SC adjourns hearing on Odisha Univ Act

POST NEWS NETWORK New Delhi, March 21: The Supreme Court Tuesday adjourned lenging Odisha University (Amendment) Act 2020 after the University Grants Commission
(UGC) sought time tofile response on the state government's affidavit. A two-judge bench of Justices Sanjay Karol and Manoj Misra posted the next hearing to April 25.
During the hearing, solicitor general Tushar Mehta's office sought time to go through the affidavit filed by Odisha government and to file its response.
Earlier the Sup Earlier, the Supreme Court had
stayed the Odisha Universities (Amendment) Act, 2020 for three
months in May 2022. The apex court in October 2022 extended the stay until further order.
The petitions have been filed in The apex court against the Orissa High Court order of January 2022 wherein the HC had upheld the validity of the impugned act. The

On the other hand, neighbouring Bangladesh which has received a bul of the displaced Rehingnya, is unwilling to term them as refugees. The mis-
eries of over a million Rohinga who have gone over to Bangladesh have been compounded by the slashing of their rations in the world's largest refugee

ing in Bangladesh since 2017, when the Myanmar military, supported by mili-

the death toll in those risky sea voyages at 350 so far. On top of it, the camps at Cox's Bazar have for some time been witnessing fires, the olatest of which early this month rendered over 12,000 people shelterless. The meagre pos-
sessions that the refugees still had were also destroyed. Added to this is the menace of armed gangs who are operating freely in the area, attacking the
refugees, robbing them, sexually abusing women in the cams and runrefugees, robbing them, sexually abusing women in the camps and run-
ning a drugracket that is part of the notorious golden triangle.The Rohingya

Amon Shea, who spent a year reading the Oxford English Dictionary commented on this word - meaning a surgical sponge that has been left in a patient after an operation - in a piece on the OUPBIog. The surgeon
who told him about it called it "a memento that we surgeons sometimes accidentally leave behind to commemorate our presence in some poor
patient's abdomen." Formally, it is called a retained surgical sponge, an patient's abdomen." Formally, it is called a retained surgical sponge, an
example of the more general class of retained foreign objects. In both subject and appearance, gossypiboma surely fits anybody's definition of a weird word. Online dictionaries have said that it's an amalgam of words from two languages: Latin gossypium, cotton, and Swahili boma, meaning is a raised enclosure of some sort especially for protective or defensive purposes (it's from a Persian or Farsi word for a garrison or a place of
safety). This is surely a false etymology. It is much more likely that gossypiboma was created from the Latin word plus the ending -oma tha denotes a tumour or other abnormal growth (as in carcinoma or
lymphoma), with a badded to separate the vowels. The ending is appropriate, since such growths can develop around alien material left in the body. This derivation is supported by another word for the situation, textiloma (from textile plus -oma), coined in 1996 in a paper in the Journa and four of his colleagues. Since surgical sponges are now usually made of synthetic fabrics it's more appropriate than gossypiboma and is becoming the more frequently used word. The earliest known example of gossypiboma was found by reader David Hocken in the titte of an article the retained surgical sponge
