Use of Bachchan's voice, image banned

NEW DELHI: The Delhi High Court passed Friday an interim order restraining unauthorised use of actor Amitabh Bachchan's voice, image or any other trait exclusively identifiable with him by any individual. The court's order came on a lawsuit by the veteran actor alleging exploitation of his 'publicity rights as a celebrity' by several individuals, including the persons behind a 'KBC lottery'. Justice Navin Chawla said it is undisputed that Bachchan is a well-known personality and is likely to suffer an irreparable loss and disrepute if relief is not granted at this stage.

Odisha gets ₹524cr as GST compensation

Bhubaneswar: The Centre has released ₹17,000 crore to states/UTs towards the balance GST compensation for the period April to June this year. For the same period an amount of ₹524 crore has been released for Odisha. With this the total amount of compensation released to the states/UTs during the 2022-23 financial year has reached ₹1,15,662 crore, the Finance Ministry said in a release. It added that the Centre has released the GST compensation to states/UTs despite the fact that total cess collection till October this year is only ₹72,147 crore. The balance amount of ₹43,515 crore


Cuttack: A 50-year-old man, who was among those who sustained burn injuries in the firecracker explosion November 23 at Balia Bazar in Kendrapara during the immersion ceremony of Lord Kartikeswar, died Friday while undergoing treatment at SCB Medical College and Hospital (SCBMCH) here. The deceased was identified as Udaya Bhoi. "Bhoi was among the 11 critically injured patients under treatment at the ICU," said a SCB doctor. More than 80 people suffered injuries when a heap of firecrackers exploded after a spark fell on it. Among those hurt, a number of critical victims were shifted to the SCBMH for treatment.



Centre defends demonetisation act

New Delhi, Nov 25: Resisting the Supreme Court's attempt to revisit the 2016 demonetisation exercise, the government said Friday the court cannot decide a matter when no tangible relief can be granted by way of 'putting the clock back' and 'unscrambling a scrambled egg'.

The remarks by Attorney General R Venkataramani came after the apex court asked the Centre to explain whether it consulted the Central Board of Reserve Bank of India (RBI) before undertaking demonetisation of ₹500 and ₹1,000 denomination notes in 2016. A fivejudge Constitution bench headed by Justice SA Nazeer is hearing a batch of 58 petitions challenging the demonetisation exercise.

"The only submission you have made is that these are all economic issues done by experts (so) don't touch it. What is your opposition to the plea of the other side? Tell us what is your submission to counter their submissions? They said it is

not in conformity with section 26 (2) of the RBI Act," the bench, also comprising Justices BR Gavai, AS Bopanna, V Ramasubramanian and BV Nagarathna, said. "You are arguing that the objectives set out have been achieved. But, we want you to address the allegation that the process followed was flawed," the bench added.

The court's observation came after Venkataramani defended the demonetisation policy and said the court should refrain from exercising judicial review of the executive decision.

"It is well settled that if the relevance of scrutiny disappears, the court will not render opinion on questions of academic value. Demonetisation was not an isolated economic policy. We are not looking at some black money here and there, we are trying to look at the big picture. Also, no well-meaning person will say that just because you have failed, your intention was also flawed. This does not make logical sense," Venkataramani said.

BJD, Opposition spar over farmers' issues

Despite an all-party meeting, the stalemate between the warring factions continued and the House had to be adjourned

Bhubaneswar, Nov 25: The second day of the Winter Session of the Odisha Legislative Assembly witnessed a pandemonium Friday as opposition BJP and the Congress and the ruling BJD created ruckus in the House over farmers' issues.

As soon as the House assembled for the day at 10.30am, the Opposition and ruling party members rushed to the Well raising slogans against each other over various demands of the farmers.

BJP members were demanding distribution of input subsidy to farmers and protesting against irregularities in paddy procurement. The BJD members too rushed to the Well of the House demanding enhancement of paddy MSP to ₹2,930 per quintal as suggested by the Assembly Meanwhile the Congress members blamed both the BJP and BJD governments for not fulfilling the demands of the farmers.

As noisy scenes prevailed in the Assembly, Speaker Bikram Keshari Arukha first adjourned the proceedings till 11.30am and then till 4.00pm.

When the pandemonium continued even after 4.00pm, the Speaker adjourned the House till



4.30pm and called for an all-party meeting. However, as it failed to break the stalemate, the proceed-

ings were adjourned till Saturday. During adjournment of the sessions, BJD MLAs staged a demonstration near the statue of Mahatma Gandhi on the Assembly premises demanding that the Centre hike the MSP on paddy. The Treasury Bench members including ministers later marched to Raj Bhavan and submitted a memorandum to the Governor demanding ₹2,930 per quintal MSP on paddy.

tag as a meeting in this regard will be held here December 6. An application had earlier been filed by the Odisha University of Agriculture & Technology (OUAT) to the Geographical Indications Registry seeking the GI tag under 'food' category. After the application was filed,

the GI registry formed a consultative group of experts to ascertain the correctness of particulars furnished in the application. This same group will meet here December 6, to ascertain whether 'Kai' chutney deserves the GI tag. "The Consultative Group will as-

certain the correctness of particulars furnished in the GI Application and Statement of Case referred to in Rule 32(1) of Geographical Indications of Goods (Registration and Protection) Rules 2002 and make necessary recommendations," the GI registry said in a letter to the chairman of Technology Management Cell, OUAT. OUAT has been asked to pre-

pare a power point presentation to support the claim. Five experts of the Red Ant variety from Mayurbhanj will be present at the meeting.

It may sound strange but the Kai chutney is one of the delicacies in Mayurbhanj district. The Red Weaver Ants are indigenous to Mayurbhani and are found in forests, including Similipal. Tribals catch them to prepare not only chutneys, but also soup with spicy ingredients.

The Kai chutney is the main 🗦 source of protection of health for the tribal people and is also considered the best safety measure to keep diseases at bay. The tribes in the Mayurbhanj district commonly use the species as a delicious foodand traditional medicine to treat dif-

THE DRAFTING OF THE CONSTITUTION STARTED MUCH BEFORE INDIA GAINED ITS INDEPENDENCE FROM THE BRITISH

New Delhi, Nov 25: India celebrates its Independence Day, its Republic Day and many more such days with gaiety and fanfare. However, very few people are aware of the 'Constitution Day' which is November 26. Only a select few are realise the importance of 'Constitution Day' or National Law Day as it marks the day the Indian Constitution was adopted by the Constituent Assembly in 1949.

It was in 2015 when the Government of India decided to establish November 26 as 'Constitution Day' to advance 'constitutional values among residents'. The day was declared in the year which marked the 125th birth anniversary of Dr Bhimrao Ambedkar, the chairman of the Drafting Committee of the Constitution.

'Constitution Day' is also known as 'Samvidhan Divas'. After India became independent, the Constituent Assembly entrusted the job of drafting the Constitution to a committee chaired by Dr BR Ambedkar. Dr Raiendra Prasad, the first President of India, was the president of the Constituent Assembly, which was established in 1946.

It should be stated here that the original Constitution of India was handwritten by Prem Behari Narain Raizada. He spent six months writing 395 articles, eight schedules, as well as a preamble in both English and Hindi at his desk at the Constitution Hall (now the Constitution Club). For Hindi calligraphy, he utilised dip-pen nibs from Birmingham, and he used a

The Constituent Assembly took almost three years to complete the sovereign, socialist, secular and democratic republic and aims to secure justice, liberty, and equality for all citizens and promote fraternity to maintain the unity and integrity of the nation.

New Delhi, Nov 25: The Registrar General of Orissa High Court has informed the Supreme Court that virtual courts are established in 24 districts in the state and that 1,413 witnesses from remote locations have been examined so far using virtual courtroom facility.

Six districts - Dhenkanal. Balasore, Jajpur, Keonjhar, Mayurbhanj and Rayagada - do not have virtual courts. In the affidavit filed through advocate Sibo Sankar Mishra, the HC submitted that a purchase order has been placed November 22 to buy 1216 computers and several other equipment to provide hardware to 44 court complexes.

With this, 152 courts in the state will be covered under the e-courts project. It was also stated that all the district courts have one e-filing station while Sundargarh district has two such stations. It was further stated that 11,290 cases have been filed through e-filing portal in district courts.

Virtual courts in 24 dists, SC told 5 virgin mines to go under hammer

Bhubaneswar, Nov 25: The state government has issued a notice inviting tender (NIT) for e-auction of five virgin mineral blocks including three bauxite mines.

The director of Mines and Geology has recently issued the NIT for e-auction of three bauxite and two limestone blocks in accordance with the Mineral (Auction) Rules, 2015.

The mines which are going to be auctioned are: Ballada bauxite block in Koraput district, Sijimali bauxite block in the border area of Kalahandi and Rayagada districts, Kutrumali bauxite block in Kalahandi and Rayagada districts, Garramura limestone block in Nuapada and Uskalvaga limestone block in Malkangiri district.



Interested bidders can purchase tender documents after payment of tender fee on the website of e-auction platform till January 9. 2023 while January 16, 2023 (till 5pm) is the deadline for submission of the bid

Tender fee for each of the three bauxite blocks is ₹5 lakh and ₹2 lakh each for two limestone blocks.

Jajpur, Nov 25: Large-scale irregularities have marred the social security scheme in Jajpur district as allegations are flying thick and fast that officials are committing irregularities in distribution of pension to elderly and differentlyabled beneficiaries.

Taking serious note of such allegations, the Social Security and Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (SSEPD) department has asked the district Collector to submit a report on the distribution of pension to beneficiaries within seven days.

As per guidelines of the social security scheme, people above 60 years and of BPL category, people with disability and widows are entitled to get monthly pension.

However, scores of people below 60 years have been enrolled as beneficiaries in Jajpur. Besides, people who have died long ago are being paid pension. This has PEOPLE ABOVE 60 YEARS AND OF BPL CATEGORY, PEOPLE WITH DISABILITY AND WIDOWS ARE **ENTITLED TO GET MONTHLY** PENSION

In the last four to five years, many pension beneficiaries have died in the district, but officials are misappropriating their money with forged fingerprints at the instruction of some influential po-

Here are instances of the irregularities. In Kolangiri panchayat under Barchana block, beneficiaries like Dhruba Mohapatra and Debaki Dalai died more than a year ago. But an official concerned of the panchayat is allegedly misappropriating their pensions.

There are several such cases of irregularities in the block. For many years, pension money of dead beneficiaries is being embezzled while the administration has not taken any step to strike off the names of the dead beneficiaries from the official list.

Many people who have tampered with their age are receiving pension. Various quarters and social activists have long been demanding stern action against officials indulging in such illegal activities to loot the government fund.

Funds for Kutia Kondhs embezzled; locals angry



Phulbani, Nov 25: Funds worth lakhs of rupees meant for development and uplift of primitive Kutia Kondh tribals are allegedly being misappropriated in Kandhamal district. Kutia Kondh Development

Agency (KKDA) is based at Belghar to carry out various developmental activities to improve the livelihood prospects for these tribals.

Projects, for which lakhs of rupees have been spent for the benefit of tribals, are allegedly marred by irregularities scuttling their

Hence, the living condition of most of the tribals has not improved till date, it was alleged. They are deprived of the benefits due to rampant corruption. It was alleged that some NGOs, engineers and KKDA officials are embezzling funds.

Here is a case of irregularity in point. An information plaque has been set up near Tidipadar village in Gumma panchayat about an irrigation project. The area falls under KKDA. It was stated that ₹5 lakh has been spent for building a check dam in 2021-22. In reality, no new check dam has been built at the place. Rather, there is an old check dam across a stream. Villagers of Tidipadar. Guchaka, Deogaon and Belghar alleged that the old check dam has been whitewashed and the fund has been embezzled

Radhakant Majhi and Kamdev Majhi alleged that this is how KKDA officers, engineers and contractors loot the government funds while tribals are left to suffer without getting benefits.

"The government really wants our development, but officials loot the funds," lamented Dipabani Majhi. Funds sanctioned for various projects are embezzled in this way, they alleged.

"We still depend on selling minor forest produce and khali leaves. We have no other alternative livelihood," they said

Asked about it, Benudhar Nayak, special officer of the KKDA said that the agency is working for development of better livelihood for Kutia Kondhs. Building houses for them is not their work, he added.

"An NGO was earlier engaged in some work, but after public allegations against it, it was driven out. The engineer can only say about the work of the check dam," the KKDA special officer said.

The life of a truck driver is not easy as hard times and struggles are permanent components of the job. However, they have learnt to become

self-reliant and earn their livelihoods due to their profession.

Septuagenarian Bhramarbar Navak is the first driver from the village. The village boasts of having more than 160 truck drivers and all because of Bhramarbar's efforts. Bhramarabar learnt driving from Brusingha Pattnaik, a native of Bali in Cuttack district in 1970. Later, he trained many youths in the village to become drivers and earn their livelihood. It is due to the efforts of Bhramarbar that every family in Biradia village has produced at least two to three drivers. From meagre daily earnings, most of them now get ₹300 or more per day by driving trucks. Bhramarbar however, now has

quit the profession due to old age. Road accidents often occur due to consumption of intoxicants by

the driver. However, the drivers of Biradia village are an example for others to emulate. They stay away from liquor due to their inclination towards spirituality. They meticulously follow rules while driving safely. As a result, the families also lead peaceful lives, said Bhimasen Sahu, another driver who resides in the village

Even though truck driving is an arduous profession, Bijay Samal, 52, said that by taking up the profession he has been able to provide proper education to his children. His only son is working as an assistant engineer in a Dubai based aluminum firm. Samal said that responsibility towards his family prompts him to drive safely. He knows that his kin are waiting at home and so he drives following rules meticulously.

A Quiet Exit From PMO

he premature repatriation of P Amudha from the Prime Minister's Office (PMO) to her parent Tamil Nadu cadre last month went relatively unnoticed despite her high profile as the additional secretary. What's intriguing about the episode is that Amudha, considered one of the brightest IAS officers from the South, was selected for a promising position in the PMO in July 2020 and seemed poised to become a high-flier. However, barely 14 months later she seems to be out of favour.

Sources have informed DKB that a few months after her repatriation, talk began circulating that her husband, 1991-batch IAS officer Shambhu Kallolikar, was seeking to quit the civil service and join a political party. That has now been confirmed, with Kallolikar reportedly applying for voluntary retirement from service. The buzz is that Kallolikar is likely to join the Congress party and contest the state Assembly elections in Karnataka, his home state. Clearly, the buzz has been around for a long time and a section of babus felt that Kallolikar's political aspirations of joining "the enemy" or another non-BJP party while his wife was serving in the PMO would be awkward and embarrassing for the government.

So, is the wife paying for her husband's political ambitions? For a bright and upright officer who served two Chief Ministers of Tamil Nadu and was poised for higher things in Delhi, hopefully, the sacrifice will be worth it.

Top-heavy police administration

A persistent gripe of the Modi sarkar is that the current shortage of IPS officers at the Centre is due to the states not sending enough officers on Central deputation. Apparently, even BJP-ruled states have failed to meet the Central deputation quota. While many states are becoming top-heavy, Uttar Pradesh has the highest number of additional director-general (ADG) and directorgeneral (DG) rank officers than others. At present, the Yogi Adityanath government has a staggering 78 DGs and ADGs against a sanctioned strength

of 28! No surprise, therefore, to find many top-ranked police officers are holding posts that have very little to do with policing - such as DG (special inquiry), DG (power), ADG (telecom)

Official data shows that UP has seven sanctioned posts for DGs but

is actually functioning with 15 DGs. Likewise, it has a sanctioned strength of 21 ADGs but actually has 63 ADGs serving in the state. On the other hand, it does not have enough officers in IG and DIG ranks. Against 51 sanctioned posts of IG, the state has only 31 officers, and against 50 DIG positions, it is making do with a mere 39 officers.

Sources in the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA), which is the cadre controlling authority of IPS officers, say the Centre has only two vacancies each for DG and ADG-rank officers across Central police organisations, agencies and forces. But it has 90 and 30 open posts for DIG and IG positions, according

Poor cadre management seems to be the obvious culprit. Clearly, there is an urgent need to restructure the cadres and rename some positions. Else, the curious situation of top-heavy police administration in the states even as the Centre is unable to fill mid-level vacancies will continue. Mandatory Central deputation for SP and DIG-rank officers is being suggested by some babus, but it may not fly well with some states, especially those run by non-BJP parties.

Prasar Bharati gets new CEO

Ending a long period of uncertainty, the government has finally named 1995-batch IAS officer Gaurav Dwivedi as the new Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of state-owned public broadcaster Prasar Bharati. The post had been vacant since June after the end of Shashi Shekhar Vempati's tenure, and Mayank Kumar Agarwal was holding additional charge of CEO.

Dwivedi, who is from the Chhattisgarh cadre, will reportedly hold the CEO post on a lien basis, instead of resigning from the IAS. His appointment for a term of five years finally quells rumours about Vempati's successor or whether the Centre will name Agrawal as the full-time CEO. Apparently, five names were in consideration for the post by the selection committee.

Usually, the Centre keeps its cards close and, sources say, that it had come close to announcing a name earlier but then withheld its decision based on a complaint filed by a senior babu against the government's preferred choice. The babu was immediately taken off the list and also removed from

an important assignment. Dwivedi, it is assumed, has a clean slate. He is a recipient of the Prime

Minister's Award for Excellence in Administration and has been a faculty member at the IAS Training Academy in Mussoorie.

■ Curry favour

hy should curry have anything to do with winning the favour of somebody or ingratiating oneself with him? Its origin lies in a French medieval allegorical poem called the Roman de Fauvel, written by Gervais de Bus and Chaillou de Pesstain in the early 1300s. Fauvel was a horse, a conniving stallion. and the poem is a satire on the corruption of social life. He decided he didn't like his stable and moved into his master's house, becoming the master and being visited by church leaders and politicians who sought his favour. There are several layers of meaning in his name: fauve is French for a colour variously translated as chestnut, reddish-yellow, tawny or fawn. A close English equivalent is the rather rare fallow, as in fallow deer, an animal with a brownish coat (it may be that uncultivated ground is also said to be fallow because it looks that colour). Fauve is also a collective name, originally les bêtes fauves, for a class of wild animals whose coats are tawny, such as lions and tigers, and hence ferocious wild animals (the fauverie in a French zoo houses the big cats). In the poem, the name Fauvel can moreover be glossed as fau-vel, a veiled lie, but it is actually a partial acronym of the initial letters of the French words for six sins: flatterie, avarice, vilenie, variété, envie, and lâcheté (flattery, avarice, depravity, fickleness, envy and cowardice). His colour also evokes the old medieval proverbial belief that a fallow horse was a symbol of dishonesty. The poem was well known among educated people in Britain, who began to refer to Fauvel, variously spelled, as a symbol of cunning and depravity. That soon became curry Favel. This curry has nothing to do with Indian food (a word that came into English only at the end of the sixteenth century via Portuguese from Tamil kari, a sauce or relish) but is another ancient word from a French source, still common in English, which means to rub down or comb a horse. The idea behind currying Favel is that the horse was highly susceptible to flattery, figuratively a kind of stroking. For people who didn't know the poem - then, as now, that was almost everybody — Fauvel or Favel meant nothing. Favour seemed much more sensible a word and by the early part of the sixteenth century popular etymology had changed it and so it has remained ever since.

THE CONSTITUTION AT 73

t was Justice John Marshall who had observed in 1821: "A Constitution is framed for ages to come and is designed to approach immortality as nearly as human institutions can approach it. Its course cannot always be tranquil." Indian Constitution is 73-year-old and its course has been far from tranquil. It would be useful to recall what K. Santhanam, leading Constitutional luminary, had observed during the debates in the Constituent Assembly: "The Constitution must usher in a social revolution which will get India out of medievalism, based on birth, religion, and community and reconstruct a modern foundation based on rule of law, merit, and secular ideas." Granville Austin, the renowned constitutional expert in his seminal book 'Working a Democratic Constitution' considers the Indian Constitution a seamless web, with three strands that are mutually dependent and intertwined. Those three strands are protecting national unity and integrity, establishing institutions and spirit of democracy and fostering socioeconomic reforms. It would be interesting to examine in retrospect, how seamless has been the web and to what extent socio-economic justice has been promoted.

A careful reading of the Constitution brings out three messages - clarity, opacity, and deferrals. There was complete unanimity amongst the founding fathers that the fundamental rights would be the conscience of the Constitution. Influenced by the Bill of Rights of the USA (1791), there was no prevarication on concepts like rule of law, the right to freedom, the right to life, the abolition of untouchability, and federalism. Though not specifically incorporated in the Preamble (1949), India did not opt for a theocratic state like Pakistan: but a secular one. Secularism was subsequently incorporated as part of the Preamble in 1976 (42nd

However, there was opacity in areas like the separation of powers

between the executive, legislative, and judiciary. Unlike in the US. the Indian Constitution did not mandate that the President will be the head of the executive; Parliament would be supreme in legislation and the judiciary would be the ultimate interpreter of the Constitution. This has led to a slew of spats between the Supreme Court (SC) and the Parliament over its powers to amend. The Kesavananda Bharati case (1973) allowed Parliament to amend even the fundamental rights with a caveat that it cannot delete or deface basic features like democracy, federalism, secularism, and independence of the judiciary. The Minerva Mills Case (1980) clearly asserted that the Constitution and not the Parliament is supreme and the desire to have Parliamentary supremacy along the lines of the British Parliament is illusory. It has also settled once and for all, that the SC's power of judicial review is beyond question.

The other area where the Constitution has provided a window of opacity is the exact relationship between the fundamental rights of citizens and socio-economic justice, incorporated as Directive Principles. In the Champakam Dorairajan case (1951), the court ruled supremacy of fundamental rights over goals.

However, in the Minerva Mills case (1980), the court ruled that Part IV is not a "veritable dustbin of sentiments." In the words of Justice YV Chandrachud: "The rights and goals of a nation are like two wheels of a chariot.

The major issues which were deferred by our Constitutional framers were Hindi as the national language and the introduction of a uniform civil code. KM Munshi called for the restriction of religion to the private sphere and the promotion of unity and societal integration on the basis of civil national identity.

There is a perception that the Indian Constitution has been amended too often (103) as against the US Constitution operative since 1789 with only 27 amendments. However, a careful reading will reveal that there have been only ten substantive amendments. The 24th amendment (1971) authorised Parliament to amend any part of the Constitution. The 25th amendment (1971) gave primacy to distributive justice over fundamental rights. The 42nd amendment (1976) included secularism, socialism to the Preamble, and fundamental duties for the citizens. The anti-defection provision was included in 1985. In 1992, the 73rd amendment introduced panchavats and municipalities as the third tier of

democracy. The right to free public education was introduced in 2002 as a new Article 21A. Fiscal federalism was brought in through the formation of the GST Council, allowing both states and Centre to impose GST. The latest amendment in 2019 is to give 10% reservation to economically weaker sections.

The Constitution has incorporated a few provisions for ushering in inclusive development Raising the level of nutrition (Article 47), providing early childhood care and education to children below the age of six years (Article 45) are goals before the State.

After economic liberalization in 1991, we have an ironical situation where the Constitution swears by socialism and distributive justice, but the economic system is propelled by market economics and wealth creation. The handsome growth in GDP, exports and savings is not matched by a perceptible reduction in infant mortality, maternal mortality, malnutrition and improvement in human development capability.

The South African Constitution (1996) has become a template of inclusive growth and development by recognising the right to housing, and a healthy environment as fundamental rights. It's high time all parties sit together and incorporate these provisions into our Constitution. A vigilant citizenry, a responsible Press, an impartial judiciary and strong political will to improve human development capability, as Prof Amartya Sen fervently argues, are the four strands needed to bolster the majesty of our Constitution. The ever-expanding reservation in jobs also sits uncomfortably on the altar of merit and competition. The present tendency for cultural homogenisation would need to be supplanted by a multicultural India, uniformity by plural ity, and hatred for minorities by brotherhood as the Constitution ordains and the courts confirm.

Reimagining our global connections

∠East and Africa are grappling with grain shortages. And virtually everyone has been struggling to get their hands on semiconductors. As disruptions to flows of vital products become increasingly common, economies and companies have important choices to make. The most fundamental seems to be whether to retreat from global integration or reimagine it. For many the temptation to retreat

may be strong. From Russia's war on Ukraine to the Sino-American rivalry, the world order is increasingly contested, and when value chains are global, a single disruption can reverberate across the planet. But, as we show in a new research paper, withdrawing from these value chains would not be nearly as easy as one might assume.

For decades, the world pursued rapid and comprehensive economic integration – and for good reason. By enabling greater specialisation and economies of scale, global value chains have enhanced efficiency, lowered prices, and increased the range and quality of goods and services available. By supporting economic growth, this boosted incomes and employment – albeit not for all - helping to lift people out of poverty. With integration came interdependence. As we show in our paper, no region today is even close to being self-sufficient. Every major

urope is facing disruptions to world region imports more than 25% of at least one important resource or manufactured good.

In many cases, the figures are

much higher. Latin America. Sub-Saharan Africa, Eastern Europe, and Central Asia import more than 50% of the electronics they need. The EU imports more than 50% of its energy resources. The Asia-Pacific region imports over 25% of its energy resources. Even North America, which has fewer areas of very high dependency, relies on imports of resources and manufactured goods. This undoubtedly generates risks, especially when it comes to goods for which production is highly concentrated. For example, most of the world's lithium and graphite - both of which are used in electric vehicle batteries is extracted largely from three or fewer countries. Natural graphite is highly concentrated not because of reserves, but because more than 80% is refined in China.

Likewise, the Democratic Republic of the Congo extracts 69% of the world's cobalt, Indonesia accounts for 32% of the world's nickel, and Chile produces 28% of the world's copper. A disruption of supplies from any of these sources would have far-reaching consequences.

The question is whether countries - and businesses – can mitigate these risks without giving up the myriad advantages of global trade. Some are already embracing diversification. Many consumer electronics companies have expanded their manufacturing footprint in India and Vietnam to reduce reliance on China and tap into emerging markets. Similarly, the United States, the EU. South Korea, China. and Japan have all announced measures to increase domestic production of semiconductors. Though semiconductors account for less than 10% of total trade, products that directly or indirectly depend on them account for an estimated 65% of all goods exports.

But diversification can take time, and often requires significant upfront investment. Minerals – among the most concentrated products in the global system – are a case in point. As the International Energy Agency has pointed out, developing new deposits of critical minerals has historically taken over 16 years on average. This is not just a matter of developing new mines; countries must also build their processing capabilities and secure workers with the relevant skills. And all of this must be done in a way that mitigates the considerable environmental impact of mining and processing.

Innovation may enable actors to circumvent these hurdles. Already, efforts are being made to develop technologies that are less reliant on natural graphite, and EV manufacturers are experimenting with approaches that use less cobalt, or none at all. Faced with rising pal-

ladium prices, the chemicals multinational BASF has developed a new catalyst technology that allows for partial substitution with platinum.

Yet another way to boost resilience may be to change our approach to sourcing. Companies can work with one another and with governments, through public-private partnerships, to leverage their pooled purchasing power; strengthen their supplies of vital goods, and help build more sustainable economies.

Models of such cooperation are already emerging. The Canada Growth Fund aims to use public funds to attract private capital to accelerate the deployment of technologies needed to decarbonise the economy, including by increasing the domestic production of critical materials such as zinc, cobalt, and rareearth elements. And the First Movers Coalition has pledged to use its collective purchasing power to create markets for innovative clean technologies across eight difficult-toabate sectors. Such strategies show that we can mitigate risks and build economic resilience without abandoning the interconnectedness that has enabled more than a billion people to escape poverty in recent decades. Rather than attempt to retreat from the global economy, we must reimagine it.

New Delhi, Nov 25: The CBI Friday filed its first charge sheet in the Delhi excise policy scam case against seven accused while Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia, who was named in the agency's FIR, does not figure in the document.

Officials said investigators have kept the probe open into the alleged role of Sisodia, a senior AAP leader, and others named in the First Information Report(FIR). Arrested businessmen Vijay Nair and Abhishek Boinpally were among the seven accused named in the charge sheet.

"Further investigation is continuing to investigate the role of accused named in the FIR and other persons on various allegations including conspiracies with other licensees, money trails, cartelization and larger conspiracies in the formulation and implementation of the Excise Policy," the CBI spokesperson said in a statement.

The charge sheet was filed before a special Central Bureau of Investigation(CBI) judge M K Nagpal who will take up the matconsideration November 30.

Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal said attempts were made to frame Sisodia in the "fake" ex-



Aam Aadmi Party(AAP) hailed the development as 'Satyamev Jayate' (Truth alone triumphs).

Sisodia demanded that Lieutenant Governor V K Saxena and Chief Secretary Naresh Kumar be sacked, alleging that he has been a victim of their "witch hunt".

The AAP also asked the BJP to tender an apology to Delhiites and the countrymen for "blatantly lying about the issue" and called Saxena and Kumar the "masterminds" behind the "conspiracy" against Delhi government.

"Manish's name is not in the CBI charge sheet. The whole case is fake. Nothing was found in the raids. A total of 800 officers found nothing in the probe for four months.

"Manish offered hope of a good future to crores of poor children in the country through a revolution in education. I am sorry that a conspiracy was hatched to defame such a person by implicating him in a false case," Kejriwal said in a tweet in Hindi. Besides Nair and Boinpally, those named in the charge sheet are the Managing Director of India Ahead News channel Mootha Gautam. Hyderabad-based liquor businessman and a partner of Boinpally in Robin Distilleries LLP Arun R Pillai, owner of Indospirit Sameer Mahendru and two former officials of the excise department --Deputy Commissioner Kuldeep Singh and Assistant Commissioner Narender Singh, officials said.

Nair and Boinpally were arrested by the CBI but recently granted bail by a special court. They are still in custody in connection with a Enforcement Directorate(ED) case against them, they said.

The seven accused have been named in the charge sheet under IPC section 120-B (criminal conspiracy) and provisions of bribery under the Prevention of Corruption Act, the officials added.

The central probe agency has got an alleged "close associate" of Sisodia -- Dinesh Arora -- to turn approver in the case, they said. Arora recorded his statement

under section 164 of CrPC before the magistrate and was granted a pardon by a special court for helping in the investigation. The CBI, after registering a case

against 15 people in August, had carried out searches at various places.

It is alleged the Delhi government's policy to grant licenses to liquor traders was influenced in favour of certain dealers who had allegedly paid bribes for it, a charge strongly refuted by the AAP.


Women look good even without clothes: Ramdev

No institution in democracy is perfect: CJI

Getting good people to become judges is first and foremost about inculcating upon minds of young

New Delhi. Nov 25: No institution in a constitutional democracy, including the collegium, is perfect and the solution is to work out within the existing system, Chief Justice of India D Y Chandrachud said Friday.

Speaking at the Constitution Day celebrations organised by the Supreme Court Bar Association (SCBA) here, he said judges are faithful soldiers who implement the Constitution.

Since 2015, November 26 is observed as Constitution Day to commemorate the adoption of the Constitution by the Constituent Assembly in 1949. Earlier, the day was observed as Law Day.

On the issue of collegium, the CJI said: "Finally, criticism about the collegium. I thought I will reserve the best for the last. No institution in a constitutional democracy is perfect. But we work within the existing framework of the Constitution as it is interpreted and given to us. All the judges of the collegium including me, we are faithful soldiers who implement the Constitution. When we talk of imperfections, our solution is to work

our way within the existing system." He said getting good people in the judiciary and paying them high salaries would not reform the collegium system

"The president (of SCBA) raised a query about good people. Getting good people to enter the judiciary, getting good lawyers to enter the judiciary is not just the function about reforming the collegium. Getting to be judges is not a function of how much salary you give judges. However high you pay judges, it'll be a fraction of what a successful lawyer makes at the end of one day," the CJI said adding that people become judges for a sense of commitment to public services.

He also said becoming a judge is a call of conscience.

Stressing on the need to make judicial offices appealable to young lawyers, he said we have to ensure that young lawyers are mentored by judges.

The CJI said the Constitution was constantly evolving to meet the new social realities of the time.

He said that the judiciary and the bar were equal stakeholders in the mission of providing justice to common citizens

J&K final electoral roll published with increase of 7.72 lakh voters

Jammu, Nov 25: The final electoral roll of Jammu and Kashmir was published on Friday with the highest-ever net addition of more than 7.72 lakh voters, officials said

The release of the electoral roll paves the way for holding of Assembly polls in the Union Territory, the first since Article 370 provisions were abrogated and Jammu and Kashmir was bifurcated into Union territories in 2019. "There has been a net increase

of 7,72,872 electors in the final electoral roll, i.E. A 10.19 per cent net increase of the registered electors over the draft roll," he said. The highest number of additions during a special summary revision (SSR) was less than two lakh earlier 'This was for the first time in the

history of Jammu and Kashmir that more than 11 lakh names were included in a single SSR period,' Salgotra said

During this period, a record 11.40.768 claims were received through Form 6 for inclusion of names in the electoral rolls across the Union territory. Out of these, 11,28,672 claims were accepted and only 12,096 claims were rejected. This included 3.01.961 claims of inclusion in the age group of 18-19. Atotal of 4,12,157 requests for deletion were received, out of which 3,58,222 were accepted and 53,935 were rejected. There has been an addition of 613 new polling stations in the

Union territory, he said. The gender ratio of the final electoral Roll has increased from 921 to 948, he added. Salgotra said that gender ratio has shown a remarkable increase by 27 points and stands at 948, which is much above the Census gender ratio of Jammu and Kashmir.

Rlys to export Vande Bharat trains by 2025-26: Official

New Delhi, Nov 25: The railways is looking at becoming a major exporter of Vande Bharat trains by 2025-26 to markets in Europe, South America and East Asia, a senior official said on Friday, adding that the latest version of the indigenous trains with sleeper coaches will be operational by the first quarter of 2024. He also said the railways is planning to clock 10-12 lakh kilometers on 75 Vande Bharat trains over the next few years, for these to be export ready.

"The ecosystem to export trains has to be created over the next two to three years. We are on track to manufacture 475 Vande Bharat trains in the next three years and once they run successfully... There will be confidence in global mar-

Bharat trains meet all international standards," he said. Talking about these trains, the official said these have a rider index of three, which means no or minimal jolts for passengers; and noise level of 65 decibel which is 100 times less than the sound produced in aircraft.

He also said that while the present Vande Bharat trains are fit for broad gauge, the railways' manufacturing units will customise the trains to run on standard gauges used by countries across the world. In fact, the national transporter

is constructing a 59 km testing track between Gudha-Thathana Mithri in Jodhpur Division (about 70 Km from Jaipur) for carrying out tests/trials of various rolling stocks. This track can test trains running at a maximum speed of



220 kmph, maneuvering a variety of curves. The track will be ready by January 2024 and trains

sleeper Vande Bharat trains will be ready by the first quarter of 2024 and will be manufactured by the Integral Coach Factory, Chennai. A decision is yet to be taken on

In another development, the officials said India will get its first tilting trains by 2025-26, with 100 Vande Bharat trains being manufactured using this technology which enables trains to maneuver curves at higher speeds, just as a motorbike on a winding road. They said 100 of the 400 Vande Bharat trains to be manufactured by 2025 will have this technology.

Thieves steal train engine from rly yard

Muzaffarpur, Nov 25: An entire diesel engine was stolen part by part from a railway yard in Bihar's Begusarai district, police said Friday.

The thieves dug a tunnel to the yard and started stealing parts, slowly doing away with the entire engine that was brought there for repairs, they said.

"Last week, a case was registered at the Barauni police station for the theft of a diesel engine brought for repairs to the Garhara yard. In the course of the investigation, three people were arrested," said PS Dubey, the inspector of Railway Protection Force (RPF), Muzaffarpur.

The thieves dug a tunnel to the yard and started stealing parts, slowly doing away with the entire engine that was brought there for repairs

Based on the information given by them during interrogation, searches were conducted at a scrap godown in Prabhat Nagar area of Muzaffarpur district and 13 sacks full of train parts were found, he said. A search is on for the owner of the scrap godown, he added.

Recovered items include engine parts. wheels of vintage train engines and railway parts made of heavy iron, he said.

"They had dug a tunnel to the railway yard and through it, they used to carry the locomotive parts and other items in sacks," said Dubey.

The gang is also involved in unbolting steel bridges and stealing

their parts, he said. Last year, a railway engineer of Samastipur Loco Diesel Shed was suspended after he allegedly sold off an old steam engine kept at the

Purnea court premises. The engineer had allegedly used a forged letter of the divisional mechanical engineer of Samastipur to sell the engine in connivancewith other railway officials and security personnel.



Ban only on online gambling: TN govt

The Bill seeking to prohibit gambling and regulate online gaming was unanimously passed by the Assembly and sent to the Governor for assent, recently

Chennai, Nov 25: The Tamil Nadu government Friday said no complete ban on online games has been proposed but only online gambling has been proscribed in the state, and sought Governor RN Ravi's assent to the Bill to prohibit online gambling and regulate online games in

As per the doctrine of proportionality, no total ban has been proposed, state Law Minister S Raghupathy said.

Games are not completely banned. They have been differentiated as game of chance and game of skill and only online gambling is banned. Therefore, it is a proportional restriction, the minis-

Also, the government submitted its response to certain doubts or clarifications raised by the Governor Thursday on enforcing a ban on online gambling in the

The Bill, aiming to give effect to the government ordinance, seeks to prohibit gambling and regulate online gaming. It was unanimously passed by the Assembly and sent to the Governor for assent, recently.

"On Thursday morning, we received a letter from the Governor asking for certain clarifications. We submitted our response within 24 hours. This shows the DMK government under Chief Minister



MK Stalin is keen on enforcing the ban in the interest of the people,' Raghupathy told reporters here.

The Bill passed by the previous AIADMK government could not stand legal scrutiny and hence the present regime had to enact a new legislation. "We addressed the issues raised by the Madras High Court and also included certain clauses and sent the Bill for assent," the law minister claimed.

The Governor raised an issue pertaining to the judgment of the Madras High Court that the legislation already enacted on the same subject is not constitutional. In particular, a complete ban without distinction between game of chance and skill is against Article

"We replied that the proposed Act is within the ambit of the Constitution, and has been framed considering the entries in List 2 of the Seventh Schedule of the Constitution. The power of the state government on making laws on gambling can be traced to Entry 34 List II of the Seventh Schedule

The draft law has been created to ban only online gambling in the current ordinance. In the preamble, this draft law was passed by

It is possible to play knowing who and how one is playing while participating in person (offline). But the law was enacted to ban online games on the grounds that when played online, there are chances for cheating and money laundering as the game is played based on a (computer) programme written by the creator of the game. Therefore, this draft law is subject to the aforementioned Article 34 of the Constitution, the minister said.

In October, the Tamil Nadu government promulgated an ordinance to prohibit online gambling and regulate online games in the state and said an online gaming authority will be established to exercise powers conferred by this ordinance.

The Gazette notification issued by the government October 3 and the ordinance promulgated by Governor Ravi October 1, said the Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Online Gambling and Regulation of Online Games Ordinance, 2022, will come into force on the date notified by the government.

It said online games and gambling ruined families, led to suicides, caused gaming addiction affecting public health, disturbing social order and prejudices the maintenance of public order.

TOP COURT DISCUSSES JALLIKATTU

If animals can't make choice, can they have liberty, asks SC

Jallikattu is a bull-taming sport played in Tamil Nadu as part of the Pongal harvest festival

New Delhi, Nov 25: The Supreme Court Thursday while hearing petitions challenging a Tamil Nadu law allowing 'jallikattu', queried, "If the animals cannot make a choice, can they have liberty?"

Some of the petitioners, who have challenged the Tamil Nadu law, contended before a five-judge constitution bench, headed by Justice KM Joseph that perpetuating cruelty cannot be permitted and the bull-taming sport leads to injuries and even fatalities of animals as well as humans.

Jallikattu is a bull-taming sport played in Tamil Nadu as part of the Pongal harvest festival.

The bench, also comprising Justices Ajay Rastogi, Aniruddha Bose, Hrishikesh Roy, and CT Ravikumar, is considering five questions, which was referred to it in February 2018, by a two-judge bench of the apex court.

One of the questions referred to the five-judge bench reads, "The Tamil Nadu Amendment Act states that it is to preserve the cultural heritage of the state of Tamil Nadu. Can the impugned Tamil Nadu Amendment Act be stated to be part of the cultural heritage of the people of the state of Tamil Nadu so as to receive the protection of Article 29 of the Constitution?"

The bench, during the hearing, noted that the Act seeks to prevent cruelty to animals, and cited boxing and fencing, which might lead to injuries.

Senior advocate Sidharth Luthra, representing petitioners in three separate pleas, said it is about choice and a lack of choice and added that when one enters any sports wilfully, the possibility of injury exists but the person has taken a conscious decision.

At this juncture, the bench asked,

choice, can they have liberty? Luthra submitted that in reality there are animal fatalities as well as injuries in 'jallikattu'. He said when someone is inducing fear among animals, it is inherently cruel and cited several provisions of the Prevention of Cruelty to

Animals Act. The five-judge constitution bench commenced hearing arguments on a batch of petitions challenging the Tamil Nadu and Maharashtra laws allowing jallikattu and bullockcart races, respectively. The arguments in the matter will continue November 29.

Tamil Nadu had amended the central Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, 1960 to allow jallikattu and this law has been chal-

Maha to make voter registration must for admission to colleges

Mumbai, Nov 25: The Maharashtra government will make it mandatory for students above 18 years of age to get their voter registration done for getting admission to colleges, a state minister has said.

Speaking at a meeting of vice chancellors of non-agriculture universities at the Raj Bhavan here Thursday, state Higher and Technical Education Minister Chandrakant Patil also said that the government will introduce fouryear degree courses from June 2023 as mandated under the National Education Policy (NEP) and the universities will have to implement the decision.

There is no option for universities as they will have to implement the four-vear degree courses from June as mandated under the NEP. he said, warning that action will be taken against those failing to do so.

The government will soon constitute a committee of retired vicechancellors to address the concerns of vice chancellors over the implementation of the NEP, Patil

Taking note of the dismal percentage of voter registration by students of universities and colleges, he said, "The government will issue a resolution mandating students to get their voter registration done for getting admission to colleges.

As against the goal of attaining the enrolment of 50 lakhs students in the higher education system, Maharashtra has enrolment of only 32 lakh students, Patil said.

The minister called upon universities to run a campaign to improve the enrolment percentage.

He also said there was a need to take into cognisance the recommendations of NEP regarding providing education in mother tongue and skill development.

State Governor Bhagat Singh Koshyari called upon vice chancellors of public universities in Maharashtra to turn universities 'aatmanirbhar' (self-reliant) to attain the goal of 'Aatmanirbhar Many private universities are

doing well through self finance and distance education programmes, he said, while urging the universities to take steps for effective implementation of the NEP.

The governor, who is also the chancellor of public universities in the state, said the NEP lays thrust on culture and the Indian knowledge system.

He asked vice chancellors to create small advisory committees comprising dedicated officers, professors, young people and resource persons to advise them on the effective implementation of the policy in universities.

The governor said he would hold a follow-up meeting of vice chancellors within six months to discuss what steps were taken on the issues agreed upon in the meeting.

Chief Minister Eknath Shinde, who was present on the occasion, asserted that the state will implement the NEP in the best possible manner.

The state government has decided to make suitable amendments in the Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016 to make the selection process of vice chancellors and pro-vice chancellors in sync with the guidelines of the **University Grants Commission** (UGC), he said.



Teltumbde likely to be released on bail

Mumbai, Nov 25: Scholar-activist Anand Teltumbde, an accused in the Elgar Parishad-Maoist links case, is likely to walk out of prison Saturday after the Supreme Court rejected the National Investigation Agency's (NIA) plea challenging the bail granted to him.

Following the Apex court's order on Friday, Teltumbde's lawyers completed bail formalities before the special NIA court judge Rajesh Katariya here.

The court then issued his release order, one of his lawyers said. Teltumbde is lodged in the Taloja jail in neighbouring Navi Mumbai

since his arrest in April 2020. The Bombay High Court on November 18 granted bail to him, noting that prima facie there was no evidence to show his involvement

in any terror activity. The high court, however, stayed its bail order for a week so that the NIA, the probe agency, could approach the Supreme Court. On Friday, A bench of Chief Justice DY Chandrachud and Justice Hima Kohli rejected the

NIA plea against the bail. Following the SC order. Teltumbde's lawyers submitted a cash bond of Rs 1,00,000 in the NIA court. Teltumbde, 73, is the third of the 16 accused arrested

TN coastal police on high alert after drug peddlers held in sea INDO-ASIAN NEWS SERVICE Chennai, Nov 25: The Indian

Coast Guard and the Tamil Nadu Coastal police are on high alert after four people were arrested mid-sea near Rameswaram Monday with 500 gm of Hashish oil and 300

NCB officials had tipped-off the Indian Coast Guard about a fishing boat that was carrying the substance. Coast Guard sleuths intercepted the boat and arrested four people along with the drug.

Sources in the NCB told IANS hat Ganja and Hashish oil were handed over to the fishermen by an operative from Ramanathapuram and that the substances were for delivery to a Sri Lankan fishing boat mid-sea. However, on finding that the Indian fishing boat was intercepted mid-sea by the Coast Guard, the Sri Lankan vessel went back.

Central Intelligence agencies have also commenced investigation into the source of the drugs and the person who had handed over the substance. It may be noted that 300 kg of heroin and five AK-47 assault rifles were seized from a vessel in March 2021 from a Sri Lankan boat off the Kerala coast.

The National Investigation



Agency (NIA) conducted an investigation and found that Suresh Raj, a Tamil national who was staying illegally in Angamaly, Kerala for several years, was the kingpin behind the smuggling of drugs and weapons from Pakistan and Iran to Sri Lanka

While Suresh Raj was the coordinator in this smuggling racket, a former LTTE intelligence operative, Satkunam was considered the key conspirator and handler in the case.

The central agencies have commenced investigation into the arrest of four people off Ramanathapuram coast Monday. It is probing whether the drug syndicate was smuggling a small quantity of ganja and hashish oil to make sure that the track was safe.

14 YEARS AFTER 26/11

Locals rename Sultanpur as Rahul Nagar after martyr

Mumbai, Nov 25: Sultanpur, a village in Maharashtra with a population of around 1,000 and 600 houses, will now be known as 'Rahul Nagar' as the local residents have changed its name in memory of its native, who laid down his life while fighting terrorists during the 26/11 Mumbai attacks in 2008.

Rahul Shinde, a constable of the State Reserve Police Force (SRPF) attained martyrdom during the terror attacks 14 years ago.

Shinde, who hailed from Sultanpur in Madha tehsil of Solapur district, around 360 km from here, was amongst the first police personnel to enter the Taj Mahal Palace Hotel in south Mumbai after reports of firing by terrorists. Shinde was hit with a bullet in his stomach by terrorists, in which he died.

While the government honoured him by conferring the President's Police Medal on him posthumously for his supreme sacrifice, the residents of Sultanpur decided to re-



name their village after him as he was born and brought up there. However, the official renaming

ceremony is yet to take place. "All the government formalities for renaming the village are done. We are now waiting for the official renaming ceremony," Subhash Vishnu Shinde, father of late Rahul Shinde, told PTI on the eve of the

14th anniversary of the 26/11 attacks. "We are waiting for the confirmation of dates from the dignitaries and guests and it will soon



be finalised," he said, adding Joint Commissioner of Police (Law and Order) Vishwas Nangre Patil, who was then Deputy Commissioner of Police (zone-I) in Mumbai, helped him in the process.

"I had been following up with the government on this for the last 10 years. Finally it is done. I am satisfied now and don't want anything more. I feel honoured that the village now bears the name of

my son," he said. Speaking about his martyred son, Shinde said he showed courage while fighting against terrorists and made the supreme sacrifice for the country. "I am proud of my son," he said.

Subhash Shinde, has two more children - a son and a daughter. He now lives with his younger son, who got married a few years ago. "Rahul's mother is still under trauma. She has not been able to come to terms with the situation yet...She is still unable to digest the

fact that Rahul is no more," he said. "After Rahul's demise, the government provided financial assistance to us as per rules. We also got a flat in Mumbai and a gas agency at the taluka place, which helps

the family earn a living," he said. The Shinde family is also involved in farming. "This year, we harvested sugarcane on our farm, he said. Shinde also set up a memorial of Rahul in the village in 2010. The aid of Rs 10 lakh, which the family received from the Mumbai civic body, was used in

installing the memorial, he said. "The memorial is meant to inspire the younger generation. The youth should feel that when it is required, one should be ready to make the supreme sacrifice for the country," he said.

"I did all this by keeping my personal sorrow aside to keep his memories alive," Shinde said, adding that he was just waiting for the official renaming ceremony.


On November 26, 2008, 10 Lashkar-e-Taiba terrorists from Pakistan arrived by sea route and opened fire, killing 166 people, including 18 security personnel, and injuring several others during the 60-hour siege in Mumbai.

The Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Terminus, the Oberoi Trident, the Taj Mahal Hotel, Leopold Cafe, Cama Hospital and the Nariman House Jewish community centre, now renamed Nariman Light House, were some of the places targeted by terrorists.

Nine terrorists were later killed by the security forces, including the NSG, the country's elite commando force. Ajmal Kasab was the only terrorist who was captured alive. He was hanged four years later November 21, 2012.

SC seeks Centre's response to pleas for recognition of gay marriages in 4 weeks

New Delhi, Nov 25: Over four years after decriminalising consensual gay sex between adults, the Supreme Court Friday sought response from the central government to separate pleas by two gay couples seeking enforcement of their right to marry and a direction to the authorities to register their marriage under the Special Marriage Act.

A bench headed by Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud, who was also part of the Constitution bench which in 2018 decriminalised consensual gay sex, issued notice to the Centre besides seeking the assistance of Attorney General for India R Venkataramani in dealing with the pleas. "Issue notice returnable in four weeks. Liberty to serve the central agency. Notice be also issued to the Attorney General for India as well," the bench, which also comprised Justice Hima Kohli, said.

The top court's five-judge Constitution bench, in a path-breaking unanimous judgement delivered on September 6, 2018, held consensual sex among adult homosexuals or heterosexuals in private space is not a crime while striking down a part of the Britishera penal law which criminalised it on the ground that it violated the constitutional right to equality and dignity. Senior advocate Mukul Rohatgi, appearing for the gay couples, said the issue was a sequel to the Navtej Singh Johar and the Puttaswamy judgments (gay sex and right to privacy verdicts respectively).

This is a living issue and not a property issue, he said, adding "we are only here talking about the Special Marriage Act.

The pleas seek a direction that the right to marry a person of one's choice be extended to LGBTQ (lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender and queer) people as part of their fundamental right. One of the petitions has sought interpretation of the Special Marriage Act, 1954 in a gender-neutral manner where a person is not discriminated due to their sexual orientation.

Assam issues fresh travel curbs

Guwahati/Shillong, Nov 25: Attendance in government offices in Meghalaya was 'thin' Friday in response to a call by various organisations for a non-cooperation movement in protesting against the November 22 violence along the border with Assam, which left six people dead, officials said.

Assam police officials Friday issued a fresh advisory asking its citizens not to travel to Meghalaya as the situation is still "not very good" in the neighbouring state where police vehicles were torched and several people were injured during protests on the previous night.

In a relief to the people of Meghalaya, the Assam Petroleum Mazdoor Union (APMU) decided to resume transportation of fuel to that state, which it has suspended Thursday, following assurance of security of tankers and crew from the neighbouring state.

Meghalaya Chief Minister Conrad Sangma called on Union Home Minister Amit Shah in New Delhi Thursday. Shah assured him that a CBI probe will be initiated into the border violence.

Several social organisations and student associations of Meghalaya, including the influential Khasi Students Union (KSU) and the Federation of Khasi Jaintia and Garo People, declared a "non-cooperation movement" following the incident.

Top court stays Calcutta HC order for CBI probe

New Delhi, Nov 25: The Supreme Court Friday stayed a Calcutta High Court division bench order, which upheld a single-judge's direction for a CBI probe into the multi-crore West Bengal School Service Commission (WBSSC)

recruitment scam. Senior advocate AM Singhvi, representing the West Bengal government, mentioned the matter before a bench headed by Chief Justice DY Chandrachud that earlier this week a single-judge of the high court had prima facie held that the application filed by the commission was a benami application and sought to know who drafted the same.

Singhvi contended that the secretary of the education department has been summoned by the



high court for examination. He added that the single bench of high court directed the CBI probe to find out whose brainchild was the application and who was pulling the

The bench, also comprising Justice Hima Kohli, was informed that though the commission sought liberty to withdraw the petition, however, the high court did not permit it, and ordered a CBI probe on the origins of the application.

After hearing Singhvi's submissions, the top court stayed the high court order directing CBI investigation into who was brain behind the commission's application seeking to protect services of illegally appointed candidates by creating supernumerary posts.

The top court also stayed the high court order directing the personal appearance of West Bengal principal secretary Manish Jain.

The single judge bench of the High Court had directed the CBI to submit a report within the next seven days, to decide on the next course of action and the Principal Secretary of West Bengal was also asked to appear in court. The state government challenged this order before the division bench of the high court, which upheld the single-judge with regard to the fresh CBI probe. The West Bengal government moved the apex court challenging this order.

EU warns of Covid-19 spike in winter

Brussels, Nov 25: The European Union's (EU) medicines regulator urged Europe to prepare for a new wave of the Covid-19 pandemic as 'cold winter months" arrive.

"Over the last weeks we have not seen a major increase in Covid-19 case rates in the EU as a result of rising immunity following vaccinations and natural infections,' Marco Cavaleri, head of Health Threats and Vaccines Strategy of the European Medicines Agency (EMA), told a press briefing.

"However, this could change rapidly as we are getting into the cold winter months," Cavaleri said.

Vaccine booster uptake in the last few months has been "rather disappointing", with the European average rate at only 29 per cent in people at highest risk, including those aged above 60 with chronic conditions and immunocompromised, he said.

The European average rate of re-vaccination, or receiving booster

Biggest crackdown on phone scammers

London, Nov 25: UK police Thursday said their biggest ever counter-fraud operation had disrupted an international criminal network targeting hundreds of thousands of victims in millions of spam phone calls.

The Metropolitan Police spearheaded the 18-month global probe into the iSpoof.cc website, working with Europol, the FBI and other law enforcement agencies worldwide. A total of 142 people have been ar-

rested, including one of its alleged London-based administrators. Suspects were arrested in Australia. France, Ireland and the Netherlands. while servers were shuttered in the



Netherlands and Ukraine.

UK police believe organised crime groups are linked to the website and its tens of thousands of users. The site enables users to access software tools to illicitly obtain victims' bank account funds and commit other fraud.

Met Commissioner Mark Rowley said the investigation signalled "a different approach" to criminals exploiting technology. "This is about starting from the organised criminals that actually drive and create the fraud that we see in the world around us," he told reporters. INDUSTRIALISED FRAUD

The London force -- the UK's largest - said in the year to August, suspects paid to access the website and make more than 10 million fraudulent calls worldwide.

Around 40 percent were in the United States. More than a third were in the UK, targeting 200,000 potential victims there alone.

Fraud detection agencies have so far recorded £48 million in losses in the UK alone. Victims lost an average £10,000. The largest single theft was worth three million pounds. Losses to victims worldwide are estimated at over £100 million.

pop star Kris Wu to 13 yrs for rape

Beijing, Nov 25: A Chinese court Friday sentenced Chinese-Canadian pop star Kris Wu to 13 years in prison on charges including rape.

Beijing's Chaoyang District Court said Wu was given 11 years and six months for a 2020 rape, and 1 year and 10 months for the "crime of assembling a crowd to engage in sexual promiscuity" in a 2018 event in which he and others allegedly assaulted two women they had got-

The court said the three victims in the rape case had also been drunk and were unable to consent. It said a combined 13-year sentence was agreed on and Wu would be immediately deported after serving his time.

"According to the facts ... the nature, circumstances and harmful consequences of the crime, the court made the above judgment," the court said.

Wu was also slapped with a fine of 600 million yuan (\$83.7 million) for evading taxes by massively under-reporting his earnings from performances, advertisements and other sources of income.

The June trial of the 32-yearold former member of the South Korean group EXO was closed to the public to protect the victims' privacy. Wu has been detained since August 2021 while police conducted an investigation in response to comments online that he "repeatedly lured young women" to have sex, according to a police state-

Ghana's Gross International Reserves stood at around \$6.6 billion at the end of September 2022, equating to less than three months of imports cover.

The army's role in Pakistan

During the 75 years since independence and formation of Pakistan out of the Partition of India, the army has seized power three times and directly ruled the Islamic republic for more than three decades, fighting three wars with India along the way.

Even when a civilian government holds power, Pakistan's generals retain a dominant influence over security matters and foreign affairs.

Who is Asim Munir?

Munir will replace General Qamar Javed Bajwa, who retires later this month after a six-year term. He served in Pakistan-occupied Kashmir and also in Saudi Arabia, a major financial supporter of Pakistan.

He later headed Pakistan's two most influential intelligence agencies - Military Intelligence (MI) in 2017 and then the Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI) in 2018. He was removed as ISI chief after just eight months on the request of then-Prime Minister Imran Khan. No reason was given for his removal.

constant problem due to insurgencies in

ethnic Pashtun and Baloch regions. Despite all the risks, Pakistan and its military have dismissed foreigners' concerns over the command and control,

and security of its nuclear weapons. Why is this appointment important domestically?

Domestically, he was accused of political meddling. Politicians said he helped former cricketer Imran Khan become prime minister in 2018. In an about-turn earlier this year, Khan accused Bajwa of playing a part in his downfall.



Lahore: Pakistan's central bank raised its key policy rate by 100 basis points to 16% Friday, the bank said in a statement after a meeting of its monetary policy committee. The bank had kept the rate unchanged at its last two meetings in October and September.

The US-based electric car maker has recalled 67,698 Model S and Model X cars imported to China between September 25, 2013 and November 21, 2020, due to software problems affecting the battery management system in the vehicles. Tesla said it will upgrade the software of recalled vehicles.

India, UAE discussing trade in rupee, dirham

New Delhi, Nov 25: The central banks of India and the UAE are discussing a concept paper on promoting bilateral trade in rupee and dirham with a view to reducing transaction cost, a top official

India's Ambassador to the UAE Sunjay Sudhir said that the concept paper for trade in local currencies was shared by India. The central banks of both countries will discuss the standard operating procedures and modalities, he told reporters here.

The objective of the exercise is to reduce the cost of transactions, he added. The exercise will help in enhancing the utilisation of the free trade agreement, implemented by both countries May 1.

"We are in the process of discussing rupee-dirham trade since we are very large trading partners. UAE is our 3rd largest trading partner and our secondlargest destination for exports. Surely the number would go up further and in that growing sense, if we are able to transact business in our two currencies, it's very desirable because the cost of transacting business will come down very effectively," Sudhir told reporters here.

The Ambassador said the issue was first discussed in September.

FOREX RESERVES RISE FOR SECOND **WEEK IN A ROW**

Mumbai, Nov 25: In the second consecutive week of an increase in the kitty, India's forex reserves have grown by \$2.537 billion to \$547.252 billion for the week ended November 18, the RBI said Friday

In the previous reporting week the overall kitty had swelled by \$14.721 billion in the highest weekly rise since August 2021 to \$544.715 billion.

It can be noted that in October 2021, the country's forex kitty had reached an all-time high of \$645 billion. The reserves have been declining as the central bank deploys the kitty to defend the rupee amid pressures caused by global developments.

Foreign currency assets (FCA). a major component of the overall reserves, increased by \$1.76 billion to \$484.288 billion during the week to November 18, according to the Weekly Statistical Supplement released by the RBI Friday.

Expressed in dollar terms, the foreign currency assets include the effect of appreciation or depreciation of non-US units like the euro, pound and yen held in the foreign exchange reserves.

The gold reserves increased by \$315 million to \$40.011 billion, it said. The Special Drawing Rights (SDRs) were up by \$351 million to \$17.906 billion, the apex bank said.

The country's reserve position with the IMF was also up by \$111 million to \$5.047 billion in the reporting week, the apex bank

kets regulator Sebi has amended norms to bring buying and selling of mutual fund units under the ambit of insider trading rules.

At present, insider trading rules are applicable to dealing in securities of listed companies or those proposed to be listed, when in possession of Unpublished Price Sensitive Information (UPSI). The units of mutual funds are specifically excluded from the definition of securities under the rules.

"No insider shall trade in the units of a scheme of a mutual fund when in possession of unpublished price sensitive information, which may have a material impact on the net asset value of a scheme or may have a material impact on the interest of the unit holders of the scheme," Sebi said in a notification issued Thursday.

Under the new rules, asset management companies (AMCs) will have to disclose the details of hold-

ings in the units of its mutual fund schemes, on an aggregated basis, held by the AMC, trustees and their immediate relatives on the platform of stock exchanges

'Details of all the transactions in the units of its own mutual funds... Executed by the designated persons of asset management company, trustees and their immediate relatives shall be reported by the concerned person to the compliance officer of asset management company within two business days from the date of transaction," the regulator said.

Also, the the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi) has prescribed a minimum standard of code of conduct for designated persons in line with provisions of existing insider trading rules.

Further, the compliance officer of the AMC would determine the ignated person cannot transact in units of the mutual fund.

Specifying institutional mechanism for prevention of insider trading, Sebi said, "Chief Executive Officer or Managing Director of an asset management company with the approval of the trustee or such other analogous person of an intermediary or fiduciary, shall put in place adequate and effective system of internal controls to ensure compliance with the requirements given in these regulations to prevent insider trading.

These internal controls to prevent insider trading include all employees who have access to UPSI are identified as designated persons and all the UPSI needs to be identified and its confidentiality be maintained. To give this effect, Sebi amended insider trading norms that became effective from November 24.

Lusail (Qatar), Nov 25: With Neymar limping off the field with an ankle injury, Richarlison came through for the Selecao. A spectacular acrobatic kick followed an easy tap-in from close range as Richarlison scored both goals in Brazil's 2-0 victory over Serbia on Friday at the World Cup.

After the match, the Tottenham striker learned of the extent of Neymar's injury. "The most important thing for us it to have him at 100 per cent for the next match, said Richarlison, whose first goal came after a buildup started by Neymar. "When I get to the hotel I'm going to go and see how he is

Brazil team doctor Rodrigo Lasmar said Neymar sprained his right ankle. He declined to speculate on whether he would be available to play in the team's next match against Switzerland Monday.

Neymar was also injured at the 2014 World Cup. Playing at home in Brazil, his tournament ended with a back injury in the quarterfinals against Colombia when he had to be taken off the field on a stretcher. Brazil ended up losing to Germany 1-7 in the semifinals.

Nevmar was fouled nine times in the match against Serbia, four more than any other player so far at this year's World Cup. But while taking care of Neymar, the opposing defense couldn't stop Richarlison.

He had his back to the goal when he used one touch to get the ball up in the air near the penalty spot, then spun around and leapt off the ground before knocking the ball into the net with his right foot in the 73rd minute.

"My childhood dream has come true," said Richarlison, who is playing in his first World Cup. 'We knew it was going to be difficult to get past them. I'm used to playing against defensive teams like this in England. I wanted to take advantage of the opportunities that I had and I did.

Brazil had struggled to get past the Serbian defence until Richarlison scored from close range in the 62nd. Vinícius Júnior assisted on both goals.

Neymar, seeking his first major title with Brazil, stayed at 75 goals for the national team, two shy of Pelé's scoring record. He was tackled hard a few times and sprained his right ankle in the second half. He was crying on the bench after being substituted in the 79th and was limping as he left the sta-

Brazil coach Tite started with an attack-minded squad that included four forwards — Neymar, Vinícius, Raphinha and Richarlison. Attacking midfielder Lucas Paquetá played alongside Casemiro, the lone defensive midfielder.

But Serbia had several players back and was able to keep Brazil from creating many significant opportunities. Neymar tried to control the pace but struggled to get free. He, Vinícius and Raphinha all squandered chances early on.

Brazil's best chance before Richarlison's opening goal had been a low long-range shot by Alex Sandro that hit the post in the 60th. Neymar had his best opportunities with a free-kick in the 50th and a shot from near the penalty spot in the 55th.

Brazil, trying to win their first World Cup in two decades, is unbeaten in their last 20 opening games, with 17 victories. It has finished first in its group in the last 10 World Cups.

India goes down to Uzbekistan in semis

JERUSALEM: India went down 1-3 to Uzbekistan in the semifinal of the FIDE World Team chess Championship here Friday. The two teams shared honours in the first round at 2-2 scoreline with SL Naravanan's superb win with black pieces over Shamsiddin Vokhidov being offset by SP Sethuraman's loss to Jakhongir Vokhidov. Vidit Gujrathi drew with Nordirbek Yakubboev on the top board, followed by an identical result in the tie between Nihal Sarin and Javokhir Sindharov. In the second round, Gujrathi and Sarin lost to Yakubboev and Sindharov respectively. Narayanan beat Vokhidov in 44 moves but that was not enough as K Sasikiran, playing on the fourth board in place of Sethuraman, drew with Sindharov to hand Uzbekistan, winner of the Open title in the Chess Olympiad earlier this year, a 2.5-1.5 victory for a place in the final.
