Speculation grows over Nitish-Naveen meeting

The Bihar CM has already met a number of his counterparts from other states to form an anti-BJP alliance for 2024 polls

Bhubaneswar, May 3: Speculation is rife about the likely meeting between Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar and his Odisha counterpart, Naveen Patnaik scheduled to take place here Friday as per reports in some sections of the national media.

Sources said that Kumar will meet the BJD supremo at the Naveen Niwas here in a bid to bring the opposition under one roof against the BJP. Kumar had earlier held meetings on this issue with CMs Mamata Banerjee, Arvind Kejriwal and K Chandrasekhar Rao in the not too distant past. Kumar also has held discussions on this issue with Samajwadi Party (SP) president Akhilesh Yadav in Lucknow.

It should however, be stated here that the BJD has always maintained equidistance with the BJP as well as other opposition parties including the Congress. Sources also pointed out that the BJP has taken the help of the BJD to pass certain bills in the Parliament. They said that it proves the good rapport Patnaik shares with some of the top BJP leaders including

Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

In such a situation, political analysts are certain the Kumar will not be able to woo Patnaik to join the anti-BJP alliance for the 2024 elections. Last month, Nitish met Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge, senior Congress leader Rahul Gandhi and Left leaders Sitaram Yechury and D Raja. However, during discussions many regional parties have voiced for an anti-BJP alliance sans the Congress.

However, there has not been any confirmation from Naveen's side regarding the upcoming meeting. BJD leaders are downplaying the development stating that nothing should be speculated, as many leaders from various parts of the country meet Patnaik as the latter is a very senior political veteran.

No 'Cyclone Mocha' Man-animal conflict: threat to Odisha: IMD

Bhubaneswar, May 3: Like an annual event that occurs every year, a summer cyclone is likely to take place in the Bay of Bengal around May 9 though details of its path and intensification has not been assessed yet, the IMD said Wednesday. Since 2018, Odisha has been ravaged by cyclones on a regular basis. In 2018, Cyclone Titli struck suddenly changing its course and entering Gajapati district catching the administration by surprise.

Then in May 2019, Cyclone Fani caused extensive damage to the state. followed a few months later in November by Cyclone Bulbul. Even before Odisha had recovered from the damages, Cyclone Amphan once again ravaged parts of Odisha in 2020. The following year, Odisha again had to bear the brunt of Cvclones Yaas and Gulab that caused extensive damages to some parts of the state. However, IMD Director General Mrutunjay Mohapatra said that once formed Cyclone Mocha (as it will be titled) is in all likelihood to spare Odisha. The name has been suggested by Yemen after its Red Sea port city.

The statement added, "However all cyclone prone districts are kept in a state of readiness. Districts and line departments along with the NDRF, ODRAF and others are in readiness for any possible eventuality."

Ex-gratia rates hiked

Bhubaneswar, May 3: The state government Wednesday enhanced the ex-gratia amount for people who got killed, suffered grievous and minor injuries due to attacks by wild

Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik oproved Wednesday a proposa in this regard. As per the decision, the compensation amount for the loss of life due to human-animal conflict has been enhanced to ₹6 lakh from ₹4 lakh.

Similarly, persons who will suffer disability of more than 60 per cent in wild animal attacks will get a compensation of ₹2.5 lakh. On the other hand, persons who will suffer incapacitation of less than 60 per cent will be provided with ex-gratia of ₹1.5 lakh, which was ₹1 lakh earlier.

People with minor injuries will be provided compensation of ₹5.000. with free treatment in government facilities. If the duration of treatment required is more than a week, the victim will be given an assistance of ₹10,000 while free

treatment will continue. The compensation for the deaths of livestock has also been increased. The amount for the death of a cow or buffalo in a wild animal attack has been increased to ₹37,500 and for an ox to ₹32,000 against the earlier assistance of ₹5,000. Moreover, the

ex-gratia for the death of a calf, goat/sheep and lamb has been doubled from ₹2,500, ₹2,000 and ₹1,500, respectively.

For damage to cereal crops, the compensation amount has been enhanced from ₹10,000 to ₹20,000 per acre. For commercial crops, the compensation was hiked from ₹12,000 to ₹25,000. The government also increased the amount of compensation from earlier ₹2,000 to ₹10,000 for partially damaged houses.

Teenager kills 9 including 8 kids in Serbia school

Belgrade, May 3: In a first of its kind mass shooting in Serbia, a teenage boy opened fire inside a_ school here Wednesday, killing eight children and a school guard, police said. Six more children and a teacher were injured and hospitalised.

Police identified the shooter by his initials, KK and said he had opened fire with his father's gun. The accused was arrested in the school yard, police said. A statement identified him as a student at the school in central Belgrade who was born in 2009. Police said they received a call

about the shooting at the Vladislay Ribnikar Primary School around 8.40am. Primary schools in Serbia have eight grades, starting with first grade. "I was able to hear the shooting. It was non-stop," a student who was in a sports class downstairs when the gunfire erupted, said. "I didn't know what was happening. We were receiving some messages on the phone," she added.

Unlike in the United States, mass shootings in Serbia and in the wider Balkan region are extremely rare. None have been reported at schools in recent years. In the last mass shooting, a Balkan war veteran in 2013 killed 13 people in a central Serbian village. However, since it was a sporadic incident, police in this city were caught by surprise. 'Ch'garh infra violation of 1947 arrangement'

New Delhi, May 3: As the Mahanadi Water Disputes Tribunal (MWDT) team concluded its second phase visit of Mahanadi basin in Chhattisgarh Wednesday, Odisha alleged that the neighbouring state has developed infrastructure for about 11 million acre feet (MAF) water, which is in excess of its equitable share and in violation of the arrangement in 1947.

Sources said a senior advocate, leading a 20-member team from Odisha comprising engineers, technical experts and lawyers, submitted before the MWDT that the state would suffer immensely even during monsoon if Chhattisgarh is allowed to develop future projects for 16 MAF water as disclosed in its letter in 2017.

Odisha has claimed that as per the DPR of Hirakud project of 1947, the equitable share of Chhattisgarh is 8.33 MAF water.

The MWDT Wednesday concluded its second phase visit of Mahanadi basin in Chhattisgarh. During the



nine days of visit, the tribunal judges along with the teams from Odisha and Chhattisgarh inspected several projects being executed by the upper riparian state in Mahanadi basin.

"Chhattisgarh has been using around 13 to 14 MAF water from illegally expanded infrastructure of 11 MAF. It has been causing injury to Odisha in nonmonsoon months by excessive storage and utilisation of Mahanadi water.' sources said, quoting the senior counsel's submission before the MWDT.

Reservoirs Chhattisgarh like Ravi Shankar Shukla. Murumsilli dam and Minimata dam have been holding water about 50 to 60 per cent of their live capacity (around 2.2 MAF) unnecessarily, the MMDT was informed

"The excessive storage

in these reservoirs is the reason behind shortage of water in Hirakud dam, Odisha said, adding that only 0.9 MAF water has been delivered at border against 1.72 MAF during non-monsoon months.

It was further argued that six industrial barrages, including Rajiv Samoda, Basantpur and Kalma, on Mahanadi river are directly causing immediate 'injury in non-monsoon months to Odisha as they are constructed in a manner to create a column of storage in the river for 84 km as FRL of downstream barrage is the level of foot of upstream barrage.

Significantly, the tribu-nal commenced the visit of Mahanadi basin in Chhattisgarh from April 19. On the first day, the tribunal visited Farsiya village, the origin point of Mahanadi. During the first phase visit, which concluded April 23, the tribunal along with the teams from Odisha and Chhattisgarh inspected projects in upper Mahanadi sub-basin and Shivnath subbasin in Chhattisgarh.

However, it has become an arduous task for pensioners like her to get the money after the state government started paying it online through banks. Left with no option, she is on her way to the bank to withdraw the pension, she added. Recently, a video showing Surya

The video attracted the notice of Finance Minister Sitharaman who immediately directed the SBI to provide her with all help. The convict was identified as Akash Mallick, 21, a resident of Basta block. The additional district and sessions judge-cum-special POCSO judge Ranjan Kumar Sutar also slapped a penalty of ₹4,000 on the convict, apart from the punishment.

In default, Mallick has to undergo additional two years of imprisonment, the judge observed while delivering the order, special public prosecutor Pranab Kumar Panda appearing for the state government said.

The judge passed the order after examining statements recorded by 11 witnesses and 21 documents relating to the case. The judge also asked the District Legal Services Authority (DLSA) to give away ₹4 lakh financial assistance to the survivor. Panda said.

According to reports, the survivor a native of Basta block was studying in Plus II Arts in a local college. She left home to appear her test at the examination centre in Fakir Mohan College in Balasore but did not return home, May 23, 2022.

ESG Ratings Count

organ Stanley Capital International (MSCI), one of the most influential gatekeepers of environmental, social, and governance ratings, L is about to downgrade the Environmental, Social and Governance(ESG) ratings of 31,000 investment funds in one fell swoop. The dramatic move comes after MSCI decided to update its methodology to meet higher standards for AA or AAA ratings. One would expect a move with such a potentially farreaching impact on financial markets to be scrutinized in advance by regulators. Alas, ESG ratings providers (ERPs) have so far flown under the reg-

ESG ratings are instrumental to guiding investment decisions. But, as the MSCI downgrades indicate, they are currently highly subjective and, often, inflated. In fact, as many as half of the companies included in a 2021 Bloomberg Businessweek analysis had been upgradedby MSCI as a result of methodological changes. Just two years later, a fresh round of changes is bringing mass downgrades – and even more uncertainty about what to ex-

This problem is hardly exclusive to MSCI. According to a 2022 report from the Institute for Energy Economics and Financial Analysis (IEEFA), how ERPs approach the measurement risk or impact is highly inconsistent.

The lack of shared standards and transparent methodologies leads to the mispricing of stocks and bonds - and, as in the MSCI case, the funds that hold them - and undermines effective decision-making by investment managers.

Regulatory intervention is urgently needed to establish a stable and credible ESG ratings system that is both accurate and predictable. The first step is to ensure that the methodologies used by all ERPs are transparent, and independently verified from the outset. Regulators should require ERPs to provide concrete and structured evidence to support the ratings assigned and the validity of their criteria.

Moreover, any changes to an ERP's methodology or internal guidelines should be independently assessed and confirmed. And if a change in criteria or methodology is set to bring sweeping ratings adjustments, regulators must step in to evaluate and approve it, just as they would if faced with the prospect of largescale credit-rating downgrades.

MSCI's ESG Fund Ratings are based on unregulated assessments that examine a company's financial risk according to ESG factors, an approach known as single materiality, rather than its influence on the environment or society. While some ERPs say that their ratings do account for broader effects, these claims are difficult to verify using their disclosed methodologies

The single-materiality approach is notably inadequate for funds with exposure to fossil-

fuel assets. The IEEFA's examination found that MSCI has granted top ESG ratings to funds with more than 85% exposure to fossil-fuel investments. These ratings are highly misleading, because they both underestimate the risks that such firms' activities generate and exaggerate their positive impact.

Reliance on fossil fuels exposes investors to climate risk, which, if not properly accounted for, could result in substantial losses through value destruction and high opportunity costs. Ultimately, high ESG ratings can make firms appear greener than they are, leading investors to tilt portfolios toward firms with poor sustainability performance.

ERPs should consider adopting a "double materiality" approach, which reflects the impact of a firm's activities on society and the planet. Only such an approach – as well as stringent regulatory oversight – can ensure that ESG ratings help avoid greenwashing and promote truly sustainable

The scale of the problem should not be underestimated. ESG ratings influence the allocation of trillions of dollars in capital markets. Ratings that are inflated and misleading - based on arbitrary rules, opaque methodologies, and entrenched bias from input-based disclosures – could well lead to disaster, much as the flawed ratings of mortgage-backed securities enabled the 2008 global financial crisis.

Better regulation of the ESG-ratings industry is vital not only to prevent the next financial crisis, but also to deliver genuine progress toward sustainability. The good news is that the United Kingdom's Financial Conduct Authority, the Securities and Exchange Board of India, the European Commission, and Japan's Financial Services Agency are already exploring ways to tighten standards on ESG ratings. In the best interest of investors and the planet other market regulators should follow suit.

Austringer

An austringer is a keeper of goshawks. It's a rare word now, though some falconers keep it alive, out of historical sentiment as much as anything, I'd guess. It's in part bound up with the technical distinction between a hawk and a falcon — the true hawks (the accipiters) are in general smaller than the true falcons (in the genus Falco) and have shorter and more rounded wings; hawks usually prefer to hunt by chasing their prey at low level, while falcons stoop or plummet down on it from above. In English tradition, the two birds that exemplify the types are the goshawk and the peregrine falcon. In medieval times, falcons had higher social status than hawks (though the claim often made that your rank determined which type of bird you could fly seems to have been invented in the fifteenth-century Boke of St Albans). As a result, falconer seems to have been an upper-class word, with hawker used for the lower classes who hunted with goshawk, sparrowhawk or kestrel (confusingly, this last bird is actually a falcon, not a hawk, though it hunts differently from the other falcons and so was classed with the hawks); in time falconer has become the general term for a person who trains and hunts with any bird of prey, including buzzards, eagles and owls (the existence of another sense of hawker, for a travelling seller of goods, with a quite different origin, has probably been a factor in its decline in this sense). Quite why the keeper of just one species, the goshawk, should have been singled out by giving him yet another name isn't clear. Austringer has sometimes been written as ostringer, or astringer (this last form turns up in a stage direction in Shakespeare's Love's Labour's Lost: "Enter a gentle astringer"). All of these spellings are modified forms of the older ostreger. which comes from French ostricier, ultimately from Latin accipiter, a hawk.

THE ALMIGHTY DOLLAR

he Chief of Kotak Bank. Uday Kotak has called the US dollar the biggest financial terrorist. Such a comment from one of Asia's preeminent and very successful bankers was bound to go viral, which it did. Before the bouquets and brickbats could begin, Kotak also clarified via a tweet that his language was inadvertent. It wasn't clear whether he regretted saying it. The word "terrorist" cannot and should not be used loosely, at least from the high podium. Kotak said that he meant to point out the disproportionate power enjoyed by the almighty dollar, as the world's dominant reserve currency. But that skirts the point that none of the 145 countries holding dollar reserves are under any compulsion, least of all a terrorist threat. to hoard their reserves in American dollars. They are doing it of their own volition. Sixty percent of the nearly 13 trillion dollars in global reserves are held in dollar denominated securities. The biggest pile of dollar reserves is with China, which is engaged in a tech cold war with the US. Another twenty per cent of all global reserves is in Euros. The rest comprises British pound sterling, Jananese ven (five per cent each). A small three per cent of reserves is held in Chinese yuan, presumably by those countries involved in trade or indebted to China.

The US dollar is the strongest it has been in fifty years. So those $\,$ countries whose imports are invoiced in dollars are feeling the pressure of higher import costs. That is adding to their infla-tion which is already high, thanks to higher commodity and oil prices, which are also denomi-nated in US dollars. Those countries which have foreign debts in dollars, are unhappy too, since their debt servicing cost has gone up, as the dollar strengthens. The dollar is getting stronger, because all the global capital is flowing "uphill", from less developed countries into America. That is because the yield on the US government bond has gone up steeply. During recessionary times. a safe place for investors to park their funds is in US bonds. Hence

the demand for the dollar is strong. Another great anomaly is not only that many countries keep their foreign ex-change assets in dollars mostly, but their trade invoicing is also in dollars. For instance, Sino-Indian trade is nearly 120 billion dollars, and is almost totally invoiced in dollars. Only 15 per-cent of India's exports go to the US, but 85 per cent of the exports are invoiced in dollars. So, the US dollar enjoys hegemony not just as the dominant reserve currency but also the invoicing currency of choice between any two ran-

dom trading partners. The reason the dollar is the currency of choice, is because of the implicit trust in its stability. A third big privilege enjoyed by the US dollar is called seigniorage. This is actually the profit made by the currency issuing authority. More than 90 per cent of the dollars in circulation as cash are in 100-dollar denominations, and the bulk of it circulates outside America. So, all those foreigners holding that currency are implicitly paying a tax to the US government even though they are not US taxpayers. This is the essence of seigniorage.

Calling the US currency a ter-

It also blocked Russian funds lodged in US banks. The US has been trying rather unsuccessfully to persuade other countries to stop buying Russian oil. Even friends like India and Korea are not complying. India has found a way to bypass dollar payments for Russian oil with bilateral trade arrangements denominated in rupees. The Chinese too have struck a deal whereby they can bypass dollar invoicing and clearing. India recently signed a deal with 18 countries, including six from Africa, to start rupee denominated trade, and try to diversify from the dollar route. All this points to efforts to reduce the vulnerability caused by an over-dependence on the dollar. As a former Secretary of Treasury during the Nixon administration of the 1970's, famously said: "the dollar is our currency but your headache"

Suffering a dollar driven headache or being under the hege mony of the world's dominant reserve and invoicing currency does not make it a terrorist. Kotak, as

he clarified later, was also allud ing to the US power to shut down Nostro accounts. These are ac counts where foreign banks hold their money in US accounts in dollars. Blocking Russian funds is one thing, but ab-ruptly shutting down the Nostro accounts of other countries is quite another. This would amount to a breach of international conventions. The discomfort is not because of any terrorising power of the US currency, but in fact because of the increasing and voluntary migration of many countries to using the dollar as a safe option.

That the US behaves in irresponsible ways, often bordering on breaking international conven-tions is well known. For instance, the IMF long ago agreed to reduce the voting share of the US, which has still not been ratified by their Congress. Or the US single handedly blocked the dispute settlement mechanism at the WTO, by stonewalling appointments to the crucial pan-el Under President Trump, the US resorted to tariff hikes which went counter to the principles of the WTO (market access and national treatment principles). The US walked out of the Paris accord after signing it, and also the Pacific Partnership. These are just a few examples of beha-viour which shows scant regard for international conventions. But it still does not make the dol-lar a terrorist. Not even if that was a misplaced metaphor. The adoption of the US dollar as the preferred currency for reserves amounting to 60 percent of all reserves, is an act of choice. The world is struggling to break away from dollar dependence. But eight countries have adopted the dollar as their de facto currency, and another 22 have pegged their currency to the dollar. Argentina may once again go to a dollar standard. Dollar addiction may be troublesome, but terrorist it is not. The decline of the dollar is still a long distance away.

emerged as a postcolonial theory L in regards to redrafting the history of the people from below. The prime objective of the subaltern studies is to emphasise specifically the history of the downtrodden en masse as antagonistic to the elitist perspective in history that tends to ignore their significant contribution in making history. This trend embarked its journey by including writing the history of the peasant's insurgencies and tribal insurrections. This project is ascribed to Ranajit Guha and followed by a group of scholars such as; Partha Chatrarjee, David Hardiman, Sahid Amin, David Arnold, Dipesh Chakrabarty, and so on.

Guha pleads nationalist movement has no substance if it neglects the contribution of the subaltern classes. Further, he adds that the elitist historiography is more into looking at the "idealist and ambiguous aspect of the indigenous elites who led people from subjugation to freedom". Such school of thought goes on emphasising the role of few individual leaders or some organisations but has failed critically to interpret and acknowledge the relentless efforts of the subaltern group who independently, on their own fought dur-

Aspects of the Historiography of Colonial India", (2013) Guha observes that the Indian freedom struggle was majorly hijacked by a group of bourgeois nationalist. The writings of this group make us aware about the impression that our nation and its consciousness of nationalism was an attainment of these bourgeois. The elitist perspective of writing portrays uprising as the 'law and order problem' and Indian nationalism is the outcome of the few charismatic elite leaders. On the other hand, the subaltern project of Guha says, there was a considerable role of subaltern classes parallel to the politics of the elite classes in the Indian nationalist movement.

He proclaims that time and again the tendency of elitist historiography provides a very personalised account of the benevolence of the native elite who had strong aversion against the colonial regime. But in contrast, history has introduced us to their tendency as exploiters, collaborationist, and oppressor having no concern to promote issues of the common mass. Their major goal was to grab power and privileges from the British Raj (2013:2). According to

Guha, "The history of Indian na- ume he has talked about a system In his article entitled "Some tionalism is a sort of spiritual biography of Indian elites".

> The Subaltern project argues, the various resistance of the tribals, peasants and subaltern classes against the Britishers emerged from the people; independent of the elites. This project believes in the binary of people and elite and also mobilisation; as one of the most important aspects of politics. The mobilisation of the elite politics that the Indian freedom struggle has witnessed is the outcome of mobilisation of the subaltern politics secured from the below. And in achieving the mobilisation traditional institutions like caste, clan, family, territoriality, kinship and most importantly deprivation supnorted the entire process

Ranajit Guha in one of his works "Elementary Aspects of the Peasant Insurgency in Colonial India(1983) argues that the major task of the subaltern project is to create an alternative history; i.e "the history of the people'

Through his book Subaltern Studies-I (1982) he has shown concern about the initiatives taken by the subaltern class as to how this class is not powerful enough to develop the full-fledged struggle for national struggle. In the same volof failure which constitutes the central problematic of the historiography of colonial India"- ac-

cording to Guha. Since Guha was a Subaltern historian and a Marxist Sociologist, he dexterously tries to rewrite the past in order to have change in the arena of historiography and transformation of consciousness. Subaltern class struggle should not be considered as 'objects' of history rather they should be considered as the 'makers' of their own history. Prof. Guha's indelible legacy on subaltern and post colonial studies has enlightened us to pose questions to which very often there are no apt answers. To Guha and his cohorts the etymological meaning associated with the term 'subaltern' implies anyone from the "inferior rank" explained with regard to class,

gender, caste and official positions. On the cusp of turning 100 years this May Ranajit Guha has left us on April 28 when the world is grappling with uncertainty but his vast epistemological claims will always enlighten the academia in years

Every year the number of deaths due to suffocation is on the increase and there should be an amicable solution to this pressing problem. The number of people who died while cleaning sewers and septic tanks in the country this year has been reported to be 22 and that is alarming. The main cause for manual scavenging was insanitary latrines that required to be cleaned by hand. This was being addressed by the Swachh Bharat Mission, through which insanitary latrines were being identified and converted to sanitary ones. Septic tank gasses contain methane, hydrogen sulfide (H2S), carbon dioxide, sulfur dioxide, ammonia, nitrogen dioxide and traces of carbon monoxide. It is a dangerous and life threatening one and unless preventive measures are taken well in advance, entering into such a septic tank, sewage outlet is most dangerous.

Easing process of divorce

Sir, Apropos, "SC removes 6-month waiting period for divorce," Orissa POST, May 3. Marriages are said to be made in heaven but consummated on earth. Although it is one of the oldest institutions of mankind, it has been undergoing challenges that may eventually destabilise it, as in some western countries. The Supreme Court has given the verdict that where a court has concluded that a marriage has irrecoverably failed, there is no need to wait for any cooling off period. Until a few decades ago, marriage was easy but divorce was difficult. And if one party decided to contest the divorce application of the other, the divorce proceedings could take more than even a decade. Things have changed so much that if both parties move the court mutually, divorce is possible within six months. Now, there is no need for the court to wait for even six months if it feels that there is no way the couple can remain united. It will be a misery for both if they are forced to remain man and wife when they find that their marriage has totally failed and it cannot be revived. In such circumstances, it is better to let them be freed from the yoke of marriage. Nonetheless, the verdict is intended to ease the process of divorce, which is at present so cumbersome and timeconsuming that it serves little social or legal purpose.

SC declines to commute death penalty of Rajoana

New Delhi, May 3: The Supreme Court Wednesday declined to commute the death penalty of Balwant Singh Rajoana, convicted in the 1995 assassination of then Punjab chief minister Beant Singh, to life imprisonment, saying "it's within the domain of the executive to take a call on such sensitive issues".

Senior advocate Mukul Rohatgi, appearing for Rajoana, argued that since the state and the Union of India have not been able to decide on the mercy petition which is pending for more than 10 years, the death penalty should be commuted to life imprisonment.

A bench comprising Justices B R Gavai, Vikram Nath and Sanjay Karol refused to accept Rohatgi's submission, saying the mercy petition of the year 2012 was filed by the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee.

"The stand of the Ministry of Home Affairs to defer the decision on the mercy petition is also a decision for the reasons given thereunder. It actually amounts to a decision declining to grant the same for the present.'

"It is, however, directed that the competent authority, in due course of time, would again as and when it is deemed necessary, may deal with the mercy petition, and take a further decision," the bench said.

New Delhi, May 3: The Election Commission Wednesday issued notices to Congress MLA Privank Kharge for his "nalayak beta" remark against Prime Minister Narendra Modi and to BJP legislator Basangouda Patil Yatnal for his "vishkanya" jibe at former Congress chief Sonia Gandhi.

The separate EC notices said the two have prima facie violated provisions of the model code in Karnataka. The notices came a day after a strong advisory was issued by the poll panel asking parties and their leaders to exercise restraint in their utterances during electioneering in Karnataka. Both Kharge and Yatnal have been asked to explain by 5 PM Thursday as to why action should not be taken against them.

While Kharge is Congress' candidate from Chittapur, Yatnal is BJP's star campaigner and a candidate from Bijapur City.

In its notice to Kharge, the EC referred to a clause in the poll code which states that "Political parties and candidates shall refrain from criticism of all aspects of private life, not connected with the public activities of the leaders and workers of the other parties...

In its notice to Yatnal, District Election Officer Koppal cited same clauses of the model code and said "a personal attack remark against a rival party leader is found to be made by you.

New Delhi, May 3: The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) Wednesday arrested Rajinder Kumar Gupta, the former CMD of WAPCOS, and his son in a Disproportionate Assets case.

During the raid and search operations which got underway on Tuesday and continued till this morning, the probe agency recovered Rs 38.38 crore, one of the biggest cash recoveries by it.

Of the total recovery so far 20 crore in cash was seized Tuesday. According to a senior CBI officer. a case was registered against Gupta and his family members on charges of possessing disproportionate assets. Searches were conducted at the accused's residential and commercial premises in 19 locations of Delhi, Chandigarh, Gurugram, Sonepat and Ghaziabad.

After retirement, Gupta had set up a consultancy firm in Delhi. The alleged immovable properties belonging to the accused include flats, commercial properties and a farmhouse spread across Delhi, Gurugram, Panchkula, Sonipat and Chandigarh.

The top court stressed that if the government takes the first step forward in this matter, there will he substantial benefit and also substantial advancement in recognition of the relationship of samesex couples, as it told the petitioners' counsel, "This is a step forward and therefore, don't have to go for all or nothing.

At the beginning of the hearing, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta submitted before a five-judge bench headed by Chief Justice of India, DY Chandrachud, that the government was agreeable to setting up a committee under the Cabinet secretary to examine what types of legal rights

could be given to same-sex couples. "The government is positive. What we have decided is that this would need coordination between more than one ministry. Therefore, a committee headed by no less than the Cabinet secretary will be constituted," Mehta said, as he sought



suggestions from the petitioners on the problems they are facing.

Mehta said the government could address these problems so far as legally permissible and requested the petitioners not to give "jurisprudential ideas" as only factual problems could be addressed by the proposed committee.

The petitioners contended that the resolution intended by the government was in the nature of administrative tweaking, and not legal.

Senior advocate Abhishek Manu Singhvi, representing one of the petitioners, said whatever is given by administrative tweaking is certainly welcomed and it should be seen as a constructive effort towards convergence, it may not be a substitute and there "won't be any major solution". Singhvi stressed that substantive changes in the law would be required to grant legal recognition to same-sex marriage. Senior advocate Saurabh Kirpal, appearing for a petitioner, said at varous seminars they have spoken to gay people and 99 per cent of them came up and said the only thing they want is to get married.

Senior advocate Menaka Guruswamy, also representing the petitioners' side, submitted before the bench also comprising iustices S.K. Kaul, S.R. Bhat, Hima Kohli and PS Narasimha that "young people in our country want marriage. I don't say this as an elite lawyer. I say this as someone having met these young people. Do not let them experience what we have experienced"

At this juncture, the Chief Justice said that at the constitutional level, there is a serious problem if one goes by what young people feel, as a constitutional court then, "we would be subject to volumes of data on how people feel... Therefore, the great salutary safeguard of the constitutional adjudication is that the court is to go by what the Constitution mandates, therefore we do not go by either popular morality or segmental morality, we decide what the Constitution says.

EAM to hold bilateral talks with Chinese, Russian counterparts

Benaulim (Goa) May 3: External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar is set to hold separate bilateral talks with his Chinese counterpart Qin Gang and Russia's Sergev Lavrov at a beach resort in Goa Thursday on the sidelines of a conclave of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) amid rapidly evolving regional security situation.

People familiar with preparations for the conclave said there is no plan yet for a structured bilateral meeting between Jaishankar and Pakistan Foreign Minister Bilawal Bhtutto-Zardari. But they did not rule out a pull aside between the two foreign ministers.

Qin, Lavrov, Bhutto-Zardari and foreign ministers of other SCO countries are arriving in Goa on Thursday to attend a crucial conclave of the SCO that is taking place ahead of the annual summit of the grouping in the first week of July.

India has been maintaining that Pakistan must show seriousness towards fighting terrorism and that talks and terror cannot go together. Bhutto-Zardari's trip to India will be the first visit from Islamabad since 2011. The then Pakistan foreign minister Hina Rabbani Khar had visited India that year. Khar is currently serving as the minister of state for foreign affairs.

In the talks with Qin, Jaishankar is once again expected to convey that India-China ties cannot be normal

The two-day SCO foreign ministerial meeting will begin with a gala reception at a luxury beach resort in Goa on Thursday while the main deliberations will take place Friday. The people cited above said Jaishankar will hold separate bilateral talks with his counterparts from almost all SCO countries. However, there is no clarity on such a meeting between Jaishankar and Bhutto-Zardari.

The bilateral meeting between Jaishankar and Qin will be the second one in the last two months. The Chinese foreign minister visited India in March to attend a meeting of the G20 foreign ministers. On the sidelines of the meeting. Jaishankar held talks with Qin during which he conveyed to his Chinese counterpart that the state of India-China relations is "abnormal" because of the lingering border row in eastern Ladakh.

NEW FINDING MAY IMPROVE DIABETES TREATMENT: STUI

New Delhi, May 3: Scientists have found genetic similarities and differences between various forms of type 2 diabetes in India and Europe, an advance that they say can be used to improve the treatment of the disease in the country.

Researchers in Sweden have previously shown that diabetes can be divided into five subgroups, and that there are genetic differences between the four subgroups relating to type 2 diabetes.

The new study, published in The Lancet Regional Health—Southeast Asia journal, confirms that the classification system is applicable

We could also confirm our previous findings that have shown that a certain form of type 2 diabetes that is characterised by relatively low BMI is the most common form of the disease in India," said Prasad.

The subgroup is called severe insulin-deficient diabetes (SIDD) and this is a form of type 2 diabetes that is also characterised by early onset, low insulin secretion, and poor metabolic control, the researchers said.


Of all the participants with type 2 diabetes in the Indian study, 47 per cent were classified as belonging to the SIDD group.


Previous studies on populations in Sweden have shown that mild age-related diabetes (MARD), which is characterized by late onset, is the most common form of diabetes among Swedish people.



HP plans to legalise cannabis cultivation for economic spinoffs

Experts opine that selective cultivation of cannabis could annually generate a revenue of ₹800 to ₹1,000 crore

INDO-ASIAN NEWS SERVICE

Shimla, May 3: A section of growers in Himachal Pradesh has been demanding the cultivation of cannabis as an alternative crop should be legally allowed as fruit crops have been facing weather vagaries every year. Also, the stiff competition from the imported cheaper apples has severely hit their earnings.

In the 'high-pitch' demand of growers and more importantly the state reeling under the heavy financial debt trap of more than Rs 75,000 crore, the Congress government led by first-time Chief Minister Sukhvinder Sukhu is mulling to legalise the controlled cultivation of hemp for medicinal purposes to economic boom, mainly to strengthen the rural economy, besides to capture business away from illicit sellers.

Experts told IANS the selective cultivation of cannabis could annually generate a revenue of Rs 800 to Rs 1,000 crore. They say there is a huge demand for opium, an extract of the poppy, in the pharmaceutical industry. Also, the climatic condition in the state is congenial for its

States like Uttarakhand, Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh have also allowed selective cultivation of poppy which greatly helped to strengthen the rural economy. In Himachal Pradesh, the wild poppy grows in the Alpine regions of the Himalayas along the glacial streams at altitudes of 12,000 to 18,000 feet.

"Controlled cultivation of cannabis would ensure remunerative returns for apple growers who are only depending upon them for the earnings," said Ramesh Singta, a prominent apple grower in Jubbal, Shimla's prominent apple belt. "Since most of the apple plantation needs rejuvenation, a costly proposition, the legalised cultivation of opium will reap handsome returns," he added.

Another grower Naresh Dhaulta told IANS the cultivation of opium would help check its illegal cultivation as it grows even naturally in the wild.

According to the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime, Indian opium has a great advantage over Turkish and Iranian opium, in so far as Turkish opium contains less than one per cent of codeine on the average, and Iranian opium about 2.5 per cent, whereas Indian opium, apart from its high morphine content, gives an average of 3.5 per cent of codeine.

Police officials say cannabis and

opium fields are grown illegally in vast tracts of Kullu, Mandi, Shimla and Chamba districts, leading to a serious problem of drug cultivation, trafficking and its use. In Kullu district the plantation

of cannabis is more confined to the higher reaches of Malana, Kasol and other areas, while in Chamba district, bordering the Doda area of Jammu and Kashmir, it is done mainly in the remote areas of Kehar, Tissa and Bharmour. More than 60 per cent of the

Now to battle the illicit trade the government believes the cultivation of cannabis would play a significant role not only in generating revenue but also prove to be beneficial for patients owing to medicinal properties. Also it can be

used for pharmaceutical industry. To build political consensus, an official statement quoting Chief Minister Sukhu said the government is cautious about the potential increase in drug use and has formed a five-member committee of legislators.

The committee, led by Horticulture and Revenue Minister Jagat Singh Negi, will conduct a thorough study about each and every aspect related to cannabis cultivation. It will visit areas where illegal cultivation of cannabis takes place and submit a report. And on the basis of the report the government will take any decision.

Justifying the rationale behind this move, the Chief Minister told the media that the neighbouring state Uttarakhand has become the first state in the country to legalise cannabis cultivation in 2017, while controlled cultivation of cannabis is also being done in some districts of Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh. He said the government would consider all aspects, including regulatory measures, and will study other states that have legalised it before arriving at a final decision.



New Delhi, May 3: Media associations in the country have voiced concern over India slipping 11 places to 161st rank in the World Press Freedom Index, 2023, published Wednesday.

Global media watchdog Reporters Without Borders (RSF), which publishes a yearly report on press freedom in countries across the world, had last year ranked India at 150 in a survey of 180 countries.

The situation has gone from 'problematic' to 'very bad' in three other countries: Tajikistan (down 1 at 153rd), India (down 11 at 161st) and Turkey (down 16 at 165th),

"The indices of press freedom have worsened in several countries, including India, according to the latest RSF report,' the joint statement said.

"For developing democracies in the Global South where deep pockets of inequities exist, the media's role cannot be understated.

Likewise the constraints on press freedom due to hostile working conditions like contractorization have to also be challenged. Insecure working conditions can never contribute to a free press," it added.

Congress leader Shashi Tharoor too commented on the embarrassing development.

'Time for all of us to hang our heads in shame: India slips in World Press Freedom Index, ranks 161 out of 180 countries," he wrote on Twitter: Sri Lanka moved 11 points up and ranked 135 while juntaruled Myanmar, moving 3 points up, was at 173, lower than India.

World Press Freedom Day is ob served every year May 3. The World Press Freedom Index highlights the degree of freedom that journalists and news organisations have in each country

According to the report, there are more than 100,000 newspapers (including 36,000 weeklies) and 380 TV news channels currently operating in the country. Since January 1, 2023 one journalist was killed in the country while 10 journalists are behind bars.

With an average of three or four journalists killed in connection with their work every year, India is one of the world's most dangerous countries for the media,' the report stated.

Journalists are exposed to all kinds of physical violence including police violence, ambushes by political activists, and deadly reprisals by criminal groups or corrupt local officials, it added.



New Delhi, May 3: India Wednesday brought back home a total of 231 people under its mission to evacuate stranded Indians from strife-torn Sudan.

The Indians arrived in Mumbai in a commercial flight. "Another #OperationKaveri flight brings citizens back home. Flight carrying 231 passengers lands in Mumbai.' External Affairs Ministry spokesper

son Arindam Bagchi tweeted. The Indians were brought back home from the Saudi Arabian city of Jeddah where India set up a transit camp for the evacuees. Under 'Operation Kaveri', India has been taking its citizens in buses from conflict zones of Khartoum and other troubled areas to Port Sudan from where they are being taken to the Saudi Arabian city of Jeddah in Indian Air Force's (IAF) heavy-lift transport aircraft and Indian Navy's ships.

On Tuesday, 231 Indians arrived in Ahmedabad while another batch of 328 citizens were brought to New Delhi. India brought back 186 people Monday under the evacuation mission that was launched over a week back.

On Sunday, 229 Indians arrived in Bengaluru while 365 people reached Delhi Saturday. Under the evacuation mission, 754 people ar-

rived in India in two batches Friday. The total number of Indians who were brought back home now stands at 2,930, according

to official data. The first batch of 360 evacuees returned to New Delhi in a commercial plane last Wednesday. The second batch of 246 Indian evacuees arrived in Mumbai in a C17 Globemaster aircraft of the IAF

Thursday.

New Delhi, May 3: India will launch its own composite index next year to quantify the impact of heat on its population and generate impact-based heat wave alerts for specific locations, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) has said.

The IMD began issuing an experimental heat index for different parts of the country last week, taking into account air temperature and relative humidity to de-

termine how hot it really feels. "The heat index is an experimental product. It is not validated and we have mentioned that (on the ·IMD's website) too. We are coming up with our own system now, a multi-parameter product called

'heat hazard score'. We hope that it will be better than the others,'

Mrutyunjay Mohapatra, Director General of Meteorology IMD, told PTI. Along with temperature and humidity, it will integrate other pa-

rameters such as wind and dura-

tion of exposure. It will be an effective indicator of heat stress for people, he said. The IMD chief said the hazard score will be ready in around two months and "it will be operational

in the next summer season". Asked if the IMD has incorporated health data into the product, he said the weather bureau will gradually do it. "We have been

working on it but health data is not readily available in some places.' Mohapatra and his team con-



ducted a heat wave hazard analysis for the entire country last year, taking into account maximum temperature, minimum temperature, humidity, wind and the duration of heat waves. The

analysis will help generate heat

hazard scores which will be utilised as thresholds to issue impact-based heat wave alerts for specific locations.

"The heat index provides apparent temperature, factoring in temperature and humidity. Heat

Russia claims Ukraine tried to kill Putin with night-time drone attack on Kremlin

Moscow, May 3: Russia accused Ukraine Wednesday of attacking the Kremlin with drones overnight in a failed attempt to kill President Vladimir Putin.

A senior Ukrainian presidential official denied the accusation - the most serious that Moscow has levelled at Kyiv in more than 14 months of war - and said it indicated Moscow was preparing a major "terrorist provocation".

The Kremlin said Russia reserved the right to retaliate, and hardliners demanded swift retribution against Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy.

"Two unmanned aerial vehicles were aimed at the Kremlin. As a result of timely actions taken by the military and special services with the use of radar warfare systems. the devices were put out of action," the Kremlin said.

"We regard these actions as a planned terrorist act and an attempt on the president's life, carried out on the eve of Victory Day, the May 9 Parade, at which the presence of foreign guests is also planned.'

"The Russian side reserves the right to take retaliatory measures where and when it sees fit," it

The state news agency TASS said the parade - for which the Kremlin last week announced tighter security - would still go ahead.

Moscow Mayor Sergei Sobyanin said earlier Wednesday that the city had introduced an immediate ban on unauthorised drone flights.

Russia has accused Ukraine of numerous cross-border attacks since the start of the war, including strikes in December on an air base deep inside Russian territory that houses strategic bomber planes equipped to carry nuclear weapons. In February, a drone crashed in Kolomna, about 110 km (70 miles) from the centre of Moscow.

Ukraine typically declines to claim responsibility for attacks on Russia or Russian-annexed Crimea, though Kviv officials have frequently celebrated such attacks with cryptic or mocking remarks.

3 jailed Iranian female journalists win top UN award

United Nations, May 3: The United Nations announced Tuesday night that its premier prize for press freedom has been awarded to three imprisoned Iranian female journalists "for their commitment to truth and accountability.'

The winners are Niloufar Hamedi who broke the news that 22-year-old Mahsa Amini died last September while being held by the morality police for wearing her headscarf too loosely, and Elaheh Mohammadi who wrote about her funeral.

Amini's death touched off months-long protests in dozens of cities across Iran. The demonstrations posed one of the most serious challenges to the Islamic Republic since the 2009 Green Movement protests drew millions to the streets.

The third winner is Narges Mohammadi, who has worked for many years as a journalist and is one of Iran's most prominent activists.

The UN Educational Scientific and Cultural Organization World Press Freedom Prize is named for Guillermo Cano, a Colombian journalism who was assassinated in front of the offices of his newspaper El Espectador in Bogota December 17, 1986. UNESCO has awarded the prize to coincide with World Press Freedom Day May 3 since 1997.

UNESCO Director-General Audrey Azoulay announced the winners at a ceremony in New York, saying: "Now more than ever, it is important to pay tribute to all women journalists who are prevented from doing their jobs and who face threats and attacks on their personal safety.'

Zainab Salbi, chair of the international jury of media professionals that chose the winners, said the brave work of the three winners "led to a historical women-led revolution.

"They paid a hefty price for their commitment to report on and convey the truth," Salbi said. "And for that, we are committed to honouring them and ensuring their voices will continue to echo worldwide until they are safe and free.'

Frankfurt, May 3: Police across Europe arrested more than 100 people Wednesday in a massive crackdown that targeted the Italian 'Ndrangheta mafia, with suspects accused of drugs and weapons trafficking with counterparts in Latin America. "Today's raids are one of the

largest operations carried out so far in the fight against Italian organised crime," said German Interior Minister Nancy Faeser, adding they had "dealt a serious blow to the 'Ndrangheta.

The swoop was part of an investigation spanning Italy, Germany, Belgium, Portugal, Spain, Slovenia, Romania, Brazil and Panama, according to European Union law enforcement agency Europol.

Belgian police said they had arrested 13 people. A total of 108 people were arrested in Italy and other EU countries on the orders of police in the southern city of Reggio

Related investigations led to the arrest of 24 people in Germany, as well as a further 53 detentions in northern Italy. The interior minister of the German state of North Rhine-Westphalia said 18 of the arrests were made there.

The network was devoted primarily to international drug trafficking from South America to both Europe and Australia, Europol said in a statement.

The network used Chinese money brokers in Italy and Colombia to arrange for funds to be moved to pay for drug deals, Italian police commander Massimiliano D'Angelantonio told a news conference.

The 'Ndrangheta clans were also involved in running weapons from Pakistan to South America, supplying Brazilian criminal group PCC (Primeiro Comando da Capital) in exchange for cocaine shipments, Europol added.

The 'Ndrangheta, which has its

Investigator Oliver Huth told reporters they found Italians from Calabria there, some of whom were believed to be involved in drugs while others had links to killings or murders. The cafe has been shut down.

Assets worth 25 million euros (\$27.6 million) were seized in Italy, Germany, Portugal and France in "Operation Eureka," launched in 2019 initially to investigate drug smuggling between Calabria and the Belgian city of Genk, according to Italian police.

"We think that among the arrests were several persons of a high value who played a huge role in the organisation, not only in Belgium but in other European countries," said Belgian federal prosecutor Antoon Schotsaert.

'Iran seizes 2nd oil tanker in a week'

Dubai: Iran has seized a second oil tanker in a week Wednesday in Gulf waters, the US Navy said, the latest escalation in a series of seizures or attacks on commercial vessels in Gulf waters since 2019. The Bahrainbased Fifth Fleet of the US Navy said the Panama-flagged oil tanker Niovi was seized by Iran's Islamic



Revolutionary Guard Corps Navy while passing through the narrow Strait of Hormuz. In Iran's first response, Tehran's prosecutor announced the oil tanker was seized on a judicial order following a complaint by a plaintiff, the judiciary's Mizan news agency said. The incident comes after Iran Thursday seized a Marshall Islands-flagged oil tanker in the Gulf of Oman called the Advantage Sweet. Maritime security firm Ambrey has said it believed the Advantage Sweet's seizure by Iran was in response to a recent seizure via a court order by the United States of an oil cargo aboard the Marshall Islands tanker Suez Rajan. Since 2019, there have been a series of attacks on shipping in the strategic Gulf waters at times of tension between the United States and Iran.



Rome, May 3: More than a quarter-billion people in 58 countries faced acute food insecurity last year due to conflicts, climate change, the effects of the Covid-19 pandemic and the war in Ukraine, according to a report published Wednesday.

The Global Report on Food Crises, an alliance of humanitarian organisations founded by the UN and European Union, said people faced starvation and death in seven of those countries: Somalia, Afghanistan, Burkina Faso, Haiti. Nigeria, South Sudan and Yemen.

While the increase last year was due in part to more populations being analysed, the report also found that the severity of the problem increased as well, "highlighting a concerning trend of a dete-



Brasilia, May 3: Brazilian police Wednesday raided former President Jair Bolsonaro's home and seized his cell phone as part of an investigation into his Covid-19 vaccination records.

The investigation may answer questions about how Bolsonaro, a strident coronavirus skeptic who vowed never to get a Covid vaccine, was registered as vaccinated in health records made public in February.

Bolsonaro confirmed the raid on his home in Brasilia to journalists and reiterated that he had never taken a Covid vaccine. He denied any role in allegedly forging documents.

"For my part, there was nothing falsified. I didn't take the vaccine. Period," he said, adding that his



phone was seized.

The vaccine probe is one of many putting the former far-right leader under pressure, including investigations into alleged voter suppression, attacks on the legitimacy of Brazilian elections and em-



icy options to mitigate climate risks. The country's goal of achieving the net zero target by 2070 would require an accelerated reduction in the energy intensity of GDP by around 5 per cent annually and a significant



improvement in its energy-mix in favour of renewables to around 80 per cent by 2070-71, it said.

"India's green financing requirement is estimated to be at least 2.5 per cent of GDP annually till 2030," the report said. It also mentioned about projected estimates of green finance requirements by various organisations.

Citing Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEFCC), the report said the cumulative total expenditure for

adapting to climate change in India is estimated to be ₹85.6 lakh crore (at 2011-12 prices) by the year 2030.

According to the report, a balanced policy intervention with progress ensured across all policy levers will enable India to achieve its green transition targets by 2030, making the net zero goal by 2070 attainable. "Climate change is upon us"

As per the World Meteorological Organisation (WMO), the 2015-22 period was the warmest on record. Despite the cooling effects of La Nina into its third year, 2022 was the eighth consecutive year in which annual global temperature reached at least 1 degree celsius above pre-Industrial Revolution levels, fuelled by ever-rising Green House Gas (GHG) concentrations and accumulated heat.

"India's diverse topography makes it highly vulnerable to climate risks, manifested in the form of sustained rise in temperature, erratic monsoon patterns, and rising frequency and intensity of extreme weather events.

"India's goal of becoming an advanced economy by 2047 and achieving the net zero target by 2070 would require accelerated efforts in terms of reducing the energy intensity of output as well as improving the energy-mix in favour of renew-

ables," it said. Estimates suggest that compared with a no policy action scenario that could increase India's carbon emissions to 3.9 gigatonnes by 2030 (from 2.7 gigatonnes in 2021), a balanced policy intervention can lower carbon emissions to 0.9 gigatonne by 2030, the report added.

Markets pause eight-day rally



per cent to end at 18,089.85. India's services sector growth accelerated in April, as strong demand conditions resulted in the fastest increase in new business and output in close to 13 years, a monthly survey said Wednesday.

Rallying for the eighth straight day, the BSE benchmark had climbed 242.27 points or 0.40 per cent to settle at 61,354.71 Tuesday. The Nifty went up 82.65 points or 0.46 per cent to finish at 18,147.65.

Women wrestlers move Supreme Court

New Delhi, May 3: The seven women wrestlers, who have levelled allegations of sexual harassment against Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) chief Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh, Wednesday moved the Supreme Court seeking permission to file an affidavit in sealed cover.

April 28, Delhi Police had filed two FIRs against Singh on the allegations of the wrestlers, hours after Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for Delhi Police, had told the apex court that a case will be registered Friday.

Wednesday, the counsel representing the women wrestlers mentioned the matter before a bench comprising Chief Justice DY Chandrachud and Justice PS Narasimha and said he was seeking permission to file the affidavit in sealed cover before the court, which is slated to hear the matter Thursday.

He said they don't have any problem in supplying the copy of the affidavit to the solicitor general but it should not go in public domain. The bench permitted the counsel to bring the sealed cover affidavit on Thursday with advance copy to Mehta.

Mehta told the bench that investigation is going on in the case and the petitioners' can share these



materials with the investigation officer. When Mehta asked if he can share the material with the investigation officer, the bench said, "alright". The country's top wrestlers have been on a sit-in at Jantar Mantar in Delhi demanding action against Singh.

She had said that the wrestlers should have shown some discipline and that they had tarnished the country's image by hitting the streets, a comment that brought criticism for her and the IOA.

Usha left without speaking with the media but Bajrang Punia said she has assured them help. "Initially when she said that, we had felt very bad but then she said that her comments were misinterpreted. She said that she is first an athlete and then an administrator," said Bajrang.

"We told her that we want justice. We don't have a fight with the government or opposition or anyone else. We are sitting here for the betterment of wrestling. If this issue is resolved and if the allegations are proved then there should be legal action," he added.

When asked if Usha had come with a solution from the government or from the IOA, Punia said, "Nothing of that sort". Sakshi said, "She (Usha) said it pains her to see us on the streets and not in the stadium. She said she feels for us, wants us to win more medals for the country."

"We respect her. She is a great athlete. Der Aaye Durust Aaye (Better late than never)," said Bajrang. "If someone has come here and says she supports us, that's all we need," added Sakshi.

Vinesh said she did not ask Usha when will the IOA complete its probe but suggested something. "I told her, now that wrestling is under her, she should take everything under her control and start organising competitions. I also told her that she is a Rajya Sabha MP... If she can raise this issue in Parliament, that will be enough," she said.

Asked if the wrestlers were satisfied following the meeting with Usha, Bajrang said, "If she is giving us assurance, I suppose she should do something. But we clearly told her that until and unless things are not okay and we get justice, of which we are very hopeful, this protest will continue."

Messi suspended for unapproved Saudi Arabia trip

Paris, May 3: Lionel Messi was suspended by Paris Saint-Germain for taking a trip to Saudi Arabia without the club's permission, a person with knowledge of the situation told this news agency.

The person Tuesday would not specify the length of the suspension, though French media reported it to be two weeks. A two-week suspension would mean Messi would miss PSG's next two games. L'Equipe and RMC Sport both reported the suspension without citing sources.

The person told the AP that the Argentine won't be allowed to train or play with the team and won't be paid during his suspension. PSG had denied Messi's request to make the trip, the person said.

The 35-year-old Messi has a commercial contract with Saudi Arabia to promote tourism in the Middle Eastern country. Messi's trip followed PSG's surprise 1-3 loss to Lorient Sunday.

L'Equipe had reported that PSG coach Christophe Galtier pledged to give his players two days off — Monday and Tuesday — if they beat Lorient. Instead, the team trained Monday and had Tuesday off.

In the men's recurve individual section, top-seeded Mrinal Chauhan overcame Alexandr Yeremenko of Kazakhstan in the shoot-off to advance into the final.
