'Chhadakhai' sales at ₹1cr-plus

Bhubaneswar, Nov 9: Prices of non-vegetarian items increased manifold as customers thronged various markets here on the occasion of 'Chhadakhai' festival. With the end of the holy month of Kartik, people once more returned to eating non-veg stuff and sellers of fish, mutton, chicken and other seafood items did brisk business. Sources said that markets in the Odisha capital and Cuttack had done business of more than ₹1 crore by selling non-vegetarian items.

The fish market in Unit-IV here was crowded from the morning with customers eager to get good varities before the supplies got exhausted. Regulars said that the

prices of the various types of fish had gone up by a minimum of ₹25 per cent, but they took it in their stride.

Sources said fish was in huge demand in all the markets and a number of people made a beeline for prawns even though it was sold at ₹500 per kilogram. Country chicken was sold for ₹400/kg while broiler at ₹220/kg. Mutton prices varied between ₹700 to ₹800 at markets, but that did not dampen the spirits of the customers. Everywhere the sellers did brisk business.

This is the day to celebrate 'Chhadakhai' and I am here to buy fish. As compared to other days, the fish sellers are charging ₹10-20 extra per kg. However, that is acceptable,' said a buyer at Unit-IV market.

President Droupadi Murmu administered him the oath at a brief ceremony held at the Rashtrapati



Bhavan here. He took the oath in English and in the name of God. He will head India's Judiciary until November 10, 2024, a day before he completes 65 years.

Justice Chandrachud's name was recommended October 11 by outgoing CJI UU Lalit and the former was named India's 50th CJI, October 17.

Quake kills 6 in Nepal, rocks north India

New Delhi/Kathmandu: Strong tremors were felt across north India and parts of Nepal in the early hours of Wednesday after a 6.3-magnitude earthquake struck the Himalayan region near Uttarakhand's Pithoragarh along the Nepal border. Six persons were killed in the quake in Nepal while five others suffered injuries. The tremors were felt in Delhi and the surrounding areas of Ghaziabad and Gurgaon and even in Lucknow, jolting people out of their sleep. "Didn't want to tweet but one can safely say it did feel like an earthquake," Union Minister Meenakshi Lekhi wrote on Twitter.


The Ukrainian president has shared the meeting on his





Settle pending PMFBY claims pronto, Nayak urges Tomar

Bhubaneswar, Nov 9: Cooperation Minister Atanu Sabyasachi Nayak Wednesday urged Union Agriculture Minister Narendra Singh Tomar for early settlement of pending claims under Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana

Navak met Tomar in New Delhi Wednesday and sought his personal intervention in this issue.

The state government has been implementing PMFBY since 2016. During Kharif 2021, the insurance companies had raised objections to the conduct of crop cutting experiments for paddy in 263 insurance units (gram panchayat/urban local bodies) thus holding up the claims of the farmers, he said during the meeting.

After intervention by the State Level Committee, claims were released only for 38 insurance units. Although the state government had done a detailed analysis of all contested cases but for the rest 225 insurance units, the insurance companies have appealed to the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) of the Centre against the order of the state government, he pointed out.

Middlemen fleece cotton farmers in western dists



Interstate bidders. middlemen and local millers are making the most of loopholes in the system and government policies and eating into the margins of farmers

Bolangir, Nov 9: Cotton cultivation has seen a rise in the western districts of Bolangir, Kalahandi, Nuapada, Subarnapur, Boudh and Bargarh, and also in Rayagada, Koraput and Gajapati districts in state's south. However, what ails the

farmers is that the middlemen,

wholesalers take a major chunk of profit from farmers' produce. Cotton is being grown on 62,433 hectare land in Bolangir district in 2022-23 kharif season. According to available data, cotton used to be grown only on 5,000 hectare in 1980 which has expanded to over 2 lakh hectare by 2022. The government at the Centre decides the minimum support price (MSP) of cotton as the cotton price is fixed

at a much higher price in the market than the MSP. MSP per quintal of cotton was

As cotton is a cash crop, the number of middlemen in its cultivation and trade is increasing every year. Interstate bidders, middlemen and local millers are making the most of loopholes in the system and government policies and eating into the margins of farmers.

While farmers earned ₹7,000 per quintal of cotton, middlemen, who purchased cotton from the farmers, got anything between ₹10,000 to ₹12,000. The bidders managed to increase the selling price of cotton but the administration has failed to rein in the middlemen

A farmer Rajendra Behera of Sihini village under Belpada block admitted that he has earned more per quintal of cotton than the previous year but the middlemen grabbed major chunk of earning.

"Government should buy cotton from the farmers through mandis instead of the millers. He alleged that the farmers are being deprived of actual profit due to apathetic attitude of the state government and the loopholes in the cotton purchase policy," he added.

The selling price of cotton went up last year as the government allowed the outside traders to buy cotton directly from the farmers. This henefitted the farmers

This year, the Cotton Corporation of India (CCI) has fixed the minimum price per quintal of cotton at ₹6,380. Harvest season has started in Bolangir and other districts from first week of November but the meeting of the district level cotton procurement committee is yet to be conducted. With the start of the harvest season, middlemen are moving from village to village transporting cotton outside.

The middlemen and traders have also introduced the system of advance payment like migrant labourers in cotton cultivation. They are paying money in advance to the farmers to buy seeds, fertilizers and pesticides by signing a contract and buying their produce after the harvest. As a result, middlemen are earning more profits than the farmers.

Moreover, the district administrations have not opened any mandi to purchase cotton except through three regulated market committees (RMCs). The CCI is also not intervening as cotton is being sold at prices more than the MSP.

Lack of registration facility for cotton farmers has also hit them. It is difficult to differentiate between an actual farmer and a middleman. Meanwhile, cotton is sold at higher prices in international market than the MSP. It is apprehended that this might soon affect the farmers if the government does not take any preventive steps.

When contacted, Collector Chanchal Rana said that the administration is making arrangements to help the cotton farmers

Recovery of ₹700cr penalty likely

Jaipur, Nov 9: The district administration has concluded the mapping of alleged excess stone mining at Rahadpur hill in Jajpur district Wednesday by using drones. It was alleged that large quantities of black stone had been extracted from Rahadpur stone mines beyond the permissible limits.

The administration engaged My World Consultancy agency to assess the plundering of the black stone. Jajpur ADM (Revenue) Akshay Kumar Mallick, Dharmashala tehsildar Swagat Kumar Das and other revenue officials were present during the mapping of the stone mines. In next seven days, the assessment report of the stone mining will be available. After the report comes, action will be taken against the leaseholders and others involved in the scam.

It is said that in 2016-17, the lessees extracted stones exceeding the perEXCESS STONE MINING IN RAHADPUR HILL



mined were valued at ₹350 crore.

As per legal provision, the administration is expected to recover penalties double its value found after assessment. This has struck fears among the leaseholders.

On the other hand, it is alleged that some administration officials, leaseholders and the consultancy agency have struck a secret deal worth ₹20 crore to underestimate the excess stone mining so that those involved in it would have to pay less penalty amounts.

It is alleged that 10 tehsildars, revenue inspectors and six sub-collectors who were earlier found complicit in the case would be free of the taint due to irregularities.

In August, four leaseholders had been served with demand notices for recovery of ₹105.87 crore after the satellite survey of the stone mines. Our correspondent tried to contact the tehsildar, but the latter did not pick up the call.

Guesthouse cook held for killing firm manager

₹17L goes down the drain as LI project defunct

Khaira, Nov 9: A lift irrigation (LI) project built at a cost of ₹17 lakh is not coming handy for farmers in Sardang panchayat under Khaira block of Balasore district as crops in hectares of land are affected by water shortage.

Now, farmlands are bone dry when they should have enough water for the plants to grow, farmers said. Crops are expected to ripen in a few weeks, but want of water in the farmlands will spoil the harvest, they added. This has caused concern among

the farmers, who have warned of agitation if the defunct LI project is not made functional in a few days.

Notably, the project was built 10 years ago at a cost of ₹17.30 lakh. After running for a few years, it became defunct. Following repeated pleas and demands from the farmers, the project was repaired eight months ago by spending ₹17 lakh again. However, it has failed to deliver a drop of water to the farmlands despite it being repaired, lamented farmers.

Contacted, assistant engineer of the lift irrigation division, Suresh Chandra Dev said that the project was repaired after the farmers complained. "If it has gone defunct again, steps will be taken to get it repaired,' he assured.

27 chromite-laden trucks detained

Anandapur: Amid allegation of illegal mining in parts of Keonjhar district, police officials have detained 27 trucks loaded with chromite in Anandapur area, late Tuesday night. The trucks were carrying the mineral from Kaliapani area of Jajpur district to Maharaja Mineral Pvt Ltd at Soso in Keonjhar. On the way, locals had suspected illegal mineral transportation and then informed the police. Police intercepted the trucks and took them to the police station. Police are examining documents and permits of all these trucks. Police have suspected something fishy in the permits for the mineral transportation. Police communicated with the deputy director of mines, Keonjhar, and the the Keonjhar RTO about the detained trucks for document verification.

Wife, 2 sons hack man to death in Ganjam

Khallikote, Nov 9: A man was hacked to death by his wife and two sons over domestic dispute at Totagaon village under Khallikote NAC area and police limits in Ganjam, late Tuesday night.

His wife and two sons were subsequently detained by police. When contacted, the IIC said that the detainees will be arrested soon and a probe is underway to ascertain the involvement of some other per-

Drunk on 'mahua', 24 jumbos sleep for hours

Keonjhar, Nov 9: People of a village went inside a forest to prepare 'mahua', a traditional country liquor, but found that a herd of elephants had already devoured the water fermented with the intoxicating flowers and were in deep sleep.

The villagers living near Shilipada cashew forest in Keonjhar district saw that a total of 24 jumbos, who were apparently drunk, were sleeping near the place where mahua flowers were kept in water in large pots for fermentation.

"We went into the jungle at around 6am to prepare mahua liquor and found that all the pots were broken and the fermented water missing. We also found that the elephants were sleeping. They consumed the fermented water and got drunk," Naria Sethi, a villager, said. There were nine

tuskers, six females and nine calves. "That liquor was unprocessed. We tried to wake up the animals but failed. The Forest department was then informed," he said. Forest department personnel after reaching the spot

Forest personnel had to beat drums to wake the herd of nine tuskers, six females and nine calves up

in the jungle under the Patana forest range had to beat drums to wake the herd up.

The elephants then went deep inside the forest, said Ghasiram Patra, the forest ranger. Sethi said the herd left the place at around 10am.

The forest official, however, is not sure whether the elephants got drunk after consuming fermented mahua.

"Maybe, they were just resting there," Patra said. Villagers, on the other hand, insisted that they spotted the elephants sleeping in intoxicated conditions at various places close to the broken pots Tuesday.

The flowers of Mahua tree (Madhuca longifolia) are fermented to produce an alcoholic drink also called Mahua. Tribal men and women in various parts of India traditionally make this liquor.

Woman found hanging in cashew orchard

Free Speech for Whom?

ow is it that a man who has banned 83 million people from Twitter can freely use the platform to post his messages denigrating women and supporting the brutal attack on the writer Salman Rushdie? I'm referring to the leader of the Islamic Republic of Iran, Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, whose government is killing young women who want to be able to show their hair in public.

For several years, the Iranian-American activist Masih Alineiad has been calling for Khamenei to be banned from Twitter. Last month, along with Ukrainian president Volodymyr Zelensky, she received the 2022 Oxi Courage Award at the United States Institute of Peace. Opposition to Khamenei does indeed require courage, as is evident from the attack on Rushdie last August, which can be traced to the 1989 fatwa issued by Khamenei's predecessor, Ayatollah Khomeini, condemning Rushdie to death for blasphemy.

As recently as 2019, Khamenei called this verdict "solid and irrevocable," and Iran's foreign ministry refused to reproach Rushdie's attacker, instead blaming Rushdie. Alinejad herself has been under FBI protection since August, when police arrested and charged a man with plotting to kill

Now that Elon Musk has purchased Twitter, the campaign to ban Khamenei

is seeking to influence him. In a recent letter directed to Twitter's advertisers, Musk wrote that he acquired Twitter because "it is important to the future of civilization to have a common digital town square, where a wide range of beliefs can be debated in a healthy manner, without resorting to violence." Otherwise, Musk warns, the opportunity for dialogue on social media will split into "far right-wing and far left-wing echo chambers that generate more hate and divide our society'

I share Musk's concern about what he calls "the woke mind virus" - the readiness to attack people who advocate positions that are perceived as politically incorrect - and the absence of genuine dialogue across the political spectrum. That is why I am one of the founding editors of the Journal of Controversial Ideas, which has just published its third issue. Like Twitter, our journal offers the option of publishing under a pseudonym, though in other respects we are poles apart. Twitter limits messages to 280 characters, whereas we accept articles up to 12,000 words. Not coincidentally, 240 million people use Twitter, while we were pleased to get 50,000 views - a lot for an academic journal – in our first year.

Musk's reference to debating beliefs in a "healthy manner" is open to various interpretations, some of them highly restrictive of free speech. But whatever it means, the question remains how it can be done. At the Journal of Controversial Ideas, we send all articles that pass an initial screen to experts for independent review, in a form that does not identify the author, and we treat responses to the articles we publish in a similar manner. We are looking for well-reasoned

Since our initial call for papers more than a year ago, we have received close to 300 submissions; our current acceptance rate is 12 per cent. Twitter, by contrast, has 6,000 new posts every second. Even for a \$44 billion company, employing enough people to vet that many tweets is not economically viable – and Musk is reportedly planning to fire about 25 per cent of Twitter employees, rather than hiring more. Artificial intelligence could be the answer,

but it isn't, at present, able to distinguish reliably between tweets that make positive contributions to debates and those that promote the very hatred and social division that Musk wants to prevent. Musk has described himself as a "free speech absolutist." He greeted his successful takeover of Twitter, which has a blue bird as its logo, by tweeting, "the bird is freed." Lifting all restrictions on what can be posted on Twitter, however, is not the way to promote debate in a "healthy manner" between

than 1,200 racist and anti-Semitic tweets and retweets that appeared on the site in a coordinated campaign timed to Musk's completion of his purchase. To achieve Musk's laudable goal, a distinction needs to be drawn between

people with very different starting points. That much is clear from the more

speech that appeals to reason and evidence, or seeks to broaden our empathy and understanding, in an effort to persuade us to change our mind, and speech that seeks to vilify others and stir up hatred against them. Musk may have come to realise this. After taking over the company, he

tweeted about forming a "content moderation council with widely diverse viewpoints" and said that the company would not take "major content decisions or account reinstatements" until "that council convenes." One issue for such a body to consider is whether Twitter should provide a platform to someone who defends a subordinate social status for women and advocates the death penalty for speech that his religion considers to be blasphemy.

Control of a platform like Twitter has put great power - and therefore great responsibility – in the hands of a single individual. Much will depend on Musk, and the members of the content moderation council he appoints, to exercise that responsibility well.

Consilience

dward O Wilson popularised this rare word when he used it in the title of his best-selling book Consilience: the Unity of Knowledge. It means "a jumping together", and in his book he encourages those who study the sciences, the humanities and the arts to bridge the gaps between their narrow specialisms and so link together all the branches of learning, an aim which goes back to the thinkers of the time of the Enlightenment. Professor Wilson is trying to bring together what three decades ago the late CP Snow called "the two cultures" in what he calls a "dream of unified learning". Wilson argues that all fields of study have a common goal, to give understanding a purpose, and to lend to us all "a conviction, far deeper than a mere working proposition, that the world is orderly and can be explained by a small number of natural laws". But Wilson didn't invent the word: that honour belongs to the nineteenthcentury philosopher William Whewell (who also gave us the word scientist), who used it in his book The Philosophy of the Inductive Sciences in 1840 to describe the interlocking of explanations of cause and effect between disciplines. He seems to have derived it from the Latin word consilere, formed from con-, "with", and salire, "to leap".

BROKEN ENERGY SYSTEM

rdinary people around the world are suffering from two massive, overlapping problems: surging living costs and the fallout from a rapidly warming climate. In the Horn of Africa, 22 million people are at risk of starvation, owing to the failure of four consecutive rainy seasons and soaring global grain prices. Making matters worse, high fuel

prices, exacerbated by Russia's invasion of Ukraine, are pushing communities and businesses across Africa to the brink of collapse. And in Europe, a summer of recordbreaking heat is about to give way to a crippling winter as the high cost of gas drives up energy prices for everyone. While one should be careful not to oversimplify global problems that manifest differently in different regions, it is impossible to ignore the root cause of today's food, energy, and cost-of-living crises: our fossil-fuel-dependent energy system is broken.

For many years, the fossil-fuel industry has argued that its products offer a fast track to cheap energy and economic development. Yet this claim has been proven wrong time and again. Decades of fossil-fuel development have not served the 600 million people in Sub-Saharan Africa who still lack access to energy.

Fossil-fuel prices are inherently volatile, and it is vulnerable communities that suffer most from wild fluctuations in global hydrocarbon markets. In the UK, this year's spike in gas prices has led to an 80% increase in projected household energy bills. In coming months, many lower-income families will be forced to choose between heating and eating. Meanwhile, BP, Chevron, ExxonMobil, Total, and Shell raked in profits of \$59 billion just in the

Worse, the pain that many are already feeling this year pales in comparison to what awaits us if we continue to burn fossil fuels. Earlier this year, the Intergovernmental

second quarter of this year.

Panel on Climate Change warned that if we want to avoid catastrophic warming scenarios, we cannot build any new fossil-fuel infrastructure, and we must rapidly phase out the fossil fuels that we are already using.

It would be madness to think that the current congeries of global crises can be solved with our current energy systems. More investments in fossil-fuel infrastructure and exploration will result in more pain and uncertainty for households, greater concentrations of profits and wealth, and unlivable climatic conditions for billions of people. But that's what we're getting: The OECD and the IEA report that government fossil-fuel subsidies around the world almost doubled in 2021. reaching \$697 billion.

If we want reliable, clean, affordable energy for all, the quickest and most effective solution is

to increase investment in renewables, energy efficiency, and integrated power grids. Electricity from solar and wind is now cheaper than electricity from gas, and the prices don't undergo dangerous fluctuations. In the UK, where successive governments have failed to lead on building renewable-energy capacity, homeowners are taking it upon themselves to install solar panels, because they know that the investment will pay for itself in lower energy bills.

Renewables are also a faster and cheaper way to expand energy access in rural Africa. Because they can be located closer to the point of consumption, they have been found to be more economically viable than building transmission lines from centralised gas-fueled power stations

In pursuing the system-wide shift that we need, developed-country governments can pay their own way. But they also must do more to help finance the Global South's energy transition. The International Renewable Energy Agency estimates that Africa will need annual investments of \$70 billion to ensure

access to clean energy for all. More broadly, there will need to be largescale investments in solar supply chains to reduce many countries' dependence on China, which has become another major source of economic risk, with supply disruptions fueling price surges.

In the run-up to COP26 last November, the global climate-financing gap was a hot topic. But the rich world's 2009 pledge to provide the developing world with at least \$100 billion in climate financing per year by 2020 still is not being met. Without a substantial increase in both public and private finance from the advanced economies, there will be no global transition to a better energy system. Since these investments will benefit everyone, the Global North, development banks, and private institutions must rise to the occasion at COP27.

The energy and cost-of-living crises are affecting people everywhere-from the north of England and northern Uganda to Florida and Pakistan, which is still reeling from this summer's catastrophic flooding. In time, investments in resilience and clean energy will pay for themselves, in contrast to investments that funnel profits to a few multinationals and rogue, war mongering petrostates.

Unless we seize the moment, democratic stagnation, rising inequality, social unrest, and other deepening structural and systemic problems are likely to get even worse. If we make the right decisions today, we can create the conditions for a more stable, equal, and prosperous future.

Three building mistakes to avoid

CORROSION OF STEEL REINFORCEMENT **EMBEDDED INSIDE CONCRETE IS POPULARLY KNOWN AS 'CONCRETE CANCER'**

much of me as a civil engineer, notwithstanding a degree from NIT - Trichy, a PhD from the University of Michigan and over 25 years of work experience, including ten years overseas. The house I had built in Bhubaneswar requires periodic repair, and the renovations I did to our parental house have been equally fraught with periodic mishaps. The last one was a particularly dramatic event. A large chunk of concrete delaminated after the reinforcement got corroded and fell off, bringing down a whole section of the suspended ceiling. Luckily no one was around at the time; else, it could have been quite dangerous. It made me reflect on my experience over the last 27 years, much of which has involved inspecting buildings and other structures for defects and prescribing remedies. I could immediately think of many avoidable building mistakes that caused major problems that needed repair, which invariably came with cost and inconvenience. But three issues stand out that I would like to discuss.

Corrosion of steel reinforcement embedded inside concrete is popularly known as 'concrete cancer'. Like cancer, it starts in any part of the reinforced concrete structure and spreads slowly without giving any evidence on the surface. By the time one sees it with the naked eye in the form of a crack, delamination or spalling, it is generally pretty late. Fixing the problem would involve removing the affected parts and applying treatment layers ranging from replacement of lost steel reinforcement, rust protection on existing steel, waterproofing, special

mother doesn't think cement plaster and surface coating for additional protection. However, the problem becomes dangerous when the area affected by corrosion is hidden from view and, therefore cannot be detected early. So, the first mistake one should avoid is using a false ceiling to hide a concrete roof slab - particularly one exposed to heavy monsoon rains. Moisture always tends to find a way into the slab, which is essential for corrosion.

A few weeks ago, there was a near similar incident in one of the busiest metro railway stations in Hong Kong. During the evening rush hour around 6 PM on 20th February earlier this year, a large chunk of concrete fell through the false ceiling near platform 3 at Central station near the escalators. It was miraculous that no one was hurt. If my mother knew such things don't only happen in our house, she would probably forgive my competence as a civil engineer. Jokes apart, this is one error which is quite common in most modern buildings where we like to hide the ceiling of reinforced concrete slabs - be it a roof or floors below with suspended ceilings. It often works well and gives the interior a nice look, but in a few cases, it can result in serious incidents. Therefore, the cardinal principle to be followed would be to ensure that false ceilings or suspended ceilings, as they are also called, are avoided, particularly under the roof, if not all floors, wherever possible. In case their use is unavoidable, make sure that they are easily openable for periodic checks and inspections. Also, ensure that the reinforced concrete slabs you are covering up are of high-qual-

ity construction and not susceptible to moisture and oxygen penetration that are prerequisites for cor-

The second building mistake is a common problem during concrete casting when it is poured from a height. While consulting on a project, double-height reinforced concrete columns were to be cast without joints. The columns were to have an exposed concrete finish without plaster. Therefore, the finishing had to be perfect and free of any honeycombing. We were aware of the problem of segregation of concrete when poured from a height, separating the aggregates from cement paste. This results in poor compaction that leads to honeycombing. We had made all arrangements to avoid this outcome by providing workers with a chute to slide the concrete along and vibrators to properly compact the concrete. When the moulds were removed, we found a well-finished column with no defects visible on surface. However, one senior engineer visiting the site took a hammer to test the concrete quality and suddenly discovered several cases of hidden honeycombing at the base of the columns. This was a major defect that had to be repaired, and all the columns had to be rigorously tested using non-destructive testing methods to ensure that the problem was localised, and the building would be safe.

The third problem is using excess water to increase the workability of concrete. It is a common practice which damages concrete more than anything else. Concrete is a mixture of stone chips, otherwise known as coarse aggregates, coarse sand, also known as fine aggregate, cement, water and optionally chemical and mineral admixtures. While the popular belief is that amount of cement is the most critical factor determining the strength and hence the quality of concrete, it is not entirely true. In fact, excess cement can cause problems for the concrete both at an early age and later.

Water content measured in terms of water-to-cement ratio plays a crucial role in determining fresh concrete properties such as workability and hardened concrete properties such as strength and durability. An important durability characteristics is its ability to resist the penetration of chloride ions from salt. water and air, which leads to steel corrosion. Unless concrete is made at a batching plant and delivered to the construction site in a ready-mix truck, water control is not accurate in site-mixed concrete. It often results in poor-quality concrete with reduced strength and durability costing millions in repairs, maintenance, and replacement.

I am not sure if my mother will change her opinion of my professional competence after reading this article. But I am not in bad company, given that she had a similarly poor opinion of my late father's skills as an agricultural scientist. In her opinion, he could never translate his considerable expertise in the soil physics lab to successfully growing vegetables in our kitchen garden!



Rajkot, Nov 9: Former Gujarat Chief Minister Vijay Rupani and ex-deputy CM Nitin Patel, both senior leaders of the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), Wednesday night announced they will not fight the next month's Assembly elections.

Two other senior BJP leaders, Bhupendrasinh Chudasama and Pradeepsinh Jadeja -- who were ministers in the Rupani cabinet -

- also announced they will not seek tickets for the polls to be held December 1 and 5.

Their statements come at a time when the central Parliament Board of BJP has convened the meeting to finalise the names of candidates in Delhi

under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. "These four senior leaders of our party have written separate letters to state unit party president CR Paatil, saying they do not want to fight the upcoming elections," Gujarat BJP spokesperson Yamal Vvas said.

"I have decided not to fight elections this time. The BJP gave me chance to be the chief minister of Gujarat for five years. Now they have made me in-charge of Punjab and as a senior leader. I have declared earlier that I will not fight this election. I have not even demanded

Top court adjourns noteban hearing

On October 11, the Supreme Court asked the Centre and RBI to file comprehensive affidavits on the 2016 demonetisation decision and also keep the files ready in_ connection with Centre's letter to the RBI, the decision of the RBI Board, and the demonetisation announcement.

A five-judge constitution bench headed by Justice S.A. Nazeer and comprising Justices B.R. Gavai, Bopanna, Ramasubramanian, and B.V. Nagarathna adjourned the matter after Attorney General R. Venkataramani sought time to file a comprehensive affidavit.

The AG apologised to the bench for not being able to prepare the

Lawyers representing the petitioners argued against the submissions for adjourning of proceedings, saying it has never been an accepted practice before a constitution bench. Senior advocate Shyam Divan, representing one of the petitioners, said this was highly unusual to ask a constitution bench for adjournment.

JeM terror module busted

Besides, there are 1.80 crore voters who are above 80 years of age, he told reporters after the rally.

The CEC said India's first voter Shyam Saran Negi, who recently died, was 106 years old and voted through postal ballot just three days



before his death. "That is the spirit," he added

Kumar said the summary revision takes place every year, but this year they are doing a very focused activity and starting it all over the country from Pune with a specific purpose to increase the participation of citizens from urban areas

'What does it mean? Everywhere in the country and the farthest possible states, be it hills, coastal lines, everywhere, inaccessible terrains, deserts, everywhere every single citizen gets enlisted as a voter and strengthens the democracy by not only getting registered but also casting his/her vote," the CEC said.

Thiruvananthapuram, Nov 9: The Kerala cabinet, Wednesday, decided to bring in an Ordinance to remove Governor Arif Mohammed Khan as the chancellor of universities in the state.

For long, Khan and CM Pinarayi Vijayan have been engaged in a tussle that started with Khan obiecting to the appointment of Vijayan's private secretary KK Ragesh's wife Priya Varghese at the Kannur University.

The Kerala High Court also stayed the appointment till the case gets finally disposed of. Since then, the tiff between the two stalwarts has intensified. The cabihas stemmed from it.

But, with Khan being in no mood to relent, it remains to be seen how he handles the situation. The two Bills sent to him after a hurriedly called special session in September, along with a few others, continue to lie on his table.

According to sources in the know of things, one of the reasons why the Vijayan government decided to bring out an Ordinance is, not long ago, when the tiff started, an angry Khan had mentioned that he is least particular that he should be the chancellor and said if an Ordinance/Bill is brought out, he will happily sign it.

Leader of Opposition VD Satheesan, on hearing about the Ordinance, said under no circumstances will the Congress-led Opposition be a party to it.

'This cannot happen in Kerala because if this becomes law, then all the appointments including that of vice-chancellor, staff will be made from the CPI-M state party headquarters," he added

Incidentally, this is the first time that such a law is being moved after Kerala was formed in 1956, when the Assembly through a Bill appointed the governor as the chancellor of universities in the state.

It didn't take long for Messi and Neymar Jr to be overshadowed by yet another over 45-foot tall Cristiano Ronaldo cutout wearing Portugal jersey. The fans have used his widely shared image of him preparing for a free kick at the 2018 FIFA World Cup.

Incidentally, FIFA tweeted a picture of the cutouts, saying world cup "fever has hit Kerala." Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan thanked the world football body for "acknowledging our unmatched passion for the sport." How Bengal women's kitchen gardens are countering anaemia

THE BENGAL GOVERNMENT'S AGRICULTURE DEPARTMENT HAS BEEN PROMOTING THE CULTIVATION OF VEGETABLES BY PROVIDING SELF-HELP GROUPS WITH SEEDS AND GUIDANCE TO BOOST THE CONSUMPTION OF LEAFY VEGETABLES BY WOMEN, MANY OF WHOM ARE MALNOURISHED AND ANAEMIC

Baharampur (WB), Nov 9: Sanjima Khatun, a 28-year-old homemaker in West Bengal's Murshidabad district, is cultivating traditional vegetables in her kitchen garden to check anaemia besides selling the extra produce in local markets to earn some money.

The West Bengal government's agriculture department has been promoting the cultivation of vegetables by providing self-help groups with seeds and guidance to boost the consumption of leafy vegetables by women, many of whom

are malnourished and anaemic. Leaders of self-help groups distribute the seeds to members like Khatun and they produce vegetables using organic manures as vitamins and other micronutrients needed to check anaemia can be

sourced from seasonal vegetables and fruits grown in kitchen gardens.

Vegetables like okra, red spinach, bitter gourd, sweet gourd, and bottle gourd are grown in my small patch of land. These vegetables are healthier than the ones available in the market as only compost and organic manures are used as fertiliser," said Khatun, a resident of Swaruppur village in Hariharpara

block of Murshidabad district. Okra is rich in Vitamin A and C Bitter gourd is a rich source of Vitamin C. Bottle gourd is a good source of Vitamin B and C. Vitamin Chelps in the absorption of iron in the body. Most of these self-help group members in the Hariharpara block got training from senior members of their SHG clusters and agriculture officials around a year ago.

In addition to growing fresh veg-

etables for their families, they sell

the extra produce in local markets, Assistant Director of Agriculture,

Moumita Mazumdar, told PTI. As per the data available from National Family Health Survey-5 (NFHS-5) conducted in 2020, improving the health of adolescent girls is necessary as nearly 71 per cent of them are anaemic in West Bengal, compared to the national figure of 59.1 per cent. In NFHS-4 conducted five years ago, the figure was 62 per cent.

In Murshidabad district, 73 per cent (NFHS-5) of such women are anaemic, whereas the figure was 53 per cent previously in NFHS-4. "Community nutrition gardens can play an important role in enhancing dietary diversity across age groups. In many parts of India, kitchen gardens have been promoted as one of the approaches to combat hidden hunger. Seasonal



fruits and vegetables are good sources of micronutrients and bring positive nutrition behaviour change in terms of feeding choice and practices," said Jayati Mitra,

Nutrition officer of UNICEF in West Bengal, which gives technical support and other assistance to the government for this project.

Apart from providing free seeds

under the aegis of various schemes of the state and the Centre, the agriculture officials train the villagers on taking care of the vegetable plants and making bio-pesticides and organic manures, said

"Apart from seasonal vegetables, seeds and saplings of other big plants like drumstick and papaya are also provided to them for yearlong supply of vegetables to their kitchens," the assistant director

of agriculture said. Praising this initiative of the state government, Mitra of UNICEF said that anaemia is complex and in addition to iron, other micronutrients like folic acid, Vitamin A, B-12 and C are essential for com-

"Most of the micronutrients can be sourced from seasonal vegetables and fruits of the kitchen gar-

bating anaemia.

dens. Vitamin C helps in the absorption of iron in the body. So, the plantation needs to be planned in such a way that along with green leafy vegetables, some plants of lemon (for Vitamin C), guava (Vitamin C), drumsticks (Iron, Vitamin A), papaya (Vitamin A) are also there," she said.

group leader of Swaruppur, said. Gram panchayats are also spending money to develop kitchen gardens.

Tremors felt across north India

New Delhi/Dehradun/Kathmandu, Nov 9: At least six people were killed when a 6.3-magnitude earthquake struck the lower Himalavan region early Wednesday, leading to tremors rippling across north India and parts of Nepal and jolting people out of their sleep in scores of cities and villages.

The National Centre for Seismology (NCS) said the epicentre of the 6.3-magnitude earthquake, which struck at 1.57 am, was in Nepal, about 90 km east-southeast of Pithoragarh. The region has been experiencing lower magnitude quakes for the last few days.

Mild aftershocks were also felt in the Uttarakhand-Nepal region at 3:15 am and 6:27 am. The NCS said the magnitude of the two tremors was 3.6 and 4.3 respectively.

The National Earthquake Monitoring Centre of Nepal said a 6.6-magnitude quake was recorded at 2.12 am. The epicentre was Doti


Two moderate earthquakes preceded the stronger tremor that jolted western Nepal, a 5.7-magnitude tremor at 9.07 pm Tuesday and a 4.1-magnitude one shortly after at 9.56 pm. The epicentre was the same, it said.

Sanjay Raut gets bail after 101 days in jail

NEET PG to soon be replaced with NExT

New Delhi, Nov 9: The National Eligibility cum Entrance Test-Postgraduate (NEET-PG) scheduled for April-May next year could be the last such examination as the admission to PG medical courses thereafter will be based on the results of the National Exit Test to be taken by final-year MBBS students, officials have said.

At a high-level held Monday, the National Medical Commission (NMC) is learnt to have conveyed to the Union Health Ministry that it intends to conduct the National Exit Test (NExT) in December 2023. official sources said Wednesday.

If held in December 2023, MBBS students of the 2019-2020 batch will have to appear for the exam. The results of the exam will also be used for admission to postgraduate medical courses from the 2024-2025 According to the NMC Act, NExT

will serve as a common qualifying final-year MBBS exam, a licentiate exam to practise modern medicine and for merit-based admission to postgraduate courses and a screening exam for foreign medical graduates who want to practice in India. The government had invoked in September the relevant provisions of the NMC Act to extend the time limit for conducting NExT till September 2024.

According to the law, the commission had to conduct a common final-year undergraduate medical examination, NExT, as specified by regulations within three years of it coming into force.

The Act came into force in September 2020. The sources said the All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi may conduct the test instead of the National Board of Examinations in Medical Sciences (NBEMS), but a decision on the matter is yet to be taken.

The NBEMS has been conducting the NEET-PG and NEET-Superspeciality so far in multiple choice question format. Conducting NExT requires preparations such as working out modalities, syllabus, type and pattern of the exam, officials said, adding students will have to given adequate time to prepare for it. Toxic air linked to cardiovascular disorder risk: Study

New Delhi, Nov 9: Long-term exposure to air pollution is associated with additional risk of cardiovascular disorders in those already having an underlying heart condition, according to a study.

The research, published recently in the Journal of the American College of Cardiology (JACC), evaluated the association between long-

term exposure to small particulate matter 2.5 (PM2.5) and 10 (PM10), and coronary vasomotor disorders in patients with nonobstructive coronary artery disease (NOCAD), which is associated with poor cardiovascular outcomes. Coronary vasomotor disorders

are characterised by impaired abil-

ity to adequately adjust coronary

blood flow to oxygen demand due

to dysfunctional vasomotor func-

tion. The researchers from Catholic University of the Sacred Heart in Rome, Italy and colleagues studied patients with myocardial ischemia and NOCAD undergoing coronary angiography and intracoronary provocation test, an established method for assessment of

coronary artery spasm. Both patients with chronic myocardial ischemia and nonobstructive coronary arteries and myocardial infarction with nonobstructive coronary arteries (MINOCA) were enrolled.

Based on each case's home address, exposure to PM2.5 and PM10 was assessed. The study included 287 patients with a median age of 62 years. 149 of the participants were male and 161 had myocardial ischemia and nonobstructive coronary arteries while 126 had MINOCA.

Higher exposure to PM2.5 and PM10 in patients with myocardial ischemia and NOCAD is associated with coronary vasomotor ab-

normalities, the researchers said. In particular, PM2.5 is an independent risk factor for the occurrence of epicardial spasm and MINOCA as clinical presentation, they said. "Our study shows for the first

time an association between longterm air pollution exposure and the occurrence of coronary vasomotor disorders, suggesting a possible role for pollutants in determining myocardial ischemia in patients with NOCAD," the authors of the study noted.

"In particular, we show that 🔫 PM2.5 and PM10 are independently associated with a positive coronary provocation test in these patients, and that PM2.5 is positively related to the occurrence of epicardial spasm as opposed to microvascular spasm," they added.

He will then be airlifted to France's newest nuclear attack submarine, the Suffren, before meeting with some elite Navy commando members.

NK fires another missile towards SK

Seoul: North Korea fired a shortrange ballistic missile toward its eastern sea Wednesday, extending a recent barrage of weapons demonstrations including what it described as simulated attacks on South Korean and US targets last week. Seoul's Joint Chiefs of Staff said the missile was launched from the western town of Sukchon, north of the capital, Pyongyang, and flew across the country toward waters off the North's eastern coast. The South Korean and Japanese militaries assessed that the missile flew about 250 to 290 kilometers at a maximum altitude of 30 to 50 kilometers.

\$4.5 billion IMF loans for B'desh

Dhaka: The International Monetary Fund reached a preliminary agreement Wednesday with Bangladesh to provide \$4.5 billion to help the country weather disruptions caused by the war in Ukraine and manage risks from climate change. The agreement is subject to approval by the IMF's executive board, which is expected within weeks Bangladesh sought the loans as its foreign currency reserves were dwindling due to a weakening currency and soaring costs for imports.

Russian troops set to withdraw from **Ukraine's Kherson**

London, Nov 9: Russian Defence Minister Sergei Shoigu Wednesday ordered his troops to withdraw from the occupied Ukrainian city of Kherson and take up defensive lines on the opposite bank of the River Dnipro.

The announcement marked one of Russia's most significant retreats and a potential turning point in the war, now nearing the end of its ninth month.

In televised comments, General Sergei Surovikin, in overall command of the war, reported to Shoigu that it was no longer possible to keep Kherson city supplied.

"Having comprehensively assessed the current situation, it is proposed to take up defence along the left (eastern) bank of the Dnipro River," said Surovikin, standing at a lectern and indicating troop positions on a map whose details were greyed-out for the TV audience

"I understand that this is a very difficult decision, but at the same time we will preserve the most important thing - the lives of our servicemen and, in general, the combat effectiveness of the group of troops, which it is futile to keep on the right bank in a limited area.

The news followed weeks of Ukrainian advances towards the city and a race by Russia to relocate more than 100,000 of its residents by ferrying them to the opposite side of the river.

Kherson is the main city of the region of the same name - one of four Ukrainian regions which President Vladimir Putin proclaimed in September he was incorporating into Russia "forever" and which the Kremlin said had now been placed under Moscow's nuclear umbrella.

Shoigu told Surovikin: "I agree with your conclusions and proposals. For us, the life and health of Russian servicemen is always a priority. We must also take into account the threats to the civilian population. Proceed with the withdrawal of troops and take all measures to ensure the safe transfer of personnel, weapons and equipment across the Dnipro River.'

The announcement had been anticipated by Russia's influential war bloggers, who described it as a bitter blow.

"Apparently we will leave the city, no matter how painful it is to write about it now," said the War Gonzo blog, which has more than 1.3 million subscribers on Telegram. "In simple terms. Kherson can't be held with bare hands," it said. "Yes, this is a black page in the history of the Russian army. Of the Russian state. A tragic page.

Amendments in the foreign trade policy and handbook of procedures have been made to allow for international trade settlement in Indian rupees i.e. for invoicing, payment and settlement of exports and imports in Indian rupees

The allowance has been made to allow grant of exports benefits, incentives, and fulfillment of export obligation under the foreign trade policy

"Given the rise in interest in internationalisation of Indian Rupee. the given Policy amendments have been undertaken to facilitate and to bring ease in international trade transactions in Indian Rupees,' the government said. The notification said that

New Delhi, Nov 9: Spending by the Indian government this fiscal year could be less than budgeted for the first time in three years, two sources with direct knowledge of the matter told Reuters, amid a push to meet a fiscal deficit target of 6.4% of gross domestic product.

Total expenditure for the 2022/23 fiscal year that started April 1 could come in ₹700 billion to ₹800 billion (\$8.59 billion to \$9.82 billion) below the budgeted ₹39.45 trillion, the sources said, requesting anonymity.

The government is keen to rein in the fiscal deficit as it is well above the historical levels of between 4% and 5%, having shot up to a record of 9.3% during the first year of the Covid-19 pandemic in 2020/21.

Though tax cuts on fuel, aimed at reducing the impact of soaring global energy prices, could reduce



revenues by more than ₹1 trillion, one of the sources said total revenues were still expected to increase by over ₹1.5 trillion to ₹2 trillion this year.

The rise in revenues would still not be enough to cover anticipated additional expenses with, for example, the government potentially having to provide additional food and fertiliser subsidies of ₹1.5 trillion to ₹1.8 trillion, according to the sources.

Despite those pressures, the government remains intent on achieving its deficit target, according to one of the sources. "The government is not going to budge from the fiscal deficit target," the source said, noting that an "expenditure rationalization" would be required.

The sources did not say which sectors were likely to be affected by

Framework for sovereign green bonds finalised The Finance Ministry has

finalised the framework to issue sovereign green bonds in line with global standards, according to sources. The government intends to mobilise ₹16,000 crore from the issuance of green bonds during the second half of the current financial year. It is a part of the borrowing programme for the second half of this fiscal. The framework is ready and it would be approved soon, the sources said. These rupee-denominated papers will have long tenure to suit the requirement of green infrastructure projects, they added. The government is planning a total borrowing of ₹5.92 lakh crore during the October-March period of the current fiscal. The government had in the Budget for 2022-23 projected a gross market borrowing of ₹14.31 lakh crore. Of this, it decided to borrow ₹14.21 lakh crore during 2022-23, ₹10,000 crore lower than the Budget estimate.

The share of South African thermal coal imports rose to the highest levels in recent months as sponge iron makers switched back amid Russian blend concerns, Coalmint said in a report this week.

tic demand, we continue to expect India's growth to remain below consensus in FY24. In our base case, we

expect India's real GDP growth to slow from 6.9 per cent in FY23 to 5.5 per cent in FY24 before settling at the long-run average of 6 per cent in FY25," the report said. Responding to high domestic in-

flation and rate hikes by global central banks, the RBI has already hiked the policy rate by 1.90 per cent since May this year and is only expected to hike more, which can have an impact on growth with a lag.

The brokerage said it expects a normalisation in consumer spending after the spurt seen in the immediate aftermath of the Covid reopening fades, and households'



purchasing power is impacted by tight monetary policy, the depletion of accumulated pandemic savings and an incomplete labour mar-

This will lead companies to defer investment plans as there is uncertainty on demand, leading to a moderation in the capital expenditure (capex), it noted.

The government will continue to boost public capex, which could help mitigate some of the adverse impact and encourage private capex, albeit with a lag, it said, adding that export will also come under pressure due to the global cues.

The brokerage, however, said India's structural growth story is intact but the country needs to make managing macro stability risks in the near term the key priority now.

"India is seeing elevated inflation, a deteriorating current ac $count\,deficit\,(CAD)\,and\,a\,stretched$ fiscal position. This poses a dilemma for India's policymakers on how to judiciously use monetary and fiscal policy tools to reduce growth downside risks while maintaining financial stability," it said

The RBI will respond by taking the middle path by allowing for gradual depreciation in the rupee while keeping the rate actions in sync with global central banks. The government will go slow on fiscal consolidation by opting to support growth in FY24, given that it will be facing a general election



Mitchell and skipper Kane Williamson (46, 42b, 1x4, 1x6) resurrected New Zealand's innings after early jolts to take their side past the 150-run mark.

India to host eves' WBC next year: BFI

New Delhi, Nov 9: India will host the women's world boxing championships in 2023 in New Delhi, two years after the country was stripped of the hosting rights of the men's event for not paying the requisite fee to the global governing body.

India has never conducted the men's World Championship but it will be the third time that the elite women's competition will be held in the country having conducted the championships in 2006 and 2018 in New Delhi. India also hosted the women's youth world championships in 2017.

Memorandum of The Understanding (MoU) was signed between the International Boxing Association (IBA) and the Boxing Federation of India (BFI) in the presence of IBA President Umar Kremlev and BFI President Ajay Singh here on Wednesday.

"The women's world championship will be held in Delhi in March 2023," Singh told reporters. "Women's boxing has shown massive improvement, we are among the top countries in the world. Last edition we were No.3 and we aim to improve that. We are expecting participation from about 75-100 countries. about 1.500 boxers and coaches."

The championship will also see the introduction of a historic bout review system. "The world championship in India will be the first event in which the review system based on technology will be used. That is any dispute can be reviewed

during the bout itself," Singh said. The event will also increase in prize money with a total prize pool of approximately ₹19.50 crore (USD 2.4 million). The gold medallists will be awarded with approximately ₹81 lakh (USD 100,000).

The hosting rights of the event to India comes as a significant development as BFI had lost the hosting rights of the 2021 event to Serbia after failing to pay the host fee, prompting the International Boxing Association, then known as (AIBA), to terminate its agreement.

The IBA has developed a new review system based on artificial intelligence which will be used for the first time during the women's world championship next year.

'It will be based on artificial intelligence, we will have four cameras. doing analysis from every corner of the punches. It will be monitored by an evaluator and if something is unclear they can come while the bout is going," IBA Secretary General George A Yerolimpos told PTI. "We will have a lot of officials monitoring it, so no one can bypass the system," he added.

The IBA Secretary General said one of the reasons India was picked as the host was because it is a digital country

Mercedes for Nikhat!

In a light moment, Nikhat Zareen said if she defends her world championship title next year she will buy a Mercedes with the prize money and invite and IBA President Kremlev to her home city of Hyderabad.

"With the cash prize I wanted to buy a new house in Hyderabad and hopefully I will win next year and then with that money I will buy a Mercedes and will invite IBA President to Hyderabad and we will go for a ride," Nikhat said.

The Russian sports functionary was quick to reply: "If Nikhat wins the world championship I will gift Nikhat a Mercedes," Kremlev said.

Musetti gets off to a strong start

New Delhi, Nov 9: Olympics bronze medallist Lovlina Borgohain and Elorda Cup champion Alfiya Pathan produced power-packed performances to enter their respective finals at the ASBC Asian Elite Boxing Championships in Amman, Jordan Wednesday.

Up against Seong Suyeon of South Korea in her semifinal bout, Lovlina (75kg) effectively utilised her clever techniques and strategies to clinch a 5-0 victory by unanimous decision. Lovlina, who has two Asian Championships bronze medals, is now guaranteed a silver in this edition, confirming her best-ever performance in the competition.

Alfiya (81+kg) was also commanding in her semifinal win as she cruised past the 2016 world champion Lazzat Kungeibayeva of

Kazakhstan in a 5-0 win. This is the second time this year that Alfiya has defeated Lazzat, having stunned the Kazakh on her own turf in the Elorda Cup, in what was her senior international debut competition. Lovlina will take on the 2021 Asian Championships silver medalist Ruzmetova Sokhiba. while Alfiya faces Islam Husaili of Jordan in the final.

In the other semifinal, Ankushita Boro (66kg) lost 1-4 to Khamidova Navbakhor of Uzbekistan to secure a bronze medal. The 2017 Youth Boxing Champion started well with her energetic approach and landed quick punches to have an edge over Khamidova but the Uzbek boxer rebounded well in the next two rounds to earn the win as well as her place in the final.

Later, Minakshi (52kg), Preeti (57kg), Parveen (63kg), and Saweety (81kg) will compete in their respective semifinal bouts. India's

total medal count of 12 in this edition is the third highest among all competing nations.

Thursday, five Indian men boxers including six-time Asian medallist Shiva Thapa (63.5kg) and twotime Commonwealth bronze medallist Mohammad Hussamuddin (57kg) will be competing in the semifinals.

Thapa, who became the most successful Asian champion in the competition's history with six medals, will be involved in a matchup against two-time Asian medallist Bakhodur Usmonov of Tajikistan, while Hussamuddin will face 2021 World Championship silver medallist Serik Temirzhanov of Kazakhstan.

Other men pugilists in action will be Narender (92+kg), Sumit (75kg) and Govind Kumar Sahani (48kg). The competition is witnessing participation of 267 boxers from 27 top boxing nations.
