





Naveen most popular CM again: India Today poll

New Delhi, August 14: Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik has been named as the most popular Chief Minister in home state in the 'Mood of the Nation' poll by *India Today*.

The poll ranked Patnaik as the most popular CM in home state with 78 per cent respondents being satisfied with his performance. Significantly, respondents in every state were asked to rate their CMs.

Assam CM Himant Biswa Sarma stood at the second position with 63 per cent while Tamil Nadu CM MK Stalin secured the third position with 61 per cent.

In Odisha, 78.1 per cent of 4,564 respondents said they were satisfied with Patnaik's performance. Six months ago, in January 2022, 71 per cent respondents had expressed satisfaction with Patnaik's performance. Patnaik is the longest serving CM of Odisha. He has remained unchallenged in his home state for over two decades.

In the national perspective, Prime Minister Narendra Modi remains the country's most popular leader with 53 per cent people preferring him to be their PM. Only 9 per cent favour Congress leader Rahul Gandhi and 7 per cent favour AAP national convener Arvind Kejriwal.

Earlier, Patnaik was ranked the most popular CM in January 2021 with 51 per cent of respondents from Odisha giving him positive ratings.

Big Bull dies

Mumbai: Ace stock market investor Rakesh Jhunjhunwala died here Sunday morning. He was 62. Jhunjhunwala passed away due to a cardiac arrest, a source in his newly set up airline said. A selfmade trader, investor and businessman, he was also known



as the 'Big Bull' of Dalal Street. With an estimated net worth of around USD 5.8 billion (about Rs 46,000 crore), Jhunjhunwala

was the 36th richest billionaire in India, according to Forbes' 2021 listing. Son of an income tax officer, he is survived by his wife and three children.

State braces for 'medium flood'

Bhubaneswar, August 14: Odisha, which has been pummelled by heavy rainfall over the past week, is bracing for a 'medium flood' in the Mahanadi river system with the formation of another depression over the Bay of Bengal, the Meteorological Centre in Bhubaneswar said Sunday.

A well-marked low pressure system that intensified into a depression over the northwest Bay of Bengal has crossed the coast near Digha in West Bengal between 10.30-11.30 am, triggering heavy-to-very-heavy rain in many coastal, northern and southern regions of Odisha.

The weather system, which lies about 70 km northeast of Balasore, is moving northwestwards and is set to maintain its intensity for the next 24 hours, the meteorological centre said. As the intensity of rain has increased in parts of the state, including the upper catchment area of Mahanadi, the state government is anticipating a 'medium flood' this time, said Special Relief Commissioner (SRC) PK Jena.

Mahanadi system," the SRC said, adding that people have nothing to panic for now as the administration had handled a similar situation in August, 2019.

Jena said as much as 9.5 lakh cusecs of water were currently passing near Khairmal, downstream of Mahanadi, and that would require 24 hours to reach Mundali.

Therefore, we expect peak flood in Mahanadi by Monday evening when above 10 lakh cusecs of water will pass," the SRC said, adding that district authorities have been asked to evacuate people from lowlying areas. Jena, who reviewed the situation, said 22 rescue teams comprising the NDRF, ODARF and Fire Service personnel, have been sent to Puri, Khurda, Kendrapara, Jagatsinghpur and Cuttack, as these places were likely to be more affected due to the possible flood. Reports said that several notices have been issued in past inviting both the states to attend a meeting on the issue but Chhattisgarh has never shown any interest to attend the meeting despite Odisha being always ready for such a meeting. The last meeting between the two states concerning the issue was held in 2019. Later, a high level committee representing both the state governments was convened April 13, 2022 at Ashok Niwas in Burla. The CWC had notified both the state governments informing them about the date, time and venue of the meeting.

However, the Chhattisgarh government again played truant and expressed its unavailability for the meet on the scheduled date following which the meeting was cancelled. It is customary for both the states to attend a meeting on water management before the arrival of monsoon but the meeting has not been held for the last three years due to lack of cooperation from the Chhattisgarh government.

The development comes close

ing around 34 gates to discharge floodwaters. The floodwater discharge has been necessitated due to incessant rain in last couple of days in upstream of Chhattisgarh that has led to a medium flood in Mahanadi river system.

This has led to an increase in water level in downstream and the peak floodwater is expected to pass through Mundali barrage in Cuttack by Monday evening. Left with no other options, the water resources officials of Chhattisgarh have requested the Hirakud dam authorities to open more gates for discharge of floodwaters. Meanwhile, the CWC has again sent a letter to both state governments inviting them to attend meeting on the issue, August 22. It is now to be seen whether the Chhattisgarh government attends the meeting or again plays truant like before, reports added.

Information literacy key to curb the spread of disinformation

onald Trump derided any critical news coverage as 'fake news" and his unwillingness to concede the 2020 presidential election eventually led to the January 6, 2021 riot at the US Capitol.

These are in no way isolated efforts to flood the world's media with dishonest information or malicious content. Governments, organisations and individuals are spreading disinformation for profit or to gain a strategic advantage.

But why is there so much disinformation? And what can we do to protect ourselves?

Three schools of thought have emerged to address this issue. The first suggests disinformation is so pervasive because distrust of traditional sources of authority including the news media, keeps increasing. When people think the mainstream media is not holding industries and governments to account, they may be more likely to accept information that challenges conventional beliefs.

Secondly, social media platforms' focus on engagement often leads them to promote shocking claims that generate outrage, regardless of whether these claims are true. Indeed studies show false information on social media spreads further, faster and deeper than true information, because it is more novel and surprising.

Lastly, the role of hostile and deliberate disinformation tactics cannot be overlooked. Facebook estimates that during the 2016 US election, malicious content from the Russian Internet Research Agency aimed at creating division within the American voting public reached 126 million people in the US and worldwide.

This crisis of information is usually framed in terms of the diffusion of false information either intentionally (disinformation) or unwittingly (misinformation). However this approach misses significant forms of propaganda, including techniques honed during the Cold War.

Most Russian influence efforts on Twitter did not involve communicating content that was "demonstrably false". Instead, subtle, subversive examples of propaganda were common and unre-



lenting, including calling for the re-

moval of American officials. So how have various entities ad dressed both mis- and disinformation? The Alex Jones jury case and verdict is one example of how societies can counter disinformation. Being hauled into court and forced by a jury of your peers to shell out \$49 million in damages would cause most people to verify what they're saying before they say it.

Governments and corporations have also taken significant steps to mitigate disinformation. In the wake of the 2022 Russian invasion

of Ukraine, the EU ceased retransmitting Russia Today, the well-known Russian state-controlled television network, and it is now no longer available in Europe or in Africa.

The EUvsDisinfo project has countered Russian propaganda and addressed "the Russian Federation's ongoing disinformation campaigns affecting the European Union, its Member States, and countries in the shared neighbourhood" since 2015. In 2022 Google followed suit, launching its Russia-Ukraine ConflictMisinfo Dashboard

which lists dubious claims related to the invasion and fact-checks their veracity.

Ordinary citizens have several avenues to counter disinformation as well. Information literacy is typically framed as an individual responsibility, but Swedish scholars Jutta Haider and Olof Sundin point out that "a shared sense of truth requires societal trust, especially institutional trust, at least as an anticipated ideal". How can we recreate a common sense of truth? Wikipedia - the freely accessible online encyclopedia where knowledge is collectively produced - is a good place to start.

Wikipedia has community-en-

forced policies on neutrality and verifiability. Anyone can edit a Wikipedia page, but countless administrators, users and automated type-setting "bots" ensure these edits are as correct as possible. Modifications and disputes about article content are archived on the website and visible to all: the edi-

Nabarangpur, August 14: Residents of three tribal villages in the district here Sunday alleged that their farmland and huts were set on fire by members of a forest protection group engaged by the state government.

During the day, the tribal people of Kapsabhata, Sariabhata

Laktipokhona villages under the banner of 'Rashtriya Kissan Mazdoor Mahasangha' staged a protest near the district magistrate's office

They lodged a complaint at the Umerkote police station, alleging that Vana Surakshya Samiti (VSS) members had Saturday evening destroyed their crops and shelters near the fields, a senior officer said. Notably, the state government engages volunteers to protect forests and promote conservation practices.

The tribal people also claimed that the forest protection group members along with over 1,000 people, including women, from nearby villages, set their maize crops and huts on fire. The incident took place inside the reserve forest in Buria gram panchayat under the Umerkote block of the district, the officer said.

"A scuffle broke out between the people belonging to Kondh tribe and the forest protection group members who mostly hail

from Kusamguda, Sirliguda, Bamandeibhata, Sirliguda, Palbeda, Kasarbhata and Chichiniguda villages. It is a long-standing dispute. VSS alleges that the tribals have been cultivating maize by encroaching forest land," a district official said.



We shall refrain from mentioning here the costs involved, that the taxpayer has to bear, for these fun and frolic of the few 'chosen' people. In a turbulent India where the economy is fast degrading and disparities between the rich and the poor vastly growing, this kind of a slogan in Hindi may seem lame to many sane Indians unfazed by political rhetoric. The young boy's only crime was that he was thirsty and wanted to drink some water. The beating by the teacher was so severe that the child was initially hospitalized



locally but was later moved to a larger hospital in Ahmedabad where he succumbed Saturday, 13 August. The teacher, Chail Singh, should not be considered as an individual with a mental aberration. Singh represents the general and widespread bitter casteist mindset that plagues most of India. That mindset also gave him the courage to get extremely infuriated and cruel enough to kill the child. This is also not an isolated case that demands strong police action. Every Indian is aware that such incidents along with torture, humiliation and bad behavior towards lower caste citizens, especially women and children, is commonplace and seems to be totally acceptable currently, so much so that most of them go unreported.

Flying the tricolor flag has been made into a great issue lately. The political overtones of such clarion calls to demonstrate publicly one's nationalism may be welcome if only it helps in creating a cohesive and equal society. Independence from the foreign rulers was but only a physical act. Whether a government acknowledges the contributions of a certain prominent freedom fighter after the goal had been attained is barely of any consequence. What matters is NOW. The India of today may or may not acknowledge verifiable facts of history. It is easier for Indians to do so since most of our history has been verbal, thanks to the upper caste Hindoos who believed in keeping their knowledge strictly confidential and not document it for fear of losing the upper hand. In spite of this, history is not only what was. History is being created every moment now. When we gloss over the death of Indra Meghwal thinking he was a poor unfortunate downtrodden boy totally unrelated to our existence, we must not forget these events are stark reminders that this country is far from being independent.

Whiffler

Students of Shakespeare will know of whifflers from Henry V: The deepmouth'd Sea, Which like a mighty Whiffler 'fore the King, Seems to prepare his way. Whifflers went in front of a procession to clear spectators from its path. In early times, they would have been men-at-arms, wielding their customary weapons such as javelins or swords to keep back the mob. By the time of Shakespeare, they had taken on a formalised role and by the next century had degenerated into being merely part of the ritual of events such as civic parades. They survived until the middle of the nineteenth century in the procession of the London craft guilds to the Guildhall banquet on Lord Mayor's Day, in which young freemen called bachelor whifflers carried flags to lead each guild. They lived on to about the same date in Norwich: In that of the Corporation of Norwich from the Guild-hall to the Cathedral Church, on the Guild-day, the whifflers are two active men very lightly equipped . bearing swords of lath or latten, which they keep in perpetual motion, "whiffing" the air on either side, and now and then giving an unlucky boy a slap on the shoulders or posteriors with the flat side of their weapons -- The Vocabulary of East Anglia, by Robert Forby, 1830. In an entry written a century ago, the Oxford English Dictionary finds the word's origin in the Old English wifle for a spear or battleaxe. But as whiffle also referred to the wind when it blew in puffs or slight gusts, or veered or shifted about (it became a figurative way to describe a shifty or evasive person), it would be as reasonable to assume that it referred to the continual waving of their weapons to encourage hangers-on to stand back. Whifflers in action would certainly have raised a constant whiffle of wind, as Robert Forby implied with his use of whiff, to blow lightly (this last word is also the source of the word in the sense of a brief or faint smell, as in "a whiff of perfume"). At the beginning of the twentieth century, Thomas Ratcliffe, a contributor to Notes and Queries, recalled this variation: The art of the whiffler-waffler is still known, though I have not seen the practice for a number of years. Whiffling waffling was common when I was a boy, and many boys could give very creditable exhibitions of the art. ... Some men were great experts, making the stick twirl in the hands round and about all parts of the body round the head, behind the back, under the thigh, the whiffling-waffling being done as easily with the left as with the right hand. When the exhibition was put of doors the stick was sent whirling high, the performer dancing round a considerable circle before catching it at the right moment of its descent. We are irresistibly reminded of a drum-major with his mace leading a band in a parade or of an American baton-twirler. There certainly seemed to be a skill to whiffling, to judge from George Borrow, who lamented in The Romany Rye in 1857, "The last of the whifflers hanged himself about a fortnight ago ... from pure grief that there was no further demand for the exhibition of his art, there being no demand for whiffling since the discontinuance of Guildhall banguets." The modern drum-major may not have his genesis in the ancient passage-clearing art of the whiffler, but parallels persist.

omebody who was widdiful deserved to be hanged. The story behind It starts with the northern English and Scottish word widdy or widdie, local forms of the standard English withy, a flexible branch from a tree such as willow used to make baskets or to tie or fasten things together. One sense was of a band or rope made of intertwined withies. Later it came to mean a halter and in particular a hangman's rope. To cheat the widdy meant to escape hanging. By an obvious transfer the sense of gallows-bird grew up, one destined to fill a widdy.

CHINA'S LOSS, INDIA'S GAIN

GLOBAL FINANCIAL CRISIS, THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC, AND **RUSSIA'S INVASION OF UKRAINE HAVE DIMMED CHINA'S ECONOMIC PROSPECTS** WHILE **BRIGHTENING** INDIA'S

ver the past decade and a half, financial, health, and geopolitical shocks have pummeled world trade. The 2008 global financial crisis devastated the banks that financed much of the world's commerce, and then triggered a secular decline in economic growth. In 2020, the COVID-19 pandemic closed factories and upended global supply chains. And now Russia's invasion of Ukraine has disrupted food and energy supplies, threatening to divide the world along geopolitical lines.

Some argue that these three shocks might even lead to the death of globalisation. But the reality is likely to be more complex: The disruptions will probably transform the global trading system rather than shrink it, with the impact varying across countries. Significantly, China will probably lose, while India might even gain.

Starting in the early 1990s, developing countries advanced as a group for almost two decades, rapidly catching up to rich countries' standards of living. This convergence was facilitated by hyperglobalisation, whereby trade liberalisation and large declines in transport and communication costs swiftly increased opportunities for the developing world. China and India benefited enormously, leading to the largest reductions in poverty the world has ever seen.

This golden age ended with the 2008 global financial crisis. Since then, national growth trajectories have varied considerably. China's deceleration has been dramatic: After decades of double-digit annual expansion, GDP growth has now slowed to almost zero. But other countries such as India have continued to grow (apart from in pandemic-hit 2020), albeit less rapidly on average than before. Why the difference?

The global shocks have proved particularly damaging for China because they have come on top of an ongoing, secular loss of competitiveness, as labour migration from farms to factories has started to reach its limits, causing wages to rise. Johns Hopkins University's Shoumitro Chatterjee and one of us (Subramanian) estimated that

declining competitiveness has caused China to lose out on about \$150 billion worth of exports.

Moreover, the shocks themselves have had an asymmetric impact. After 2008, trade in goods stopped growing as a share of global GDP, while trade in services continued to rise. This affected China more severely, because it is a manufacturing powerhouse, whereas India is a competitive services trader. As a result, China's exports-to-GDP ratio decreased from its pre-2008 peak of 36% to 18.5% while India's declined by much less, from 25% to about 19%.

The long-term consequences of $% \left\{ 1\right\} =\left\{ 1$ the shocks could be very serious for China. For starters, the country has reached an inflection point in its development, where it needs to navigate the difficult transition from middle-income to upper-income status. When South Korea attained China's current level of development (a GDP per capita of roughly \$15,000 in purchasing-powerparity terms), its further transition required exports to surge by another 25 percentage points of GDP.

The prospect of China being able to replicate this seems remote, in large part because the world's political willingness to absorb Chinese exports has reached its limits. The COVID-19 shock has forced a reassessment of globalisation, with countries seeking to reduce their reliance on imports of critical goods such as pharmaceuticals.

Moreover, Russia's invasion of Ukraine has led to a broader geopolitical realignment, with the United States and its allies on one side and Russia and China on the other. This reordering comes on top of a longer-standing superpower rivalry between the US and China. The severe Western sanctions against Russia and the resulting weaponisation of interdependence have further sharpened the geopolitical divide.

Meanwhile, China's growth model is under huge stress. The real estate and construction boom that powered the economy's rapid expansion for decades has come to an end, leaving many leading developers close to bankruptcy. Demographic trends are far more adverse than the country's official population statistics indicate. And President Xi Jinping's embrace of state intervention is undermining entrepreneurship and economic dynamism – the domestic wellsprings of growth.

This will leave China more dependent on exports, just at a time when global demand is dimming. Consequently, the Chinese growth model may be in even more serious trouble than many believe.

But as China's prospects darken, those of other countries are brightening. For example, countries such as Vietnam, Bangladesh, and Indonesia have increased their exports at extraordinary rates. All have seized the opportunity created by the \$150 billion of manufacturing export space that China has vacated. At the same time, the global shocks have increased opportunities for services exporters. The COVID-19 pandemic has encouraged services firms to allow their staff to work from home But if workers for a Boston-based firm can log in from Boise, then why not from Bangalore? Indeed, services trade has boomed over the past few years, benefiting India.

Similarly, "friend-shoring" of production will boost countries perceived to be friendly to the West. A growing number of firms have exited Russia, and foreign capital is fleeing China, aggravated by Xi's domestic policies. At the same time, integration efforts among the US-led alliance are increasing, with India having resumed negotiations on free-trade agreements with the European Union and the United Kingdom.

But to gain from the globalisation shocks that have differentially favoured services and open, pluralistic democracies, India will need to change its policy direction. It will need to reverse its recent inward turn and become more open economically. At the same time, it needs to improve what we call the "software of economic and political policymaking," ensuring the rule of law even-handed treatment of all investors, robust domestic institutions, and social stability, all of which are critical for creating a favourable environment for sustained economic growth.

In sum, the three shocks to glob alisation have squeezed opportunities for China while enlarging them for India. Of course, China can overcome its challenges, just as India can seize the initiative. But in each case, success will require a reassessment of current domestic policies and governance.

A change amid JD-U's funds leap

he corporates know how best to invest and reap dividends. Long before a sleuth could know, the investments in JD-U's fortune were soaring. Yes, it is the party with donations of ₹160 crore in a short span, largest among regional parties for past some time. Its luck smiled long before it was known to change its alliance partner in Bihar this month and Nitish Kumar formed the government with RJD dumping the BJP. If the donations were in anticipation of the miracle, the donors must be complimented for their foresight and speculative capacity. Having been with the BJP, Nitish realises the importance of the purse in a volatile political situation. The JD-U received ₹60.15 crore, the

highest donation among 54 regional parties, in 2020-21 as per figures submitted to the Election Commission. It was followed by the DMK-₹33.99 crore and AAP-11.32 crore, the Indian Union Muslim League ₹4.16 crore, Telangana Rashtra Samithi ₹4.15 crore. Even the Samajwadi Party with ₹50.44 crore before the Uttar Pradesh elections in 2020-21 was a laggard.

With the maximum number of donations during FY 2020-21, JD(U) declared 58 donations from corporate/business sectors amounting to ₹60 crore, while 272 individual donors donated ₹90.60 lakh. In February 2022, JD-U Bihar president Umesh Kushwaha announced that during a fortnight of starting a fund-raising campaign, it received ₹100 crore as donation from, "leaders, supporters and workers, showing the popular ity of Chief Minister Nitish Kumar." He hoped at that time that by March the party would get ₹300 crore. This was not confirmed.

With regard to the total amount of donations, the Shiv Sena leads with ₹62.859 crore from 436 donations, followed by the AIADMK, which has declared receiving ₹52.17 crore from three donations.

In 2019-20, corporate/business donated ₹931.95 crore to national parties. The BJP had the highest with ₹720.4 crore. At ₹4847 crore, it has the highest assets among top seven parties. The Congress was a distant second, with ₹55.36 crore received from 151 corporate donors. In such a scenario, the JD-U has seemingly changed its tack. It has apparently introduced a regular levy system on its leaders, office-bearers and other workers. Even Deputy Chairman Rajya Sabha Harivansh Narayan Rai is regularly contributing to it. But it has never

Maharashtra cabinet: BJP takes the cake

Mumbai, August 14: Five days after the induction of 18 ministers into his cabinet. Maharashtra Chief Minister Eknath Shinde Sunday distributed portfolios, with the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) getting several key ministries, including the Home and Finance that will be handled by Deputy CM Devendra Fadnavis

Shinde kept Urban Development and 11 other ministries with himself. Shinde, whose rebellion against the Shiv Sena leadership had led to the collapse of the Uddhav Thackeray-led Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) government, had taken oath as the chief minister on June 30 with the support of the BJP. Fadnavis was sworn in as his deputy.

In addition to Home and Finance and Planning, Fadnavis will also handle Law and Judiciary, Water Resources, Housing, Energy and Protocol portfolios. Another important portfolio - the Revenue Department - has been given to BJP leader Radhakrishna Vikhe Patil who had quit the Congress a few months before the 2019 Assembly elections to join the saffron party.

Shinde had expanded his twomember ministry on Tuesday, 41 days after taking oath as the chief minister by inducting 18 minis-

ters - nine each from his rebel Shiv Sena group and the BJP. However. the list did not include any woman.

Apart from the Urban Development Department, CM Shinde has kept with himself General Administration Department, Public Works Department (public sector undertakings), Information and Public Relations, Transport, Marketing, Social Justice, Disaster Management, Relief and Rehabilitation, Soil and Water Conservation, Environment and Climate Change and Minority Development.

From the BJP's side Chandrakant Patil, Sudhir Mungantiwar, Girish Mahajan, Vijaykumar Gavit, Suresh Khade, Ravindra Chavan, Atul Save and Mangal Prabhat Lodha were inducted as ministers.

Mumbai, August 14: Stock market investments are always said to involve risks and people who made big fortunes often made headlines as scamsters, leading to Dalal Street always being looked at with suspicion, but Rakesh Jhunjhunwala was broadly an exception.

Jhunjhunwala, a partner at RARE Enterprises, who rose to amass a \$5.8 billion fortune and earn the tag of the country's biggest individual investor, leaves behind a relatively cleaner slate.

Unlike names like Harshad Mehta and Ketan Parekh, whose rise in fortunes in post-liberalised India was tainted with scam links, the newest 'Big Bull' in the more-regulated market had lesser baggage

on this front. Jhunjhunwala was unabashed about wealth creation and strutted his connections flamboyantly, a sign of the shift to a market-based economy in early 1990s

It was Jhunjhunwala's long-term, research-based bets on stocks like Titan and Indian Hotels Company which made him one of the biggest names in the Indian markets.

Every move in his portfolio was tracked closely by the growing number of investors in India, who wanted an early entry into scrips which would eventually break out. Some of the bets, especially in the infrastructure space, did not pay off for Jhunihunwala. But the proverbial 'humbling effect' was missing, as he would often succeed in some other stock, showcasing his Midas touch.

And when companies underperformed, Jhunjhunwala was unsparing, like the

iconic character of Gordon Gekko in the movie 'Wall Street'. Managements of quite a few portfolio companies faced questions from an irate Jhunjhunwala himself on analyst calls.

Outspokenness and wit came to define Jhunjhunwala. Unlike most of his contemporaries who shied away from having a public profile, Jhunjhunwala participated in industry seminars and spoke passionately on a variety of subjects beyond the markets as well.

His newest venture in the heavily-regulated airlines sector, Akasa Air, also had a smooth take off.

Not given to shying away from sharing his reflections, Jhunjhunwala had lately spoken about not paying enough attention to his health during his pursuit of wealth lasting several decades. He was down with multiple ailments and struggled to stand and walk towards the end.

Jhunjunwala, who often spoke about nobody being capable of predicting the weather, death, market or women, breathed his last Sunday morn-

Flood fear grips downstream areas

WEAK EMBANKMENTS ALONG MAHANADI, PAIKA, LUNA RAISE CONCERN; PEOPLE OF 55 PANCHAYATS PANICKED

Kendrapara/Mahakalapara, August 14: Amid heavy rains upstream, 34 gates of the Hirakud dam have been opened in Sambalpur. People living in riparian pockets in the downstream areas of Mahanadi, Paika and Luna rivers have been living in fear of possible floods in Kendrapara while the Mahanadi water level has been rising alarmingly in vari-

Fear of flood is gripping people of 55 panchayats in this district. On the other hand, due to tides, sea water has entered Batighat, Kalapatia, Pentha, Kansar, Dadadandua, Talachua, Satabhaya and Gangani panchayats. The administration has stepped up alertness on weak embankments along Chitrotpala, Luna, Karandia, and

Two ODRAF teams, one NDRF team, four teams of firefighters have reached Kendrapara to deal with the emerging flood situation.

Major cause of public concern is that embankments along these three rivers under Mahakalapara block are weak at many points. These embankments may collapse at those vulnerable points under pressure from the swirling flood waters, they apprehended. The breaches, if created, will wreak havoc in riparian pockets, locals

People in Teragan under this block pointed out that a new embankment has been built on the left side of Luna river near Teragan Ghat, but small boulders have been used in the construction. They said that in case of flood, small boulders will not withstand

BAITARANI IN SPATE

Floodwater is also flowing over Badajora road in Gundichapada panchayat under Odapada block, disrupting communication to Besalia and Dhenkanal town. People of Bidabandi, Khunatujhari, Balabhadrapur and Koreigadi were inconvenienced on the communication front. They are unable to venture out in case of any emergency while schoolchildren have stopped going to school.





The arrest of Habibul Islam alias Saifulla by the Anti-Terrorist Squad (ATS) came close on the heels of the arrest of Mohammad Nadeem (25), an alleged terrorist linked to Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM) who was tasked with carrying out a 'fidayeen' attack on suspended BJP spokesperson Nupur Sharma.

"Following Nadeem's interrogation Saifulla was brought from Fatehpur to Kanpur. He was later arrested. Saifulla admitted that he knew Nadeem and both of them were linked to JeM," the UP ATS said in a statement on Sunday.

Indian and international links of Saifulla are being probed and he has been booked under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, Additional Director General of Police (ATS) Naveen Arora said.

According to the police, Saifulla, who was residing in Uttar Pradesh's Fatehpur district, is a native of Bihar's Motihari district." Saifulla is an expert in making virtual IDs and he has provided around 50 of those to Nadeem as well as terrorists in Pakistan and in Afghanistan. He was linked to handlers in Pakistan and Afghanistan through various so-

cial media platforms like Telegram,

WhatsApp and Facebook

Messenger," the ATS said. Saifulla was linked to various groups on social media which used to share "jihadi videos", the police alleged, adding he used to "send

iihadi videos to people to motivate them". The ATS has also alleged that a Pakistani handler of the JeM had asked Saifulla to come to_ Pakistan for "jihadi training" and then "carry out jihad in India". A mobile phone, a SIM card and a knife have been seized from him, the ATS said.

This is the third such module of cross-border smuggling of arms and explosives that has been busted by the Punjab Police in less than a week.

Those arrested have been identified as Deepak Sharma of Moga; Sandeep Singh of Ferozepur; and Sunny Dagar and Vipin Jakhar, both of Delhi.

DGP Yadav said following reliable inputs that associates of Arsh Dala are being harboured by Jakhar at his accommodation in Goyla Khurd village in Delhi, teams of Punjab Police along with Delhi Police conducted a raid at their premises on Friday, and arrested them after recovering two 9 mm pistols (foreign-made) along

Gandhi family loyalist Sam Pitroda who



Taliban declares public holiday

Kabul: The Taliban have declared Monday a public holiday in Afghanistan to mark one year since the Islamist militant group conquered Kabul during the chaotic withdrawal of US-led NATO forces. Fireworks blast kills 1, injures 36

Yerevan: A strong explosion at a fireworks storage area tore through a popular market in Armenia's capital Sunday, killing at least one person, injuring 36 others and setting off a large fire. More than three hours after the early afternoon blast at the Surmalu market, firemen labored to put out the blaze that sent a towering column of smoke over the center of Yerevan.

Jerusalem shooting: 8 Israelis wounded

Jerusalem: A gunman opened fire at a bus near Jerusalem's Old City early Sunday, wounding eight Israelis in a suspected Palestinian attack that came a week after violence flared up between Israel and militants in Gaza, police and medics said.

Moderate quake jolts Indonesia

Jakarta: A 5.9-magnitude quake rocked Indonesia's eastern province of North Maluku (Maluku Utara) Sunday. The quake hit at 9:47 Jakarta time (0247 GMT), with the epicentre at 139 km northwest of Halmahera Barat (West Halmahera) district and the shallow of 10 km under seabed, Xinhua news said.

Truss in commanding lead over Sunak

London, August 14: The UK Prime Ministerial race frontrunner, Foreign Secretary Liz Truss, continues to hold on to a commanding 22-point lead over former Chancellor Rishi Sunak in the Conservative Party leadership contest, according to a new survey of Tory mem-

In an Opinium poll for 'The Observer' newspaper of 570 Conservative members with a vote in the election, Truss is on 61 per cent and the British Indian former minister is on 39 per cent. With under three weeks to go before the September 2 deadline for postal and online votes to be cast by the membership to elect a successor to outgoing Prime Minister Boris Johnson, Sunak seems to have closed the gap only slightly in

"From the moment we knew the final two candidates, it has



been clear that Truss has had all the momentum, and our latest poll sets out just how large her lead among the party members has become," Chris Curtis of Opinium told the newspaper. "With many members having already returned their ballot papers, it is now very unlikely Truss won't become Prime Minister in September. It's clear

that Sunak's biggest problem is trust. While some members respect his economic arguments, this hasn't been enough to overcome the view among members that he isn't honest or trustworthy enough for the top job, particularly after he called for Johnson to go," he said.

Opinium's detailed questioning also uncovers a striking lack of enthusiasm for either candidate when members are asked whether they would prefer one of them to Johnson to run the party and country. When offered the choice of Johnson still being in No. 10 Downing Street, or Truss taking over, around 63 per cent of Tory members polled said they would prefer Johnson to be still in charge against 22 per cent who wanted Truss. On the other side, 68 per cent said they would prefer to still have Johnson than see him replaced by Sunak, who was preferred by just 19 per cent.

The poll also found that almost three in 10 of the Tory electorate (29 per cent) had already voted. Some 47 per cent said they would definitely be voting for the candidate they had opted for. Just 19 per cent said they had yet to make up their mind. Opinium said that while these findings meant it may still be possible for Sunak to pull off a "stunning comeback" to enter

10 Downing Street, but to do so he would have to win over almost all the undecideds and convert a sizeable chunk of those not fully behind

The Foreign Secretary's support is particularly strong among older Conservative members, while Sunak's is far higher among younger ones. For Sunak the most cited reason was that he would be better at managing the economy (22 per cent), while 10 per cent said they regarded him as the most competent or intelligent.

A main reason mentioned by people who backed Truss was dislike of Sunak (14 per cent). The same proportion (14 per cent) said the Cabinet minister was more honest and trustworthy, while 10 per cent chose the fact that she had remained loyal to Johnson and not called on him to resign. Around 2 per cent of Tory members cited race or ethnicity as a reason for supporting Truss and not Sunak.

Salman Rushdie off ventilator

Wylie had earlier said Salman was using the ventilator and could lose an eye after he sustained injuries to his arm and liver in the attack, dpa news agency reported.

The Indian-born Briton, whose novel "The Satanic Verses" led to death threats from Iran in the 1980s. was about to deliver a lecture in New York state on Friday, when he was attacked. The man accused of stabbing him pleaded not guilty on Saturday to charges of attempted murder and assault.

blocked an entrance to the church, causing a stampede, they said, adding that most of those killed were children.

"People were gathering on the third and fourth floor, and we saw smoke coming from the second floor. People rushed to go down the stairs and stared falling on top of each other," said Yasir Munir, a worshipper at the church.

"Then we heard a bang and sparks and fire coming out of the window," he said, saying he and his $daughter\ were\ on\ the\ ground\ floor$ and able to escape.

Electrical fires of this kind are

not a rare occurrence in Egypt; in late 2020, a fire at a hospital treating Covid-19 patients killed at least seven people and injured several others. In a statement, the Interior Ministry said a forensic examination showed that the fire began on the second floor air conditioning of the church as a result of an electrical malfunction.

Smoke inhalation was the main cause for the deaths and injuries, it said. Families of city of Giza near Cairo those who died will receive 100,000 Egyptian pounds (\$5,223), according to a

Cash-strapped Britons give up pets as living costs soar

London, August 14: Stood on her hind legs to greet any prospective owner who might approach her glass-doored kennel, Harriet is a black English cocker spaniel abandoned as a deepening cost-of-living crisis pushes growing numbers of Britons to part with their pets.

She was found running along a busy road in London after witnesses saw her pushed out of a car and is one of 206 dogs and 164 cats currently being looked after at rehoming centres run by the Battersea animal charity. It is a similar story at other centres across the country - with some seeing record inquiries for dog and cat returns - as the tightest squeeze on living standards since at least the 1960s forces many owners to decide the addi-

tional cost of food plus hundreds of pounds in vet bills is no longer manageable.

'We are concerned that's going to be an increasing reason for people bringing their dogs in to Battersea," Steve Craddock, who manages the centre in soutwest London, told Reuters.

Exotic pets such as snakes and lizards are also proving too expensive due to their need for specialist heating and lighting. Three snakes, including an 8-foot (2.4metre) boa constrictor, were recently dumped in pillow cases outside a reptile shop, the Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (RSPCA) told

centres across the country, said the last time it had seen anything like this was in the wake of the 2008 financial crash. "This cost-of-liv-

ing crisis has crept up on us a lot more quickly than people ever expected," said the Trust's operations director Adam Clowes.

he trend, which follows a surge in demand for pets during Covid lockdowns in a country known for its love of animals, comes as households brace for energy bills to more than triple in January on last year, hammering people's incomes

Such is the pressure that the charity is considering whether it should expand an emergency support fund, normally reserved for people on welfare benefits who need short-term financial support to keep their pets, to more middle income earners.

Animal charities say they are

At Battersea, some pets are being rehomed. Magpie is a British short hair cat who arrived pregnant after her owner of two years realised that they could not afford the kittens. All of her four kittens have now been found new

But that is unlikely to be the case for most animals, with another charity, Woodgreen, saying applications to adopt animals have dropped to the 100s a month from around 10,000 during lockdowns. Pilar Gómez-Igbo, an assistant editor, could have been one potential owner, but having done some research she is now worried about the extra costs.



New Delhi, August 14: The finance ministry is proposing to soon review the exemption-free new tax regime with a view to making it more attractive for individual income taxpayers, sources said.

Eventually, sources said, the government aims to establish a system where there are no exemptions and the complex old tax regime with exemptions and deductions is terminated.

The Union Budget 2020-21 introduced a new tax regime. Taxpayers were given the option to choose between the old regime with various deductions and exemptions and the new tax regime that offered lower tax rates without

exemptions and deductions. The intention behind the move was to provide significant relief to the individual taxpayers and to simplify the income-tax law.

Asked about the experience of the new tax regime, sources said, there are clear signs that people who have finished their home and education loans are willing to shift to the new tax regime as they have no exemptions to claim.

Sources further said that lowering of taxes in the new regime would make the new tax regime more attractive. A similar tax regime for corporate taxpavers was introduced in September 2019 by significantly lowering rates and removing exemptions.

Riyadh, August 14: Oil giant Saudi Aramco Sunday unveiled record profits of \$48.4 billion in the second quarter of 2022, after Russia's war in Ukraine and a postpandemic surge in demand sent crude prices soaring.

Aramco is just the latest oil major to rake in eyewatering sums after ExxonMobil, Chevron, Shell, TotalEnergies and Eni also revealed multi-billion-dollar profits in the second quarter.


While global market volatility and economic uncertainty remain, events during the first half of this year support our view that ongoing investment in our industry is essential," said Aramco president and CEO Amin H. Nasser. "In fact, we expect oil demand to continue to grow for the rest of the decade," he added.



Net income rose 22.7 percent from Q1 in "strong market conditions". Aramco said, Half-vear profits were \$87.9 billion, up from \$47.2 billion for the same period

Aramco will pay an \$18.8 billion dividend in Q3, the same as it paid in Q2. It "continues to work on increasing crude oil maximum sustainable capacity from 12 million barrels per day to 13 million by 2027", its earnings announcement said.

The quarterly profits, the highest since Aramco's record-breaking IPO, beat a company-compiled analyst forecast of \$46.2 billion. Aramco shares were down about 1.0 percent at 40.4 riyals (\$10.8) in early trading on the Saudi stock exchange. They are up 25 percent this year.

New Delhi, August 14: They mesmerised all and sundry with their skills and 'surefootedness' during those heady Indian club football days of 1970's and 1980s, but former national captains like Shabbir Ali Manoranjan Bhattacharya and Bhaichung Bhutia will have a far bigger task at hand in the coming days. Their prudence will decide the course that Indian football system charts, after more than a decade long 'One-Man show' (read Praful Patel) at the helm of affairs, which has done more harm than good for the sport in India.

These three and 33 other prominent internationals of their times are now part of an exclusive voter's list to elect the next governing body of All India Football Federation (AIFF) with an imminent FIFA ban looming large. It is they who will decide whether India will get the chance to host the Women's U-17 World Cup.

There are 24 male and 12 female former India footballers, who have been included in the initial voter's list of 67 for the elections dated August 28 on the orders of the Supreme Court. And for once, the players will, and not bureaucrats and politicians crazy for posts in sports bodies, decide as to who runs Indian football.

As per rule, an 'eminent player' must have played at least two matches for India and must have retired two years before the date of the upcoming elections.

The publication of the Electoral College also ruled out a big politician running for the AIFF president's post. Former Sports Minister and current Union Minister Sarbananda Sonowal's name was doing the rounds as presidential candidate.

Catalan giants Barcelona drop points in season opener against Rayo

Barcelona, August 14: Robert Lewandowski's Barcelona debut ended in a disappointing 0-0 home draw with Rayo Vallecano at Camp Nou in their first La Liga game of the season Saturday. It was a frustrating night for the Barca fans who showed up at an almost soldout stadium to see their new team headlined by Poland striker Lewandowski, the twice 'FIFA Best Player of the Year' winner, and Brazil winger Raphinha.

Barcelona dominated the match with almost 70 per cent of ball possession and 18 goal attempts to two for Rayo. However, the two best chances fell to the visitors with Alvaro Garcia thwarted by a brilliant save by Marc Andre ter Stegen and Sergio Camello shooting wide.

Rayo's five-man defence did a superb job in shackling Lewandowski, who barely touched the ball in the entire game. The closest the former Bayern Munich star went to scoring was a header flicked well over the bar in the first half. Most of Barcelona's chances in the first half came from wingers Raphinha and Dembele, who linked up well and gave the team an attacking threat.

Barca coach Xavi Hernandez tried to break the deadlock by sending on forwards Ansu Fati and Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang from the bench, but Rayo showed real grit to hold out for the draw.

As the frustration mounted for

Barca, their captain Sergio Busquets lost his cool and was sent off for an elbow to the face of Falcao Garcia in added-on time.

Goalkeeper Stole Dimitrievski kept a clean sheet for the third consecutive time against Barcelona after Rayo won both games against the Spanish giants last season. He made a couple of crucial stops in the second half, one from a Busquets long-range shot and another from a strike by Raphinha.

"We tried as much as we could but we lacked aim and effectiveness. Maybe the pressure and expectation got a little under our skin," Xavi said after the game. "It will be a process. We have to be patient and keep working. Better days will come, I am sure about that," Xavi added.

Halep will face Brazil's Beatriz Haddad Maia, a 6-4 7-6 (7) winner over 14th-seeded Karolina Pliskova of the Czech Republic in the semifinal played later Saturday night.

Halep smashed a racket on the hard court at Sobeys Stadium after she missed a return late in the third set. "The fire is back," Halep said. "It's a good sign if I do that. It looks like I'm fighting. It helps me sometimes. I don't know if it's always good or not, but it helps

me," the Romanian added. The 15th-seeded Halep won the

tournament in Montreal in 2016 and 2018. Pegula was seeded seventh. This is Maia's first WTA Masters event final. In June, she won con-

secutive grass court events in Nottingham and Birmingham in England for her first two tour titles. "I just try to breathe a little bit more. I try to calm down and think about what I need to do and not what I'm experiencing," Maia said

after the match. "I try to play every point and think about the next shot," she added. Maia had beaten top-ranked Iga Swiatek in the round of 16. "I don't think about, 'Oh, I'm here playing against No. 1 in the world in a big stage in a 1000 WTA', because

otherwise I wouldn't be able to

play," Maia said referring to her stunning win. Halep began working with coach Patrick Mouratoglou in April and said that he has rekindled her passion for tennis, pointing to training sessions at his tennis school in the French Riviera. "Patrick brought about the change. The vibe from the academy gave me the energy. To see all those kids fighting every day to touch the dream that they have. I felt that I still can do it. I still have it
