### **Sundarpada locals** suffer as officials spar over authority

Bhubaneswar, August 17: The outskirts of the Odisha capital witnessed severe inundation Wednesday in Sundarpada locality as water from the Daya river entered many houses bringing normal life to a standstill.

Eye-witnesses said floodwaters entered and rose above the ground level in a large number of residences and flooded roads and cars. Locals said that power and drinking water supply was also disrupted due to the inundation. Fire services and Odisha Disaster Rapid Action Force (ODRAF) personnel were seen rescuing residents on inflatable boats or carrying the marooned people physically on their shoulders in waist-deep water to safer locations.

Meanwhile, reacting to the problems put on social media by the Sundarpada residents, SRC PK Jena asked the Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation (BMC) to intervene and take immediate



measures to pump out floodwater from the Sundarpada locality.

However BMC officials said that the area does not come under their iurisdiction and so they are not obligated to intervene. "We are prepared for any such adverse situation in the state capital or areas that are under the BMC's authority. The Sundarpada locality comes under Jatni tahsildar," a BMC official said.

ODRAF personnel informed that anti-venom kits in case of snakebites have been distributed in the locality. They added that drinking water is also being provided. Some of the affected people said that they will move to the homes of their relatives.

### BJP rejigs apex board, axes Gadkari, Chouhan

■ Former Union Ministers Jual Oram and Shahnawaz Hussain also dropped as the party wants to portray a more regional face

New Delhi, August 17: In a major shake-up Wednesday, the BJP dropped Union Minister and former party president Nitin Gadkari and Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan from its parliamentary board, the apex organisational body. The saffron party brought in six new members, including former Karnataka CM, BS Yediyurappa and Punjab leader Iqbal Singh Lalpura.

The party also rejigged its central election committee (CEC) and named Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis and Union Minister Bhupender Yadav among its new members. Gadkari and Chouhan also ceased to be CEC members after their ouster from the parliamentary board.

All apex board members, which include Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Union Ministers Amit Shah and Rajnath Singh and BJP president JP Nadda, automatically become part of the CEC, which has some additional members as well.

The omission of Gadkari and

Chouhan marks their diminishing stock within the party which has tried to make its key organisational bodies more socially and regionally representative by bringing in members of different communities

Former Union Ministers -- Jual Oram, Shahnawaz Hussain and former BJP 'Mahila Morcha' chief Vijava Rahatkar have also been removed from the CEC.

The other new board members are Laxman, Sudha Yaday and Satyanarayan Jatiya while the new entrants to the CEC are Rajasthan leader Om Mathur and BJP women wing chief Vanathi Srinivasan besides Fadnavis and Bhupender.

This is the first time the BJP parliamentary board has been rejigged under Nadda, who took over as the party president in 2020. The board had several vacancies caused by the death of Arun Jaitley and Sushma Swaraj while Venkaiah Naidu and Thaawarchand Gehlot had to leave it after becoming Vice-President and

state governor respectively. Among the new board members, Sudha and Laxman are from the Other Backward Classes (OBC) while former Union Minister Jatiya is from the Scheduled Castes

Yediyurappa's inclusion highlights BJP's efforts to reward the Lingayat leader whose community is critical to its poll prospects in the state Assembly elections next year.

# **Flood situation worsens**

Close to 5 lakh people of more than 2,100 villages in 18 districts affected with no signs of situation improving soon

Bhubaneswar, August 17: Over 4.91 lakh people in 2,110 villages under 78 blocks and 18 ULBs of 18 districts have so far been affected by the flood and heavy rainfall, Special Relief Commissioner (SRC) PK Jena said here Wednesday. Due to heavy rainfall and subsequent floods, over 2.5 lakh people in 425 villages have remained marooned while more than 60,000 people have been evacuated to safer places. Cooked food is being served to about 58,000 people at different shelters, Jena informed.

As per the preliminary reports, about 4.67 lakh people in 1,757 villages under 64 blocks and 10 ULBs of 12 districts have so far been affected by the flood while over 2.26 lakh people in 425 villages have remained marooned.

The worst flood affected districts are – Angul, Bargarh, Cuttack, Jagatsinghpur, Jajpur, Kendrapara, Khurda, Nayagarh, Puri, Sambalpur and Sonepur.

Meanwhile the flood situation in Odisha's Mahanadi river system remained grim as it continued to swell, with around 1.5 lakh people in 237 villages being marooned, Engineer in Chief, Water Resources

# ED 'Kick' for Jacqueline over extortion

New Delhi, August 17: The Enforcement Directorate (ED) filed Wednesday a charge sheet naming actor Jacqueline Fernandez as an accused in a multi-crore money laundering case linked to alleged conman Sukesh Chandrashekhar and others, official sources said.

The federal probe agency filed the fresh (second supplementary) charge sheet or prosecution complaint in this case Wednesday before a special Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) court here and sources said, the actor has been arraigned in it as an accused. The court will take up the charge sheet for taking cognisance August 31.

The 37-year-old actor has been questioned multiple times by the agency in this case, the last being in June.

She had also informed the probe agency that she returned a Mini Cooper car which had been gifted to her.

The ED however, said that she also received a horse worth ₹52 lakh and a Persian cat worth ₹9 lakh and the total amount of gifts to her had been to the tune of ₹10 crore.



## 2,073 challans issued to helmetless riders

Bhubaneswar, August 17: Cracking the whip on helmetless riding, the State Transport Authority (STA) has issued 2,073 challans to bikers on national and state highways during the last 24

According to sources, the enforcement team of STA has collected Rs 4.3 lakh penalty and suspended 400 licences of those who were found riding two-wheelers without wearing helmets.

Moreover, 77 vehicles have been seized as riders were found not having driving licences

"The main aim of this drive is to create a sense of responsibility among the road users for prevention of road accidents and fatalities. It has been observed that many of the road mishaps taking place on NHs/SHs are related to two-wheeler riders. People are using helmets in urban areas due to continuous enforcement activities but are unfortunately avoiding helmets on highways where protection is much more needed,' said Sanjay Biswal, Joint Transport

It can be mentioned that helmetless riding is one of the major causes of road accidents across the state. As many as 1,308 people, including riders (868) and pillion riders (440) of motorised two-wheelers, were killed in road accidents in 2021. Most of them were not wearing helmets. Altogether 1,280 were grievously injured and 747 had minor injuries in accidents involving two-wheelers.

The move against helmetless

riding on highways is a two-week long special drive being conducted by STA from August 16 to 30. Earlier, in a crackdown on helmetless riders on NHs/SHs from May 15 to 21, officials had imposed penalties on 10,661 two-wheeler riders while 2,505 licences were suspended. Similarly, in a special drive conducted July 30, 1,469 riders were issued challans for helmetless riding and as many as 117 vehicles were seized, said STA sources.

## APPEAR BEFORE DELHI POLICE

WITHIN 15 DAYS: HC TO VARSHA

Cuttack, August 17: The Orissa High Court Wednesday directed actor Varsha Priyadarshini to appear before the Delhi Police within 15 days in connection with a case filed against her for allegedly hurling casteist remarks at a staffer of her spouse and MP Anubhav Mohanty.

Soon after, a team of Delhi Police tried to reach out to Varsha with assistance of Purighat Police in Cuttack, but to no avail. The Delhi Police team left a notice for Varsha at the Purighat police station before returning to the national capital.

Later. Varsha received the notice. Fearing arrest, the actor moved the HC seeking anticipatory bail.

### BJP slams govt over flood management

Bhubaneswar, August 17: As Odisha grapples with the decade's worst flood in Mahanadi river system. opposition BJP Wednesday came down heavily on the ruling BJD accusing it of failing to implement proper water management in Hirakud reservoir - the lone facility that controls floods in the biggest river in the coastal state.

BJP state unit president Samir Mohanty came down heavily on the Naveen Patnaik government and said the present situation in the Mahanadi river system has arisen because of the utter negligence by the administration.

"The state government has miserably failed in flood management that has affected thousands of people in 10 districts this time," he said at a press conference here.

The opposition party alleged that the state government never bothered to work out a proper mechanism for water management in the Hirakud reservoir during the 22 years of BJD regime in the state.

"There is a Rule Curve for proper flood control and water management in Hirakud dam. The state government, however, never thought BJP state unit president Samir Mohanty (centre) addresses the media оррното of bringing amendments in the rule though there was need to do

rules during the last 24 years since BJD came to power despite climate change and global warming,

Mohanty said.

The Rule Curve is a guideline for flood control during monsoons and maintenance of reservoir functions like irrigation and power production post the season. The flood in Mahandi river is managed as per its provisions which suggest how much water should be stored in the reservoir and when to discharge the excess water. It was adopted in 1962 and was last amended in 1988.

Mohanty claimed that the BJD government did not amend the

so and instead used the Mahanadi water issue for political purposes to mislead the people. The government completely ignored factors like climate change, global warming, unseasonal rainfall and deposit of huge quantities of silt in Hirakud reservoir which affected its storage capacity over the years. Instead of focus-

ing on proper water management

in the Mahanadi river system, the

government kept itself busy in or-

ganising agitations over the river

water issue at different times since

2017, he alleged. Though river embankments have become weak and prone to breaches in different places, the state government did not respond to the situation and has thereby pushed the lives of people into danger, he claimed.


Keeping up with his criticism, Mohanty alleged that the government's preparedness to deal with the current flood remained confined to announcements while local people are seen in many places repairing breaches on embankments on their own.

## Vegetable prices skyrocket due to depleting stock in Capital

Bhubaneswar, August 17: At a time when many parts of the state are reeling under flood, skyrocketing vegetable prices in the Capital city has come as a double whammy, reportedly due to lack of adequate stock and transportation hurdles.

While green vegetables saw a two-fold jump in prices, essential vegetables like potato and onion also saw significant increase in rates. Tomato, which was selling at Rs 40 per kg a week ago, saw a 50 per cent increase and is being sold at Rs 60 per kg now. Similarly, eggplant, which was being sold at Rs 60, saw 66 per cent jump to be sold at Rs 100 per kg.

Meanwhile, pointed gourd saw a 100 per cent rise in price and is now being sold at Rs 80 per kg as compared to Rs 40 per kg a week ago.

Other green vegetables such as beans and drumsticks also saw escalation in the prices by 50 per cent within a week.

"Farms have been submerged in floodwaters and we are managing with only 40 per cent stock left to cater to the demand. The upward trend in prices may continue for some time until the rain subsides and floodwater recedes,' said Bhubaneswar Green Vegetable Traders' Association president Kabiraj Swain.

Notably, local vegetable growers supply fresh produces to the state capital. Moreover, the state depends on Nasik, Bengaluru, Indore, Andhra Pradesh and West Bengal for green vegetables. However, vegetable import has reduced by 40 per cent due to heavy rain and flood-like situation in other states that has directly affected the small vendors.

"I'm finding it very tough to manage the monthly expenses due to increase in prices. I have a family of eight to feed. However, observing that the prices may not come down soon. I have decided to stock up vegetables as much as possible," said Satya Das, a citizen here.

### Most Indians want rules on common chargers

even in 10 Indian consumers believe that mobile devices have different charging cables because it allows the manufacturers to maximise sale of accessories amid lack of government standards, a new report said Wednesday. While five in 10 respondents say

different charging cables are there due to lack of government standards, nine in 10 want the government to drive standardisation of charging cables on priority as it will reduce inconvenience and

make charging cables more affordable, according to data provided by community social media platform LocalCircles.

The European Commission has recently made a commendable move by passing a resolution that all smartphone makers will be required to support USB-C as a single charging standard for all mobile devices across the European Union (EU) nations by 2024

The Department of Consumer Affairs in the country is set to meet industry representatives to evaluate the possibility of mandating a common charger for most mobile devices, including smartphones, tablets and wearable devices.

While 78 per cent of consumers said all smartphones and tablets should have the same USB charging cable regardless of the company, only 6 per cent said the current sys-

tem is fine where different smartphones and tablets have different charging cables regardless of the company. The findings indicate

that the majority of Indian consumers are unhappy that smartphones. tablets have different charging cables for different devices and believe that brands do the same to

maximise sales of accessories. Since the charging cables made by brands are priced high, the majority end up buying the generic version. Most consumers now demand that the government should create common standards for USB charging cables like the EU as they believe standardisation will drive prices lower and make original charging cables more affordable.



## Does entitlement make you more likely to cheat?

**7** hy do people cheat? An intriguing study by two Israeli researchers in 2016 put forward a possible reason that has since become well established in the scientific literature and popular media.

The researchers reported a series of experiments apparently showing that people told they have won a skill-based competition, such as a visual task, subsequently cheat more than others in games of chance, such as dice games. The proposed explanation was that winners experienced a sense of entitlement that induced them to cheat.

The paper has been highly cited by other researchers. One scientific comment paper even pointed out its significance in the light of tax evasion costing governments US\$3.1 trillion (£2.6 trillion) annually.

But does the finding hold up to scientific scrutiny? We decided to replicate the study and investigate more closely the reasons why people do or don't cheat.

Our new study, published in Royal Society Open Science, failed twice to replicate the original finding. We found that the original experiments were "statistically underpowered", meaning they used far too few experimental participants (43 in their main experiment) to sustain the conclusions that were drawn.

There were also problems of experimental design and methodology, notably a failure to randomly decide which participants were winners, losers, or part of a control group that weren't told how they had done in the skillbased competition.

We began by replicating the original research as closely as possible, but in a large-scale experiment (252 participants) to achieve adequate statistical power. We also assigned participants randomly to conditions.

To assign winners and losers, we used the perceptual judgement test used in the original experiment. The test involves the difficult task of estimating which of



Participants who dislike inequality cheated less than others. This is presumably because they had a stronger sense of fairness and considered cheating unfair

Research suggests people's feelings about inequality are one part of the explanation. There are also momentary circumstantial factors that encourage some people, but not others, to cheat

several different symbols is the most numerous in briefly displayed slides similar to the one shown below.

We put the participants in pairs

and told them whether they had a better or worse score than their partner in the skill task. They were then put in new pairs and played a game of chance. The pairs then played a game of chance, also identical to the game in the original research. This involved rolling two dice under an inverted cup and then peeking through a spyhole in its base to see the result.

The players were told to help themselves to money from an envelope provided depending on what numbers the dice showed - 25 pence for each dice spot. While it was impossible to tell who in particular cheated collecting much significantly more than the average

amount was evidence of cheating. We also assigned one-third of the participants to a control group. They were not told whether or not they had beaten their partner in the visual task before playing the the dice game.

Comparing the results to what we'd expect to happen by chance, a small but statistically significant amount of cheating seemed to have occurred, as in the original Israeli experiment. But our results showed no evidence that winning (or losing) had any statistically significant effect whatsoever on cheating, as can be seen in the graph below, where the dotted line shows the value expected by chance, without cheating.

We also ran an even larger online experiment (275 participants) in which we assigned participants randomly to be winners, losers or control participants using the same perceptual test as before.

In this experiment, each participant tossed a coin ten times and claimed rewards (Amazon gift vouchers) depending on how many heads they tossed. The results were almost identical to our first experiment: we found a similar level of cheating and no evidence of any effect of winning or losing on subsequent cheating.

We used standardised psychometric tests designed to measure differences between people that might influence cheating, including a sense of entitlement, self-confidence, belief in personal luck, and a few other factors. But only one, turned out to be statistically significant in all treatment conditions.

Jena also said the next 24 hours will be crucial for Odisha. The SRC, however, claimed that floodwater flow in Mahanadi through Mundali near Cuttack has gone down by 17,000 cusecs Wednesday morning. However, it is expected that around 9/10 lakh cusecs of water will pass through Mundali tomorrow (Thursday), he informed.

"The Odisha government has deputed additional teams of NDRF, ODRAF and Fire Brigade personnel to the flood-affected districts. The collectors of Keonjhar, Bhadrak and Jajpur have been asked to maintain high alert as Brahmani and Baitarani river basins are expected to receive rains in next few hours,' Jena said.

The SRC also said the state government has asked the Health department to store adequate number of anti-venom kits in the flood-affected areas.

### Bystanders No More

n March 1964, the New York Times reported that 38 witnesses saw or heard a brutal, drawn-out, and ultimately fatal attack on a woman called Kitty lacktriangle Genovese, but none did anything to help her, or even summoned the police. The report was later shown to be erroneous, but the "bystander effect" is real. As many psychology experiments have shown, an individual is less likely to come to the aid of another if they can see that other people who could help are not doing so

Last month, in the middle of the day on a busy street in the Italian town of Civitanova Marche, Alika Ogorchukwu, a Nigerian street vendor, was attacked and killed by a man using his bare hands. Although the police were called, and someone filmed the attack, no one intervened. Amid general outrage, an editorial in the Italian newspaper La Stampa took this as a sign that we are in "the twilight of civilization.

If you had been there, would you have aided Ogorchukwu? Consider, before you answer, that to intervene would have involved some personal risk. The assailant was not using a weapon, but how could you know that he did not have one? And even without a weapon, he was evidently both enraged and strong

Whatever you feel you would have done had you been present, a far big-

ger bystander effect is playing out right now. In this case, you can assist in saving the lives of others, without any danger to you. Moreover, some of those whom you may be able to save are Nigerians, which makes it possible to think of the assistance as a token of your opposition to the failure to help Ogorchukwu.

A report issued recently by the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization and the World Food Program warns that between now and September, famine could affect 49 million people in 46 countries. The countries most at risk are Afghanistan, Ethiopia, Nigeria, Somalia, South Sudan, and Yemen. Civil strife is one major risk factor for famine in these countries, but the report also cites weather extremes, such as storms, flooding and drought, and rising food and energy prices stemming from the war in Ukraine. café and order a cup

And yet a disturbing trend has become evident: governments of affluent countries are giving less foreign aid. The most striking example is the United Kingdom, a country that gradually, with bipartisan agreement, worked its way up to the United Nations foreign-aid tar get of 0.7% of gross national income. That target was reached in 2013 and was met every year until 2020. In 2021, however, the UK's for eign-aid budget was slashed to 0.5% of GNI, and it will most likely remain at that level in 2022

As Mark Lowcock, a former permanent secretary of the UK Department for International Development, pointed out in a

recent interview, his country, which used to be a world leader in making extreme poverty the clear priority of its aid program, is now placing less emphasis on helping the poorest and weakest countries. Aid to countries like Yemen, South Sudan, and Somalia has been cut, increasing the loss of life from humanitarian disasters. Instead, Lowcock says, aid is going to middleincome countries where its impact on people's lives is not nearly as big as when it goes to those living below the World Bank's extreme poverty line of \$1.90 per day

There are two important ways in which you can avoid being a bystander to the avoidable deaths of millions of people in the coming months.

First, according to preliminary OECD figures, in 2021, only Luxembourg, Norway, Sweden, Germany, and Denmark have reached or exceeded the 0.7%-of-GNI target for foreign aid. The United States still lags near the bottom of the table of donor countries, giving only 0.18% of its GNI, while Australia, at 0.22%, is not much better. If you live in an affluent country that is not meeting the 0.7% target, contact your elected representatives and tell them that you are ashamed of your country's failure to do its share to create a world in which everyone can meet their basic needs. Join with others to create a movement for more and better foreign aid.

Second, after you have done that, don't just sit around waiting for your government to do the right thing. Do it yourself. If you are affluent enough to go to a café and order a cup of coffee there, you are probably spending more doing that than nearly one in ten people on this planet have to live on for an

### **■** Willy-nilly

One modern meaning of this common but odd-looking expression is without direction or planning; haphazardly": We've got to make it a physical game and we are not going to go there and chuck the ball about willy-nilly. We've got to go there with a purpose and that purpose is to win the game (Doncaster Free Press, 15 Nov. 2011). Its original sense appeared at the beginning of the seventeenth century, when people used it to suggest that something must be done no matter whether one is willing or unwilling, whether one wants to or not. It's a modified form of an older phrase that is variously expressed as will I, nill I or will ye, nill ye, or sometimes as nilling willing. Will here is used in its sense of wanting to do something, to wish or desire that something should happen (when you make your will, you are using the same sense: you are expressing your wishes for the distribution of your goods after vou die). Nill is very old, known before the Norman Conquest, but has long since vanished from the language. It was the opposite of will, so to nill is to want not to do something, to refuse or reject some course of action. So will I, nill I can be expanded into "be I willing, be I unwilling", combining the two sentiments with the implication that it doesn't much matter what you feel, you're stuck with doing something. More recently, this conflict gave rise to an implication that a person was not sure whether to do something, and so suggested he was undecided or indecisive. Even more recently, the associated sense has grown up of embarking on some project without direction or planning or in a disorganised way. There is an equivalent Latin phrase nolens volens, which is formed from two Latin participles that mean "unwilling, willing". It is sometimes said that willy-nilly is actually a translation of the Latin phrase. It may have been an influence, but it's hard to tell.

## IS BJP THE NEW CONGRESS?

THE BJP LIKE THE CONGRESS **OF YORE WISHES TO BE BRANDED AS** THE 'PARTY OF **NATURAL GOVERNANCE** 

The answers to the header of this column are both ves and no. First the caveats - while the BJP that is the subject of comparison here is the present day BJP being led by the triumvirate of Narendra Modi, Amit Shah and JP Nadda (in that order of control and influence over the BJP), the Congress Party that will be discussed about is the current one led by the Gandhi family members (officially and unofficially) as also the Congress of the 1970s and early 1980s (up to the assassination of Indira Gandhi in 1984).

Many keen watchers of the Indian political scenario might balk at the prospect of comparing BJP with Congress, which according to them are as similar as chalk and cheese. However, as time passes, the BJP increasingly resembles the Congress in quite a few respects.

First is the unbridled devotion to the numero uno figure. In case of the Congress, in the 1970s and early 1980s up to her death at the hands of her bodyguards, Indira Gandhi commanded the unquestioned loyalty of her partymen, which reached the zenith (or nadir) of sycophancy in the statement of DK Barooah that "Indira is India and India is Indira." It was easy for Barooah to equate the nation with its leader as only the letter 'r' was the difference between the two. The task is not easy for the men and women of BJP as the words 'India' and 'Modi' have very few letters in common and they don't rhyme well like 'India' and 'Indira'. Increasingly, BJP looks like the party of the present PM rather than a party led currently by Modi. It would be pertinent to share a personal anecdote. This columnist is a member of a school WhatsApp group where one of the spokespersons of the state BJP happens to be a member. On selection of Droupadi Murmu as the NDA candidate for the office of the President, he posted a message in Odia whose loose English translation goes like this: "It is a matter of pride and respect for all the residents of Odisha that Honourable Prime Minister Modiji

has selected respected Droupadi Murmu for the office of the President. This clearly proves how much respect, love and importance Modi ji has been paying to Odisha. Thank you Modi ji!" As can be seen, in this post, the person who was selected as the candidate (this being a watershed moment for all Odias as she eventually became the first Odia to reach the highest office of the land) got mentioned once whereas the PM got mentioned thrice. This is symbolic of the nauseating personality cult that a party like BJP (which along with its ideological fountainhead RSS prided on the principle of collective leadership and abhorred too much emphasis on the person) has descended to. The only difference here between BJP and Congress is that there is no Modi family to carry forward some sort of a dynastic rule afterwards.

The second factor that increasingly shows the BJP as the new age Congress is the quest to diminish, disregard and demolish its political opponents by encouraging defections, splits and dissidence in the ranks of the latter. Like the Congress of Indira Gandhi's times, which had the distinction of conversion of a state government of Janata Party to that of the Congress overnight (in Haryana), BJP now considers defection from Opposition parties as the most preferred method to weaken its political adversaries.

Thirdly, the ruling party at the Centre now reportedly employs money power (as alleged by leaders from Opposition parties), not to mention the ruthless use of central agencies like the Enforcement Directorate, to bring down leading lights from the Opposition's ranks. Of course, some state governments run by the non-BJP parties are not far behind in employing their state machineries to fix their political opponents.

Another area that makes BJP indistinguishable from the Congress is foreign policy. In spite of the perceived tilt towards the USA in the initial years of Modi government, the latter has gradually been seen aligned with Russia, especially in the wake of Russia-Ukraine war. That even the Communists don't have much to complain about the foreign policy of their bete noire goes a long way to show how there is some kind of a consensus about preferring Russia which is regarded as an all weather friend of India rather than rely on the USA which is seen as a fickle partner, especially

in the aftermath of its shoddy withdrawal from Afghanistan.

Last but not the least, BJP like the Congress of yore wishes to be branded as the Party of Natural Governance.' That's the reason why BJP doggedly pursues the prospect of forming governments in all those states where it can, by allying with disparate parties or by facilitating defections from other parties. However similar to Congress the BJP may look like, there are some aspects where there won't be any meeting point between the two.

First is the issue of Hindutva which also is intertwined with the concepts of secularism and attitude towards religious minorities (especially Muslims). BJP accuses the Congress of being anti-Hindu and of practicing the policy of appeasement towards religious minorities. Congress, on the other hand, considers BJP to be anti-Muslim and accuses it of running a majoritarian (read Hindu) agenda.

Another aspect that the two parties have different approaches to is the factor of dynastic politics. Though BJP is not immune to dynastic succession as exemplified by Union Ministers Dharmendra Pradhan, Anurag Thakur and many others who are scions of former Union Ministers/Chief Ministers, it makes efforts to not encourage it for two reasons: (a) to enforce its image of a 'party with difference' and (ii) to put the Gandhi family led Congress on the mat.

Indian politics to a great extent is characterised by greater influence of personalities rather than policies. The way things are going there are indications that the BJF may veer away from certain po sitions that it held earlier. This will be driven by change in personal views of Modi and Shah than anything else. A case in point is the BJP top brass downplaying killings of Hindu activists in certain states. However, seeing the political morass the Congress finds itself in, any significant change in the policies of the party seems remote or impossible.

## Disturbing trends in malnutrition

**TECHNOLOGY CAN BE A POWERFUL ENABLER IN REDUCING MALNUTRITION** 

▲ Independence, it's distressing to note the huge mismatch between the country's creditable economic growth rate and rising curve of anaemia and abysmal quality of early childhood education and care. The NFHS V report (2019-21) brings out how 38% of our children are stunted and 57% are anaemic. The percentage of those afflicted with anaemia on an all India basis has increased from 53% (2015-16) to 57% (2019-21). The situation is particularly disconcerting in states like Bihar (63.5%), Odisha (64.3%) and Gujarat (65%). This has a cascading impact on IMR, MMR and low birth weight babies. In Bihar, Odisha and Gujarat, the IMR is as high as 46.8%, 36.3% and 31.2% respectively, whereas in Kerala it's only 4.4%. As regards Early Childhood Education, the ASER survey by Pratham shows that only 16% of students in Class I can read textbooks, while 40% cannot recognise letters.

The ICDS programme unveiled in 1975 has today 16 lakh Anganwadi centers with 22 lakh workers to provide supplementary nutrition like protein, vitamin A, IFA and deworming medicines, basic health care and early childhood education to about 70 million children and

s India celebrated its 75th 15 million pregnant and nursing tween 2003 and 2006 anaemia went natal period for women. Article 47 tion of ₹20,135 crore. However, such programmes have failed to contain the proliferation of anaemia barring states like Kerala. The Poshan Abhiyan was launched by the PM in 2018 to reduce anaemia amongst adolescent girls by 3% per year. The NFHS V report, however, shows that none of the states has been able to achieve the target. While there is a lot of hype for promoting awareness through Jan Andolan, there is very little action on the ground to improve supply chain management and to connect stakeholders technologically.

As per the NFHS report, the deprivation in Vitamin A, IFA, and deworming for females is as high as 54%, 86% and 72% respectively. The deprivation is particularly high for poor girl children where the deficiency in intake of vitamin A, IFA and deworming is as high as 62%, 92% and 76% respectively. This leads to the question as to why the existing supply chain management is not able to meet the timely provision of supplements to adolescent girls and women. In an interesting study in UP, project UMANG was launched in 2003 amongst school children and it was found that bedown from 73% to 25% Interestingly 80% of the beneficiaries regularly consumed the supplements and the additional per head cost was found to be only \$0.36 dollar. This experiment clearly shows that a vigilant programme with empathetic stakeholders can significantly reduce anaemia in a time bound manner. Deficiency in Vitamin A, iodine and iron causes disability, premature death and reduced productivity. In adolescent girls' iron requirement increases by two fold to meet the loss of iron from the body with the onset of menstruation. Traditional diet is not able to make good the loss of blood. Therefore, IFA supplementation is critical to reduce anaemia amongst girls in the reproductive age group.

There is also a necessity to revisit the nodal system for providing nutrition through the Anganwadi system which has been existing since 1975. Quite clearly 7 crore children who are provided supplementary nutrition as well as 1 crore pregnant and nursing mother who get the benefit of vitamins, IFA are not being provided the critical nutrition requirement at critical stage up to the age of 3 years for a child and prenatal and postState to raise the level of nutrition and the standard of living and to improve public health as among its primary duties." It also implores the states to provide early childhood care and education. The Gender Gap report, the NFHS V report and ASER survey very clearly show that in our quest for high growth through free market mechanism, we have put the challenge of containing anaemia amongst children, adolescent girls and mothers and proper informal learning of children in the age group of 3-6 years in the backburner. Technology can be a powerful enabler in reducing malnutrition as has been proved by the Community Application Software being used in Angul district since 2015 in connecting all stakeholders through smart technology. We have shown how the UMANG initiative has been a game changer in containing malnutrition amongst school children in UP. This would require a community led approach where the state, the corporate and local community work as partners.



The ministry's clarification came hours after Union Minister for Housing and Urban Affairs Hardeep Singh Puri put out a tweet saying India has always welcomed those who have sought refuge in the country and announcing that all Rohingva refugees would be shifted to EWS flats in east Delhi's Bakkarwala area. The Home Ministry issued a statement clarifying its position. "Illegal foreigners are to be kept in Detention Centre till their deportation as per law. ### Madras HC orders in favour of OPS

Chennai, August 17: The power struggle in AIADMK has taken a turn with the Madras High Court giving an order in favour of former Chief Minister and coordinator O Panneerselvam (OPS).

The court Wednesday ordered maintenance of the status quo as of June 23 in the AIADMK. The July 11 General Council (GC) meeting of the party had elected Edappadi K Palaniswami (EPS) as the interim general secretary

Justice G Jayachandran of the Madras High Court passed the order on a petition filed by O Panneerselvam and party General Council member, P Varimuthu, who had challenged the legality of the GC meeting held July 11 in which Panneerselvam and those close to him were ousted from the party.

The single-bench judge of the Madras High Court ordered that the coordinator and joint coordinator can convene the GC again in the presence of a commissioner to oversee the council meeting.

Advocate Guru Krishnakumar appearing for OPS said that the General Council was a small body and it was made to appear as if the decision of the GC was the opinion of the entire party. Aravind Pandian, another advocate representing OPS argued that the party presidium chairman cannot con vene the GC meeting, but only can conduct it.

He said that there was no rule under the party bylaws that allows any other person other than the general secretary or the coordinator of the joint coordinator to convene the General Council meeting and, hence the GC was convened by the presidium chairman under Rule 19 and 20 of the AIADMK bylaw stands nullified.

However, the Palaniswami side represented by former Advocate General of Tamil Nadu, Vijay Narayanan, and two other lawyers argued that there were no illegalities or violations of the party code in calling the meeting.

They said that the actual announcement of the meeting was made on the floor of the June 23rd General Council meeting by the presidium chairman and the invitations were sent by the headquarters' office-bearers as the post of coordinator and joint coordinator had lapsed following a decision taken by the party executive committee in December 2021.

Justice Jayachandran after hearing both sides passed the order of maintaining the status quo of June 23 and treated the General council meeting of July 11 as null and void. The judgment will lead to OPS returning as the coordinator and EPS as the Joint coordinator.

# Govt approves ₹50K-cr credit support to hospitality sector SIT to probe death of six in Jammu-

New Delhi, August 17: The government Wednesday approved an additional ₹50,000 crore under the **Emergency Credit Line Guarantee** Scheme (ECLGS) to ensure lowcost credit flow to hospitality and related segments hit hard by the Covid-19 pandemic.

The Union Cabinet has approved the enhancement in the limit of ECLGS by ₹50,000 crore from ₹4.5 lakh crore to ₹5 lakh crore, with the additional amount being earmarked exclusively for enterprises in hospitality and related sectors, Information and Broadcasting Minister Anurag Singh Thakur told reporters here.

The increase has been done on account of the severe disruptions suffered by hospitality and related enterprises due to the pandemic.

The enhancement is expected to provide much needed relief to enterprises in these sectors by incentivising lending institutions to REPRESENTATIONAL IMAGE

provide additional credit of up to ₹50,000 crore at low cost, an official statement said. The ECLGS was announced in May 2020 in wake of the outbreak of Covid-19 to help various sectors, especially in the MSME segment, to get credit at a concessional rate of 7 per cent. Loans of about ₹3.67 lakh crore have been sanctioned under ECLGS till August 5, 2022. In Union Budget 2022-23, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman had announced extending the validity of ECLGS till March 2023 and an increase in the limit of guaranteed cover by ₹50,000 crore.

Jammu, August 17: Six people, family, were found dead under mysterious circumstances here Wednesday, prompting police to set up a special investigation team to probe the turn of events. The bodies of the victims, in-

cluding three women, were recovered from two adjoining houses in the posh Tawi Vihar in Sidhra area around 1 am, police said, adding that prima facie, it appears that they were poisoned.

Noor Ul Habib, Sakina Begum, her daughter Naseema Akhter and grandson Sajad Ahmad Magrey were found dead inside Habib's house. The bodies of Sakina's other daughter Rubina Bano and son Zafar Salim were recovered from the nearby house, the official said.

"A four-member Special Investigation Team (SIT) headed by Superintendent of Police (Rural) Sanjay Sharma has been formed to investigate the incident," Senior

Superintendent of Police (Jammu)

Chandan Kohli said. A police spokesperson said a call was received from Habib's sister Shahzada, a resident of Srinagar's Barzulla locality, wherein she expressed apprehension that her brother might have committed suicide as he was not answering her calls. After reaching Habib's house, police found it bolted from inside and noticed a foul smell emanating from it. The doors of the house were broken down and four semidecomposed bodies were found inside. Local people informed police that the nearby house belonged to Sakina, a widow who originally hailed from Doda district and was living with her family. When the police reached the other house, they found two more bodies there, the spokesman said, adding "Prima facie, it appears to be a case of poisoning. It is being ascertained whether it is a case of forced poisoning or the victims committed suicide." SSP Kohli also rushed to the spot and ordered a thorough probe into the incident. The bodies have been shifted to Government Medical College and Hospital here for post-mortem examination, Kohli said.

## World's biggest cities face worst air quality: Report

*India* is home to 18 of the 20 cities with the most severe increase in fine particle pollutants (PM2.5) from 2010 to 2019, according to a comprehensive and detailed analysis of air pollution and global health effects for over 7,000 cities released Wednesday

New Delhi, August 17: The world's biggest cities and urban areas face some of the worst air quality on the planet, a new report published by the US-based research organization Health Effects Institute (HEI) said on Wednesday.

The report, Air Quality and Health in Cities, released by HEI's State of Global Air Initiative, provides a comprehensive and detailed analysis of air pollution and global health effects for more than 7.000 cities around the world, focusing on two of the most harmful pollutants; fine particulate matter (PM2.5) and nitrogen dioxide (NO2).

In 2019, 1.7 million deaths linked to PM2.5 exposure occurred in the 7,239 cities included in the analysis, with cities in Asia, Africa, and Eastern and Central Europe seeing the greatest health impacts.

By the year 2050, as much as 68 per cent of the world's population is expected to live in urban areas. This rapid urbanisation places the world's top cities at the forefront in the battle to reduce the health effects of air pollution, especially in low- and middle-income coun-



tries. The report, using data from 2010 to 2019, found that global patterns for exposures to the two-key air pollutants are strikingly different. While exposures to fine particulate, or PM2.5 pollution tend to be higher in cities located in lowand middle-income countries, exposure to nitrogen dioxide, or NO2,

is high across cities in high-income as well as low- and middle-income countries

NO2 comes mainly from the burning of fuels often in older vehicles, power plants, industrial facilities, and residential cooking and heating. As city residents tend to live closer to busy roads with

According to the **WHO's Air Quality** database, only 117 nations currently have ground-level monitoring systems to track PM2.5, and only 74 nations are monitoring NO2 levels

dense traffic, they are often exposed to higher NO2 pollution than residents of rural areas.

In 2019, 86 per cent of the more than 7,000 cities included in this report exceeded the WHO's 10 Ig/m3 guideline for NO2, impacting about 2.6 billion people. While PM2.5 pollution tends to get more attention on known hotspots around the world, less data has been available for NO2 at this global scale.

Susan Anenberg of George Washington University, one of the project collaborators, said: "Since most cities around the world have no ground-based air quality monitoring in place, estimates of particulate and gas pollution levels can be used to plan air quality management approaches that ensure the air is clean and safe to breathe.

The report also highlights data gaps in low- and middle-income nations, a key aspect to understanding and addressing the health

effects of air pollution. Strategic investments in groundlevel air quality monitoring systems and expanded use of satellites and other emerging technologies in targeted regions can provide crit-

ical first steps toward cleaner air. The report combined groundbased air quality data with satellites and models to produce airquality estimates for cities around the world.

## **Delhi in 2019 saw 106** deaths per lakh people due to PM2.5 pollution

New Delhi, August 17: Delhi and Kolkata reported 106 and 99 deaths per 1 lakh population in 2019 which could be attributed to PM2.5 pollution, according to a new report published by US-based Health Effects Institute Wednesday.

In 2019, Delhi recorded an annual average PM2.5 concentration of 110 microgram per cubic metre, the highest among the most-populous cities in the world, followed by Kolkata (84 microgram per cubic metre), said the report Air Quality and Health in Cities by the State of Global Air Initiative, a collabora tion between the Health Effects Institute and the Institute for Health Metrics and Evaluation's Global Burden of Disease project.

The report summarises data on air pollution exposures and associated health impacts in 7,239 cities (with minimum population of 50,000) from 2010 to 2019. It combines ground-based air quality data with satellites and models to produce air quality estimates for cities around the world.

PM2.5 refers to fine particles (measuring 2.5 µm or less in diameter) that penetrate deep into the body and fuel inflammation in the ing to the risk of having cardiovascular and respiratory problems, including a weak immune system.

Beijing in China had the highest PM2.5-attributable death rate of 124 in 2019. Delhi and Kolkata ranked sixth and eighth, respectively.

The report said the burden of PM2.5 on health has grown rapidly in cities in Southeast Asia.

Of 7,239 cities analysed, all the 20 cities with the largest increase in PM2.5-attributable death rates from 2010 to 2019 are located in Southeast Asia, including 19 cities in Indonesia and one in Malaysia. All 20 cities reported increase of more than 10 microgram per cubic metre in PM2.5 exposures in 2019 compared with 2010, it said.

The report said geographic patterns of nitrogen dioxide (NO2) pollution are strikingly different from the patterns seen for PM2.5

pollution. PM2.5 pollution tends to be highest in cities in low and middle-income countries, whereas NO2 levels are high in large cities across countries of all income levels.

New Delhi, August 17: Amid a spike in Covid-19 cases in the national capital, there has been a nearly two-fold increase in hospitalisations in over a fortnight; with officials saying those with comorbidities are getting admitted to

Even though the rise in infections and hospitalisations is not yet alarming, experts have reiterated the need to wear masks and follow Covid-appropriate behaviour.

Of the 9,405 available beds for coronavirus patients in Delhi, 307 (3.26 per cent) were occupied August 1. The occupancy rate was 3.75 per cent August 2 and four per cent the day after. It kept on rising on most days thereafter and stood at 6.24 per cent August 16.

The bed occupancy rate was five per cent August 6 and 5.97 per cent August 11. The occupancy rate was 6.13 per cent August 12 and declined marginally to 5.99 per cent the next day. It rose to 6.21 per cent August 14 and stood at 6.31 per cent August 15.

Dr Vikas Maurya, Director and HOD, Pulmonology, Fortis Hospital Shalimar Bagh, said in the last one week or so, they are observing a rise in hospital admissions due to the viral infection.

Most of the patients are those who have multiple comorbidities and some of them are also unvaccinated. Some patients also have had lung involvement, which meant that they required antiviral treatment and other Covid



### Yamuna crosses warning level again in Delhi, to swell further

New Delhi, August 17: The Yamuna crossed the warning mark of 204.5 metres in Delhi again Wednesday with Harvana releasing more water from the Hathnikund barrage amid rains in the upper catchment areas, officials said.

The river had breached the danger mark of 205.33 metres Fridav following heavy rains in the upper catchment areas, prompting authorities to evacuate around 7,000 people from low-lying areas. The warning mark Monday and stood at 203.96 metres at 6pm Tuesday.

However, the water level rose again and crossed the warning mark around midnight. It stood at 204.89 metres at 7am Wednesday, the Delhi government's flood control room said. A forecast issued by the Central Water Commission said the river is likely to rise to  $205.25\,\mathrm{metres}$  by 9pm and remain stable thereafter.

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has said widespread rainfall with isolated heavy falls is very likely over Himachal

Pradesh and Uttarakhand over the next two-three days.

The catchment of the Yamuna river system covers parts of Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, Haryana, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh and Delhi. Last week, Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Keiriwal appealed to people to avoid going towards the banks of the river.

Flood alert is declared in Delhi when the discharge rate from the Hathnikund barrage in Haryana's Yamuna Nagar crosses the one lakh-cusecs mark and people living near the floodplains and in floodprone areas are evacuated.

The Yamuna floodplains and low-lying areas in Delhi near the river are considered vulnerable to flooding. They are home to around 37,000 people. The overflowing Yamuna had affected lowlying areas near the river in northeast, east and southeast Delhi last week and around 7.000 people were shifted to higher ground.

The Delhi flood control room re ported a discharge rate of around 14,000 cusecs from the Hathnikund Barrage in Harvana's Yamuna Nagar at 6am Wednesday

### Now on, consumers in UP can buy only 1 unit of cough syrup

Lucknow, August 17: Consumers will no longer be able to buy more than one unit of codeine-based cough syrups in Uttar Pradesh, following orders issued by the food and drug administration department.

Codeine, a medical derivative of opium, is a prodrug used to treat pain, coughing and diarrhoea.

Almost all kinds of cough syrups contain codeine. AK Jain, drug controller, said, "Though it has mild pain-relieving properties, it is a powerful drug and one can get addicted to it.

Citing provisions under rules 51 and 52 of the Uttar Pradesh Drug Rules, Jain has fixed the number of units a company depot and clearing and forwarding agents (C&F), a whole-seller and a retailer can store and sell to ensure that it is not misused.

As per the order, company depots and C&F agents can store any packing of codeine-based cough syrup, but sell only 500 units of the same.

Wholesellers, on the other hand, can store 1,000 units of the syrup, but sell not more 100 units of the formulation. Retailers will be able to store not more than 100 units of the same and sell only one



to a single customer.

The same order also regulates sale of high intensity painkillers like those based on compounds like tramadol, pentazocine and buprenorphine along with antidepressants like alprazolam, clonazepam, nitrazepam, diazepam in all strengths and combinations.

As per the order, tramadol-based painkillers will be provided only on a medical prescription thought they can buy 20 tabletscapsulesampoules of alprazolam and clonazepam. Ten units of nitrezepam and pentazocine are allowed.

However, since anti-depressants belong to the Schedule-H of the drug manual in India, they cannot be bought over the counter which means that prescription is a must for them. Also, not more than 10 tablets of buprenorphinebased pain killers can be bought

### Slippers, shampoo, biscuits for jail inmates in UP under new manual

Lucknow, August 17: Slippers for convicted prisoners, a creche and nursery for children of inmates, evening tea and biscuits, shampoo, sanitary napkins will now be available in jails in Uttar Pradesh.

The jail manual in the state has been modified sufficiently to provide better facilities to prisoners, especially female prisoners. The amendments approved by

the state Cabinet in the new prison manual are based on the orders given by various courts from time to time. Minister of state for prisons and

home guards Dharamveer Prajapati told reporters that the recommendations of the All-India Jail Reform Committee and Human Rights Commission have also been con-



sidered in the new jail manual. Additional Chief Secretary (Home) Avanish Kumar Awasthi said that the jail manual has been changed and the punishment of 'kala pani' in Port Blair has been abolished after 100 years.

Awasthi said that acting on the instructions of Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, the new prison manual has been im-

plemented and it will not only improve the living conditions of the criminals in the jails, but also promote the advancement of their education and professional skills. "Focus has also been made on maximum use of technology," he said.

Starting with reforms, from now on Fast and Secured Transmission of Electronic Records' (FASTER), a software to transmit court orders from the Supreme Court swiftly, securely through electronic mode will now be accepted across the state.

'The aim is to avoid a situation where release of prisoners gets delayed even after Supreme Court grants them bail, solely on grounds of delay in jail authorities getting certified hard copies of release order," he said.

In an official release, PETA India Veterinary Policy Advisor Dr Nithin Krishnegowda said: "These attacks are a wake-up call that if India continues to allow dogs, typically used for cruel human exploits such as criminal dogfighting-- to be bred, more people will

get hurt. A prohibition on all breeds used for unlawful fighting would protect these dogs from being born only to face cruelty and suffering and protect many hu-

In India, inciting dogs to fight is illegal under the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (PCA) Act, 1960. Yet organised dogfights are prevalent in parts of North India, The state has already reportedly shown an interest in prohibiting pitbull, rottweiler, and mastiff breeds

making Pitbull-type dogs and others used in these fights the most abused dog breeds.

Pitbulls are commonly bred to be used in illegal fighting or kept on heavy chains as attack dogs, resulting in a lifetime of suffering.

Many endure painful physical mutilations such as ear-cropping, an illegal process that involves removing part of a dog's ears to prevent another dog from grabbing them during a fight.

These dogs are encouraged to continue fighting until they become exhausted and at least one is seriously injured or dies.

### **LUCKNOW ZOO TO BE SHIFTED TO NEW LOCATION**



## Now taste local flavours as vendors return on trains

New Delhi, August 17: Bringing back the nostalgia of buying local wares from hawkers and gorging on regional cuisines, the Railways will now allow vendors to sell their goods on trains, as part of its efforts to boost local businesses.

The Railways will also provide them designer carts and kiosks to sell their wares at stations and on trains. Part of the "One Station One Product" policy announced this year in the Union budget, the Railways aims to promote a local product at each railway station.

Earlier, hawkers used to board trains at stations selling local products, mostly food items to passengers. However, they were illegal and raised both safety and hygiene concerns. The Railways conducted large scale eviction drives which eventually making them a rarity on board trains and even at stations.

Now, however, the variety on offer would range from food products to handicrafts to household goods to decorative items, and would be sold with permission of the national transporter.

## **Can't prevent political** parties from making promises: Apex court

New Delhi, August 17: Political parties and individuals cannot be prevented from making poll promises aimed at fulfilling the constitutional mandate and the term "freebie" should not be confused with genuine welfare measures, the Supreme Court said Wednesday.

Observing that the voters are not looking for freebies, the top court referred to the Mahatma Gandhi Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme and said, "Given an opportunity, they will look for dignified earning". 'We all must remember the

good old saying: 'There is no free lunch', "the apex court said, adding the "concern is about the right way of spending public money". "There has to be a distinction be-

ween the offer of ornaments, television sets, consumer electronics free of cost and real welfarist offers. The promise of free coaching for professional courses cannot be compared with the promise of free white goods," a bench headed by Chief Justice N V Ramana said.

The bench, also including justices J K Maheshwari and Hima Kohli is mulling and setting up an expert panel to brainstorm the issue of freebies announced during elections.

It said that the issue of regulating freebies is "getting increasingly complicated" and asked all the stakeholders to give their suggestions on the proposed panel while fixing the PIL for hearing August 22. At the outset, the bench said the expression 'freebie' should not be confused with genuine welfare measures" and gave illustrations to distinguish between freebies and "real welfarist offer"

### CBI FREEZES ANUBRATA'S FDS WORTH ₹16.97CRORE

**CATTLE SMUGGLING CASE**

New Delhi, August 17: The CBI has frozen fixed deposits worth ₹16.97 crore allegedly belonging to TMC leader Anubrata Mondal and his family members in connection with a case of cattle smuggling across the Indo-Bangladesh border, officials said Wednesday.

The agency detected the fixed deposits in State Bank of India, Axis Bank and Bank of India during the questioning of several close aides of Mondal and other witnesses during its ongoing probe in the case, they said.

The probe has found that Mondal allegedly gave cash to his aides who used to deposit it in bank accounts and later set up fixed deposits in his name, they said.

The central agency kept the heat on Mondal and grilled his accountant Manish Kothari for over two hours at its temporary camp office in Bolpur.

The agency also recorded statements of two bank officials of the bank where the Mondal has accounts, the CBI officials said. The CBI suspects that several

bank accounts belonging to Mondal's daughter Sukanya were used for financial transactions in the scam, they said.

A four member agency team on Wednesday visited Mondal's Nichupatti residence in Bolpur to question Sukanya, a primary school teacher, but left within 10 minutes after she refused to talk to them.

The team had gone to question Sukanya about the alleged wealth accumulated by her which does not look justified going by her salary and profession. The team returned after she said she was not in an "emotionally good shape' due to the recent death of her mother and arrest of her father. The CBI officials said she did not cooperate in the investigation.

Under scanner are several properties in the name of Sukanya, who is also director in some companies.

Mondal (62), who is currently TMC's Birbhum district president and member of the party's national working committee, rose to prominence in the 11 years of the TMC regime in Bengal, mostly for his audacious statements and browbeating.

### KASHMIRI PANDIT MURDER **PROTEST HELD IN JAMMU**

Meanwhile, Kashmiri Pandits serving in the Valley held a massive protest against the killing of their community member in Shopian and demanded that the employees in Kashmir under the prime minister's package be relocated to Jammu in view of selective and targeted killings.





#### Many feared dead in **Kabul mosque blast**

Kabul: Many worshippers are feared dead following an explosion inside a mosque in the northern part of the Afghan capital Kabul. The blast occurred during evening prayer in the Kotal-e Khairkhana area of the city, Kabul police spokesman Khalid Zadran was quoted as saying by dpa Wednesday. Zadran said the exact number of casualties was not clear but security forces were investigating the incident. Unconfirmed reports suggested that at least 20 people, including the mosque Imam Mawlawi Amir Mohammad Kabuli, were killed in the blast and 40 others were injured.

### 5 Islamist ultras get death sentence

# Here to kill Queen: Windsor **Castle intruder told police**

Indians have long demanded a formal apology from Britain for what is also known as the 1919 Jallianwala Bagh massacre, when British troops opened fire on unarmed civilians who had gathered to protest against a colonial law



London, August 17: A man arrested at Queen Elizabeth's Windsor Castle home on Christmas Day last year wearing a mask and holding a crossbow told security "I am here to kill the queen", a British court heard Wednesday.

Jaswant Singh Chail, 20, who has been charged under Britain's Treason Act, had spent months planning the attack and trying to gain access to the royal family, London's Westminster Magistrates' Court was told.

Prosecutors said Chail, from Southampton in southern England, recorded a video before he entered the grounds of the castle to the west of London where the 96-yearold monarch mostly resides. She was there on the day of the intrusion.

"I am sorry for what I have done and what I will do. I am going to attempt to assassinate Elizabeth,

queen of the royal family," he said in the video, in which he was seen holding a crossbow and wearing a face covering.

"This is revenge for those who died in the 1919 massacre," Chail said, referring to an incident when British troops shot dead nearly 400 Sikhs in their holy city of Amritsar in northwestern India. "It is also revenge for those who have been killed, humiliated and discriminated on because of their race." he said.

Queen Elizabeth laid a wreath at the site of the massacre during a visit to India in 1997 and referred to it as a "distressing example" of "difficult episodes" in the past.

'SUPERSONIC X-BOW' Chail, who appeared at Wednesday's court hearing via videolink, spoke briefly to confirm his name, his date of birth and gave his address as Broadmoor, a high-security psychiatric hospital. He did not enter a plea

#### Prosecutors say man spent months planning attack

- Intruder was found in grounds of Windsor Castle with crossbow
- 'Revenge for those who have been killed, humiliated and discriminated'

The queen was at the castle on the day of the intrusion with her son and heir Prince Charles and other close family members.

The prosecution said Chail had entered the grounds at 8.10 am and was spotted by a protection officer in an area where the intruder would have access to the private quarters of the castle

The officer, who said Chail looked like something out of a vigilante film or dressed for Halloween in a hood and mask, asked: "Can I help you?"

The court heard that Chail re sponded: "I am here to kill the queen". The officer drew his taser and shouted at Chail to get on his knees and drop the crossbow. Chail complied

The recovered crossbow was a "Supersonic X-bow", the discharged bolt from which has the potential to cause serious or fatal injuries, the prosecution said.

Searches of Chail's home found a gas mask, rope and electronic devices which showed he had previously applied to the Ministry of Defence and the Grenadier Guards in an effort to make contact with the royal family.

Chail has been charged with making threats to kill, possession of an offensive weapon and an offence under section 2 of the Treason Act 1842, which details punishment for having a weapon with intent "to injure or alarm Her Majesty"

### **Prominent Vatican Cardinal named in** sexual assault suit

Rome, August 17: Vatican Cardinal Marc Ouellet is the highest-ranking clergyman accused in a court document in Canada made public Tuesday as part of a class action lawsuit against the Quebec Catholic diocese alleging sexual assault, the complainant' lawyer said.

The lawsuit represents more than 100 people, including minors, who were alleged to have been sexually assaulted by 88 priests and staff working at the Quebec diocese starting in 1940, according to a court document and a news release issued by the Arsenault Dufresne Wee firm which filed the class action.

In the filing in Quebec Superior Court, an anonymous complainant alleges Ouellet inappropriately touched her, including by rubbing her shoulders and back, and made comments that made her feel uncomfortable.

The document states the interactions took place between 2008 and 2010 when Ouellet was archbishop of Quebec and head of the diocese and she was working as a 23-year-old intern. Ouellet faces no criminal charges.

Ouellet now heads the Vatican's powerful Congregation for Bishops which advises the pope on which priests should be made bishops. He is on many experts' short lists of candidates to succeed Pope Francis after the pontiff dies or resigns.

One of two resident Canadian cardinals at the Vatican, he accompanied Pope Francis on his trip to Canada last month.

The woman's complaint against Ouellet was filed directly to the Vatican in 2021 and assigned to priest Jacques Servais, a theologian tasked with looking into the matter; the woman said she had yet to learn of any conclusions, the filing said.

The class action was authorized in May to proceed. Arsenault said he expects the number of victims in the class action will grow after the filing Tuesday.

The situation in Ukraine shows that the US is trying to drag the conflict out, and it acts in exactly the same way trying to fuel conflicts in Asia, Africa and Latin America.'

#### China to send troops to Russia for 'Vostok'

Beijing: Chinese troops will travel to Russia to take part in joint military exercises led by the host and including India, Belarus, Mongolia, Tajikistan and other countries, China's defence ministry said Wednesday. China's participation in the joint exercises was "unrelated to the current international and regional situation", the ministry said in a statement. Last month, Moscow announced plans to hold "Vostok' (East) exercises from August 30 to September 5, even as it wages a costly war in Ukraine. It said at the time that some foreign forces would participate, without naming them. Its last such exercises took place in 2018, when China took part for the first time. China's defence ministry said its participation in the exercises was part of an ongoing bilateral annual cooperation agreement with Russia.

### MULTIPLE BOMB, ARSON ATTACKS ROCK THAILAND



Bangkok, August 17: Explosions and fires ripped through at least 17 locations in southern Thailand Wednesday, authorities said, in what appeared to be multiple coordinated

attacks that injured seven people. The bombings and arson attacks happened after midnight and targeted convenience stores and a gas station across three provinces, lightly injuring at least seven, according to police and military statements. No one has claimed re-

sponsibility for the attacks so far. Provinces in southern Thailand along the border with Malaysia have seen a decades-long, low-level insurgency, in which the Thai government has battled shadowy groups seeking independence for the predominantly Muslim provinces of Pattani, Yala, Narathiwat and parts of Songkhla.

More than 7,300 people have been killed in the conflict since 2004, according to the Deep South Watch group, which monitors the violence. Peace talks that began in 2013 have faced repeated disruptions.

Wednesday's attacks came after the Thai government earlier this vear restarted discussions with the main insurgent group, the Barisan Revolusi Nasional, after a two-year hiatus due to the pandemic.

### China races to alleviate drought, power cuts

China has repeatedly warned that it faces a proliferation of extreme weather events in coming years as it tries to adapt to climate change and rises in temperature that are likely to be more severe than elsewhere

Shanghai, August 17: China is scrambling to alleviate power shortages and bring more water to the drought-hit basin of the Yangtze river as it hattles a record-breaking heatwave by deploying relief funds, seeding clouds and developing new sources of supply.

For more than two months, baking temperatures have disrupted crop growth, threatened livestock and forced industries in the hydropower-dependent regions of the southwest to shut down so as to ensure electricity supplies for homes.

On Wednesday, China's southwestern province of Sichuan said it would ration power supplies to homes, offices and shopping malls, after having already ordered energyintensive metals and fertiliser producers to curb operations.

In what appears to be an official call to cut back use of electricity, government offices were asked to set air conditioners no lower than 26 degrees Celsius (78.8°F) and use more staircases instead of lifts, the Sichuan Daily, run by the provincial government, said.

Fountains, light shows and commercial activities after dark are to be suspended, it added.

Hydropower makes up about 80% of Sichuan's power capacity, but dwindling water flows on the Yangtze and its tributaries led to a struggle to meet mounting demand



for air conditioning as temperatures soared to 40 degrees Celsius (104 F) and beyond.

Drought throughout the Yangtze river basin was also "adversely affecting" drinking water for rural people and livestock, as well as the growth of crops, the water resources ministry said in a notice.

To boost downstream supplies, China's biggest hydropower project, the Three Gorges dam, will step up water discharges by 500 million cubic metres over the next 10 days, it said Tuesday. Water flows there this week were about half those of a year earlier.

Some livestock from droughthit areas had been temporarily moved elsewhere, the finance ministry said this week, promising disaster relief of 300 million yuan (\$44.30 million)

### Pak makes currency $\dashv$ declaration by all int'l passengers mandatory

Islamabad, August 17: The Pakistan government has made currency declaration by all international passengers mandatory, as part of the measures taken to curb money laundering to fulfil the condition of the Financial Action Task Force (FATF), according to a notification issued by the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA).

The notification came as an FATF team was expected to arrive in Pakistan next month for "onsite" visit to verify steps taken by Islamabad to curb money laundering and terror financing, The Express Tribune reported. A successful on-site visit would pave the way for Pakistan getting out of the FATF grey list.

The CAA issued the notification on the instructions of the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR). The notification said that a declaration form would have to be filled and handed over to the airline staff, in which the passenger would show details of domestic and foreign currency.

No international passenger would be able to board the flight or leave the airport without submitting the declaration, it said.

The notification added that the passengers would be required to submit the currency declaration form to the customs staff before checking in for the flight.

The authority had issued instructions that currency declaration forms should be made available at booking offices of the airlines.

It added that domestic and foreign airlines, pilots and staff had been informed about the details regarding the provisions of the customs declaration form, The Express Tribune reported.







### FPIs' stock holding slips 14% to \$523bn

New Delhi: The value of the foreign portfolio investors (FPI) holdings in the domestic equities dropped 14 per cent to \$523 billion in the three months ended June 2022 from the preceding quarter, according to a Morningstar report. This was the third consecutive quarterly decline in the value of FPIs' investments in Indian equities. Foreign investors were cautious since the start of the year and it intensified as the year progressed, following the influence of worrying trends in both global and domestic markets.

#### MFI sector's loan portfolio grows 24%

Mumbai: Microfinance (MFI) industry witnessed a growth of 24 per cent in its loan portfolio at Rs 2,75,750 crore during the April-June quartr as against Rs 2,22,307 crore in the year-ago period, a report said Wednesday. The portfolio of all lenders stood at Rs 2,62,599 crore as on March 31, 2022, according to the report released by Sa-Dhan, an RBI recognised Self-Regulatory Organisation (SRO) for microfinance institutions. #### **CCPA fines Flipkart** for faulty cookers

Flipkart has also been directed to notify consumers of all 598 pressure cookers sold on its platform, recall the pressure cookers and reimburse money to the consumers, CCPA Chief Commissioner Nidhi Khare

### **Cabinet approves** 1.5% interest aid on agriculture loan

New Delhi, August 17: With RBI hiking the lending rate, the Union Cabinet Wednesday earmarked Rs 34.856 crore towards the interest subvention scheme to help banks provide short term agriculture loans of up to Rs 3 lakh at a rate of 7 per cent.

Information and Broadcasting Minister Anurag Singh Thakur said the Cabinet has decided to restore interest subvention on short term agriculture loans to 1.5 per cent for all financial institutions. The interest subvention of 1.5

per cent will be provided to lending institutions for financial years 2022-23 to 2024-25 for short term loans of up to Rs 3 lakh to the farmers. The interest subvention support

requires additional budgetary provisions of Rs 34,856 crore for the period of 2022-23 to 2024-25 under the scheme, an official statement said.

Thakur said the government's support to banks for the interest subvention scheme was stopped in May 2020 as lenders were themselves able to provide short term agriculture loan at 7 per cent.

However, with the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) increasing the repo rate or short-term lending rate thrice by 140 basis points in recent months, it became necessary to compensate banks so that they can continue providing agriculture loans at 7 per cent.

Thakur also said the government has not let the fertiliser prices to rise despite the increase in global prices. Further, the minister said the fertiliser subsidy in the current fiscal year is likely to be more than Rs 2 lakh crore.

In the Union Budget for 2022-23, the fertiliser subsidy was estimated at Rs 1.05 lakh crore. The subsidy was Rs 1.62 lakh crore in the last financial year.

On the interest subvention scheme, the official statement said the government support will ensure sustainability of credit flow in the agriculture sector as well as ensure financial health and viability of the lending institutions, especially regional rural banks and cooperative banks

Banks will be able to absorb the increase in the cost of funds following the hike in repo rate by RBI and will be encouraged to grant loans to farmers for short term agriculture requirements

# India's oil demand to rise 7.7% in '22

New Delhi, August 17: India's demand for petroleum products like per cent in 2022, the fastest pace in the world, an OPEC report said.

India's demand for oil products is projected to rise from 4.77 million barrels per day (bpd) in 2021 to 5.14 million bpd in 2022, OPEC said in its monthly oil report.

The growth in demand is the fastest in the world ahead of 1.23 per cent of China, 3.39 per cent of the US and 4.62 per cent of Europe.

For 2023, the Organisation of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) projected a growth of 4.67 per cent in India's demand to 5.38 per cent. This, however, will be lower than 4.86 per cent growth in China.

The demand for petroleum products in India is supported by the healthy economic growth of 7.1 per cent, continuing economic reopening amid ease of Covid restrictions and easing of trade-related bottlenecks supporting both mobility and industrial sector activity.

India's crude imports edged higher averaging 4.7 million bpd in June, with Russian oil flows up 0.9 million bpd, the report said quoting secondary sources.

"In terms of crude imports by source, Kpler data shows Russia moving up to be the top supplier of crude to India in June, securing a 24 per cent share. Iraq fell to second with a share of 21 per cent, followed by Saudi Arabia which was stable at 15 per cent," it said.

New Delhi: India's crude oil imports from Russia in July fell for the first time since March along with its overall purchase while supplies from Saudi Arabia rebounded for the first in five months, data obtained from trade and industry sources showed. Indian refiners lifted more term supplies from Saudi Arabia as prices were attractive while prices for Russian supplies have climbed on robust demand. India shipped in 877,400 barrels per day (bpd) oil from Russia in July, a decline of about 7.3% from June, with Moscow continuing as its second biggest oil supplier after Iraq. Overall India shipped in 3.2% less oil in July at 4.63 million bpd from June as some refineries planned maintenance turnaround from August, the data showed. India's oil imports from Saudi Arabia rose by 25.6% to 824,700 bpd in July, the highest in three months, the data showed, after the producer lowered official selling price in June and July compared with May. Saudi Arabia stayed at No 3 spot among India's suppliers.

ganisation of the world's major oil exporting nations such as Saudi Arabia and Iraq, stated that India's crude imports are likely to remain close to current levels in July, with Russian inflows remaining above 1 million bpd and with expectations for slightly lower flows from elsewhere.

The 30-share BSE benchmark jumped 417.92 points or 0.70 per cent to settle at 60,260.13 -- closing above the psychologically key 60,000-mark for the first time since April 5 this year.

Similarly, the broader NSE Niftv spurted 119 points or 0.67 per cent to finish at 17,944.25, marking its seventh straight session of gains.

## Govt projects record foodgrain output this crop yr

New Delhi, August 17: India's wheat production is projected to have declined nearly 3 per cent to 106.84 million tonne while the overall foodgrain production is estimated to have touched record 315.72 million tonne in the 2021-22

Releasing the fourth advance estimate for the 2021-22 crop year, the Union agriculture ministry on Wednesday said a record output is also estimated for rice, maize,

gram, pulses, rapeseed and mustard, oilseeds and sugarcane.

The crop year 2021-22 was from July 2021 to June 2022.

The country's overall foodgrain production is estimated to be record 315.72 million tonne in the crop year that ended in June 2022, according to the ministry. In the 2020-21 crop year, the

country's foodgrain output, comprising wheat, rice, pulses and coarse cereals, stood at record 310.74 million tonne.

As per the data, wheat produc-



tion is pegged lower at 106.84 million tonne in the 2021-22 crop year as against 109.59 million tonne in

the previous year. However, rice production is pro-

jected at record 130.29 million tonne in the crop year under review as against 124.37 million tonne in the year-ago period.



# Ray of hope for AIFF



New Delhi, August 17: The Supreme Court Wednesday deferred till August 22 hearing on the All India Football Federation (AIFF) matter after the Centre said it is in discussion with FIFA over holding of the U-17 Women's world cup in India.

The court also asked the Centre to take proactive steps to hold the world cup in India and lift the suspension of AIFF.

Meanwhile, FIFA's ban on AIFF came as a surprise for the Odisha government. The iconic Kalinga Stadium was scheduled to host six group matches, including India's that were to be played October 11, 14 and 17.

Sources informed that the state  $\,$ government has already spent nearly Rs 70 crore on building infrastructure for the mega event.

The state government has already upgraded the football stadium in accordance with FIFA standards. Four practice pitches, including one inside the Kalinga Stadium and three in different parts of Bhubaneswar, have been developed, which can also be used in future for hosting other tournaments

An artificial grass pitch has also been developed for practice.

A bench of Justices DY Chandrachud, AS Bopanna and JB Paridwala was told by Solicitor General Tushar Mehta that two meetings have been held by the government and committee of administrators with FIFA and efforts are being made to "break some ice" on the holding of the U-17 Women's World Cup in India.

New Delhi, August 17: Odisha 'will' play host to 2023 Men's hockey World Cup after international hockey federation (FIH) made it clear that it "does not consider the court as third party", ruling out the possibility of a ban with only months left for the World Cup in Bhubaneswar and Rourkela.

A two-member delegation from the FIH is in the national capital to discuss the way forward and avert a possible suspension of Hockey India (HI), currently placed under a CoA on the directive of the Delhi HC.

The meeting was attended by FIH's acting president Seif Ahmed, CEO Thierry Weil and the members of the CoA - Justice Anil R Dave, former Judge of the Supreme Court, SY Quraishi, former Chief Election Commissioner of India and Zafar Igbal, a former Olympian.

Speaking in context of the Delhi HC order with respect to HI, Ahmed said, "We don't consider the court as a third party and respect the judiciary. We believe that the order of a court is not an interference.'

Dave said, "The interaction was extremely positive and encouraging. We have been able to conclude and agree on some important next steps to ensure the continued smooth

New Delhi, August 17: The Indian men's team will be playing a whopping 138 bilateral international matches during the next five-year Future Tours & Programme (FTP) Cycle between May 2023 to April 2027, the ICC said Wednesday.

Most sought-after team commercially, the 'Men In Blue' will play 38 Tests, 39 ODIs and 61 T20Is in the five-year period and focus on shortest format is an indicator how pri orities across formats will be change ing. The ODI bilaterals will remain but mostly be three-match series.

India expectedly has a choc-a-bloc calender but as usual there won't be any bilateral cricket series with Pakistan due to obvious political reasons.

The 12 Members will play a total of 777 international matches – 173 Tests, 281 ODIs and 323 T20Is - in the 2023-2027 FTP cycle compared to the 694 in the current one.

This includes the next two cycles of the ICC Men's World Test Championship, multiple ICC events and a host of bilateral as well as triseries action.

As far as India's schedule is concerned, the traditional India versus Australia Test series for the Border-Gavaskar Trophy, that used to be a four-match affair for a long time will become five-Test series.

India will be playing five-Test series against both England and Australia and also on the T20 front, there are a lot of five-match series which is on expected lines with the broadcasters demand with premium advertisement rates for short-form matches.

The Indian team will play 27 ODI games before the 2023 50-over World Cup in India scheduled in October-November next year. The run starts with India's series against Zimbabwe in Harare from Thursday.

The chunk among the 27 ODIs is from the previous FTP cycle which also include home three-match series against South Africa and an away three-match event against New Zealand just after T20 World Cup.

uring the next FTP cycle, India to visit West Indies (July-Aug 2023) for a full series including 2 Tests, ODIs and 3 T20Is.

The 5-Test home series against England will be tentatively held between Jan-March in 2024.

ndia's trip Down Under is in December-January, 2024-25 when they play Australia in a 5-Test series for the first time since 1991.

India will host Bangladesh for a 2-Test series in September 2024.

Australia and England during the same five-year phase will be playing 40 and 43 Tests respectively.

The inaugural World Test Champions New Zealand in the next cycle have 32 Tests earmarked, while South Africa in the same duration play only 29 Tests. They mostly play two and some 3-Test series.

Pakistan have only 27 Tests between May 2023-April 2027 while Sri Lanka and West Indies play 25 Tests

### PSL to clash with mighty IPL in 2025

NEW DELHI: The Pakistan Super League (PSL) is set to clash with the mighty Indian Premier League (IPL) in the summer of 2025 due to Pakistan's packed home season, which sees them host the ICC Champions Trophy. The IPL's two and half month window starts from March and goes on till the beginning of June. However, the Pakistan Cricket Board has been forced to push back the 10th season of its T20 league from its regular January-February window to between March and May as the country is set to host the Champions Trophy in February 2025. It will be the first time that a T20 League will go head-to-head with the cash-rich IPL. It will be interesting to see which tournament the players, plying their trade in both leagues, pick. The 2025 Champions Trophy will be the first ICC event to be held in Pakistan in almost 30 years. Due to security-related issues, Pakistan had missed out on hosting top teams in the previous three Future Tours and Programmes Cycles (FTP). However, that has changed in the latest cycle, which will see Pakistan play 13 Tests, 26 ODIs and 27 T20Is at home in addition to the Champions Trophy, leading to a packed calendar.

### Praggnanandhaa beats Giri for 2nd straight win

Miami, August 17: Young Indian Grandmaster R Praggnanandhaa continued his fine run in the FTX Crypto Cup, the American finale of Champions Chess Tour, beating Anish Giri of the Netherlands 2.5-1.5 in the second round here Wednesday.

Having started his campaign with victory over World No.4 and the top ranked junior Alireza Firouzja, the 17-year old Indian prodigy scored the all-important win in the fourth and final game, to hand Giri his second straight Praggnanandhaa, who played a

key role in the Indian 'B' team's bronze medal win in the recent chess Olympiad in Mahabalipuram near Chennai, edged out his Dutch opponent in 81 moves in the fourth game after the first three ended in

The Indian GM is now on six points after two wins, the same as World No.1 Magnus Carlsen of Norway, who beat Hans Niemen 3-1.

"Baby's day out! @rpragchess wins his second match with 2.5-1.5 over Anish at #FTXCrvptoCup Miami," his coach RB Ramesh tweeted after the game.

Praggnanandhaa will take on Carlsen in the third round later Wednesday night. He has beaten the World No.1 twice in online matches recently and has been in good form in the past few months.

In other matches in the second round, Firouzja bounced back after the defeat to Praggnanandhaa by beating Quang Liem Le of China 2.5-1.5 and Lev Aronian outlasted Poland's Jan-Krzyztof Duda 3.5-2.5 via the tie-break.

The eight-player all-play-all tournament is the American finale of Champions Chess Tour. There is USD 7,500 at stake for each match win at the event. Each match will be played over four rapid games, with blitz tiebreaks in case of a 2-2 draw.

### SERENA GOES DOWN TO RADUCANU

Mason, August 17: The second stop on Serena Williams' farewell tour was a short one. The 40-year-old Williams fell to 0-2 in matches since announcing 'the countdown has begun' on her career, losing 4-6, 0-6 to US Open champion Emma Raducanu in the Western & Southern Open Tuesday night.

Williams said last week in a Vogue magazine essay and an Instagram post that her career was winding down, although she did not explicitly say the US Open, which begins August 29 in New York, would be her last tournament.

The Cincinnati event was the second US Open tune-up for Williams, and the next time she takes the court will be at Flushing Meadows.

Williams is a 23-time Grand Slam champion, most recently in 2017 at the Australian Open, when she was pregnant with daughter Olympia. She said wanting to expand her family was a big reason



she plans to step away. Raducanu, World No.19, was sharp as she dispatched Williams — and

quieted the vocally pro-Williams

crowd — in 1 hour, 5 minutes. "I can't believe I just played Serena Williams," the 19-year-old

Raducanu said. "It's something

that I think I'm really fortunate to have been able to do, and for our careers to have crossed when there's such a big (age) gap and watching her growing up, it was an amazing experience to just play her." Williams did not speak to re-

porters after the match. Fans cheered heartily when Williams was introduced, and again when she won her first point on a Raducanu error in the second game. She briskly left the court after the match, waving to the crowd as she exited.

Raducanu will face veteran Victoria Azarenka in Wednesday's second round. Among others, fourtime Grand Slam champion Naomi Osaka was eliminated by Shuai Zhang, 6-4, 7-5. Karolina Pliskova advanced with a 7-5, 6-1 win over Williams' older sister, Venus.

In the men's draw, top-ranked Daniil Medvedev of Russia advanced to the third round, beating Botic van de Zandschlup 6-4, 7-5. Nick Kyrgios beat Alejandro Davidovich Fokina 7-5, 6-4.
