



Meanwhile, Vice Chancellor of the Sambalpur University Prof Sanjib Mittal said that the question paper was leaked from Kalahandi. 'The question paper was leaked

from an aided college in Kalahandi district. The principal of the concerned college was called to the university. A lecturer of the college was involved in question preparation," Mittal said.

Now, the university has rescheduled the Plus III Final Year examination for the students of Education (Honours) and Physics (Honours) subjects following the question paper leaks. While the sixth semester examination in Education has been rescheduled for July 19, the Physics examination will be held July 20, announced

the Controller of Examinations of Sambalpur University Friday.

As per the notice, the exam has been scheduled from 10am to 1pm. As many as 205 colleges have been notified about the schedule. This time, the question papers will be sent by email before 30 minutes of exam to avoid any issues, the university authorities said.

Reportedly, the screenshots of question papers were circulated on WhatsApp. Following the question paper leak, the Physics examination scheduled at 10am Friday was cancelled. Thursday, the university authorities had suspended the Education (Honours) exam after question paper leak.

Out of the four medical colleges in the NIRF list of 50 institutes, AIIMS-Bhubaneswar ranked 26, while the SCB Medical College and Hospital in Cuttack is at the 44th position. The National Law University in Cuttack is placed at 25 on the list of law institutes.

Delhi HC refuses to direct revival of WW-II era Mayurbhanj airstrip

New Delhi, July 15: The Delhi High Court Friday refused to direct the central government to build an airport in Mayurbhanj district of Odisha by reviving an airstrip constructed there in the year 1940.

A bench headed by Chief Justice Satish Chandra said that the construction of an airport is a policy decision that has to be taken by the central government while keeping in mind several factors.

"It is the pure domain of the government of India as well as the Airport Authority of India to construct an airport keeping in view the flow of the traffic and other relevant factors," said the bench also comprising Justice Subramonium Prasad

The petitioner, a practicing advocate, said that during the British regime in 1940, an airstrip was constructed at Rasgobindpur block in Mayurbhanj, but after the Second World War was over, no steps were taken to make it functional.

He emphasised that the locality needed an airport and therefore the central government should be directed to make the airstrip functional.

The court refused to grant any relief to the petitioner but said that the central government was free to explore the possibility of reviving the airstrip in question on its own

"It is a genuine concern but it is for the government of India to decide. If it is a necessity, they will do it," the court remarked.

New Delhi, July 15: The rupee nearing 80 to a US dollar will make imports of items from crude oil to electronic goods, overseas education and foreign travel costlier while raising fears that the inflation situation could worsen.

The primary and immediate impact of a depreciating rupee is on the importers who will have to shell out more for the same quantity and price. However, it is a boon for the exporters as they receive more rupees in exchange for dollars.

The rupee depreciation has wiped away some of the gains that would have accrued to India from international oil and fuel prices dropping to pre-Ukraine war levels.

India is 85 per cent dependent



on foreign oil to meet its needs for fuels, such as petrol, diesel and jet fuel. The basket of Indian imports includes crude oil, coal, plastic material, chemicals, electronic goods, vegetable oil, fertiliser, machinery, gold, pearls,

precious and semi-precious stones, and iron and steel

Mumbai: The country's foreign exchange reserves declined by a massive USD 8.062 billion to USD 580.252 billion in the week ended July 8, according to RBI data. In the previous week ended July 1, the reserves had dropped by USD 5.008 billion to USD 588.314 billion. During the reporting week ended July 8, the decrease in the reserves was on account of a fall in the Foreign Currency Assets (FCA), a major component of the overall reserves, and in the gold reserves, RBI said. FCA was down by USD 6.656 billion to USD 518.089 billion in the reporting week, according to the Reserve Bank of India's Weekly Statistical Supplement released Friday

Cuttack-Palasa Express extended up to Gunupur

Bhubaneswar, July 15: The East Coast Railway (ECoR) has decided to extend the services of Cuttack-Palasa-Cuttack Express (18443/18444) up to Gunupur.

The services, scheduled stations and timings of the trains between Cuttack and Palasa from both the directions will remain unchanged, said the ECoR.

The Cuttack-Gunupur Express (18443), originating from Cuttack, will run up to Gunupur from July 20. The train will leave Palasa at 2225hrs (10.25 pm) and arrive at Gunupur at 0145hrs (1.45 am).



In the return direction, Gunupur Cuttack Express (18444) is scheduled to begin its journey from Gunupur at 0245hrs (2.45 am) July 21. The train will arrive at Palasa at 0555hrs (5.55 am), ECoR sources said.

40-year-old woman kills self, shocked hubby drinks acid

Bhubaneswar. July 15: A suspected feud between a couple in Laxmisagar area here, Friday, reportedly prompted the 40-year-old woman to hang herself to death and her husband to drink acid in an attempt to end his life.

Delhi man held in fake loan app case

Bhubaneswar, July 15: The Economic Offences Wing (EOW) of the state Crime Branch has arrested one of the directors of a company for running an illegal digital loan application, an official said Friday.

The official said they have arrested Nitin Mallik, one of the directors of Good Start Business Services Private Limited, from Hari Nagar police limits in New Delhi July 13 on the basis of a complaint filed by Sakti Prasad Dash of Bhubaneswar regarding harassment by recovery agents of 'Kredit Gold'. a digital loan app, run by Mallik's firm.

"Soon after the arrest, Mallik as produced before a local court

On July 2 this year, Dash approached the EOW which registered a case (13) under Sections 294, 384, 420, 467, 468, 471 and 120B of the IPC and Section 66D of the IT Act 2000.

The EOW official said that following investigation, it was learnt that the recovery calls to Dash were made from numbers belonging to M/s Good Start Business Services Private Limited running 'Kredit Gold'. The company is not registered with RBI as a NBFC.

"Mallik was working at the behest of a Chinese group that is running at least 10 such illegal instant loan applications in India. 'Kredit Gold' has more than one lakh downloads. Lakhs of gullible people across the country have been victimised by the fake app.

'The initiative was crucial for the BMC as more than half the corporators are first timers and have very limited knowledge about the functioning of an important ULB like Bhubaneswar. 

No Room for Laggards

Vaking its cue from the Centre's order on premature retirement, the Finance Department of the Delhi government has ordered all department heads to conduct periodical reviews of account cadre officers, especially those nearing retirement and who have been found to be performing below par. Sources have informed DKB that the aim is to identify such babus and retire them from service.

All, including Delhi Lt Gov Vinai Kumar Saxena, are reportedly on board with the plan. In fact, sources say, Saxena has taken a serious note of the issue and is keen on the government conducting periodical reviews of all officers working in the Delhi government. He apparently wants this undertaken on a priority basis to weed out the laggards and stragglers who are holding up the system.

The Finance Department's order directs all heads of departments to submit reports of account cadre officers, deputy controller of accounts, senior accountants, account officers and assistant accountant officers who are covered under the DoPT's premature retirement rules. A review committee will study the reports and recommend appropriate action.

However, there are no reports yet of how the babus who are likely to be affected by this decision have reacted. Will they resist the move? Watch this space for updates.

G-20 role is Kant's tallest challenge

India's G-20 team just got more powerful with Amitabh Kant, former CEO of Niti Aayog, named as its new Sherpa. He replaces Union Minister Piyush Goyal, who has stepped down citing "work overload". Kant's new assignment came as a surprise to many even though no one expected him to simply fade away into the sunset after his six years as the CEO of Niti Aayog. A gubernatorial stint was hinted at, but the government clearly had a better plan for Kant!

Still, it was a timely move, coming just as India is set to assume the presidency of the G-20 later this year, and is prepping to host the G-20 meet next

year. Kant now joins former Foreign Secretary Shringla, who is India's chief G20 coordinator. Given the high stakes, Kant was a shoo-in since India needs a full-time Sherpa for G20 since Goyal has his plate full, with his various ministerial and par liamentary responsibilities.



As a long-time policy maven of the NDA government, and later at the Niti Aayog, this is Kant's moment to shine on the international stage. The combo of IAS (Kant) and IFS (Shringla) will be useful at the strategic forum during discussions on efforts to aid global recovery. As the Sherpa, Kant will need to devote a lot of time to numerous meetings that will be held in different parts of the country and abroad. So, Kant's best moment may be yet to come.

High-speed rail MD terminated

In a sudden move, the Centre has terminated the services of Satish Agnihotri, the MD of National High-Speed Rail Corporation Limited and gave the additional charge of MD to Rajendra Prasad, the present Director, Projects, of the corporation. The company is implementing the NDA government's prestigious bullet train project.

However, those in the know of the development have informed DKB that Agnihotri was under a cloud. Though the government has not given any reason for Agnihotri's termination, it is believed that due to serious allegations of corruption against the rail babu, his position as MD had become untenable.

Curiously, his appointment as MD of the corporation was as dramatic as his ouster now. In 2018 Agnihotri, an Indian Railway Service (IRS) officer of the 1982 batch, was brought back from retirement to head NHSRCL by the government. At the time it was said that Agnihotri did not fit the advertised age criteria for the post, yet he was appointed over other eligible candidates.

The fall has certainly been swift. But the bullet train project is a prestige project for the Modi sarkar and it should have been obvious that it will not brook any criticism on account of those who were charged with its successful completion.

hen faced with a major threat, people have usually turned to religion or government for help. Today, the climate crisis is accelerating, part of Europe is at war, the United States is deeply polarized and beset by rising gun violence, COVID-19 is still with us, and developed economies are facing the prospect of a stagflationary recession. But while millions of people around the world are suffering economically and emotionally, religion has largely lost its moral authority and practical influence, and many governments are either hamstrung or controlled by autocrats.

The private sector cannot solve all these problems by itself, of course. But might the world at least be a better place if firms and investors consistently adhered to environmental, social, and governance criteria?

Not so fast, say some. The idea that business has an obligation to report on and discuss ESG metrics with the same rigor that it currently applies to its financial results is controversial. Some politicians have sought to make ESG considerations a partisan issue. Big investors claim that a surfeit of prescriptive ESG proposals in this year's proxy season of annual shareholder meetings shows that the sustainable-investment movement has gone too far. Tesla CEO Elon Musk recently tweeted his opposition to the concept after the electric car manufacturer was removed from the S&P 500 ESG Index.

Nonetheless, capital can still be a critical lever for positive global change – but perhaps not in the way one might think. It is the capital flowing through the world's private markets - not public stock exchanges-that can play the key role in taking ESG mainstream. After all, globally, nine out of ten people employed in the corporate sector work for a private firm. And for every publicly traded company, there are 200 private firms. Private businesses form the heart of capitalism. And the main artery

through which the most important firms obtain resources to grow is private markets - and particularly private equity.

To be sure, private equity has traditionally not been the first thing people think of when discussing how to improve the world. But though this industry has been around in its current form only since the 1980s, today it manages more than \$9 trillion of assets and owns many of the companies we depend on for daily life. Moreover, it is about to undergo an epochal shift, as the founders of many leading private-equity firms retire and a younger generation takes the reins.

This cohort, now in their thirties and forties, is well aware of the failures of Gordon Gekko-inspired, baby-boomer investors and of the limitations of Milton Friedman's view that business leaders' only social responsibility is to maximize shareholder value. The new wave of private-equity leaders fundamentally believe that capitalism can produce shared and durable prosperity. They think that generating good financial returns requires recognizing that sustainability, the environment, and the dignity of workers are core to building enduring enterprises. Underscoring this view is the ideal of purpose: the belief that successful organizations create a mutually positive dynamic between their owners, employees, customers, and suppliers, and the communities in which they operate.

In this environment of multidimensional returns, it is essential to develop key non-financial yet material metrics and establish benchmarks and standards of performance. The management guru Peter Drucker probably never said, "If you can't measure it, you can't manage it." But that doesn't make it any less true.

The choice of which ESG metrics to measure may vary, depending on the region, industry, company size, and owners' goals. But this is no reason to give up on establishing standards. There are many important indicators that every business can regularly meas ure in order to make good on talk about doing the right thing.

For example, all companies should track their freshwater use, waste generation, and direct and indirect emissions, and monitor whether any of their activities are causing soil sealing. Other key metrics include the diversity of the management team and the board of directors, employee at

trition, work-related injuries, and data breaches.

There is no one-size-fits-all approach to capturing ESG data, but there is a minimum that does fit all. We applaud the work of the ESG Data Convergence Initiative to develop baseline reporting metrics as well as efforts by the International Sustainability Standards Board to update and globalize industry-based standards.

This information needs to be tracked now. Globally, there are over 8,000 private market investment firms, and the vast majority have not yet embraced ESG criteria. That needs to change, Regulators will soon demand it, as rules and standards such as the Sustainable Finance Disclosure Regulation and those recommended by the Task Force on Climate-Related Financial Disclosures come into effect. Investors will demand it, too - and already are, as the significant rise in the number of climate-related proposals in this year's proxy season shows. And society needs investors to pay greater attention to ESG factors in the face of heightened social tensions and unprecedented environmental instability. Put simply, we must move from "trust me" to "show me."

Almost 90 years ago in the US. Congress created the Securities and Exchange Commission, and the accounting industry established Generally Accepted Accounting Principles. Businesses whose financial disclosures had been uneven and spotty began reporting regularly and transparently. In turn, capital markets were bolstered by broader investor participation and the advent of shareholder democracy.

We now need to do the same for ESG reporting and stakeholder democracy. And a new generation of private-market players can lead the way.

his term has been around for several years (the earliest examples I can find are from 1999), but has mostly been used by specialists up till now. It has gained a higher profile in the past year or so and has been in the news because the first International Symposium on Agroterrorism was held earlier this month. Agroterrorism is the deliberate introduction of a plant or animal disease that disrupts agriculture and so causes widespread economic loss along with fear and instability. The risk is potentially high in the USA, which is a major agricultural country with huge exports, so that the effect of a terrorist attack might be felt well beyond its own borders. As yet, no successful attack by agroterrorists anywhere in the world is known to have happened. Threats in New Zealand to spread foot-and-mouth disease have been blackmail by individuals, not terrorism. Known cases of food contamination in various countries, or of threats to contaminate food, have also proved to be the work of would-be blackmailers or disgruntled employees.

Yaffle

affle is a local or dialect English name for the green woodpecker. Readers familiar with the cult BBC children's television series Bagpuss will know of Professor Yaffle, who is indeed a woodpecker. What brought it to mind was spotting one of these handsome birds in my garden, assiduously searching the edge of the lawn for ants. On the rare occasions one sees rather than hears a green woodpecker - with its green back, yellow rump and a crimson head that flashes in the sunlight as it turns its long bill - it seems too exotic to be a native British bird. Mostly, the signal that one is nearby is its characteristic laughing call, which provoked this odd name for the bird. Other names for it, now rare, include rain bird (because its cry was said to bring wet weather), hickwall, wickwall, woodwall, and yuccle, though these have turned up in so many forms in various British dialects, such as eccle or ickwell, that their links are sometimes hard to detect. While we're sure vaffle is imitative (the word could at one time also refer to the yelp of a dog), the other names are much harder to pin down; the Oxford English Dictionary hazards a guess that they, too, might be imitative, but they're so old that they have been transformed out of recognition. It has a number of other senses, derived from various English dialect words. It can be a description of somebody who is eating greedily, which is known in this sense in Royal Navy slang. And in the Newfoundland dialect it refers to a handful. This is from another English dialect word, spelled yafful in the English Dialect Dictionary.

Europe got caught between the USA for its security and Russia for energy supply. The deficit in the European Union's foreign and defence policy got exposed in the wake of the Ukrainian war.

Ukraine is of course the biggest loser. It has become a pawn like Afghanistan between two big powers - USA and Russia. It has suffered heavy loss of men and material in addition to territory. Ukraine may not have had any other choice than fighting back for its independence, as the Russian forces marched in. But, the question is could it have avoided the war by refusing the Western overtures. That was not to be. Ukraine must fight to the finish or find a way to ceasefire and then cessation of the war

That said, let us explore the scope for New Delhi's intervention as a peace-broker which may catapult India to the world stage. New Delhi has conducted its international affairs on a platform of neutrality which was called ideologically and strategically, non-alignment. I have argued con-

No expert or leader can pre-dict when it ends. Since it is order. Both Germany and France India's neutrality has not paid off in any way, rather it has harmed India's interests. It could perhaps take two diplomatic steps – one, inward, and another to help resolve the Ukrainian crisis. New Delhi has to rethink its neutrality and make strategic partners. The obvious partner is the Western bloc for two reasons. One is to enhance its GDP to 10 trillion USD from under 3 trillion USD at present. In order to do so, New Delhi has to engage with G-7 economies. It should complete the FTA negotiations with the EU and Britain. Second reason for going to the West is to secure itself against Chinese incursion into Indian territory. Some experts are suggesting that Quad could be turned into a military alliance of sorts. India could nudge Quad into going down that road. On the contrary, New Delhi seems most reluctant of all in militarising Quad.

India's smart and strategic military alliances will secure her from Chinese threats and possible aggression, minimise the enormous military expenditure, and reduce her dependence on Russia. According to SIPRI estimate in International Arms Transfers (2021) factsheet, "India was the

11 per cent of total global arms import in the period". Is this military strategy sustainable or advisable for a developing country with a 2.7 trillion economy? Is it realistic to engage in an arms race with China, whose economy is around 14 trillion USD? The disarmament experts show that the cost of one fighter aircraft can run the primary schools of the entire country for 20 years and likewise, the cost of a submarine will run the old-age homes for a similar period. The estimate may not be exact but the principle holds.

This is the first time Rubaiya has been asked to appear in the case. She had been freed after five terrorists were released in exchange. Rubaiya, who stays in Tamil Nadu, is listed as a prosecution witness by the CBI, which took over investigations into the case in early 1990.

Rubaiya identified Malik, who was present in the court through video conferencing. ""This is the person and his name is Yasin Malik. He was the man who threatened me that he will drag me out of the minibus if I refused to follow their diktat," Rubaiya told the judge.

She later identified him again through the pictures that were exhibited in the court. The case had gone into virtual cold storage and was revived after Malik was picked up by the National Investigation Agency (NIA) in 2019 on charges of

terror funding. In January last year, the CBI, with help from special public prosecutors Monika Kohli and SK Bhat, framed charges against 10 people, including Malik, in the Rubaiya kidnapping case that turned out to be a turning

point in the Valley's volatile history. The release of the five JKLF members was seen as a morale booster for terror groups, which had started raising their heads at the time.

During the hearing, Rubaiya recorded her statement before the special judge and during the course she identified Malik. who was recently sentenced to life imprisonment in a terror funding case, and three others as her abductors.

Ahead of Rubaiya's statement, Malik had appeared in the same case on July 13 during which he asked the court for ensuring his physical appearance so that he could cross question the witnesses in the case or else he would sit on indefinite hunger strike in prison. Malik told the court that he was awaiting a response from the government till July 22 failing which he would start his indefinite hunger strike.

The JKLF chief is at present lodged in the high-security Tihar Jail after he was sentenced by a special NIA court in Delhi in May.

Assam, Arunachal CMs sign pact to end border dispute

Itanagar/Guwahati, July 15: Arunachal Pradesh Chief Minister Pema Khandu and his Assam counterpart Himanta Biswa Sarma Friday inked a pact to end the decades-old border dispute between the two states, and they agreed in principle on restricting the number of contested villages to 86 instead of 123.

Chief Ministers of the two Northeastern neighbours announced in separate tweets that they met at Namsai in Arunachal Pradesh and signed the agreement."We have decided to restrict the 'disputed villages' to 86 instead of 123. Based on our present boundary, we'll try to resolve the rest by September 15, 2022," Sarma tweeted.

Of the 123 disputed villages, a consensus has been arrived on 37 and 86 others are left. According to the 'Namsai Declaration', Sarma and Khandu agreed that out of the 37 disputed villages, 28 which are within the constitutional boundary of Arunachal Pradesh shall remain with the state while, three villages on which claims were withdrawn by Arunachal Pradesh, will be with Assam.

Six other villages which could not be located on the Assam side would also remain with the frontier state if they exist in Arunachal Pradesh. the agreement stated. "Both states would constitute 12 Regional Committees each covering the 12 districts of Arunachal and counterpart districts of Assam for joint verification of 123 villages to make recommendations to respective State Governments," Khandu tweeted.

These regional committees would submit their first tranche of the report on the areas or any other areas where consensus has arrived, before September 15. "As and when the regional committees will conclude their deliberations and agreement is arrived at between the two governments, the draft MoU will be referred to the union government for its approval," the Namsai Declaration stated. The border dispute between the two states was seven-decade-old, but no earlier governments showed the political will to resolve it, Khandu said.

Kochi, July 15: A full emergency was declared at Kochi airport on Friday after an incident of hydraulic failure was reported from an inbound Air Arabia flight from Shariah, the Cochin International Airport Limited (CIAL) said. All passengers and crew were safe.

CIAL, in a communication sent to the media, said Air Arabia G9-426 which was supposed to land at 19:13 hrs here reported a hydraulic failure following which a full emergency was declared at the airport.

"Aircraft landed safely at runway 09 at 19:29 hrs," CIAL said, adding that only towing was required. The full emergency was withdrawn at 2022 hrs. Meanwhile, CIAL MD, S Suhas, said a concerted effort and timely coordination helped CIAL to see through the airport emergency situation. "Though such a situation occurred after a long period, it was proved that the safety systems worked effectively. We could resume the operations in 45 minutes," Suhas said.

PRESS TRUST OF INDIA New Delhi, July 15: If children can go to school at seven in the morning, why cannot judges and lawyers start their day at 9 am, Supreme Court judge Justice UU Lalit re-

marked Friday. A bench of Justices Lalit, S Ravindra Bhat and Sudhanshu Dhulia on Friday started Friday's work at 9.30 am, an hour earlier than the usual working hour of the apex court.

Justice Lalit, who is next in line to become the Chief Justice of India, said, "In my view, ideally we should sit at 9 in the morning. I have always said that if our children can go to school at 7 in the morning, then why can't we come at 9 am". The remark came after senior advocate Mukul Rohatgi, appearing in one of the bail matters, lauded the bench at the end of the hearing of the case for sitting earlier than the usual time

He said, "I must say that this

time of 9.30 am is a more proper time to start the courts". Justice Lalit said if the courts can start early, it can finish the day's work early and judges would get more time in the evening to read the case files for the next day.

"The courts can start their work at 9 am and rise at 11.30 am for a half an hour break and then finish the day's work by 2 pm. By doing this, judges will get more time to do more things in the evening", Justice Lalit said, adding this arrangement could work when there are only fresh matters and cases that don't require lengthy hearings. Rohatgi said hopefully these arrangements could be seen more by the end of August. To this, Justice Lalit said, "This is just a capsule". The judges of the Supreme Court hear cases from 10:30 am to 4 pm on weekdays. Chief Justice of India NV Ramana is set to retire on August 26 and Justice Lalit will take over charge from him and remain in office till November 8, this year.

New Delhi, July 15: The Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Madras retained the top spot among institutes in the country for the fourth consecutive year whereas the Indian Institute of Science (IISc) Bengaluru was the best university and re-

search institution, according to the Ministry of Education's National Institutional Ranking Framework rankings.

The seventh edition of NIRF rankings was announced Friday by Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan. Seven Indian Institutes of Technology (IITs) -- IIT Madras, IIT Bombay, IIT Delhi, IIT Kanpur, IIT Kharagpur, IIT Roorkee and IIT Guwahati-figured in the top 10 in the overall rankings

The All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) and Jawaharlal Nehru University were ranked ninth and tenth in the overall rankings. In the universities category, IISc Bengaluru bagged the top spot followed by JNU and Jamia Millia Islamia at second and third rank. The BHU, which was ranked



third last year in the category, slipped to the sixth position this year. Jadavpur University, Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham, Manipal Academy of Higher Education, Calcutta University, Vellore Institute of Technology and University of Hyderabad bagged the subsequent positions in the universities category. Eight IITs -- Madras, Delhi, Bombay, Kanpur, Kharagpur, Roorkee, Guwahati and Hyderabad

-- have figured among the top ten ranks in the engineering institutions category. The National Institute of Technology (NIT) Tiruchirapalli - which was ranked ninth last year - has bagged the eighth spot this year while NIT Surathkal has retained its 10th position.

Among colleges, Miranda House retained its spot as the best college in the country followed by Hindu College which has improved its rank to make it to the second spot from the ninth position last year. Lady Sri Ram College for Women slipped to fifth rank from the second spot last year while Presidency College, Chennai climbed to the third spot from the seventh position. Loyola College in Chennai has slipped to the fourth spot from third rank.

Delhi University's noted colleges St. Stephens and SRCC, which

Flood alert issued in Coimbatore dist

Chennai, July 15: The Coimbatore district administration has issued flood alerts following heavy rain. Water flow in the Bhavani, Noyyal, and Amaravathi rivers has increased due to incessant rain and heavy South West Monsoon lashing the areas.

The heavy rainfall at the catchment areas of reservoirs have increased the water flow in major reservoirs with inflow to Pillur reservoir increasing to 12,000 cusecs Thursday and the storage is 97.5 feet which are only 2.5 feet less than the maximum storage level of the reservoir or Full reservoir level (FRL).

The water authority department released 26,000 cusec water into the Bhavani river to maintain the storage at a manageable level in Pillur reservoir and this is the first time this season that the storage level has touched the Full Reservoir Level (FRL) this season.

Traffic was disrupted between Singanallor- Vellalore road after the road was submerged following water from the Noyyal River gushing into the road following heavy rainfall.

With the catchment areas receiving heavy rain, the district administration has warned the local people about the rising water levels and a flood alert has been issued. Revenue and Disaster

Management Minister, KKSSR Ramachandran reviewed the situation to take preventive measures.

Ramachandran, along with Electricity Minister V Senthil Balaji, visited the Pilloor Dam near Mettupalayam, which was reaching its capacity level of 100 feet, necessitating the release of surplus water Normal life was affected in the hilly Nilgiris district too follow-

_____ ing incessant rains over the past few days, leading to minor land-

few days, leading to minor landslips among others, as the state government kept on standby various agencies to effectively handle any exigencies.

Two teams from the State Disaster Response Force with 160 personnel have been deputed to the district for possible rescue and relief work while the NDRF is on standby, Chief Minister M K Stalin said.

The Nilgiris administration has declared holiday to all schools in the district. Being a major tourist attraction, Udhagamandalam (Ooty) wore a deserted look, as no tourist activities were happening in the last 10 days, affecting the income of taxi drivers, businessmen and street vendors.

Almost all the 12 dams in the district are reaching their full capacity and rivers in Mayaru, Kallatti are brimming. Gudalur and Devala Avalanche witnessed unprecedented downpour. Cabbage, carrot and potato grown on 300 acres of farm land have been totally damaged.

In a statement in Chennai, Chief Minister Stalin said while Tamil Nadu has received 48 per cent excess rainfall during the period June 1-July 14 at 115 mm, Nilgiris received 664.9 mm. This was 125 per cent above normal, he said.

"As a precautionary measure, 105 people have been moved to relief camps and provided with food, safe drinking water and basic necessities," he said.

A three-member ministerial delegation, which includes local minister K Ramachandran, and Revenue Commissioner SK Prabakar have been deputed to the district to oversee the rescue and relief activities. Various multi-departmental zonal committees are also on standby with required equipment, including earthmovers.

Justice Sandesh bench, which took up the bail petition of the accused in PSI Recruitment Scandal Thursday stated, "In case of murder one person dies. Here, 50,000 candidates are put to difficulty. If every recruitment is made in the same fashion, do you want the court to sit quiet?"

The bench further stated that the scam "is a terrorism unleashed on the society". The remarks of the bench came after the counsel for the accused sought bail by maintaining that the scam is not a murder case. Public Prosecutor V S Hegde maintained that an officer of the

rank of Additional DGP has been ar-

rested and it shows the seriousness of the case. "The investigation might reach anywhere. ADGP Amrit Paul, two Deputy Superintendents and three PSI candidates have been arrested and thousands of call details need to be analysed," said Hegde.

"One month is needed to investigate the huge data of mobiles and other devices," Hegde added. He also informed the court that till date the ₹2.5 crore cash has been seized during the investigation. The court adjourned the hear-

Cong demands lie detector test of accused

Bangalore: Karnataka's opposition Congress Thursday demanded a lie detector test (polygraph test) for government officers arrested in connection with the Police Sub-Inspector recruitment scandal.

The CID has arrested senior IPS officer and ADGP Amrit Paul in connection with the scandal, along with many other police officers, ranking from Sub-Inspector to Deputy Superintendent of Police.

Leader of Opposition Siddaramaiah said that there is suspicion of involvement of many ministers and their associates, and clarity over the issue could only come if the accused officers are given lie detector tests.

He underlined that the diary written by arrested ADGP should also be investigated thoroughly. ing of the case to July 20. Earlier, Justice H P Sandesh took

the ruling BJP to task with regards to the appointments to the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB). After his rap, the ACB arrested Bangalore Urban DC on charges of corruption.

Chennai, July 15: The Madras High Court Friday gave major relief to Tamil superstar Vijay in a case related to his import of a luxury BMW car from the US, ruling that he would be liable to pay the penalty for delayed payment of entry tax only from January 29, 2019, to December 2021 and not from 2005.

A bench of Justice R Suresh Kumar said that Vijay was liable to pay an entry tax as a division bench of the court had, on January 29, 2019, held that the state government was



entitled to levy entry tax. The bench, however, said that the Commercial Taxes Department should not have demanded a huge

amount of ₹30.23 lakh towards penalty, by levying it since 2005 and that the fine may be levied from January 29, 2019. Vijay had approached the court in January 2022 and challenged a notice issued by Commercial Taxes Department September 17, 2021, asking him to pay ₹7.98 lakh as entry tax along with penalty of ₹30.23 lakh.

The advocate for the superstar said that he has already paid tax liability of ₹7.98 lakh in December 2021 and is challenging the penalty alone. He said he had then imported the BMW as there were no dealers for the luxury car in Chennai those days. The actor had also pleaded to the court to cancel the demand notice and the recovery notice.

Horticulture Ministers here. He said this fund will be disbursed as a loan to the interested people with "impressive proposals". Union Minister for State for Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Shobha Karandlaje said the loan will be given at a minimal interest rate of three per cent.

Tomar said the progress in the project is good as the States have agreed to utilise the fund.

During the two-day conference, the states were asked to work on a mission mode to popularise natural farming to improve soil health, the Minister said.

According to him, natural farming is taking place in four lakh hectare in the country, an area which has to be increased further.

Suspected gas leak in Chennai: TNPCB monitoring air quality

Chennai, July 15: The Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board (TNPCB) has commenced monitoring the air quality after residents complained of a pungent order suspected to be due to Sulphur Dioxide leak from Chennai Petroleum Corporation Limited (CPCL).

Residents of Tiruvottiyur and Manali in Chennai city have been complaining of a pungent smell for the past few days and several healthy people had complained of breathlessness. Residents living in an area of 2.3 kms of CPCL have complained of pungent smell and breathlessness, particularly during the morning and evening times. A senior officer with the TNPCB while speaking to IANS said, "We have received complaints from residents of Jyothi Nagar in Tiruvattiyor and in Manali areas. We are monitoring the air quality for the next 24 hours and will find out what exactly has happened."

The officer also said that a few days ago CPCL had imported Sulphur dioxide from Russia with high sulphur content and the PCB has directed CPCL not to further import that particular variety of crude oil. CPCL officials, however, denied

that there was any leak from the plant and a senior official told IANS that they are assisting the PCB officials in finding out the gas that has leaked. The official said, "If the leak was from our plant, our workers and officials would have felt it first."

The CPCL official also denied that there was no crude import with high sulphur content from Russia and that crude comes from Mumbai and the Middle East.

However, the PCB has directed the CPCL to install incinerators with Sulphur Recovery Units (SRUs). The pollution control board also directed CPCL that emission standards are complied with and to achieve Sulphur Recovery efficiency of 98.7 per cent at all times in compliance with the Union Environment Ministry notification of March 2008.

Woman willingly living with man can't file rape case if relation fails: SC

New Delhi, July 15: The Supreme Court has held that a woman, who was in a relationship with a man and willingly staying with him, cannot file a case of rape, after the relationship had gone sour. It ordered release of the appel-

lant on bail to the satisfaction of the competent authority. A bench of Justices Hemant Gupta and Vikram Nath noted the admitted case of the complainant that she was in a relationship with the appellant for a period of four years. Also, the complaint's counsel admitted that

she was 21 years old, when the relationship started.

"In view of the said fact, the complainant has willingly been staying with the appellant and had the relationship. Therefore, now if the relationship is not working out, the same cannot be a ground for lodging an FIR for the offence under Section 376(2)(n) IPC," said the bench.

Ansaar Mohammad had moved the top court challenging the Rajasthan High Court's May 19 order, which dismissed an application for pre-arrest bail under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal



Procedure, 1973 for the offences under Sections 376(2)(n), 377 and 506 IPC.

The top court granted anticipatory bail to Mohammad who was accused of rape, unnatural offences, and criminal intimidation. "Consequently, we allow the present appeal and set aside the order of the High Court. The appellant is ordered to be released on bail to the satisfaction of the competent authority," it said.

However, the bench clarified that the observations in the present order are only for the purposes of deciding the pre-arrest bail application. "The investigation shall proceed uninfluenced by the observations made in the present order. Pending application(s), if any, also stand disposed of," said the bench.

The high court had said: "It is an admitted position that petitioner had made the relation with the complainant by promising to marry her and due to their relation, one female child was born. So, looking at the gravity of offence, I do not consider it a fit case to enlarge the petitioners on anticipatory bail. Hence, the anticipatory bail application is dismissed."

But I mean, we were living together. She (Bezuidenhout) stayed here for about 18 months after Rushi was born," Musk's father was quoted as saying. This is the first expansion of the SCO after India and Pakistan were admitted to the grouping in 2017.

New Delhi, July 15: Finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman Friday asked World Trade Organisation (WTO) to allow India to export foodgrains from its public stockholding to nations which are facing food crisis.

She was speaking at a seminar on 'Strengthening global collaboration for tackling food insecurity on sidelines of the third G20 **Finance Ministers and Central** Bank Governors (FMCBG) meeting in Bali, Indonesia.

As per WTO norms, countries are not allowed to export foodgrains from their public stock holdings as they are procured at subsidised rates.

"WTO restriction that grains so procured cannot be brought to the market to export. It is a condition which exists from the Uruguay Round days. We have repeatedly said that (surplus) than what we have

for our small farmers...We are quite willing to trade," Sitharaman said.

She said that India can help in reducing hunger or food insecurity but there is a hesitation on the part of WTO.

A group of about 70-80 countries, led by Singapore, is pushing member countries of the WTO to accept binding commitments of not extending export restrictions on the foodgrains procured under the United Nations World Food Programme (WFP).

Some members, however, have voiced concerns regarding a blanket exemption for WFP food pur-

States' capex seen soaring 36% in FY23, fiscal deficit at ₹8.4trn: Icra

Mumbai, July 15: States have budgeted 36 per cent higher capital expenditure during this financial year, which may lead to a sharp rise in their fiscal deficit to ₹8.4 lakh crore, a report said Friday.

(FY20) levels, 26 large states, excluding Assam, have spent ₹5 lakh crore in capital expenditure, or ₹1.3 lakh crore more than they had spent in FY20, shows an Icra analysis of these states' budgets. According to the agency, these 26 states are on course to spend ₹6.8 lakh crore or 35.8 per cent more this

fiscal in capital expenditure (capex) over FY22 when it stood at ₹5 lakh crore. As much as 72 per cent of the incremental ₹1.8 lakh crore capital push is led by UP, Maharashtra, Bengal, Odisha, Andhra and

In the previous fiscal, the capex push was led by Bihar, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Telangana, Tamil Nadu and Uttar Pradesh.

The combined capex of these $26\,$ states is budgeted to expand by an impressive 35.8 per cent to ₹6.8 lakh crore in FY23, on top of the 34.1 per cent or ₹5 lakh crore they spent in FY22. In FY20, they spent ₹3.7 lakh crore in capex, while FY21 was a washout due to the



pandemic, the agency said.

The report also notes that with this aggressive capex push, these states will also see their fiscal deficits widening sharply to ₹8.4 lakh crore in FY23, from ₹6.3 lakh crore in FY22, and much higher than ₹4.8 lakh crore in FY20. However, deficit was higher in

FY21 at ₹7.9 lakh crore due the higher pandemic expenses and

In FY22 these states had much narrower revenue and fiscal deficits. While revenue deficit was similar to the pre-Covid level, fiscal deficit exceeded the FY20 level on account of higher capex.



Basel (Switzerland), July 15: Has Roger Federer finally made up his mind about his career and calling it quits. Well his recent comments to Dutch newspaper 'Algemeen Dagblad' certainly hints that 'retirement' is on his mind as he now enjoys 'little things' that he never did in the past.

The Swiss tennis ace last played a competitive match at Wimbledon last year. He lost in straight sets to Hubert Hurkacz in the quarterfinals. The 40-year-old then had his third knee surgery in 18 months and has been recuperating since. This year he gave Wimbledon a miss and since then there has been lot of talk as to whether Federer will ever be seen playing a competitive match again.

Adding more fuel to the speculations of his retirement, Federer has said that he doesn't 'need the tennis' anymore.

Toronto, July 15: The 23-time Grand Slam champion Serena Williams is set to play in the National Bank Open tennis tournament August 8-14 in this city. People close to player said that she will play the tournament to prepare for the last Grand Slam of the year, the US Open.

This will be Serena's first hard court tournament in two years after she made her return to tennis at the end of June by playing doubles in the Eastbourne tournament on grass ahead of Wimbledon. She then played singles at Wimbledon, losing in the first round to France's Harmony Tan in a close three-set match. Serena is using her protected ranking to enter the tournament here.

Serena is a three-time champion here and last played in 2019, where she made the final but lost to Bianca Andreescu. The Canadian was also granted a wild card into this year's main draw.



Serena hasn't officially announced whether she is playing at the US Open, but it looks like she's attempting to continue her comeback at the Grand Slam. Led by World No 1 Iga Swiatek, the tournament here will feature 41 of the top 43 ranked players.

"I have made up my mind more 🔌 or less to play in Toronto. I don't know yet whether I will play in the US Open. I will take it match by match and see where my fitness stands," Serena was quoted as saying by the tournament's website. "I-(still feel that I have some tennis left in me," she added.
