'India threatened to shut Twitter' GOVT DISMISSES TWITTER EX-CEO'S ALLEGATION AS AN 'OUTRIGHT LIE'

New Delhi, June 13: India threatened to shut Twitter down unless it complied with orders to restrict accounts critical of the government's handling of farmer protests, the social media platform's cofounder Jack Dorsey has said, an accusation Union Minister Rajeev Chandrasekhar dismissed as an 'outright lie', Tuesday.

In an interview to YouTube channel 'Breaking Points', Dorsey, who quit as Twitter CEO in 2021, claimed that the Indian government 'pressured' the company with threats of a shutdown and raids on employees if it did not comply with 'requests' to take down posts and restrict accounts that were critical of the government over the protest by farmers against new agri laws in 2020 and 2021.

"It manifested in ways such as: 'We will shut Twitter down in India', which is a very large mar-



ket for us; 'we will raid the homes of your employees', which they did; and this is India, a democratic country," Dorsey said. Rubbishing the claims, the

Minister of State for IT Rajeev Chandrasekhar tweeted that Dorsey's Twitter regime 'had a problem accepting the sovereignty of Indian law'. "No one went to jail nor was Twitter 'shutdown', Chandrasekhar said. "This is an outright lie by @jack - perhaps an attempt to brush out that very dubious period of twitters history."



4% DA hike for


Bhubaneswar, June 13: Ahead of Raja, the state government announced a four per cent hike in dearness allowance (DA) for its employees and pensioners, Tuesday.

The DA for employees and pensioners has been increased to 42 per cent from the existing 38 per cent.

A release issued by the Chief Minister's Office (CMO) said the enhanced DA will be applicable with retrospective effect from January 1, 2023 and the employees will receive the amount with their June salary. A total of 7.5 lakh employees and pensioners will get the benefit.

Bhubaneswar, June 13: At least 19 persons sustained burn injuries in a steam leak incident at Tata Steel's Meramandali plant in Dhenkanal district Tuesday, police said. Workers and engineers were

inspecting the blast furnace of Meramandali plant around 1pm when steam leaked, leaving at least 19 of them injured. The injured persons were im-

mediately rushed to a private hospital in CDA area of Cuttack. Dhenkanal Collector Saroj Kumar Sethi, superintendent of police (SP) Gyana Ranjan Mohapatra and other senior officials reached the site to take stock of the situ-

ation. The SP said that around 19 persons were injured in the incident. However, a Tata Steel spokesperson said 17 persons suffered burn injuries, including one who was described as serious.

The injured persons were immediately shifted to the Occupational Health Centre on the plant premises and then to Cuttack for further treatment, as a precautionary measure, in the company's ambulance, accompanied by doctor and paramedics, the statement added.

All emergency protocols were activated and the area has been cordoned off, the steel major said.

"We are working closely with relevant authorities on ground and have initiated an internal investigation to ascertain the cause of the accident," the company said, adding that safety remains its top priority

Mourners stunned as 'dead woman comes alive' in coffin

Quito (Ecuador), June 13: A 76-yearold woman who was declared dead at a hospital in Ecuador astonished her relatives by knocking on her coffin during her wake. The incident has prompted a government investigation into the hospital.

Relatives left the coffin behind and rushed retired nurse Bella Montova back to the hospital after the wake Friday in the central city of Babahoyo, son Gilberto Barbera told The Associated Press. "It gave us all a fright," Barbera said, adding that doctors have said his mother's situation remains dire. Ecuador's Health Ministry said that Montoya was in intensive

care Monday at the Martín Icaza Hospital in Babahoyo while the ministry investigates doctors involved in her case. A technical committee has been formed to review how the hospital issues death certificates, the ministry said in a statement. Initially, Montoya had been admitted Friday at the hospital with a possible stroke and cardiopulmonary arrest, and when she did not respond to resuscita-


The family members then brought her to a funeral home and were holding a wake later Friday when they started to hear strange sounds. "There were about 20 of us there," Barbera said. "After about five hours of the wake, the coffin started to make sounds. My mom was wrapped in sheets and hitting the coffin, and when we approached we

could see that she was breathing heavily." Though he and relatives rushed her back to the hospital Friday, she was still in serious condition Monday. She was under intubation, and doctors weren't giv-

ing relatives much hope about her prognosis, Barbera said. Bella Montoya is not the only person to 'come alive' after being officially declared dead.

In February, an 82-year-old woman was found to be breathing while lying in a funeral home in New York. She had been pronounced dead three hours earlier at a nursing home.

Bhubaneswar, June 13: Vigilance officials Tuesday arrested two officials - Bikash Chandra Bhuyan, assistant engineer of Cuttack Sadar block, and Pradeep Kumar Chandrakar, banking assistant of Bhawanipatna Central Cooperative Bank, Komna branch in Nuapada - for possessing disproportionate assets (DA).

In the first instance, Vigilance reg istered a case against Bhuyan, and his spouse under Section 13(2) r/w 13(1)(b)/12 of Prevention of Corruption Amendment Act, 2018. He was forwarded to the court of Special Judge, Vigilance, Cuttack.

During house searches, movable and immovable assets worth crores were unearthed in the name of Bhuyan and his family members. The properties detected include one double-storied building at Soubhagya Nagar in Capital city, seven plots in prime locations of Bhubaneswar and Cuttack, bank deposits and jewellery over Rs 50 lakh. This apart, investment in cryp-

tocurrencies, one four-wheeler, three two-wheelers worth Rs 13.40 lakh, and cash and household articles worth Rs 11.73 lakh were also unearthed.

Besides, Bhuyan had spent ap-



proximately Rs 1 crore on engineering and medical education of

his son and daughter. In the second case, the Vigilance sleuths arrested Pradeep Kumar Chandrakar, banking assistant of Bhawanipatna Central Cooperative Bank, in connection with a DA case.

He was forwarded to Court of Special Judge, Vigilance, Bhawanipatna for possession of DA to the tune of 254 per cent of his known sources of income.

A case has been registered against Chandrakar and his spouse under Section 13(2) r/w 13(1)(b)/12 PC Amendment Act, 2018.

During searches, movable and immovable assets worth crores were unearthed. 'Power cuts due to governance deficit'

Bhubaneswar, June 13: Taking on the state government over frequent power cuts amid the heat, Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan Tuesday said it was happening because of "governance deficit". The state BJP also announced a two-day agitation outside Tata Power offices across the state from Wednesday over the issue.

Maintaining that Odisha was rich in coal and have several hydropower projects, Pradhan said, "It is sad that the people of this state are facing power outages. There is no shortage of resources to generate power here."

He said other states generate electricity by procuring coal from Odisha, but the people here were experiencing loading shedding.

"There is power in the state, but they cannot reach the people because of governance deficit," he said. The officials were busy in publicity for the gov-

ernment rather than governance, he alleged.

Reacting to Chief Secretary PK Jena pulling up TP Central Odisha Distribution Ltd on social media for sluggish restoration of supply, Pradhan said it was not acceptable.

"The government must have signed an agreement with the discoms (distribution companies) regarding smooth electricity supply to the people. It should now ensure its proper implementation," he said.

State Energy Minister PK Deb has blamed poor infrastructure and nor'westers for the power cuts, claiming that there was no power shortage in the state.

Two senior leaders of the BJD - Rajya Sabha MP Amar Patnaik and Cuttack Mayor Subhas Singh also expressed displeasure over the frequent power outages in the state.

Patnaik held Tata Power responsible for the situation, stating that the situation was a result of improper load balancing.

"The disruption in power supply occurs due to some gaps or shortfall in distribution which are not being reviewed and upgraded from time to time," he said.

Researchers from the University of Sheffield, UK, argued that AI systems are unlikely to resemble real brain processing no matter how large their neural networks or the datasets used to train them might become, if they remain disembodied.

Current AI systems, such as ChatGPT, use large neural networks to solve difficult problems, such as generating intelligible written text. These networks teach AI to process data in a way that is inspired by the human brain and also learn from their mistakes in order to improve and become more accurate. However, the researchers



said there are also important differences. Human brain directly senses and acts in the world. Disembodied AIs, on the other hand, learn to recognise and generate complex patterns in data but lack a direct connection to the physical world. Therefore such AIs have no understanding or awareness of the world around them.

Further, the human brains are made up of multiple subsystems, which are organised in a specific configuration -- known as architecture -- that is similar in all ver-

tebrate animals from fish to humans, but not in AI.

The team said that the biological intelligence -- like in the human brain -- has developed because of this specific architecture and how it has used its connections to the real world to overcome challenges, learn and improve throughout evolution.

This interaction between evolution and development is rarely factored into the design of AI, according to the study, published in the journal Science Robotics.

"ChatGPT, and other large neural network models, are exciting developments in AI which show that really hard challenges like learning the structure of human language can be solved. However, these types of AI systems are unlikely to advance to the point where they can fully think like a human brain if they continue to be designed using the same methods," said Tony Prescott, Professor of Cognitive Robotics at the varsity.

"It is much more likely that AI systems will develop human-like cognition if they are built with architectures that learn and improve in similar ways to how the human brain does, using its connections to the real world. Robotics can provide AI systems with these connections -- for example, via sensors such as cameras and microphones and actuators such as wheels and grippers.

Cash crop cultivation on the wane in Kendrapara

LACK OF WATER AND MARKETING FACILITIES PROMPTING FARMERS TO SEEK OTHER METHODS OF LIVELIHOOD

Kendrapara, June 13: Cultivation of cash crops like sugarcane, jute, arhar and sunflower are on the wane in this district due to a number of reasons. Among them are the lack of irrigation facilities, the closure of a sugarcane crushing mill and proper marketing opportunities, sources said Tuesday.

The economy of Kendrapara district is agriculture oriented More than 70 per cent of the residents of this district are dependent on agriculture for their livelihood. However, due to the various problems they face, more and more farmers are turning towards other means of income.

Sources pointed out that even a few years back, sugarcane cultivation was being carried out on 15,000 hectares of land. Now it has been reduced to only 1,000 hectares. Sugarcane farmer Akshaya Behera of Pattamundai area said

that farmers in Garadpur, Derabish, Marshaghai, Pattamundai, Aul and Rajkanika blocks were into sugarcane cultivation even five-10 years back. This was because of the presence of a sugarcane crushing mill. However, with the mill closing down, most of these farmers have stopped sug-

arcane cultivation. Whatever cultivation is done is for the festive season, Behera added. Similarly, a jute research centre has been lying defunct for a long time. Hence people are not going in for jute cultivation.

Sources said people in this district were cultivating pulses like arhar and sunflower in the past, but that has been abandoned due to lack of proper water supply and the absence of mandis. Locals pointed out farmers will only be attracted to cultivate various produces only if there is uninterrupted supply of water.

Farmer Niranjan Parida of

Kansar village under Kendrapara block pointed out that spiralling labour costs is another reason why people are turning away from agriculture. He informed that he was growing arhar and sunflower on 15 acres of land, but this year he could not do so as costs have increased. As a result his two sons have migrated to Surat to earn their livelihood.

Farmer leader Gayadhar Dhal said the 'Atmanirbhar Bharat' scheme of the Centre and the state government's promise to give special attention to agriculture in this district is yet to be implemented. "The state government had promised to dig up an irrigation canal. However, it hasn't been done in

the last 28 years," Dhal said. Dhal said sugarcane cultivation

should be promoted as there is a need for 2.21 lakh MT of sugar in Odisha. However, first the government has to provide proper marketing facilities for the product. Local intellectual Mir Abbu Obeda said water management is a major problem in Kendrapara district. The only way to solve it, is to link the rivers in the district. It will end the irrigation woes and also minimise the damages due to floods, Obeda added.

Senior agriculture scientist Surya Narayan Mishra of Krishi Vigyan Kendra at Jajang said that Kendrapara district receives sufficient rainfall and has four types of soils for which farmers should take up integrated farming. They should dig up ponds to collect rain water and take up cultivation of vegetables, fruits, mushroom, turmeric and medicinal plants to boost their incomes.

Jajpur, June 13: One of the eight main accused in the jewellery shop loot case in this district has been arrested from Bihar, police said Tuesday. The accused, identified as Rupesh Kumar, is from Gauriya Chaman village of Warispur under Bhagwanpur poice limits in Vaishali district of Bihar. Incidentally, the showroom situated in this town was looted by eight miscreants at around 1.30pm May 15. Jajpur SP, Vinit Agrawal told reporters here that the accused had arrived at Balasore two days prior to the loot and had camped there. On the day of the burglary, he and an accomplice had driven down from Balasore to take part in the loot. After the loot, the eightmember gang separated and went in different directions, police said.

"A dacoity case was earlier registered at Jajpur Road police station and multiple teams were formed to carry out an investigation into the armed robbery. The probe is still continuing," Agrawal stated. "We have found out that eight persons were involved in the crime. Three motorcycles used in committing the crime have been recovered by the police teams, including some documents and mobile phones. 

Berhampur, June 13: Despite the MKCG Medical College and Hospital being the lifeline for people in Ganjam and Gajapati districts, it does not have burn care unit. As a result all burn cases are referred to either the SCB Medical College and Hospital in Cuttack or to treatment centres in neighbouring Andhra Pradesh.

Despite the state government facilitating treatment, by modernising the hospital, the lack of a burn care unit continues to haunt all. There have been many cases when severe burn patients have breathed their last en route to other



hospitals. Locals pointed out that the authorties or the Health defiled by social worker Rabindra partment should immediately set Kumar Mishra with the National up a centre for treatment of pa-Human Rights Commission tients with burn injuries. (NHRC). He has asked NHRC to

instruct the Odisha government to set up a burn care unit in MKCG at the earliest.

There is a high rate of burn injuries during summer. On many occasions, such patients are admitted to the General Ward at the MKCG as it would be too dangerous to send them to other hospitals. Just a couple of days back, a lady, identified as Supriya Bastarai of Raiponka village in Gajapati district was brought to the MKCG with severe burn injuries. However, the hospital refused to admit her as there were no treatment facilities. Another patient died while on the way to Cuttack. February 9, 2021, 27 persons suf-

fered serious burn injuries in the Mendaraj bus tragedy under Golanthara police limits. All of them were brought to MKCG, but 12 of them died due to lack of treatment. Immediately after that the hospital authorities had announced the setting up of a burn care unit. However, it still remains a distant dream.

It should be pointed out that locals have repeatedly appealed to the Odisha government for a burn unit at the MKCG, but to no avail. Sources pointed out that at an average, 30 severe burn cases come to the MKCG every month. Only a few lucky ones manage to survive while many of them die en route to other hospitals.

Bunga Bunga Berlusconi

he death of Italy's Silvio Berlusconi, former Prime Minister and one of the most remarkably colorful personalities of that country since World War II, marks the end of an era of thrills and fun. At the same time he leaves a dangerous legacy that brackets him with the likes of former US President Donald Trump, Russia's Vladimir Putin and Israel's Benjamin Netanyahu, apart from several other leaders in different countries with mass appeal but with exposed autocratic tendencies. The stuff that leaders of the ilk of Berlusconi are made of is immense personal wealth, control of the media, carefully-crafted personality cult, mass appeal, brazen disregard for the laws of the land, financial irregularities and penchant for changing the laws to evade punishment. Added to the list is an unabashed display of amorous pursuits and involvement in sex scandals. His infamous 'Bunga' parties with truckloads of young women brought in were always newsworthy.

Berlusconi's career was tainted by countless allegations of corruption, tax fraud conviction and mafia links. A Wikipedia page on the legal cases he faced runs to over 18,000 words showing how deeply he was mired in controversial and illegal business deals. Yet, he earned the distinction of being one of the dominant figures in Italy's postwar politics. The Milan prosecutor's office, which handled many criminal cases in which Berlusconi was involved, said a few hours after his death that he was "a man who marked the history of Italy." The former Prime Minister died with one unresolved case still pending.

Berlusconi was accused of false accounting, bribing tax officials and magistrates and involvement in the mafia bomb attacks of 1992 and 1993. Yet, despite these very serious allegations, he had a remarkably successful political career. This has made some experts comment that he represented certain typical Italian characteristics that do not make much of rules and value unconventional, uninhibited approach to life.

At a time when social media has become a powerful tool in the hands of politicians, especially those who thrive on polarisation politics, Berlusconi could be regarded as a forerunner in the art of propaganda and demagogy. He began first as a crooner, a showman and then became a real estate giant. Soon, he established his media empire and also became the owner of one of Italy's big football clubs. He manipulated and dominated Italian politics for over two decades.

Berlusconi's sexual escapades eventually tarnished his image and he gradually yielded political space to far-right groups. This was because the liberal democrats had long become discredited in Italian politics for their mismanagement of economy and incompetent governance. He represents a brand of politics where there is no Opposition politician of stature to challenge the main protagonist who charms the electorate with his oratory and a captive media. So many countries, including India, are witnessing such a political phenomenon.

He cultivated friendship with leaders of other countries, including Putin. His intimacy with the latter was such that he even supported Russia's invasion of Ukraine, which was an embarrassment for Italy's PM Giorgia Meloni who does not subscribe to his view, though his party is her alliance partner. No wonder Putin was among the first foreign heads of state to pay his respects, in a rare, lengthy letter to Berlusconi. His words show the affinity between the two autocratic leaders: "For me, Silvio was a dear person, a true friend. During each of our meetings, I was literally charged with his incredible vitality, optimism and sense of humour.'

Berlusconi's sense of humour often bordered on narcissism and salaciousness. He joked about his funeral at the Church of the Holv Sepulchre in Jerusalem, where the body of Jesus had been brought after crucifixion. In a humorous vein, he promised to bring a "bus full of whores," for the footballers of his club, if they could win the championship, which they did.

The world has lost a dangerously charming and colourful politician.


s neoliberalism swiftly gives way to a resurgence of industrial policy in advanced economies, the perspective of low-income countries is being ignored. As in neoliberalism's heyday, a subtle form of intellectual imperialism is skewing the global economic debate toward the interests of major powers.

If developing countries' perspectives were given due consideration, the debate about neoliberalism and industrial policies such as the US Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) would likely play out very differently. After all, the neoliberal Washington Consensus that took hold in the 1980s delivered tangible benefits to the world's poorest countries. The turn away from it could be similarly beneficial if we draw the right lessons from the neoliberal era.

Neoliberals' embrace of markets and globalisation has been widely blamed for a wide range of problems, such as rising inequality, concentration of power, the decline of manufacturing, recurring financial crises, and even the rise of identity politics. But while neoliberalism's liabilities merit serious debate, its balance sheet includes quite a few assets as well. particularly when it comes to the world's poorest regions. As Dev Patel, Justin Sandefur, and I have argued, the era of hyper-globalisation enabled developing countries to reverse a 200-year trend and catch up with their richer counterparts, resulting in the fastest reduction in poverty ever recorded.

The rising tide of global trade lifted developing countries' exports, enabling them to escape economic underdevelopment. While China's success story is well-known, India's remarkable transformation offers an equally relevant example of globalisation's transformative power. Once considered inward-looking and uncompetitive, India achieved 13 per cent average annual growth (in dollar terms) in exports - not just of its fabled IT services but also of its manufacturing output – for nearly 25 years. As economic miracles go, that is hard to beat. Such was the power of globalisation.

It is to be expected that nativist politicians and thinkers in the West focus solely on the effects of neoliberalism on their own countries. But progressive intellectuals' will-



globalisation has been widely blamed for a wide range of problems, such as rising inequality, concentration of power, the decline of manufacturing, recurring financial crises, and even the rise of identity politics. ingness to overlook its positive welfare effects in developing countries is surprising and disconcerting. Any form of cosmopolitanism, whether guided by the utilitarian principle of maximising benefits for the greatest number of people, or inspired by John Rawls' focus on benefiting the least advantaged, would credit globalisation with bringing unprecedented prosperity to billions of people in Sub-Saharan Africa and Asia.

To be fair, intellectuals in developing countries have also celebrated the demise of neoliberalism. While their reasons for downplaying its positive impact remain unclear, this may be an example of what Lant Pritchett calls isomorphic mimicry, whereby they reinforce the intellectual imperialism of their rich-country counterparts. Groupthink is not the monopoly of Davos Man; it afflicts global progressives, too.

A similar dynamic is playing out with the United States' newfound embrace of industrial policy. Setting aside the IRA's domestic po litical ramifications, much of the conversation about the Biden administration's signature climate legislation has focused on its implications for the US-China rivalry, the tensions between the US and the European Union, and the EU's internal politics Suppose, instead, that the IRA

needs of a typical low- or lower-middle-income country that is a net energy importer and reliant on fossil fuels. In this context, all that would matter is its impact on the cost of renewable energy. By fostering technological innovation and facilitating economies of scale, the IRA could drive down energy prices and expand developing countries' energy access, bolster their fiscal positions, and strengthen their climate-mitigation efforts. But the IRA's role as a provider of global public goods has been overlooked.

We tend to forget that the renewables revolution is first and foremost an energy revolution. Enhancing low-income countries' access to energy grids would deliver enormous welfare gains. To expedite the green transition, it is crucial to lower the cost of renewable energy. Given major economies' already-strained balance sheets, it is unrealistic to expect substantial climate financing for developing countries. The recent debates about expanding the World Bank's lending capacity should puncture ambitions about

large financial flows from rich to poor. The practical solution is to ensure that renewables can compete with fossil fuels - and fast. Only technological progress, supported by IRA-type industrial policies, can accelerate this process.

Without affordable, competitive renewable energy, the green transition is a non-starter. But to achieve a just transition, we must ensure that new technologies are accessible to all and are not driven solely by the proprietary interests of private capital. Developing countries' own policies will be critical to achieving this goal.

It is instructive to compare the US approach to industrial policy and the EU's (arguably neoliberal) strategy, which relies on carbon pricing. Unlike the IRA, it is unclear whether the EU plan could provide the global public good of cheaper renewable energy. What is clear, however, is that Europe's carbon border taxes will undermine developing countries' exports of carbon-intensive goods. That is why the anti-neoliberal US policy is better for low-income economies than the European approach

While the IRA's potentially protectionist aims and the risk of worsening tensions between the US and China have little relevance to low- and middle-income countries, any breakdown of the international economic order would have severe consequences for the world's poorest economies. For this reason, the US, Europe, and China must reach some modus vivendi that permits the subsidisation of renewables while minimizing the burden imposed on others. But the cost of renewable energy itself will have the most significant impact on developing countries' prospects.

Today's policy debate is marked by certainty about the failures of neoliberalism and confusion about what comes next. From the perspective of developing countries, however, it is possible to mourn the death of neoliberalism while simultaneously embracing its antithetical successor.

An amino acid may help us live longer

Josser

t is easy to become lost in the fog surrounding the source of this word. There are - or at least, there have been - several meanings to it, which don't all come from the same source. At one time josser was a mildly contemptuous word for a man of the cloth, a clergyman or padre, a term that was better known in Australia than elsewhere. This came from the seaports of the Malay peninsula, having been taken from the pidgin English joss for a Chinese idol or religious image (hence joss stick and good joss, meaning good luck). Joss isn't a Chinese word, however, but from deos, an archaic form of the Portuguese word for God, which makes the name for a clergyman entirely apt, if deviously derived. Then there's the sense of joss for the boss, which is from an obscure English dialect word that was taken to Australia in the middle of the nineteenth century. Our word is used in Polari (or Palari, or other spellings), which was once the private language of showmen and travelling folk. The word is originally from Romany, the language of the Gypsies, and literally means an outsider; it was used for a person who wasn't born to the trade but who joined a circus or travelling fair as an adult. A member of a circus community might once have said (for Polari is now virtually extinct), "Nante palari before the josser cul", "Don't speak Palari before that outsider". There's yet another meaning for josser, for a man, often an old man or one regarded with mild contempt (so it's quite close in meaning to geezer). This is the sense that most often turns up in British and Irish literature during a period of about half a century from the 1880s on. An example is in Five Tales, by John Galsworthy (for whom it was a favourite word): "He lowered himself to the ground, and moved in the bluish darkness towards the gate of his daughter's house. Bob Pillin walked beside him, thinking: 'Poor old josser, he is gettin' a back number!' " Was this a variation on the clergyman sense, or from the English dialect word for the boss, or from the circus sense? Nobody seems to know.

WITH URINE

f you haven't heard of taurine, don't worry. Until a few days

L ago, neither had I. If someone had offered it to me, I would have politely declined. I generally avoid anything containing the word "urine.

But taurine has nothing to do with urine. And taurine is unavoidable—I already have it in my body, though not as much as I did in my younger years.

Taurine is an amino acid that our body produces naturally. It helps us in a number of ways, including keeping our central nervous system functioning and supporting immune health. Taurine is considered a dietary supplement and can be found in many energy drinks. Many people are giving themselves a taurine-boost by buying these supplements and drinks.

It's possible, however, to get taurine for free. You just need to do two things: (1) wear a monkey costume; and (2) visit the lab of Dr Vijay Yadav at Columbia University in New York City.

Yadav has been studying the ef-

fects of taurine on monkeys, mice and even worms.

It's risky, of course, to wear a monkey costume in New York City. You may be captured and taken to the zoo. Much safer to wear the costume in New Delhi, where monkeys are more common and your chances of getting into a taurinetesting lab are just as high. That's because Yadav has been collaborating with a number of researchers around the world, including some at the National Institute of Immunology in Delhi.

It's quite likely that the monkeys getting taurine-boosts are based in Delhi. They're sitting in a lab somewhere, scratching each other's backs as they wait for the next delivery of energy drinks.

Don't feel sorry for the monkeys though-atleast not the ones getting high-dose taurine supplements. Save your sympathy for the monkeys in the control group-the taurine-deprived monkeys.

Yadav and his team compared two groups of middle-aged monkeys and found that the ones who had received six months of taurine treatment showed improved bone density, sugar metabolism and immune function. They were healthier and ready to tackle any challenges that life gave them. The taurine-deprived monkeys, on the other hand, were counting down the days to retirement.

While the middle-aged monkeys received a significant healthboost from taurine, the middleaged mice took it to another level. One day, they were lying around, complaining about aches and pains; the next day, they were ready to run in the Delhi Road Race for Rodents. The mice that received taurine were lighter, stronger and less anxious than the other mice. They also had fewer zombie cells-oldcells that are damaged but refuse to die. Their average lifespan increased by 10 per cent for males and 12 per cent for females. Worms also lived longer. Yadav and his co-researchers published their results in the journal Science. "For the last 25 years, scientists

Nuclear capabilities

Sir, This refers to "China's nuke arsenal growing," Orissa POST, June 13. China continues to rapidly expand its nuclear weapons arsenal, as does Pakistan albeit slowly, but India remains confident of its strategic deterrence capabilities with induction of new-generation Agni ballistic missiles and nuclear-capable Rafale fighter jets. China now has 410 nuclear warheads, while Pakistan has 170 and India 164. Nuclear deterrence, of course, can't be reduced to simplistic counting of the number of warheads, which themselves are just estimates, though well informed ones, because countries keep them closely guarded. With long unresolved "active" borders with both Pakistan and China, which are expanding their nuclear arsenal, India needs robust and assured "second-strike capabilities" in keeping with its declared policy of no "firstuse" of nuclear weapons. India has been taking steps to consolidate its nuclear delivery systems, especially the Agni series of ballistic missiles. Just last week, the first 'pre-induction night launch" of the new-generation Agni-Prime, which has a strike range from 1,000 to 2,000-km, was undertaken by the Strategic Forces Command (SFC). The third leg of the "nuclear triad," however, remains a major concern. India, currently has only one nuclear-powered submarine armed with nuclear-tipped ballistic missiles. In contrast, countries like the US, Russia and China have a fleet of much larger SSBNs armed with well over 5000-km range missiles.

Balaji also holds the Prohibition and Excise portfolio. The Supreme Court had earlier allowed police and ED probe into an alleged cash-forjobs scam against Balaii, who was earlier with the AIADMK. He was

under the provisions of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), the sources said. Last month, the Income Tax department too had searched people close to Balaji in the state. Responding to the ED searches today, Balaji said he was "ready to extend full cooperation" to the investigating agency

"With what intention they have come, what are they looking for, we will see. Let it get over," he told reporters soon after the sleuths started the searches. Whether it be the IT or ED, Balaji assured full cooperation to the authorities concerned. adding whatever explanation sought by officials based on documents, will be provided. The Minister, who went for a morning walk, said he took a taxi back home after receiving a message about the raids on his premises.

The ED officials were accompanied by central paramilitary personnel during the raids. Last month, Income Tax officials were allegedly attacked in Karur when they went to conduct searches at some places linked to Balaji.

4 dead as chemical tanker explodes

This is a big corruption case," MP Congress chief Kamal Nath said.

Nath demanded a probe by an independent agency. He alleged that authorities were ill-prepared to deal with such a situation. "Their preparedness is only for making money," he said.

Narottam Mishra, who is also the state government spokesman, said, "The Congress doesn't participate in helping but looks for opportunities of politics. About 4,000 employees work in the office. Who will take kerosene and petrol to set the fire? I pity their intelligence.

The minister said that the destroyed files will be recreated as the data is available in electronic form at different places. The victim allegedly objected to the criticism of the leaders and he got into a heated argument with the driver.

After some time, other passengers got down at their respective destinations and Rajesh Dubey was the only passenger left in the car. After some time, Rajesh also got down from the car was walking towards his house when Amjad ran the car over him. Dubey died on the spot.

When they learnt of the incident, the local people they staged a demonstration of the Mirzapur-Pravagrai highway. Senior officials reached the spot and pacified them with the assurance of action against the accused.

Fadnavis, who also holds the home portfolio, called the accident "unfortunate". "Three other persons were injured in the accident and are being treated in a local hospital. I pray for their betterment," he said on social media.

The state police, highway police, personnel from INS Shivaji and the fire brigade are at the spot and the fire has been brought under control, he said. The traffic from one side of the highway has resumed. Another side will be opened soon. The situation is being monitored by the state, he added.

Live-in couples cannot seek divorce: Kerala HC

Kochi, June 13: The Kerala High Court has held that the law does not recognise live-in relationships as marriage; it considers as a legal union only weddings solemnised according to personal or secular laws

Therefore, a couple that lives together by virtue of an agreement cannot claim it to be a marriage nor seek a divorce based on that, the high court said, The ruling by a bench of Justices A Muhamed Mustaque and Sophy Thomas came on an interfaith couple's appeal against a family court order dismissing their plea for divorce on the ground that their marriage was not solemnised under the Special

Marriage Act.

The couple, one a Hindu and the other Christian, had been living together since 2006 under a registered agreement and have a 16year-old child. As they no longer wanted to continue their relationship, they had moved the family court for divorce. Disposing of their appeal, the high court said, "The law is yet to recognise the live-in relationship as marriage. The law accords recognition only if the marriage is solemnised in accordance with personal law or in accordance with secular law like the Special Marriage Act. "If the parties decide to live together

by virtue of an agreement, that by itself will not qualify them to claim it as a marriage and claim di-



vorce thereon." The high court said that while there may be a situation where such a relationship qualifies for creation of reciprocal obligation or duties else-

where, that does not mean it can be recognised for the purpose of divorce. The bench further said that law relating to divorce is peculiar in our country and customised through legislation.

'The extra-judicial divorce followed in some communities also got recognition through statutory laws. All other forms of divorce are of statutory nature. "The statute only recognises or allows the parties to divorce if they are married in accordance with the recognised form of marriage applicable as per the personal law or secular law," it said in its order dated June 8.

The high court also held that in the present case, the family court did not have the jurisdiction to entertain such a claim for separation in the first place and instead of dismissing the couple's plea, it should have returned the petition by saying it was not maintainable. "The family court enactment fairs thereon. The marriage referred to in the preamble of the Family Court Act only denotes marriage as recognised by the law. "Any marriage entered into between the parties through a contract has, so far, not got any recognition under law for the purpose of granting divorce. In such circumstances, the family court also does not have jurisdiction to entertain such a claim for divorce," the bench said. It directed the family court to return the couple's plea holding that it was not maintainable. "The parties are given liberty to work out their remedy elsewhere. Accordingly, this appeal is disposed of," the bench said.

Lucknow, June 13: Rising temperatures in Uttar Pradesh are driving up electricity demand in the state to record levels even as the power generation in the state has dipped due to breakdown of some power production units

The UP Power Corporation Ltd (UPPCL) is struggling to cope with the situation even as local distribution faults have only added to the woes of the people.

The power demand in the state set a new record Saturday night when it surpassed last year's high-

est demand witnessed in September: "The maximum demand was recorded to be 26,672 MW on Saturday at 10.55 p.m. and this was more than the highest peak demand of 26,589 MW recorded on September 9, 2022," senior UPPCL official said.

"As the fresh spell of heat continues, people are increasingly relying on air-conditioners for relief. The power infrastructure is overstrained because of which. reports of transformers catching fire, cables getting burnt and overhead wires melting, causing power outages, are coming

'Waste-to-wonder' park, fountains to beautify Delhi

New Delhi, June 13: Replacing over 2,000 exhaust fans with plastic ones and installing lights at dark spots are among the measures the Tihar Jail has taken to prevent incidents like the recent murder of jailed gangster Tillu Tajpuriya, officials said Tuesday.

The Public Works Department (PWD) will be carrying out the work. It has floated tenders for

Central Jail number 1 of Tihar and more are in the offing. Once the tender is awarded the work has to be completed within a month, the officials added.

According to prison officials, keeping the safety of inmates in mind and to prevent a repetition of such incidents in the near future, the Tihar Jail administration got more than 2.000 exhaust fans removed from the wards housing the barracks where inmates are lodged.



"More than 2,000 exhaust fans installed in the wards of the Tihar jails have been removed and these will be replaced by plastic exhaust fans, which will be installed by the PWD by this month. The process of removing the exhaust fans started after gangster Tillu Tajpuriya was murdered," a senior jail official said. He added that areas, LED lights will also be installed, he said.

'We have identified certain dark spots inside the wards and soon these areas will be lit up with LED lights. This will also help the guards to keep a close watch on any suspicious activities inside the premises," the official added.

The jail officials said the iron grilles of water coolers have also been covered with plastic so that no inmate can use these to make 'improvised weapons".

Tajpuriya was killed with "improvised weapons" allegedly by four members of the rival Gogi gang—Deepak alias Titar, Yogesh alias Tunda, Rajesh, and Riyaz Khan — who stabbed him "92 times". The four attackers, lodged on the first floor of the prison, cut an iron grille and used bed sheets to climb down, police had said.

Quake hits Doda, parts of north India

Doda/Bhaderwah (J-K), June 13: A 5.4 magnitude earthquake hit Doda in Jammu and Kashmir Tuesday afternoon, causing damage to scores of buildings and injuring at least five people, officials said.

The tremors were felt across Delhi and other parts of north India, and in neighbouring Pakistan. People in parts of the union territory rushed out of their homes in panic. The National Centre for Seismology (NCS) said the 5.4 magnitude earthquake struck the region at 1:33 pm. Its epicentre was in Doda.

The earthquake struck at a depth of 6 kilometres, it said. Five persons, including two children, suffered minor injuries in Doda district, officials said. Jammu Divisional Commissioner Ramesh Kumar said, "There was no loss of life or any major injury to anyone in Jammu region. Several buildings have developed cracks.

Biparjoy: 30,000 people evacuated in Gujarat

Jakhau/Ahmedabad, June 13: Authorities Tuesday shifted 30,000 people from coastal areas to temporary shelters two days before powerful cyclone Biparjoy's expected landfall near Jakhau port in Gujarat's Kutch district.

An official said several NDRF and SDRF teams are on standby. Simultaneously, Army authorities have jointly planned relief operations with civil administration and National Disaster Response Force. The Army has kept flood relief columns ready at strategic locations. In a virtual meeting to take stock

of the cyclone preparedness, Union Home Minister Amit Shah asked the Gujarat government to make arrangements for moving people living in sensitive places to safer areas and ensure all necessary services, such as electricity, telecommunication, health and drinking water. The meeting was attended by

Gujarat Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel, two Union ministers, several Gujarat ministers and MPs, MLAs and officials from eight districts that are likely to be affected by the cyclone.

We have already started evacuating people residing near the coast who are likely to be affected the most during the landfall. So far, various district administrations have shifted nearly 30,000 people to temporary shelters," said State Commissioner of Relief, Alok Kumar Pandey.

The state government is aiming to evacuate people within 10 km of the coast, he said, adding that so far one fatality related to the cyclone has been recorded. Ahmedabad IMD director Manorama Mohanty said the cyclone is likely to cross between Mandvi in Kutch and Karachi in Pakistan near Jakhau port with 125-135 kmph wind speed

A warning has been issued for extremely heavy rainfall accompanied by strong winds in coastal parts of the Saurashtra-Kutch region, especially in the districts of Kutch, Porbandar and Devbhumi Dwarka, she said."After it makes landfall and weakens, the movement of the cyclone is likely to remain north-eastward and it is expected to move towards extreme

south Rajasthan. It will bring heavy to very heavy rain in north Gujarat till June 15-17," Mohanty said. Fishing activities have been suspended till June 16, ports are shut and ships are anchored as the sea turned very rough and weather became inclement with extremely heavy rainfall and strong winds in the region

due to the approaching cyclone. "The sea will remain very rough to high till Jun 14, increasing to high to phenomenal on June 15," Mohanty said. Pandey said the government is constantly working to ensure that there is no loss of life due to the weather phenomenon.

He said the rescue operation is being carried out in two phases, with people residing 0 to 5 km from the seashore to be shifted first. Thereafter, people living within a distance of 5 to 10 km from the coast will be moved to safer places, with priority to be given to children, pregnant women and the elderly.

The government said 17 teams of the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) and 12 of the State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) are on standby in affected districts of Devbhumi Dwarka, Rajkot, Jamnagar, Junagadh, Porbandar, Gir Somnath, Morbi and Valsad.

The Western Railway has so far cancelled 69 trains and decided to short-terminate 32 and short-originate 26 trains as a precautionary measure to ensure the safety of passengers as well as train operations.

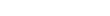

Kyiv, June 13: Russian missiles rained down in a central Ukrainian city overnight, killing at least 11 people and wounding more than two dozen in a warehouse and an apartment building, regional officials said Tuesday.

The attack in Kryvyi Rih, President Volodymyr Zelenskyy's hometown, comes as Ukrainian forces are in the early stages of a counteroffensive, more than 15 months after Russia invaded. Russian forces have unleashed


overnight missile strikes repeatedly against targets across Ukraine in recent weeks, and Tuesday's toll was among the highest from a single attack. In late April, missile strikes hit an apartment building

in the central city of Uman, killing 23 people, including six children. Images from the latest missile attack relayed by Zelenskyy on his Telegram

channel showed firefighters battling a blaze as flames poked through broken windows in the damaged apartment building. Charred and damaged vehi-

cles littered the nearby ground. "More terrorist missiles," he wrote. "Russian killers continue their war against residential buildings, ordinary cities and people.'

The governor of the Dnipropetrovsk region, Serhiy Lysak, wrote on Telegram that the bodies of seven people were recovered from a private company's warehouse, and "another four destinies were cut short" at the apartment building. He said search operations had been called off. Kryvyi

Trump arrives at court to face secret document charges

Miami, June 13: Former President Donald Trump arrived Tuesday afternoon at the federal courthouse in Miami to formally surrender to authorities ahead of his court appearance on charges accusing him of illegally hoarding classified documents at his Mar-a-Lago estate in Florida.

He was expected to face a magistrate judge, kickstarting a legal process that will unfold at the height of the 2024 presidential campaign and carry profound consequences not only for his political future but more urgently for his own personal liberty. Four black SUVs entered the garage beneath the Miami courthouse, followed by police officers, ahead of his scheduled 3 p.M. Appearance.

Security remained tight outside the building but there were no signs of significant disruptions. Trump approached his arraignment with characteristic bravado, insisting as he has through years of legal woes that he has done nothing wrong and was being persecuted for political purposes.

The case is laden with political implications for the 76-year-old Trump, who currently holds the dominant spot in the early days of the 2024 Republican presidential primary

It also poses profound legal impact given the prospect of a yearslong prison sentence. Even for a defendant whose post-presidential



life has been dominated by investigations, the documents probe has stood out for both the apparent volume of evidence amassed by prosecutors and the severity of the allegations. It's also a watershed mo-

ment for a Justice Department that until last week had never before brought charges against a former president. The arraignment, though largely procedural in nature, is the latest in an unprecedented public reckoning this year for Trump, who faces charges in New York arising from hush money payments during his 2016 presidential campaign as well as ongoing investigations in Washington and Atlanta into efforts to undo the results of the 2020 race. The court appearance is also unfolding against the backdrop of potential protests. Some high-profile backers have used barbed rhetoric to voice support.

Trump himself has encouraged supporters to join a planned protest Tuesday at the Miami courthouse, where he is expected to surrender to authorities. Trump has said he's looking to add to his legal team though no announcements were made Monday.

Traders in Nepal stop importing veggies from India PRESS TRUST OF INDIA

Kathmandu, June 13: Traders in Nepal Tuesday said they have stopped importing onions, potatoes and other vegetables from India after the government slapped a hefty 13 per cent Value-Added Tax (VAT) on these items last month.

Opposition lawmakers have criticised the Nepal government's move, arguing that it would make low-income families vulnerable to food insecurity and increase the agony of people who are already hit hard by skyrocketing inflation.



According to the financial bill introduced in Parliament May 29, imported onions, potatoes and other vegetables and fruits will now be subjected to a 13 per cent VAT. Finance Minister Prakash Sharan Mahat has defended the move, asserting that it was intended to protect local farmers and trim imports.

Nepal imports almost all its onions from neighbouring India. Last year, it imported 173,829 tonnes of onions from India. Nepal grows potatoes that cater to around 60 per cent of local de-mand, while the rest are also imported from India.

RBI may tighten norms for banks' unsecured lending

INDIAN BANKS HAVE BEEN EXPANDING THEIR UNSECURED **LENDING PORTFOLIO AS THE PANDEMIC-INDUCED STRESS BEGAN EASING**

Mumbai, June 13: The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) is looking to tighten scrutiny on the unsecured lending portfolios of banks amid the growing risk of potential defaults, four banking sources told Reuters.

Unsecured loans - mostly personal loans and credit cards-do not carry any collateral and therefore pose a higher risk of default. These loans, however, are a big contributor to margins as they entail higher interest rates.

Some action from the RBI on unsecured lending, credit cards. etc. could be seen," a senior source aware of the central bank's thinking said. "Excessive growth is the first sign of potential delinquencies.



None of the sources wanted to be named because they are not authorised to speak to the media.

'We can expect the RBI to increase risk weights on unsecured personal loans and credit cards and, or, float a discussion paper on how to monitor the space more efficiently," said the

head of credit card vertical at a private sector bank.

As per RBI norms, the risk weights - or the capital that the banks need to set aside for every loan - on unsecured personal loans and outstanding on credit cards currently stands at 100% and 125%, respectively.

"The RBI has enough options with it for stricter vigilance," said a senior official at a large private sector bank. "We are bracing for tighter norms, it's a matter of time,' the executive said.

The RBI did not immediately respond to an email seeking comment.

Govt to review PLI scheme this month



New Delhi, June 13: India will review its production-linked incentive (PLI) scheme at the end of this month to improve utilisation in sectors that are lagging behind, a trade ministry official said Tuesday

The PLI scheme, which is Prime Minister Narendra Modi's main industrial policy to boost manufacturing, has so far announced incentives for 14 sectors. The review will focus on six sectors, including steel and textiles, where the scheme has not been effective, the official, who did not want to be named, told reporters.

The official said the review will help in better utilisation of funds over the next 2-3 years.

Another official said the government had no plans to include chip manufacturing in the PLI scheme, but that talks were in "reasonably advanced stages" to bring tovs, footwear and new-age bikes under the fold. The PLI scheme has drawn investments totaling 535 billion rupees (\$6.54 billion) until December 2022.

In the world's biggest crude importer, China, which posted disappointing economic data last week, the central bank lowered a short-term lending rate to restore market confidence.

Demand jitters offset a temporary boost in oil prices from Saudi Arabia's pledge to cut more production in July.

The Organisation of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) kept its forecast for 2023 global oil demand growth steady for a fourth month Tuesday, slightly increasing expectations of Chinese demand growth.

Another monthly report by the International Energy Agency (IEA) due Wednesday will provide further trading cues.

Mumbai, June 13: The banking sector is on course to report the best asset quality in over a decade this fiscal, with headline gross NPAs and net NPAs falling to 2.63 per cent and 0.83 per cent, respectively, in March 2023, according to Moody's and its arm Icra Ratings.

At the same time, the likely gross fresh NPA generation at 2 per cent will be the lowest since fiscal 2012, the agencies told reporters here Tuesday. They also said the strong domestic demand, improving credit conditions of borrowers and strengthened solvency and funding will support further improvement in the credit quality of banks and non-banking financial institutions in spite of the challenging environment for banks globally.

The report expects the healthv profitability trend to continue, primarily driven by strong loan

growth, which it sees to moderate to 11-11.7 per cent this fiscal from 15.5 per cent in fiscal 2023 and a favourable credit environment.

The trend of improving asset quality will continue with headline gross non-performing advances and net bad loans declining to their best level in over a decade, at 2.63 per cent and 0.83 per cent this fiscal from 3.96 per cent and 0.97 per cent, respectively, in fiscal 2023. At the same time, the gross fresh NPA generation rate of 2 per cent will be the lowest level since fiscal 2012, Alka Anbarasu, an associate managing director at Moody's and Karthik Srinivasan, a senior vicepresident at Icra, told reporters.

While the year-on-year credit growth is likely to moderate with higher interest rates, the incremental credit growth is expected to be ₹15-16 lakh crore, which is poised to become the banking sector's second-highest increase on record, they said.

Rohit's Test future uncertain

New Delhi, June 13: There is no imminent threat to Rohit Sharma's Test captaincy but the stylish Mumbaikar will need to rake up some significant numbers in West Indies to prevent a question mark over his leadership in the traditional format.

Rohit will lead Indian in the two-Test series in the West Indies and then perhaps sit with BCCI and decide on his future in traditional format.

If those privy to developments in the Indian team are to be believed, unless Rohit himself decides to stay away from two-Test series against West Indies starting in Dominica from July 12, he will be leading the team.

However the BCCI brass and the national selection committee will be under pressure to take a tough call if he fails to notch up at least one big knock either at Dominica or at Port of Spain during the second Test (July 20-24).

"These are baseless stuff that Rohit will be removed from captaincy. Yes, whether he will last the whole two-year WTC cycle is a big question as he would be nearly 38 when the third edition ends in 2025," a senior BCCI source in know of things told PTI on conditions of anonymity.

"As of now, I believe that Shiv Sunder Das and his colleagues will have to take a call after the two Tests and looking at his batting form.'

In fact, the BCCI works very differently from other sporting organitions. In Indian board, those in power believe that you don't take decisions when the criticism reaches crescendo.

"After West Indies, we have no Tests till December-end when the team travels to South Africa. So there is enough time for selectors to deliberate and take a decision. By then the fifth selector (new chairman) will also join the panel and a decision can be taken, he added

Those who are aware about developments in Indian cricket know that once Virat Kohli quit Test captaincy after series defeat in South Africa, Rohit wasn't very keen to become the leader in longest format initially as he didn't know that whether his

body would hold

or not. "The two top men at that time (former president Sourav Ganguly and secretary Jay Shah) had to



once KL Rahul failed to impress as a captain in South Africa," the source said.

Save a classy 120 against Australia on a challenging Nagpur track, Rohit hasn't exactly scored the kind of runs that is expected from a player of his calibre.

Since Rohit took over Test captaincy in 2022, India played 10 Tests and he missed three --- one in England due to COVID 19 and two in Bangladesh due to split webbing. He scored 390 runs in 7 Tests and had an average of 35.45 in 11 completed innings with a sin-gle hundred and no other

score above 50. In that same phase,

Kohli played all 10 Tests, scoring 517 runs in 17 innings with 186 against Australia at Ahmedabad being his best. Cheteshwar Pujara in the same phase played eight Tests and scored 482 runs in 14 innings with two unbeaten knocks at an average of 40.12. But one needs to factor, scores of 90 and 102 came against a weak Bangladesh attack.

The selectors know that in the next three years, all three big players on the wrong side of 35 can't constitute the top order of India and hence tough calls will be required, looking at future.

McDonald credits 'sub-continent journey' for Aussies' WTC triumph

London, June 13: They might have failed to conquer the 'Final Frontier' on their last tour of India, but Australia head coach Andrew McDonald feels their "sub-continent journey" helped them get the World Test Championship mace.

Having missed out due to overrate penalties in the 2019-21 cycle, Australia Sunday became the first team to win ICC world titles across formats when they defeated India by 209 runs in a lopsided WTC Final at the Oval here.

"You can string down series in isolation, you can talk about the subcontinent journey where we went from Pakistan to Sri Lanka into India," McDonald told reporters.

"We had to navigate through that. So, it was a tricky World Test championship cycle and I think the wins in the subcontinent got us here.

The Pat Cummins-led side had enjoyed some splendid wins in the sub-continent before travelling to India in pursuit of its first Test series triumph since 2004-05 in the final leg of the WTC cycle.

Before travelling to India, Australia won a three-match series in Pakistan 1-0 with a crushing 115-run defeat of the hosts in Lahore in March. Then in Sri Lanka, they won the first Test by 10 wickets only to go down by an innings and 39 runs in a drawn 1-1 series.

On turning Indian conditions where the matches failed to last the distance, Australia's biggest bright spot in a 1-2 loss was their nine-wicket win in the third Test in Indore. It also sealed their WTC Final berth with a round to spare in the 2021-23 cvcle.

"We're really strong in Australia. So I think that most people would

expect us to be winning Test matches in Australia, but to be able to execute in Pakistan, win a Test match in Sri Lanka and then to get that win in Indore to secure a place in the final was vitally important to give us this opportunity. And we've been able to take that, so it's a job well done.'

The 42-year-old further said they were just buying into the "new concept" of the WTC having missed out on the inaugural final in 2021.

"It's a new concept. But we're certainly buying into the concept and I think that was probably the disappointment of the first couple of years when it was in existence where we missed out due to over rate so we've made it a significant focus of ours

"Every time we come into a series we're checking in around where we are, there's a ladder, albeit stretched out over two years, which is a little bit different to other sports, but yeah, it's high on the priority list.

"And you put on the priority list, you want to be here and you want to win it and that's what we've been able to do. So it's right up there. And if you go into that dressing room at the moment, there's a lot of happy people about, reflecting on what they've been able to achieve over the last few years."

The focus however will shift to the marquee Ashes showdown in less than a week when they will be looking to break a 22-year drought in England
