more than 1,000 daily cases for the fourth day on the trot.

Friday's figures are the highest since February 4, when the na-

tional capital logged 2,272 cases and 20 deaths while the positivity rate stood at 3.85 per cent.

The positivity rate on Friday is the highest since January 29 when 4,044 cases were recorded with a positivity rate of 8.60 per cent, while the city had registered 25 deaths.

The national capital recorded 1,323 new Covid cases and two deaths on Thursday, while the positivity rate stood at 6.69 per cent.

The fresh cases pushed Delhi's coronavirus tally to 19,19,025 while the death toll rose to 26,226. the department said in its latest bulletin.

The national capital had recorded 1,375 new Covid cases Wednesday, the highest since May 8, while the positivity rate rose to 7.01 per cent.

Jammu, June 17: In the first indication of a timeline for assembly polls in Jammu and Kashmir since it was downgraded to a Union Territory, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh Friday said there is a possibility of holding the polls "by this year-end"

Addressing a function here to celebrate the 200th year of the coronation of Maharaja Gulab Singh, the defence minister said the delimitation exercise has been completed following which the number of seats has gone up to 90 with Kashmir having 47 seats and Jammu 43. Rajnath Singh, who is on a two-day visit to the Union Territory, said, "By this year-end,

Bhim Sena chief arrested for threatening Nupur

New Delhi, June 17: The Delhi Police has arrested Bhim Sena chief Nawab Satpal Tanwar for threatening and announcing a bounty of Rs one crore on now-removed BJP spokesperson Nupur Sharma over her remarks on Prophet Mohammad, officials said

Tanwar was arrested Thursday from Gurugram in Haryana, they said. The statements of former BJP office-bearers Sharma and Naveen Kumar Jindal on Prophet Mohammad have sparked a massive controversy which has led to violent protests in several parts of

The police said Tanwar had posted a video in which he announced a bounty of Rs one crore on Sharma for her remarks and was trying to fuel communal disharmony. Recently, various handles on Twitter and other social media platforms were posting materials which was spreading hate and was against the maintenance of public tranquillity, the police said in an official statement, adding that they received also various complaints in this regard.

On the basis of complaints and suo-motto social media analysis, the Delhi Police registered 19 FIRs under various sections of the Indian Penal Code, it said. In one such case, Tanwar, who claimed to be the chief of Bhim Sena, having multiple Twitter handles and Facebook profile, posted a video in which he announced a bounty of Rs one crore on Sharma and was trying to fuel communal disharmony, the statement stated. An FIR was registered in this connection and the investigation was taken up.

BMW hit-and-run case: One CCTV helps trace driver

A 27-year-old man was arrested by the Delhi police for ramming a speeding BMW car into another car, which killed two children sleeping on the footpath, while eight people were injured, a police official said

New Delhi, June 17: In the infamous BMW hit-and-run case in the national capital, the footage of one CCTV camera helped the police trace the accused driver, police said Friday.

A 27-year-old man was arrested by the Delhi Police for ramming a speeding BMW car into another car, which killed two children sleeping on the footpath, while eight people were injured, a police official said.

The accused driver was identified as Sahil, a resident of east Delhi's Nirman Vihar. Deputy Commissioner of Police (south east), Esha Pandey said a PCR call was received on June 10 at Hazrat Nizamuddin regarding an accident wherein two to three persons were injured under the Lodhi Road flyover.

Responding to the PCR call, the police officers rushed to the spot and came to know that a Wagon R was hit by a black coloured luxury car.

Due to the force of the collision. the Wagon R ran over people sleeping on the footpath under the Lodhi Road flyover. The injured persons were shifted to AIIMS trauma centre where Roshini (6) and her brother Amir (10) were declared brought dead.



The Wagon R car's driver said at nearly 4.30 a.m. while they were returning from Samrat hotel and moving towards Surya hotel through Lodhi road, a black coloured luxury car's driver who was driving fast hit their car.

The black car's driver fled from the spot. As the incident took place late night and there was no one to witness the incident except the injured persons, it was a very challenging task for the police.

The CCTV cameras installed near the flyover were not functioning at all. After this the police started making efforts to first locate the route through which the black car had travelled after the incident. To trace the accused driver's route, nearly 60-70 cameras which were installed on the road towards Oberoi hotel, Lodhi Road, Barapulla Road and Lala Lajpat Rai Marg were checked. It was just one camera which

led to a breakthrough in the case. "In one of the cameras, it was found that the vehicle after the accident had turned towards Neela Gumbad, Nizamuddin," the official said. The CCTVs on the route going towards Zakir Hussain Marg, Sunder Nursery and Mathura Road were

checked. After analysing the CCTV footage of nearly 70-80 cameras, one black colour sedan luxury car was zeroed in. It was found that the vehicle took a turn to Mathura road and had gone towards Ashram. The police finally reached the exact location of the accused driver. Upon interrogation of the accused Sahil, it was revealed that he along with his uncle was coming from the airport while he was driving the car.

Lucknow, June 17: Uttar Pradesh is all set to emerge as a hub of distilleries, with as many as 13 new distillery plants being set up with an investment of ₹20,000 crore.

The state government has been making sustained efforts for reforming the field of excise through various policies and making it free from the dominance of liquor mafia. The state will soon become an exporter of liquor and will also provide liquor to other states and countries.

It is worth stating that in the last five years, the number of distilleries has increased from 61 to 78 with an investment of about ₹6,500 crore.

Due to this, the alcohol production capacity of the state has increased from 170 to 270 crore bulk litres and the production of ethanol also went up from 42 to 115 crore bulk litres. Prime Minister Narendra Modi, recently laid the foundation stone of 13 distillery plants to be set up with an investment of ₹20,000 crore in the ground

Friday prayers go 'peacefully' after week of protests

UP has been racked by high tension protests across its cities since last Friday, which was responded to by authorities, among other methods, with demolition of houses of some of the key accused

Lucknow, June 17: A week after violence erupted in Uttar Pradesh over the remarks on Prophet Mohammad by a BJP leader, no untoward incident took place following the Friday prayers, an official said here.

No protests were reported from any part of the state till afternoon (2.25 PM) and Friday prayers passed peacefully, ADG Law and Order Prashant Kumar said. With the help of religious leaders and police administration the prayers were held in a peaceful manner in the state, he said. Speaking before the Friday prayers at Lucknow's Jama Masiid Idgah, Maulana Mohd Mushtaq urged the people to refrain from any kind of protest at the mosques, which he said is the place for offering namaz only.

In a release issued by the Islamic Centre of India, Maulana Mohd Mushtaq said that the purpose of mosques is to worship and offer namaz there and not for staging of protests. In a goodwill gesture, people offered roses to the security personnel deployed outside the prominent 'Tile Wali' masjid in the state capital -- which was the places of sloganeering last Friday

 after the Friday prayers. In Saharanpur, Prayers were observed peacefully amid heavy deployment of the police force and drone cameras. Flag marches had been held in Saharanpur and Deoband the past couple of days as a precautionary measure.

Aligarh too, reportedly, witnessed no confrontation or protests after the prayers, where they were observed amid tight security.

According to reports, the district authorities had conferred with the prominent people of both communities and top officials, including the district magistrate Inder Vir Singh, to discuss ways of restoring the peace. SSP Kalanidhi Naithani reportedly visited all communally sensitive spots of the city to oversee the situation.

Mumbai: Cov TPR crosses 15 per cent twice this week

Mumbai, June17: The Covid-19 test positivity rate (TPR) in Mumbai jumped over 15 per cent twice in the current week, civic officials said Friday, as the metropolis battles a fresh surge in cases after the third wave of the pandemic waned earlier this year.

They said TPR jumped to 15.58 per cent on June 14, when 1,724 people tested positive for coronavirus out of 11,065 tests conducted that day and then again on June 16 the rate shot up to 15.11 per cent when 2,366 new patients were detected on the back of 15.656 tests in

a span of 24 hours. TPR is the proportion of positive cases out of the total tests conducted and it has witnessed a steady rise in the financial capital since the last one month.

The Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) has ramped up the number of daily tests since the first week of June after the city witnessed a spike in fresh cases. Since June 7, Mumbai has been witnessing daily cases in four digits with the fresh count crossing the 2,000-mark on a few days. Consequently, the number of tests since then has also gone above 15,000 per day barring a couple of days.





Chennai, June 17: The Idol wing of Tamil Nadu police is joining hands with Indian Institute of Technology-Madras for identifying smuggled antique idols from

The special wing of the Tamil Nadu police will seek the support of IIT- Madras to create artificial intelligence-based software to hunt for smuggled idols belonging to temples of the state.

Director-General of Police K. Jayanth Murali, who is heading the Idol Wing of the Tamil Nadu police, while addressing media persons said, "We are developing an algorithm along with the IIT-Madras, with the unique characteristics of idols belonging to different periods like Pandya, Chola, and Sangam periods.

This software, according to the police officer, will look for idols from Tamil Nadu using the images of idols using the images available on international web-



sites of museums and collectors. The Tamil Nadu idol wing had identified two more idols stolen from Kumbakonam in Tamil Nadu

and now in Denver and California. The DGP said that the department registered a case on Wednesday and initiated action under Mutual Legal Agreement Treaty (MLAT) to bring them back. The senior officer said that the idol wing has identified 40 such idols from Tamil Nadu that were stolen and smuggled out of the country and kept in international museums

Jayanth Murali said that the Union Government would write to those countries seeking retrieval of the idols as per the UNESCO treaty by submitting proof of their origin such as photographs taken in Tamil Nadu temples

After scrutiny of the requisition of the Home Ministry, the communication is sent to the country concerned and a representative of the country concerned will visit the state and conduct an inquiry about the idol, temple, and the period in which it was stolen

The idol will be sent back to India only if the representative is convinced that it belongs to the temple from where it has been stolen, according to the documents presented. The idol wing has also sought the details of all the idols of Tamil Nadu temples from the Hindu Religious and Charitable Endowment (HR&CE) department which has a complete database of the idols.

Jayanth Murali handed over two high-value idols of Nandhikeswarar and Gangalamoorthi, which were recently brought back from the US to the executive officer of the Narasinganallur temple in Tenkasi district.

India, the world's third-biggest oil-importing and consuming nation, has long defended purchases of crude oil from Russia following President Vladimir Putin ordering the invasion of Ukraine. The oil ministry had last month stated that "energy purchases from Russia remain minuscule in comparison to India's total consumption." Price said India's relationship with Russia developed over several decades. "It developed over the course of decades at a time when the United States was not prepared or able to be a partner of choice for the Indian government," Price said. "This is not a partnership built in the course of days, weeks, or months, Price said. "I mentioned before that India's relationship with Russia was built up over the course of many decades, as countries reorient their relationship with Moscow, as we have seen many of them do. This will be a gradual process," he said in response to a question.

Britain approves Julian Assange extradition to US

London, June 17: The UK government Friday gave the go-ahead for WikiLeaks founder Julian Assange to be extradited to the US to face charges over the alleged leak of classified documents related to the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan.

UK Home Secretary Priti Patel gave the requisite ministerial signoff for the 50-year-old Australian national's extradition order after several stages of court appeals right up to the Supreme Court. However, a counter appeal by Assange's legal team is expected to restart another round of legal battle.

"On 17 June, following consideration by both the magistrates



court and High Court, the extradition of Mr. Julian Assange to the US was ordered. Mr. Assange retains the normal 14-day right to appeal," a UK Home Office spokesperson said.

"Under the Extradition Act 2003, the Secretary of State must sign an extradition order if there are no grounds to prohibit the order being made. Extradition requests are only sent to the home secretary once a judge decides it can proceed after considering various aspects of the case," the spokesper-

"In this case, the UK courts have not found that it would be oppressive, unjust, or an abuse of process to extradite Mr. Assange. Nor have they found that extradition would be incompatible with his human rights, including his right to a fair trial and to freedom of expression, and that whilst in the US he will be treated appropriately, including in relation to his health," the spokesperson_

Assange has denied any wrongdoing all along and has been held at Belmarsh high-security prison in London since 2019 when he was taken into custody from the Ecuadorian Embassy where he had sought asylum.

He had been living in the embassy since 2012 to avoid extradition to Sweden to face sex offence allegations, which he denied and were eventually dropped.

China blocks US, India move to list Makki as global terrorist

United Nations/Beijing, June 17: China has blocked a joint proposal by India and the US to designate Pakistan-based top LeT militant Abdul Rehman Makki as a global terrorist under the UN sanctions committee, a move Beijing's claimed were in accordance with the relevant procedures and rules.

On June 1, India and the US jointly proposed to list Makki under the UN Security Council's Al-Qaeda and ISIL Sanctions Committee which is also known as the UNSC 1267 Committee. But, China, a close ally of Pakistan, placed a "technical hold" on the proposal to list Makki and this measure can last for up to six months at a time.

All decisions of the Committee are taken through consensus. In New Delhi, government sources said China's decision runs counter to Beijing's claim of combating terrorism and signals its "double standards"

He has been involved in raising funds, recruiting and radicalising youths to resort to violence and planning attacks in India, particularly in Jammu and Kashmir, they said. Protecting well-known terrorists from sanctioning will only undermine China's credibility and "risk exposing" even itself more to the growing threat of terrorism, they said.

"This decision by China is extremely unfortunate given the overwhelming evidence against Makki. Moreover, it runs counter to China's claims of combating terrorism,' said a source.



Oil retailers urged to maintain stock

New Delhi: In a bid to rein in private fuel retailers curtailing operations to cut losses, Government has expanded the scope of Universal Service Obligation (USO), mandating licensed entities to maintain petrol and diesel sales at all petrol pumps, including in remote areas, for specified working hours. "The government has now expanded the horizon of USO by including all retail outlets (petrol pumps) including remote area ROs under their ambit," the Oil Ministry said in a statement Friday. Failure to meet norms can lead to the cancellation of licences.

New Delhi: Digital financial services firm One97 Communications' Managing Director Vijay Shekhar Sharma has purchased 1.7 lakh shares of the company worth ₹11 crore, according to a regulatory filing. The report comes as Revlon filed for bankruptcy earlier this week after global supply chain disruptions drove up raw material costs and prompted vendors to demand upfront payments.

Gadkari further said the government is promoting ethanol produced from crop residue instead of petrol and diesel. Mumbai, June 17: Governor Shaktikanta Das Friday refuted criticism of the RBI being behind the curve in its policies, making it clear that the consequences of focusing on the 4 per cent inflation target would have been "disastrous" for the pandemic-hit economy.

In comments that came two days after former Chief Economic Advisor Arvind Subramanian coauthored an article blaming the RBI for acting late on inflation and being behind the curve. Das said the central bank acted as per the evolving economic developments and also gave out a timeline of its actions to explain the shift.

'...tolerance of a higher inflation during the pandemic was a necessity and we still stand by our decision," Das said speaking at an event organised by Financial

According to the governor, the RBI was not optimistic with its FY23 inflation estimate of 4.5 per cent made public ahead of the Russian invasion of Ukraine, which sent the oil prices rocketing. Das said in the estimate, the RBI had bakedin oil prices to be at \$80 per barrel, and had decided to wait till the end of the fiscal to see the developments and take actions accordingly

Seeking to stress that the RBI was watchful of the inflation situation, the governor said the central bank, which had initially decided to look through the higher CPI prints in the pandemic, dropped the word "transitory" from its commentary in

RBI shoots down **Big Tech's financial** services play

Mumbai: RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das Friday said the entry of big tech firms into the financial sector poses systemic concerns like overleveraging at the borrowers' ends. The entry of firms like Google, Amazon and Facebook (Meta), referred as big tech companies, also poses question marks around competition and data privacy. "They (big tech) carry risks, which need to be properly assessed and dealt with," Das said while speaking at Modern BFSI Summit 2022 organised by Financial Express. Such companies can include entities in e-commerce, search engines and social media platforms that have started to offer financial services in a "big way" on their own or through tie-ups, he said, adding this is leading to the use of new methodologies in credit assessment. "Such large-scale use of new methodologies in credit assessment can create systemic concerns like overleverage, inadequate credit assessment and similar other risks," he added. Das said deploying harsh recovery methods like calling up at odd hours or using foul language is "unacceptable" and assured that the RBI is paying "serious attention" to such happenings to ensure necessary action is taken to curb such activities.

Geneva, June 17: The World Trade Organization agreed the first change to global trading rules in years

The package, which the WTO Director-General Ngozi Okonjo-Iweala called "unprecedented", included the two highest profile deals under consideration - on fisheries and on a partial waiver of intellectual property (IP) rights for Covid-19 vaccines.

The accord to curb fishing subsidies is only the second multilateral agreement setting new global trading rules struck in the WTO's 27-year history and is far more ambitious than the first, which was designed to cut red tape.

At one stage, a series of demands from India, which sees itself as the champion of poor farmers and fishermen as well as developing countries, appeared set to paralyse talks but accommodations were

Overall, many observers said the deals should boost the credibility of the WTO, which was weakened by former US President Donald Trump's crippling of its ability to intervene in trade disputes, and set it on a course for reform.

Rajkot, June 17: Dinesh Karthik (55, 27b, 9x4, 2x6) played a knock to remember before Avesh Khan (4/18) gave his dad a "perfect birthday present" with a fiery spell as India steam-rolled South Africa by 82 runs here Friday to level the fivematch series 2-2.

Karthik scored his maiden fifty close to 16 years after his T20 debut and alongside vice-captain Hardik Pandva (46, 31b, 3x4, 3x6) took India to a fighting 169/6.

For the second game in a row South African batters faltered and collapsed to 87/9 in 16.5 overs with skipper Temba Bavuma retired hurt. Avesh led India's brilliant display with the ball and recorded his career-best figures in the process. It was an away team's lowest total in T20Is in India.

Bhuvneshwar Kumar and Avesh were impressive with the new ball as South Africa slipped to 35/2 in the powerplay. After a hit on the shoulder, Bavuma (8) injured his left elbow with a dive on the run and had to leave the field. He didn't even come out for the post-match presentation ceremony.

New Delhi, June 17: Expressing concerns over Rishabh Pant's form in T20I cricket, former India opener Wasim Jaffer has said that the wicketkeeper-batter has not been able to replicate his Tests' success in the shortest format of the game and the left-hander is not a certainty in the Indian side going for-

The 24-year old Pant is leading India in the ongoing 5-match T20I series against South Africa. He was named the captain after KL Rahul, who was initially picked as the skipper, was ruled out of the series due to a groin injury.

The left-handed batter had a decent IPL 2022 campaign with Delhi Capitals wherein he scored 340 runs in 14 matches but he has been struggling to get going in the ongoing T20I series, having managed just 34 runs in 3 matches.

The more concerning thing about Pant is the way he is throwing his wickets away more than once and Jaffer feels that the attacking batter might not be able to retain his place when Rahul returns to the side and also mentioned about the presence of Dinesh Karthik in the scheme of things.

"You've got KL Rahul. Once he comes back, he walks into the side. He's a wicketkeeper as well. If


keeper. So, I am not too sure. The way Rishabh Pant has played recently, I won't call him a certainty,' Jaffer told 'ESPNcricinfo'.

"I think he still needs to score runs and score them pretty consistently. He hasn't done that in the IPL. He hasn't done it in many T20Is. I've said that many times the way he has played in Test cricket, the way he has played in quite a few ODI innings as well, he hasn't done that in T20Is. So, I won't say that Rishabh Pant is a certainty for me (in T20Is) going forward," he added.

Injured Rahul is set to miss India's tour of England as well, whereas Dinesh Karthik has been named as the wicketkeeper for the T20I series in Ireland in the last week of June and the side also have Ishan Kishan. India also have Sanju Samson waiting in the wings as the Rajasthan Royals captain has found his way back to the side for the T20I series against Ireland after leading his side to IPL 2022 final.

Pant's form in T20I cricket has been far from impressive and in stark contrast to his numbers in Tests. While the wicketkeeper-batter has established himself as a mainstay in the longest format of the game with some match-winning knocks, he has not been at his best in the T20I cricket. The batter has managed just 723 runs in 46 T20Is at a paltry average of 23.32, with only three fifties.

England set new WR in ODIs, post 498/4

Amstelveen (The Netherlands), June 17: England broke their own record for the highest-ever score in the history of one-day international (ODI) cricket by making 498/4 against the Netherlands Friday.

The total surpassed the 481/6 made by England against Australia at Trent Bridge in June 2018. Jos Buttler (162 n o, 70b, 7x4, 14x6), Dawid Malan (125, 109b, 9x4, 3x6) and Phil Salt (122, 93b, 14x4, 3x6) all hit centuries in Amstelveen, outside Amsterdam.

Buttler reached three figures in 47 balls for the second-fastest hundred for England. His pleasing knock of 162 not out contained 14 of the team's 26 sixes. Buttler now has the three quickest ODI centuries for the national team — off

46 balls, 47 balls and 50 balls.

Bairstow credits IPL stint with PBKS for Trent Bridge show

London, June 17: England cricketer Jonny Bairstow has given a huge compliment to the IPL, saying that the lucrative league had prepared him better for Test cricket than red-ball county cricket.

The 32-year-old Bairstow was the architect of England's fivewicket win in the Trent Bridge Test, with the right-hand batter smashing a T20-style 136 off 92 deliveries to guide the team to take an unassailable 2-0 lead in the series.

He smashed seven maximums and 14 boundaries as England

chased down 299 on the final day of the Nottingham Test, scoring at a strike rate of nearly 148.

This season Bairstow, a member of England's 2019 World Cupwinning squad, was bought by Puniab Kings for Rs 6.75 crore and scored 253 runs in 11 games at a strike rate of 145.

The Yorkshireman said the IPL provided better preparation for his Test cricket. "There were a lot of people saying I should not be at the IPL and should be playing county cricket," Bairstow was quoted as saying by Daily Mail after the 32-year-old came within one ball of breaking Gilbert Jessop's 120-year record for the fastest Test ton by an Englishman.

"But you are playing against the best in the world in the IPL and to have those gears, and being able to switch them up and down, is important," said Bairstow.

"People say it would be fantastic if you had four games of redball cricket under your belt before a Test series but unfortunately that doesn't happen with current scheduling and we're very fortunate to be able to play in some of the best competitions around
