Another jumbo skeleton found

Bhubaneswar, June 27: Officials of the Crime Branch STF which is helping the SIT team probe into elephant deaths found Monday another jumbo skeleton in Mandap reserve forest in Gopapur section of Badamba. This is the fourth elephant carcass that has been found in Narasinghpur-Badamba forest range.

Meanwhile the Principal Chief Conservator of Forest (PCCF) of Odisha, Sashi Paul informed Monday that three trackers have already been arrested in this connection. However, the forester and ranger are still absconding.

"The police are looking for the absconding officials. Not only criminal cases will be lodged against, once they are apprehended, they will face departmental proceedings also. The erring officers won't be spared and will face stringent punishment," Paul said.

"We want to make an example out of it so that no other official would ever be inclined to get involved with the poachers and neglect their duty," Paul added.

Mask mandatory for Rath Yatra devotees

With Covid-19 cases on the rise, the government urges people to watch rituals on TV and not visit Puri

Bhubaneswar, June 27: Wearing mask was made mandatory for all participants at the annual Rath Yatra festival in Puri, July 1 amid rising Covid-19 cases in Odisha, Director of Health Service Bijay Mohapatra said Monday.

Around 10 lakh devotees and tourists are expected to gather for the festival in the temple town from across India, and some foreign nations, Mohapatra informed.

The festival of Lord Jagannath this time will see the participation of devotees after two years. In 2020 and 2021, only servitors took part in rituals due to the pandemic.

"We are expecting a large congregation during the festival this year. Mask is mandatory in Puri during the festival. Health camps will be set up at the railway station, bus stand and Grand Road (Bada Danda)," Mohapatra informed.

He also requested people to stay at home and watch the rituals on TV and asked people with symp-

toms to avoid visiting Puri.

Man burnt to death as bike catches fire Shinde draws first blood

Bhubaneswar, June 27: A youth was charred to death after his motorcycle mysteriously caught fire on the Acharya Vihar flyover here late Sunday night. The deceased, identified as Chandan Kumar Pati is a resident of Balikuda area in Jagatsinghpur district.

Pati who used to work as a medical representative was residing at a rental accommodation at Kesura locality here under Saheed Nagar police limits. The deceased was returning home after attending a private function in Chandrasekharpur, Sunday night.

Sources claimed that some commuters witnessed Pati and his bike in flames on the NH 16 at around 12.15am in the intervening night of Sunday and Monday. They tried to rescue Pati to save him but he had succumbed by then.

On being informed, personnel from the Saheed Nagar police station and Fire services reached the spot and extinguished the fire. The severely charred body of Pati was sent to Capital hospital for postmortem. Meanwhile the deceased's father told mediapersons that his son's death is not 'normal' and he would like a proper investigation. Meanwhile, one of Pati's friends

stated that he was a normal guy without any vices.

Police have started investigation into the matter after registering a road accident case (229/22). "We are yet to know the reasons behind the bike catching fire and charring the victim. We have sought the help of a motor vehicles inspector. Prima facie it appears to be an accident. However, we will carry out necessary action as per the findings of the investigation," informed DCP Prateek Singh.

Sena MLAs as SC keeps in abeyance disqualification proceedings till July 11

New Delhi, June 27: In a relief to rebel Shiv Sena lawmakers, the Supreme Court kept in abeyance Monday the disqualification proceedings before the Deputy Speaker of the Maharashtra Assembly till July 11 and sought responses to pleas by rebel MLAs questioning the legality of notices seeking their disqualification.

A vacation bench of Justices Surya Kant and JB Pardiwala also directed the Maharashtra government to protect the life, liberty, and property of 39 rebel Shiv Sena MLAs and their family members.

While issuing notice to the Maharashtra deputy speaker, the

Yashwant files nomination for Presidential poll



New Delhi, June 27: Opposition presidential candidate Yashwant Sinha filed his nomination papers Monday for the July 18 election, with a host of leaders including Rahul Gandhi, Sharad Pawar, Akhilesh Yadav and Faroog Abdullah accompanying him. Significantly, TRS leader KT Rama Rao, the son of Telangana Chief Minister K Chandrasekhar Rao was also present when Sinha filed his papers. He told reporters that the TRS will support Sinha. Among other leaders present were TMC MPs Abhishek Banerjee and Saugata Roy.

However, there were no leaders of Jharkhand Mukti Morcha (JMM) and AAP. Their absence indicated that chinks were already appearing in the Opposition camp.

Sinha handed over four sets of nomination papers to Rajya Sabha Secretary General PC Mody, who is the returning officer for the Presidential election.

Sinha, a former bureaucrat and a Union Minister during the Atal Bihari Vajpayee government, was decided as the joint candidate for the Presidential election June 21 at a meeting of several opposition leaders. He is likely to launch his campaign June 28 from Chennai and will cover the southern states of Kerala and Karnatakaas well during his first round of **MORE P7** meetings.

AGENCIES London, June 27: Russia defaulted on its international bonds for the

first time in more than a century, the White House said Monday, as sweeping sanctions have effectively cut the country off from the global financial system, rendering its assets untouchable.

The Kremlin, which has the money to make payments thanks to oil and gas revenues, swiftly rejected the claims, and accused the West of driving it into an artificial default. Earlier, some bondholders said they had not received overdue interest Monday following the expiry of a key payment deadline Sunday.

Russia has struggled to keep up payments on \$40 billion of outstanding bonds since it began February 24, the invasion of Ukraine.



'This morning's news around the finding of Russia's default, for the first time in more than a century, situates just how strong the actions are that the US, along with allies and partners have taken, as well as how dramatic the impact has been on Russia's economy," said an US official on the sidelines of a G7 summit in Germany.

Russia's efforts to avoid what would be its first major default on international bonds since the Bolshevik revolution more than a century ago hit a roadblock in late May when the US Treasury Department's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) effectively blocked Moscow from making payments.

"Since March we thought that a Russian default is probably inevitable, and the question was just when," Dennis Hranitzky, head of sovereign litigation at law firm Quinn Emanuel' had said Sunday.

A formal default would be largely symbolic given Russia cannot borrow internationally at the moment and doesn't need to thanks to plentiful oil and gas export revenues. But the stigma would probably raise its borrowing costs in future.

The payments in question are USD 100 million in interest on two bonds, one denominated in US dollars and another in Euros, that Russia was due to pay May 27. The payments had a grace period of 30 days, which expired Sunday.

Russia's finance ministry said it made the payments to its onshore National Settlement Depository (NSD) in Euros and dollars. It said that all obligations have been

In a call with reporters, Kremlin spokesperson Dmitry Peskov said the fact that payments had been blocked by 'Euroclear' because of Western sanctions on Russia was 'not our problem'. Clearing house 'Euroclear' did not respond to a request for comment.

Until the Ukraine invasion, a sovereign default had seemed unthinkable, with Russia having an investment grade rating shortly before that point. A default would also be unusual as Moscow has the funds to service its debt. Moscow has tried in the past few days to find ways of dealing with upcoming payments and avoid a default.

Chariot makers create

Bhubaneswar, June 27: They have no manuals, architectural drawings or modern machines, but a group of craftsmen make gigantic and identical chariots for Lord Jagannath and His siblings –Lord Balabhadra and Devi Subhadra— in Puri every year, using only traditional knowledge.

During the annual Rath Yatra in the Holy City, three chariots famed for their majestic structure and brilliant craftsmanship start from the 12th century Srimandir and reach the Gundicha temple.

"The chariots are constructed afresh every year. There is no deviation in their heights, widths and other key parameters for centuries. However, new features are added to the chariots to make them more colourful and attractive,' Asit Mohanty, a researcher in the Jagannath culture, told PTI.

The carpenters engaged in charot construction do not have any formal training. They only have knowledge and techniques that have been trickled down from their forefathers, Mohanty pointed out.

The chariots are constructed from over 4,000 pieces of wood by a few families who have the hereditary rights to make them.

"I have been engaged in chariot making for about four decades. I was trained by my father Lingaraj Mohapatra and he received training from my grandfather Ananta Mohapatra. It is a tradition and we are privileged to get the opportunity to serve the Lord," said Bijay Mohapatra, the chief Biswakarma (carpenter) of Lord Jagannath's chariot 'Nandighosh' having 16 wheels.

Only traditional equipment like chisel are used in the construction of the chariots, he said.

"Our measurements are in the units of 'haat' (hand size) and 'Anguli' (finger size). There are no such units like feet or inches,' Mohapatra said.



Asked how the 'haat' size remains the same over centuries as the lengths of the hands of different carpenters are not similar, Mohapatra said, "My father has given me a stick. This stick is considered as one 'haat'. It is equivalent to 20 inches. Twenty-five 'Angulis' make a 'haat'. We use these measures to calibrate the height and width of the chariots.'

The carpenters start constructing chariots from the day of Akshaya Tritiya and take around 57 days to complete them.

The carpenters' children assist them in making the chariots of Lord Jagannath, Devi Subhadra and Lord Balabhadra, so that the traditional knowledge is passed on to the future generation.

"Though our children live outside Puri for a living, all of them come for two months and help their fathers in chariot making. It is considered to be a pious work for all of us," he said.

Not only carpenters but also a group of artisans and blacksmiths are involved in the work for gen-

While the 'Bishwakarma' servitors look after the main construction of chariots, 'Pahi Maharanas' fix the wheels of the chariots. There are others like 'Oiha Maharanas' (blacksmiths) who prepare nails, pins, clamps, and iron rings.

This apart, various wooden sculptures such as 'Ashta Manjari' (eight women) are fitted to the chariots. Covers, canopies, and flags made_ of cloth are prepared by the 'Darzi' servitors (tailors).

"As many as 150 traditional craftsmen are engaged in chariot making for 57 days," an official of the Shree Jagannath Temple Administration (SJTA) said.

Another researcher Bhaskar Mishra said that Lord Jagannath's chariot, covered by red and yellow cloths, is constructed with 832 pieces of wood while Lord Balabhdra's chariot 'Tajadwaja' having 14 wheels, is draped in red and green cloths. Similarly, Devi Subhadra's chariot 'Darpadalan' having 12 wheels is covered with

red and black cloth. The Works department of the Odisha government gives fitness certificates to the chariots before they are pulled during the festival which attracts lakhs of people from

across the country and abroad. A team of engineers from the works department and the railways are kept ready for any repair work in the event of a breakdown of the chariots.

After the completion of the festival, the chariots are dismantled and major portions of them are auctioned. The remaining wood is sent to the temple kitchen.

But despite government efforts, TB remains widely stigmatised. And in order to break the stigma, TB needs to be a part of public dis-

course." Reiterating the role of the media, District TB officer (DTO) Ray said. "This is where the media is extremely important as awareness levels are low. It is vital that information on TB symptoms, diagnosis and treatment and the need to stop stigmatisation of people with TB reaches citizens.

She added that in the past, media helped in making national-level health programmes on Covid-19,HIV/AIDS and polio a success and with the same commitment towards TB, it will be possible to achieve the goal of ending TB by 2025 as envisaged in the National

Strategic Plan (2017-25). The objective of the roundtable was to provide media updated information on TB as well as recent data and innovations on TB in Bhubaneswar, Odisha and India.

Intermittent fasting may help heal nerve damage Intermittent fasting helps change the activity of gut bacteria and increase their ability to recover

from nerve damage, according to a study conducted in mice. Researchers from the Imperial

College London observed how fasting led to the gut bacteria increasing production of a metabolite known as 3-Indolepropionic acid (IPA), which is required for regenerating nerve fibres called axons -thread-like structures at the ends of nerve cells that send out electrochemical signals to other cells in the body.

This novel mechanism was discovered in mice and is hoped to also hold true for any future human trials. The team states that the bacteria that produces IPA - named Clostridium sporogenesis - is found naturally in the guts of humans as well as mice; and IPA is present



in human's bloodstreams too.

Brain Sciences. "Intermittent fasting has previously been linked by other studies to wound repair and the growth of new neurons - but our study is the first to explain exactly how fasting might help heal nerves,"

Di Giovanni added. The study, published in the journal Nature, assessed nerve regeneration of mice where the sciatic nerve -- the longest nerve running from the spine down the leg - was crushed. Half of the mice underwent intermittent fasting (by eating as much as they liked followed by not eating at all on alternate days), while the other half were free to eat with no restrictions at all.

These diets continued for a period of 10 days or 30 days before their operation, and the mice's recovery was monitored 24 to 72 hours after the nerve was severed.

The length of the regrown axons was measured and was about 50 per cent greater in mice that had been fasting.

Importantly, when IPA was administered to the mice orally after a sciatic nerve injury, regeneration and increased recovery was observed between two and three weeks after injury.

WWF calls for consensual framework to halt biodiversity loss

The post-2020 global biodiversity framework is expected to be adopted at the second and final part of the 15th conference of parties (COP15) to the UN Convention on Biological Diversity meeting slated for December 5 to 17 in Montreal, Canada

he international community should agree on the establishment of a new and transformative framework to strengthen conservation of biodiversity in the light of threats fuelled by human actions and the climate crisis, senior officials from World Wide Fund for Nature (WWF) said.

Marco Lambertini, the Director-General at WWF International, stressed that a global consensus was urgent to facilitate establishment of a landmark pact to reinvigorate protection of species and speed up nature positive growth, reports Xinhua news agency.

"We need a science-based, ambitious and measurable framework to reverse habitat loss, and put us on a path towards carbon neutrality," Lambertini said at a briefing on the sidelines of the fourth meeting of the open-ended working group on the post-2020 global biodiversity framework underway in Nairobi.

The Nairobi meeting, according to Lambertini, should rise above partisan interests to agree on a text that could open a new chap-



ter in global efforts to reverse unprecedented loss of species.

He noted that biodiversity loss had not only created an ecological crisis but had worsened poverty, food insecurity, water scarcity and

roots communities. Convened by the UN Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD), the June 21-26 meeting in Nairobi is fine tuning the final draft of a global framework to re-engineer conservation of species in the next decade

The post-2020 global biodiversity framework is expected to be adopted at the second and final part of the 15th conference of parties (COP15) to the UN Convention on Biological Diversity meeting slated for December 5 to 17 in Montreal, Canada

"Addressing key drivers of species loss including harmful farming practices, pollution and unsustainable production and consumption should inform establishment of the decade-long global biodiversity framework," said Guido Broekhoven, the Head of Policy, Research and Development at WWF International.

In addition, the framework should advance repurposing of economic models to ensure they were nature positive besides strengthening climate resilience of local custodians of biodiversity hotspots, added Broekhoven. IANS

They Don't Know

t does seem like no one in this country knows anything except those in absolute but temporary power. The bureaucracy has been the torch bearer lacksquare of this mindset since colonial days. They were the very first to understand that the average brown skinned native was incapable, given her limited intellectual abilities, to comprehend what the goras knew about the universe. That thought process has flowed down the line to this day and time when even those youngsters who have cleared that ONE single test by the UPSC that makes them 'rulers' for life think they know whatever it may that is needed to be known. Mostly, the bureaucracy thinks the political class is dispensable except whosoever heads it since pleasing that Headman becomes very important for them to further their careers. Political minions however have a different story to narrate. They are nowhere near the stage to matter for the bureaucracy. It is only personal relations that help them survive the upheavals that most of them face as daily grind.

The political class is an endangered species in current times. Take for example the US Supreme Court's ruling on the Roe Vrs Wade issue. Downwind is where all of them end up since very few have the audacity to stand against the current. It is mostly a matter of convenience that makes politicians do whatever it is that they do. Of course, there are aberrations like Ukraine's Volodymir Zelenskyy who seems to have a conviction that his nation needs to be independent and his strength of char-



acter seems to have percolated down to his country folks who can be observed as real combatants in a real war. The USSC ruling on abortion has not remained limited to American shores. The sign of the times is that the regressive mindset is here to stay. At least for some more time. Depriving women of a very basic right to control their own body's reproductive activities smells of a society that has corroded from deep within. Seemingly the Court did not bother to go deep into issues that affect every individual of that country. With six out of the nine judges going on a roll together, conservatism looks like it is back in vogue.

Some optimists, on the other hand, feel strongly that even though the present global scenario seems to be having a massive swing towards an anti-poor, hate filled and intolerant society, the truth could be trudging along somewhere else. They feel that there is a great desire among the common citizen for a more equitable, tolerant and just social order and that could be the key to

Undoubtedly the courts, governments and politicians, across the globe, seem to have all lost credibility. The supporters of power are seen as scared and timid people filled with hate for everyone else. Those who oppose are counted as rodents that need to be exterminated at the very first opportunity. With a global society that is diametrically opposite to what everyone thought as being obvious and natural just a decade ago, the future could be changing. Which way the dice rolls is anyone's guess.

■ Totter

totter is a rag-and-bone collector. Not, you will note, the verb to move Aunsteadily (which comes from the Middle Dutch touteren, to swing), nor to do with tiny tots (which you might wrongly guess is an abbreviated form of totter, but which is actually an old English dialect word whose origin is unknown, though it's the same one as a tot of spirits and so means something small), nor has it anything do with a person who tots up figures to come to a total (that's an abbreviation from the Latin totum. total, which was once marked against a summed figure in account books). Our totters' name is from the old slang term tot for a bone, as in the nineteenth-century tot-hunter, a gatherer of bones, a word also used as a term of abuse; both may come from the German tot, dead. Totters were once a familiar sight in the streets of every town and city in Britain, often announcing their presence with the ringing of a handbell and the cry of "rags, bones, bottles" that had been so often repeated it had been reduced to a hoarse, inarticulate shout. The original totters, of nineteenthcentury Britain, really did collect rags and bones, among other items. The former were sold to a rag merchant who passed them on to firms that reprocessed them into the cheap material called shoddy. The latter were the remnants of families' meals, which were sent to firms that rendered them down for glue. Some even swept out the fireplaces and ovens of the more prosperous households, sifting out the ashes to sell to soap-makers and selling on the half-burnt coals and logs to those in need of cheap fuel. It was recycling at its most basic. Later, the cry was often "any old iron", commemorated in a famous music-hall song. By the early 1960s, when BBC Television produced Steptoe and Son about two rag-and-bone men in Shepherd's Bush, west London, the totting trade in its old form was pretty much extinct: nobody wanted rags and bones any more. The men of that period and later were scrap merchants, picking up any unwanted item of junk that looked as though it might be worth a few coins.

HEADING TO STAGFLATION

INFLATION AND SHORTAGES IN WESTERN ECONOMIES ARE BEING BLAMED ON RUSSIA AND CHINA FOR SEPARATE REASONS

ermany is the current chair of the group of seven richest nations called G7. This group is meeting in the Bavarian Alps, hosted by the Chancellor of Germany, Olaf Scholz who took charge just six months ago after Angela Merkel's tenure of sixteen years. India is an invitee to the meeting along with Indonesia, Argentina, Senegal and South Africa. Even though the agenda for the meeting covers many topics like food security, health, climate change, terrorism, gender equality and even democracy, clearly the most important worry on every one's minds will be the war in Ukraine and its impact on the world economy. Prime Minister Modi who is attending, tweeted that he looks forward to interacting with world leaders, but he too would like to gauge the international mood on the economy. India is very vulnerable being dependent on import of energy, mainly crude oil. Oil prices have remained stubbornly high, and are not likely to come down. India wants to take advantage of a steep discount being offered by Russia on its oil exports. In doing so, it will earn the ire of all the members of G7, who want a complete boycott of Russia, in order to put economic pressure on the country to withdraw from Ukraine.

But Germany and other west European nations are learning the hard way how much energy dependence they have on Russia, whose oil export and particularly gas pipelines have become Europe's lifeline. Switching to coal-based energy is not easy nor desirable. In this awkward geopolitical position, some people are questioning the wisdom of erstwhile, and much venerated leader Angela Merkel, during whose long tenure, Germany's energy embrace with Russia became tighter. Now Germany has started to ration the supply of gas causing much hardship. Apart from energy, even food prices are at a record high, because of the Ukraine conflict. The

inflation is also affecting other consumer items and producer inputs. One additional reason for persistent inflation is due to shortages created by the lockdowns in China. During the recent and new outbreak of COVID, possibly a fourth or fifth wave, China adopted a zero-COVID policy, imposing very harsh lockdowns even in big cities like Shanghai. This has caused the ports in China to be clogged by ships bound for the West await their consignments.

As a consequence, inflation and shortages in Western economies are being blamed on Russia and China for separate reasons. And of course, both Vladimir Putin and Xi Jinping are not invited to the G7 summit. The G7 summit is also determined to show a unified front of all democracies to counter the actions and stance of Russia and China. But putting up this show of unification is not easy. For instance, India wants to have the freedom to import cheaper oil from Russia and will simply not join any call for boycott or blockade. After all Russia has always been a very dependable ally in the supply of military hardware, technology and support for several decades. Similarly, India has been conducting several rounds

of high-level talks with China (fifteen and counting) to sort out border disputes, after the bloodshed and deaths in Galwan, Ladakh. Imports from China into India continue to soar, and for the third year in a row, Indo-China trade will grow strongly.

Meanwhile, the global economic outlook continues to become gloomier. The World Bank recently reduced its global growth forecast for this year, from 4.1 to 2.9 per cent. That is a downgrade of 1.2 percentage points, which translates to a lower income of trillions of dollars. Both the US and Europe are expected to go into recession. India's growth forecast too has been reduced by one or two per cent by many economists. That translates into reduced national income of about ₹3 to 4 lakh crore, and perhaps 5 to 8 million fewer jobs. India is counting on a vigorous growth in exports for next year too, to reach closer to 500 billion dollars in merchandise exports. But that would need the world economy to be in better shape than what seems to be the case.

Since most economies are facing very high inflation (forty-year high in the US, thirty-year high in India for wholesale price index infla-

tion, record high in UK), most central banks are increasing the interest rates and tightening money supply This tightening is causing investors, especially those in stock markets, or private equity funding future unicorns and startups, or hedge funds, to become risk averse. The foreign portfolio investors have pulled 40 billion dollars out of India in the past six months. No wonder the stock market has crashed. The much-celebrated IPO of LIC has seen its stock price come down and value erosion of nearly ₹1.2 lakh crore. Much of this is because of foreign and global investor sentiment. Even the domestic retail investors in India, whose SIPs used to pour ten or twenty thousand crores into the stock market every month, are now reducing their participation.

The world is heading to stagflation, and India will not remain immune from the effect. It must pull itself up on the strength of domestic demand and fiscal support. Money supply is getting tightened for now but can provide some relief if inflation eases. A good monsoon is badly needed. As of now, the June rainfall is barely one fourth of the normal monsoon. To add to all this, the political instability in a large, industrialised state like Maharashtra is not helping. Instability means inaction or even paralysis in decision making, since policymakers are distracted in tackling the political situation. Private sector investors in new factories, new businesses, in housing and other consumer industries might also prefer to wait and watch. All this adds to the sluggish growth environment However, compared to the Western economies which are entering a recession, India will have some positive growth, but perhaps not as high as needed. That is of course a small comfort for a developing economy, for job creation and growth which is imperative. Policymakers have a tough time ahead in the next six to twelve months.

By announcing its Presidential candidate from the tribal community the BJP-led NDA has made an act of unshackling historical injustice inflicted to one of the least represented populace in India. Or, will this be just another symbolism or second biggest project of increasing base of Hindutva. as alleged by its staunch opponents when the incumbent President was picked by the ruling party?

Not a single representative of a tribal community has ever been in the front race to become the head of the State despite the Constitution allocating a special schedule (Schedule-V) for tribal community. Droupadi Murmu in all probability is likely to become the

first tribal President of India. While Murmu has emerged winner among 20 probable candidates of the NDA government, the speculation over selecting a candidate from the Muslim community was potentially high due to the prevailing domestic upheavals and their international ramifications. The Opposition failed three times to have a consensus candidate due to their differences, not ideologically, but in their own parochial strategies

o more, at least, glaring pic-aimed at the BJP-RSS. Fourth time, a consensus candidate emerged from the coalition of Opposition who was a former Finance and External Affairs Minister under BJP led NDA-I government. Not wasting much words and time to resurrect India's 'great Opposition' or its Presidential nomination, who has already started politicking before his official nomination filing, it's worthwhile to prospect probable mainstreaming of indigenous communities in governance of India.

> The perpetual alienation, exploitation, dispossession of indigenous people during pre- and post-Independence India continued despite half-baked piecemeal approaches by various regimes. During the Constituent Assembly debate in framing the Constitution of India, Jaipal Singh Munda was the sole tribal representative. Known as 'Marang Gomke' (great leader in Mundari language in Jharkhand), Munda who also captained India to its first Olympic hockey gold, eloquently and convincingly ensured special safeguards for tribals and their recognition and Constitutional protection. Speaking for the first time in the Constituent Assembly 19 December, 1946, calling himself a 'Jungli', Munda called tribals 'the original people of India' and most democratic people on the Earth. Munda believed in the new chapter of Independent India where there

would be equality of opportunity, where no one would be neglected.

But Independent India has neglected many millions knowingly and unknowingly. In Chhattisgarh and Odisha, one would easily hear one of the oldest tribal struggles against the 1927 Indian Forest Act. There has been a constant and continuous animosity between the state forest departments and the indigenous communities across the country over access to natural resources for the livelihood of millions. It is not British-era law but Independent India's legislations related to conservation, protection and management of natural resources, developmental activities including mining, river valley projects and infrastructure projects that have deprived 8.6 per cent of India's population of their rights.

When the UPA government formulated and approved the Forest Rights Act (2006), it was the first ray of hope, meant to be compensating historical injustice, for millions of tribal people in recognising their rights to forest land. Implementation of the Act has been marred with all possible discrepancies, mostly deliberate. Frequent news of cancellation of applications of recognition rights and subsequent evictions still continue.

Murmu's nomination and probable winning as the 15th President of India may accelerate the unfinished dream of Jaipal Singh Munda's Constituent Assembly statement of equality of opportunity of indigenous people in development of India, At least, formulation of any legislation in Parliament as well as in state Assemblies related to indigenous people and their lives and livelihoods must be in accordance with the meaningful participation of indigenous communities. Any developmental projects targeted in tribal areas may follow the salient features of FPIC (Free Prior Informed Consent). Indigenous people's knowledge is key to addressing multiple environmental threats the world is facing - climate catastrophe, vanishing species and water scarcity. Under the leadership of Murmu, India may be able to share the knowledge of sustainable way of living of indigenous people with the world. India would like to lead in addressing challenges of indigenous peoples across the world.

Can Murmu, if elected as the head of State, delivering her Constitutional duty -- neither a rubber stamp nor representing a deep BJP-RSS project -- ensure equal participation of indigenous communities in the decision making process of Naya Bharat? That's real and natural justice for indigenous people.

He said the police were investigating the allegations levelled against a 71-year-old man who is working as a personal secretary to a senior political leader.

Senior officials from both the sides will hold discussions till July 1. India and the EU "today kick-start 1st round of trade negotiations in #NewDelhi," Ugo Astuto, Ambassador of the European Union to India and Bhutan, said in a tweet.

India and the 27-nation bloc June 17 formally resumed negotiations on the proposed agreements on trade, investments and Geographical Indications (GI).



India had started negotiations for a trade pact with the EU in 2007, but the talks stalled in 2013 as both sides failed to reach an agreement on key issues, including customs duties on automobiles and spirits, and the movement of professionals. Commerce and industry minister Pivush Goval in Brussels on June 18 had said India wishes to engage with the world on modern products and look at areas where it can gain in terms of new technology and investments.

"All cards are on the table and we are coming with an open heart and an open mind... Agreements do not have to always be about gain or demands, I think agreements also have to be which is good for both negotiating teams and for the people," he had said.

He filed four sets of nomination papers, signed by lawmakers of the Congress, TMC, SP and



the DMK, with Sonia Gandhi being one of the proposers.

He said the July 18 presidential election is not a contest between two individuals or identities, but a fight between two ideologies. The presidential election is a battle between the ideology of absolute power and that of freedom, he said, adding that this is a fight for protecting and safeguarding the values and prin-

and most of the Opposition parties have come together in this election to wage this battle and it's not going to stop here. I am confident they will remain together and carry the fight forward. We are confident we alone will succeed in the end because truth is on our side and we are not resorting to any

FSSAI comes out withrules for vegan foods

New Delhi, June 27: In order to curb sale of fake vegan foods, food regulator FSSAI has come out with regulations by defining what constitutes vegan foods and listed out various specifications to be followed for manufacture, sale and import of such food items.

Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) has come out with the Food Safety and Standards (Vegan Foods) Regulations, 2022. The regulator had brought the draft regulations in September 2021. After considering objections and suggestions received from the public in respect of the draft regulations, the FSSAI has come out with the new regu-

lations. "Vegan food means the food or food ingredient, including additives, flavourings, enzymes and carriers, or processing aids that are not products of animal origin and in which, at no stage of production and processing, ingredients, including additives, flavourings, enzymes and carriers, or processing aids that are of animal origin

has been used," the FSSAI said in its definition. No person can manufacture, pack, sell, offer for sale, market or otherwise distribute or

import any food as vegan food unless they comply with the requirements laid down under these FSSAI regulations. "The food products to be called vegan, shall not have involved animal testing for any purpose, including safety evaluation, unless provided by any Regulatory Authority," it added. Every pack aging material used for vegan foods should comply with the provisions

of the packaging regulations. The seller of vegan food, either exclusively or as part of retail merchandise, should store and display such food in a manner distinguishable from non-vegan food. Every package of vegan foods, after the approval, should carry the logo specified by the FSSAI.

Hyderabad, June 27:Fact-checking website, Alt news' co-founder Mohammed Zubair was arrested in the national capital Monday for allegedly hurting sentiments of a particular religious community, the police said.

The police had registered a case after getting a complaint from a Twitter handle, where it was al-

leged that Zubair had tweeted a questionable image with a purpose to deliberately hurting religious sentiments.

"Such tweets were getting retweeted and it appeared that there is a brigade of so-

cial media entities, who indulge in insult mongering thereby leading to a possible ramification on communal harmony and is overall against the maintenance of public tranquility," Deputy Commissioner of Police KPS Malhotra told IANS

On Monday, Zubair joined the investigation in a case that was registered at the Special Cell police station. During the probe, the police had given a status report, wherein the tweet by Mohammad Zubair

was not found objectionable even though subsequent tweets after his tweet led to a series of questionable and derogatory tweets. "In the investigation of this case, he had been earlier examined and the investigation is on the verge of conclusion," the police officer said.

However, earlier this month the police was alerted by a Twitter handle that Mohammad Zubair

had earlier made an objectionable tweet and his followers on social media entities had amplified and created a series of debates and hate mongering

in the thread. "He was examined in this

INCREASED DEATH AMONG PATIENTS WITH HEART DISEASE OR THEIR RISK FACTORS

New Delhi, June 27: Covid-related hospitalisations claimed lives of middle-aged to elderly Indians more frequently than people of the same age groups in other regions of the world, according to a new study.

The study, led by the $\check{\text{W}}\text{orld}\,\text{Heart}$ Federation in association with the Public Health Foundation of India, revealed that a higher prevalence of diabetes and hypertension among Indians are the major drivers of the increased mortality.

The study included 40 hospitals from 23 countries, with 5,313 patients admitted with Covid and aimed to bridge the research gap between low and high-income countries

The findings, published in the



journal Global Heart, showed that during the pandemic Indians had nearly three times higher mortality due to Covid hospitalisation. than the European population. However, the number was less than the Hispanics and Blacks.

"South Asians (Indians) in the middle-aged to elderly group died more frequently than other regions due to Covid hospitalisations, owing to significantly greater background prevalence of diabetes and hypertension," D Prabhakaran, Vice President, Research and Policy, PHFI, told IANS.

The study demonstrated that patients were relatively younger as compared to previous research (where the average age was 57 years), predominantly middle aged men, with high prevalence of cardiovascular risk factors such as hypertension diabetes and high

Patients of Asian, Hispanic or Black ethnicities had higher death rates both within the hospital and after discharge as compared to white Caucasians, Prabhakaran said. Another finding was that patients with HIV had increased death at 30 days but not during hospitalisation.

For example, the chances of dying or having Covid-related complications particularly with the Alpha and Delta strains were 2-3 times higher among those with hypertension, diabetes or established heart disease, including previous heart attack or those who had undergone a previous bypass surgery as compared to those without the presence of any of these.

"The effects of Covid-19 on the heart can be direct or indirect. It can be direct damage to the heart during the cytokine storm or indirect because of low levels of oxygen due to lung disease," Prabhakaran said. "However, the good news is that with recent Omicron infections, the cytokine storm is extremely low. This may be related to the high vaccination rates or the inherently lower virulence (the severity or harmfulness of the virus) of the Omicron strain," he added.

Kanhaiya leaves Satyagrah venue after ABVP protest

Patna, June 27: Kanhaiya Kumar and other Congress leaders faced an awkward situation in Patna Sahib Monday when a section of the people shouted slogans and called him a traitor.

Kanhaiya Kumar went to Shikarpur Chowk near Patna Sahib Railway station to participate in a day long Satyagrah called by the Congress party against the government's Agnipath scheme. People who were supposed to be youth wing leaders of the ABVP interrupted the event and he eventually left the venue in a huff.

Kanhaiya Sunday announced Satyagrah in all 243 assembly constituencies of Bihar against Agnipath scheme on Monday from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

During the Satyagrah event, leaders like Kanhaiya Kumar, state president Madan Mohan Jha, Praveen Kushwaha and others were present at the venue. When Kanhaiya was in the middle of the speech, some people shouted slogans against him and called him a traitor. They claimed that Kanhaiya Kumar speaks only against the country.

"Serving in defence is a pride for every countryman but recruitment on the contract in the defence is extremely dangerous. The Congress party is protesting across the country against the anti national policy 'Agnipath'. It is a betrayal of the future of youth,' Kanhaiya said during the early

part of his speech. "Why has this government made a provision of four years and why not 5 years. We have to understand the labour policy of the country first. If any labourer associated with a company and serves for 5 vears, he/she would be entitled to get pension. The Centre has launched this scheme for four years only to avoid paying pen-

sion," Kanhaiya said. "Agnipath scheme is simply a move towards the contractualisation of defence jobs. Agniveers won't get employment or pension after completing their service duration of four years. Students and job aspirants will definitely protest against such schemes that will thrust the youth of the country into the fire. But Union ministers are trying to sell the scheme like salesmen," he said.

"Why is Prime Minister Narendra Modi silent on the issue? The government talked about 'one rank, one pension', but has come up with a scheme of 'no rank, no pension'. The scheme is neither in favor of the country nor good for army job aspirants," he added.

'The BJP-led NDA government at the Centre is not serious about addressing the unemployment problem in the country. By bringing in the Agnipath scheme, it has made jobs contractual in defence sector. But the Union government must not play with national security. We demand an immediate roll-

Agnipath row paralyses both Houses in Bihar PRESS TRUST OF INDIA

Patna, June 27: Both Houses of the legislature in Bihar were paralysed Monday, the second day of the brief monsoon session, when an obstreperous opposition demanded the withdrawal of Agnipath and shouted slogans against Prime Minister Narendra Modi, inveighing against his government for bringing in the scheme.

The assembly was adjourned till Tuesday at about 3 PM by Speaker Vijay Kumar Sinha, whose repeated attempts to cajole the RJD-led opposition proved to be of no avail

RJD chief whip Lalit Yadav and Congress legislative party leader Ajeet Sharma had moved separate adjournment motions, both seeking a withdrawal of the contentious scheme of recruitment in the armed forces which provides for retirement after four years of service without pensions.

Slogans against the NDA government at the Centre, including the Prime Minister, drew sharp reactions from the treasury benches, especially members of the BJP.

Strong displeasure was expressed by Deputy Chief Minister Tarkishor Prasad who was aghast at slogans belittling the Prime Minister.

Ministers of Chief Minister Nitish Kumar's JD(U), which has been sceptical of the new scheme and sympathetic towards those opposing it, were also of the view that since the matter had national implications, it would not be proper to hold a discussion on the same inside the House.



Statements to this effect were made on the floor of the House by Vijay Kumar Sinha and Shrawan Kumar, the ministers for parliamentary affairs and rural devel opment respectively.

The Speaker was also visibly miffed at the recalcitrant opposition members, whom he reprimanded for raising an issue that fell outside the purview of the House and shouting slogans against the Prime Minister. "Nothing will be recorded in the proceedings. Your adjournment motion could have been taken up for consideration at noon, the assigned hour, but the House was not allowed to run. the Speaker remarked sullenly.

The Speaker, known for his penchant for sensitizing schoolchildren about the functioning of the legislature, was repeatedly seen pleading with folded hands "students from Buxar have come. They are watching us. Please do not create such a scene.

Meanwhile, similar uproarious scenes over Agnipath were witnessed in the legislative council despite an assurance to opposition members by Acting Chairman Awadhesh Narayan Singh that the matter will be referred to the business advisory committee of the House.

Former Chief Minister Rabri Devi, who is the leader of the opposition in the Upper House, stood outside the Vidhan Parishad along with members of her RJD, before the commencement of proceedings, carrying placards and raising slogans.

'The scheme should be withdrawn and all the police cases lodged against protesting youths should be taken back. The government has been accusing us of fomenting trouble. Do they think the public is so stupid that it cannot think for itself? You cannot chop off the tongues of those who raise their voice", she told reporters.

JD(U) MLC Neeraj Kumar told reporters after proceedings were stalled for the day, "I wonder what went wrong with the opposition that it did not allow the House to function in the post-lunch session. They seemed okay with the Acting Chairman's assurance. They are wasting precious time



Dehradun, June 27: A very rare carnivorous plant species called Utricularia Furcellata has been found in the western Himalayan region for the first time.

The detection of the rare species was made by a research team of the Uttarakhand Forest Department in the picturesque Mandal valley located in Chamoli district, Chief Conservator of Forest (Research) Sanjiv Chaturvedi said.

"It is the first sighting of the plant not only in Uttarakhand but in the entire western Himalayan region," he said.

The discovery by the Uttarakhand Forest Department team consisting of Range Officer Harish Negi and Junior Research Fellow Manoj Singh has been pub-



lished in the prestigious 'Journal of Japanese Botany', a 106-yearold journal on plant taxonomy and botany which is considered to be one of the finest in the field, Caturvedi said

It is a proud moment for the Uttarakhand Forest Department as it is the first discovery by it which has been published in the prestigious journal, he said.


The discovery was part of a project study of insectivorous plants in Uttarakhand. This carnivorous plant belongs to a genus which is commonly known as bladderworts,

Chaturvedi said. "It uses one of the most sophis-

ticated and developed plant structures for trap and the targets range from protozoa to insects, mosquito larvae and even young tadpoles,' he said.

Its operation is based on a mechanical process by creating a vacuum or negative pressure area, to draw prey inside the trap door. Carnivorous plants are found mostly in fresh water and wet soil. They have a completely distinct manner of arranging food and nutrition through intelligent trap mechanisms, as compared to the photosynthesis mode of normal plants.

Carnivorous plants which generally grow on poor nutrient soil have aroused new interest in the scientific community across the world because of their potential medicinal benefits, the official said.



in or lose, we go shop-ping after the election," said Imelda Marcos, wife of one-time President Ferdinand Marcos of the Philippines. In a different context, this stands true after every election in India as political entities get busy making and then breaking governments, 'shopping' list in hand.

Proof comes plentiful. After previous attempts at pulling down the Maharashtra Vikas Aghadi (MVA) government came a cropper, a new one is underway in a never-say-die spirit. If it was the NCP of Sharad Pawar in the crosshairs of the BJP last time, it is the Shiv Sena splitting to align in 'lotus' formation this time.

National Highway-48 linking Mumbai to Delhi passes through Guiarat. So did New Delhi's attempts to align Maharashtra to its fold. The first whiff of the move to splinter the Shiv Sena and replace the MVA with a BJP-led formation came when Eknath Shinde and his rebels were moved out to a Surat hotel into the safety of BJP ruled Gujarat which is also the citadel of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Union Home minister Amit Shah. Interestingly, Gujarat BJP chief CR Patil, a close confidante of Modi, hails from Surat as does the state's home minister Harsh Sanghvi. The Surat hotel swarming with cops even before the rebel legislators landed was a dead give-away. The Prime Minister has visited Guiarat thrice within the last one month while the frequency of the Shah's visits has been higher.

Though Patil with his Jalgaon connection remained the interface of the initial reach-out to the Shiv Sena legislators, it was overseen and fine tuned from New Delhi. Published reports have also hinted at the use of enforcement agencies to soften up the legislators before putting the plan into ac-

However, it was the ease with which two Shiv Sena emissaries of Uddhav Thackeray managed to establish contact with the rebel leader Eknath Shinde and arranged a conversation that alerted the BJP leadership to the inherent



weakness of Surat being too close to Maharashtra for comfort and therefore the move to airlift the rebels to Assam posthaste.

Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma seems to have now become the go-to person for the BJP and its look north-eastwards policy. It was the Assam police which had picked up Congressbacked independent legislator from Gujarat, Jignesh Mevani for tweeting against the Prime Minister and just around the time the rebellion was unfolding in Surat, Delhi Chief Minister Manish Sisodia was faced with an FIR and a ₹100-crore defamation suit filed by the wife of the Assam Chief Minister and the now the move to shift the Shiv Sena rebels also to the safety of a hotel in Assam.

Whatever may be the outcome

of this tug-of-war, what it has brought to centre-stage are the double standards of the political class. The framers of the country's Constitution would be hard but to visualise a scenario where the lawmakers would need to be herded together and moved crosscountry to the safety of their favoured governments.

The 2018 Vidhan Sabha elections, conducted at stupendous cost to the exchequer in Madhya Pradesh, brought the Congress to power. The Kamal Nath government lasted 15 months before it was pulled down with 23 legislators defecting to the BJP led by Congress leader Jyotiraditya Scindia. The defecting legislators had to be moved to the safe sanctuary of BJP-ruled Karnataka, until the government was taken down. What principle or morality was involved in the Scindia switchover or was it just personal pique and quest for power remains a moot point.

The anti-defection law was enacted by Parliament in 1985 as the tenth schedule of the Constitution to prevent destabilising of governments through defections. However, the political class which enacted the law is the one that comfortably bypasses it by making the legislators resign and getting them re-elected under their own party's government. The same script, tweaked with variations, had earlier played out in Karnataka, Meghalaya, Manipur, Goa and Arunachal Pradesh.

The recently concluded elections to fill up 57 Rajya Sabha seats presented a spectacle of sorts. The Congress legislators from BJPruled Haryana had to be spirited away to the safety of its own ruled Chhattisgarh. And yet, all in vain for legislator Kuldeep Bishnoi de fiantly votes a BJP backed mediabaron and another one wasted the vote. Haryana Chief Minister Manoharlal Khattar is quick to felicitate Bishnoi for listening to his inner voice and cross-voting. BJP rules Haryana and yet feels insecure so moves its legislators to Union territory, Chandigarh. Congress rules Rajasthan and vet needs to move its legislators to a resort in Udaipur. BJP was happy

with Bishnoi voting against his own party, the Congress. However in Rajasthan when BJP legislator Shobharani Kushwah did the same thing, sinking the hopes of a BJP backed media baron, she was

promptly suspended. Again, the very Congress which dismissed Bishnoi for cross-voting in Haryana had no qualms about seeking a "conscience vote" from the JD(S) MLAs for its second candidate in Karnataka. With Jairam Ramesh largely secure, Karnataka CLP leader Siddaramaiah wrote an open letter to JD(S) legislators for their second candidate. 

6 Mexican police officers killed

Mexico City: At least six police officers were killed during a shootout with armed individuals travelling in a convoy of about 10 armoured trucks in Nuevo Leon state, authorities said. "Four more policemen were injured and are already receiving medical attention," Xinhua news agency quoted the state's security department as saying. The attack occurred between the towns of Lampazos and Colombia in the north of the state, where police were outnumbered by the attackers, who carried largecaliber weapons, according to the authorities.

Russian missile strike hits mall

Sloviansk (Ukraine): Scores of civilians were feared killed or wounded in a Russian missile strike Monday on a crowded shopping mall in Ukraine's central city of Kremenchuk. Ukrainian officials said. Zelenskyv said in a Telegram post that the number of victims was "unimaginable," citing reports that more than 1.000 civilians were inside at the time of the attack. Images from the scene showed giant plumes of black smoke from a shopping center engulfed in flames, as emergency crews rushed in.

Gas leak kills 10, injures 250

Amman: A poisonous gas leak in Jordan's southern port city of Aqaba Monday killed at least 10 people and injured some 250, authorities said. Video carried by state-run media outlets showed a crane hoisting a large tanker from a truck and then dropping it on the deck of a ship, causing an explosion of yellow smoke and sending dock workers racing away. The Public Security Directorate said a gas tank sprung a leak while being transported. It did not identify the contents of the tanker.

RENEWED G7 PLEDGES TO STAND WITH UKRAINE SOLIDARITY

G7 leaders launch plan to rival China's BRI

Berlin, June 27: G7 leaders have launched a detailed plan to to mobilise hundreds of billions of dollars and deliver quality, sustainable infrastructure in a move deemed to counter Chinese President Xi Jinping's ambitious Belt and Road Initiative (BRI).

According to the BBC, the Partnership for Global Infrastructure and Investment (PGII) relaunches a scheme unveiled at last year's G7 talks in Cornwall, England.

Addressing the summit in Krun on Sunday, US President Joe Biden said that last year in Cornwall, the G7 made a commitment to "step up and provide financing for quality, high-standard, sustainable infrastructure in developing and middle-income countries".

"We're offering better options for countries and for people around the world to invest in critical infrastructure that improves the lives, their lives, all of our lives, and delivers real gains for all of our people, not just the G7, all of our people," the President was quoted as saying in a readout issued by the

Biden said that the G7 leaders aim to mobilise nearly \$600 billion by 2027. Of the total, the US will raise \$200 billion via grants, federal funds and private investment, while the European Union (EU) has pledged 300 billion euros (\$316 billion). "These strategic investments are areas of critical to sustainable development and to our shared global stability."

Tokyo warned of power crunch

Tokyo, June 27: The Japanese government warned of possible power shortages Monday in the Tokyo region, asking people to conserve energy as the country endures an unusually intense heatwave.

Weather officials have announced the earliest end to the annual summer rainy season since the Japan Meteorological Agency began keeping records in 1951. The rains usually temper summer heat, often

well into July. The economy and industry ministry urged people living in the region serviced by the Tokyo Electric Power Co. to conserve power in the afternoon, especially when demand peaks at 4-5 p.m. Kaname Ogawa, director of electricity supply policy at the ministry, said electicity demand Monday was bigger than expected because the temperature is higher than Sunday's

"We are struck by unusual heat for the season," Ogawa said. "Please

The NATO reaction force currently numbers around 40,000 soldiers which can deploy quickly when needed. Coupled with other measures including the deployment of forces to defend specific allies, NATO Secretary-General Jens Stoltenberg said the move is part of the "biggest overhaul of collective defense and deterrence since the Cold War."

'These troops will exercise together with home defense forces," Stoltenberg said.

"And they will become familiar with local terrain, facilities, and our new pre-positioned stocks. So that they can respond smoothly and swiftly to any emergency.'

Stoltenberg made the remarks at a press conference ahead of a NATO summit later this week in Madrid when the 30 allies are expected to also agree on further support to Ukraine in its war against Russia. Stoltenberg said he expects allies to make clear they consider Russia "as the most significant and direct threat to our security.

In NATO's new strategic concept, the alliance is also expected to address for the first time the security challenges posed by China, Stoltenberg said.

Colombo, June 27: Troops in Sri Lanka handed tokens Monday to people queuing for petrol amid a severe fuel shortage in the nation battling its worst economic crisis in seven decades, while schools shut in Colombo and public employees were asked to work from home.

With its foreign exchange reserves at a record low, the island of 22 million is struggling to pay for essential imports of food, medicine and most critically, fuel.

'I have been in line for four days, I haven't slept or eaten properly during this time," said autorickshaw driver W.D. Shelton, 67, one of those who received a token

'We can't earn, we can't feed our families," added Shelton, who was 24th in line at a fuel station in the centre of Colombo, but set to stay there as he had no petrol for the journey to his home just 5 km (3

miles) away. It was not immediately clear how far the government could stretch its fuel reserves. The stockpiles stand at about 9,000 tonnes of diesel and 6,000 tonnes of petrol, Power and Energy Minister Kanchana Wijesekera said on Sunday, but no fresh shipments are due.

The government has told employees to work from home until further notice, while schools have been shut for a week in the commercial capital of Colombo and surrounding areas.

Fuel station queues have grown rapidly since last week. "This is a tragedy, we don't know where this will end." Shelton said.

Public transport, power generation and medical services will get priority in fuel distribution, with some rationed to ports and airports. A team from the International Monetary Fund is visiting Sri Lanka to hold talks on a \$3-billion bailout package.

Although the Indian Ocean nation is hoping to reach a staff-level agreement before the visit endson Thursday, that is unlikely to unlock any immediate funds.

NITI pegs gig workforce at 2.35cr by FY30

India – with its demographic dividend of half-a-billion labour force and the world's youngest population, rapid urbanisation, widespread adoption of smartphones and associated technology – is the new frontier of this revolution, the report noted



As per the report, in terms of industrial lassification, about 26.6 lakh gig workers were involved in retail trade and sales, and about 13 lakh were in the transportation sector

About 6.2 lakh were in manufacturing and another 6.3 lakh in the finance and insurance activities

At present, about 47 per cent of the gig work is in medium skilled jobs, 22 per cent in high skilled, and about 31 per cent in low skilled jobs

New Delhi, June 27: India's gig workforce is expected to expand to 2.35 crore by 2029-30 from 77 lakh in 2020-21, a NITI Aayog report said Monday, and recommended extending social security measures for such workers and their families in partnership mode as envisaged in Code on Social Security.

The report titled 'India's Booming Gig and Platform Economy' further said gig workers are expected to form 6.7 per cent of the nonagricultural workforce or $4.1~{\rm per}$ cent of the total livelihood in India by 2029-30.

According to the NITI report, it is estimated that in 2020-21, 77 lakh workers were engaged in the gig economy and they constituted 2.6 per cent of the non-agricultural workforce or 1.5 per cent of the total workforce in India.

Similarly, it estimated that there were 68 lakh gig workers in 2019-20, using both principal and subsidiary status, forming 2.4 per cent of the non-farm workforce or 1.3 per cent of the total workers in the country.

Gig workers can be broadly classified into platform and non-platform workers. Platform workers are those whose work is based on online software apps or digital platforms while non-platform gig workers are generally casual wage workers, working part-time or full-time. Gig workers prefer a flexible

work schedule, typically with low to middle level of education. Income through gig work is not their primary source of income and they are often holding another regular job.

The report pointed out that the employment elasticity to GDP growth for gig workers was above one throughout the period 2011-12 to 2019-20, and was always above the overall employment elasticity.

To harness the potential of the gig-platform sector, the report recommended accelerating access to finance through products specifically designed for platform workers, linking self-employed individuals engaged in the business of selling regional and rural cuisine. street food, etc. with platforms to enable them to sell their produce to wider markets in towns and cities.

Other recommendations include undertaking a separate enumeration exercise to estimate the size of the gig-platform workforce and collecting information during official enumerations.

Rupee to remain under pressure: Experts

For a nation that is 85 per cent dependent on imports to meet its oil needs and 50 per cent for gas requirements, soaring international energy and commodity prices have worsened its external finances

New Delhi, June 27: India's rupee is likely to remain under pressure due to high prices of crude oil and other commodities, and may stabilise at around 79-80 against the US dollar in the near term, say experts amid limited headroom available with the Reserve Bank to check the weakening of the domestic currency.

Also, the continuing FPI (Foreign Portfolio Investments) outflows has put the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) in a situation where it cannot go all out to strengthen the rupee as it needs to hold on to forex reserves to meet the import requirements

An article published in the RBI's latest bulletin has cautioned that in case of an adverse global scenario, potential portfolio outflows can average up to 3.2 per cent of GDP or \$100 billion (Rs 7.8 lakh crore) in a year.

The article, titled 'Capital Flows at Risk: India's Experience' further said in a 'black swan' event comprising a combination of shocks, potential portfolio outflows can rise to 7.7 per cent of GDP.

UPI RECORDS ABOUT A 99% INCREASE IN VOLUME AND OVER 90% INCREASE IN VALUE COMPARED TO LAST YEAR

Mumbai, June 27: India saw 9.36 billion transactions amounting to ₹10.25 trillion in the first quarter (January-March period) via various payment modes led by Unified Payment Interface (UPI), a new report showed Monday.

The UPI P2M (person to merchant) transactions emerged as the most preferred payment mode among consumers with a market share of 64 per cent in volume and 50 per cent in terms of value, according to the report by Worldline, a global leader in payments industry.

As of the first quarter, the top UPI apps in terms of volume were PhonePe, Google Pay, Paytm Payments Bank App, Amazon Pay, Axis banks App while top PSP UPI Players were YES Bank, Axis Bank, State Bank of India, HDFC Bank and Paytm Payments Bank.

Among the top UPI Apps, Phone Pe, Google Pay and Paytm accounted for 94.8 per cent of UPI transactions volume and 93 per cent of UPI transactions value as of March 2022, the report showed.

The average ticket size (ATS) for UPI P2P (peer-to-peer) trans-



actions was ₹2,455 and ₹860 for P2M transactions (as of March).

Credit cards accounted for 7 per cent of transactions, but 26 per cent of value, indicating that customers still prefer to use their credit cards for high value transactions.

Debit cards account for 10 per cent of transactions, but 18 per cent in value. The volume has shrunk from previous years likely because of the rise of UPI.

As of March, the total number of POS terminals deployed by merchant acquiring banks were 6.07 million with over half a million POS terminals deployed during Q1 2022.

The POS deployment witnessed over 28 per cent growth in Q1 2022 compared to a year before.

As of March, the total number of Bharat QRs were 4.97 million, a 39 per cent rise as compared to March 2021 while UPI QRs stood at 172.73 million, registering an increase of 87 per cent as compared to March 2021.

The total number of credit and debit cards in circulation by the end of Q1 2022 was 991.28 million.

In Q1 2022, consumers made 15.6 billion mobile based payments whereas net banking/Internet browser-based transactions were over 1 billion, the report showed.

ELECTRONICS MANUFACTURING Govt okays schemes worth ₹86,824cr

New Delhi, June 27: The electronics and IT ministry has approved a total of 314 applications with proposed investments of ₹86,824 crore under a modified special incentive package scheme till May 31, 2022, an official note said.

The proposals that were approved in May included an investment of ₹596 crore from Bosch Automotive Electronics Private Limited, the official note dated June 24 said.

"As on May 31, 2022, 320 applications with proposed investment of ₹89,232 crore are under consideration. Out of these 320 applications, 314 applications with proposed investment of approximately ₹86,824 crore have been approved," the official document said.

M-SIPS (Modified Special Incentive Package Scheme) was_ announced by the government in July 2012. It has been amended twice - in August, 2015 and in January, 2017, and mainly provides

a capex subsidy of 20-25 per cent. Samsung, LG, Bosch, Tejas Networks, Motherson Sumi Systems, Tata Power SED, Nidec India, Nippon Audiotronix, Continental Automotive, GE BE and Wipro GE healthcare were the initial applicants for the scheme.

Dambulla, June 27: Skipper Chamari Athapaththu struck a counter-attacking 48-ball 80 not out (14x4, 1x6) as Sri Lanka outplayed India by seven wickets in the third and final T20I to avoid a whitewash here Monday.

The 32-year-old Chamari became the only cricketer from the island nation to get to the 2000-run mark in T20Is. Tillakaratne Dilshan (1889) is the highest run-scorer among the male cricketers from Sri Lanka.

Chasing a modest 139 to avoid a clean sweep by the Indians, Sri Lankan batting finally came good as the hosts hunt down the target with three overs to spare to claim a consolation win.

The three-match T20I series thus ended 2-1 in favour of India, who stuttered after opting to bat before skipper Harmanpreet Kaur's resilient 39 not out (33b: 3x4, 1x6) propped up their total to 138/5.

In reply Sri Lanka lost Vishmi Gunaratne (5) in the first over, but Harshitha Samarawickrama (13) gave a fine support to Chamari in the powerplay before being dismissed by Radha Yadav in the fifth

Thereafter, Nilakshi de Silva (30) joined hands with Chamari as the skipper cruised to a 29-ball fifty - the fastest fifty for Sri Lanka women's T20I.

Luck also was on her side as Chamari got a reprieve on 42 when Jemimah Rodrigues missed a running catch in the midwicket boundary. She soon slammed back-toback fours en route to her fifth

With Chamari looking furious, Sri Lanka just needed 18 runs in the final five overs and the hosts it without much ado to seal their first T20 win against India at home. India were sloppy on the field and missed a slew of run-outs and signed off the T20I series on a dis-



Djokovic makes history Sindhu, Prannoy lead India's challenge with win at Wimbledon

Wimbledon, June 27: These days, Novak Djokovic makes history just about every time he wins another match. Monday, the top-ranked Serb did just that at Wimbledon.

Djokovic, a six-time champion at the All England Club, beat Kwon Soon-woo 6-3, 3-6, 6-3, 6-4 on Centre Court, his 80th victory at the grasscourt major. With it, he became the first man or woman to win that many matches at each of the four Grand Slam tennis tournaments.

Djokovic was playing for the first time since losing to Rafael Nadal last month in the French Open quarterfinals. It didn't all go his way on Monday, however.

With the roof closed because of sporadic rain, Kwon was able to pick his spots with his booming forehand. It all came together in the second set, and even continued into the third, but Diokovic stepped it up and played like he usually plays in

southwest London — unbeatable. Djokovic has won the last three Wimbledon titles and is going for his seventh overall. That would put him in a tie for the second most with Pete Sampras and William Renshaw.

Only Roger Federer, with eight, has more. Another major title would also give him 21 for his career. Nadal has 22, and Federer has 20.

Most of Djokovic's Grand Slam singles championships have come at the Australian Open, where he is a nine-time champion. But he was unable to defend his title in Melbourne this year after being deported because of Australia's vaccination protocols.

The first player to reach the second round was Alison Riske, who defeated Ylena In-Albon of Switzerland 6-2, 6-4. Other seeded women who advanced were No. 3 Ons Jabeur of Tunisia and No.29 Anhelina Kalinina of Ukraine. Kalinina will face another Ukrainian, Lesia Tsurenko, in the second round.

Saina had skipped the Indonesia leg to manage workload and will look to put up a good show against Wang, whom she had defeated in three games the only time they met last year at Orleans Masters.

In men's singles, Prannoy has been on a consistent run with a series of quarterfinals since the world championships last year. He played a pivotal role in India's epic Thomas Cup win and then dished out some superlative performances in Jakarta to reach the semifinals.

The 29-year-old was crestfallen after a series of unforced errors led to his ouster from Indonesia. Prannoy, who is desperate to end his five year title drought, will be pitted against Malaysian veteran Daren Liew, who had defeated him at the Thailand Open in May this year.



B Sai Praneeth will be up against sixth seeded Indonesian Anthony Sinisuka Ginting, while Sameer Verma takes on another Indonesian Jonata Christie, seeded seventh.

Former Commonwealth Games gold medallist Parupalli Kashyap, also returning after recovering from an injury, will meet Korea's Heo Kwang Hee in the opening

World No.8 pairing of Satwiksairaj Rankireddy and

MORGAN SET TO ANNOUNCE INTERNATIONAL RETIREMENT

London, June 27: England's World Cup winning skipper Eoin Morgan is set to announce his retirement from international cricket Tuesday after a career spanning 16 years during which he amassed over 10,000 runs across ODIs and T20Is.

According to a report in Sky Sports, the 35-year-old Dublin-born Morgan wanted to lead England at this year's T20 World Cup in Australia but he had a change of

 $heart\,after\,struggling\,with\,his\,form$ and fitness in the last 18 months.

Morgan captained England in the first two ODI games against the Netherlands this month but failed to open his account on both the occasion. He subsequently missed the

third game due to a groin niggle. Vice-captain Jos Buttler is likely to replace him as England skipper and the upcoming white-ball series against India could be his first

assignment. Morgan made his debut for



Ireland in 2006 but then after three years he switched his alliance to England in 2009. The elegant lefthanded batter, who played in the middle-order, has so far scored 7,701 runs from 248 ODIs, after

making his debut against Scotland. He also featured in 115 T20 matches, amassing 2,458 runs, after making his debut in the format for England against the Netherlands in 2009. The soft-spoken Morgan also featured in 16 Tests but managed to score only 700 runs and played his last Test in 2012 against Pakistan. However, Morgan's legacy will be defined by his seven and a half year rein as England's limited over captain during which the team rose

to the No.1 position in the world

rankings in both ODI and T20 cricket. Morgan along with then coach Trevor Bayliss breathed a fresh air into the English side, which encouraged the players to play a fearless brand of cricket, which eventually led them to win the World Cup—

in 2019 in their own back-yard.
