he realise, the path he is on, the things that he wants will take away the things which are of much higher importance?







Man gets 25-yr jail for raping 5-yr-old

PHULBANI: A court in Kandhamal district sentenced a 42-year-old man to 25 years of imprisonment Friday for raping a five-year-old girl. Phulbani Pcoso court judge Sanjiv Behera also imposed a fine of ₹25,000 on Nileswar Pradhan, additional public prosecutor Asim Praharaj said. The court directed the District Legal Services Authorities to grant a compensation of ₹6 lakh to the rape survivor. On the evening of October 9, 2020, the girl was returning from her neighbour's house after watching TV when the accused dragged her to a nearby field and raped her. The judgement was based on the statements of 10 witnesses and the medical report.

Monsoon retreats from entire state

BHUBANESWAR: The southwest monsoon has completely retreated from Odisha, the IMD said Friday. The conditions are very likely to become favourable for further withdrawal of southwest monsoon from the entire country over the next 48 hours, it said. Though the monsoon has withdrawn from the state, Odisha is likely to experience heavy to very heavy rainfall October 24 and 25 under the influence of a possible cyclone over the Bay of Bengal. The Regional Meteorological Centre in Bhubaneswar has issued a heavy rainfall warning for several districts of the state.

Agni Prime test fired off Odisha coast

BALASORE: India Friday successfully test-fired indigenously-developed new generation medium-range ballistic missile Agni Prime off the Odisha coast, Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) sources said. The sleek missile was test fired from a mobile launcher from the APJ Abdul Kalam Island around 9.45 am, they said. The solid-fuelled canistered missile met all mission parameters during the test, they added. All its navigation was tracked and monitored by radars and telemetry equipment positioned along various points, the officials said. The missile's strike range is between 1,000 km and 2,000 km, they said. The last trial of the missile was conducted December 18 last year.

HEAVY RAIN IN COASTAL PARTS ON OCTOBER 24

Bhubaneswar, Oct 21: In view of the possible cyclone, Revenue and Disaster Management Minister Pramila Mallick said all districts and coastal region authorities were directed to be prepared to deal with the emerging situation.

The system is likely to trigger heavy rainfall when it crosses parallel to the state's coast Monday.

Mallick said personnel of the fire service department, the ODRAF and NDRF are on standby for any emergency situation.

A low-pressure system over the Andaman Sea is likely to intensify into a cyclonic storm and reach West Bengal-Bangladesh coasts October 25, causing wind gusting to 110 km per hour, the IMD said Friday.

Briefing media persons, Special Relief Commissioner PK Jena said the cyclone is likely to pass about 200 km away from Dhamara in Bhadrak district. Under its impact, coastal areas of Jagatsinghpur, Bhadrak and Balasore districts may witness a wind speed upto 50 to 60 kmph, he said. Heavy rainfall would occur in some pockets in coastal Odisha October 24. However, he said, there is no need to panic.

SC calls for suo motu action on hate speech

Apex court warns any delay on the part of the administration in taking action on this 'very serious issue' will invite the court's contempt

New Delhi, Oct 21: Holding that the Constitution of India envisages a secular nation, the Supreme Court Friday directed Delhi, Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand governments to come down hard on hate speeches, promptly registering criminal cases against the culprits without waiting for a complaint to be filed.

The apex court warned any delay on the part of the administration in taking action on this "very serious issue" will invite the court's contempt.

"The Constitution of India envisages a secular nation and fraternity among citizens assuring the dignity of the individual...The unity and integrity of the nation is one of the guiding principles enshrined in the preamble. There cannot be fraternity unless the members of the community from different religions are able to live in harmony. The petitioner

points out despite various penal provisions, no action has been taken and there is a need to serve constitutional principles. We feel this court is charged with a duty to protect the fundamental rights and also protect and serve the constitution where the rule of law is maintained," the top court said.

A bench of Justices K M Joseph and Hrishikesh Roy also issued notices to Delhi, Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand on the petition filed by journalist Shaheen Abdullah. Though Delhi is governed by the Aam Aadmi Party government, the national capital's police come under the Union Home Ministry.

The court said action must be

taken against those making hate speeches irrespective of their religion to preserve the secular fabric of the nation.

"Respondents 2-4 (the three states) will file a response as to what action has been taken for the speeches highlighted. They shall ensure that as and when any (hate) speech or action takes place without any complaint being filed, suo motu action is taken in such cases in future without waiting for complaints. Respondents will issue directions to their subordinates for appropriate action and such action will be taken irrespective of religion against the person who delivers such hate speech so that the secular character of this country as envisaged in the preamble is maintained," it said.

Abdullah has moved the top court also seeking direction to the Centre and states to initiate independent, credible and impartial probe into the incidents of hate crimes and hate speeches across the country.

Fruit juice given in drip, patient dies

Prayagraj, Oct 21: A private hospital in Prayagraj where a dengue patient died after he was allegedly transfused fruit juice instead of blood platelets, has been sealed after a preliminary inquiry by the district administration into the incident revealed lapses on the part of the hospital authorities.

The family of the patient has appealed to the state government to take strict action against those responsible.

The relatives of the 32-year-old patient were allegedly supplied sweet lime juice in a bag marked as 'plasma' at the Global Hospital and Trauma Centre in Prayagraj.

The patient's family alleged his condition deteriorated after transfusion from one of the bags supplied by the hospital. The patient was shifted to a second private hospital, where he died, the family said, adding that doctors at this second hospital told them the 'platelet' bag was fake and actually a mix of chemicals and sweet mosambi juice.

State to create 125 additional OAS posts

Bhubaneswar, Oct 21: In view of increasing workload on revenue administration, specifically in districts and sub-divisions, the state Cabinet Friday decided to create additional 125 posts in OAS Grade A (Junior Branch).

With the creation of additional 125 posts, the total OAS cadre strength has been enhanced to 1313 in the state, said Chief Secretary SC Mahapatra. The government has decided to create 121 deputy collector posts -- two in each district headquarters, one post in each sub-collector's office and three ADM offices at Bhubaneswar, Paradeep and Rourkela. Besides, four under-secretary posts have been created at the Board of Revenue, Cuttack.

The Cabinet has also decided to return 206.685 acres of land in Kalipali village of Ganjam district to the original land owners or to the legal heirs as per the provision of Rule 20 of Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement (Compensation, Rehabilitation and Resettlement and Development Plan) Rules, 2015.

The land was acquired two decades ago for Tata Steel. However, the land remained unutilised and farmers are now

cultivating the land, the Chief Secretary said.

In larger public interest, the Cabinet has decided to return it to the original land owners. The compensation amount paid to the land owners has been waived, he said.

The Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik-led panel also decided to pay the due to L&T for the strengthening and widening of Sambalpur-Rourkela road out of ADB assistance. After exhausting all the legal remedies, it was decided for payment of decretal dues amounting to ₹100.06 crore to Larsen & Toubro Ltd. for compliance of the

arbitral award of Arbitration Tribunal, the Chief Secretary said. Similarly, the Cabinet has decided to amend the Odisha Pani Panchayat Act, 2002. Now, mega lift irrigation projects have been included under the Act. Spouses of water users, who are land holders in the area of a Pani Panchayat, can become members of the Panchayat. The tenure of Chak Committee and Executive Committee of the Pani Panchayats has been increased to five years.

Moreover, the government has decided to revise the scale of pay of judicial officers of the state with effect from January 2016. The state government will bear additional ₹93 crore for this purpose, said the Chief Secretary.

Next pandemic may come from melting ice

As global temperatures rise owing to climate change, it becomes more likely that viruses and bacteria locked up in glaciers and permafrost could reawaken

London, Oct 21: The next pandemic may come not from bats or birds but from melting ice, according to latest research.

Genetic analysis of soil and lake sediments from Lake Hazen, the largest high Arctic freshwater lake in the world, suggests the risk of viral spillover -- where a

virus infects a new host for the first time -- may be higher close to melting glaciers.

The findings imply that as global temperatures rise owing to climate change, it becomes more likely that viruses and bacteria locked up in glaciers and permafrost could reawaken and infect local wildlife, particularly as their range also shifts closer to the poles.

In 2016 an outbreak of anthrax in northern Siberia that killed a child and infected at least seven other people was attributed to a heatwave that melted permafrost and exposed an infected reindeer carcass. Before this, the last outbreak in the region had been in 1941.

To better understand the risk



posed by frozen viruses, Dr Stéphane Aris-Brosou and his colleagues at the University of Ottawa in Canada collected soil and sediment samples from Lake Hazen, close to where small, medium and

large amounts of meltwater from local glaciers flowed in.

Next, they sequenced RNA and DNA in these samples to identify signatures closely matching those of known viruses, as well as po-

tential animal, plant or fungal hosts, and ran an algorithm that assessed the chance of these viruses infecting unrelated groups of organisms.

The research, published in Proceedings of the Royal Society B, suggested that the risk of viruses spilling over to new hosts was higher at locations close to where large amounts of glacial meltwater flowed in -- a situation that becomes more likely as the climate warms.

The team did not quantify how many of the viruses they identified were previously unknown -- something they plan to do in the coming months -- nor did they assess whether these viruses were capable of triggering an infection.

Pakistan out of FATF's grey list

New Delhi, Oct 21: Pakistan has been taken off from the grey list of the FATF, the global watchdog on terror financing and money laundering, four years after the country was put in the infamous category.

Significantly, for the first time, the FATF put Myanmar in the "high risk jurisdictions subject to a call for action," often referred to as the watchdog's black list.

In a statement, the Financial Action Task Force (FATF) said it welcomes Pakistan's significant progress in improving its anti-money laundering, combating financial terrorism regime.

JAJPUR RTO GOES GREEN

Bhubaneswar/Jaipur, Oct 21: The Regional Transport Office (RTO) in Jaipur has become the first solar-powered transport office in the state.

As most of the offices depend on electricity for most of their energy consumption needs, installing solar panels on the rooftop of the RTO buildings will reduce electricity bills. "The idea was to adopt green energy and reduce energy bill. It will save a lot of money in the long run and improve the efficiency of the workplace as solar power can create unending flow of huge amount of electricity without fluctuations," said Jaipur regional transport officer NK Pradhan.

The RTO is still connected to the grid, but will only pay meter charges for air-conditioner usage or consume electricity from the grid during complete cloud cover. Pradhan further said, "A recurring cost of Rs 1,000 (Approx.) per day for 20 official days sum up to Rs 20,000 (Approx.) will be saved. Approx. 30 units power generation every day will reduce the grid energy bills. This may reduce more electricity bill - approximately 10 holidays X 25 units. These 250 units can be used by general public (one normal house consumption)."

Bhubaneswar, Oct 21: In a significant development in lady blackmailer Archana Nag case, Bhubaneswar Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP) Prateek Singh Friday said that whoever is found involved in the episode would face action.

He said this while addressing the media following the arrest of Archana's husband Jagabandhu Chand from his Satya Vihar residence in Mancheswar area here Friday. Chand was arrested for his alleged role in sextortion and human trafficking case.

A team of the city police in mufti reached the house of Chand Friday morning before they picked him up and took him to an unknown place for interrogation.

Chand was arrested following interrogation by the cops for a few hours in the afternoon.

Speaking on the issue, the DCP said, "A case has been registered against Archana Nag December 2 and we arrested Archana December 6. The police team continues investigation in the matter. Archana's husband was facing same allegations like assault, blackmailing a lady, extorting money and making photos viral. We were analyzing facts and information fetched during investigation. After charges of

conspiracy and abetment were prima facie established against Chand, he was arrested by Khandagiri police from his residence today (Friday)."

The police later produced Chand in the court that sent him to judicial custody after rejecting his bail plea in the evening.

His lawyer told the mediaper-

sons that they have requested the court to ask authorities to provide appropriate facilities to Chand in jail as he recently underwent neck surgery and suffering from lungs ailments. During the crackdown on Chand, the police also seized four mobile phones, a laptop, a diary and some documents from

Chand's possession. The seizure

is expected to reveal vital clues to the blackmailing case. Singh also said that the victim's statements have been recorded under Section 164 of the IPC.

The police team led by inspector-in-charge (IIC) of Khandagiri police station is investigating the case.

"We have been investigating the allegations made in the case sincerely. We will take action whoever is found involved in the case including absconding accused Khageswar," stated Singh.

Singh claimed that the police have been examining the bank account statements of the couple and the financial transactions therein.

Meanwhile, police are yet to arrest other accused persons including the couple's close aide and neighbour, Khageswar.

Notably, a lady lodged a complaint with Khandagiri police accusing Archana and others of blackmailing her with intimate photos and forcing her to keep sexual relations with influential persons.

They later allegedly forced the victim to extort money from the clients. The rags to riches story of Archana was so intriguing that an Odia filmmaker has planned to make a movie on her life.

The court of the sub-divisional judicial magistrate (SDJM) here October 18 rejected the bail plea of Archana.

Mahanadi drainage channel revival soon

Bhubaneswar, Oct 21: The state government will rejuvenate a drainage channel of Mahanadi river in Cuttack district, a project that could help in irrigation, growing cash crops and fishing activities, an official release Friday.

The mouth of the channel Suka Paika, or dead river, was closed in 1950s as a high flood control measure and now a target has been set to complete the rejuvenation work within 18 months, it said.

Chief Secretary Suresh Chandra Mahapatra held a meeting with the engineers concerned at the Secretariat and directed the Water Resources department to float a tender soon for renovation of the channel. Rs 49.67 crore was approved for the purpose in the meeting, the release said.

He asked the engineers to keep the renovated channel filled with water throughout the year so that farmers can utilise it for irrigation. Mahapatra also asked them to be careful about the time of implementing the project to avoid any ingress of high flood water from Mahanadi river, it said.

Four bridges will be constructed to connect village roads on both sides of the channel.

The natural channel originated from the right embankment of Mahanadi river near Ayatpur village in the district. After flowing through about 30.45 km in three blocks, the channel merged again with the river at Bankala near Tarapur.

SC bins plea for removal of Prez

New Delhi, Oct 21: The Supreme Court Friday dismissed a petition filed by an environmentalist seeking his appointment as the President of India after removing President Droupadi Murmu from the post.

A two-judge bench of Justices DY Chandrachud and Hima Kohli called the petition "scurrilous" and an abuse of the process of the court.

"What kind of scurrilous petitions are these? How is this filed under Article 32," the bench asked. The apex court also directed the registry not to entertain such frivolous petitions in future.

"The petition is frivolous and an abuse of the process of the court. The allegations made are expunged from the record and registry is requested not to entertain such pleas in the near future," the bench ordered. The petitioner in his plea alleged that he was not allowed to contest the recent Presidential elections. He pleaded the court to hear him and that he will work for the betterment of the world.

"Please hear me for two minutes. Recent example of Sri Lanka where citizens entered President's home, what is happening in Russia, I will work for the whole world where things are messy. President's role needs to be redefined," he said. "If you are an environmentalist you can make speeches with your specialised knowledge but not this," the court said.

Hybrid hearing in tehsils from Nov 1

Bhubaneswar, Oct 21: The state government has asked the district Collectors to ensure revenue courts in 60 tehsils offer a hybrid mode of hearing from November 1 this year.

In a letter to the Collectors, Revenue and Disaster Management (R&DM) department Additional Chief Secretary (ACS) Satyabrata Sahu said the department has undertaken a host of e-governance initiatives to reduce physical interface between citizens and government offices, and enable citizens to apply and avail its services from anywhere.

Services of the Revenue department can be availed without visiting government offices except in

cases of statutory requirements. "So, the government has been pleased to allow hearing of parties through virtual mode at the option of parties. Hybrid mode—both physical and virtual modes—is allowed," Sahu said.

The tehsildars have been asked to facilitate such virtual hearing through Bharat Net, MS Team, Google Meet or Zoom from November 1, 2022. Sahu has asked the Collectors to circulate the information to all sub-collectors and tehsildars so that they can create public awareness for the virtual hearing.

The Collectors have also been asked to review the number of such virtual hearing cases heard by each tehsildar during the district revenue review meeting.

Share of fair sex in organised workforce up: Data

Female participation in the organised workforce has recorded a rise in August as net membership of women in organised workforce has increased by 22.60 per cent in August 2022 as compared to the corresponding period last year.

The provisional payroll data of Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) released Thursday showed an increase of 14.40 per cent in net membership addition in August 2022 as compared to the corresponding month during last year in 2021. EPFO has added 16.94 lakh net members in August 2022.

Of the total members added during the month, around 9.87 lakh new members have come under the ambit of EPFO for the first

time. Out of 9.87 lakh new members added, approximately 58.32 per cent are from the age-group of 18-25 years of age.

This age-group signifies a crucial stage for an individual's potential in terms of earning capacity and joining organised workforce in large numbers following their education.

The data shows that during the month, approximately 7.07 lakh net members exited but rejoined EPFO by changing their jobs within the establishments covered by EPFO and opted to transfer their funds from previous PF account to the current account instead of submitting claims for final settlement. This may be attributed to various e-initiatives taken by EPFO for seamless and uninterrupted serv-

report has been forwarded to the police station.

Rajnagar police have been asked to investigate about Tarapad Raptan and five others having familial link with him, tehsildar Ashwini Kumar Bhuyan said. "We want to know about their real identities and nationality. After investigation report is submitted, action will be taken against the people if their identities are found forged," he added.

It may be noted here that post seventies, infiltration of Bangladeshis in coastal pockets under Rajnagar and other areas of Kendrapara district has been increasing. Illegal settlers have managed to obtain voter cards, Aadhaar and ration cards and spread to almost all panchayats under Rajnagar block during the nineties, it was alleged. Some of them have even been elected as people's representatives over years.

In 2016, an investigation had revealed that Tarapad Raptan had come from Bangladesh. However, according to the Gupti RI's report, Tarapad's kin like Haripad Raptan, Nalini Raptan, Maya Raptan and Itika Raptan are Indian nationals. This confusion has drawn sharp reactions from various quarters.

One Dharanidhar Rout of Satabhaya area had complained before Collector Amrit Rituraj that Tarapad and his kin Haripad Raptan, Nalini Raptan, Maya Raptan and Itika Raptan are Bangladeshis nationals, but these people have been rehabilitated as Indians using political pressure. The Collector has taken the issue seriously and asked the tehsildar to look into the matter and submit a report.

Bagapatia along with the Charigharia villagers.

Locals have alleged that if a person was officially found to be a Bangladeshi, how the kin of the person concerned could be treated as Indian nationals. Many wondered and argued how the tehsil administration failed to know about the nationality of these five suspected Bangladeshis before their rehabilitation along with local people at Bagapatia.

After some reports on the matter appeared on media, the tehsil administration has woken up from its slumber. Strangely, Bijay Jena, revenue inspector (RI) of Gupti, in his investigation report had earlier claimed that these five people are Indian nationals who had been living at Charigharia for over 35 years.

The Gupti RI in his report even tried to prove their Indian nationality by producing voter identity cards, Aadhaar cards, ration cards and other official documents issued to the five people.

To verify the report of the RI, the Rajnagar tehsildar Ashwini Kumar Bhuyan has issued a letter to Rajnagar police Thursday to look into the matter and submit a report on the identity of the five. The RI's

The Sanatanpali Farmers' Producer Company under Jujumura block which has over 740 farmers including 400 women is a case in this point. The women farmers here are being supplied with types of seeds and pesticides either free of cost or at subsidised rates, she said. SIRENS OF APPEASEMENT



As the West considers its options for avoiding World War III, it must not repeat the mistakes it made back in 2008, when it did practically nothing about Putin's war of aggression against Georgia

practically nothing about Putin's war of aggression against Georgia. In claiming to have annexed large swaths of Ukrainian territory through sham referendums and arguing that Ukraine is a fake country, Putin has made no secret of his ultimate intentions. Yet according to those calling for peace negotiations, Putin might be "reconciled" to the continued existence of some rump Ukrainian state if it means that he can keep the illegally annexed territories, and if NATO commits never to admit Ukraine.

Such arguments are music to Putin's ears. He is gambling that a cold winter, high energy prices, and war fatigue will undermine the West's unity and make the sirens of appeasement irresistible. The less chance there appears to be for a timely military victory (by either side), the greater the impetus for Western diplomats to intervene and start pushing Ukraine to negotiate and settle.

But the 2008 Georgia War and the 2014 annexation of Crimea should have proven by now that appeasement only begets more aggression. The sole way for the West to secure peace is to maintain unity and support Ukraine (militarily, economically, and diplomatically) until it regains all of its territory.

That means not giving in to Putin's nuclear threats (which smack of desperation), and not countenancing any short-term deals that help him create the illusion of victory. Like a half-treated cancer, Russia will simply regroup and strike back even more aggressively if Putin is appeased.

Ukraine has already paid a staggering price for its freedom – and for the cause of freedom everywhere. The least the West must do is give it a chance to secure a viable, long-term peace. That starts by not selling Ukraine out to those who deny its very right to exist.

Wars are easier to start than to finish, and their finale rarely follows any prescribed script. But if you are the aggressor, a clear zero-sum victory is rarely an option.

Nonetheless, with no end in sight for the Russian-Ukrainian War, calls by some in the West to give Russian President Vladimir Putin a "face-saving off-ramp" out of the conflict are growing louder. Most of these arguments start with the flawed presumption that Putin had a valid reason for his war, which would justify a peace that compromises Ukraine's sovereignty yet again.

The 2008 NATO Summit in Bucharest supposedly incited Putin's ire by granting Georgia and Ukraine a promise of eventual membership in the alliance. Never mind that there was no membership action plan for either country put forward, owing to lack of support from Germany and France.

While NATO's non-decision signaled to Putin that he should do whatever he could to make such promises impossible, France and Germany's reluctance gave him an opportunity to drive a wedge between the alliance's members. He seized it by launching a war in Georgia in 2008, occupying territory that remains under Russian control to this day. Sadly for the world, that gambit worked: most NATO members took a decisive step back from political support of the accession process for Georgia and Ukraine.

The world likely would be in a very different place today if the Bucharest Summit had actually put Georgia and Ukraine on a path to NATO membership. The West would have responded to the invasion of Georgia with more than declarations, and Ukraine most likely would have been spared today's bloodshed.

That didn't happen. While Georgian officials warned in 2008-09 that impunity for Russia for its invasion and land grab would lead to more acts of aggression against Ukraine and others, they were

dismissed as being paranoid or solely concerned with their own political survival following a disastrous war. As Georgia's ambassador to the European Union between 2005 and 2013, I was often told by senior European policymakers that Russia would never dare to annex Crimea or invade Ukraine.

Not only did the EU ignore our pleas for sanctions and a revision of its Russia-dependent energy strategy; some European officials even started making excuses for Russia. When the EU launched an Independent International Fact-Finding Mission on the Conflict in Georgia, Russia successfully manipulated the final report to suit its own interests. Then, US President Barack Obama's administration took office and pursued its ill-fated "reset" with Russia, sending an unambiguous signal that Putin would face no meaningful accountability for launching a war to carve up Georgia.

In 2012, Georgian President Mikheil Saakashvili, whom Putin often described as a personal foe, was voted out of office. Some in the West took his defeat as a sign that relations with Russia should be normalized further.

No one seemed to have noticed at the time that Saakashvili's pro-Western government was replaced by a Russia-friendly oligarchy that has since stalled Georgia's progress toward democracy and integration with the West. Over the past decade, the Georgian government has undermined projects of great strategic importance to NATO in the Black Sea region – such as the Anaklia Deep Sea Port – while showing only lukewarm support for Ukraine in its fight for survival.

Similarly, Germany's decision to press ahead with the Nord Stream 2 pipeline – first following Putin's invasion of Georgia, and then again following his illegal annexation of Crimea – now stands out as a completely feckless strategic blunder (though it certainly isn't the only one). All these missteps helped bring us to where we are today. As US President Joe Biden recently warned, the prospect of nuclear "Armageddon" now looms larger than it has since the Cuban Missile Crisis of 60 years ago this week.

Deputation Blues

The annual conference of principal secretaries of states and union territories held recently had one theme that overrode other discussions on administration and administrative reforms-related work.

Union Minister of State for Personnel Jitendra Singh asked the states to spare more IAS, IPS and IFS officers for Central deputation, which has become a major issue in recent months. And as 2024 approaches, the Modi sarkar is hastening to address gaps in governance. Singh is now trying to urge babus to overcome their reluctance to serve at the Centre. The Union government has been facing a shortage of IAS officers and to tide over the crisis, it even tweaked the rules in 2021, which stated that state government permission is not necessary for a posting at the Centre. But clearly, that carrot has not worked, with even babus from the BJP-ruled states, preferring to keep their distance from Delhi. Meanwhile, reportedly, the Centre has to confront a shortage of 1,472 IAS officers and 864 IPS officers.

Clearly, the periodic pep talks and admonitions by Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Singh to the babus have failed to dispel the perception in the states and UTs that a Central posting is desirable for upward career mobility. Until the Centre solves this conundrum, it will continue to suffer from deputation blues.

Show your face: AP to senior babus

Fingerprint scanning is passe. Facial recognition is now the next step in recognising the identity of employees. The Andhra Pradesh government has reportedly made facial attendance mandatory for senior IAS officers of the state. Those in the secretary rank and work in the state Secretariat may soon be required to face a camera and mark their attendance.

Sources have informed DKB that the Jagan Reddy government has prescribed this new standard operating procedure to mark the daily attendance of the secretary, principal secretary and special chief secretary-rank IAS officers. As far as DKB can tell, while fingerprint scanning is prevalent in some states, this is a first-of-its-kind system for senior babus in the country. The government has bought a facial recognition system mobile application with geographical information system tagging to mark the daily attendance of these very senior babus. For now, this system has been implemented in the Secretariat, but it will soon be rolled out to cover other IAS officers as well.

Apparently, the system has been in the works for more than a year, sources say. Chief Secretary Sameer Sharma has been issuing frequent instructions, on the directions of Chief Minister Jagan Reddy, asking special chief secretaries, principal secretaries and secretaries of all departments to "get organized and make things effective."

Intrusive or just sensible? And what next, some wonder. Iris scanners?

Low-key but powerful

Even if it is not formally mandated, Narendra Modi's PMO is the focal point, controlling all decision-making of the Modi sarkar. Even the ministries have either conceded their domain or the PMO has simply overridden their decision-making authority, in most cases. Naturally, the men and women who comprise today's PMO invite a lot of interest.

For those who want to know how the Prime Minister manages to look at so many decisions on a continuous basis, perhaps a look at the structure below the Big Three is the obvious thing to do. While many of the high-profile names who made waves during Modi's first tenure have moved out of the PMO, the current lot carefully handpicked by Modi now spearheads his flagship programmes and lends their expertise to their given responsibilities.

At the top of this select group is PK Mishra, now Principal Secretary to the PM, who has continued his association with the PM since the Gujarat days and accompanied Modi to the PMO in 2014. Besides him, two other senior advisors in the PMO are retired IAS officers Amit Khare and Tarun Kapoor. Besides them are four additional secretaries, three joint secretaries, two private secretaries, 10 directors and four officers on special duty, drawn from all services including the IAS, IPS, IFS and IRS. Interestingly, there is one woman officer Punya Salila Srivastava, who was inducted last year. She oversees social and welfare programmes and is in charge of the various announcements made by the PM. It is this team that Modi relies on most for the implementation of government policy. It is these low-profile babus who are pulling the strings behind the scenes.

Woebegone

Woebegone is first recorded in The Romance of Guy of Warwick, of about the year 1300. At that date, people would say things like "me is woe begon", grief has beset me. Notice the word order, with me as the indirect object of the sentence, but put first. The verb here is bego, which has been obsolete for something like four hundred years, but which in medieval times had a variety of senses, such as to go round, surround or beset. Over time, the link between woe and begone, the past participle of bego, became so close that they fused into a single adjective, so tightly linked that they survived shifts in language and the loss of the verb bego. For some centuries it retained this sense of "afflicted by grief", oppressed with misfortune, distress, sorrow or grief. We're now a long way from that medieval romance, but in continuing to use the word we retain a small vestige of middle English as a linguistic fossil. Several other archaic forms in woe have also survived, such as "woe is me" and "woe betide you", presumably because there's a continuing need for formulaic lamentatory utterances.

Allohistory

Other names for this idea are counterfactualism, virtual history, and uchronia, though the most common term is alternative history (alternate history in the US). It's a "what if" approach, which works out what might have happened if some nodal event in history had not occurred or had turned out differently – what if Napoleon had won at Waterloo, for example (it was "a damn close-run thing", you may recall). It has long been a staple plot type for science fiction, from Ward Moore's Bring the Jubilee, through Philip K Dick's The Man in the High Castle and Keith Robert's Pavane, to Orson Scott Card's Pastwatch and Kim Stanley Robinson's recent The Years of Rice and Salt. In scholarly historical circles, "what if" speculation has in the past been unpopular to the point of derision, though this is now changing, in particular in the field of military history. The British historian Niall Ferguson wrote a book in 1997 in which he defended allohistory – he argued that if the study of history is ever to be able to predict future events on the basis of past ones, it is important to analyze what might (or should) have happened, as well as what actually did. The prefix allo- is from Greek allos, "different, other", as in allegory and allergy.

SPECTRUM HEALTH INFRA

Liberal funding critical

Writing on the health sector always starts with the poor outlay and the appalling infrastructure that exists in the rural and backward regions of the country. While many economists would give priority to utilise the scarce resources available in the country for developing social infrastructure, it has to be admitted that the Union government as also the states can strain their purse a little bit, keeping in view the fact that health has a very positive effect on the economic process.

In her Budget speech two year ago, Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman stated that the government proposed to set up hospitals in Public Private Partnership (PPP) mode in select underserved districts where at present there are no hospitals covered by the Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (PMJAY). It was also said that medical colleges would be attached to district hospitals in PPP mode to address shortage of qualified medical doctors. However, the Indian Medical Association (IMA) expressed concerns through public health experts that inviting the private sector to manage public hospitals was tantamount to backdoor corporatisation of civil hospitals and would not help the poor.

At that time, the IMA asked the

government to revise its decision. While there has been a steady fall in the outlay of the National Health Mission during the past four years or so, except the expenditure incurred in tackling the pandemic, both the district and sub-divisional health infrastructure has deteriorated.

The 15th Finance Commission allocated Rs106, 606 crore for strengthening the public health infrastructure, accounting for 0.1 percent of the GDP based on recommendation of the Working Group for Health.

Therefore, The Pradhan Mantri AtmanirbharSwasthya Bharat Yojana (PMASBY) is expected to undertake strengthening 29,000 primary healthcare facilities, establish integrated labs in districts and blocks, nine bio-safety labs, four Regional Institutes of Virology, strengthen the surveillance system and the National Centre for Disease Control etc. However, reports indicate that not much has been achieved till date, obviously due to resource crunch and other factors which include the mushrooming of nursing homes to compensate for poor health infrastructure in blocks and villages.

It is understood that the Family Caregivers grant for strengthening primary care through local bodies is conditional on the states

establishing the State Finance Commission regarding property tax. It should be mentioned here that such an attempt of releasing conditional grants for local bodies by earlier Commissions failed as devolution of functions, funds and functionaries as required under the 73rd and 74th amendments is seen to be a politically risky reform that most states are reluctant to undertake.

In such a scenario, health sector remains a cause for serious concern. With the government's unwillingness to spend on health together with doctor's unwillingness to work amongst the poor in the villages as facilities are inadequate – and virtually non-existent in the backward regions of the country – it is a big challenge.

In India, the weakening of the public health system and collapse of the three-tier health system combined with rampant privatisation of healthcare has been disastrous, especially for the poor. India's obsession with the quantity of doctors has resulted in the opening of a large number of colleges with poor facilities and infrastructure, inadequate patient load and not enough faculty, leading to thousands of poorly trained doctors being churned out every year. The colleges for nursing and paramedical staff are said to be

in a worse state, as about 90 percent of these are private and clearly substandard. Though on paper the numbers available to the health system are constantly increasing, in reality, in rural India, where two-thirds of the population lives, the acute shortage of doctors and nurses remains unaddressed. Doctors either work in metros and big cities or look for opportunities overseas.

Like education, health has become a safe zone of business with virtually no risk. It is quite distressing that the system seeks to ignore violation of rules and regulations insofar as health is concerned for the ordinary people.

The health of a nation is intrinsically connected to wealth and prosperity. Though the government may have taken positive steps in relation to tackling the pandemic by allocating necessary resources in this direction, there is need to continue with this liberal spending in the rural hospitals.

Keeping in view the imperative need to reduce the quantum of diseases, the government must also come forward with an integrated plan of action for the marginalised section in the coming five years in collaboration with all agencies working in the field. This should be applicable in all states and Union Territories.

Four teens drown

Thane: In a tragic incident on Diwali eve, a group of young students, celebrating a birthday party with a swim, drowned in a temple pond in Ambarnath town here on Friday afternoon, police said. The tragedy occurred around 1.30 p.m. at the Kondeshwar Shiv Temple water tank where the Mumbai boys - all aged 19 - had gone to celebrate the birthday of their friend Akash R. Zinga. According to Kulgaon Police Station, Friday afternoon, three of them, birthday boy Zinga, along with Suraj M. Salve and Linus B. Uchchhapawar, had dived into the temple tank for a swim.

Restrictions on Spicejet lifted

Mumbai: India's air safety watchdog has lifted its restrictions on budget carrier SpiceJet Ltd's operations and will allow the airline to operate at full capacity from October 30, reports said Friday. The Directorate General of Civil Aviation had halved the airline's approved fleet in July this year for a period of eight weeks, citing safety concerns. The restriction was extended till October 29.

Mehbooba asked to vacate bungalow

Srinagar: PDP president Mehbooba Mufti has been served a notice to vacate her official bungalow in the high-security Gupkar area here. "The notice to evict from Fair View was served to me a few days ago. This has not come as a surprise and is along the expected lines," the former Jammu and Kashmir chief minister said. She said although the notice mentions that the bungalow is meant for the chief minister of Jammu and Kashmir, that is not the case. "This place was allotted to my father (Mufti Mohammad Sayeed) in December 2005, after he relinquished the chief minister's office. So the grounds mentioned by the administration are not correct," Mufti said.

Pregnant woman, mother killed

Chennai: In a tragic incident, a pregnant woman and her mother died when an ambulance taking them to hospital rammed into a roadside tree in Tamil Nadu's Sivaganga district Friday. The incident occurred at Senkulam in the district. Nivedha, 24, had labour pains on Friday morning and an ambulance was called from the Sivaganga Government Hospital to bring them. The driver Malaiarasam lost control on the way and hit a tree. Nivedha, her unborn baby, and her mother Vijayalakshmi died on the spot.

RISING ASSAULT ON DOCTORS SC seeks Centre's reply on pleas

New Delhi, Oct 21: The Supreme Court Friday sought responses from the Centre and others, including the Medical Council of India, to petitions alleging rising assault on doctors and seeking framing of guidelines for their protection across the country.

A bench of Chief Justice Uday Umesh Lalit and Justice Bela M Trivedi also issued notice to the Rajasthan government as the petitions filed by the Delhi Doctors Forum, Indian Medical Association (Dwarka) and Suneet Kumar Upadhyay sought a CBI probe into the alleged suicide of a gynaecologist in Dausa in the state.

Upadhyay's wife Archana Sharma, a gynaecologist, had ended her life by suicide in Rajasthan after being harassed by a mob following the death of a woman patient during the delivery on account of excessive bleeding. "Issue notice on the petitions returnable on November 23. Dasti in addition," the bench said. In legal parlance, 'Dasti' means delivery of a notice by hand.

Lawyer Shashank Deo Sudhi, appearing for Medical Association (Dwarka), said doctors are being attacked across the country even if a patient dies on account of health reasons which are beyond the control of medical professionals. "There are no medical cells in



police stations either. The police officers do not understand medical terminology," he said, adding there was a need for framing comprehensive guidelines to protect doctors.

Senior advocate Gopal Sankaranarayanan, appearing for the husband of the deceased doctor, said the child was delivered healthy and the mother had pre-conditions which led to the death. Still the gynaecologist was hounded.

The petitioners pleaded for the Centre and other stakeholders to take remedial steps. "Issue a direction in nature of mandamus or any other appropriate writ, order/direction or directions for constituting a CBI enquiry into the circumstances which led to unfortunate death of young gynaecologist doctor by committing

suicide under the mysterious conditions in order to find out the actual perpetrators of the entire incident and bring them to justice to deter other such potential wrong doer," one of the pleas said.

It also sought a direction to stakeholders for evolving a mechanism to compensate the family and dependents of doctors who lost their lives to the cause of public service. A pregnant woman, Asha Bhairwa, aged about 22 years, had died at Anand Hospital at Lalsot in Dausa, Rajasthan during delivery due to post-delivery hemorrhage on March 28.

Protests were held outside the hospital against the treating doctors who were also threatened with the registration of a murder FIR, the plea said, adding the gynaecologist died a day later allegedly by suicide.

Opposition parties denounce action on aspiring teachers

Kolkata, Oct 21: Opposition parties and prominent personalities of West Bengal Friday condemned the police action while removing primary teachers' job applicants from their agitation site, saying the TMC government had "flouted" the democratic rights of the protesters.

The opposition parties hit the streets against the police action, while the prominent personalities deplored the police crackdown on the agitating Teacher Eligibility Test (TET) 2014 candidates on the intervening night of Thursday and Friday terming the manhandling of "would-be teachers" as an attack on democracy.

A strong police contingent had removed the protesters, who claimed to have qualified for the 2014 TET exams but were still omitted from the merit list, after 84 hours of sit-in near the head office of the West Bengal Board of Primary Education in Salt Lake area here.

The police had dispersed the protesters, saying section 144 of the CrPC had been imposed in the area.

Around 20 of the 500-odd protesters, who sat on one flank of the road from October 17, were on fast from the next day and five of them were shifted to hospital after they fell ill Thursday.

Meanwhile, leaders of DYFI, the youth wing of the CPI(M), Meenakshi Mukherjee, and Kalatan Dasgupta were among 10 activists who were detained by the police for obstructing traffic by staging road blockade and violating prohibitory orders in the Karunamoyee area of Salt Lake.

Members of the state BJP also took out a protest rally in central Kolkata.

Helicopter crash: 4 bodies recovered

Itanagar, Oct 21: Four Army personnel were killed in an defence chopper crash in Upper Siang district of Arunachal Pradesh on Friday and search is on for a fifth person, a defence spokesperson said.

The bodies of the four Army personnel have been recovered from the crash site in a densely wooded mountain area 35 km from the borders with China, he said. The cause of the crash is not yet known and details are being ascertained, he said.

The advanced light helicopter (ALH) WSI, carrying five Army personnel including two pilots, was on regular sorties when it crashed at 10.43 am around Migging, around 25 km south of Tuting, the district headquarters.

"There were five Army personnel onboard. The mortal remains of four personnel were recovered from the crash site so far. Search for the other person is on," Tezpur based defence spokesperson Lt Col A S Walia said.

A joint search and rescue operation by the Army and Air Force was immediately launched in which a MI-17 and two ALHs along with three columns of the Indian Army were deployed and the four bodies were found, he said.

The district police sent a team to the spot for the search operation, Upper Siang superintendent of police Jummar Basar said.

Hyderabad, Oct 21: The Telangana government Friday derecognised a private school in Hyderabad where a four-year-old girl was sexually assaulted by driver of the school's principal.

Education Minister P Sabitha Indra Reddy ordered the Hyderabad District Education Officer to cancel recognition of DAV Public School. However, to ensure that the education of students studying at the school is not affected, the minister directed DEO to make arrangements to shift them to other recognised schools. She asked the DEO to take all necessary steps to allay the apprehensions of the parents.

The education minister also asked the officials to make sure that such incidents are not repeated. She said a committee would be constituted to recommend measures to the government to ensure safety and security of the students in schools.

The committee, which will be headed by the education secretary, will submit its report to the government within a week. She said after the receipt of the report, the government would take appropriate measures for the protection of school children. The minister's

order came three days after the police arrested driver of the school's principal for sexually assaulting the LKG student. The principal was also arrested for negligence.

Banjara Hills police on Tuesday arrested driver of the school principal for the sexual assault on the child. Following protest by the victim's relatives and others, the police on Wednesday arrested the principal for negligence. According to police Beemana Rajani Kumar (34) was arrested and sent to jail. He has been booked under section 376 A and B of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and section 6 read with 5(1)(m) of Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act.

'Climate change increased J&K's average temp in last 28 years'

Jammu, Oct 21: The average mean temperature in Jammu and Kashmir has increased in the last 28 years due to climate change, a senior official said Friday.

He said agriculture is the only sector that can help reduce poverty by raising incomes and food security for 80 per cent of the world's poor populace.

"J&K is also witnessing the brunt of climate change and average mean temperature in last 28 years has climbed up by 2.32°C and 1.45°C in Jammu and Kashmir region, respectively", Additional Chief Secretary (ACS), Atal Dulloo said after inaugurating a two-day international conference on "existing climate change scenario and its arising risks" here. He said in 2014, we witnessed a devastating flood situation in Kashmir and almost every year due to untimely rainfall, the crop of paddy in Jammu and apple in Kashmir suffer huge losses. "We should prepare ourselves and our farmers to adapt to these weather changes so that they do not suffer on the economic front," Dulloo said. He said agriculture is an integral part of the world's economy and is the life-line of underdeveloped and developing countries like India.

"But, today the prosperity of agriculture and future of our farmers is being threatened by numer-

ous impending challenges like climate change which needs to be tackled collectively", he added.

ACS said the yield of rain-fed and irrigated rice in India has been projected to reduce by 2.5 per cent and 7 per cent, respectively, by 2050.

Further, the wheat yield has been projected to be lessened by 6 to 25 per cent and maize yields by 18 to 23 per cent in 2100, he added.

Dulloo informed the government have constituted a high-powered committee under the chairmanship of Dr Mangla Rai, former di-

rector-general of the Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) and secretary Department of Agricultural Research and Education (DARE) for formulating a comprehensive policy for holistic agriculture development in J&K.

He appreciated the vice-chancellors of both farm universities for playing an outstanding role in drafting proposals with the target to enhance the incomes of farmers in the union territory.

A study that maps climate hotspots over the forest cover in India using computer-model-based temperature and rainfall has been conducted for the three future time periods i.e. years 2030, 2050, and 2085. It has been observed that the biggest temperature rises are expected in Ladakh, Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, and Uttarakhand. Ladakh, Jammu & Kashmir, and Himachal Pradesh are expected to witness the smallest increases in rainfall if any at all.

Climate change has accelerated the already rising temperature, and unstable precipitation patterns and worsened the vulnerabilities to drought, thereby bringing the Himalayan ecosystem to naught

NEET Give grace marks to SC aspirant: HC

"When the appellant/writ petitioner hailing from a downtrodden community has secured 92

marks in the National Entrance-cum-Eligibility Test (UG) 2022 examination, in view of the wrong key answers given to question No.97, he failed to secure the four marks."

"It is also the admitted case of both parties that the key answers to the question have been wrongly given. It is not out of context to mention herein that Article 46 of the Constitution says that the State shall protect the economic interests of the weaker sections of the society in particular, of the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes," the first bench of Acting Chief Justice T Raja and Justice D Krishnakumar said in a recent order, while allowing the appeal as a special case.

The NTA, being an instrumentality of the State, cannot refuse to award the four grace marks to the appellant who belongs to the weaker section of the society, the bench said.

Dengue cases surge in Jammu

Jammu, Oct 21: Dengue cases in the district have witnessed a surge in recent weeks with one medical expert calling it the biggest epidemic since 2013.

More than 3,000 patients are admitted in hospitals with dengue while the district has already recorded six deaths, a health official said. The trend has emerged as a grave concern with cases, tests and admissions increasing every week, the official said. "Six people have died in Jammu till today (Friday)," Jammu Chief Medical Officer Harbaksh Singh told PTI.

He said the district had so far recorded 3,376 cases. "Of these, 2,796 cases have been reported from rural areas," Singh said. Besides, a few hundred cases have also been recorded in private hospitals.

In the city, over 80 per cent of the cases have been reported from Sarwal, Janipur, Rehari and Ploura areas, the official said.

Hospital admissions have increased too," She said the mosquito-borne seasonal viral disease had spread rapidly to all regions and the number of patients in hospitals was rising every day. "Around 80-90 children and nearly 50-60 adults

are being admitted in hospitals daily," she said, adding that it was the biggest epidemic after 2013 the way it was spreading. Sharma attributed the deaths to late hospital admission.

She added that the hospital was fully prepared to cope with the situation. "Cases are being controlled and all measures are being taken to avoid the spread," she said. She also appealed to the general public to follow all precautions. Chief Medical Officer Singh said all measures had been put in place to deal with the situation.

TN govt passes Bill to prohibit online gambling

Chennai, Oct 21: The Tamil Nadu Assembly Wednesday passed a bill to prohibit online gambling and regulate online games in the State.

The state government had earlier this month promulgated an ordinance to prohibit online gambling and regulate online games in Tamil Nadu and said an online gaming authority will be set up to exercise powers conferred by the ordinance.

Online games and gambling ruined families, led to suicides, caused gaming addiction affecting public health, disturbing social order and prejudices the maintenance of public order. Hence, the need for the present ordinance, the government had said.

Srinagar, Oct 21: In addition to Paharis, the GD Sharma commission has also recommended ST status for Paddari tribe, Gadda Brahmans and Kolis in Jammu and Kashmir.

Sources said the inclusion of these tribes along with Paharis as STs has been recommended by Sharma commission and these recommendations have been received by the Union ministry of tribal affairs. "The draft recommending the inclusion of Paharis, Paddari tribals, Kolis and Gadda Brahmans as STs will have to be approved by the Union cabinet after which it will be tabled before Parliament."

"This can happen during the November-December winter ses-



sion of the Parliament," sources added. For inclusion of these communities as STs in J&K as per the recommendations of the Sharma commission, Parliament will have to pass an amendment to the country's Reservation Act.

Gujjars and Bakarwals had reservations in jobs and education even before the abrogation of Article 370, but they did not have any political reservation. The delimitation commission has given them political reservation by including 9 seats, 4 in Kashmir division and 5 in Jammu division, in the 90-member J&K for STs. The Assembly elections are

likely to be held next year in the UT. At present, 744 castes are categorised as STs in the country.

The GD Sharma commission recommendations follow the report of the delimitation commission headed by Justice (Retired) Ranjana Prakash Desai that has reserved 9 seats for STs and 6 for the SCs in the 90-seated J&K Assembly.

With the inclusion of Pahari tribals, Paddaris, Kolis and Gadda Brahmans, it is possible that the number of seats reserved for the STs in the J&K Assembly might go up.

In job reservation, the STs get 10 per cent while the SCs get 8 per cent. During his recent visit to J&K, Union Home Minister Amit Shah had promised ST status for the Pahari community. Shah also said that the grant of ST status to Paharis would not undermine the ST rights of the local Gujjars and Bakarwals in any manner.

Heavy rain lashes Erode

Chennai, Oct 21: A 65-year-old woman, who was sleeping at her residence, drowned to death when water gushed into her house after heavy rains in Tamil Nadu's Erode district Friday.

Rangammal (65) of Ashokapuri was drowned to death at 1.30 a.m. This, according to district officials was due to the flooding in the Perumpallam canal in the district and water entering around 75 houses located in low-lying areas near the canal. The body of the deceased Rangammal was sent to the Government Hospital, at Erode for post-mortem. Water also entered 200 houses in Rangampalayam, Sathya Nagar, Moolapalayam, Senathipalayam and Cehittipalayam in the morning. People were shifted to relief camps set up by the district administration.

Many people complained that their household equipment were damaged as water entered their residences. Several people also complained of water entering shops

Srinagar, Oct 21: Snowfall in higher reaches of Kashmir, including popular tourist destinations like Gulmarg and Sonamarg, and rains in plains brought wintry conditions earlier than usual in the valley, officials said Thursday.

"There was significant snowfall in many areas of Kashmir including Gulmarg, Sonamarg, Gurez, and Karnah during the interven-



ing night," the officials said.

The officials said more than two inches of snow had accumulated in the Gulmarg bowl while the snowfall was heavier in higher reaches of the valley. They said even the Zabarwan mountain range in the city had received traces of snowfall during the night.

Srinagar city and other areas of the valley received moderate rainfall since the early hours of Thursday, bringing down the temperature by several degrees. People have slipped into winter wear like

sweaters and heavy jackets earlier than usual.

The early snowfall has brought cheer to the faces of tourists who have arrived here to escape the pollution caused by Diwali crackers elsewhere in the country.

"We had come to enjoy the autumn hues of Kashmir while escaping the pollution caused by firecrackers back home. This snowfall is an unexpected bonus for us," S Arvind, a resident of Hyderabad, told PTI.

Shoabi Ali, a travel agent, said

the reports of snowfall have led to renewed interest in Kashmir's winter tourism this year. "The first snowfall in the mountains was on Tuesday and I had a busy day attending to calls from regular clients Wednesday about winter packages. Hopefully, there will be good snowfall this winter to sustain winter tourism," Ali said.

However, apple farmers in south Kashmir are worried lot as heavy snowfall before December will not only destroy the crop this year but cause damage to trees.

"We have had early snowfall now for three years in a row. I hope it was just a passing event as a heavy snowfall at this time will damage the trees which are still full of fruit," Bashir Ahmad, an apple farmer from Shopian, said.

He said while early harvesting this year has ensured against any major loss, 20 per cent of the crop was still on the trees. The weatherman has forecast improvement in the conditions later in the day and predicted a dry week.


Patil's jihad remarks unacceptable: Cong

New Delhi, Oct 21: The BJP Friday stepped up its attack against the Congress over its leader Shivraj Patil's claim that Bhagavad Gita also spoke of jihad, saying that this is one more attempt to smear Hindutva by the opposition party, which disassociated itself from the remarks, terming them as "unacceptable".

The Congress also said the former governor and former Union home minister has clarified his comments and asserted that Bhagavad Gita is a key foundational pillar of Indian civilisation. Attacking the Congress, BJP spokesperson and Rajya Sabha MP Sudhanshu Trivedi demanded that Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge or its leader Sonia Gandhi should respond to Patil's comments. He noted that Mahatma Gandhi in his commentary on the Hindu epic had described it as a source of 'Anasakti Yoga' (selfless action) while Bal Gangadhar Tilak expounded his philosophy of 'Karma Yoga' through his study of Gita and added that Congress leaders now see jihad in it.

BJP national spokesperson Prem Shukla alleged that the Congress has long been involved in the conspiracy to "insult Hindu, Hindutva and Hindustan" and Patil's remarks are yet another chapter towards this. Congress leaders in the past have drawn a parallel between Hindutva with terror organisations like Boko Haram and Taliban, he alleged. Former Union ministers Sushilkumar Shinde and P Chidambaram had spoken about "saffron terror", he said. Gita is the philosophy of humanity, Shukla

asserted. The BJP also accused it of playing vote bank politics. With the BJP seizing on Patil's remarks also to corner it, Congress general secretary Jairam Ramesh took to Twitter to give the party's view.

"My senior colleague Shivraj Patil reportedly made some comments on Bhagavad Gita that's unacceptable. Subsequently, he clarified. The Congress's stand is clear. Bhagavad Gita is a key foundational pillar of Indian civilisation," he said.

He also shared on Twitter excerpts from Jawaharlal Nehru's book 'The Discovery of India', wherein the former prime minister wrote: "The message of the Gita is not sectarian or addressed to any particular school of thought. It is universal in its approach for everyone, Brahmin or outcaste. 'All paths lead to me,' it says. It is because of this universality that it has found favour with all classes and schools."

Patil on Thursday claimed that the concept of jihad was not just in Islam but also in Bhagavad Gita and Christianity. Speaking at the

launch of Congress veteran and former Union minister Mohsina Kidwai's biography, Patil, also a former Lok Sabha Speaker, said it is said there is a lot of discussion of jihad in the religion of Islam.

The concept comes to the fore when despite having the right intentions and doing the right thing, nobody understands or reciprocates, then it is said one can use force, he said. "It is not just in Quran, but in Mahabharata also, the part in Gita, Shri Krishna also talks of jihad to Arjun and this thing is not just in Quran or Gita but also in Christianity," he claimed in his remarks in Hindi. Reacting to Patil's comments, BJP spokesperson Shehzad Poonawalla on Thursday tweeted, "after AAP's Gopal Italia & Rajendra Pal, not to be outdone in Hindu hatred & vote bank politics, Congress' Shivraj Patil says Shri Krishna taught 'Jihad' to Arjun!"

"Congress coined Hindu/Saffron terror, opposed Ram Mandir, Questioned Ram Ji's existence, said Hindutva=ISIS," Poonawalla tweeted.

TN fisherman hurt in firing by Navy

Chennai, Oct 21: A fisherman from Tamil Nadu was injured after he was reportedly fired at by a patrolling team of the Indian Navy in the Palk Bay on Friday, sources said. K. Veeravel, the 30-year-old fisherman from Vanagiri in Mayiladuthurai district, has been hospitalised. According to the sources, the incident occurred when the patrolling team from a station in Uchipuli opened fire at a fishing boat with 10 persons on board, after it did not heed to their signal to halt.

Veeravel received bullet injuries on his thigh and stomach. In a statement, the Navy said: "The Indian Navy maintains a continuous vigil over the crucial waters of Palk Bay, which separates India and Sri Lanka."



"During the early hours of October 21, 2022, a suspicious boat was observed by an Indian Navy ship on patrol in Palk Bay near the India-Sri Lanka International Maritime Boundary Line (IMBL). Despite repeated warnings, the boat did not stop. The ship, as per standard operating procedures, fired warning shots to stop the boat.

"One of the crew onboard the suspicious boat is reported to have sustained an injury. The injured person was administered first aid by the ship and evacuated by an Indian Navy Chetak helicopter to INS Parandy at Rannad and was shifted to the Government Hospital, Ramanathapuram for further medical management. His condition is reported to be stable."

Anil Deshmukh denied bail

Mumbai, Oct 21: A special court here Friday rejected the bail application filed by former Maharashtra home minister Anil Deshmukh in an alleged corruption and misuse of official position case being probed by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI).

Deshmukh (71) had sought bail in the case as soon as the Bombay High Court granted him bail on October 4 in a money laundering case registered against him by the Enforcement Directorate (ED).

Special CBI court judge S H Gwalani rejected his plea after hearing arguments from both sides. The court's detailed order is not available yet. The Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) leader was arrested on November 2 in 2021 and has been in judicial custody. He was admitted to a private hospital last week for coronary angiography.

In March 2021, senior IPS officer Param Bir Singh had alleged that Deshmukh, the then home minister, had given a target to police officers to collect Rs 100 crore per month from restaurants and bars in Mumbai.

Former assistant police inspector Sachin Waze, arrested in the 'Antilia' bomb scare case in March 2021, had levelled similar allegations against him.

New Delhi, Oct 21: The Supreme Court Friday junked a plea seeking a "fact-finding inquiry" into the history of the Taj Mahal and the "opening of 22 rooms" on the monument's premises, terming it "publicity interest litigation".

A bench of justices M R Shah and M M Sundresh refused to interfere with the Allahabad High Court order that had dismissed the plea. "The high court was not

in error in dismissing the petition, which is more of a publicity interest litigation. Dismissed," the bench said.

The high court had, on May 12, said petitioner Rajneesh Singh, who is the media in-charge of the Bharatiya Janata Party's (BJP) Ayodhya unit, had failed to point out which of his legal or constitutional rights were being infringed.

It had also pulled up the petitioner's lawyer for filing the



Public Interest Litigation (PIL) petition in a "casual" manner and said it could not pass an order under Article 226 of the

Constitution in the matter. The article empowers a high court to issue orders or writs to any person or authority in the area

under its jurisdiction to enforce fundamental rights. Several Hindu right-wing outfits had claimed in the past that the Mughal-era mausoleum was a temple of Lord Shiva.

The monument is protected by the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI). The petition had also sought the setting aside of certain provisions of the Ancient and Historical Monuments and Archaeological Sites and Remains (Declaration of National Importance) Act, 1951 and the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Sites and Remains Act, 1958, under which the Taj Mahal, Fatehpur Sikri, the Agra Fort and Itimad-ud-Daulah's tomb were declared historical monuments.




The high court had in April 2021 directed the CBI to carry out a preliminary inquiry. The CBI, based on this inquiry, registered a first information report (FIR) against Deshmukh and his associates for alleged corruption and misuse of official power. Deshmukh had resigned as the home minister in April 2021 after the high court ordered a CBI probe into the corruption charges levelled against him by Singh, former Mumbai police commissioner.

FATF removes Pak from 'grey list'


Islamabad, Oct 21: Global money laundering and terror financing watchdog, the Financial Action Task Force (FATF), Friday removed Pakistan from a list of countries under "increased monitoring", also known as the "grey list", media reports said.

Pakistan Foreign Minister Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari made the announcement prior to an FATF press conference, congratulating the country on the achievement, Dawn reported.

Pakistan was included among jurisdictions under the increased monitoring list in June 2018 for deficiencies in its legal, financial, regulatory, investigation, prosecution, judicial and non-government sectors in fighting money laundering and combat terror financing, which are considered serious threats to global financial system.

Islamabad made high-level political commitments to address these deficiencies under a 27-point action plan. But later the number of action points was enhanced to 34. The country had since been vigorously working with FATF and its affiliates to strengthen its legal and financial systems against money laundering and terror financing to meet international standards in line with the 40 recommendations of the FATF, Dawn reported.

A 15-member joint delegation of the FATF and its Sydney-based

regional affiliate Asia Pacific Group paid an onsite visit to Pakistan from August 29 to September 2 to verify the country's compliance with the 34-point action plan committed with the FATF.

The authorities which kept the countrywide visit of the delegation low profile later termed it as "a smooth and successful visit". The delegation had detailed discussions with the relevant agencies pursuant to the authorisation of onsite visit by the FATF Plenary in June 2022.

Pakistan believed that as a result of strenuous and consistent efforts over the past four years, it has not only achieved a high degree of

technical compliance with FATF standards, but also ensured high level of effectiveness through implementation of two comprehensive FATF action plans.

In June this year, FATF had found Pakistan "compliant or largely compliant" on all the 34 points and had decided to field an onsite mission to verify it on ground before formally announcing the country's exit from the grey list that finally took place in August and September. In terms of technical compliance with FATF standards, Pakistan was rated by APG as "compliant or largely compliant" in 38 out of 40 FATF recommendations in August this year, which

Pak's election panel disqualifies Imran

Islamabad: In a major setback to former Prime Minister Imran Khan, Pakistan's top election body Friday disqualified him from holding public office for five years in the Toshiakhana case for hiding proceeds from the sale of gifts he received from foreign leaders. After the consensus ruling by a four-member bench headed by Chief Election Commissioner Sikander Sultan Raja, the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) chairman cannot become a member of the parliament for five years. The decision was taken unanimously by the five-member bench. However, the member from Punjab was not present for the announcement.

Boris, Sunak leading race to become UK's next PM

London, Oct 21: Boris Johnson and his former finance minister Rishi Sunak were leading potential contenders to replace British Prime Minister Liz Truss Friday, with candidates canvassing support to become Conservative Party leader in a fast-tracked contest.

Truss, chosen by party members to succeed Johnson after he was ousted by his lawmakers in July, quit herself Thursday after six turbulent weeks in power.

Those who want to replace her must secure 100 nominations from Conservative lawmakers by Monday to run in a contest which the party hopes will reset its ailing fortunes.

With opinion polls suggesting the Conservatives would be all but wiped out if a national election were held now, the race is on to become the fifth British premier in six years. An election is not due to be held for two years. The winner will be announced Monday or next Friday. In what would be an extraordinary comeback, Johnson, who remains popular with party members was being touted alongside Sunak as a likely candidate.

But Johnson, who left office comparing himself to a Roman dictator twice brought into power to fight crises, might not reach the 100 nomination threshold after his three-year premiership was blighted by scandals and allegations of misconduct. Johnson, who no longer speaks to identified, said he was unlikely to reach the target, having alienated dozens of Conservative lawmakers.

Will Walden, who also once worked for Johnson, said the former leader was returning from holiday and taking soundings.

Defence Secretary Ben Wallace ruled himself out of the running and said he was leaning towards backing Johnson, who led the party to a large majority at a 2019 national election.

Sunak, the former Goldman Sachs analyst who became finance minister just as the Covid-19 pandemic arrived in Europe and was runner-up to Truss in the summer's leadership contest, is the favourite with bookmakers, followed by Johnson.

Japan, Oz to boost ties

Tokyo: Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida, who is travelling to Australia for talks with his counterpart Anthony Albanese, said on Friday he wants to bolster military and energy cooperation between the two countries amid their shared concerns about China. Kishida said he hoped to update their 2007 bilateral security pact to factor in the progress they've made and further promote their partnership. Australia's liquefied natural gas and coal exports are key to a stable energy supply for resource-scarce Japan, and Kishida said he hoped to discuss the future of Japanese resources and energy stability with Albanese.

Roslyn likely to be a hurricane

Mexico City: Tropical Storm Roslyn is gaining strength off Mexico's Pacific coast Friday and forecasters expected it to be a hurricane when it makes a likely weekend landfall between the resorts of Puerto Vallarta and Mazatlan. The US National Hurricane Centre said Roslyn's maximum sustained winds had increased to 65 mph (100 kph) early Friday. It was centred about 295 miles (475 kilometres) south-southeast of Cabo Corrientes — the point of land jutting into the Pacific south of Puerto Vallarta — and moving west-northwest at 7 mph (11 kph).

Dissident Iranian cleric dies at 96

Dubai: Ali Tehrani, a dissident cleric and brother-in-law of Iran's supreme leader, has died at age 96, local media reported. Tehrani had been a critic of Iran's authoritarian ruler, Shah Mohammad Reza Pahlavi, and of the Islamic leaders who toppled the shah in 1979. Tehrani advocated for a more liberal political system after the Islamic Revolution. He opposed clerics having a role in government and supported the freedom of activity of all political groups, including Marxist and secular factions.

UN demands end to violence in Haiti

United Nations: The UN Security Council unanimously adopted a resolution Friday demanding an immediate end to violence and criminal activity in Haiti and imposing sanctions on a powerful gang leader. The United States and Mexico, which drafted the 10-page resolution, delayed the vote from Wednesday so they could revise the text in hopes of gaining more support from council members — and they succeeded in getting approval from all 15 nations.

Zelensky calls on West to warn Russia not to blow up dam

Ukraine, Oct 21: Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky called on the West to warn Russia not to blow up a huge dam that would flood a swath of southern Ukraine, as his forces prepare to push Moscow's troops from Kherson in one of the war's most important battles.

In a television address, Zelensky said Russian forces had planted explosives inside the huge Nova Kakhovka dam, which holds back an enormous reservoir that dominates much of southern Ukraine, and were planning to blow it up.

"Now everyone in the world must act powerfully and quickly to prevent a new Russian terrorist attack. Destroying the dam would mean a large-scale disaster," he

said. Russia accused Kyiv earlier this week of rocketing the dam and planning to destroy it, in what Ukrainian officials called a sign that Moscow might blow it up and blame Kyiv.

Neither side produced evidence to back up their allegations. The vast Dnipro bisects Ukraine and is several km wide in places. Bursting the dam could send a wall of water flooding settlements below it, towards the city of Kherson, which Ukrainian forces hope to recapture in a major advance.

The alarm has echoes of a World War Two disaster at another huge dam further upriver, which Ukrainian historians say was dynamited by Soviet sappers as their troops retreated, causing floods that swept away villages and killed thousands of people.

Bannon sentenced to four months in prison




of \$6,500 as part of the sentence. Bannon was convicted in July of two counts of contempt of Congress:

It is widely speculated that Xi will be formally endorsed as the General Secretary for an unprecedented third-five-year term by the new Standing Committee Sunday.

San Francisco, Oct 21: Elon Musk plans to lay off most of Twitter's workforce if and when he becomes owner of the social media company, according to a report Thursday by The Washington Post. Musk has told prospective investors in his Twitter purchase



that he plans to cut nearly 75 per cent of Twitter's employee base of 7,500 workers, leaving the company with a skeleton crew, according to the report. The newspaper cited documents and unnamed sources familiar with

the deliberations.

San Francisco-based Twitter and a representative for Musk attorney Alex Spiro did not immediately respond to messages seeking comment. While job cuts have been expected regardless of the

sale, the magnitude of Musk's planned cuts are far more extreme than anything Twitter had planned.

Musk himself has alluded to the need to cull some of the company's staff in the past, but he hadn't given a specific number — at least not publicly.

"A 75 per cent head count cut would indicate, at least out of the gates, stronger free cash flow and profitability, which would be attractive to investors looking to get in on the deal," said Wedbush analyst Dan Ives. "That said, you can't cut your way to growth."

Ives added that such a drastic reduction in Twitter's workforce would likely set the company back years.

Already, experts, non-profits and even Twitter's own staff have warned that pulling back investments on content moderation and

data security could hurt Twitter and its users.

With as drastic a reduction as Musk may be planning, the platform could quickly become overrun with harmful content and spam — the latter of which the Tesla CEO himself has said he'll address if he becomes owner of the company.

After his initial \$44 billion bid in April to buy Twitter, Musk backed out of the deal, contending Twitter misrepresented the number of fake "spam bot" accounts on its platform. Twitter sued, and a Delaware judge has given both sides until October 28 to work out details. Otherwise, there will be a trial in November.

Twitter Inc (TWTR.N) clarified to staff that there are no plans for company-wide layoffs since it signed a deal to be acquired by billionaire Elon Musk.

SBI raises retail term deposit rates

Bangalore: State Bank of India, the country's largest lender, said Friday it will raise interest rates on retail term deposits below Rs 20 million by up to 80 basis points from October 22. While loan growth in India was at a multi-quarter high with a 16.4% jump in the fortnight ended September 23 from a year earlier, according to the central bank data, deposit growth across the industry has remained comparatively tepid at 9.2%.

Bid deadline for Future extended

Mumbai: The resolution professional for India's debt-laden Future Retail Ltd has extended the deadline for potential buyers to submit their bids for the retailer, due to tepid interest, two banking sources said Friday. The deadline had ended October 20, but has been extended to November 3, according to an updated document released by the resolution professional (RP). There were hardly any bids and none from any significant ones so it has been decided that we should allow more time to see if more bids come in, said a senior executive at a state lender that has exposure to the Future group.

JSW Steel posts quarterly loss

Bangalore: India's JSW Steel reported a surprise consolidated quarterly net loss compared to a year-ago profit Friday, mainly due to a sharp fall in steel prices. Consolidated net loss came in at Rs 8.48 billion (\$102.40 million) for the three months to September 30, while total revenue from operations rose to Rs 417.78 billion from Rs 325.03 billion a year earlier. Analysts on average had expected the Mumbai-based steelmaker to post a profit of Rs 8.99 billion, according to Refinitiv IBES data.

Adani looks to raise \$10bn debt

Bangalore: Indian billionaire Gautam Adani's group plans to raise at least \$10 billion in new debt through the next year to refinance large borrowings and fund projects in its pipeline, Bloomberg News reported on Friday, quoting people in the know. The Adani Group plans to use several vehicles including foreign currency debt and green bonds to raise up to \$6 billion to swap its current high-interest debt with lower-cost borrowings and deploy the rest for project financing, according to the report.



New Delhi, Oct 21: Google Friday said it will review Competition Commission's (CCI) decision to impose a Rs 1,338 crore penalty for alleged anti-competitive practice, and termed the order a "major set-

back" for Indian consumers and businesses.

"The CCI's decision is a major setback for Indian consumers and businesses, opening serious security risks for Indians who trust Android's security features, and raising the cost of mobile devices



for Indians," a Google spokesperson said in an email statement.

Google said it will "review the decision to evaluate the next steps".

The competition watchdog Thursday slapped a steep penalty of Rs 1,337.76 crore on Google for abusing its dominant position in multiple markets in relation to Android mobile devices and ordered the internet major to cease and desist from various unfair business practices.

The regulator, which passed the order after ordering a detailed probe more than three years ago, has also directed Google to modify its con-

duct within a defined timeline.

Android is a popular open-source, mobile operating system installed by original equipment manufacturers (OEMs) of smartphones and tablets.

CCI, which had started probing the case in April 2019, has directed that OEMs should not be restrained from choosing from among Google's proprietary applications to be pre-installed and also not be forced to pre-install a bouquet of applications on their smart devices.

Forex reserves drop by \$4.5bn to \$528.37bn

Mumbai, Oct 21: India's forex reserves dropped by \$4.5 billion to \$528.37 billion for the week ended October 14, the RBI said Friday.

The overall reserves had increased by \$204 million to \$532 billion in the previous reporting week, which was the first weekly increase in the kitty since August this year.

To help arrest rupee's record fall, the Reserve Bank of India has also burned \$117 billion from its forex coffers

In October 2021, the country's forex kitty had reached an all-time high of \$645 billion. The reserves have been declining as the central bank deploys the kitty to defend the rupee amid pressures caused majorly by global developments.

Foreign Currency Assets (FCA), a major component of the overall reserves, saw a drop of \$2.828 billion to \$468.668 billion during the week to October 14, according to the Weekly Statistical Supplement released by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI).

Gold reserves, whose value had risen by \$1.35 billion in the previous reporting week, saw a decline of \$1.502 billion in the value to \$37.453 billion.

The Special Drawing Rights (SDRs) were down by \$149 million to \$17.433 billion, the apex bank said. The country's reserve position with the IMF were down by \$23 million to \$4.813 billion in the reporting week, the apex bank data showed.

IEX trade volume declines over 11%

New Delhi, Oct 21: The total trade volume of Indian Energy Exchange (IEX) dipped over 11 per cent to 23.1 billion units in the July-September quarter, compared to the year-ago period, due to supply-side constraints.

The total trade volume of IEX was 26 billion units (BU) in July-September 2021, a company statement showed.

It said, "during the quarter, the Exchange traded 23.1 BU electricity volume versus 23.4 BU in Q1 FY'23. The volume comprised 19.7 BU in the conventional power market, 1.5 BU in the Green Market segment and 19.14 lakh Certificates in the Renewable Energy Certificates (REC) Market which is equivalent to 1.9 BU."

During the quarter, the volumes declined by 11 per cent YoY (year-on-year), as compared to Q2FY22, it stated. However, it said that during H1FY23 (April-September 2022) the volumes declined marginally by 2 per cent YoY. The volumes were impacted due to supply-side constraints, led by high prices of e-auction coal, imported coal and gas.

The average Day Ahead Market prices increased to Rs 5.40 per unit during Q2 FY23, as against Rs 4.14 in Q2 FY22. However, it stated that the average Day Ahead Market price was Rs 7.76 per unit during Q1 FY23.

HURTING RUPEE

Exporters hold off dollar sales eyeing better outcomes

A WEAKER RUPEE WILL HELP EXPORTERS AS IT INCREASES THEIR EARNINGS. SO WITH A STEADY FALL SEEN AHEAD, THEY PREFER TO HOLD ON TO THEIR DOLLARS FOR LONGER

Mumbai, Oct 21: Indian exporters are holding back on dollar sales on hopes of a further slide in the rupee, eyeing a windfall as the local currency plumbs record lows this year.

The rupee breached the 83 per dollar mark in a dramatic fashion Wednesday, once the Reserve Bank of India stopped protecting it at 82.40 levels. It hit a record low the next day and is expected to decline further to about 84.50 by the end of this year.

Brokers and bankers alike said they are advising their exporter clients to either hedge less or not at all, as predicting rupee's eventual normal range has become difficult, while the only certainty was that it would decline.

"We are advising exporters to hedge only partially, about 15-20% of their exposure," down from anything between 40%-60% during normal times, a treasury sales executive at a large private bank said.

The rupee's woes are many - the US Federal Reserve remaining on its aggressive rate hike path, widening current and trade account deficits domestically and foreign in-

vestors continuing to dump risk assets on fears of a global recession.

RBI WORSENS TROUBLE

To protect the rupee from sharp falls, the RBI has been intervening in both the spot and forward markets. The buy/sell swaps in the forward market has led to a fall in forward premiums to their lowest in more than a decade, turning dollar sales even more unattractive. USD/INR 1-year forward implied yield currently stands at 2.45%, declining from 3.07% earlier this month and down sharply from 4.75% at the start of 2022.

The declining premium has created a shortfall in dollar supply, further hurting the local unit.

While the demand for imported goods remains intact, exporters are unwilling to part with their dollars, leading to an artificial imbalance. Abhishek Goenka, founder and CEO of forex advisory firm IFA Global said, "That's why the rupee is weakening."

India rice export curbs to trigger global prices

In India, dry weather conditions delayed the sowing of rice, with many farmers not planting the crop at all, and then torrential rains damaged ripening paddy fields, raising concerns about food inflation

Mumbai, Oct 21: India's recent curbs on rice exports could trigger a rally in global prices after more than a decade of stability, traders said, as New Delhi's protectionist move coincides with falling output in other major producers and rising global demand.

Uneven monsoon rains hit rice planting in India, prompting the export restrictions in September, and floods have cut output in Pakistan even as consumption has grown in top importers such as Bangladesh and the Philippines. That's why forecasters are saying global demand will outstrip production in 2022/23.

This is bad for Asian and African countries that use rice as a staple, some of which import as much as 60% of their supply.

Since India - the world's biggest rice exporter - banned exports of broken rice and slapped a 20% export tax on some non-basmati varieties, global rice prices have jumped more than 10%. Last month, the Food and Agriculture Organization's global rice price index rose 2.2% to hit an 18-month high.

Governments worldwide had already been struggling to tame food inflation because of COVID-19 disruptions to production and supply chains, and then Russia's invasion of Ukraine removed millions of tonnes of foodstuffs from global markets, pushing inflation to a record earlier this year.

Before India implemented its export curbs a few months ago, industry and government officials in Asia were saying rice prices would hold steady due to ample stocks.

Rice, unlike wheat, was insulated from the Russia-Ukraine war as neither country is a big producer, and supplies of the grain had remained relatively steady during the Covid-related disruptions for other foodstuffs.

Now, however, top exporters Thailand and Vietnam sit on insufficient inventories to make up for India's curb on exports and widespread output losses. Global rice inventories could fall to their lowest in at least five years in 2023, three global traders said, citing internal assessments.

OUTPUT FORECASTS LOWERED

The US Agriculture Department (USDA) has cut its global rice production estimate for 2022/23 to 508 million tonne, the lowest in four years. Just a month ago, the agency was expecting output for the year at 512 million tonne.

Some top global trading houses, though, expect a sharper fall to around 500 million tonne because of the extreme weather conditions that threaten crop yields in nations such as China, India, Bangladesh and Pakistan.

India's summer-sown rice output is likely to fall to 105 million tonne in 2022/23, down 6%, the farm ministry said in September, and private traders estimate it could fall as low as 100 million tonne.

This is a big change from last year, when India's record 21.2 million tonne of rice exports - 30% cheaper than rival suppliers - helped cap global prices while other food commodities soared due to supply disruptions. After the September curb, India's rice exports are set to fall by around a quarter this year.

Reliance Q2 hit by windfall tax

Bangalore, Oct 21: Reliance Industries Ltd, India's most valuable company, Friday posted a near-flat quarterly profit as export tax on refined fuels and weak refining margins dented performance at its mainstay oil-to-chemical business.

The Mukesh Ambani-led conglomerate said consolidated profit was Rs 136.56 billion in the second quarter ended September 30, compared with Rs 136.3 billion a year earlier. A bigger shock came in the form

of windfall tax on exports of gasoline, diesel and aviation fuel levied by the government. The export duty adversely impacted profit for the quarter by Rs 40.39 billion, it said.

Earnings before interest, taxes, depreciation, and amortization for the Q2C segment dropped 5.9% year-on-year to Rs 119.68 billion.

The retail business, which suffered the most during Covid, saw revenue growth of 42.9% in the quarter as footfalls continued to surge, while the telecom unit Reliance Jio reported a 28% rise in profit.

New Delhi, Oct 21: Shares of companies related to the defence sector gained in the past two days, with the government's efforts to indigenise more defence equipment as well as boost their exports energising investor sentiment.

The 'Fourth Positive Indigenisation List' of 101 defence items was announced by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday, which also means that domestic players related to the multi-billion dollars worth defence segment, will have increased business opportunities.

An analysis of the stocks of com-

panies that have businesses related to the defence space showed that most of them have gained in the past two days.

Mazagon Dock, Bharat Dynamics, Cochin Shipyard, Mishra Dhatu Nigam, Bharat Electronics, Bharat Forge, Astra Microwave Products and Paras Defence and Space Technologies, are among the companies that have gained as much as 5 per cent in last two trading days, Wednesday and Thursday.

Since the end of trade October 18 till the close October 20, shares of Mazagon Dock rallied 5.39 per cent and BEML jumped 4.43 per cent on the BSE.

Similarly, Bharat Dynamics



climbed 3.32 per cent, Cochin Shipyard gained 2.82 per cent, Mishra Dhatu Nigam Ltd advanced 2.18 per cent and Bharat Electronics went higher by 1.93 per cent during the period.

The stock of Bharat Forge gained

1.44 per cent, Astra Microwave Products spurred 0.84 per cent and Paras Defence and Space Technologies (0.26 per cent) in the last two days.

Meanwhile, a few stocks remained muted. Shares of Data Patterns

different characters. Perth, Brisbane are out and out pacers' and seamers' tracks while MCG, SCG and the Adelaide tracks will assist spinners.

Add to that the big grounds Down Under, just relying on big shots would not suffice since running between the wickets will be key.


Australia has three different time zones. The climate in the state of Western Australia (Perth) is slightly different from Queensland (Brisbane), South Australia (Adelaide), New South Wales (Sydney) and Victoria (Melbourne), where India will meet Pakistan Sunday.

While the local Met department has predicted 80 per cent chances of rain, the MCG track, in case there's a full match, will have enough juice to keep the bowlers - both pacers and spinners in business.

RAIN THREAT LOOMS OVER INDO-PAK TIE

IRELAND KNOCK OUT WINDIES



Hobart: Ireland sprang the biggest upset of the T20 World Cup, eliminating two-time champions West Indies with a stunning 9-wicket win that also sealed their Super 12 berth here Friday. It was their 32-year-old veteran opener Paul Stirling who smashed an unbeaten 66 from 48 balls (6x4, 2x6) to seal the chase with 15 balls to spare after leg-spinner Gareth Delany's career-best figures of 3/16 restricted the Windies to 146/5.

A traditional Australian wicket does produce steep bounce along with some lateral movement till the stitches on the seam of the white kookaburra don't flatten. However the true bounce makes these tracks batting belts.

Batting maestro Sachin Tendulkar feels that bowlers will have an upper hand. "The pitches could have lateral movement and it might not be as hard as we are used to seeing. There would be a tad softness," Tendulkar shared his observation with this agency dur-

ing an interaction.

"I was watching one of the games in Geelong (Namibia vs Sri Lanka) and I felt that seamers were getting good lateral movement off the pitch and spinners got a couple of balls to turn because the pitch isn't as hard as we are expecting.

"They have left a bit of grass on the surface and when the ball is new and seam is upright, ball does something which is true for both pacers and spinners," said Tendulkar.

ZIMBABWE OUST SCOTLAND

Hobart: Zimbabwe made it to the Super 12 stage of the T20 World Cup for the first time after an easy 5-wicket win over Scotland in a Group B match here Friday. For Scotland, it was the end of their campaign after the loss. Pacer Tendai Chatara, who also became the first from Zimbabwe to take 50-plus wickets in T20is, led a spectacular bowling show with figures of 2/14 as Zimbabwe restricted Scotland to a below-par 132/6. In reply, Zimbabwe cantered home in 18.3 overs with their star all-rounder Sikandar Raza slamming a 23-ball 40 (3x4, 2x6).



a finger spinner like Ravichandran Ashwin will be more effective on tracks like MCG and Sydney in case there is enough moisture retention.

During the iconic 2020-21 series in Australia, Ashwin came into the attack within the first hour of the MCG Test and executed coach Ravi Shastri and bowling coach Bharath Arun's strategy of making full use of the moisture. Ashwin made full use of the damp and moist conditions as the odd ball would grip the surface and there

was appreciable turn and bounce.

But that was December and there was rain in Melbourne. This is one Australian city where one would often witness three different weather conditions in a single day. There would be nip in the air the mornings and evenings, the occasional steady drizzle and also bright sunshine, which bakes the track well. But that is for Test matches but in an evening T20 game, there won't be such luxuries.

However, finger spinners, who can get more side spin and drift (sideways movement) will stand to gain more at least during the first half of the group league stage.

While the Round 1 games, featuring minnows (save Sri Lanka and West Indies) have been moderately low-scoring ones mostly, it is expected that average innings score would significantly improve as the ability and skill sets of batters in teams featuring in main round are much better.

“We are currently having a lot of wet weather in Australia and during the first phase we might see some rain, and because of rain, wickets will be a lot more sportier than usual but I am expecting good contests in the main round as there will be good traditional wickets”

Madrid had taken their lead to six points after a 3-0 win at last-place Elche Wednesday. The rivals had entered the first 'clasico' of the season tied on points and Madrid won 3-1 at the Santiago Bernabeu to take sole possession of first place.

Sunday's loss had compounded Barcelona's disappointment after they saw their hopes of advancing in the Champions League all but end with a 3-3 home draw against Inter Milan last week.

Lewandowski opened the scoring with a low shot from near the penalty spot after clearing two defenders with a nice first touch off a cross by Jordi Alba.

The Poland striker added to the lead with another beautiful goal as he moved away from a defender and a fired a curling right-footed shot from outside the area into the far corner.

Fati sealed the victory from close range after a buildup started by Ferran Torres. It was Fati's first goal

since September.

It was Barcelona's eighth win in 10 league matches so far, with the other setback in addition to the 'clasico' loss being a 0-0 home draw against Rayo Vallecano in the first round.

Barcelona will next host Athletic Bilbao before welcoming Bayern Munich in the Champions League in a match in which it might already be eliminated depending on Inter

Milan's result earlier in the day.

Villarreal dropped to ninth place. Unai Emery's team had beaten Osasuna in the previous round to end a four-game winless streak in the league.

The three goals Villarreal conceded matched the number of goals they had allowed in all other league games so far. It had arrived at the Camp Nou with the league's best defense.

NEWS IN BRIEF

BOOST FOR PRO LEAGUE WINNERS

NEW DELHI: The winners of FIH Pro League from 2023-24 season in both men's and women's categories will directly qualify for 2026 World Cups and 2028 Olympic Games, said hockey world body's CEO Thierry Weil Friday. "From season 5 and season 6, the winners of the men's and women's Pro League will directly qualify for 2026 World Cup. The winners of seasons 7 and 8 will get direct entry into 2028 Olympics," International Hockey Federation (FIH) CEO Weil said in a virtual interaction. Besides, the FIH has also planned major changes in the Pro League as from the fourth edition - 2022-23 season - the world body will introduce relegation and promotion system. The last-placed team at the end of the season in both men's and women's competitions will be relegated to the Nations Cup, while the winners of the Nations Cup will be promoted to the Pro League.

HALEP SUSPENDED

LONDON: Two-time Grand Slam champion Simona Halep was provisionally suspended by the International Tennis Integrity Agency after failing a drug test during the US Open in August. The ITIA announced the punishment Friday for Halep, a former No.1 player who is currently No.9 in the WTA rankings. In a social media post, Halep called the news of her positive test "the biggest shock of my life," adding: "Facing such an unfair situation, I feel completely confused and betrayed." "I will fight until the end to prove that I never knowingly took any prohibited substance," Halep wrote.

BLOW FOR GERMANY

MUMBAI: Germany's head coach Friederike Kromp Friday tested positive for COVID-19 and was isolated as the ongoing FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup had its first coronavirus case. Kromp tested positive for the virus hours before Germany's quarterfinal clash against favourites Brazil at the DY Patil Stadium here. Kromp will not sit in the team dug out on Friday and she will be replaced by Melanie Behringer as head coach while Julia Simic will be the assistant on the sideline. Behringer had represented Germany in 123 international games, winning the World Cup in 2007 in the process.

DANGI STEALS SHOW, BAGS GOLD AND SILVER

CAIRO: Sagar Dangi bagged a gold and silver in the junior men's 10m Air Pistol team and individual events at the ISSF World Championship here Friday. India picked up four more medals, including one gold. India now have a tally of 30 medals - 11 gold, seven silver and 12 bronze - and are behind China in second place in the standings. Dangi (silver) and Varun Tomar (bronze) in the junior men's 10m Air Pistol, Nancy and Sri Karthik Sabari Raj Ravishankar (bronze) in the 10m Air Rifle junior Mixed Team and Dangi, Tomar and Samrat Rana - gold in the men's 10m Air Pistol junior Team event - fetched medals for India.

Lakshya beats Prannoy to enter quarterfinals

Odense, Oct 21: Commonwealth Games gold medallist Lakshya Sen got the better off his senior compatriot HS Prannoy in straight games to progress to the men's singles quarterfinals of the Denmark Open Super 750 badminton tournament here.

Sen, a 2021 World Championships bronze medallist, beat World No.13 Prannoy 21-9, 21-18 in a 39-minute clash to set up a last eight clash with Japan's Kodai Naraoka.

The two came into the match with a 2-2 head-to-head count in four meetings but the younger Sen proved to be the better player on the day as he made a rollicking start to put Prannoy on the back foot Thursday World No.8 Sen zoomed to a 5-1 lead early on before swelling it to 11-3 at the mid-game break. He kept moving ahead as Prannoy's game crumbled.

In the second game, Prannoy gave a better account of himself as he kept breathing down his opponent's neck

with slender leads of 5-4 and 11-10. Things remained the same after the interval but Sen broke off at 17-17 to shut the door on Prannoy.

INDIA FINISH 13TH

NEW DELHI: The Indian team notched up a 4-1 win over Germany to sign off at the 13th position at the World Junior Mixed Team Badminton Championships in Santander, Spain Friday. Mixed doubles pair of Samarveer and Radhika Sharma starting the proceedings, beating Germany's Jarne Schleyvoigt and Julia Meyer 21-18, 21-16 to give India a 1-0 lead. In men's singles, Bharat Raghav saw off Germany's Sanjeevi Padmanabhan Vasudevan 14-21, 21-17, 21-8. Men's doubles combination of Arsh Mohammad and Abhinav Thakur, however, went down 14-21, 22-24 to Jonathan Dresp and Simon Krax. But Unnati Hooda crushed German hopes with a 21-8, 21-6 win over Selin Hubsch and then women's pair of Shreya Balaji and Srinidhi Narayan prevailed 21-13, 21-13 over Julia Meyer and Cara Siebrecht.
