Some police officials and administrative officials were keeping a close watch on the strong room.

The State Information Commission has recently imposed a fine on the SJTA's officer SK Chatterjee for not sharing information in the public interest.

Asserting that the SJTA cannot decide to open the inner chamber of the 'Ratna Bhandar', temple administrator (development) Ajay Kumar Jena said the issue will be



placed before the Sri Jagannath Temple Managing Committee in its next meeting.

"The SJTA will inform the managing committee's decision to the government and then only the treasury can be opened," he said. It seemed that water seeps through cracks in the wall of the store, temple's 'Ratna Bhandar' in-

charge and servitor Niranjan Mekap said, adding that the treasury must be opened immediately and repaired.

Leader of Opposition in the state assembly Jaynarayan Mishra alleged that the state government has never made any attempt to open the inner chamber of the treasury even though it has gold, diamond jewellery, precious stones and other ornaments. It remained closed for 44 years even as the Sri Jagannath Temple Act, 1955 has a provision of undertaking inspection of the 'Ratna Bhandar' every three years, the BJP leader said.

Mumbai: Rupee dropped to an alltime low versus the dollar Monday on bets the Federal Reserve will keep a restrictive stance for longer prompting the Reserve Bank of India to step in. The rupee closed at 79.96 per US dollar, down from 79.86 in the previous session. The local currency had dropped to a record low 80.12 earlier in the day before the RBI sold the dollar to boost the rupee. Jio 5G in key cities by Diwali: Ambani AGENCIES

New Delhi, August 29: Reliance Jio will invest Rs 2 lakh crore for the 5G services rollout, beginning with metro cities in October as it looks to take lead in the launch of ultra-high-speed internet services.

Jio's superfast 5G services will be launched in key cities -- including Delhi, Mumbai, Chennai and Kolkata -- by Diwali, Reliance Industries Chairman Mukesh Ambani said Monday as he underlined the company's commitment to make India the largest data-powered economy in the world. beating China and the United States.

India deserves nothing less than "True 5G", Ambani said at Reliance Industries' 45th AGM and emphasised that 5G cannot remain an exclusive service available only to the privileged few or only to those in the largest cities. Digital freedom is the birthright of every Indian, he asserted. The company showcased the potential of JioAirFiber (its highspeed fixed-broadband offering) and Jio Cloud PC (virtual computer hosted in the cloud) and said combined might of the two along with Jio 5G would be a 'gamechanger'.

'Within the next two months, that is by Diwali of 2022, we will launch Jio 5G across multiple key cities, including the metro cities of Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata, and Chennai," he added. Subsequently, the company will increase its footprint to deliver Jio 5G to "every town, every taluka, and every tehsil of our country" by December 2023.

K'taka govt's big hunt 'leopardized' for 25 days

With jumbos and JCBs failing miserably and the forest minister facing demands of resignation, the public heat has forced the authorities to desperately try to 'honey trap' the leopard on prowl

the 25th day Monday, with authorities now using a 'honey trap' method to capture the big cat. Sources involved in the operation explained that the urine of a female leopard is being spread across

the cage installed to catch the prowling big cat. More than 350 personnel have started combing operations with JCBs, 2 elephants, sharpshooters, anesthetic experts, and a special drone team in the premises of the Golf Club spread across 250 acres in the heart of the Belagavi city.

The premises are full of dense vegetation and the leopard is able to hide away. Though the team is getting CCTV footage of the leopard, it is still escaping and disappearing. The posts have also kindled the mega operation, involving hundreds of staff.

As a precautionary measure, 21 schools and colleges have been closed for the last 25 days. Nearly 20,000 students are being affected by the move

The authorities have also put dogs inside a few cages and clearing the thick vegetation to track and enable the better visibility of leop-



ard to be able to trap it. The authorities have built watch towers and placed cages at strategic spots in Golf Club spread across 250acres in the heart of the city, but

to no avail. They were forced to change the places of eight small cages, one big cage and CCTV cameras as the leopard is changing its place of movement.

The forest department is spending over 3 lakh per day for carrying out the operation. The prolonged operation has created public outrage and opposition Congress party workers are demanding the resignation of the state Forest Minister Umesh Katti.

Meanwhile, they are facing flak from the public for failing to catch the leopard. The city is abuzz with talks, rants, memes and gossip about the sly leopard. Social media posts have been created making Aadhaar Card, even a PAN card of it and claiming that the leopard is now a respectable citizen of Belagavi city and it will only leave after celebrating Ganesh festival.

Bhubaneswar, August 29: To strengthen its fire-fighting wing, the state government has decided to form Striking Fire Force for quick response during fire mishaps and natural calamities.

Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik Monday approved a proposal in this regard after a thorough deliberation with senior officials of concerned departments.

The Striking Fire Force, equipped with state-of-the-art gadgets and modern equipment, will ensure speedy rescue operations during various disasters, particularly fire mishaps. As per the decision taken at a meeting, there will be three range headquarters of the Striking Fire Force in Cuttack, Sambalpur and Berhampur. For each range headquarters, 48 posts will be created and the force will have a total of 144 officers and personnel.



The force will have assistant fire officers, station officers, assistant station officers, havildar major. driver havildar, havildar mechanic, leading firemen and fireman driver. The striking fire force will also

play a crucial role in relief and rescue operations. During natural calamities, man-made disasters and accidents, the state fire service organisation has been acting as a 'First Responder' to provide quick and efficient service to the people.

Significant assistance is also being extended by the Fire Services to other states during natural calamities. Therefore, there is a need for a special force equipped with modern skills and gadgets to effectively tackle any calamity, sources said.

Ex-ASI, retired SDO convicted of bribery

Bhubaneswar, August 29: The special Vigilance court here Monday awarded two years' rigorous imprisonment (RI) to a former assistant sub inspector (ASI), holding him guilty of demanding bribe from a person for filing chargesheet in a case around eight years ago. The convict has also been asked to deposit a fine of ₹6.000 and in case of failure to pay the fine he would serve additional jail term of six months. The convict identified as Sashikanta Satapathy was posted at Sarankul police station in Nayagarh district in 2014. One Baikunthanath Mohapatra of Pancharida Manpur had filed a case (164/2013) at Sarankaul police station in 2013. However, Satapathy deliberately delayed the filing of charge-sheet before the court. He asked Mohapatra to pay a bribe of ₹2,000 for the purpose. Later, Mohapatra lodged a complaint with the Vigilance January 28, 2014. Based on the complaint, Vigilance sleuths filed a case (1/2014)and laid a trap to nab Satapathy redhanded. On January 29, 2014, the convict was caught red-handed by a Vigilance team while accepting money from Mohapatra at Sarankul bus stand. The Special Judge, Vigilance Satya Narayan Sarangi after going through the statements of nine witnesses and other documents held Satapathy guilty of accepting bribe. Similarly, the court of additional special judge of Vigilance Monday sentenced a retired SDO of Gridco to three years' RI for accepting bribe of ₹1,500 from a businessman to give electricity connection to the victim's commercial establishment in 1996. The convict has also been asked by the court to pay ₹20,000 as fine. The convict identified as Umesh Prasad Das during his tenure as the SDO (Electricals) in Gridco at Khurda was caught red-handed while accepting bribe from complainant Rabi Narayan Das of Saradhapur village. Umesh had earlier demanded ₹1,500 from Rabi for the installation of power supply to his flour mill at his village. Accordingly, Rabi also paid the convict ₹1.000 but he insisted onthe payment of the rest amount before the installation.

In 2020, the courts in the state disposed of 8.164 cases registered under various sections of the IPC involving serious and heinous crimes like murder and rape. As many as 913 cases out of 8,164 ended in conviction while the accused persons were acquitted in rest 7.251 cases in 2020. The conviction rate was 11.2 - the second lowest in India after Assam.

The NCRB report revealed that the conviction rate dropped to 5.7 per cent in 2021 against 11.2 per cent in 2020.

The courts in the state disposed of more number of cases under IPC in 2021. Trials were completed in 10,483 cases in 2021. Out of this,

as many as 601 cases ended in conviction and the accused went scotfree in the rest 9,882 IPC cases.

On other hand, the state witnessed a shameful drop in conviction rate in cases registered under various Special and Local Laws (SLL) like Arms Act, NDPS ACT and Immoral Traffic (Prevention) Act. The conviction rate dropped to 3.8 per cent in 2021

Similarly, the conviction rate in women related cases also further slipped to 8.3 per cent as against 9.2 in 2020. Out of 2,313 cases in which trials were completed in court, only 193 cases ended in conviction while in 2,120 cases the accused were acquitted or went scot-free

The state government had approved August 12 ₹2,808.40 crore for implementation of Millets Mission for six years -

2021-22 to 2026-27. In the first phase of implementation in 2017-18, the program started in 30 blocks spread over seven districts. In the second and third phase, it has been successfully implemented in 84 blocks of 15 districts. The state has extended its area of implementation to 142 blocks in 19 districts from 2022-23 onwards.

Jharkhand Mess

The politics of hide and seek and bus ride that has become a common feature in a few states in the country for some time is now being reenacted in Jharkhand. Its beleaguered Chief Minister Hemant Soren, desperate not to lose his chair, held marathon meetings and even took legislators on a bus and boat ride out of Ranchi in order to keep his flock together.

The Opposition's hope of challenging the BJP's growth and taking it on in the general elections of 2024 in a spirited manner got a boost when the Nitish Kumar-led Janata Dal (U) joined hands with the RJD to oust the BJP from power and formed a new coalition government in Bihar. But, the developments in neighbouring Jharkhand have caused a setback to the credibility of regional parties in providing a clean government. For, the exit of Soren looks almost certain, even if he succeeds in hanging on for the next six months taking advantage of some Constitutional niceties. The uncertainty has been created after the Election Commission recommended the disqualification of Soren as MLA under the Representation of the Peoples Act, 1951. He has been found guilty of misusing his position while allotting a stone mining lease to himself last year. The abuse of power not only smacks of unbridled greed, but dashes to the ground tall claims by the Jharkhand Mukti Morcha-led coalition government to fight corruption and work for the people. The EC's recommendation has created the prospect of political instability in a state which has witnessed 11 governments in 22 years.

Soren has indeed sunk to a new low by awarding himself a mining lease as Minister for Mines in 2021. The BJP complained to the Governor February 11, 2022, that the granting of the lease violated Section 9(A) of the Representation of the Peoples Act. The Governor referred the complaint to the Election Commission of India (ECI) for its opinion as per legal provisions. Subsequently, ECI wrote to the Governor last week that Soren could be disqualified under Section 9(A). It is sad that he seems to have learnt no lesson from the wrongs done by his father Shibu Soren. Many today may not remember the utter stupidity of Soren Sr who had deposited a lot of cash in his bank account which he had received to vote for and help the then PV Narasimha Rao led Congress government at the Centre to survive. There is a saying that goes 'like father, like son'. Hemant Soren committed an equally dumb act of taking a mine in his own name from his own ministry which proved, beyond doubt, his involvement in the sordid deal. There are also two PILs pending against him in the Jharkhand High Court. One of these seeks a probe into the alleged allotment of mining lease for a stone quarry in a 0.88-acre land parcel in the Angara Block of Ranchi and alleged laundering of money via some shell companies reportedly linked to his family members. On June 3, the High Court accepted the maintainability of the PILs. It held that they were perfectly in order. The Chief Minister challenged the High Court order in the Supreme Court and the apex court on August 17 reserved its order, while staying the High Court proceedings. As if this was not enough for the coalition government of Jharkhand, three Jharkhand Congress MLAs were arrested in West Bengal recently with huge amounts of money they had allegedly received to defect.

All these murky developments along with the arrest of a high profile Trinamool Congress Minister of West Bengal in an education scam bring much cheer to the BJP which can be checked only through a combined Opposition formed with regional parties. But, the regional outfits are digging their own graves through their acts of opening laundries and acting stupid.

WHAT IF UKRAINE PREVAILS?

he Ukraine war and the world's reaction to it will be a decisive factor in shaping the global political and economic order in the decade ahead. In particular, the Western allies' actions, narratives, and planning regarding both Russia and the role of the Global South in Ukraine's postwar reconstruction will indicate what their long-term strategic goals are. Does the West simply want to see Russia defeated and NATO enlarged and strengthened, or can it envisage a "victory" in Ukraine that lays the foundations for a world in which democracy is more secure and global governance more inclusive and effective?

While the outcome of the fighting remains uncertain, the West's strategic aims, particularly how it intends to treat Russia in the event that Ukraine prevails, will have huge consequences. The big question is whether the allies will seek to punish Russia as a whole by imposing severe reparations or instead target President Vladimir Putin's autocratic regime in a way that limits the burdens imposed on the Russian people.

At the beginning of the war, the Western allies emphasised that defending the United Nations Charter and democracy were their primary objectives. In late spring, some US strategists and officials advocated permanently weakening Russia as a strategic goal, although it is not clear whether this would still be an objective in the event of regime change in Russia.

While any overall settlement of the Ukraine conflict must require Russia to bear some part of the reconstruction burden resulting from a war that it started, the severity of the terms imposed on the Russian people will have political ramifications. The harsher the terms, the more likely it will be that Russia embraces China even more closely, so that a tight Sino-Russian bloc becomes part of the postwar geopolitical order. The effect of such an alliance

should not be underestimated. While China would be the bloc's center of gravity, Russia's relatively small GDP (which is less than that of Italy) should not lead one to dismiss the country's scientific capabilities, the size of its nuclear arsenal, its natural-resource wealth, and the strategic importance of its vast territory. By pursuing measures that treat the Russian people differently than Putin and his autocracy, the world's democracies might hope to prevent a long-term outcome in which Russia would be "lost" to them. Banning all Russians from entering the European Union, as some policymakers now propose, is the type of measure that will push the country toward China. And misleadingly dividing the world into

True, Russia's veto power in the UN Security Council made it impossible for the UN to play a coordinating role in countering Russia's aggression in Ukraine. But the Western allies that assumed that task made little effort to consult the Global South in their decision-making, or to involve it in the postwar planning process.

It is of course also true that much of the Global South abstained from voting on the two major UN General Assembly resolutions condemning Russia in March. But the West should have recognised that developing countries' response to the war reflected old and deep-seated reflexes namely, the bitter collective memory of European colonialism and recollections of the Soviet Union's support for many of these countries during the struggle for independence. Moreover, the Lugano confer-

ence organised by the Western allies in early July to launch a platform for Ukraine's reconstruction did not include any countries from the Global South. One could argue that this was primarily a donors' meeting, but it excluded rich Gulf states and included countries such as Albania and North Macedonia, neither of which is likely to be able to contribute

Rebuilding Ukraine will reuire hundreds of billions of dollars. This effort thus risks diverting substantial aid from the Global South, which is still trying to get rich countries to fulfill their longstanding pledge to provide \$100 billion per year to support climate-change mitigation and adaptation in poorer countries. It will also be interesting to see the extent to which the procurement rules for reconstruction projects in Ukraine will allow non-donor developing countries to bid effectively.

But it may not be too late for the West to involve the Global South - particularly countries like India and South Africa, which have good technical capacities in certain sectors - in Ukraine's reconstruction. The West should also include developing countries in setting the rules regarding possible remaining sanctions against Russia after the first phase of a settlement, as well as the regulations governing frozen Russian assets

In the event that Ukraine prevails, the West's treatment of Russia and its stance toward the Global South during Ukraine's reconstruction will determine whether the war's outcome serves as the launchpad for global progress toward a more inclusive and equitable multilateralism. In the worst case, the West will have achieved a pyrrhic victory that ends up strengthening autocracy and further deepening global divisions.

Bear up

t's an ancient phrase, which has been used in various senses, often literally to carry something up, or to be carried up by some force or action ("he was borne up by the force of the explosion"). The sense you mean, of staying cheerful in the face of adversity, could conceivably be connected with the sea. In its sailing ship sense, to bear up means to steer the ship more closely into the wind, a more difficult and uncomfortable thing to do than the opposite, to bear off. But the link between the sailing sense and the figurative one isn't particularly close, and it's conceivable that it actually refers to bearing one's troubles, but in an elevated way that rises above the discomfort, the opposite of feeling down (though to bear down has quite another meaning, such are the peculiarities of English verbs).

Beefing

he verb beef has been in the language for a surprisingly long time - it's on record from the 1860s. We have to go back further to trace the verb to its beginnings. In the early eighteenth century there was a slang phrase to cry hot beef or give hot beef, which meant to raise the alarm, to start pursuit or to set up a hue and cry. This may have been based on a street hawker's cry and to have been a pun on stop thief! The New Canting Dictionary records in 1725, "to cry beef upon us: they have discover'd us and are in Pursuit of us". A few years later, the verb beef by itself also meant to raise a hue and cry and this continued in use well into the nineteenth century. The next step is a bit disconnected, because the written evidence for it only begins to appear in the 1860s and it doesn't chart the way that beef had been developing. One change was that beef became a general cry of alarm, unconnected with theft, and then merely a shout or cry, a sense that came out of the theatre and was later taken to Australia by emigrants. At around the same period beef shifted to mean a complaint, thus giving us the slang sense we have today. You gave your message the punning subject line what's the beef? That obviously comes from the verb to beef and is still a common idiom meaning "what's the problem?" or "what's going on?", though it typically turns up in the popular prints as a humorous reference to ranching, mad cow disease, the Calgary stampede, McDonalds restaurants and related bovine topics. Here's a recent example: The Dallas Observer newspaper even had a story about it more than a year ago, based on a press release issued by the Houston-based chain. So, what's the beef all of a sudden (The Fort Worth Star Telegram (Texas), 9 Jan. 2011). We must, of course, make a careful distinction between what's the beef? and where's the beef? The latter, which questions the importance, significance, inner meaning or substance of something, derives from the early-1980s advertising campaign for Wendy's hamburgers in the US and Canada and briefly became a political slogan.

It is no doubt that the remission was decided arbitrarily. The committee which has decided to grant remission has ten members including five official members. But all the five private members of this committee are known BJP leaders. One of the members, who is also the local MLA, said in an interview that the convicts were released only for their 'sanskar' as they belong to Brahmin caste. This is an act of a majoritarian state signaling impunity for crimes targeting some citizens.

In April 2022, the Supreme Court in a judgement said that while the discretion rest with the government to suspend or remit the sentence, the executive power cannot be exercised arbitrarily. The prerogative of the executive will be subjective to the rules of law. The fairness in state action is embodied in Article 14 of the Constitution, This shows the power of remission cannot be exercised arbitrarily. So the decision to grant remission should be fair. transparent and reasonable.

The arbitrary release of the convicts is not an isolated inci-

dispensations both in Gujarat and at the Centre. Under this regime we have been witnessing increasing violence against the Muslim community while those committing these crimes are provided with immunity. The then Union minister Mahesh Sharma honoured the killers of Mohammed Akhlaq, who was lynched in Dadri, Uttar Pradesh. Similarly, a 'tiranga yatra' was taken out by the BJP in support of the accused in the gangrape of a seven-year-old Kashmir girl in Kathua, Jammu & Kashmir. Muslim women activists and intellectuals were auctioned online in the name of 'Sulli Deals' and 'Bulli Deals' with impunity. Mahant Bajrangi Muni openly issued rape threats against Muslim women.

We have seen that activists like Teesta Seetalvad who fought for justice for the victims and survivors of the Gujarat riots and other cases are being put behind the bars. The Supreme Court has dismissed a petition against the SIT report giving clean chit to the then Chief Minister Narendra Modi in the 2002 Gujarat riots case. One should know that these 11

endorsed by the highest court of the country. Again it was not just for the gangrape of Bilkis Bano and her three-year-old daughter's murder. Three other women were also raped and 14 members of her family were killed by these criminals. They were targeted only for their Muslim identity by none other than their known neighbours. Now, after their release the convicts will be living besides Bilkis Bano's family for rest of their lives. With their release, the 20-year-old wounds from the Gujarat riots have been revived once again. Bilkis Bano who survived the horrors of the communal violence, said: "I had trusted the highest courts of my country. I had trusted the system and I was slowly learning to live with my misery. The release of these convicts has taken away my peace and also shaken my faith in availing justice. This sorrow and loss of faith is not only for myself. but for every woman who is fighting for justice in courts." This is nothing but the travesty of jus-

Racist attack

Clamour for withdrawing general consent to CBI gets louder in Bihar

Patna, August 29: Senior Congress leader and former Union minister Tariq Anwar Monday came out in support of the demand for withdrawal of general consent to CBI, which is being raised by leaders of the ruling Mahagathbandhan in Bihar.

The AICC general secretary said that Chief Minister Nitish Kumar, who was hamstrung earlier because he was a BJP ally, should now take the step in view of mounting allegations of 'misuse' of central agencies.

"Nitish Kumar should take a leaf out of the book of many other states and go for such a step. Misuse of investigating agencies is a reality. He may not have been able to take such a decision earlier because he was with the BJP. But now he must act," Anwar told PTI-Bhasha over phone.

He was reacting to demands having been made in this regard by many leaders of the seven-party ruling alliance of which the Congress is a part. The RJD, the largest constituent, has been most vocal. Its top leaders like Lalu Prasad, Bihar Deputy CM Tejashwi Yadav and many close members of their family and key aides have been named in cases lodged by the CBI.

The agency also raided many premises owned by RJD leaders last week on a day the new government in the state was seeking trust vote.

GRAFT IN EDU DEPT K'taka schools seek PM's intervention

Bangalore, August 29: In a fresh trouble for the ruling BJP in Karnataka, which is facing flak for alleged corruption in Public Works Department (PWD), two associations representing private unaided school managements have raised the issue of "rampant corruption" in the state education department.

Together, Schools Management Association (RUPSA), and Associated Managements of Primary and Secondary Schools in Karnataka (KAMS), in a letter addressed to Prime Minister Narendra Modi, have named the state's School Education and Literacy Minister BC Nagesh. RUPSA president Lokesh T claimed that this is the third such letter they have addressed to the Prime Minister in this regard.

RUPSA also released an audio recording purported to belong to a Block Education Officer allegedly demanding bribe for processing an application for renewal of a school's recognition. RUPSA members alleged that as much as 50 per cent cut is demanded by department officials to clear RTE reimbursements.

RUPSA has alleged that rampant corruption in the education department has forced several schools to the verge of closure. Despite several pleas to Chief Minister Basavaraj Bommai and Minister BC Nagesh, there is no improvement in the situation, it noted.

Echoing the RUPSA allegations, the Associated Managements of Primary and Secondary Schools in Karnataka (KAMS), stated that they had also recently written to the Prime Minister about corruption in the state education department.

Bangalore, August 29: In spite of Karnataka going through phases of social unrest, different parts of the state witnessing revenge killings, stabbing incidents, the capital city Bangalore remained untouched by the disturbing happenings. However, the row over the Idgah Maidan in Bangalore is threatening to derail law and order in the city known as the Silicon Valley of India.

The legal fight is over Idgah Maidan, a 2.5 acre plot of land in Chamarajpet locality of Bangalore, between the Wakf Board and the Revenue Department. Hindu activists are demanding permission to celebrate the Ganesh Utsav at the Maidan.

BJP national general secretary CT Ravi has stated that if namaz is allowed, the Ganesh festival celebrations should also be allowed there. The Chamarajpet Citizens' Forum, which is waging a legal battle and agitating for years, is adamant to celebrate the Ganesh festival there.

The Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP) has handed over the property to the Revenue Department. The Wakf Board is claiming that the decision of the BBMP is against the ruling of the Supreme Court and obtained a status quo order from the Karnataka High Court.

Patapat Srinivas, an activist associated with the Chamarajpet Citizens' Forum, told IANS that there can be no compromise on the celebration of the Ganesh festival at the Idgah Maidan. "The legal fight will continue, we should



not have any problem worshipping our God," he says. When asked about the possibil-

ity of violence, Srinivas said that since the 1964 court order permitting namaz at the site, no Hindu activist has caused any trouble till date. There should not be any trouble if the Ganesh festival is celebrated at the site.

A Karnataka High Court bench headed by Justice Hemanth Chandan Goudar has clearly asked the Advocate General not to let the controversy go the way of the Hubballi Idgah Maidan dispute, which resulted in police firing.

Five persons were killed and hundreds injured in the Hubballi police firing in 1994. The incident had resulted in large-scale violence across the state.

Srinivas said that the Wakf Board is claiming the property over a gazette notification of 1965, which does not specify a survey number and boundaries. The Supreme Court had asked the Wakf Board to approach the local court over the rights of property. The BBMP had given sufficient time to the Wakf Board to submit the relevant documents and get the property in its name. However, the Wakf Board has failed to produce the documents.

Once a nursery of progressive movements, Shivamogga now a communal hotspot

Bangalore, August 29: The name of Shivamogga is synonymous with socialist, farmer, Dalit and women centric movements. The 1951 Kagodu satyagraha by farmers demanding ownership of the land they tilled was said to have paved the way for land reforms in the country. However, the region has come a long way and is now turning into a communal hotspot of Karnataka. The Ganeshotsay in Shivamogga sees widespread violence, shoot at sight orders have also been issued after the 1980s. Now, the region is witnessing revenge killings and stabbing incidents. Though political heavyweights like former Chief Minister BS Yediyurappa, Home Minister Araga Jnanendra, who come from Shivamogga are playing an important role in state politics, they are not able to find a solution to the vicious circle of violence that the city has been trapped in.

of the 75th Independence Day. Congress MLA and state media in-charge Priyank Kharge stated that the BJP has turned Shivamogga into a communal laboratory. If the region from which Home Minister Araga Jnanendra hails witnesses three communal clashes in 8 months, is it negligence on his part or silent approval? The clashes have caused a Rs 300 crore loss, he said.



Between 1950 to 1980, Shivamogga saw a slew of pro-people movements. The people here questioned the system of manual scavenging, and stood for social justice. Ram Manohar Lohia, the socialist political leader, visited Shivamogga to witness the Kagodu agitation by farmers demanding their right over land.

According to the police, Shivamogga has seen three communal clashes in eight months. The brutal murder of Bajrang Dal activist Harsha made national news. It was followed by stabbing incidents over the installation of VD Savarkar's statue. Prohibitory orders were clamped for more than eight days after the killing of Harsha. The city came under curfew again following incidents of stabbing during the celebration



Senior journalist NM Ravikumar said that the greatest social revolutions have been brought to the region without any violence. Land was taken away from religious mutts and landlords and distributed to poor farmers. This land is the birthplace of Allama and Akka Mahadevi.

Allama went on to create the first parliament of the world in the form of 'Anubhava Mantapa' challenging the caste system. Akka Mahadevi is revered for her fight for gender equality centuries ago.

He stated that the people of Shivamogga rejected the violence propounded by the naxal movement in the 90s. "The BJP has been the beneficiary of communal clashes. Dalits and Muslims have been the deciding factors in the elections in Shivamogga city. The clashes are polarising Dalit votes towards the BJP, ensuring its victory."

Socialist leaders like the late S Bangarappa, who hailed from Shivamogga, went on to join the BJP. The socialist leaders identified with the Congress party failed to transfer the socialist ideology to the next generation leading to the rise of Hindutva and the BJP, he added.

Shivamogga has always been identified as a land of struggle in the history of Karnataka.

Tech glitch allows cyber fraudsters to thrive

Patna, August 29: In a joint operation by the Telangana and Nawada police of Bihar August 13, four fraudsters including the kingpin Mithilesh Prasad, were arrested after a brief encounter. When interrogated, the joint

team was shocked to hear their confessions. Gaurav Mangla, the SP of

Nawada said: "The accused confessed that they duped a number of people of crores of rupees. The police team recovered Rs 1.23 crore from the house of the kingpin apart from two vehicles."

"When the joint team raided the village of the kingpin, Bhawani Bigha, four persons including Prasad were seated in a car. They fired at the police team and tried to flee. The police fired at them and arrested them after a brief chase," he said.

August 17, a joint team of the Bihar and Rajasthan police arrested a person named Jitendra Ram from his native village Apsandh for his alleged involvement in cyber fraud. The joint team recovered several incriminating documents, mobile phones and SIM cards from his possession. February 15, a joint team of SWAT and Nawada police arrested 33 persons from Thalaposh village. The team recovered three laptops, over 3 dozen mobile phones and a bike from their possession.

These are some of the incidents which prove that cyber fraudsters are active in the region.

The naxal dominated Nawada is located on the border of Jharkhand's Koderma district. Due to it being a border district, there are several places having dual junctions where mobile towers frequently fluctuate. They sometimes catch the mobile towers of Nawada and sometimes from Koderma.

"The cyber fraudsters use this technical glitch to hide their identities and actual locations. A cyber comman belonging to Nawada can use the mobile towers of Koderma to confuse investigators," an official of the Economic Offences Wing said.

The fraudsters generally have a rural background but they are skilled and trained to fool the people of the metros. They generally victimise city people and many of the victims lost small amounts. They may file online complaints in cyber cells but the police of the respective states hardly act in all the cases. They generally take ac-



tion in cases where big amounts are involved.

During the investigation in some of the cases, it appeared that the accused used to open bank accounts in the name of labourers and poor people who did not know about the fraud.

The accused are managing to open fake accounts in large numbers. "On one occasion, when we reached the house of a person in Nawada, we were shocked to know that an illiterate labourer had a bank account used in the transaction of money. When we charged that he withdrew lakhs of rupees from his bank account, he revealed that some persons who claimed to be bank officials approached him and took his Aadhar card, ration card, BPL card, and thumb impression on a plain paper to open an account. Later, he received a bank passbook. During verification, we found that all the information was correct but the bank name and account number were different," the official said.

"The accused had used the documents to open accounts at other banks after little changes in the

address. The banks and mobile wallet companies never go for physical checking of individuals at the time of opening the account and mobile wallets." the official said.

The police investigation revealed that the thumb impression was taken on a plain paper and scanned digitally. They used photoshop to clean up the image and a polymer chemical stamp machine to make a rubber thumb.

"The dark side of liberalisation in the banking and financial sectors has allowed the mushrooming of over 100 mobile wallet companies in the country and commen frequently use it to dispose of the conned money. Shockingly, there is hardly any method to zero in on the accused. The success rate of cracking such cases is not more than 15%. The accused in some of the cases fall into the police net but it is very difficult to recover the money from them," he said.

Patna based cyber expert Rakesh Sharma said: "Selling bank accounts in districts like Jamtara and Dumka in Jharkhand, Nawada, Sheikhpura in Bihar is a common practice. The gangs operating from these districts of Bihar are different from the notorious Jamtara gang but they operate on almost the same lines."

Delhi, the most-populous Union Territory, has reported the highest number of suicides (2,840) among the Union territories. followed by

Puducherry (504). A total of 25,891 suicides were reported in the 53 mega cities of the country in 2021.

The rate of suicide - the number of suicides per one-lakh population -- has been widely accepted as a standard vardstick for comparison. The all-India rate of suicides was 12 in 2021. The Andaman and Nicobar Islands reported the highest rate of suicide (39.7), followed by Sikkim (39.2), Puducherry (31.8), Telangana (26.9) and Kerala (26.9).

New Delhi, August 29: Video footage of BCCI secretary Jay Shah appearing to turn down an offer to wave the national flag after India beat Pakistan in a thrilling cricket match at the Asia Cup in Dubai on Sunday has sparked a controversy, with Opposition leaders taking a dig at him.

Several Congress leaders shared the video footage on social media and slammed Shah, who is Union Home Minister Amit Shah's son. Tagging the footage of the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) secretary appearing to turn down an offer to wave the flag, Congress general secretary Jairam Ramesh tweeted in Hindi: "I have papa, keep the tricolour with you.'

Congress leader Ajoy Kumar also tweeted the footage and wrote in Hindi: "Looks like the tricolour was of 'Khadi' ... Not of 'polyester'!" Congress's Karnataka MLA Priyank Kharge asked why would Jay Shah refuse to wave the tricolour after India's victory against Pakistan.

"Any Indian would have done so reflexively. Did he want the Bhagwa Dhwaja or BJP flag?" he asked.

The Congress has been strongly criticising an amendment of the flag code under which the national flag can now be made of polyester and with the help of machines.

Shiv Sena's Rajya Sabha MP Priyanka Chaturvedi said "staying neutral as ACC (Asian Cricket Council) president doesn't at any point mean being disrespectful to

Kathmandu, August 29: Nepal has asked India to halt its recruitment of Gurkhas into the Indian army under a new scheme for shorter military contracts until it was clear what would happen to them when they retired, an aide to the prime minister said Monday.

Nepal seeks to pause

An agreement between London, New Delhi and Kathmandu after India's independence from colonial rule in 1947 allowed India and Britain to continue to recruit Gurkhas, who have served in the British army since 1815 under a deal struck with the British East India Company.

Tens of thousands of Gurkhas now serve in the Indian army, including in counterinsurgency operations in the Himalayan territory of Kashmir and the northeastern states.

In June, India unveiled a recruitment policy called Agnipath, or "path of fire", aimed at enlisting young men into the military on short four-year contracts to lower the average age of its 1.38 millionstrong armed forces.

Gurkha soldiers have historically served for much longer terms in both the Indian and British armies.

Nepali Prime Minister Sher Bahadur Deuba's foreign affairs advisor, Arun Subedi, said the recruitment of Gurkhas would be "withheld for the time being" as political parties in Nepal discussed the future of the Gurkhas after their retirement.

"Nepal wants to be clear whether the Agnipath scheme will apply for the recruitment of Nepali nationals... and about their fate after retirement at the end of four years of service," Subedi told Reuters.

Last week, Indian foreign ministry spokesperson Arindam Bagchi said India had been recruiting Gurkha soldiers to the Indian army for a long time and looked forward to continuing to recruit them under the new scheme.

IMF okays \$1.17bn bailout fund for Pak

Islamabad: Pakistan took a sigh of relief as the IMF Monday approved the revival of its Extended Fund Facility (EFF) programme after which the cash-strapped country will receive the 7th and 8th tranche of \$1.17 billion. The decision was taken at the IMF's executive board meeting in Washington, which would immediately provide \$1.17 billion to foreign exchange starving Pakistan. Pakistan and the IMF had signed the \$6 billion deal in July 2019 in January 2020 and restored briefly in March last year before again going off the track in June. The present government which got power in April this year began an effort to revive the programme.

PRESS TRUST OF INDIA Islamabad, August 29: The death toll from the devastating floods in Pakistan neared 1,100 Monday, as international aid began to trickle in following Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif-led cash-strapped government's desperate appeal for aid to deal with the crisis that has displaced 33 million or one-seventh of the country's population. Pakistan's Climate Change Minister Sherry Rehman called it the "monster monsoon of the decade," while Finance Minister Miftah Ismail said the floods have impacted Pakistan's economy by

\$10 billion. 1,136 have been killed due to floods and another 1,634 injured, according to the latest data issued Monday by the National Disaster Management Authority, the chief national organisation tasked to deal with natural calamities.

Officials said the final death toll could be much higher, a grim forecast as thousands of villages in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province remain cut off from the rest of the country as swollen rivers destroyed roads and bridges, the Express Tribune newspaper reported.

Pakistan's Energy Ministry said that restoration of power in Sindh and Balochistan provinces remained top priority, Geo TV reported.

Citing an aide to Pakistani Prime Minister Sharif, the BBC said the country was desperate for international support.

"Pakistan has been grappling with economic issues, but now just when we were about to overcome them the monsoon disaster hit," Salman Sufi said, adding that funding from a lot of development projects had been rerouted to the affected people.

The US, UK, UAE and others have contributed to a disaster appeal, but more funds are needed, of-

ENGINE SNAG NASA postpones debut test flight of next-gen moon rocket

The maiden journey of the SLS-Orion marks the kickoff of NASA's highly vaunted moon-to-Mars Artemis programme, the successor to the Apollo lunar missions of the 1960s and '70s. The programme was named for the goddess who was Apollo's twin sister in ancient Greek mythology

Cape Canaveral, August 29: An engine problem forced NASA Monday to postpone for at least four days the launch of its colossal next-generation rocketship on a long-awaited debut test flight around the moon and back 50 years after Apollo's last lunar mission.

The countdown was halted about 40 minutes before launch time as the 32-story-tall, two-stage Space Launch System (SLS) rocket and its Orion crew capsule awaited liftoff from the Kennedy Space Center in Cape Canaveral, Florida.

The US space agency cited a problem on one of the rocket's main engines, after launch teams had begun filling its core fuel tanks with supercooled liquid oxygen and hydrogen propellants. Mission engineers struggled to properly condition that engine to the right temperature for launch, the agency said.

NASA did not give a new launch date but said its first available backup launch opportunity was set for Friday, September 2. Whether the agency sticks with

that date depends on how quickly engineers can resolve the engine issue. The subsequent launch opportunity is Monday, September 5. The voyage is intended to put the 5.75-million-pound vehicle through its paces in a rigorous demonstration flight, pushing its design limits, before NASA deems it reliable enough to carry

The last humans to walk on the moon were the two-man descent team of Apollo 17 in 1972, following in the footsteps of 10 other astronauts during five earlier missions beginning with Apollo 11 in 1969.

The Artemis programme seeks to eventually establish a longterm lunar base as a stepping stone to even more ambitious astronaut vovages to Mars, a goal that NASA officials have said will probably take until at least the late

2030s to achieve.

SLS has been under development for more than a decade, with years of delays and cost overruns. But the Artemis program also has generated tens of thousands of jobs and billions of dollars in commerce under the primary contractors Boeing Co for SLS and Lockheed Martin Corp

for Orion. One issue cited by NASA officials last week as a potential show stopper for Monday's launch was any sign during rocket fueling that a newly repaired hydrogen line fitting had failed to hold. NASA officials said on Sunday they were also eveing a potential, but minor, helium leak in launch pad equipment.

DRAFT, NO THREAT TO WC DRAW SEPT 8

New Delhi, August 29: The International Hockey Federation (FIH) Monday cleared the air over Hockey India elections, saying the revised draft constitution sent by Committee of Administrators (CoA) running the sport in the country is fully compliant with the world body's statues.

The FIH also stated that the draw of the Men's Hockey World Cup, to be hosted jointly by Bhubaneswar and Rourkela from January 13 to 29 next year, will take place as per schedule September 8.

'The latest correspondence, received from the CoA today, comply with the talks held between

the CoA and the FIH in India August 17," FIH Senior Manager Communications, Nicolas Maingot told this agency. "Regarding the draw of the upcoming Men's World Cup, it will be held as already announced September 8.

The recent uncertainty over HI elections came to light following reports that FIH CEO Thierry Weil wrote a stern email to CoA, accusing the three-member committee of deviating from the Delhi High Court's three-point brief while drafting the new constitution.

Weil had reportedly said that the CoA made unnecessary changes to the constitution and broke FIH's trust after the two parties reached a common agreement during a meeting here 11 days ago. Weil also threatened to cancel the draw ceremony if the CoA failed to comply with the High Court order.

The Delhi HC had suspended the HI executive board in May, terming the illegal post of Life President held by former Indian Olympic Association president Narinder Batra and the voting rights of HI CEO Elena Norman as 'unconstitutional' and in violation 🗎 of the National Sports Code.

The Court subsequently appointed a three member CoA, headed by former Supreme Court judeje Justice (retd) Anil R Dave, former Chief Election Commissioner SY Quraishi and ex-India captain Zafar Iqbal to get the HI house in order.
