Bhubaneswar, May 21: Putting all speculation to rest, Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik Sunday picked up three senior BJD leaders and former ministers for their re-induction in his Cabinet.

According to reliable sources, three senior MLAs Bikram Keshari Arukha, Sarada Nayak and Sudam Marndi are likely to be inducted in the Cabinet, Monday.

Phone calls have been made to the three senior BJD MLAs to remain present at the swearing-in ceremony, the sources said.

Notably, Assembly Speaker Bikram Keshari Arukha along with two controversial ministers Samir Ranjan Dash (School and

Mass Education) and Srikanta Sahu (Labour and Employees' State Insurance) resigned from their positions, May 12. Besides, the then Health Minister Naba Kishore Das was murdered January 29 this year, creating another vacancy in the Cabinet.

The Odisha Council of Ministers can have 22 ministers including the Chief Minister but now has 19 ministers. So, with the induction of three ministers, all vacancies will be filled up.

According to the sources, the Chief Minister may also make changes in the portfolios of some ministers after the swearing-in event.

However, it is unclear who will be the next Speaker of the state Assembly. The probable names for Speaker's posts making the rounds are: Prafulla Samal, Debi Prasad Mishra, Amar Prasad Satpathy, Snehangini Chhuria and Badri Narayan Patra.

Meanwhile, Odisha Governor Ganeshi Lal, who was out of station, arrived in Bhubaneswar Sunday evening.

Naveen Patnaik had effected a complete reshuffle of his Cabinet last time in June 2022. So, another reshuffle will be conducted Monday morning.

New Delhi, May 21: Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar and Delhi counterpart Arvind Kejriwal Sunday called for opposition unity to take on the BJP as the JD(U) leader met the AAP convenor at his residence here and extended "complete support" to him in the ongoing face-off with the Centre over the control of administrative services.

Kejriwal said he would meet leaders of various parties to ensure that any Bill brought to replace the recent Central ordinance, which virtually negated the May 11 Supreme Court order that ruled in favour of his government, is not passed in Rajya Sabha and also urged Kumar to reach out to them to rally support on the issue.

"If the Bill is defeated in Rajya Sabha, it will send out a message that the BJP will lose the 2024 Lok Sabha elections," he claimed. "It will be the semi-final of the 2024 Lok

Sabha polls," the AAP national convenor told reporters outside his residence after meeting Kumar and his deputy and RJD leader Tejashwi Yadav. Kejriwal will be meeting the chiefs of the TMC, Shiv Sena (UBT) and the NCP this week seeking their support.

Kumar said the Centre's actions were "strange" and "baffling". "How can you take away an elected government's power," the Janata Dal (United) leader asked.

He said Kejriwal is doing good work in Delhi and it's surprising that his government is being stopped from doing its work. "That's why we are saying that all (opposition parties) in the country should come together," he said.

The BJP hit out at both Kumar and Kejriwal, saying the Bihar chief minister should pay attention to his state which is being pushed into "anarchy" instead of daydreaming about becoming the

Prime Minister.

Addressing a press conference, the party's six MPs from Delhi said Kejriwal was seeking the support of opposition leaders who he once branded as corrupt. "There was a time when Arvind Kejriwal used to carry a list of political leaders and considered them as symbols of corruption. But today he is ready to hug Nitish Kumar and Tejashwi Yadav," BJP leader Manoj Tiwari said.

Kejriwal's priority is not to eliminate corruption, but to defeat Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the MP from North East Delhi said and alleged that the AAP chief "is ready to stoop to any level to save his empire of corruption."

The Centre promulgated the ordinance Friday to create a National Capital Civil Service Authority for the transfer of IAS and DANICS cadre officers and disciplinary proceedings against them. This came a week after the Supreme Court handed over the control of services, excluding those related to police, public order and land, to the elected government in Delhi.

The Centre has also filed a review plea in the apex court against the verdict. Kejriwal had Saturday said that the ordinance was "unconstitutional" and they will challenge it in the apex court. An ordinance has to be ratified by Parliament within six months. The Aam Aadmi Party has 10 MPs in Rajya Sabha and one MP in Lok Sabha.

Branches fall on Vande Bharat, crack windshield

UP AND DOWN SERVICES OF THE TRAIN WILL REMAIN CANCELLED MONDAY

Kolkata, May 21: Tree branches fell on the Puri-Howrah Vande Bharat Express during a storm in Jajpur district Sunday, stranding it there for over three hours, officials said.

The branches got entangled with its pantograph, besides cracking its windshield, bringing the train to a halt, they said.

No one was injured in the incident, a South Eastern Railway (SER) official said.

The incident happened around 4.45pm between Baitarani Road and Manjuri Road stations, near the Jajpur-Keonjhar Road station, he said.

The train remained stranded there for over three hours, before

it restarted its journey with a diesel engine at 8.05pm, the official said.

A diesel engine would haul the train to Bhadrak as the overhead traction wire was damaged by the fallen tree branches, he said. It will run on its own from Bhadrak to Howrah thereafter, he added.

The up and down services of the train will remain cancelled Monday since some repairs would be required for the rake, the SER said.

22895-22896 Howrah-Puri-Howrah Vande Bharat express will remain cancelled for repairs of damages caused by thunderstorm May 21 in Cuttack-Bhadrak section of East Coast Railway, a statement by SER said.

The train was flagged off by Prime Minister Narendra Modi Thursday, and commenced its commercial run Saturday.

Sarpanch dies in honeybee attack

Jagannathprasad, May 21: A public representative under Jagannathprasad block in Ganjam district died Saturday after being attacked by a swarm of honeybees.

The deceased was identified as Sanat Kumar Pradhan, the sarpanch of Kudutai panchayat under this block.

The incident occurred when he was working on his farmland.

Suddenly a swarm of honeybees attacked him and some other farm workers on nearby farmlands. Pradhan ran to save his life when some villagers covered him with a tarpaulin.

The honeybees after moving around for some time left the place. Villagers rescued him and admitted him to a private hospital in Bhubaneswar where he succumbed to his injuries, late Saturday night.

Persona non grata: Georgian Airways' flight ban on Prez

Tbilisi, May 21: The founder of Georgia's national airline Georgian Airways has banned the country's President from using its services after she said she would boycott the airline over its resumption of flights to Russia, Russia's TASS news agency reported Sunday.

Russia announced this month it was lifting a four-year old ban on direct flights with Georgia and removing a decades-old visa requirement for Georgians travelling to Russia. Subsequently, President Salome Zourabichvili urged Georgian authorities to thwart the Russian initiative, an appeal they ignored.

A Georgian Airways aircraft made a flight to Russia May 20 for the first time since 2019.

On the same day, Zourabichvili, during a briefing, called on fellow citizens to boycott the airline, promising that she herself would not use its services. The President called it unacceptable that a Georgian airline, which enjoys the support of the state, flies to a country that occupies 20% of the Georgian territory.

Tamaz Gaiaashvili, founder of privately-owned Georgian Airways, was cited by TASS Sunday as saying that Zourabichvili was now persona non grata and would be banned until she apologises before the Georgian people.



According to Gaiaashvili, the president mistakenly believes that "by stopping the Georgian airline, it will destroy the Russian economy" and does not think about the interests of Georgia. There was no immediate reaction



from Zourabichvili. Although Georgian officials welcomed the resumption of flights, some Georgians who want the South Caucasus country to distance itself from Moscow in favour of the European Union

Many Georgians oppose any rapprochement with Moscow whose troops garrison two breakaway regions - Abkhazia and South Ossetia - that make up around one fifth of the country's territory.

Other Georgians are more open to the idea, however, and the Georgian government has in recent years worked to improve ties with Moscow, declining to impose sanctions on Russia over the war in Ukraine.

President Zourabichvili, whose position is largely ceremonial and whose relations with the government are strained, has warned that deepening ties with Russia could jeopardise the country's chances of the EU one day.


Angry over 'sexual insult' to Princess Kate, a Twitteratti digs up an old video of Priyanka Chopra wanting to go on a date with Prince William







search, the sleuths recovered 1107 gram of brown sugar worth Rs 1 crore, a motorcycle and a few incriminating materials from Chittaranjan's possession.

5T Secy inspects progress on projects in Nuapada

Bhubaneswar/Nuapada, May 21: 23 higher secondary schools and 7 colleges of Nuapada district will be taken up under the 5T initiative of the state government, informed secretary to CM (5T) VK Pandian during his visit to Nuapada Sunday.

On the direction of Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik, Pandian visited the district to take stock of progress of various development projects.

The Secretary visited the blocks of Nuapada, Sinapali, Khariar, Boden, Komna and reviewed the development projects and interacted with the people about their problems. Pandian first visited the large lift irrigation project in Gadramal and interacted with the local people there. In this project, 819 hectares of land is being irrigated while 1,630 farmer families are benefitting from it. The objective of the project is to encourage farmers to cultivate maize, groundnut, cashew, and vegetables apart from traditional farming.

Pandian has also taken decision for the development of some major temples in Nuapada.

He discussed with the sevayats and local people about the transformation of Jogeswar Mahadev Mandir at Patora. He directed them to prepare and submit a detailed report for renovation and beautification of the temple along with the development of tourism and water sports facilities.

Woman found dead, family cries foul play

Bhubaneswar, May 21: A 25-year-old married woman in the City died under mysterious circumstances at a private hospital here Sunday morning. The deceased, Manisha Panda was a resident of Aska in Ganjam.

Based on complaint lodged by the family members of Manisha, police registered a case (155/23) against the accused husband under sections 302, 304B, 498(A) of the IPC and section 4 of the Dowry Prohibition Act.

Police sources claimed, Manisha had married Lingaraj Panda of Baliapatana area around four years back. The couple was staying alone in a rented house at Lingaraj area. Saturday afternoon, the couple engaged in a heated argument over some petty issues when she suddenly fell on the ground losing her consciousness. Her husband rushed him to capital hospital and informed his family members.

Manisha was later shifted to the private medical college and hospital in Bharatpur area where she succumbed. The in-laws claimed that Mansiha had committed suicide by consuming poison.

However, her family members have alleged that Manisha was killed by her husband. The accused has been detained at the Lingaraj police station till the last news came in.

STF takes accused on 3-day remand

Bhubaneswar, May 21: The accused persons held for selling one-time passwords (OTPs) and mule bank accounts to Pakistani intelligence operatives and other cyber-criminals were Sunday brought on 3-day remand by the special task force (STF) for further probe.

The STF had earlier sought the court's permission to take the accused on remand for five days.

As per sources, it's possible that the STF could slap the National Security Act on the accused if their complicity in anti-national activities is established during the course of investigation.

The accused persons, Pathani Samant Lenka, Soumya Pattanaik and Saroj Kumar Nayak alias Amit, were in touch with a woman PIO agent who was arrested in Rajasthan last year.

Besides, the STF sleuths have so far succeeded in fetching some more

startling leads in the case during the investigation. The cops reportedly have found that the accused persons have links with anti-national criminals in Gujrat and New Delhi.

The STF suspects that the accused might be involved in spying for Pakistani intelligence agencies.

On the other hand, the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) and various banks have reportedly shared with STF officials vital details regarding financial transactions the accused persons made with Pakistani agents through UPI.

The NPCI was earlier requested by the STF to share details about the Pakistani agents and other criminals who had made payments to the accused in lieu of the OTPs and mule accounts.

Following a tip-off, the STF sleuths had arrested Pathani Samant Lenka from Master Canteen area here May 11. Pathani Samant was reportedly planning to go Kolkata to procure pre-activate SIM cards.

ZERO SHADOW DAY IN CITY

Bhubaneswar, May 21: At 11:43 am Sunday, Capital Bhubaneswar experienced a 'Zero Shadow Day', a time when vertical objects appear to cast no shadows. This was because the sun was at its zenith, and the shadow fell directly under the object, a planetarium official explained.

A large number of people, including children, thronged the Pathani Samanta Planetarium here to witness this rare event.

"Today, when the Sun exactly reached overhead at 11:43 am in Bhubaneswar, the shadow of any vertical object disappeared at that instant. Zero Shadow Day occurs twice a year in any particular place," said Pathani Samanta Planetarium deputy director Subhendu Patnaik.

While informing that the phenomenon was observed for 2 to



3 minutes in the City, Patnaik said that Cuttack will also witness the Zero Shadow Day May 22 at 11.30 am.

Uttarayan (movement of Sun from south to north from winter solstice to summer solstice) and Dakshinayan (back from north to

south) happen because Earth's rotational axis is tilted at an angle of roughly 23.5 degrees to the axis of revolution around the Sun.

Patnaik explained that the Sun's location moves from 23.5 degrees N to 23.5 degrees S of Earth's equator and back. All

places whose latitude equals the angle between the Sun's location and the equator on that day experience Zero Shadow Day, with the shadow of an object falling just beneath it at local noon.

"For the first time, I have experienced this wonderful event. It enhanced my practical knowledge about how the Sun moves around the earth," said a student present at the planetarium.

13 new courts to improve access to justice in state

Cuttack, May 21: Orissa High Court Chief Justice S Muralidhar inaugurated thirteen New Courts in the Cadre of Senior Civil Judge in Puri, Boudh, Ganjam, Kalahandi, Angul, Jharsuguda, Sundargarh, Malkangiri, Nabarangpur, Balasore and Baragarh in hybrid mode.

Inaugurating the courts, the Muralidhar said that courts at these places, which are spread across the Odisha, are a part of the bigger expansion project undertaken by the High Court.

Justice S Talapatra said the presiding officers of the newly opened Courts should constantly strive to develop innovative ideas and put efforts to get the best out of infrastructure of the Court system.

App tracks men's contribution to household chores

Angela Rodriguez, Spain's secretary of state for equality, says the app aims at shedding light on the invisible 'mental load' overwhelmingly carried by women when it comes to domestic tasks

The Spanish government is hoping to encourage men to do more at home by developing a free app that will log how much time each household or family member spends on domestic chores, The Guardian reported. Announcing the measure in Geneva earlier this week, Spain's

secretary of state for equality, Angela Rodriguez said the aim was to shed light on the invisible 'mental load' overwhelmingly carried by women when it comes to domestic tasks, it said.

According to Rodriguez, the app is very similar to those used to measure the sharing of travel expenses.

"The design of the program would be 'bold' and it would be capable of tracking the progress of a variety of domestic tasks, reflecting the 'mental burden' that housework and caring duties entail," The Telegraph reported quoting Rodriguez.

The app is being designed with couples and families in mind, but it could also be used to share tasks among children or roommates, Rodriguez said.



Rodriguez said the app would also serve to highlight all the invisible jobs necessary for the smooth

running of a house. Although tidying up the kitchen might take 20 minutes, she said, it depended on

someone having remembered to buy washing-up liquid or having planned the shopping list.

The Spanish government has opened bidding for which company will produce the app, with a budget of 211,000 (€183,000).

According to sources, most Spanish men continue to do far less than their fair share when it comes to household chores and caring work.

According to a study by INE, the state statistics institute, 50 per cent of women in heterosexual relationships say they perform the majority of housework, compared with only 4 per cent of men, according to The Telegraph.

A further 40 per cent of women are the principal carer for a child, with the same being true of 5 per cent of men, it said.

Speaking in Geneva at a convention of the Committee on the Elimination of Discrimination Against Women, a United Nations (UN) body, Rodriguez said, "We (women) spend more time on domestic tasks than men."

Spain's equality ministry has introduced a host of reforms since the Left-wing government of prime minister Pedro Sánchez took power five years ago, including legislation to increase access to abortion, introduce menstrual leave for women with severe period pain and create a consent-based rape law.

The latter proved controversial, however; after more than a thousand prison sentences for convicted sex offenders were reduced as a result of the changes in the penal code.

Listing of bail applications at HC

Cuttack, May 21: Orissa High Court has issued a new set of practice directions in the shape of a standing order relating to listing of bail applications. Pursuant to the observations made by the Supreme Court of India in order May 15, 2023 passed in Pradhani Jani v. the State of Odisha (Criminal Appeal No. 1503/2023 arising out of SLP (CrI) No. 3241/2023). The new practice direction has been issued modifying paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 of Standing Order No. 1 of 2020.

The High Court had earlier issued Standing Order No. 1 of 2020 which provided that all the bail applications of a particular accused arising out of the same FIR would be listed before the same bench in the High Court and the practice was continuing since then.

In a recent order passed May 15, 2023 in Pradhani Jani v. the State of Odisha (Criminal Appeal No. 1503/2023 arising out of SLP (CrI) No. 3241/2023) the Hon'ble Supreme Court had observed that hearing of bail applications of different accused persons arising out of the same FIR in different benches creates an anomalous situation because it so happens that while some accused get bail orders in some benches, some do not get bail orders in similar footing though they are involved in the same case. The Supreme Court had requested the High Court of Orissa to change the practice.

Pursuant to the said observations the High Court has now modified paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 of its Standing Order No. 1 of 2020 and issued Standing Order No. 2 of 2023 relating to listing of bail applications. The new standing order provides that all the anticipatory bail applications arising out of the same FIR would be heard by the same bench and if previous bail applications have been heard by different benches, the bench which first decided any of those applications would hear the subsequent bail applications. The same practice will be followed for the bail applications where the accused persons are in custody.

Large carnivores play roles in balancing ecosystems

Large carnivores like wolves are returning to areas they used to occupy, leading scientists to wonder whether they may once again fulfil important ecological roles. But wolves' return to the landscape can affect other nearby animals in complex ways.

The research, published in the journal Science, shows that an increase in predators can lead smaller carnivores, like coyotes and bobcats, to seek refuge near people - but humans then kill them at even higher rates than large predators do.

Predators structure ecosystems Large carnivores play crucial roles in their ecosystems. As they prey on or push other animals to avoid the areas they frequently use, predators shape the way interconnected food webs work.

Wolves also kill smaller predators like coyotes, providing respite for the animals that coyotes eat.

Research suggests that landscapes with wolves may have more

diverse vegetation and more small animals like songbirds than those without wolves.

But because humans are often intolerant of predators and kill them at high rates, large predators tend to avoid areas that are frequented by people.

Predators in human-dominated landscapes

Wolves are now returning to areas heavily modified by humans.

This level of development raises the question: Do predators have the same influence on ecosystems where humans, rather than wolves, are the top dogs?

To answer this question, GPS collars were used to track the movements of 22 wolves, 60 cougars, 35 coyotes and 37 bobcats as they navigated the landscapes a patchwork of public forests and land used for agriculture, ranching, logging and residential development.

When 'human shields' are lethal

The researchers found that wolves and cougars avoided areas heavily influenced by humans,

such as busy roads and residential areas.

Coyotes strongly avoided wolves, which brought them closer to humans. In parts of the landscape with large predators around, both coyotes and bobcats moved to areas with approximately double the

human influence, potentially using humans as shields.

When coyotes and bobcats sought refuge near people, they instead encountered a more lethal source of danger:

Humans were the greatest cause of mortality, killing these smaller

predators at more than three times the rate that large carnivores did.

People are biggest danger for bobcats and coyotes

People use modern technologies such as firearms and steel traps to kill small predators at far higher rates than other predators kill small predators. Unlike other predators, humans often target animals in prime condition.

But if people are so dangerous, why would coyotes and bobcats seek refuge near them? Other research shows that smaller predators do indeed fear humans, so they likely still recognise that humans are dangerous.

Most bobcats and coyotes in were either shot or trapped. These technologies allow people to kill animals either when absent or from large distances, possibly making it difficult for animals to accurately gauge risk.

Additionally, lenient hunting

regulations for these small predators put them at high risk.

Conservation in human-dominated landscapes

While the findings may at first seem like bad news for conserving smaller predators, these results have important implications for maintaining balanced ecosystems, where no species is too abundant.

Unbalanced ecosystems, like ones with too many small predators, can face devastating effects. In Australia, for example, overabundant cats and foxes have contributed to the extinctions of about 30 small mammal species.

The results show that larger predators can constrain the behaviour of smaller predators in human-dominated landscapes, which may help to prevent overabundance.

Rewinding ecosystems by using large predators to reestablish missing ecological processes may provide a way to maintain balanced ecosystems.

Berhampur Ring Road hit by land acquisition glitches

NEW PLAN LAUNCHED TO ACQUIRE LAND FROM PRIVATE OWNERS

Chhatrapur, May 21: The construction of the proposed Ring Road in Silk City of Ganjam district has been inordinately delayed even after 10 years of the commencement of work.

Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik laid the foundation stone for the project in 2013 to ease the traffic problem arising out of the burgeoning population in this city. Sources informed Sunday that failure to acquire private land has led to the delay in completion of the project.

The Ring Road will be constructed at a cost of ₹475 crore. Once completed it will ease commuting in the city for residents of Berhampur, Chhatrapur, Gopalpur and Digapahandi Assembly segments. People coming from rural areas will be specially benefited as

they will not have to take long detours to reach their destinations and get caught in the traffic snarls after entering this town.

Moreover, people of the beach tourism site Gopalpur, Rangelunda and Kukudakhandi blocks coming here for work can use the Ring Road. Sources said that it will not only facilitate smooth commuting for the residents but will also lead to financial growth in these areas.

The construction of the Ring Road will also help in making the Haldiapadar bus terminal here operational. The Ring Road will have bypasses from Raghunathpur to Ratanpur and then to Haldiapadar road and from Raghunathpur to Karapalli.

The proposal for construction of the road was moved during the stint of Krishan Kumar, the then District Collector of Ganjam. It had then been decided to construct

the 46-km long Ring Road. Despite the foundation stone being laid, construction from the beginning stuttered due to problems in land acquisition and non-cooperation of National Highway Authority of India (NHAI). Eight years passed and the first phase of work for the Ring Road started only during the stint of former Ganjam Collector Vijay Amruta Kulange in November, 2021.

Meanwhile, efforts have been launched for land acquisition for the project. Authorities have decided to acquire land from the private owners in Gobindpur and Manoharpur mouzas for construction a stretch from Ratanpur to Haldiapadar. The Works department in a letter to the Ganjam Collector has given its permission for acquisition of private land.

According to the letter, 10,552 acres of private land will be acquired in Manoharpur mouza and 4,449 acres in Gobindpur mouza. Funds worth ₹13.92 crore will be spent for acquisition of land. The land acquisition process will be undertaken in the presence of the executive engineer of Ganjam Roads and Buildings Division-1 (R&B). Moreover, the authorities have been directed to make photography of the land acquisition.

When contacted, District Collector Dibyajyoti Parida confirmed the development stating that the land acquisition process has reached its final stage.

The specially coloured notes were seized from Podha's pockets. He was arrested and produced in court Sunday itself. After Podha's bail application was rejected, he was taken to the prison.

Trader arrested for murder bid on wife

Berhampur, May 21: Bada bazaar police personnel in Ganjam district have arrested a man on the charge of trying to murder his wife. Incidentally the wife is an assistant sub-inspector (ASI) of police. The accused has been identified as Ramesh Chandra Sahu, 47, a trader by profession and a resident of Sriramnagar, IIIrd lane in Silk City. His wife Jyotshna Sahu presently works as an ASI at the Palsara police station in the district. Police registered a case and produced the accused in court Sunday.



Ramesh married Jyotshna 20 years back and the two have a 17-year old daughter and a 14-year old son. After marriage, Ramesh frequently used to physically and mentally torture his wife under various pretexts. However, Jyotshna tolerated the physical and mental assaults with the hope that someday Ramesh will mend his ways. That however, did not happen.

Matters took a turn for the worst when Ramesh assaulted his wife and tried to strangle her Saturday night. However, both his children resisted Ramesh and rescued their mom. The kids then dialled up emergency services number following which police arrived at the victim's house and arrested Ramesh. Jyotshna, who was injured in the attack, is currently undergoing treatment at a hospital here.

Rape convict gets 10 yrs RI

Kantabanji, May 21: A man was sentenced to 10 years of rigorous imprisonment after being convicted of raping a physically-challenged woman. The court also slapped a fine of ₹50,000 on the convict identified as Rabi Hans. In case he fails to pay the fine amount, Rabi will have to undergo two more years in prison.

NHRC seeks report on plight of sex workers in Bhubaneswar

Bhubaneswar, May 21: The National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) has directed Odisha Chief Secretary PK Jena and the DGP, to submit a detailed report on the preventive, punitive, reformative and rehabilitation measures taken by the government on the issues related to the plight of sex workers within eight weeks.

Acting on a petition filed by human rights activist Radhakanta Tripathy and a response received from the authorities, the NHRC has passed the order recently. The petitioner pointed out the plight of the girls and women working as sex workers in brothels in Master



Canteen/Mali Sahi and other areas of the Odisha capital. Most of these girls/women are victims of human trafficking, the petitioner said.

Tripathy in his plea also said that during the World Cup hockey tournament, some of the sex workers were rendered homeless by the police without minimum life support.

Even if there is anti-traffic units in police stations those do not work, Tripathy said and added that the police don't take sincere steps to prohibit the recurrence of sex trade.

Tripathy alleged that the Statutory Institution, set up under Immoral Trafficking (Prevention) Act, 1956, is not functional. He pointed out that victims have been deprived of benefits under various social welfare programmes like Anganwadi scheme and integrated child development scheme (ICDS). The Supreme Court judgement about the rights of the sex workers has not been complied with by the state government, Tripathy alleged.

Cash, ornaments stolen from Rayagada temple

Rayagada, May 21: In a shocking incident miscreants looted money and jewellery from a Kali temple close to the superintendent of police's residence here. The incident proves, how criminals are dominant in this town despite the police's claim that they are keeping a watch over the law and order situation.

Police said Sunday that some miscreants broke open the lock of the temple late Saturday night and entered its premises. They then looted all the money in donation boxes and also decamped with the jewellery adorning the idol.

Temple committee president Dillip Pattnayak said, that approximately ₹1,00,000 in cash have been stolen. The value of the gold and silver jewellery that have been taken away will be worth several lakhs, he added.

It should be stated here that three CCTV cameras have been installed at places close to the entrance of the temple. However, none of them were working, police said. It has made their job of identifying the criminals dou-



bly difficult, police added. Even though a probe has been launched police are yet to identify the miscreants and so far no arrests have also been made. Police however, are hopeful of solving the case soon.

Without cold storage, farmers forced to resort to distress sale

Baisinga, May 21: Farmers in Baisinga locality under Betanoti tehsil of Mayurbhanj district are staring at a bleak future as huge quantities of vegetables are rotting on a daily basis, due to lack of a cold storage in the area, sources said. The ongoing heatwave has compounded the problems of the farmers. As a result, farmers have been forced to resort to distress sale of vegetables to recover some portion of their losses.

Sources said that vegetable cultivation is carried out on a large scale on farmlands situated close to Budhabalanga river bank and on

Gangahara river basin. This year farmers have cultivated ridge gourd, brinjal, cucumber, pointed gourd, green chillies and beans.

Farmers of Patalipura, Salagaon, Nakhara, Denfouda, Deopada Dariha, Pratimadeipur, Manatri, Chandanpur and Mangobindpur villages alleged that they have no option, but to sell their produces at dirt cheap rates because of the lack of a cold storage. The ongoing heatwave is destroying the vegetables, they pointed out. They added that if there were cold storage facilities, they could have preserved the vegetables for a long time and even sell those in markets at Cuttack and Bhubaneswar.



Reports said that farmers have been severely hit due to drastic decline in vegetable prices in the markets at Baisinga, Manatri and

Betanoti. As a result they are failing to recover their investments. Currently their only aim is to recover as much money as they can.

The Dahibadi weekly market is held twice a week and farmers have to pay a fee to sell their produce there. The Regulated Market Committee (RMC) at Betanoti and Baisinga panchayat officials collect taxes from over 5,000 farmers. Despite paying fees and taxes, farmers lamented the lack of a proper storage facility.

Farmers have demanded the construction of a cold storage on land belonging to RMC which is about 500 metres away from the Dahibadi vegetable market adjoining National Highway-18

Badasahi MLA Sanatan Bijuli had earlier drawn the attention of the Odisha government on this

issue. In the last session of the Odisha Assembly, Bijuli had brought up the topic of building a cold storage. State Agriculture Minister, Ranendra Pratap Swain had informed Bijuli then that the government did not have any plans for establishment of a cold storage in any of the localities mentioned above. However, he had said that the government will specially allocate funds if a cold storage is established on private initiative.

When contacted, Betanoti's RMC secretary Sadanand Marndi informed that he is aware about the problems of vegetable farmers and very soon he will submit a proposal to the state government in this regard.

the BJP and won in a straight contest. As a result, the Janata Dal (Secular) of former Prime Minister HD Deve Gowda was reduced to irrelevance. The NCP and the AAP, besides the BRS of Telangana Chief Minister K Chandrashekar Rao which supported the Janata Dal (Secular), all failed to harm the electoral prospects of the Congress by dividing the anti-BJP vote. The Congress registered a convincing victory which proved that the regional players could not establish their relevance beyond their state borders.

If anything, this election only proves that regional players cannot take on the BJP at the national level. In several states, the BJP and the Congress are the principal contenders. This comes in sharp contrast to other Opposition parties, like Samajwadi Party in Uttar Pradesh and Trinamool Congress in West Bengal, which, at best, are mere regional players, but not national parties. This victory has helped the Congress to reassert its primacy as the principal challenger to the BJP at the national level.

The results also establish that Rahul Gandhi has finally arrived on the national political scene. Rahul's 4,000 km-long Bharat Jodo Yatra from Kanyakumari to Kashmir did result in an image-makeover for him. He cannot now be taken lightly by his counterparts in the rest of the Opposition. As talks for Opposition unity gain momentum, it will be that much easier for Rahul to stake claim to leadership.

Surely, after these results, the Congress is highly unlikely to concede the leadership to any other leader from among other parties in the Opposition. But, this win in Karnataka, which is astounding by all means, is not enough for the Congress. It has to wrest Madhya Pradesh and retain Chhattisgarh and Rajasthan in the Assembly elections later this year to face the Lok Sabha elections in 2024 with confidence.

him, particularly on power-sharing between the two leaders. Sonia Gandhi is understood to have reached out to DK Shiva Kumar, breaking the ice and persuading him to come on board.

The moot question is whether Siddaramaiah and DK Shiva Kumar will manage to sink their differences and work together as a team, especially in the run up to the crucial Lok Sabha elections in 2024. The experience in the Congress has not been particularly encouraging. Ashok Gehlot and Sachin Pilot in Rajasthan and Bhupesh Baghel and TS Singh Deo in Chhattisgarh pulled in opposite directions. In Madhya Pradesh, differences between Kamal Nath and Jyotiradiya Scindia forced the latter to break ranks with the Congress and join the BJP. So, will it work in Karnataka, is what remains to be seen.

In fact, Siddaramaiah-Shiva Kumar duo makes an ideal team. They complement each other. Siddaramaiah is a mass leader, who united SCs, STs, OBCs and minorities in a caste alliance known as Ahinda in Karnataka. Late former Karnataka Chief Minister D Devaraj Urs is credited with conceiving the Ahinda combination, just as Madhavsinh Solanki is considered the architect of KHAM (Kshatriya, Harijan, Adivasi and Minorities) in Gujarat. Now, Siddaramaiah has

strengthened the Congress hold on the Ahinda. Only the second Karnataka Chief Minister to complete a full term in office from 2013-2018, Siddaramaiah is considered an astute administrator.

Shiva Kumar, on the other hand, is the quintessential organisational man, capable of mobilising resources. After the truce, Shiva Kumar went on to assert that the Five Congress Guarantees were issued under his name and signature and he has a stake in delivering on the commitments made to the people of Karnataka and in ensuring good governance in the state. If they can really pull together, the Congress can face the challenge of the Lok Sabha elections with a greater degree of self-confidence.

For the Congress, this huge electoral victory was badly needed, as the party has lost out major states. The Karnataka victory will help the party to strengthen its own credentials for taking the lead in its efforts for forging Opposition unity. The Congress can now aim to replicate its electoral success in Karnataka at other election-going states like in neighbouring Telangana, besides Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Rajasthan, where Assembly elections are due later this year.

Karnataka election results are significant as the Congress fought

Soon after scoring a spectacular electoral victory in the Karnataka Assembly elections held on May 10, the Congress was plunged into a prolonged political crisis, as both Siddaramaiah and DK Shiva Kumar crossed swords on who should don the mantle of Chief Minister. The Congress high command burnt the midnight oil to bring about a truce between the two warring camps of Siddaramaiah and DK Shiva Kumar. Now, Siddaramaiah and DK Shiva Kumar have come together, as the new Double-Engine Sarkar in Karnataka. The big question, however, is how viable is this new arrangement, so painstakingly worked out by the Congress high command. Will the truce endure at least till the Lok Sabha elections in May, 2024? Pink Isolation

It is disconcerting the way the capital of India, New Delhi, is handling some problems faced by women during their daily public interactions. The message that Delhi is sending out is that women need to be segregated or given a defined 'safe space' to avoid the prying eyes of some perverted men. This is not only turning the clock backward, but is also an attempt to hide the administration's failure to discharge its responsibilities towards providing a safe environment for women. The failure to curb harassment of women in public spaces is a poor reflection on the efficiency of the law enforcing agencies.

Instead of acting more effectively, the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) has decided to take the easy option of proposing to open 'Women Only Pink Parks' where entry of men will be prohibited. All 250 Wards under MCD will soon get these Pink Parks to provide a 'more comfortable space' to women in the national capital.

On the surface, this might look like a pro-women move, but it seems like an act of the government washing its hands off the responsibility of providing 'comfortable space' to women everywhere else. No matter which political party is getting this done. In this case it is not the predictable BJP but the so called liberal Aam Admi Party (AAP) of Kejriwal. Interestingly, this move has the potential to satisfy conservative Hindus as well as radical Moslems who both seem disturbed by women's equal position in society.

The solution to women's safety does not lie in taking away their liberty. Limiting women to isolated safe spaces is in itself an admission that all other spaces are unsafe and that society cannot provide free movement to women without compromising their safety. It is an admission that Indian society has become perverted beyond redemption and women better limit themselves to small spaces like Pink Parks in the company of only other women to feel comfortable.

At a time when the world has condemned the Taliban regime's decision first to segregate parks for women and eventually ban women's entry into parks, Delhi Municipality's Pink Parks decision seems to be going in the similar regressive direction. In the name of providing protection to women, the civic body is harking back the medieval idea that men and women cannot be present together in public places. On the other hand, millions of men and women of the country study in co-ed institutions and share workspaces. There have been numerous cases of women being subjected to harassment and obscenities both in educational institutions and in work sphere. But that does not mean women will have to suffer banishment from studies and work to keep them protected. Instead, those spaces will need to become safer for women by more responsible behavior by men. The seed of segregation never stops. It will eventually lead to compartmentalization and isolation in education, work space and social spaces, forcing women to bear the brunt of the fallout.

The issue of women feeling insecure in public spaces will need to be handled in a more responsible and sustainable manner. In another development, the Delhi Metro Railway Corporation (DMRC) authorities has decided to deploy 100 of its personnel in civilian clothes inside metro trains in a bid to crack down on acts of 'nuisance' and 'obscene activities' inside compartments. Along with DMRC and CISF officials, these police personnel will prosecute offenders on the spot and take further legal action. The decision followed complaints of some cases of nuisance, including masturbation by a depraved man inside the train recently. Another passenger was seen brushing his teeth in a compartment. The two videos went viral on social media prompting the metro railway to take the decision. However, more than obscenity, dancing, singing, taking photographs and making videos or reels in metro trains will henceforth be deemed an offence. A country where police presence or policing is increased to keep a watch on citizens is undoubtedly heading towards an authoritarian regime. Especially who does not know the attitude of the Indian police and its outlook towards women in distress. Also, the behavior of the Army towards women in Manipur and other areas where the Armed Forces Special Powers Act has been in place is public knowledge. It may not be assumed that men in uniform are 'safer' or their presence in large numbers makes women feel 'comfortable' anywhere in India. If at all, it is an objectionable intrusion. All these steps seem to be leading towards a much more regressive and authoritarian society which is governed by laws that take away civil liberties and suppress citizens under the excuse of assurance of safety. Be it under the AAP or BJP rule, these steps do not bode well for the capital city as well as the entire nation.

Since today we have a pretty firm hold on geography and climate, we find it a little strange to learn that the ancient Greeks believed a race of people lived at the northern limits of the world, beyond the place from which the god Boreas sent his icy blasts. They were untouched by old age or conflict or disease, spending their days in song and dance and in worshipping their god Apollo, who came every winter to visit them. Hence hyperborean, from the Greek words hyper, beyond, plus boreas, the north wind. It has been used in English for pretty much the same idea — of a people who live in the extreme north — though without the merrymaking, frolicking or warmth. We know too well that the far north contains no earthly paradise but only ice, snow, gales and bone-freezing temperatures. Hence appearances of the word like this, from D P Thompson (better known for The Green Mountain Boys, about Vermont's struggle for independence), in Gaut Gurdy, 1857: It was the second week in May; and spring, delightful spring, sweet herald of happiness to all the living creatures that have undergone the almost literal imprisonment of one of the long and dreary winters of our hyperborean clime, was beginning to sprinkle the green glories of approaching summer over the reanimated wilderness.

The climate elephants in the room

EVEN IF CHINA AND INDIA ARE NOW TWO OF THE WORLD'S BIGGEST POLLUTERS, THEY BEAR LITTLE RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE PAST, CUMULATIVE EMISSIONS THAT LED TO THE CURRENT CLIMATE CRISIS

Now that the falsehoods and obfuscation of climate denialism have finally been silenced, addressing climate change has become the world's top priority. But time is running out, and the International Monetary Fund warns that any further delays on implementing policies to mitigate global warming will only add to the economic cost of the transition to a low-emissions economy. Worse, we still lack a concrete, pragmatic strategy for tackling the problem. Although economists have made a robust case for why carbon taxes are the best solution, this option has proven politically infeasible, at least in those countries that account for some of the highest emissions (namely, the United States).

Commentators have also stressed that climate change is a shared problem involving important cross-border externalities that must be addressed through a multilateral approach to global coordination. But, as with carbon taxes, this argument has fallen on deaf ears. And, given the current geopolitical climate and the increasing fragmentation of the global economy, there is little hope that the message will get through anytime soon.

Having committed to assisting developing economies as they confront climate change, the World Bank finds itself limited by the

country-based model underlying its financing operations. It is earnestly weighing its options and considering how it could coordinate climate-related financing across borders. But while such efforts are well meaning and consistent with the spirit of multilateralism, they inevitably will delay concrete action. World Bank financing would have to be completely restructured, and coordinating action across multiple countries that have limited financial resources and often conflicting interests seems an impossible task. For example, while some developing economies are rich in fossil fuels, others are starved for energy sources.

Given these limitations, pragmatism dictates focusing on the biggest polluters. Global carbon dioxide emissions are concentrated among only a handful of countries and regions. China, the US, the European Union, Japan, and Russia collectively account for 63% of the total, and none of these top polluters is a low-income country anymore. China, the poorest of the group, represents around 30% of all emissions, making it by far the world's largest current polluter in absolute terms. But its government is taking steps to accelerate the transition to green energy — a winning strategy, given the country's abundance of rare earth metals.

India, the third-largest emitter, currently accounts for approximately 7% of global CO2 emissions, and its size and growth trajectory imply that it could easily surpass China as the leading polluter, barring stronger climate policies. In fact, when it comes to helping developing countries decarbonise, considerable progress could be made simply by targeting India alone. The big advantage of this strategy is that it would avoid the paralysis associated with attempts to adopt a multilateral approach in an increasingly fragmented world.

This does not mean that we should eschew projects aimed at climate mitigation or adaptation in other countries. But we would not need to wait until everyone is on board before doing anything. Those insisting on a multilateral approach should learn from the experience of the ultimate multilateral institution: the World Trade Organization. Its requirement that every single provision in every multilateral agreement gain unanimous support has left it increasingly paralysed, prompting demands for institutional reform.

Of course, India is not low-hanging fruit. It is rich in coal and has little incentive (beyond the health of its citizens) to hasten the transition to green energy. In focusing on India, we would need to employ

the carrot, not the stick. Since the stick generally takes the form of pressure to implement carbon taxation, it is a non-starter. A tax would be ineffective, because it would incite massive domestic opposition (as has been the case in the US). It would also be morally objectionable, because it is unfair to ask a lower-middle-income country to bear the burden of reducing CO2 emissions when rich countries (like the US) have failed to do the same. Moreover, even if China and India are now two of the world's biggest polluters, they bear little responsibility for the past, cumulative emissions that led to the current climate crisis.

That leaves the carrot, which would come in the form of tax incentives or subsidies to support green energy. When paired with other policies, these can ease firms into adapting to higher environmental standards (such as those associated with a cap-and-trade programme). But such policies are expensive, which means that tackling climate change will require richer countries to help finance them. Whether or not India becomes the new China, it is still in our power to ensure that it does not become the new outside polluter.

COVID origin

Sir, A new report on the origins of the COVID-19 pandemic has said circumstantial evidence points that the coronavirus outbreak came from a lab accident at the Wuhan Institute of Virology (WIV) in China. Marco Rubio, US Senator from Florida, released a report stating that "after years of censorship, there is growing evidence that some type of lab accident is responsible for the COVID-19 pandemic." Rubio released the findings of a 17-month probe into the origins of COVID. Beijing's efforts to render imperceptible the exact timing and original cause of the initial outbreak of SARS-CoV-2 are what necessitated this study, the report released by Rubio's office said. The report points to a mountain of circumstantial evidence that the pandemic came from a lab accident in Wuhan. Information detailed in this report, including that derived from official Chinese sources, further indicates that a serious bio containment failure or accident, likely involving a viral pathogen, occurred at the state-run WIV during the second half of 2019 — approximately during the same period of time in which the available epidemiological evidence indicates that SARS-CoV-2 was introduced to the human population in Wuhan, the release read. Beijing has repeatedly dismissed the lab leak theory, but at the same time warned its officials that the risk of laboratory-acquired infections with SARS-CoV-2 was significant, and ordering regulatory reforms to be implemented immediately, the contents of the report read. Pilgrim dies

Katra/Jammu: A 27-year-old woman was killed and 24 people were injured when a Rajasthan-bound bus carrying Mata Vaishno Devi pilgrims overturned in Jammu and Kashmir's Reasi district Sunday, officials said. Three dead

Hisar (Haryana): Three people died after allegedly inhaling toxic gas while cleaning a well in the Saharwa village in this Haryana district, police said Sunday. The victims have been identified as Jaipal, Narendra and Suresh, they said. According to the police, Jaipal entered the well but lost consciousness after allegedly inhaling the toxic gas. Narendra then went inside but did not return either. Suresh and Vikram -- the fourth man hired to clean the well -- then went in to bring Jaipal and Narendra out. However, Suresh also fell unconscious and Vikram immediately came out of the well, they said. Later, the police recovered the bodies of Jaipal, Narendra and Suresh from the well.

Elephants kill man

Seraikela: A 68-year-old man was trampled to death by a herd of wild elephants in Jharkhand's Seraikela-Kharsawan district Sunday, police said. The victim, identified as Lilkant Mahato, went out to relieve himself when the incident happened in Khunti village in Chandil block, they said. He died on the spot, they added. A police team reached the spot on being informed by the villagers and recovered the body.

any form of G20 meetings on disputed territory", Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesman Wang Wenbin told a media briefing in response to a question. "We will not attend such meetings," he added. Islamabad and Beijing have previously made unwarranted references to the Indian Union Territory of Jammu & Kashmir India has previously rejected the statements from Beijing and Islamabad on Jammu & Kashmir. "We have consistently rejected such statements and all parties concerned are well aware of our clear position on these matters. The Union Territory of Jammu & Kashmir are and always will be integral and inalienable parts of



India. No other country has a locus standi to comment on the same," the Ministry of External Affairs has commented before on comments by Pakistan and China. Turkey, Saudi Arabia and Egypt also have not registered for the G20 meeting at Srinagar. It is pertinent to note that as per Indian Union Tourism Secretary Arvind Singh, the registration window to attend the meeting would remain

open till May 22 morning. Turkey has consistently leaned towards Pakistan on the Kashmir dispute. The country has also raised the Kashmir issue at international forums. "A total of 60 international delegates have registered so far for the Third working group meeting to be held from May 22-24," said Union Tourism Secretary Arvind Singh as per reports. "A total of 17 G20 member countries have confirmed their participation till now. Those who have still not registered are China, Turkey and Saudi Arabia. The number of invited countries is nine out of which only Egypt has not registered so far," Singh added. The Group of Twenty (G20) is an inter-governmental forum com-

prising 19 countries - Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, China, France, Germany, India, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, Republic of Korea, Mexico, Russia, Saudi Arabia, South Africa, Turkey, United Kingdom and United States, and the European Union. The G20 meet in Jammu & Kashmir is being billed as the first major international event being hosted in the state after the revocation of special status under Article 370 of the Constitution and the bifurcation of the erstwhile state into the Union Territories of J&K and Ladakh. It was on August 5, 2019, when the Centre had ended the special status of Jammu and Kashmir and restrictions imposed in the region had severely impacted tourism there.

Speeding BMW crushes man to death in Delhi

New Delhi, May 21: A speeding BMW car that was being driven by a woman has crushed a man to death here in west Delhi's Moti Nagar area, an official said Sunday.

The incident took place at around 4 a.m. near Fun Cinema crossing. The speeding BMW car first hit the scooter that was being ridden by the 36-year-old man, then collided with a generator at the roadside, before coming to a halt. Though the police arrested the woman, she was later reportedly released on bail.

The police said that the deceased -- identified as Ajay Gupta, used to run a grocery shop, and the woman is an architect. According to the police, Gupta was on his way home after taking medicines from a hospital while the woman behind the wheels of the BMW was returning to her home in Ashok Vihar after attending a party in Greater Kailash.

A senior police officer said that the police received a call about the incident at around 4.08 a.m. The caller said that a BMW car crushed a scooter rider near Moti Nagar Metro Station and Fun Cinema. A police team that went to the spot found two vehicles in a damaged condition. The police said that neither the driver of the BMW car nor the victim, who was on the scooter, were found there.

A generator was spotted there in a damaged state as it was also hit by the BMW car. Police were told that the victim was taken to a nearby hospital. On reaching there, the police learnt that the driver of the BMW car had taken the man to the hospital. Later, the man was shifted to another hospital where he was declared dead, a police officer said. Soon after the incident, a number of people assembled at the spot and raised slogans against the police and the accused. The police said that initially, they filed a case under Sections 279, 337 of the Indian Penal Code in this regard. Later, Section 304A was also added to the case.

President should inaugurate new Parliament: Rahul

Taking to Twitter, Rahul Gandhi said, "The President should inaugurate the new Parliament House and not the Prime Minister".

Veteran Parliamentarian and former deputy leader of the Congress in Rajya Sabha Anand Sharma and some other opposition leaders were also of the same view "It will not be constitutionally correct for the PM to inaugurate the new building of Parliament. Jury is out whether it was required at all. No major democracy has done this. Westminster is the seat of the



British Parliament and Capitol Hill of the US Congress for hundreds of years," Sharma said on Twitter.

He said Parliament is the custodian and pride of India's Constitutional democracy and its glory must not be undermined as the sovereignty of the people is vested in it. Article 79 of the

- Vice President and Lok Sabha Speaker. PM and leader of Rajya Sabha are seated in Central Hall. The Constitution must be respected in letter and spirit and the President should inaugurate," Sharma said in a series of tweets.

CPI general secretary D Raja also said the prime minister leads the executive organ of the state and Parliament is the legislative organ. "It would have been appropriate for Smt. Droupadi Murmu as Head of the State to inaugurate the new Parliament," he said.

"Obsession with self-image and cameras trumps decency and norms when it comes to Modi Ji," Raja alleged on Twitter. RJD leader Manoj Kumar Jha had earlier said, "Shouldn't the honorable President of India be inaugurating the new 'Sansad Bhavan'? I leave it at that...Jai Hind."

AJMM leader Asaduddin Owaisi too had raised objections to the prime minister inaugurating the new Parliament building. "Why should the PM inaugurate Parliament? He is head of the ex-

ecutive, not legislature. We have a separation of powers and Hon'ble Lok Sabha Speaker and RS Chair could have inaugurated. It's made with public money, why is the PM behaving like his 'friends' have sponsored it from their private funds," Owaisi said on Twitter.

The inauguration of the new Parliament building on May 28 coincides with the birth anniversary of Hindutva ideologue V D Savarkar and several opposition parties have targeted the government over it.

The Congress has called it a "complete insult" to the country's founding fathers. The new Parliament building can comfortably seat 888 members in the Lok Sabha chamber and 300 in the Rajya Sabha chamber, according to the Lok Sabha Secretariat.

In case of a joint sitting of both Houses, a total of 1,280 members can be accommodated in the Lok Sabha chamber. The prime minister laid the foundation stone of the new Parliament building on December 10, 2020. The present Parliament building was completed in 1927.

Massive anti-terrorist operation in Poonch

Poonch/Jammu, May 21: The Army Sunday launched a massive search operation in a forward area in Jammu and Kashmir's border district of Poonch after troops picked up suspicious movement and opened fire, officials said.

No one was injured in the firing by the soldiers on patrolling duty at Kerl in Mendhar sector around 3 am, they said. Though there was no retaliation from the suspected persons, the Army launched a massive search operation in the area and adjoining forests to ensure that there is no presence of terrorists, the officials said.

All roads leading to the besieged vast area were closed and the residents were asked to stay indoors as a precautionary measure, they said, adding the searches were completed in the populated area but no one was arrested.

The nearby Bhata Dhurian witnessed a deadly ambush by terrorists on an Army vehicle on April 20, resulting in the killing of five soldiers and injuries to a major-rank officer. At least six overground workers were arrested for providing shelter to the terrorists. However, the attackers are still at large and efforts are on to neutralise them, with the Army almost conducting daily search operations and area domination patrols, according to officials.

He further said the locals will get direct and indirect benefits from installation of the mobile towers and the area will also get developed.

Chauhan said that 65 remote villages of Varanasi district and adjoining Chandauli, Ghazipur, Mirzapur, Sant Ravidas Nagar, Sonbhadra, Varanasi districts under the Varanasi Business Area will be provided 4G services through 49 new towers and by upgrading seven existing towers.

One step at a time for MP Cong: First, winning state election, then 2024

Bhopal, May 21: The BJP's recent loss in two assembly elections - Himachal Pradesh and Karnataka - has given rise to speculation on whether the Congress can come back to power at the Centre in 2024 like in 2004? As the Congress won these two elections after its leader Rahul Gandhi's "Bharat Jodo Yatra", which covered 14 states and over 3,800 km was over, it was obviously going to create a buzz.

A question gaining momentum is what if the BJP loses the upcoming assembly elections in three Hindi speaking states - Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Rajasthan. Out of these three, the BJP is in power only in Madhya Pradesh, while the Congress is ruling in Chhattisgarh and Rajasthan. Madhya Pradesh based political analysts IANS spoke to were of the view that Karnataka's outcome may not have much impact on the Lok Sabha elections, but it has given the impression that the opposition has strongly planted their feet on the battle ground for the general elections in 2024.

Replying to an IANS query on this subject, former Chief Minister and Madhya Pradesh Congress president Kamal Nath in a statement said currently he was completely focused on the assembly elections due later this year and maintained that the party will form the government with a full majority. However, he stated that the

In Madhya Pradesh the Congress as of now seems in a better position against the ruling BJP, mostly because of the huge anti-incumbency against Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan's government of nearly two decades

The BJP is also striving hard to remain in power, and at the same time, it has also started preparing for the Lok Sabha elections

Congress will win the maximum number of Lok Sabha seats in Madhya Pradesh.

In the Lok Sabha elections in 2019, the BJP had won 28 out of the total 29 seats in Madhya Pradesh. The Congress had managed to save only Chhindwara, where Kamal Nath's son Nakul Nath could win the election. If it is assumed that the Congress can win the maximum Lok Sabha seats in 2024, it would be pertinent to mention that when the last general election was held in 2019, the Congress was in government in Madhya Pradesh, but it could win just one seat.

Political analyst N. K. Singh talking to IANS said that the position of both the national parties, the BJP and the Congress, is getting clearer by the day. The saffron brigade is not just struggling to tackle anti-incumbency but many more issues also, while the Congress seems in a better position.

Divided Muslim vote cause of worry for SP

The Samajwadi Party may face difficulties in upcoming Lok Sabha elections if Muslim votes get divided, as it was the Muslim votes because of which, the SP did well in the 2022 assembly elections

Political experts said: "This time the Muslim votes got divided among parties in the local body elections. Changing the previous election trends of uniting behind a single party against the BJP, Muslims have voted for the people of their choice this time."

"UP's Muslims have voted for Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) and SP on some seats. However, they ignored the Muslim candidates of BSP and SP on some seats and voted for Congress, Independents, Aam Aadmi Party, and All India Majlis-e-Ittehadul Muslimeen (AIMIM)." According to experts, division of votes among Muslim vot-

ers in Moradabad - the strongest bastion of SP - left the SP at the fourth position in mayoral contest. Congress candidate Mohd Rizwan stood at second position, BSP nominee Mohd Yameen remained at third place, while BJP candidate won the seat.

"In Shahjahanpur, the Muslims were divided between Congress and SP. Even in Bareilly, the Muslims were not inclined towards any one

party," the experts said. According to election statistics, this time the BJP has won the seats with majority of Muslim voters. Muslims have shown their faith in the state government. The BJP fielded 395 Muslim candidates in the just-concluded local body elections in UP and more than 70 of them won, according to party leaders.

Political analyst Prasan Pandey said: "One thing that was seen in

the civic elections is that the percentage of votes in some Muslim areas has been low. Apart from this, the division of the Muslim vote became the reason for the defeat of the opposition."

Another analyst Amod Kant said that the fragmentation of Muslim voters in UP has become a major reason for the defeat of the opposition. Like the 2022 assembly elections, the Muslim votes did not come in favour of the SP.

"By voting for BSP, Congress and AIMIM in the local body elections, Muslims have given this message that now Muslim voters are not going to remain tied to a party. They will vote wherever they see a better option," he said.

In such a situation, before the 2024 Lok Sabha elections, the SP will have to chalk out a new strategy to secure its traditional vote-bank along with adding new vote-banks.

Rehan Akhtar, assistant professor of Indian Religious Culture of Aligarh Muslim University, said the way electors have voted is a clear indication that SP should take up the cause and issue of Muslims.



The party and the chief minister will decide which minister is more suited for the government or the party. The exercise will rejuvenate the party and the government and ensure that it is fighting fit for the Lok Sabha elections," said a sen-



ior party functionary.

BJP sources said that by changing responsibilities of ministers and the state leaders, the party wants to keep the ministers and the organisational leaders consistently on toes. The sources said that the party and the state government have been receiving inputs about some of the ministers and organisational leaders not acting promptly in some of the districts.

"The party is analysing the performance of ministers and legislators in their respective constituencies in the recent municipal polls. The entire data will be shared with the Chief Minister and other senior leaders after which a decision will be taken

regarding cabinet reshuffle," the functionary said.

The Yogi Adityanath government's decision to reshuffle his cabinet marks the beginning of the much-anticipated change in the government and party structure ahead of the Lok Sabha polls.

Party sources said that some high-profile ministers who had failed to perform may be shifted to organisational posts in the party and new blood will be inducted in the government.

In view of his own excellent performance, the chief minister is likely to be given greater freedom in choosing which ministers are to be dropped and which one should be promoted.

UP SURPASSES MAHA IN SUGAR PRODUCTION

Lucknow, May 21: Uttar Pradesh has surpassed Maharashtra in sugar production in the current season even as 118 sugar mills operated in UP during the period compared to 210 mills that were operational in the western state.

UP's Cane Development and Sugar Mills' minister Laxmi Narayan Chaudhary told PTI, "UP is ahead of Maharashtra as far as production of sugar is concerned along with a number of other factors." Elaborating further, Chaudhary said, "The total sugar produced by Uttar Pradesh in sugar season 2022-2023 is 107.29 lakh tonnes (which includes 3.05 lakh tonnes of Khandasari (physically extracted sugar from liquid jaggery), as compared to 105.30 lakh tonnes by Maharashtra. The area under cane cultivation in Uttar Pradesh is 28.53 lakh hectare (maximum in India) as compared to 14.87 lakh hectare in Maharashtra." The sugarcane crushing season runs from October to June. "The sugarcane production in UP has been 2,348 lakh

tonnes, while in Maharashtra it was 1,413 lakh tonnes," Chaudhary said. He added that total cane crushed by sugar mills in UP in the 2022-2023 season was 1,084.57 lakh tonnes, whereas it was 1,053 lakh tonnes in Maharashtra.

The UP minister also informed that 19.84 lakh tonnes of sugar was diverted to ethanol in Uttar Pradesh, while in Maharashtra, it was 15.70 lakh tonnes. Pointing towards the number of installed sugar mills in both the states, the UP minister said that as compared to 246 installed sugar mills in Maharashtra, there are 157 installed sugar mills in UP.

Nirupur village becomes hub for production of famous Shahi Litchi

Ballia (UP), May 21: Farmers in a dusty village of Ballia district in eastern UP are pioneering the art of growing the famous Shahi (Royal) Litchis and expanding the horizons by taking the succulent fruit to other markets in the country.

Raja Shankar Tiwari, who retired from the Railway Protection Force, is one of the farmers who is about to bring Nirupur village into the limelight by producing the high quality litchi fruit.

Tiwari, was one of the pioneers of Litchi farming in Nirupur, told PTI that in 2013, after his retirement, he started litchi plantation after reading somewhere that a tree gives an output of Rs 90 lakhs in its entire life.

"After retirement, I went to Muzaffarpur and learned about litchi horticulture at Litchi Research Center and planted 230 royal (Shahi) litchi trees and 200 mango trees in two hectares of land in Dopahi Mouja of our village," said Tiwari.

Over the years some other vil-



lagers in Nirupur and nearby villages followed suit and dedicated themselves to grow litchi in the area, which is traditionally not known for the fruit.

The decade-long efforts resulted in high litchi yield. "Eight tonnes of litchi is expected to be produced this year on our farm," said Tiwari.

Besides the high litchi production, the farms also provide jobs to villagers and are a source of an alternate income. For almost six months during the fruiting and harvesting season, villagers are

hired as workers. Tiwari says that over 30 villagers work at his farm and over Rs 1.5 lakh is spent every month as their salaries.

Munnan of Pindari village, neighboring the Nirupur village, is associated with this work for the last several years. Munnan said due to rising litchi cultivation in the area he easily gets a job as a worker and earns up to Rs 10,000 a month.

Tiwari said earlier, litchi and mango produced in the village were sold in the local market only

Nirupur village located 13 kilometers from the district headquarters, has become a hub for the production of the famous Shahi Litchis

Due to this the profit was less. "In the last three years we have started selling litchi in markets outside the state.

Talking about the problem they face, the farmers said that lack of long distance transport facilities in Ballia is affecting their business. Besides Litchi, the farmers of the area also grow mangoes of Langra, Dussehri and Chausa variety.

District Magistrate Ravindra Kumar said that farmers of Nirupur like Tiwari are taking the horticulture sector of the district forward.

Buoyed by K'taka win, Congress calls crucial meet

New Delhi, May 21: After a stunning victory in Karnataka, the focus of Congress leadership has shifted to the next round of assembly elections where the party is locked in a direct contest with the BJP in some states.

While Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh are two states ruled by the Congress where it is hoping to offset the anti-incumbency factor and factional fighting by replicating the 'Karnataka strategy', the party is also determined to make a comeback in Madhya Pradesh where it lost power after Jyotiraditya Scindia and some of the MLAs switched loyalties, sources said.

The Congress is not leaving any stone unturned to continue its winning spree, after wresting Himachal Pradesh and Karnataka from the BJP, as the party hopes to consolidate its gains

The party is in a direct contest with the BJP in Chhattisgarh, Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh, even though there is a triangular fight in Telangana among the Congress, the BJP and the ruling BRS

Mallikarjun Kharge has called a meeting of its leaders from Telangana, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh on May 24 to strategise on the upcoming assembly elections. Kharge will hold separate meetings with the state leaders. A senior leader said the idea is to chalk out an early strategy to reach out to the grassroots level. "The Bharat Jodo Yatra, which passed through states like Telangana, Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan, will benefit the party as the cadres are already ac-

tivated and the party will get the benefit of the Yatra, as it did in Karnataka," a senior leader involved with one of the states said.

Another leader said the good schemes and works initiated by the Congress governments in Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh will be highlighted in a big way and the poll strategy adopted by the party leadership in Karnataka will be replicated in these poll-bound states.

The Congress faces peculiar challenges in several of these states, especially due to infighting and

factionalism. In Rajasthan, the Congress has to tackle the festering feud between Sachin Pilot and Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot.

Upping the ante, Pilot has threatened to launch an agitation if his demands were not met by May end. Concluding his five-day Jan Sangarsh Yatra in Jaipur during which he targeted the Gehlot government on the issue of corruption, Pilot had recently placed three demands - disbanding the Rajasthan Public Service Commission (RPSC) and its reorganisation, compensation to youths

affected by the government exam paper leak and conducting a high-level inquiry into corruption allegations against the previous Vasundhara Raje government.

There is an also open fight between Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel and state minister T S SinghDeo, who has been staking claim to the top post in the state. In Telangana too, its state unit chief Revanath Reddy faces infighting from state leaders who consider him an outsider.

In Karnataka, the party gave five guarantees to the people of the state and the politics of freebies seems to have worked in its favour. The party is likely to carry this freebie policy forward in other poll-bound states after its success in Himachal Pradesh and Karnataka. Another senior leader said the party needs to start now and present a united face against the BJP, as has been done in Himachal, Karnataka and some other states, where the state leaders were projected.

Wankhede quizzed for more than 5 hrs

Mumbai, May 21: Former Mumbai NCB chief Sameer Wankhede was questioned for more than five hours on the second day in a row Sunday by CBI probing the alleged Rs 25 crore bribe demand from actor Shah Rukh Khan for not implicating his son Aryan in the Cordelia cruise 'drug bust' case, an official said.

Wankhede, an Indian Revenue Service (IRS) officer, reached the Central Bureau of Investigation's (CBI) office in the Bandra-Kurla Complex at around 10.30 am, he said. While entering the office, Wankhede told reporters he has "faith in the judiciary".

He was allowed a lunch break during questioning, the official said, adding Wankhede left the CBI office for the day at around 4.30 pm. Wankhede didn't respond to queries from media persons waiting outside the CBI office but only said, "Satyamev Jayate" (truth only triumphs).

On Saturday also, the CBI questioned Wankhede for more than five hours. After he left the CBI office at around 4.30 pm on Saturday, Wankhede along with his family members visited the Siddhivinayak temple at Prabhadevi in Mumbai.

The central agency booked Wankhede and four others on May 11 for alleged criminal conspiracy and threat of extortion, besides provisions pertaining to bribery under the Prevention of Corruption Act on a complaint by the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB).

On Friday, Wankhede got a relief from the Bombay High Court which directed the CBI not to take any "coercive action", such as arrest, against him till May 22. Seeking quashing of the FIR, Wankhede alleged before the HC that the "draft complaint" in the 2021 drugs-on-cruise case named Aryan Khan as an accused, but it was later replaced and Aryan's name was dropped. Aryan Khan was arrested by the NCB on October 3, 2021, following the alleged drug seizure on board the Cordelia cruise ship here. He was granted bail by the high court three weeks later as the anti-drugs agency failed to substantiate its charges against him.

Srinagar, May 21: An operative of the Pakistan-based Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) terror outfit, who was allegedly passing secret information about the movement of security forces in Jammu and Kashmir, has been arrested, an NIA official said Sunday.

The arrest of Mohd Ubaid Malik of north Kashmir's Kupwara came amid a crackdown against conspiracies being hatched by terrorist organisations based across the border to destabilise India through terrorist attacks in Jammu and Kashmir, a spokesperson of the federal agency said.

"Malik was in constant touch with a Pakistan-based JeM commander. Investigations have revealed that he was passing on secret

information, especially regarding the movement of troops and security forces, to the Pakistan-based commander," the spokesperson said.

The official said various incriminating documents showing his involvement in the furtherance of terror activities were recovered from his possession at the time of his arrest. The National Investigation Agency registered the terror conspiracy case suo motu on June 21 last year to unearth the conspiracies hatched by cadres and underground workers of various terrorist organisations on the directions of their commanders based in Pakistan, the spokesperson said.

"It involves collection and distribution of huge consignments of narcotics, cash, weapons, improvised explosive devices (IEDs), including remote control-operated sticky/magnetic bombs," the official said. The spokesperson said IEDs and explosives are often delivered from across the border using drones and are also being assembled locally in order to execute terrorist attacks in Jammu and Kashmir.

"The attacks are mainly targeted at minorities and security forces personnel," the official said. The NIA said such conspiracies are being hatched both physically and in cyberspace with the overarching aim of disturbing peace and communal harmony, engaging in terrorist acts, and waging a war against the Government of India.

9 K'TAKA MINISTERS HAVE CRIMINAL CASES: REPORT

New Delhi, May 21: Nine ministers, who have taken oath in Karnataka, have criminal cases against them and all are crorepatas, according to the report of the Karnataka Election Watch and Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR).

The report is based on the analysis of the self-sworn affidavits of nine out of 10 Ministers, including Siddaramaiah, the new Chief Minister of Karnataka.

The report said that it could not analyse K.J. George's case due to the unavailability of his clear and complete affidavits on the ECI website at the time of making this report. The report said, "Out of the nine ministers analysed, all nine ministers have declared criminal cases against themselves, while four ministers have declared serious criminal cases against them.

Highlighting the financial background of the nine ministers, the



report said that all the nine ministers in Karnataka are crorepatas. It said, "The average assets of nine ministers analysed is Rs 229.27 crore."

The report further said that Karnataka's sole Deputy Chief Minister D.K. Shivakumar is the richest as he declared total assets worth Rs 1,413.80 crore, while Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge's son Priyank Kharge is the minister with the lowest declared total assets. Priyank, who is an MLA from Chittapur (SC) constituency, has declared assets worth

Rs 16.83 crore.

The report also pointed out that all nine ministers have declared their liabilities. Out of these the one with the highest liabilities is D.K. Shivakumar, MLA from the Kanakapura constituency with Rs 265.06 crore. Highlighting the Ministers' education, the report said, "Three Ministers have declared their educational qualification to be between 8th pass and 12th pass, while six Ministers have declared having an educational qualification of graduate and above."

But Iqbal Singh Atwal (BJP) not only slipped to the fourth place, he lost his deposit as well. A candidate must get 1/6th of total valid votes polled to save deposit. 10 killed in Mexico car race shooting
Mexico City: At least ten people were killed and nine others injured in an armed attack targeting a group of amateur rally drivers in a car race in the Mexican state of Baja California, local media reported. A group of armed individuals got out of a vehicle and opened fire at the car race participants who were parked on the side of a highway in Ensenada, Baja California Saturday, said the Milenio newspaper citing local authorities.

Cholera outbreak claims 10 more lives
Johannesburg: The provincial health department in the South African province of Gauteng Sunday announced 19 new cases of Cholera in Hammanskraal, including 10 deaths. South Africa reported its first cholera death in February, after the virus arrived in the country from Malawi. It was unclear how many cholera cases there was nationally as of Sunday, but the most populous province of Gauteng, has been hardest hit.

Six border guards killed by 'terrorists'
Tehran: Six Iranian border guards were killed in armed clashes with members of a "terrorist" group in Saravan County in southeastern Sistan and Baluchistan province, Iran's semi-official Tasnim news agency reported Sunday. According to Tasnim, five border guards were killed by the "terrorists" at the scene, and another succumbed to his wounds at the hospital.

3 dead in shooting at Kansas City bar
Washington: Three people were killed in a shooting at a bar in Kansas City in the US state of Missouri early Sunday, local media reported, citing police sources. Two of the victims were killed at the scene, and a third victim died later at a hospital, said Kansas City police, Xinhua news agency reported.

UK Home Secy under pressure
London: UK Home Secretary Suella Braverman is under pressure as it was claimed in a media report Sunday that she attempted to dodge a driving fine after being caught speeding outside London when she was Attorney General of the country last year. 'The Sunday Times' reported that the Indian-origin Cabinet minister asked civil servants to help her avoid a speeding fine and points on her driving licence by arranging a private one-to-one driving awareness course.

Alberta wildfire fighters hope rain, cooling bring relief



Canada, May 21: Alberta authorities hope cooler temperatures and showers forecast for the coming week will help firefighters battling blazes in the oil-rich Canadian province, although storms could complicate efforts.

Amid hot, dry conditions, forecasters were tracking a front likely to move into the province on Sunday that should bring much-needed relief, including humidity and even rain, Christie Tucker, information unit manager at Alberta Wildfire, said at a Saturday briefing.

"What we'd like to see is a long-steady rain that will soak into the forest and into the ground," Tucker said. Alberta is enduring energy production cuts, home evacuations and poor air quality after an intense start to the wildfire season. This year, Alberta Wildfire responded to 496 wildfires burning more than 842,000 hectares, compared with just 459 hectares in 2022.

Authorities have closed some parks and campgrounds in Alberta over the Victoria Day weekend. The holiday weekend, when residents traditionally go camping or enjoy other outdoor activities, usually sees an uptick in seasonal wildfires, some of which are accidentally caused by people.

G7 ends with Ukraine in focus

Zelenskyy drew a parallel between the destruction of Bakhmut and the horror of Hiroshima, evoking the symbolism of mass destruction as he wrapped up a surprise appearance at the Group of Seven (G7) summit in Japan

Hiroshima, May 21: Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy huddled with some of his biggest backers in Hiroshima Sunday, building momentum for his country's war effort even as Russia claimed a symbolic victory on the battlefield. The Ukrainian leader's in-person appearance in his trademark olive drab during the final day of the Group of Seven summit underscored the centrality of the war for the bloc of rich democracies.

It also stole much of the limelight from other priorities, including security challenges in Asia and outreach to the developing world, that the leaders focused on at the three-day gathering. Zelenskyy held two major rounds of meetings Sunday, one with G7 leaders and a second with them and a host of invited guests including India, South Korea and Brazil. He also held one-on-one talks with several of the leaders.

US President Joe Biden announced a new military aid package worth USD 375 million for Ukraine during his meeting with Zelenskyy, saying the US would

provide ammunition and armoured vehicles.

That fresh pledge came days after the US agreed to allow training on American-made F-16 fighter jets, laying the groundwork for their eventual transfer to Ukraine.

Hanging over Sunday's talks was the claim by Russia's Defence Ministry that forces of the Wagner private army, backed by Russian troops, had seized the Ukrainian city of Bakhmut.

The eight-month battle for the eastern city — seen by both sides as a major symbolic prize — has been the longest and likely the bloodiest of the war.

Asked if Bakhmut was still in Ukraine's hands, Zelenskyy said he thought that Russian forces had

finally taken the city in a siege that "destroyed everything."

"For today, Bakhmut is only in our hearts. There is nothing in this place," Zelenskyy said, adding that the fight had left nothing in Bakhmut but a lot of "dead Russians."

While Ukraine was the overwhelming focus of the summit, the leaders of Japan, the United States, the United Kingdom, France, Germany, Canada and Italy, as well as the European Union, also aimed to address global worries over climate change, AI, poverty, economic instability and nuclear proliferation.

Biden also aimed to reassure world leaders that the US would not default because of the debt limit

Modi arrives in Papua New Guinea on key visit

Port Moresby, May 21: Prime Minister Narendra Modi Sunday received a warm welcome as he arrived in Papua New Guinea on his maiden visit during which he will host a key summit Monday between India and 14 Pacific island countries to boost bilateral ties.

The Prime Minister arrived here from Japan where he attended the summit of the G7 advanced economies and held bilateral meetings with several world leaders.

Modi's visit to Papua New Guinea on the second leg of his three-nation tour is the first ever by any Indian prime minister. He was received at the airport by Prime Minister James Marape who touched his feet as a mark of respect.

"Reached Papua New Guinea. I am thankful to PM James Marape for coming to the airport and welcoming me. This is a very special gesture which I will always re-

member. I look forward to boosting India's ties with this great nation during my visit," Modi tweeted.

Normally Papua New Guinea doesn't give a ceremonial welcome to any leader coming after sunset. But a special exception was made for Prime Minister Modi and a ceremonial welcome was accorded to him. Modi shared some pictures of the ceremonial welcome on his twitter handle, describing it as "a very special welcome." On Monday, Modi and Marape will host the third summit of the Forum for India-Pacific Islands Cooperation (FIPIIC). The summit will take place at a time when China is making efforts to enhance its military and diplomatic influence in the region.

"I am grateful that all 14 Pacific Island Countries (PIC) have accepted the invitation to attend this important summit (FIPIIC)," Modi had said earlier.

FIPIIC was launched during his visit to Fiji in 2014.

The FIPIIC Summit will see participation from leaders of 14 countries. Normally all of them rarely converge together due to connectivity and other issues, sources said. PIC includes Cook Islands, Fiji, Kiribati, the Republic of Marshall Islands, Micronesia, Nauru, Niue, Palau, Papua New Guinea, Samoa, Solomon Islands, Tonga, Tuvalu and Vanuatu. Modi will also hold bilateral talks with Marape and meet Bob Dadae, the Governor General of Papua New Guinea.

Ukraine denies fall of Bakhmut to Russia

The loss of Bakhmut would be hugely symbolic for the Ukrainians, who had held on for months, ignoring US advice behind the scenes to focus elsewhere

Kyiv, May 21: Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said Sunday that Russian forces weren't occupying Bakhmut, casting doubt on Moscow's insistence that the eastern Ukrainian city had fallen. Responding to a reporter's ques-

tion about the status of the city at the Group of Seven summit in Japan, Zelenskyy said: "Bakhmut is not occupied by the Russian Federation as of today."

"We are not throwing people (away) to die," Zelenskyy said in Ukrainian through an interpreter. "People are the treasure. I clearly

understand what is happening in Bakhmut. I cannot share with you the technical details of what is happening with our warriors."

"The fight for the city of Bakhmut is continuing," the Ukrainian military's general staff said in a statement on Sunday evening. The fog of war made it impossible to confirm the situation on the ground in the invasion's longest battle, and a series of comments from Ukrainian and Russian officials added confusion to the matter.

Zelenskyy's response in English to a question earlier at the summit about the status of Bakhmut suggested that he believed the city had fallen to Russian forces, and he offered solemn words about its fate. When asked if the city was in Ukraine's hands, Zelenskyy said: "I think no, but you have to — to understand that there is nothing, They've destroyed everything. There are no buildings. It's a pity. It's tragedy." "But, for today, Bakhmut is only in our hearts."

Greeks head to polls with voters worried about cost of living

Athens, May 21: Greeks were voting Sunday in the first election since their country's economy ceased to be subject to strict supervision and control by international lenders who had provided bailout funds during its nearly decade-long financial crisis.

Greek officials have pledged fast results — about 90% of the precincts should have reported by 10 pm local (1900 GMT), three hours after the voting ends, Dimitris Bakakos, general manager of IT services firm Singular Logic, which is tasked with presenting the results, said in

a television interview, adding that, by 8:30 pm, there should be enough data to predict the result within half a percentage point.

The vote pitches conservative Prime Minister Kyriakos Mitsotakis, 55, a Harvard-educated former banking executive, against 48-year-old Alexis Tsipras, who heads the left-wing Syriza party and served as prime minister during some of the financial crisis' most turbulent years, as the two main contenders.

Mitsotakis has repeatedly stressed that he needs a second term to build on what he says he accomplished during the first. He

pressed the same line when he talked to media after casting his vote.

"Today, we vote for our future, for higher wages, for more and better jobs. We vote for a more effective public health system, for a fairer society, for a stronger country, which plays an important role in Europe, with protected borders."

Tsipras, unsurprisingly, painted a bleaker picture of the present government's record and emphasized the need for change.

Although Mitsotakis has been steadily ahead in opinion polls, a newly introduced electoral system of proportional representation makes it unlikely that whoever wins the election will be able to garner enough seats in Greece's 300-member parliament to form a government without seeking coalition partners. The winner of Sunday's election will have three

days to negotiate a coalition with other parties.

If that fails, the mandate to form a government passes to the second party and the process is repeated; in case of failure the third-

place party also gets a chance. But deep divisions between the two main parties and four smaller ones expected to enter parliament mean a coalition will be hard to come by, making a second election likely

probably July 2.

The second election would be held under a new electoral law which makes it easier for a winning party to form a government by giving it a bonus of up to 50 seats in parliament, calculated on a sliding scale depending on the percentage of votes won.

A total of 32 parties are running, although opinion polls have indicated only six have a realistic chance of meeting the 3% threshold to gain seats in parliament.

Greece's once-dominant socialist Pasok party is likely to be at the center of any coalition talks. AAI back on profitable runway

Airports Authority of India reports ₹3,400 crore profit in 2022-23 fiscal

New Delhi, May 21: Airports Authority of India (AAI) is back in the black, raking in a profit of ₹3,400 crore in the fiscal ended March as surging domestic air traffic boosted its financial performance, according to a source.

AAI has reported a profit for the first time after the coronavirus pandemic that had significantly impacted air traffic and the aviation sector as a whole.

In the financial years - 2021-22 and 2020-21 - AAI had reported a loss.

While the loss was ₹803.72 crore in the fiscal ended March 2022, the same stood at ₹3,176.12 crore in the financial year ended March 2021.

These figures excluded exceptional and extraordinary items and tax. The source in the know told PTT that AAI has recorded a profit of ₹3,400 crore for the 2022-23 financial year.

This is a provisional figure and the final figure will be known after the audit of the financial results.

The source also said the good performance was mainly due to



the high growth in domestic air traffic.

In 2022, domestic air passenger traffic surged 47.05 per cent to 12.32 crore compared to 8.38 crore in the year-ago period.

Further, the passenger numbers soared 51.70 per cent to 3.75 crore in the first three months of this year as against 2.47 crore in the same period a year ago, as per official data.

In 2021-22, AAI had a meager profit of ₹8.76 crore, including exceptional items and tax.

Meanwhile, in the fiscal ended March 2022, the government had waived compulsory dividend payment requirement. AAI had requested the waiver in lieu of waiving Air India's that was done prior to the sale of the loss-making carrier by the government to the Tata Group in January 2022.

Pink slips to nearly 2L techies in '23 to date

As more and more Big Tech companies continue to axe employees, they listed various reasons behind the move -- over-hiring, uncertain global macroeconomic conditions, strong tailwinds from the Covid-19 pandemic and the list goes on

New Delhi, May 21: The year 2023 has become the worst year for tech employees as nearly 2 lakh tech employees -- from Big Tech firms to startups -- have been sacked to date globally, as companies like Meta, BT, Vodafone and many others announced further plans to lay off more employees in coming months.

As per the data by layoffs tracking site Layoffs.fyi, 695 tech companies have shown the doors to around 1.98 lakh employees so far this year.

In comparison, 1,046 tech companies laid off more than 1.61 lakh employees in 2022.

In January alone this year, close to 1 lakh tech employees lost jobs

globally, dominated by companies like Amazon, Microsoft, Google, Salesforce and others.

In total, about 3.6 lakh tech employees have now lost their jobs in 2022 and till May this year.

Meta (formerly Facebook) is reportedly going to start laying off

more employees next week in its third round of job cuts.

While the exact number has not been confirmed, it is expected that the company will lay off approximately 6,000 employees in this round.

Amazon India laid off around

400-500 employees from its Cloud division AWS as well as People Experience and Technology Solutions (PXT) or HR and support verticals this month.

Fintech unicorn Zepz is laying off 420 employees, or 26 per cent of its workforce.

The UK telecommunication giant BT Group has announced plans to slash a massive 55,000 jobs by the end of the decade.

Global telecom carrier Vodafone said it plans to reduce 11,000 jobs over the next three years, with an aim to "simplify" both headquarters and local markets.

Meanwhile, Microsoft will not give any raise to salaried employees, including senior leaders, this year as global macroeconomic conditions continue to haunt Big Tech.

PSBs cross ₹1L-cr profit mark

PUBLIC SECTOR BANKS IS A TURNAROUND STORY FROM RECORD LOSSES TO RECORD PROFIT ON THE BACK OF HIGHER INTEREST INCOME AND IMPROVEMENT IN MANAGEMENT OF BAD LOANS

New Delhi, May 21: Public sector banks' cumulative profit crossed the ₹1 lakh crore-mark in the financial year ended March 2023, with market leader State Bank of India (SBI) accounting for nearly half of the total earnings.

These 12 Public Sector Banks (PSBs) witnessed 57 per cent increase in total profit compared to ₹66,539.98 crore earned in 2021-22.

In percentage terms Pune-based Bank of Maharashtra (BoM) had the highest net profit growth with 126 per cent to ₹2,602 crore, followed by UCO with 100 per cent rise to ₹1,862 crore and Bank of Baroda with 94 per cent increase to ₹14,110 crore.

However, in absolute term, SBI has reported an annual profit of ₹50,232 crore in 2022-23, showing an increase of 59 per cent over the preceding financial year.

Except for the Punjab National Bank (PNB), other PSBs have reported impressive annual increases in their profit after tax. Delhi-headquarter PNB posted a 27 per cent decline in annual net profit from ₹3,457 crore in 2021-22 to ₹2,507 crore in the year ended March 2023.

The PSBs which reported an annual profit in excess of ₹10,000 crore are Bank of Baroda (Rs 14,110 crore) and Canara Bank (Rs 10,604 crore).

Other lenders like Punjab and Sind Bank posted an annual profit growth 26 per cent (Rs 1,313 crore), Central Bank of India 51 per cent (Rs 1,582 crore), Indian Overseas Bank 23 per cent (Rs 2,099 crore), Bank of India 18 per cent (Rs 4,023 crore), Indian Bank 34 per cent (Rs 5,282 crore) and Union Bank of India 61 per cent (Rs 8,433 crore).

PSB is a turnaround story from



record losses to record profit. The doom-to-bloom story of the public sector banking industry can be attributed to the initiatives and spate of reforms undertaken by the government led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, along with former finance minister Arun Jaitley and financial services secretary Rajiv Kumar and his successors.

The government has implemented a comprehensive 4R strategy: Recognising NPAs transparently, Resolution and recovery, Recapitalising PSBs, and Reforms in the financial ecosystem.

As part of the strategy, the government infused an unprecedented ₹3,10,997 crore to recapitalise PSBs during the last five financial years -- from 2016-17 to 2020-21. The recapitalisation programme provided much-needed support to the PSBs and prevented the possibility of any default on their part.

Mcap of 6 of top 10 firms erodes

New Delhi: Six of the 10 most valued firms faced a combined erosion of ₹70,486.95 crore in their market valuation last week, with Reliance Industries and Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) taking the biggest hit following a weak trend in equities. While Reliance Industries, TCS, HDFC Bank, ITC, State Bank of India and HDFC were the laggards from the top 10 pack, ICICI Bank, Hindustan Unilever, Infosys and Bharti Airtel were the gainers. Reliance Industries continued to rule the top 10 most valued firms chart, followed by TCS, HDFC Bank, ICICI Bank, Hindustan Unilever, Infosys, ITC, State Bank of India, HDFC and Bharti Airtel.

SBI's procurement from GeM drags

New Delhi: India's largest lender SBI was quite slow in procuring goods and services from government-owned GeM portal in 2022-23 and lagged behind smaller counterparts, including Canara Bank and Punjab National Bank, according to the government data. Canara Bank emerged as the largest buyer among the state-owned lenders in 2022-23, making total purchases of ₹592.82 crore from the portal, the data showed. Punjab National Bank (₹164.57 crore) was the second largest, followed by Indian Overseas Bank (₹159.82 crore), State Bank of India (₹158.22 crore), Indian Bank (₹111.59 crore), Bank of India (₹63.81 crore), Bank of Baroda (₹48.63 crore), Union Bank of India (₹37.03 crore), Bank of Maharashtra (₹10.26 crore), Punjab and Sind Bank (Rs 9.98 crore), UCO Bank (₹5.30 crore) and Central Bank of India (₹4.54 crore) in 2022-23.

Discoms' dues down by a third

New Delhi: The total outstanding dues of electricity distribution utilities (discoms) has reduced by a third to around ₹93,000 crore in May, in less than year of implementing the Late Payment Surcharge (LPS) Rules in June 2022. The burgeoning dues of discoms toward power generation (gencos) mainly and transmission (trancos) firms have been affecting the entire value chain of the sector till last year. According to industry data, in June last year, discoms' dues were at ₹1.39 lakh crore at the time of the launch of the Late Payment Surcharge (LPS) scheme. The total outstanding dues now stand at around ₹93,000 crore as per the portal PRAAPTI (Payment Ratification And Analysis in Power procurement for Bringing Transparency in Invoicing of generators).

EXCHANGES OF ₹2,000 NOTES

No form, ID proof required: SBI

New Delhi, May 21: No form or requisition slip is required for exchange of ₹2,000 notes up to a limit of ₹20,000 at a time as part of exercise to withdraw high-value currency notes from circulation.

RBI Friday in a surprise move announced withdrawal of ₹2,000 currency notes from circulation but gave public time till September 30 to either deposit such notes in accounts or exchange them at banks. Unlike the November 2016 shock of demonetisation, when old ₹500 and ₹1,000 notes were invalidated overnight, the ₹2,000 notes will continue to be a legal tender.

In a communication to chief general manager of all its local head offices, State Bank of India (SBI) informed that the facility of exchange of ₹2,000 notes by public up to a limit of ₹20,000 at a time will be allowed without obtaining any requisition slip.

With regard to deposit of such notes in own account, RBI has not specified any limit but it will be subject to compliance with extant Know Your Customer (KYC) norms and other applicable statutory requirements.

"Further, no identity proof is required to be submitted by the tenderer at the time of exchange," the communication dated May 20 said.

It has asked its local head offices to arrange and extend all co-operation to the public so that the exercise is conducted in a smooth and seamless manner without any inconvenience.

According to sources, one can stand any number of times in queue for exchange of ₹2,000 notes.

Although the facility for exchange is available from May 23, many customers were seen visiting their branches with the ₹2,000 notes Saturday.

Bank officials returned such customers after advising them about the start date for exchange.

Some of the customers used cash deposit machines Saturday to deposit ₹2,000 notes in their accounts.

Many have tried jewellery shops to buy gold and other precious metals. However, jewellers are also hesitant in accepting ₹2,000 notes and asking for KYC beyond prescribed cash purchase in many parts of the country.

According to the Confederation of All India Traders (CAIT), withdrawal of ₹2,000 notes by the Reserve Bank of India will not affect the trade of the small traders but will certainly hit the big and affluent class which might have stocked ₹2,000 notes in large quantities. CAIT does not anticipate any disturbance in trade activity due to this move.

FPIs bring in ₹30,945cr in May

New Delhi, May 21: Foreign investors have put in ₹30,945 crore in the Indian equities in May so far, driven by strong macroeconomic fundamentals, prospect of reducing interest rates, positive earnings outlook and falling valuations of stocks.

With this, net inflows by Foreign Portfolio Investors (FPIs) reached ₹16,365 crore in 2023 so far, data available with the depositories showed.

According to data from the depositories, FPIs invested a net sum of ₹30,945 crore in Indian equities

during May 2-May 19.

This came following a net infusion of ₹11,630 crore in equities in April and ₹7,936 crore in March. Moreover, in the first two months of the year, FPIs pulled out over ₹34,000 crore.

Apart from equities, FPIs have invested ₹1,057 crore in the debt market so far in May.

In terms of sectors, FPIs have been consistent buyers in a host of sectors such as autos and auto components, capital goods, FMCG, health care, telecom, realty and oil & gas. They were big buyers in financials as they invested ₹8,382 crore during the period under review.

El Nino on the way, could erode \$3trn of world economy

El Nino, the band of warm ocean water that spans from South America to Asia triggering far-reaching weather changes, has persistently reduced country-level economic growth, attributing \$4.1 trillion and \$5.7 trillion in global income losses to the 1982-83 and 1997-98 events, respectively

New Delhi, May 21: El Nino is on the horizon, which can lead to severe heat waves and droughts in many countries, including India, and could take a \$3 trillion toll on the global economy, new research published in the journal Science has warned.

The 2023 El Nino is predicted to come at a time when sea-surface temperatures are at an all-time high, according to the research. "The last major El Nino occurred in 2016 and made that year the hottest in recorded history. Global warming has only intensified in the seven years since. In addition, the

world is coming out of an extended La Nina and the two phases can strengthen each other," the researchers wrote.

The US National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration projects the chances of El Nino setting in by late summer as higher

than 80 per cent.

"The deck is potentially stacked for a really big El Nino. Our results suggest that there will likely be a major economic toll that depresses economic growth in tropical countries for potentially up to a decade," said Christopher Callahan, a doctoral candidate at Dartmouth College in the US.

The result could be trillions of dollars in productivity lost globally relative to a world without this El Nino.

Justin Mankin, an assistant professor of geography, and Callahan project that global economic losses for the 21st century will amount to \$84 trillion as cli-

mate change potentially amplifies the frequency and strength of El Nino -- even if current pledges by world leaders to reduce carbon emissions come to fruition.

The researchers estimate that the El Nino predicted for 2023 alone could hold the global economy back by as much as \$3 trillion by 2029.

The findings, Mankin said, highlight a critical and understudied factor shaping the economic toll of global warming -- year-to-year variations in climate conditions.

In the years it strikes, El Nino results in devastating floods, crop-killing droughts, plummeting fish populations, and an uptick in tropical diseases.

Six short-sellers in Adani stocks under ED, Sebi scanner

New Delhi, May 21: Six entities including four foreign portfolio investors (FPIs) are under lens for suspicious trading in Adani group shares prior to the release of the damning Hindenburg report, the Supreme Court-appointed expert committee has said.

There was a buildup of short positions in the Adani scrips prior to the January 24 release of the Hindenburg report, and substantial profits were booked thereafter as stocks crashed, the 178-page report said.

A "short" position is generally the sale of a stock one does not own. Investors who sell short believe the price of the stock will decrease in value. If the price drops, they can buy the stock at the lower price and make a profit.

Hindenburg's report claimed that the Adani empire was the "biggest con in corporate history" engaged in a "brazen stock manipulation and accounting fraud scheme".

The report did not name any of the six. "The trading pattern here is suspicious because of the buildup of short positions by these entities in the Adani scrips prior to the Hindenburg report, and substantial profits earned by them by squaring off their short positions after publication of the Hindenburg report on January 24, 2023," the expert committee said. A detailed investigation is being carried out in respect of the trading of the six entities.

12 dead in stampede at football stadium

San Salvador (El Salvador): At least 12 people were killed and dozens more injured when stampeding soccer fans pushed through one of the access gates at a quarterfinal match in the Salvadoran league here Saturday. The National Civil police said in a preliminary report via Twitter that 12 dead were confirmed at the match between clubs Alianza and FAS at Monumental stadium in Cuscatlan, which is about 25 miles (41 kilometers) northeast of the capital. At least two of the injured transported to hospitals were in critical condition, the police said.

Good show by Indian paddlers

Durban: India veteran Sharath Kamal made a winning start at the World Table Tennis Championships here Sunday. The 56th ranked Indian defeated World No. 170 David Serdaroglu of Austria 11-8, 9-11, 11-9, 11-6, 11-6 to advance to the round of 64. G Sathiyani also made a winning start beating England's Tom Jarvis 4-3 (11-9, 11-8, 7-11, 11-2, 15-13, 13-11, 11-6) in a men's singles contest. However, Manush Shah and Harmeet Desai lost their opening matches. In mixed doubles the Indian pair of Manika Batra and Gnanasekaran advanced to the round of 32 defeating Xia Lian Ni and Luka Mladenovic of Luxembourg 9-11, 11-8, 14-16, 11-7, 11-6.

3 golfers qualify for final stage in Florida

West Palm Beach (Florida): Three of the four Indian women, including Aditi Ashok, made the cut at the Aramco Team Series Florida golf tournament here Saturday. Making the final stage of the three-round event are Aditi (75-76) and Diksha Dagar (73-79) at T-39, while Amandeep Drall (79-73) was T-50. However, Vani Kapoor (78-79) missed the cut. Aditi had a mixed day on the course with two birdies and four bogeys. Diksha, on the other hand had six bogeys and no birdies.

Eves salvage a draw

Adelaide: Deep Grace Ekka converted a penalty corner to help the Indian women's hockey team rally and play out a 1-1 draw in their third tour game against Australia here Sunday. Deep scored in the 42nd minute after the hosts took the lead through a goal by Maddison Brooks (25th). However, despite the draw, the Australians won the three-game series 2-0 having emerged victorious in the first two matches. Incidentally Sunday's game was the 250th one for skipper Savita.

Gold for Parul

Mumbai: Indian distance runner Parul Chaudhary gave another glimpse of her superb form in the run-up to the Asian Games by winning the 3000m steeplechase title Saturday in the 'Track Night' meet at New York. Parul clocked nine minutes 41.88 seconds to take first place in the Icahn Stadium, which hosted the bronze-level event which is part of the World Athletics Continental Tour. American competitor Madeline Strandemo finished second in 10:02.48 seconds with her compatriot Meredith Rizzo taking third place in 10:08.52 seconds.

Barca stunned

Barcelona: New La Liga champions Barcelona tumbled to a 1-2 defeat to Real Sociedad here Saturday before receiving their trophy at a packed Camp Nou. Mikel Merino and Alexander Sorloth struck for the visitors, who defended their hold on fourth place, restoring a five-point gap on Villarreal, fifth, in the fight for Champions League qualification. "Anyone will feel great to have a season like this, but I'm not thinking that far that I will get selected to Indian team," said Rinku after the game against Lucknow Super Giants here Saturday which KKR lost by a single run.

The 25-year-old Rinku, struck a 33-ball unbeaten 67, his fourth half century this season, and nearly pulled off another thrilling win against LSG. Rinku finished with the top run-getter for KKR with 474 runs at an average of 59.25 and 149-plus strike rate.

From getting used to the chants of 'Rinku, Rinku' in the packed Eden Gardens' galleries to receiving adulation from all quarters, his life has changed for good in

span of just two months.

But Rinku prefers to go back to drawing board and follow the same routine. "I will just continue my same routine - practice and gym - after returning home. Names will keep on coming, I will just do my job," the UP cricketer said.

"Everyone at home is really happy. Last year people came to know about me for my cameos. But after hitting those five sixes, I'm getting a lot of respect. Many people now know me. I'm happy but not overjoyed, after all we couldn't make it (play-offs)," rued the left-handed batter.

Needing to hit three sixes from last three deliveries to win against LSG, it was a Gujarat Titans like situation. "I was completely relaxed, and thought we would see whatever happens. Yes, the thoughts of hitting five sixes in a row (against Gujarat Titans) did come to my mind. I just missed one ball (to hit a six) and it turned out to be a four," he lamented.

"We defeated Thailand in the Kings Cup on their turf without him, and held Qatar away in a fantastic game during the 2022 World Cup qualifiers. We also held Oman 1-1 without Sunil," he added.

Rybakina rules Italian Open courts

Rome, May 21: Elena Rybakina is discovering that her big serve and heavy groundstrokes can do damage on clay courts, too. The Wimbledon champion was dominating 21-9 with winners when Ukrainian opponent Anhelina Kalinina retired due to a left thigh injury early in the second set of the rain-delayed Italian Open women's final Saturday.

"I can play good on all the surfaces," Rybakina said after the match. "It's just maybe for clay I need to be ready more physically and maybe have a lot of preparation," she added.

It's been quite a year for Rybakina, who reached the final of the Australian Open, also won an elite title in Indian Wells and was the runner-up in Miami.

"I'm proud that I can maintain this level," Rybakina stated. "I can see improvements on the court, physically also. However, I think there is still a lot of room to improve," she added.

Rybakina will move up to a career-high No. 4 when the rankings will be announced Monday and will be a contender at the French Open, which starts next weekend.

"She's serving 200 kph (125 mph). She's also making winners like no one on tour," Kalinina said. "Anyone can win in Paris, but she has good chances. I am sure if she's going to do like this, maybe new World No. 1 for sure."

Rybakina was leading 6-4, 1-0, 15-0 when Kalinina called for a trainer and grasped her left leg. She then decided she couldn't continue. "I'm really sorry that I couldn't play," Kalinina said during the awards ceremony as the crowd — which had waited under the rain for hours before the night session started — whistled.

In the men's final Holger Rune will face Daniil Medvedev. The 20-

year-old Rune rallied past Casper Ruud 6-7 (2-7), 6-4, 6-2 and Medvedev performed a little celebratory dance after beating Stefanos Tsitsipas 7-5, 7-5 in a semifinal that was suspended twice in the first set for a total of nearly 4½ hours due to rain.

The 47th-ranked Kalinina was playing in the biggest final of her career, and has been dedicating her performances to her war-torn country.

Kalinina's family home was destroyed in a Russian attack last year. Also, her elderly grandparents have had to relocate from the southern city of Nova Kakhovka — which is held by Russian forces — to Kyiv.

Man City celebrate title triumph

Arsenal's shocking loss enables defending champs to canter to their 5th victory in six years

London, May 21: Manchester City who became Premier League champions Sunday itself after Arsenal lost to Nottingham Forest, celebrated their title win Monday with a 1-0 victory over Chelsea. The all-important goal of the game was scored by Julian Alvarez in the 12th minute of the game. It was City's 12 successive win in all competitions.

City won the Premier League for the fifth time in six seasons after second-placed Arsenal lost 0-1 at Nottingham Forest, Saturday. A second consecutive defeat for the Gunners left Mikel Arteta's men still four points adrift of Man City with one game left for them to play. It means that even if Arsenal win the game, they will not be able to catch up with City.

Meanwhile Manchester United and Newcastle are on the brink of qualifying for next season's Champions League after Liverpool's

1-1 draw against Aston Villa. United's 1-0 victory at Bournemouth, combined with Liverpool's failure to beat Villa, left Erik ten Hag's men and Newcastle within touching distance of ensuring Premier League top four spots. Fourth-placed Man U and Newcastle, in third, are both three points clear of fifth-placed Liverpool,

who have only one game left.

Taiwo Awoniyi's winning goal against Arsenal also had huge ramifications at the bottom of the table as Forest are now safe from relegation in their first season back in the top flight for 23 years.

City's title triumph could be the start of a treble as Pep Guardiola's

men face Manchester United in the FA Cup final and Inter Milan in the Champions League final next month.

Arsenal pushed the defending champions most of the way but crumbled in the decisive final months of the season. They have won just two of their last eight games to allow City to canter over the line with three games to spare.

The visitors rarely even looked like scoring as a raucous atmosphere at the City Ground roared Forest onto survival. Arteta's decision to name an experimental back four without any recognised full-backs backfired inside the first 20 minutes.

Morgan Gibbs-White has been central to Forest's recovery after winning just one of their opening 11 league games. The England under-21 international created the only goal as he teed up Awoniyi to dink home his fifth goal in three games over Aaron Ramsdale.

Murray skips French Open, to focus on Wimbledon

New Delhi, May 21: Former World No. 1 British Andy Murray has withdrawn from the French Open in order to ramp up his preparations for the grass court season in the build-up to Wimbledon, which starts July 3. The former French Open finalist's name has now been removed from the entry list on the Roland Garros website, 'Eurosport' reported.

Earlier, clarifying his thinking on Roland Garros, Murray had said he was hoping to play in the year's second Grand Slam. "I would like to play, just purely because I don't know if I'll get another opportunity to play there again. Whilst I feel fit and healthy, I would like to give it a go," Murray had said.

The three-time Grand Slam winner's best showing at the event was his 2016 defeat to Novak Djokovic in the final.

The Brit, who was bidding to

revive his career after major hip surgery in 2018, entered clay court tournaments this season at Monte Carlo, Madrid and the Italian Open in preparation for a potential run at the French, but suffered first-round defeats at all three events. He did beat Tommy Paul in the final of the ATP Challenger event in Aix-en-Provence early May to secure his first title at any level since 2019. However, it was followed with a heavy defeat against Stan Wawrinka at the Bordeaux Challenger event.

Murray is the latest big name to pull out of the clay court major; following Rafael Nadal and Nick Kyrgios. The French Open, the second Grand Slam of the year, takes place from 28 May to 11 June while Wimbledon starts July 3. It will give Murray sufficient time to prepare for the event.

"Obviously Wimbledon has a different feeling as far as I am concerned. So I would like to give the event my full focus," Murray said.
