(RBI) Governor Shaktikanta Das, Rhe six-member MPC will meet for
three days and the decision would be announced Thursday, June 8 . After the last MPC meeting in April, the RBI paused its rate hike
cycle and stayed with the 6.5per cent repo rate. Prior to that the central bank had cumulatively hiked the
repor rate by 250 basis points since May repor rate by 250 basis pointssince
2022 in a bid to contain inflation. The MPC is meeting in the back-
drop of CPI inflation declining to an 18-month low of 4.7 per cent in April. Das recently indicated that the May print would be lower than
the April numbers. The CPI for May is scheduled to be announced June 12. On expectations from the
MPC, Rumki Majumdar, Economist, Deloitte India said, "We expect a pause in this meeting as growth conthe global economy slowing down, here are risks that the slowdown contagion may impact us." Globally,

 Bhubaneswar, June 6: The state govBalasore train crash to 288 , which includes 39 from Odisha so far, while theCentral Bureau of Investigation (CBI) started its probe into alleged criminal negligence leading to the mishap after registering an FIR, Tuesday. Speaking to reporters, Chief Secretary
Praden Pradeep Kumar Jena said 275 deaths
were confirmed till Monday, and after verification of bodies, the figure was raised to 288. Jena said 205 bodies of the total 288
have been identified so over to their families. The remaining 83 odies were kept at AIIMS-Bhubaneswar and other hospitals for identification, he said. "People are facing difficulties
in identifying the bodies as they are in in identifying the bodies as they are in
a very bad shape. So, body embalming and DNA sampling is being carried out at AIIMS-Bhubaneswar," he added. The government had reported the
