Howrah-Puri Vande Bharat starts today

Bhubaneswar: The Howrah-Puri Vande Bharat Express will be flagged off virtually Thursday by Prime Minister Narendra Modi from the Pilgrim City. With this, Odisha will get its first Vande Bharat train. Governor Ganeshi Lal, Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik and Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw will be present at the Puri station during the ceremony. The train will run six days a week, excluding Thursday, Railway officials said. The train will stop at Kharagpur, Balasore, Bhadrak, Jajpur Keonjhar Road, Cuttack, Bhubaneswar and Khurda Road during both the upward and downward journeys and it will have 14 AC chair car coaches and two executive class coaches.

39 go missing as **Chinese boat capsizes**

Beijing: China sought Wednesday the help of several countries to rescue 39 people who were on board a Chinese fishing vessel which sank in the Indian Ocean, the official media here reported. Among the 39 who have gone missing, 17 are Chinese crew members, an equal number from Indonesia and five from the Philippines. Officials said that the fishing vessel capsized in the central part of Indian Ocean early Wednesday morning. Officials sources indicated that the chances of survival of the missing persons are slim. Chinese President Xi Jinping is personally supervising the rescue operations.

Sherpa Kamta regains Everest-scaling record

Kathmandu: One of the greatest mountain guides, Kamta Rita, 53, regained his title for the most climbs of Mount Everest after scaling the peak for the 27th time Wednesday. It came just three days after fellow Sherpa Pasang Dawa had equalled his previous record of scaling the peak for the 26th time. Rita reached the 8,849 metres (29,032 feet) summit guiding a group of climbers on the world's highest mountain, and was safe and in good health, said Mingma Sherpa of the Kathmandu-based 'Seven Summit Treks'. Rita first scaled Mt Everest in 1994, and has been making the trip nearly every year since then.

SC blow for Delhi LG over MCD nominations

New Delhi, May 17: Giving the lieutenant governor (LG) the power to nominate aldermen to the Municipal Corporation of Delhi will mean he can destabilise an elected civic body, the Supreme Court observed Wednesday and wondered why these nominations were of so much concern to the Centre.

A bench of CJI DY Chandrachud and Justices PS Narasimha and JB Pardiwala made this observation while reserving its verdict on the plea of the Delhi government challenging the LG's power to nominate aldermen. The MCD has 250 elected and 10 nominated members.

In December last vear, AAP defeated the BJP in the civic elections, winning 134 wards and ending the saffron party's 15-year run at the helm of the MCD. The BJP won 104 wards.

"Is the nomination of 12 specialised people in MCD of that much concern to the Centre? Actually, giving this power to the LG would effectively mean that he can destabilise the democratically elected Municipal committees because they (aldermen) will have voting powers also," the

Mahanadi Tribunal starts Odisha inspection Friday

Odisha has already alleged that Chhattisgarh government is violating the 1947 Hirakud dam arrangement by developing illegal infra along the river basin

New Delhi, May 17: The threemember Mahanadi Water Dispute Tribunal will start Friday its survev of the Mahanadi river basin in Odisha. The survey will end May 28. During the survey the tribunal will conduct site inspection of the Mahanadi basin at Hirakud dam, May 20. The three-member team comprising Justices AM Khanwilkar, Ravi Ranjan and Indermeet Kaur will also visit the Chilika lake, the Mahanadi barrage in Cuttack and various other places. The three-member tribunal will be accompanied by legal teams of both the Odisha and the Chhattisgarh governments.

Earlier, the tribunal had visited the Mahanadi basin in Chhattisgarh in two phases starting April 19 and ending May 3. It inspected several projects being carried by Chhattisgarh on the Mahanadi basin. During the first visit which concluded April 23, the tribunal inspected projects in the upper Mahanadi sub-basin and Shivnath sub-basin. In the second phase from April 29 to May 3, the tribunal visited Hasdeo Bango dam, the Sheonarain and Kalma barrages

At the end of the survey in Chhattisgarh, the government of Odisha had alleged that the upper riparian state has developed infra-

structure for about 11 million acre feet (MAF) water which is in excess of its equitable share and in violation of the arrangement of 1947.

Sources said Odisha government has submitted before the tribunal that the state would suffer serious damages during the monsoons if Chhattisgarh is permitted to develop future projects for 16 MAF water as disclosed in its letter in 2017. Odisha had claimed that as per the DPR of Hirakud project of 1947, the equitable share of Chhattisgarh is 8.33 MAF water.

Sources said that earlier the Odisha government had submitted before the tribunal that Chhattisgarh has been using around 13 to 14 MAF of water from illegally

expanded infrastructure of 11 MAF and causing injury to Odisha in non-monsoon months by excessive storage and utilisation of Mahanadi

river water. Odisha also contended that Chhattisgarh has been holding about 50 to 60 per cent of the live capacity (2.2 MAF approximately) in various reservoirs namely Ravi Shankar Shukla, Murumsilli and Minimata dams without any valid reason. The excessive storage of water in these reservoirs is the reason behind shortage at Hirakud dam. Odisha has also informed the tribunal that only 0.9 MAF water has been delivered at the border against agreed upon 1.72 MAF during non-monsoon months.

SHRADDHA MURDER CASE REVISITED IN BOLANGIR

Youth found murdered with body chopped and packed in polythene bags

Bolangir, May 17: In a shocking incident, Town police here recovered the chopped off body parts of a youth packed in black polythene from a locked house at Salepali in this town, Wednesday.

The deceased was identified as Rinku Meher, 27, a native of Liad village under Khariar police limits in Nuapada district. Police said it was a case of murder. The gruesome incident reminded one of the Shraddha Walkar murder case in Delhi in May. Her boyfriend had murdered her and chopped her body into pieces.

The matter came to the fore after locals found stench emanating



from inside the house near Mathakhai Temple Square and informed the police after they found it locked from outside.

In the presence of a magistrate and forensic team, police broke the lock of the house and recovered the chopped body parts of Rinku. Two axes, a crowbar and a ham-

mer were recovered from the spot. Preliminary inquiries suggested that the miscreants after brutally murdering Rinku had chopped off his body parts and packed it in polythene in a bid to destroy evidence. Rinku who was working as a_

driver was staying in the house here for the last eight years with his father Markand, mother and younger brother after shifting from his native village. Police did not rule out involve

ment of Rinku's family behind his death as he had a tiff with his father a few days back. Police said that they were probing all angles and said those involved will be

THREE KILLED IN SEPARATE **ROAD ACCIDENTS IN STATE**

Keonjhar, May 17: Three persons lost their lives Wednesday due to road mishaps in various parts of Odisha while 17 others suffered injuries.

In the first incident two persons were killed and two others suffered serious injuries after the driver of the SUV they were travelling in, lost control and crashed into a tree near Ramchandrapur on Champua Road in Basudebpur locality of this district early Wednesday morning. The deceased were identified as Vinod Barik and Niladri Ghana and both were from Sundargarh district.

In the second incident, a man on a scooty was killed after a Bolero car hit the two-wheeler from the rear near Sriguni village under Gochapada police station in Phiringia block of Kandhamal district. The deceased was identified

as Manoi Panda of the same village. In another accident, 15 people suffered injuries, some of them seriously, after a bus collided headon with a pick-up van on National Highway-57 near the Charichaka tehsil office in Boudh district. The injured have been admitted to the Purunakatak community

Hinduja scion SP



New Delhi, May 17: His business successes which started with the international distribution rights for the Hindi blockbuster movie 'Sangam' in 1964 made him one of the richest in Britain but it was the Bofors scam that made Srichand Parmanand (SP) Hinduja famous, or rather infamous, back in India. SP, as he was popularly known, died Wednesday in London after a prolonged illness. He was 87, a family spokesperson informed. Born in a business family in

Karachi, SP and his two younger brothers were accused of receiving payments worth ₹64 crore in illegal commissions to help Swedish gunmaker 'AB Bofors' secure an Indian government contract. All three - Srichand. Gopichand, and Prakash Hinduja, were however exonerated by the Delhi High Court in 2005.

Srichand, the eldest of four brothers and chairman of the 'Hinduja Group', lost his wife, Madhu, in January this year. She was 82. He is survived by his daughters, Shanu and Vinoo. "SP Hinduja was a spiritual person, courageous in action and generous at heart. Hisloss has left a huge void," a family statement said.

Man who could have been French monarch

A DESCENDANT OF THE FORMER FRENCH ROYAL FAMILY LIVES WITH ITS GLORIOUS PAST AND OBSCURE PRESENT IN BHOPAL

London, May 17: In Prime Minister Rishi Sunak, the United Kingdom (UK) already has a person of Indianorigin leading the country. The same could have happened in France also. According to Prince Michael of Greece, cousin to Britain's Prince Phillip, a portly, soft spoken 48-year-old Indian gentleman living a quite life in the city of Bhopal is the real king of France.

However, Balthazar Napoleon de Bourbon doesn't have anything to show for his royal blood, save certain artefacts that have been passed on to him through generations. The only proof to his royal claim is the brass plaque on the door of his house which proclaims 'House of Bourbon' together with the white feathered fleur-de-lis crest of the French Bourbon kings

The Bourbons were the grandest royal dynasty Europe has ever seen. They were builders of the fabulous Palace of Versailles. However, the Bourbon monarchy effectively ended on the guillotine in 1793 when the French revolutionaries put paid to Louis XVI.

The Bourbons of India are a family who claim to be legitimate heirs of the House of Bourbon, descended from Jean Philippe de Bourbon, an exiled French noble who served in Mughal Emperor

Akbar's court. The family is also known as the 'House of Bourbon-Bhopal', a name derived from the city where their last few generations resided and worked in the preindependent Indian Bhopal State



Royal Court. Balthazar, now close to 65 years and portly, once worked as a lawyer in Bhopal. He has never visited France and hence has not been able to lay claim as to what may have been his crown. And he doesn't repent the fact that he has lost out on the monarchy of France.

"I don't think of such things. Ours is a life full of insecurity.

Being from a royal heritage, there are always hidden enemies. So one has to be careful and not dream about a rosy future," Balthazar was quoted as saying by gq.com a few years back. Since then not much is known about his whereabouts as he is keen to maintain a low profile despite continuing to stay in Bhopal.

However, Balthazar lives lavishly though at times he finds it difficult to manage ends. The bungalow, dominated by Mughal arches, shares the 30,000 square feet compound with a school run by his wife Elisha. He is happy with what he has got now and is not interested in treading unknown territories.

Health dept rolls up sleeves for Rath Yatra

Puri, May 17: Health and Family Welfare (H&FW) commissionercum-secretary Shalini Pandit Wednesday asked the Chief District Medical Officer (CDMO) to ensure hassle-free health services from Nabajauban Darshan to Bahuda Yatra of the sibling deities in the Pilgrim City here.

Chairing a review meeting ahead of the Rath Yatra here, Pandit took stock of the ambulance services, de ployment of health officials as well as food safety inspection teams, and treatment of infectious diseases in Puri. The H&FW commissioner-cum-secretary also reviewed the coordination between departments on welfare services and Covid management ahead of

keep the casualty and emergency medical units in full readiness. Multiple 'First Aid Centres' will be set up on the Grand Road.

This apart, 30 ambulances will be kept ready at various strategic locations. Two teams will be deployed for food safety inspection and special health awareness program

will also be organised.

Meanwhile, at least 25 oxygen beds, operation theatre (OT) and intensive care unit (ICU) are fully prepared in the DHH. In order to avoid the possibility of spread of infectious diseases during Rath Yatra, Health officials have tightened the inspection of food safety and drinking water system.

Pandit asked the Health Services director to ensure that there is no shortage of doctors and paramedics in the district during the annual car festival. The hospitals of the district were asked to ensure availability of necessary medicines and recheck the functioning of all medical equipment.

It was decided to provide passes to health officials and employees of the district administration for proper patient care during the mega festival.

'Naveen dismantled father's

memorial for developing Puri'

Bhubaneswar, May 17: In order to create more space at Swargadwar and facilitate beautification drive in Puri, Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik ordered dismantling of the 'samadhi' of his father and former CM Biju Patnaik at the crematorium in the Holy City in 2019, CM's private secretary VK Pandian said.

Pandian, who is associated with the CM for over 13 years, said this while addressing the Odia Diaspora in Dubai.

"Now, instead of a memorial, a plaque mentioning Biju babu's name is there at Swargadwar," he said.

Many Hindus want to cremate their near and dear ones at Swargadwar as they believe that salvation can be obtained if one is

Biju Patnaik's memorial was constructed by the local civic body at Swargadwar after his demise April 17, 1997. The 'samadhi' took a large area of the crematorium.

Pandian said he had showed the beautification plan of the crematorium to the chief minister.

"After learning that a corner of the plot remained blocked due to the memorial, the chief minister decided to dismantle it. Other members of the Patnaik family also shared the same opinion," he said.

"Patnaik said that his father lives in the hearts of people and not in stone," Pandian said.

Puri's Swargadwar was the first transformation project of the state.

The chief minister had ordered dismantling of the memorial early in the morning to avoid public outcry, Pandian said.

Oppn targets BJD over ADR report

Bhubaneswar, May 17: A day after the Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) reported the income of regional political parties from unknown sources in the financial year 2021-22, Opposition BJP and Congress Wednesday targeted the BJD saying 94.73 per cent of its annual income in the period was from unknown sources.

According to the ADR report, the income of regional political parties from unknown sources in the financial year 2021-22 amounted to Rs 887.55 crore. The ruling BJD has received funds to the tune of Rs 291.096 crore from unknown sources during the financial year 2021-22. Unknown sources contributed 94.73 per cent of the BJD's annual income of Rs 307.29 crore in 2021-22.

Armed with the report, BJP chief whip in Odisha Assembly Mohan Majhi said that the ADR report indicates rampant corruption in





Process of producing hydrogen from non-fossil fuels discovered

hemists have laid bare the complete reaction mechanism for an important group of "water-splitting" catalysts, taking them closer to making pure hydrogen from renewable energy

The chemists at the United States' University of Kansas (KU) and US Department of Energy's Brookhaven National Laboratory achieved this through pulse radiolysis experiments, the results of which are published in the journal Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences.

"Understanding how the chemical reactions that make clean fuels like hydrogen work is very challenging," said co-author James Blakemore, associate professor of chemistry, whose research in Lawrence, Kansas, forms the basis of the discovery.

"Our paper presents data hardwon from specialised techniques to understand how a certain catalyst for hydrogen generation does the job. Implementing these (techniques) allowed us to get a full picture of how to make hydrogen from its constituent parts, protons and electrons," said Blakemore.

Blakemore took his research at KU to Brookhaven for research using pulse radiolysis, as well as other techniques

Pulse radiolysis is a method of initiating fast reactions to study reactions occurring on a timescale



faster than approximately one hundred microseconds, when simple mixing of reagents is too slow and other methods of initiating reactions have to be used

"It's very rare that you can get a complete understanding of a full catalytic cycle," said Brookhaven chemist Dmitry Polyansky, a co■ Blakemore took his research at KU to Brookhaven for using pulse radiolysis, as well as other

author of the paper. "These reactions go through many steps, some of which are very fast and cannot be easily observed.'

Blakemore and his collaborators made their discovery by studying a catalyst that is based on a pentamethylcyclopentadienyl

rhodium complex, which is [Cp*Rh] for short. They focused on the Cp* (pronounced C-P-"star") ligand paired with the rare metal rhodium because of hints from prior work showing suitability of this combination for the work.

"Our rhodium system turned out to be a good target for the pulse radiolysis. "The Cp* ligands, as they're called, are familiar to most organometallic chemists, and really chemists of all stripes.

"They're used to support many catalysts and can stabilise a variety of species involved in catalytic cycles. One key finding of this paper gives fresh insight into how the Cp* ligand can be intimately involved in the chemistry of hydrogen evolution," said Blakemore. Besides producing clean hydrogen. Blakemore stressed the findings could lead to other improved

"In our work, we hope that

chemists will see a study about how a common ligand, Cp*, can enable unusual reactivity.

chemical processes as well.

"This unusual reactivity is relevant to the hydrogen story, but it's actually bigger than this because Cp* is found in so many different catalysts.

"Chemists normally think of catalysts as being based on metals. In this way of thinking, if you're making a new molecule, the metal is the key actor that brings the constituent parts together.



he debate about how to achieve climate goals – most notably, the transition to net-zero emissions of greenhouse gases - has fuelled speculation that the world will deglobalise. Some argue that, since trade flows generate GHGs from production and transport, a sustainable economy, by definition, must be less global.

But research by the McKinsey Global Institute suggests the opposite is true. The materials, innovation, and capital needed to reach net-zero emissions are not equally distributed and, as a result, must be shared around the world. Without cross-border flows of goods, services, financing, and intangibles, limiting global warming will be very challenging, if not impossible. The World Trade Organization reaches a similar conclusion in its most recent annual report, which outlines how trade can play an essential role in helping countries reduce emissions and build climate resilience.

For starters, no economy is self-sufficient. Our research finds that every major world region imports more than 25 per cent (in value-added terms) of at least one important type of resource or manufactured good. At the country level, and for inputs needed to achieve the net-zero transition, that number can be much higher. Moreover, products that originate in only a few places are in every region and sector. For example, today, more than 75 per cent of the global supply of lithium, a key compo-

nent of electric-vehicle batteries, is sourced from Australia and Chile.

Decarbonising the sectors that produce the majority of GHG emissions, including power. transportation, and heavy industry, will require investing in low-emissions technologies and support infrastructure. Building and operating these assets will in turn depend on three vital inputs: new mineral resources, new fuels, and complex manufacturing at scale. The international network of interconnected supply chains is crucial to producing all of them.

Consider minerals, including copper, lithium and rare earth metals. Given their importance for the production of electric vehicles, renewable power, and broader electrification, all are critical to achieving net-zero emissions. Yet to reach that goal, supplies will need to be scaled up rapidly - by as much as eight times in some cases (though the use of recycled materials, or innovation to reduce or entirely replace the need for certain minerals. could change exactly how much new supply

In the case of entirely new supply, sourcing many of these minerals will require global flows, because extraction and refining are geographically dispersed. About 70 per cent of the world's cobalt is mined in the Democratic

Republic of the Congo, and nearly one-third of the world's nickel is extracted in Indonesia, which is home to the world's largest proven reserves. China processes many of the most critical minerals, including lithium, cobalt, and graphite, but also relies on other countries for key steps or technologies. Japan and South Korea, for example, specialise in coating spherical purified graphite.

As for the new fuels needed for the net-zero transition, hydrogen, and its derivatives, offers many potential use cases, particularly for long-haul freight transport and steel making. Here, too, a geographical mismatch between sources of supply and demand means that global trade is likely to be vital. The International Energy Agency estimates that about 12 million tonnes of low-emission hydrogen could be exported annually by 2030, if projects currently under development are completed as planned.

Finally, deploying manufactured goods such as solar panels and electric vehicles also relies on global supply chains. Broader participation of countries in trade flows can incentivise innovation, enhance efficiency, and help drive down the costs of these technologies.

The imperative for globalisation extends beyond just goods flows. Ensuring a sustainable future will require massive investment, and developing countries will likely need to spend more on the net-zero transition as a share of GDP than developed countries. With constrained fiscal space to invest in climate solutions, many of these economies will need increased access to cross-border financial flows.

Innovation is equally important in developing and deploying novel climate $\,$ technologies, and that, too, depends on cross-border flows, albeit of intangibles, such as intellectual property and data, and of skilled workers; both can foster invention, drive down costs, and increase access. These flows linked to knowledge and know-how have replaced trade in manufactured goods as the driving force of global integration.

All these types of flows are interconnected. If economies implement strategies to localise or diversify supply chains – either to reduce trade-related emissions or build resilience - there will be a greater need for capital and intangibles. Building a domestic plant to manufacture electric-vehicle batteries, for example, can cost billions of dollars.

Even in a highly connected world, delivering a reliable, secure, and affordable net-zero transition will require scaling up cross-border flows significantly. New sources of production must be developed, new supplier relationships built, and new forms of global integration pursued. Rising geopolitical tensions will make this task even more complex and challenging. But the alternative - giving up on globalisation - will only make the effects of climate change more punishing.



large portion of our population had been living without any kind of coverage -- health, accident or life insurance for so long. Also, the unorganised sector workers who constitute more than 85% of our workforce of nearly 50 crore, do not have any formal pension provision. Eight years ago, the Budget 2015-16 highlighted these issues and proposed three social security schemes -- Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana (PMSBY), Atal Pension Yojana and Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana (PMJJBY). The idea was to protect the vulnerable citizens at the time of illness, accident or old age. Encouraged by the success of Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana (PMJDY), the government of India proposed to work towards creating a universal social security system for all Indians. The poor and the under-privileged and the workers in unorganised sector were the target groups. Their bank accounts were used as the basis for launching the schemes.

Availability, accessibility and affordability are the three vital pillars of any social welfare scheme. Financial inclusion has always been an important policy imperative in our country. We have indeed come a long way in our pursuit for financial inclusion. We started with promotion of cooperatives, nationalisation of banks, priority sector lending, lead bank scheme models and more recently PMJDY and PMJSY. The national strategy for financial inclusion (NSFI) 2019-2024 has given a further fillip to these efforts. The strategy aims to provide access to formal financial services in an affordable manner - banking for the unbanked and insurance for the un-insured. Promoting financial literacy and consumer protection are the other important objectives.

PMJDY has completed eight years and eight months and nearly 49 crore accounts have been opened as on 26 April, 2023, where there is a balance of Rs 1.98 trillion outstanding. This by any standard can be considered a landmark in the history of Indian banking. As of December 2022 there were 154087

branches of schedule commercial banks with deposits of Rs 178.54 trillion and advances of Rs 135.46 trillion. This translates closely to 15 bank branches per one lakh population. We have also been able to provide banking access to almost every village within a five km radius in most of the states and UTs. However, having a bank account is the means and not the end in itself. The focus is thus not only on opening bank accounts but also making available a bouquet of financial services including credit and insurance and it is necessary that these services are not only available to vast majority of people but also they are easily accessible and affordable. Inclusive credit and insurance form the bedrock of inclusiveness in the society. Against this backdrop let us introspect how far we have travelled during the last eight years.

PMSBY is to ensure risk coverage in case of accidental death, full or partial disability. The insured amount for accidental death and full disability is Rs 2 lakh whereas for partial disability it is Rs 1 lakh. It has an annual premium of Rs 20 which is auto-debited by the bank from the subscriber's account. People in the age group of 18-70 are eligible for the scheme.

PMJJBY is designed to benefit

people in the age group of 18-50 in case of death for whatsoever reason. People who join the scheme before completing age of 50 can continue to have the risk of life cover up to the age of 55 years; subject to payment of premium which is Rs 436 per annum for a life cover of Rs 2 lakh. The premium is auto-

debited in this case also The latest information available from all sources; schedule commercial banks, cooperative banks and data relating to convergence schemes reported by insurance companies all put together suggest that while there are little over 16 crore cumulative enrolments under PMJJBY, the figure stands at 34.17 crore for PMSBY. Since the former scheme covers age group of 18 to 50 and let us say we have about 100 crore people above 18 years, the target group could be 65 crore. Similarly, in case of PMSBY the target group could be a bit higher, say around 82 crore. So going by cumulative enrolment data so far only 25% from the target group under PMJJBY and around 41% under PMSBY have subscribed to avail the concessional insurance cover during the last eight years. Besides, the number of active enrolment cases will be less than the cumulative cases. Notwithstanding the above the fact remains that in

surance awareness campaign was never done on a mission mode. We as a nation have a habit of delivering more when we are on a mission mode

The subscription to various insurance products is gaining traction slowly but surely; especially post pandemic. The total number of claims settled and amount paid under PMJJBY so far has been to the extent of 6.64 lakh and Rs 13290.40 crore, respectively. The relatively forward states such as Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Guiarat and Maharashtra are doing better in comparison to others. Similarly, under PMSBY a total of 115951 claims with amount involving Rs 2302.26 crore have been settled. Apart from the relatively forward states, Rajasthan, MP and UP are doing better on this front

The journey so far has been encouraging -- from near zero insurance consciousness level we have travelled quite a distance. But like opening an account is not enough unless we make affordable needs-based credit to the beneficiary, one-year enrolment under any of the social scheme will not ensure any protection unless the policy is gets renewed and sustained. For this we need to educate our vast majority through financial literacy programmes on a

mission mode. The insurance penetration in our country is 3.2%, as per the Economic Survey 2022-23 released in January 2023. Countries like Taiwan, South Africa, the USA, the UK report much higher penetration, all above 11%. The government of India has launched a campaign to double the penetration under both PMJJY and PMSBY for a period of three months w.e.f. 1 April 2023. The initial results have been encouraging and it is expected that substantial number of prospective beneficiaries will be brought under the social secu-

AI in health sector: Issues & concerns

THE AI BASED **DIAGNOSTIC TOOLS CANNOT BE HELD ACCOUNTABLE FOR** THEIR DECISIONS AND JUDGEMENTS

rtificial Intelligence (AI) is not new but the recent resignation of the AI pioneer Geoffrey Hinton from Google has raised serious concerns. Hinton wrote: "I could talk about the dangers of AI without considering how this impacts Google." He left Google to speak freely about the dangers of technology after realising that computers could become smarter than people far sooner than expected. In another case. German artist, Boris Eldagsen, refused to accept a prestigious photography prize with an entry that was generated by AI. He was selected for the award for AI generated work and while rejecting the award concluded that such competitions were not equipped to handle AI entries.

AI may be defined as the simulation of human intelligence

processes by machines, especially computer systems. These processes include learning (the acquisition of information and rules for using the information), reasoning (using rules to reach approximate or definite conclusions) and self-correction. The field of AI is very exciting and is rapidly expanding and has significantly impacted all aspects of human life including healthcare. Some of the health applications are proved very successful: Computed Tomography (CT) scans can be automatically read by AI as well as radiologists; tuberculosis screening can be done by AI using chest X-rays with comparable performance as molecular testing; mammography scans can be used to predict the onset of breast cancer before visual signs appear. In addition to diagnosis, there is huge potential for AI in therapeutics, preventive treatments, clinical decision making, public health surveillance, complex data analysis, and predicting prognosis.

There are issues like accountability and responsibilities. Who is accountable for errors; how can the patients be safeguarded and protected? The AI based diagnostic tools cannot be held accountable for their decisions and judgements. Regulatory mechanism must be in place to fix accountability at all stages of development of AI in the health sector. Besides, there are concerns for data safety, data sharing and data privacy. AI empowers the masses by making easy and early diagnosis and access to health facilities. The unsupervised use of such tools and techniques is potentially risky.

There are other benefits of induction of AI in the healthcare sector. It might help reduce human error and have potential of enhancing screening and diagnosis. There are reports of shortage of skilled healthcare professionals. Advancement of AI provides opportunities to tackle this shortage. Telemedicine and interactive chatbots (chatbot is alternative to human assistant for specific customer interactions through its language understanding): digital monitoring devices - tools which can be used as alternatives to remote monitoring and identifying early signs of disease by healthcare staff. AI can assist self-monitoring of personal health related parameters like intake of nutrition, physical activity, blood pressure, glucose, lipids for identifying high risk individuals. It provides solutions for medication adherence, motivation, reminders and building a care network. It helps people to self-manage noncommunicable diseases

As we see rapid use of AI, it is

important to study the impact of the technology on people. Legal and ethical issues are of paramount importance. The lack of regulations raises apprehension that AI technology will wreak havoc on society before the governments can react. With this apprehension in mind, the White House told the Chief Executive Officers of US AI giants that they have the moral responsibility to protect the society from the potential dangers of AL The Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) has recently released "Ethical Guidelines for Application of Artificial Intelligence in Biomedical Research and Healthcare." While this is a welcome measure, it is important to make regulations to protect the common man from the dangers of AI, especially in the healthcare sector. Someone has aptly said: "Ethics is not definable, it is not implementable, because it is not conscious, it involves not only our thinking but also our feeling.'

Indigenisation push

Sir, India's defence sector has been grappling with the challenge of achieving self-reliance while also meeting the requirements of the armed forces. The Defence Ministry's initiative for the approval a list of 928 components and subsystems to be purchased only from domestic industry as part of the government's "Atmanirbharta" or self-reliance programme is certainly a commendable step towards indigenisation, but the involvement of the private sector could further accelerate production. The current approach to indigenisation in the defence sector has largely been dependent on the DRDO (Defence Research and Development Organisation) and DPSUs (Defence Public Sector Undertakings) to deliver on the promise. However, there have been delays in DRDO projects, and the armed forces have raised concerns over the quality of products which has resulted in the armed forces resorting to imports rather than waiting for indigenously developed products. The solution to this problem lies in encouraging private sector companies to participate in defence production, especially in the medium and high-tech regimes. Premier institutes like IITs and private universities could also be incentivised to run academic courses on the defence sector. The government needs to provide tax incentives to defence manufacturers and encourage startups, particularly in cutting-edge technology products like drones used in warfare. *Bishal Kumar Saha*, MURSHIDABAD

Special team to probe into chinks in land acquisition

Sambalpur, May 17: A special team will probe into the irregularities in land acquisition for construction of a ring road or necklace road around Sambalpur town, a report said Thursday.

The ring road having four lanes will be constructed at a plan outlav of ₹1.000 crore by the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI). The purpose behind the construction of the ring road is to ease the traffic problems in the town and facilitate smooth plying of heavy vehicles. The road will start from Goshala, Katapali on NH-53 and will run through Maneswar, Jayantpur and Kabrapali before connecting the Biju Expressway at Sasan.

The ring road will have roads for two national highways while a bridge on Mahanadi and a railway bridge will also be constructed for the purpose. Most of the land required for the project is government land while some private land will also be acquired for the purpose.

The tender will be opened and works will start after 80 per cent of the land is acquired for the project, NHAI sources had said

Meanwhile, the NHAI has floated a tender for the purpose while the land acquisition is nearing com-

pletion. However, large scale irregularities have marred the land acquisition process as some influential people have allegedly connived with the land acquisition officials and local land brokers to extract more compensation.

It is alleged that houses have been built on the lands meant for acquisition after publication of 3D notice. Such irregularities are alleged to have been committed in Gunderpur, Sudunga, Brahmanipali, Nuapali, Jayantpur areas where land acquisition is underway for construction of the ring road.

The houses which have been constructed are allegedly not fit for human habitation. Normal process has not been followed during the construction of houses in which proper flooring works are yet to be done.

The interior of the houses are in

decrepit conditions while the exte rior of the houses have been plastered and applied with colours. The local residents have lodged complaints with the concerned officials but their pleas are yet to be addressed.

The rule mandates that the land status cannot be altered and no construction will be allowed once the notice is issued for land acquisition. Moreover, restrictions are imposed on carrying out any further construction work on the concerned land and if necessary then construction works can be undertaken after obtaining necessary permission from the district Collector.

A report is prepared and compensation is sanctioned on the status of the land before the issue of the notice for land acquisition. However, here in an aberration, construction works were taken up on the land after issue of the notice.

NHAI project director Nageshwar Rao said that a GPS survey, field verification, videography and photography were un dertaken before land acquisition. He said that construction of a house after issue of a notice can be clearly known and the district administration has been informed to check these wrongdoings. Any house found uninhabitable will not be given any compensation.

Joda, May 17: The 2009-10 scam in Joda mining circle of Keonjhar district had triggered shockwaves in the state. The Justice MB Shah Commission and a Central Empowered Committee had conducted a probe and submitted their reports to the Supreme Court. Later, the leaseholders were directed to pay penalty for irregu-

larities in mining, sources said. However, the leaseholders of mines are yet to pay over ₹6,000 crore as penalty sources informed Monday. Delay in payment of the amount has seriously affected the development works in the mineralbearing areas of the district being undertaken by the Odisha Mining Bearing Affected Development Corporation (OMBADC).



New Delhi, May 17: In a massive crackdown on the terrorist-gangster-narco nexus, the NIA along with Punjab and Haryana police on Wednesday raided 324 locations in nine states and Union territories under "Operation Dhvast", the agency said.

During the day-long raids in Punjab, Delhi, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, Maharashtra, Gujarat, Chandigarh and Madhya Pradesh, arms and ammunition, incriminating material and Rs 39 lakh were seized, a spokesperson of the National Investigation Agency (NIA) said.

While the NIA raided 129 locations, the Punjab Police raided 143 places in 17 districts and the Haryana Police 52 locations in 10 districts, the official said and added that the raids simultaneously began at 5:30 am. The NIA said the raids were aimed at breaking the terror nexus of designated terrorist Arsh Dalla, and dreaded gangsters such as Lawrence Bishnoi, Chhenu

Pehalwan, Deepak Teetar, Bhupi Rana, Vikash Lagarpuriya, ashish Choudhary, Gurpreet Sekhon, Dilpreet Baba, Harsimrat Simma and Anuradha.

'The focus of today's raids was on weapon suppliers, financiers, logistic providers and Hawala operators associated with the hardcore gangs working with drug smugglers and terrorists based out of other countries such as Pakistan and Canada," the spokesperson said. The official said the raiding parties have seized a pistol, assorted ammunition (both live and used cartridges), 60 mobile phones, five DVRs, 20 SIM cards, a hard disk, a pen drive, a dongle, a WiFi router, a digital watch, two memory cards, 75 documents and over Rs 39.60 lakh.

These was the sixth in a series of crackdowns launched by the NIA following the registration of three cases since august last year pertaining to conspiracies related to targeted killings, terror funding of pro-Khalistan out-

TN CM announces 4 per cent DA hike

Chennai: Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M K Stalin has approved a 4 per cent dearness allowance (DA) hike for state government employees. The move, which would entail an additional expenditure of Rs 2,366.82 crore annually to the exchequer, will benefit 16 lakh government employees teachers, pensioners and those receiving family pension, an official release said Wednesday said. The hike comes into effect retrospectively from the start of the financial year, April 1, 2023. The DA was increased from 38 per cent to 42 per cent, the release added

New K'taka CM likely in a day or two: Cong

New Delhi, May 17: Hectic parleys were held on Wednesday to break the deadlock in deciding on the Congress' chief ministerial pick in Karnataka with both the hopefuls Siddaramaiah and D K Shivakumar presenting their cases before the top brass even as the party asserted an outcome is likely within a day or two.

After the multiple rounds of discussions, AICC general secretary in-charge for Karnataka Randeep Surjewala said a decision on the new cabinet will be in place in the next 48-72 hours.

He also claimed that Karnataka will have a five-year-long stable government of the Congress and urged people not to believe in speculation and "fake news", which he alleged was being peddled by the BJP.

Later in a tweet. Surjewala said all Congress leaders have been advised not to issue statements on the leadership matter. "Any out of turn remarks made from here onwards will be treated as indiscipline and action taken accordingly."

A section of the top Congress leadership feels Siddaramaiah's popularity among several sections including the poor, OBCs and minorities can get votes for the party in the Lok Sabha elections.

Addressing the media outside Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge's 10 Rajaji Marg residence, Surjewala said the party chief has been authorised to appoint the leader of the legislature party and that is why deliberations are underway.

"It (the decision to name the CM) is a matter of today and tomorrow and we will have a leader of the legislature party. Within the next 48 to

CBI raids premises linked to ex-media advisor of Satya Pal

New Delhi, May 17: The CBI Wednesday conducted searches at the premises of Sunak Bali, who was an aide of Satya Pal Malik when he was the governor of Jammu and Kashmir, and 11 other locations in Delhi and Rajasthan in the alleged insurance scam case, officials said. Malik, who was the J-K governor

from August 2018 to October 2019, defended Bali and alleged it was "revenge" by the agency

Officials said CBI teams started a search operation early this morning at the residence of Bali, Chartered Accountant Sanjay Narang, Virender Singh Rana and Kanwar Singh Rana, Priyanka Chowdhary and Anita in Delhi and Rajasthan. The operation was spread across 10 places in Delhi and two districts in Rajasthan.



Malik, who has served as governor of various states, told PTI that Bali used to arrange media interviews for him when he was the governor of Jammu and Kashmir.

Malik said he has known Bali for a long time and he did not get any salary from him.

The agency move comes within a month of questioning Malik on April 28 in the matter.

HINDENBURG ROW SC grants SEBI time till August 14 to complete probe_

New Delhi, May 17: The Supreme Court Wednesday granted the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) time till August 14 to complete its probe into the allegations of stock price manipulation by the Adani group and asked the market regulator to place on record an updated status report of the probe.

A bench headed by Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud also directed that copies of the report submitted before it by the apex court-appointed Justice (retd) A M Sapre expert committee be made available to the parties to enable them to assist it in further deliberations in the matter.

When Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for SEBI, requested the top court to consider extending the deadline till September end, the bench said, "We are not granting an indefinite extension of time. If there is some genuine difficulty, you let us know.'

The bench, also comprising Justices PS Narasimha and JB Pardiwala, was hearing the pleas filed on the Adani-Hindenburg row. It was also considering the SEBI's application seeking extension of time by six months to complete the probe into allegations of stock price manipulation by the Adani group. "SEBI is granted an extension of time till August 14, 2023 to submit its report," the bench said, adding, "SEBI shall place on record an updated status report with regard

to the course of investigation. The remit of the Justice Sapre panel was to provide an overall assessment of the situation, including the relevant causal factors which have led to volatility in the securities market in the recent past. The panel was asked to suggest measures to "(i) strengthen the statutory and/or regulatory framework; and (ii) secure compliance with the existing framework for the protection of investors"

the court had earlier said. At the outset on Wednesday, the CJI observed, "The committee has submitted its report. It is a tentative report and now SEBI has asked for an extension of time to complete their investigation.

Advocate Prashant Bhushan, appearing for one of the petitioners, referred to a reply given by the minister of state for finance in Parliament in July 2021 about SEBI investigating some Adani group companies with regard to compliance with SEBI regulations.

SILENT DISASTERS OF U'KHAND

Unchecked pilgrimage, construction spell calamity: Experts

Environmentalists point to the road expansion project as another factor posing a serious risk to the stability of the region, already

highly prone to *climate-driven disasters,* experts say

New Delhi, May 17: Crumbling mountainsides, sinking towns and untrammelled construction. It is against this backdrop that thousands of pilgrims make their way to the upper reaches of Uttarakhand each day, posing serious risk to the fragile Himalayan region, say

That reports of landslides are in-

creasing and people in subsidencehit Joshimath, the gateway to Badrinath, one of the Char Dham destinations, are being compelled to move back to the homes they left because of large cracks add to the general sense of foreboding gripping the area.

The Uttarakhand government's decision to lift the daily cap on the number of pilgrims visiting the state for the Char Dham Yatra is a matter of grave concern, according to environmental activist Atul Sati.

Earlier, the daily limits were --Yamunotri (5,500 pilgrims), Gangotri (9,000), Badrinath (15,000) and Kedarnath (18,000).

Geologist C P Rajendran said the attendant problem of higher footfall is the generation of huge amounts of waste, including plastics and horse and donkey excreta. The heavy pilgrim traffic, he ex-



plained, could also result in the melting of glaciers and environmental degradation with a serious impact on biodiversity.

A 2019 report headed by veteran environmentalist Ravi Chopra described the Char Dham project an ongoing road project that will connect the four important pilgrim towns of Badrinath, Kedarnath, Gangotri, and Yamunotri — as "an assault on the Himalayas".

The committee recommended limiting road widths to 5.5 meters on the Char Dham project. However,

in December 2021, the Supreme Court in its order allowed the road width to 10 meters.

Environment researcher Abhiiit Mukherjee noted that a primary reason for landslides in the Himalayas is because road widening cuts away the toe of slopes that support the rocks. This in turn destabilises the mountain area

In his view, authorities have not taken adequate measures to address the environmental and safety concerns of both the pilgrims and the local community.

Adding a note of warning, Rajendran said the mountains, already dealing with forest fires, deforestation, loss of water sources, and soil loss, cannot bear the brunt of "unregulated tourism and footfall".

On January 2 this year, hundreds of people were displaced by a land subsidence event in

Joshimath town and forced into relief camps.

Experts as well as locals attributed the event to unscientific road construction and infrastructure projects coming up in the ecologically fragile zone.

A study published earlier this year estimated that 309 "fully or partially road-blocking landslides" were identified along the 247-km road stretch between Rishikesh and Joshimath, which translates to an average of 1.25 landslides per km.

According to environmental expert Anial Prakash, there is need for a regulated system based on the carrying capacity of the hills.

Uttarakhand has a long history of natural disasters, including earthquakes, landslides. cloud bursts, and flash floods thathave claimed thousands of lives in the past.

CBI arrests journalist, ex-Navy commander

New Delhi, May 17: The CBI has arrested freelance journalist Vivek Raghuvanshi and former Navy commander Ashish Pathak for allegedly collecting sensitive information on defence matters and passing them on to foreign intelligence agencies, officials said Wednesday

Raghuvanshi and Pathak were produced before a special CBI court which sent them to six days custody of the agency, they said.

The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) had taken over the probe from the Delhi Police Special Cell, which was on the trail of Raghuvanshi since September last year, after getting information that some Indian journalists were collecting and passing on such information to for-

eign intelligence agencies having potential to disturb relations under Section 3 (spying) of with friendly countries. The informa-

tion received by

the Special Cell suggested that a journalist was illegally collecting "sensitive details" about "future procurement of armed forces which reveal the strategic preparedness of our country's classified communications/information related to national security, and details of

strategic and diplomatic talks of

Kolkata, May 17: Teams from the state CID and forensic department started their investigation into the explosion at an illegal firecracker factory in Egra area of West Bengal's Purba Medinipur district Wednesday, a senior police officer said.

Forensic experts started collecting samples from the now collapsed house at Khadikul village which housed the illegal firecracker unit and its surroundings, he said.

The CID officers are speaking to the witnesses as well as with family members of those killed in the blast, the officer said. A huge posse of local police have been deployed in the village near the Odisha border. The district police have lodged an FIR in connection with the explosion that took place Tuesday in which nine people were killed and several others injured.

"Our officers are at the spot and they have started their investigation. Forensic experts are also there. The samples collected from the spot will be sent for examination to identify the materials used at the factory to prepare firecrackers," the police officer told PTL

Meanwhile, BJP leader Suvendu Adhikari reached Khadikul village on Wednesday morning. He spoke to villagers there and tried to take a look at the house where the firecracker factory was housed, from the terrace of a neighbouring building. Thiruvananthapuram, May 17: The LDF government in Kerala Wednesday approved an ordinance that provides for stringent punishment, including imprisonment of up to seven years and a maximum fine of ₹5 lakh for those found guilty of causing grievous bodily harm to doctors, medical students, and others working in the health services sector in the state.

Under the Kerala Healthcare Service Workers and Healthcare Service Institutions (Prevention of Violence and Damage to Property) Amendment Ordinance, anyone found guilty of causing grievous bodily harm to any healthcare worker or professional would be punished with imprisonment ranging from one year to seven years and a fine of ₹1 lakh to ₹5 lakh, a government statement said.

The ordinance also provides that anyone who commits or at-

tempts to commit or incites or inspires an act of violence against healthcare workers or those working in healthcare institutions shall be punished with imprisonment for a term of not less than 6 months and up to 5 years and with a fine

between ₹50.000 to ₹2 lakh, it said Before the amendment, under the Kerala Healthcare Service Workers and Healthcare Service Institutions (Prevention of Violence and Damage to Property) Act of 2012, any act of violence against a healthcare service person or damage to property of a medical institution carried a punishment of a maximum three years imprisonment and a fine upto ₹50,000.

Besides the enhancement of punishment, the ordinance states that the trials in cases lodged under the Act have to be completed in a timely manner, and that special courts will be designated in each district to ensure speedy adjudication, the statement said.

The ordinance also states that cases registered under the Act have to be investigated by a police officer not below the rank of Inspector and the probe has to be completed within 60 days of registration of the FIR, it said.

Furthermore, the ordinance extends the protection under the Act to paramedical students, security guards, managerial staff, ambulance drivers, helpers who are posted and working in health care institutions.

Centre seeks hysterectomy data from all states

New Delhi, May 17: The Centre has asked states to provide data on hysterectomies conducted in private as well as public hospitals with an aim to prevent certain medical institutions from carrying out the procedure even when it is unnecessary and unjustified.

Union Health Secretary Rajesh Bhushan has advised all states and Union Territories to undertake compulsory audit for all hysterectomies as is being done for maternal mortality in all healthcare institutions, both public and private.

"The matter is regarding the prevention of unnecessary and often unjustified hysterectomies performed by certain medical institutions. This issue is being closely monitored by the Ministry of Health



and Family Welfare," Bhushan said in a letter sent to all states

and Union Territories April 28. Guidelines on hysterectomy -- a procedure in which the uterus is removed surgically -- were prepared by the health ministry and a copy of it with a data collection format

Preventive healthcare in India gets shot in the arm with 'Health ATMs'

New Delhi: A preventive health screening drive using "Health ATMs", fitted with cutting-edge diagnostic equipment, has been launched in northern India as part of a joint initiative of the HEAL Foundation and India Health Link (IHL). Health ATMs are touch-screen automated teller machine-sized machines which can screen vital parameters, including pulse, blood pressure, temperature, body mass composition, blood glucose, oxygen saturation levels and ECG, without any paramedic assistance. A "Health ATM" kiosk was set up at the second G20 Health Working Group meeting held in Goa last month.

Terrorists hiding in Khan's house

Lahore: The interim government in Pakistan's Punjab province Wednesday claimed that some '30 to 40' terrorists are hiding at the Lahore residence of former prime minister Imran Khan, giving him an ultimatum of 24 hours to hand them over or face stern action. The police in March had stormed the Zaman Park residence of Khan to arrest him but strong resistance of his party, Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf, workers thwarted that plan. Mir, who is the brother of known anchor Hamid Mir, asked Khan to take this ultimatum seriously as the law enforcement agencies have reserved the right to arrest the terrorists from his house. "The intelligence report that has come is very alarming," Mir said, adding that the agencies were able to confirm the presence of the "terrorists" in Zaman Park through geo-fencing.

Raiapaksa free to fly overseas again

Colombo: A Sri Lankan court here Wednesday ordered the lifting of the overseas travel ban on former president and prime minister Mahinda Rajapaksa. The Fort Magistrate's Court imposed a ban on overseas travel on Rajapaksa, 77, and over a dozen other politicians in May last year in view of investigations against them for their alleged involvement in the deadly attack on peaceful anti-government protesters in Colombo. At least nine people were killed and over 300 others injured in the violence in May. Heat on way to melt records

GLOBAL TEMPERATURE SET TO BREAK 1.5 DEGREES CELSIUS THRESHOLD FOR THE FIRST TIME

Washington, May 17: There's a two-out-of-three chance that the world will temporarily hit a key warming limit within the next five years, the United Nations weather agency said Wednesday.

But it likely would only be a fleeting and less worrisome flirtation with the internationally agreed upon temperature threshold. Scientists expect a temporary burst of heat from El Nino — a naturally-occurring weather phenomenon—to supercharge humancaused warming from the burning of coal, oil and gas to new heights. Temperatures are expected to then slip back down a bit.

The World Meteorological Organisation forecasts a 66 per cent likelihood that between now and 2027, the globe will have a year that averages 1.5 degrees Celsius (2.7 degrees Fahrenheit) warmer than the mid 19th century.

That number is critical because the 2015 Paris climate agreement set 1.5 degrees Celsius as a global guardrail in atmospheric warming, with countries pledging to try to prevent that much long-term warming if possible.

'It won't be this year probably. Maybe it'll be next year or the year after" that a year averages 1.5 degrees Celsius, said report lead au-

Belgrade (Serbia), May 17: Dozens of Serbian schools Wednesday received bomb threats, the education ministry said, amid security concerns following two mass shootings early this month, including one in an elementary school.

The education ministry said 78elementary schools and 37 high schools in Belgrade received warnings by email early Wednesday that explosive devices had allegedly been planted.


Classes were postponed and students evacuated as police checked the buildings. There have been no reports that bombs were found in any of the schools, and police are

yet to issue their report. Similar multiple threats have



been sent to school addresses in the past, in Serbia and other countries in the region, and have proven false each time. However, the threats could further heighten security fears after the May 3 and May 4 shootings that left 10 people dead and 21 injured.

The first shooting happened at an elementary school in central Belgrade when a 13-year-old boy took his father's gun and opened fire. A day later, a 20year-old shot randomly at people with an automatic weapon in two villages south of Belgrade.

Kathmandu, May 17: Nepali climber Kami Rita Sherpa reached the top of Mount Everest for the 27th time Wednesday, reclaiming the record for the most summits of the world's highest mountain.

"He successfully reached the

summit this morning guiding a Vietnamese climber," Mingma Sherpa of Seven Summit Treks, his expedition organiser, told AFP.

The 53-year-old had held the title since 2018, when he ascended Everest for the 22nd time, passing the previous mark he shared with two other Sherpa climbers, both of whom have since retired.

But Sunday another climber, Pasang Dawa Sherpa, 46, tied the record by reaching the top for the

A guide for more than two decades, Kami Rita Sherpa first summited the 8.848-metre (29.029foot) peak in 1994 when working for a commercial expedition.



Since then, he has climbed Everest almost every year, several times leading the first rope-fixing team to open the route to the world's highest point.

These records were made not with an intention to make them but during my work as a guide,' Sherpa told AFP last month as he headed to the base camp.

Growing up, Sherpa watched his father and then his brother don climbing gear to join expeditions as mountain guides, and was soon following in their footsteps.

In 2019, he reached the summit twice in the span of six days. Nepal is home to eight of the world's 10 highest peaks and welcomes hundreds of adventurers each spring, when temperatures are warm and winds are typically calm. Authorities have issued 478 per-

mits to foreign climbers this year, the \$11,000 fee part of total costs for a summit ranging from \$45,000 to \$200,000. Since most will need a guide,

more than 900 people -- a record -will try to summit this season, $\stackrel{\searrow}{\rightarrow}$ which runs until early June.

Nepali guides, usually ethnic Sherpas from the valleys around Everest, are considered the backbone of the climbing industry and bear huge risks to carry equipment and food, fix ropes and repair ladders.



The World Economic Situation and Prospects as of mid-2023 released Tuesday said India's economy, the largest in the South Asian region, is expected to expand by 5.8 per cent in 2023 and 6.7 per cent in 2024 (calendar year basis), supported by resilient domestic demand.

However, higher interest rates and weaker external demand will continue to weigh on investment and exports in 2023, it said. Inflation in India is expected to

decelerate to 5.5 per cent in 2023 as global commodity prices moderate and slower currency depreciation reduces imported inflation. The estimates for India's eco-

nomic growth in the mid-year assessment remained unchanged from the projections made in the World Economic Situation and Prospects 2023 report launched in January this year.

The flagship report issued in January had said that India's GDP is projected to moderate to 5.8 per cent in 2023 as higher interest rates and global economic slowdown weigh on investment and exports.

India's economic growth is expected to remain "strong" even as prospects for other South Asian nations are more challenging.

A warning on big tech, from ChatGPT's Altman, global face of AI

■ Governments worldwide are under pressure to move quickly after the release of ChatGPT, a bot that can churn out human-like content in an instant, went viral and both wowed and spooked users

Washington, May 17: Sam Altman, the chief executive of ChatGPT's OpenAI, told US lawmakers Tuesday that regulating artificial intelligence was essential, after his poemwriting chatbot stunned the world.

The lawmakers stressed their deepest fears of AI's developments, with a leading senator opening the hearing on Capitol Hill with a computer-generated voice - which sounded remarkably similar to his own - reading a text written by

the bot. "If you were listening from home, you might have thought that voice was mine and the words from me, but in fact, that voice was not mine," said Senator Richard Blumenthal.

Artificial intelligence technolo-

gies "are more than just research experiments. They are no longer fantasies of science fiction, they are real and present," said Blumenthal, a Democrat. The latest figure to erupt from Silicon Valley, Altman's testimony

in front of a US Senate judiciary subcommittee was far from the testy grilling given to the bosses of Facebook or TikTok when they visited Washington. Tipped as an opportunity to educate lawmakers, Altman used the

session to urge Congress to impose

new rules on big tech, despite deep



regulating the internet. Altman has since become the global face of AI as he both pushes out his company's technology, including to Microsoft and scores of other companies, and warns that the work could have nefarious effects

DC TURN PARTY POOPERS FOR KINGS

Milan, May 17: Inter Milan reached their first Champions League final in more than a decade with a 1-0 victory against city rival AC Milan. Inter had a 2-0 lead from the first leg of the semifinal and Lautaro Martinez's 74th-minute goal Tuesday ended any hopes for Milan to stage a comeback.

Several players from both teams fell to the ground in tears at the final whistle as the Nerazzurri won the so-called "Euroderby" 3-0 on aggregate to progress to its first final since it won the league, Italian Cup and Champions League under Jose Mourinho in 2010. Inter players and staff celebrated

for long afterwards with their fans, singing and dancing in front of the Curva Nord packed full of Nerazzurri supporters in an electric atmosphere at San Siro — the stadium that both teams share.

"It's obviously a great emotion, a dream that I had together with the guys, that we nurtured right from when the draw was made," Inter coach Stefano Inzaghi said.

"We had to believe in ourselves and we have got here by merit, no one has gifted us anything. We had a long road, with difficulties but I think we earned it. I think probably from tomorrow we'll realize more what we have done. But it's a wonderful night with the fans, with our family, you can't ask for anything more.

Inter will face either 14-time champions Real Madrid or another juggernaut in Manchester City June 10 in Istanbul. The second leg of the other semifinal is Wednesday, with the scoreline
