KCC senior surgical oncologist byasachi Parida said, "The lady, hen arrived at our super speality cancer centre, was unable eat and sip water for more than o weeks as nothing was going inde beyond her stomach due to mplete obstruction. Without food d fluid intake, she had become ry weak.' <br> However, the entire team at KCC on on the challenge under the adership of Parida and following abilisation of the health of the pant, an operation was performed it involved two organs. During e surgery, Radical holecystectomy for the gallbladr mass and radical excision of odenal tumour for small bowel ncer, followed by Duodenojunostomy for restoration of instinal continuity, were performed. Parida, while explaining the mplex surgical intervention, so mentioned that it was exmely risky performing the produre as there was high risk of kage from the site of intestinal pair. | o one seems to know how the United States would react if China were to invade Taiwan. For decades, USleaders did all they could to avoid this question. Then, in September of last year, President Joe Biden seemed to pave ended Washington's when he said that US troops would defend the island in the event of "an unprecedented attack." But alspoke, White House officials backtracked, insisting that the US policy on Taiwan had not changed. <br> While the 1960 US-Japan Security Treaty obliges America to go to war if Japanese territory is attacked, the US has no such treaty with Taiwan. If China decided to attack the island, it would have to guess how the US would respond. But while strategic ambiguity is meant to serve as a deterrent, the real question is whether it is enough anymore. After all, China is far more powerful now than it was when it tried to "liberate" Taiwan from Chiang Kaishek's Nationalists by shelling the islands of Quemoy and Matsu Crisis. The US still had a mutual defense treaty with Taiwan back then, and American military leaders pushed to launch a nuclear strike on the mainland. <br> Today, China has the world's largest military in terms of personnel and a substantial nuclear arsenal. Chinese President Xi Jinping knows that the US cannot risk a nuclear war, which is why it has not intervened directly in Ukraine, and that emboldens him. After all, if the US does not want to fight the far weaker Russia, it will certainly not go into battle against China. <br> A political shift in the 2024 US presidential election could bolster China's hopes of taking Taiwan by whether former President Donald Trump or a like-minded figure, from quarrels in faraway countries. Govt may invite bids for Shipping Corp in May

New Delhi, April 11: The gov-
ernment plans to invite financial bids for the privatisation of Shipping Corp of India Ltd (sCi)
next month, as it looks to sell the
state-run company after years of delay, two government officials told Reuters.
The Prime Minister Narendra Modi-led government had, in 2019, number of state-run companies,
including selling its stake in SCI, which was stalled due to regulatory
delays. SCI - which owns and op-
erates bulk carriers and crude oil tankers, among others - had to
spin off its non-core assets before spin off its non-core assets before
the government could sell its $63.75 \%$ stake, which hit a roadblock over
the amount of funds to be transferred to the demerged entity.
SCI completed the spinoff last month after getting gegulatory proval late in February.
