SHORT TAKES Defence production crosses ₹1L-cr mark

New Delhi: For the first time, the value of India's defence production has crossed the rupees one lakh crore mark in the financial year 2022-23, the Defence Ministry said Friday. The value of total defence production in India in 2021-22 was over ₹95,000 crore. In the last few years, the government has taken a series of measures to promote the domestic defence industry. "The value currently stands at ₹1,06,800 crore," the Defence Ministry said in a statement.

dead in mishaps in state

Bhubaneswar, May 19: In a number of mishaps that took place Friday in various parts of Odisha, six persons including three kids lost their lives. All the three minors who met their untimely demise were drowned while the three others died in a road accident.

The road mishap took place on Loisingha-Bharasuja road near Karkachia Square in Bolangir district when a bike with three people collided head-on with an SUV. All the three deceased were on the bike and were identified as Rajesh

Patel of Rota, his brother-in-law Tulsiram Patel of Sadeipali and Suranjan Patel of Kusanga, police said. The trio was on their way to Rota when the accident occurred.

The three suffered serious injuries and were rushed to a nearby hospital locals. However, doctors declared the three dead on arrival. Loisingha police said they have seized the vehicle and detained the driver.

In another incident which occurred in Pipalpur village under Lamtaput block of Koraput district, two minor siblings drowned while taking a bath in a pond. They were identified as Yogesh (5) and his 10-vear-old sister Saathi, both children of Jinu Ladanaik. They slipped into deep waters while bathing and with no one around to help them, both drowned. The bodies of both the kids were found floating in the pond after Jitu started searching for them.

In another tragic incident, Chandan Mohapatra, a resident of Srirampur village under Charampa panchayat in Bhadrak block died while trying to swim in the village pond. He had secured 519 marks (86%) in the BSE Matric results which were an-

New Delhi, May 19: The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) announced Friday the withdrawal of ₹2,000 denomination bank notes from circulation. The notes will, however, remain legal tender and people can exchange these notes with other denomination banknotes till September 30, the RBI said.

The ₹2,000 notes were introduced in 2016 after Prime Minister Narendra Modi announced demonetisation in November the same year. While the Union government claimed that the decision to withdraw ₹500 and ₹1,000 notes was to flush out black money and also to tackle flow of counterfeit currency in the economy, the decision turned out to be a drastic failure with 99 per cent of invalidated notes returned to the banks and instances of counterfeit currency increased.

According to an RBI report, fake notes of ₹2,000 denominations increased by more than 54 per cent.

The RBI, though, stated that ₹2,000 notes were introduced to meet currency requirements of the economy post-demonetisation

and after adequate availability of banknotes of other denominations, the printing of the notes stopped in 2018-19. It said that the denomination is not commonly used for transactions and currently it constitutes only 10.8 per cent (₹3.62 lakh crore) of notes in circulation as of March 31. The RBI

The RBI informed that people can exchange ₹2,000 notes with other denominations at any bank branch from May 23. The exchange can be made up to a limit of ₹20,000 at a time. "To complete the exercise in a

time-bound manner and to provide adequate time to the members of the public, all banks shall provide deposit and/or exchange facility for ₹2,000 banknotes until September 30. The banks are also advised to stop issuing ₹2,000 denomination banknotes with immediate effect," the RBI said in a

HC junks ASO merit list

Cuttack, May 19: The Orissa High Court scrapped Friday the merit list prepared by the Odisha Public Service Commission (OPSC) for recruitment of 796 Assistant Section Officers (ASOs) in the State Secretariat.

While hearing pleas filed by a few of the ASO aspirants, Justice Aditya Kumar Mohapatra asked the OPSC to come up with a fresh merit list of candidates within two months on the basis of marks obtained by them in the written examination conducted August 27, 2022, said petitioners' lawyer Manoj Kumar Mishra. The OPSC had conducted the written examina-

tion for recruitment of 796 ASOs, the results of which were announced November 7, Mishra said. A total of 1,48,888

candidates had appeared for the written examinations. The commission prepared the merit list in line with the new

'qualification mark rule' wherein candidates who secured at least 40 per cent in each paper were selected.

A few unsuccessful candidates, however, approached the Orissa HC stating that the commission did not mention the new 'qualification mark rule' of evaluation in its advertisement and introduced it at a later stage, the petitioner's lawyer

said, demanding scrapping of the merit list. "OPSC had no right to decide on the cut off marks. It had violated the service norms by issuing cut off of 40 per cent. Taking this into consideration, the HC had February 10, 2023 concluded the hearing and reserved the judgement," Mishra informed.

"Shoigu! Gerasimov! Where are the shells?" Prigozhin is heard shouting in the video. "Look at them! Look at them!" he fumed, gesturing at the corpses. "You sit in expensive clubs, your children make YouTube videos, while 'Wagner' fighters die so you can gorge yourselves in your offices!'

Astonishingly, Prigozhin even took aim at Putin, referring to the president as 'happy grandfather' who thought the war in Ukraine was proceeding smoothly. "But what if it turns out that this grandfather is a complete fool," he said.

The infighting between Wagner and Russia's military has become a soap opera played out in front of a global audience. In the most recent episode, an

article in 'The Washington Post' this week said that Prigozhin had on several occasions made contact with Ukrainian military intelligence and is ready to shift allegiance. The story claimed Prigozhin had offered to turn over information about the positions of Russian forces if the Ukrainian military withdrew from the city of Bakhmut, where Wagner fighters have been fighting Ukrainian forces for months. If the Kremlin accepts that line, Prigozhin will be in serious trouble.

According to political analysts, it is not that Putin is unaware of the developments fostered by the Wagner group. In the past he had dealt with such rebellions with an iron fist. However, the fact is that he now seems unable (or unwilling) to do so with Prigozhin. It indicates that Putin's ability to control the Kremlin's fiefdoms isn't what it used to be.

Authoritarian governments need narratives about success, trading on tales of triumph against foreign or domestic evils. Putin's Russia has been no exception to this rule. However, when things go badly, it becomes imperative to punish scapegoats, deflecting blame from the leader. This is what is happening now, with Russia's armed forces and Wagner attempting to pin culpability on one another.


In the picture, the actor can be seen standing dejected near a police jeep in a chequered shirt and pair of black pants that he paired with white sports shoes and transparent







CB rolls up sleeves to curb fake SIM menace

Bhubaneswar, May 19: In a bid to curb misuse of fake and pre-activated SIM cards, the Crime Branch (CB) of Odisha Police has suggested a host of measures to telecom service providers (TSPs), an official said Friday. SIM registered in their name and

Only those dealers who have permanent shops should be allowed to sell SIM cards as it would go a long way to curb illegal sale of pre-activated SIMs at makeshift stalls, the CB asked the TSPs during a special meeting here.

The TSPs have been asked to en-

sure prompt tele-verification of new SIM cards. "TSPs should ensure expeditious tele-verification of new SIM cards by calling to Aadhaarlinked phone numbers only," said a CB official. TSPs have also been instructed to devise a mechanism through which customers can easily lodge complaint about the fake

subsequently get it deactivated. The CB officials asked the TSPs to blacklist Point of Sales (POS) violating the standard operating procedure (SOP) of SIM activation.

"TSPs should create awareness among the customers regarding

Telecom Analytics for Fraud Management and Consumer Protection (TAFCOP) tool that enables the customers to verify and ascertain as to how many SIM cards are in use in their name with or without their knowledge. TSPs should have internal surveillance mechanism over the activated SIMs lying dormant continuously but are being recharged regularly," the CB said.

While speaking in the meeting, CB ADG Arun Bothra warned that in case of bulk seizure of fake or preactivated SIM cards, the sleuths will investigate the role of TSP officials in the conspiracy to issue such SIMs. He told the authorities that stringent action will be taken against those found guilty along with others persons in the supply chain.

Bothra urged the TSPs to strengthen their internal vigilance mechanism and conduct regular checks and verification and deactivate such SIMs to check the misuse. He also requested Department of Telecom officials to regularly provide inputs to police against

Bhubaneswar, May 19: Odisha Pradesh Congress Committee (OPCC) Friday wanted the Mahanadi Water Disputes Tribunal (MWDT) to pass an interim order considering the acute water crisis in Odisha during non-monsoon period.

Addressing a press conference here, OPCC president Sarat Patnaik, media cell chairman Ganeswar Behera and campaign committee chairman Bijay Patnaik said the water flow in Mahanadi has drastically reduced during non-monsoon period leading to acute shortage of water for irrigation and drinking purpose.

Expressing their concern over the delay in resolve of the water dis-

pute, they wanted the MWDT to issue an interim order. They also asked the Tribunal to give a specific deadline for the verdict.

The Congress leaders said though two committees—one under the chairmanship of Chief Minister and another under the chairmanship of the Speaker - were formed to initiate steps for the resolve of the Mahanadi water dispute, the committees have not met even once

They said though the Tribunal was formed five years back, it has not given a single verdict so far.

They said the common information format has not yet been finalised by the Odisha government. The Congress leaders alleged

that the water flow to Hirakud has been reduced by more than 77 per cent in May following the construction of barrages by Chhattisgarh. Meanwhile, a team of the MWDT arrived in Odisha Friday on a 10-day field survey. The team is scheduled to visit 30 locations during the survey. The team has already conducted its field survey in Chhattisgarh in two phases from April 18 to May 3 last and assessed the situation there.

The 12 decorative stone mineral blocks put for electronic auction are—Baharapada-Jamurhiha (East), Baharapada-Jamurhiha (West), Betarsing Block-A, Betarsing Block-B, Damba, Derab (East), Derab (West), Jhadapada, Lausahi, Nuagan (Nuagad), Nuagan (Tuburuba Mouza) and Tentulikhunti.

The government has invited financial bids in digital format only, while technical bids can be submitted both in digital and physical format from eligible bidders.

The interested bidders can purchase tender documents after payment of a fee on the e-auction platform by June 29, 2023, and the last date for submission of the bid is July 7, 2023. A bidder will have to pay ₹50,000 (excluding GST) to purchase tender documents for each

of the mineral blocks. The state government had transferred the administration of minor minerals from the Revenue and Disaster Management department to Steel and Mines department. After that, this is the first tranche of e-auction of the minor minerals, sources said.

Globally, one in 10 people is affected by food-borne diseases each year. Antonina Mutoro, a nutrition researcher at the African Population and Health Research Centre, explains what causes food contamination and how we can lower the risk of disease.

Access to safe and nutritious food is a basic human right which many do not enjoy, partly because of food contamination. This is defined as the presence of harmful chemicals and microorganisms in food that can cause illness. According to the WHO, food contamination affects about one in every 10 people globally and causes about 4,20,000 deaths annually.

Food contamination can be: physical: Foreign objects in food can potentially cause injury or carry disease-causing microorganisms. Pieces of metal, glass and stones can be choking hazards, or cause cuts or damage to teeth. Hair is another physical contaminant.

Biological: Living organisms in food, including microorganisms (bacteria, viruses and protozoa), pests (weevils, cockroaches and rats) or parasites (worms), can cause disease

Chemical: Substances like soap residue, pesticide residue and toxins produced by microorganisms such as aflatoxins can lead to poi-

Most common causes of food con-

tamination The most common cause of food



contamination is poor food handling. This includes not washing your hands at the appropriate time -before eating and preparing food, after using the toilet, or after blow-

ing your nose, coughing or sneezing. Using dirty utensils, not washing fruits and vegetables with clean water, and storing raw and cooked food in the same place can also be harmful. Sick people should not handle food. And you should avoid

consuming under-cooked foods, particularly meat.

Poor farming practices can also contaminate food. This includes the heavy use of pesticides and antibiotics, or growing fruits and vegetables using contaminated soil and water. The use of inadequately composted or raw animal manure or sewage is also harmful.

Fresh foods can lead to a number of illnesses. In Kenya, for instance, the contamination of meat, fruits and vegetables with human waste is relatively common. This is attributed to the use of contaminated water to wash food. Flies carrying contaminants can also directly transfer faecal matter and bacteria onto plant leaves or fruits.

Street foods are another common source of food contamination. These foods are widely consumed in low- and middle-income countries because they're cheap and easily accessible.

Signs that you've eaten contaminated food

Biological and chemical substances are the most common food contaminants. They account for more than 200 food-borne illnesses, including typhoid, cholera and listeriosis. Food-borne illnesses usually present as diarrhoea, vomiting and stomach pains.

Zero Shadow Day to occur May 21



Bhubaneswar, May 19: Residents of the state Capital of Odisha will experience the Zero Shadow Day May 21, a rare celestial event that is generally witnessed only two times a year: Zero Shadow, which essentially means that there would not be a shadow of any object or beings when the Sun is at its peak in the sky.

Deputy Director of Pathani Planetarium Bhubaneswar, Subhendu Patnaik explained the phenomenon which will start at 11:43am. The Cuttack residents will witness the Zero Shadow day May 22 at same time.

"We don't need equipment to see the event but we can use a white paper and place it on a flat ground, keep some vertical object like a bottle on it and study the movement of its shadow," Patnaik said.

"The phenomenon takes place as the rotation axis of the Earth is tilted at an angle of 23.5° to the axis of revolution around the Sun. When the location of the Sun moves from 23.5° N to 23.5° S of Earth's equator, all places whose latitude equals the angle between the location of the Sun and the equator will experience Zero Shadow Days," explained Patnaik.

Pathani Samanta Planetarium has made special arrangements for the people to witness the event May 21 from 10:30am in the morning.

The Zero Shadow Days fall during the movement of the Sun towards the Tropic of Cancer in the north (Uttarayana) and towards the Tropic of Capricorn in the south (Dakshinayana) between December 21 and June 21.

Over 50% of world's largest lakes losing water: Study

largest lakes in the world are losing water, according to a new study, with key culprits unsurprisingly being warming climate and unsustainable human consumption.

The study, published in the journal Science, is the first comprehensive assessment of trends and drivers of global lake water storage variability based on an array of satellites and models, said lead author Fangfang Yao, University of Virginia, US.

He said this new method of tracking lake water storage trends and the reasons behind them could give water managers and communities' insight into how to better protect critical sources of water and important regional ecosys-

Motivated by environmental crises such as the drying of the Aral Sea between Kazakhstan and



Uzbekistan, Yao and colleagues from the University of Colorado Boulder (US), Kansas State University (US), France, and Saudi Arabia set out to measure changes in water levels in nearly 2,000 of the world's biggest lakes and reservoirs, representing 95 per cent of the total lake water storage on

For the study, the team created a technique by combining three decades of observations from an array of satellites with models to quantify and attribute trends in lake storage globally.

ssessing storage trends in reservoirs, the researchers found that nearly two-thirds of Earth's large reservoirs experienced significant water losses

They surveyed the area of 1,972 of Earth's biggest lakes by using 2, 50,000 lake-area snapshots captured by satellites between 1992 and 2020. Collecting water levels from nine satellite altimeters and using long-term water levels, the scientists reconstructed the volume

The results were staggering, they said. 53 per cent of lakes globally experienced a decline in water

By leveraging recent advancements in water use and climate modelling, climate change and human water consumption were found to dominate global net decline in natural lake volume and water losses in about 100 large lakes, Yao said.

"And many of the human and climate change footprints on lake water losses were previously unknown, such as the desiccations of Lake Good-e-Zareh in Afghanistan and Lake Mar Chiquita in Argentina," said Yao.

Lakes in both dry and wet areas of the world are losing volume, the researchers said. The losses in humid tropical lakes and Arctic lakes indicate more widespread drying trends than previously un-

Further, assessing storage trends in reservoirs, the researchers found that nearly two-thirds of Earth's large reservoirs experienced significant water losses.

"Sedimentation dominated the global storage decline in existing reservoirs," said Ben Livneh, also a co-author, and associate professor of engineering at CU Boulder. In long-established reservoirs - those that filled before 1992 - sedimentation was more important than

droughts and heavy rainfall years. While the majority of global lakes are shrinking, 24 per cent saw significant increases in water storage. Growing lakes tend to be in under-populated areas in the inner Tibetan Plateau and Northern Great Plains of North America and in areas with new reservoirs such as the Yangtze, Mekong, and Nile river basins,

Dabugaon, May 19: Tribals under this block in Nabarangpur district are resorting to distress sale of minor forest produce (MFP) as they are oblivious about the prices fixed by the state government, a report said Friday.

The state government has permitted the panchayat samitis to fix the prices of MFPs and facilitate their sale. However, the order has remained only in pen and paper as the tribal villagers do not know anything about the prices of various MFPs.

In the absence of a proper mechanism, the traders are calling the shots in deciding the prices. In the haats, traders are fixing the prices of MFPs at their whim fleecing the tribals. Such a situation has cropped up due to seer negligence of government officials in the pan-

The tribals are dependent on collection of 64 varieties of MFPs including Sal seeds and Mohua flowers to earn their livelihood.

Dabugaon panchayat's extension officer AD Prasad said the prices of MFPs are fixed every year in the month of October. However, he did not have the price list with him.

This is indicative that how the tribals are openly exploited due to the negligence and apathetic attitude of government officials.

Sources said the district has a vast forest cover spread over an area of 2,519 sq. km and almost 50 per cent of that area is covered by only Sal forest.

A senior forest official requesting anonymity said that once upon a time the district used to sell 1 lakh quintal of Sal seeds

The state delegated the sale and management of MFPs to the panchayats 20 years back. Since then, the panchayats are only engaged in sanctioning licenses to the traders instead of doing anything good for the collectors. They never see if the collectors get the right price for the MFPs during sale. However, the government has never taken stock of what the panchayats have done for the tribals during these past 20 years.

When contacted, TDCC Director Akhil Bhatra said that TDCC is planning to buy the Sal seeds from tribals and efforts are on to strengthen the infrastructure of TDCC and construct a godown in

BENGAL FIRECRACKER BLAST

Prime accused factory owner dies in hospital

Kolkata/Cuttack, May 19: In a major shocker for the sleuths investigating the explosion at an illegal firecracker factory at Egra in West Bengal's East Midnapore district that claimed nine lives, the prime accused and the owner of the said factory, Krishnapada Bag aka Bhanu died at a hospital in Cuttack, Friday.

He was arrested by the Criminal Investigation Department (CID) of the West Bengal Police Thursday only along with his son, Prithvijit Bag and nephew Biswajit Bag. However, Bhanu, who himself suffered severe burn injuries in that explosion, could not be released from the hospital and brought back to West Bengal.

Confirming the death of Bhanu, the district police superintendent of East Midnapore K Amarnath claimed that attempts are being made to bring Bhanu's body back to West Bengal

Following the death of Bhanu, his son and nephew are the two prime accused now. His nephew, Biswajit has been taken into custody of CID. After the cremation,



the police will also take his son, Prithvijit in custody.

Police sources said that Bhanu got admitted to the hospital at Cuttack by misleading the authorities there. He told them that his injury was due to a cylinder blast at a function.

On Thursday, a division bench of the Calcutta High Court directed CID to continue with the probe on the explosion, but after including sections of the Explosives Act

In the initial FIR filed by the po-

lice, only sections under the Indian Penal Code and West Bengal Fire Service Act were included for which the state police attracted severe

Although the initial police investigation has suggested that the explosion was probably from the firecracker manufacturing raw material stocked at the illegal factory, the opposition parties have claimed that the impact of the explosion proves that not firecrackers but crude bombs were being manufactured there.



Damaged Reputation

The case of Sandeep Silas, an IRTS officer from the 1984 batch, raises concerns about the irreparable damage caused to a babu's reputation, even after corrective actions have been taken. Recently, the ACC headed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, approved Silas' empanelment in Higher Administrative Grade (HAG) for the 2016-17 panel on a notional basis, almost three years after his superannuation and eight years after being falsely implicated in the "Rail Neer" scandal in 2015.

Sources have informed DKB that despite reports from the Railway Board Vigilance and the Central Vigilance Commission in 2016 clearly stating that "no case is made out" against Silas, the Railway Ministry proceeded to issue a prosecution sanction against the officer, even disregarding the Delhi High Court order quashing this sanction. Silas, who interestingly, had earlier served as the private secretary to Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge during his tenure as Labour and Employment Minister, was subjected to custody, both by the CBI and subsequently by the judiciary, and his tenure as CCM (Catering) Northern Railway was cut short to just two months due to a leave vacancy.

While a grievous wrong has been rectified, several babus and observers are asking questions about the role of key officers and the institutional negligence that led to a loss of reputation, career and harassment of the babu. It also serves as a reminder of the urgent need to address the systemic issues that allow such episodes to occur.

New CBI chief: A strategic move or partisan politics?

In the aftermath of the state Assembly elections in Karnataka, while one political battle may seem to have concluded, another one is brewing. The shifting battleground now lies within the power corridors rather than the polling stations. Just a day after the Congress party's triumph,

the Centre announced the selection of Karnataka DGP Praveen Sood as the new Director of the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) for a two-year tenure, replacing the outgoing director Subodh Kumar Jaiswal.

Given that Sood had been targeted by senior Congress leader DK Shivakumar, who denounced him as a "stooge of the BJP" and even demanded his arrest, the move is being seen by many as a deliberate attempt by the Modi sarkar's way to continue to make things difficult for the new Congress government in Karnataka. The choice of Sood as the head of the CBI clearly indicates that he is the preferred candidate of the Centre. Consequently, Sood is expected to resume his battle with Shivakumar and the Congress, both of which are vulnerable to corruption charges.

However, Sood's appointment did not come without a hitch. Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury, the Leader of the Opposition and a member of the threemember selection panel chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, expressed dissent by stating that Sood's name was not included in the original list submitted to the panel. Despite Chowdhury's reservations, Modi's decision prevailed. And now that Sood will sit in Delhi as the head of the powerful CBI, observers eagerly await the resurgence of the battle between the BJP and the Congress. As the dust settles, only time will reveal the true motivations behind this decision and the impact it will have on the political landscape of Karnataka.

Impasse continues on Delhi's administrative authority

In the aftermath of the Supreme Court's landmark verdict, the AAP government in Delhi wasted no time in acting, swiftly moving to remove Ashish More, Secretary of the Delhi government's Services Department. But the move took a dramatic turn when the Special Secretary of the department responded, asserting that the power of the Delhi government to transfer and post officers independently has not yet been implemented. According to the prevailing order from the Ministry of Home Affairs, this authority rests with the Lt Governor until the Ministry either revokes or revises it.

Clearly, there are still grey areas, despite the five-judge bench order, and given the response of the Services Department to More's transfer, the ultimate hiring power still rests with the Centre!

During this administrative tug-of-war, the Aam Aadmi Party has filed a plea regarding the stalled transfer of the Secretary of the Service Department by the Centre. It has also reportedly recommended the name of 1995 cadre IAS officer AK Singh for the position.

What the ongoing power tussle shows is the complex dynamics of administrative authority in Delhi. The clash between the elected government and the LG's office has been a long-standing issue, with each side claiming legitimate authority. For now, the issue is back with the Supreme Court, and it is hoped that we'll finally see some clarity and guidance on the scope and extent of the elected government's administrative authority Until then, babus in Delhi will remain on tenterhooks!

Hunky-dory

he Random House Historical Dictionary of American Slang suggests that the term may have been introduced in America about 1865 by a popular variety performer named Japanese Tommy. Other references suggest that it may have been sailors' slang for a street in Yokohama that catered for what one might describe as the special needs of sailors. In Yokohama a broad thoroughfare called Honcho-dori runs from the centre of the city to the port area, so one that would have been familiar to sailors (dori is the Japanese word for a road, in particular a broad or important one). What seems certain is that hunkydory was a play on an existing sense of the word hunky for something that was fine, splendid or satisfactory. In turn, this probably derives from the adjective hunk, which means that one is all right or in a safe or good position. This derives from the Dutch honk, meaning "goal" or "home" in a Frisian variant of the game of tag. This word (and presumably the game, too) was said to have been taken by the Dutch to New Amsterdam, later New York, but was first recorded only around the 1840s. It has links to another reduplicated term, hunkum-bunkum. Though the first part sounds a bit like the hunker of hunker down (which is also of Dutch origin), the words seem not to be related. It may be that hunky-dory was the result of a bilingual pun, perhaps invented because American sailors knew the word dori and prefixed it with hunky as an imagined Japanese street of earthly delights.

A DIVISIVE AGENDA NO MATTER HOW STRONG, WILL **END UP DIVIDING THE NATION AND ENHANCING A CULTURE OF DIVISION**

⁻anipur has been in a state of conflict for quite some time. It is not surprising that the situation often escalates into violence in this north-eastern state bordering Myanmar. The beginning of the current spell of violence in Manipur was perhaps spontaneous but not the discontent and discord between the Meitei and the Kuki tribals. Multiple problems have contributed to the strife between the two groups which are clearly divided by lines of geography, economy, caste and religion. The Meteis who are mostly Hindus live in the plains of the Central Valley while the largely Christian Kuki tribals live in the surrounding hills. The Meiteis, who are better off, educated, constitute more than half the population and are the ruling elite, want to be included in the list of the state's Scheduled Tribes, setting off the current crisis which escalated after the Manipur High Court asked the state government to consider the demand. The BJP has been in power here for six years under Chief Minister Biren Singh, completing the first year of his second term, yet nothing has been done by the Centre or state to deescalate a crisis that will ultimately spread, challenging the Constitution, unravelling the efforts to uplift backward classes and ruining the work of our founding fathers. In such a situation appealing for peace in Manipur is

just not enough. Peace is so distant and the only thing that is evident now is the depth of the discord and lack of trust. This can be measured by the fact that 10 Kuki legislators, including two ministers from the present Manipur government and seven BJP MLAs have petitioned the Union government to provide for a separate administration as a constitutional measure for the hills. They have stated that there are no ST members in the valley and there are no Meitei members in the hill areas. The divide is

some home entrances in the valley now reportedly carry written signboards spelling out the social identity of the residents in those homes. What happens then to the Constitutional principle of 'Fraternity' which now seems to be an alien concept in the streets of Manipur? According to Dr Ambedkar, both Equality and Liberty have no meaning in the absence of Fraternity.

The depth of the discord can also be measured in the demand by Meitei leaders that an NRC inquiry be instituted to decide the citizenship status of Kuki tribals. There are different reasons being put on table by various stakeholders as the root cause of the trouble including: the fact that Kuki ST members can purchase land in the valley dominated by the Meitei but not the vice versa; the Meitei were referred to as an ethnic group but not included in the ST list during the framing of the Constitution; the Meitei who represent 53% of the population in Manipur reside in only 10% of the state's land. The other issues include the state government's steps to remove tribals dwelling in forest areas by terming them as 'encroachers'; the avenues open for tribals by their ST quotas have also added to the discord between the two groups. The underlying reason is clear. There is also an element of envy among the Meitei, though they are better off, seeing the progress the ST communities

have achieved.

Prime Minister Modi has yet to say anything on such an important matter. This suggests that as a political party, their difficulty in promoting the idea of Hindutva faces a dilemma in such situations. Does the party and the notion of Hindutva recognise as a non-negotiable principle the importance of the Constitution which has carved out a safe space for the representation in multiple avenues of public life for the marginalised communities through a system of reservation? Or should the Constitution be undermined by promoting the inequality of status as accorded by the caste system? Undoubtedly, the former calls for the party to also undertake a mammoth role, that of the social

reformer. Dr Ambedkar had argued before the Southborough commission in 1919 advocating adult franchise for all Indian citizens on the grounds that the right to representation and the right to hold public office were an integral part of citizenship. The Constitution later legalised adult franchise for all citizens and introduced the system of reservation for SCs and STs spanning the fields of higher education, public sector jobs and the legislatures. The Constitution has expanded the scope of reservation to women, OBCs and lastly for the economically weaker sections who are not a part of the SC. ST and OBCs.

While the rationale for the lat ter is debatable given their social and political status in the country, the central question is: without reservations in place, would the SC and the ST, the most marginalised communities, have ever found representation, an all-important step towards achieving equality and human dignity in the country?

Reservation in the cases of SCs and STs, apart from the educational and economic benefits have brought about a space for their humanisation. They have suffered centuries of deprivation and humiliation with restrictions on ed ucating themselves. And for the SCs, even restricted physical mobility for moving around in public spaces.

The country has witnessed social tension between the Dalit and the non-Dalit communities for a long time. There have been numerous anti-reservation riots and the incidents of caste violence are by and large on the increase each year. India and all its political parties have failed to abolish untouchability and the practice of manual scavenging. The incidents of caste violence are often rooted in absurd grounds like Dalits growing moustache or dressing better. The patrons of Hindutva have undermined realities on the ground so much that in a state like Gujarat, Dalits though being Hindu, cannot

enter temples in 90.2% villages. While caste violence is not a new phenomenon, the large-scale violence against the tribal community in Manipur is unmissable.

The truth is perhaps simple. An appeal for peace is not enough. The danger is that the cracks in the Constitution are widening. The need of the hour is to find the true meaning of religion. A divisive agenda no matter how strong, will end up dividing the nation and enhancing a culture of division

lifty years ago, my first article we made progress in our attitudes treat animals as we do apoof them, since 1975? red in The New York Review of Books. Two years later my book Animal Liberation was published. subsequently to be credited with triggering the modern animalrights movement. Animal Liberation contains both ethical arguments and factual descriptions of what we do to animals. The ethical arguments have stood up well to nearly 50 years of discussion. Similar perspectives are now supported by many philosophers, including those who hold views that are very different from my own utilitarian position: Christine Korsgaard, a Kantian; feminist philosophers like Carol Adams, Alice Crary, and Lori Gruen; Mark Rowlands, who takes a social contract view of animal rights; and Martha Nussbaum, who is closer to Aristotle. On the other hand, the factual de-

scriptions in Animal Liberation of what we do to animals have long ceased to capture current conditions accurately. So, 18 months ago, I started a complete update and revision of the book, which will be published this month under the title Animal Liberation Now.

In writing what is, in effect, a new book on our treatment of animals, I could not avoid the question: have

cruelty to animals, but focus on how we treat our companion animals, especially cats and dogs, who number about 840 million worldwide. That number is dwarfed by the approximately 200 billion vertebrate animals raised for food in appalling conditions in factory farms. In any objective assessment of the lives, and deaths, of animals under human control, the welfare of intensively farmed animals far outweighs the significance of how we treat our companion animals. Of these vertebrate animals raised for food in close confinement, about 124 billion are fish. There is now strong evidence that fish can feel pain, and there is no justification for ignoring that pain.

Moreover, difficult as it may be to conceive of 124 billion individual fish, the total number of fish who suffer because of intensive fish farming is even greater. An estimated 460 billion-1.1 trillion fish are hauled out of the ocean every year, ground up into fishmeal, and fed to carnivorous fish. A typical farmed salmon has eaten 147 fish before it is itself killed.

After fish, chickens are the most consumed vertebrate: about 70 billion are raised and killed each year,

that their immature leg bones cannot easily support their weight, causing them chronic pain for the last fifth of their lives.

For that reason, John Webster, an emeritus professor at the University of Bristol who is also a veterinarian and a widely respected expert on the welfare of farmed animals, has described modern intensive chicken production as "the single most severe, systematic example of man's inhumanity to another sentient animal.'

Because of the growth and further intensification of animal production, humans inflict more suffering on animals today than they did in 1975. Nevertheless, the trend since 1975 is not all negative. The idea that animals should have rights has gone from being ridiculed to being widely held. In many countries, safeguarding animal welfare is seen as an important government responsibility.

In Europe, reforms have reduced the suffering of hundreds of millions of animals raised for food or used in research. It is now illegal in the 27 countries of the EU and in the UK to keep egg-laying hens in the standard bare wire cages that, in 1975, prevented nearly all hens from spreading their wings

typically in large sheds contain- fully or laying their eggs in the ing about 20,000 birds each. Today's nest that hens instinctively seek if chickens are bred to grow so fast given the opportunity. The same countries also prohibit breeding sows and veal calves in individual crates that prevent them from turning around or moving more than a single step.

Regrettably, most other parts of the world lag behind Europe in this respect. That includes the US, where, in the absence of any federal legislation to regulate how farmed animals can be raised, billions of them still live in conditions that have not improved over the past 50 years.

Then there is China, which 50 years ago produced relatively few intensively farmed animals but is now the world's leading producer of pigs and a huge producer of chickens. To increase production still further, China is now building massive skyscraper "farms," 26 stories high and totalling 800,000 square metres, all to be filled with closely confined pigs.

Mahatma Gandhi said that "the greatness of a nation and its moral progress can be judged by the way its animals are treated." By that standard, there are no truly great or morally progressive nations yet.




Conditions are favourable for further advance of southwest monsoon into some more parts of south Bay of Bengal, Andaman Sea and Andaman & Nicobar Islands during next 3-4 days, it said.

On Tuesday, the weather office had said that the onset of monsoon over Kerala is likely to be on June 4 with a model error of four days. The monsoon arrived in Kerala on May 29 last year, June 3 in 2021, June 1 in 2020, June 8 in 2019 and May 29 in 2018.

Agriculture contributes around 15 per cent to India's 3.5 trillion dollar economy and a good monsoon helps recharge aquifers and reservoirs besides watering the farms. The emergence of the El Nino weather pattern has raised concerns over monsoon rainfall in 2023. El Nino, which is the warming of the waters in the Pacific Ocean near South America, is generally associated with the weakening of monsoon winds and dry weather in India. The El Nino conditions this year follow three consecutive La Nina years. La Nina, which is the opposite of El Nino, typically brings good rainfall during the monsoon season.

Mumbai, May 19: Former Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) Zonal Director Sameer Wankhede Friday alleged before the Bombay High Court that the "draft complaint" in the 2021 drugs-on-cruise case named actor Shah Rukh Khan's son Aryan as an accused, but it was later replaced and Aryan's name was dropped.

before the HC seeking to quash an FIR registered by the CBI against Wankhede for allegedly seeking a bribe of ₹25 crore from Khan for not implicating his son in the alleged drug bust.

A vacation bench of Justices Sharmila U Deshmukh and Arif S Doctor, after recording Wankhede's undertaking that he would appear before the CBI on Saturday, directed the agency not to take any coercive action (like arresting him) till May 22. Among other things, his petition also provided transcriptions of phone chats with Shah Rukh Khan during the period Aryan was in NCB custody. It cited Khan as pleading with Wankhede to be kind to his son and praising the officer for his "uprightness"

The petition, filed through advocate Rizwan Merchant, claimed that after concluding the investigation in the case, a draft complaint was prepared by the Department Legal Advisor, where charges were proposed against Aryan Khan among others.

But this draft complaint never came to be filed on record and was replaced by another draft complaint prepared from outside, Wankhede alleged. It made apparent "the evil design of dropping the name of a particular accused from prosecution," it added.

The Narcotics Control Bureau, eventually, named 14 people in its charge sheet but let off Aryan due to "lack of sufficient evidence" Gyaneshwar Singh, then NCB deputy director who headed the NCB's team which conducted an inquiry against Wankhede, falsified records to claim that he was not involved in the supervision of Aryan Khan case and Wankhede had acted independently, the plea alleged.

Advocate Merchant also argued that the CBI searched his client's house for 14 hours in his absence and took away his phone, slippers and "even undergarments." The petition cited Wankhede's purported phone chats with Shah Rukh Khan to claim that they nowhere suggest that any bribe had been demanded.

New Delhi, May 19: The Supreme Court Friday deferred a scientific survey, including carbon dating, to determine the age of a "shivling", claimed to have been found at Varanasi's Gyanvapi mosque, saying implications of the Allahabad High Court order for it merit closer scrutiny.

The high court on May 12 had ordered determination of the age of the structure, claimed to be a "shivling", using modern technology. However, the mosque's authorities have said the structure is part of a fountain in the 'wazu khana', where ablutions are performed before namaz.

A bench headed by Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud issued notices to the Centre, the Uttar Pradesh government and the Hindu petitioners on the plea of the Anjuman Islamia Masjid committee against the high court order for the "scientific survey", including carbon dating, of the structure. "Since the implications of the

impugned order merit closer scrutiny, the implementation of the directions concerned in the order shall stand deferred till the next date," the bench also comprising justices P S Narasimha and K V Vishwanathan said.

Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for the Uttar Pradesh government, expressed concerns regarding damage to the structure during the process and said the government will examine in consultation with the Archaeological Survey of India if there is an alternative method to ascertain the age of the "shivling" found at Gyanyapi.

Senior advocate Huzefa Ahmadi, appearing for the Aniuman Islamia Masiid committee, told the bench that the survey work will commence on May 22. The Centre and the Uttar

The high court order had said no harm should be done to the structure, which the Hindu petitioners claim is a "shivling". However, the mosque's authorities said it is part of a fountain in the 'wazu khana'. It had passed the order on a revision petition filed by Laxmi Devi and three others challenging the Varanasi court order.

The high court had obtained a report from various institutions, including the IITs in Kanpur and Roorkee, and the Birbal Sahni Institute in Lucknow, before ordering for determination of the age of the structure.

BENGAL'S RAM NAVAMI VIOLENCE SC allows NIA probe

New Delhi, May 19: The Supreme Court Friday refused to stay the order of the Calcutta High Court handing over the probe into incidents of violence during Ram Navami celebrations in West Bengal to the NIA.

A bench of Chief Justice DY Chandrachud and Justices PS Narasimha and KV Viswanathan deferred the hearing on the plea of the West Bengal government challenging the high court order till after the summer vacation.

'We have not stayed the high court order and will take up the matter after summer vacation in the month of July,' the bench told Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for NIA.

The anti-terror probe agency has registered the case following a high court order. During the hearing, senior advocates Abhishek

and Sankaranaraynan, representing the West Bengal government, said the high court has in its order referred to only one FIR related to the

Chandan Nagar incident. "We have instructions that the court may allow the probe of Chandan Nagar FIR to be done by NIA but rest five FIRs be allowed to be investigated by the state police," Sankaranaraynan said. Singhvi said the NIA cannot be brought in for ordinary cases of violence unless it affects the country's security or sovereignty.

He said the National Investigation Agency (NIA) has a clear bar and it cannot be brought in just because someone says bombs might have been used in an incident. "Either summoning of police officials by the NIA be stayed or the high court order be stayed till this court has adjudicated the appeal of the state government finally," he said.

Oppn targets PM over withdrawal of ₹2,000 notes

New Delhi, May 19: Opposition parties targeted Prime Minister Narendra Modi Friday over the RBI's announcement on the withdrawal of ₹2.000 currency notes from circulation, with the Congress saying the move was "typical of our self-styled vishwaguru" and his method of "first act, second think".

The Congress also said demonetisation has come a full circle and added that the ₹2,000 note was a "band-aid to cover up the foolish decision of demonetising" ₹500 and ₹1,000 notes. Left parties, including the CPI and the CPI(M), and the AAP also attacked the government over the issue.

A Congress MP said it was the beginning of a second demonetisation "disaster", in an apparent reference to the demonetisation exercise of November 8, 2016, when the legal tender status of all ₹500 and ₹1,000 bank notes was withdrawn by the Modi government.

'Typical of our self-styled Vishwaguru. First Act, Second Think (FAST), 2,000 rupee notes introduced with such fanfare after that singularly disastrous 'Tughlagi firman' of Nov 8 2016 are now being withdrawn," Congress general secretary Jairam Ramesh said on

Twitter, targeting the prime minister. Senior Congress leader and former Union finance minister P



Chidambaram said a few weeks after demonetisation, the government and the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) were forced to re-introduce the ₹500 note and he will not be surprised if the Centre re-

introduces the ₹1,000 note as well. In a tweet in Hindi, Delhi Chief Minister and AAP national convener Arvind Keiriwal said, "First he said that by bringing 2,000 note, corruption will stop. Now they are saying that by banning 2,000 notes, corruption will end. That's why we say, PM should be educated... He doesn't understand. The public has to suffer."

On the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) withdrawing ₹2000 notes from circulation, CPI(M) general secretary Sitaram Yechury said that it "virtually reverses the 2016 demonetisation, grandly announced by Modi as the answer to India's problems of black money, corruption, terrorist funding, and promoting digital economy". He said

it is a dismal failure on all counts. The TMC also said on Twitter, "BJP demonetised ₹500 and ₹1.000 notes in 2016, disrupting the lives of Indians everywhere! They claimed that the introduction of ₹2,000 note would curb the flow of black money. Seven years later, they are withdrawing it from circulation. Yet another Modinomic masterstroke?"

CPI leader Binoy Viswam tweeted, "Tuglakhs control the financial sector of the country. They have withdrawn the ₹2,000 notes. They may argue that this shows the strength of the economy under Modi." "Are they dare enough to bring out a white paper on Indian economy after the demonetisation," he asked. Congress spokesperson Pawan Khera said the "ghost" of November 8, 2016,has come back to haunt the nation once again.

THE POOR World's 1st insurance schemes for heat

This form of disaster assistance is on the rise across the developing world, as vulnerable communities are

hammered by worsening droughts, storms and heatwaves

Ahmedabad, May 19: A bright sun beat down on the sprawling Indian market where Kamlaben Ashokbhai Patni sat worrying about the brass jewellery on display in her wooden stall. When the heat rises, the metal blackens. Plastic pearls become unglued.

"The colour of the jewel starts to fade as it becomes hotter, making it worthless and akin to junk", said the 56-year-old mother of four, on a late April day when temperatures simmered around 38 Celsius (100F) in the western city of Ahmedabad.

Climate change drove heat in the city to a record-breaking 48 degrees C in 2016. Last year, it peaked at nearly 46 degrees C.

Such high temperatures could mean a hit to business. But Patni is now among 21,000 self-employed women in Gujarat

If temperatures climb high enough above historical averages and linger there for three days, she'll receive a small payout to help cope and compensate lost income.

While traditional insurance can take months to pay, with socalled "parametric" insurance there is no need to prove losses. It can pay within days of a trigger being reached – a predetermined threshold beyond which conditions are considered extreme. Payments can be set to things like wind speeds or rainfall.

But with climate change happening faster and causing more damage than scientists had predicted — and too little money being spent on protecting populations — such projects could struggle over the longer-term, according to more than 20 industry experts consulted by Reuters.

Reinsurer Swiss RE reported that sales of parametric product jumped 40% between 2021 and August 2022. Insurance analysts at Allied Market Research estimate the market, valued at \$11.7 billion in 2021, could reach \$29.3 billion by 2031.

The past year has seen new products rolled out across Latin America, Africa, and Asia-Pacific. The

"For vulnerable women on the margins, enduring extreme temperatures for three days directly amplifies the chances of sickness or death," said Sahil Hebbar, a physician attending to the women in SEWA who work jobs in construction, trash collecting and shipbreaking.

Insurance payouts allow them to buy things like gloves to protect their hands from scorching hot metal tools, or fans to stay cool and avoid heat exhaustion.

Sitting with her jewel in the market, Patni said if temperatures climbed higher she would put payout money toward medicine to help with heat-related headaches. "I spend 15 hours at the stall everyday ... in summers it becomes difficult to stay here," she said.

Across the city, Heena Kamlesh Parmar, 26, works as a daily wage labourer at a construction site where she is building a high-rise residential complex, earning Rs 350 per day.

LÍMITS

While parametric insurance has been around since the 1990s. recent advances in satellite technologies have opened up areas that were previously difficult to assess for damage, such as distant islands or mountain communities.

However, some industry experts question whether the products will be financially viable in the long-run, in part because of too frequent payouts due to climate risks escalating faster than predicted less than a decade ago. This could drive up premiums.

Some schemes have already fizzled. The Kenva Livestock Insurance Program, for example supported pastoralists hit by drought with 1.2 billion Kenyan shillings (\$8.8 million) in payouts between 2015 and 2021. But with just 1.1 billion (\$8.1 million) shillings collected in premiums, the scheme operated at a loss and was replaced this year with another that offers other financial savings products alongside insurance.

At the moment, insurance schemes in the developing world are largely subsidized by nonprofit groups, national governments, or wealthy countries.

Interviews with more than a dozen groups involved in such insurance found that most products launched in the last five years had already paid out.

While she walked and ran to reach work sites on time since her vounger days, the woman never thought that she would ever become an athlete one day and win medals in open meets in and outside the country in these cate-

This is Sheeba, a cashew worker and domestic help-turned-athlete from Kerala who represented the country in various World Masters Athletics meets and garnered medals and accolades.

Hailing from Mayyanad in this southern district, the 38-year old

woman is now on another run in life to find a sponsor for the upcoming Asian Masters Athletics Championship scheduled to be held in the Philippines in November

Though the event is a few months away, she is yet to find Rs 1.5 lakh to enable her participate in the international meet "As the government does not

recognise athletics in the masters' category, we have to find money on our own for participation. I could participate in similar meets held in four countries before and in various Indian states with the support of noble-minded people, Sheeba told PTI.

Last year, the woman athlete had won medals in 400 metres relay race and 3.000 metres walk during the national masters athletic events held in West Bengal, thus



qualifying for the Asian Masters

Championship. A mother of two, Sheeba has been working in a cashew factory for years and also as a domestic help in some households to make both ends meet.

She said she would manage to find time amidst this busy sched-

After completing chores, I would go to the factory. Then, with the permission of the employer there, I would leave early in the evening and work as a domestic help in some nearby houses. So, my life itself is a race

ule for daily practice also. "When I practise wearing a tracksuit, people in the neighbourhood make fun of me, asking if she doesn't have any other job at this age. But, I usually won't take these negative comments to my heart," she said.

A school dropout, the woman said she does not receive any desired support from the family to chase her dreams. Sheeba said she had not participated in any sports events during her school days but since she stepped into the world of athletics somehow, it has been her passion and dream.

Despite the hardships, challenges and financial constraints, this woman is optimistic and positive about her participation in the upcoming event in the Philippines

"Look at these medals and certificates...All I have won fighting all these hardships and challenges, she said pointing to the heap of medals, trophies and certificates, stacked in gunny bags and kept at window panes in her humble home.

"So, I am sure a door will be opened before me this time also...And I will wear the Indian jersev and win medal(s) for the country in the international event, Sheeba signed off.



My sister's husband and his father have been demanding dowry since the marriage. We have given them as per our financial capacity but they were still demanding for more," Ravindra Paswan said.

SC asks Bihar for records on Anand Mohan's release

New Delhi, May 19: The Supreme Court Friday directed the Bihar government to produce complete original records with regard to the remission granted to former MP Anand Mohan, who was serving life term in the 1994 murder case of then Gopalganj District Magistrate G Krishnaiah.

A bench of Justices Surva Kant and JB Pardiwala told advocate Manish Kumar, appearing for the Bihar government, that no further adjournment will be granted in the case and directed him to place the complete records for perusal of the court. It listed the plea filed by the wife of the slain officer challenging the release of Mohan on

At the outset, Kumar sought some time to file a reply to the plea. Senior advocate Siddharth Luthra, appearing for Uma Krishnaiah, the wife of the slain officer, said the state government has changed the policy retrospectively and released him in the case.

He urged the bench to direct the state to place entire records of criminal antecedents of Mohan and sought the matter to be listed in August. The bench recorded that counsel for state government and Mohan have appeared before it and said no further adjournments will be granted.


"Original records with regard to remission to respondent-4 (Anand Mohan) by order dated April 10, 2023, be placed before the court", the bench said, adding that records with regard to criminal antecedents be also placed before it.

On May 8, the top court had sought response from the Bihar government on a plea challenging the state government's decision to prematurely release Mohan. Mohan was released from the Saharsa jail April 24 after serving 14 years of imprisonment following an amendment made in Bihar's prison rules by the state government.

The petitioner has contended that life imprisonment awarded to the gangster-turned-politician meant incarceration for his entire natural course of life and it cannot be mechanically interpreted to last just 14 years. "Life imprisonment, when awarded as a substitute for

death penalty, has to be carried out strictly as directed by the court and would be beyond application of remission," she said in her petition before the Supreme Court.

Mohan's name figured in a list of more than 20 prisoners who were ordered to be set free by a notification issued by the state's law department as they had spent more than 14 years behind the bars.

The remission of his sentence followed an April 10 amendment to the Bihar Prison Manual by the Nitish Kumar government whereby the restriction on early release of those involved in killing of a public servant on duty was done away with.

This, the critics of the state government's decision claim, was done to facilitate the release of Mohan, a Rajput strongman, who could add heft to the grand alliance led by Nitish Kumar in its fight against the BJP. Several others, including politicians, benefited from the amendment to





Mocha toll reaches 145 in Myanmar

Bangkok: The official death toll from the powerful cyclone that struck Myanmar has burgeoned to at least 145, including 117 members of the Muslim Rohingya minority, state television reported Friday. It said the figure applied to the western state of Rakhine, where Cyclone Mocha did the most damage, but did not say how many storm-related deaths there have been in other parts of the country. The accounting of casualties from the cyclone has been slow, in part due to communication difficulties in the affected areas and the military government's tight control over information.

Manila: Philippine Vice President Sara Duterte resigned Friday as a member of the Lakas-Christian Muslim Democrats (Lakas-CMD), the ruling political party in the House of Representatives, Sara Duterte, the daughter of former President Rodrigo Duterte who serves as the party's chairperson, did not state the reason for her "irrevocable" resignation, reports said.

Iran executes three

Tehran: Three men who were sentenced to death in connection to last year's anti-government protests in Iran were executed by the authorities Friday, the judiciary announced. Majid Kazemi (30), Saleh Mirhashemi (36) and Saeed Yaqoubi (37) were arrested in the city of Isfahan November 16, 2022, the BBC reported. They were convicted over their alleged involvement in an attack which killed two Basij paramilitary force members and a police officer during a protest in the city.

PM Modi in Hiroshima for G7, Quad summits

Hiroshima, May 19: Prime Minister Narendra Modi arrived here Friday to attend the annual summit of the G7 grouping and the third in-person Quad leaders'meeting during which he will exchange views with world leaders on global challenges and discuss ways to collectively address them.

Modi arrived in Hiroshima on the first leg of his three-nation trip to Japan, Papua New Guinea and Australia and is expected to take part in over 40 engagements.

"Landed in Hiroshima to join the G7 Summit proceedings. Will also be having bilateral meetings with various world leaders." Modi tweeted.

Earlier, in his departure statement, the prime minister said he was looking forward to exchanging views with the G7 countries and other invited partners on challenges that the world faces and the need to collectively address them.

"My presence in this G7 summit is particularly meaningful as India holds the G20 presidency this year. I look forward to exchanging views with the G7 countries and other invited partners on challenges that the world faces and the need to collectively address them," he said.

The Prime Minister was received by senior Japanese and Indian officials at the airport. Modi was warmly received by the Indian community when he reached his hotel. The Prime Minister also interacted with children and members of the Indian community.

Police left Imran's house after having 'water and biscuits'

The move comes hours after Punjab Police obtained warrants to conduct a detailed search at

Khan's residence. According to the Punjab Police



statement, the search would encompass a thorough examination of both the entrance and exit points of the residence, with the primary objective of finding "terrorists' hiding at the place, the *Dawn* newspaper reported. Khan's chief security

officer Iftikhar Ghuman, however, said the Punjab police have returned from Zaman Park "empty-handed", the report said.

Zelenskyy, Assad in Saudi for Arab summit

Jeddah, May 19: Saudi Arabia hosted an Arab League summit Friday in which Syrian President Bashar Assad was welcomed back after a 12-year suspension and Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy made a surprise visit to rally support against Russia.

Russian airstrikes have left a swath of destruction across both countries, but in Syria they came at Assad's invitation and helped him cling to power through years of grinding civil war.

Several other Arab states have maintained warm ties with Moscow while remaining largely neutral on the Ukraine war

Hundreds of millions of life years lost to pandemic: WHO

Geneva, Switzerland, May 19: Nearly 337 million life years were lost in the two first years of the Covid-19 pandemic, as millions of people died prematurely, the World

Health Organization said Friday. The UN health agency's annual world statistics report also showed a swelling threat from non-communicable diseases (NCDs) such as

heart disease, cancer and diabetes The most dramatic finding, based on data up to 2022, was the estimate of how many years of life Covid had taken, WHO said.

The pandemic has wreaked global devastation and officially killed nearly seven million people, with the true figure believed to be closer to 20 million.

The WHO report lays bare how the virus itself and the broader impact of the crisis abruptly cut short the lives of millions of people.

While the WHO officially registered 5.4 million Covid deaths in 2020 and 2021, its excess mortality data shows around 14.9 million people actually likely died due to the crisis over that period.

Even more striking, perhaps, it said the statistics show that during



those two years alone, Covid resulted in the loss globally of 336.8 million years that otherwise would

have been lived. "It's like losing 22 years of life for every excess death," Samira Asma,

WHO's assistant chief for data and analytics, told reporters ahead of the launch.

The WHO warned that the pan-

demic had helped throw off-track

many health-related indicators

that had been improving for years. During the first two decades of the century, the world saw significant improvements in maternal and

child health, with deaths falling by one-third and one-half respectively. The incidence of infectious diseases like HIV, tuberculosis and malaria also declined significantly,

as did the risk of premature death from NCDs. Global life expectance rose from 67 years in 2000 to 73 in 2019. But after the pandemic hit, existing inequalities in access to high-quality health care, routine immunisations and financial protection deepened, among other things sending the long improving trends on malaria and TB in the opposite direction.

'Stark message'

And while the world still enjoys health progress overall, the share of deaths caused each year by NCDs has grown, the study showed.

In 2000, around 61 percent of global deaths annually were linked to NCDs. By 2019, almost 74 percent were. 'If this trend continues, NCDs are projected to account for about

86 percent of the 90 million annual deaths by mid-century, WHO said in a statement. "The report sends a stark message on the threat of noncommunicable diseases, which take an immense and increasing



The overall cancellation rate of scheduled domestic airlines stood at 0.47 per cent in April, with Alliance Air seeing the highest cancellation rate of 7.55 per cent.

The Indian government blocked BGMI, the flagship game made by Krafton last July citing concerns about its data-sharing and mining in China.

of the game was agreed after it complied with issues of server locations and data security, Indian deputy minister for Information Raieev Technology,

Chandrasekhar, said in a tweet. Daishin Securities analyst Jeeeun Lee said the spillover from political spats with China to Krafton will be limited.

"It will be tough for India to impose an outright ban on companies affiliated with China over political issues when they operate through a local corporation that hire Indian workers like Krafton for instance," she said.

The ban on PUBG was part of a larger ban on more than 300 Chinese apps, including shortvideo platform TikTok, after the government ramped up its scrutiny of Chinese businesses in the wake of a 2020 clash between the neighbours.

The government also intensified the scrutiny of investments by Chinese firms in Indian companies.

Mumbai, May 19: The Reserve Bank of India Friday approved a Rs 87,416 crore-dividend payout to the central government for 2022-23. nearly triple of what it paid in the previous year.

The dividend payout is significantly higher than the amount estimated in the Union Budget 2023-24 from the central bank and state-owned financial institutions. The government was expecting Rs 48,000 crore from the RBI, public sector banks and financial institutions in the current fiscal.

The dividend payout by the RBI was Rs 30,307 crore for accounting year 2021-22.

With public banks posting record profits of over Rs 1 lakh crore in fiscal 2022-23, the government's earn-

ings from them too is likely to be

higher.

For 2021-22 fiscal, the government earned Rs 40,953 crore from the RBI and public sector financial institutions. It was much lower compared to Budget Estimate of Rs 73,948 crore for 2022-23.

The decision on Rs 87,416 croredividend payout was taken at the 602nd meeting of the Central Board of Directors of the RBI held under the Chairmanship of Governor Shaktikanta Das.

"The board approved the transfer of Rs 87,416 crore as surplus to the central government for the accounting year 2022-23 while deciding to keep the Contingency Risk Buffer at 6 per cent," the RBI said in a statement.

The contingency risk buffer, which is based on the recommendations of the Bimal Jalan Committee report, was 5.50 per cent for accounting year 2021-22. The panel had prescribed a Contingency Risk Buffer range of 6.5 per cent to 5.5 per cent.

Further, the RBI said the board reviewed the global and domestic economic situation and associated challenges including the impact of current global geopolitical developments.

It also discussed the working of the RBI during the year April 2022 -March 2023 and approved the annual report and accounts for the accounting year 2022-23.

The meeting was attended by deputy governors Mahesh Kumar Jain, Michael Debabrata Patra, M Raieshwar Rao, T Rabi Sankar and other directors of the central board. HIT NEAR 1-YEAR HIGH FOREX KITTY EDGE TOWARDS \$600BN

Mumbai, May 19: Rising for the second consecutive week, India's forex kitty jumped \$3.553 billion to \$599.529 billion for the week ended May 12, their highest level since early June, the RBI said Friday.

The overall reserves had jumped by \$7.196 billion to \$595.976 billion for the previous reporting week.

It can be noted that in October 2021, the country's forex kitty had reached an all-time high of \$645 billion. The reserves have been declining as the central bank deploys the kitty to defend the rupee amid pressures caused majorly by global developments.

For the week ended May 12, the foreign currency assets, a major component of the reserves, increased by nearly \$3.577 billion to \$529.598 billion, according to the Weekly Statistical Supplement released by the RBI Friday.

Expressed in dollar terms, the foreign currency assets include the effect of appreciation or depreciation of non-US units like the euro, pound and ven held in the foreign exchange reserves.

Gold reserves increased by \$38 million to \$46.353 billion, the RBI said. The Special Drawing Rights (SDRs) were down by \$35 million to \$18.413 billion, the apex bank added.

The country's reserve position with the IMF was down by \$28 million to \$5.164 billion in the reporting week, the apex bank data showed.

No TCS on overseas card spends up to ₹7L PRESS TRUST OF INDIA

New Delhi, May 19: The government Friday announced that no tax will be charged on overseas spending of up to Rs 7 lakh in a year using debit or credit as it looked to douse backlash from its earlier decision of

levying TCS on all spending. The government had earlier this week brought overseas credit card spending under Liberalised Remittance Scheme (LRS). This meant that any spending using credit cards overseas would attract a 20 per cent tax from July 1. Debit card

spending was already part of LRS. However, the move to levy tax collected at source (TCS) attracted criticism with some calling it "tax terrorism".

On Friday evening, the government said no TCS will be de-



ducted on the spending of up to Rs 7 lakh overseas using any debit or credit card.

Concerns have been raised about the applicability of Tax Collection at Source (TCS) to 'small transactions' under the Liberalised Remittance Scheme (LRS) from July 1, 2023

To avoid any procedural ambiguity, it has been decided that any payments by an individual using their international Debit or Credit

cards up to Rs 7 lakh per financial year will be excluded from the LRS limits and hence, will not attract any TCS," the ministry said.

Today's clarification by the ministry means that overseas payments exceeding Rs 7 lakh a year through international credit and debit cards will be subject to TCS levy at the rate of 20 per cent with effect from July 1.

Currently, overseas medical treatment and education expenses up to Rs 7 lakh a year is exempt from TCS. A 5 per cent levy is charged on expenses exceeding Rs 7 lakh.

For those who availed of education loans, the rate of TCS is 0.5

"Existing beneficial TCS treatment for education and health payments will also continue," the min-

istry said.

Japan mulling to ioin India's UPI payment system

New Delhi, May 19: Japan is mulling to join India's UPI payment system and promote cooperation on the digital identity system, a statement said Friday.

Bhutan, Nepal, Singapore and UAE have already started accepting Unified Payment Interface (UPI) payment systems.

"Almost every global forum, whether G20, SCO (Shanghai Cooperation Organisation) or G7, wherever we are presenting Hon'ble PM Modi's Digital India vision, has very good traction. People understand how Modi ii has democratised digital technology. I thank the Japanese digital minister. He has accepted PM Modi's very deep and extensive vision of Digital India," Union Minister for IT and Telecom Ashwini Vaishnaw said.

Japanese Digital Minister Kono Taro earlier Friday said that Japan is mulling joining India's UPI system and working on mutually recognising digital identities as well.

'We just had our G7 Digital Ministers' meeting last month and we had our Indian Digital Minister Mr Vaishnaw join with us and right now. Japan and India are trying to promote digital cooperation. We are now seriously thinking about joining Indian UPI, the payments system and also, we are contemplating how we can mutually recognise e-ID, for well – starting with cooperation, so we can increase interoperability," Taro said.

BAJRANG CRITICISES BRIJ BHUSHAN

New Delhi, May 19: Olympic medallist Bajrang Punia has criticised former Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) chief Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh for his alleged comment that a medal is worth just ₹15 and the grapplers should also return the crores of rupees the gov-

ernment has spent on their training. Brij Bhushan, who is in the eye of a storm for allegedly sexually harassing women wrestlers including a minor, said in a video interview that not just the medals, the athletes should also return the crores of

rupees spent on their training. Bajrang, who is leading the protest at Jantar Mantar along with fellow Olympic medallist Sakshi Malik and Asian Games gold medallist Vinesh Phogat, said Friday that the medal Brij Bhushan was demeaning by saying it was worth just ₹15 had been "earned after 15 years of toil".

"He (Brij Bhushan) has not given me the medal in charity. I have earned it for the country with my blood and sweat. He shouldn't have uttered these words if he truly respects our achieve-



ments," added Bajrang.

Sakshi said that, at an age when she should have been playing with dolls, she took up wrestling and "embraced the mud pits". "The medal he (Brij Bhushan) is saying is worth ₹15, we have sacrificed everything for that. It's shameful that the champion athletes of the country are seeing such bad days. I have won this medal for the country, no one can put a price on it,' said Sakshi.

As the protest entered its 27th day, several women's organisations jointly gave a memorandum to the President, Prime Minister,

Home Minister and Sports Minister and demanded the arrest of Brij Bhushan.

They alleged in the memorandum that ever since the politician took charge of WFI, women wresters had been facing sexual harassment. The protesting wrestlers also said that the deadline given to the government to \rightleftharpoons take action against Brij Bhushan was due to expire in two days and the khap mahapanchayat could take a "big decision" after that. They also said the agitation at Jantar Mantar will continue until Brij Bhushan is arrested.
