## Romantic bilingual poet Durga Prasad Panda says when mobile phone was unheard of and land phone was a high class luxury, love found its way through artistically handwritten letters and cupid struck the lovebirds without much fanfare

nown as the 'Father of English poetry' Geoffrey Chaucer's 14th century poem Parliament of Fowls describes a group of birds which gather together in the early spring to choose their mates for the year. This is one of the earliest references to the idea that St. Valentine's Day is a special day for lovers.

Since then, the second week of the second month of every year has been earmarked to celebrate the essence of love and relationships. Moreover, it has turned into a significant cultural, religious, and commercial celebration of romance in many regions of the world and Odisha is no exception.

With just a couple of days to go before Valentine's Day, SundayPOST caught up with a few euphoric lovers who go down their memory lane to dote their valentines.

#### Love is as ancient as this earth

Love is not an 'Entitlement', you 'Earn' it by making yourself 'Worthy' of its grace. It is a primal energy and emotion and is as ancient as this earth and civilization itself,

believes bilingual romantic poet Durga Prasad Panda.

"The force, pattern and intensity around love are not something new: what is new

are their outer manifestations and packaging. I believe that there is always a certain sense of 'timelessness' to love, leaving aside constrictions like 'modern' times or old times. Love brings out the best and the worst in human beings. It defies and thwarts any attempt to define or box it into fixed notions. For me, love gives you an elevation, depth and spread; all at the same point of time. Love is a splendored thing that makes the world go round itself and makes life exquisitely colourful," says the poet.

He recalls, "During our formative years, back in the 1980s, we didn't hear anything like Valentine Day and its significance. Unlike its brazenness today, in our small town upbringing 'love' was talked about in whispers, that too in a closed circle. Friends used to make fun linking one's name with someone from the opposite sex on slightest pretext: an exchange of glance or note (book) s was



cause enough to spark a murmur leading to sleepless nights, gossip, and lots of daydreaming. In those days our ideas of love originated from and shaped mostly by Bollywood films and cheap novels. No wonder, Cupid's arrow struck us without much of a fanfare and show".

He goes on to add that in those days

when mobile phone was unheard of and land phone was a high class luxury, love found its way through artistically handwritten letters; the smell of ink, paper, sweat of her hands and the long wait surrounding it added a mysterious aura to it. But the toughest part was hiding these love letters for fear of getting caught by the prying, hawkish eyes. The whole secrecy of it was so profoundly beautiful that added a separate charm to love, recalls the poet whose poems have been anthologized thrice in British Council's Poetry India.

# CELEBRATING VOICE FROM THE SKY

n World Radio Day, we celebrate the impact and influence of radio as a medium of communication and entertainment. Despite the development of new technology, radio maintains a distinct position in our lives by providing a unique experience and a connection to the outside world.

Since its inception in the early 20th century, radio has advanced significantly. It has changed and evolved from being the main source of news and entertainment to accommodating the changing demands of its listeners. However, of late podcasts have significantly replaced traditional radio. People now frequently use podcasts to listen to their favourite music, news, television series, and other contents. Podcasts are more popular option for listeners in India due to their accessibility, personalisation, and on-demand nature.

Ahead of World Radio Day, a couple of RJs shared with **SundayPOST** their thoughts on the rise of podcasts and whether they are likely to eclipse radio in a few years from now.

**RJ Komal** of Radio Chocolate says, "Radio, in my opinion, has a distinct vibe. We listen to the radio for entertainment, current events, and news. Radio provides up-to-date news, traffic reports, and current

affairs, but podcasts are unable to do the same. Podcasts feature packages that are published later and not supplied with live feed. In podcasts, RJs record interviews, package it, add some finishing touches, and edit it appropriately before uploading it so that listeners may access it later. Podcasts require a lot of packages and time to produce their content. You can't get news that is current and in real-time like you can get on the radio."

Looking back the days gone by Komal

continues: "Earlier, in the absence of television, people used to rely on the radio to listen to music, information, and news, so they were quite excited at the launching of All India Radio. Then, radio listeners in Odisha again greeted

they may pick up any RJ's show or other specific content from the website of that particular channel, she says while acknowledging that the number of listeners has perhaps dropped slightly as a result of social media, but people still tune in to various radio channels.

# 10 FUN FACTS ABOUT RADIO

- One of the first scheduled radio broadcast services, known as PCGG, started at Rotterdam, Netherlands, November 6, 1919.
- India's radio broadcast history returns to the mid-1920s. During British rule, the first radio programme was broadcast in July 1923 by the Radio Club of Mumbai.
- 3. In 1922, the UK government presented a radio license costing 10 shillings (50 paise). From 1922-1971 people were unable to listen to the radio in the UK without having a license.
- Marconi made the first successful transatlantic transmission of radio waves in 1901 and 1902. In 1903 Marconi empowered US President Roosevelt to send a radio message to Edward VIII.
- Marconi won a Nobel Prize for "contributions to the development of wireless telegraphy" in 1909.
- 6. In September 2010, Spain proposed to observe World Radio Day on February 13, that day the United Nations radio was set up in 1946.
- 7. The private Indian Broadcasting Company Limited (IBC) appeared in July 1927, when it began working with two radio stations in Mumbai and Calcutta.
- During the 1930s the US President began sending messages about the nation every week to the American public.
- 9. On June 8, 1936 Indian State Broadcasting Service was renamed All India Radio.


## **RISHIKESH, UTTARAKHAND**
