IMA advises against antibiotics use

New Delhi, March 4: A persistent cough, sometimes accompanied by fever, running through India for the past two-three months is due to Influenza A subtype H3N2, ICMR experts said.

The H3N2, which has been in wide circulation for the past two-three months, causes more hospitalisations than other subtypes, said Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) scientists who keep a close watch on ailments caused by respiratory viruses

through the Virus Research and Diagnostic Laboratories network. They have also suggested a list of Dos and Don'ts for people to follow to protect themselves from contracting the virus.

The Indian Medical Association (IMA) has advised against indis-

criminate use of antibiotics amid rising cases of cough, cold and nausea across the country. Seasonal fever will last five to seven days, it said.

The fever goes away at the end of three days but the cough can

persist for up to three weeks, the IMA's Standing Committee for Anti-Microbial Resistance said.

The association also asked doctors to prescribe only symptomatic treatment and not antibiotics.

"Right now, people start taking antibiotics like Azithromycin and Amoxiclav etc, that too without caring for done and frequency and stop it once start feeling better. This needs to be stopped as it leads to antibiotic resistance. Whenever there will be a real use of antibiotics, they will not work due to the resistance," the IMA said.

BALL IN STATE'S COURT

State should provide infra required for HC bench, says Law Minister Kiren Rijiju

Bhubaneswar, March 4: Hope for establishment of a permanent bench of Orissa High Court in western Odisha rekindled as the Centre Saturday said that it is ready to help the state after receiving a complete proposal from the state government.

Speaking to mediapersons here, Union Law Minister Kiren Rijiju said, "The Orissa High Court and state government have to take the call on establishment of circuit bench of the High Court. We are ready to help the state as we will give approval to it." It is the responsibility of the state government to provide required infrastructure for establishment of a bench of the High Court, he said. "I have written a letter in this re-

gard twice and even MPs from Odisha raised questions in the Parliament. In reply, all I can say is the Odisha government and Orissa High Court should take the matter forward and take necessary steps. We are ready to give approval," he added. The Union Law Minister was in Bhubaneswar

to attend 'Nyaya Yajna', the first conference of Central Government Councils of Eastern States.

Earlier, writing a letter to BJP MP Suresh Pujari, Rijiju had said that the High Court benches, at a place other than its principal seat, are established in accordance with the recommendations made by Jaswant Singh Commission and a judgement pronounced by the apex court in 2000.

The bench can be set up after due consideration of a complete proposal from the state government incorporating readiness to provide infrastructure and meet the expenditure, along with the consent of the Chief Justice of the concerned High Court and the consent of the Governor of the state, he had mentioned in the letter. Mines dept official held with 368% DA

Bhubaneswar, March 4: The Vigilance department Saturday arrested additional director of Mines, Umesh Chandra Jena, after detecting ₹1.64 crore in cash and other disproportionate assets (DA) in his possession.


An official said that after his arrest, Jena was taken to the court of a special judge, Vigilance for possession of DA to the tune of 368 per cent against his known sources of income.

The anti-corruption wing officials Friday conducted raids on the properties of Jena at 13 places in Khurda and Keonjhar districts.

Apart from the cash, the sleuths also detected one multi-storey building in Bhubaneswar and three buildings at Keonjhar, five plots in Keonjhar, two four-wheelers, two two-wheelers, 650 gram gold from the mining department official, they said.

Similarly, additional chief engineer of Bhawanipatna Minor Irrigation Circle (KBK), Kandarpa Pradhan was also arrested by Vigilance for illegally accumulating DA to the tune of 75 per cent of his known sources of income. A case (5/23) has been registered in this regard with Bhubaneswar Vigilance police station here.

Huma on representation of women in movies

Mumbai: It is an exciting time for female artistes in cinema, believes actor Huma Qureshi, who says there has been an interesting 'shift' in the way storytellers are approaching female characters on screen.

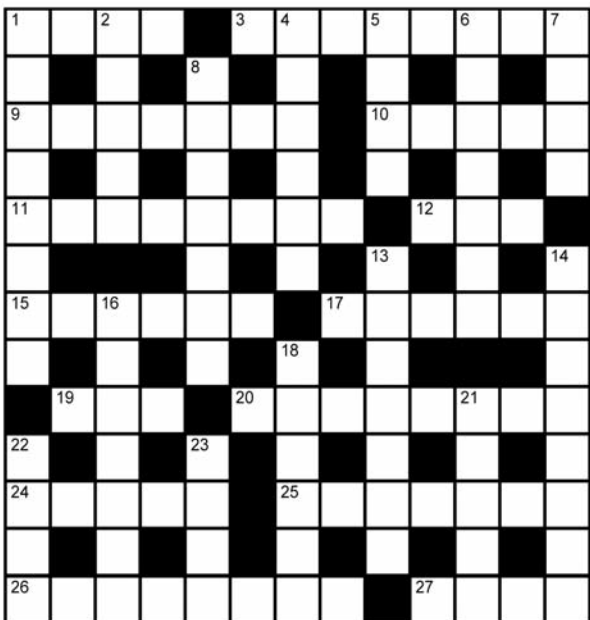

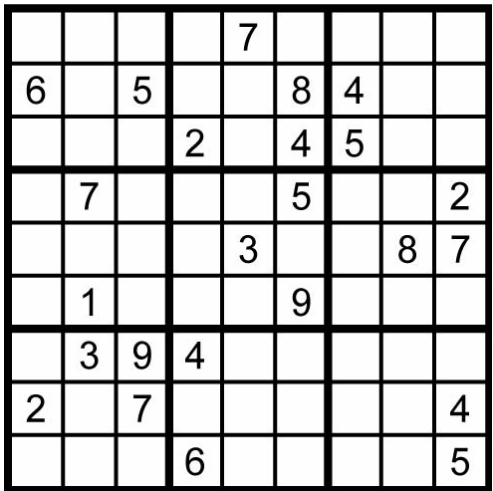

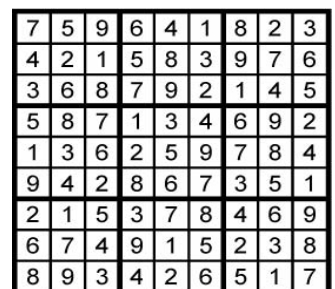

Police should clear doubts: LoP

Sambalpur, March 4: Leader of Opposition in Odisha Assembly Jayanaryan Mishra said questions have been raised about the mysterious death of a B.Tech graduate in Burla and police should clear the doubts.

The body of B.Tech graduate of Veer Surendra Sai University of Technology (VSSUT), Burla, Chinmayee Priyadarshini Sahu was fished out from the power channel of Hirakud Dam March 1.

Speaking to media persons Friday, Mishra alleged that police are trying to suppress the issue. Doubts have been raised in the death incident of the girl and police should try to clear the doubts, he said.

The BJP leader said that if the police don't take appropriate steps, the issue would be raised in the Assembly.

Chinmayee, who was from Madanpur Rampur in Kalahandi dis-



trict, allegedly jumped into the power channel of Hirakud Dam after receiving her degree in the convocation, which was held February 28. Her family members, however, alleged that alleged that Chinmayee

was strangled to death before she was thrown into water.

Sources in VIMSAR, where the autopsy was conducted, said, the autopsy report has already been handed over to the police and the report found drowning to be the cause of death.

CHINMAYEE DEATH CASE

Police said, prima facie, no evidence substantiating the allegation, made by the family, has been found. However, the investigation into the matter is still on and it is being investigated on the basis of the allegation. To investigate all possible angles of the case, police have also formed special teams.

Inspector-in-charge (IIC) of Burla police station, Susant Dash said, a team has been sent to Bhubaneswar. The team will search the rented room of Chinmayee in Bhubaneswar to find if there is any written document related to the incident. Moreover, a scientific team visited the spot, where the inci-

POLYGRAPH TEST ON DEY, TUDU

Bhubaneswar: Burla police Saturday carried out lie detection or polygraph tests on Pritiman Dey and Manas Tudu at the State Forensic Science Laboratory (SFSL) in Bhubaneswar in connection with the suspicious death of Chinmayee Priyadarshini Sahu, a former student of VSSUT, Burla in Sambalpur, February 28. Police asked several questions to elicit vital clues from both Dey and Tudu during the test which continued for around four hours. They tried to ascertain whether he was present at the bridge along with the deceased, the conversation that transpired between the duo on the fateful day, and the nature of the relationship between them.

Sputnik vax scientist killed

Moscow, March 4: Andrey Botikov, one of the scientists who helped to create the Russian Covid-19 vaccine Sputnik V, was strangled to death with a belt at his apartment here and police have arrested a suspect in connection with the murder, according to a Russian media report Saturday.

Botikov, 47, who worked as a senior researcher at Gamaleya National Research Center for Ecology and Mathematics, was found dead in his apartment Thursday, Russian News Agency TASS quoted the Investigative Committee of the Russian Federation as saying. Russian President Vladimir Putin honoured the virologist with the



Order of Merit for the Fatherland award for his work on the COVID vaccine in 2021. Botikov was one of 18 scientists who developed the Sputnik V vaccine in 2020, according to reports. His death is being investigated as a murder, the committee, which is the investigating authority in Russia, said in a Telegram statement.

According to investigators, a 29-year-old young man strangled

Botikov with a belt during an argument and fled. Law enforcement agencies said the murder was a domestic crime and the result of a conflict, the report said.

The suspect was arrested shortly after Botikov's body was found, the federal investigative agency said in the statement.

"The location of the attacker was established in short order. During the interrogation, he pled guilty and was charged. The defendant has a previous criminal record, as he stood trial on charges of committing a serious crime. In the near future, the investigation plans to petition the court to place the defendant in custody pending trial," the Investigative Committee said.

CBI gets 2 more days of Sisodia's custody

New Delhi, March 4: A Delhi court Saturday extended by two days the CBI custody of former deputy chief minister Manish Sisodia, arrested



in a corruption case related to the excise policy. Special judge MK Nagpal directed the agency to produce the Aam Aadmi Party leader before the court Monday.

The CBI had sought

three more days of custody of Sisodia after producing him before the court on expiry of his three-day remand granted earlier.

The CBI's plea was opposed by Sisodia's lawyer who said the inefficiency of the agency to complete the probe cannot be ground for remand and he cannot be asked to incriminate himself. P9

thority has approved two projects with a cumulative investment of ₹203.71 crore.

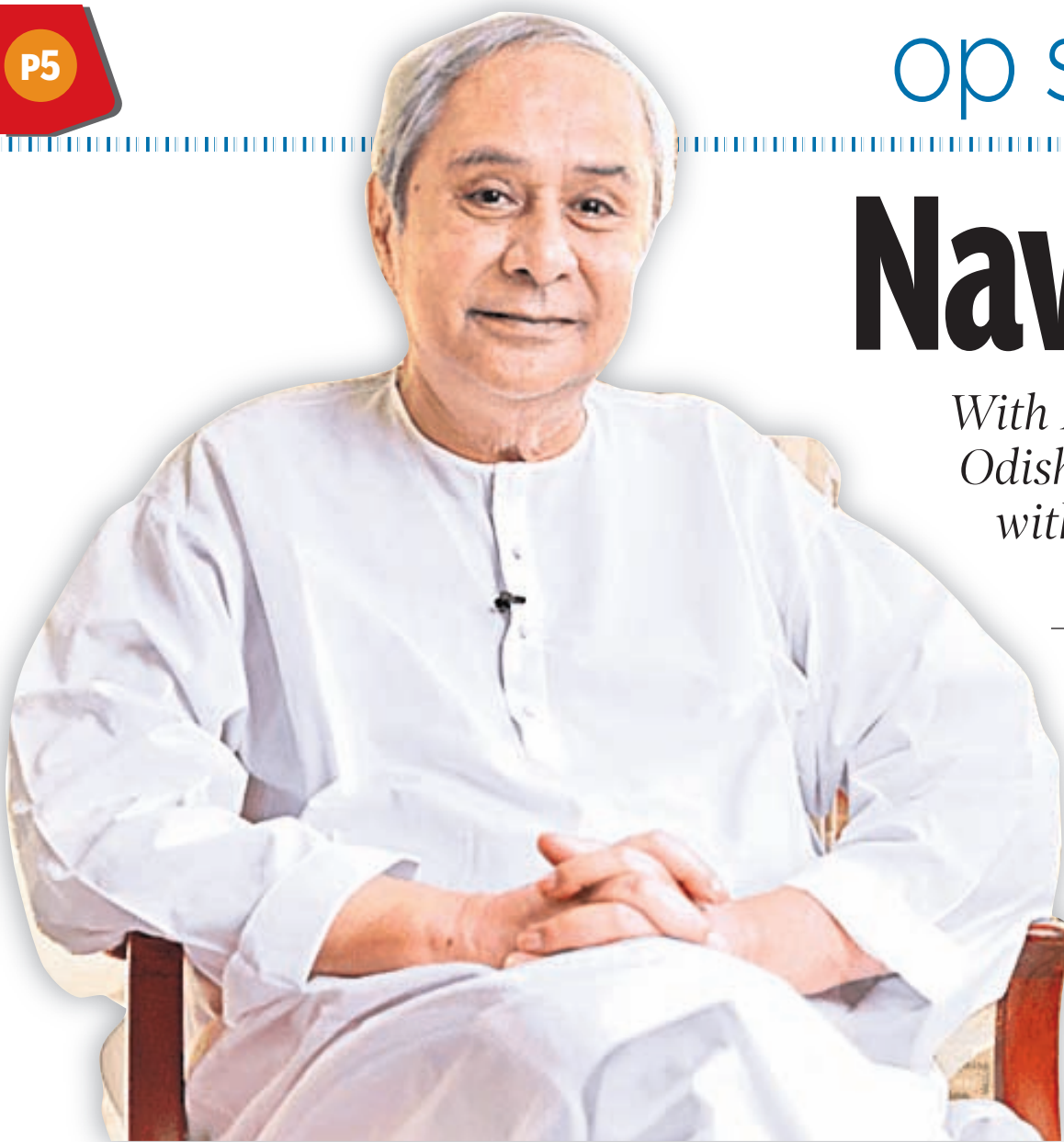

Naveen's new Odisha

With Naveen Patnaik completing 23 years as Chief Minister and Odisha celebrating Panchayati Raj Diwas Sunday that coincide with the birth anniversary of legendary leader Biju Patnaik, Orissa POST takes a stroll down the memory lane

Naveen Patnaik will be completing 23 years as the chief minister of Odisha Sunday—March 5. Under Patnaik's 23 years of visionary leadership, Odisha has transitioned from a backward state into a thriving development laboratory with remarkable progress in terms of human development indices.

When Naveen became the chief minister in early 2000, the state was still recovering from the super cyclone of 1999, which claimed thousands of lives in coastal districts, and facing the ignominy of poverty. The coastal state was dependent on others for its food security.

In these 23 years, Odisha has transformed itself into a food surplus state adding to the country's public distribution system. Starvation death is now a thing of the past.

Odisha's economy has reached Rs 2,30,000 crore from Rs 20,000 crore in these years. As compared to 2000, the programme expenditure has witnessed a 35-time rise and reached Rs 1,25,000 crore, while the capital expenditure saw 60-time growth to reach Rs 51,000 crore. Odisha is the only state to witness such rise. Odisha has become a number one state in the country in fiscal management from its earlier performance of making overdraft for 28-days to pay the salaries to employees. It has also carved a niche for itself by becoming the revenue surplus state in the last few years.

The per capita income has increased from Rs 12,400 to more than Rs 1.5 lakh in the last few years, which is more than the national average.

Odisha has made remarkable progress in agricultural production by becoming the fourth highest rice producing state in the country. It is producing in such quantities that the Centre is unable to procure all paddy from farmers.

Odisha first put a way forward by encouraging millet cultivation in hilly areas where water availability is less and now the whole country has adopted it. The UN has also given its acceptance to millet cultivation which has helped protect the life and livelihood of tribals.

Odisha has achieved rapid strides in irrigation during last 23 years. Irrigation facility for Kharif and Rabi season was only for 36 lakh hectare in 2000, but it has now grown to 66 lakh hectare. Gangadhar Meher project in Bargarh and a few other projects which will be operational soon will increase the irrigation to 72 lakh hectare by 2024.

Odisha has also become the number one state in infrastructure construction. The state is leading the work on its own fund while the Centre is neglecting it in air, rail and road connectivity.

The state fulfilling its election promise it made in 2014 has completed the construction of 546 km road consisting of four lanes from Rourkela in Sundargarh to Amapani in Nabarangpur. The construction of Biju Expressway has benefited residents of Sundargarh, Jharsuguda, Sambalpur, Bargarh, Nuapada, Kalahandi and Nabarangpur. It will pave the way for economic development of the districts and more employment opportunities for the people as

various companies have expressed their interest for setting up their plants by this expressway.

Similarly, the construction of 335 km of Biju Expressway-2 has also been announced which will be built at an expenditure of Rs 6,100 crore.

Investment in the industrial sector during last two decades has turned Odisha into an industrial prosperous state. It has become the number one state in steel and aluminium production while the maximum phosphate fertiliser is also being produced in the state. Industrial houses from country and abroad have agreed to invest over Rs 10 lakh crore during the Make in Odisha Conclave. Infrastructural development has prompted firms like Deloitte and IBM to open their branches in Odisha.

The state has constructed industrial estates, MSME parks and food parks while it is going to spend an additional Rs 3,500 crore in industrial infrastructure development to attract more investments from industrial houses to Odisha.

The CM has taken Odisha to a new height in development of educational infrastructure during last 23 years. Smart classrooms, e-libraries and modern science laboratories have been built in 8000 schools under school transformation programme which is on its last leg. Developmental works in schools have been expedited under Mo School Abhiyan in which over 33 lakh students have registered their names. Over 7.5 lakh alumni have donated around Rs 200 crore for the development of their alma mater while the state government has donated Rs 600 crore for it.

Appointments are being made in phases to fill up the vacant post of teachers while the state is going to appoint around 25,000 teachers soon. Odisha Adarsha Vidyalayas have been established in each blocks to impart teaching in English.

The state has implemented 'Biju Swasthya Kalyan Yojana' which aims to provide cashless treatment to 3.30 crore people belonging to 96 lakh families in all hospitals. The state has increased the number of medical colleges to nine while four more medical colleges are soon going to become operational which will produce more doctors in the state. The state will produce 2200 doctors from 13 government medical colleges and other private medical colleges.

Over 70 lakh women through 7 lakh SHGs have become self reliant by adopting various trades and vocation. Now, Mission Shakti is trying to make these women and entrepreneur while plans are afoot to provide Rs 50,000 crore loan to these SHGs within next five years.

The work of the government has helped in reduction of infant mortality from 91 to 36 (per 1000) while the maternal mortality has reduced from 450 to 119 (per one lakh) in the state. Earlier, low voltage problem and power cut were acute in the state but large scale reforms brought in the power sector has helped stop undeclared power cuts in the state.

BIJU PATNAIK: A DISTINCT VISIONARY

Freedom fighter, fearless pilot, visionary industrialist, statesman, philanthropist, unofficial security advisor to Prime Minister.. the list is endless. He was the ultimate trendsetter India has ever produced. As Odisha celebrates Biju Patnaik's 107th birth anniversary, Orissa POST takes a look at some of his lesser known achievements

'ABSCONDERS' PARADISE: Biju Patnaik used to give asylum to freedom fighters to evade their arrest by British police. A foreign freedom fighter who was aware of this had named his house 'Absconders' Paradise.'

BRITISH HONOUR: He was honoured by British rulers for his act of releasing some British families who were imprisoned by Japanese during the World War II.

FRIEND OF RUSSIA: He helped the Soviet Army fight Hitler during second World War and was honoured by the Russians for his service.

NEHRU'S SECURITY ADVISOR: During the Indo-Chinese War in 1962, the then Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru used to consult Biju Patnaik on war situation. For some time he turned the former Premier's defence counsel, unofficially of course.

KALINGA ON SLEEVE: Most of his ventures were named Kalinga, the erstwhile name of Odisha. He set up Kalinga tubes, Kalinga Airlines, Kalinga Iron Works, Kalinga Refractories and Kalinga, a daily Oriya newspaper. In 1951 he established the international Kalinga Prize.

PROUD ODIA: When the Central government refused to give funds to build the Paradeep port, Biju Patnaik: To hell with the Government of India. I will build the port with state government and my own money. And he spent Rs 1.60 billion on it. Later, of course, Nehru sanctioned funds for the project.

AVID PEDALLER: Biju Patnaik was an avid cyclist too. He was spotted many a time cycling to the State Secretariat. When he was studying, he had cycled all the way from Cuttack to Peshawar (now in Pakistan) to spread the message of humanity.

RARE HONOUR: When Biju Patnaik died, the national flags of three countries - India, Indonesia and Russia were wrapped on his body in his last journey. Heads of countries, Premiers often do not have such privilege.

CM to unveil *Dakota* today

The people of Odisha will now be able to have a glimpse of the iconic Dakota aircraft. The reassembled Dakota DC-3 VT-AUI aircraft is all set to be on display outside the Biju Patnaik International Airport (BPIA) here for public viewing starting Sunday, the birth anniversary of the legendary leader Biju Patnaik. Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik is slated to unveil the aircraft. "It is a matter of pride for the Odisha government to unveil the Dakota DC-3 aircraft which was relocated from Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose International Airport in Kolkata to Biju Patnaik International Airport. Public display of the aircraft will serve as an embodiment of the former Chief Minister's courage and adventurousism, and inspire people of Odisha to dream big," an official said. It may be recalled that the parts of dismantled Dakota aircraft had been brought to Bhubaneswar from Kolkata January 18. The aircraft, which was parked at Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose International Airport in Kolkata, was dismantled and its parts were safely loaded on three trailers and brought here on road. The state

government had roped in Odisha Police and asked them to coordinate with their West Bengal counterpart in order to ensure the safe passage of the dismantled aircraft weighing over 8 tonne and around 64 feet 8 inches long with wings that extend upto 95 feet. A special team of experts inspected the aircraft after its arrival at BPIA. A team of engineers, technicians and experts undertook the assembling of the dismantled aircraft. The Airport Authority of India has allotted 1.1 acre of land for the aircraft to be placed in front of the airport named after the legendary leader for display of the DC-3 aircraft. A memorial has been built for this purpose. Before joining politics, Biju Patnaik had floated Kalinga Airlines which had a fleet of 15 Dakotas.

‘None loved Odisha & Odias more than Biju Babu’

Age has failed to have an impact on Rasananda Lenka's memory. The 92-year-old senior advocate at Rairangpur sub-divisional court recalls every important incident of his life without much effort.

He recalls how, as a ninth grader at MKC High School, Baripada, he had gone to the Baripada market in the evening of August 14, 1947 to celebrate the Independence of India. By the time he arrived, a huge crowd had begun dancing. The festivities increased and got noisy as the evening moved towards midnight. Sweets were distributed as they patiently heard Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru's historic speech that epoch-making night. "As soon as the brief speech ended, the entire crowd erupted into a roar of happiness, celebrations continued till the morning. But no one was tired," he thunders.

The nonagenarian doesn't get tired, when he speaks of another. A 'pucca Congress worker' by his own admission, Lenka was active in college elections before he became councillor for two consecutive times in the Rairangpur NAC in 1962. He had just begun his law career at the sub-divisional court in the sleepy town. Three decades later, in 1997, India's present President Droupadi Murmu became a councillor in Rairangpur- which earned municipality status in 2014.



Lenka who worked for the Congress till 2014 elections, had been appointed as the organising secretary of the state youth Congress. It provided him the opportunity to move around the state, and more importantly work closely with the top leaders of the state. "The tallest of all, in stature, was of course, Biju Babu (Biju Patnaik). Biju Babu was one of the leading faces in the country too," thunders Lenka.

As the organising secretary, Lenka organised political seminars, where senior leaders and intellectuals deliberated on different topics. However, he says, funds crunch was a huge issue.

For one such seminar, as suggested by some party seniors, he went to invite Biju Patnaik. The real motive, though, was to get some sponsorship for the three-day event near Puri.

Lenka vividly remembers the meeting. The maverick Biju Babu asked about the topic of the seminar. 'Role and Responsibility of the President', replied Lenka.

"What have I got to do with it, you bet-

ter invite constitutional expert Prof Shriram Das, he can speak much better," Lenka recalls the iconic leader's words.

For a minute there was complete silence. Lenka was standing there. Perhaps, aware of the intention of the invite, a minute later, Biju Babu enquired in his typical style, what more could he do for the event. Lenka, who was waiting for this, requested for some financial assistance.


Immediately, Biju Babu asked for the estimate, which Lenka lacked. A furious Biju Babu shouted, "Hopeless fellow, you have come here for aid without an estimate." "I didn't feel bad, rather I was happy within," Lenka says. He returned to Baripada.

However, in the morning of the inauguration of the event, one of the first to be present at the venue was Biju Babu. Not only he was present in the event for three days, he also asked the manager of Kalinga Tubes - which he owned - to bear the entire expenses. "He had a large heart, much larger than any leader I have come across in seven decades of my association with politics. No one's as generous as Biju Babu," Lenka tells Orissa POST.

Lenka cherishes many such incidents involving the maverick leader. He says it's for Biju Babu that he could be part of the youth Congress delegation to Belgrade in 1962. "No one loved Odisha and the Odias more than him," he says.

The answer is not known perhaps because the question has not been asked before, but we have to consider it seriously since the claim is serious, just as the claim that we have been elected head of the G20 is serious. Also, if we are vishwaguru why not just take the place on the Council rather than ask for it? If someone is stopping us, who dares do that to vishwaguru? Again, the answer is not obvious.

The other thing related to this issue is what happened at the G20 meeting in Delhi. It was a meeting of the foreign ministers and The Hindu reported the event under the headline 'G20 foreign ministers meeting: Divisions between Western countries, Russia-China derail joint statement'. The context was the war in Ukraine, which also derailed the joint statement last year in Bali (when Indonesia was G20 president though it was not vishwaguru). The question that occurs is simple: can our presidency not produce anything different from Indonesia's or anyone else's, and if it cannot then what is the point of all the song and dance? This is a rhetorical question.

The next thing that happened is that India has, in addition to being mother of democracy and vishwaguru, become the world's most populous nation. This news came to vishwaguru from the outside. The World Population Review database says that on Friday, March 3, our population was 142 crore and 80 lakh people, while China's was 142 crore and 50 lakh people. When this becomes official there will be a lot of song and dance about it but remember that it is the second time that India is ahead of China. The first was of course all the years before 1947 when, if you assume a united India, it was always the most populous part of the world.

Why do I say that the news came to us from outside? That is because we have not conducted a census for the first time in over a century and we do not know when it will be conducted. The second last thing on this subject is that along with becoming the world's populous nation our fertility rate has been falling. It stands at 2.0, which is right at the point of replacement, and it continues to fall. Meaning that in a few years our population will start to decline. There is something to be said here against those people who keep scaremongering on the basis of faith, but this is not the place to discuss that. However we should, and this is the last thing, consider that a few years ago we began our demographic bulge, when the number of working-age people in the population began to maximise.

However, this is also the same period when our labour force participation rate and our unemployment rose, according to the government's figures. A combination of a record population and record unemployment, what will that bring? We will see.

The last item in this column deals with the Union budget. The Prime Minister this week referred to it as Amrit Kaal budget when talking about such things as education. The first point of Amrit Kaal according to him is that by or in 2047 India would become 'developed'. Now if we go by the growth rate we have achieved since 2014 which is an average of 5.7 per cent growth per year; where would we be in 2047? The answer is at \$8800 per capita. That is \$4000 less than China is today, and less than one fourth of Japan's current per capita and about one ninth of America's current per capita GDP.

If we will call ourselves developed are we going to do so by changing the definition of development? Or do we expect the others to come down? Or do we expect to grow faster than we have since 2014? If we expect to grow faster than how and what are we doing or going to do that is different from what we have done since 2014?

This is again, a rhetorical question because there are no answers. Our solutions lie in acronyms, slogans, coining new words and phrases and pretending to be something we are not and are not about to be. Getting great powers to agree to something against their will requires either hard power or at the very least great moral authority, neither of which, truth be told, we have. A government that cannot count its own people, cannot count its own record of growth and extrapolate it, that does not acknowledge its own data on employment and joblessness will not be taken seriously. On the positive side, nobody can stop us from preening, from bombast and from pretending. And so we can expect that to continue.

Gibberish

To describe some attempt at communication as gibberish today is most likely to disparage it as mere meaningless verbiage. But at its strongest, in its earlier days, gibberish was speech that belonged to no known language. It was worse even than calling it double Dutch or asserting that it was all Greek. Etymologists have been scratching their heads over its origin almost since it first appeared in the language in the middle 1500s. There's a set of similar words — gibber, jibber, jabber, gobble and gab (as in gift of the gab) — that may be related attempts at imitating incomprehensible utterances. But how they arrived and in what order is unknown. An eighteenth-century writer linked gibberish with the French word geber, meaning to cheat, which is now not thought to be in the least likely. Other experts prefer an origin in an unrecorded Germanic word. The best of the invented stories about its origin is the one that Dr Samuel Johnson subscribed to in his Dictionary of 1755: "[I]t is probably derived from the chymical cant, and originally implied the jargon of Geber and his tribe." Geber is a Latinised form of the name of a prolific eighth-century Arabic writer, Abu Musa Jabir ibn Hayyan. His name is attached to hundreds of books, covering such an encyclopaedic range that some scholars have argued he was the pseudonym of a syndicate or was awarded authorship by posterity. One notable point about gibberish is that it has shifted pronunciation. Today, it's almost always said like jibberish, with a soft g sound. But at one time, it had a hard g; some current dictionaries give that as a variant pronunciation though it survives only to a small extent — a British survey in 1998 found the hard g form was used by only 4% of respondents. That version may suggest a closer connection with gobble and gab and a lesser one with jibber and jabber.

QUEST FOR MULTILATERALISM

GERMANY AND INDIA SHOULD WORK IN TANDEM TO PROMOTE MULTILATERALISM

The German Chancellor Olaf Scholz was in India, 25 and 26 February. It was his maiden visit after he helmed the German leadership in December 2021. Two developments would have influenced his agenda in India; one, the ongoing Ukrainian war, which is causing deep concern for Europe, and of course, the rest of the world, second, the G-20 Summit taking place in India later this year. Therefore, Scholz's agenda consisted of defence and security, in the wake of the war, and economic cooperation, green technology and India-Pacific strategy, which may bear upon the negotiations and transactions around the G-20 events.

The German Chancellor was accompanied by a business delegation comprising twelve major companies and from medium and small sectors. The visit was significant for another reason. In the wake of the war, Germany is redrawing its foreign policy, namely the defence and security policy. The soundings are that Germany is seeking to emerge as an independent global player in a multilateral world. While consolidating its pre-eminent position in 27-country European Union, it is reaching out to other strategic partners across the world. India could be one of them. Bilaterally, Germany is the biggest European investor, ninth largest in the world, for India. It is also one among the top ten global partners of India.

Giving clear indication of Germany's leadership in Europe, the Chancellor promised India that he would advance trade talks between India and EU. Deepening the partnership, the Chancellor offered to build six submarines in India to help New Delhi modernise its maritime forces. He also offered to create a new system to facilitate migration of Indian professionals into Germany.

The security imperative in the visit was evident in the press statement of German Ambassador to India, Philipp Ackerman, on the eve of the visit, "the Chancellor will talk geopolitics with Prime Minister Narendra Modi. You will see Russia and Ukraine very high on the agenda." He explained at the press briefing that, "India buying oil from Russia is not of our business.

Basically, that is something that the Indian government decides. What we would like to see, of course, is an Indian engagement at some stage." This obvious German concern should not have been lost on Indian leadership. German interests and economy are badly affected by the war, placing heavy burden on the state's exchequer; what to speak of the rising costs of fuel and electricity which has quite an uncomfortable consequence for German way of life.

From the Indian point of view, the war is turning out to be a major concern for India's security. As the war pushes Russia closer to China, New Delhi should be wary because of China's belligerent postures on the borders. There is also a rethink in EU as well as in US on diverting trade from China. If that be so, a big market like India could be the only and obvious alternative to China. This is where the Indian and German interests should converge. But do they?

India, a big country in Asia, and Germany a strong economy in the West with similar approaches to democracy, human rights and a rules-based international order should come really close. The onus lies more on Germany as a bigger economy. However, Germany's attitude toward India is contingent upon Berlin's equation with Beijing. Also, it hinges on

Germany's conception of multilateralism, as referred above.

Surprisingly, the German Chancellor dashed to Beijing after Xi Jinping was re-appointed as the head of CCP in its 20th Party Congress. The visit was explained away as Germany's compulsion of protecting their heavy trade and investment in China, an understandable national interest and priority. However, a systematic assessment of China is found in SPD position paper on New Foreign and Security Policy Agenda. Although Scholz heads a coalition government, he belongs to SPD, the largest partner in the coalition and the oldest democratic party of Germany.

The policy document states that, since China, failed to condemn the Russian attack on Ukraine, it is obvious that China under Xi Jinping is a global power that intends to shape world politics in its own interests. Germany contends that decoupling from China is not advisable as Beijing has become 'an indispensable player' in international politics in dealing with several global challenges.

At the same time, Germany is pushing their own companies and the European ones to diversify their value chains and sales market. They must find an alternative supplier and minimise their economic dependence on China. Germany

also is looking out for partners in the world and in the India-Pacific region where India's stakes lie. Germany will like to reach out to those countries including India which feel threatened by China. The document says, "We must take these concerns and fears seriously and take them into account in our policy towards China." This is where India should come in.

The other variable in India-German relationship is the latter's attitude towards NATO. Although there was a rupture in US-European ties on NATO during Donald Trump's tenure, under the Biden regime, it was reaffirmed that USA and NATO still serve as the guarantors of European security. So, Scholz administration will like to strengthen EU's military capabilities while relying on NATO. New Delhi should be sensitive to US and Europe partnership in security while laying out its own security agenda.

Finally, on multilateralism, Germany is unwilling to see the world divided into two antagonistic blocs. It believes that addressing global challenges requires multilateral efforts; they cannot be met by a divided world. Germany recognises the legitimate claim of countries in Global South to participate in shaping a just international order. EU itself is a multilateral body. That is why Germany and European countries put their faith in multilateral institutions for global peace, prosperity and security. India holds a similar position in international politics. So conceptually, Germany and India should work in tandem to promote multilateralism.

I have maintained that a united world, manifested in genuine multilateralism, notwithstanding the panoply of international institutions, is a utopia. History does not support that aspiration. A balance of power is more realistic. However, developments involving human beings are quite complex creating new realities from time to time. Hence, if Germany and India want multilateralism, so be it. More power to them.

Climate finance for developing world

INDIA HAS MADE HUGE STRIDES IN RENEWABLES IN RECENT YEARS, BECOMING THE THIRD-LARGEST RENEWABLES MARKET IN THE WORLD

Recent estimates suggest that the developing world will need \$1 trillion of external climate finance annually by 2025, and \$2.4 trillion per year by 2030, to meet the goals enshrined in the Paris climate agreement. But these targets will not be met unless international financial institutions and governments create stronger incentives, paying special attention to three key areas.

First, the world needs a more robust and consistent international process of price discovery for new offerings such as carbon offsets, green hydrogen, direct carbon capture, and battery storage. Because price-discovery mechanisms currently vary from country to country, the international community must come together to establish an overarching framework, which, by enabling offtake (pre-purchase) agreements, would help clean-energy manufacturers attract more investment, escaping the "chicken-or-egg" scenario in which many currently find themselves.

A credible international carbon price is crucial for driving greater investment toward clean-energy projects, as well as for gradually reducing – and eventually eliminat-

ing – fossil-fuel subsidies. Speaking at COP27 last November, IMF's MD, Kristalina Georgieva, stressed that the price of carbon should rise to \$75 per tonne by 2030 to impel consumers and businesses to change their behaviour. But in 2021, the global average carbon price was just \$3 per tonne (though some regions have far exceeded that). To get to \$75, policymakers will have to work closely together at the global level, finding new ways to bring detractors on board.

A second important issue is the establishment of multi-sovereign loan guarantees, which are needed to strengthen the creditworthiness of clean-energy projects and attract more private capital to developing countries. Leveraging this mechanism to its full potential will require clearer assessment standards. Equally, boosting the sums of climate finance requires better concessional rates to companies and entities involved in the shift to clean energy. The IMF and multilateral development banks (MDBs) have a significant role to play here, as do national banks at the local level.

Multi-sovereign guarantees and other climate-finance initiatives should be applied across regions and

spread throughout the value chain, from the mining of minerals and equipment manufacturing to clean-energy generation and transportation. Getting to scale will require reforms to multilateral lenders' shareholding arrangements and risk-tolerance standards, as well as faster disbursements and greater transparency concerning investment data.

Finally, the international community needs to forge a consensus on green-investment standards. A May 2022 proposal for a "green hydrogen standard" was a step in the right direction, but it remains to be seen if it will be approved and adopted by all. India has made huge strides in renewables in recent years, becoming the third-largest renewables market in the world. With the government having set a target of net-zero emissions by 2070, developments are now moving fast. Since COP26 in November 2021, India has introduced a national hydrogen plan and established new incentives for electric-vehicle and battery manufacturers.

Yet, as it stands, India is still the world's third-largest emitter of greenhouse gases, and much of its clean-energy investment has come from

domestic sources. As strong as our climate commitments are, developing countries like India need external support to shift away from traditional energy sources such as coal.

COP27 brought a major advance with last-minute agreement on a "loss and damage" fund to support developing countries that are being hit hardest by climate-related disasters. But MDBs and governments can and should be doing more to encourage climate investment in developing countries. MDBs need to make greater use of concessional finance, including grants, to mobilise investments where benefits are shared globally. Helping middle-income countries move away from coal should be a top priority, along with offering stronger borrowing terms and de-risking clean-energy investments across developing world.

Without a greater impetus from governments and global financial institutions, there is a risk that by the time global economic conditions improve, the window for achieving net zero by mid-century will have already closed. We must not let that happen.

SC seeks Centre's reply on tiger deaths

New Delhi, March 4: The Supreme Court has directed the Centre to inform it about reported deaths of tigers in the country.

A bench of justices KM Joseph and BV Nagarathna sought the information after taking note of newspaper reports about tiger deaths. The apex court was hearing a petition filed by advocate Anupam Tripathi in 2017 seeking to save endangered tigers whose numbers are dwindling across the country.

"Though the petitioner is not present, respondents will ascertain about reported deaths of the tigers in India. List the mat-



ter after three weeks," the bench said.

According to the National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA), India lost 1,059 tigers since 2012 with Madhya Pradesh,

which is known as the 'tiger state' of the country, recording the highest number of deaths (270).

On January 27, the Centre had told the top court that there

are 2,967 tigers in the country spread across 53 tiger reserves, according to a 2018 report. Additional Solicitor General Aishwarya Bhati had told the bench that lot of work has been done for the conservation of tigers and increasing their population.

The top court in 2017 had issued notice to the Ministry of Environment, the National Board for Wildlife and the National Tiger Conservation Authority on the plea which had also sought relocation of people living near tiger reserves.

The petition had said tigers were being killed either by poisoning by locals or the authorities, shooting by forest guards or by poaching.

The accused was identified as Robin alias Sunny, a resident of Khera Khurd, Delhi and he was wanted in cases of attempted murder and riots registered in Mukherjee Nagar police station. According to police, specific inputs were received that a wanted criminal would come near SurajMal Stadium, Nangloi, Delhi following which a police team was formed to nab him.

One dead, 4 hurt

Guwahati: One person was killed and four others were injured in an elephant attack at a tea estate in Assam's Nagaon district, officials said Saturday. The incident took place in the Kaliabor Hatigaon tea estate on Friday. Witnesses have claimed that the wild tusker frightened the tea garden workers who were taking a break after a long day of work. One of the workers, Laxman Minj, was rushed to a nearby hospital but died of his injuries.

Liquor seized

Ranchi: An illegal liquor factory was busted in Jharkhand's Bokaro district and spurious liquor worth around Rs 1 crore was seized, an Excise department official said. After getting a tip-off, a team of the excise department raided the illegal factory at Ganjori village, some 120-km from the state capital Ranchi, on Thursday midnight, the official said. "The factory was running in a bunker in Ganjori village. We have seized 2,000 litres of spirit, 300 cartons of spurious liquor and other items required for making liquor from the spot. The price of seized liquor will be around Rs 1 crore," excise inspector Praveen Choudhary said.

Sisodia's CBI custody extended

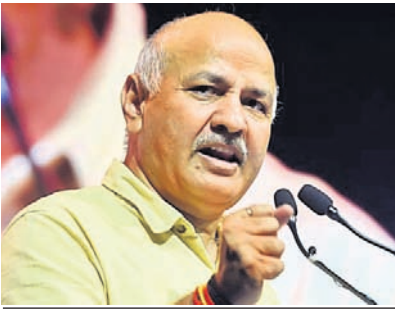

New Delhi, March 4: A Delhi court Saturday extended by two days the CBI custody of former deputy chief minister Manish Sisodia, arrested in a corruption case related to the now-scrapped excise policy, and directed the central probe agency to produce him on Monday.

Special judge M K Nagpal also directed the CBI not to ask him the same questions repeatedly after Sisodia termed it as "mental harassment". "They are not using third-degree. But sitting for eight to nine hours and answering the same questions again and again, that too is mental harassment," Sisodia said.

To which the judge, who had on the last hearing directed the CBI not to use the third degree on the accused, told the probe agency not ask the "same questions again and again. If you have something new, ask him."

During the arguments, Sisodia's counsel also told the court that his wife's health was very poor and that she was basically in a "vegetative state". "While considering all things, my wife's medical condition has been brushed aside. She is basically a vegetable and her body is degenerating," the coun-



sel said on behalf of Sisodia.

The former deputy chief minister of Delhi made these arguments while opposing the CBI plea seeking his further custody on the ground that he was not cooperating.

The CBI's plea was opposed by Sisodia's lawyer who said the inefficiency of the agency to complete the probe cannot be ground for remand and he cannot be asked to incriminate himself.

"Non-cooperation cannot be a ground for remand. They cannot say we will wait till he confesses. They should have completed the investigation. Their failure to complete investigation can't be a ground for remand," senior advocate Dayan Krishnan, appearing for Sisodia, said.

The court, meanwhile, issued notice to the CBI on Sisodia's bail

plea and directed it to file a reply by March 10, when it will hear the arguments on the application. In his application, Sisodia stated that he joined the investigation as and when called for by the Central probe agency.

He further stated that no fruitful purpose would be served by keeping him in custody as all the recoveries have already been made, adding that the other accused persons arrested in this case have already been granted bail.

Asserting that he had held an important constitutional post of Deputy CM of Delhi, Sisodia said he has deep roots in the society.

There was heavy security presence in and outside the Rouse Avenue Courts premises. AAP supporters staged a protest outside the premises and raised slogans.

Sibal's new platform to fight 'injustice'

New Delhi, March 4: Alleging that a government working against the citizens is at the helm, Rajya Sabha MP Kapil Sibal Saturday announced a new platform 'Insaaf' to fight "injustice" prevailing in the country and called on everyone, including Opposition parties' chief ministers and leaders, to support him in his endeavour.

A huge team of the Burtolla police station in Kolkata raided Bagchi's residence in Barrackpore in North 24 Parganas district around 3.30 am, and arrested him after a few hours. Bagchi, also a lawyer, was granted bail on a personal bail bond of Rs 1,000 by the additional chief metropolitan magistrate at Bankshall court.

The court directed him to meet the investigating officer once a week. The prosecution prayed for Bagchi's police custody till March 10 for questioning him, alleging he was involved in a conspiracy.

Praying for bail, Bagchi's lawyers questioned why a lawyer was arrested by the police early in the morning from his residence, instead of serving him a notice. The arrest was not necessary since the charges against him in the FIR do not entail a sentence of over seven years, his lawyers told the court.

Bagchi was arrested on the basis of a complaint filed at the Burtolla police station on Friday night by one Sumit Singh, who claimed to be a TMC supporter, for his alleged comments against the chief minister.

Bagchi allegedly criticised Banerjee for making "personal attacks" on state Congress president Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury after the party snatched the Sagardighi seat in Murshidabad district from the TMC in a bypoll.

He was booked under several sections of the IPC, including 120-B (criminal conspiracy), 504 (intentional insult with intent to provoke breach of the peace) and 506 (criminal intimidation). The Congress workers protested against the arrest at various places across the state.

Sibal said efforts will be made

Eight injured in Tripura

Agartala, March 4: At least eight people were injured in post-poll violence in Tripura, police said Saturday.

Twenty people have been arrested in connection with the post-poll violence incidents in the state, the police said. Chief Minister Manik Saha who visited the injured persons at GBP hospital on Friday asked the police to take stern action against the miscreants in order to maintain peace and tranquility.

Most of the post-poll violence cases were reported from Sepahijala and Khowai districts where a few persons were injured and shifted to nearby health facility but no death is reported yet, Assistant Inspector General of Police (AIG), Law and Order, Jyotishman Das Chowdhury said.

POST-POLL VIOLENCE

"So far five specific FIRs have been registered in this regard and eight people were grievously injured. Over twenty miscreants were arrested for their alleged involvement", he said, adding that around 70 such incidents have been reported across the state since the election results were announced.

All the police stations have been alerted following post poll violence, he said, adding that the police are working in coordination with the local administration to maintain peace.

In Sepahijala district, Charilam, Sutarmura and Lalsinghmura witnessed violence but there was no major incidents due to timely intervention by the police and administration, he said.

SC ISSUES NOTICE ON TN GOVT'S PLEA

New Delhi, March 4: The Supreme Court has sought a response to a plea challenging an order of the Madras High Court quashing a May 2018 notification prohibiting the sale, manufacture and transport of gutkha and other tobacco-based products.

A bench of Justices KM Joseph and BV Nagarathna issued notice to Food Safety Commissioner, Jayavilas Tobacco Traders and others on a plea filed by the Tamil Nadu government.

"Issue notice in the special leave petition. Issue notice in the prayer for interim relief also" the bench said.

Additional Advocate General Amit Anand Tiwari, appearing for the state, argued that orders of the Food Safety Commissioner banning the sale, storage, manufacture, etc. Of gutkha and other tobacco products are backed by Regulation 2.3.4 of the Food Safety and Standards (Prohibition and Restriction on Sales) Regulations, 2011.

The high court had set aside a notification issued by the Food Safety Commissioner on May 23, 2018, banning the manufacture, storage, transport, distribution and sale of gutkha, pan masala and other chewable food products containing tobacco/nicotine as ingredients.

It had held that allowing the Food Safety Commissioner to impose a permanent ban on tobacco products by issuing successive notifications year after year would amount to conferring a power that was not provided in the law.

Sangam era terracotta lamps unearthed from TN river

Chennai, March 4: Archeologists have unearthed a few terracotta lamps stated to be of the Sangam era from the river bed of the Thenpennai river in Panruti.

The unearthing of the lamps has created excitement among researchers on human settlements and archeology. The terracotta lamps that were unearthed from Thenpennai river bed in the past two days resemble that of terracotta lamps that were found at Keeladi in Sivaganga district and Arikamedu in Puducherry.

These two sites were archeo-



logical sites believed to have the story of a rich civilisation hidden beneath. The finding of terracotta lamps from Panruti in Cuddalore district from the Thenpennai river

is also considered to be a finding which has far reaching significance in the archeological and anthropological studies that are being conducted in Tamil Nadu by the

state archeological department and the Archeological Survey of India (ASI).

According to researchers who carried out the excavations, the terracotta lamps that were unearthed from the Thenpennai riverbed, were of various shapes and sizes and perfectly handmade.

C. Immanuel, who is an archeological researcher, and Prof D. Ramesh, History Professor of Villupuram Arignar Anna Arts College who have found these terracotta lamps from the Thenpennai riverbed said that these lamps were both in black and red colour.

They said that one lamp was red

in colour and disc-like with a depression in the middle and had four points for wick to be placed to lit up. The other one was black in colour and had one point to hold the wick. However, both the lamps were damaged but made with excellent craftsmanship.

The researchers said that the lamps were an indication of the domestication process of human beings who wanted light for a long time in closed places. It is to be noted that terracotta lamps were found also from Paiyampalli and Appukal in the Vellore district and Mothur in Erode district of Tamil Nadu.

Indonesia fuel depot fire kills 18

Jakarta: Indonesian rescuers and firefighters Saturday searched for more than a dozen missing under the rubble of charred houses and buildings, after a large fire spread from a fuel storage depot in the capital and killed at least 18 people. The Plumpang fuel storage station, operated by state-run oil and gas company Pertamina, is near a densely populated area in the Tanah Merah neighbourhood in North Jakarta.

Storms roll eastward after slamming Texas

California: A large storm system spouting heavy winds and possible tornados in Texas, Louisiana and Kentucky damaged homes and buildings, downed trees, left thousands without power and was blamed for the deaths of two people Friday as it marched eastward, threatening heavy snow in the Midwest and Northeast. After spawning likely tornadoes overnight in Texas and Louisiana that damaged a university campus, the storms threatened the Tennessee and Ohio valleys with high winds and more tornadoes as they moved toward New England.

16 killed in traffic accident in SA

Johannesburg: Sixteen people were killed in a traffic accident involving two minibus taxis and a heavy vehicle on the R579 in Motetema, Limpopo province, the Limpopo Department of Transport and Community Safety said. One of the minibus taxis involved was transporting learners to school; drivers of the two taxis and six learners were among the 16 killed, Chuene said, adding that law enforcement officers at the scene cite reckless driving as a possible cause of the crash.

China hints at hiking defence budget

Beijing, March 4: Beijing, Mar 4 (PTI) China Saturday signalled at increasing its defence budget, the second biggest after the US, citing "complex security challenges" ahead of its annual Parliament session during which it will unveil a new ministerial and official leadership, including a successor to Premier Li Keqiang.

Over 5,000 deputies and advisors will take part in the two sessions lasting for over a week during which China will formally unveil its new ministerial and top official leadership including a new Premier to succeed Li, who will be retiring.

Li is widely expected to be succeeded by President Xi Jinping's loyalist Li Qiang.

Except for President Xi, 69, all top officials will be replaced as part of the practice of changing the leadership team every 10 years.

Xi and a new set of officials -- mostly stated to be his loyalists -- were elected to various key posts of the ruling Communist Party of China (CPC) at its once-in-a-five-year Congress here in October last year.

Xi, regarded as the most powerful leader holding the key posts of head of the party, the military and the Presidency, has been elected for an unprecedented third five-year term continuing in power be-



yond the 10-year tenure followed by his predecessors. Ahead of the NPC session, its spokesman Wang Chao signalled an increase in its defence budget, which last year totalled \$230 billion after a 7.1 per cent rise, the second largest after the US defence spending of \$777.1 billion.

Wang, while not disclosing the amount, which he said will be formally revealed at the NPC on

The annual season of China's rubber-stamp Parliament began Saturday with the opening meeting of the top advisory body the CPPCC while its national legislature, the NPC, will begin its session Sunday

Sunday, defended China's steady increases in annual defence budgets, saying China's defence spending as a share of the GDP was lower than the world average. China has been ramping up its defence expenditure as it vied with the US for global influence.

On Friday, Guo Weimin, spokesperson of the CPPCC said the allegations of "debt traps" linked

to last year's defence budget was over three times that of India's defence spending of about USD 70 billion

Wang said the increase in the defence budget is needed to meet the "complex security challenges for China to fulfil its responsibilities as a major country"

China's military modernisation will not be a threat to any country but a positive force safeguarding regional stability and world peace, Wang said

to China's Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) are a groundless smear, and Beijing will not stop the initiative from going forward.

China's investments like that of Sri Lanka's Hambantota port which it acquired as part of a debt swap led to allegations of debt traps.

Guo said to avoid creating new debt risks for countries participating in the BRI initiative, China has taken into account their conditions when offering loans for their projects. The BRI, which involves mainly infrastructure and production, has added to high-quality assets in participating countries, he said. By mid-February, China had signed more than 200 BRI cooperation documents with 151 countries and 32 international organisations, Guo said.

Pakistan has 'unique distinction' of hosting terrorists: India at UN

Geneva, March 4: Pakistan has the "unique distinction" of hosting the most number of UNSC-designated terrorists and terror organisations, and its policies are directly responsible for thousands of civilian deaths in the world, India has said as it slammed Islamabad for its "malicious propaganda" against it.

Exercising its right of reply to Pakistan's statement at the United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC) in Geneva Friday, India said when it is not entirely focused on suppressing its own population, Pakistan actively lends its energies to aid, host and abet international terrorists.

"It has the unique distinction of hosting the most number of UNSC designated terrorists and terror organisations. Osama bin Laden lived next to Pakistan's premier military academy. Its security agencies have nurtured and sheltered Hafiz Saeed and Masood Azhar for decades," First Secretary of India's Permanent Mission to UN Seema Pujani said.

"These are but a few dreaded names from the annals of Pakistan's history of supporting terrorism. Pakistan's policies are directly responsible for the death of thousands of civilians around the world," she said in response to a statement delivered by Pakistan.

Pujani said Pakistan's obsession with India while its population battle for their lives, livelihood and freedom is an indication of the state's misplaced priorities.

She said its leaders and officials should focus their energies on working for the benefit of their

own population instead of "baseless propaganda" against India.

"Pakistan's representative has once again chosen to misuse this august forum for its malicious propaganda against India," she said. Pujani raised the issue of enforced disappearances, saying students, doctors, engineers, teachers, and community leaders are regularly disappeared by the State never to return.

"Pakistan is a State which responds to any calls for reforms with enforced disappearances. In the last decade, Pakistan's own Commission of Inquiry on Enforced Disappearances has received 8,463 complaints. The Baloch people have borne the brunt of this cruel policy," she said. In her statement, Pujani also expressed regret over a statement made by Türkiye at the UN session.

"We regret the comments made by Türkiye on a matter that is an internal affair of India and advise it to refrain from making unsolicited comments on our internal matters," she said.

Pujani also spoke about the persecution of religious minorities in Pakistan and asserted that no religious minority can freely live or practice its religion in the Muslim-majority country.

The Indian diplomat said the state's crackdown on those who wish to raise their voice against any of these heinous policies is also incomparable.

"A bill which proposes a five-year jail term for anyone who 'scandalises or ridicules' the military or the judiciary is currently on the table in Pakistan's Parliament," she said.



UN nuclear head meets Iranians

Dubai, March 4: The head of the UN nuclear watchdog was meeting with officials in Iran Saturday, days after it was revealed that the country had enriched particles of uranium to near weapons-grade, raising new alarm over its long-disputed nuclear programme.

Rafael Mariano Grossi, the head of the International Atomic Energy Agency, declined to comment on his discussions during a press conference with the head of Iran's nuclear programme, saying the delegation's work was still ongoing.



"It's an atmosphere of work, of honesty and cooperation," Grossi said. He later met with Iran's President Ebrahim Raisi and was expected to speak with reporters upon his return to Vienna.

The confidential quarterly report by the IAEA, which was dis-

tributed to member states Tuesday, came as tensions were already high amid months of anti-government protests in Iran and Western anger at its export of attack drones to Russian forces fighting in Ukraine.

The IAEA report says that inspectors in January found that two cascades of IR-6 centrifuges at Iran's Fordo facility had been configured in a way "substantially different" to what had been previously declared.

The IAEA took samples the following day, which showed particles with up to 83.7 per cent purity, the report said.

Civilians flee embattled town as Ukrainian pullout looms

Khromove (Ukraine), March 4: Pressure mounted Saturday on Ukrainian troops and civilians hunkering down in Bakhmut, as Kyiv's forces tried to help residents flee amid what Western analysts say may be preparations for a Ukrainian withdrawal from the eastern city that Russian forces have spent months trying to capture.

A woman was killed and two men were badly wounded by shelling while trying to cross a makeshift bridge out of Bakhmut Saturday, according to Ukrainian troops who were assisting them.

A Ukrainian army representative who asked not to be named for operational reasons told The Associated Press that it was now too dangerous for civilians to leave the city in Donetsk province by vehicle and that people had to flee on foot instead.

Bakhmut has for months been a key target of Moscow's grinding eastern offensive, with Russian troops, including large forces from the private Wagner Group, inching ever closer to Kyiv's key eastern stronghold. An AP team near Bakhmut Saturday saw a pontoon bridge set up by Ukrainian soldiers to help the city's few remaining residents reach the nearby village of Khromove. Later, they saw at least five houses on fire as a result of attacks in Khromove.



Studies have also indicated that sea level rise will vary regionally because shifts in ocean currents will likely direct more water to certain coastlines, including the northeastern United States. What is notable

about this study is the way it incorporates naturally occurring sea level fluctuations caused by such events as El Nino or changes in the water cycle, a process known as internal climate variability, the study said.

According to the study, by using both a computer model of global climate and a specialised statistical model, the scientists could determine the extent to which these natural fluctuations can amplify or reduce the impact of climate change on sea level rise along certain coastlines.

The study showed that internal climate variability could increase sea level rise in some locations by 20-30 per cent more than what would result from climate change alone, exponentially increasing extreme flooding events, it said.

In Manila, for example, coastal flooding events are predicted to occur 18 times more often by 2100 than in 2006, based solely on climate change, the study said.

But, in a worst-case scenario, they could occur 96 times more

often based on a combination of climate change and internal climate variability, it said. Internal climate variability will also increase sea level rise along the west coasts of the United States and Australia, it said.

The study drew on a set of simulations conducted with the National Center for Atmospheric Research (NCAR)-based Community Earth System Model that assume society this century emits greenhouse gases at a high rate.

The simulations were run at the NCAR-Wyoming Supercomputing Center. The paper stressed that the estimates of sea level rise come with considerable uncertainties because of the complex and unpredictable interactions in Earth's climate system.

Twitter's revenue drops 40% in Dec

San Francisco: Despite Elon Musk's efforts to monetise Twitter, the micro-blogging platform reported a massive 40 per cent drop in revenue and adjusted earnings for December 2022, the media reported Saturday. Several advertisers "ditched the social-media platform following Elon Musk's takeover," the Wall Street Journal reported, citing sources. In an update to investors, Twitter reported a 40 per cent decline (year-over-year) in both revenue and adjusted earnings for December. The company recently made a first interest payment to banks that lent \$13 billion to help Musk buy Twitter. Musk had predicted in November that Twitter may go bankrupt. He fired thousands of employees and shut down offices across the world in order to cut expenditures. The company had lost half of the top 100 advertisers in less than a month after the billionaire took office. Later, some advertisers returned to the platform.

HDFC subsidiaries get merger nod

New Delhi: The National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT) Friday gave its approval for the merger of HDFC Property Ventures and HDFC Venture Capital with HDFC Capital Advisors, taking the merger of the parent with HDFC Bank a step closer. The tribunal is yet to approve the merger of its two insurance arms and the asset management company as also the patent into the bank as part of the \$40-billion reverse merger. In its final order, the NCLT sanctioned a composite scheme of amalgamation of HDFC Property Ventures and HDFC Venture Capital into HDFC Capital Advisors, HDFC said in an exchange filing. This approval will help pave the way for the merger of HDFC into HDFC Bank expected to be finalised by the third quarter of next financial year. The proposed entity will have a combined asset base of around ₹18 lakh crore.

Airbnb lays off 30% of staffers

San Francisco: Online hospitality major Airbnb has laid off 30 per cent of its recruiting staff. The cuts affected 0.4 per cent of the company's total workforce of 6,800, as it plans to increase headcount this year. Amid the pandemic, Airbnb had laid off 25 per cent of its workforce, or about 1,900 employees.

2023 holds little promise for tech IPOs

New Delhi, March 4: The global economic crisis, which hit the companies' initial public offering (IPO) plans in India in 2022, continues to haunt the founders and CEOs and the first two months of the new year went completely dry as no public offering was launched amid recession fears.

Although some IPOs appear to be in the offing this month, the mood among the companies, investors and the public is yet to be lifted after a dismal December.

Forty Indian corporates raised ₹59,412 crore through IPOs in calendar year (CY) 2022, half of the ₹ 1,18,723 crore (all-time high) mobilised by 63 IPOs in 2021, according to Prime Database, India's pre-

mier database on the primary capital market.

When it comes to big new-age internet companies, only fully-integrated logistics service provider Delhivery (Rs 5,235 crore IPO) and data intelligence firm Tracxn Technologies (Rs 309.38 crore) took the public offering route last year.

Droneacharya Aerial Innovations also went public, with an aim to raise approximately ₹34 crore through a new issuance of shares. In 2021, 11 startups went public, including Zomato, Paytm, Policybazaar and Nykaa.

Market experts believe there will be many more IPOs from March onwards.

There is an ongoing risk of further escalation in the war on Ukraine and the current wheat



crop being impacted by hot weather conditions, according to market research firm Redseer Strategy Consultants.

Consumer perception of the general economic condition continues to be pessimistic as per the Reserve Bank of India's Consumer Confidence Survey of January 2023, where more than 50 per cent of consumers reported it to have

Startups and tech companies that deferred their public offerings last year included Oyo, Snapdeal, Ola, Droom, MobiKwik, PharmEasy, BoAt and Flipkart

worsened.

The IPO and qualified institutional placement (QIP) activity has been declining consistently since 2022 amid global macro-economic conditions and funding squeeze.

This comes at a difficult time for startups. They currently have limited ability to drive growth through discounts and other levers, which worked well during an eas-

the sources said.

IndiGo, owned by InterGlobe Aviation Ltd, is also comparing the A320neo with the Boeing 737 MAX as it weighs a major new order for narrow-body jets, they added. The split between wide- and narrow-body jets was not immediately clear.

An IndiGo representative told Reuters the airline is constantly in talks with manufacturers as it plans its next phase of growth. "However, we haven't finalised anything till now," Airbus declined to comment on any talks, saying it is "always in contact with existing and potential customers". Boeing had no immediate comment.

IndiGo, which counts a 55% share of the domestic market, is widely expected to maintain Airbus as its supplier of narrow-body jets to squeeze out further economies of scale.

It is already one of Airbus's largest customers and has so far ordered a total of 830 Airbus A320-family jets of which 488 are still to be delivered.

But Indian analysts say Airbus will face a tougher fight for the wide-body order. In a departure from its single-aisle strategy, IndiGo last month began international operations with a Boeing 777, its first wide-body aircraft, taken from codeshare partner Turkish Airlines, which provides the pilots.

Foxconn seeks chip, EV cooperation with India

Foxconn has ambitious plans to make EVs and is also looking to make chips

Taipei, March 4: Major Apple Inc supplier Foxconn said Saturday it was seeking cooperation in India in new areas like chips and electric vehicles (EVs) after a visit to the country by its chairman, Liu Young-way.

Apple has been shifting production away from China after the country's strict Covid-19 restrictions disrupted the manufacturing of new-model iPhones and other devices, and amid tensions between Beijing and Washington.

In January, India's trade minister said Apple, which began iPhone assembly in the country in 2017 through Wistron Corp and

later Foxconn, wants India to account for up to 25% of its production from about 5% to 7% currently

Taiwan's Foxconn, the world's largest contract electronics maker and formally called Hon Hai Precision Industry Co Ltd, said Liu had visited India from February 27 to Saturday. "My trip this week supported Foxconn's efforts to deepen partnerships, meet old friends and make new ones, and seek cooperation in new areas such as semiconductor development and electric vehicles," Liu said.

Windfall tax on diesel slashed to ₹0.50/litre, nil on aviation fuel

New Delhi, March 4: The government slashed windfall profit tax on export of diesel to its lowest of ₹0.50 per litre and nil on jet fuel (ATF) while the levy on domestically produced crude oil was marginally increased, according to an official order.

The levy on crude oil produced by companies such as Oil and Natural Gas Corporation (ONGC) has hiked to ₹4,400 per tonne from ₹4,350 per tonne, the order dated March 3 said.

Crude oil pumped out of the ground and from below the seabed is refined and converted into fuels like petrol, diesel and aviation turbine fuel (ATF).

The government has also cut the tax on export of diesel to ₹0.5 per litre from ₹2.5, and the same on overseas shipments of ATF was cut to nil from ₹1.50 a litre.

The new tax rates come into effect from March 4, the order said. This is the second reduction in rates in a fortnight. Rates were cut February 16.

The export levy on diesel and ATF is the lowest since the tax was introduced in July last year.

The tax rates are reviewed every fortnight based on average oil prices in the previous two weeks.

India first imposed windfall profit taxes July 1, joining a growing number of nations that tax super normal profits of energy companies. At that time, export duties of ₹6 per litre (\$12 per barrel) each were levied on petrol and ATF and ₹13 a litre (\$26 a barrel) on diesel.

A ₹23,250 per tonne (\$40 per barrel) windfall profit tax on domestic crude production was also levied.

The export tax on petrol was scrapped in the very first review.

Reliance Industries Ltd, which operates the world's largest single-location oil refinery complex at Jamnagar in Gujarat, and Rosneft-backed Nayara Energy are primary exporters of fuel in the country.

The government levies tax on windfall profits made by oil producers on any price they get above a threshold of \$75 per barrel.

The levy on fuel exports is based on cracks or margins that refiners earn on overseas shipments. These margins are primarily a difference between the international oil price realised and the cost.

Startups struggling to raise funds, investors retreat

ONLY 53% OF STARTUPS SAW POSITIVE FUNDRAISING EXPERIENCE IN 2022, DOWN FROM 92% IN 2021

New Delhi, March 4: The economic turbulence of 2022 has entered 2023, even getting worse, and startup founders are finding it all the more difficult to raise funds amid the global macro-economic conditions.

Amid a deepening funding winter, only 53 per cent of startup founders had a positive fundraising experience (71 per cent of those who attempted to raise) in 2022, down from 92 per cent in 2021.

Startup founders expect this year to be challenging, with 58 per cent of founders expecting a tough fundraising environment, according to a recent report by InnoVen Capital, Asia's leading venture debt firm.

Fintech startups in India raised

\$5.65 billion in 390 rounds last year, a massive drop of 47 per cent in terms of funding amount and 29 per cent in the number of rounds when compared to 2021.

This drop in funding can be attributed to the decline in late-stage funding from \$8.3 billion in 2021 to \$3.7 billion in 2022, a drop of 56 per cent, according to data provided by global software-as-a-service (SaaS)-based market intelligence platform, Tracxn.

"The country is currently experiencing a funding winter. Growing inflation and macroeconomic tensions have made the investors step back from making big investment decisions," the Tracxn report said.

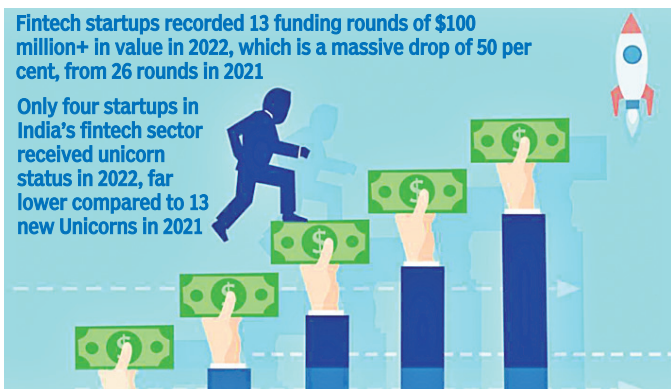
In 2023, the tightening funding environment has also led to an increased focus on profitability and

The year 2022 was challenging for the startup ecosystem with an end to cheap money, rising interest rates and a challenging geopolitical environment. The positive aspect of the slowdown has been an increased appreciation for building sustainable business models

unit economics.

"While both growth and profitability are important, for the first time in seven years, founders had a higher bias for profitability over growth. Around 55 per cent of founders cited profitability as a bigger focus area in 2023, com-



pared to only 17 per cent in 2021," the InnoVen Capital report said.

Startup founders are also increasingly looking towards a domestic IPO as the likely mode of exit, despite the recent volatility of public market tech companies.

As Indian startups face turbu-

lence in the global funding winter, experts said they need to reserve cash, create a long-term goal and adopt a culture of customer feedback to survive in 2023.

According to Ritesh Malik, Director, Alliance for Digital India Foundation (ADIF), startups must

hear back from their customers.

"The more you hear from your customers, the more you will be able to understand their changing needs. And the more your product becomes dynamic, you constantly change that product to the whims and fancies of the customer," he told IANS.

Ravish Nareish, CEO and Co-founder of Khatabook, said that there is a stronger acknowledgment of Indian startups' role in solving core problems of emerging economies to bridge the socio-economic gaps.

"This year, our primary aim is to turn profitable and scale up the digital lending offerings to meet the unmet credit demand of Indian MSME businesses. We are optimistic about the Indian economy and its opportunities for the startup ecosystem," he said.

Mumbai Indians slay Giants

Mumbai, March 4: In a mismatch of epic proportions, Mumbai Indians crushed Gujarat Giants by 143 runs to stamp their authority with an all-round show as the Women's Premier League got underway here Saturday.

After posting a mammoth 207/5, powered by captain Harmanpreet Kaur's sensational 30-ball 65 (14x4), Mumbai Indians' bowlers led by Saika Ishaque (4/11) produced a superb show to restrict Giants to just 64/9 in 15.1 overs and make a dream start to the competition.

Giants captain Beth Mooney suf-

fered an injury in the first over and retired hurt after initial checkup on the field, and could not return to bat again.

Mumbai not only dominated Giants right from the start but also showcased their aggressive style of play both with the bat and the ball in the first game itself, delighting a fairly packed crowd.

Kaur recorded the first-ever half century of WPL with stunning strokeplay and added 89 runs from just 42 balls with New Zealand's Amelia Kerr (45 n o, 24b, 6x4, 1x6) after Hayley Matthews (47, 31b, 3x4, 4x6) provided the initial fireworks.

Kaur's innings was straight out

of textbook for all the domestic players watching in her team, competition and beyond. She found gaps at will, connected the ball perfectly, and did not give a single chance to the opposition bowlers to capitalise.

But before Kaur's onslaught, it was the aggressive West Indies batter Matthews who looked set to score the first fifty of the tournament but unfortunately fell just three runs short.

Matthews added 54 runs for the second wicket with Nat Sciver-Brunt, an association that laid the platform for a strong first-innings total for the winning side.

England star Sciver-Brunt was

in her elements as after smoking 5 fours for her 18-ball 23, she returned an opening spell of 2-0-5-2 that helped derail the Gujarat Giants off the track.

It was certainly a forgettable first outing for Giants who did not have much to cheer about. After their bowlers were hammered all over the park for a grand total of 31 fours and 6 sixes by the Mumbai Indians, the wheels came off completely when they were left tottering at 23/6 after 7.1 overs.

With the pounding received in the first half of the game, the matters became worse for the Giants as soon as their chase began.

But before they lost Meghana, Giants had suffered a huge blow in the form of Ashleigh Gardner, with Matthews taking a sharp catch at the first slip off the right-arm pacer Issy Wong (1/7) to walk back for a golden duck.

Ishaque removed Annabel Sutherland (6) in the fifth over, and returned in the seventh over of the innings to clean up Georgia Wareham (8), making the most of the pressure created by the impressive right-arm seamer Wong from the other end. The pair of Dayalan Hemlatha (29 n o) and Mansi Joshi (6) did their best to delay the inevitable, but Mumbai completed the win with 29 balls to spare.

Manchester, March 4: Manchester City passed a huge test of their Premier League title credentials by beating Newcastle 2-0 Saturday as a couple of big calls by Pep Guardiola paid off in a match between the wealthiest teams in English football.

Phil Foden was handed a start

over Riyad Mahrez on the right wing and gave City the lead in the 15th minute when his driving run into the area ended with a shot that deflected past Newcastle goalkeeper Nick Pope.

City never looked comfortable against a powerful Newcastle team that was dangerous on the counterattack but got the crucial second goal three minutes after Guardiola

took off Kevin De Bruyne, who endured a rare ineffectual performance.

De Bruyne's replacement, Bernardo Silva, scored with one of his first touches, poking the ball past Pope from 15 meters in the 67th after collecting a flick from Erling Haaland.

By becoming just the second team - after Liverpool - to defeat Newcastle in the league this season, second-place City kept the pressure on leader Arsenal, which was playing later Saturday at home to Bournemouth. The teams came into the weekend separated by five points.

It was another blow to Newcastle, who lost the English League Cup final to Manchester United last weekend and whose league form has dipped in recent weeks.

The northeast team has dropped out of the top four in their bid to qualify the Champions League and stayed four points behind fourth-place Tottenham, which has played one game more.

INDIAN PLAYERS BACK IN NETS

New Delhi, March 4: A day after an embarrassing nine-wicket rout at the hands of Australia, some of India's Test squad members were back at the Holkar Stadium for a gruelling 90-minute net session.

With head coach Rahul Dravid and batting coach Vikram Rathour for company, opener Shubman Gill, middle-order batter Shreyas Iyer, all-rounders Ravichandran Ashwin, Ravindra Jadeja, and left-arm wrist-spinner Kuldeep Yadav sweated it out in two nets adjacent to the match strip.

The third Test, played on an extremely turning pitch with variable bounce, ended in just over two days. While Kuldeep had a long bowl at the nets, the other four enjoyed extended batting sessions against local net bowlers and also faced throwdowns.

There were no experimental or innovative shot selections but plain and simple copybook batting as they looked to get some form back before the fourth and final Test, starting in Ahmedabad from March 9.

SHAMI SET TO RETURN

India's senior-most speedster Mohammed Shami is expected to feature in the playing XI for the final Test after being rested as part of workload management during the Indore game.

The Indian team management, in consultation with its medical staff, has decided to space out the pace bowlers, who are going to play the IPL and are in the ODI

World Cup plans.

Hence Shami, who had played the first two Tests and is also a part of the ODI squad, was rested for the third game. In his place, Umesh Yadav was drafted in as the second pacer after Mohammed Siraj.

With Siraj bowling only 24 overs in the first three games for one wicket, Umesh, with his better show in Indore, and who is not part of the white ball set-up, stands a good chance to share the new ball with Shami in Ahmedabad.

Siraj is likely to feature in all three ODIs March 17 to 22 and will probably get some time off during the final game at the Narendra Modi Stadium.

Shami, who has been the best pacer on view across both teams with seven scalps from 30 odd overs in the series, will be needed on a dry Motera surface that might be conducive for reverse swing.

India are currently leading the series 2-1 but need to win the last game, in order to nullify the result of Sri Lanka's upcoming away series against New Zealand, and qualify for the World Test Championship final.

KOHLI'S TEMPLE VISIT

With the third Test ending way before schedule, star batter Virat Kohli and wife Anushka Sharma Saturday visited Shree Mahakaleshwar Temple in Ujjain to offer prayers.

While some of the players stayed back in Indore, a few, including skipper Rohit Sharma, returned to Mumbai and will join the team in Ahmedabad March 6.
