CM approves ₹2K cr VSSUT revamp plan

Bhubaneswar, Sept 17: The state government will spend ₹2,000 crore for the transformation of Veer Surendra Sai University of Technology (VSSUT) Burla, in three phases in the next five years.

Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik Saturday approved a master plan for the development of the VSSUT. Steps would be taken for devel-

opment of the institution in such a way that about 10,000 students will be imparted education in 24 undergraduate departments by 2026. As per the plan, the strength of the students would be enhanced to 10,874 students from the existing 2,849 students.

On August 25 last, on the direction of the Chief Minister, the Chief Secretary and 5T Secretary, during their visit to the institute, had advised officials to make a

master plan to develop the uni-

versity as a Centre of Excellence. As per the plan, the VSSUT would be developed as a Multi-Disciplinary Engineering and Research University by 2030 at par with prominent engineering institutes

To achieve the goal, it would have seven schools like School of Engineering, Skill Development Centre, School of Medical Technology and School of Basic

Bhubaneswar, Sept 17: Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik Saturday wrote to Union Tribal Affairs Minister Arjun Munda seeking inclusion of 160 communities in the ST list of the state.

Since 1978 onwards, Odisha government has recommended more than 160 communities for their inclusion in the ST list of the state with the approval of Tribal Advisory Council. Because of the delay in their inclusion in the ST list, all these 160 plus communities of the state are becoming victims of "historical injustice", Patnaik said in a letter to the Union minister.

Stating that among these (160 communities) some are new while others are sub-tribes/subsets, synonyms and phonetic variations of the existing ST communities residing in different parts of the state. Patnaik said they are being deprived of benefits availed by STs though they have the same characteristics as

their respective notified STs. "I am given to understand that

a task force under the Ministry of Tribal Affairs had recommended 9 proposals from Odisha as priority cases for inclusion in the ST list of the state in the year 2014, but the same is vet to be notified in the Presidential Order." Patnaik mentioned in the letter.

The Chief Minister said, "I would therefore request you to kindly

look into this long pending matter and expedite the scheduling of these left out communities to deliver social justice to them in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution of India.' Patnaik said this shall go a long

way in helping these deprived communities by giving them their much needed recognition as ST and ensure social justice. He said since 2011 onwards a

number of communications have been made by him with the Centre on this "sensitive matter". He urged Munda for urgent

action addressing the long standing pending matter and do justice to the communities who are waiting for decades to get their due grievances redressed.

The CJI inaugurated the courts at a function organised on the premises of Odisha Judicial Academy in the presence of Supreme Court judge Justice DY Chandrachud and Chairperson, e-Committee, Justice MR Shah, Chief Justice of Orissa High Court S Muralidhar and Justice S Talapatra, Chairman, Artificial Intelligence and Information Technology Committee of the High Court of Orissa

Speaking on the occasion, CJI Lalit said there are many advantages of technological advancement and now a common man sitting in the remotest part of the country can have access to justice. "Covid-19 pandemic has taught

us to adapt, change and modernise ourselves. The advantages of technology are here for us not only to witness but assimilate into our lifestyle," CJI Lalit said. In his welcome address, Justice

S Muralidhar thanked the e-Committee, Supreme Court of India for the guidance and encouragement to the High Court in expanding the horizon of digitization and using information technology for other initiatives like paperless courts, e-payment of court

700 MAOISTS, SUPPORTERS SURRENDER

Bhubaneswar: Howrah-Bhubaneswar Jan Shatabdi Express derailed at a level crossing near Bhadrak Saturday, an East Coast Railway official said. The two front wheels of the guardcum-luggage van located next to the engine derailed due to sudden application of brake despite which the train hit a bull, he said, adding no casualty of passengers was reported in the incident. Pickpocket menace hits Bharat Jodo Yatra

Alappuzha DCC president loses ₹5,000 to pickpockets when he was on the forefront to welcome the drive

Thiruvananthapuram, Sept 17: The Alappuzha District Congress Committee (DCC) president Babu Prasad Saturday became poorer by ₹5,000 when his pocket was picked while he was getting ready to receive Rahul Gandhi leading the Bharat Jodo Yatra.

Prasad, a former Congress legislator by virtue of being the DCC president was in the forefront to receive the yatra when it entered the Alappuzha district crossing over from Kollam district on Saturday

Incidentally, a similar thing was reported when the Gandhi-led yatra had entered Thiruvananthapuram district from neighbouring Tamil Nadu at Nemom September 12.

It was later identified from close circuit television (CCTV) visuals that there were three pickpockets,

all from Tamil Nadu.

Now at Alappuzha, the Congress party is trying to see if there are any CCTV visuals.

This yatra has evoked a huge response ever since it entered Kerala border on the 11th of this month. There are close to around 5,000 people in the morning session of the yatra, while in the evening, participation swells to around over 20,000.

Earlier, when the Bharat Jodo Yatra began its Kerala leg September 11 from

Thiruvananthapuram, the party received both bouquets and brickbats for its 19-day stay in the state.

Though Congress leader Rahul Gandhi received a rousing welcome from supporters and party leaders, some in the ruling CPM felt that the grand old party should have focused its energy more on the BJP-ruled states such as Uttar Pradesh or Gujarat instead of spending over two weeks in Kerala. where the saffron party's presence

is negligible. During the Kerala schedule, Rahul is scheduled to travel 450 km, before entering Karnataka September 30, where he will spend 21 days before moving north.

According to the schedule, Rahul will be in Uttar Pradesh for two days, while Gujarat and Himachal Pradesh, where elections are scheduled for later this year, will be skipped.

Maha FDA cancels J&J baby powder licence Mumbai: Maharashtra's Food and

Drugs Administration (FDA) has cancelled the baby powder manufacturing licence of Johnson & Johnson Pvt Ltd "in the interest of public health at large. In a release issued Friday, the state government agency said the company's product, Johnson's Baby Powder, may affect the skin of newborn babies. Samples of the powder for babies did not conform to standard pH value during a laboratory test, the regulator said. The release said the action was taken after Kolkata-based Central Drugs Laboratory's conclusive report that concludes "the sample does not conform to IS 5339:2004 with respect to the test for pH." According to the release, FDA had drawn samples of Johnson's Baby Powder from Pune and Nashik for quality check purposes.



Bhubaneswar, Sept 17: Expressing concern over the pendency of cases in Fast Track Courts (FTCs) and Fast Track Special Courts (FTSCs) of the state, Union Minister of Law and Justice Kiren Rijiju has urged Orissa High Court Chief Justice S Muralidhar to take steps for their time-bound disposal, an official said Saturday.

According to sources, FTCs are setup by the state government for trial of cases related to heinous crimes, crimes against women, children and senior citizen, while the FTSCs are setup under Centrally-Sponsored Scheme (CSS) for expeditious trial of cases relating to rape and

Rijiju said that the 14th Finance Commission, with the increased share of devolution of funds, rec-

As of July, 2022, total pendency of rape and POCSO Act cases is more than 3,28,000 which is an alarming situation.

In Odisha, 19,214 such cases are pending in the courts. In July alone, 504 new cases were registered

and 487 cases were disposed of. The government of India has been allocating sufficient funds in budget every year for the FTSC scheme and the department of Justice has been repeatedly following up with the state governments and the High Courts for availing the allocated funds and its timely utilisation.

However, in many states, the pre-requisite compliances for the release of CSS funds under the Public Financial Management System (PFMS) are not fully complete or are partially complete leading to under utilisation of the allocated budget, he said.

"As the safety and security of our women, children and other marginalised categories are of paramount concern, the need for robust functioning of the FTCs and FTSCs becomes highly imperative," said the Union Law

Amid huge pendency of cases, he urged the Chief Justice to open the remaining FTCs in Odisha with due consultation of the state government.

As per the CSS of FTSCs, the remaining number of courts could be set up and operationalised on priority basis, stated Rijiju.

He also suggested setting up a strict monitoring mechanism for the time-bound disposal of cases by the FTCs/FTSCs.

Post-ICU rehabilitation project unveiled at AIIMS-Bhubaneswar

Bhubaneswar, Sept 17: In a bid to reduce the number of fatalities among patients discharged from ICUs, the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) here has launched a rehabilitation project for such people who had undergone tracheostomy in the inten-

The project was launched after reports poured in from different corners of the state that many patients, mostly those recovered from Covid-19, died at home after being discharged from hospital ICUs, an official said.

Tracheostomy is an opening created at the front of the neck so that a tube can be inserted into the windpipe (trachea) to help a patient breathe. If necessary, the tube can be connected to an oxygen supply and a breathing machine called a ventilator, it was learnt.

The AIIMS. Bhuhaneswar has set up a panel of doctors to suggest and

guide the ICU-discharged patients and their attendants on how to take care of the patients. As many as 200 such patients have so far been roped in for availing the post-ICU rehabilitation facilities.

The event, titled '200 and Growing', witnessed healthcare workers, doctors, nurses, rehabilitated patients and their family members come together on one platform to share stories, said Alok

He said the aim was to enhance awareness among the various stakeholders to widen the reach of such rehabilitation projects.

They discussed key parameters that ensure successful rehabilitation, such as the training at bedside and home follow-up.

AIIMS, Bhubaneswar executive director Ashutosh Biswas interacted directly with the patients and some of their families who shared their experiences.

The NHM, Odisha, has funded this innovation project.

STA to launch weeklong drive State braces for heavy against overloading of vehicles

Bhubaneswar, Sept 17: The State launch a weeklong drive beginning September 19 against overloading of vehicles throughout Odisha, an official said Saturday.

Joint Transport Commissioner (Road Safety) Sanjay Biswal said that the drive that will begin September 19 and conclude 25 will be extensively carried out across the state with special focus in regions hav-

ing industrial and mining activities. "Overloading by goods carriers has grave implications on the safety of road users and the durability of roads. In regions having industrial and mining activities, many goods vehicles could be found plying in brazen violation of Motor

Vehicle (MV) rules," said Biswal. Biswal added that the enforcement drive will be carried out with special focus on Rayagada, Bolangir,



overloading vehicles in 2021. While 673 road users were killed in mishaps, 834

Bargarh, Sambalpur, Jharsuguda, Sundargarh, Dhenkanal, Angul, Cuttack, Kendrapara, Jajpur, Balasore, Bhadrak and Khurda. According to the MV Amendment

Act, 2019, the violators will be penalised under Section 194 (1). Overloading of vehicles would attract a penalty of Rs 20,000 and additional fine of Rs 2,000 per excessive tonne. Moreover, the Driving Licence (DL) may be suspended for three months.

In a press meet Friday, Jharpada Durga puja committee general sec-

retary Dharanidhar Jena said that for the last two years people have not been able to celebrate the occasion with happiness and festivity due to Covid-19 restrictions. However, this year we are hoping to celebrate Durga puja festival in grand manner, Jena added.

Jena informed that more than 50 people from Kolkata have come to construct the pandal which will be 50 feet in height and 150 feet in width. Work has been going on for

Earlier, BMC Commissioner Vijay Amruta Kulange said that discussions have been held to conduct a hassle-free puja. "We will coordinate with all puja committees in order to ensure cleanliness around the pandal. Drinking water and toilet facilities will have to be set up at all puja pandals. Each committee has been asked to appoint a nodal person who will be responsible for the arrangements," Kulange said.

"Paperless courts will also save precious time for lawyers, who may soon find themselves burning less midnight oil stitching together paper-books and preparing volumes upon volumes of annexures," he said adding that paperless courts are environmentally sustainable because they will (as their name suggests) reduce the consumption of paper.

Justice Chandrachud said that it is estimated that the Indian legal system is responsible for the use of millions, if not billions, of sheets of paper in any given year.

"Inauguration of paperless courts in Odisha will certainly go a long way in ensuring that this number is reduced. All the advantages that I have listed are doubly beneficial in the context of the District Courts because it is there that a lion's share of the country's litigation takes place.

"In a lighter vein, the only disadvantage of paperless courts is that young lawyers will be deprived of the daily workout or exercise that comes with carrying voluminous paper books. We may witness a rise in the number of gym subscriptions in Odisha after the inauguration of paperless courts!," he said.

Justice Chandrachud said it is imperative to recognize the existence of the digital divide and take steps to bridge this gap.

"We must and will ensure that the digitisation of the court process does not disadvantage the common citizens in any way. E-Sewa Kendras are being set up in the High Courts and in one District Court in each state to assist lawyers and litigants with various eprocesses and we intend to ensure that within a period of one year, every single court establishment will have an e-Sewa

"It is true that many of us may be unfamiliar with the use of technology and therefore uncomfortable with using it in court proceedings. As a former member of that group, I am happy to report that familiarizing oneself with technology is not as difficult as it may initially seem," he said.

Justice Chandrachud said while courts across the nation quickly and efficiently adapted to what we have come to term as "the new normal", it is important to remember that reactive policy-making rarely results in the development of sustainable and bankable solutions.

Therefore, courts at all levels must build digital capabilities that are scalable, stable and designed for use by lay persons and lawyers,

Seized ganja over 32 quintal destroyed

Bhubaneswar, Sept 17: The state police including the Special Task Force (STF) of Crime Branch have disposed off seized cannabis weighing 3270 kg before the completion of the trial in the current month. The destroyed contrabands were seized from the possession of drug peddlers held in 11 cases registered by STF sleuths under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, 1985 during the last couple of years.

The drugs were destroyed at the designated incinerators following all due procedure as per the decision of the Drug Disposal Committees of Kandhamal, Malkangiri, Angul and Koraput

'The STF has already destructed/disposed of more than 8.5 Kg Brown Sugar as per Sec.52 A of NDPS Act, 1985 in the month of June. It is further worthwhile to mention here that many other cases are under process (both at STF

The drugs were destroyed at the designated incinerators following all due procedure as per the decision of the Drug **Disposal Committees**

and district police level) for disposal/destruction. It is expected that most of the seized drugs will be destructed within 3-6 months," STF mentioned in the press note.

Notably, the Supreme Court of India in 2016 had directed the authorities to destroy the seized drugs, even in cases in which the proceedings are still pending before the concerned courts. Subsequently, the Orissa high court while hearing a plea by STF issued a detailed Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) and directed the Sub-ordinate courts to dispose off the applications filed under sections Sec.52A of NDPS Act, 1985 for the destruction of the seized contraband.

SEIAA norms thrown to winds in Keonjhar

SPCB ISSUES SHOW CAUSE TO STONE CRUSHING UNI

Keonjhar, Sept 17: The State **Environment Impact Assessment** Authority (SEIAA) has laid guide lines that no stone crushing unit will function within a five-km perimeter of the lease area limits. But this norm has been openly flouted at Khantaghar under Dhenkikote revenue circle in Keonjhar district as a stone crushing unit and two coal tar plants have been running near a

These units operating in close proximity of the stone mine are allegedly triggering air and water pollution in the area, leaving the locals suffocated and fuming.

Local people have sought to know how the Revenue department and the Odisha State Pollution Control Board (OSPCB) could turn a blind eye to such blatant violation of anti-pollution norms and urged the administration to look into the problem and take steps.

Meanwhile, it was learnt that the OSPCB has issued a show cause notice to the company September 9, 2022.

Reports said, the stone quarry has been leased out at Khajurijuani near Khantaghar to meet the raw material requirement for ongoing expansion of NH-20. The stone crushing unit has been operating for some years within the lease area. This is an illegal unit set up by Shivam Condev Pvt Ltd as it has not obtained sitting criteria certificate from the authorities concerned. Moreover, the unit has not obtained consent-to-operation (CTO) from the Odisha State Pollution Control Board (OSPCB). Locals have demanded an investigation into all such violations committed by the stone crushing unit.

Beside, the unit has been set up on 2.90 acre belonging to some tribals, locals pointed out. Two coal tar units have been functioning in the peripheral area. The administration has not granted permission for the coal tar plants.

The officials are not measuring quantities of stone being extracted from the mine and stones being crushed with crusher on a daily basis. Locals alleged that as the stone crushing unit and coal tar units are near a reserve forest, pollutant fumes and dust particles are flouting the environment. "Water and air are getting polluted from dust particles and black smoke. Movement of wildlife in the area has been severely affected by pollution, lights and noise of the crusher unit," said some conscious citizens.

"Due to excessive illegal stone mining and crushing, the state government is incurring huge revenue losses. The administration should look into these aspects,' locals said, demanding closure of the coal tar units.

Contacted, manager of ARSS construction agency Nihar Das said that there has been no violation in setting up of the stone crushing unit. The manager of the stone crushing unit was contacted over phone, but he did not pick it up.

Regional officer of the OSPCB, Prashant Kar said that a complaint in this regard was received and legal action will be taken only after a probe.

e like to think India is in some way different from the rest of South Asia but really we are not. On the meaningful indicators there is little to separate Indians from Bangladeshis or Pakistanis. For instance, our per capita income is quite similar. In 2021, the three nations had an income per person of \$2503 for Bangladesh, \$2277 for India and \$1537 for Pakistan. For comparison, Kenya was at \$2006 and South Africa at \$6900. Now look at China (\$12556), South Korea (\$34757) and Japan (\$39285). They are clearly in a different league from us while we in South Asia are

Let us take human development indicators. The United Nations describes its Human Development Index as a summary measure of average achievement in key dimensions of human development: a long and healthy life, being knowledgeable and have a decent standard of living. The health dimension is assessed by life expectancy at birth, the education dimension is measured by mean of years of schooling for adults aged 25 years and more and expected years of schooling for children of school entering age. The standard of living dimension is measured by gross national income per capita.

In 1990, meaning 32 years ago, Bangladesh's life expectancy at birth was 56 years and mean years of schooling 3.3 years. Pakistan's was 60 years and

2.3 years, while India's was 58 years and 2.8 years. In 2021, this has become 72 years and 7.4 years for Bangladesh, 67 years and 6.7 years of schooling for India and 66 years and 4.5 years for Pakistan. Nepal at 68 years and 5.1 years, and Sri Lanka 76 years and 10.8 years can be seen for comparison. The world average was 72 years of life expectancy at birth and 8.6 years of schooling, meaning that with the exception of Sri Lanka, all South Asian nations are below the world average.

In 1990 China was 68 years and 4.1 years of schooling. Today it is 78 years and 7.6 years, and it is the average income that takes China over the world average for their HDI.

To the outsider looking at such things, it will not seem like India is different from Pakistan or Bangladesh. Confronted with the hard data we would have to agree with them, even if we may have some philosophical idea of difference. If we accept we are similar if not same then we must turn to why it is that we have not been able to grow faster and make lives better for our people since 1947. Is it, as is often assumed. the "system" that is the problem? Again, here if we examine the history of South Asia we find that in the 75 years we have experimented with every possible type of system but we remain poor and clubbed together.

We have dabbled in parliamentary democracy that has been dominated by one party (India under Congress and under BJP since 2014), that has been comprised of various factions (1979, then 1989, 1998 and under Vajpayee), and that has derailed itself with authoritarianism (1975-77). We have tried military dictatorships (Pakistan in the 1960s, 1980s, 2000s and Bangladesh in the 1970s and 1980s). We have tried dynastic democracy (Gandhis, Bhuttos, Mujib-Hasina, Zia-Khaleda), we have tried "merit" democratic leaders (Morarji, Shastri, Vajpayee, Sharif, Modi, Gujral, Gowda). We have tried managing the economy through central planning (India in the 1950s and 1960s), through license raj, through "liberalisation". We have returned to the same things we were doing before (import substitution in India in the 1970s and today). We have created sectors where we are leaders (India 30 years ago in IT/BPO and Bangladesh today in garments). We have developed nuclear weapons, we have spent large sums on our militaries. Pakistan sends 17% of its government spending to the army, India and Bangladesh send 9%. We have tried to be strong, we have tried to be defiant. We have joined Western alliances (Pakistan in the 1960s), we have remained non-aligned (India in the 1950s) and we have tried a patchwork of things in between. But the end result is the numbers we see at the top of this

The World Bank says that intraregional trade between Bangladesh, India and Pakistan accounts for 5% of our total trade, compared to South East Asia where the number is five times higher. Trade here is \$23 billion though it could be five times more. The problem is purely man-made. The World Bank says that "border challenges mean it is about 20 per cent cheaper for a company in India to trade with Brazil instead of a neighbouring South Asian country" and that the main problem is "a broad trust deficit throughout the region.

column. There must be something we are missing. What is it?

This is the one thing we have not tried. We have not opened ourselves to each other and returned to the sort of geography and economy that we had before 1947. Is it possible that we can do that and what are the effects it can have on our societies? I do not know if by doing this we can repeat what China and Japan and South Korea did, but I do know that it removes the one restraint that we have put on ourselves and can remove ourselves. The fact that it is not even discussed widely today in the region, despite all three states being democracies, tells us something about how blind we have become to our condition. And how satisfied our political parties are with the way things continue to remain in the South Asia as we enter the second quarter of the

■ Boycott

Captain Charles Cunningham Boycott was an Englishman working in ✓ Ireland. In the 1870s he was farming at Loughmask in County Mayo and serving as a land agent for an absentee English landlord, Lord Earne. This was the time of the campaign organised by the Irish Land League for reform of the system of landholdings. In September 1880, protesting tenants demanded that Captain Boycott give them a substantial reduction in their rents. He refused. Charles Stuart Parnell, the President of the Land League, suggested in a speech that the way to force Boycott to give way was for everyone in the locality to refuse to have any dealings with him. Labourers would not work for him, local shops stopped serving him (food had to be brought in from elsewhere for him and his family), and he even had great trouble getting his letters delivered. In the end, his crops were harvested that autumn through the help of fifty volunteers from the north of the country, who worked under the protection of nine hundred soldiers. The events aroused so much passion that his name became an instant byword. It was first used — in our modern sense of collective and organised ostracism — in the Times of London in November 1880, even while his crops were still being belatedly harvested; within weeks it was everywhere. It was soon adopted by newspapers throughout Europe, with versions of his name appearing in French, German, Dutch and Russian. By the time of the Captain's death in 1897, it had become a standard part of the English language.

DANGEROUS EMBRACE

EACH US PRESIDENT SEEMS TO BELIEVE THE WORLD IS WAITING FOR AMERICAN DIRECTION AND DEVISES POLICIES BASED ON THIS FLAWED ASSUMPTION

he United States rarely learns from its mistakes, what the late political scientist Hans Morgenthau called "strategic narcissism." Each US President seems to believe the world is waiting for American direction and devises policies based on this flawed assumption.

For example, President Joe Biden seems determined to repeat past blunders by resuming America's coddling of Pakistan. Successive US Presidents have failed to appreciate that America's longstanding partnership with Pakistan's rogue Inter-Services Intelligence agency has allowed Pakistan to institu tionalise terrorism by employing armed jihadists in low-intensity asymmetric warfare against neighbouring countries. For example, Pakistan has always sought to colonise Afghanistan by installing a regime that would do its bidding, so the ISI created the Taliban in the early 1990s. With the Taliban back in control after the ISI engineered America's humiliating defeat in Afghanistan, Pakistan has gotten

Pakistan itself has become an extremist Mecca that hosts multiple United Nations-designated terrorist entities. The US found al-Qaeda founder Osama bin Laden - the mastermind behind the worst terrorist attack in American history - living next to the Pakistan Military Academy. Other 9/11 plotters – including Khalid Sheikh Mohammed, al-Qaeda's third in command - were also captured in Pakistan. And yet, despite its terrorist ties, Pakistan's politically powerful military, including its ISI, has managed to get off scot-free.

On the recent 21st anniversary of the 9/11 attacks, Biden pledged to continue monitoring and disrupting terrorist activities "wherever we find them, wherever they exist," while noting that it took "ten years to hunt down and kill Osama bin Laden." Yet, disturbingly, Biden has reversed the policy of his predecessor, Donald Trump, to keep Pakistan at arm's length until it ended its unholy alliance with terrorist organisations. Biden could have taken advan-

tage of Pakistan's desperate need for an International Monetary Fund bailout to compel it to sever its links with state-backed terrorist groups. Instead, his administration recently helped the country stave off an imminent debt default by securing the IMF board's approval for the immediate disbursement of a \$1.1 billion aid package. This is not the only leverage over Pakistan that the Biden administration has been reluctant to use. With American and Chinese support, Pakistan is close to exiting the "gray list" of the Parisbased Financial Action Task Force (FATF), the inter-governmental agency combating terrorist financing and money laundering. The fact that Pakistani authorities have not addressed the reason their country was placed on that list in 2018 – tolerating terrorist financing – appears to matter little. In fact, Pakistan should have been placed on the FATF's most punitive 'black" list, a status that usually invites Western sanctions. But American troops were fighting the Taliban at the time, and the US, seeking to moderate Pakistan's approach to Afghanistan, successfully lobbied against it.

Nothing better illustrates Biden's embrace of Pakistan than the \$450 million deal unveiled this month to modernize the cash-strapped country's US-supplied F-16 fleet, despite the risk that it might harm America's close strategic relationship with India. For decades, the US had armed Pakistan to the teeth, a role subsequently taken over by China as a manoeuvre against India. The F-16s were given to Pakistan as a reward for its serving as the staging ground for the covert US war against the Soviet forces occupying Afghanistan in the 1980s, when Pakistan also launched its nuclear-weapons programme clandestinely. Pakistan's four active F-16 squadrons remain central to its air-warfare plans against India: in fact, some were involved in a February 2019 skirmish across the

Line of Control in Kashmir. The US justified the deal by disingenuously claiming that equipping Pakistan's F-16s with cutting-edge avionics would advance counterterrorism. But the move-announced without warning India, which was hosting senior US officials at the time - will likely renew skepticism toward the US among Indian officials. Biden has said nothing about China's 28-month-long frontier aggression against India, and his State Department chose to remain neutral by urging the two powers to find "a peaceful resolution." By strengthening Pakistan - China's client state - the F-16 deal further

imperils US-India relations.

Biden's enthusiastic re-engage ment with Pakistan dismisses those who called on the US to punish Pakistan for its pivotal role in the Afghanistan debacle. Far from imposing sanctions or adding Pakistan to the State Department's list of state sponsors of terrorism, his administration has championed the country as a "major non-NATO ally," a status conferred on 17 other countries as well – but not India.

This approach should not come as a surprise. The US did not impose sanctions on Pakistan even after it aided and abetted the Taliban's killing of American sol diers. Instead, the US treated Pakistan as a gatekeeper of its geopolitical interests in the region. America's weakened position following its Afghan fiasco has only increased its dependence on the ISI, which continues to facilitate the Biden administration's outreach to the Taliban.

The recent assassination of al-Qaeda leader Ayman al-Zawahiri in Kabul by an American drone strike would not have been possible without US access to Pakistani airspace, which explains Secretary of State Antony Blinken's commitment to "expanding the US-Pakistan partnership." But at the heart of this partnership is a Faustian bargain whereby the Biden administration condones Pakistan's harbouring of known terrorists and eases sanctions on the brutal Taliban regime, despite its close ties with al-Qaeda.

The Biden administration's re luctance to learn from previous US failures ensures that short-term geopolitical considerations will continue to drive American foreign policy, despite the long-term strategic damage to America's interests. Biden's approach will nurture a major hub of international terrorism and jihadism, allowing Pakistan to set regional fires while pretending to be a firefighter.

How Wright's Law can right the climate

THE LESS **EXPENSIVE CLIMATE ACTION BECOMES, THE GREATER OUR CHANCES OF MAINTAINING CLIMATE STABILITY**

Athe United States is critical to preserving a livable planet. And with the recently enacted Inflation Reduction Act – which allocates hundreds of billions of dollars toward decarbonisation - America has shored up its credibility just in time for the United Nations Climate Change Conference (COP27) in Egypt.

America is now well positioned to achieve its goal of halving its emissions by 2030, relative to 2005 levels. While the IRA's provisions could cut US emissions up to 43% by 2030. the remaining shortfall can be covered by new Environmental Protection Agency rules and stronger state-level action of the kind that we have seen this year in California.

But while the IRA is a historic achievement in its own right, its largest benefits will come in the form of global economic spillover effects. Like the European Union's "Fit for 55" policies, the IRA will drive the deployment of solar, wind, and battery storage, thereby reducing the costs of these clean technologies for everyone. Ultimately, all countries will pay much less to cut their own emissions at the speed and scale necessary to keep climate change in check.

To be sure, the US still needs to fol-

s the world's second-largest low through on its other climate capacity to produce zero-carbon hying the \$11.4 billion per year that it has pledged to finance mitigation and adaptation in the Global South. Counterintuitively, though, massive domestic investments in clean technologies by the US and the EU stand to be much more valuable than any direct financing they provide, owing to a little-known phenomenon known as Wright's Law.

Named after the US engineer who first noticed it in the 1930s (Theodore Wright), Wright's Law predicts that every cumulative doubling of a technology's global production will reduce its cost by a constant percentage. And as recent research at the University of Oxford confirms, solar, wind, battery, and electrolyzer costs have declined steeply as their global production has increased

But even more significantly, the researchers found that Wright's Law holds true even after an innovative technology has achieved high levels of market maturity. That means the IRA's \$370 billion dollar investment in clean-energy production could trigger even faster cost decreases for the technologies needed to solve the climate crisis, delivering a higher quality of life for billions of people.

IRA incentives are expected to add five gigawatts of electrolyzer

emitter of greenhouse gases. commitments, not least by provid-drogen, which will be critical to cutting emissions in the chemical industry and aviation. Moreover, the IRA's public investments will unlock several times as much private capital. Add in Europe's investments and China's massive push into clean energy and EVs, and annual deployment of innovative clean technologies is poised to explode. In addition to reducing emissions

in the world's largest and most highly polluting economies, the exponential growth in clean technologies will make it dramatically cheaper for the rest of the world to transform their energy systems. In fact, we have already seen this dynamic playing out. Green investments by Germany and California at the start of the last decade helped reduce the costs of solar by 85% and of wind by 56% between 2010 and 2020. Similarly, EV demand in China has helped slash battery costs by 89% since 2010.

For its part, India has capitalised on these falling costs by designing clever power auctions that result in the lowest utility-scale solar-power prices in the world. As the decrease in costs accelerates, countries across the Global South will be able to exploit the benefits of Wright's Law through bold policies to decarbonise

sistently shows that ambitious cleanenergy policies expand economies and create jobs, while also improving air quality. Even before the IRA, research found that India could save more than 60 trillion rupees (\$752 billion) by 2050 if it adopts high-decarbonisation policies.

To that end, performance standards - requiring an increasing minimum share of clean power and EVs each year - are a particularly powerful instrument. In low- and middle-income countries, such policies can elegantly leverage US and EU investments at no cost to governments beyond enforcement, and can prevent a country from becoming a dumping ground for polluting vehicles and equipment.

Understanding Wright's Law can help reframe North-South dialogue at COP27. Domestic investments by the wealthiest countries will cut costs for developing countries and stretch international finance further. The less expensive climate action becomes, the greater our chances of maintaining climate stability.

Rao charged "disruptive forces' with distorting the occasion of September 17 to fulfill their narrow and selfish political interests. The TRS hit back, slamming Shah for trying to "divide and bully."

While the Centre celebrated the 'Hyderabad Liberation Day,' the state government had opted for the nomenclature "Telangana Jateeya Samaikyata Dinotsavam" (Telangana National Integration

vote bank politics," Shah charged. He was speaking at the Union Government's official celebration of 'Hyderabad Liberation Day' to mark the occasion of erstwhile princely State under Nizam rule merging with the Indian Union on September 17, 1948, following a police action codenamed "Operation

In an apparent reference to Chief Minister Rao, Shah said many people had promised during elections and agitations to commemorate the day but went back on them after coming to power. "Many people had made promises, during elections and during agitations. But, after coming to power, they turned back due to the fear of 'Razakars' (armed supporters of Nizam rule)," he said.

He congratulated Prime Minister Modi for his decision to officially celebrate the day. Shah said he is not surprised but happy that everybody now celebrates the day after Modi took the decision.

"They celebrate the day. But, it is

not called 'Hyderabad Liberation Day'. There is still fear in the mind. I would like to tell them that remove that fear. 'Razakars' cannot make decisions in this country. It has been 75 years since this country got independence," he said.

Shah credited the country's first Home Minister Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel for the liberation of Hyderabad and said the erstwhile princely state might not have joined India by 1948, but for the former's efforts. "Even though Omar Abdullah was a minister in the Vajpayeeled NDA government, the closing of ranks between the NC and the BJP is practically impossible after abrogation of Article 370, 35A and the downgrading of the state into a Union Territory," said another politician who is a constituent of the People's Alliance for Gupkar Declaration (PAGD) headed by NC president, Dr. Farooq

What adds an important dimension to this development is the opinion of some senior leaders of the BJP in the UT.

TN suicide numbers shoot up in 2 years



Chennai, Sept 17: The latest report of the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) states that Tamil Nadu witnessed the second highest number of suicides in the country. Maharashtra tops the list with 22,207 suicides, and Tamil Nadu is second with a total of 18,925 suicides.

As per the NCRB data, in 2019 Tamil Nadu reported 13,493 suicides, 16,883 in 2020 and an increase to 18,925 in 2021.

Social activist and counsellor Sneha Abraham of Sradha, an NGO actively involved in the counselling



of people with psychological issues, noted that there are various reasons for people to commit suicide. She

said that most of the suicides in Tamil Nadu are due to domestic issues, followed by financial distress, chronic disease, failed romance, and poor results in examinations.

The study found that the average age of those who committed suicide due to family issues was between 35 and 40, while those who took their own lives because of failed love affairs were between 18 and 25 years. Students in the average age group of 16 to 21 committed suicide due to poor results and failure to crack competitive exams. Those who took their own life due to financial distress were in the age group of 28 to 45 and those who ended their lives due to chronic illness were 45 to 60. The number of males was more than women among those who committed suicide in Tamil Nadu.

Sneha Abraham said: "Several rounds of counselling are done to prevent people from committing suicide. However, according to the latest NCRB report, there is a steady increase in the number of suicides in Tamil Nadu. I feel that right from school days, there has to be proper counselling to students to make them mentally strong. Children have to be confident in life and then the tendency to commit suicide will be less.'

Dehradun, Sept 17: A section of priests in Kedarnath have opposed the gold plating of the walls inside the sanctum sanctorum of the Himalayan temple saying it amounted to tampering with its centuries-old traditions

Pilgrimage priests (teerth purohits) opposing the gold plating are incensed that the use of big drilling machines in the process are damaging the temple's walls. The four

walls of the famed temple were covered with silver plates which have been removed to replace them with gold plates.

The gold plating of the temple's walls is being done after a Shiva devotee from Maharashtra volunteered to make an offering of gold for the purpose and his proposal was accepted by the Badrinath-Kedarnath Temple Committee with permission from the state government.

The gold plating is damaging the temple walls. Big drilling ma-



chines are being used for the purpose. We cannot tolerate this tampering with the centuries old tra-


ditions of the temple," a pilgrimage priest named Santosh Trivedi said in Kedarnath

However, the priests are divided on the issue with some senior priests favouring the renovation work currently underway inside the temple's sanctum sanctorum. Senior priest at the temple Shrinivas Posti and former president of Kedar Sabha Mahesh Bagwadi said the temple is a major centre of Sanatan faith and gold plating of its walls is in keeping with the Hindu beliefs and traditions. Badrinath-Kedarnath Temple

Committee president Ajendra Ajay said opposition to the the gold plating of the temple walls is not justified as it is being done in accordance with the traditions without tampering with the original structure.

"Renovation and beautification of the temple from time to time is a normal practice. A handful of priests may oppose it but their representative bodies never opposed it. Decades ago the temple ceiling used to be made of grass and twigs. As the times changed it began to be made of stones and later of copper sheets," he said.

The BKTC president also termed the protest as part of the "opposition propaganda". "Hindu temples all over the country are symbols of grandeur. Decorating Hindu deities with gold and jewellery has been part of our traditions. I see nothing wrong in covering the temple walls with gold plates," Ajay said. The BKTC took due permission from the state government beforegoing ahead with the gold plating of the temple walls, he said.

Addressing a news conference here, defence minister Khawaja Asif said Chinese President Xi Jingping had extended an invitation to Sharif to visit China during a meeting in Samarkand, Uzbekistan on the sidelines of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) summit, which concluded Friday.

Landslides in **Nepal claim 17**

Kathmandu: At least 17 people triggered by heavy rains in western Nepal in the past 24 hours, an official said Saturday. The landslides occurred in different parts of the Achham district of the Sudurpaschim province, which has been badly affected by floods caused by incessant rainfall for the last few days. According to acting chief district officer Dipesh Rijal, at least 17 people have been confirmed dead in landslides in the district, which is about 450 km west of Kathmandu.

Israel strike hits Syrian airport

Damascus: An Israeli strike hit Damascus International Airport and other areas of the Syrian capital, killing five soldiers, state media reported Saturday, The state-run SANA News Agency said the strike hit around 12.45 am. It said there had been some "material losses", without elaborating. Israel hasn't directly acknowledged the strikes, but it comes amid a wider shadow war between the country and Iran.

Kyrgyz-Tajik hold talks to end conflict

Moscow: The security chiefs of Kyrgyzstan and Tajikistan sat down for talks Saturday to stop fighting on the border between the two countries that so far has killed at least 24 people and wounded over 100. The Kyrgyz border service announced the new round of talks as the two ex-Soviet nations traded blame for shelling that resumed Saturday morning after what appeared to be a brief respite overnight. The fighting, which started Wednesday for no obvious or publicly announced reason, intensified Friday.

Samarkand, Sept 17: President Vladimir Putin brushed off a lightning Ukrainian counter-offensive with a smile but warned that Russia would respond more forcefully if its troops were put under further pressure.

Speaking after a summit of the Cooperation Shanghai Organisation in the Uzbek city of Samarkand, Putin cast the invasion as a necessary step to prevent what he said was a Western plot to break Russia apart.

Putin also said the "liberation" of Ukraine's entire eastern Donbas region remained Russia's main military goal and that he sees no need to revise it. Moscow, he said, was in no hurry in Ukraine. And its goals remained unchanged.

The Kiev authorities announced that they have launched and are conducting an active counter-offensive operation. Well, let's see how it develops, how it ends up," Putin said with a grin.

It was his first public comment on a rout of his forces in northeastern Ukraine's Kharkiv region a week ago that has prompted unusually strong public criticism from Russian military commentators.

Russia hit Ukrainian infrastructure in response - including a reservoir dam and electricity supplies - and Putin said those attacks could get worse


Asked if what he calls the "special military operation" needed correction, he said: "The plan is not subject to adjustment.

'The General Staff considers one thing important, another thing secondary - but the main task remains unchanged, and it is being implemented," Putin said. "The main goal is the liberation of the entire territory of Donbas.'

The Donbas comprises two largely Russian-speaking provinces of eastern Ukraine - Luhansk, which is now fully under the control of Russian and Russian-backed separatist forces, and Donetsk. which they partially control.

However, Russia now occupies around a fifth of Ukraine in all, including much of the southerly Zanorizhzhia and Kherson provinces, in addition to Crimea. which it seized in 2014 and considers part of Russia.

American media Friday praised Prime Minister Narendra Modi for telling Russian President Vladimir Putin that this is not the time for war in Ukraine. The Modi-Putin conversation in Samarkand was widely carried by the mainstream American media. "Modi rebukes Putin over wai in Ukraine," The Washington Post reported in a headline, "In a stunning public rebuke, Modi told Putin: "Today's era is not an era of war, and I have spoken to you on the phone about this," the daily reported. "The rare reproach showed the 69-yearold Russian strongman coming under extraordinary pressure from all sides," the Post said. It was the lead story on the webpage of both The Washington Post and The New York Times. "India's Leader Tells Putin That Now Is Not an Era for War," The New York Times said in its headline. "The tone of the meeting was friendly, with both leaders refe ring to their long shared history. Before Modi made his comments, Putin said he understood India's con cerns about the war in Ukraine," the daily said. "Modi's comments came a day after President Xi Jinping of China -- in his first face-to-face meet ing with Putin since the invasion began -- struck a far more subdued tone than the Russian president, and steered clear in his public comments of any mention of Ukraine," reported the New York Times.

China saves 26/11 mastermind from **UNSC's blacklist**

United Nations, Sept 17: China has blocked a proposal by the US and India at the United Nations to blacklist top Pakistan-based Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) militant Sajid Mir, one of India's most wanted terrorists and the main handler of the deadly 2008 Mumbai attacks, in the third such move by Beijing within four months.

It is learnt that Beijing put a hold Thursday on the proposal moved by the US and co-designated by India to blacklist Mir under the 1267 Al-Qaeda Sanctions Committee of the UN Security Council as a global terrorist and subject him to assets freeze, travel ban and arms embargo.

Mir is one of India's most wanted terrorists and has a bounty of \$5 million placed on his head by the US for his role in the 26/11 Mumbai terror attacks carried out by Pakistan-based LeT terrorists.

In June this year, he was jailed for over 15 years in a terror-financing case by an anti-terrorism court in Pakistan, which is struggling to exit the grey list of the Paris-based Financial Action Task Force (FATF).

Pakistani authorities had in the past claimed Mir had died, but Western countries remained unconvinced and demanded proof of his death. This issue became a major sticking point in FATF's assessment of Pakistan's progress on the action plan late last year.

Fury in Iran as woman dies after moral police arrest

Under Iran's sharia (Islamic) law, imposed after the 1979 revolution, women are obliged to cover their hair and wear long, loose-fitting clothes to disguise their figures. Violators face public rebuke, fines or arrest

Dubai, Sept 16: A young Iranian woman has died after falling into morality police enforcing Iran's strict hijab rules, sparking protests by Iranians on social media and on the streets Friday.

In the past few months, Iranian rights activists have urged women to publicly remove their veils, a gesture that would risk their arrest for defying the Islamic dress code as the country's hardline rulers crack down harder on "immoral behavior".

Authorities launched probes into the death of Mahsa Amini following a demand by President Ebrahim Raisi, state media reported. Police said the 22-year-old was taken ill as she waited together with other detained women at a morality police station.

"Since her transfer to the vehicle



and also at the location (station), there was no physical encounter with her," a police statement said, rejecting allegations on social media that Amini was likely beaten.

Closed-circuit television footage carried by state TV appeared to show a woman identified as Amini falling over after getting up from her seat to speak to an official at a police station.

Police earlier said Amini had suffered a heart attack after being taken to the station to be "educated". Her relatives have denied she suffered any heart condition.

Several prominent sports and arts figures posted critical social media comments about Amini's death, and outspoken reformist politician Mahmoud Sadeghi called on Supreme leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei on Twitter to speak out as he had denounced the killing of George Floyd by US police in 2020.

Japan braces for super typhoon


Tokyo, Sept 17: The Japan Meteorological Agency issued a special typhoon warning Saturday for Kagoshima prefecture on Kyushu, the southernmost of Japan's main islands, as the region braces for a powerful and potentially destructive super typhoon.

The warning came after the weather agency earlier in the day urged residents to evacuate parts of the Kyushu, ahead of the typhoon Nanmadol, expected to bring up to half a metre (20 inches) of rain when it makes landfall Sunday.

Nanmadol, classified as a super typhoon by the US Navy's Joint Typhoon Warning Center, has the potential to be the most destructive tropical storm to strike Japan in decades.

The 14th typhoon of the season was near Japan's southern Minami-Daito Island heading northwest at 20 kph (12 mph) Saturday afternoon. Winds at the centre of the storm were blowing at 198 kph (123mph) and gusting up to 270 kph (167 mph), according to the JMA.

Mumbai: The country's foreign exchange reserves declined by \$2.234 billion to stand at \$550.871 billion for the week ended September 9, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) said Friday. In the previous reporting week, the reserves had dropped by \$7.941 billion to \$553.105 billion. The foreign currency assets decreased by \$2.519 billion to \$489.598 billion in the reporting week. The value of the gold reserves increased by \$340 million to \$38.644 billion, the data showed. The Special Drawing Rights dropped by \$63 million to \$17.719 billion. The country's reserve position with the IMF was up by \$8 million to \$4.91 billion in the reporting week.

First REIT of retail assets coming soon

New Delhi: India is expected to get its first Real Estate Investment Trust (REIT) of retail assets soon as institutional investors and developers look to monetise their rent-yielding space in shopping malls, according to III. India, REIT, a popular instrument globally, was introduced in India a few years ago to attract investment in the real estate sector by monetising rentyielding assets. It helps unlock the massive value of real estate assets and enable retail participation. At present, there are three listed REITs - Embassy Office Parks REIT, Mindspace **Business Parks REIT and** Brookfield India Real Estate Trust - on Indian stock exchanges but all these are of leased office assets.

Several people were cheated in the last few years by cyber frauds because they have stored their card data on the merchants website for future payments.

Tokenisation means the details of your cards such as 16-digit number, names, expiry dates and codes which you used to save earlier for the future payments will now be replaced by a token.

The RBI is implementing these norms of tokenisation in order to secure the card details of the customers. Currently, the bank card details are saved by a merchant during a transaction. If, the merchant's website is hacked, the details of the customers will be exposed.

Post implementation of these norms all the customers data will be with the bank and not with the merchant website.

The review cautioned that increased focus of advanced economies on energy security in view of upcoming winter months could elevate geopolitical tensions, testing India's astute handling of its energy needs so far.

India imports 85.5 per cent of its crude oil requirements and hence higher prices in the global market have a major bearing on domestic inflation. "In these uncertain times, it may not be possible to remain satisfied and sit back for long periods. Eternal macroeconomic vigilance is the price for stability and sustained growth," it said.

Watchful and prudent fiscal management and credible monetary policy will remain essential for India to fulfil its growth aspirations, it said, adding, both these pillars of public policy will enable benchmark borrowing costs for the government and the private sector



vate sector capital formation. Vigorous pursuit of asset monetisation at all levels of government will help lower debt stock and hence debt servicing costs, it said.

That would cause risk premiums to drop and credit rating of India to improve and a virtuous circle would set in as the quality of public expenditure increases in its wake and the private sector enjoys a lower cost of capital, it said.

On the first quarter growth numbers, the report said, the real GDP in first quarter of 2022-23, is now nearly 4 per cent ahead of its corresponding level of 2019-20, marking a strong beginning to India's growth revival in the post-pandemic phase.

The government raised capital expenditure by 35.4 per cent for the financial year 2022-23 to ₹7.5 lakh crore to continue the public investmentled recovery. The capex last financial year was ₹5.5 lakh crore.

Adani Group pips Tata Group in m-cap

New Delhi, Sept 17: Adani Group has emerged as India's most valuable business house in terms of market capitalisation (m-cap) of its companies, surpassing the Tata Group. The completion of the acquisition of Ambuja Cement and ACC helped Adani overtake the Tata Group and made it India's most valuable conglomerate.

The combined market value of the Adani Group, including the newlyacquired Ambuja and ACC, stood at ₹22.25 lakh crore as Friday The total market value of all Tata Group firms was ₹20.81 lakh crore.

On Friday, the nine listed firms of Adani group lost overall ₹40,000 crore market cap while Tata Group's



market cap declined by nearly ₹60,000 crore. Mukesh Ambani-led Reliance Industries is in third place with ₹17.07 lakh crore market value.

Excluding ACC and Ambuia Cement, the Adani Group's market capitalisation has increased by nearly ₹10.16 lakh crore this year. During this period, Tata Group has lost ₹2.57 lakh crore in market cap as its flag-

ship company Tata Consultancy

Services declined by over 17%.

Adani group stocks have been on a tear this year, with the share prices of four companies more than doubling — Adani Power is up 3.9 times, followed by Adani Transmission, which is up by 2.4 times, even in a weak and volatile market backdrop.

India Inc's overseas

Mumbai, Sept 17: India Inc's investment in their overseas ventures dropped by 59 per cent on an annual basis to \$1.03 billion in August this year, data from Reserve Bank showed.

The RBI data on Outward Foreign Direct Investment (OFDI) for August 2022 showed that the total financial commitment by the domestic firms was worth \$1,027,67

million in August, 2022-23. In the same month of 2021-22, it stood at \$2,500.97 million (\$2.5 billion). In the preceding month of July 2022. Indian businesses' overseas financial investment was \$1,116.69 million (\$1.12 billion).

Of the total investment during August this fiscal, the highest was in the form of equity infusion at \$585.65 million. While \$266.63 million was infused by way of issuance of guarantees, the rest \$175.39 million was through loans.

RBI said the data is provisional and subject to change based on online reporting by authorised dealer (AD) banks. Among the major investors, Lenskart Solutions infused equity worth \$319.99 million in its whollyowned subsidiary in Singapore, while Glenmark Pharmaceuticals invested \$100 million in a fully-owned subsidiary in Switzerland through guarantee issuance.

Hasham Traders Data Stax Inc loaned \$54.69 million to a joint venture in the US and CitiusTech Healthcare invested \$30 million in a fully-owned unit in the US through guarantees. Adani Ports and Special Economic Zone invested \$25.58 million through a mix of loan and guarantee issuance in a wholly-owned unit in Singapore, the RBI data showed.

Social influencers eye long-term gains of proposed norms

New Delhi, Sept 17: As the Centre readies a list of do's and don'ts for social media influencers, the thriving community of individuals and companies is contemplating the challenges of a more 'regulated' future -- and it's not all bad.

So whether it is podcast host Vedant Kaushik or marketing agency Pulp Strategy -- the two ends of the influencer spectrum working towards pushing trends with their endorsement of products ranging from makeup to movies -- both welcome the move to streamline the sector.

"The proposed guidelines will eradicate in one go the vagueness on whether a piece of content is

sponsored or not... We have laws and standards for TV, films, radio, etc. Why not for the modern medium of social media," Kaushik, who has nearly 60,000 followers on Instagram, told PTI. The Department of Consumer

Affairs is expected to come out with guidelines for the community in the next few days, sources said. Influencers with large followers on social media platforms such as Instagram are endorsing products after taking payments from brands, they explained.

Soon, however, they will be required to put a disclaimer in their posts when they endorse a brand or are paid by a brand for promotion, the sources said. Violation of these guidelines might attract hefty penalties.

lowers, is what constitutes influencer marketing. Influencer marketing agencies such as Pulp Strategy connect influencers to companies

and create strategies for them. "The penalties are reportedly

in the range of ₹10 lakh-50 lakh," said influencer-turned-entrepre-neur Gaurav Jain. "I think creators will be fined in accordance with their audience size and the kind of brand they've worked with. But I still feel mostly bigger celebrities and macro creators will fall under their radar in case of noncompliance," Jain explained.

According to influencers and marketing agencies, the fear of heavy fines and possible litigation may pose some challenges, especially to smaller creators, initially. However, in the longer run, the guidelines will help formalise the industry and make brands and creators more responsible towards consumers.

The growing influencer marketing segment can cater to a wide gamut of industries, including fashion, food, cosmetics, design, technology and entertainment.

"An influencer can earn from as small as a few thousands to lakhs of rupees, based on the brand, the creator's reach and the quality of content." Jain explained.

Fitness coach and influencer Meenal Bhardwaj Pathak, who has more than one lakh followers on Instagram, said guidelines and penalties will instil a sense of moral and social responsibility in creators.

Last year, the ASCI released the 'Guidelines For Influencer Advertising In Digital Media' that mandated influencers on social media who advertise brands from their accounts to disclose paid part nerships.

Lillehammer (Norway), Sept 17: India were thrashed 0-3 by a far-superior Norway team as World No.2 Casper Ruud combined with Viktor Durasovic to win the doubles match and complete the rout in the World Group-I tie of the Davis Cup here Saturday. The Indian pair of Yuki Bhambri and Saketh Myneni went down 3-6, 6-3, 3-6.

Having lost both the singles on the opening day, the Yuki-Saketh pair did put up a fight before losing to the fancied Norwegian duo in an hour and 50 minutes.

On day one, both Ramkumar Ramanathan and Prajnesh Gunneswaran had lost their respective singles matches by identical margins of 1-6, 4-6 to Durasovic and Ruud, respectively.

While Ruud, a finalists at French Open and the US Open is a cut above the rest, the Indians couldn't tame even Durasovic, whose singles ranking is a lowly 325 and stands at 224 in the doubles list.

Ruud, on the other hand, doesn't even play doubles on the circuit. However, as had been the case often, the potent singles player had an advantage over the spe-

cialist doubles players. The Norwegian pair needed one break point each in the first and third set to clinch the rubber.

The Yuki-Saketh pairing had had some success at the Challenger level where it reached a few finals, but at a level which is a few notches higher, the duo failed to keep India afloat despite having a better understanding on paper, compared to the pair of Ruud and Durasovic.

With Norway taking an unassailable 3-0 lead, the two reverse singles won't be played. The Indian team were staring at a heavy defeat after conceding a 0-2 lead to the hosts following Ramkumar's loss to Durasovic in the second singles Friday evening.

Ramkumar, the No.1 singles player for India, failed to live up to expectations as he suffered a loss to his lower-ranked opponent Durasovic in one hour and 16



Sagar Jaglan's quest for a bronze medal in 74kg ended as the 18-yearold lost to reigning Asian Champion Yones Aliakbar Emami of Iran 6-0. Sagar had earlier defeated Suldkhuu Olonbayar of Mangolia 7-3 to move to the bronze medal bout.

City has scored 23 goals in the first seven games of its title defense and Haaland has almost half of them.

MotoGP likely to make India debut in winter of 2023

New Delhi, Sept 17: MotoGP, the pinnacle of two-wheel racing, could come to India in the winter of 2023 if all goes ahead as planned, providing a massive boost to the stagnant motorsport scene in the country.

The master agreement between MotoGP commercial rights owner Dorna and Noida-based race promoters Fairstreet Sports could be signed as early as next week.

Dorna MD Carlos Expeleta and CEO Carmelo Ezpeleta will be in the national capital Wednesday and they are expected to make an official announcement on the 'Grand Prix of Bharat'.

The round is most likely to be held at the Buddh International



Circuit, once home of the Formula I Indian Grand Prix, which was discontinued due to financial, tax

and bureaucratic hurdles. The FIM homologation of the track will be done only after the

agreement is signed between MotoGP rights owner and race promoters.

Speaking to PTI, Fairstreet Sports COO Pushkar Nath said they have done their homework for the organisation of the high-profile race, taking into consideration what went wrong with Formula 1 nine years ago. "India is the largest two-wheeler market in the world. Everyone has a connect with bikes. It has aspirational value. MotoGP is one of the most watched sport-

ing events," Nath told PTI. 'We have taken all the precautionary steps for the India round. We ave taken all the steps to ensure we can race in India for a long period. We are looking at a winter

round for India next year.' Akbar Ebrahim, president of

Indian motorsports federation FMSCI, welcomed the development. "I hope the master agreement between Dorna and Fairstreet is signed soon and then we can move on to track homologation and the organisation of the race. The support of the government will be key here," said Ebrahim.

Around 5000 people work on a MotoGP weekend which includes races in junior classes Moto 2 and Moto 3. The race will not only put Uttar Pradesh on the global map but is expected to boost tourism.

The all-electric Formula E race is also coming to Hyderabad next February and if MotoGP can go ahead as planned, Indian motorsport will finally get what it's desperately waiting for.
