House adjourned sine die 29 days ahead

Bhubaneswar, Dec 2: The Winter Session of the Odisha Assembly was adjourned sine die by the Speaker Friday, 29 days ahead of its scheduled end December 31.

Speaker Bikram Keshari Arukha announced sine die adjournment of the House after passing the Appropriation Bill for first supplementary budget of ₹16,800 crore for the year 2022-23.

The Appropriation Bill was also passed in the absence of the opposition BJP and Congress members. Soon after that, government chief whip Prasant Muduli moved a motion proposing sine-die adjournment of the session as no legislative business was left to discuss in the House. Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik remained present during the validatorily session.

Out of 33 business days of the winter session that started November 24, the House was as-

Three Bills were passed and three CAG reports laid in the Assembly during the session. Besides, 38 papers and 10 annual reports were laid before the House during the session.

Earlier in the day, as the House assembled for the day at 10.30 am, the BJP members carrying ban-

ners stormed into the well of the house and raised slogans against the government over various demands of farmers. As a noisy scene prevailed in the House, the Speaker adjourned the proceedings till 11.30 am. When the House reassembled, the BJP members continued their protest and later staged a noisy walk out from the Assembly on the farmers' issues.

The BJP member later sat on dharna before the Mahatma Gandhi statue in the Assembly premises. "The Chief Minister along with

many ministers have remained absent in the Assembly as they are busy campaigning for the Padampur by-poll. No one here listens to the problems of farmers," said BJP chief whip Mohan Majhi.

Congress legislature party leader Narasingha Mishra targeted both state and central governments for not looking at the plight of farmers. "The PMFBY is a Central government scheme. So, they cannot put the responsibility on the state. At the same time, the Odisha government is also equally responsible. The question is why they implanted the yojana in the state. It is Naveen Babu's weakness that he agrees to whatever the Prime Minister says," Mishra said.

Reacting on BJP's protest, BJD MLA Amar Satpathy said, "The objective is not the farmer issue. They are using the House to fulfill their political motives as the by-election is ahead."

Archana case: ED grills City realtor

Bhubaneswar, Dec 2: The Enforcement Directorate (ED) sleuths Friday continued the interrogation of several persons having links with Archana Nag sextortion case. A noted City-based property dealer Prabhat Ranjan Pati appeared before the ED at the Nayapalli office here for questioning.

Pati has reportedly been summoned by the Central agency to ascertain his links with Archana and the role he played in sale of a land to the lady blackmailer and her close aide and business partner, Khageswar Patra.

Meanwhile, Archana's former landlord and noted movie producer Pramod Kumar Swain again appeared before the ED Friday for questioning.

He was earlier grilled by the ED officials November 29.

Raped multiple times, woman tries to kill self in Berhampur

Berhampur, Dec 2: A 30-year-old woman, who was allegedly raped multiple times, tried to set herself afire on a court complex in Ganjam district Friday seeking justice, police said.

The incident happened at the Sub-Divisional Judicial Magistrate (SDJM) court in Berhampur, they said.

Constable Rashmi Ranjan Das, who was on security duty at the spot, rescued the woman immediately after she poured kerosene on herself, they added.

The woman was briefly detained at BN Pur police station, and was let go after questioning, police said.

The woman, who is married, alleged that she was first raped in

October last year. After that, the accused was arrested. However, after being released on bail, he allegedly raped her again along with a friend November 14 this year.

The accused man was arrested again, but the woman was seeking the arrest of his friend, and his mother who was guarding the house when they were allegedly raping her, police said.

The woman's husband lives in Hyderabad for livelihood. He used to send her money through the accused man's bank account, they said. On Monday, a 51-year-old man named in at least four criminal cases threatened SDJM Pragnyan Paramita Parihari with a knife in the court.

Lawyers rescued the judge and handed the accused to police.

CAG finds chinks in Biju Setu Yojana

Bhubaneswar, Dec 2: The Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) of India has found irregularities in construction of bridges in rural areas under Biju Setu Yojana (BSY).

In a report, which was tabled in the Assembly Friday, the CAG said the state government had planned to complete 793 bridges between 2017 and 2021 out of which only 473 were completed – an achievement of 59 per cent.

The scheme was launched by the state government in 2011 to bridge all the missing links on roads in rural areas.

The state government planned to take up 300 bridges initially, of which 55 were to be funded by National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (Nabard).



However, since 2015-16 onwards, 100 per cent of BSY works are funded from Rural Infrastructure Development Fund (RIDF) operated by Nabard, it said.

A total budgetary provision of ₹2,570 crore was made for BSY during 2017-21, against which the actual utilisation stood at ₹2,255.62

crore (88 per cent) and ₹314.38 crore remained unutilised, the CAG said in its report.

Under BSY, the state government planned to complete 793 bridge projects during 2017-18 to 2020-21. Out of these, only 473 (59 per cent) were completed and 318 remained incomplete.

The auditor also said that works on 48 bridge projects remained incomplete after incurring expenditure of ₹184 crore due to non-acquisition of land required for the bridge or for approach roads to the bridge.

Also, provision for manual excavation instead of mechanical excavation, resulted in extra expenditure of ₹4.82 crore in 82 projects, pointed out the CAG.

A high-level bridge over river Suktel on Tamia Mudalsar road in Bolangir district was completed in September 2015 with an expenditure of ₹7.58 crore.

Due to the execution of very poor and porous concrete in the deck, cracks have developed. The bridge collapsed in April 2020 while dismantling work was going on and caused two casualties, said the audit report.

Bhubaneswar, Dec 2: Projects approved by Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik for urban infrastructure development under Mukhyamantri Karma Tatapara Abhiyan (MUKTA) Yojana last year need to be completed by March 2023, Housing and Urban Development (H&UD) department principal secretary G Mathivathanan told the officials during a review meeting on the state's flagship scheme here Friday.

The meeting focused on preparation of ward-wise Annual Action Plan under MUKTA for 2023-24 across 115 ULBs for provision of basic amenities. ULB officials were appraised on guiding principles for preparation of demand-driven action plans in a participatory approach involving all stakeholders. They were reminded that focus



should be given to creation of ward-wise basic amenities in a saturation mode across all 2,055 wards of 115 ULBs of the state. ULB-wise action plans will be approved by the Chief Minister before being executed. "All the projects approved by the CM for urban infrastructure development last year need to be completed by March 2023. Release of timely payments to MSGs/SDA

and wage seekers is of paramount importance as it would form a strong base for sustainable partnership model between CBO and the department," the participants were told.

"Action plans for 2023-24 are to be sent to the department in the prescribed format by December 15 2022. The action plan should be demand-driven and need to include

low-cost, technically feasible, sustainable and labor oriented works. Land Clearance must be ensured before preparation of plan and estimates of the proposed projects," Mathi Vathanan advised.

Varhanan instructed that 2,055 Open Air Gyms and 2,055 Child Play Stations should be set up across 115 ULBs, with every ward of the ULBs having at least one Open Air Gym and one Child Play Station.

All the projects under MUKTA are going to be implemented with involvement of Mission Shakti Groups (MSGs) and Slum Dweller Associations (SDA) as Implementing agencies.

Capacity building and knowledge transfer to MSGs/SDA on projects assigned under MUKTA will be taken up by a team of professionals at the ULB and state level.

ECoR to start repair works

Bhubaneswar, Dec 2: In view of safety related modernisation works at various places under East Coast Railway (ECoR) jurisdiction, the Railways has planned to take proactive steps to take up immediate repair and maintenance works without affecting passenger's convenience.

The safety related modernisation works include repair of old bridges, installation of Limited Height Sub-ways (LHSs) by converting level crossings; interlocking of tracks for commissioning of doubling/third line works and others.

ECoR General Manager Roop Narayan Sunkar has given strict instructions to the officials to ensure that passengers are not inconvenienced at all. So, minimum cancellation of trains is being planned.



In the next two months, safety related modernisation works have been planned at different railway sections. On Sundays, LHS and track linking works have been planned in Angul-Sambalpur Railway Section. Similarly, installation of new girders has been planned on bridges in Palasa-Vizianagaram Railway Section on Thursdays by replacing old girders. Apart from this, safety related works have also been planned on Tuesdays and Saturdays in Titilagarh-Raipur Railway Section.

CAG smells rat in liquor supply

Bhubaneswar, Dec 2: An examination of 'supply chain management of liquor products in the State' by the Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) has revealed severe lapses by the Excise department, causing huge financial losses to the exchequer.

The CAG report was presented Friday by Panchayati Raj and Drinking Water department Minister Pradip Kumar Amat in the Odisha Assembly.

According to the report, Excise officers in charge of the liquor manufacturers have no record of passes issued by the district excise officers



(DEOs) for procurement of 4,52,990.72 London Proof Litre (LPL) Extra Neutral Alcohol (ENA), the primary raw material for manufacturing IMFL, by two manufacturing units during 2017-21. Hence, the Odisha government could not realise excise duty (ED) of ₹6.60 crore on the ENA consignments received, the CAG .

The CAG said that in the warehouses of three IMFL and one beer manufacturing units, 69,708.46 LPL IMFL and 62,342.80 BL beer bottled during January 2002 to March 2020 were lying in stock as of March 2021—beyond the stipulated period of three months. However, excise duty and fine amounting to ₹1.19 crore had been imposed against the due amount of ₹6.33 crore.

The CAG further said that the Excise department failed to realise extra hour operations charges of ₹1.61 crore as of January 2022 from one manufacturing unit. This apart, establishment charges amounting to ₹1.42 crore also could not be collected.

Intents worth ₹1.70L-cr received

Bhubaneswar, Dec 2: The state government received 180 investment intents worth ₹1.70 lakh crore in various sectors Friday, Industries secretary Hemant Sharma informed. He said these investments would create employment opportunities for 3,78,446 persons.

Out of the 180 intents received on the third day, 46 proposals are from the mineral, metal, metal ancillary sector; 43 from agri and food processing, 24 from IT, 22 from power



and renewable energy, 17 from chemical and plastic, 14 from agri businesses, five from agri marketing and nine from textile & garment sector; informed Sharma. The maximum number of proposals worth ₹78,000 crore have been received from metal downstream sector.

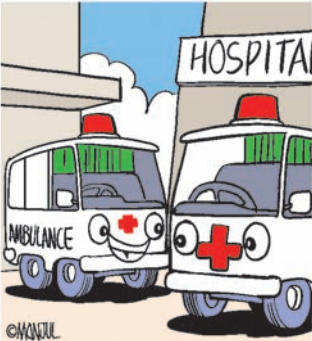
Orissa HC stays ASO results

Cuttack: In a major decision in connection with the ASO recruitment exams-2022 conducted by the Odisha Public Service Commission (OPSC), the Orissa High Court stayed Friday the publication of final mark list of the candidates. However, the court has allowed the OPSC to continue with the computer proficiency test.

Several candidates had moved the Orissa High Court petitioning that various norms were violated in the ASO recruitment exams.

"The OPSC has set minimum qualifying mark for written test, this year. We argued that the OPSC has no power to set minimum qualifying mark for written test and our plea was," said lawyer Manoj Mishra.

MHA Tough on Babus

Since the start of his tenure as the Union Home Minister in 2019, Amit Shah has constantly sought to burnish his 'tough guy' image. He's taken the Modi sarkar's crackdown on wayward babus to a whole new level. Sources have informed DKB that 2021 was a 'good' year, with the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA), on average, taking strict action against at least one gazetted officer every week! At least 10 gazetted officers have faced dismissal, removal and compulsory retirement in 2021 compared to two officers each in 2020 and 2019. The Andaman & Nicobar Islands chief secretary J Narain suspended on charges of sexual harassment, is one of the most high-profile cases of recent times.

The ministry's annual report reveals that 237 disciplinary cases were filed between April and December 2021 against 249 gazetted officers. The action was taken against 52 gazetted officers involved in 48 cases. Punishment, say observers, ranges between minor infractions and major misdemeanours. In some instances, the ministry censured and issued warnings to the erring babu while in more serious offences, ordering the dismissal, removal and compulsory retirement of the officer.

Shah's way seems less to censure or warn an officer and favours major punishment such as dismissal from service and removal. In this, the minister is aided by a vigilance cell within the ministry headed by a joint secretary-rank officer, who acts as part Chief Vigilance Officer. Sources say that there are separate vigilance divisions in each organisation under the MHA's control, and these cells are responsible for all disciplinary and vigilance activities of the ministry.

Non-IAS services making inroads in PMO

The acronym IFS seems to be working rather well for those lucky enough to hold it. Three Indian Foreign Service officers – Deepak Mittal, Vipin Kumar and Nidhi Tewari – are joining the Prime Minister's Office (PMO) following their appointment at the joint secretary, deputy secretary and undersecretary levels respectively. Their ingress into the hallowed portals of the PMO is being seen in the context of India assuming the presidency of the G20 recently. It is clearly going to be a busy year for India's foreign service officers and Prime Minister Narendra Modi will lean on them to ensure that India's one-year tenure as head of the summit passes flawlessly.

But some observers also note that increasingly the Modi sarkar is keen to promote non-IAS services to positions that formerly only the IAS held. The government is increasingly empanelling officers from all services, and elevating them to crucial positions in important ministries. It is now no longer surprising to see Indian Forest Service (IFoS) officers and Indian Revenue Service (IRS) officers posted to positions that the IAS long considered their own turf.

The government states that no position is reserved for IAS officers. It is appointing officers from all services based on their efficiency. Of course, it could also be a way to address the current crunch of IAS officers at the Centre.

ED chief's tenure extended 'in public interest'

Going by current form, the Enforcement Directorate (ED) seems to be the busiest government agency by a mile. The third extension for ED Director SK Mishra, after four years already as the chief, has been sought to be justified by the several high-profile key investigations that he is leading, and which may lose momentum if someone new takes over the helm. With this extension, Mishra would be able to complete five years in the post next year.

Last year the government brought an ordinance mandating that the tenure of CBI and ED directors can be extended up to three years after the mandated two-year term. This is how Mishra got his second extension.

However, now there are several petitions pending in the Supreme Court challenging the extension of Mishra's tenure. The petitions have questioned not just Mishra's continuation but also the amendments in the CVC and DSPE acts.

The Centre has argued in the SC that restricting the tenure of the director of ED or CBI would be counterproductive to India's concerted action against corruption and money laundering. It added in its affidavit filed in September this year that enough safeguards are in place, as any extension beyond two years is to be given on the grounds of larger public interest and for reasons recorded in writing by the committees appointing them.

With the apex court currently sceptical of the government's replies to its query on the tenure of election commissioners, it would be interesting if it takes a similar view on Mishra's third extension or sees it as well within the purview and powers of the Executive.

Deasil

It means to move righthandwards, in the direction of the sun, clockwise. It now mainly conjures up associations with witchcraft, as it's the much rarer converse of widdershins. Trying to define it unambiguously immediately runs into the fundamental problem of how to explain the difference between left and right (clockwise is fine, unless you only know about digital clocks, or you're one of those jokers who has one that runs backwards; sunwise works in the northern hemisphere only; just try explaining to an alien visitor which is right and which left, using words only). In immediate origin deasil is a Gaelic word that derives from the same root as the Latin dexter, "right, right-handed" which even then could mean "skilful" (hence our word dextrous). In witchcraft, including modern Wicca, to move deasil is to invoke positive qualities. As an example of its associations, here is Sir Walter Scott, in Chronicles of the Canongate: "In the meantime, she traced around him, with wavering steps, the propitiation, which some have thought has been derived from the Druidical mythology. It consists, as is well known, in the person who makes the DEASIL walking three times round the person who is the object of the ceremony, taking care to move according to the course of the sun".

Decussate

You may be reminded of Dr Samuel Johnson's famously unhelpful try at defining network in his Dictionary of 1755: "Any thing reticulated or decussated, at equal distances, with interstices between the intersections." The moral for lexicographers is not to define a word using words that are less familiar than the one you're defining. The verb decussate means to intersect or cross two things to form the shape of an X. Its source is the Latin verb decussare with the same sense. This can be traced back to the ancient Roman copper coin called an as. A coin worth 10 of them had the name decussis, a combination of as with the word for 10, decem. As the Roman symbol for 10 was X, decussis came to mean cross-shaped and the verb followed. In everyday life we've never had much need for decussate, as it's much simpler to use crosswise. Mostly, it turns up in specialist fields of study. As an adjective, neurologists use it to describe nerve fibres that cross the midline of the spinal cord or brain. For botanists, it refers to the leaves in some plants that are arranged on the stem in alternate pairs at right angles.

FOCUS G20 PRESIDENCY

GEOPOLITICAL CONCERNS



For India, the presidency of this important body will challenge its strategic thinking while presenting an opportunity which the present government will be loath to miss

The Group of 20 was created in 1999 in the wake of the global economic crisis as an inter-governmental body to mutually sort out global economic issues. It had three pillars initially on its agenda – boosting global growth, strengthening global supply chains and firming up global markets, investments and production. Climate change and sustainable development were later added to the lot when there were several protest movements from climate activists and development managers to infuse depth and strength into the 20-member grouping. However, of late with the virtual formation of two ideologically-divided power blocs, and majorly with the impact of COVID-19 and Russia's Ukraine invasion, it has no longer remained an exclusive economic group but has taken on multifarious global issues including managing the aftermath of COVID-19 and addressing the Ukraine war. On the latter, clearly India has fallen out of the lot siding with China and Russia over the war. This schism was visible at the Bali Summit recently. So long as the war continues, India will have to suffer opprobrium from the developed bloc though it stands to gain from the cheap crude purchase from Russia.

PM Modi, before embarking for Bali to take over the G20 Presidency, had been eloquent while inaugurating the logo of G20 in extolling India's age-old heritage. He called the lotus (the national flower of India) resting over Mother Earth with the colours of the national flag as “the symbol of hope in these troubled times” and claimed that it devolved on India “a new responsibility and measure of the world's trust in India.” Recently, in a radio address he reiterated the claim and said that India stood for “global good and welfare”.

Contrastingly global powers are more concerned about the steady attrition in India's democratic values. Last week the US Commission on International Religious Freedom blamed India for the government's “crackdown on civil society and dissent” and “religious freedom violations”. To add to it, the same or-

ganisation, known for its independence, recently clubbed Modi with the likes of the Saudi Crown Prince and some African dictators for prosecuting dissidents, commenting that Modi's US visa was granted on his becoming the PM and the ban on his travel to the US has been 'suspended' but not lifted. It is clear that the Biden administration uses India as a counterweight to China's expansionism as well as for India's large and potentially lucrative market. As usual the MEA spokesperson rubbished such reports as biased and misrepresenting facts which showed “their lack of understanding of India”. Such eye-wash statements do not gel for an international audience.

Indian officials in the PM's entourage gloated in Bali about how India played an instrumental role in coming up with a consensual joint communiqué at the last minute, and that the PM's famous quote, “this is not the era of war” was incorporated at the end of the communiqué. The same communiqué however mentioned that some countries abstained from taking a position against Russia on its invasion of Ukraine. Ironically, India was among the 'some countries', in the same league as China, while Russia's Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov flew back from Bali even before the communiqué was released.

For India, the presidency of this important body will challenge its strategic thinking while presenting an opportunity which the pres-

ent government will be loath to miss. The challenge first, the pandemic for over two years soon followed by the Ukraine war led to severe shortages in oil, gas and basic commodities leading to global inflation and rupture in the global value chain crippling the global economy. Along with it the fight for supremacy between the two great powers, the US and China, has brought in a third angle of global domination leading to both developed and emerging economies seeking fresh alternatives. Herein lies the opportunity for India, to wrest the situation by bringing in its economic assets to play. It needs no gainsaying that India has the lowest GDP per capita among all the G20 members, both in nominal as well as PPP terms. Though government officials and the RBI hold India's macro-economic fundamentals to be robust, the facts speak otherwise. Rising inflation, unemployment at its peak, low investment and decline in savings with a huge debt burden have put the country under heavy pressure. Besides, the constantly falling rupee has done much harm to India's global trade and export earnings and consequent flight of capital and severe drain in its forex reserves.

While international agencies like IMF and World Bank have predicted a 6.5% GDP growth for the current year, other estimates like that of Goldman Sachs have predicted a less than 6% growth. Of course the neoliberal policies pur-

sued by the government have boosted the super capitalists at the cost of the poor, and with a regressive indirect tax regime in place where the poor is taxed as much as the rich, it is no wonder that India's social development matrix continues to backslide. Thus the Presidency of G20 comes at a time when India can ill afford to speak on behalf of 2/3rd of the global population with a cumulative GDP of 85% and 75% of global trade. Yet the irony is that India would be expected to be the spokesperson for the Global South and call out for human development and climate change activism, among other important economic declarations.

During the course of the Ukraine war, India has hobnobbed on both sides of the ideological spectrum in its national interest of buying cheap crude from Russia and being brazen about it, while dallying as part of the Quad catering to Western interests in the Indo-Pacific. Canada has recently proposed an Indo-Pacific Forum with the Quad members in view, while China has launched a China-Indian Ocean Forum with nearly 20 riparian states of the Indian Ocean, all members of the BRI led by China. India has not been invited to join the group though it is a moot point whether it would have. All these developments should caution India to carefully navigate its foreign policy amidst this fractured geopolitics.

On their return from Bali, senior officials in charge of G20 preparations made a presentation in the Andamans to some 40 diplomats and representatives of international organisations, whose heads are likely to attend the grand finale of G20 in September, 2023, about India's preparedness with an “ambitious, action-oriented and decisive” agenda over the year with 200 meetings in all parts of India. Such exoticisation of a global event may not necessarily add heft to India's ability for global leadership unless there is a sea change in the government's policy thinking that domestic issues have a large bearing on the country's external perception, which could play a vital role in future.

The global ambitions of Chinese law

A recent report by the NGO Safeguard Defenders about the existence of “secret Chinese police stations” in cities around the world, including New York, has sparked investigations in several European countries and attracted the attention of the FBI. But while these investigations aim to protect the rule of law from subversion, they also highlight how unprepared Western democracies are to grapple with China's growing international influence.

In their eagerness to appear “tough on China,” Western media and government officials alike have demonstrated their inability – or perhaps unwillingness – to evaluate the Safeguard Defenders report, which is plagued by mistranslations and misunderstandings of Chinese and international legal norms. China's rising power requires careful technical debate and strategising rather than crude populist appeals.

Since emerging as a global economic and political power, China has increasingly focused on shaping international norms and institutions. Chinese leaders have indeed made extraterritorial jurisdiction a national priority in recent years, adding clauses to domestic laws that aim to expand their reach beyond

China's borders. But China's extraterritorial influence is a natural consequence of its growing economic and political interconnectedness with the rest of the world.

Criminal justice is a small but illustrative example. China has been increasingly aggressive in seeking to repatriate criminal suspects and fugitives, focusing primarily on areas of great concern to the Chinese public, such as online fraudsters targeting China and corrupt local officials who have fled abroad. Pursuing such criminals and recovering stolen assets is viewed as an essential component of deterrence and a legitimising demonstration aimed at Chinese citizens of the state's ability to protect their interests anywhere in the world.

Here, China has studied and largely mimicked the practice of established powers, particularly the US. It has employed various methods to enforce Chinese laws abroad, including extradition and formal international cooperation, exerting pressure by seizing suspects' domestic property, and promising leniency to those who return willingly.

But while China borrows from other countries' legal toolkits, it often lacks the capacity to extend the reach of its laws, owing to a

shortage of extradition treaties, professional resources, and international influence. It seems clear that strengthening China's ability to enforce its laws abroad will remain a high priority for the authorities.

To be sure, legitimate concerns about China's pursuit of political dissidents affect how its extraterritorial tactics are viewed around the world. While China's overseas enforcement has not focused primarily on dissidents, it is essential to consider their plight, as well as the inadequacy of procedural protections for all defendants in China's criminal justice system.

At a more fundamental level, the ruling Communist Party of China's understanding of the rule of law differs from Western conceptions. In China, Party leadership is considered an “essential feature and inherent requirement” of its “socialist rule of law with Chinese characteristics.” In the context of Chinese communism, the law is primarily a tool for maintaining domestic stability and CPC rule.

Moreover, the CPC rejects institutional checks on government power, such as constitutionalism, separation of powers, and judicial independence, as “incorrect Western concepts.” Whether such a legal

system can ensure basic fairness and reduce arbitrariness to protect the rights of both Chinese and foreign citizens is a question that anyone, including other governments, must seriously consider before interacting with China's legal system.

Addressing the challenges involved with China's growing influence will require new rules of engagement, as well as fact-based analysis and technical debate. China has made great efforts to learn from, emulate, and adopt global legal practices. European and US policymakers must cultivate an equally accurate understanding of China's actions and ambitions.

Painting China as an irrational agitator seeking to impose its will on the rest of the world is an easy way to curry popular support. But sensationalist reports of “secret police stations” do not contribute to sustaining a rules-based international order. In fact, this simplistic narrative grossly underestimates China and the challenges posed by its sophisticated and strategic efforts to use the law to promote its national interests.

Trust deficit

Sir, China's growing discomfort over closer ties between India and America is evident in the Pentagon's latest report to the US Congress. China has also objected to the ongoing India-US military exercises taking place about 100 km from the LAC. Earlier this year, China had reacted sharply to comments by US Army's Pacific Commanding General Charles A Flynn, who had termed the situation in eastern Ladakh as alarming and red-flagged Chinese infrastructure build-up along the LAC. Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesman Zhao Lijian had accused American officials of adding fuel to fire and stated that Beijing and New Delhi had the 'will and capability' to resolve their differences through talks. However, China has repeatedly failed to match its conciliatory words with verifiable action to reduce hostilities on the ground. Even as military commanders of the two nations have held 16 rounds of talks in the past two years, the Chinese have remained elusive on the disengagement of troops from the friction points of Depsang and Demchok. The trust deficit between India and China has spurred Washington to strengthen defence and strategic cooperation with New Delhi. The US sees India as a key ally in the region which can possibly deter China from throwing its weight around.

The ED presumed that the money used for land purchase might have come from the alleged coal levy scam, he said. ED lawyer Saurabh Kumar Pandey claimed that the central agency had enough evidence against Chaurasia in the case. Chaurasia, considered a powerful bureaucrat, was arrested under the criminal sections of the

Rijiju bats for regional languages

Don't derail a working system: SC

New Delhi, Dec 2: The Supreme Court said Friday the existing collegium system should not be derailed on the basis of statements of "some busybody", asserting the top court is one of the most transparent institutions.

Amid divisions within the judiciary and its festering dispute with the government over the system under which existing judges appoint judges to constitutional courts, it said it does not want to comment on what a few former apex court judges, who were once members of the Supreme Court collegium, are now saying about the mechanism.

A bench of Justices MR Shah and CT Ravikumar said, "Nowadays, it has become a fashion to comment upon earlier decisions (of the collegium) made when they (former judges) were part of the collegium. We don't want to say anything on their comments."

"Let the existing collegium sys-



tem which is functioning not get derailed. Collegium does not work on the basis of some busybody. Let the collegium function according to its duties, we are one of the most transparent institutions," it said.

The top court was hearing a petition by RTI activist Anjali Bhardwaj against the Delhi High Court order dismissing her plea seeking the agenda of the Supreme Court collegium's meeting held on December 12, 2018 when certain decisions were purportedly taken on the elevation of some judges to the apex court.

On the fateful day, she mixed poison with the food that she gave to her children. Afterwards she had ended her life, said the police. Usna Kausar worked at a nursing home in Maddur town. The husband and wife often quarrelled over a family dispute.

The incident took place on Thursday night and it came to light on Friday. The police visited the spot and have taken up the investigation.

Sidhu murder mastermind detained in US

Chandigarh, Dec 2: Murdered Punjabi singer Sidhu Moosewala's father Friday welcomed the news of the detention of gangster Goldy Brar, prime accused in the case, by the US authorities.

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann, who is currently in Ahmedabad confirmed the development, saying that Brar has been detained by the police in California and that he would "definitely be brought to India". He will be in the custody of the Punjab Police "very soon", he told reporters.

In Mansa, Moosewala's father

Balkaur Singh said he was yet to get any official information about the development.

"I do not have any official information. I learnt through media reports that Brar has been detained. If it is so, I welcome it," Singh told reporters. Singh had on Thursday called upon the Union government to announce a reward of Rs 2 crore for any information leading to the arrest of Canada-based gangster Brar. He had even offered to pay for the reward from his own pocket.

Singh on Friday said he seeks severe punishment for Brar. He said it is because of criminals



like these that the reputation of the country also gets tarnished and that is why they should be put behind bars.

He said he will not sit quietly till such criminals are punished. Singh said his son was innocent

and committed to his state. Shubhdeep Singh Sidhu, popularly known as Sidhu Moosewala, was shot dead in Punjab's Mansa district on May 29.

Satinderjeet Singh alias Goldy Brar, a member of the Lawrence Bishnoi gang, claimed responsibility for the singer's murder. A red corner notice, which allows the arrest and detention of a fugitive abroad, was issued against him.

According to the 1,850-page chargesheet filed in the Moosewala murder case, Goldy Brar was the mastermind behind the killing.

Kanye's Twitter acc suspended again

Washington: Twitter Inc Friday suspended Kanye West's account again, just two months after it was reinstated, after its owner Elon Musk said he had violated the platform's rules prohibiting incitement to violence. Musk, who calls himself a free speech absolutist, had welcomed the return of the rapper, now known as Ye, to the platform in October. "I tried my best. Despite that, he again violated our rule against incitement to violence. Account will be suspended," Musk tweeted late Thursday.

Seoul places new sanctions on NK

Seoul: South Korea Friday sanctioned eight people and seven companies suspected of engaging in illicit activities to finance North Korea's growing nuclear weapons and missile programmes. The move, which prohibits South Koreans from conducting any type of business with them without authorisation, was largely symbolic as there are little financial dealings between the rival Koreas. But the steps may still draw an irritated response from North Korea, which last month called South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol and his government "idiots" and a "wild dog gnawing on a bone given by the US".

Peru enters 5th Covid-19 wave

Lima: Peru has entered into its fifth wave of the Covid-19 pandemic after an increase of confirmed cases in the past three weeks, Health Minister Kelly Portalatino announced. A total of 6,541 new infections were detected, and nine deaths were reported between Tuesday and Wednesday, Xinhua news agency quoted the Minister as saying. Since the start of the pandemic in early 2020, Peru has had a total of 4,252,383 cases and 217,414 deaths, according to the Health Ministry.

Global terrorists

Washington: The US has designated four top leaders of al-Qaeda and the Pakistani Taliban groups as global terrorists, Secretary of State Antony Blinken has said as he emphasised that the Biden administration will ensure that terrorists do not operate with impunity in Afghanistan. The terrorists who were designated on Thursday were Osama Mehmood, the emir of al-Qaeda in Indian Subcontinent (AQIS), Atif Yahya Ghouri, the deputy emir of AQIS and Muhammad Maruf who is responsible for the group's recruiting branch.

London, Dec 2: One of the sons of slain al-Qaeda chief Osama Bin Laden has claimed that his father was training him to follow in his footsteps, making him fire guns as a child in Afghanistan and using his dogs to test chemical weapons. In an interview with "The Sun" newspaper while on a visit to Qatar, Bin Laden's fourth eldest son Omar claims he was a "victim" and has tried to forget the "bad times" with his father. "I said goodbye and he said goodbye. I'd had enough of that world. He wasn't happy that I was leaving," he tells the newspaper. "I saw it," he says, with reference

to chemical experiments conducted by his father's henchman. "They tried it on my dogs and I wasn't happy. I just try to forget all the bad times as much as I can. It's very difficult. You suffer all the time," he said. Now a painter, Omar believes his art is like therapy and his favourite subject is "mountains after living in Afghanistan for five years". His artwork reportedly sells for up to GBP 8,500 a canvas. "They give me a safe feeling, like I'm untouchable," said Omar, born in Saudi Arabia to Bin Laden's first wife Najwa in March 1981. When asked why he thinks his father chose him as his heir, he tells the newspaper: "I don't know,

They say they threw him in the ocean but I don't believe that. I think they took his body to America, for people to see."

A RAY OF HOPE RUSSIA 'OPEN' TO TALKS ON UKRAINE



After more than nine months of fighting and with winter tightening its grip, Western countries are trying every possible measure to put an end to the war which has shattered global peace

Kyiv, Dec 2: Russian President Vladimir Putin is "open to negotiations" on Ukraine but the West must accept Moscow's demands, the Kremlin said Friday, a day after US President Joe Biden said he was willing to talk if Putin were looking for a way to end the war. Biden and French President Emmanuel Macron said after talks at the White House Thursday that they would hold Russia to account for its actions in Ukraine but the US president also appeared to hold out an olive branch to Moscow while stressing he saw no sign of any change in Putin's stance. Biden has not spoken directly with Putin since Russia invaded Ukraine February 24. In March, Biden branded Putin a "butcher" who "cannot stay in power". In Moscow's first public response

Peskov reiterated that Russian President Vladimir Putin remains open to talks but the Western demand that Moscow

first withdraws its troops from Ukraine is unacceptable. His comments came as Putin spoke with German Chancellor Olaf Scholz. Scholz's office said he made clear to Putin "that there must be a diplomatic solution as quickly as possible, which includes a withdrawal of Russian troops." Putin told Scholz that the Western line on Ukraine was "destructive" and urged Berlin to rethink its approach. Fighting is raging in eastern Ukraine, with the town of Bakhmut the main target of Moscow's artillery attacks, while Russian forces in the southern Kherson and Zaporizhzhia regions remain on the defensive, Ukraine's General Staff said in its latest battlefield update. In a bid to reduce the money available for Moscow's war effort, the European Union has tentatively agreed to a \$60 a barrel price cap on Russian seaborne oil, diplomats said. The measure will need to be approved by all EU governments in a written procedure by Friday.

Prime Minister Modi Thursday said India will work to further promote oneness, inspired by the theme of "One Earth, One Family, One Future" and listed terror, climate change, pandemic as the greatest challenges that can be best fought together. India's G20 priorities will be shaped in consultation with not

just our G20 partners, but also our fellow-travellers in the global South, whose voice often goes unheard, Modi said in an article which appeared in several newspapers and was posted on his website as well. India's G20 agenda will be inclusive, ambitious, action-oriented and decisive, he said. "Let us join together to make India's G20 Presidency a Presidency of healing, harmony and hope. Let us work together to shape a new par-

adigm — of human-centric globalisation," Modi noted. The country looks forward to working on encouraging sustainable lifestyles, depoliticising the global supply of food, fertilisers and medical products among other subjects, the Prime Minister said in a series of tweets. The next G20 Leaders' Summit at the level of Heads of State/Government is scheduled to be held on September 9 and 10 in New Delhi. The G20 or Group of 20 is an intergovernmental forum of the world's major developed and developing economies. It comprises Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, China, France, Germany, India, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, the Republic of Korea, Mexico, Russia, Saudi Arabia, South Africa, Turkey, the UK, the US and the European Union (EU). Together, they account for over 80 per cent of the global Gross Domestic Product, 75 per cent of international trade and two-thirds of the world population.

FARMGATE SCANDAL

Ramaphosa's future as SA Prez in trouble

Johannesburg, Dec 2: Senior officials in South Africa's ruling African National Congress (ANC) were gathering Friday to decide whether President Cyril Ramaphosa should stay on after an inquiry found evidence of misconduct over cash hidden at his farm. His future has been in doubt since publication Wednesday of a report by a panel of experts investigating the alleged theft of millions of dollars of cash stuffed into furniture in the multi-millionaire leader's Phala Phala game farm in 2020. Ramaphosa has denied any wrongdoing and has not been charged with any crime. The president has said the money was much less than the \$4 million to \$8 million reported, and that it was the proceeds of game sales at the farm. The media has dubbed the affair "Farmgate".



For the investigators, the theft, which only came to light in June, has raised questions about how Ramaphosa acquired the money, why he wasn't keeping it in a bank and whether or not it had been declared to authorities. Ramaphosa put a pledge to fight endemic graft at the heart of his successful drive to oust predecessor Jacob Zuma in 2018. More than 80 officials from the ANC's senior entity, the National Executive Committee (NEC), were meeting in Johannesburg, the ANC announced. The scandal has damaged South Africa's image as a relatively stable investment destination and gateway to the continent. The country was only just recovering from several corruption scandals linked to Zuma, which authorities are now investigating.

Indonesia set to penalise sex outside marriage

Indonesia, the world's most populous Muslim-majority nation, has hundreds of regulations at the local level that discriminate against women, religious minorities, and LGBT people

Jakarta, Dec 2: Indonesia's parliament is expected to pass a new criminal code this month that will penalise sex outside marriage with a punishment of up to one year in jail, officials have confirmed. The legislative overhaul will also ban insulting the president or state institutions and expressing any views counter to Indonesia's state ideology. Cohabitation before marriage is also banned. Decades in the making, the new criminal code is expected to be passed December 15, Indonesia's deputy justice minister, Edward Omar Sharif Hiariej, told Reuters. "We're proud to have a criminal code that's in line with Indonesian values," he told Reuters in an interview. Bambang Wuryanto, a lawmaker

involved in the draft, said the new code could be passed by as early as next week. The draft has the support of some Islamic groups in a country where conservatism is on the rise, although opponents argue that it reverses liberal reforms enacted after the 1998 fall of authoritarian leader Suharto. A previous draft of the code was set to be passed in 2019 but sparked nationwide protests. Tens of thousands of people demonstrated at the time against a raft of laws, especially those seen to regulate morality and free speech, which they said would curtail civil liberties. Critics say say minimal changes to the code have been made since then, although the government has in recent months held public consultations around the country to provide information about the changes.



The changes to the code would be a "huge a setback to Indonesian democracy", said Andreas Harsono of Human Rights Watch. Some changes that have been made include a provision that could allow the death penalty to be commuted to life imprisonment after 10 years of good behaviour. The criminalisation of abhorrence, with the exception of rape

victims, and imprisonment for "black magic", remain in the code. Mumbai, Dec 2: Equity benchmark indices ended lower Friday, halting their eight-day rally, amid a weak trend in global markets and emergence of profit-taking.

The 30-share BSE Sensex fell 415.69 points or 0.66 per cent to settle at 62,868.50. During the day, it tanked 604.56 points or 0.95 per cent to 62,679.63. The broader NSE Nifty dipped 116.40 points or 0.62 per cent to end at 18,696.10.

Among the Sensex pack, Mahindra & Mahindra, Hindustan Unilever, Maruti, Nestle, HDFC, Asian Paints, Bajaj Finance and Power Grid were among the major laggards. Tata Steel, Dr Reddy's, Tech Mahindra, IndusInd Bank and HCL Technologies were among the winners.

"Markets witnessed profit-taking and lost over half a per cent, taking a breather after the recent surge," said Ajit Mishra, VP - Technical Research, Religare Broking Ltd.

The broader market, however, bucked the trend and ended in the green, with the BSE midcap gauge settling 0.80 per cent higher and smallcap index climbed 0.70 per cent.



Among sectoral indices, power fell 1.23 per cent, auto declined 1.12 per cent, utilities (1.10 per cent), tech (0.52 per cent), consumer durables (0.46 per cent), IT (0.41 per cent) and bankex (0.32 per cent).

Commodities, industrials, capital goods, telecommunication and metal were among the winners.

The rupee pared its initial gains to settle down by 7 paise at 81.33 against the US dollar Friday. At the interbank foreign exchange market, the local unit opened at 81.11, but pared the gains and ended at 81.33, down 7 paise over its previous close. On Thursday, the rupee appreciated by 4 paise to close at 81.26 against the US dollar.

The BSE benchmark had climbed 184.54 points or 0.29 per cent to settle at 63,284.19, its fresh record closing high. Thursday The Nifty advanced 54.15 points or 0.29 per cent to end at 18,812.50, its new record closing high.

Doha, Dec 2: Same stadium. Same result. Similar shocking victory for Japan at the World Cup. After beating Germany 2-1 in their opener, Japan found their way into the round of 16 of the World Cup by defeating Spain by the same score in their last group game Thursday. Spain also advanced despite the loss.

Japan scored twice early in the second half to come from behind and defeat another European powerhouse and make it to the knockout stage for the second straight time. It was the first time Japan has advanced past the group stage in back-to-back tournaments.

Ao Tanaka scored the winning goal from close range early in the second half. It took about two minutes for video review officials to confirm the ball hadn't gone out of bounds before the goal that gave Japan the win at Khalifa International Stadium, which is where Japan had shocked Germany in their opener.

Japan finished at the top of Group E to set up a last-16 matchup against Croatia. Spain finished second and will take on Morocco.

Spain and Germany—who beat Costa Rica 4-2—both had three points in the group. But Spain had a superior goal difference from their first group match so Germany was eliminated.

The group standings bounced back and forth during both matches. Costa Rica were beating Germany

at one point. If that result had stood, Costa Rica would have eliminated Spain.

Alvaro Morata scored first for Spain in the 11th minute and Spain was in control until Japan rallied after halftime. Ritsu Doan equalised

in the 48th with a left-footed shot from outside the box, and Tanaka added the second three minutes later. Morata became the first player to score in the first three Spain matches at the World Cup since Telmo Zarra in 1950. Spain had

opened with a 7-0 rout of Costa Rica before conceding late in a 1-1 draw against Germany.

Japan were eliminated by Belgium in the last 16 in Russia. The Blue Samurais have never gone past the round of 16 at World Cups.

VAR controversy hits again



Doha: The goal that dumped Germany out of the 2022 World Cup initially didn't count. Japan scored it to take the lead during their win over Spain, but referees initially disallowed it because the ball, a second before the goal, seemed to have crossed the end line.

But the video assistant referee (VAR), after reviewing the play, overturned the call on the field because, although replays and still photos both appeared to show the ball crossing the line, it didn't—

at least not fully, apparently.

There was, from some camera angles, green grass between the ball and the white end line. That bit of green led millions of fans, and even refereeing experts, to assume the goal wouldn't count.

But the excuse or debate was wrong, as far as the rule is concerned. That bit of green between ball and line does not matter. By rule, the ball is only out of play when the entirety of it has fully cleared the plane of the boundary.

In other words, if you were to draw a line perpendicular to the ground—straight up from the end line toward the sky—and that vertical line intersects with any part of the ball, the ball is still in play.

Camera angles that offered a bird's eye view seemed to show that the ball hadn't done this; that a sliver of it still hovered above a sliver of the line. And thus, after video review, the goal was given.

The decision was not infallible. Whereas goals can be checked via goal-line technology, similar to the "Hawk-Eye" system popularised by tennis, goal-line tech only applies between the posts.

The VAR, though, would have had access to multiple angles from cameras perched in line with the end line. FIFA has not published the video or still photos used to overturn the decision on the field, but the video assistants must have concluded that those angles were definitive.

S Korea kill 2 birds with 1 stone

Al Rayyan, Dec 2: South Korea scored a last-gasp goal to beat already-qualified Portugal 2-1 at the World Cup in a comeback win that sent the Asian side into the last 16 ahead of Uruguay on goals scored.

With the clock ticking down on South Korea's time in the tournament, striker Son Heung-min ran free after a Portugal corner in added time and slipped a pass to Hwang Hee-chan who fired past Diogo Costa to spark wild celebrations.

After the whistle blew, the anxious Korean players gathered in a circle awaiting the end of the Uruguay-Ghana game and exploded with joy when the news arrived that the South Americans had only won 2-0 in their Group H clash.

South Korea had to beat Portugal at the Education City Stadium to stand a chance of going through to the last 16 and their win catapulted them from fourth to second place

by virtue of having scored four goals in the tournament to Uruguay's two.

Winger Ricardo Horta had put Portugal ahead with their first goal attempt in the fifth minute when he found himself inside the box and converted a neat cut-back by defender Diogo Dalot.

The Koreans equalised later through defender Kim Young-gwon who scored after the ball bounced off Cristiano Ronaldo's back following a corner: Ronaldo, seeking a goal to equal Portugal's overall World Cup record of nine scored by the great Eusebio, had his first chance just after the half-hour mark with a solo effort which Kim Seung-gyu saved and he was in any case offside.

URUGUAY BOW OUT

Luis Suarez cried on the sidelines after Uruguay were eliminated despite a 2-0 win over Ghana. The result also put Ghana out of the competition.

Suarez played a key role in both first-half goals scored by Giorgian De Arrascaeta and Uruguay appeared headed for the round of 16 after inflicting more pain on Ghana 12 years after their now-infamous meeting in the quarterfinals at the 2010 World Cup.

Then, Suarez denied Ghana a winning goal with a deliberate handball on the goal-line and having been sent off, he celebrated wildly on the sidelines when Ghana missed the resultant penalty.

Uruguay were in a position to go through in Qatar until South Korea's late goal gave it a 2-1 win over Portugal in the other Group H game. That meant Uruguay needed to score one more goal in the dying minutes of their game to qualify.

They didn't and were eliminated. Suarez was distraught on the sidelines and covered his face with his shirt having been substituted in what was likely his last World Cup appearance.



DISAPPOINTMENT FOR GERMANS

Al Khor (Qatar), Dec 2: Germany were eliminated from the group stage of the World Cup for the second tournament in a row.

The four-time champions beat Costa Rica 4-2 Thursday but it wasn't enough to reach the round of 16. Japan's 2-1 victory over Spain in the other group game allowed both of those teams to advance instead, with the Japanese team finishing at the top of Group E.

"I was just in the changing

room and as you can imagine, the disappointment is huge," Germany coach Hansi Flick said. Playing as defending champions at the last World Cup, Germany also were knocked out in the group stage.

Germany, who lost to Japan in their opening match in Qatar, needed help from the other match in order to advance with a victory at Al Bayt Stadium, but things didn't go its way. If Spain had beaten Japan, the Germans would have finished second in the group.

It all started so well with Serge

Gnabry putting Germany in front against Costa Rica with a 10th-minute header and Spain taking an early lead against Japan at the Khalifa International Stadium here. Both matches were turned upside down in the second half.

Yeltsin Tejeda evened the score in the 58th minute and Juan Vargas scrambled another in the 70th, putting Costa Rica ahead 2-1 and on target to advance at Spain's expense.

But Germany substitute Kai Havertz made it 2-2 three minutes later and then restored Germany's lead in the 85th. Another substitute, Niclas Füllkrug, added the fourth.

Japan finished at the top of Group E with six points, two more than both Spain and Germany. Spain progressed because of their better goal difference, with most of them coming from their opening 7-0 rout of Costa Rica. Germany would have needed five more goals to match the Spanish tally.

The match was also notable because French referee Stéphanie Frappart became the first woman to officiate a men's WC match.

It is unbelievably a repeat story of 2018. On a thrilling night the World Champions of 2014 are out of the tournament again in the group league. We know that Germany are in the process of changes. They are trying to rebuild, trying to make a new team. So, in the last World Cup their exit in the first round was understandable.

However, this edition's result proves that they failed to rebuild the team. For them Qatar was a place to start a new chapter, but they repeated the history. It's quite inconceivable that Germany would exit at the group stage in two successive World Cups—but it's happened.

Japan played brilliant matches in the group league but (vs Spain) they won with a controversial goal. Apart from that we must praise the Asian team.

In my opinion the big surprise of this World Cup is undoubtedly Japan. Realistically it's not so sur-

prising, since they have been improving year after year. But this year they surprised with their attacking game and the speed of their tireless players.

And to me credit also goes to my Brazilian legend Zico who changed Japan football. Next up for the Japanese is a round of 16 tie against Croatia, where they will play as underdogs once more.

Earlier, Spain coach Luis Enrique said that football was a show and that you had to have fun. It wasn't what really happened. Enrique was seen to be restless and very nervous, because of the bad game that his men were having.

At this stage I can say, one of the favourites to win this World Cup is Argentina. Slowly they are getting back their rhythm. But the problem is some of the players are already feeling tired and fatigued. Coach must find out the way to overcome this.

As an example, Angel Di Maria. He is one of the main players and perhaps coach Lionel Scaloni will lose him for the game against Australia. It is not to worry, since they have plenty of good players. But it is not a good sign that there are already injured players just before the start of the knockout stage. They must overcome these issues to progress through the World Cup.

BCCI set to introduce 'impact player' rule in IPL

New Delhi, Dec 2: In its bid to provide tactical flexibility to the teams, the BCCI is all set to introduce the 'impact player' system in the upcoming edition of IPL where the captains will be able to replace one playing-XI member with a substitute player during the match.

BCCI had put the system on trial during the Syed Mushtaq Ali T20 tournament in October and the move was largely welcomed

by the state teams.

According to sources privy to development, the matter was discussed at the IPL Governing Council on Thursday evening. The franchisees have already been sent a note with regards to introduction of tactical substitution.

"The matter has been discussed at the IPL GC meeting and BCCI will share the details soon," an IPL franchise source told PTI on conditions of anonymity. While the exact details are awaited, the play-

ing regulations, followed during the Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy, would be adopted.

According to the 'impact player', a team can have four pre-decided substitute players who can be pencilled as "tactical substitutions" and one of them can be used in a match situation. However any such substitute has to be introduced, if required, into the match before or by the end of the 14th over of a team's innings. The 2023 IPL will played between April and October.

Odisha FC move to 2nd with victory

An equaliser came in the second half when Rochharzela scored just five minutes after coming on. In the 78th minute, Crespo unleashed a shot at goal, which was parried away by the keeper straight to Jerry, who put the hosts back in front.

The narrow win kept Odisha FC's 100 percent record at home intact and helped them leapfrog Hyderabad FC and move into second place, three points behind leaders Mumbai City FC with a game in hand. NorthEast United FC remained at the foot of the table, still waiting to get off the mark.

Chinese GP cancelled

LONDON: Formula One confirmed Friday that the Chinese Grand Prix will not take place in 2023, making it the fourth year in a row the race has been cancelled because of the coronavirus pandemic. F1 has not visited the Shanghai circuit since 2019 as China pursues a strict policy of lockdowns and entry restrictions during the pandemic.
