Bargarh, May 23: A longstanding dispute over property between two families took a gory turn, with a man killing his nephew and the latter's family members at Jhikijhiki village under Bhatli police limits in Bargarh district, an official said, Tuesday.

The incident took place late Monday night when accused Shiba Bag, 58, barged into the house of his nephew Gurudev Bag, 45, and killed the family of four with a crowbar, the official pointed out.

Police recovered the bodies of Gurudev, his wife Sibagri, 40, and their son Chudamari, 15, and daughter Sravani, 10, Bargarh sub-divisional police officer (SDPO) Amrit Kumar Panda said.

The bodies have been sent for postters hospital (DHH) here," the SDPO pointed out.



Kathmandu, May 23: Veteran Sherpa guide Kami Rita scaled Mount Everest for the 28th time Tuesday beating his own record less than a week after setting it, as two guides compete with each other for the title of most climbs of the world's highest peak.

Kami Rita, considered one of the greatest mountain guides, reached the 29,032-foot summit at 9:20 am local time Tuesday, according to expedition organiser Seven Summits Treks.

His latest climb comes a day after fellow Sherpa guide Pasang Dawa matched his record of 27

trips to the summit. The race for the title began with Pasang Dawa climbing the peak for the 26th time May 14, equalling Kami Rita's previous record. Kami Rita went on to the peak three days later for the 27th time. With a few more days left

in the spring climbing season, both Sherpa guides were

on the mountain helping their clients up the snowy peak. May is the busiest month to make the dangerous climb since it has the best weather conditions.

Kami Rita first summitted Everest in 1994 and has been making the trip nearly every year since. He is one of many Sherpa guides whose expertise and skills are vital to the safety and success each year of foreign climbers who seek to stand on top of the mountain.

His father was among the first Sherpa guides.







Smart classrooms soon in 6,974 state schools

Bhubaneswar, May 23: After its ambitious transformation of high schools, the Odisha government has now initiated steps to set up smart classrooms in 6,974 elementary and secondary schools of the state

According to sources, the School and Mass Education department has decided to set up 13,948 smart classrooms in these 6.974 elementary and secondary schools.

For this, the Odisha Computer Application Centre (OCAC) has invited tenders from central and state public sector undertakings (PSUs) for implementation of smart classrooms, including installation of interactive flat panels and content storage and distribution software in the schools. The selected PSU will supply, install, commission, operate & maintain the smart classrooms for a period of three years. Each school will have at least

Man nabbed for duping his ex-employer

Bhubaneswar, May 23: Commissionerate Police Tuesday arrested a man for allegedly duping his former employer of more than ₹3 lakh.

The 30-year-old accused identified as Rama Krushna Panda is a resident of Khulada under Bhanjanagar police station in Ganjam district.Panda was arrested after a case(181/23) was registered on the basis of a complaint lodged by Sanjit Kumar Mohanty, who had alleged that the former was working in his construction firm a few months back. The accused had allegedly taken ₹3 lakh from him as loan on different pretexts. When Mohanty asked Panda to return the money, the latter startetd avoiding him and also left the job after a few months. The accused asked Mohnaty January 7to meet him at a place in Saheed Nagar area.

Accordingly, Mohanty reached the spot and told Panda to pay back the money. The accused told Mohanty that he would repay the amount which has been kept with someone. Panda later took the complainant's scooter to bring the money. However, he did not come back despite the lapse of more than four hours and went incommuncado.

Mohanty finally sought the help of Saheed Nagar police after four months May 11, 2023. On a tip-off, the police conducted a raid and arrested the accused from his native place. The accused was Tuesday produced before the court that sent him to judicial custody.

Bhubaneswar, May 23: In the Civil Services Exam results announced by Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) Tuesday, over 20 aspirants from Odisha have secured top all India ranks. Orissa POST talks with some of these rank holders to learn about their motivations and preparation strategies

Anup Das, who got AIR 38, says that there is no substitute to hard work. However, with hard work, the aspirants need to do smart work as well.

Anup is already serving in Indian Revenue Service (IRS) and is posted in the Income Tax department, Delhi. It is for the second time that he has cracked the civil services.

"I had first cracked the UPSC Civil Services in 2020 and again appeared after a gap of three years. There have been a lot of changes and the aspirants need to prepare keeping in mind the current scenario, competition as UPSC is also evolving and they make the exam competitive," said Das.

Similarly, Soumyanjan Dash, who got rank 136, cracked the exam in second attempt. Dash graduated from IIT Kanpur in electrical engineering and was working as software development engineer and achieved this rank in his second attempt.

Dash says he resigned last year from his job to focus fully in exam and got this result in return. He says, "I had no professional coaching support. But once I got the idea, it became easy. A lot of content is available online and the aspirants can get some idea on how to attempt the UPSC. I watched toppers' interviews and got some

ideas and it also gave me confidence. I also identified the resources and gave multiple tests to analyse myself.

Another aspirant from Odisha, Pranita Dash, who got rank 42 and is happy that things turned out to be the way she wished, says, "One needs to understand that this is a long journey and two years of hard work is needed. I am also studying in Cambridge and appeared for the exams in between.

Taking coaching and preparing for mocks and interviews helped her to crack the UPSC exam, said Dash. Dash, who is pursuing her MPhil from Cambridge University, had completed her graduation from St Xavier's in Kolkata.

"In the last one year, I did smart work more than hard work. What to read and what not, everything is available on the internet. However, I focused on practice and revision and all credit goes to my uncle, who is a justice at Orissa High Court. He inspired me to join the government sector and serve the society. My family also supported me throughout," said Dash.

Unlike others, Tejaswini Behera, who got AIR 516, says there is scope for improvement and she will make another attempt.

"The scenario is such that a lot of students prepare for the civil services. After post-graduation, I augmented my preparations. I am hoping to get revenue service, but whatever service is given, I will give my 100 per cent," said Behera.

Ganja ban at Shiva shrines evokes mixed reactions

Bhubaneswar, May 23: The state government's notification banning ganja or marijuana at Shiva temples across the state Tuesday evoked mixed reactions.

Opposing the decision, Congress MLA Suresh Routray said, "Bhang



government should instead check the large-scale supply and consumption of alcohol and ganja and other intoxicants. Gania and bhang are used in very small quantities at the temples as a ritual necessity and the government should not act against the custom. Besides, both bhang and ganja have medicinal value too," he added. Editor of Orissa POST and Dharitri Tathagata Satpathy said, "Every

Odia knows it well that ganja is used as 'prasad' at

the notification.'

"Not only ganja, the government should also ban liquor in the state, especially near the temples. Bol Bam devotees during Kawariya yatra are consuming ganja openly. The devotees plead that Lord Shiva consumes ganja and so do we. This is totally wrong," said Aparna Nayak, a member of Milita Odisha Nisha Nirabana Abhijan.

Welcoming the move, Padma Shri Baba Balia said. "We have written a

"Ganja or marijuana can in no form be used in any Shiva temple in the state," the government informed the district enforcement authorities.

"Like the practice of animal sacrifice was banned at Bhagabati Temple in Banapur in Khurda, and subsequently it was banned in most of the temples, the restriction will be imposed on the use of ganja in all Shiva temples across Odisha," Culture Minister Ashwini Patra said

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Puri RTO fines bus sans permit



Cuttack. May 23: Appalled by the irresponsible behaviour of a bus owner, a Twitter user from Puri had recently shared details of a bus via Twitter DM to State Transport Authority alleging that the bus (0R 09 R 1810) was plying without a permit.

Taking swift action, transport commissioner Amitabh Thakur had asked the Regional Transport Office (RTO), Puri, to probe the matter.

Puri RTO, on probing the issue, found that the bus was actually plying without permit. Moreover, the conductor did not have a valid licence. The RTO has issued a challan of ₹20.500 to the bus owner under the amended Motor Vehicles Act.

As per the challan, the bus owner was fined for plying vehicle without permit (Rs 10,000), conductor having no/expired license (Rs 10,000), and a general offence challan (Rs 500). "As under the 5T initiative, citizen centric grievance redressal is given utmost importance, STA diligently looks into all grievances received and ensures strict action is taken against vehicle owners for flouting MV rules,' said an agency official.

Bhubaneswar, May 23: On the occasion of World Turtle Day, Tuesday, Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik said continuous conservation efforts, unflinching dedication of volunteers and awareness campaigns have made the Odisha coast a favourite rookery for Olive Ridley turtles.

Taking to social media, the Chief Minister said, "On World Turtle Day, let's all pledge to welcome them & create a safe nesting cove for the endangered species."

Odisha has a 480-km coastline and is a well known mass nesting site for Olive Ridley turtles in India. Gahirmatha, Devi rivermouth and Rushikulya are the three mass nesting

sites recorded in the state. About 6.37 lakh Olive Ridley sea turtles have arrived at Rushikulya coast this year for mass nesting, setting a new record for the beach in Odisha's Ganjam district. The aquatic species also arrive at Kendrapara's Gahirmatha beach – world's largest known rookery.

The state government has taken steps to reduce plastic pollution in and around Gahirmatha beach as plastic bags and other items can be fatal for turtles.

Olive Ridleys dig holes on the beach with their front flippers for hours. Subsequently, they use their hind flippers to scoop out sand to create a cavity. They lay dozens of eggs at one go and cover them again with sand. Before sunrise, the turtles return to the sea, leaving behind the eggs, which would hatch after 40-60 days. The hatchlings are expected to emerge from the eggs in April and May.

Despite all the measures, human activities such as fishing, exploitation of nesting beaches for ports and tourism pose major threat to these aquatic reptiles.

Forest department staffers have recently rescued 119 turtles from a person who was found smuggling them from Kalahandi district to Raighar in Nabarangpur district. The accused, Raiesh Das, was arrested by the Forest department sleuths.

Young climate activist Soumya Ranjan Biswal, who works for Olive Ridley safety, said, "Despite restrictions imposed on fishing and boating activities in nesting sites, many boats can be seen in these areas which needs to be stopped completely."

ore than 840 million people worldwide will suffer back pain by 2050, largely due to population increase and the ageing people, according to a modelling study published in the Lancet Rheumatology journal.

The researchers analysed over 30 years of data to show that the landscape of back pain cases is set to shift, with the biggest increases in cases to be in Asia and Africa. The continued lack of a consistent approach on back pain treat-

ment and limited treatment options have researchers concerned that this will lead to a healthcare crisis, as low back pain is the leading cause of disability in the world, they said.

"Our analysis paints a picture of growing low back pain cases glob-

ally, putting enormous pressure on our healthcare system," said study lead author, Professor Manuela Ferreira from the University of Sydney in Australia. "We need to establish a national

consistent approach to managing low back pain that is informed by research," Ferreira said in a statement. The study found that since 2017,

the number of low back pain cases has ticked over to more than half a billion people. In 2020, there were approximately 619 million cases of back pain.

At least one third of the disability burden associated with backpain was attributable to occupational factors, smoking and being overweight. A widespread misconception is that low back pain mostly affects

The study analysed Global However, researchers said this Burden of Disease (GBD) data from study has confirmed that low back 1990 to 2020 from over 204 countries and territories to map the pain is more common among landscape of back pain cases Low back pain cases were also over time.

The GBD is the most comprehensive picture of mortality and disability across countries, time, and age.

"Health systems need to respond to this enormous and rising burden of low back pain that is affecting people globally," said Professor Anthony Woolf, co-chair of the Global Alliance for Musculoskeletal Health which is calling for priority to be given to addressing the growing burden of musculoskeletal conditions.

"Much more needs to be done to prevent low back pain and ensure timely access to care, as there are effective ways of helping people in pain," Woolf said.

In 2018, experts voiced their concerns in The Lancet journal and gave recommendations, especially regarding exercise and education, about the need for a change in global policy on the best way to

prevent and manage low back pain to stop the rise of inappropriate treatments

However, since then, there has been little change. Common treatments recommended for low back pain have been found to have unknown effectiveness or to be ineffective - this includes some surgeries and opioids, the researchers said.

Ferreira said there is a lack of consistency in how health professionals manage back pain cases and how the healthcare system needs to adapt.

"It may come as a surprise to some that current clinical guidelines for back pain treatment and management do not provide specific recommendations for older people," the researcher added.

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Tsunami management remains a non-starter in Kendrapara

Rapid decline in mangrove covers increasing chances of natural calamity

Kendrapara, May 23: A massive tsunami with waves up to 30 metres (100 feet) in height had devastated areas along the coast of Indonesia as well as localities in Tamil Nadu, Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Kerala, Pondicherry and Andhra Pradesh in December, 2004. The calamity is still etched in memory. It was a rude wake-up call for many states in India. The Odisha State Disaster Management Authority (OSDMA) then identified 64 villages in coastal Mahakalpara and Rajnagar blocks of this district as tsunami prone.

However, till date, other than mock drills related to evacuation in cyclone shelters, nothing concrete has been done for protection of people in these villages. The state government mooted a proposal for creation of mangrove forests along the coastline to protect the villages but it is yet to be implemented. As

a result the residents of these 64 villages are always panic-stricken and live under the perpetual fear of floods and cyclonic storms

Local intelligentsia Ganesh Chandra Samal, Rabindra Kumar Dash and Ashis Kumar Senapati informed that during 'Cyclone Yaas' tidal waves flooded three kilometers into the mainland. They said that if a tsunami occurs then it will wreak havoc in the coastal villages. The tsunami can only be checked to some extent if mangrove forests are extensively grown on the coastline.

A three-member team of scientists from the National Institute of Oceanography at Goa visited Kendrapara district to survey the availability of infrastructure on the coastlines in 2006. They visited Bhitarkanika National Park and later took stock of the mangrove forests which stood as a wall protecting the mainland from cyclonic storms and ingress of tidal waves.

They termed the development 'satisfactory' but asserted that more mangrove forest cover is needed for protection against tsunamis. They recommended to the Odisha government and the Centre to increase the mangrove cover for protection of residents living on the Kendrapara coastline.

Notably, mangrove trees can act like a sentinel against hurricanegenerated or tsunami waves. Their roots intertwine to form a dense thicket above water that breaks waves and helps blunt the force. Since then 17 years have passed

but the tsunami management in this district has not taken off at all in the 64 villages. Locals alleged that the mangrove cover has not been increased at all. On the other hand, they said that the mangrove cover on the coastline is rapidly declining due to erosion. They stated that five revenue villages in Satabhaya panchayat have vanished from the map due to rapid sea erosion. Approximately 571 villagers from these villages have been rehabilitated at Bagapatia in 2018. Moreover, the mushrooming of prawn gheries is also destroying

the coastlines and its green cover. When contacted, ADM Basant Kumar Rout said that the district administration is laying more stress on creation of mangrove cover while a geo-synthetic wall has been built on Pentha coast to protect the coastline from sea erosion. This apart, awareness programmes are being undertaken in tsunamiprone villages to sensitise the residents, he added.

Foot patrolling to increase in Similipal

Baripada, May 23: Forest department officials have been asked to step up foot patrolling in Similipal Wildlife Sanctuary in Mayurbhanj district after the killing of a guard by poachers Monday. They have been warned of salary cuts if they are found neglecting their duty, sources said Tuesday

The matter came to the fore after Prakash Chand Gogineni, field director and regional chief conservator of forests of Similipal Tiger Reserve issued a direction in this regard.

The notification assumes significance as there has been a sharp rise in poaching incidents inside the sanctuary leading to deaths of a large number of elephants and



other animals. Poachers and the timber mafia are also felling precious trees and smuggling those to other parts of the country.

The clampdown on Forest official comes amid allegations of shirking work. It has been alleged that many personnel are simply

spending time in office and not going out for patrolling citing bad road conditions. Then there are some officials who just patrol 15-17kms a week on foot. All these issues have made life of the poachers that much more easier.

As per the new order, a forest

guard has to cover a distance of 100 to 120km per month on foot for patrolling. Similarly, foresters have to cover 70km, range officers 50km and ACFs 30km on foot per month. Anyone found violating the order would face disciplinary action, the notification said.

Sources said that those who violate the norms will be issued showcauses for the first offence. If they repeat the fault, salaries may be deducted or will completely be stopped.

Two separate apps have been developed to monitor foot patrolling by the Forest department staff. The apps will clearly display patrolling on foot and in vehicles. The assistant conservator of forests (ACFs) will be monitoring the movement of those entrusted with the responsibility of patrolling.

Keonjhar, May 23: Places in this district have turned into a mango hub. However, farmers and residents of this district rarely manage to savour the luxury of this delicious fruit. Most of the varieties of mangoes cultivated are transported to different places outside this district for sale. And in most cases farmers fail to reap the benefits of mango cultivation as they have to sale the fruit at cheap rates. It is the visiting traders who make the maximum profit from mangoes.

The Agriculture department provides high-yielding varieties of mango saplings, but absence of proper marketing facilities and storage units time and again force farmers to resort to distress sale of the fruit. At times, farmers even lease out mango orchards to traders for two to four years because of the amount they get at one go. However, the end result is that the traders make double or at times triple the amount they spend for the lease. Sources said that mango is culti-



vated on large tracts of land in Telkoi, Sadar, Harichandanpur, Ghatagaon, Banshapal and Jhumpura blocks of the district as both the climate and soil are conducive. They added that mango cultivation is being done over 100 acres of land in this district. Among the varieties of mangoes produced are 'Baiganpalei', 'Khirsagar', 'Himsagar', 'Amrapalli', 'Langra' and 'Neelam'. However, most of the produces are sent to places like Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata, Varanasi and a host of other Indian cities. They are also available in markets at Cuttack, Bhubaneswar and Rourkela, but the price range is auite high.

Sabitri Nayak, a woman farmer of Golabandha area under Telkoi block said there is no machinery to pluck the mangoes and store them. Then there is also the fear of elephant attacks as they love the fruit. Hence, they have no option but to sale the mangoes to traders from outside the district at throwaway prices.

Farmer Murali Nayak pointed out that lack of godowns and cold storage units leads to quick rotting of mangoes. So they auction the mango trees

they have trying to make a quick buck. Senior resident Fakir Charan Mishra informed that the government should implement a proper marketing procedure so that mango farmers benefit from it.

Others alleged that the district administration, except for holding mango fairs, has failed to do anything better for the farmers. Others pointed out that despite Keonjhar district turning into a mango hub, most residents cannot afford the fruit as the price range is very high.

When contacted, ORMAS executive Swapan Goswami said six groups have been formed in Telkoi block with each consisting of 40 farmers for the formation of a company. Arrangements for sale of mangoes at a particular place have also been made in the district.

Goswami added that efforts are on for organising mango fairs at Bhubaneswar and Rourkela under the supervision of ORMAS. He asserted that famers will soon get the right price for the mangoes.

Fate of Imran Khan

onflict between Pakistan's former Prime Minister Imran Khan and the army, which has come to a head after more than a year of trou-['] bled relations, has once again brought to the fore the inherent instability of the country's political system propped by the armed forces. Pakistan is often termed as a failed state because of the peculiar relationship between the army and its civilian leaders since its inception. Its generals have always interfered with running of the government. The political leaders therefore have shown a tendency to depend on the army's backing for their own survival. It is certainly not a sign of healthy democracy that none of Pakistan's 31 Prime Ministers so far have been able to complete a full five-year term. It is an unwritten law in the country that politicians will continue to rule as long as they enjoy the support of the army.

Imran Khan, who during his tenure as PM was criticized for turning authoritarian, tried to go against the all-powerful army and had to pay the consequences by losing power. However, the economic mess in the country has once again given him the opportunity to raise his head. He seems to be the only democratic political leader that Pakistan currently has. His ability to remain neutral and vet be diplomatically friendly with both Russia and China on one hand and the Western bloc on the other was proven when Russia invaded Ukraine in February 2022. His sports background and a semi flamboyant lifestyle helped him gain acceptability internationally. Whatever bad will was created towards Imran was after he became a clear supporter of radical Islamists in his desire to retain power.

However, his popularity seems to have not only returned but also increased remarkably in recent times in Pakistan. This seems to have sent the alarm bells ringing both in the army establishment and the ruling coalition. To keep Khan out of reckoning, the government charged him with corruption and terrorism leading to his custody earlier this month. He is currently facing 120 charges across the country for which he fears he could be arrested any time, even though he has been granted interim bail from the Supreme Court.

Recent developments suggest Pakistan's military leadership is going full throttle to sideline Khan and his Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) party from politics. Khan blamed Pakistan Army chief Asim Munir for ordering his arrest by paramilitary forces. As the army was being discredited in public perception, in self defence, it issued a statement vowing to use the Pakistan Army Act to prosecute protesters who attacked military facilities after Khan's arrest. The 1952 law involves the use of military trials, mainly to prosecute military officers. An amendment in 2015 gave the military powers to prosecute civilians too. The civilian leaders endorsed the army statement apparently because the Supreme Court had recently ordered Khan's release and rejected an earlier government decision to delay two provincial elections. Army leaders seem determined to stop the due process of law fearing the judiciary may be too lenient towards Khan. Hence, they are now set to use their powers to corner Khan and his followers.

At this stage reports have emerged that Khan has been asked to either go to London in exile or face trial under the Army Act. The offer is said to have come from 'powerful elements'. Khan himself alleged in a series of tweets that the country's military establishment wants to imprison him for the next 10 years under sedition charges. It also plans to put his wife, Bushra Begum, behind bars in order to humiliate him, he has alleged. He said the army was using the pretext of violence committed by his supporters while he was in prison. He even suggested he might meet the fate of Mujibur Rahman of the erstwhile East Pakistan, who was not allowed to rule the country in 1971 by the army with the help of Z A Bhutto after his party Awami League secured a majority.

Sensing serious trouble ahead, Khan has started to adopt a conciliatory tone towards the army stating that he had no problems with the army general. He claims his political opponents are trying to drive a wedge between him and the army to ensure they win the coming elections.

Pakistan seems to be heading towards another period of chaos that is likely again to help the army consolidate its position as the de facto ruler of the country. This does not augur well for the country.



Post-Holocaust in Nazi Germany, a UN-led Partition Plan for Palestine was adopted by the General Assembly. The Arab League rejected the plan, but the Jewish Agency for Palestine accepted it. On May 14, 1948, the State of Israel was proclaimed. As a reaction, a coalition of five Arab states declared war against the new state, but was eventually defeated by Israel in 1949. Before the war. between 200.000 and 300.000 Palestinians had already left or were forced out from Palestine and during the fighting, a further 300,000 to 400,000 others were displaced. The overall figure is estimated to be around 700.000.

During the war, more than 400 Arab villages were destroyed. While human rights violations were committed on both sides, the massacre of Deir Yassin -- a village on the road between Tel Aviv and Jerusalem -- is particularly engraved in Palestinian memory to this day. At least 100 people were killed, including women and children. It triggered widespread fear among Palestinians and prompted many to flee their homes. By the end of the war, Israel held around 40% of the area initially earmarked

Then Palestinian leader Yasser Arafat coined the term Naqba Day in 1998. He set the date as the official day for the commemoration of the loss of the Palestinian homeland. Most of the Palestinians ended

Until today, only a fraction of the next-generation Palestinians have applied for or received other citizenships. As a result, the vast majority of the currently around 6.2 million Palestinians in the Middle East have remained stateless into the third or fourth generation.

According to the UN's Palestinian refugee agency, UNRWA, most Palestinians in the region still live in refugee camps, which over time have transformed into refugee towns. They are mainly based in the Gaza Strip, in the Occupied West Bank, Lebanon, Syria, Jordan and East Jerusalem.

Unfortunately, UNRWA has not been able to get full support from the Western nations for fulfilling its mandate. To date. UNRWA has only received less than 25 per cent of its financial requirements, or \$364 million and still needs \$1.3 billion. At the beginning of the year, UNRWA appealed for \$1.6 billion in support of its programmes, operations and emergency response across Syria, Lebanon, the West Bank (including East Jerusalem), the Gaza

Noam Chomsky observed that "settler colonialism is the most extreme and sadistic form of imperialism." The hallmark of settler colonialism is ruthlessness and disregard for law, justice and morality. And currently we are witnessing all these aspects under the Zionist Israeli regime. The Zionist movement was nothing if not ruthless. It did not plan to cooperate with the native Arab population for the common good. On the contrary, it always planned to supplant them. The only way the Zionist project could be realised and maintained was by expelling a large number of Arabs from their homes and taking over their land.

Apparently Israel was able to achieve this, with the help of the British politicians and in later years, with the tacit American support. If we have to resolve the Palestinian issue, then the only credible option is for the UN to influence both the UK and USA to play a constructive role not a confrontational or bipartisan approach towards resolving the issue, as per the aspirations of the Palestinian people and demands of fair and equal justice.

On the other hand, the position of Arab states on the issue was evident from the statement made by the Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, who stressed his country's commit ment to the Palestinian statehood at the Arab League summit on May 19, amid intensified US efforts to broker a normalisation deal between the Gulf kingdom and Israel.

The comments are largely standard for leadership in Riyadh, which has long insisted publicly that it remains committed to the Palestinian cause and will only normalise ties with Israel after a two-state solution has been reached. But it also shows the lack of resolve on their part to get the Palestinian issue resolved once for all.


Ignoramus

t's a satisfying way to tell somebody that he's stupid or ignorant, its Latinate form projecting an aura of dusty academic superiority. It also has a long and interesting history. The ancient legal institution of the grand jury now continues only in the USA, but it was once the standard way of deciding whether a person should be charged with a crime. It was called a grand jury because it was made up of 24 men, twice the size of one in a trial, which was a petit jury or petty jury. Grand juries were originally called from among local men who were expected to act on personal knowledge. If they felt the evidence was too weak their foreman wrote the Latin word ignoramus on the back of the indictment. This literally meant "we do not know", from the Latin verb ignorare, to be ignorant. In practice it meant "we take no notice of this". It was the opposite of declaring the indictment a true bill, which meant the accused person went to trial. How this abstruse foreign form from the specialised language of the law became an English word is due to George Ruggle. He wrote a play called Ignoramus, mostly in Latin, which was performed on 8 March 1615 at Trinity College, Cambridge, before an audience of some 2,000 which included King James I of England and the future Charles I. It featured a rascally and ignorant lawyer, the Ignoramus of the title, who used barbarous law Latin of a kind deplored by the university's academics. The king loved the play but his judges and law officers hated it. It caused a huge controversy that led to the name of the play's chief character entering the language. Since there is no lack of ignorance and stupidity in our world, we have to decide how to create its plural. A slight knowledge of Latin noun plurals suggests it should be ignorami, to match nucleus, fungus, terminus, cactus, and stimulus. But ignoramus never was a Latin noun, so the sensible course is to stick to the rules of English, making ignoramuses. That's a mouthful, but it will stop you from sounding like an ignoramus.



Amid demands from the opposition that the president should inaugurate the new building, leaders of like-minded opposition parties deliberated on the issue and a joint statement by the floor leaders announcing a united boycott of the event may be issued soon. sources said. They added a final decision will be taken Wednesday, once the formal invitation is received by the parties.

The Congress, which has been targetting the government over the issue, said any decision on whether the party will boycott or attend will be taken at the right time. Announcing the party's decision, TMC's leader in Rajya Sabha Derek O'Brien wrote on Twitter, "Parliament is not just a new building: it is an establishment with old traditions, values, precedents and rules -- it is the foundation of Indian democracy. Prime Minister Modi doesn't get that. For him, Sunday's inauguration of the new building is all about I, ME, MYSELF. So count us out." CPI general secretary D Raja also said his party will not

attend the ceremony. Soon after the MPs started receiving soft copies of the invitation, they got into a huddle to discuss the issue. The Aam Aadmi Party Tuesday said it will boycott the inauguration ceremony of the new parliament building.

"By the way, Chairperson of the Council of States Vice President of India is also conspicuous by his absence on the invitation card," he added.

Congress' head of media and publicity department head Pawan Khera said on Twitter, "Hon'ble Minister needs to be told there's a difference between Parliament Annexe and the Parliament. I hope he has been attending sessions in the right building and not the library or the Annexe.

"Is this the level of intellect in Modi Ji's cabinet or this is Bhakti Ki Shakti," he asked.

Modi will inaugurate the new

Parliament building on May 28 following an invitation by Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla.

On Monday, Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge had raised objection to President Murmu not being invited for the inauguration of the new Parliament Building, saying the Parliament is the supreme legislative body of the Republic of India, and the President of India is its highest Constitutional authority

On Kharge's remark, Congress leader Shahi Tharoor then tweeted, "Articles 60 and 111 of the Constitution make it clear that the President is the head of Parliament. It was bizarre enough that the PM performed the groundbreaking ceremony and puja when construction began, but totally incomprehensible and arguably unconstitutional for him and not the President to inaugurate the building.'

NCP national spokesperson Clyde Crasto wondered if it was not the right of President Murmu to inaugurate the new Parliament building for her being the head of the country.

The opposition parties had boycotted the ceremony to lay the foundation stone of the building by Modi in December 2020, citing concerns about its timing amid farmer protests, the COVID-19 pandemic and the economic distress due to a lockdown.

The grand opening of the new building, it is learnt, will be marked by the chanting of hymns, a "havan' and a "puja". The rituals will start in the morning and the main programme is scheduled to be held in the afternoon. Besides Modi, Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla will be present at the opening ceremony The invitation card for the event states the ceremony will start at noon and requests the invitees to take their seats by 11.30 am.

Kolkata, May 23: West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee Tuesday assured her counterpart from Delhi, Arvind Kejriwal, that her party would support him in his fight against the Central ordinance to control appointments and transfer of bureaucrats in the city state.

Kejriwal who had come along with his party comrade and Punjab CM Bhagwant Mann as part of a nationwide tour to garner support for his fight against the Centre's ordinance on control of services in Delhi, held a nearly hour-long meeting here with Banerjee at the state secretariat.

Kejriwal told newspersons that a forthcoming vote in Rajya Sabha on a bill to convert the central ordinance into law, will be a "semifinal before the 2024 elections."

He alleged the saffron party "buys MLAs, uses CBI, ED to try to break" opposition governments, besides using Governors to disturb non-BJP governments such as "Bengal and Punjab".

Banerjee told newspersons, "We support AAP in the fight against the Central ordinance ...Request all parties not to vote for BJP's law (on controlling appointments in Delhi)".

The feisty TMC leader also quipped "The double engine (BJP rule in both state and centre) has become a troubled engine" and added mysteriously, "Its only a matter of six months (that the central government will stav in power) ...But if a miracle occurs, they might have to go before that too.'

Kejriwal and Mann also turned the impromptu press conference held after the meeting of the two leaders, into an attack on the BJP and central government

The AAP leader and Delhi chief minister said, "BJP has made a mockery of democracy ... where it cannot form a government, it buys MLAs, uses CBI, ED to try to break the government ... Governors to disturb non-BJP governments such as Bengal and Punjab"

He went on to predict,"This (contest in the Parliament) will be a semi-final before the 2024 elections.

The bone of contention between the AAP government and the BJP has been the Central government ordinance setting up a National Capital Civil Service Authority which overturned a Supreme Court order last week giving control of services, excluding those related to police, public order and land, to the elected government in Delhi.

The accident took place at 7.20 am near Sindkhed Raja town on old Mumbai-Nagpur highway in the district, located more than 450 km from the state capital Mumbai, an official said. The bus, belonging to the Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation (MSRTC) and carrying 33 passengers, was going towards Mehkar in (Buldhana) from Pune, he said. As the bus reached Palaskhed Chakka village, it collided with the truck, the official said.

New Delhi, May 23: India will make tests mandatory for cough syrups before they are exported, a government notice showed Tuesday, after Indian-made cough syrups were linked to the deaths of dozens of children in Gambia and Uzbekistan

Any cough syrup must have a certificate of analysis issued by a government laboratory before it is exported, effective June 1, the government said in a notice dated May 22 and shared by the health ministry Tuesday.

India's \$41 billion pharmaceutical industry is one of the biggest in the world but its reputation was shaken after the World Health Organization

'Cough svrup shall be to be exported subject to the export sample being tested and production of certificate of analysis," said the notice issued by the trade ministry

The health ministry did not immediately respond to a query on whether testing would be required for cough syrups sold in the domestic market.

The notice identified seven federal government laboratories where samples could be sent for testing, in addition to other state laboratories certified by a national accreditation body.

Indian tests of cough syrups made by Maiden Pharmaceuticals Ltd, linked to the deaths of children in Gambia, found no toxins but contaminants were detected in many drugs made by Marion Biotech, whose syrups were linked

to deaths in Uzbekistan. The health minister and federal and state regulators also held a brainstorming session in the southern city of Hyderabad earlier this year "to find a solution to exported cough syrups that killed children," a document from the prime minister's office dated May 15 showed.

TWO-MONTH-OLD CHEETAH CUB DIES IN KUNO

Bhopal, May 23: A cheetah cub, born at Kuno National Park in Madhya Pradesh two months back, died Tuesday, the forest department said. The latest fatality took the death toll of cheetahs in KNP to four in the last two months, including three felines translocated from African countries.

Prima facie, the cub died of weakness, a Forest department release said. "The monitoring team found that one of the four cubs of feline 'Jwala' was lying at the spot where they were spotted earlier while three other cubs were roaming with their mother. The team alerted veterinarians who rushed to the spot and gave necessary treatment to the cub, but it died," the release

said. It seems the cub died because of weakness as it was weak since birth, said the release. Cheetah Jwala, earlier known as Siyaya, was brought from Namibia to KNP in Sheopur district in September 2022. She gave birth to four cubs in the last week of March this year. Cheetahs were reintroduced in India, 70 years after the species was declared extinct.

Assam, Meghalaya CMs to discuss border row today

Guwahati/Shillong, May 23: The chief ministers of Assam and Meghalava will meet in Guwahati Wednesday to take forward discussions on resolving border disputes in the remaining six areas.

Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma Tuesday said he and his Meghalaya counterpart Conrad Sangma will also visit the disputed areas later as a goodwill gesture.

'The Meghalaya CM will come here tomorrow and discussion will be held on finding solutions for the remaining six areas," he said. It will be the first meeting of the second round of talks between the two states, a Meghalaya CMO official told PTI in Shillong.

The two Northeastern states had signed a memorandum of understanding in March 2022 in the presence of Union Home Minister Amit Shah in New -Delhi towards ending the disputes in six areas.

Meghalaya was carved out of Assam in 1972 and had since then challenged the Assam Reorganisation Act of 1971,which is recognised by Assam as its border.

Sex work an offence only in public: Mumbai court

Mumbai, May 23: A Mumbai Sessions Court has recently ruled that sex work can be termed an "offence" when its done in a public place causing nuisance to others, as it set free a 34-year-old commercial sex worker who was shunted to a shelter home against her wishes.

Following a raid on a brothel by the Mumbai Police in suburban Mulund in February, the CSW, along with two others, was arrested and produced before the Mazagaon Magistrate Court February 19.

year's rehabilitation March 15, though the other two women nabbed were released.

Challenging the order in the Sessions Court, the woman with two minor children, also denied indulging in any immoral activities as alleged by the police.

Hearing her plea, Additional Sessions Judge CV Patil said that the lower court had detained the victim only on the ground of antecedent of indulging in a similar kind of offence, which she has challenged.

Judge Patil ruled that the victim is a major and had the right to work, and there were no allegations that she was indulging in sex work in public.

"As per the rule, to involve in sex work is not itself an offence, but

to do sex work in public place so as to cause annoyance to others can be called as offence," he held.

He noted that the woman had two kids who needed her and if she was being detained against her wishes, then it curtailed her fundamental rights, including the freedom to move freely all over India, and quashed the Magistrate's order to set her free from the shelter home.

In mid-February, the Mumbai police had carried out the raids on a nearby shady hotel with decoy customers where the owner and manager were reportedly keeping women for purposes of prostitution for the customers.

Bank of Baroda has said they don't require any form but need ID proof for non-account holders. ICICI and HDFC have said they require all customers to fill out forms, but ID proof is needed only for non-account holders. As per the RBI guidelines issued Friday, the exchange of ₹2,000 facility is available from Tuesday. A person can exchange up to a limit of ₹20,000 at a time without filling out any form or requisition slip. Further, no identity proof is required to be submitted by the tenderer at the time of exchange.

During the November 2016 demonetization, 86 per cent of the currency in circulation was withdrawn with old 500 and 1000 notes ceasing to be legal tender. The entire process was completed over a shorter 50-day time period.

State Bank of India, the country's biggest bank, in an official memo to its branches stated that no form or slip would be required while exchanging or depositing ₹2,000 notes. Private banks like Kotak and HSBC said they are asking for form/ID Proof for non-account

No great rush was witnessed for exchange when branches opened. Outlets of private sector banks in metro cities in the early hours had business as usual.

The Centre asked states and Union territories to hold Yoga Day activities at the panchayat level and identify a gram panchayat or a cluster of gram panchayats for setting up "Ayush Gram" or "Sampoorn Yoga Gram" and intimate it to the Panchayati Raj Ministry by May 25.

According to the advisory, mass yoga sessions with "maximum participation" have to be organised at strategic locations and near "amrit sarovars" -- water bodies that have been recently rejuvenated under a central scheme.

"Observe IDY from desert to for est, river to sea, village to industry...Anganwadi to old age home ..., the advisory stated.

It stated that each district magistrate may be directed to organise a countdown event by holding a mass demonstration following the common yoga protocol at the district headquarters.

States and UTs have also been asked to put up Yoga Day banners and posters, including those with Prime Minister Narendra Modi's quotes on yoga, at all public institutions such as hospitals, health and wellness centres, police stations, bus stations, and offices of panchayat, municipality, corporation and taluk.

Workshops and online training programmes will be held, and NGOs, resident welfare associations and such bodies will be roped in for promoting yoga as an intangible cultural heritage

The UN General Assembly had declared June 21 as International Yoga Day following a resolution moved by India and co-sponsored by a large number of nations. The first International Yoga Day was observed June 21, 2015.

Cross-border attack crushed: Russia

Kyiv, May 23: Moscow said Tuesday it had routed and killed scores of "Ukrainian nationalists" who crossed into Russia from Ukraine after two days of combat, in what appeared to be one of the biggest incursions of its kind of the 15-month-old war.

There was no immediate independent confirmation that the fighting had ended, but the governor of Russia's Belgorod region said the anti-terrorism measures he introduced after Monday's attack had been lifted. And one of two groups claiming to be behind the raid said in a post on social media: "One day we will return to stay."

The fighting forced Russia to evacuate towns along the border with northeast Ukraine. Russia has blamed Ukraine for the attack, which Kyiv has denied. The two groups that claimed responsibility describe themselves as Russian armed dissidents. The Russian military said it had

killed more than 70 Ukrainian nationalists and destroyed four armoured vehicles. There was no independent confirmation of those losses. Russian forces had surrounded the enemy fighters and defeated them with "air strikes, ar-

tillery fire and active action by border units", the defence ministry said. "The remnants of the nationalists were pushed back to Ukrainian territory where they continued to be hit by gunfire until they were completely eliminated," it added.

US debt ceiling crisis: No deal yet

Washington, May 23: President Joe Biden and House Speaker Kevin McCarthy both said they had a productive debt ceiling discussion late Monday at the White House, but there was no agreement as negotiators strained to raise the nation's borrowing limit in time to avert a potentially chaotic federal default.

It's a crucial moment for the Democratic president and the Republican speaker, just 10 days before a looming deadline to raise the debt limit. As soon as June 1, Treasury Secretary Janel Yellen said in a letter to Congress, "it is highly likely" the government will be unable to pay all the nation's bills. Such an unprecedented default would be financially damaging for many Americans and others around the world relying on US stability, sending shockwaves through the global economy.

Each side praised the other's seriousness, but basic differences remained. They are at odds over how to trim annual budget deficits. Republicans are determined to cut spending while Biden's team offered to hold spending levels flat. Biden wants to increase some taxes on the wealthiest Americans and some big companies, but McCarthy said that is out of the question.

'The time of spending, just spending more money in America and government is wrong, McCarthy said after the Oval Office meeting. In a brief post-meeting statement, Biden called the session productive but merely added that he, McCarthy and their lead negotiators "will continue to discuss the path forward." Upbeat, McCarthy said their teams would

work "through the night."

Biden said all agreed that "default is not really on the table." Though there is no agreement on basic issues, the contours of a deal seem within reach. A budget deal would unlock a separate vote to lift the debt ceiling, now \$31 trillion, to allow more borrowing.

Negotiations are focused on finding compromise over a 2024 budget year cap that would be key to resolving the standoff. Republicans insisted next year's spending be less than it is now, but the White House instead offered to hold spending flat at current 2023 numbers.

Republicans initially sought to roll back next year's spending to 2022 levels, and impose 1% caps on spending growth for 10 vears, though a later proposal narrowed that to about six years. The White House wants a twoyear budget deal, keeping 2024 spending flat. They proposed a 1% cap on spending growth for 2025, according to a person familiar with the talks and granted anonymity to discuss them.

A compromise on those topline spending levels would enable McCarthy to deliver for conservatives, while not being so severe that it would chase off the Democratic votes that would be needed in the divided Congress to pass any bill.

The latest casualty was a 6-year-old boy who died late Monday night in a hospital after the collapse at the Wat Nern Por primary school, according to the public relations office in Phichit province, 300 kilometers (185 miles) north of Bangkok. Several students had gone inside the activity center to shelter from the rain when the roof collapsed, according to a Facebook post from the official disaster prevention department, and 18 people were hospitalized.

ISLAMABAD VIOLENCE **IMRAN GETS BAIL IN 8 CASES**

Islamabad, May 23: Former Prime Minister Imran Khan got a major relief on Tuesday when an anti-terrorism court in Pakistan granted him bail till June 8 in eight cases related to violence that erupted at the Judicial Complex here in March.

The cases were registered in different police stations of Islamabad against 70-year-old Khan after clashes erupted between police and his supporters when the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) party chief appeared before a court in the Judicial Complex on March 18.

The clashes erupted when Khan attended a much-awaited hearing in the Toshakhana corruption case. During the confrontation, over 25 security personnel were injured. On Tuesday, Khan travelled from Lahore to the capital, Islamabad to appear before the anti-terrorism court located in the Judicial Complex.

Harry loses court bid over UK police protection

London, May 23: Prince Harry Tuesday lost a bid to legally challenge the British government's decision not to allow him to pay for police protection while he is in the United Kingdom.

Harry, King Charles' younger son, was stripped of the police security usually afforded to royal figures in the United Kingdom after he and his American wife Meghan stepped down from their official roles in 2020 to move to the United States.

The High Court in London, which last year already agreed he should be allowed to challenge the original decision to end his protection, ruled on Tuesday he could not also seek a further judicial review over the refusal of his offer to pay privately for the highly-trained officers. The decision to remove publicly-



funded security was taken by the Executive Committee for the Protection of Royalty and Public Figures, known by the acronym RAVEC, which approves security for the royals and VIPs, such as the prime minister.

Last week, lawyers for Harry had argued RAVEC did not have the power to reject his funding offer, and even if it did have such authority, it was wrong not to consider an exception or hear representations on his behalf.

New Delhi, May 23: India's GDP has crossed \$3.5 trillion in 2022 and will be the fastest-growing G-20 economy over the next few years. but reform and policy barriers could hamper investment, Moody's said Tuesday.

In a research report, the USbased rating agency said bureaucracy could slow approval processes in obtaining licences and setting up businesses, prolonging project gestation.

"India's higher bureaucracy in decision-making will reduce its attractiveness as a destination for foreign direct investment (FDI). especially when competing with other developing economies in the region, such as Indonesia and Vietnam," Moody's Investors Service said

It said a large young and educated workforce, increasing nuclear families and urbanization will fuel demand for housing, cement and new cars

Government infrastructure spending will bolster steel and cement, while India's net-zero commitment will drive investment in renewable energy, it said

"While demand across the manufacturing and infrastructure sectors will grow 3-12 per cent annually for the rest of the decade, India's capacity will still rank well behind China's by 2030," Moody's said

It said despite the economy's strong potential, there is a risk that the pace of investment in India's manufacturing and infrastructure sectors could slow because of limited economic liberalization or slower policy implementation

New Delhi, May 23: Nearly 60,000 outsourced contract workers lost jobs in India's information technology sector in the year ending in March as jobs for flexi workers hired through contractors by companies shrank 7.7% from a year earlier, a recruitment body said Tuesday.

'The drop in new employment generation within the IT flexi staffing sector mirrored the global slowdown in IT hiring," said Lohit Bhatia, president of the Indian Staffing Federation, representing over 120 recruitment agencies across the country

However, the hiring in the manufacturing, logistics, and retail sectors remained strong, helped by domestic consumer

The \$194-billion sector whose software services helped businesses adopt pandemic-era practices of online shopping and remote working is facing a slowdown this year as employees return to offices and the Russia-Ukraine war weighs on spending from clients in Europe. The hiring of flexi workers in the

IT sector shrank 6% quarter-onquarter in the March quarter, Bhatia said, noting that hiring of contract workers through a thirdparty may remain weak for the next few quarters in the software industry

India's unemployment rate in April rose for the fourth month in a row to 8.11%, from 7.8% in the previous month, according to the Centre for Monitoring Indian Economy, (CMIE), a Mumbai-based think tank.

The Federation said overall demand for flexi workers slowed down in other sectors as well. adding 177,000 jobs through vendors in the financial year 2022/23 ending in March, compared with 230,000 workers in the previous year.

The number of flexi workers hired through vendors by Indian companies has increased to 1.4 million including one-fourth of women workers

Cryptoverse: Busy bitcoin births new breed of crypto

Some investors and developers view bitcoin's blockchain as a safer long-term basis for creating tokens and applications in the wake of the crypto carnage that followed the collapse of high-profile firms like FTX and a general flight from riskier assets

Washington, May 23: Things are heating up on the bitcoin blockchain. Daily transactions have rocketed to an all-time high of 682,000 this month, according to data from Glassnode, almost 40% higher than the previous peak in 2017. Bitcoin's dominance, or its share of the overall \$1.16 trillion cryptocurrency market, has swelled to 44% from 38%

at the start of the year. What's going on?

Enter BRC-20, the first class of crypto tokens to be built on the bitcoin blockchain, besides bitcoin

itself. Nearly 25,000 of the experimental coins have already been minted this year, sending transactions through the roof.

"BRC-20 tokens are a phenomenon we haven't seen before," said Gordon Grant, co-head of trading at Genesis trading.

Primarily due to the creation of these tokens, the average daily transactions over seven days stands at more than 531,000, nearly twice as high as a month ago, according to Blockchain.com data.

This new class of crypto has no specific use beyond speculation, akin to memecoins. Yet its nascent



popularity points to interest in bitcoin not just as a store of value or payments method, but as the foundation for developing new coins and applications - previously considered the domain of more mod ern blockchains such as Ethereum and Solana. Still, the BRC-20 frenzy has been volatile.

The total value of these tokens - which are typically traded in secondary markets, particularly decentralized exchanges - exceeded \$1 billion in early May, but has since fallen back to \$446 million, according to tracker BRC-20.io. **INSCRIBED ON SATOSHI**

As bitcoin's blockchain wasn't originally developed to support a crypto ecosystem, unlike Ethereum and Solana, BRC-20 tokens are created using ordinals theory, which allows data to be inscribed on each satoshi-the smallest denomination of bitcoin, or one hundred millionth. 'There isn't much utility when

it comes to BRC-20 tokens and Ordinals," said CJ Reim, contributor at blockchain firm CoreDAO, though **People** he sees the have seen what is trend as possible with other blockchains and they want it on bitcoin, as the oldest "promising" in terms of network, bitcoin has a track interest in record that people building can trust

The race to create these new coins hasn't had a significant impact on the price of bitcoin, which has been trading under \$30,000 since mid-April.

The rapid creation of BRC-20 tokens hasn't been without contention, with detractors saying the issuance of these tokens has made it more difficult for users who want to use bitcoin for its originally intended purposes.

"Gas" fees, or transactions costs on the bitcoin blockchain have soared over the past month, with the total dollar-denominated fees paid per day touching near a new all-timehigh of \$17.8 million per day, according to Glassnode data. The median transaction fee spiked as high as \$30.91 versus a range of 90 cents and \$4.23 between January and May 1, Blockchain.com data

The network has also slowed considerably. The congestion was so acute, that the world's largest crypto exchange Binance had to briefly pause bitcoin withdrawals May 7

"Although congestion has eased somewhat, it is still elevated and at its peak users were waiting over 30 hours for transactions to be confirmed," said Nauman Sheikh, head of treasury management atdigital asset investment manager Wave Digital Assets.
