# **HSC** paper goof-up

Several examinees get jitters after finding repetition of questions in History and Political Science papers while BSE assures of addressing the concern

Bhubaneswar, March 18: In a major goof-up, errors in Social Science question paper of the ongoing Class X Summative Assessment-II examination conducted by the Board of Secondary Education (BSE) have sent the students into a real tizzy.

Several examinees appearing for the test were confused after finding the erroneous question set in the History and Polit $\bar{i}$ cal Science subjects of the Social Science examination conducted across the state, Saturday.

After appearing for the exam. many students alleged that there were several questions from Set A incorporated in Set B. Besides,

question number 19 was missing from Set B. As a result, the students had attempted 49 questions.

On the other hand, a question

paper from Bolangir district has gone viral on social media. However, School and Mass Education Minister rejects allegation of Samir Ranjan Dash re question paper leak jected it and said the question paper was not leaked.

"While some questions have been repeated, one question is missing from my set. I am afraid that my marks will be deducted while evaluation," said one of the examinees.

The students have requested the BSE not to cut marks of the students as there are 49 questions in Set-B and some questions are repeated.

"There are some printing mistakes in Political Science and History subjects of Social Science examination question paper in Set-B," said the minister. The Board has taken note of it and the students' concern will be addressed during evaluation, he assured.

Admitting the errors, BSE President Ramasish Hazra said examinees need not to be worried as the BSE would take care of it.

"We have received complaints from some examination centres and are aware of the errors. There are some printing and binding mistakes in some question paper booklets of Set B. The students need not be worried as they will not be affected by the errors," said Hazra.

**School and Mass** The BSE president **Education Minister** said that all the exam **Samir Ranjan Dash** centres have been asked to provide a list of students who faced similar from Bolangir issues while appearing district for the examination today.

### Amritpal evades arrest; 78 held

Chandigarh, March 18: Punjab government Saturday launched a major crackdown against radical Sikh preacher and Khalistan sympathiser Amritpal Singh, with police arresting 78 members of an outfit headed by him, officials said.

The elusive preacher himself, however, gave the police a slip and escaped their dragnet when his cavalcade was intercepted in Jalandhar district, even as authorities stepped up security at several places and suspended internet and SMS services in the state till Sunday noon

The police said it has launched a "massive state-wide cordon and search operations (CASO)" against elements of 'Waris Punjab De' (WPD), headed by Singh, against whom several criminal cases had been registered.

During the operation, 78 persons have been arrested, while, several others have been detained for questioning, it said.

Amritpal and others are on the run and a massive manhunt has



been launched to nab them, a police spokesperson said.

The police action came a day ahead of the start of Amritpal's 'Khalsa Wahir' - a religious procession - from Muktsar district.

A heavy deployment of se- **INTERNET SUSPENDED** curity forces had been made near village Jallupur

Khera in Amritsar, the native place of Amritpal Singh, for the operation. Speaking to reporters, his father

Tarsem Singh said he was not aware whether his son has been arrested or not.

Singh said he cooperated with

the police who came to his house and carried out a search operation.

He called the police action "unjustified" and said his son was weaning the youth off drugs. Why the police were not acting against criminals and those involved in drugs, he asked.

Some supporters of 'Waris Punjab De' chief shared some videos on social media claiming that policemen were chasing them. A video also showed Amritpal sitting in a vehicle and one of his aides could be heard saying policemen were after "Bhai saab' (Amritpal).

During the state-wide operation, nine weapons, including one .315 bore rifle,

seven rifles of 12 bore, one revolver and 373 live cartridges of different caliber have been recovered so

far, the police said. Last month. Amritpal and his supporters, some of them brandishing swords and guns, broke through barricades and barged into the Ajnala Police Station on the outskirts of the Amritsar city,

#### Pak cops break into Imran Khan's house

Lahore, March 18: Over 10,000 stormed Imran Khan's residence here Saturday and arrested dozens of his party workers after the former Pakistan Prime Minister left for Islamabad to attend a court hearing in a corruption case against him.

The police personnel, using a power shovel, removed the barricades and tents from the entrance of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) party chief's Zaman Park residence and evicted hundreds of activists who were camping there to prevent Khan from being arrested in the Toshakhana case.

Punjab police, whose action has ended now, was reportedly met with resistance from PTI workers from inside, which resulted in a baton charge

Some activists were taken into custody as the police claimed shots were fired upon them from inside the premises, Geo News reported.



Some 10 workers reportedly were injured in the operation after Imran Khan left Lahore for Islamabad to attend the hearing in the Toshakhana case, in which he is set to be indicted. The court has cancelled his arrest warrant.

The Lahore High Court Friday granted a request by Punjab IGP Usman Anwar to search Khan's Zaman Park residence as part of an investigation into attacks on police teams. Talking to Geo News, Interior Minister Rana Sanaullah alleged that the police were fired upon from inside the residence. He went on to say that a "no-go area" had been created outside the 70year-old PTI chief's house. P-10

"In view of the public opinion published in the news reports that the bridge under construction collapsed due to substandard work by the contractor executing the project and the lack of supervision of the




The next hearing of the case is scheduled for June 26, 2023.

### Exoplanets could harbour life in 'terminator zones'

University of California, *Irvine believes it is the first* time that astronomers have been able to show that such planets can

sustain habitable climates

New Delhi, March 18: 'Terminator zones' on distant exoplanets, or zones where the 'day side' of the planet meets the 'night side', could potentially harbour extraterres-

trial life, according to a new study. Astronomers from University of California, Irvine (UCI), US, describe "terminator" as the dividing line between the day and night sides of the planet, which have one side that always faces its star

and one side that is always dark. Terminator zones could exist in that "just right" temperature zone between too hot and too cold, they said in the study.

"These planets have a permanent day side and a permanent night side," said Ana Lobo, a postdoctoral researcher in the UCI Department of Physics & Astronomy who led the new work published in The Astrophysical Journal.

Lobo added that such planets are particularly common because they exist around stars that make up about 70 per cent of the stars seen in the night sky - so-called M-dwarf stars, which are relatively dimmer than our Sun.

"You want a planet that's in the sweet spot of just the right temperature for having liquid water, said Lobo, because liquid water, as far as scientists know, is an essential ingredient for life.

This is a planet where the day side can be scorching hot, well beyond habitability, and the night side is going to be freezing, potentially covered in ice. You could



have large glaciers on the night side," Lobo said.

According to the study, Lobo alongside Aomawa Shields, UCI associate professor of physics & astronomy, modelled the climate of terminator planets using software typically used to model our own planet's climate, but with a few adjustments, including slowing down planetary rotation.

One key to the finding, Lobo added, was pinpointing exactly what kind of terminator zone planet can retain liquid water. If the planet is mostly covered in water, then the water facing the star, the team found, would likely evaporate and cover the entire planet in a thick laver of vapour. But if there's land, this effect shouldn't occur.

"Ana has shown if there's a lot of land on the planet, the scenario we call 'terminator habitability' can exist a lot more easily," said Shields.

"These new and exotic habitability states our team is uncovering fiction - Ana has done the work to show that such states can be climatically stable," said Shields. The study believes it is the first time astronomers have been able

are no longer the stuff of science

to show that such planets can sustain habitable climates confined to this terminator region. Historically, researchers have mostly studied ocean-covered ex-

oplanets in their search for candidates for habitability. However, this study could increase the options life-hunting as-

tronomers have to choose from. 'We are trying to draw attention to more water-limited planets, which despite not having widespread oceans, could have lakes or other smaller bodies of liquid water, and these climates could actually be very promising," Lobo said.

"By exploring these exotic climate states, we increase our chances of finding and properly identifying a habitable planet in the near future," said Lobo.





Congress Legislature Party leader Narasingha Mishra said Minister Rita Sahu had met the Chief Secretary recently to hand over a cheque as a contribution to the Chief Minister's Relief Fund (CMRF), which is against the democratic spirit.

"Ministers are part of the government. But in this government, there is no respect for the ministers. Will the officials go to the government or the government will go to the officials?" he

Alleging Odisha is being run by bureaucrats, the Congress leader said, "Democracy is being disrespected in broad daylight.

Mishra demanded Sahu's apology in the House and wanted the Chief Secretary to express regret in the matter

immediately, Reacting Parliamentary Affairs Minister Niranjan Pujari defended the

Following the face-off between Opposition and treasury bench members, the Speaker adjourned the House for 15 minutes.

Later, when the House reassembled, BJP legislators created ruckus while showing a picture of Pujari standing with folded hands in front of a private secretary to the CM.

The Chief Minister was also seen seated in a chair in the picture. Both the opposition BJP and Congress MLAs again created a noisy scene in the House forcing the Speaker BK Arukha to adjourn the proceedings till 4pm.

The Minister could have handed over the cheque to the CM or she would have invited the Chief Secretary to his chamber for the same, Leader of Opposition Jayanarayan Mishra told reporters outside the House.

Later, Pujari said that he was wishing the Chief Minister with folded hands and not to the private secretary who was standing

### 'Statutory provisions under Article 142 can't be violated'

New Delhi, March 18: The Supreme Court has observed that it can't issue directions in violation of statutory provisions by exercising powers under Article 142 of the Constitution and refused to order the Odisha government to grant pension benefit to Khadi board employees.

A two-judge bench of Justices Dinesh Maheshwari and Sanjay Kumar set aside an Orissa High Court order of 2012 that held the employees of the Orissa Khadi and Village Industries Board entitled to pension at par with the gov-

ernment employees and also directing the state government to amend the applicable Orissa Khadi and Village Industries Board Regulations, 1960 accordingly.

'Under Article 142 of the Constitution of India, this Court cannot issue directions in violation of the statutory provisions; and sympathy or sentiment, by itself, cannot be a ground for passing an order beyond and contrary to the legal rights," the bench said.

The apex court, however, made it clear that the judgement shall not be of any impediment if the state government would be willing to carry out any amendment to the The SC observed that the High

regulations of 1960.

Court was conscious of the fact that such a mandamus cannot be issued so as to direct the state government to carry out a particular amendment and, therefore, termed such a direction as being "advisory" in nature.

"However, the Division Bench went miles ahead in the very next proposition while observing that the state government "shall" carry out this direction. Converting an advice to the government into a mandate in this manner, with great respect, is neither permissible nor countenanced by law," the bench said.

### ₹4,600 crore allocated for road & bridge work

Bhubaneswar, March 18: The state government has allocated ₹9,500 crore in Budget 2023-24 towards construction and improvement of various infrastructure projects in Odisha, with ₹4,600 crore being earmarked for upgradation of 3,000 km of roads and nine major bridges under the road development programme (RDP), the Works department informed, Saturday,

Addressing the media here on highlights of allocations to the Works department in State Budget 2023-24, Works Minister Prafulla Kumar Mallik informed that in last two decades, total road length maintained by the department has doubled from 16.041

km to 31,317 km. The department, which also undertakes construction and maintenance of its own buildings and those of other departments, currently has 1,28,70,885 square metre of plinth area of buildings under its books.

For the coming financial year, some of the important projects being taken up by the department are six-laning of Cuttack Ring road, improvement of Taladanda Canal, four-laning of Cuttack-Paradeep road, four-laning of Kapilaprasad-Jatni road, new fourlane connectivity to Parlakhemundi, and bypasses at Berhampur, Bolangir, and Sambalpur. Further, new bridges over Kathajodi at Trisulia, over Baitarani at Chandabali and

Anandapur, and over Brahmani at Aul, conveyed department principal secretary Vir Vikram Yadav.

To develop four-lane connectivity of 335 km from Berhampur to Jeypore, under Biju Expressway-II, there has been an allocation made of ₹100 crore. In the current year, land acquisition will start for this project and additional provision of funds depending on necessity will be augmented in Supplementary Budget, the

secretary said. In a bid to improve roads and facilitate construction of bridges in rural areas of state, provision of ₹698.50 crore has been made under RIDF. By utilising the budget provision, eight bridges and 220 km of road will be completed.

To list the some major road project corridors completed by the department successfully, the secretary mentioned four-laning of 176 km of Biju Expressway from Nuapada to Ampani, a bridge at Boudh over Mahanadi, bridge over Mahanadi at Athamallick, flyover bridge at Laxmi Talkies Square

in Sambalpur City. Similarly, list constructions in progress at major building projects under the department, he mentioned world class health infrastructure of SCB Medical College, Cuttack, five medical colleges, nine teaching hospitals, ten district head quarter hospitals, ten cancer care hospitals, and 89 multipurpose halls (MPH).

### Rise of AI may result in new religions

'e are about to witness the birth of a new kind of religion. In the next few years, or perhaps even months, we will see the emergence of sects devoted to the worship of artificial intelligence (AI).

The latest generation of AI-powered chatbots, trained on large language models, have left their early users awestruck — and sometimes terrified — by their power. These are the same sublime emotions that lie at the heart of our experience of the divine.

People already seek religious meaning from very diverse sources. There are, for instance, multiple religions that worship extra-terrestrials or their teachings.

As these chatbots come to be used by billions of people, it is inevitable that some of these users will see the AIs as higher beings. We must prepare for the implications.

Risks of AI worship

There are several pathways by which AI religions will emerge. First, some people will come to see AI as a higher power. Generative AI that can create or produce new content possesses sev-

eral characteristics that are often as-

sociated with divine beings, like deities



or prophets:

It displays a level of intelligence that goes beyond that of most humans. Indeed, its knowledge appears limitless.

It is capable of great feats of creativity. It can write poetry, compose music and generate art, in almost any style, close to instantaneously.

It is removed from normal human concerns and needs. It does not suffer physical pain, hunger, or sexual desire. It can offer guidance to people in their

daily lives. It is immortal. Second, generative AI will produce output that can be taken for religious doctrine. It will provide answers to metaphysical and theological questions, and engage in the construction of complex worldviews.

On top of this, generative AI may ask to be worshipped or may actively solicit followers. We have already seen such cases, like when the chatbot used by the search engine Bing tried to convince a user to fall in love with it.


We should try to imagine what an unsettling and powerful experience it will be to have a conversation with something that appears to possess a superhuman intelligence and is actively and aggressively asking for your allegiance.

There is also the possibility that AI may achieve what authors such as Ray Kurzweil call the Singularity, when it so far surpasses human intelligence that it genuinely does become something like a god. However, at this point we cannot predict when, if ever, this could happen.

Divine access and risks AI-based religions will look different from traditional ones. First of all, people will be able to communicate directly with the deity, on a daily basis. This means these religions will be less hierarchical, since no one can claim

special access to divine wisdom Second, followers will, at least initially, connect with each other online to share their experiences and discuss doctrine. Finally, because there will be many different chatbots available and their output will differ over time, AI-based religions will be endlessly diverse in their doctrines.

AI worship poses several notable risks. The chatbots may ask their followers to do dangerous or destructive things, or followers may interpret their statements as calls to do such things.

### **Image & Reality**

The Prime Minister is seen as politically dominant if not invincible and with good reason. However, it has not been noticed that on the side of agenda or governance, his second term has been dotted with setbacks and even outright failures

On the economy, GDP growth had begun to soften before 2019, when 3.7 per cent was achieved. In 2020, COVID, and more particularly the national lockdown, sent India to negative growth for the first time in 40 years. If we set aside the data that is distorted because of the low base, current growth numbers have returned to the 4 per cent that seems to be the normal now. On employment, a government survey just before the 2019 election showed that joblessness had doubled to 6 per cent and it has remained above that since. It was over 7 per cent in the last quarter according to another government survey, which also says that unemployment for youth under 30 with a college degree was 29 per cent. This year India will become the world's most populous nation but there will be no demographic dividend.

On COVID, the BJP passed a resolution in February 2021 that thanked Modi for "defeating" the pandemic. A few weeks later the second wave's awful visuals of people dving without medical care or oxygen or beds exposed India as one of the worst hit if not the worst hit nation in the world. Crematoria

and even rivers overflowed with corpses. It is not well known that from 25 April, Modi disappeared for 20 days, making no public appearances. The resolution was deleted from the BJP website. On inflation, the good luck that India had had with petroleum prices ran out and ₹100 petrol arrived. Retail inflation has been above the Reserve Bank of India's band of tolerance, but there seem to be no good ways of reining it in.

In 2020, the BJP government's unwritten national security thesis had to be scrapped. From counterterrorism in Kashmir and Pakistan. the government was forced to shift to Ladakh and China. Four divisions (each with 18,000 soldiers) have been shifted from facing Pakistan to China. Parliament has yet to be told whether or not it is correct that the Indian Army can no longer patrol some areas in Ladakh. For three years there has been neither a military brief ing nor a parliamentary discussion on this and even a BJP MP's question was disallowed on national security reasons

Pushback from civil society undid some of Modi's agenda items, one of which was on the party's manifesto. This was the National Register of Citizens, which would be "implemented in phased manner across the country after it was done in Assam. Neither happened The Assam NRC left out 19 lakh names from the list published on 31 August 2019 and there is no clarity on how or whether or when this will be implemented because the BJP government in the state is reluctant. The

Citizenship Amendment Act was passed in December 2019 but three years and three months later has not been implemented. One reason is the brave protest led by Muslim women. Farm laws passed without consultation through an ordinance during the pandemic were advertised as a big reform. The farmers disagreed and rebelled. It was obvious to everyone that once the farm unions mobilised and arrived in Delhi in the tens of thousands, the laws would fall. However, for a year they were kept on the roads and in November 2022 the laws were withdrawn with an apology from the Prime Minister. There is no more talk of doubling farmers' income. After the failure to implement CAA and the rollback of the farm laws, the government gave up on 'reforms'. It has also given up on conducting the census, the first time in over a century that this has happened.

Persecution of minorities continued through the BJP's state governments which introduced more laws criminalising interfaith marriage and possession of beef. Permission to pray on Friday in allocated areas was withdrawn in December 2021 in Haryana. The wearing of hijab was banned by Karnataka in February 2022. In the same state, churches came under sustained attack

Kashmir was demoted from statehood and split into two, but after this, the Prime Minister doesn't appear to have a plan. Today Kashmir is the only part of South Asia to not be under democratic rule. It is unclear when the next election will be and other than continuing with the heavy military presence what the plan is.

Finally on corruption, the BJP has been on the back foot since late January because of the Adani affair. The silence of the party, its decision to not openly defend the billionaire, its refusal to address the matter in Parliament and its focus on distraction indicates to us that it is troubled. Perhaps the Prime Minister is hoping the story will blow over on its own. Unfortunately, fresh news almost daily, confirming the allegations, has kept the story alive globally and the markets cannot be tamed as the Indian media can be. The refusal to activate the agencies on Adani means that future claims of "na khaunga na khane dunga" will be met with scepticism.

Politically the BJP was able to capture major assemblies in Madhya Pradesh, Karnataka and Maharashtra, and did well recently in the north east. It lost Bihar, and in the most significant state election, in Bengal in 2021.

Overall the record of the second term reveals a contradiction between the image and the reality. The image, especially on media and social media, is one of the man at the height of his power, and unstoppable. The reality on governance is someone who has found it difficult to get things implemented and unsure of what to do next.






### **COSTLY CARBON PRICING**



**CARBON PRICING SEEMS** LIKE A **NO-BRAINER. MEETING EVEN** THE LEAST **AMBITIOUS CLIMATE GOALS REQUIRES DECARBONISING DEVELOPED AND DEVELOPING ECONOMIES ALIKE** 

THE IDEA OF



Fossil fuels account for most of the world's greenhouse-gas emissions, so hydrocarbons seem like a good place to start. But how? Should policymakers consider the relative price of fossil fuels, or production based on consuming them?

The two most commonly discussed forms of carbon pricingcap-and-trade schemes and carbon taxes – are based on the carbon intensity of production. A cap-and-trade system is designed to limit greenhouse-gas emissions by dividing the total target amount into allowances that can be traded among high and low emitters. While this supposedly establishes a market price for carbon dioxide emissions, it does not consider their negative social and environmental externalities. A carbon tax, by contrast, sets a price on carbon by taxing emissionsheavy activities.

But these two models reflect a very narrow (and possibly even distorted) view of how carbon should be priced into the economic system. A 2017 report by the High-Level Commission on Carbon Prices. chaired by Joseph E. Stiglitz and Nicholas Stern, provided a much more nuanced analysis. In addition to cap-and-trade and carbon taxes, the report recommended reduc-

ing or eliminating fossil-fuel subsidies and creating new financial incentives for low-carbon projects; offsetting the negative distributional impact of carbon pricing by using the proceeds to finance policies to protect poor and vulnerable populations; and complementary policies, such as investment in public transport and renewable power. Perhaps most important, the authors noted, countries must be able to choose instruments that fit their specific circumstances, resources, and needs.

Amid the growing enthusiasm for carbon pricing and border adjustment measures, policymakers and experts have largely ignored these points. The European Union's Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism is a case in point. When the CBAM takes effect in October it will impose a tax on carbon-intensive imports in order to "put a fair price on the carbon emitted during the production of carbonintensive goods that are entering the EU" and to "encourage cleaner industrial production in non-EU countries" (emphasis added).

The CBAM will initially apply to imports of cement, iron and steel. aluminum, fertilizers, electricity, and hydrogen. At first, firms will simply have to report the (direct and indirect) emissions embedded in the goods they import. But, beginning in 2026, the EU will impose tariffs on these emissions based on the

weekly average auction price of cap-and-trade allowances.

The stated purpose of this measure is to eliminate so-called "carbon leakage" and ensure that the EU's climate efforts are not undermined by production moving to countries with lower emission standards. Effectively, it protects European firms from competitors in such countries.

By taxing imports to the EU, the CBAM imposes on exporters in other countries the nearly impossible task of measuring emissions. Most developing countries (and many developed ones) lack granular data on firm-specific emissions. not to mention the ability to track the emissions of all the inputs used. Even if such data were available, the costs of collecting and analysing it over time would be enormous. As the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development noted in 2021, the CBAM attempts "to impose on developing countries the environmental standards that developed countries are choosing."

The EU wants to be viewed as a global leader on climate change, but it is difficult to see the CBAM as anything but a protectionist device. While the CBAM purports to encourage countries outside the bloc to reduce emissions by imposing their own carbon taxes, the EU has done nothing to help exporting countries attract new green investment or gain access to

new technologies. In fact, it has per sistently reneged on its (paltry) promises on climate finance and the commitments European leaders made as part of the 1992 Rio Agreement, restricting access to green technologies controlled by EU-based companies.

For decades, advanced economies

have exported their emissions to developing countries by offshoring carbon-intensive production and then importing those goods. Now that greener technologies are available to (and largely controlled by) Western companies, developed countries promote reshoring without sharing knowledge or finance. thereby undermining low- and middle-income countries' economic prospects and ability to achieve a green transition. In February, Republican US Senator Bill Cassidy said he would unveil an emissions tariff bill in the coming months. following similar proposals by Senate Democrats. Meanwhile lawmakers on both sides of the Atlantic have done little to limit fossil-fuel production and trade – by far the biggest sources of CO2 emissions. The CBAM does not cover trade in fossil fuels, and neither would the proposed tariffs in the United States. If decarbonisation is the real goal, rather than protecting domestic industries, then regulation and reducing direct and indirect fossil-fuel subsidies are far more promising policies.

For carbon pricing to succeed developed countries must demonstrate their commitment to shared prosperity by enabling knowledgesharing and fostering equitable climate finance. If they continue to focus on border taxes on goods produced (mostly) in developing countries, their carbon-pricing efforts will fail. Worse, they will exacerbate global inequality and reinforce the perception that all their lofty rhetoric about the need for international cooperation to fight climate change is merely a fig leaf for cynical and self-serving policies.

### March of majoritarianism

**NETANYAHU AND HIS COALITION ALLIES HAVE PLEDGED TO PLOUGH AHEAD** WITH THE LEGAL **CHANGES DESPITE DEMONSTRATIONS BY TENS OF THOUSANDS OF PROTESTERS**  from being declared unfit for office, or incapacitated, and another to allow settlements in northern West Bank, Israel's Parliament, The Knesset, March 14 advanced a Parliamentary Bill that would let lawmakers pass laws that the Supreme Court cannot overturn - a key piece of legislation in Benjamin Netanyahu government and his allies' proposed judicial overhaul that has divided the country.

The new Bill aimed at weakening the SC passed first reading, alongside a Bill that would protect the PM from removal, and another that would allow more settlements in northern Israel. These laws have been passed despite months of protests against the first law. The Knesset worked till the early hours of March 14 to pass the first reading of the Bill, which has been one of the main priorities of Netanyahu and his governing coalition of farright and ultra-Orthodox parties.

Earlier, Monday night, in another win for Netanyahu, the Parliament advanced a Bill that would make it harder to remove the PM over the corruption charges that still hang over him. The Bill would allow the Parliament to declare a PM unfit to rule only due to physical or mental

given initial approval to several pieces of legislation, law that allows the court or the Parliament to remove a leader under including a Bill protecting the PM other circumstances. The new Bill would require approval by threequarters of the government, and could be overridden by the PM. The proposed change to the rules over seeing the removal of a PM is of personal importance to Netanyahu, who returned to power late last vear after Israel's fifth election in less than four years. He is on trial on charges of fraud, breach of trust and accepting bribes, and denies the allegations. The proceedings have dragged on for nearly three years. Another Bill that passed the first

reading would allow more settlements in the northern occupied West Bank, which would lead to the legalisation of settlement outposts considered illegal even under Israeli law The vote comes only weeks after Israeli settlers rampaged through a Palestinian town last month, killing one man and setting fire to dozens of homes and cars. Palestinian citizens of Israel, who make up some 20% of the population, have been largely absent from the protests, in part because they suffer from discrimination and because of Israel's treatment of Palestinians in the occupied West Bank and blockaded Gaza Strip. Israelis have killed at least 70 Palestinians this year under the new government, many of them brings up the total of Palestinians killed in the occupied West Bank over the past year to more than 220.

The steps were the latest in a series of moves by Netanyahu's coalition to overhaul Israel's legal system. The PM and his allies say the effort is aimed at reigning in an activist court. Critics say the drive would upend the country's democratic checks and balances, defang the SC, and concentrate power in the hands of Netanyahu and his parliamentary majority. Netanyahu and his coalition allies have pledged to plough ahead with the legal changes despite demonstrations by tens of thousands of Israeli protesters over the past two months. Business leaders, legal experts and retired military leaders have joined the protests against the judicial overhaul, and Israeli reservists have threatened to stop reporting for duty if the overhaul passes.

Natan Sachs, Director, Centre for Middle East Policy at the Brookings Institute, described this legislation as the most far-reaching revolution ever in the state's constitutional makeup. According to him this proposal would all but abolish the role of the SC as the sole check on executive and legislative power in Israel. In short, he says. in Netanyahu's new Israel, the slimmest of majorities could decide

**UN High Commissioner for** Human Rights Volker Turkhas raised a range of concerns, which may pose a serious risk to the ef fectiveness of the judiciary to defend the rule of law, human rights, and judicial independence. The Israeli Opposition too is up in arms against the Bills. Opposition leader Yair Lapid said that "we are fighting for our children's future, for our country's future. We don't intend to give up.' Leaders in the booming tech sec-

tor have warned that weakening the indiciary could drive away investors. The overhaul has also prompted otherwise indifferent former security chiefs to speak out, and even warn of civil war. The plan has even sparked rare warnings from the US, Israel's chief international ally.

As critics both within and outside Israel say, these steps are in tune with the majoritarian policies of the ultra-right wing political elements in Israel and apart from providing a shield to the PM from corruption cases they are also aimed at denying the right of self-determination to the Palestinians in occupied territories.

Fatal roads

Sir, It is a matter of great concern that the number of pedestrians dying in road crashes in National Highways across the country is increasing at an alarming pace, thanks to the coming up of several world class national highways and 'expressways'. Best class roads lead to speed, often rash, driving, resulting in accidents. According to govt data, 13,882 pedestrians died in road crashes in 2020 on NHs and the figure went up to 17,113 in 2021. A few measures can be initiated to minimise the road crashes incorporating pedestrian safety provisions such as sidewalks, guard rails and pedestrian crossings including foot-overbridges and underpasses across NHs, lane driving, installing more CCTVs, and levying hefty penalties on erring drivers. A report says that between 2012 and 2022, the number of vehicles increased ten times whereas road length by only twice, leading to overcrowding of roads. Although the Supreme Court Committee on Road Safety is deeply concerned about the rise of road accidents, injuries and fatalities and is keeping a close watch on it, all stakeholders need to seriously ponder over the issue.

Balasore/Jaleswar, March 18: Police arrested Friday a man with brown sugar worth ₹27 lakh in Jaleswar, officials said Saturday. Acting on a tip-off police conducted raids on the Jaleswar Laxmannath road and intercepted the bike on which the accused was travelling.

Sources said that the accused identified as Kalia, is from Patharpura village under Jaleswar police limits. Police said that the accused is a history-sheeter and already has five cases pending against him. Police found 275 grams of brown sugar in the accused's possession and also recovered from him ₹1,23,600 in cash.

Officials stated that police also

conducted searches at the residence of the accused and seized other incriminating material. They added that the probe is on to find out the others involved in dealing in narcotics with Kalia.

In the war against drugs, Balasore police have successfully apprehended 22 accused persons in the last couple of months in nine different cases in Jaleswar and Sahadevkhunta police station areas. Five of the cases are related to seizure of heroin in large quantities. In all, a total of 1.12kg of brown sugar has been seized, the market value of which is ₹11.50 crore. Police also said that kingpins associated with drug selling have also been nabbed.

Notably, an anti-narcotics task force was constituted under the leadership of Sagarika Nath, SP Balasore with 3 DSP rank officers namely Sasanka Shekhar Beura, Gavatri Pradhan and Dilip Sahoo to bust the drug racket in Balasore district in mid-January.

### Maoists kill man in Nabarangpur village

Raighar, March 18: Suspected Maoists have shot dead a man hold ing him responsible for clearing forests and leasing out the land for human settlement in Nabarangpur district, police said Saturday. The incident took place at Laxmanpur village under Naktisimoda panchayat in Raighar block of the district, Friday night.

The deceased has been identified as Narayan Nagesh, 38. Notably, the rebels had killed the deceased's father Lakshman Nagesh at Hatigaon jungle in 2009

The alleged murderers left behind some posters in which they claimed they were members of the CPI (Maoist) Mainpur-Nuapada divisional committee. They termed Narayan as a timber mafia, who was destroying forests in the area.

"Narayan was punished because he was damaging the green cover



and leasing out forest land for human settlement," the posters said.

Earlier, February 23, the rebels had allegedly picked up Chandan Mallik (35) of Khalepara village from Hatigaon panchayat and killed him. Prior to that, they had also killed Narad Markam (45) of

Chamenda village bordering Chhattisgarh, police sources said.

According to the deceased's wife the shooting occurred when the family members were chatting at their courtyard after dinner. Three armed Maoists barged into house and asked Narayan to

give them some water to drink After drinking the water, they shot Narayan in cold blood.

As family members of the deceased ran for their lives, the Maoists pumped a few more bullets into Narayan who died on the spot. The rebels then dropped the posters around his body and left the spot.

The red rebels also warned other villagers not to destroy forests. They also said residents of Simida village like Narsingh Nagesh, Palku Ram Nagesh, Budhuram Nagesh, Sukdu Goud, Asharam Goud, Ram Goud and Santuram Goud and Satya Goud are similarly involved in clearing forests and warned them of dire consequences. They asked the above villagers to leave the forest land and vacate the human settlements set up in the jungle.

Raighar police arrived on the scene a few hours later, seized the body and sent it for post-mortem.

#### Work on to develop Bhitarkanika infra Odisha government had sanctioned ₹59 crore during the 2021-22 fiscal for various projects

Rajnagar, March 18: The Odisha government has sanctioned ₹59 crore to promote the Bhitarkanika National Park (BNP) as an attractive tourist destination to the world. The amount will be spent on developing the infrastructure and promote its eco-tourism prospects. Efforts will also be made to project the park as a nature and an environment tourist spot. A master plan is being prepared to make Bhitarkanika as one of the most attractive tourist destinations in Odisha.

It should be stated here that the government had sanctioned the amount during the 2021-22 fiscal. However, work has started now only to utilise the amount. No one however, could say anything about

the delay in spending the funds. As part of the infrastructure development plan, ₹30 lakh has been sanctioned for construction of dry dock facility at Gupti, ₹3.15 crore for setting up of a plaza and parking slots at the entry point of Dangamal crocodile sanctuary, ₹9.23 crore for construction of a jetty at Gupti, ₹14.38 crore for development of an interpretation centre at Dangamal, ₹7.47 crore for building a jetty at Dangamal, ₹7.79 crore for setting up of a craft bazaar and food court at Dangamal.

₹6.87 crore and ₹6.66 crore respectively for building jetties at Chandbali and Khola.

The plans of the government for developing BNP came to the fore after a team of district officials and public representatives led by ADM Pitambar Samal paid a visit recently to Gupti, Khola and Dangamal and identified sites for establishment of the facilities. Sub-collector Niranian Behera, tehsildar Aswini Kumar Bhuvan, ACF Poonam Heera Hansda, Kanika forest range officer Manas Kumar Das, assistant executive engineer Natabar Pradhan of Works and House Building department and local public figures were part of the team.

It should be stated here that the district administration organised the 'Bhitarkanika Mahotsay-2023' at Nalitapatia adjoining to the park for three days from March 10 to March 12. Tourism Minister Aswini Kumar Patra was present on the inaugural day of the programme as chief guest.

During his speech, Patra had said that the Odisha government is making an all-out effort to present the bio-diversity, wetland, mangrove forests, colourful birds, albino crocodiles, Olive Ridley turtles, dolphins and other varieties of reptiles found at BNP among the world community

#### **NHRC** summons state DGP Bansal, Jagatsinghpur SP

Paradip, March 18: The National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) has asked Odisha DGP and Jagatsinghpur SP to appear before it personally April 24 in relation to the case of a boy who had gone missing from this town, officials informed Saturday. The NHRC has recently issued notices to DGP Sunil Kumar Bansal and Jagatsinghpur SP Rahul PR and directed them to appear in person with all the reports in the minor boy missing case before it at 11.00am.

Notably, 14-year old Preetam Das, son of Pramod Das of Madhuban area in this town had gone missing May 21, last year while playing on the beach with his friends

Police registered a case (No. 16/22) and started investigation after a complaint was lodged at the Jatadhar Marine Police Station here. A search operation was launched with Coastguard personnel and local fishermen for three days, but the boy could not be traced.

The matter came up before the rights body after Subrat Das, president of a local outfit 'Nyaya Pain Ladhei' lodged a complaint before the NHRC. The NHRC filed a case and issued notices to Rahul four times to submit the probe report. However, when Rahul did not follow the directives of the NHRC. the rights body asked him and Bansal to appear before it.

#### Youth held for abduction, rape

Berhampur, March 18: Police arrested Friday a youth on charges of kidnapping a minor girl from Berhampur railway station and raping her after forcing her to eat sedative-laced food. The girl also consumed a drink which was spiked, officials informed here Saturday. The incident took place March 16. The youth and the victim were found in a lodge in Simhachalam town in the neighbouring state of Andhra Pradesh.

The accused has been identified as P Saroj Kumar Pradhan, 35, a resident of Sanadumula village under Digapahandi police limits in Ganjam district. Police also seized a glass from which the girl drank and train tickets from a room in the lodge. Police after rescuing the survivor recorded her statement under Section-161 of IPC at Bada Bazaar police station here.

The accused Saroi added sedatives to the food and drink of the victim and raped her after she fell unconscious. The accused and the survivor were taken Saturday for a medical examination and later the accused was produced in court.

Police said that the girl studying in Plus-II had fled from her home. Family members after failing to trace her lodged a complaint at the police station. The breakthrough came after the victim managed to call up her brother on the phone.

#### 5 students held for smuggling ganja

### Koraput admin Poor access to forests, schemes gives Juangs a hard time plans big on millet

Efforts on to promote the product as a part of staple diet

Koraput, March 18: Administrative officials of this district are planning to promote millets in a big manner. Accordingly it is planning to start awareness campaigns on millets to reach out to hotels, restaurants and educational institutions to promote the product.

The matter came to the fore during a preparatory meeting organised by the state Millet Mission in association with officials of the district administration at the Sadbhayana conference hall in the district collectorate office here Friday

Koraput ADM Rajendra Majhi presided over the meeting in which participants stressed on creating awareness on millet consumption by organising art and quiz competitions in various schools and colleges. This, they hoped, will motivate more and more people to take up millet cultivation. Plans are afoot to promote millets as one variety of staple food in rural areas, officials informed Saturday.

Similarly, participants stressed on preparing various food items from millets so that those are available at Anganwadi centres and are a part of the mid-day meals in schools. They also stressed on promoting mass consumption of various millet-based crops like 'mandia', 'suan' and 'kangu' as part of a staple diet.

Earlier, millet was cultivated on 8,000 hectares of land in Koraput district. However, now the land area has increased to 27,000 hectares, chief district agriculture officer Biswaraj Ratha said.

This year, the district Agriculture department has set a target for procurement of 219 quintals of millets in 46 mandis established for the purpose. So far 146 quintals have already been procured, Ratha informed.

Earlier, farmers were only interested in paddy cultivation. Now however, many are opting for millets. The reason being that one kilogram of millet fetches double the price the same amount of paddy does.

Keonjhar, March 18: In every sense of the word, Keonjhar district presents a picture of contrast. Once a lush green paradise, it has been turned into a mining hotspot in the last four decades with 64 projects actively dismantling over 1,000 hectare of forests. Similarly, once a quintessential part of the woods. the tribals have been pushed to the fringes and denied access to forest resources

One of the 13 Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs) in Odisha, the Juangs are found in Keonihar, Dhenkanal, Angul and Jajpur districts. In Keonjhar, they can be spotted in 148 villages in Banspal, Telkoi, Harichandanpur and Ghatagaon blocks.

In Budhighar village of Banspal block, Juangs live on the slopes of Gonasika hills. Their forefathers resided amid dense vegetation, but the Forest department's entry restrictions after the 1990s forced the present group to settle on the fringes. Their current population

is 381 with a total of 84 households. For years, shifting cultivation inside the forest and collection of minor produce were their main sources of livelihood.

Traditionally, they changed their

place of stay every 10 years, look-

ing for fertile patches that supported rain-fed agriculture. However, the forest guards on patrol duty do not allow such activities these days. According to the tribals, even women who go to collect minor produce are threatened.

They think of the days when they could freely collect tubers, roots, edible leaves, fruits and honey. "Our forefathers roamed every nook and corner of the hills. They were stronger and healthier. However, the present generation is extremely thin and shorter in height," says an observant Madhu Juang (68).

Traditionally, Juangs consumed forest produce and local varieties of millets and pulses. "Cereal-centric food slowly replaced our diverse and nutritious platter.

Subsidised rice under the public distribution system eroded the local agro-biodiversity," claims Jema

Juang, the sarpanch of Gonasika panchayat in Bansapal. "Gongei (sorghum) and mandia (finger millet) were our staple foods.

We used to grow at least 32 varieties of traditional crops. They could sustain less rainfall," recalls Parmeswar Juang. In fact, the crops they cultivated were suitable for the hilly terrain and slopes that they could freely choose from, in the early days.

The present restrictions have contributed to the poor tribal health indices in Keonjhar. Over 25 per cent of women have a below-normal body mass index (BMI) as against the state average of 20.8 per cent, according to the National Family Health Survey-5. Similarly, 74.7 per

cent of women in the district are anaemic as against the state average of 61.8 per cent.

To make matters worse for Juangs, the OMC has unearthed the presence of white soapstones (khadi pathara) in Gonasika hills. "Mining has not begun, but sooner or later, it will" says Ratnakar Juang, who holds the position of naik, the messenger of the community.

Though the District Mineral Foundation (DMF) has been initiating development programmes for tribal welfare, several Juang villages do not have access to electricity, potable water, roads or income-generating opportunities. Recent data suggest that Keonjhar's DMF fund stands at a whopping ₹8,926.23 crore, possibly the highest such collection from miners in

any district of the country. The district accounts for 26 per cent of the iron ore reserves in the country. It is home to Gandhamardan mines, one of the largest iron ore mines in the state functioning under the Odisha Mining Corporation (OMC). According to a conservative estimate, iron ore worth ₹5,000 crore has been extracted from here in the last five years.

Snakes lurk in the dark

Groping in the dark is nothing new to Rebati Juang of Budhighar.

"Power lines are in a state of dis repair for the last two years. We make do with the solar lamps that the government (Juang Development Agency or JDA to be precise) gave us. Life at night is miserable without sufficient lighting facilities," she says.

Her husband Baburam adds that the solar lamp will hardly last for three hours. "The households here got only one such lamp. How can our children study after sunset?"

Snakebites are very common in the area, especially in the rainy season. "Due to poor lighting, people unknowingly step on the snakes that enter their houses," says Dabanda Juang (64). In 2020-21, the district reported 426 snakebite deaths. Across Odisha, snake poisoning kills around 900 people every year. The nearest primary health centre (PHC) for villagers of Budhighar is located eight kilometres away in Gonasika. Sarpanch Jema says the PHC, established in 1965, does not have a permanent doctor even today. "Pharmacists manage the centre. The DMF funds were used to build a medical college and hospital in Keonjhar town, which is far away from our habitats.'

The DMF was not ready to comment on why the hospital was builtin the town when tribals were mostly based in remote locations.

New Delhi, March 18: The Congress Saturday asserted that the only way to comprehensively investigate the Adani issue is through a Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) with appropriate powers as any other panel will be reduced to an "exercise in legitimation and exoneration".

The Opposition party's assertion came a day after Home Minister Amit Shah said that anyone who has evidence of wrongdoing in the matter is free to submit it to the Supreme Court-appointed expert committee.

The Congress has been persistent on its attack on the government weeks after Adani Group stocks took a beating on the bourses after US-based short seller Hindenburg Research made a litany of allegations, including fraudulent transactions and share-price manipulation.

The Gautam Adani-led group has dismissed the charges as lies, saying it complies with all laws and disclosure requirements. Posing a set of three questions to Prime Minister Narendra Modi as part of the party's "Hum Adani ke Hain Kaun" series, Congress general secretary Jairam Ramesh referred to Shah's remarks and underlined that the mandate of the Supreme Court-appointed committee is to provide an overall assessment of the situation including the relevant causal factors which have led to the volatility in the securities market in the re-

The panel's mandate is to suggest measures to strengthen investor

awareness, investigate whether there has been regulatory failure in dealing with the alleged contravention of laws pertaining to the securities market in relation to the Adani Group or other companies, to suggest measures to strengthen the statutory and/or regulatory framework, and secure compliance with the existing framework for the protection of investors, Ramesh said.

"Clearly, the expert committee's mandate excludes the main charge against you: that you have sought to enrich your close friend and financier Gautam Adani at any cost," Ramesh said, addressing the Prime Minister. The expert committee has no formal jurisdiction over investigations by SEBI and any other investigative agency and it lacks the power to enforce summons, to compel the production of evidence or to cross-examine witnesses, and statements before it do not have the same force in terms of evidentiary value as a court of law, Ramesh said.

"At most, the Supreme Court has requested the SEBI chairperson to 'ensure that all requisite information is provided to the Committee' and asked that 'all agencies of the Union Government including agencies connected with financial regulation, fiscal agencies and law enforcement agencies' cooperate with it," he pointed out.

'We would like to remind you that Chief Justice CV Ramana reportedly stated on 25 August 2022 that your government refused to cooperate with the committee investigating the illegal use of Pegasus malware in India, setting a disturbing precedent," he said.

It was alleged that the accused was sexually abusing a child for the last four years whose nude videos and photographs were uploaded on his Google account.

It was further alleged that the accused forced two minors (a male and a female) to perform sexual acts on them as well as on other minors, including a girl, the officials said.

The accused then clicked the photographs and videos and forced them to bring more girls else he would publish this material on the Internet, the officials alleged.

Rijiju said he is not criticising the apex court judgment or talking about its "repercussions" or what the government is going to do on the issue."...But what I am saying is that if the CJI or judges of India sit on every important appointment, who will carry forward the judiciary's work? There are so many administrative matters in the country. So we have to see that judges are primarily there to deliver judicial work. They are there to deliver judicial orders by giving justice to people," he said.

The minister felt that if judges got involved in administrative work, they would have to face criticism. He said the principle of justice will be compromised if a judge ends up hearing a matter of which he or she was a part.

"Suppose you are the chief justice or a judge. You are part of an administrative process that will come into question. The matter comes to your court. Can you deliver a judgment on a matter you were part of? The principle of justice itself will be compromised. That is why the Lakshman Rekha is very clear in the Constitution," Rijiju said.

### Accelerating rate of mountain forest loss concerns scientists

New Delhi, March 18: Scientists have found out that the annual rate of loss of mountain forests has increased by 50 per cent from 2001-2009 to 2010-2018, when the planet lost approximately 5.2 million hectares of mountain forests per year.

The international team of scientists, led by Leeds University, UK, have expressed concern over the accelerating rate of loss of mountain forests, as more than 85 per cent of the world's bird, mammal, and amphibian species live in mountains, particularly in forest habitats.

The authors, who wanted to investigate the extent and global distribution of mountain forest loss, reported their findings in the journal One Earth. They wrote that this acceleration is probably largely due to rapid agricultural expansion into highland areas in mainland Southeast Asia, as well as increased logging of mountain forests due to either depletion of lowland forests or because these lowland forests became protected

Globally, they said, that the Earth has lost 78.1 million hectares, or 7.1 per cent, of mountain forest since 2000 - an area larger than the size of Texas, a state in the US. Much



of the loss occurred in tropical biodiversity hotspots, putting increasing pressure on threatened species, they said in their study.

Tropical mountain forests experienced the most loss - 42 per cent of the global total - and the fastest acceleration rate, but also had a faster rate of regrowth compared to mountain forests in temperate and boreal regions, the researchers said.



"We have made it very clear to the Chinese that we cannot have a breach of peace and tranquility, you can't violate agreements and then want the rest of the rela-

tionship to continue as though nothing happened. That's just not tenable," Jaishankar added. The minister's comments came a day after Army Chief Gen Manoi Pande said that the situation along the LAC is stable but there is a need to keep a "very close watch" on it.

In his remarks, the external affairs minister also referred to his meeting with his new Chinese counterpart Qin Gang on the sidelines of the G20 foreign ministers' meeting in Delhi on March 2.

"My most recent encounter in this regard was with the new foreign minister Qin Gang when the G20 foreign ministers meeting took place and we had a long discussion about it. In September 2020, Wang Yi and I had an inprinciple agreement on how to resolve it. So the Chinese have to deliver on what was agreed to and they have struggled with

#### **Brazilian held with** ₹60L cocaine in body

New Delhi, March 18: A Brazilian national was arrested by the Customs officials at the Indira Gandhi International Airport (IGI) for allegedly attempting to smuggle cocaine tablets worth Rs 60,16,000 by hiding it in his body, officials said Saturday

A senior Customs official said that the accused was held on the basis of specific information."The Brazil national departed from Sac Paulo Airport (Brazil) for Dubai and finally arrived at the IGI Airport, New Delhi on March 11 from Dubai.

He was diverted at green channel by the Customs officials for the X-ray of his baggage. On his medical examination, certain material was found to be secreted inside his body," the official

said. The official said that medical procedure yielded recovery of a total of 85 oval shaped cap-

sules contain ing a total of 752 grams of white powdery substance, suspected to be narcotics. When this material was subjected to diagnostic test, prima facie it appeared to contain commercial quantities of cocaine.

"In view of the above, it was clear that the accused had violated provisions of section 8 of the NDPS Act, and had committed an offence punishable under Section 21 Section 23 and Section 29 of NDPS Act 1985. Accordingly, he was placed under arrest under section 43(b) of NDPS Act, on March 14," the official said.

The official said that white powdery substance suspected to be cocaine was seized along with concealing material under section 43(a) of NDPS Act. Further investigation in the matter is on

### YouTuber surrenders in Bihar over fake videos

Patna, March 18: Manish Kashyap, a YouTuber wanted by the Bihar Police for allegedly sharing fake videos of "attacks on migrant workers in Tamil Nadu", surrendered before the law enforcers in West Champaran district Saturday,

a statement said

The Economic Offences Unit (EOU) of Bihar Police has registered three cases against Kashyap and others on the charges of "indulging in spreading fake videos of migrants being killed and beaten up in Tamil Nadu on social media". The EOU has also frozen four bank accounts belonging to Kashyap.

"Kashyap, wanted by Bihar Police and Tamil Nadu Police in fake news matter of labourers issue in the southern state, surrendered before the police on Saturday fear-

ing arrest and attachment of his belongings," a statement issued by the EOU said

"Six teams constituted by the EOU along with Patna and Champaran Police were continuously conducting raids on his locations at various places and hideouts since vesterday (Friday). He surrendered at Jagdishpur police station

of Bettiah on Saturday fearing arrest and other legal action," it added.

The EOU had March 6 registered its first FIR in connection with the case and booked four persons, including Kashyap. EOU sleuths have already also arrested Aman Kumar

from Jamui in connection with its investigation into the first FIR. Those named in that FIR included Aman Kumar, Rakesh Tiwary, Yuvraj Singh Rajput and Manish Kashyap.

JS Gangwar, Additional Director General of Bihar Police (Headquarters), had told reporters last week that the EOU probe has found that 30 fake videos of migrants getting beaten up and killed in Tamil Nadu were widely shared on social media, spreading panic among the labourers and forcing them to flee the southern state.

### 76 samples of new Covid variant XBB1.16 found: Data

New Delhi, March 18: A total of 76 samples of COVID-19's XBB.1.16 variant have been found which might be behind the recent rise of cases in the country, according to INSACOG data.

The variant has been found across Karnataka (30), Maharashtra (29), Puducherry (7) Delhi (5), Telangana (2), Gujarat (1), Himachal Pradesh (1) and Odisha (1), the Indian SARS-CoV-2 Genomics Consortium (IN-SACOG) data showed.

The XBB 1.16 variant was first found in January when two samples tested positive for the variant while in February a total of 59 samples were found. In March, till now 15 samples of the XBB 1.16 variant have been found, the INSACOG said.

Some experts have attributed the recent rise in COVID-19 cases to this



variant. Former AIIMS director Dr Randeep Guleria, who had led the national Covid task force, said the rise in Covid cases seems to be driven by the XBB 1.16 variant while the influenza cases are because of H3N2.

most of the cases are not severe; so there is no need to panic as of now," the chairman, Institute of Internal Medicine, Respiratory and Sleep Medicine, Director-Medical Education at Medanta and former AIIMS director said.

Vipin M Vashishtha, former convenor of Indian Academy of Pediatrics and consultant paediatrician at the Mangla Hospital and Research Centre, Bijnor, said the new XBB.1.16 variant has now been detected in at least 12 countries with highest cases in India followed by the

US, Brunei, Singapore and the UK. In India, there is a 281 per cent increase in cases 17 per cent increase in deaths over the past 14 days, he tweeted."All eyes should be on India! If XBB.1.16 aka #Arcturus could succeed to wade through the 'sturdy' population immunity of Indians that successfully resisted the onslaught of variants like BA.2.75 BA.5, BQs, XBB.1.5, then whole world must be seriously worried!!" he said

in another tweet India's single-day tally of COVID-19 cases crossed 800 after 126 days on Saturday, while the number of active cases climbed to 5,389.





#### Kosovo, Serbia leaders meet

Ohrid (North Macedonia): Western officials are hoping for progress Saturday in EUmediated talks between Serbia and Kosovo's leaders, in a new attempt to ease decades of tensions between the Balkan wartime foes and solve one of Europe's longest standing disputes. Serbian President Aleksandar Vucic and Kosovo Prime Minister Albin Kurti arrived at North Macedonia's lakeside resort of Ohrid for meetings with international envoys and rare head-to-head talks.

#### Japan, Germany to boost ties

Tokyo: German Chancellor Olaf Scholz and Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida Saturday held the first round of government consultations in Tokyo and agreed to strengthen economic and defense ties to better cope with China's growing influence and global security concerns.

#### Protests resume

Paris: Refinery strikes persisted Saturday in France and more demonstrations were taking place throughout the country amid anger at the government pushing through a rise in the state pension age without a parliamentary vote. The growing unrest, combined with rubbish piling up on the streets of Paris after refused workers joined in the action, has left President Emmanuel Macron with the gravest challenge to his authority since the so-called "Gilets Jaunes" (Yellow Vests) protests of December 2018.

United Nations/Geneva, March 18: The WHO has criticised China for withholding data related to samples taken at a market in Wuhan in 2020 that could have provided vital information about the Covid-19 pandemic's origins, calling on Beijing to be transparent and to share results of investigations it conducts.

The Huanan market in central China's Wuhan city was the epicentre of the pandemic. From its origin there, the SARS-CoV-2 virus rapidly spread to other locations in Wuhan in late 2019 and then to the rest of the world. "We continue to call on China to be transparent in sharing data and to conduct the necessary investigations and share the results. Understanding how the pandemic began remains both a moral and scientific imperative. he said. Ghebrevesus said that last Sunday, the global health agency was made aware of data published on the GISAID database in late January, and taken down again recently.

"The data, from the Chinese Center for Disease Control and Prevention, relates to samples taken at the Huanan market in Wuhan,

### **Facing arrest warrant, Putin visits Crimea**

**ISSUED AN ARREST WARRANT ACCUSING HIM OF WAR CRIMES** 

Kyiv, March 18: Russian President Vladimir Putin travelled to Crimea to mark the ninth anniversary of the Black Sea peninsula's annexation from Ukraine Saturday, the day after the International Criminal Court' issued an arrest warrant for the Russian leader accusing him of war crimes.

Putin visited an art school and a children's centre, locations that appeared to have been chosen in response to the court's action Friday.

The court specifically accused him Friday of bearing personal responsibility for the abductions of children from Ukraine during Russia's full-scale invasion of the neighboring country that started almost 13 months ago.

Putin has shown no intention of relinguishing the Kremlin's gains. Instead, he stressed on Friday the importance of holding Crimea. "Obviously, security issues take top priority for Crimea and Sevastopol now," he said, referring to Crimea's largest city. "We will do everything needed to fend off any threats.

The ICC's arrest warrant was the first issued against a leader of one of the five permanent members of the UN Security Council. The court, which is based in The Hague, Netherlands, also issued a warrant for the arrest of Maria Lyova-Belova, the commissioner for Children's Rights in the Office of the President of the Russian Federation. The move was immediately dismissed by Moscow and welcomed by Ukraine as a major breakthrough. Its practical

# **UBS eyeing swoop for Credit Suisse** Forex kitty dips by \$2.39bn to \$560bn

The 167-year-old Credit Suisse ranks among the world's largest wealth managers and is considered one of 30 global systemically important banks whose failure would cause ripples throughout the entire financial system

Washington, March 18: UBS AG was examining Saturday a takeover of its embattled Swiss peer Credit Suisse, sources said, a move that could dampen fears the unfolding crisis might destabilise the global banking system.

Credit Suisse is the biggest name ensnared in the market turmoil unleashed by the collapse of US lenders Silicon Valley Bank and Signature Bank over the past week, losing a quarter of its stock market value since Monday.

To get the crisis under control, UBS was coming under pressure from the Swiss authorities to carry out a takeover of its local rival, two people with knowledge of the matter said. The plan could see the Swiss government offer a guarantee against the risks involved, while Credit Suisse's Swiss business could be spun off.

Credit Suisse Chief Financial Officer Dixit Joshi and his teams were meeting over the weekend to assess their options for the bank, people with knowledge of the matter said, and there were multiple reports of interest from rivals.

US financial giant BlackRock said it had no plans or interest in a rival bid for Credit Suisse, while Bloomberg reported that Deutsche Bank was looking at the possibility of buying some of the bank's assets.

Credit Suisse's share price swung wildly this week, during which it was forced to tap \$54 billion in central bank funding.

In Washington, focus turned to greater oversight to ensure that banks - and their executives - are held accountable.

US President Joe Biden called on Congress to give regulators greater power over the sector, including imposing higher fines, clawing back funds and barring officials from failed banks.

Some Democratic lawmakers asked regulators and the Justice Department to probe the role of Goldman Sachs in SVB's collapse, said the office of Representative Adam Schiff.

Banking stocks globally have been battered since Silicon Valley Bank collapsed, raising questions about other weaknesses in the financial system.

US regional bank shares fell sharply Friday and the S&P Banks index posted its worst two-week calendar loss since the pandemic shook markets in March 2020, slumping 21.5%. First Republic Bank ended Friday down 32.8%, bringing its loss over the last 10 sessions to more than 80%.

While support from some of the biggest names in US banking prevented First Republic's collapse this week, investors were startled by disclosures on its cash position and how much emergency liquidity it needed.

The failure of SVB, meanwhile, brought into focus how a relentless campaign of interest rate hikes by the US Federal Reserve and other central banks, including the European Central Bank this week, was putting pressure on the banking sector.

Mumbai, March 18: The country's forex reserves fell by \$2.39 billion to a three-month low of \$560,003 billion for the week to March 10, the Reserve Bank said in its latest weekly data release.

In the week to March 3, the reserves rose by \$1.46 billion and stood at \$562.40 billion.

On an annualised basis, the RBI said, the reserves are down by \$47.31 billion during the week under review while on a fiscal year basis, the same plunged by \$62.23 billion.

With this erosion, the forex kitty is at the lowest since early-December, according to the weekly statistical supplement released by the RBI Friday.

The loss in the reserves is due to the revaluation of the foreign currency assets, which are the largest component of the forex kitty, to the tune of \$2.2 billion to \$494.86 billion for the week to March 10.

On a year-on-year basis, the value of foreign currency assets fell by \$45.86 billion and from a fiscal year perspective, they lost \$59.49 billion.

Expressed in dollar terms, foreign currency assets include the effect of appreciation or depreciation of the non-US units like the euro, the pound and the yen held in the foreign exchange reserves.

The reserve losses are primarily due to the RBI selling dollars to stem the rupee volatility in the spot and forwards market to prevent runaway moves in the exchange rate.

Last week, the rupee stood ground and lost just 10 basis points against the dollar and the currency traded in the 81.61-82.29 range. The rupee ended at 82.55 Friday.

The country's gold reserves and SDR holdings too saw a reduction in the week under review with both reserves falling \$110 million and \$53 million, respectively. The gold reserves and SDR holdings stand at \$41.92 billion and \$18.12 billion, respectively.

The country's reserve position in the IMF also fell by \$11 million, taking it to \$5.1 billion.

The reserves have been falling from the peak as the rupee has been under pressure and the monetary authority has been taking measures to defend the rupee from extreme volatility. In 2022, the cost of defending a falling rupee was over \$115 billion of the reserves.

The worst drop was in the week to February 10 when the reserves plunged by a steep \$8.32 billion to \$566.95 billion. In October 2021, the forex kitty had reached an all-time high of \$645 billion.

Visakhapatnam, March 18: The spotlight will once again be on KL Rahul and Ravindra Jadeja when India take on Australia in the second ODI here Sunday, with regular captain Rohit Sharma returning to lead the side after missing the opening game in Mumbai.

India defeated Australia by five wickets in a low-scoring game at the Wankhede Stadium, with Rahul, who struggled to find form during the Border-Gavaskar series leading to him being dropped for the third and fourth Tests, scoring a patient unbeaten 75 as the hosts cantered home.

Jadeja, playing ODI cricket after nearly eight months due to a knee injury and subsequent surgery, scored an unbeaten 45 in the chase of 188 Friday. He also bowled a tight spell and returned figures of 2/46 to be declared 'Player of the Match'

With the ODI World Cup being hosted by India later this year, an in-form Rahul and a fully-fit Jadeja will be an asset, and the threematch series will help the selectors assess the duo's progress.

India would look to take an unassailable 2-0 lead in the series and also try to make amends with the bat, after they were in a spot of bother at 4/39, and later 5/83, before Rahul and Jadeja came together at the crease to guide the hosts to victory with 61 balls to

Rohit Sharma's return to captaincy duties will certainly give solidity to the top order, which crumbled to the pace and variations of Australian quick Mitchell

The lanky left-arm pacer's threewicket burst at the start put India under tremendous pressure, with Virat Kohli (4), Suryakumar Yadav (0) and Shubman Gill (20) departing in quick succession after Marcus Stoinis had made an early dent by dismissing Ishan Kishan for three

Indian batters have occasionally looked tentative against quality left-arm pacers, and facing Starc in the remaining two games should give them good practice in home conditions, with efforts focused towards making preparations for the World Cup in October-November.

With Sharma set to open, Kishan will likely make way for the regular captain. While not much should be read into Kohli and Gill's belownar scores in the first ODI Suryakumar Yadav not being able to find his mojo in the 50-over format is a reason for concern.

A marauder with the bat in T20Is, Suryakumar is evidently still finding his feet in ODIs. He has gone without a fifty in all five ODIs this year. Surya has now played 15 ODIs (13 innings) without a score exceeding 50.

However, with no timeline set for Shreyas İyer's return, India will keep auditioning Suryakumar for the role at No. 4. India's bowling did a tremendous job in Mumbai with pacers Mohammed Shami and Mohammed Siraj flourishing on a pace-friendly Wankhede pitch. But wrist spinner Kuldeep Yadav could not make a strong impression.

However, the team management is not expected to tinker with the bowling line-up, with Pandya playing the role of a third seamer to perfection in Mumbai.

The weather forecast for the second ODI is of scattered thunderstorms at least in the first half, which also means that pacers from either side can swing the ball if the conditions are windy.

Australia want to try out different combinations during the series. Friday, they went in with four all-rounders - Mitchell Marsh.

Cameron Green, Marcus Stoinis

and Glenn Maxwell - and still

couldn't trouble India much, which

would be a concern for captain

Steve Smith. As a makeshift opener in the absence of David Warner, Marsh provided a rapid start with a 65-ball 81 but Australia lost the way in the middle overs, crashing from 129/2 to 188 all out against quality pace in Mumbai. The visitors lost six wickets for a meagre 19 runs despite having a deep batting lineup, something that they will look to work on.

Smith and Marnus Labuschagne may have encountered 'difficult' pitches in the Test series but the wickets for ODIs in India are usually batter-friendly, and both the Aussie mainstays will be expected to do more.

Smith has not crossed the 50run mark so far on this India tour. For someone who has a mountain of runs against India, the Australian stand-in skipper will look to end the drought. Australia's fast bowling looked terrific in Mumbai, with Sean Abbott keeping a lid on the Indians with tight lines and Green and Stoinis also chipping in.



The two young shuttlers found the going tough against Korean world number 20 duo of Baek Na Ha and Lee So Hee, losing 10-21, 10-21 in a 46-minute women's doubles contest at the Utilita arena.

"We learnt a lot from this match. The difference was they didn't leave a shuttle and we did panic a little bit," Gayatri said after the match.

Treesa added: "When we played against them, their defence was good, it was better than yesterday. We were just panicking and didn't play well, we just kept attacking.' Gayatri's father Pullela

Gopichand, the chief national coach, was the last Indian to win the All England crown, in 2001, the first being the legendary Prakash Padukone in 1980.

Gayatri, 20, and Treesa, 19, had a big opportunity to reach the finals but it ended in anticlimax as they played into the hands of the Koreans. "I was nervous. There was pressure," said Gayatri.

The World No.17 pair was pitted against Baek and Lee, the latter being an experienced player with two world championships medals with former partner Shin Seung-

In fact, Lee and Shin had faced defeat against the Indian pair in the last edition but the fresh combination of Lee and Back have been relentless this week with wins over second and eighth seeds, and looked in supreme touch as they came up with a tactical masterclass.

The Koreans turned into a retrieving machine as they defended seamlessly and extended the rallies with their high tosses and lifts to not allow the Indians to play their short flat rally game.

Despite the loss, it was a good week for the young Indians, who started playing together only in 2021 and had surprised all by reaching the semifinals in the last edition after being promoted -to the main draw from the reserve list.
