Bhubaneswar: The Odisha government Wednesday hiked the compassionate assistance for employees in the event of death while on duty from ₹4 lakh to ₹10 lakh. It also increased the assistance from ₹2 lakh to ₹5 lakh for employees who get permanently disabled due to injuries suffered while on duty and from ₹1 lakh to ₹2 lakh for employees partially disabled due to injuries suffered while on duty. Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik approved a proposal in this regard Wednesday.

Modi may visit **Odisha in June**

Bhubaneswar: Top BJP leaders including Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Home Minister Amit Shah and Defence Minister Rajnath Singh will visit Odisha in June as a part of the month-long special public relations campaign (Maha Jansampark Abhiyan). The programme has been launched to mark the completion of nine years of the Modi government and it will continue till June 30, BJP officials said Wednesday. Bhubaneswar, May 31: The results of Plus-II examinations in Science and Commerce streams were announced Wednesday by the Council of Higher Secondary Education (CHSE)

Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik congratulated the successful students. "Best wishes and congratulations to the students who have passed the Science and Commerce stream exams. Regardless of the results. let's all move forward

with the goal of success in life. Wishing everyone a bright future." he said.

School and Mass Education (S&ME) Minister Sudam Marndi informed that the overall pass percentage stood at 84.93 per cent and 81.12 per cent for Science and Commerce streams respectively. Last year the pass percentage was 94.12 per cent in Science and 89.20 in Commerce.

S & ME secretary Aswathy S explained the reason behind the dip in pass percentage. The exams were held in the pre-Covid pattern. Also students appeared physically in a board exam for the first time. They could not do so for their Class X exams as it was during the pan-

2 GIRL STUDENTS ATTEMPT SUICIDE

Balasore: Two girl students tried to die by suicide after failing to get marks as expected in the Plus II exams, the results of which were announced Wednesday. In the first incident, the girl, a resident of Simulia village under Nilagiri NAC limits in Balasore district jumped from a three-storied building to end her life. She was rescued in critical condition and rushed to Nilgiri hospital first and later to the Balasore headquarters hospital and then to a private nursing home in Bhubaneswar after her condition worsened. In the second incident, a girl of Mendhapur village under Aul block of Kendrapara district, tried to end her life by jumping into Brahmani river near Dandisahi under Pattamundai police limits. Locals and fire personnel rescued her and admitted her to the Pattamundai hospital first and later shifted her to the Kendrapara district headquarters hospital.

As seen in the Class X board exams, girls have once more outperformed the boys in the Plus II examinations. In Science stream, 85.67 per cent of girls were successful while the figure for boys stood at 84.28%. Of the 92,950 students who appeared for the examinations, 78,938 students, comprising 42,121 boys and 36,817 girls were successful. Similarly, in the Commerce



Cuttack, May 31: The Cuttack Municipal Corporation (CMC) announced Wednesday an ex-gratia of ₹10 lakh to the family of the minor girl who died Tuesday after suffering serious injuries due to the collapse of an old iron bridge here. The financial assistance was announced by CMC Mayor Subash Chandra Singh.

The development came after Singh was prevented from meeting the family of the deceased. He also

faced protests from local residents when he visited the accident spot.

Facing backlash from the local residents, Singh ordered the putting up of information signages at all construction sites in the city. He also asked officials to provide security guards and the barricading of sites where constructions are currently on. Orders have also been given to check all old structures and cover all open drains in this city.

Sixteen-year-old Mohini Das who died in the mishap was a resident of Nua Rausapatana locality in the city. She was a Plus II student of Emarti Devi Women's College. The mishap occurred at Gamadia locality of Kesarpur under Puri Ghat police limits. The victim was crossing the bridge when it collapsed leading to her death.

New Delhi, May 31: The investigation into the sexual harassment case against WFI chief Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh is under progress and reports claiming that the Delhi police have not found sufficient evidence are 'wrong', officials said Wednesday. The police had earlier said that they had not found sufficient evidence to arrest Singh, who is accused of sexually harassing seven female wrestlers. including a minor.

In a separate development the United World Wrestling (UWW) issued a statement Wednesday condemning the detention of wrestlers during a march to the new Parliament building Sunday.

UWW has also expressed 'disappointment over the lack of results of the investigations' against the federation chief and threatened to suspend the body if its elections are not held within 45 days.

Delhi police took to Twitter to clear the confusion. "Several media channels are running a story that the Delhi police haven't found sufficient evidence in the cases registered against the expresident of WFI and a final report in the matter is due to be submitted before the concerned court. It is to clarify that this news is 'wrong' and the investigation into this sensitive case is under progress with all sensitivity,' Delhi police tweeted.

In a related development Delhi Commission for Women chief Swati Maliwal issued a notice Wednesday to police seeking action against a man who allegedly revealed the identity of a minor wrestler who has filed a sexual harassment complaint against Singh. New Delhi, May 31: Auditor Deloitte has flagged three transactions, including recoveries from a contractor identified in the Hindenburg report, as it issued a qualified opinion on the accounts of Adani Ports & Special Economic Zone (SEZ).

In the auditors' report on the audit of the fourth quarter and 2022-23 financials, Deloitte Haskins & Sells LLP highlighted transactions with three entities, which the company said were unrelated parties. Deloitte however said it could not attest to the company's statement as no independent external examination has been done to prove the claims.

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



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

4.11 lakh new power connections in 4 yrs

Bhubaneswar, May 31: The state government has provided 4.11 lakh new connections and addressed the grievances of 5,100 consumers through Mo-Bidyut portal. This was revealed during a review meeting chaired by Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik here Wednesday.

Addressing the media after the meeting that took stock of the achievements of the Energy department during the last two years, Minister Pratap Deb said 1,320 mega watt (MW) additional capacity was added to 420 MW generated by Odisha Power Grid Corporation (OPGC) in 2019 to ensure energy security of the state.

The Chief Minister appreciated various initiatives undertaken by the department in power generation, transmission, distribution & rural electrification sectors.

After the review meeting, Deb told the media that during the last four years more than 2,200 MW of renewable energy (RE) was contracted by GRIDCO (Solar- 1,158 MW & Wind- 1,050 MW). The share of renewable has increased to 10.7 per cent in 2022-23 from 2.74 per cent in 2018-19.

A progressive Renewable Energy Policy, 2022 was launched with an objective to add about 10 giga watt (GW) RE capacity in the state by 2030, Deb said.

With the present generation contracted capacity of 8,065 MW, the state is able to meet the average peak power of around 5,400 MW conveniently, he said.

The average duration of power supply in rural areas of the state has been increased from 20.13 hours in 2018-19 to 23.22 hours in 2021-22 which is better than national average of 20.53 hours, he claimed.

Phase IV) was launched with an outlay of about ₹1,800 crore. More than 17 lakh new low tension (LT) compositions and over

sion (LT) connections and over 72,000 new agricultural connections were given. Further; aggregate technical and commercial (AT&C) losses have been brought down from 30.57 per cent in 2018-19 to 18.12 per cent in 2022-23. More than 50 customer care centres are in operation, he said.

Highlighting the actions taken under 5T initiatives, the minister said that 4.11 lakh new connections were provided, and 5,100 consumer grievances redressed online through Mo-Bidyut.

About 67,103 e-certificates for electrical licensing & inspection were issued by EIC (Electricity) while 1,291 women SHGs were engaged for metering, billing and collection activities. All these measures have been instrumental in providing quality and reliable power to the consumers and facilitating growth of industries and economy in line with the commitments of the state government, Deb added.

Bhubaneswar, May 31: Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik Wednesday reviewed the targets and achievements of Women & Child Development (W&CD) department and the fulfilment of the assurances given in the election manifesto of 2019.

After the meeting, W&CD Minister Basanti Hembram presented the details of fulfilling the assurances given in the manifesto and other transformative steps undertaken by the department during the last four years.

Hembram said that Mamata, a conditional maternity benefit scheme of the state government, aims at reducing maternal and infant mortality by improving the health and nutrition status of pregnant women and lactating mothers and their infants. Since its inception in 2011, more than 56 lakh pregnant women & lactating mothers, children in the age group of 6 months to 6 years and adolescent girls have benefitted.

She said that ₹ 2,706 crore have been e-transferred to the bank accounts of beneficiaries since 2011. It has contributed directly to the improved health of pregnant women, infants and lactating mothers. As part of the 5T initiative and to introduce greater accountability, e-Mamata 2.0 has been launched.

Relaxation has been given to particularly vulnerable tribal groups (PVTGs) for more than two live births since 2014. Altogether 22,733



PVTG women have benefitted from the scheme. A mobile app was also launched February 25, 2021 by the Chief Minister. Anganwadi workers can update the details of pregnant and lactating women through this app to ensure hassle-free and timely cash payments. More than 99 per cent pregnant women have used the app. More than 17.86 lakh SMSes have been sent to the beneficiaries on transfer of funds, said the minister.

She also said that Ashirbad, a unique scheme of the state government, was launched to provide support and financial assistance to children who lost their parents during Covid-19 pandemic. The government has committed to extend the benefits to such children till they attain the age of 18 years. A total of 51,130 beneficiaries have been included under the scheme till March 2023. The process has been made citizen-friendly using Ashirbad portal. Payment of assistance is credited into the bank account of the child/guardian on a monthly basis through direct benefit transfer (DBT).

There has been a significant improvement in the overall nutritional status of children (stunting, wasting and under weight) in the last 20 years as evident from NFHS-2 to NFHS-5 reports.

There has been a 10-fold rise in the budget provision for the W&CD dept during the last two decades – from ₹376.86 crore in 2000-01 to ₹3,670 crore in 2023-24. Programme Expenditure (Budget) has increased from ₹272.99 crore in 2000-01 to ₹3,641 crore in 2023-24.

Odisha was one of the first states in India to decentralise Supplementary Nutrition Programme (SNP) in April 2011, thereby eliminating involvement of contractors and other suppliers, claimed the minister. This decentralised system involves local women self-help groups of the state for production and supply of take home ration (THR). The scheme benefits 39.19 lakh people across 30 districts.

Odisha is the first state in India to initiate the concept of 'Nutrition Budgeting' in financial year (FY)_ 2020-21 along with Gender Budget, Child Budget and Children's Policy. It has enabled the state to stride ahead in improving the nutritional status of the most vulnerable.

Purna Aahara or communitybased management of acute malnutrition is being implemented in all districts since November 2022.

In 2023, World Milk Day, with the theme 'Enjoy Dairy', will focus on showcasing how dairy is reducing its environmental footprint, while also providing nutritious foods and livelihoods. The objective will be to drive an active narrative that integrates the environmental, nutritional and societal impacts of the sector.

This day is celebrated by all United Nations member states which organise various events to educate the public about the importance of milk.

Back home, the rising price of milk and dairy products has, however, taken the sheen off the nutrient-rich product. Saraswati Devi, a resident of Sailashree Vihar area in Bhubaneswar, said milk and its benefits are beyond calculation.

"The benefits of dairy products outdo the negligible rise in price. These days, we are receiving packaged milk and other dairy products with assured purity at doorsteps. Quality comes with a price. And a negligible rise in milk price shouldn't be an issue," Devi, a retired banker, said. Pahala Rasagola Sangha president Akshay Lenka attributed the rise in prices of sweets to the milk price hike.

prices of milk and its products in April first week resulted in subsequent rise of prices of the sweets made out of it," Lenka said.

According to Bhimasen Tripathy, a tea seller in Rasulgarh area of the Capitl city, although the middleclass is somehow unaffected by the milk price hike, owners of small tea joints across the Temple City are bearing the brunt.

"With the latest rise of ₹4 per litre of milk, it's tough to convince customers while selling a cup of tea for ₹7. Milk price hike is almost like a bolt from the blue for tea sellers like me who has already been reeling under the burden of rising prices of LPG and other essentials," said Tripathy.

Science, Arts most preferred streams

New Delhi, May 31: Science and Arts have been the most popular streams among students over the last 10 years, while commerce has stagnated with only 14 per cent students opting for it, according to a study conducted by the Ministry of Education (MoE).

The study, which is an assessment of Class X and XII board exam results, noted that there are huge variations in choice of streams across states.

"Only 2 per cent students in Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu and Telangana opt for Arts stream but in states like Tripura and Gujarat over 82 per cent students choose the stream while in states like Punjab and Rajasthan the percentage of such students is above 70," it said.

Similarly, the popularity of science stream is extremely low in Punjab, Haryana and Assam where just about 17 per cent students opt for it, whereas in states such as Andhra Pradesh, Telangana and Tamil Nadu, more than 60 per cent students choose science to study after Class XII.

"In Goa and Karnataka, distribution of students is almost similar A study conducted by the Ministry of Education notes that Commerce has stagnated with only 14 per cent students opting for it over last 10 years

in major streams," the report said. A large difference in performance of students from various boards, significant variation in pass percentages and no level playing field for students in terms of standard are among the challenges identified by the ministry in the assessment.

According to School Education Secretary Sanjay Kumar, the difference between pass percentages of various states has led the MoE to look at standardising the assessment pattern for all 60 school boards across states in the country.

Currently, there are three central boards in India – Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE), Council for the Indian School Certificate Examinations (CISCE) and the National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS). Apart from these,

various states have their own boards, taking the total number of school boards to 60.

The study analysed the Class X and XII results for state boards of Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Karnataka, Kerala, Manipur, Odisha, West Bengal and Telangana to understand the variation in results for different state boards. Based on the report, all states have

been asked to work on the standardisation process of assessment.

"A meeting in this regard was held earlier this month wherein the presentation was shared with the states and concerns about developing a common assessment system were discussed," Kumar added.

The report also noted that 11 states contribute to 85 per cent of school dropouts. These states are Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat, Tamil Nadu, Rajasthan, Karnataka, Assam, West Bengal, Haryana and Chhattisgarh.

Among possible causes for higher failure rate in state boards pointed out in the report include less number of trained teachers and teachers per school. 

2020 was the warmest on record. Current national commitments to cut greenhouse gas emissions put Earth on track for 2.7°C of warming. Scientists believe this would entail 2 billion people living with average annual temperatures above 29°C as soon as the end of this decade - heat that very few communities are accustomed to.

This will have multiple repercussions, not least for human health. High temperatures compromise the body's ability to regulate its own internal temperature, affecting the heart, lungs, brain and kidneys, as well as the mind and the hormonal system, all of which can contribute to premature death and disability. Temperature extremes (both hot and cold) already result in 5 million excess deaths a year.

There are many ways in which humans adapt to temperature extremes and other climate-related risks and one valid response is migration. This includes temporarily mi-



grating in the hottest months, longerterm seasonal migration often for employment reasons, and permanent migration. The findings suggest that heat, in at least some contexts, is and will continue to play a part in peoples' intention to move, while also threatening their health when on the move and settling.

The heat factor in migration

Of the 32 studies that considered how heat affects migration, half showed that consistently rising temperatures would increase the likelihood that a person will migrate. People seem to be less likely

are and whether they have access to suitable healthcare and a source of income where they reside.

Heat risks health

Many studies concerned people migrating to find work, particularly in agriculture and industry, where the risk of heat appears to be less important than the need for economic survival.

Once in a new destination, the impacts of heat seem to be worse for migrants than non-migrants. This can be because of the type of housing and work migrants are more likely to find themselves in. While there is a trend towards

people migrating as a result of increasing temperatures, no absolute threshold is defined above which people will definitely migrate, and migration also does not seem to be a guaranteed outcome of heat. The decision and ability to migrate is never straightforward, and is often a last resort when other measures for adapting to the heat have been exhausted

Jajpur, May 31: At least two persons, including a child labourer, were killed after a large chunk of stone came crashing down on them reportedly from a height of 20-feet at an illegal black stone quarry in Lunibar mouza near Chadheidhara under Jenapur police limits and Dharmasala tehsil in Jajpur district, police said Wednesday. One of the deceased was iden-

tified as Shantanu Khilar, a machine operator and a resident of Telkoi in Keonjhar district, while another is a child labourer.

The incident took place at

Lunibar black stone quarry under Jenapur police station limits where the stones were being extracted using heavy earth moving equipment. The trader had engaged the deceased duo and some other labourers to extract stone late Tuesday night.

Khilar and the child labourer as well as others were loading stone on a truck with an earthmover. After conducting blasting on the quarry, they were picking up the heavy boulders and loading it on a transport vehicle.

Both the deceased persons were inside the heavy machine when a large chunk of stone came crashing reportedly from 20 feet height and fell on them. Khilar died on the

A Western Distraction

t should be common knowledge by now that climate change is a complex problem with outsize consequences for the Global South. By 2030, most Small Island Developing States (SIDS) will lose up to 100% of their GDP to climate disasters. Similarly, Africa's 54 countries will suffer some of the worst consequences of a warming planet, even though they are least responsible for the crisis, contributing less than 4% of global greenhouse-gas (GHG) emissions.

Rising temperatures are likewise threatening life in the Arab world, resulting in water scarcity in Jordan and extreme heat waves in the Gulf countries. The need for a great transformation at the regional, as well as the global, level was one of the main reasons why Egypt hosted last year's United Nations Climate Change Conference (COP27), and why the United Arab Emirates will host this year's meeting. In preparation for COP28, which will convene in Dubai in November and December, the UAE has committed to engaging in open and honest discussions with everyone to ensure that the conference is a success

Building on its strategic decision to promote and invest in renewables, conservation, and climate technology, the UAE selected Sultan Al Jaber as the COP28 president-designate. The choice has received ample attention: in addition to being the chairman of Masdar - the world's first carbon-neutral

city and home to the International Renewable Energy Agency – and the minister of industry and advanced technology, Al Jaber is managing director and group CEO of Abu Dhabi National Oil Company.

Accelerating climate action, meeting the challenges of the energy transition, and maintaining the world's demand for oil must be addressed comprehensively. Recognising this reality, the UAE has chosen as its official to oversee talks someone who has extensive experience in renewable-energy projects, as a special envoy for climate change, and in positions responsible for reducing industrial emissions. Global warming is a complicated problem, and solving it calls for sophisticated solutions requiring the expertise of specialists in a wide variety of fields

A small but loud group of politicians in the United States and Europe, together with some activists, have questioned why an "oil executive" is leading COP28. Many of these policymakers insist on reducing climate negotiations to a zero-sum game. By distracting people from the challenge of implementing realistic climate solutions and focusing instead on Al Jaber's appointment, they seem to view the fight against global warming as a political stick to wield, rather than a global imperative that requires close collaboration.

Last week, members of the US Congress and the European Parliament sent a letter to US President Joe Biden, European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen, and UN Secretary-General António Guterres urging the removal of Al Jaber as COP28 president-designate. Their demand was not based on any wrongdoing or a lack of commitment to the role, but rather was a means to score political points at the expense of a united global effort to tackle climate change and maintain economic growth. Legislators should ensure the best possible outcomes for their constituents and their children, not embrace positions based on political biases without any effort at genuine engagement. Worse still, the US and European legislators are advocating international intervention in a sovereign decision - the latest in a long line of Western efforts to dictate to Global South governments for domestic political gain.

Moreover, the tendency to prescribe policy solutions to Global South countries - which are often the worst hit by climate change and have endured injustice after injustice, including colonialism and resource extraction - is widening the gap between approaches to global warming. Emerging economies like China and India must balance climate action with the need to provide economic opportunities for billions of people.

Nonetheless, both China and India have invested substantially in climate mitigation and adaptation, and China has developed the world's largest capacity to manufacture and deploy renewables. The two countries lead globally in solar and wind capacity and have deployed more than 40% of the world's new solar and wind capacity each year since 2017. Fossil-fuel consumption continues in China and India - as it does worldwide - but has been reduced from 96% to an average of 83% of the total across both countries. With nearly three billion people between them, China and India are among the largest and fastest-growing economies in the world; their needs cannot be ignored. The same legislators lecturing sovereign states about how to navigate climate policy seem to forget that the US and Europe are responsible for the majority of historic emissions. Rather than interfering in decision-making by countries committed to climate action, they should be exerting pressure on their own governments to live up to their climate commitments. Currently, the US and Europe are expanding their own fossil-fuel infrastructure and failing to contribute substantially to internationally agreed funds to mitigate the effects of climate change. The United Kingdom has announced its first new coal mine in 30 years, while Germany has resurrected or extended the lives of at least 20 coal-fired power plants. Any discussion about the energy transition requires nuance and a sincere commitment to joint action. But that is impossible when certain politicians are more committed to catchy soundbites and making a name for themselves. The world has largely agreed on the need to reduce GHG emissions. We cannot let a minority change the framing of the problem and, in the process, slow momentum. The climate crisis is real, as is the political drama that impedes tangible and practical solutions. We must avoid the trap of division and distraction if we want to address global warming before it is too late.

Protests and mass movements are integral to India's democratisation processes, and they have long occupied a central role in shaping public policy and legislations. India's genesis itself is a product of popular struggle against the British rule, where top national leaders participated. Our founding fathers, especially Mahatma Gandhi, believed in the idea of the common man standing up for himself and expressing his dissent to the policies of the regime.

This precedent of protests is reflected in Article 19 of the Constitution, which guarantees it as a right to our citizens. It was believed by Dr BR Ambedkar, one of the founding fathers and drafters of our Constitution, that protests would be rare in an Independent India as other means would be available to get justice. However, this no longer holds good as many mass movements have taken place in the country initiating socio economic and political reforms and changed the nature of our institutions. The best-known example is that

of the people's movement led by Jayaprakash Narayan, which led to the fall of the 'invincible', dictatorial government of Indira Gandhi in 1977, a feat thought impossible leading to the first non-

Congress government since Independence. Similarly, Anna Hazare's anti-corruption movement in 2011 was instrumental in taking down the scam-riddled central government. Social issues such as rape have too been addressed through protests, evidenced by the large-scale movement after the Nirbhaya case in 2012-13, which forced legislators to address the situation immediately. However, it is disheartening to note that in recent years, except the organised and massive protest by farmers, there has been no noteworthy movement that has a national or state-level appeal. The reason for the decline in protest movements is difficult to ascertain, but it is generally believed that the authoritarian tendencies of both central and most state governments may be a critical rea-

The other important factor is the lack of dynamism of the middle class, which has been benefitted by the pro-capitalist policies of the ruling dispensation. The upper middle class is always away from protest movements as it is more interested in its self-interest while a section of the lower middle class sometimes had earlier joined protests

Besides, recent years are seeing unleashing of concerted propaganda against civil society groups and NGOs working in the social sector as being labelled as 'foreign agents.' One may refer here to the well-known political scientist, Rajni Kothari, who called civil so ciety movements non-party political formations. These grassroots movements influenced mainstream electoral politics. Political parties had to acknowledge the issues raised by these struggles. But in recent times, it has been

manifest that the State has become violent and uses force against the non-violent protests of common people. A lot of the legislation used for silencing detractors can be traced to colonial times which

remained after Independence. Just as protests are intrinsic to Indian democracy, the laws to suppress them are as well. One of them is the sedition law in the IPC (Section 124-A), which has been construed to treat dissidents as rebels and put them in jail. Gandhi and Nehru were charged under the same provision by the British and subsequently imprisoned. Recall, Disha Ravi, an activist who edited two lines of a document shared by Greta Thunberg to show solidar ity with farmers was arrested under this provision. Fortunately, the Supreme Court, dealing with several petitions against the misuse of the law, has put a stay on it. Another legislation, the UAPA too has been misused to detain dissenters during protests and dissenting on social media.

The protesters and detractors are often termed 'anti-national', aided by the media, which is reluctant to criticise the government. Police too have been increasingly discouraging protesters through harassment and brutality.

Social scientists believe, and quite rightly, that fragmentation of society as also political chaos and authoritarianism can only be curbed if there are mass protests against policies of the government, which, in recent times, are seen as autocratic and anti-people.

The attitude of the authorities these days shows an unwillingness to understand the viewpoint and address people's grievances. This needs to change for unless the problems of the people are understood and considered, inclusive democracy cannot be a reality. It is critical for the government to understand and empathise with the masses and not seek to entice them with claims of taking India to new heights, of it becoming a superpoweror a \$5 trillion economy. ©INFA

is officially back into the Arab fold. He was warmly embraced by regional leaders at the Arab League summit in Jeddah. Saudi Arabia. last week. Apparently it seems that the Arab League has lost its meaning and purpose and it is demonstrated by the manner in which member states take its sessions in a non-serious manner. Morocco declined to host a summit in 2016, calling the event a waste of time. Saudi Crown Prince Mohammad bin Salman, skipped last year's gathering in Algeria on medical grounds. Heads of state are sometimes spotted falling asleep at the fora meetings.

But it seems that at the moment no one would relish the regional Arab body more than Assad, who seemed euphoric to be invited to the Arab Summit. Syria was suspended from the league in 2011, when Assad began a brutal crackdown on antigovernment protests that plunged the country into a civil war.

Assad's deployment of chemical weapons against his own people along with mass arrests, torture and disappearances and killing of more than 3 million civilians in the country have no parallel elsewhere. This is a legacy, which he in-

On May 7 however, the regional Arab body agreed to re-admit Syria to its fold. Though an invitation from a dull talking shop crammed with dictators may seem unappealing to many but to Assad, it is the culmination of a long effort to end his Arab isolation - and, he may hope, another step towards acceptance in the West.

However, Assad's regional Arab acceptance creates a "problem" for the US, which continues to oppose any sort of normalising ties with the Syrian government but has not been able to force its Arab partners from restoring ties with Damascus. The US officials maintain that though they do not back normalisation with Assad, they share the objectives that restored relations could bring, including expanding humanitarian access to conflict-torn regions, combating IS, reducing Iran's influence and countering the trafficking of the drug Captagon.

Making the US stand quite clear, US Secretary of State Antony Blinken said last week: "We do not believe that Syria merits readmission to the Arab League." Still, Blinken said Washington and its Arab allies have broader common objectives in Syria.

Arab Spring, a wave of anti-government demonstrations across sev-

eral countries in the region that year. That heavy-handed security approach in Syria turned into a protracted war, killing hundreds of thousands of people and displacing millions.

In recent years, government forces recaptured much of Syria with the aid of Russia and Iran, and local ceasefires have maintained relative calm as parts of the country remain under the control of vari ous rebels and armed groups.

As to why Arab states are keen to bring Syria among their fold, there are many plausible reasons. One is to forge a broader spirit of detente. The Saudis struck a deal in March with Iran to restore diplomatic ties and reopen embassies. Turkey and Egypt, mired in mutual economic crises, are trying to end a decade of animosity. Gulf states have ended their embargo of Qatar. which accomplished little. Old foes across the region are keen to pretend they are friends

When it comes to Syria, however, they want something bigger in return. Its neighbours hope to get rid of millions of Syrian refugees. The 2 million or so in

mood has also turned hostile.

In addition, the West hope that mollifying Syria may result in it controlling its Captagon trade. Syria has become the world's leading producer of Captagon, an amphetamine that is a popular recreational drug in the Gulf. The scale of the Captagon trade is often exaggerated. Unconfirmed estimates put its annual value at \$57 billion. The real figure is probably an order of magnitude smaller -- but that is still large enough to make it Syria's top export.

Regardless of the future of US policy on Syria, the fact that Arab states are normalising with Assad is also a sign of the receding US political influence in the region. Indeed, this seems to be a sad commentary on the Arab world and its dictatorial leaders who basically conspired to crush the Arab Spring 12 years ago, instead of working for the betterment of their people. In reality the pro-democracy, pro-rights movement has not fizzled out; rather, it was clubbed to death by a conspiracy of the dictators.

THE SUIT FILED IN AUGUST 2021 SOUGHT PERMISSION FOR **DAILY WORSHIP AT** MAA SHRINGAR

GAURI STHAL PRESS TRUST OF INDIA

Prayagraj, May 31: The Allahabad High Court Wednesday rejected a plea challenging the maintainability of a suit filed by five Hindu women seeking permission for regular worship of Shringar Gauri and other deities in Varanasi's Gyanvapi mosque compound.

Justice J J Munir dismissed the mosque management committee's revision petition that contended that the suit is barred under the Places of Worship Act, 1991, which prohibits conversion of any place of worship and provides for the maintenance of its religious character as it existed August 15, 1947. The Anjuman Intezamia Masjid (AIM) committee had filed the petition in the high court against the order of the district judge of Varanasi in September last year that turned down its objections on the maintainability of the suit filed

Eating junk food linked with reduced sleep quality: Study

New Delhi, May 31: Consuming an unhealthier diet is associated with a lower quality of deep sleep, according to a small-scale study.


Deep sleep, the third stage of sleep, repairs and restores necessary functions such as memory, muscle growth, and immunity. Researchers at Uppsala University in Sweden analysed how junk food affects sleep. Healthy participants consumed an unhealthier as well as a healthier diet in a randomised order. The study, recently published in the journal Obesity, shows that after eating the junk food, the quality of the participants' deep sleep deteriorated, compared



with those who followed the healthier diet. "Both poor diet and poor sleep increase the risk of several public health conditions," said Jonathan Cedernaes, Associate Professor at Uppsala University. A total

of 15 healthy normal-weight young men participated in two sessions of the study. Participants were first screened for aspects such as their sleep habits, which had to be normal and within the recommended range of seven to nine hours per night.

The participants were randomly given both a healthier diet and an unhealthier diet. The two diets contained the same number of calories, adjusted to each individual's daily requirements. Among other things, the unhealthier diet contained a higher content of sugar and saturated fat and more processed food items. Each diet was consumed for a week, while the participants' sleep, activity and meal schedules were monitored at an individual level.

Shimla, May 31: Unseasonal excess summer rains affected lakhs of hectares of to be harvested crops in Himachal Pradesh, but came as blessing in disguise for forests that largely turn into tinderboxes with the rise in mercury every year in May.

As per government estimates. the state's forest wealth accounts for 68.16 per cent of the total geographic area that is rich in biodiversity and plays a vital role in preserving the fragile Himalayan ecology. As per government data, 1,200 to

2,500 forest fires are reported in the state every year. Mid and low hills in Shimla, Solan, Bilaspur, Una, Hamirpur, Kangra, Mandi and Sirmaur are the worst-affected. With the onset of May, a major-

ity of the fires are reported from pine forests when the trees shed pine needles that are highly inflammable due to the rich content of turpentine oil.

The pine forests are found up to an altitude of 5,500 feet. The main reason for the forest fires is the long dry spell and the abnormal increase in temperatures.

Official figures show 2018 was the worst year with 2,469 fire incidents reported -- the highest in eight years -- that gobbled up 25,300 hectares of forest across the state.

Taking into consideration the problem of forest fires, the government adopts a fire management strategy before the onset of the peak summer season.

INTENSE RAINFALL TO CONTINUE

Shimla: Intense rainfall with thunderstorms and gusty winds may continue in hills of Himachal Pradesh, a weather official said here Wednesday. "Many places of the state are likely to experience intense rainfall with hailstorms in the districts of Shimla, Sirmaur, Solan, Bilaspur, Una, Chamba, Hamirpur, Mandi and Kangra," an official with the Meteorological Department told IANS. He said tourist towns of Shimla, Narkanda, Kufri, Kalpa, Kasauli, Chamba, Dharamsala, Palampur and Manali may get moderate to heavy rain. "Highaltitude areas of Lahaul and Spiti, Chamba, Kullu and Kinnaur districts may experience mild snow during the next 24 hours," the official added. The average rainfall in the state in May was 61.2 mm. "Till May 30, the state had 109.8 mm in May, which is 79 per cent higher than the average rainfall," added the official.

When will life be back to normal, wonder villagers

Violence-hit villagers pin their hopes on Home Minister Amit Shah's four-day tour of Manipur

Sangaithel/Saheibung (Manipur),

May 31: As Kuki and Meitei villagers pick up their lives after one of the worst bouts of ethnic clashes in this northeastern state, they have only one question in mind when will life be back to normal?

Normal for most of them meant being able to chat with a fellow Manipuri, without worrying whether he or she belonged to another tribe, ride a motorcycle to the next district in search of a bargain or see a movie in the evening without worrying about an arson attack at the cinema hall.

"Politicians need to step out and work towards a 'milap' (friendship) ... Only then, there will be peace and all will be able to sleep in their own homes. Otherwise, there will be no end to this madness," N Sundeep Meitei told PTI in Sangaithel village in Imphal West district

L Bimol Meitei, an ex-BSF personnel, said that his village Sangaithel is adjacent to a Kuki village and before the violence began, there was a cordial relationship between them with both

sides visiting each other. There was trade happening between the two tribes. After May 3, there is an atmosphere of fear because attacks took place in some nearby places. So, the contacts have stopped now, he lamented.

In the neighbouring Kuki village of Saheibung, located in the foothills of Kangpokpi district, Village Chief S Athang Haokip said his family was affected and they had to flee on the first night of rioting to hide in the jungle.

"After the Army came, we felt safer and relieved. But I don't know how long this will go on. Once the army leaves, what will be the situation -- only time will say that," he added.

Haokip said that houses in his and other neighbouring Kuki villages were not burnt by people from Sangaithel or any other nearby Meitei settlement, but by attackers who came from distant places.

The village chief said, "Kukis have nowhere to go, Meitis are in the same boat ... If violence continues after the Army leaves, we have no option but to fight. We have to fight until both of us are finished The BJP government



says it is double-engined and they can do anything. Such a fast and strong government will have solutions ... Unless there is a solution, this war will go on." Hoping that Shah's visit will provide some solutions to the problem, Haokip requested the Central government to do whatever is needed to bring normalcy back

Bimol Meitei said there must be a dialogue between the two communities and the state or Central government should take the initiative to that end. He said that people from Sangaithel and Saheibung met once after the violence started mainly due to an initiative taken by the armed forces. "There, we all agreed that this violence must end at least here as soon as possible. Both sides agreed that we would request our community brothers in other places to stop violence," Meitei said. This, he pointed out, needs to be replicated on a bigger scale throughout the state.

Home Minister Amit Shah's four-day tour of Manipur is being viewed by these simple but shrewd villagers as a portent for just such an effort.

Though there are mutterings against the state government for failing to do its duty during the rioting, the tour of the state by Shah and his high-powered team, even as the smoke from burnt houses still smoulders, is being seen as a sign that the hatchet may yet be buried and life may get back to what it was before

New Delhi, May 31: Himachal Pradesh Chief Minister Sukhvinder Sukhu Monday called on Union Power Minister RK Singh here and informed him about the 99 years lease period of the Shanan hydropower project that is expiring in March 2024

The country's first hydroelectric project is presently under the control of the Punjab State Power Corporation Ltd (PSPCL) in Himachal Pradesh.

The Chief Minister requested the Union Minister to issue directions to the Punjab government for taking mandatory steps for handing over the project to the state before the expiry of the lease period.

He also apprised the Union Minister about the facts regarding the share of the state in the Bhakra Beas Management Board (BBMB) and demanded 12 per cent water royalty for the state.

Sukhu said due to the construction of projects by the BBMB, many townships were compelled to face rehabilitation and numbers of oustees were not yet compensated even after 50 years.

He urged that the state government may be allowed to impose free power royalty in all commis-

sioned projects of the BBMB. This was the long-pending demand of the state.

He also raised the issue of raising the royalty of state in SJVN. He said that free power royalty share being received from the SJVN projects which have completed debt period of 12 years may be enhanced from existing free power royalty share ranging from 12 to 30 per cent.

The Union Minister assured of all possible support to the state.

The more than 90-year-old Shanan hydropower project is still generating power and earning revenue for his state.

The project located at Jogindernagar was constructed in 1932 by British engineer Colonel BC Batty and his team, and started generating 48 MW power at that time

Currently, the power house is running with a capacity of generating 110 MW.

The project came in to being based on an agreement made March 3, 1925

During the reorganisation of Punjab, Haryana and Himachal Pradesh in 1966, the Shanan Power House was allocated to Punjab by the Union Ministry of Irrigation and Power on a 99-year lease agreement.

Gangtok, May 31: With over 50 per cent work done on the Sivok-Rangpo railway line project, Sikkim is expected to become a part of the national network by 2024, while the country will get an "infrastructure of strategic importance" in the Himalayan state that borders China.

Passing through mountains. over ravines and the Teesta river, the under-construction all-weather 45-km rail line from Siliguri in West Bengal to Rangpo in Sikkim will have 14 tunnels and 22 bridges, officials said Tuesday.

"Work is underway on war footing but being done with extreme care as the entire project falls in seismic four and five zones. In addition, there



is always the threat of landslides and flash floods," Project Director Mohinder Singh from IRCON International, a central PSU under the Ministry of Railways, said.

Safety protocols are in place and being followed, the official of the Indian Railway Construction (IRCON) International Limited, assured.

He further said that there are also plans to extend the line up to Gangtok, but that is at a later stage. There have been crucial breakthroughs in tunnel building and lay-

ing of bridges, he told reporters and

added that the two-km tunnel (T-14) before the yet-to-be built Rangpo station has been completed while six are in its final stages (lining work). "This is an infrastructure of

strategic importance as well as of economic importance," the director said when asked about the project's significance in view of Sikkim sharing its border with China. Overall, more than 50 per cent of the work has been completed," he said.

Echoing Singh's views on the significance of the rail line proj ect - 41.45 km of which is in West Bengal and 3.51 km in Sikkim, Darjeeling MP Raju Bista said, 'The region (Sikkim and North Bengal) share borders with four countries -- Bangladesh, Nepal, Bhutan and China – and a part of it is called the 'chicken's neck'. This is a very sensitive region.'

"Besides improving connectivity in the region, known for its many tourist destinations, it will be a major boost from the security point facilitating troop movement,' the MP said.

The government is planning to create 700 lakh tonne of grain storage capacity in the cooperative sector over the next five years and said the move will also help in creating job opportunities in rural India

New Delhi, May 31: The Union Cabinet Wednesday approved a ₹1 lakh crore programme to create the world's largest grain storage capacity in the cooperative sector to reduce crop damages and prevent distress sales by farmers, besides strengthening the country's food security.

Briefing media, Information and Broadcasting Minister Anurag Singh Thakur said the Cabinet has approved the "world's largest grain storage plan in the cooperative sector". On investment, he said the programme will start "with an expenditure of around ₹1 lakh crore" As per the plan, a godown of 2,000

tonne capacity will be established in each block. This will help in strengthening the cooperative sector, as Primary Agricultural Credit Societies (PACS) can diversify into the storage of food grains. There are 1 lakh PACS in the country, out of which around 63,000 are functional.

Thakur said the country's foodgrains production is around 3,100 lakh tonne, while the storage capacity is only 47 per cent of the total output. In developed economies, he said, the storage ca-



pacities are higher than output. Asked about the source of funding, Thakur said the funds available in ministries of agriculture, food processing and food and consumer affairs would be utilised.

At present, the total grain storage capacity in the country is about 1,450 lakh tonne, he said, adding that 700 lakh tonne storage capacity will now be established in the cooperative sector.

This will take the total capacity to 2,150 lakh tonne. On benefits, the minister said the creation of decentralised storage capacity at the local level would reduce food grain wastage and strengthen the food security of the country.

This would hugely reduce the cost incurred in the transportation of food grains to procurement centres and again transporting the stocks back from warehouses to ration shops, he said.

Mumbai, May 31: Hours after the opposition Nationalist Congress Party met the Mumbai Police Commissioner on the issue, Chief Minister Eknath Shinde directed the Chief Secretary to take action against a couple of websites which published offensive articles against the legendary social reformer Savitribai Phule, here Wednesday.

An official said that the article has created a furore with many political parties and social organ isations raising serious objections to the 'derogatory' references to the pioneer of women's education, Savitribai Phule.

"Taking cognizance of these objections, the CM has directed the Chief Secretary to probe the content of the website and take strict action if there is any objectionable material found in the article

He has also warned that the government will not spare those who indulge in offensive language while writing about great icons," said the official.

The developments came barely hours after a high-level NCP delegation called on Mumbai Commissioner of Police (CP) Vivek Phansalkar and demanded stringent action against two websites for publishing the articles with vulgar references to Savitribai Phule.

Bihar: Jilted lover stabs girl 12 times

Patna, May 31: A jilted lover in Bihar's Sitamarhi district stabbed his former girlfriend 12 times, a police official said Wednesday, adding that the victim sustained severe injuries and is battling for her life in a hospital.

The accused, Chandan Kumar, has been arrested and confessed to committing the crime Tuesday.

According to the police, the victim sustained six stab wounds, including one on her chest.

"After committing the crime, the accused was trying to escape but failed. We have arrested him on the charge of attempt to murder. Investigation is underway. We will take strong action against the accused," said Sitamarhi SP Manoj Kumar Tiwari.

Chandan Kumar confessed to the police that he was in a relationship for five years. But the girl started ignoring him of late and also refused to marry him. "I got angry and stabbed her multiple times," he said. New Delhi, May 31: On the World No Tobacco Day, the Union health ministry Wednesday notified the amended rules under the Cigarettes and Other Tobacco Products Act, 2004, making it mandatory for OTT platforms to display anti-tobacco warnings as are seen in movies screened in theatres and TV pro-

fication, publishers of online curated content displaying tobacco products or their use will be required to display anti-tobacco health spots each of a minimum of 30 seconds at the beginning and middle of the programme.

They shall also be required to exhibit an anti-tobacco health warning as a prominent static message at the bottom of the screen when tobacco products or their use are displayed during the programme.

Also, an audio-visual disclaimer of a minimum of 20 seconds on the ill-effects of tobacco use will have to be also displayed at the beginning and middle of the programme, the source stated.

"The anti-tobacco health warning message as specified in clause(b) of sub-rule (1) shall be legible and readable, with font in black colour on white background and with the warnings 'Tobacco causes cancer'



or 'Tobacco kills'," the notification stated. Besides, the anti-tobacco health warning messages, health spots and audio-visual disclaimers will have to be in the same language as used in the online curated content. The display of tobacco products or their use in online curated content shall not extend to display of the brands of cigarettes or other tobacco products or any form of tobacco product placement and

display of tobacco products or their use in promotional materials.

According to a senior ministry official, the decision was taken following discussions with the Information and Broadcasting ministry and other stakeholders.

'If the publisher of online curated content fails to comply with the provisions of sub-rules (1) to (5), an inter ministerial committee consisting of representatives from

Welfare, Ministry of Information and Broadcasting and Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, shall take action suo motu or on a complaint, and after identifying the publisher of online curated content, issue notice giving reasonable opportunity to explain such failure and make appropriate modification in the content," the notification said.

The expression "online curated content" means any curated catalogue of audio-visual content, other than news and current affairs content, which is owned by licensed to, or contracted to be transmitted by a publisher of online curated content, and made available on demand, including but not limited through subscription, over the internet or computer networks, and includes films. audio visual programmes, television programmes, serials, series and other such content.







Seoul, May 31: A North Korean satellite launch Wednesday ended in failure, sending the booster and payload plunging into the sea, North Korean state media said, and the South's military said it had recovered parts of the launch vehicle.

The new "Chollima-1" satellite launch rocket failed because of instability in the engine and fuel system, state news agency KCNA reported.

It prompted emergency alerts and brief evacuation warnings in parts of South Korea and Japan. The notices were withdrawn with no danger or damage reported.

South Korea's Joint Chiefs of Staff said the military was conducting a salvage operation to recover what is believed to be parts of the space launch vehicle.

The military shared pictures of a large cylindrical object floating in the sea about 200 km (124.27 miles) off the west coast island of Eocheongdo.

George William Herbert, adjunct professor at the Center for

Nonproliferation Studies and a missile consultant, said the images showed at least part of a rocket, including an "interstage" section designed to connect to another stage. It is most likely a liquid-fuel

rocket, and a round, brown object inside is likely a propellant tank for either fuel or oxidizer, Herbert added Officials from the United States, Japan, South Korea held a phone

call, where they "strongly condemned" the launch, Japan's foreign ministry said.

Better data needed: NASA UFO panel

Washington, May 31: The first public meeting of a NASA panel studying what the government calls "unidentified aerial phenomena," commonly known as UFOs, kicked off Wednesday to discuss findings since its formation last year.

The 16-member body, assembling experts from fields ranging from physics to astrobiology, was formed last June to examine unclassified UFO sightings, which it refers to as UAPs, and other data collected from civilian government and commercial sectors.

"If I were to summarize in one line what I feel we've learned, it's we need high quality data," said panel chair David Spergel during opening remarks.

NASA said the focus of

"Harassment only leads to further stigmatization of the UAP field, significantly hindering the scientific process and discouraging others to study this important subject matter," NASA's science chief Nicola Fox said.

The panel represents the first such inquiry ever conducted under the auspices of the US space agency for a subject the government once consigned to the exclusive and secretive purview of military and national security officials.

The NASA study is separate from a newly formalized Pentagonbased investigation of unidentified aerial phenomena documented in recent years by military aviators and analyzed by US defense and intelligence officials.

Panel officials Wednesday, having relied on unclassified data sensors, indicated they have run into much of the same obstacles as their Pentagon counterparts in studying unidentified objects.

"The current data collection efforts about UAPs are unsystematic and fragmented across various agencies, often using instruments uncalibrated for scientific data collection," Spergel said.

The parallel NASA and Pentagon efforts, both undertaken with some semblance of public scrutiny, highlight a turning point for the government after decades spent deflecting, debunking and discrediting sightings of unidentified flying objects - long associated with notions of flying saucers and aliens - dating back to the 1940s.

Earth is 'really quite sick now', in danger zone: Study

London, May 31: Earth has pushed past seven out of eight scientifically established safety limits and into "the danger zone," not just for an overheating planet that's losing its natural areas, but for well-being of people living on it, according to a new study.

The study looks not just at guardrails for the planetary ecosystem but for the first time it includes measures of "justice," which is mostly about preventing harm for countries, ethnicities and genders. The study by the international scientist group Earth Commission

published in Wednesday's journal Nature looks at climate, air pollution, phosphorus and nitrogen contamination of water from fertilizer overuse, groundwater supplies, fresh surface water, the unbuilt natural environment and the overall natural and human-built environment. Only air pollution wasn't quite at the danger point globally.

Air pollution is dangerous at local and regional levels, while climate was beyond the harmful levels for humans in groups but not quite past the safety guideline for the planet as a system, the study from the Swedish group said. The study found "hotspots" of **CLIMATE CALAMITY**



problem areas throughout Eastern Europe, South Asia, the Middle East, Southeast Asia, parts of Africa and much of Brazil, Mexico, China and some of the US West — much of it from climate change. About two-thirds of Earth don't meet the

"We are in a danger zone for most of the Earth system boundaries," said study co-author Kristie Ebi, a professor of climate and public health at the

It's not a terminal diagnosis. The planet can recover if it changes, including its use of coal, oil and natural gas and the way it treats the land and water, the scientists said.



that helped push the annual growth rate to 7.2 per cent. After this, the Indian economy is now \$3.3 trillion in size.

Asia's third-largest economy beat all estimates to grow at 6.1 per cent in January-March, the last quarter of the 2022-23 fiscal, up from a revised 4.5 per cent in the previous quarter, government data released Wednesday showed.

The growth was boosted by a 5.5 per cent expansion in agriculture and a 4.5 per cent growth in manufacturing. Other sectors of the economy - construction, services and mining - too posted handsome growth rates.

The economic expansion was recorded at 6.1 per cent during the March 2023 quarter, while it was 4.5 per cent in October-December and 6.2 per cent in July-September 2022. The growth was 13.1 per cent in April-June 2022, as per the data re-

leased by the National Statistical Office (NSO) For the full 2022-23 fiscal (April 2022 to March 2023), the growth

fourth quarter from 6.7 per cent in the year-ago period. GVA growth in the services sector -- trade, hotel, transport, com-

munication and services related to broadcasting -- was 9.1 per cent in the fourth quarter against a growth of five per cent a year ago. Financial, real estate and professional services grew by 7.1 per cent in the March 2023 quarter compared to 5.7 per cent in the

year-ago period. Public administration, defence and other services posted 3.1 per cent growth in the quarter against 5.2 per cent expansion in the same quarter a year ago.

Separately, provisional Union government finance numbers as per controller general of accounts showed limiting of fiscal deficit to 6.4 per cent of the GDP in 2022-23, mainly due to continued good performance of tax and non-tax revenue.

Also, the overall core infrastructure sector growth for FY23 came in at 7.7 per cent with a solid performance in the coal, fertiliser and electricity sectors.

However, core sectors' growth for April 2023 again came in at a tepid 3.5 per cent year-on-year. A contraction in the output of crude oil, natural gas, refinery products and electricity along with a high base effect pushed the core sector growth to a six-month low.

Fiscal deficit narrows to 6.4% of GDP in FY23

New Delhi, May 31: The Centre's fiscal deficit narrowed to 6.4 per cent of the GDP in 2022-23 from 6.71 per cent in FY22, as anticipated by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman in her Budget in February this year.

In the Union Budget, the government aimed to further bring down the fiscal deficit -- a key indicator of borrowing -- during the current financial year 2023-24 to 5.9 per cent of the gross domestic product (GDP).

Unveiling the revenue-expenditure data of the Union government for 2022-23, the Controller General of Accounts (CGA) said the fiscal deficit in absolute terms was ₹17,33,131 crore (provisional), marginally down from the amount projected in the Revised Estimates (RE) in the Budget.

CGA said the government received ₹24.56 lakh crore (101 per cent of corresponding RE 2022-23 of total receipts) during 2022-23.

It comprised ₹20.97 lakh crore tax revenue (Net to Centre), ₹2.86 lakh crore of non-tax revenue and ₹72,187 crore of non-debt capital receipts. Non-debt capital receipts con-


sist of the recovery of loans and miscellaneous capital receipts.

About ₹9.48 lakh crore has been transferred to state governments as devolution of taxes by the central government, which is ₹ 50,015 crore higher than the previous year (2021-22).

The CGA data further revealed that the Centre's total expenditure was ₹41.89 crore (100 per cent of corresponding RE 2022-23), out of which ₹34.52 lakh crore was on the revenue account and ₹7.36 lakh crore on the capital account.

Out of the total revenue expenditure, ₹9.28 lakh crore was on account of interest payments and ₹5.31 lakh crore towards major subsidies.

As per CGA, the revenue deficit for the fiscal ending March 2023 was 3.9 per cent of GDP while the effective revenue deficit worked out to be 2.8 per cent of GDP.

Aditi Nayar, Chief Economist and Head - Research and Outreach, Icra, said the government was able to restrict its FY2023 fiscal deficit at ₹17.3 lakh crore, a shade below the FY2023 RE, with higher than estimated revenue receipts and a small undershooting in revenue expenditure, offsetting the disinvestment miss and a healthier than

expected capex. "In FY2023, the government's net tax revenues reported a healthy growth of 15.2 per cent. amidst a 17.8 per cent contraction in non-tax revenues, 7.8 per cent increase in revenue expenditure, and a robust 24.2 per cent expansion in capex," she said.

Key infra sector growth slows to 6-month low

New Delhi, May 31: The production growth of eight key infrastructure sectors slowed down to a six-month low of 3.5 per cent in April 2023 due to a decline in the output of crude oil, natural gas, refinery products and electricity.

The core sector growth was 9.5 per cent in April 2022, while in March 2023, the key infra sectors recorded a growth rate of 3.6 per cent. The growth rate in April 2023 is the lowest since October 2022 when the sectors expanded by 0.7 per cent.

Coal production growth declined to 9 per cent in April this year, according to the official data released. Fertiliser production soared by

23.5 per cent, steel by 12.1 per cent and cement output by 11.6 per cent in April, the data showed.

The output of crude oil, natural gas, refinery products and electricity declined by (-) 3.5 per cent, (-) 2.8 per cent, (-) 1.5 per cent and (-) 1.4 per cent, respectively.

The eight core industries comprise 40.27 per cent of the weight of items included in the Index of Industrial Production (IIP).



Govt to sell up to 3% stake in CIL

New Delhi, May 31: The government Wednesday proposed to sell up to three per cent stake in Coal India Ltd through the offer for sale route from June 1.

The Offer for Sale (OFS) will be open for retail and non-retail investors June 1 and 2.

The proposal is to offload 9.24 crore shares amounting to a stake of 1.5 per cent in the coal producer. Besides, there will be a green shoe option for selling an equal amount of stake in case of over subscription, according to a regulatory fil-

The company, which started selling its made-in-India vehicles from 2012, currently sells entry level car Kwid, compact SUV Kiger and multipurpose vehicle Triber.

Patanjali Foods to dilute 6% share

New Delhi: Patanjali Foods Wednesday said its promoters plan to sell shares to institutional investors in June for dilution of a 6 per cent stake to meet minimum nublic shareholding norms of 25 per cent. Patanjali Foods Ltd (PFL), erstwhile Ruchi Sova Industries, was acquired in September 2019 by Baba Ramdey-led Patanjali Group through a corporate insolvency resolution process. In an interview with PTI. Ramdev said: "We are planning to meet the minimum shareholding norms as prescribed by the market regulator SEBI.'

Bank credit to industry decelerates

Bank credit growth to the services sector accelerated to 21.6% annually in April 2023

Mumbai, May 31: Growth of bank credit to industry decelerated to 7 per cent in April 2023 as compared to the corresponding month in the previous year, according to Reserve Bank data.

The Sectoral Deployment of Bank Credit - April 2023 of the RBI also said personal loans growth registered a growth of 19.4 per cent (y-o-y) in April 2023 as against 14.4 per cent a vear ago, mainly driven by housing and vehicle loans.

Loan to agriculture and allied activities improved to 16.7 per cent (yo-y) in April 2023 from 10.6 per cent a year ago.

"Credit to industry registered a growth of 7 per cent (y-o-y) in April 2023 as compared with 8 per cent in April 2022," it said.



Size-wise, credit to large industry rose by 5.3 per cent as compared with 1.3 per cent a year ago. Credit growth of medium industries was 19.1 per cent as against 53.7 per cent last vear. Credit to micro and small industries registered a growth of 9.7 per cent in April 2023 (29.8 per cent a year ago).

RBI further said among major industries, credit growth (y-o-y) to 'basic metal & metal products' and 'petroleum, coal products & nuclear fuels' accelerated in April 2023 as compared with the corresponding month of the previous year.

Credit growth to 'chemicals &chemical products', 'food processing', 'infrastructure' and 'textiles' decelerated.

Bank credit growth to the services sector accelerated to 21.6 per cent annually in April 2023 from 11.2 per cent a year ago, primarily due to the improved credit offtake to non-banking financial companies and trade.

RBI said data on sectoral deployment of bank credit for April was collected from 40 select commercial banks, accounting for about 93 per cent of the total non-food credit deployed by all banks.

At the closing price of ₹241.20 apiece on BSE Wednesday, the sale of 3 per cent stake in Coal India would be worth around ₹4,400 crore.

"The seller proposes to sell up to 9,24,40,924 equity shares of face value of ₹10 each of the company (representing 1.50 per cent of the total paid-up equity share capital of the company) (base offer size), on June 1st and 2nd for retail investors and non retail investors," the filing said.

There will be an option to additionally sell 9,24,40,924 (1.50 per cent) equity shares of the company, it added.



Adani to raise \$3.5bn

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New Delhi: Billionaire Gautam Adani's conglomerate is looking to raise about \$3 billion through an equity share sale to institutional investors in the boldest comeback strategy after the ports-toenergy group was hit by a damning report of a US short seller. While boards of Adani Enterprises Ltd - the group's flagship firm - and electricity transmission company Adani Transmission Ltd have already approved raising up to ₹21,000 crore (over \$2.5 billion) through share sales to qualified institutional investors, the board of Adani Green Energy Ltd is likely to do so for raising up to \$1 billion in the next couple of weeks, sources aware of the matter said

New Delhi, May 31: About 40-50 foreign direct investment (FDI)proposals from countries sharing land border with India under the provisions of Press Note 3 are pending for approval with the govern-

ment, official sources said. Under Press Note 3, the government has made its prior approval mandatory for foreign investments from countries that

share land border with India. These countries are China, Bangladesh, Pakistan, Bhutan, Nepal, Myanmar and Afghanistan.

As per that decision, FDI proposals from these countries need government approval for investments in India in any sector.

"About 40-50 proposals are pending with the commerce and industry ministry as they require security and political clearances,' one of the sources said. Sources added that there is no

consideration at present to ease norms under this press note. "FDI is not totally banned from these countries. It is just that they

(investors from these countries) have to follow the government approval route and of course that

takes times," a source said. As per industry sources, MG Motor, a British brand owned by

local partners and investors over the next 2-4 years as it looks to raise around ₹5,000 crore capital to fund next round of its growth in the country.

The automaker has been looking to raise capital for some time now to fund its expansion.

With little success so far, it has now started looking for other options to raise the required capital.

Total FDI flows into India, which include equity inflows, reinvested earnings and other capital, declined 16 per cent to \$70.97 billion in last fiscal year as against \$84.83 billion in 2021-22 due to lower inflows in important sectors such as automobiles, computer hardware

Press Note 3 was introduced in

April 2020 as the government wanted to curb opportunistic takeovers of domestic firms following the Covid-19 pandemic.

An inter-ministerial committee has been formed by the government to scrutinise these proposals.

All administrative ministries and departments have been advised to have dedicated FDI cells to process these proposals expeditiously.

India received \$2.5 billion FDI equity from China during period April 2000 to March 2023.

During the period, India received \$0.076 million investments from Bangladesh, \$3.31 million from-Nepal, \$9 million from Myanmar and \$2.57 million from Afghanistan.

In the bowling department, while the likes of Mohammed Siraj Shardul Thakur, Axar Patel, Jaydev Unadkat and Umesh Yadav were part of the first batch to travel to England, pace spearhead Mohammed Shami's departure was delayed as the IPL final in Ahmedabad last Sunday was moved to the reserve day after incessant rain.

The middle-order mainstay Virat Kohli was also among the players who left in the first batch along

with the Rahul Dravid-led coaching staff. Kohli joined the camp on Monday along with Cheteshwar Pujara, who linked up with the squad in England as he was busy playing County Championship for Sussex

The Indian team is expected to have a few practice sessions at the Arundel Castle Cricket Club in Sussex ahead of the big final.

"The preparation has been good so far. The initial bit was to ease into the practice session but the last two sessions have been pretty happy — I think we pushed them a little bit. Just adding a little bit of workload for the bowlers, just kind of preparing them for the Test match," said India's bowling coach Paras Mhambrey in a video released by the BCCI.

"(We are) happy with the conditions, I think it is a lovely ground,

Mhambrey said while the bowlers will get some rest in days leading up to the WTC final, the group is determined to extract the maximum benefits from the training sessions.

"We have two more sessions now, we want to build up especially with the bowlers in a couple of sessions. One day before the Test match, all of us have an easier option, the bowlers' option is they take an off and maybe one or two sessions before that.

"If you look at it, we have three quality sessions in which we can push them in and try to get the best out of every session we have,' he said.

India batting coach Vikram Rathour said the focus will also be on adapting to the longest format. "They have all played a lot of cricket. Whatever time we are getting, it is about adapting to a different format, getting used to playing with the red ball and getting a few sessions in and getting used to the format," he said.

"He will have the captains here as far as the Oval pitch is concerned and don't forget he has also been captaining the team, so he definitely will have worked out quite a few strategies seeing that Steve Smith, the Australian is his teammate at the moment."

Gavaskar also said the Indian batters, coming off the IPL, will have to adjust their bat speed ahead of the WTC final, and advised them to play as late as possible.

"I think they are going to look at their bat speed. Coming from T20 where the bat speed is very fast to Test cricket where the bat speeds got to be a lot more control, that is something they'll need to do,' Gavaskar told Star Sports.

He also emphasized the need for batters to play as late as possible in English conditions, allowing for swing and avoiding the mistake of reaching out for the ball.

Sindhu, however, faltered in the opening round, going down fighting 8-21, 21-18, 18-21 to Canada's

In other matches, Ashmita, who came through the qualifiers, beat compatriot Malvika Bansod 17-21, 14-21, while London Olympics bronze medallist Saina defeated Canada's Wen Yu Zhang 21-13, 21-7. Ashmita will next face Carolina Marin, while Saina is likely to meet He Bing Jiao of China.

Srikanth lost 8-21, 21-16, 14-21 against China's Weng Hong Yang. Praneeth also found France's Christo Popov too hot to handle, going down 14-21, 16-21 in another match.

Orleans Masters winner Priyanshu Rajawat too couldn't cross the opening hurdle, going down 19-21 10-21 to Malaysia's Ng Tze Yong. Former World No.11 Sameer Verma went down 15-21, 15-21 to Denmark's Magnus Johannesen. Ashwini Bhat K and Shikha Gautam lost to Korea's third seed Baek Ha Na and Lee So Hee 11-21, 6-21 in women's doubles.

The BWF World Tour is divided into six levels, namely World Tour Finals, four Super 1000, six Super 750, seven Super 500, and 11 Super 300 in order. One other category of tournament, the BWF Tour Super 100 level, also offers ranking points. The Super 500 is a Grade 2 (level 4) event in the BWF tournament ranking system.

Protesting wrestlers return to their homes

New Delhi, May 31: The "shellshocked" protesting wrestlers, except Sakshi Malik, have returned to their homes in Harvana, and did not speak with the waiting media in Haridwar due to a silence vow, a member of the protest group said Wednesday.

The grapplers had resumed their agitation against Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) chief Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh April 23 at Jantar Mantar and stayed there till May 28, the day they were detained by the Delhi Police during their march towards the new Parliament building.

Immediately after their detention, the police cleared the protest site and made it clear that wrestlers will not be allowed back to the Jantar Mantar. The police action against the wrestlers drew criticism from different quarters.

Tuesday, they threatened to immerse their medals into the holy river Ganga but the farmer leaders stopped them from taking the extreme step.

"They were crying since morning. It is not easy to throw away even a medal won at district level and they were ready to throw away those big international medals. They were shell-shocked, not a word was coming out of their mouths," said a member of the protesting group.

"They had taken a silence vow for Tuesday and that's why they did

not speak with anyone in Haridwar. All have returned to their respective homes but Sakshi is still in Delhi," he added.

While the wrestlers did not address the media, they were seen having discussions among themselves, whispering in each other's ears.

The mood was sombre when the wrestlers arrived at the famous Har ki Pauri with their medals as they wept and were being consoled by their family members. They did not carry out their threat and returned with their medals after farmer leaders sought five days to sort out their issues

The wrestlers have been demanding the arrest of Brij Bhushan, who they have accused of sexual exploitation. Two FIRs were filed against him, including one in POCSO act, but it is now being claimed that the 'minor' who has filed a complaint against the WFI chief is actually not a minor.

The oversight panel, which was formed by the government to probe the allegations, did not make its findings public but sources had claimed that the six-member committee did not find any incriminating evidence against Brij ২ Bhushan.

The WFI chief has denied all the charges and said that even if one allegation is proved, he will "hang himself". Brij Bhushan has alleged political conspiracy behind the protest.

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
